

Hot pursuit



Hash smuggler nabbed after dramatic car chase

A spectacular Hollywoodstyle car chase ended in the seizure of 631 kilos of hashish resin and one arrest in Es-

The massive haul was being transported in a Citroen C5 which has also been impounded after several Guardia Civil patrol vehicles were involved in a hair-raising 40kilometre pursuit.

The drama unfolded after officers were called to assist the occupants of a vehicle that had been involved in a traffic accident at kilometre 25 of the A-7 motorway in San Roque, Cadiz.

One of the patrolmen was charged with controlling passing traffic, and his suspicions were raised as the French motor approached since it was straining under a heavy load which appeared to outweigh the maximum permitted on Spanish highways.

As he gestured to the car to pull over, the driver instead put his foot down and hurtled away at breakneck speed.

The startled officer was forced to take evasive action to avoid being flattened, but managed to spot a number of bale-like objects on the back seat.

Meanwhile, his partner, who had seen everything, leapt into the patrol car and began to chase the fugitive, with a number of other police vehicles joining in as the

alarm was raised.

The dangerous high-speed pursuit continued as far as Estepona, where the trafficker left the motorway and entered a hotel car park, where he was eventually subdued following a violent struggle.

A beach in northern Spain has kicked sand in the eyes of all would-be Costa competitors by being placed in a ranking of the World's Best Beaches. Southern Spain and the Balearic Islands boast miles and miles of fabulous beaches, some jam-packed with tourists from all over Europe every summer, others offering relaxing peace and quiet year-round. But it is La Concha Beach in San Sebastian that tops all others in Spain, bagging sixth place in TripAdvisor's just-announced list of the World's Best 25 Beaches for 2017.

How cool!

THE only beach in Spain to make the Top 25, visitors to La Concha are able to paddle out to the small island of Santa Clara with its own beach bar and lighthouse, but it comes with a weather warning since San Sebastian does not enjoy near-year-round sunshine, as many southern Spain beaches do.

The global ranking was once again topped by Baia Do Sancho beach, on the stunning volcanic archipelago of Fernando de Noronha, Brazil.

With crystalline water, white sands and a breathtaking backdrop of high cliffs and tropical forest, it is a truly idyllic spot.

Grace Bay in the Turks and Caicos Islands, near the Bahamas, claimed second spot, while Eagle Beach on the tiny Caribbean island of Arruba was placed third.

Police inhibitor wreaks havoc

MODERN car drivers are reporting issues with their vehicles when driving past, or parking near, the National Police station in Torremolinos.

People parking their cars on Skal and Brasil Street find they cannot lock their cars with remote keys, often resulting in people unknowingly leaving their vehicles unlocked.

Similar issues occur at every station however the signal strength and range of the frequency inhibitor at the Torremolinos headquarters has caused numerous complaints.

There have also been reports of the latest models of cars shutting down when driving past the station, blocking the road until the inhibitor is turned off or the car is towed.

Residents have been at loggerheads with the police for years but one resident said although it is "much easier to steal a car on this street, the fact that its next to a police station compensates it." A police spokesperson said the inhibitors are "essential for the security of every police station," and frequencies are "limited and cannot be changed."

Checking change

SO many bi-metal coins are in circulation and being passed in place of €1 and €2 coins that National Police are now urging people to check they are being handed euro coins as change. People who try to pass off foreign coins are committing an offence.

Cashing in on €500 notes

A TRADING scam which saw more than €50 million laundered with profits of €1.5 million has seen Guardia Civil and National Police in Madrid arrest 26 people.

The scam involved alleged responsible gold dealers making significant payments - always using €500 notes specifically sought from banks - for scrap gold.

However, rather than using them to purchase gold, they supplied the high value notes to drug cartels in exchange for smaller denominations, charging an extra 3 per cent for their ser-



Postcard from **OSASUN**A



DECLARED a site of historic and artistic importance, Osuna is a feast of history, culture and gastronomy for the discerning visitor.

The town with a population of just under 20,000 and about a one-hour drive from Sevilla, can trace its history back 3,000 years when it was inhabited by the Tartessos who lived in parts of what is now modern-day Portugal and Spain.

In the days of Marc Antony it was a town for legionary veterans who were given status as Roman Citizens although it became part of the Moorish invasion before being 'freed' in 1239 by Fernando III of Castile.

Many of the town's buildings date back to Renaissance times with visiting classical scholars and historians consequently finding visits fascinating and educational.

Surrounded by forests and olive plantations, the area also boasts a lagoon with flamingos and herons along with abundant flora and fauna. Additionally some mountainous areas offer incredible vistas, though visitors must allow for cold winters and hot summers.

Dancing off into the sunset

A PARTY of 120 diners of Romanian origin, celebrating a baptism, paid a Castilla v Leon restaurant a €900 deposit saying they would settle the balance at the end of the meal. But just before the dessert, they formed a conga line and shot out, leaving a €2,000 bill unpaid.

"It happened in the space of a minute," said restaurant owner Antonio Rodriguez. "It was something

It later emerged the same people have a history of not paying their bills, and have been dubbed the 'kings of simpa,' which is a diminutive of the Spanish 'Sin pagar' [without paying]. They are thought to be responsible for legging it from another restaurant in the area after a wedding banquet earlier this year.

Drag despair

A CONTESTANT in a Las Palmas drag queen competition won after dressing as the Virgin Mary, and then returned depicting the crucifixion. The Bishop of the Canary Islands, Francisco Cases, has since described the performance as "frivolous blasphemy" which made him even sadder than when the Spanair plane crashed in 2008.

No to wall

THE national construction company Grupo ACS will not bid for any contract involving US President Trump's proposed wall on the Mexican border, company head Florentino Pérez has revealed, contradicting a suggestion by its German subsidiary Hochtief.

