# Slashed

### 50,000 to lose Ferrocarril discount

By Matthew Elliott

Soller residents will no longer receive a discount on the famous Ferrocarril train line. The European Commission ruled that the subsidy discriminated against tourists after a German national made a formal complaint.

The European Union threatened sanctions against the Balearic government if it did not comply with the demand to abolish the resident's discount. Jaume Mateu, the regional

transport minister, has now confirmed that residents will be forced to pay the full fare from April 1.

Tickets on the famous train, one of Mallorca's biggest tourist attractions, presently cost €16 for tourists and €7 for local residents. The vast majority of passengers are guests, who accounted for over 90 per cent of the line's almost two million journeys made last year.

That still leaves 50,000 people who will have their Balearic resident's discount card taken away from them. The Balearic government is reportedly working on establishing a new subsidy system for locals, especially those who rely on the train to make a living or see relatives.

Different modes of transport may be considered, or users will be rewarded for frequent journeys with financial discounts that make no mention of residency. Another option is making return trips from Soller to Palma cheaper than two singles, or the more popular Palma-Soller route.



The European Commission's decision found the discount to be illegal on the grounds that it discriminated against people on the basis of their nationality. Becoming a resident of Soller is not restricted by nationality or golden visa applicants.

The Ferrocarril de Soller is expected to do excellent busi-

ness in 2017. Work first began on the railway, advertised to tourists as the Orange Express, more than a century ago in 1911.

Demands have long existed to update Mallorca's transport infrastructure to reduce reliance on the railway and the attendant cost for residents with business in Palma.

# Viva el amor!

ALTHOUGH not a traditional fiesta, St Valentine's Day is known as San Valentin in Spain, and is celebrated the same way as in the UK. Many Spaniards are convinced that it was only created to boost consumerism, though, and have dubbed Valentine's Day as the Dia de El Corte Ingles (El Corte Ingles Day) in a sarcastic reference to the famous department store.

Certain Spanish regions also celebrate their love on different days of the year. In Valencia, for example, October 9 is the most romantic day, when the Day of the Valencian Community coincides with the Day of Saint Dionysius, the patron saint of lovers. It is customary for

men to gift their loved one a Mocadora, consisting of marzipan sweets handcrafted by local confectioners and wrapped in a silk scarf.

In Catalonia, couples celebrate their love on April 23, St George's Day, known locally as La Diada de Sant Jordi. Men present their sweetheart with a red rose while receiving a book in return, and a myriad of stalls selling the symbolic items spring up across the region.

LATIN countries dominate the ranking of the most romantic nationalities in the world, with Spain coming in fourth behind the sensual samba of Brazil, the ooh la la of France, and the legendary passion of Europe's most convincing Casanovas, Italy.

PETROL may soon be cheaper across Mallorca. A ruling from the Balearic Supreme Court has allowed self-service petrol stations, thus reducing operating costs. Whether those reduced costs will be transferred to consumers remains to be seen but competition will certainly increase. For years consumer regulations across the islands have insisted there is at least one on-duty worker manning petrol stations during opening hours.

### Collective island wisdom

AN exodus of young people has left many Mallorcan villages with an older population than ever before. The latest demographic data from the Spanish Institute of Statistics dates to January 2016 and makes for very interesting read-

There are now 14 municipalities across the island where more than a fifth of the populace is a pensioner aged over 65. In places like Ariany and Sant Joan the proportion of pensioners is approaching one in three. Many villages scattered throughout the Tramuntanas have a considerably older population than other parts of the island.

In contrast Palma, Inca, Calvia and Alcudia have the lowest relative number of pensioners at around one in nine. The capital does, however, have by far the largest number of centenarians. As of January last year there were precisely 198 people aged over 100 on Mallorca, 90 of them in Palma, 13 in Manacor, eight in Son Servera and seven in Porto Pollen-

### Virtually abducted

POLICE managed to stop a father from Zaragoza paying €10,000 to a criminal gang in Chile who falsely told him his son had been kidnapped. ### **Postcard** from **ITUREN**



ITUREN is a town and tiny municipality in northern Spain in the Pyrenees. It's made up of four small hamlets, one of them, also called Ituren, had just 518 inhabitants in 2012.

That's not a lot by any stretch of the imagination. But once a year it leaps to the top of any index measuring the oddest of local customs. Remember Morris dancers? Men with bells, ribbons and pigs' bladders? Well, this lot knock them into a cocked hat. On the first Monday and Tuesday of February its men and boys take part in a procession through the locality dressed in sheepskins and conical hats with ribbons, while carrying whips. But that's not all. Giant cowbells are strapped to their backs.

And as they progress they are confronted by other villagers dressed as witches and demons who must scatter as they walk through. The ceremony, not surprisingly, has a lot to do with good and evil, light and darkness and so on. You may think it's just quaint or done only for the tourists. But some researchers evidently think it could be one of the oldest carnival events in the whole of Europe. It's certainly one of the strangest....

