Family heartache

Children spend night next to dead father

Read by over half a million every week

A heartwarming community effort will see funds raised for the victims of the tragic road accident on the CV-60.

A family car overturned in Montichelvo, killing the father and seriously injured the mother and their two young children on

The family live in Onteniente but are originally from Bulgaria. Now, the president of the region's official Bulgarian community has pledged to raise funds for the funeral and the repatriation of the dead man's body so he can rest in his home country.

Ivan, who was just 36 when he died, was a much-loved figure in the community, running a car wash in Enguera with his partner Yana, 27. Yana has only just come out of the ICU at Valencia's General Hospital. Their daughter, aged five, and son, six. both remain under observation in hospital with different injuries and psychological symptoms.

Their car veered off the road, a notorious black spot, on Saturday night. The crash was severe, killing Ivan instantly. But the disaster wasn't discovered until the Sunday morning when a local farmer came across the wrecked Mercedes 180.

Yana and her daughter were forced to spend the night trapped in the car with their injuries. The boy had managed to escape and was found by firefighters outside the vehicle in a state of shock.

The rescue operation involved

five fire engines and 20 firefighters from Gandia. A helicopter was needed to transport the little girl to La Fe hospital, such was the severity of her injuries.


A beach in northern Spain has kicked sand in the eyes of all would-be Costa competitors by being placed in a ranking of the World's Best Beaches. Southern Spain and the Balearic Islands boast miles and miles of fabulous beaches, some jam-packed with tourists from all over Europe every summer, others offering relaxing peace and quiet year-round. But it is La Concha Beach in San Sebastian that tops all others in Spain, bagging sixth place in TripAdvisor's just-announced list of the World's Best 25 Beaches for 2017.

## How cool!

THE only beach in Spain to make the Top 25, visitors to La Concha are able to paddle out to the small island of Santa Clara with its own beach bar and lighthouse, but it comes with a weather warning since San Sebastian does not enjoy near-year-round sunshine, as many southern Spain beaches do.

The global ranking was once again topped by Baia Do Sancho beach, on the stunning volcanic archipelago of Fernando de Noronha, Brazil.

With crystalline water, white sands and a breathtaking backdrop of high cliffs and tropical forest, it is a truly idyllic spot.

## Checking change

SO many bi-metal coins are in circulation and being passed in place of €1 and €2 coins that National Police are now urging people to check they are being handed euro coins as change. People who try to pass off foreign coins are committing an offence.

#### Cashing in on €500 notes

A TRADING scam which saw more than €50 million laundered with profits of €1.5 million has seen Guardia Civil and National Police in Madrid arrest 26 people.

The scam involved alleged responsible gold dealers making significant payments - always using €500 notes specifically sought from banks - for scrap gold.

However, rather than using them to purchase gold, they supplied the high value notes to drug cartels in exchange for smaller denominations, charging an extra 3 per cent for their ser-



## **Postcard** from **OSASUNA**



DECLARED a site of historic and artistic importance, Osuna is a feast of history, culture and gastronomy for the discerning visitor.

The town with a population of just under 20,000 and about a one-hour drive from Sevilla, can trace its history back 3,000 years when it was inhabited by the Tartessos who lived in parts of what is now modern-day Portugal and Spain.

In the days of Marc Antony it was a town for legionary veterans who were given status as Roman Citizens although it became part of the Moorish invasion before being 'freed' in 1239 by Fernando III of Castile.

Many of the town's buildings date back to Renaissance times with visiting classical scholars and historians consequently finding visits fascinating and educational.

Surrounded by forests and olive plantations, the area also boasts a lagoon with flamingos and herons along with abundant flora and fauna. Additionally some mountainous areas offer incredible vistas, though visitors must allow for cold winters and hot summers.

## Dancing off into the sunset

A PARTY of 120 diners of Romanian origin, celebrating a baptism, paid a Castilla v Leon restaurant a €900 deposit saying they would settle the balance at the end of the meal. But just before the dessert, they formed a conga line and shot out, leaving a €2,000 bill unpaid.

"It happened in the space of a minute," said restaurant owner Antonio Rodriguez. "It was something

They are thought to be responsible for legging it from another restaurant in the area after a wedding banquet earlier this year.

#### Drag despair

A CONTESTANT in a Las Palmas drag queen competition won after dressing as the Virgin Mary, and then returned depicting the crucifixion. The Bishop of the Canary Islands, Francisco Cases, has since described the performance as "frivolous blasphemy" which made him even sadder than when the Spanair plane crashed in 2008.

#### No to wall

THE national construction company Grupo ACS will not bid for any contract involving US President Trump's proposed wall on the Mexican border, company head Florentino Pérez has revealed, contradicting a suggestion by its German subsidiary Hochtief.

"We have not even considered it and, moreover, it is not our speciality," said the businessman and Real Madrid head honcho.

His words came a day after Marcelino Fernandez Verdes, head of Hochtief and widely considered to be Perez' successor-in-waiting. suggested that the firm is looking to win more business in the US.

"At the moment the plans of Donald Trump's government are unknown, but we are open to all types of contract," he said.

#### Animal alert

A STUFFED lion, crocodiles and a number of rare and exotic birds were seized in an operation coordinated by Interpol across 42 countries. Guardia Civil officers helped carry out some of the near 6.000 inspections with almost 60 people believed to be smuggling or selling protected species of flora and fauna.

## Hefty sentence for violent burglar

A ROMANIAN national has been sentenced to 16 years in prison for his part in a violent crime.

The man, aged 44 and named as Costel R, was one of a gang of five who burst into a house in Pedreguer on May 14, 2010.

The gang accessed the property in the early hours of the morning wearing scarves, balaclavas, gloves and wool socks

A woman has already been convicted for her part in the violent attack, whilst three others are still at large.

## Fugitive caught by police in La Nucia

NATIONAL POLICE officers have arrested a Polish man wanted for drug trafficking offences in Poland.

Information provided to the officers through the Commissary General of the Judicial Police, in collaboration with the Polish and Alicante forces, meant that The European Order of Detention and Delivery warrant was executed following a covert surveillance operation.

