Sex gang smashed

Women trafficked into Spain for 10 years



NIGERIAN WOMEN: Were harshly treated and punished for the slightest infraction.

Police have broken up a gang who specialised in trafficking Nigerian women into Spain as sex workers.

It is thought they had been operating their smuggling route for at least 10 years.

The women were either hidden in lorries or brought across the Straits of Gibraltar in fast boats

From there they were moved to so-called safe houses before being passed onto groups operating brothels in the south of Spain, including Almeria and Torrevieia.

In a joint operation codenamed Odyssey, Spanish Police and Moroccan security agents targeted the criminals

One of the gang was said to be so wealthy he passed through multiple border crossings unhindered while transporting both women and chil-

When police investigations were completed, seven Nigerians, including two women, were arrested in Spain.

They are thought to be responsible for trafficking at least 39 women

forced into sex work for at least 12 hours a day. They were made to eat and sleep together in unhygienic conditions and even forced to take on additional work as cleaners and cooks to bring in extra money.

While the Spain-based gang was being disrupted, Moroccan security agents swooped on a property in Tangiers where the women were detained before being smuggled into Spain.

ALMERIA police have arrested two men accused of violently robbing a married couple on their front

The victims were accosted by two masked individuals as they attempted to enter their home, hitting the woman in the face with the butt of a gun and stabbing her partner in the left thigh.

Two shots were also fired before the assailants made off in the couple's high-end car.

Exports unaffected

THE latest data from the Andalucian Regional Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Rural Development confirms that exports of fruit and vegetables to the UK have not been adversely affected by the Brexit bombshell.

According to the ministry, sales increased by 12 per cent between July and November 2016 compared to the same period in 2015.

More than 129,000 tonnes of produce with an estimated value of €154 million was exported to the UK, of which 87,000 tonnes was produced in Almeria's infamous 'Sea of Plastic.'

Working to protect

GENDER violence victims in Carboneras are to be better protected as the Local Police force is to join the VioGen network.

The agreement was made at the latest local security meeting, attended by local authorities and government delegate for Almeria Andres Garcia Lorca. Now the Secretary of State Security for the Ministry of the Interior will grant access to the integral gender violence case monitoring network to

Flying bullit

LOCAL POLICE in Almeria City have detained a 17-year-old boy after he crashed the car he was driving into a police patrol vehicle following a pursuit.

The chase began when police reported that a car was behaving suspiciously on Calle Instincion de Los Molinos, the driver putting his foot down as the officers approached.

He proceeded to hightail it towards the El Puche neighbourhood, sometimes drifting into the opposite lane.

As the two vehicles careered onto Avenida Mare Nostrum, the fugitive span his car around to face his pursuers before driving headlong towards them and slamming into their left wing.

The police car was rendered useless, and the runaway once again attempted to escape at high speed, but lost control and crashed into a lamp post.

The two occupants then fled on foot, with one still being at large as the Euro Weekly News went to press.

Jealous and violent attack

A RUSSIAN woman who the Local Police were sent out to help in Almeria City refused to report her other half even though he had allegedly dragged her down the street by her hair.

The police force dispatched a patrol to Calle Poeta Paco Aquino in the city centre after receiving a call from a man who said he had had to step in to stop an attack.

Upon their arrival the officers found the man accompanying a 34-year-old Russian woman. She claimed that her jealous partner had grabbed her hair, pushed her over and dragged her along the pavement because he wanted to see her mobile phone and the contents of her

Although she insisted she did not require medical assistance and did not want to report her 52-year-old Spanish boyfriend, officers explained that protocols meant she had to accompany them to the station and give a statement.

Armed forces

MORE than 2,000 Spanish military personnel are deployed on missions in 15 foreign countries.

Most are soldiers in the Army with the biggest contingent serving in the Lebanon with the UN's blue helmet force. Spain contributes nearly 500 troops to the fight against Daesh where they are deployed with the Iraqi Army.

Fourteen soldiers are attached to the UN mission in Colombia as peace observers while in Afghanistan, Spain has 20 personnel based in the capital, Kabul. More than 140 officers and men are serving in the Indian Ocean with the EU's anti-piracy initiative.

Weapons held

FIFTY-EIGHT people have been arrested in a major Spanish policeled crackdown on illegal weapons coming out of the Balkans. Seventeen police forces across Europe were involved, including agents from the US. The joint operation to combat arms trafficking was coordinated from Europol's control centre in The Hague.



Postcard from **SALAMANCA**



HOME to the oldest university in Spain, Salamanca is an ancient Celtic city in the community of Castile and Leon. It was once besieged by Hannibal, he of the Alps and elephants fame.

During the Spanish Civil War it was a nationalist stronghold, Franco being named Generalissimo while in the city. It is also the site of an unusual festival day on February 5 when women, symbolically at least in years gone by, would take over the reins of power in civic venues including the town hall.

While this was going on they were supposed to leave their men at home doing the housework. Nowadays they're more likely to take to the streets for a party with dancing and music.

The festival is based on St Agatha, regarded as the protector of women, who was persecuted for her Christian faith. The women are consequently known as Aguedas. Her refusal to accept the romantic entreaties of a Roman official led to her death in a Roman prison.

First 3D printed bridge

A PARK in Madrid has made history with the installation of the world's first bridge constructed using a 3D

The 40ft concrete structure represents the first time such technology has been utilised on such a scale. Because 3D printers do not need any casts or moulds, the costs of making the bridge were kept to a minimum.

The design team behind the project said the structure "reflected the complexities of nature's forms" and its design meant waste had been kept to a minimum "by recycling the raw material during manufacture.'

The bridge is also being hailed as a first by those who believe a whole range of structures could now be manufactured much more cheaply using the same technique.

Sea rescue

TWELVE fishermen were rescued when their vessel sank off the northern coast of Spain. All the men were suffering from hypothermia but were otherwise uninjured when they were plucked from the sea. Seven of the crew were taken to a hospital in Asturias and the other five to a hospital in Galicia. Three helicopters and three lifeboats were launched after distress signals were received.

Defiant trio

THREE former members of the Catalan government, including its ex-president Artur Mas, say they have nothing to apologise for over their symbolic independence vote three years ago.

They are accused of criminal disobedience and breach of trust. The court trying them could impose bans from public office of 10 years if convicted. Less than half of those eligible to vote actually

Smash-andgrab over

POLICE have smashed another gang using explosives to blow up cash machines. At least 23 people, most of them from Chile, were arrested over several months but details are only now being released.

