# Danger deactivated

A NAVY diver's unit specialising in the deactivation of dangerous explosives neutralised an American-made flare found in the Major port in La Manga del Mar

Menor. The flare was found by a local fisherman who contacted police. In turn they reached out to the Maritime Action Force to deal with the threat.

# Out of sight

TWO Kurdish families were found hidden inside a truck which original nated from Murcia. The driver of the vehicle alerted the authorities after he discovered the stowaways, four of them minors, in the Biscavan town of Elorrio. A married couple had three children with them, while a young mother was accompanied by a one-year-old child.

# International effort

IN the year it has been running. Murcia's Health Department has provided assistance to 3,892 people from 35 different countries under the Social Protection Programme. The figure was announced by Health Delegate Encarna Guillen at a meeting with charities and groups which deal with foreigners in irregular situations in the region with insufficient resources.

# **Suspected** robber sent behind bars

NATIONAL POLICE in Alcantarilla have arrested a 26-year-old Spanish man with a previous record and wanted by three Murcia region courts for allegedly robbing minors.

The suspect, who was remanded in custody to await trial is suspected of being behind at least 11 crimes in which victims, all teenagers, reported that their attacker used his height and size to intimidate them as well as brandishing a

Investigations began in November last year after a pattern was noted amongst the crimes reported at police stations in Alcantarilla and Murcia City's del Carmen district and the suspect was identified by victims through photographs.

Although upon his arrest the suspect tried to run away through the streets of Alcantarilla, where he lived, officers soon caught up and took him before a judge, who decided to send him to jail to wait for his trial.

# Fake officer arrested

A SPANISH man was arrested for impersonating a police officer in Alicante.

The 28-year-old had made himself a special badge which he presented and announced he was part of the 'secret police' of the National Police, in order to deceive his victims.

The man stopped his victims and upon claiming to be police, asked them to remove their belongings from their bags for inspections

Carrying out a quick search, he would ask them to wait as he made a few calls checking their documentation and paperwork. It was at this point that he would flee with their money and personal

Police launched the investigation in late November last year following a large number of complaints all telling the same story about the thefts.

A beach in northern Spain has kicked sand in the eyes of all would-be Costa competitors by being placed in a ranking of the World's Best Beaches. Southern Spain and the Balearic Islands boast miles and miles of fabulous beaches, some jam-packed with tourists from all over Europe every summer, others offering relaxing peace and quiet year-round. But it is La Concha Beach in San Sebastian that tops all others in Spain, bagging sixth place in TripAdvisor's just-announced list of the World's Best 25 Beaches for 2017.

# How cool!

THE only beach in Spain to make the Top 25, visitors to La Concha are able to paddle out to the small island of Santa Clara with its own beach bar and lighthouse, but it comes with a weather warning since San Sebastian does not enjoy near-year-round sunshine, as many southern Spain beaches do.

The global ranking was once again topped by Baia Do Sancho beach, on the stunning volcanic archipelago of Fernando de Noronha, Brazil.

With crystalline water, white sands and a breathtaking backdrop of high cliffs and tropical forest, it is a truly idyllic spot.

Grace Bay in the Turks and Caicos Islands, near the Bahamas, claimed second spot, while Eagle Beach on the tiny Caribbean island of Arruba was placed third.

# Playas high in Europe

LA CONCHA also topped the ranking in TripAdvisor's Best 10 European Beaches of the Year, with two other Spanish beaches also listed.

Plava de Ses Illetes on Formentera. off Ibiza, grabbed sixth place. The beach, part of the Ses Salines natural area of special interest, features transparent waters and a pristine seagrass meadow, making it popular with divers. It is also clothing-optional, leading to a hedonistic ambience.

In 10th is the six-kilometre Playa de Muro in northern Mallorca. A longstanding favourite, it has three sections, with tourist facilities closest to Alcudia, and much of the remainder backed by unspoilt sand dunes and pine forest.

# **Bobbies out in bangers**

NOT only do they have to cope with the largest workload in the country, the Guardia Civil in Torrevieja also have to do so in bangers which ought to be in the scrapyard, the AUGC (United Guardia Civil Association) union has complained.

In a city with an estimated 150,000 residents, many of which are not registered meaning fewer resources are available to the authorities, and many foreigners in residential complexes on the outskirts seen as easy prev by thieves, the force's patrol cars spend more time in the garage than on the

Not only do old, faulty engines lead to frequent breakdowns but patrol cars also suffer from defects including cracked windscreens, faulty gearboxes and broken lights which would, in the case of vehicles belonging to private individuals, be good cause for fines or immobilisation.

The union, therefore, is demanding that a leasing system similar to that used by the National Police force is set up to allow patrol cars to be exchanged at 200,000 kilometres.

# Checking change

SO many bi-metal coins are in circulation and being passed in place of €1 and €2 coins that National Police are now urging people to check they are being handed euro coins as change. People who try to pass off foreign coins are committing an offence.

# Cashing in on €500 notes

A TRADING scam which saw more than €50 million laundered with profits of €1.5 million has seen Guardia Civil and National Police in Madrid arrest 26 people.

The scam involved alleged responsible gold dealers making significant payments - always using €500 notes specifically sought from banks - for scrap gold.

However, rather than using them to purchase gold, they supplied the high value notes to drug cartels in exchange for smaller denominations, charging an extra 3 per cent for their ser-



# **Postcard** from **OSASUN**A



DECLARED a site of historic and artistic importance, Osuna is a feast of history, culture and gastronomy for the discerning visitor.

The town with a population of just under 20,000 and about a one-hour drive from Sevilla, can trace its history back 3,000 years when it was inhabited by the Tartessos who lived in parts of what is now modern-day Portugal and Spain.

In the days of Marc Antony it was a town for legionary veterans who were given status as Roman Citizens although it became part of the Moorish invasion before being 'freed' in 1239 by Fernando III of Castile.

Many of the town's buildings date back to Renaissance times with visiting classical scholars and historians consequently finding visits fascinating and educational.

Surrounded by forests and olive plantations, the area also boasts a lagoon with flamingos and herons along with abundant flora and fauna. Additionally some mountainous areas offer incredible vistas, though visitors must allow for cold winters and hot summers.

# Dancing off into the sunset

A PARTY of 120 diners of Romanian origin, celebrating a baptism, paid a Castilla v Leon restaurant a €900 deposit saying they would settle the balance at the end of the meal. But just before the dessert, they formed a conga line and shot out, leaving a €2,000 bill unpaid.

"It happened in the space of a minute," said restaurant owner Antonio Rodriguez. "It was something

It later emerged the same people have a history of not paying their bills, and have been dubbed the 'kings of simpa,' which is a diminutive of the Spanish 'Sin pagar' [without paying]. They are thought to be responsible for legging it from another restaurant in the area after a wedding banquet earlier this year.