The 50-year-old is accused of transporting several consignments of hashish from Spain to Poland, the first recorded incident was in September 2008, followed by another in November 2008. It is believed that he committed the crime on more than two other occasions.

Should he be convicted he will face a sentence of up to 27 years in prison in Poland.

When he was arrested the officers noted that the man had drastically changed his physical appearance and was using fake identity documents in a bid to avoid being discovered.

## Water under a cloud

LAST December and again in January, Altea residents were warned not to drink the domestic water supply.

After years of drought, prolonged periods of torrential rain filled the Guadalest reservoir but also stirred up silt, producing unacceptable cloudiness in tapwater in Altea, Alfaz and La Nucia.

Local mayor Jaume Llinares and Roque Ferrer, the councillor responsible for water, have now met Inmaculada Clemente, director of the Marina Baja Public Health De-

partment, to discuss options and solutions for preventing future restrictions.

Llinares explained that Altea had in the past occasionally experienced episodes of cloudiness. "But Public Health directives were not as rigorous and exhaustive as they are now,"

he said while criticising his predecessors for not resolving this old prob-

The public were kept in the picture at all times via public announcements, the radio, social networks, the town hall website and the WhatsApp emergencies alert, the mayor pointed out. "Nevertheless, we want to prevent a repetition," he said.

The domestic water supply could be filtered at the reservoir itself, Llinares suggested and then chlorinated and treated in the towns belonging to the Marina Baja Water Consortium.

#### Caterpillar plague

RESIDENTS in Campello's Muchavista neighbourhood are worried about processionary caterpillars.

Although the council fumigated pines in the area last month, this has not prevented the annual plague. The trees, including those in children's playgrounds, are full of the caterpillars' white gauzy nests, the l'Horta-Muchavista and La Zenia neighbourhood associations complained in a letter to the town hall.


The treatment was clearly inadequate, they said, as there are up to five nests in some of the trees in the Hello Kitty park behind the Villamarco shopping complex.

"We are faced with a plague that produces serious allergic reactions that can be dangerous for children and pets," the letter continued, pointing out that long strings of the caterpillars have been seen in Calle Huelva and other streets

The associations urged the town hall to take urgent action with a year-round campaign using pheromone traps, phytosanitary pesticides and fumigation as well as destroying and burning the nests.

The town hall letter called on the council to distribute pheromone traps to the owners of private land with pines.

## Policewoman showed the way

IT is now 30 years since Enriqueta Borras Faus, the town's first female Local Police officer, arrived in Denia.

She was the subject of a tribute on International Women's Day which was preceded some days earlier by a seminar on 'Women's Integration in the Local Police within the Valencian Community.

This examined the situation of women police officers in the past, present and future. Above all the seminar aimed to accentuate fairness and equality inside the Local Police force, said Javier Scotto, Denia's Public Safety councillor.

Enriqueta Borras, who attended the seminar



and is now with the Local Police in Gandia, recalled that fairness and equality were once in short supply. After facing hostile interview panels, she joined the Denia force as an auxiliary in 1987, passing her police exams two years later.

"Often colleagues did not want to serve with me. In some cases it was machismo and in others their families were suspicious," Borras revealed.

"In a masculinised force, a woman had to demonstrate that she could carry out the same tasks as her male colleagues and was therefore entitled to the same rights and opportunities," said Denia's Equality councillor Elisabet Cardona. "She showed the way with strength, dedication and courage."

## Market plans to ban mobility scooters

THE Benidorm Indoor Market is considering banning mobility scooters.

The popular shopping area, in the Rincon de Loix part of the resort, has already refused access to the two-seater scooters, and is now looking into the legalities of refusing entrance to the one seater vehicles.

Shopkeepers are reported as being 'fed up' with the vast number of the vehicles moving down the narrow aisles of the



market, often colliding with customers, as well as their stalls.

The indoor market. which has over 150 traders, is hoping to follow in the footsteps of some of the hotels within the resort, who have vetoed the access of scooters within their buildings because of the increasing problems that they are

One café worker in the market, Paqui Sanchís, has witnessed many times the vehicles hitting chairs and said: "We have very narrow aisles, I would like to have no access to any of the chairs, not two seats, or

A further concern for many of the businesses is what would happen in the case of an emergency.

### Citizens have a say

BENIDORM Council held a participatory forum which invited citizens to submit proposals regarding mobility and accessibility.

The meeting was part of the town hall's Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan. Rrepresentatives from all groups influ-

enced by mobility attended including taxi drivers, cyclists, social entities, business and neighbourhood associations and urban technicians.

Mayor Toni Perez opened proceedings and after the lectures citizens were invited to put their own proposals forward.

#### Filming set to start

## End of an era threat

THE courts will decide the future of Casa

The lease is up on the Tarbena restaurant, a shrine to Communism that opened in the mid-70s before the party was legalised. It occupies municipal property below the town hall and the lease has been renewed without problems until now.

The council is willing to extend the lease for four years but Jeroni Moncho Ferrer, son of Casa Pinet's founder is asking for another eight years, extendable for a further eight. The monthly rent would also rise from the present €100 to €450.

The town hall argues that it is not willing to

commit to so many years as the Pinet premises could be required for municipal use in the future. Jeroni argues that the restaurant, the electrical installation, water pipes and toilets all need attention, an investment that he cannot recoup in only four years.

Almost 9,000 people have put their names to a petition in the restaurant and another 3,000 have been collected by Change.org on the internet.

"We don't want Casa Pinet to close because it's an important tourist attraction." said Thierry Mas, Treasury and Town Planning councillor of the small town, which has a registered population of 636. "But we have to strike a balance between the general interest and this business."

### Victim of its own success

THE annual tree planting event in Villajoyosa, celebrating the World Day of Nature has been postponed until May 14.

The Department of Environment took the decision having received a surge in inscriptions, just days before the event was due to take place at the weekend.

ONCE again the Costa Blanca community responded to a missing person request, resulting in a happy ending.

The Costa Blanca Missing People's Facebook page, headed by Deborah Law and Jacquie Perkins, were contacted by the family of Tony Ahmid, a 70-year-old gentle-

man from the UK, who had gone missing in Benidorm.

Suffering from Alzheimer's Tony had already been missing for two days when the group was contacted.

