In dire straits

A 53-YEAR-OLD German man was rescued by Guardia Civil officers and firefighters after spending the night sleeping in his car in the middle of the River Guadalest near Callosa d'En

Surprising selection

IT'S all change at Benissa Town Hall with Abel Cardona of Reinciem Benissa installed as mayor.

Juan Bautista Rosello, mayor for almost 18 years, announced last December that he was stepping down. "The time has come to hand over," he said.

Rosello was expected to be succeeded by fellow Partido Popular member Arturo Poquet, until then councillor responsible for Town Planning, Environment and six other municipal departments.

Instead Ciudadanos councillor Isidor Molla Carrio voted with the PSPV-PSOE. Reiniciem and Compromis to give nine votes to Reinciem Benissa's candidate Abel Cardona against Poquet's eight.

Molla Carrio, who was himself Benissa mayor for 12 years between 1987 and 1999, has now been suspended from Ciudadanos for flouting the party's policy of supporting the most-voted party.

Meanwhile Reiniciem Benissa has contacted the local media, including the English-language press, clarifying that the party has no links to the Podemos party.

"We are a citizens' platform created before the 2015 elections with the aim of bringing local politics closer to the population," a communiqué said.

Only mildly shaken

SPAIN'S National Geographic Institute (IGN) recorded a 2.9 magnitude earthquake in Aguas de Busot.

The tremor was felt just before 10pm by residents in the area, some of whom felt sofas move and saw lamps sway. Minutes later the IGN registered two milder aftershocks measuring 2.5 on the Richter Scale.

One Aguas resident said afterwards that he first noticed a loud noise, "a sort of crunching" that was followed by a shaking inside the house that made the furniture move.

The earth tremor was also felt in Busot and Jijona and occurred 10 kilometres below ground, said the IGN whose seismological station is located in the Cuevas de Canalobre.

British Legion conference

His Majesty's pleasure

RELATIVES visiting prisoners in Villena prison were snowed in after a blizzard hit the inland area.

According to the Acaip union that represents prison employees, several people who arrived early in the morning to visit family members were unable to leave when the prison was cut off after heavy snow.

The prison management supplied them with food and blankets and also contacted prisoners on day release to inform them that they would not have to return that night.

Less lucky were the prison guards who were unable to return home and had to sleep in the prison.


Despite the at times Arctic-like temperatures in recent days, last year was the hottest since world records began in 1880. And local weather is set to change more up to the year 2100 than it has in the last 10,000 years, according to experts.

Things are hotting up

TEMPERATURES in Spain could increase up to 5°C by 2080, with 30 per cent of the country becoming a desert should the most severe predictions play out.

Climate change has already warmed Spain 1.3°C in the last century, 0.3°C more than the global average. As a result, parts of the Bay of Biscay coastline could become submerged by the end of this century.

September 6 was the hottest day in Spain last year with 45.4°C recorded in Cordoba and 38 provinces experienced temperatures above 40°C. Meanwhile, 21.4°C in Cuenca on December 26, 2016 was the hottest for the



month in Spain since national records began in 1955.

In the future, extreme summers and heat waves are likely to become four times as common.

Eyesore solution in sight

THE owners of the Hotel Selomar on Benidorm's seafront are once again negotiating to sell it.

The Selomar closed in 2007, ostensibly for improvements, but failed to reopen owing to disagreements at the time between its major shareholders, the locally-prominent Almodobar and Barcelo families.

Occupying a prime position at the town end of the Levante beach, sale of

the now derelict building to a French investment group fell through at the last moment.

The would-be purchasers backed out after the building was damaged by a fire started by squatters in 2015.

Whale found on beach

THE body of a pilot whale, a member of the dolphin family, was found dead on a Denia beach following the recent storms.

The five-metre long gentle giant was discovered on the Estanyo beach, although this was not the first dolphin to have struggled with the treacherous aquatic conditions. A grey dolphin measuring 3.5 metres had been washed up a few days previously on the nearby Els Molins beach.

The Maritime Environmental Service for Denia removed the carcass from the shoreline and following protocol sent it to Valencia for a necropsy to confirm the cause of death.

Pilot whales have been known to reach over six metres in length and weigh on average 2.5 tonnes. They are more commonly found in the Atlantic.

Crime wave broken

THREE men have been arrested and charged with 28 burglaries in the Marina Alta region.

The area of Pedreguer, Orba and Benidoleig fell victim to the three accused, aged 31, 33 and 36, who brazenly entered each of the 28, mostly country houses, and took what they wanted before making their escape.

Cutting perimeter fences and forcing windows, the gang stole jewellery, tools, and electronic devices including televisions, computers and mobile phones.

The three were eventually caught when Guardia Civil officers received a call saying that a burglary was in progress at a property on the CV-731 between Benidoleig and Orba.

Rushing to the scene they were able to catch the gang in the act and search their vehicle. They discovered stolen items along with tools such as screwdrivers and pliers which could be used to break into a property.

A PENSIONER taking part in a popular Spanish dating show fell asleep while the programme was live on air. The hapless contestant had taken a sleeping pill to stave off nerves and instead of finding love, she ended up falling asleep.

The presenter of Canal Sur's Andalucia-based show asked technicians to turn off the lights when the show had finished, leaving this particular sleeping beauty still in slumberland. The woman, known as Eloisa and from Almeria, was then told the footage had been seen by around three million people.

Presenter Juan Y Medio was on hand to help wake her up, but Eloisa is still without a partner.

Radioactive

SPAIN'S intention to stockpile nuclear waste less than 100 miles from the Portuguese border has angered its neighbour.

The plant is to be built at the Almarez complex, but Portugal has filed a complaint with Brussels.

It claims it should have been consulted when 'transborder' issues potentially affect the environment and says this was not done.