# Drag despair

A CONTESTANT in a Las Palmas drag queen competition won after dressing as the Virgin Mary, and then returned depicting the crucifixion. The Bishop of the Canary Islands, Francisco Cases, has since described the performance as "frivolous blasphemy" which made him even sadder than when the Spanair plane crashed in 2008.

## No to wall

THE national construction company Grupo ACS will not bid for any contract involving US President Trump's proposed wall on the Mexican border, company head Florentino Pérez has revealed, contradicting a suggestion by its German subsidiary Hochtief.

"We have not even considered it and, moreover, it is not our speciality," said the businessman and Real Madrid head honcho.

His words came a day after Marcelino Fernandez Verdes, head of Hochtief and widely considered to be Perez' successor-in-waiting. suggested that the firm is looking to win more business in the US.

"At the moment the plans of Donald Trump's government are unknown, but we are open to all types of contract," he said.

#### Animal alert

A STUFFED lion, crocodiles and a number of rare and exotic birds were seized in an operation coordinated by Interpol across 42 countries. Guardia Civil officers helped carry out some of the near 6.000 inspections with almost 60 people believed to be smuggling or selling protected species of flora and fauna

# Child's terrifying ordeal

A MOTHER has been charged with abandoning her child after firefighters launched a nerve-wracking rescue of a five-year-old girl stuck on a seventhfloor window ledge in her bare feet.

Nail-biting video footage of the tiny figure holding on to the window for dear life has shocked viewers across the country. It shows the girl balancing outside the extremely high Alicante apartment at 10pm in her pyjamas on

Neighbours fearing the worst placed mattresses around the bottom of the building. It was impossible to enter the apartment and eventually a firefighter was sent up on a crane to collect her.

Fortunately she was unscathed, though certainly terrified. She was alone in the apartment at the time and is now in her father's custody as criminal charges pend against her mother.

She claims to have left to meet a friend at a nearby fitness centre while her daughter was sound asleep. She says she thought it was impossible that a five-year-old could open the heavy window, let alone climb

There are no previous complaints against the mother, but the girl's father has been battling for custody for four years and claims to have always worried for her safety.

# Woman killed in truck and bus collision

A WOMAN was killed and 10 people injured in a car crash in Murcia

A truck and a bus collided at kilometre 649 of the A-7 in the municipality of Puerto Lumbreras. The bus driver alerted the emergency services in the early hours of the morning alerting them that a truck had collided with the bus and

one of the 28 passengers on board was seriously iniured.

Five ambulance crews arrived on scene but a woman had been killed instantly. A further 10 people were attended to and taken to hospital, one of them had serious injuries and remains in the Virgen de la Arrixaca hospital in Murcia.



Director of the Valencian Agency of Security and Response to the Emergencies, Jose Maria Angel, explained that, in the forest territory of the Valencian Community, there is a high risk of

fires, which is why a 'pre-emergence risk level' is issued that indicates the level of forest fire risk. Now, this risk level will be issued for the following day to "allow us to plan resources to the administrations and agencies involved."

A level one warning indicates a low or medium risk of danger; level two means a high risk of fire and a level three is when there is an extreme risk.

The information is updated, daily, through the www.112cv. gva.es website and on social networks through the Twitter account @GVA112.

# Family can stay... for now

THE Stop Evictions platform has managed to prevent a family losing their home in Alicante.

It is the second time the group has managed to postpone an eviction. In this case a couple and their two children, aged one and three, faced being removed from a property in the Virgen del Remedio neighbourhood.

It is claimed they entered the building illegally and Marisa Garcia. spokeswoman for Stop Evictions,

said: "We have tried to have the bank offer the family a social rent in this same building, but we did not get it." Garcia added: "The family has tried to find a rented apartment with the help of the city, but nobody wants to rent to people who do not have a fixed income."

They have managed to halt the eviction this time, but have criticised the lack of social housing in Alicante to help such families.



The president, a member of the ruling Partido Popular, has become public enemy number one following claims that he lined his own pockets handing out public contracts to associates in the building of an auditorium in Puerto Lumbreras.


# Do they put in the hours?

# British ambassador gives Brexit insight in exclusive EWN interview

THE pressures of being British Ambassador to Spain during the ongoing Brexit complexities are intense. But Simon Manley showed cool professionalism openly answering concerns of British expats put to him by Caroline Tyszka in this exclusive EWN interview at the Melia Villaitana hotel complex in Benidorm.

Brexit does not mean Britain is leaving Europe, merely that it is coming out of the European Union and becoming a sovereign independent United Kingdom "tolerant at home and confident abroad "

Spelling this out, Ambassador Manley was also keen to ease other concerns of the tens of thousands of British expatriates who call

southern Spain home in the count-down to the triggering of Article 50 to Brexit.

Spain does not recognise dual nationality. What do you recommend to Britons considering applying for a Spanish passport?

"It is a matter for the individual. As British Ambassador for Spain I am not going to be recommending

people take another nationality. My priority is to ensure that in the negotiations we secure the best possible deal for British people living in Spain - and anywhere else in the EU - and that we secure that deal as soon as possible. I know through all the contacts we have had. and talking to British people across Spain, of the uncertainty they feel. I know people are very worried about reductions in their British pensions because of the fluctuating currency, and they are concerned about continuing healthcare. We are expressing these concerns to the Spanish government."

The most important thing is to prepare for the negotiations."

How often do you receive updates from the UK government regarding the Brexit process and negotiations?

"All the time, from both the Foreign Office and the new Brexit department. We are in close contact with all our European colleagues as well as understanding the position of the Spanish government, plus Spanish media and Spanish businesses. We spend a lot of time talking to Spanish investors in the UK and British investors in Spain, having a very fluid interchange with all parties."

■ There appears a positive message from Spanish regional governments, with the Valencian authorities seeking to assure the British that they will still be welcome and valued. Is this the message you are getting?

"That's right. My own contact with regional presidents all over Spain is that they are very keen to see the British here and continue to attract new business and tourism. It matters to them. The main problem is rumours and speculation via

the British media which then get picked up by their Spanish counterparts, making what is fact and what is fiction blurred. I recommend people keep an eye as a 'one-stop-shop' for accurate information - on the British government's website and Facebook page.

#### Have you been told to prepare for a worst-case scenario in the event of a hard Brexit?

"The most important thing is to prepare for the negotiations. We want to make sure they are a success, in that we come out with a sovereign independent United Kingdom which is tolerant at home, confident abroad. and engages in free trading across the world. This will give prosperity to the British people whilst having a close, constructive relationship with the European union, because we voted to leave the EU not Europe, and we will all continue to face the same threats, whether through terrorism or Russian aggression, and we need to work together to face those threats."