Deborah said: "On receipt of that contact our administration team collated certain information, started the process of social media appeals and getting feet on the ground in the area that Tony was last thought to have been

Within 45 minutes of the me-

dia blasts the group were getting reports of sightings, which were immediately checked and either verified or ruled out.

The break came three hours after the initial appeal.

"I was able to confirm with a bar owner certain information

that was not made public," Deborah said, "This gave us a base for the fact verses fiction regarding sightings."

A member of the team went to the reported location but Tony could not be found. Fortunately he was then reported as being in a bar, saying that he was cold to a lady working at the premises. She, seeing the man was in need of help, gave him a jacket.

These details were kept out of the media spotlight, ensuring that information coming in would be correct in relation to what people had last seen him wearing.

Finally, a lady who had been at work and previously contacted the group, saw Tony and followed him whilst on the phone to Deborah.

She followed him into a local bar where the team collaborated with the police and the bar staff and arranged for friends of Tony's - who were also on holiday in Benidorm to go to the bar to take over practical care until he could be reunited with his daughter

Deborah said: "We had this case wrapped up within 24 hours of our involvement. Having direct contact with the family, and all leads coming directly to Costa Blanca missing people, meant that we were able to interview and collate the information immediately, with the support of the consulate."

Costa Blanca missing people are a voluntary group of professionals with expertise in the field of missing persons.

They have a team consisting of an ex-police forensic psychologist, IT experts, social worker, social researcher, translator, British consulate support, members who are relied on for practical feet on the ground support, along with local radio stations, and other social media groups.

## Best possible deal all important - envoy

## British ambassador gives Brexit insight in exclusive EWN interview

THE pressures of being British Ambassador to Spain during the ongoing Brexit complexities are intense. But Simon Manley showed cool professionalism openly answering concerns of British expats put to him by Caroline Tyszka in this exclusive EWN interview at the Melia Villaitana hotel complex in Benidorm.

Brexit does not mean Britain is leaving Europe, merely that it is coming out of the European Union and becoming a sovereign independent United Kingdom "tolerant at home and confident abroad.

Spelling this out, Ambassador Manley was also keen to ease other concerns of the tens of thousands of British expatriates who call southern Spain home in the countdown to the triggering of Article 50 to Brexit.

My priority is to ensure that in the negotiations we secure the best possible deal for British people living in Spain."

**■** Spain does not recognise dual nationality. What do you recommend to Britons considering applying for a Spanish passport?

"It is a matter for the individual. As British Ambassador for Spain I am not going to be recommending people take another nationality. My priority is to ensure that in the negotiations we secure the best possible deal for British people living in Spain - and anywhere else in the EU - and that we secure that deal as soon as possible. I know through all the contacts we have had, and talking to

British people across Spain, of the uncertainty they feel. I know people are very worried about reductions in their British pensions because of the fluctuating currency, and they are concerned about continuing healthcare. We are expressing these concerns to the Spanish government."

#### ■ How often do you receive updates from the UK government regarding the Brexit process and negotiations?

"All the time, from both the Foreign Office and the new Brexit department. We are in close contact with all our European colleagues as well as understanding the position of the Spanish government, plus Spanish media and Spanish businesses. We spend a lot of time talking to Spanish investors in the UK and British investors in Spain, having a very fluid interchange with all parties."

The most important thing is to prepare for the negotiations."

■ There appears a positive message from Spanish regional governments, with the Valencian authorities seeking to assure the British that they will still be welcome and valued. Is this the message you are getting?

"That's right. My own contact with regional presidents all over Spain is that they are very keen to see the British here and continue to attract new business and tourism. It matters to them. The main problem is rumours and speculation via the British media which then get picked up by their Spanish counterparts, making what is fact and what is fiction blurred. I recommend people keep an eye - as a 'one-stopshop' for accurate information on the British government's website and Facebook page.

#### Have you been told to prepare for a worst-case scenario in the event of a hard Brexit?

"The most important thing is to prepare for the negotiations. We want to make sure they are a success, in that we come out with a sovereign independent United Kingdom which is tolerant at home, confident abroad, and engages in free trading across the world. This will give prosperity to the British people whilst having a close, constructive relationship with the European union, because we voted to leave the EU not Europe, and

we will all continue to face the same threats, whether through terrorism or Russian aggression, and we need to work together to face those threats."

**Do you think the House of** Lords' decision has complicated things for the public and their understanding of what this means for Brexit,

#### and with Tony Blair speaking out, did this detract from the inevitable?

"It's really important that we realise we have a democratic parliamentary process going on, we are the world's greatest democracy, I am confident we will bring that process to a successful conclusion this month. and that Theresa May will be writing to her EU colleagues shortly. I recognise some of these developments make people wonder what is happening, which makes me come back to the British government website for updates, ensuring the things people read are the whole truth and nothing but the truth.

**■** If you were a retired expat in Spain, how would you be planning for the potential changes?

"Firstly I would make sure that I was on the padron to ensure continued access to healthcare and also registering that I was legitimately here. I would also be thinking ahead and planning my finances for the future.

"It is important to remember that whilst we are leaving the EU we all face many similar challenges; combating terrorists, ageing populations and active labour markets, issues that we share and work closely together with, and will continue to

Should the next election see Sinn Féin obtain the majority of seats, then it would almost certainly demand immediate union with Eire, the DUP would refuse to form a government in the minority and the logical outcome is that the power to rule would then return to Westminster.

## What to do with a multi-currency mortgage in Francs, Yen... The nullity of multi-currency clauses

AS we have pointed out in previous articles, one of the types of loan that has seriously damaged the consumer is without doubt the multi-currency loan or mortgage, for which, instead of receiving the money in Euros, it is lent in a foreign currency, usually Swiss francs or Japanese ven, etc.

They are very risky loans, as the monthly mortgage payments to be paid, and the outstanding capital (the equivalent in Euros) depend on the exchange rate of the currency, which is highly unpredictable. This is why we believe this product is only advisable for experts in currency exchange, or for those who have their income in the currency cho-

#### The legal consequences of requesting the nullity of multi-currency clauses.

In contesting these loans in court, it should be requested that the multi-currency clauses be declared null, but not the entire loan or mortgage, since doing so it would mean that both parties would need to give back anything received, so the bank would return what was received from the consumer

(monthly payments), but the consumer would also have to return the entire capital received from the bank.