### Doctors held in false limb scam

DOCTORS are among 22 people arrested in Cadiz accused of defrauding more than €250,000 from the Andalucian Health Service. They face charges of embezzlement, fraud and falsifying documents. Police said false claims for prosthetic limbs and other items were made

#### Train crash

RELATIVES of 81 people killed in a high-speed train crash in Spain have received the backing of a highlevel group of MEPs. The Spanish inquiry into the 2013 crash in Santiago de Compostela was not independent, they said. Around 150 people were also injured in the accident. The MEPs said a fresh inquiry should be ordered.

### Heroin gang

TWENTY-NINE people have been arrested in the Spanish cities of Madrd, Pontevedra and Ourense as police cracked down on a gang responsible for heroin trafficking in Galicia. Officers found a laboratory where a high-grade drug was mixed before being sold on the streets.

The heroin had come largely from the Balkans. Turkey and the Netherlands, police said. Among those arrested was a Spaniard who will be transferred to prison to serve a 14 year sentence and a Madrid surgeon who hid the drugs when it arrived in

### Bowing out

A BULLFIGHTER'S final departure if it comes in the ring can make national headlines. But the latest sad statistic is the death of a timber salesman from the Wirral in England's north-west who fell in love with the sport and became known as El Niño. Peter Jones fought several times in the summer of 2001 after attending a festival in Salamanca. He finished his short-lived career without serious injury and remained deeply committed to the sport. His death at age 49 was revealed by colleagues at his local golf club.

### Banker sold his soul

A CORRUPT British banker who holidayed in Mallorca with his ill-gotten gains has been jailed for 11 years. A London judge described the money laundering scandal as one of the worst cases he had ever seen

Lynden Scourfield, a director at HBOS, forced clients to do business through a consultancy owned by David Mills, who received 15 years for his part in the crime. Desperate

business owners seeking loans were forced to go through the illegal consultancv and extorted for lucrative

The pair were ringleaders of the corrupt cabal which poured the eyewatering 'consultancy fees' into their own personal accounts, ultimately defrauding the bank and hundreds of small business owners of more than €300 mil-

Jurors at Southwark Crown Court heard how the bankers

spent millions hiring superyachts and prostitutes during lavish trips to Mallorca and the Caribbean. Judge Martin Beddoe told Scourfield that he had 'sold his soul' to the devil 'for sex, for bling and for swag' during the 2005-2007 crime spree.

An inquiry will now determine whether Lloyds, which owns HBOS, has a moral and legal duty to compensate the hundreds of men and women left 'cheated, defeated and penniless.

### **Interview with British Ambassador to Spain**

THE British Ambassador to Spain, Simon Manley holds an incredibly important position now that Britain intends to leave the EU as he represents the UK in one of its most important European trading partners and whilst in Malaga today (February 3) granted Euro Weekly News an exclusive interview.

He is often mentioned in the media but generally articles concentrate on what he is saying today and in this interview, he agreed to give more of an insight to the history of the man himself as well as his current

He entered service with the Foreign and Commonwealth

Office in 1990 and has worked his way through the service with two postings to the Embassy in Brussels, one to the British Consulate in New York, two periods of secondment to the European Union and most recently as Director of European Affairs and Head of Counter Terrorism in the FCO.

Whilst one might assume that the role of counter terrorism would sit with the Police and Security Services, the Foreign Office also has to have a very close involvement in such matters especially when British citizens are involved.

Spain is one of the most important positions in the diplomatic service worldwide, with more consulates than any other country because of the size of the expatriate population and the enormous amount of trade which occurs be-

> His role is just not just a commercial one nor indeed as an observer of expatriate and tourist needs as a lot of this is dealt with at ground level with the consulates but because of his background he has close relationships with the Spanish government over mat-

ters of security and there is also considerable co-operation in matters of criminality.

A general conversation confirmed that it is a little frustrating for him to be unable to give any guaranteed information concerning Brexit and how it will affect Britons in Spain as until negotiation are completed no-one knows what the results will be although it is government policy to try to have the case of expatriates agreed at the earliest opportunity.

Part of his role is to try to explain to the government and civil servants in the UK, the hopes, expectations and fears of those British passport holders loving in Spain and the need for their wishes to be incorporated into any Brexit ne-

## 'Historic injustice' set to come to an end

By Matthew Elliott

AFTER 20 years the Soller tunnel will finally be made free for drivers. From September 1 the controversial toll, relatively the most expensive in Spain, will no longer be charged.

The decision is being described as the righting of an 'historic injustice' for the people of Escora, Deia, Fornalutx and Soller. Thousands of working men and women have been forced to pay the €5 tax simply to get to work, many of them twice a day, although subsidies were recently introduced.

Mallorca Council had previously intimated they would lift the toll before the high season began. President Miquel Ensenyat said the council will pay Globalvia, the concessionaire, €15.4 million in a one-off payment to cancel the toll.

With five years remaining on the contract, the company is



seeking compensation of €33 million, more than double the figure offered. However much is paid, the taxpayer will bear the brunt of the cost. Considering its relatively short length

The Soller tunnel, opened in 1997, was immediately the subject of one of Mallorca's greatest corruption cases. Almost

the tunnel is Spain's most ex-

pensive toll road.

10,000 vehicles pass through each day and the tunnel needs safety improvements estimated to cost millions of euros.

By making the payment the Council hopes to ensure the tunnel doesn't fall into private hands once the contract expires. But the political landscape will look very different in five years time and millions in additional costs can certainly be expected.