■ Do you think the House of Lords' decision has complicated things for the public and their understanding of what this means for Brexit, and with Tony Blair speaking out,

#### did this detract from the inevitable?

"It's really important that we realise we have a democratic parliamentary process going on, we are the world's greatest democracy, I am confident we will bring that process to a successful conclusion this month, and that Theresa May will be writing to her EU colleagues shortly. I recognise some of these developments make people wonder what is happening, which makes me come back to the British government website for updates, ensuring the things people read are the whole truth and nothing but the truth.

#### If you were a retired expat in Spain, how would you be planning for the potential changes?

"Firstly I would make sure that I was on the padron to ensure continued access to healthcare and also registering that I was legitimately here. I would also be thinking ahead and planning my finances for the future.

"It is important to remember that whilst we are leaving the EU we all face many similar challenges; combating terrorists, ageing populations and active labour markets, issues that we share and work closely together with, and will continue to do so."

# Mobiles banned in secondary schools

SECONDARY schools are prohibiting students from taking their mobile phones to school.

When students move up to secondary school, parents are reminded that a phone should not be taken to school as they are not necessary and are an expensive toy.

# New inhabitants under investigation

EXPERTS at CIMAR marine investigation centre are currently studying 11 new invasive species which have appeared in Santa Pola and Tabarca.

The increasing temperature in the Mediterranean, scientist Andres Izquierda has explained, means that marine creatures entering via the Suez Canal and Straits of Gibraltar or arriving with boats from all over the world are able to adapt to the environment and remain.

The investigation centre has asked fishermen to help by remitting any members of intrusive species they find to the Santa Pola facility to allow further study and determine whether their continued presence could affect or endanger native species.

# Violent robbers arrested

A GANG has been dismantled and arrested for carrying out violent robberies from trucks, seizing their loads to be resold on the black market.

The three arrested, two men and a woman from Torrevieja and Rojales, are also accused of being engaged in

drug trafficking.

All three are charged with crimes of belonging to a criminal organisation, robbery with intimidation, two crimes of robbery with force and a crime against public health for drug trafficking.

The investigation launched in

August last year when a foreign exchange office on the Orihuela Costa was raided. Disguising their identity and holding firearms they made away on a motorbike with around €24,000.

As the investigations continued police identified the authors of this first robbery as members of a gang that was dedicated to targeting trucks in the area of Madrid. Another robbery was carried out in Ibi where items taken, including the cargo of the trucks and a tractor, were valued at more than €200,000.

With police closing in on the gang, raids were carried out at two properties in Torrevieja and Rojales, where officers seized high end vehicles, €5,000 in cash, numerous electronic devices as well as dried and packaged marihuana and 30g of cocaine. A total of 130 marihuana plants as well as equipment used for the cultivation of marihuana was also seized.

Based on documentation and evidence found, police believe the gang was preparing for another robbery.

The two men have been remanded in prison whilst the woman has been released on

# Visitors spending more on the Costa

AROUND half a million foreign tourists visited the Costa Blanca in January, spending around 26 per cent of the foreign revenue in Spain that month.

The 481,589 tourists spent an average of €1,089 each during their trip, an annual increase of 2.8 per cent compared to January 2016.

The average duration of the trip was

8.5 days with the UK being the main source of foreign visitors, allaying any fears so far of the 'Brexit effect' putting off British travel to Spain. Tourists from Germany and the Nordic countries also headed the list of foreign tourists.

The Valencia Region was the second most popular destination in Spain for foreign tourists after the Canary Islands.

The injured man, aged 31 from Elche, was treated at the scene before being moved to the General Hospital of Elche.

It was the second accident of the week involving cyclists as just a few days before a man hunt was launched for the driver who fled the scene after hitting a cyclist and knocking him off his bike.

The 42-year-old from Elche was cycling along a rural road between Guardamar and Quesada when a vehicle hit him and the driver



# Robotic revolution



LOCAL scientists are pioneering new technology that has the potential to transform the lives of disabled people. Neuroengineers at Elche's University of Miguel Hernandez are developing a robotic skeleton that can function as a powerful arm with the use of brain waves.

The arm would be attached to a wheelchair and connected to the patient's own arm. Using willpower alone patients will be

able to direct the robot arm, having it pick up items or open doors. Special glasses will help users focus the arm on objects.

Early efforts saw the robot arm weigh a hefty 35 kilograms but it is now down to just 10. It is so precise that patients can even use it to brush their teeth and comb their hair. The psychic energy involved in directing the arm's use gives patients a feeling of power that has been

denied them for many years. Most involved in the trials are confined to wheelchairs with little use of their arms and legs.

Engineers are also working on connecting wheelchairs to visual communication systems, allowing users to talk with friends and family through Skype, WhatsApp and Facebook. They can also watch a film, or even use the robot arm to draw and paint.





THE result of the election in Northern Ireland which saw the Democratic Unionist Party (DUP) just retain a majority of one seat over rivals Sinn Féin could lead to a major Brexit problem if the two main parties are unable to agree a workable power sharing procedure.

Under the current arrangements, there has to be an agreed position between the 'protestant' DUP which wants to remain part of the UK and the 'catholic' Sinn Féin which wants to see union with the Irish Republic in order for government to remain at Stormont in

The parties have three weeks to come to form a government or there will be another election, but the Sinn Féin leaders object to the re-appointment of Arlene Foster as First Minister which is why they caused this election because of an investigation into what is

> referred to as the Renewable Heat Incentive scandal.

Should the next election see Sinn Féin obtain the majority of seats, then it would almost certainly demand immediate union with Eire, the DUP would refuse to form a government in the minority and the logical outcome is that the power to rule would then return to Westminster.

His partner was able to open the door to officers who managed to calm the man and take the child from him arms. He then became violent, resisting arrest and kicking and punching officers with two receiving treatment for minor injuries obtained during the struggle.

Due to his state, a doctor was called to administer a tranquilliser to calm him before taking him to the Vinalopo Hospital. He remains under assessment in the Psychiatry Unit.

# Torrevieja Symphony Orchestra

AN Extraordinary General Meeting of members of the Torrevieja Symphony Orchestra recently took place at the Real Club Náutico de Torrevieja. The one and only point in the agenda was for the members to make a decision about the current situation of the orchestra having to pay for rent and staff at the auditorium, the usual venue for its performances.

The president, Pelayo Mellado, and José Vicente Berná, member of the Board of Directors, explained in detail what was discussed at the meetings held with the mayor and other members from the town's administration. Even though many different options were offered to the Council, nothing has changed about the previous situation in that the law requires rent to be paid for a performance when tickets are going to be sold.