Many banks in the court proceedings argue that in case of the nullity of the multicurrency clauses being declared, because the bank did not correctly inform about the risks and the clauses were not transparent, then the judge must declare the complete loan null and void. They argue that this is the only solution, since the judge cannot disintegrate the contract, modify it and set a different currency than the one agreed by the

We do not agree, and along with most court precedents, we believe that the nullity of multi-currency clauses must result in the loan being understood as agreed in Euros from the beginning, and all the monthly payments paid, along with the amortization table, must be reviewed accordingly.

The full nullity of the loan as requested by the banks, would, as the ECJ says in its judgment of April 30, 2014, be against the ultimate aim of the consumers' regulation,

which is the protection of consumers, since the effect would be more detrimental to the consumer than to the bank, since the consumer has to repay the loan in full.

The possibility of interpreting these kind of mortgage loans as agreed in Euros leaving the loan to exist despite the nullity of part of its clauses, is also in line with the article 83 of RDL 1/2007 concerning consumers and users, and the principles of interpretation in favour of the consumer (pro consumatore) and the principle of conservation of the contract.

## Merely passing through

A SPOTTED CRAKE, rarely seen in Spain, was detected during a ringing session. It was identified by Pedro Gomez Clavel, an expert from the Bird Migration Centre in Madrid after it was caught in the Los Algezares park.

It is a bird of passage. Gomez Clavel said, that neither nests nor winters near the Vinalopo but is beginning to use the river as a migration route before crossing to Africa.

The ringing session was organised by the Carduelis Bird Protection Association and Aspe's Environment department to take a census of the birds in the Los Algezares park. Fifty-four birds were ringed and included willow warblers, snipe, blackcaps and buntings.

## Late payments costly to council

THE Villajoyosa Council has set aside €540,000 to pay interest to their rubbish contractor for late payments in 2010 to 2014.

A claim in 2014 by the contractor, Sociedad Anónima Agricultores de la Vega Valenciana (SAV), called for the payment of interest on arrears, over the four year period, of €1,178,853.23. Under appeal this amount was reduced to €543,755.93 which will now be paid this year by the council.

However, this is not the first time that the public coffers have been dipped into for late payments by the town hall.

The same company filed a legal claim against the council in 2008 regarding late invoice payments for road cleaning, collection of rubbish and management of the towns Eco Park which resulted in it receiving

€400,000 as a settlement.

Andreu Verdú, mayor of Villajoyosa said: "Once again the town has to pay for poor management, in this case for late payments to a basic service such as the contracting of rubbish.

It is unacceptable that this council has for years been paying bills late and sometimes, ignoring the company's claims. Thanks to the work we have done, the amount has been considerably reduced."





## Plan two years on

JAVEA'S Local Police recently reviewed its Strategic Plan adopted two years ago.

This was introduced to adapt the force to the needs of the 21st century, making it more approachable, sociable, empathetic and mediatory.

Public Safety councillor Pepa Gisbert explained that her department called in consultants to evaluate the Local Police and recommend action to turn it into a different force.

Two years later the situation has changed considerably, Gisbert said.

Communication with the public has improved thanks to the force's own web page and social

media presence, revealed Local Police superintendant Jose Antonio Monfort.

Officers are designated to mediate in day-to-day issues, twice as many deal with gender violence and there are environment protection and special assignment units.

The Javea force is currently completing the formalities to become a member of the European Forum for Urban Security (EFUS), which supports and motivates local authorities and their security policies.

Once incorporated, Javea's Local Police will be one of only three Valencian Community forces that belong to EFUS.

## Putting the harbour to ri

THE regional government's Ports director general, Carlos Domingo, was in Javea recently to inspect the harbour.

The northern arm was badly damaged during the storm that raged between January 19 and 20 when 80 metres of the northern breakwater were affected as far as the Tango beach.

Pounding seas shifted the blocks of stone beneath the breakwater's cement platform, leaving visible gaps. His department classed repairs as an emergency, Domingo revealed during the visit, and was obtaining the necessary €250,000 from the regional government's contingency fund.

Environmental impact permits were being processed and Ports were seeking a contractor to start repairs as soon as possible. These would be carried out on land so that port activities would not be affected, Domingo said.

Javea's mayor Jose Chulvi accompanied Domingo, his second-incommand Pilar Alvarez and Ports Management chief Julio Marin as they inspected the harbour. They also visited the port installations from the Club Nautico to the public area, fishing berths and the fish market.

The contract to redesign the harbour will be put out to tender over the coming months, Domingo revealed. There are no plans for extending the port but the existing installation will be better organised, he explained. Protecting the fishing port was a priority, he continued, as care should be lavished on a sector that remains an economic pillar for municipalities like Javea.

MARCH is Brain Tumour Awareness Month and, appropriately, four-year-old Leo Bermejo from Almeria is about to embark on what could be lifesaving treatment in the States.

Doctors at the Oklahoma clinic have now completed their assessments with Leo and consultations with cancer experts on each side of the Atlantic.

They have recommended 31 proton sessions, which will be given Monday to Friday, so once it begins it will involve approximately six weeks of treatment.

The consensus is that Leo needs full brain and spine proton therapy with a boost to the tumour bed. As mum Karen says, "The treatment needs to be aggressive to kill this beast."

Leo will be given a lower dose to the healthy brain and he will not be any worse than he is now. Karen added: "The doses that we have discussed are the same doses that another child has had who had the closest condition I could find to Leo.

"I have been in contact with the mother of this child who also had weakness in one side and loss of speech but he is progressing and now goes to a normal school.





# Agent Provocateur in 'pre-pack' deal

NEVER one to shy away from controversy, Mike Ashley, owner of Sports Direct and a number of other businesses is said to be in the process of purchasing luxury lingerie brand Agent Provocateur much to the disgust of one of its original founders

Joe Corré, the son of Dame Vivienne Westwood and the late Malcolm McLaren of Sex Pistols fame, cofounded Agent Provocateur in 1994 with his former wife Serena Rees and the brand currently employs some 600 people and has 11 shops in the UK.