The gang were involved in numerous crimes including burglary, identity theft, vehicle theft and the use of gas and explosives to blast open cash machines in Catalonia, Valencia and Madrid. In one robbery at a cash machine nails were thrown across roads to hinder the chances of police following them.

Jail's safety concerns

TRADE unions have expressed their concern for the safety of wardens at Almeria's El Acebuche jail after one was injured while trying to break up a fight earlier this week.

The warden entered a cell to separate two fighting inmates and took one outside to calm him down but ended up receiving blows and being taken to hospital for treat-

Although in this case the warden's injuries were not life-threatening, unions fear the worst as they have noted a sharp increase in violent situations over the last

"This increase in attacks on prison staff is the consequence of insufficient personnel at the centre which has worsened over recent years as those who leave are not replaced," Jose Hernandez, head of the Penitentiary Institutions section at CSIF trades union complained.

CSIF has therefore demanded a specific aggression protocol is drawn up for workers at El Acebuche and hopes "the competent administrations will take note of what has happened and take urgent measures to guarantee workers' safety and correct functioning of the prison."

Mother did not prostitute daughter

THE Prosecution Office in Almeria has confirmed that a 13-year-old girl, suspected of having been forced into sexual work by her mother, has not in fact been working as a prostitute.

However, she was performing domestic work in exchange for cash which she used to buy spirits and tobacco for her alcoholic parent, who would violently throw her out of the house if she returned empty-handed.

The mother, who is of Russian nationality, is now under investigation for neglect and mistreatment of her daughter and nine-year-old son.

A 59-year-old man with previous

sexual abuse convictions did hire the girl to work in his house but she refused his advances

The owner of a local bakery where she worked for two or three euros per day has also been arrested for employ-

The two children remain in the care of a specialised protection centre.

Abusive father faces prison

THE Public Prosecutor's office in Almeria will be requesting almost 19 years in jail for a man accused of domestic violence, causing injuries and sexually abusing his three children.

The defendant has a previous record for injuring one of his sons and for violent behaviour towards his wife, the prosecutor's provisional conclusions report.

The father, over a number of years, dished out disproportionate punishments for 'ridiculous alleged misdemeanours' and the children's mother's fear of her aggressive partner stopped her from being able to do anything about it, the prosecutor insists.

The children, all under 18, were found by the Legal Medicine Institute to require psychological treatment and two of them suffer from anxiety and depression.

Altogether the prosecutor has requested 18 years and 10 months in jail, loss of custody and a restraining order banning him from going within 200 metres of the children or contacting them for 31 years plus €15,000 in damages for the young-

Uncertainty of decontamination

THE Spanish government has admitted it "cannot know" whether Donald Trump and his new government will uphold the agreement regarding clearing contamination from Palomares.

MP Eva Garcia Sempere announced that she had queried the matter and the central government had responded that "currently there is no way of knowing whether the new US government will affect the planned decontamination." It did, however, stress that relations between the two countries are solid and that conversations will continue with a view to meeting the goal of solving the Palomares problem.

The two countries reached an agreement in 2015 to clear the area still affected by radioactive material from bombs dropped when two US air force planes collided above the province in 1966.



IN just 18 months, her council team has managed to pay off 61.42 per cent of the debts left behind by the previous council, Garrucha Mayor Maria Lopez has announced.

The PSOE socialist mayor claimed that the previous Partido Popular council had run up more than €1 million in debts by the time she took over the town hall on June 1, 2015.

He had become annoyed with his parents the night before and, after breaking into his piggy bank, sneaked out of school that morning and caught a bus to the provincial capital. Once in the city he had started to wander the streets but got lost, the boy told officers.

After contacting the child's parents through his school, his father rushed to the station to collect him and said he was surprised as the boy was not problematic and there had never been any trouble before

Greenpeace has no choice but to take the matter to the criminal courts to have the illegal hotel demolished," Greenpeace lawyer Jose Manuel Marraco said.

Fresh scrutiny for taxpayers in Spain

The Spanish tax office has announced new measures to crack down on tax fraud. Their tax inspections plan for 2017 revealed new IT tools and processes that will make it much easier to investigate the tax affairs of wealthy individuals.

More access to information

Now, the tax office (Agencia Tributaria or Hacienda) will be able to analyse and cross-reference data from a wide range of sources to detect possible tax fraud. This includes personal income and wealth tax returns, as well as Modelo 720 declarations, etc.

Tax authorities are already benefiting from the new 'automatic exchange of information' regime, with Spain being one of over 100 countries that will share information on taxpayers' assets and income. Financial institutions reporting data across countries include banks, custodians, investment funds, certain insurance companies, trusts and foundations.

Information being shared includes personal data such as your name and address, country of tax residence and identification number. Information about your accounts includes investment income you earned over the year, including interest, dividends, income from certain insurance contracts and annuities. Account balances are also reported, as are gross proceeds from the sale of financial assets.

With all this information combined, the new Hacienda system will be capable of estimating the total wealth of each taxpayer in Spain.

Identifying 'fake' residency

One focus for the Hacienda will be identifying those who actually live in Spain but do not declare their income and assets here, usually claiming residency in a low taxation territory.

The tax office can now collect information from utility providers, as well as paperwork for vehicles and property ownership, to establish where individuals are effectively living. For example, they can check electricity bills to confirm whether a property is being lived in long enough to trigger residency. They can also identify if people have an income arising from letting out property without declaring it.

It is likely that they will look closely at those who have declared themselves resident in lower taxation territories like Gibraltar, Andorra and Portugal. This could also catch out expatriates who declare themselves

UK residents without realising they are actually tax resident in Spain.

Why the crackdown?

By penalising tax fraud, the Spanish government can recoup revenue to bring down budget deficits. Wealthy individuals are the latest target because the Hacienda sees them as more likely to use aggressive tax planning.

According to Agencia Tributaria chief, Santiago Menéndez, in the last five years, they collected €400 million from tax inspections of individuals with wealth over €10 million.

A RECENT incident which saw hundreds of people temporarily evacuated from their homes in El Patio in Almeria City's Pescaderia district has served to highlight the abandoned state of the entire area.

PSOE socialist party councillor at City Hall Manuel Vallejo has complained of an "unbearable lack of cleaning and maintenance which the Partido Popular is subjecting Pescaderia to, especially in the Camino Viejo area where rubbish of all types is piling up and posing a

PSOE councillors held a meeting with a number of neighbours' association representatives, who took them on a tour to see the worst areas, a letter has been sent to the mayor demanding something be done urgently.