It was explained to members the difficulties with proceeding with the scheduled concerts given this unexpected payment. One solution could be to charge an extra 20 per cent for the tickets and membership fees starting next season, assuming the risk of getting less sales.

Many of the members suggested that donations could be made at every concert.

Pelayo read an email from German members, Günter and Rosemarie, who stated that "they hoped in the next negotiations, the town administration will pay attention to the high international value of the Torrevieja Symphony Orchestra and the importance of the culture in this town, as well as to promote the use of this large concert hall.

"The orchestra and the Torrevieja Auditorium belong together. The concerts are a cultural highlight that give the town a special prestige and are of great tourist and economic value." Pelayo insisted it was important to have support from the Administration in order to get this project going, and that "this support doesn't have to be just a financial one."

Former councillor of Culture at Torrevieia Town Council and fellow member, Alejandro Blanco, showed his support and explained that, in his opinion, there could be other ways to overcome this expense by a nominative subsidy from the town council.

After much debate the 61 members present voted on how to proceed. An overwhelming majority (97 per cent) voted to carry on with the remaining concerts of the season by assuming the aforementioned expenses. Only 3 per cent voted to temporarily cancel the concerts and there were no votes for moving performances to an alternative auditorium. It wouldn't make any sense to take the orchestra out of Torrevieja, when it bears the name of the town.

Members present expressed a wish to highlight the orchestra's situation to the media and reiterate to the local government about the value of the importance of continuing to have the Symphony Orchestra in Torrevieja.



# Rescue centre reopens major fundraiser as building work begins

AS construction ramps up on a secure new boundary wall funded entirely by kind donors, the Easy Horse Care Rescue Centre is calling for further donations to build the wall higher in a bid to better protect equines from winter winds and summer sun.

Co-founders Sue and Rod Weeding have reopened the rescue centre's major fundraiser and hope to raise a further €7.000 to fund the extra height, dramatically improving the lives of dozens of their rescued equines.

Sue said,"Making the wall higher will give our horses shelter from the cold north winds in winter and, in the future, allow us to create very sturdy and large field shelters for extra protection from the sun and rain, using the boundary fence as the back wall."

The new design will now include five higher sections along the 218-metre long block wall, with lower sections in between to allow the horses to look out to the road, which, Sue says, the horses love. A new gate will also provide additional secure access to the centre.

"It's a win-win situation re-

ally," says Sue, "but we do need help raising more money to go with this plan."

Rod, formerly a professional builder in the UK, is doing much of the work himself, which has reduced costs by as much as €4,000. The new donations will help cover additional blocks and materials required to increase the wall's height and strength to accommodate shelters in the future.

The major fence fundraiser was originally launched in March last year to secure the centre, following a string of break-ins and intimidatory behaviour. These acts were believed to be retaliation after Sue and Rod rescued a horse named Oscar, who arrived at the centre starving and dehy-

More than 90 donors rallied to help raise an incredible €13.000 for Sue and Rod. who felt under siege at the centre, which is also their

After a series of delays due to approvals and bad weather, work finally began on the wall late last year, with Rod completing the first of five sections last month. Importantly, this section preserved crumbling irrigation channels, remnants of a centuries-old Moorish irrigation system still used by local farmers today.

Sue urged supporters to get behind the reopened fundraiser, saying even a small donation of just €5 would help. Donors who contribute €200 or more will be honoured with a plaque on a dedicated section of the fence

# Agent Provocateur in 'pre-pack' deal



NEVER one to shy away from controversy, Mike Ashley, owner of Sports Direct and a number of other businesses is said to be in the process of purchasing luxury lingerie brand Agent Provocateur much to the disgust of one of its original founders

Joe Corré, the son of Dame Vivienne Westwood and the late Malcolm McLaren of Sex Pistols fame, cofounded Agent Provocateur in 1994 with his former wife Serena Rees and the brand currently employs some 600 people and has 11 shops in the UK.

In 2007, the couple split and at that time sold their business to private investment company 3i for a reported £60 million (€69.5 million) and Corré went on to become involved in other fashion and cosmetic operations from 2009, but he is clearly unhappy with the decision to allow Mike Ashley to become involved in his former com-

Known for his ability to obtain publicity, in late 2016 with the co-operation of his mother, the designer and entrepreneur arranged to burn an archive of punk memorabilia said to be worth £6 million (€6.95 million)

on a barge in the River Thames.

Now he has described the sale of his former 'baby' as "a disgrace to British business" and "preposterous" and has intimated that he will take further action after previously taking legal action against 3i and Ashley.

What he seems to object to is the fact that the sale is being made via a contentious financial vehicle known as a 'pre-pack administration' whereby 3i - originally founded in 1945 by the

Bank of England and various banks under a different name in order to stimulate the British economy - has allowed the sale of the company.

This type of sale means that many creditors including HM Revenue and Customs will remain unpaid whilst a major creditor, thought to be Barclays Bank may take the majority of the revenue and Corré believes that other 'safer' purchasers have been side-

3i may well lose most of their investment but will no longer have to support the struggling brand and they argue that the decision has been made by AlixPartners, the administrators of Agent Provocateur not themselves.

The purchase is actually being made by Four Holdings, the parent company of Four Marketing, which is 25 per cent owned by Sports Direct which gives rise to the accusation that Mike Ashley who is the director of 218 companies is behind the purchase.

Whilst it would seem a strange 'bed fellow' to market besides the sporting clothes and utilitarian underwear sold in the Sports Direct shops, the owner, Mr Ashley has recently taken an interest in designer clothing brands such as French Connection.

He certainly appears to want to expand and move upmarket although there is some fear that he might just take the name and existing stock and dump everything else.

# Lego NASA female pioneers

AFTER introducing such legendary fictional characters as Darth Vader, Harry Potter and Batman and to coincide with International Women's Day on March 8, Danish company Lego has announced that it will produce a set of NASA female pioneers.

> Once designed and manufactured, the collection is not expected to reach the markets until late in 2017 or early 2018.

## **Spain consulted** over Opel sale

The minister however appeared fairly comfortable with the discussions that took place and believes that if the takeover does occur, then Spain will play an important part in future developments of the new company.

# US firm raided by tax authorities

CATERPILLAR INC, an American company and the largest manufacturer of industrial machinery and trucks in the world has had three of its premises in the US raided by the authorities apparently investigating alleged tax evasion.

This follows an investigation into its Swiss subsidiary CSARL by the American authorities who accused the company of diverting funds to the semi-tax haven and supposedly

saving \$2.4 billion (€2.28 billion) in tax which should have been paid going back to 2000.