In 2007, the couple split and at that time sold their business to private investment company 3i for a reported £60 million (€69.5 million) and Corré went on to become involved in other fashion and cosmetic operations from 2009, but he is clearly unhappy with the decision to allow Mike Ashley to become involved in his former com-

Known for his ability to obtain publicity, in late 2016 with the co-operation of his mother, the designer and entrepreneur arranged to burn an archive of punk memorabilia said to be worth £6 million (€6.95 million)

on a barge in the River Thames.

Now he has described the sale of his former 'baby' as "a disgrace to British business" and "preposterous" and has intimated that he will take further action after previously taking legal action against 3i and Ashley.

What he seems to object to is the fact that the sale is being made via a contentious financial vehicle known as a 'pre-pack administration' whereby 3i - originally founded in 1945 by the

Bank of England and various banks under a different name in order to stimulate the British economy - has allowed the sale of the company.

This type of sale means that many creditors including HM Revenue and Customs will remain unpaid whilst a major creditor, thought to be Barclays Bank may take the majority of the revenue and Corré believes that other 'safer' purchasers have been side-

3i may well lose most of their investment but will no longer have to support the struggling brand and they argue that the decision has been made by AlixPartners, the administrators of Agent Provocateur not themselves.

The purchase is actually being made by Four Holdings, the parent company of Four Marketing, which is 25 per cent owned by Sports Direct which gives rise to the accusation that Mike Ashley who is the director of 218 companies is behind the purchase.

Whilst it would seem a strange 'bed fellow' to market besides the sporting clothes and utilitarian underwear sold in the Sports Direct shops, the owner, Mr Ashley has recently taken an interest in designer clothing brands such as French Connection.

He certainly appears to want to expand and move upmarket although there is some fear that he might just take the name and existing stock and dump everything else.

# Lego NASA female pioneers

AFTER introducing such legendary fictional characters as Darth Vader, Harry Potter and Batman and to coincide with International Women's Day on March 8, Danish company Lego has announced that it will produce a set of NASA female pioneers.

> Once designed and manufactured, the collection is not expected to reach the markets until late in 2017 or early 2018.

As the company moves from strength to strength, it invited followers to put forward suggestions for new characters or images to add to the range and the concept of the NASA pioneers which was presented by science writer Maia Weinstock won the competition with more than 10,000 votes.

The set will need to be designed and manufactured as part of a larger Lego NASA collection so is not expected to reach the markets until late in 2017 or early 2018.

### **Spain consulted** over Opel sale

# US firm raided by tax authorities

CATERPILLAR INC, an American company and the largest manufacturer of industrial machinery and trucks in the world has had three of its premises in the US raided by the authorities apparently investigating alleged tax evasion.

This follows an investigation into its Swiss subsidiary CSARL by the American authorities who accused the company of diverting funds to the semi-tax haven and supposedly

saving \$2.4 billion (€2.28 billion) in tax which should have been paid going back to 2000.

An earlier senate paper suggested that having negotiated a special tax rate of 6 per cent with the Swiss government, Caterpillar regularly reported large amounts of profits earned through CSARL even though it had transferred no staff or ongoing business to the Swiss company.

proper tax within the USA yet on the other hand he wants to support American business and encourage a growth in employment and sales within the US.

### Not as many unemployed

UNEMPLOYMENT continued to drop significantly in Spain during the last quarter of 2016 to its lowest level of 18.6 per cent and represented the lowest number of unemployed since 2009, although the fourth quarter of every year sees large numbers of seasonal jobs created which then disappear in the following month.

February figures however showed a positive result with 9,355 fewer people registered as unemployed taking the total for Spain to 3.75 million although it does appear the number who are eligible for employment has dropped as well.

According to the Ministry of Employment there are now 17,748,000 people actual registered with social security as being employed and this does not take into account those receiving cash in hand.

Overall, things are continuing to look positive although interestingly, there were 2,859 more foreign workers registered as unemployed.

# Tyre checks

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



TYRES are arguably one of the most important elements of a vehicle, but many drivers neglect them.

Through the intense daily wear they receive in hot and cold conditions, going over potholes and kerbs, they can become easily damaged so drivers are urged to carry out regular checks on their tyres to ensure they are in optimum conditions for safe driving. But what do you need to look out for?

Tyres must have enough tread to maintain grip, requiring a minimum tread depth of 1.6mm across the central area. At 1.6mm tread in wet weather it takes an extra two car lengths, around 8m, to stop if travelling at 50mph, compared to if the tread was 3mm.

Over or under inflated tyres will cause uneven wear on the tread which can also cause problems. An under inflated tyre can result in more wear on the edges of the tyres and over inflation could result in more wear in the centre. You should also check the tyre's pressure with most vehicles having a metal plate on or near the driver's inside door which will indicate the optimum pressure, which is stated as PSI. Always check tyres when they are cold for an accurate reading.

There are also calls to ban the sale of used tyres amid increasing safety fears from industry professionals.

It is estimated that hundreds of thousands of vehicles on the roads of Spain are fitted with used tyres, a figure which has increased in recent years due to the financial crisis. One mainstream supplier states that 80 per cent of their business is in the sale of used, rather than new tyres. In addition, it is believed that 60 per cent of all cars over 10 years of age are fitted

Accident investigators say that tyres are a factor in three out of four road traffic incidents, and point out that tyre wear and tear is different on all vehicles, makes and models.

As a result, industry professionals are now lobbying for the sale of used tyres to be prohibited to ensure safer conditions for drivers.

I've read this week that Malaga airport is



# Trump this! The Donald on women's looks and bodies





## Ask the Optician: Focus on Women's Eyes

THIS year's UK Mother's Day falls on March 26 and as we know many of you celebrate on this special day we want to honour all the great Mums, Grandmas, Sisters and Aunties by answering some questions about how women's eyes are affected by hormones and what eye health conditions can particularly affect women.