Local residents say they cannot believe that the council has spent almost one million euros on cleaning up the nearby access areas to the city while ignoring the inside of the district. Roads are in such a bad state that, they say, in some areas potholes are so big they are accumulating piles of rubbish inside.

Not only that, Vallejo said, but this clear-up job involved demolition of warehouses which caused the earth to move and cracks have appeared in local homes. "The inhabitants are worried because this could be dangerous and when it rains their walls leak," the councillor said.

Regarding El Patio itself, Vallejo has asked the council to explain what it is going to do about the state of the complex to guarantee safety as the residents are clearly in no position to cover the costs of rehabilitation of the build-

Cops go undercover





Looking to the future



WETLANDS IN PERIL: The record number of overwintering birds masks a grim

Record wintering birds, despite wetlands suffering

By Matt Ford

RECORD numbers of wetland birds are overwintering in Andalucia, with close to a million recorded during the 2016 annual census.

This represents an increase of 115,000 over the previous record, set in 2014.

Around 645,000 of the birds counted during the census, which included 230 wetland sites, were in Doñana National Park, which straddles parts of Huelva and Sevilla provinces and is the largest wetland in southern Spain.

Regional Environmental councillor, Jose Fiscal, said: "This increase is due in particular to the abundant rainfall that hit the Atlantic coast during autumn, which had led to excellent flooding in Donaña's natural marshland."

The councillor was speaking at a release of endangered species at the artificial Cañada de los Pajeros reserve in Puebla del Rio, Sevilla, in order to commemorate World Wetlands Day (WWD).

However, the positive news regarding the number of birds present in the region came as a scathing WWD report by SEO/Birdlife International concluded that Doñana, the Ebro Delta and the Albufera

de Valencia, Spain's three most important wetlands, are on the verge of environmental collapse.

The Executive Director of the organisation, Asuncion Ruiz, explained how wetlands in Spain, a country that "has the potential to become the desert of Europe," are reaching "a point of no return that will not only endanger nature, but also society.'


WWD commemorates the signing of the Ramsar International Convention on Wetlands in 1971.

However, Ruiz said that Spain "should drop its bragging over its status as the country with the third largest number of Ramsar sites," because "its poor conservation standards may lead to its expulsion."

She added that the chronic situation in Doñana, the Ebro and Valencia has forced her organisation to open an official investigation "to assess whether Spain meets the requirements to remain in the catalogue."

Wetlands are among the most fragile ecosystems on the planet, with around 60 per cent having disappeared during the 20th century, 87 per cent since the year 1700.

In Spain, the conservation status of an estimated 80 per cent of freshwater habitats fails to meet standards, with decades of pollution, overexploitation and mismanagement having taken their toll.

BAD timing of new by-laws will mean volunteers who feed strav cats in Almeria City will face fines, the opposition has complained.

PSOE socialist representative at City Hall Ines Plaza has explained that the cleaning by-law, the first due to come into effect, will forbid feeding of animals on the public street. Although a new domestic animal by-law also due to come into effect in the near future will specify feeding points where authorised people will be allowed to care for strays, in the meantime they will be breaking the law, Plaza said.

This has led to more than 300 complaints being lodged with the council by animal

Plaza has also highlighted the low amount set aside in this year's budgets, €5,000, for the launch of a capture, sterilise and release programme to keep stray numbers under control. "Malaga, where the system works perfectly, spends four times the amount." the opposition councillor said.

"The PP council should really thank the volunteers for the work they do and the money of their own they spend to control cat colonies in Almeria, which have benefits for the community as the felines keep rodent and insect numbers down." Plaza

Brexit negotiations could destabilise EU

BREXIT PAGE

NOT known to be a great fan of Britain, the President of the European Commission Jean-Claude Juncker has warned in a radio interview that the British are clever enough to make different promises to different countries over Brexit.

Rather than admit that individual member states within the European Union will do all that they can to secure a deal that suits them

best, he has decided to accuse Britain of trying to manipulate those members by saying different things to different states.

He seems to have overlooked the number of cities who are vying to take over as headquarters of the European Medical Agency which is currently based in London and which will have to remove itself once Brexit is completed.

Denmark, Germany, Ireland, Spain and Sweden have all declared that they wish to be considered as the new home of that agency and the European Banking Agency will also be looking for a new home in two years time.

Mr Juncker appears to think that Britain's future negotiations are likely to destabilise the European Union as members agree different deals, even though he insists that no deals should be done until after Britain has left.

He has also indicated however that he does intend to stand for re-election as president in

Brexit voting is still on course in the Commons

HAVING successfully sailed through the House of Commons with majority approval of the White Paper on triggering Article 50 to allow Britain to leave the European Union, Prime Minister Theresa May must be pleased with the ease of the vote.

With only Kenneth Clarke deviating from the Tory benches by voting against as he indicated at a very early stage, it was the Labour front bench which saw yet more unrest with five members of the Shadow Cabinet resigning as they would not bow down to a three line whip instructing them to vote in favour.

The resignations gave rise to yet another round of 'Corbyn stepping down' rumours

which have been hurriedly denied and even the absence of staunch supporter Diane Abbott with a sudden migraine on the first round of voting caused a flurry of speculation, although she did turn up and follow the party line at the second vote.

Reports suggest however that when Brexit Secretary David Davies went to kiss her after congratulating her on the vote, she was horrified and expressed this with an expletive. He has since apologised to her for his initial lighthearted action.

Despite the government's statement it wanted to see the situation of expats in the UK and abroad resolved early, one amendment which covered this position was

voted down which has caused some upset with British nationals living within the EU. All attempts at adding clauses were easily beaten but things may not be so tranquil when the Bill reaches the House of Lords where the government does not have a majority.

Whilst it is likely to pass in due course, any amendments agreed by the House would have to be referred back to the Commons on March 7 and these amendments could 'ping pong' backwards and forwards for some time

Despite all this, it is still expected that the government will be able to trigger Article 50 by the planned

ALTHOUGH province has a very active agricultural export sector, local farmers are clearly not too keen on boats as Almeria Port imported more fruit and veg than it exported last year.

A new report from the state port authority, Puertos del Estado, revealed that in 2016 the city port received 13,950 tonnes of produce, mainly from Morocco, but sent out just 13.327 tonnes, most of which were headed for Algeria.

Although in the past grapes and oranges were exported from Almeria by sea, since the greenhouse boom of the 1970s farmers have appeared to place more trust in lorries and roads to transport their ware.