With 18 million tourists from the UK spending €16 billion a year in Spain, coupled with British purchases which show a €10 billion imbalance in favour of Spain, there is no question that Britain is an incredibly important market and trading partner, especially as it has such a large population of expatriates as well.

# These chills are multiplying

STORMS returned over the weekend and gave way to a cold snap with snow expected in the mountains on Thursday February 9 and high winds predicted for the weekend.

Powerful winds saw emergency services in almost nonstop action across Mallorca. rescuing fishermen, drivers and homeowners.

The brunt of the damage was done on Sunday February 5. Police officers and firemen were called out to hundreds of incidents with winds hitting 134kph in Alfabia. Fallen trees and electricity cables saw roads closed in Montuiri and Manacor.

Bus and ferry services were cancelled and three flights diverted from Palma airport. Extremely strong gusts on Monday struck almost 100kph in Binissalem, Sineu and even the outskirts of Palma.

Winds even ruined the dream of Olympic sailor Iker Martinez who had to abandon his quest to circumnavigate Mallorca in record time. He and his crew were towed to safety and lived to sail another

Snow is expected at altitudes above 1,000 metres.

Wednesday saw the cold arrive and snow is expected at altitudes above 1.000 metres from Thursday onwards. More populated areas will also feel the chill as maximum temperatures plummet by an average of eight degrees.

# **Buxton English teacher** running length of Europe

IN August 2016 Aleks Kashefi. a science teacher from Buxton in Derbyshire, started what was to be an epic 6,200km solo adventure to run the entire length of Europe, a distance of almost 150 ultra-marathons.

His incredible journey began at the most northern point of mainland Europe, Nordkapp in Norway, deep within the Arctic Circle and will finish at the southernmost tip of Europe, the Punta de Tarifa in Spain on February 18.

Aleks has maintained a blog throughout his trip complete with wonderful photography to share his experience in thoughtful, witty and insightful posts, beautifully told snippets of his various challenges, including his tent breaking on the first day of his adventure to falling in a river and injuring his leg.

Though a very humble man, and certainly not one who needs or likes the fanfare, he is keen to share his story in the hope that he will provide inspiration to people, especially his former students; to encourage them and others to be brave, to step out of their comfort zones and take on more challenges. In his own words "where these actions lead isn't important, but the inspiration it may provide others to get outside, to have less and do more, that ordinary people can achieve extraordinary things."



# Tony Christie shares Leo's story Thanks for a fighting

LITTLE Leo Bermejo is made of the right stuff. He cannot talk but he is a happy, energetic fouryear-old who just a day ago underwent a long operation at Merseyside's famous Alder Hey Hospital.

The surgeons' task was to cut away the tumours in young Leo's brain that have hampered every step of a life that has barely started.

As his mother Karen says, Leo is a fighter. "He is so happy and when you see him he is playing and laughing. He does every-

But the tumours Leo is battling are caused by a rare cancer that mostly attacks children, boys in particular and often those under four.

And when they grow they grow very fast. This is why this brave voungster can't speak because they have already damaged that part of his brain.

But Leo, who has fought back after one major operation now faces his toughest battle of all.

Once the Alder Hey surgeons have done their work, there is no more that can be done for him anywhere in the UK. Conventional radiotherapy would be too damaging to his young brain.

His only hope, and the option that offers him the chance of ridding himself of the tumours once and for all, is a treatment called proton therapy.

And the specialist unit which has worked on SPNET tumours before, is in the US, in the Midwestern state of Oklahoma

THE cancer that is attacking Leo goes by the acronym SP-NET. Its victims are children. often boys, and those under four years of age.

The characteristic is that the tumours grow and grow fast. They are located in the cerebrum, the part of the brain that governs Leo's speech, his emotions, his voluntary muscular movements and even his ability to reason and solve problems.

SPNET tumours are extremely malignant. After Leo's first operation in Pamplona, the

signs that they were re-emerging took just nine weeks. And they do not stay in the same place. Once the tumours have been removed, conventional radiation on a young brain is damaging. So for Leo the answer is proton therapy. At high

energies, the positively charged protons can destroy cancer cells without being so damaging to Leo's body.

The treatment allows the surgeon greater control when delivering the right dose. There are thought to be less than 40 such specialist units in the world and there is nowhere in the UK with such a facility.

### Stuck in the middle with you

COSTITX is stamping its claim to be at the very centre of Mallorca with a 23-feet high sculpture. But that claim is disputed by nearby Sencelles and Sineu who also argue that they are bang in the middle of Mallorca.

The sculpture, by local artist Joan Ramis, was purchased by

Costitx Council 15 years ago to plant in the village as a symbol of its centrality. A study from the University of the Balearic Islands found Costitx to be officially at the centre of the island.

Yet Sineu and Sencelles believe otherwise. And a rival study from national geographers found that the 'real' centre was in the woods of Lloret

de Vistalegre at Sa Comuna, Indeed there is already a symbol there said to mark the spot.

Costitx mayor Antoni Salas is, however, adamant that the Balearic University study trumps the pesky geographers and old legends. And until he's proven wrong, Costitx will have the tallest claim to fame.