WHILE many motorists refuse to use the metro and continue to drive on the city's main and frequently clogged roads, Mayor Manuela Carmena wants to ban all vehicles from many main streets by 2019.

With her term of office due to end in two years' time she is keen to drastically reduce the pollution levels in streets that at present are daily thoroughfares for thousands of vehicles every hour, with the Gran Via one of the busiest. And other changes are also planned as her mayoral hope is to additionally introduce garden areas on the tops of buses and bus shelters as a boost to her aims to "deliciously pedestrianise" the capital.

Statistics reveal that the city of 3.2 million boasts one car for every two citizens. Given its high ground location, vehicle fumes are in part blamed for the smog that can grip it during winter months, affecting daily life for tens of thousands of families.

While the mayor's schemes have been criticised and even ridiculed by some, around 2,000 people die annually in Madrid from the effects of polluted air.

€14,200 'to kill a husband'

A MAN accused of hiring a professional hit-man to kill the husband of his partner has been arrested by police in

Acting on information from Interpol and police in Bolivia, officers swooped on their target in Algeciras.

The man is wanted in connection with a murder in 2014 when the then husband of his current partner was shot dead in Santa Cruz. South American police claim the hit-man received \$15,000 ($\le 14,200$) to carry out the killing and are now seeking his extradition.

Underground arms stash

WEAPONS including machine guns, pistols and thousands of rounds of ammunition have been seized in the Basque country.

Police uncovered a sophisticated underground workshop where arms were reconditioned before being sold to criminal gangs.

The haul is estimated to be worth €10 million on the black market.

ONE of the most enduring characters in Spanish fiction and equally famous on television is set to reappear on the nation's screens. The original creator of much-loved Detective Pepe Carvalho, novelist Manuel Vázquez Montalbán, died 13 years ago.

Now Carvalho is set to make another appearance with the publication next year of a new novel which will be televised. Poet and writer Carlos Zanón is the man charged with reigniting Spain's love for the iconic detective.

A DEVELOPER is planning a luxury hotel and 1,000 apartments in Coveta Fuma (Campello).

The project backed by British and US money will be orientated towards the gay community.

The developers are prepared to invest €150 million and the four-party political alliance running the town hall is initially in favour of the project.

Campello's mayor Benjami Soler confirmed that he has met the development company's representatives who expressed 'great interest' in building the hotel and urbanisation on 800,000 square metres of land in Las Lomas between l'Amerador and Coveta. Most of the land is now believed to have been acquired.

This area, zoned for building but yet to be developed, is unaffected by the recent annulment of Campello's 2011 General Urban Development Plan (PGOU).

No planning modifications will be necessary and the development would be similarly unaffected by the regional government's Patival coastline protection leg-

Horse shelter

A HORSE shelter in the Marina Alta has lost the use of valuable land used to exercise and hold many of their animals

The Xara Friends of the Horse (APAC) in Denia was given the wasteland adjacent to their shelter five years ago and until Christmas the relationship between APAC and the landowner had been good.

However, the owner of the 3,000m² plot now wants to sell it saying the animals bother him and create a bad image. This announcement comes despite the plot being considered lacking in any urban value as it is next to a railway line and a ravine.

Lois Ford, president of APAC said: "We have helped over 200 horses and this land allowed the horses to run free with children and people with disabilities coming to look after them and do activities with them."

APAC Denia are a little-known charity with the woman behind it. Jules Winstanley Jones, devoting everything to it. Jules has tirelessly rescued and reared over 100 horses who have been mistreated. abandoned and abused. She has shown them love, provided a caring home and regained their trust whilst providing the space and surroundings to aid their rehabilitation.

This decision has meant that 26 rescue horses have had to be moved as the owner wanted the land free whilst he looks for a buyer.

At the moment the herd of horses are spilt into three groups using different kindly donated fields around the area and although the horses are cared for the charity says it is a struggle logistically having them apart.

Shattering storms cause severe damage

RESIDENTS of the northern Costa Blanca are counting the cost of the shattering storms which have left a trail of devastation in their wake. There is severe damage in Gandia, Denia, Javea, Calpe, Altea and even Benidorm.

The regional government has made an urgent request for emergency aid from the national authorities in Madrid. President Ximo Puig has officially declared the past week a natural catastrophe in order to ensure proper compensation arrives for affected

been recorded as heavy rains and wild winds battered the coast. Much of the Costa was hidden in a thick blanket of snow as temperatures sunk below zero.

Dozens of private homes, beaches, public buildings and trees have endured serious dam-


More than 32,000 buildings were left in the dark due to sudden power outages. Several beaches were engulfed by the waves.

In Gandia the strong winds and waves devastated the Nord beach. Dozens of homes around the Les

damaged by the onslaught as waves crashed through private

Calpe's Fossa and Arenal beaches suffered badly with furniture swept away and access routes left unrecognisable. Businesses and restaurants in Javea were forced to close as dirt swept in from the sea and trees and dangerous electrical wiring collapsed.

Emergency measures will now begin in earnest to repair the damage. Significant funding will be required from all levels of government as Costa Blanca citizens cope with the effects of more weather-related damage.

Officers seize 664 illegal firearms

ACTING as part of a pan-European investigation, with assistance from Europol, the Guardia Civil from its involvement in Operation Bosphorus has announced that it arrested 46 people, seized 247 firearms and more than 23,000 cartridges.

The operation which included police forces from Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Finland, Greece, Netherlands, Poland, Romania, Sweden and the United Kingdom netted a total of 225 people arrested and seizure of 664 firearms, 33.748 cartridges of different calibres, hand grenades and silencers. In Spain, four illicit factories

were also closed down together with two illegal internet gun shops with arrests taking place in A Coruña, Albacete, Alicante, Almeria, Badajoz, Barcelona, Bizkaia, Cordoba, Granada, Huelva, Huesca, Jaen, Madrid, Malaga, Murcia, Sevilla, Tarragona, and Zaragoza provinces.