An earlier senate paper suggested that having negotiated a special tax rate of 6 per cent with the Swiss government, Caterpillar regularly reported large amounts of profits earned through CSARL even though it had transferred no staff or ongoing business to the Swiss company.

## Not as many unemployed

UNEMPLOYMENT continued to drop significantly in Spain during the last quarter of 2016 to its lowest level of 18.6 per cent and represented the lowest number of unemployed since 2009, although the fourth quarter of every year sees large numbers of seasonal jobs created which then disappear in the following month.

February figures however showed a positive result with 9,355 fewer people registered as unemployed taking the total for Spain to 3.75 million although it does appear the number who are eligible for employment has dropped as well.

According to the Ministry of Employment there are now 17,748,000 people actual registered with social security as being employed and this does not take into account those receiving cash in hand.

Overall, things are continuing to look positive although interestingly, there were 2,859 more foreign workers registered as unemployed.

# Tyre checks

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



TYRES are arguably one of the most important elements of a vehicle, but many drivers neglect them.

Through the intense daily wear they receive in hot and cold conditions, going over potholes and kerbs, they can become easily damaged so drivers are urged to carry out regular checks on their tyres to ensure they are in optimum conditions for safe driving. But what do you need to look out for?

Tyres must have enough tread to maintain grip, requiring a minimum tread depth of 1.6mm across the central area. At 1.6mm tread in wet weather it takes an extra two car lengths, around 8m, to stop if travelling at 50mph, compared to if the tread was 3mm.

Over or under inflated tyres will cause uneven wear on the tread which can also cause problems. An under inflated tyre can result in more wear on the edges of the tyres and over inflation could result in more wear in the centre. You should also check the tyre's pressure with most vehicles having a metal plate on or near the driver's inside door which will indicate the optimum pressure, which is stated as PSI. Always check tyres when they are cold for an accurate reading.

There are also calls to ban the sale of used tyres amid increasing safety fears from industry professionals.

It is estimated that hundreds of thousands of vehicles on the roads of Spain are fitted with used tyres, a figure which has increased in recent years due to the financial crisis. One mainstream supplier states that 80 per cent of their business is in the sale of used, rather than new tyres. In addition, it is believed that 60 per cent of all cars over 10 years of age are fitted

Accident investigators say that tyres are a factor in three out of four road traffic incidents, and point out that tyre wear and tear is different on all vehicles, makes and models.

As a result, industry professionals are now lobbying for the sale of used tyres to be prohibited to ensure safer conditions for drivers.

# Trump this! The Donald on women's looks and bodies





The skin of butterfly children can be so sensitive that the body must be wrapped in gauze to protect it from the mildest friction. Even the brush of a bed sheet can cause a burn-like blister. Blistering also occurs internally (in the mouth, oesophagus, intestine, airways, urinary tracts and even the inside of the eyelids) leading to further suffering and serious health problems.

Butterfly skin also becomes a disability because people suffering from this condition require intensive daily care from their relatives. They also tend to lose the use of their hands and feet due to the extent of the blistering and the retraction of the skin in these areas. Life expectancy is unfortunately short; hence the majority of its members are children.

# Millions suffering from

# osteoporosis

AROUND 3.5 million people in Spain suffer from osteoporosis and in 2010, the World Health Organisation (WHO) estimated that around 22 million women and 5.5 million men in the EU were suffering.

Osteoporosis is a bone disease that occurs when the bone mass breaks away, becoming weakened and brittle. When viewed under a microscope, a healthy bone looks like a honeycomb, but in those with osteoporosis, the holes in the honeycomb are much larger showing a loss in density and mass

It can have serious consequences for sufferers who are much more fragile and can suffer from broken bones from a slight fall or knock, with hip fractures being the most common.

In those aged over 70, around 63,000-65,000 hip fractures occur every year in Spain, related to osteoporosis. In the country, between 20 and 25 per cent of the beds of the Traumatology Services of the hospitals are occupied by osteoporosis patients who have suffered a

In 2010 there were 42,809 deaths directly related to fragility fractures in the European Union. A total of 2,550 of these deaths were in Spain.

It can have serious consequences for sufferers who are much more fragile.

The economic burden of osteoporosis is also increasing and recent studies estimate that the direct costs associated with fragility fractures in 2010 amounted to €29 billion in the five largest countries in the EU of France, Italy, Germany, Spain and Great Britain.

Commenting on the figure, the Spanish Society of Geriatrics, believes that more information and advice must be given to osteoporosis sufferers as around 80 per cent of patients discharged after a fracture receive no recommendations to help prevent the onset of a new frac-



ture. The association also wants better management, diagnosis and treatment of these pa-

# **Dealing with** high levels of cholesterol

CHOLESTEROL is a word just about everybody has heard of but many people are unaware of what it really is, so this week we've asked the doctor to explain a little.

#### - What exactly does it mean to have high cholesterol?

If after a blood test you are told that you have high cholesterol, this means that the total cholesterol levels, and in particular the LDL (or socalled 'bad' cholesterol) levels in your blood are higher than they should be.

Although the maximum amount considered normal will vary depending on other medical conditions a patient may have, generally anything over 200 is considered to be high.

However, this is not an exact figure as it depends more on how much of the cholesterol is of the socalled 'bad' variety.

#### - What are the main caus-

The main cause of high cholesterol is genetic. If you have family members with high cholesterol levels you are likely to inherit this condition. An unhealthy diet. rich in fat, and a lack of regular daily physical exercise are other things which can bring cholesterol levels up.

#### - Is it dangerous?

Yes, it is, as it can be a cardiovascular risk factor and can increase your chances of suffering heart attacks or

#### - What can be done to bring it down?

The first thing is to follow a balanced, low-fat diet and get regular physical exercise. If this fails to get the problem under control then medication, known as statins, will be necessary.

#### - Will I have to be on a diet the rest of my life to keep it down?

Yes. You will always have to stick to a balanced diet, especially as you get older as cholesterol levels tend to increase with age.


The word 'breakfast' refers to breaking the evening fast. Try simply leaving a 12-hour space between dinner and

the menopause. As we age this can get worse, with 60 per cent of women over 50 years old suffering from this uncomfortable condition. To reduce symptoms drink plenty of water, use eye drops and sprays to add extra lubrication, reduce your central heating and avoid direct heat from heaters.

■ What is conjunctivitis? Conjunctivitis is the most common eye disease in the Western hemisphere and children often get this at school and pass this on to their Mums. It is an inflammation of the conjunctiva, which makes the sclera appear reddened due to an increase in blood supply. The eye feels itchy and watery. Sometimes, there is a sticky discharge, which feels uncomfortable and makes vision blurry.