### The problems with panga

A CONTROVERSIAL species of catfish native to south-east Asia will continue to be fed to Balearic schoolchildren, despite some Palma schools banning it. The Pangasius fish, known as panga in Spain, has also now been banned from the Carrefour supermarket across the country.

Several Palma schools, and others on the mainland, have stopped serving the white fish, which is farmed intensively in south east Asia and very cheap globally. They have responded to fears from parents about allegedly high mercury levels found

The Balearic health ministry has found no evidence to suggest there are health risks to children. Carrefour has banned panga on environmental grounds, following claims from Greenpeace that its farming contributes to heavy pollution in the

Many also believe that Spain shouldn't be undercutting local fishermen by importing vast quantities of the fish from Asia. Spain is the largest consumer of panga in the EU, despite having some of the most abundant fishing opportunities in the con-

# Bank of England rethinks forecasts

By John Smith

THOSE who predicted that the UK economy would not be adversely affected by the Brexit decision were dealt a blow by the Bank of England which gave a very gloomy forecast immediately following the referendum decision.

The Bank expects the economy to sustain reasonable growth over the next three years.

Now just over six months later, the situation is definitely reversed with the Bank having to completely review its growth forecast upwards yet again to a figure of 2 per cent for 2017 which is only marginally lower than the forecast in May 2016 when it was assumed that Britain would remain in the EU.

The Bank had previously said that following the referendum result, its actions had done a great deal to stave off a possible disaster and now suggests that higher internal spending by

the government as revealed in the Chancellor's last budget review has helped to make the figures look better than expected.

Looking further forward the Bank also expects the economy to sustain reasonable growth over the next three years thanks to a stronger than ex-

pected world economy, cheaper credit options and a decision by the British public to reduce savings as borrowing is cheaper.

These revelations therefore accounted for the fact that there was no hike in the interest rates which continue at a low of 0.25 per cent, although many analysts expect this to be increased sooner rather than later

Wages have not increased according to expectations so that any cut in unemployment is currently unlikely to see an increase in inflation which is still at an acceptable level, but this is subject to the pound recovering further against the dollar and euro and with the expectation that consumer spending will begin to tail off.

Should inflation begin to increase above acceptable levels then there is little doubt that a speedy increase in the base rate will be implemented.

In many ways these announcements come as something of an embarrassment for both the Bank of England and Governor Mark Carney who recently indicated that he would not leave his post until Brexit has been completed.

If the government and industry cannot rely upon forecasts from the most influential of financial institutions in the UK, then the economy itself could be damaged, especially at a time when Britain is trying to negotiate itself out of the EU and into new trade deals with countries worldwide.

Now that approval has been given in Parliament for the government to proceed to invoke Article 50, the next step will be to review the contents of the White Paper covering the government's overall strategy for Brexit and market reaction to that may well give a strong pointer to how accurate these latest forecasts

# Saving their bacon

AFTER reports that due to the appalling weather in parts of Spain there would be a shortage of a number of vegetables and fruit in British supermarkets, news is now coming in of a bacon shortage in the USA.

There may well be a sudden surge in downloads of the video game Aporkalypse - Pigs of Doom, but there has been something of an online panic as Twitter users worry about the latest news from the US Department of Agriculture that reserves of frozen pork bellies had fallen significantly.

It appears that despite President Trump's fear that the country is being swamped by Muslims, that sales of pork bellies from which American Bacon is mainly produced have risen considerably.

America has been experimenting with bacon recently and the advent of bacon cheesecake, ice cream, smoothies, cupcakes, doughnuts and popcorn coupled with the introduction of all-day breakfasts by major chains has meant that most fresh pork meat has been sold rather than frozen and put into storage.

According to the Department of Agriculture report, stocks have dropped from 22 million kilos to just over eight million kilos in a year which has triggered some fear about prices and scarcity of tasty porcine comestible.

Whilst it is possible that Danish producers will be looking to increase their production, representatives of American pig councils have acted swiftly to advise that the number of pigs in America is greater than ever, although there may be some short term price increases.

On a more serious note, any shortage

which results in price rises must be considered counter-productive and in Zambia several years ago, there were a number of deaths when one particular type of maize was in short supply and many people refused to consume an alternative and different coloured maize which was supplied as aid by the US Government.

## A different fashion connection

NOW that Sports Direct seems to have ridden out the tide of negative publicity about its treatment of staff, owner Mike Ashley is reported to have gained control over an 11 per cent stake in fashion chain French Con-

It would appear that he now has access to 10.7 million shares in the company which may be ripe for a takeover by using an unusual form of investment known as a 'contract for difference' which gives him a very strong position to either benefit from a sale to a third party or if he wishes to make an offer himself.

The bulk of his new shareholding came from asset managers Schroders and it is known that Sports Direct which owns a number of clothing brands such as Lonsdale and Everlast offers a number of French Connection items in its

The main shareholder of French Connection with 42 per cent is founder Stephen Marks, but he has been under considerable pressure from a consortium of business shareholders as the company has been making consistent losses for the last five years.

The introduction of Mike Ashley could mean that French Connection could well be ripe for a significant change in its fortunes in the not too distant future.

### Bla Bla Car says ha ha

The matter was heard before a Madrid court which ruled those drivers using Bla Bla Car are not employees of that company, nor are they in the main professional drivers touting their business for hire and reward.