Many of the weapons had been

obtained from Eastern Europe with a number supposedly made inoperable but the various well equipped firearms workshops were able to convert them back to working models and they also manufactured cartridges at the

THE Terra Natura Park in Benidorm has a new resident, a giant bullfrog weighing an enormous 700 grammes.

Classified as the world's largest species of frog, the four-year old-male will join the park's exhibition and be on show for visitors to observe.

Originally from Africa the amphibian, named Jabba, has moved from a zoo in Madrid to Benidorm and can be expected to live as long as 10 years.

Keepers at the park explained that Jabba could reach 1kg, which in comparison to the Iberian common toad's maximum weight of 100 grammes shows how large their new resident is.

Bullfrogs often fall victim to predatory birds and reptiles, making it rare for many to make it into adulthood. During the summer they usually bury themselves to take refuge from the heat in a process known as aestivation.

They can remain in their underground hideaways for about three months to avoid dehydrating, reemerging when the autumn rains begin.

Accessible for everyone

BENIDORM Council has signed an agreement to make the resort one of the most accessible holiday destinations in Spain.

Speaking at the International Tourism Event (Fitur) in Madrid, Mayor Toni Perez said their intention was to develop the city's first Accessibility Plan.

"This is aimed at improving the conditions, products and services of the town and will be promoted through the TUR4all accessible tourism platform, its website and its mobile app," he told reporters.

Some of the actions agreed already are studies to see how much access is currently offered and training council staff linked to tourism on how best to serve the public with diverse needs.

The agreement was welcomed generally, but Socialist spokesman Ruben Martinez criticised the signing of such an important policy without consulting other parties.

"This is another example of the lack of institutional respect for the rest of the opposition groups that the government has. Such an important agreement for the town can place us as the most accessible beach and sun destination in Spain. It is intolerable," he said.



Rainfall good for some, bad for others

TORRENTIAL rainfall was good for crops in the southern Costa Blanca although the centre and north suffered.

The rain dispelled the threat of night frosts in the south and was welcomed by Eladio Aniorte, president of the Asaja agricultural union. "If it weren't for the rain, everything would have frozen."

Hail and snow in the north and centre of the province affected early potatoes, broad beans, onions and artichokes. Root and green vegetables were damaged in the Villena area where overnight temperatures plummeted to -7.5C when the weather was at its worst. Growers were also pessimistic about the next olive crop

Crops like grapes which are grown on unirrigated land

felt the benefit, Aniorte said, while citrus fruit and green vegetables were losers. The biggest winners were the inland growers in mountain areas to the north.

"Rain is marvellous for cherries, avocados and nisperos. They are all going to bud with gusto next spring, and the same with the almonds, which could produce a great crop," Aniorte predict-

How to claim back expenses paid on your mortgage

AS mentioned in a previous article, a decision by the Supreme Court of Spain (705/2015), stated that mortgage loan clauses included on mortgage deeds which obliged the customer to pay all the costs related to their mortgage, are in fact abusive.

This is because these expenses: notary fees, land registry fees, etc of the mortgage, should in reality be paid by the banks, as the banks are the ones that ask the consumers for the mortgage to be set up as a guarantee of the loan.

This is because it is in the interest of the banks that the mortgage deed is registered, in order to have this mortgage guarantee in place against the property of the consumer and to protect the bank's rights.

Therefore, and as noted in the previous article, if you have a mortgage with any Spanish bank, when you signed your mortgage, in almost all cases the bank will have made a retention from the amount of the loan, in order to pay on your behalf the expenses of the registration of the mortgage loan deed, and to make sure that the mortgage is finally registered.

What can you claim for? You can claim for the expenses of the notary, land Registry, the expenses of the bank's agency for the registration process of the mortgage deed, and the Stamp Duty Tax (AJD - although not all the judges agree about the possibility to claim for the tax paid).

Who can claim? Any customer who has signed a mortgage deed in Spain, and the bank has obliged to pay the expenses of the said deed; that means the vast majority of customers who have signed a mortgage in Spain.

How much can you claim? It will depend on the amount (the capital) of the mortgage loan, the documentation attached to the deed and fees charged by the bank agency for dealing with the registration. Purely as an example; in a mortgage loan of about 150,000 Euros, the expenses that can be claimed would be between 3,000 Euros and 3,500 Euros and if we include the taxes (AJD) the expenses, it could add up to 7,000€.

In order to claim you will need copies of all the following:

- your mortgage deed
- the invoices paid for the mortgage to the notary, land registry, registration proceedings, etc.
- the AJD tax paid (tax form 600).
- the invoice showing the amount paid to the bank agency to manage the registration process of the mortgage at the land registry.

What if you do not have the documentation? The bank or its agent has an obligation to provide you with all the invoices of the amounts paid on your behalf, because they normally retained the money, and they must show what and how they spent your money withheld by them.


LIKE all local towns, Calpe has provided shelter for the homeless during the recent low temperatures and stormy


LA NUCIA has employed three workers as part of their programme to hire the unemployed.



This will affect concerts in the GuillermoAmor stadium in Foietes and Julio Iglesias auditorium in the Aiguera park, acknowledged Treasury councillor Lourdes Caselles.

The move has required modifying an existing by-law that stipulates a €230 an hour fee for these events. This is unviable, municipal sources said as promoters can take several weeks to set up a major event.

In contrast, a surcharge on tickets would be simpler.

Despite the system's

apparent simplicity and although it was approved more than a year ago, the local government has waited until now to explain to councillors when the by-law modification, and the surcharge, will come into effect.