- Are women's eye affected by hormones? Unfortunately women's eyes can suffer when they are menstruating, pregnant or breastfeeding, as they need to retain more liquids and this can affect the eyes as well as giving other side effects such as bloating and swollen ankles.
- Are there any other things that can affect a woman's eyes? The contraceptive pill can often cause changes in your vision, as can antidepressants, anti-anxiety medications and antihistamines.
- Why do my eyes get so dry? The term 'dry eye' is used when we don't produce enough tears or our tears evaporate too quickly. People with dry eyes often have plenty of water in their tears but not enough oil.

Dry eye is three times more common in women than men, as it is affected by hormonal changes during a menstrual cycle, pregnancy, breastfeeding or the menopause. As we age this can get worse, with 60 per cent of women over 50 years old suffering from this uncomfortable condition. To reduce symptoms drink plenty of water, use eye drops and sprays to add extra lubrication, reduce your central heating and avoid direct heat from heaters.

What is conjunctivitis? Conjunctivitis is the most common eye disease in the Western hemisphere and children often get this at school and pass this on to their Mums. It is an inflammation of the conjunctiva, which makes the sclera appear reddened due to an increase in blood supply. The eye feels itchy and watery. Sometimes, there is a sticky discharge, which feels uncomfortable and makes vision blurry.

Although conjunctivitis is often referred to as 'pink eye,' this technically only refers to one type of the eye disease, bacterial conjunctivitis. Users of contact lenses should remove them and wear glasses until your symptoms recover.

## More middle-aged women are suffering from eating disorders

ACCORDING to research by BEAT, an eating disorders charity, more middle-aged women are suffering from eating disorders. A study found that 15 per cent of women aged between 40 and 50 showed signs of a lifelong eating disorder, but less than 30 per cent had sought help for their problem.

The study by BEAT found that women dealing with an eating disorder at work felt stigmatised due to their illness and felt their colleagues were uneducated about eating disorders.

So how can you spot the signs that someone you work with could be suffering from an eating disorder?

Look for changes in mood and behaviour as they will appear long before the physical signs. Not eating will leave the body deprived of nutrients making workers perhaps more moody, irritable and socially withdrawn than normal.

Remain compassionate, offer a listening ear and encouragement.

Look for signs they are not eating, they may be pushing their food around the plate or cutting it into extremely small pieces, to give the impression they are eating.

They may start wearing baggy clothes in an attempt to hide their weight and shape.

Above all, remain compassionate, offer a listening ear and encourage them to seek help.

## **Dealing with** high levels of cholesterol

CHOLESTEROL is a word just about everybody has heard of but many people are unaware of what it really is, so this week we've asked the doctor to explain a little.

#### - What exactly does it mean to have high cholesterol?

If after a blood test you are told that you have high cholesterol, this means that the total cholesterol levels, and in particular the LDL (or socalled 'bad' cholesterol) levels in your blood are higher than they should be.

Although the maximum amount considered normal will vary depending on other medical conditions a patient may have, generally anything over 200 is considered to be high.

However, this is not an exact figure as it depends more on how much of the cholesterol is of the socalled 'bad' variety.

#### - What are the main caus-

The main cause of high cholesterol is genetic. If you have family members with high cholesterol levels you are likely to inherit this condition. An unhealthy diet, rich in fat, and a lack of regular daily physical exercise are other things which can bring cholesterol levels up.

#### - Is it dangerous?

Yes, it is, as it can be a cardiovascular risk factor and can increase your chances of suffering heart attacks or

#### - What can be done to bring it down?

The first thing is to follow a balanced, low-fat diet and get regular physical exercise. If this fails to get the problem under control then medication, known as statins, will be necessary.

#### - Will I have to be on a diet the rest of my life to keep it down?

Yes. You will always have to stick to a balanced diet, especially as you get older as cholesterol levels tend to increase with age.





#### Testing journey not necessary

ONCE again, students of Norwegian will be able to take the Bergenstest proficiency exam without leaving Spain.

The Bergenstest is the most widely-known and accepted Norwegian language test and essential for access to higher education but until recently students living in Spain had to take the written exam in one of the Norwegian consulates. They then had to travel to Norway for

Following an agreement between Alfaz Town Hall, the Norwegian School Costa

Blanca, the UNED open university in Denia and the Folkeuniversitet in Oslo, this long drawn-out procedure is no longer necessary.

Alfaz had a population of 21,700 at last count and 8,000 are Norwegian and the town is the only location outside Norway where both the written and oral test can be taken, said Alfaz's Culture secretary Rocio Guijarro.

The written exam, which lasts between five and six hours is scheduled for April 1 while the oral takes place in May via videoconference.

Recently the park had an open day to show off their two new small addi-



These individual bands have paid for their members' licence fees explained Juan Jose Olcina, president of Alcov's Moors and Christians Association.






A ONCE-MONTHLY children's film session begins at the Casa de Cultura in Campello.

## Sell-by dates - a necessity or a con?

GOOD FOOD. **GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS** WITH GARRY WAITE

OR YEARS now, discussion has raged as to the amount of food wastage incurred domestically, as well as in our industry, although not so much as the former. The millions of tons representing 12bn pounds per year wasted have a lot to do with sell by/use by/best before dates. I notice the UK milk marketing board has challenged the government's date policy saying that no one need a use by date as it's pretty obvious when you can no longer use/drink milk!!

This is not new, in 2011 the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) said that sell by and display until dates would be replaced with 'use by' and 'best before' dates.

Dates that I do think are useful are packaging and display until/best before dates. For instance if in a supermarket a packet of fish states it was 'packed' say on 6/4 and the 'display until date' says the 8/4 that makes sense. The buyer can then decide if they are going to consume it before say the weekend (in this case 11/4) or whether to freeze it down for later use - or give it to the

One good thing about sell by dates is that shops tend to put those items that are 'out-of-date' as 'bargain buys.' I know people who will not purchase anything past its 'sell by /consume before' dates. But astute shoppers can save quite a lot of money.

In my, not so, humble opinion the information that would be more helpful to the buyer, the supplier and would save tons of wastage are the following:

FISH: Caught/farmed date packed on date - display until date

MEAT: Slaughter date - packed on date - consume preferably by date

DAIRY/VEGETABLES ETC.



MILK: That's my style of labelling!

There is a huge difference between the labelling used - and used intelligently could benefit all parties. You pays your money.....!