In addition, it ruled they were not looking to make a profit from the journey but were simply sharing the costs incurred.

Confebus does have the right of appeal against this service and city councils who feel that this business undermines their local bus services could also decide to take action against the company in the future.

### Clamping down on repeat offenders

AS part of the series, we answer some common driving questions and keep you updated on the latest driving and road news kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break

A TOTAL of 22 vehicles have been seized in Ourense, in Galicia, north west-

The DGT took the vehicles from repeat road safety offenders. Although seemingly extreme, the action was taken on account of the severity of the repeat offences. The public prosecutor said each of the owners would have potentially had their vehicles seized for accumulating at least three consecutive convictions in a two year period for various crimes, such as drink and drug driving, or driving without a valid licence.

Of the vehicles seized, 19 have been scrapped. The remaining three are being held as evidence on account of continued investigations being carried out.

The Guardia Civil arrested 362 people in Ourense in 2016, all for serious offences against road safety. The majority were related to alcohol with 204 drivers arrested for driving whilst over the alcohol limit.

As well as clamping down on offenders, it is hoped it will enhance road safety for users. Last year, across the Spanish road network system, there were 1,038 fatal incidents in which 1,160 people lost their lives. A further 5,067 people needed hospital treatment as a result of a traffic accident.

### Can he get it in Minutes?

At the last AGM of our Community, in the discussion at the end of the meeting, I brought up an issue about a member of the Committee, who has hired a family member to work on the maintenance. I feel that this is incorrect. After some comments, the sense of the meeting was that the

problem was minor, but the President said he would look into it. No vote was taken. I wanted this situation to be written into the Minutes book, but the President refused. Can he do this?

Yes, he can. By law, the official Minutes book of the AGM must record the members who attended, either in person or by proxy, and the decisions taken as a result of



the voting, with a list of those who voted in favour

and those against. Only those members who are recorded as voting against a proposal can later challenge it in court. Other details of discussions or points of view are optional.

# Valentine's Day - the origins



My wife was very well before the last treatment, she was strong and apart from the breast cancer very healthy. On the day of her treatment I sat with her, she was well. The next day my wife got ill, was taken to hospital, when I was allowed in the medico said there was no point going to her bed as she was dead.

He said they had done their best to save her but the chemo was too strong for her heart, he asked me if I wished to see her body and that is all he said. I was told I could collect the body at any time and to get an undertaker.

There was no inquest, my wife at her family's request was sent to the UK for burial. I am very concerned as the chemo should not have been so strong, a mistake was made and there should have been an inquest as my wife died very suddenly. Killed, I believe, by the medication.

I know whatever I say will never bring my wife back, but I write this letter to inform others that a hospital that can kill without any comeback is very frightening: the hospital can be very cavalier in their treatment and not worry about the results. In the UK with all its faults if a person dies suddenly there is always an inquest, but here there seems to be no concern.




With Portugal's Supreme Court throwing out their libel case against him, Amaral could now sue them for extensive damages.





Well this could soon become a reality as scientists in America are working on a smart device that can warn you up to half a day in advance gathering information from wearable health trackers which monitor heart rate and body temperature.

The team at California's Stanford

University is working on the app, and have tested the theory on 43 volunteers who wore a smart watch for up to 11 months.

Analysing the data they found that as people start to become ill their heart rate and skin temperature



By getting this heads up people could plan better and prevent aggravating the illness and hopefully have a quicker recovery.

The app could also be used to track the health of the elderly or those with chronic illnesses, such as diabetes and act as a warning system for carers or family members.

The scientists are confident the app will be on the market within the next few years.

### More cancer cases

THE number of cancer cases in Spain has increased more than expected.

The latest figures show 247,771 new cases were recorded in 2015, with 148,827 of these in men.

Released to mark World Cancer Day, the Spanish Society of Medical Oncology (SEOM) said the increase can be attributed to the aging population with more people living longer. Smoking, alcohol, obesity and physical inactivity were also leading to a more unhealthy nation and an increased risk of cancer.

A rise in the cases of viral infections such as Hepatitis C and Papillomavirus, can also be factors in increasing cancer cases.

The most diagnosed types of cancer in 2015, including both sexes, were colorectal (41,441 cases), prostate (33,370), lung (28,347), breast (27,747) and bladder

Miguel Martin, president of

the SEOM, said: "The current situation in Spain is such that one in two men and one in three women will have cancer of some kind throughout their life," although he insisted this does not mean they will die from the disease

Survival figures for cancer patients (an average of 53 per cent five years after diagnosis) have also improved, although thanks to great medical improvements in treating some tumours, the survival rates are even higher, such as in breast cancer.

The specialist said one third of cancers could be prevented: "Some people think that cancer is random and it is inevitable, but this is not true as there are risk factors that when addressed we can reduce the chance of cancer." Martin added the key is healthy lifestyle habits, such as exercising regularly, minimising alcohol intake, not smoking and avoiding obesi-

#### -What are the most common causes of hip pain?

There are many things which can cause hip pain. The most common is osteoarthritis of the hip, when the components of the joints like bones and tendons degenerate over time. Other common causes are infections or injuries.