It remains to be seen how the levy will affect the annual Low Festival. According to the promoter's agreement with the council, the festival will be held in Benidorm until 2020 but the new arrangement could oblige them to allocate part of their takings to the town.

"The town hall will be studying the Low agreement," said Caselles who added that the promoters should pay "like anyone else."

Supreme Court confirms parliament must be consulted over Article 50

THE Supreme Court has rejected the government appeal against the High Court decision requiring that parliament should vote on the triggering of Article 50 of the Lisbon agreement by eight votes to three on January 24.

In summing up the decision made by the majority of 11 Supreme Court judges, Lord Neuberger explained that the overall view was that whilst the government could make decisions of this sort under most circumstances, on this occasion, as the rights of the British people would be affected, that parliament must have a say.

In addition, the judges unanimously agreed that in the case of the devolved assemblies, there was no obligation to allow them to add their approval as this was a decision to be made by the government of the

United Kingdom, supported or rejected by members of parliament representing all of the UK voters.

The immediate response from the Attorney General on behalf of the government was that it was disappointed with the decision but would comply with the ruling.

As Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn announced that he had no intention of voting against the decision to implement Article 50, there seems little likelihood of the government being defeated.

'My new Maggie' to meet with Trump

ALTHOUGH much was made of the fact that Prime Minister Theresa May was the 10th leader to be called after Donald Trump won the US presidential election, she has turned the tables and will be the first major world leader to meet him as president when she travels to Washington on January 27.

Whilst she was quick to explain to interviewer Andrew Marr on BBC TV that she would be confronting him on a number of matters including NATO, treatment of women and his policies with regards to Muslims and other minorities as well as Syria and terrorism, there is little doubt that a trade agreement will be uppermost in her mind.

Having suffered the embarrassment of losing the government's appeal to the Supreme Court and being told in no uncertain terms by the European Union that she can't pick and choose what she wants from any future negotiations on immigration and trade, she needs to be able to show that Britain can stand alone.

President Trump has sent Mrs May (who he refers to as 'my new Maggie') an indication that he wants the relationship between America and Britain to be as close as it was under the Reagan administration and that he would be happy to put a new trade deal in place quickly.

Unfortunately for Mrs May, under current EU rules, EU countries cannot make separate trade deals with non-EU countries so whilst she may be able to thrash out the terms, she can't actually implement the agreement until Britain leaves or EU rules are changed.

Donors battle through storms

DESPITE the appalling weather conditions in La Nucia blood donors waded through streets that had become rivers to attend the monthly blood donor session.

THERE was some positive financial news as the Spanish government announced that the value of exports had hit an all-time high and the trade deficit had shrunk by 27.1 per cent in the period January to November

As imports fell by 0.9 per cent to €250.11 billion in the period under review, the trade deficit fell to €16.1 billion in one of the best years since 1977, beaten only by the result in 2013.

The positive performance of Spanish exports between January and November

is in contrast to that of Spain's neighbours. In the Eurozone, exports increased slightly (0.2 per cent) while in the European Union as a whole exports shrank by

Exports were up in Germany (0.8 per cent) and Italy (0.7 per cent), but less so than in Spain, and were down in France (-1.8 per cent) and the United Kingdom (-1.5 per cent), with figures for the USA (-4 per cent), China (-6.4 per cent), and Japan (-8.5 per cent) being far worse.

Main improvements in exports were seen in capital goods, the automotive sector, and food, drink and tobacco, al-

though growth of imports was also seen in the same sectors.

Exports to the EU which amount to 66.5 per cent of all exports grew by 4 per cent whilst sales to other countries throughout the world saw some falls although Canada, China, Hong Kong and Morocco saw significant and welcome

Spain's trade surplus with the EU stood at €1.71 billion in November 2016 compared to €554 million in November 2015 but the trade deficit with non-EU countries increased by 23 per cent over the November 2015 results to €2.96 billion.

Holding back the waves

BANKED sand again protected Javea's Arenal beach and the promenade against storms and towering waves.

Frontline restaurants, cafes and shops bordering the Paseo David Ferrer were grateful for the measure, which in December safeguarded their premises and prevented the wash from breaking waves reaching the promenade.

When the January weather worsened dramatically and snow briefly covered the Paseo, torrential rain and heavy seas combined to flood the zone near the La Fontana canal

The remainder of the beach fared little better. Reeds, vegetation and debris that were swept out to sea down the swollen River Gorgos were later returned to the shore by towering waves.

This time business-owners began making their own barricades until the town hall's Services department, coordinated by councillor Kika Mata, stepped in and brought out the municipal diggers to build up the dykes.

This was the simplest and most practical way of preventing the heavy seas from inundating the Paseo David Ferrer and businesses there, Mata said.

Two bars bordering the Benissero beach - Montgo di Bongo and Siesta - were less fortunate and lost terrace furniture, awnings and blinds. These were swept away by waves as far as the Primer Muntanyar road which was closed after it was littered with stones brought in by the sea.

The Marina Española at Javea port was also carpeted with stones and pebbles by waves that also tore away benches and other fittings. Business-owners did not suffer, having protected entrances and terraces, knowing from past experience what to expect.

Fears over fall in residency

By Linda Hall

JAVEA'S registered population continues to fall, according to the latest figures.

A gradual decline has seen the number in 2013 drop from 33,149 to 27,225 at the end of last year.

This reduction reduces the amount of money that the central government transfers to the municipality each year. The town hall recently presented its budget for 2017 and revealed it will receive €1.3 million less from the Spanish state owing to the drop in popula-

Economic factors accentuated by the recession are the principal reasons, according to statistics experts. Some foreign residents have left Javea, fewer people have arrived to offset the mortality rate and the Spanish-born population of 15,439 now outnumbers those from abroad.