Leo the gets rea Oklah

LEO THE LION has had his surgery on Merseyside and the doctors are pleased. They have done

their part, taking out the two tumours which were growing inside the four-year-old's brain and would have killed him. And after just two days in recovery he was being discharged. For his family especially, and his hundreds of well-wishers and supporters, it was the news everyone had been waiting for. It means the first hurdle has been crossed. Leo must now recover his strength and continue to get better ready for his date with a plane that will take him stateside.

That date is set for February

23 when Leo and mum Karen will fly to Okla-

Before that, Leo was being reunited with his older sister, Sofia, who had to stay in Spain while he was undergoing his treatment at Alder Hev.

The first hurdle has been crossed for Leo.

When the family arrived in the UK, they left their home with fundraising still going at break neck speed.

Hundreds of events, large and small, contributed to a rising total that was climbing faster and faster towards the magic €175,000. Eventually an anonymous donor stepped in to help, instantly taking the financial strain off the family and leaving them to concentrate

Everyone has their theories about who it could be and certainly a lot of famously charitable names were bandied about. But the truth is we don't know. Maybe it's better that way, but Leo's fight against such massive odds, and his smiling face no matter what the cost, had moved thousands of people to donate towards his cause.

In a touching post on social media, Leo's mum Karen said: "Dad, I promise I will continue to do everything in my power to make sure Leo wins this battle. Cancer already took your life so quickly on Christmas Eve. We all miss you so much and our family has lost our rock... I haven't even had time to mourn you yet."

She went on to say, "But I know you will be protecting and looking after him as he takes the next step on this horrendous journey to beat this deadly disease. Leo is going to do this for you. xxx"

When they arrived on Merseyside and a stay at the renowned Alder Hey Children's Hospital, it was clear Leo would need a new round of tests.

An MRI scan gave the surgeons their best view of their twin foes and crucially whether Leo's medical condition had deteriorated.

The extraordinary MRI technology revealed Leo's operation could go ahead but it also showed something new and deeper down that cannot be removed. The most likely option is that it's a new developing tumour, but this time it cannot be cut out.

Instead, Leo must recover his strength so the US-based experts can join in the battle to help him.


In Oklahoma Leo will undergo proton therapy treatment. It offers the chance to bombard the post-operative tumour sites with a fine proton beam.

This will limit as much as possible, any damage to the surrounding tissue in Leo's young brain.

With proton beam therapy he could recover a lot of the faculties he has lost. That would not be possible with conventional radiation.

When the treatment gets underway, under the guidance of Dr Andrew Chang at Pro-Cure in Oklahoma City, the decision will then be made about how to the hea treat the newest mass in Leo's brain.

His family and the rest of us have no alternative but to hope and pray that it responds to the treatment. Leo would then be free, at last, of the tumours that grow as a result of his very rare childhood cancer.



THERE are probably two children's hospitals which attract most attention in the UK. One, of course, is Great Ormond Street, probably because of its location in London, but the other is Alder Hey on Merseyside. Founded during the First World War, it is a centre of excellence for

the treatment of children with cancer.

It is also Europe's first children's hospital built in a park. Construction of the new hospital, which has been going on since 2013, is still underway in some areas. Its managers insist that parts of the building were 'designed through the eyes of a child.'

signed through the eyes of a child.'

One of the hallmarks of the design has been the construction of rooms with single beds with sufficient space for parents to sleep there if required. The aim, say its designers, is to give every child who comes for treatment, a space where they can play and relax. Besides its emphasis on new technology, the hospital is designed to be one of the most environmentally friendly units of its type in the world.

Cohabitants' pension benefits

OFTEN criticised for causing unnecessary bureaucracy and impinging on the British parliament's right to govern the country, the European convention on human rights could help a large number of people who are in longterm partnerships.

Prior to his death he had worked for Translink, a company responsible for public transport in Northern Ireland for 15 years and as he had not specifically named Ms Brewster as a cohabiting partner in the pension scheme of which he was a member, she was denied the right to receive any pension following his death.

Relying on a clause within the convention on human rights, her lawyers argued that it was discrimination and that she should have been paid the pension as if she had been named and the five Supreme Court judges agreed with this argument.

As much of UK law is based on precedence shaped by court opinion, this effectively means that those who cohabit should receive the same treatment as those who are married as far as pension rights are concerned.

Professional advice

IN order to try to persuade more people to obtain professional advice on their pension savings, the British government has decided that any saver can take up to £1,500 (€1,750) from their pension pots tax free to pay for professional advice.

The Pension Advice Allowance will be available from April of this year and those who take advantage of it, regardless of their age may use £500 (€585) on three separate occasions to pay for independent professional advice and those in the highest tax bracket will save £600 (€700) if they use the whole allowance.

BUDGET airline Ryanair has announced that the last three months trading saw an increase in passengers, thanks in part to a fall in airfares and a reduction in profits to €95

Despite the fact that it is often accused of predatory pricing, charging for everything (including a fictitious claim that it would make people pay to use the toilet) it revealed that the average single fare paid by passengers was just €33 which is why its planes flew at 95 per cent capacity.

"Ryanair responded to this

weaker environment by continuing to improve our 'Always Getting Better' (AGB) customer experience, cutting costs, and stimulating demand through lower fares which has seen load factors jump to record levels."

Containers the new commercial fashion

AS it becomes more expensive to obtain quality retail or office space for start-up businesses in particular, it is becoming more and more attractive for London 'hipsters' to move into container

Entrepreneurs are obtaining plots of land, purchasing numbers of containers which range in price from £1,000 (€1,150) to £2,500 (€2,900) depending on condition, renovating them, obtaining planning permission and adding mains utilities.

Although more expensive than a permanent market, the containers are secure and protect from adverse weather.

Thus in a very short period of time and at relatively low cost a brand new specialist food quarter, light industrial estate or office complex can be opened and will quickly attract tenants willing to pay up to £20,000 (€23,000) per annum which is cheaper than almost any high street shop in a ma-

Admittedly the containers are more expensive than a permanent market stall, but they are secure and protected from adverse weather and in most cases have shared dining areas so size is not a

In the UK, London has the largest number of these parks but the concept is expanding with similar sites in University cities such as Bristol opening up and although storage is probably the most difficult problem to deal with, these companies which tend to attract young and relatively affluent clients create a new and trendy area to visit.

For those selling products or food, the most im-

portant thing is footfall and owners and tenants work together to present music and artistic events in order to attract more people to their premises.

The concept has taken off in the USA and parts of Europe but is particularly strong in Christchurch New Zealand following the devastating 2011 earthquake and harks back to the prefabs following the Second World War.