#### -Are there any specific exercises to help prevent or improve the pain?

There are different exercise routines which can help to control the pain and stop it from progressing. Yoga and pilates exercises and certain exercises in the swimming pool, especially low impact ones, can help a

-Many elderly people seem to suffer from hip pain. Is it something which we will all suffer in the end, in other words, is there no way to avoid it?

Over time deterioration

of the hips is inevitable and osteoarthritis is bound to appear. This appearance can, however, be delayed or the severity reduced with certain rehabilitation exercises and by avoiding being overweight and following a balanced diet.

#### -How can hip pain be cured, is there any medication?

Pain-killers, anti-inflammatory medication and muscle relaxers can be used to help keep the pain under control. Physiotherapy is also vital to help control the symptoms.

#### -Will surgery be necessary

Sometimes and with the pass of time the damage produced is so severe and causes so many symptoms, especially pain and mobility limitations, that surgical intervention is required. This often consists of implanting a prosthesis.

# Good Food, Good Wine and Good Friends

WITH GARRY WAITE



HANKS to the client that contacted me a couple of weeks ago.

A year or so ago he came to Spain to buy a restaurant/pub. He succeeded in buying a relatively well-established premises and has run it (under management) with some success, but is not happy with the way things are now going. Having been open since the beginning of last year he has reached stagnation and wanted my help to revitalise the operation if possible.

We sat down to discuss where he felt that things were going wrong. Most clients come back with the same answer, "We need more clients!" Often that is not the main problem. Costs are normally the base problems of most businesses. Overstaffing, wrong type of staff, no control over food and beverage costs/sales.

The problem with opening a business without knowledge can be dangerous. Even if you have some experience in the industry in your home country, you soon find out it is different in a foreign country.

After all you need an Indian scout in Indian country!!

We started with his figures. I asked him if he was making money and he said yes. But a closer look showed me that this was not the case.

Without doing a full stock take I did a guestimate based on purchases and sales and a rough idea of stock-in-hand. It showed that sale of food had cost 45 per cent. Ideally it should be around 35 per cent or lower. Wine sales were good, but again with his prices he should have been making 75-80 per cent. The bar was much the same.

Analysing these figures would help to understand where the losses were.



CULINARY DIRECTION: The choice of menu and chef is inseparable.

Kitchen management was the first area to look at. The Chef was not passionate about what he was doing. Therefore he had no care for his product. His costings were wrong and his wastage too high.

Instead of utilising his ingredients he would throw away items that could make money in the right hands. One of the problems was that the owner, while not having any kitchen experience, enforced a

The modern wine market in India is small; annual per capita consumption of wine in the country is a mere nine millilitres, approximately 1/8000th that of France. Winemaking has existed throughout most of India's history but was particularly encour-

aged during the time of the Portuguese and British colonisation of the subcontinent. The end of the 19th century saw the phylloxera louse take its toll on the Indian wine industry followed by religious and public opinion moving towards the prohibition of alcohol. Following the country's independence from the British Empire, the Constitution of India declared one of the government's aims was the total prohibition of alcohol.

Several states went dry and the government encouraged vineyards to convert to table grape and raisin production. In the 1980s and 1990s, a revival in the Indian wine industry took week in this column.

# Property heaven for investors

FOR the seventh year in a row, Hong Kong has been declared the least affordable city in the world when it comes to buying a property. An apartment in the skyscraper city costs more than 18 times the annual income of an average household.

That shocking statistic has actually improved since 2015 when a flat would cost 19 times a salary, but the relationship between income and property prices remains the

The findings were published after an extensive survey of over 400 cities by Demographia. They followed World Bank data and terminology. The economic organisation considers a place where property prices are over 5.1 times the average salary to be 'severely unaffordable.'

Hong Kong has some of the most expensive apartments to be found in Asia, given its prime location near China. but free from the strict regulations of the People's Repub-

also millions of people who pay more than 50 per cent of their income to live in tiny toilet sized capsules on a rooftop paying over €400 per month.

Hong Kong is way ahead of the competition in the disparity games, Sydney is a distant but nonetheless concerning second. The Australian city has prices 12 times the average annual income, just ahead of Vancouver where the ratio is 11.8. Hell for inhabitants, but heaven for investors.

# Action finally taken after European ruling

MAJOR Spanish lender Bankia will be among the first institutions to act on a recent European ruling declaring socalled 'floor clauses' to be abusive.

Well over one million bank customers across Spain were affected by the clauses, which imposed a lower limit on mortgage repayments, regardless of interest rate fluctua-

Bankia has seen the writing on the wall from the hugely significant European Court of Justice decision late last year. They have announced that they will refund all of their affected customers with the help of a giant €200 million kitty they have set aside.

It's not completely due to a sense of fair play or responsibility. The bank has openly recognised that they will probably have to pay out even more in legal fees and bureaucracy further down the line if they drag their heels over repayment.

People due refunds will have the choice between a one-off payment straight into the bank account, or the due amount being wiped from their larger mortgage debt.

Various schemes across different banks are set to be rolled out across the country as the government approved new legislation set to guarantee that people get their money back.

Banks will be expected to not only pay back what they overcharged, but to do so with interest attached. Billions of euros are expected to be paid back to property owners in the coming years as a direct consequence of the decision.