Most of the town's residents - 12,242 according to 2015 figures - are European, followed by Latin Americans and Africans

Wrong righted for anglers



World Economic Forum in Davos

WHILST many conspiracy theorists comment on the fact that the World Economic Forum meeting held in Davos, Switzerland each year is a front for a small group dominating the world, there is no doubt that it attracts politicians from every conti-

The Forum engages businesses in projects and initiatives to address industry, regional and systemic issues.

In its own words, "the Forum provides a platform for the world's 1,000 leading companies to shape a better future. As a membership organisation, the Forum engages businesses in projects and initiatives - online and offline - to address industry, regional and systemic issues."

To some extent therefore there is little doubt that this organisation does help to shape future decisions as the members contribute so much to the economies of so many countries and

whilst there are any number of public speeches and meetings, it would be naive to assume that no other deals take place in private.

This year saw the first visit from a Chinese leader as Xi Jinping addressed members with a thinly veiled message for President Elect Trump about the dangers of a potential trade war and the advantages of globalisa-

Theresa May rushed over to Davos following her Brexit speech at Lancaster House and explained her view of the future for Britain, Europe and the rest of the world and warned

multinational organisations that they need to pay more tax to ensure fairer treatment for individuals.

As far as she is concerned, she believes "It is essential for business to show leadership - to show that in this globalised world, everyone is playing by the same rules." In addition, she

wants them to forget short term profits and invest in helping individuals and the community for the long term.

This view agrees with that of Christine Lagarde, Managing Director of the International Monetary Fund who has also called for fairer treatment for individuals where big business uses globalisation to reduce its tax obligations to the detriment of the economies of a number of coun-

Mrs May has also indicated that she intends to make Britain a world leader in free trade, although it would appear that she will be unable to negotiate any of these trade deals until such time as Britain has physically left the European Union, by which time there could well be less than one year before a new General Election in

Davos is an important event which also highlights the fact that so few women are involved in the forum that rules have been introduced (and sometimes ignored) that each member company should bring one woman for every four men who attend, whilst every organised discussion should have at least one woman

Rolls-Royce agrees massive bribery fine

ROLLS-ROYCE HOLDINGS PLC which is responsible for the production of engines for the aeronautical industry has issued a public apology and agreed to pay fines totalling £671 million (€771 million) to Britain, Brazil and the USA.

This deal which is being made under the Deferred Prosecution Agreement (DFA) will save them from a number of proposed criminal prosecutions for what it admits was endemic bribery in order to win contracts over an extended period.

The main bulk of the fine, £479 million (€550 million) will be paid to the British government with a further £141 million (€162 million) being paid to the US Department of Justice, with the balance being paid to Brazil.

Introduction of the DFA system in the UK is relatively recent and this is without doubt the largest agreed settlement ever reached in Britain, but it is fairly common in the USA and has been in regular use with regards to agreed fines for banks who acted improperly in the run up and subsequent to the financial problems of 2008.

Sources suggest that the decision to reach these agreements now was in part due to fears that the new President might have been tempted to instruct the DOJ to take an even tougher stance

The investigation by the UK Serious Fraud Office (SFO) started in 2012 when certain information concerning the use of bribes to obtain business for the company was brought to its attention.

The current management of the company will continue to give the SFO access to documents even though they have reportedly ex-BA aircraft with a amined 30 million already and Rolls-Royce engine. this agreement is seen as something of a

As investigations proceeded and with the full cooperation of what was effectively a new management team, it became clear that bribery was almost the norm rather than the exception for several years, with payments amounting to as much as \$36 million (€34 million) being paid to ensure that contracts were obtained.

In some cases, the company 'turned a blind eye' to bribes being made by agents or intermediaries whilst in other cases it was complicit in the actual payments which were alleged to have been made to companies in Angola, Azerbaijan, Brazil, China, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Nigeria, Russia and Thailand.

Manchester United makes a fortune to top revenue table

THEY may be out of the Champions League this year but Manchester United have topped the revenue league table prepared annually by financial consultants Deloitte for the first time in 12

If anyone doubts the value of top class football teams then the 10 most successful clubs earned €5.228 billion between them with five of the top 10 coming from the Premier League.

For the last 11 years, Real Madrid has been the most financially successful club followed by Barcelona with Manchester United in third place but this year, with income of €689 million, the British club has pushed Los Blancos (Real Madrid) to third position with Barcelona pipping them to second place by just €100,000.

Every club in the top 10 has seen an increase in income for 2015-2016, with the average in-

crease being 12 per cent.

Although many smaller clubs around Europe are finding it difficult to generate sufficient income, those who are at the top consistently generate increased profits through tickets sales, TV rights and most importantly merchandising.

Deloitte forecasts that the next season could see another turnaround as United will not be in the Champions League, will face increased pressure on salaries and transfer fees due to continued Chinese expansion and may well also

A very important part of the revenue stream for the Manchester club has been in respect of commercial and merchandising deals which have seen an additional €100 million in income, but other clubs are likely to learn from the

Super Rich

THE international charity Oxfam has released a report to tie in with the World Economic Forum in Davos that states that eight men own as much wealth as the 3.6 billion people who make up the poorest half of humanity.

The report entitled 'An economy for the 99 per cent' suggests that the gap between the rich and the poor is actually getting greater and that the super rich, both corporate and individuals are using their wealth to screen themselves from paying taxes, for influencing politicians and driving

Whilst all of the eight richest people in the world are men and the majority come from the USA, there is one Spaniard, Amancio Ortega of Inditex and a Mexican, Carlos Slim.