HBOS fraud will lead to compensation

WHEN complaints were made to the board of HBOS (Halifax Bank of Scotland) and Lloyds Banking Group after it took over HBOS about fraudulent activities by certain employees which ruined customers' lives, the complaints were rejected.

Now however, as six people including two senior former HBOS employees have been jailed for the scam which the banks denied, Lloyds Bank has finally admitted some liability and is to offer compensation.

It is estimated at least £28 million (€33 million) was made in loans which were never repaid and the HBOS officials involved received a percentage of not only these loans, but the overall value of all money fraudulently extracted from the bank and the companies involved.

Now the Lloyds Banking Group has confirmed it will appoint an independent consultant to review compensation for those who it believes were affected.

A family affair

MELANIA TRUMP, the new First Lady has decided to reopen a legal case against the Daily Mail, saying it cost her a 'once-in-a-lifetime opportunity' to profit from her brand because of the position she finds herself in.

She is now demanding compensation of \$150 million (€140 million) from the paper which accused her of being an 'escort' and then retracted the statement.

Her husband Donald has not yet joined in on this compliant but has tweeted expressing his dissatisfaction at clothing outlet Nordstrom for dropping his daughter Ivanka's fashion line commenting "Ivanka has been treated so unfairly.'

This is the fifth company to drop her line saying that there was insufficient demand, but opponents of the President have suggested that he is abusing his position by commenting.

Want to be young again?



I was in Chelmsford in the UK and stopped to look in the window of a branch of Next and saw a shirt I fancied but there were steps up to door. I asked if they had a ramp and they said no.

They also informed me that the menswear department was on the first floor and they did not have a lift. I didn't even think that was allowed these days but obviously I was mistak-

en. It's just as bad here in Spain with a lot of the smaller stores being inaccessible. In this day and age it should be mandatory that every store, big or small, must have disabled access.

I had to phone my insurance company the other day. Now, I have unlimited calls and unlimited messages included in my tariff but I wanted to check that the free phone numbers offered are not free if dialled on your mobile phone. This is strange as all my calls are free except the free phone ones which I have to pay for. So now I know. How weird is that?

Anyway, remember I wrote about using up all my data allowance on my phone? They charged me two euros for extra data and another three euros for a deal they offered me. They said they would refund the two euros but I didn't get it. So, whilst I was on the phone the operator asked if there was anything else she could help me with. Bad move!

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Aging can seriously affect driving skills

AS part of the series, we answer some common driving questions and keep you updated on the latest driving and road news kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



DRIVE SAFELY: Medical check-ups and eye tests can ensure you keep your licence.

AS we all get older, our body gets older and all too often without us realising that gradual changes have been made including reduced vision, limited mobility, tremors and muscle spasms. All of these are natural age-related signs the body is slowing down, but they can affect the way you drive and have fatal consequences when mixed with road accidents.

In the event of being involved in an accident, the Guardia Civil traffic department has the authority to withdraw your licence at the roadside if they feel your health and status is a contributing factor in the accident. As a result, you may need to have medical proof to resolve the issue

and regain your licence.

In 2015, in the Ourense area of Spain, some 45 drivers had their licences withdrawn that year on suspicion of being unfit to drive on medical grounds. Most of those drivers have given up driving altogether, whilst others have taken to obtaining a certificate to prove they are able to drive by carrying out a fitness course and test. Three of those drivers failed.

During your medical check ups with the doctor or optician, it is vital that you mention that you are a driver so they can monitor your ability and the consequences of any treatments and conditions to ensure you remain fit to drive.

What does 'second call' mean?

At the last AGM of our Community, it was announced that this AGM was held on the "second call". This term appeared in the notice for the meeting as well. So, we waited a few minutes and the President

announced the meeting would now start on the second call. I think it has something to do with how many people attend the meeting.

G M (Costa del Sol)

Assuming only a few staunch members of your Community attended the AGM in person, and a few others gave their proxy vote to some of the people who attended, this is the usual pattern for Community meetings. If there are 40 members, maybe only



10 of them present. This means you can never get a majority vote of the total members and their participatory shares.

The law says that, in a meeting held on the 'second call,' a majority vote of those members and shares present at the meeting, either in person or by proxy, will suffice to make Community decisions that are legally valid. Absent members have 30 days to protest.



Hydrocarbon fuels

WE are told that man's use of hydrocarbon fuels will cause climate catastrophes, with more droughts, heatwaves, bush fires, floods, blizzards, snow storms, typhoons, etc.

Why then would governments compound these claimed risks by pushing weather-dependent energy like wind, solar, hydro or tidal power?

During heatwaves on sultry summer afternoons, wind power fails when our cold rooms, fridges and air-conditioners need it most. Overheating turbines start bushfires. On cold still winter nights, wind and solar will produce zero power when all the trains, heaters, TV sets and coffee machines are sucking energy.

In a gale, turbines switch off to avoid damage; in still air they sit idle; in a snow storm they consume power to prevent icing up; and in a tsunami, offshore wind turbines and tidal generators are destroyed.

Solar panels shut down every night; their output varies even when the sun shines; they are blotted out by snow, clouds or dust; and are smashed by hail stones.

So if the alarmists are right, and if we are faced with wild weather for any reason, we can't trust weather-dependent energy. Stick to reliable hydrocarbons coal, oil and gas, and for dire emergencies diesel. They will produce electricity, weather-or-not.

Claims male contraceptive jab works for two years

IS it time for men to step up in the fight against unwanted pregnancies? Previously, condoms or a vasectomy were the only option open for men, but now a new jab claims it has a 100 per cent success rate in preventing getting a woman pregnant.

The male contraceptive jab is claimed

to be more effective than the Pill as it blocks sperm from leaving the body and works for two years.

Scientists have previously invented a jab using hormones that disrupted the sperm production, but it was found to cause side effects such as depression and

muscle pain. This new injection is hormone free and during trials, was 100 per cent successful in monkeys. It is expected to be trialled in men as early as next year.

The jab works by injecting a gel into the tube which transports sperm from the testicles to the urethra, to block it.

The lowdown on high blood pressure



| SPECIALIST: Doctor Luis Perez Belmonte.

THIS week the doctor has given us the lowdown on what having high blood pressure really means and what can be done about it.

- What are normal blood pressure levels and when can it be considered to be high?

This varies depending on many important factors. In general terms, blood pressure readings of under 130-140 / 70-80 mmHg can be considered normal, but a patient's age and other illnesses or medical conditions must be taken into account to evaluate each individual case.

- What does having high blood pressure mean exactly?

It refers to the pressure of the blood running through our arteries being higher than normal due to a series of fac-

- What tends to cause it?