## An ornamental tree with fruit

By Graeme Tyrrell

IF you want an attractive ornamental tree that also provides fruit, you may consider growing a loquat tree. Loquats are a handsome tree with well- structured branching easily maintained with minimal pruning. The large thick leathery feather shaped glossy leaves are attractive all year round. They flower in autumn under the right conditions and the fruit forms over winter.

I have several different varieties growing for the fresh loquat fruit that ripens in spring. Spring is a time when few other fresh fruits are available off the tree. Different varieties ripen a little earlier and later allowing the harvest season to be extended. They are hardy when established, needing minimal watering in summer and provide a heavenly scent throughout the garden in au-

They are not usually a large tree, tending to be three to five metres high at maturity with an equal spread but they can grow to 10 metres in good soil conditions. They grow well in natural soils with some compost added and mixed into the surface soil at planting time.

In colder climates the tree is grown as an ornamental species. It will not flower without hot



fruit. The small white flowers are heavily per-

They flower prolifically in autumn, displayed in bunches in a grape like fashion. This gave rise to their botanical name Eriobotrya which refers in Greek to the woolly grape cluster appearance of the flower panicles forming in groups.

The yellow to orange coloured fruit individually resemble an apricot. They grow in bunches however that usually ripen progressively rather than all at one time. Different varieties have varying characteristics in colour, size and taste, but in general they have a smooth skin with delicious flesh, sometimes frustratingly thin, surrounded by a very large seed or multiple seeds in

There is an art to eating them. The easiest way I have found is to pull or cut off the stem and squeeze the other end so the inner fruit pops out without the skin. It takes practice and juicy varieties can be messy for the beginner but handy to learn if you have a big harvest.

The taste of the fruit is like a scented tropical flavour. There are various recipes for using the fruit that have been developed in China. India and Japan where it has been popular for centuries. The fruit can be used in pie recipes, as jam or jelly, for sweet sauces, chutneys, and even to make fruity wine and liqueurs.

The leaves are also used in herbal medicine for various health benefits taken as a tea and much research has been done on the leaves' healing properties.

Trees are readily available in Spain and are known as nisperos. They are a well-accepted exotic fruit popular in the Mediterranean region and they grace many country homes and urban landscapes in Spain.

their woody, erect stems and large green lanced leaves. There is a variety with a lighter-coloured band on the sides of the leaves which is very eye-catching.

To keep yuccas happy, make sure they get plenty of natural light.

Although unlikely to sprout flowers when grown indoors, vuccas can have very pretty bell-shaped white, cream or pink flowers at the top.

Yuccas resist lack of water well as their leaves economise when necessary and their roots, when grown outdoors, can go down as far as two metres into the earth in search

Grown as houseplants yuccas can reach heights of between two and four metres and outdoors they can grow up to eight metres.

They are best planted between March and August and need moving to larger pots regularly over the first three or four years.

To keep yuccas happy, make sure they get plenty of natural light. They thrive in temperatures between 16 and 38 degrees. Water every 15 to 20 days in winter and once a week in spring and summer. Be careful not to overwater as drowning will kill the yucca.

PERSONALLY I believe that all dogs can bite, but they do not really want to! Here are 10 top tips to prevent a dog biting you, or anyone else for that matter!

- 1. Read the dog's body signals - licking, yawning, shaking as if wet. A dog will do these things if they begin to get a bit unsettled. Give your dog the chance to get away, settle down, have a quiet moment and things are less likely to escalate.
- 2. Do not expect a growl. Many dogs decide that growling is a waste of time. Why? Because when they growl. they get punished. Instead,

they don't bother to growl and just bite anyway.

- 3. Biting is a sign of patience pushed too far. Some dogs have lower tolerance than others, of course, but unless a dog has learned to bite they would rather get away from a situation. Let them take themselves off to a quiet place if they want to.
- 4. Teach your children well! Use the free Kennel Club Safe and Sound game, or buy the Blue Dog DVD. Get Kendal Shepherd's book The Canine Commandments, a book to help

children understand and be understood by dogs. Children cannot read dog warning signals until they are well into their teenage years! Do not leave them unsupervised together.

5. If a dog has bitten once, they are likely to do it again. This doesn't mean you should panic and rush for euthanasia or rehoming. Be aware of the

situation that caused the bite. Get professional help from a qualified behaviourist immediately.

- 6. Hugging and kissing can be threatening to a dog. Obvious? Not to many. Even if your dog is used to your loving attention they may not see it that way one day.
- 7. Always read the signs. Dogs can have bad days too! How can we tell if a dog is in pain, has a bad tummy, or is really tired or achy? Usually dogs will not show the signs until the pain is extreme. Be ready to help your dog by taking them to the vet if you see signs of unusual or grumpy behaviour.
- 8. He only nipped. Not a dog bite then? A snap is often a deliberate miss. Take action by getting professional help now. Your dog was clearly feeling under pressure and needs help to feel less stressed.
- 9. Socialise, socialise, socialise. Get your dog used to people and their weird ways from early puppyhood, and keep practising!
- 10. Do not assume that your dog would never bite. They all can if they are put in the right (or wrong!) circum-

## What documents do I need to take in my car?

WHEN you drive a vehicle on Spain's roads, it is compulsory for you to carry certain documents with you in the vehicle.