Although conjunctivitis is often referred to as 'pink eye,' this technically only refers to one type of the eye disease, bacterial conjunctivitis. Users of contact lenses should remove them and wear glasses until your symptoms recover.

# When mood changes become a bipolar disorder

Bipolar

Formally known as the manic-depressive disorder, the bipolar disorder is one of the most common mental impairments these days. Manic episodes causing problems in social or occupational functioning on the one hand, and depressive episodes with diminished interest in (almost all) activities on the other hand characterise this disorder.

Therefore it is very important to recognise the symptoms at an early stage to heal the disease and improve the life of the sufferer and relatives. According to the worldwide accepted diagnostic classification system DSM-5 (Diagnostic And Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders), very specific symptoms describe a bipolar disorder and should be confirmed by a health professional in order to take necessary steps. These symptoms describe both poles of this disorder: The manic and hypomanic episodes as well as the depressive episodes. Also duration and occurrence of these episodes are important.

Recommended treatment

Talking about the different possible treatments, the cognitive behaviouristic approach is the first choice. Free of medication and side effects, the patient learns first of all, how to recognise the abnormal and strong mood changes. This is in many cases not easy to admit because especially the manic part of this disorder comes along with an overload of euphoria and self-esteem and

"When I'm depressed I feel like not being able to do anything, I feel weak and want to stay in bed all the time, suicidal thoughts often come up. Then I have periods of feeling superstrong and hyperactive, get up at 3am, no one can stop me and I start doing stupid things that nobody understands.

But I just want to be 'normal', not jumping from one extreme to the other..."

it is hard for patients to accept the inadequateness of this behaviour. Once the patient learns how to recognise the different states, in a next step it is learned how to cope with the situations: Doing undepressive exercises limiting themselves regarding inadequate behaviour when having a manic phase. Learning this coping behaviour plus the improvement of management of their emotions is the key to control this disease.

Professional advice is important at this stage because trying to handle these situations without the experience and knowledge of a psychologist or psychiatrist is nearly impossible and not at all recommendable. To consider that especially close relatives often suffer a lot, also very important to find the motivation to seek help. Therefore, do not hesitate to look out for professional support and you will find advice in your language with treatments tailored to your needs.



# Sell-by dates - a necessity or a con?

GOOD FOOD, **GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS** GARRY WAITE

OR YEARS now, discussion has raged as to the amount of food wastage incurred domestically, as well as in our industry, although not so much as the former. The millions of tons representing 12bn pounds per year wasted have a lot to do with sell by/use by/best before dates. I notice the UK milk marketing board has challenged the government's date policy saying that no one need a use by date as it's pretty obvious when you can no longer use/drink milk!!

This is not new, in 2011 the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) said that sell by and display until dates would be replaced with 'use by' and 'best before' dates.

Dates that I do think are useful are packaging and display until/best before dates. For instance if in a supermarket a packet of fish states it was 'packed' say on 6/4 and the 'display until date' says the 8/4 that makes sense. The buyer can then decide if they are going to consume it before say the weekend (in this case 11/4) or whether to freeze it down for later use - or give it to the

One good thing about sell by dates is that shops tend to put those items that are 'out-of-date' as 'bargain buys.' I know people who will not purchase anything past its 'sell by /consume before' dates. But astute shoppers can save quite a lot of money.

In my, not so, humble opinion the information that would be more helpful to the buyer, the supplier and would save tons of wastage are the following:

FISH: Caught/farmed date packed on date - display until date

MEAT: Slaughter date - packed on date - consume preferably by date

DAIRY/VEGETABLES ETC.



MILK: That's my style of labelling!

There is a huge difference between the labelling used - and used intelligently could benefit all parties. You pays your money.....!

With frozen/jarred and tinned products that technically will not go passed their best if kept in their original state the date of packaging is the only guide that the buyer needs. We have all heard stories about canned food from the war days still being opened to be found in edible condition. I opened a tin of water chestnuts the other day that I have had in my cupboard for more than 10 years. The only reason I knew how old it was, was because of the 'sell by date'. Totally unnecessary, they were perfect!!

Most people know that a good quality piece of meat needs to hang for a couple of weeks minimum before eating. Many years ago I met a meat buyer for Marks and Spencer. He had to get up at three in the morning to get to the meat market as he had to buy the finest quality of meat available. Nothing strange about that, but he had also to make sure it was bright red, as, if it




MANY READERS ARE SURE to remember one of the UK's most respected journalists and TV anchor man Bob Friend who from the first broadcast of Sky News in 1989 became the 'Face of Sky News.

I was going through some old photos the other day and came across a few pictures of us having dinner in Marbella and reflected that he died of a brain tumour more than eight years ago at the young age of 70. He was a great practical joker with a wicked sense of humour.

He told me many stories of his more than 50 years in journalism, many self mocking. Once he had to report the death of a relevantly unknown African figure with an unpronounceable name and despite practising the delivery many times before going on air he just couldn't get the name right, so with his friend and fellow presenter, Lisa Azziz at his side (also with a sense of humour) he began to report on the sudden death of an 'important figure in Africa whose name has not been released until his family have been informed. Classic!!!

One day he was reporting or the fact that hedgehogs were fast disappearing from Britain's countryside. The reason apparently being that the 'Travellers' were eating them. So he invited viewers to send in the recipes for hedgehog!! Later that morning he phoned me and asked if I had heard the broadcast? 'Why don't you send me a recipe?' he asked. So, I did.

Hedgehog, despite being a verminous creature, is quite edible and has a flavour of chicken. The way

they are cooked is by encasing them in clay and baking them in a form of underground fire (earth oven). When cooked one breaks the clay and the spines fall away leaving a cooked 'chicken'! Las Chapas, at the time and as the breakfast programme went out (repeating the item every hour for three hours) it had Lisa (once again) giggling at such a ridiculous article but Bob continued seriously..... Garry Waite, owner of Restaurante La Reser-

va de Marbella in Marbella.... ...... For three days after the broadcast I was getting reservations for hedgehog dinner, a call and interview with BBC Radio Four Food Programme and a call from the Telegraph and Sunday Times magazine, as well as our own trade magazine the Caterer. The power of advertising?

I had forgotten how many laughs we had and what an amazingly generous man he was, both professionally and personally. Why do the best go first?

A survey from YouGov revealed that 51 per cent of new occupants endured problems ranging from un-

finished fittings to severe electrical faults. The poll also found that a plurality of people believed that secondhand homes were better than new builds and would rather

One developer has already had to fork out almost €10 million in compensation for faults.

Meanwhile housing chari-

ties have denounced the government's building plans as skewed towards favouring developers earning a profit, rather than struggling families getting a proper roof over their head.