Blood pressure levels are influenced by lots of different factors. As we age the walls of our arteries tend to become more rigid and this favours atheroma (damage and cholesterol build-up).

The main cardiovascular risk factors such as obesity, eating too much salt, lack of physical exercise, diabetes, etc are also elements which generally encourage high blood pressure.

- How is it treated, with medication?

Medication is one of the pillars of treatment of high blood pressure. There are many different groups of drugs which help get blood pressure readings under control in different ways.

- Can I get it down with exercise?

Lifestyle and dietary measures are vital. A balanced diet which is low in salt, daily physical exercise, not smoking, losing weight and controlling other cardiovascular risk factors is very important for treating high blood pressure.

- What risks could I be facing if I ignore it?

Failing to get high blood pressure under control can have very serious effects and the heart, kidneys, brain, etc can all be affected, sometimes even leading to death. Therefore, all patients should be evaluated and treated by specialists in Internal Medi-

A grape a day keeps dementia away...

A HANDFUL of grapes twice a day could help boost memory and ward off the onset of Alzheimer's

A study was carried out with people who were suffering from early cognitive decline over six months. One group was given whole grape powder, the equivalent of two portions, every day, with the other group given a placebo.

Their cognitive ability was measured at the beginning of the experiment and at the end and it was found that grapes did help to boost memory. PET scans were also used to assess changes in metabolism.

It is believed that the compounds found in grapes help to maintain levels of a chemical in the brain that is vital to maintaining its health. It is also thought they promote blood flow and when the flow is lacking it can lead to dementia.

However, before you rush off to the supermarket to stock up on grapes, it is worth noting that the research was funded by grape-growers and the California Table Grape Commission in

Calls for FGM to be included in new domestic violence law

WITH more than 17,000 girls in Spain at risk of Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) the Spanish government is proposing including FGM in its gender violence legislation.

On World Day of Zero Tolerance Against Female Genital Mutilation, Secretary of State for Equality, Mario Garcés, addressed more than 5,000 professionals from all areas working to prevent it. Garces said it was "a crucial moment" because it coincides with the State negotiation against gender violence, in which there are calls to have a section in the new Domestic Violence Law on FGM, in a bid to protect young girls who are at risk of being mutilated.

"It's a problem of justice, human rights and health," stressed Garces, who recalled that, in Europe, more than half a million women and girls are at risk of being mutilated.

To mark the World Day of Zero Tolerance, several UN organisations are calling for greater actions against FGM saying that around 200 million women have undergone total or partial excision of their external genitalia.

Whilst more common in countries such as Burkina Faso, Kenya, Liberia and Egypt, it remains a widespread practice across Africa and the Middle East. Many carry it out as part of cultural traditions preparing girls to pass on to adulthood allowing to them to be eligible for marriage or to achieve a

Spaniards in America 20,000 years ago!





MORE than a month ago someone

asked me 'what was my favourite article that I've written?' Here it is full force and easily unmemorable. For years all American archaeolo-

gists theorised that America was populated via the Bering Strait, which couldn't have frozen over until 12,000-14,000 years ago. This was proven when some unique arrow heads were dug up in New Mexico (Clovis points). Therein a long lost dogma became carved in stone.

That postulate lasted more than 10 decades until further Clovis sites started emerging on the East coast and plains of the states with earlier excavation dates. WHAM-O, a 100year-old postulate should have gone out the window - but didn't. None of the learned men would accept the results until further examination and research would prove their theory.

Recently a group of historians and archaeologists reluctantly admitted these new sites did date some 5,000 years beyond accepted knowledge.


Lately sporadic rumours of further unnatural sites have appeared as distant as Monte Verde, Chile and Ca-

hokia, Illinois. Some scientists, brave enough to consider other alternatives, risk ridicule and academic rebuke. One such man is Dr Dennis Stanford from the prestigious Smithsonian Institute's Paleo-Indian division, who has been searching for clovis culture arrow points in Siberia, the accepted Bering Strait migration route. They had to be there, but weren't. Befuddled, he looked elsewhere. During his 30-year hunt discoveries by other archaeologists were revealed and likewise became enig-

Stanford goes on to say "it's very clear to me that we are looking at multiple migrations through a very long time period - of many different peoples of many different ethnic origins, that came in at different times."

Well further new discoveries have come to light from the Cactus Hill dig on the States' eastern seaboard. Stanford explained to a shocked audience in Santa Fe why he believes that Clovis people came from Europe - long before Columbus, and by boat. "They were from Iberia, not Siberia. The continent's first inhabitants may have crossed the Atlantic more than 18,000 years ago from Europe's Iberian Peninsula - the area that is now Spain, Portugal and southwestern France 'known as "Solutrean's' and they used the same elementary flints and tools of an exact nature recently unearthed in America.

Andrew Muir wrote in Newsweek "tools recently found beneath Clovisera layers at a dig in Cactus Hill, Virginia - about where European itinerants could have first landed - also resemble Solutrean artefacts."







Good Food, Good Wine and Good Friends

EGULAR readers of this column will know that last week I introduced you to one of my clients who had opened a restaurant down here over a year ago and was going through a few problems. We established that one of his problems was the pairing of his chef with a menu that he had designed, leaving the chef with no option but to serve what he was asked

I explained to the client that this was probably stunting the growth of

So last week we sat down with the chef and started to go through the menu to see where we could make savings on costs as well as getting the chef's input as to the type of food that he felt he excelled

The four-hour session was very illuminating not least for the client. For the first time he was beginning to see where the chef was coming from. While there is no problem in serving classic dishes - known nowadays as 'retro' - they are becoming exceptionally popular, but there is still room for lighter modern dishes in this health and body consciousness world.

We decided to mix the two styles. Starters such as 'Wild Mushrooms on Ciabatta with a Poached Egg and Crispy Pancetta, Tuna Tartare with Wasabi Crème Fraîche' now sit on the same menu as a 'Classic King

Prawn and Lobster Cocktail and Moules Marinière.' The client loved his classic Tourenedos Rossini, but the chef complained that if he was going to do it, it should be done with fresh foie gras and truffle, not pate and a button mushroom!! So the five star classic fillet steak dish holds pride of place as a Chef's Speciality along side the chef's own creation of 'Roast Tranche of Turbot with Fennel Croquettes, Spinach and Spring Onions with a Pernod

The menu was now starting to fall into place. The ability of the chef to embrace the owner's desire to keep some of his favourite dishes and the owner's ability to allow the chef to create dishes more in keeping with his personal style meant that dialogue and creativity were having a positive result.