#### The ITV Card

Official document which relates to the technical inspection of the vehicle, the Inspección Técnica de Vehículos, or ITV.

#### **ITV Report**

Once your vehicle is four vears old it will have to undergo the mandatory ITV test. The ITV report details what happened during that inspection.

#### Permiso de Circulacion

The Permiso de Circulacion is similar to what we might refer to as the log book for a vehicle, which contains information such as the number plate, the vehicle owner and other details.

There are also some documents which are not compulsory, but it is advisable that you carry them with you too.

#### **Insurance Policy**

Carrying the insurance policy is NOT compulsory as the information is contained on a central computer, however, if vou are involved in an incident you will need to know your policy details for the Accident Agreement.

Today the world's most expensive superyacht is thought to be that owned by the president of the United Arab Emirates Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, whose family has around €150 billion to play with. His yacht, the Azzam, is almost 600 feet long, cost almost €500 million and naturally has a missile defence system.

Superyachts form a perfect luxury holding for the uber rich and are collectively worth more than their artworks, private jets and mansions. So it's no surprise that superyacht selling and renting is developing into some of an artform itself

One innovative new technique to separate the superrich from their fortunes is the use of virtual reality to show poten-

tial customers just how perfect a possible yacht can be. The technology is already in place for hotels, allowing clients to virtually visit rooms and get a feel for the place.

Until recently it's proven much harder for yachts, but one international developer has made a breakthrough. Soon superyacht investors will be able to hit the high seas and take a whirl in a helicopter without even leaving their office suite. Various shipyards have taken note and we can expect to see virtual reality rooms become commonplace at exclusive harbours.



## Will try again

AFTER the record for circumnavigating the globe was shattered, Mallorca proved a much harder task for Spanish skipper Iker Martinez. The Olympic legend was attempting to set a new record for sailing around the island when strong winds toppled his mast on Friday February 3.

Martinez was sailing east on the catamaran M32 Movistar yacht towards Alcudia Bay at 30 knots when conditions suddenly worsened. He and his highly experienced four man crew had only set off that morning and were ultimately towed to Colonia de Sant Pere in Arta.

They hoped to beat the Vuelta Mallorca record of 17 hours, 14 minutes and 39 seconds set in 2005 set by German entrepreneur Klaus Murmann who died in 2014.

Martinez and the Movistar crew will be desperately disappointed having delayed their plans for weeks in wait of ideal weather conditions. The 160-mile route is technically very difficult and it would have been virtually impossible to complete, let alone set a new record, given recent storms.

But no Olympian worth their salt is easily discouraged and the 39-year-old has already announced he and his crew will set out again to break the record at the end of February, weather permitting of course. Martinez won Olympic Gold in Athens in 2004 and Silver in Beijing 2008.

# Around the world in 40 days

A NEW record was set to snatch the Jules Verne trophy. Francis Joyon and his Idec Sport crew sailed around the world in just 40 days, 23 hours, 30 minutes and 30 seconds. The team smashed the previous record by more than four days, sailing 26,412 miles at an average speed of just under 27 knots.

During the race they also shattered a range of other records as they sped around the world from December 16, 2016 to January 26 this year. An onboard meteorologist helped the crew nip across the entire Indian ocean in just six days on their maxi trimaran Idec Sport yacht.

The six-member crew had one Spanish member, Alex Pella, but owes their success largely to the superhuman efforts of Joyon, a 60-year-old French veteran of the sport. On their 14th day the crew sailed 894 miles, while another record was set when they managed over 800 miles a day for eight consecutive days.

It wasn't all smooth sailing. The first attempt was aborted after just a few days. Later they experienced extreme storms in the Doldrums and were well behind the pace set by



record holder, the Banque Populaire V as they finished the second week.

The quest will now be on to see who can half the original Jules Verne ideal of circumnavigating the world in 80 days. Winning skippers have almost exclusively been French with the first to manage a sub-80 day sail being Bruno Peyron in 1993.

If anyone is to break the 40-day mark then Joyon must be firm favourite. As well as skipping his crew to the Jules Verne trophy, the Breton also holds the record for the fastest solo sail around the world. He beat Brit Ellen MacArthur's record in 2008 when he managed it in just 57 days, 13 hours, 34 minutes and six seconds. He gained revenge

for her usurping his previous world record when she had beaten it by one day in 2005.

Joyon holds one other staggering record. In 2005 he raced single-handedly across the Atlantic in little over six days and in one awe-inspiring 24-hour period managed to power across 543 nautical miles (1,006km).

# Overnight boating

# Busy day for Shamrock


Mallorca's best guide to local sport

Vicki Connolly won a bronze medal in the 800m freestyle (50+ category), just missed out on bronze coming fourth in her 200m freestyle event and swam a seasonal personal best of 1:17:75 in her 100m freestyle.

On Saturday Julio came 10th in his 50m butterfly in the 35-39yrs category. On the final day Javier Sanchez won silver in the 50m breaststroke in the 30-34yrs category.

By the end of the competition with only four swimmers representing CN Elche the club managed to rank 68th of 166 clubs. A massive achievement with only four swimmers! Well done to all.