# New Spain, new mortgage market

The solution appears to have been placing the business of mortgages into the private sector, allowing new and energised competition to the battered banks, while enhancing govern-

Mortgages in Spain are now vastly more secure propositions than in the past, or in the US for example. The industry is at an exciting juncture, confident and creative enough to move forward and embrace the future.

### Brit buyers due billions

AS much as €6.2 billion could be dished out to the estimated 130,000 Brits who lost their deposits to bankrupt developers across Spain. The figure, almost triple the initially floated figure of €2.3 billion, was released by legal specialists Spanish Legal Reclaims.

The firm reckons that more Brits than previously imagined are due money and are likely to win their legal battles. Recent success stories have injected them with confidence that if affected Brits come forward they have a better chance of winning than ever before.

Spanish courts are bracing themselves for an avalanche of cases after the Supreme Court ruled that banks must repay deposits if the developer went bankrupt. Although each case is different, the landmark ruling is certain to result in billions being paid out.

One such example is the case of Malcolm Young, who has now been awarded the €130,000 he put down as a deposit for a Marbella apartment in 2004. The CEO of Spanish Legal Reclaims, Luis Cuervo, has said that British buyers "will finally get what they are owed."

# End to unfair tax



MORE than half a million home owners across Spain could be in for a cash windfall as an avalanche of regional judgements finally reached the Constitutional Court. At the end of February national judges put an end to the surplus value tax controversy, raising hopes among the estimated 550,000 sellers who lost out to the unconstitutional levv.

The surplus value tax is a financial obligation imposed on anyone selling their property in Spain to pay tax on the 'increased' value of the land. The bizarrely complex calculation means thousands of people have had to fork out thousands of euros even when they take a heavy hit on a sale.

Momentum began when an Andalucian court ruled that it was unfair to charge a Costa del Sol

seller €5,000 in increased value tax when he sold a property he bought for €230,000 for just €70,000.

The latest decision from the Constitutional Court helps bring the wildly varying situations across the Spanish regions under some kind of national control.

It also means that courts across the land can expect a tidal wave of surplus value tax cases concerning the 550,000 properties that have been unfairly charged. With taxes paid ranging from €1-10,000, the total payout is likely to be in the

The decision also removes a valuable source of income for Spain's hundreds of municipal governments.

# Palm trees are ideal for a Mediterranean garden

A PALM tree has always been a must for the ideal landscape design in the Mediterranean garden. Palm lined strands, boulevards and well-placed palms around water features signal the relaxing atmosphere of enjoying hot days sitting by the pool or bathing in the sun or sea at the beach.

Over the last 10-15 years, the palm tree has been in serious decline due to a ravenous red beetle or weevil (Rhynchophorus ferrugineus) that has decimated thousands of Canary Island palms in Spain and has adversely affected other palm species as

The outbreak of the weevil is not yet under control in most areas of Spain or other Mediterranean and Middle Eastern countries where palms are prevalent. Fortunately the Canary Islands have been successful in eradicating the weevil through strict monitoring, sanitation and treatment of their thousands of palm trees.

Early detection is normally obtained with a specific pheromone trap for the weevil and just one adult caught indicates action is required to protect the palms in the vicinity. An adult female weevil can lay around 200 eggs. New treatments to combat the weevil are being developed to assist in the battle to save the palms, including chemical and biological agents.

The weevil is originally from Asia where it is a major pest of coconut palms. It appears that Canary Island palms are its favourite in Spain but it can also affect other palms such as the Sago, Date, Washing-

ton, Sugar, Betel nut and Toddy palms.

If you have a palm tree that is healthy, it is best to have it checked by a person trained in palm care. If you have a sick or dead palm then have it completely removed. Once a palm shows signs of drooping leaves and stunted growth it is usually too late to save it. It will be necessary to have it disposed of in accordance with regional authorities guidelines.

The insect is extremely thorough in its infestation of the palm with eggs in cracks and crevices, larvae tunnelling through the palm and pupae in the roots in the ground so it is extremely difficult to eliminate all stages of growth completely.

In order to eradicate the weevil all palms should be checked and treated appropriately as was done in the Canary Islands. Eradication will require good community cooperation if it is to succeed. How many palms will remain in Spain before the weevil is stopped depends on the cooperation of everyone involved in landscapes containing palms and the preventative measures to protect the remaining healthy palms by responsible authorities and owners

The Mediterranean garden will not be the same if the weevil is not stopped as all susceptible unprotected palms will eventually be lost. It would be hard to imagine the loss of such an icon of the region.

### March garden tasks

SPRING is coming and that means there is more to do in the garden to prepare for it. Airing the lawn, starting to plant seeds and carrying out the first fertilising treatments are a few of them.

Houseplants: no matter what time of year it is, indoor plants always need their leaves washing gently to remove dust and dirt. It's now time to start increasing the amount of water we give them and add some fertiliser

Garden plants, bushes and trees: Rose bushes should be fertilised after pruning. Now is also the time to divide up lively plants and take cuttings of geraniums, chrysanthemums and dahlias. It's also a good time to plant aromatic plants.

Lawns: As temperatures increase weeds may appear amongst the grass that we need to remove. We must also air the lawn and start fertilising it, as well as replacing any deteriorated areas in preparation for spring.

Watering: As the weather warms up, depending on how much rain there is we may need to start upping watering routines, especially for plants that are starting to bud, and we can start including some liquid fertiliser in the water. Watering should be done in the morning to avoid fungal growth caused by excessively damp

Pruning: Winter's nearly over so there are various pruning tasks to get done. By the end of this month we should have finished pruning fruit trees, rosebushes, trees and bushes and grasses like Pampas grasses should be cut right down.

# Paint it yourself tips for success


IF you're thinking of taking spring cleaning a step further and painting any of your rooms yourself, bear these tips in mind to make the experience a successful one.

Before getting the brushes and rollers out, it's vital to ensure all furniture and fittings are well protected with plastic sheets and tape.

Experts say painting should always be done from top to bottom. If you're painting the ceiling too start there to avoid leaving marks or dribbles on newly-painted walls.

Once you move onto the walls, again the key is to work from the top downwards. To ensure an even coating on all areas, work in areas of about 60 by 60 centimetres at a time.

Go slowly and take frequent breaks so as not to wear yourself out. Once the first coat is on, take a well-deserved break and don't rush to do the second coat until the first has dried. Depending on the conditions and the paint itself, this can take between eight and 24 hours.

# The sit and stay



#### **David THE Dogman**

THIS is an exercise that can only be correctly taught if each stage is perfected before continuing on to the next stage. The training for this exercise should be started indoors, the dog on the lead and no distractions. Initially the handler should kneel on the floor with the dog close to the handler's left side.