With a new design of the menu itself, making it more readable and appealing, we were on our way to creating the changes that we all felt would point the restaurant in the direction that all parties were happy with.

Next we have to look at the presentation of the dishes and the costings to ensure profitability. After that, the restaurant itself will need freshening up, something we will have to do without spending too much money. But the menu and the décor must suit each other. Then we will be looking at the wine menu, staff and uniforms as well as training. It's never a quick fix, but a carefully planned redevelopment. After all we are not reinventing the wheel, just making sure that they are on tight and have sufficient air in the tyres to ensure a smooth ride!!

• THE Michelin Guide has just been released in France and has once again come under fire from those that believe that the stars awarded are not always commensurate with the food served and the prices charged. With a meal for two in three star establishments often costing between 450€ and 1,100€ food critics - as opposed to Michelin inspectors often agree that there is little difference between three and two star restaurants apart from the price.

In 2014 one such critic Meg Zimpowerful and knowledgeable. beck the highly acclaimed food blogger (Paris by Mouth) spent more than 7.000€ of her own money eating anonymously in all nine of the three star and all six of the two star restaurants in Paris!!

In one of her articles on the subject she writes "There is an obvious barrier in understanding these restaurants: the staggering, outrages almost immoral price of a meal!" She continued, "No one, I mean really no

one, who writes about food would pay for themselves in a three star restaurant and neither would their editors." So the writer put her money where her well-educated palate is and compiled her own reports at her

Her conclusion, much like many of us, I suppose, is that you can eat as well if not better in some lesser establishments. She quotes eating at Alain Ducasse's famous three star La Plaza Athenée, which cost an eye watering 1.100€ for two as 'absolutely horrible.' When she returned for an invitation meal offered to all

food writers in Paris she stated that while it was a more extravagant affair with flowing Champagne - 'it was still horrible!!'

The Michelin guide "directs people to some of the least exciting and overblown dining in the city. A three star designation indicates extravagant prices, plush surroundings, and a surfeit of staff. It does not, unfortunately, always lead you to the best food in Paris." Overall, Zimbeck concluded that while there are some "truly enjoyable" meals to experience at the three star level, very few of the dishes were markedly better than what she had experienced at Paris restaurants that cost a fifth or a 10th of the price.

I had a friend who was a Michelin inspector and we often discussed the fact that it was harder to get a Michelin star in the UK than in France and similarly Spain. I have had the 'pleasure' of eat-

ing at several one star restaurants, including some of those that we have on our door step. I have eaten at one two star restaurant, but never a three star. I may have to wait for our esteemed editor to send me off to investigate!!! I tend to agree that I have eaten better in lesser eateries that cooked with more heart and less hydrogen!

I ate many years ago in a Michelin restaurant just outside of Cherbourg and got food poisoning. We should have known we were on to a bad 'un when we went in. The restaurant was decorated in dark blue, but the sign outside said restaurant 'Maison Rouge'!!

These special suites also come with CCTV, allowing anxious cat owners to monitor their pets 24 hours a day by using a phone

There are 'lesser' rooms, which can accommodate between three and seven cats, which come with either a 'queen,' 'double' or 'single' bed and up to three feeding and cleaning sessions per day. Some have shower fa-



Gun dealers arrested

SEVEN men and one woman have been arrested in a joint Guardia Civil and National Police operation in Almeria, Alicante and Murcia for allegedly tampering with and selling illegal weapons.

The arrestees, all Spanish and aged between 20 and 50, are believed to have bought starter pistols from various gunsmiths in Murcia and converted them into real guns before selling them on to crimi-

Six homes were searched, including one in Zurgena, and officers confiscated nine firearms, 1,300 bullets, 130 marihuana plants, 11 mobile phones, a frequency inhibitor, a luxury car, tools and €12,000 in cash.

The group members face charges of illegal weapon possession and dealing, a crime against public health, faking documents, making threats and blackmail.

A SPANISH watchdog has warned that people who rent properties in the country are at risk from unregulated insurance.

Rental insurance is a system whereby landlords are protected from failed monthly payments, and tenants can avoid paving steep deposits or needing guarantees.

There are now plenty of rental insurance schemes on the market for both landlords and tenants. But the Spanish Observatory of Rental Insurance has said that some products out there won't stand up to scrutiny from insurers in court.

The tourism property battle is heating up

THE battle over tourist rentals continues in the Catalan capital, Barcelona. Shared accommodation platform Airbnb has announced that it will force users to comply with a new regulation on landlords.

Homeowners in the coastal city will now only be able to rent out one house or apartment at a time. The new rule greatly restricts previous freedoms enjoyed by landlords who could snap up multiple buildings and rent out dozens of rooms at extremely expensive rates.

The gesture is meant as something of an olive branch from Airbnb to the council, but city officials say it goes nowhere near far enough.

They want Airbnb to completely ban unregistered homes from the site. Barcelona is attempting to have all tourist-used properties pay the appropriate taxes to limit the city's tourist phenomenon.

This is the latest in a series of battles between Airbnb, which is present in thousands of cities across the world, and Barcelona's new administration, which

Airbnb has announced it will force users to comply with regu-

has pledged to protect local residents from higher rents.

Last year the American company was €600,000 for violating tourist rental rules by allow-

ing non-registered properties to be advertised online. The fine was later revoked by a Spanish court in a major embarrassment for the city council.

Gardening tasks for February

THIS month gardeners' tasks are focused mainly on preparing everything for the spring which, although it may still seem a way off, is really just round the corner.

Houseplants:

How are your houseplants coping with heating? Some of them could be suffering a little and in need of an extra dose of water or humidity. This is a good time to prune them a bit, removing dry leaves and affected areas. Watch for yellowing, this is usually a sign either of a lack of water or of a lack of iron.

Outdoor plants, bushes and trees:

It's time to plan the shape of your garden for the spring and summer. Seedbeds for annual summer plants can be prepared now. Also, remember that your current plants may still need protecting from the cold.

Lawns:

Weather permitting (minimum temperatures must be over 10°C for this) you can start planting new lawns this month. First prepare the earth, turning over and removing all weeds before starting to plant. Distribute seeds evenly then rake into the



earth. Water in the form of fine rainfall, avoid walking on the future lawn and make sure the ground drains well.

Time is running out to get rose bushes and ornamental trees pruned. As soon as there is no longer any risk of frost, it's also time to shape and prepare fruit trees.

Vegetable garden:

This month is good for planting tomatoes, peppers, courgettes, aubergines, peas, watermelons, melons, leeks, parsley, spinach, onions, carrots, radishes, lettuces, celery and beetroots.