Previously it was thought that the major wealth of the planet was held by 62 individuals, but this figure has been drastically reappraised following new data concerning poverty levels in China and India, both of which boast many millionaires although millions of people exist on meagre daily

CLEVER Patxi! Patxi Lopez has taken the political equivalent of a selfie and put his name down in PSOE's secretary general

Lopez is old blood instead of Pedro Sanchez's new blood which caused such bad blood in the PSOE. As secretary general Sanchez appealed to the paid-up party membership - aptly described in Spanish as militants - but not the voters or party hierarchy.

Former president of the Basque region, Lopez was briefly Speaker following the December 2015 elections. He backed Sanchez's 'no means no' stance over Mariano Rajov's investiture bid but later abstained. Nothing to complain about there, then - unless you're Susana Diaz and thought you had it in the

Sanchez has a problem and not only with Patxi Lopez or Susana Diaz.

Backing for Sanchez in his tug-of-war with the party hierarchy stemmed not from support for his person, but his refusal to allow Mariano Rajoy to form a government. Baleares regional president, Francine Armengol, and Idoia Mendia, secretary general of the Basque socialists, have now spelled that out to Sanchez.

The PSOE membership, which famously chose Sanchez in the 2014 primaries dropped by several thousand under his leadership. The militants might not be enamoured of the Managing Committee headed by Javier Hernandez but will they come out for Sanchez now that Patxi Lopez has thrown his hat in the ring? Or will it be 'No means no thank you?'

Of primary concern

SPAIN'S president Mariano Rajoy has compromised over the primaries that some in the Partido Popular are call-

Members up to date with their dues will vote for candidates in a first round. In the second, the party's US-style delegates, will vote for those obtaining more than 10 per cent of the vote.

Galicians like Rajoy are notorious for answering questions without giving a definite reply. And this, for the

time being, is his response to an issue that brought so much grief to the PSOE.



Undesired effect

EX-PRESIDENT Jose Maria Aznar has severed most of his links with the Partido Popular but confirmed that he does not intend to start a new right-wing party. Not that he is going to keep quiet, he warned, which will do neither Rajoy nor the PP any harm. Criticism from Aznar is praise indeed.

Protect your pensions now

YOUR article on the current situation whereby UK pensioners living in certain countries do not receive the annual increases in the state pension will have horrified many expatriates

When Brexit comes into effect it could mean that the UK will no longer be legally obliged to pay the annual increases to pensioners residing in the EU. Whether this actually happens will become apparent during the negotiations.

For the half million UK pensioners already living in the EU and in receipt of their state pension there is little that can be done apart from protesting should their state pensions become frozen.

However those UK expatriates already living here who are not yet of pension age can take action to maximise their pension. In the UK the working population pay into the state pension system since it is compulsory when in employment.

However upon leaving the UK to live abroad the state pension becomes voluntary and as a result many expatriates decide that a pension is something which can be faced up to at a later date and is usually overlooked until it is too late to do anything about it.

The government will argue that it has bent over backwards during the last 15 years to make contribution rates attractive. It is currently possible to catch up in respect of contributions for the last six years if they have been missed and from time to time it has campaigns in order to persuade people to improve their pension record and so maximise the state pension that they will ultimately receive.

The return on additional contributions made in this way is over 30 per cent. In the event of the government depriving UK pensioners living in the EU of the annual increases, they should at least ensure that that their state pension is approaching the maximum amount of £160 per week and is not a derisory amount as a result of taking no action.

Eating red or processed meat can, over time, increase the risk of de-

veloping type 2 diabetes as well as other disease. Try boosting your intake with beans and dark green leafy vegetables which are especially good sources of iron, even better on a per calorie basis than meat.

Iron absorption is increased markedly by eating foods containing vitamin C along with foods containing iron. None or less meat eaters do not have a higher incidence of iron deficiency than do full-time meat eaters. Tofu, spirulina, pumpkin seeds, quinoa, tomato paste, white beans, dried apricots, cooked spinach, dried peaches, prune juice, lentils, peas...



Being a mummy can be bad for your health

MOTHERS fall ill an average of 324 times during their child's childhood years and most of these illnesses have been passed on from their voungsters.

A survey of 2,000 parents found that 68 per cent of women said they often got more sick after having children and admitted to only feeling completely well for an average of 13 days per month.

From when their child is born to the age of 18, mothers will suffer from around 54 colds, as well as a total of 108 sore throats or runny noses, as well as around 36 sickness

The survey by Healthspan also reported that 72 per cent of mothers said that they cope with being ill better than their partner does. Around 36 per cent soldier on through feeling bad, but their partners have to resort to bed rest.

Psychologists believe this could be similar to the flight or fight response, with women unconsciously needing to do everything to ensure the survival of their child and safeguard their family.

The study also found that two-thirds of people were prone to becoming ill when they switch off or take a holiday. This is because stress can





Eat healthily to increase your vitamin and mineral take to provide greater defence against colds and try taking a multivitamin, although check before giving to a child.







One in 67 babies suffers from FAS

EVERY year, over 100,000 babies are born in the world with foetal alcohol syndrome (FAS) as a result of the mother drinking too much during pregnancy.

The Centre for Addiction and Mental Health Canada, carried out a study to find out which countries had the highest incidence of women drinking during their preg-

In Canada it is estimated that around 10 per cent of women continue drinking alcohol when pregnant. The five countries with the highest consumption were Russia, the UK, Denmark, Belarus and Ireland. Europe as a region, saw pregnant women drinking 2.6 times more than the world average. Southeast Asia and the Eastern Mediterranean saw the lowest levels of alcohol consumption.

It is believed that FAS affects one in every 67 babies from drinking mothers. Babies may be shorter in height, have a small head. behavioural problems and issues with sight and sound. The risk of problems depends on how much and often the mother drinks.



Fasting during sleep can help you live longer

DIETING whilst you sleep can help you live longer. Fasting overnight and not eating between 5pm and 8am can help you lose weight and also live longer.