1. Give the SIT command once only, whilst putting the dog into the sit position at your left side, thereafter NEVER recommand, even if the dog moves. Pull up and back with your right hand in the collar, simultaneously push down with your left hand on the dog's back just above the base of his tail. Never apply pressure any higher up the dog's back as this could cause injury.

PRAISE the dog quietly once he is settled and comfortable in the SIT and remains there without any physical restraint from the handler. If the dog moves, replace him into the SIT with no further com-

> SIT COMMAND: Praise the dog once he is settled.

mands. Do this as often as necessary, until he is sitting still and comfortably, praise quietly, then give the release command and at the same time move the dog from where he is sitting. PRAISE.

2. Repeat stage 1 until the dog is sitting when commanded with confidence. Always use the method described in stage 1 to guide the dog into the sit position. Gently try to pull or push the dog out of position (the handler should still be kneeling next to the dog), but be prepared to place him back into the SIT should he move. If he resists your gentle attempts to dislodge him, PRAISE and give the release command.

If the attempts to move succeed - place him back into the sit position without commanding and go back to stage 1 and start again, until he is doing the

The more frequently stages 1 and 2 are repeated the easier it will be to progress through this exercise and the more reliable your dog will be.

3. When the dog is doing stage 2 confidently, without moving, the exercise can be expanded. Put the dog into the SIT and with, as little fuss as possible, stand upright. If he moves, put him straight back into the SIT without saying a word. When you are able to stand next to him use the lead, gently applying pressure to the collar to test the sit. If he moves again, replace him giving no extra commands and start stage 3 again. When he is resisting your attempts to move him from the sit PRAISE and RE-

NB On no account should you proceed any further if he is not reliable on stage 3.

4. When he is doing stage 3 reliably and confidently, the exercise can again be expanded. Place him in the SIT, take a couple of steps away from him, but be ready to put him back just as he moves. Using the lead again, gently apply pressure to the collar, return to the dog immediately, PRAISE profusely and then RELEASE.

NEVER release the dog until you are standing by his side or he will never do a reliable sit

#### THE DOWN STAY

This is taught in exactly the same stages as the SIT - remember to only command the dog once and only when you are standing next to him, always replace him into position using no extra commands and PRAISE and RELEASE at the end of each sit/down.

When both the sit and down are perfected with no distraction indoors, use different places where there are no distractions and start again at stage 1, working through all the stages. Perfect the technique by gradually increasing the distractions ie rattling a bunch of keys, dropping your hanky etc.

NEVER TEMPT FATE by leaving the dog in a stay where a sudden distraction could cause an accident ie untethered outside a shop.


# Alex loves spaniels

# Texting epidemic

DRIVING while using a phone will soon become as unforgivable as drink driving according to the UK government. Tough new laws punishing phone offenders came into place on March 1.

New drivers, who have passed their test within two years, could have their licence revoked if caught using a phone just once. Six penalty points and a £200 fine will be imposed on anyone caught. Experienced drivers caught twice face disqualification and a £1,000 fine.

The use of mobile phones on British roads has been described as an epidemic. There were 22 deaths and 99 serious injuries as a direct consequence of phone use in 2016. Research has shown that drivers who text take twice as long to react as those who have drunk mod-

# lissan Navara double cab

ONCE, pick-up trucks were just pick-up trucks, rugged workhorses normally seen on building sites. But when double-cab versions began to be produced, the humble pick-up developed an exciting new life as a dual-purpose family vehicle.

These days pick-ups are produced by several manufacturers but few can match Nissan for experience: the company has been making them for more than 80 years.

Nissan's latest Navara underlines just how far the double cab pick-up has come: it has a stylish exterior, a luxury interior, highspec standard equipment and the driving refinement of a family car.

It's not surprising really as most are bought by small business-



transport and thus require all the comfort and technology now common in most cars. Indeed, Nissan estimates 95 per cent of all Navara models will be double cab.

Navara prices start at €28,781 (£24,560) but the luxury versions cost more - my flagship Tekna all-wheel-drive with auto transmission cost €38,403 (£32,770). Standard kit includes 18-inch alloy wheels, roof rails, parking sensors, leather seats, four powered windows, air-conditioning, hill-start assist, auto lights and wipers, limited slip differential, cruise control with speed limiter, radio/ CD/USB/AUX and Bluetooth, sat-nav and HD touchscreen.

Tekna models also come with 360-degree camera monitoring, meaning you can see all around the vehicle when

sounds like the spec of a premium model, and the similarity doesn't end there because on the tarmac, despite its large overall footprint, the Navara has much of the refinement and road manners of a crossover model. And in the cabin, the Tekna's leather seats and classy dashboard styling that makes you think you in in something quite superior.

With four doors, access to the rear seats is easy and there is plenty of head and legroom. The front seats are very comfortable and you get a commanding driving position. Underway the 2.3 litre diesel engine is remarkably smooth and quiet, and gives a nippy 0-100 kph time of 10.8 seconds. Top speed is 180 kph (112 mph) and combined fuel figure is 14.5 kpl (41 mpg).

Ride quality is exceptionally good for this type of vehicle, thanks largely to independent multi-link rear suspension instead of traditional leaf-springs. The steering is well-weighted and responsive and the cornering composure very good, though obviously not quite up to car standards.

The open load bay (payload is 1,059 kg) is lined with a durable plastic and there is an optional hard top which offers greater security and works from the remote central

# New vehicles to feature unlimited 4G internet

UNLIMITED wifi is coming soon to new cars. Fast and strong 4G internet is being built in to new vehicles produced by American behemoth General Motors. From March 3 drivers eveing new rides at the other side of the pond have the tempting offer of in-vehicle 4G wifi for just \$20 (€19) per month.

Chevrolet, a General Motors brand, conducted research last year which found that its drivers and passengers used more than four million gigabytes of data in their cars. That amounts to almost 20 million hours of video.

Other General Motors brands include Buick and Cadillac, but the Americans are only jumping on a very busy bandwagon as firms across the world try to capture a new consumer imagination. Just as bars and cafes now need a wifi

hotspot to compete on the modern high street, car manufacturers too are catching up with demand.

In-built wifi with affordable monthly contracts is still a unique selling point, with just a few million enabled cars roaming American roads.

In Europe the first forays into wifi-enabled cars are likely to come from a Ford-Vodafone partnership. A deal has already been announced to bring 4G hotspots into new Ford cars.

The exact timetable and price expectations remain sketchy but up to 10 devices will be able to be connected at any one time.

That suggests the modern car will soon become a humdrum of online activity. How drivers will feel about transporting half a dozen netizens plugged into the iPhones, iPads, and iMacs, remains to be seen.

Particularly frustrating when they face a hefty fine and penalty points for even making a call.