Epileptic attacks

EPILEPSY is a problem suffered frequently by dogs under the age of five, which usually causes convulsions or epileptic attacks. Canine epilepsy has a genetic factor and there are breeds, including Beagles, St Bernards and German Shepherds which are more likely to suffer.

The first epileptic attack usually happens between the ages of six months and five years and comes completely unexpectedly in the form of convulsions, peddling movements of the legs, excessive salivation, uncontrolled urination and loss of conscience.

Although the attacks in themselves don't put a dog's life at risk, they are in danger of biting their tongues, falling or bumping into things and injuring themselves.

Knowing how to react during an attack will help you remain calm and help your dog. First, lay it down on a soft surface. Avoid high places like the sofa to avoid the risk of a fall. It's important not to try to pull your dog's tongue out as it could end up biting it. Attacks usually last two minutes at the most. When over, let the dog rest in a quiet place as they are usually tired and confused after an attack.

Discovering Sierra Espuña


SPAIN, probably better known for its long beaches packed with sunloungers and allinclusive holidays, has much more to offer and you only have to travel inland a few kilometres to get a real feel for nature and tranquillity.

One such area is the municipality of Alhama de Murcia where you will find the Sierra Espuña Regional Park which is surrounded by small villages such as Gebas and El Berro, both situated alongside the hills that make the nature reserve

Gebas, which has a population of around 20 full-time residents, is surrounded by gullies, canyons and ravines, giving it a spectacular look not dissimilar to a lunar landscape, it also has forested areas with formations of grasses and pine trees, a magnificent contrast offering stunning views

El Berro, just a few kilometres away from Gebas is again a small village, although slightly larger than Gebas with approximately 100 residents. It has cafes, restaurants, and a bakery.

The stunning area caters for all types of visitors, with hotels and campsites nearby offering activities that include rock climb-




protected in 1992 and has also been classified as a Special Protection Area for Birds (SPA) as well as a Site of Community Importance (SCI).

The many pine trees were famously planted, in almost a regimented fashion, by the Spanish engineer Ricardo Codorniú

with the aim of helping the landscape which suffered from landslides and erosion in the latter part of the 19th and early 20th century.

The fauna in the area is rich and varied, it's not hard to find squirrels, mouflons (wild sheep), wild boars or golden eagles, although in 2015 the authorities had to organise a cull of the wild, goat looking, sheep whose population had expanded. Of the 1400 only 300 were left.

May's allergy to leather



TOP GEAR and Grand Tour star James May is selling his classic Rolls-Royce after discovering that he's allergic to its leather seats. May admitted that his 1972 Corniche had made him itchy after a spin for years, forcing him to conclude his drive with a 'very thorough' shower.

The 54-year-old even claimed that he had to boil his clothes afterwards and has evidently decided that enough is enough. The Corniche will be auctioned off on March 19 by Bonhams at the Goodwood Member's Meeting.

Bidding for the model, which has a 6.75 litre V8 engine and can reach 120mph, is expected to begin at around £20,000 (€23,471). But in good nick, with fewer than 10,000 miles on the clock, and a famous owner, it could fetch closer to £50,000 (€58,677)

May has previously described the Corniche as 'supremely comfortable and quintessentially British.' He bought his in 2007 after decades of infatuation with the classic model. He drove it in a few Top Gear episodes and claims it sailed through 10 MOTs.

Parking vigilantes

PEOPLE who get irate when they see illegally-parked cars can now make a tidy profit from their rage. A new app for smart phones will offer nosy neighbours £10 every time they send a photo of an illegallyparked car to the UK Car Park Management (CPM).

Anyone who sends in photos will remain anonymous. The CPM will use the licence number to identify the culprit, fine them £60 and then give the users a tenner for the tip-off.

Motorists caught by the trap will be none the wiser, assuming they had the bad luck of being seen by an official. The CPM believes the scheme is an effective way to protect land owners and other drivers against selfish road users.

However, the RAC thinks offering the public financial incentives to shop offenders could lead to even more distrust in the authorities.

Prestige

DS is part of the giant Citroen group but is a stand-alone brand, the Citroen name not appearing on the cars at all. The smallest car in the chic and sporty DS range is the DS3, available as a three-door hatchback and in cabriolet form.

As a hatchback it is up against Mini, Audi A1 and other small cars in a sector where eye-catching styling is important.

DS3 also comes with a vast range of personalisation options which can give the cars a very individual look and ensure they stand out. Prices start at €16,910 euros (£14,395) with

petrol and diesel versions available. My test model was a Prestige Blue, with a 118 hp 1.6 litre diesel engine which provides sporty performance - 0-100 kph in 9.3 seconds - yet outstanding fuel economy, 27.7 kpl (78.5 mpg).

The DS3 is based on the Citroen C3 supermini, but with retuned suspension to give a more sporty driving feel. It has excellent handling characteristics, and is grippy and composed, though the overall ride quality is on the firm side.

There is good steering feed-

back with assured cornering and in town, the car feels very



DS3 is quite distinctive in the hatch sector, displaying lots of clues to its sporty nature - sleek shape, twin exhausts, big 17inch alloy wheels, rear spoiler and quirky DS badges. Inside, the car is roomy in the front though rear accommodation is a little cramped. The boot is a decent size at 285 litres.

Equipment on the Prestige test model, priced at €23,253 (£19,795), includes gearshift indicator, tyre pressure monitor, cruise control and speed limiter, DAB Radio/CD/USB, front and rear parking sensors, sports seats and sat-nay with seveninch touch screen.

The cabin is smartly designed and well laid out.

Keenly priced in its sector and with more exclusive styling than most rivals, the DS3 may be a relative newcomer but it has certainly made its mark.

Alexa behind the wheel

VOICE control systems have landed in Europe after the latest technological wave debuted in the US in 2015. Mainstream brands, including Ford, Volkswagen and Honda, have now integrated themselves with new software from Amazon.

The online shopping giant recently let loose 'Alexa,' its version of the personal voice assistant made popular by Apple's 'Siri.' Alexa has already been transforming the home lives of millions, who can instruct it to change the TV channel or order pizza.

Now Alexa is firmly behind the wheel. She, or it, can be installed using Logitech's ZeroTouch technology for as little as €60. Drivers will be able to command music playlists and have Alexa read out text messages or emails



while they man the wheel.

The technology only needs an internet connection through a smart phone and can be adapted to most cars, with no need to buy a 2017 model. The consumer landscape will soon be packed with alternatives from Apple, Google and other emerging software giants as voice control looks set to become a common driving feature.