Researchers carried out a study on monkeys and stopped food between these hours and found it helped them live longer. Restricting food appeared to make bodies more able to fight off illnesses that accompany old age. As humans share 93 per cent of the same genes, they say their findings will also apply to humans. However, the results showed that it didn't work in young monkeys, so advised that people started it later in life also.

It is believed this restriction on eating reduces the cancer and dementia and that by eating less it may send the body into survival mode so that it focuses on protecting

The scientists said they wanted to look at ways to slow the aging mode of the body in a bid to reduce serious illnesses

What to do about flu?

THERE is a lot flu about at the moment and also a lot of coughs and colds.

- What are the usual symptoms of flu?

Flu usually causes fever, muscle and joint pain, headache, cough, fatigue, lack of appetite and a general feeling of being unwell. Sometimes it can also cause chest infections with green mucus, chest pain and difficulty breathing being warning signs.

- What's the difference between flu and a common cold?

Common cold symptoms are far less severe and include a runny nose, stuffed up feeling and sneezing. Fevers are rare.

- Should I go to the doctor if I think I might have flu?

Generally, you don't need to see a doctor as there is no cure. However, if your symptoms last for a long time or you get worse rather than better, then get yourself checked out by a doctor.

- So there's no treatment?

The only medication available for flu is to treat the symptoms: control pain and reduce fevers. Antibiotics are not needed for flu. Drink plenty of water and get lots of rest.

- When should I go to hospital?

Very rarely, complications require hospital treatment. If you have serious trouble breathing or any other severe symptoms, then a visit to A&E is probably a good idea though.

- How long will it last?

Flu symptoms usually last between five and 10 days. Common colds usually last one week.

- I had the flu jab, can I still catch flu?

You are less likely to catch the flu but there is always a possibility of doing so. Your symptoms will probably be far less severe than if you hadn't had the vaccination though.



There will be conducted tours of a military camp.








Red hot properties down under

REAL estate in New Zealand startled observers when two Auckland homes were sold five times in just four days. The country continues to experience a property boom, considered one of the biggest in the world today.

New Zealand continues to experience a property boom, considered one of the biggest in the world today.

Both houses were 'flipped,' meaning sold two or more times during a year. The phenomenon is common in piping hot property markets but averaging more than one sale a day for five days straight is unprecedented.



The properties are actually neighbouring homes located in an affluent Auckland suburb. One saw its value almost double from €900.000 to €1.6 million from February to August 2016. Both properties ended up in the hands of the same developer, who reportedly plans to demolish them and build 18 townhouses in their

Almost 2,000 homes in the city changed hands more than twice last year and there are so-called 'flipping hotspots' scattered around both the north and south islands. The average house price in Auckland recently shot through the NZ\$1 million mark (roughly €670,000), up from half that 10 years ago. With foreign investors snapping up thousands of properties the city is now experiencing a housing crisis as many working people are forced to live in tents and caravans.

Exciting times

A SURVEY among senior property experts suggests that 2017 will be an exciting year for Spanish real estate. Half of the managers questioned believed that house prices will rise by between 3 and 6 per cent. Asked the same question last year, only one in five considered such a performance possible.

The comprehensive survey was conducted by internationally renowned surveyance firm CBRE, who asked 100 recognised experts to share their thoughts on the future of Spanish property. The results were overwhelmingly positive and bode well for 2017.

Two out of every three believed that private investors will shape the market to a greater extent than they did in 2016, while more opportunistic investors will take a back seat. That is a positive trend for long term stability and highlights growing confidence in the residential mar-

The impact of international investors is expected to remain stable, contributing

around one third of total developments and continuing to buy up second homes. Meanwhile the experts anticipate that the office sector will really take off this year, especially in the quickly growing ma-

New incentives for landlords

LANDLORDS who offer their tenants fair rents will be offered tax breaks and other subsidies as a reward under a new scheme aimed at lowering prices and ending the scourge of abusive rents. The project has been pioneered by the Catalonian government as rents in the region reached a record high last year.

High demand and a lack of rent control had led to predatory pricing whereby landlords take advantage of struggling tenants and booming foreign and touristic demand, especially in Barcelona. Rent control schemes have made a major impact in Germany and other places, but are relatively unheard of in Spain.

Instead the government hopes to act indirectly, offering incentives for landlords whose prices don't exceed a new local price index. On the other hand those who do demand higher prices will be forced to admit this is the case on official documents.

The real test, however, is how Catalonia can compete with accommodation sharing platforms like Airbnb which encourage homeowners to rent out their homes to tourists for a handsome price, far beyond that affordable by local families.

Spain attracts eastern money

ASIAN investors are increasingly turning away from the UK and looking to countries like Spain, France and Germany when they consider expanding their European property portfolios. That is the message of the European Public Real Estate Association (EPRA).

The group represents Europe's publicly listed property companies, which boast more than €360 billion worth of assets. It has well over 200 members and prides itself on helping them secure lucrative deals from global investors outside the EU.

Chief executive Philip Charls has noted that the first generation of Asian investors chose London, largely due to the language and financial strength of the capital. He believes that Brexit might see a flourish of activity around an alternative continental financial centre such as Dublin or Frankfurt.

Charls also explicitly mentions the booming hotel sector in Spain in an interview with one of China's top newspapers.

New year, new room

IF you've decided to redecorate your living room this year, there are a few common points interior designers tend to agree upon to get it right.

Firstly, remember the room needs a focal point. Think about where you want visitors' eves to be drawn when they first walk into the room.

Next, consider the atmosphere you want for your home. Failing to get the right feel can lead to a sterile, unwelcoming room.