With frozen/jarred and tinned products that technically will not go passed their best if kept in their original state the date of packaging is the only guide that the buyer needs. We have all heard stories about canned food from the war days still being opened to be found in edible condition. I opened a tin of water chestnuts the other day that I have had in my cupboard for more than 10 years. The only reason I knew how old it was, was because of the 'sell by date'. Totally unnecessary, they were

Most people know that a good quality piece of meat needs to hang for a couple of weeks minimum before eating. Many years ago I met a meat buy-


er for Marks and Spencer. He had to get up at three in the morning to get to the meat market as he had to buy the finest quality of meat available. Nothing strange about that, but he had also to make sure it was bright red, as, if it showed any brown/greenish tinges and dark yellow fat (the signs of good ag-

That meat should carry a label, BEST IN ABOUT TWO WEEKS!!

ing) their customers would not buy it!


MANY READERS ARE SURE to remember one of the UK's most respected journalists and TV anchor man Bob Friend who from the first broadcast of Sky News in 1989 became the 'Face of Sky News.'

I was going through some old photos the other day and came across a few pictures of us having dinner in Marbella and reflected that he died of a brain tumour more than eight years ago at the young age of 70. He was a great practical joker with a wicked sense of humour.

He told me many stories of his more than 50 years in journalism, many self mocking. Once he had to report the death of a relevantly unknown African figure with an unpronounceable name and despite practising the delivery many times before going on air he just couldn't get the name right, so with his friend and fellow presenter, Lisa Azziz at his side (also with a sense of humour) he began to report on the sudden death of an 'important figure in Africa whose name has not been released until his family have been informed. Classic!!!

One day he was reporting on the fact that hedgehogs were fast disappearing from Britain's countryside. The reason apparently being that the 'Travellers' were eating them. So he invited viewers to send in the recipes for hedgehog!! Later that morning he phoned me and asked if I had heard the broadcast? 'Why don't you send me a recipe?' he asked. So, I did.

Hedgehog, despite being a verminous creature, is quite edible and has a flavour of chicken. The way

they are cooked is by encasing them in clay and baking them in a form of underground fire (earth oven). When cooked one breaks the clay and the spines fall away leaving a cooked 'chicken'! I thought this was too tame for Bob so I sent him a mildly humorous version of hedgehog chasseur! Informing those preparing this dish to avoid those animals that had been run over by a car as they would not be suitable, skin the animal and keep the skin to use as scrubbing brushes etc. And then went into the recipe for the dish. I was running La Reserva de Marbella, Las Chapas, at the time and as the breakfast programme went out (repeating the item every hour for three hours) it had Lisa (once again) giggling at such a ridiculous article but Bob continued seriously..... "the recipe for hedgehog has been sent in by

Garry Waite, owner of Restaurante La Reser-

va de Marbella in Marbella.... ...... For three days after the broadcast I was getting reservations for hedgehog dinner, a call and interview with BBC Radio Four Food Programme and a call from the Telegraph and Sunday Times magazine, as well as our own trade magazine the Caterer. The power of advertising?

I had forgotten how many laughs we had and what an amazingly generous man he was, both professionally and personally. Why do the best go first?

#### **Brit buyers** due billions

AS much as €6.2 billion could be dished out to the estimated 130.000 Brits who lost their deposits to bankrupt developers across Spain. The figure, almost triple the initially floated figure of €2.3 billion, was released by legal specialists Spanish Legal Reclaims.

The firm reckons that more Brits than previously imagined are due money and are likely to win their legal battles. Recent success stories have injected them with confidence that if affected Brits come forward they have a better chance of winning than ever before.

Spanish courts are bracing themselves for an avalanche of cases after the Supreme Court ruled banks must repay deposits if the developer went bankrupt. Although each case is different, the landmark ruling is certain to result in billions being paid out.

One such example is the case of Malcolm Young, who has now been awarded the €130,000 he put down as a deposit for a Marbella apartment in 2004

## Is new property better than second-hand?

MORE than half of the Brits buying new home have found huge problems with infrastructure and construction.

The UK government is struggling to meet housing demand by building a million new homes but they are clearly of shoddy quality.

A survey from YouGov revealed that 51 per cent of new occupants endured problems ranging from unfinished fittings to severe electrical faults. The poll also found that a plurality of people believed that

second-hand homes were better than new builds and would rather not take the risk of living in a new property.

One developer has already had to fork out almost €10 million in compensation for faults.

Meanwhile housing charities have denounced the government's building plans as skewed towards favouring developers earning a profit, rather than struggling families getting a proper roof over their



## End to controversial tax



MORE than half a million home owners across Spain could be in for a cash windfall as an avalanche of regional judgements finally reached the Constitutional Court.

At the end of February national judges put an end to the surplus value tax controversy, raising hopes among the estimated 550,000 sellers who lost out to the unconstitutional levy.

The surplus value tax is a financial obligation imposed on anyone selling their property in Spain to pay tax on the 'increased' value of the land. The bizarrely complex calculation means thousands of people have had to fork out thousands of euros even when they take a heavy hit on a sale.

Momentum began when an Andalucian court ruled that it was unfair to charge a Costa del Sol seller €5,000 in increased value tax when he sold a property he bought for €230,000 for just €70,000.

The latest decision from the Constitution-

al Court helps bring the wildly varying situations across the Spanish regions under some kind of national control.

It also means courts can expect a tidal wave of surplus value tax cases concerning properties that were unfairly charged. With taxes paid ranging from €1-10,000, the total payout is likely to be in the billions.

The decision also removes a valuable source of income for Spain's municipal

## Palm trees are ideal for a Mediterranean garden

A PALM tree has always been a must for the ideal landscape design in the Mediterranean garden. Palm lined strands, boulevards and well-placed palms around water features signal the relaxing atmosphere of enjoying hot days sitting by the pool or bathing in the sun or sea at the beach.

Over the last 10-15 years, the palm tree has been in serious decline due to a ravenous red beetle or weevil (Rhynchophorus ferrugineus) that has decimated thousands of Canary Island palms in Spain and has adversely affected other palm species as well.

The outbreak of the weevil is not yet under control in most areas of Spain or other Mediterranean and Middle Eastern countries where palms are prevalent. Fortunately the Canary Islands have been successful in eradicating the weevil through strict monitoring, sanitation and treatment of their thousands of palm trees.

Early detection is normally obtained with a specific pheromone trap for the weevil and just one adult caught indicates action is required to protect the palms in the vicinity. An adult female weevil can lay around 200 eggs. New treatments to combat the weevil are being developed to assist in the battle to save the palms, including chemical and biological agents.

The weevil is originally from Asia where it is a major pest of coconut palms. It appears that Canary Island palms are its favourite in Spain but it can

also affect other palms such as the Sago, Date, Washington, Sugar, Betel nut and

If you have a palm tree that is healthy, it is best to have it checked by a person trained in palm care. If you have a sick or dead palm then have it completely removed. Once a palm shows signs of drooping leaves and stunted growth it is usually too late to save it. It will be necessary to have it disposed of in accordance with regional authorities guidelines.

The insect is extremely thorough in its infestation of the palm with eggs in cracks and crevices, larvae tunnelling through the palm and pupae in the roots in the ground so it is extremely difficult to eliminate all stages of growth completely.

In order to eradicate the weevil all palms should be checked and treated appropriately as was done in the Canary Islands. Eradication will require good community cooperation if it is to succeed. How many palms will remain in Spain before the weevil is stopped depends on the cooperation of everyone involved in landscapes containing palms and the preventative measures to protect the remaining healthy palms by responsible authorities and owners.

The Mediterranean garden will not be the same if the weevil is not stopped as all susceptible unprotected palms will eventually be lost. It would be hard to imagine the loss of such an icon of the

#### March garden tasks

SPRING is coming and that means there is more to do in the garden to prepare for it. Airing the lawn, starting to plant seeds and carrying out the first fertilising treatments are a few of them.

Houseplants: no matter what time of year it is, indoor plants always need their leaves washing gently to remove dust and dirt. It's now time to start increasing the amount of water we give them and add some fertiliser

Garden plants, bushes and trees: Rose bushes should be fertilised after pruning. Now is also the time to divide up lively plants and take cuttings of geraniums, chrysanthemums and dahlias. It's also a good time to plant aromatic

Lawns: As temperatures increase weeds may appear

amongst the grass that we need to remove. We must also air the lawn and start fertilising it, as well as replacing any deteriorated areas in preparation for spring.

Watering: As the weather warms up, depending on how much rain there is we may need to start upping watering routines, especially for plants that are starting to bud, and we can start including some liquid fertiliser in the water. Watering should be done in the morning to avoid fungal growth caused by excessively damp nights.

Pruning: Winter's nearly over so there are various pruning tasks to get done. By the end of this month we should have finished pruning fruit trees, rosebushes, trees and bushes and grasses like Pampas grasses should be cut

## The sit and stay

left side, thereafter NEVER recommand, even if the dog moves. Pull up and back with your right hand in the collar, simultaneously push down with your left hand on the dog's back just above the base of his tail. Never apply pressure any higher up the dog's back as this could cause injury.

PRAISE the dog quietly once he is settled and comfortable in the SIT and remains there without any physical restraint. If the dog moves, replace him into the SIT with no further commands. Do this as often as necessary, until he is sitting still and comfortably. praise quietly, then give the release command and at the same time move the dog from where he is sitting. PRAISE.

2. Repeat stage 1 until the dog is sitting when commanded with confidence. Always use the method described in stage 1 to guide the dog into the sit position. Gently try to pull or push

the dog out of position (the handler should still be kneeling next to the dog), but be prepared to place him back into the SIT should he move. If he resists your gentle attempts to dislodge him, PRAISE and give the release command.

If the attempts to move succeed - place him back into the sit position without commanding and go back to stage 1 and start again, until he is doing the exercise with more reliability.

3. When the dog is doing stage 2 confidently, without moving, the exercise can be expanded. Put the dog into the SIT and with, as little fuss as possible, stand upright. If he moves, put him straight back into the SIT without saying a word. When you are able to stand next to him use the lead, gently applying pressure to the collar to test the sit. If he moves again, replace him giving no extra commands and start stage 3 again. When he is resisting your attempts to move him from the sit PRAISE and RE-LEASE.

4. When he is doing stage 3 reliably and confidently, the exercise can again be expanded. Place him in the SIT, take a couple of steps away from him, but be ready to put him back just as he moves. Using the lead again, gently apply pressure to the collar, return to the dog immediately, PRAISE profusely and then RELEASE.

NEVER release the dog until you are standing by his side or he will never do a reliable sit

THE DOWN STAY

This is taught in exactly the same stages as the SIT - remember to only command the dog once and only when you are standing next to him, always replace him into position using no extra commands and PRAISE and RELEASE at the end of each sit/down.

When both the sit and down are perfected with no distraction indoors, use different places where there are no distractions and start again at stage 1, working through all the stages. Perfect the technique by gradually increasing the distractions ie rattling a bunch of keys, dropping your hanky etc.







New drivers, who have passed their test within two years, could have their licence revoked if caught using a phone just once. Six penalty points and a £200 fine will be imposed on anyone caught. Experienced drivers caught twice face disqualification and a £1,000 fine.

The use of mobile phones on British roads has been described as an epidemic. There were 22 deaths and 99 serious injuries as a direct consequence of phone use in 2016. Research has shown that drivers who text take twice as long to react as those who have drunk moderately.



ONCE, pick-up trucks were just pick-up trucks, rugged workhorses normally seen on building sites. But when double-cab versions began to be produced, the humble pick-up developed a new life as a dualpurpose family vehicle.

These days pick-ups are produced by several manufacturers but few can match Nissan for pick-up experience: the company has been making them for more than 80 years.

Nissan's latest Navara underlines just how far the double cab pick-up has come: it has a stylish exterior, a luxury interi-

or, high-spec standard equipment and the driving refinement of a family car.

It's not surprising really as most are bought by small businesses who also use them as family transport and thus require all the comfort and technology now common in most cars, Indeed, Nissan estimates 95 per cent of all Navara models will be double cab.



Moving onto Rugby - and the first of this weekend's Six Nations matches kicks off tomorrow when Wales play Ire-