Go for a colour-scheme that suits the room and your character. It's no good going mad with the latest fashions if they are going to look wrong or make you feel uncomfortable, after all, a living room is for living in, not cringing in.

Lighting and layout are just as important as paint and prints. Leaving the lighting till last can be a big mistake and just sticking a lamp in a corner can ruin the overall effect you've worked so hard to achieve.

IT'S often hard to know what to plant on balconies, especially in the winter. These are five of the best plants to cheer up your balcony boxes or pots at this time of year:

Dracaena: these plants are best suited to south-facing balconies. Their dark purple

leaves will give a touch of elegance and add volume to planters.

Primroses: a seasonal plant used to add colour and cheer up winter compositions. They

tend to flower towards the end of winter and last until early spring.

Red Swiss chard: not only are these very decorative for the autumn and winter

months, you can eat them too! The intense red colour of their stems makes them useful to add colour to balconies.

Violets and pansies: these outdoor plants tend to start

flowering in the winter. They cope well with low temperatures so are apt for the autumn and winter seasons.

Snapdragons: native to the Mediterranean, these grow very well in pots and can reach heights of up to two metres.

Climbing roses are ideal to plant in the winter

THE Mediterranean winter is short but it gives a break from the many activities needed to maintain the garden through the long hot summer. Now is an ideal time to prepare the soil and plant roses.

There is a limited range of quality roses that will thrive in the Mediterranean garden but an often overlooked possibility that is more reliable is the climbing rose.

Traditional rose beds can do well when carefully planned with varieties selected to suit the long hot summers. I have a rose bed that provides exquisite blooms with scents that put most bottled perfume to shame.

Rose bushes need a lot of care to maintain the right amount of sunlight without being too shaded or too scorched with balanced moisture levels, mulch to insulate the soil temperature and reduce evaporation, applied nutrients to ensure vigorous growth, regular pruning, rose hips and unwanted lateral branches in addition to winter pruning, insect control and fungal prevention.



The most spectacular display of rose flowers in my garden however is the 20+ year old climbing roses that grace the stone walls in full sun all day and all the year.

They need and receive little care except for an annual pruning after the main flowering period in May/June. The advantage of a climbing rose is that it finds the best way to grow itself if placed where it can ramble over walls and structures to optimise its own environment by shading its root zone and foliage with its branches and seeking out the place to receive the right amount of sunlight.

1. PETS should always have complete Pet Passports before you make a journey. Ensure you schedule a visit to your veterinarian and allow sufficient time prior to your trip to discuss diseases or problems that might exist when you are travelling.

2. When travelling by car, plan for twice as many rest stops as you would for a small child. Pets need ample time to stretch their legs and to go to the bathroom.

3. Avoid motion sickness by only feeding your pet a small

meal a few hours before leaving for your trip. Start with short trips and increase the time before a long trip.

4. Take plenty of fresh water. It has been found that many area's water varies, this has caused problems. Whenever you travel with your pet and factor in potential emergencies, such as if your vehicle breaks down. Always bring extra food and snacks for the road.

5. Safety belts and harnesses are good for securing small dogs in vehicles, but the safest way for your dog to travel is secured in a crate in your back seat or at the rear of an estate vehicle.

6. If your trip includes an overnight stay, research petfriendly hotels first and have a full understanding of what accommodations are available for them, as well as any extra charges that may apply.

7. All airlines require pets to have a health certificate before

they can fly - make sure you check first. Each airline's policy differs, so plan accordingly. Also, find out if the airline will fly your pet during weather extremes - hot or cold

8. Make sure your pet has a strong collar and identification tag, and include information about your destination.

Also, remember all dogs and cats in Europe are required by law to be microchipped and remember to carry a current photo of your pet along with health certificates and inoculation records.

9. Never leave a pet in a car on warm or hot days. Temperatures in cars are at least 20 degrees above the outside temperature and heatstroke or death can result

10. Prepare for the unexpected and enrol your pet with a Veterinary Pet Insurance policy, which will give you great peace of mind should an accident or illness occur on the road.

Protect your pets

WITH the abnormally cold recent weather all over Spain, humans and animals alike are suffering the effects. It is more important than ever to make sure pets are warm and dry as, unlike humans, they cannot tell you they are cold or put on a jumper to protect themselves!

Move all animals indoors, even if they usually live outside. Under no circumstances should pets be left outside in freezing conditions.

If you have no choice but to leave dogs in the garden during the day, make sure they have access to a dry, draught-free kennel or shelter which is big enough to move in, but small enough to hold in body heat. The floor should be off the ground and some form of bedding should be included.

Pets which spend time outside will need more food to replace warm and, as always, they require costant access to fresh water. Use plastic food and water dishes outside.

Small dogs will appreciate a coat on walks at this time of year and keep a pot of Vaseline handy to deal with chapped noses and paws.

Use common sense and remember, if it feels cold to you it probably feels cold to your pet too.

Baby talk works... for puppies

A NEW study published in Proceedings of the Royal Society B biology journal has explained that humans talk to dogs in a similar way to babies because puppies in particular are more responsive to the short phrases and high tone.

People were recorded saying certain phrases such as 'good boy' and 'come here' while looking at photos of dogs of different ages, human beings and while not looking at anything.

Not only were the subjects found to employ what we refer to as baby talk when addressing the dog photos, but when the recordings were played back to dogs of different ages puppies paid far more attention to it.

Older dogs, however, appeared not to be as attentive to baby talk, possibly because as they grow older they are less interested in understanding strangers, scientists suggested.

Dogs are believed to have evolved over more than 30,000 years of close interaction with humans to understand them better. This,

researchers claim, has led them to develop communication skills similar to those of small children.

Dogs react to gestures such as pointing in a way which no other animals do. studies have found. Unlike children, though, dogs take these gestures as a mild order rather than a way of passing on information.