"We have not even considered it and, moreover, it is not our speciality," said the businessman and Real Madrid head honcho.

His words came a day after Marcelino Fernandez Verdes, head of Hochtief and widely considered to be Perez' successor-in-waiting. suggested that the firm is looking to win more business in the US.

"At the moment the plans of Donald Trump's government are unknown, but we are open to all types of contract," he said.

Animal alert

A STUFFED lion, crocodiles and a number of rare and exotic birds were seized in an operation coordinated by Interpol across 42 countries. Guardia Civil officers helped carry out some of the near 6.000 inspections with almost 60 people believed to be smuggling or selling protected species of flora and fauna.



Plot thickens in the Agnese case

A NIGHTCLUB porter is facing charges over the mysterious disappearance of Latvian waitress Agnese Klavina from a Marbella nightclub. Detectives believe the worker at Aqwa Mist may have helped prime suspects Westley Capper and Craig Porter bundle the girl into their car.

Capper, who faces a court trial over a drink and drug fuelled hit and run killing of a Bolivian mother in San Pedro last May, is believed to have called the porter 48 times after Klavina's disappearance in September 2014.

Personal connections and an assumed friendship with the British suspects have been sufficient for Spanish prosecutors to investigate the man. Klavina's family lawyers have also voiced their suspicion that he was involved.

Video surveillance shows him holding the door of a car closed against the waitress as she struggled to exit the vehicle. The question is whether the janitor was following instructions from Capper.

What exactly happened that night or Agnese's ultimate fate remains unknown but the National Police's homicide unit are adamant that she was kidnapped.

Capper, the son of a wealthy British property developer, told police that she entered the car voluntarily and that he and Porter dropped her off at a

roundabout while they did cocaine.

In the absence of a solid criminal prosecution case, Agnese's family have launched a private, civil prosecution. They want the courts to imprison the men until more evidence can be gathered. That motion was denied but a travel ban has been imposed.

AFTER the moving campaign urging Marbella to name a street after Pablo Raez gathered almost 200,000 signatures, Mayor Jose Bernal has expressed his support.

Raez, who inspired millions during his courageous battle with leukemia,

died in February aged just 20.

The young man from Ojen singlehandedly managed to increase bone marrow donations across the Costa del Sol by 1,400 per cent through his inspiring messages on social media.

Hundreds gathered at his funeral, with even the Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy paying tribute to Pablo

and his family.

The petition to have a Marbella street named after him began on Change.org and quickly captured the public's imagination. With Bernal's support it looks certain to become a reality. The mayor says it may be a street, square, boulevard or health cen-

War over a woman

INVESTIGATORS are slowly piecing together the fateful night in Benalmadena that left one man dead, another injured, and two possibly facing murder charges. Police believe the suspects and victims initially squared off inside a cocktail bar when one apparently flirted with another's girlfriend.

Last week the Euro Weekly News reported two men were arrested over an apparent revenge hit and run attack on two youths riding a moped. One man, the 40-year-old owner of the Renault Laguna used in the killing, was arrested on the night. His accomplice, 24, came forward of his own accord four days later.

They are accused of taking revenge on two youths of Moroccan descent, 22 and 19, after the fight by driving into their moped. One died instantly and the other is in critical condition.

Both tested positive for alcohol and cocaine. Eyewitnesses described how they drove the Renault into the moped which was dragged for several metres.



HUNDREDS of artists and public figures have protested the controversial decision to build a monstrous 135 metre hotel at the port of Malaga.

The enormous skyscraper would tower over the rest of the gateway to the Costa del Sol, dominating the skyline and panorama. A Qatari consortium funded by rich Arab Sheikhs is already drawing up blueprints.

Cultural groups across the city have denounced the decision and plan public protests. They warn building the tower will have irreversible consequences for Malaga and its traditional seafaring façade. It will also obscure views to the Cathedral and other historical landmarks.

Despite the strong opposition, politicians from all sides are unusually united in their

defence of the project. Mayor Francisco de la Torre says the hotel will be beautifully designed, help create jobs and guarantee the port's economic viability into the future.

Still the critics argue beauty is in the eye of the beholder and that short-term economics cannot justify changing the face of the Costa del Sol's biggest city forever.

European Union rejects House of Lords report

EUROPEAN politicians are up in arms over a House of Lords report that suggests the UK could exit the EU without paying a €60 billion 'divorce settlement.'

That is the potential sum which the UK would have to pay to meet existing commitments according to the European Commission (EC) and 27 EU member states.

However, an analysis by the House of Lords EU financial affairs subcommittee published on Saturday concluded that the UK would be in a strong legal position should it opt to abstain from

Gianni Pittella, who is leader of the socialists in the European parliament and likely to play a key role in Brexit negotiations immediately accused Theresa May of incompetence and bullying.

"Theresa May is a bull in a China shop," he said. "She likes playing the role of the hardliner, but she's just coming across as fully inadequate to live up to this incredibly delicate historical phase.

"Against this background, it is extremely important that the UK is called upon to honour all financial obligations falling due, up to and including the date of its with-

make payments to the EU in "The reality will soon wake 2019 and 2020, although they may continue until 2023. "Without an agreement on this and other crucial

issues, talks on future relationships between the EU and UK cannot start," continued Pittella. "Madame May is fully aware of this, but she's still fooling

her up. Negotiations between the European Union and UK should be concluded in good faith and a spirit of mutual respect to ensure the orderly exit of the UK from the EU."

Northern Ireland election and Brexit

THE result of the election in Northern Ireland which saw the Democratic Unionist Party (DUP) just retain a majority of one seat over rivals Sinn Féin could lead to a major Brexit problem if the two main parties are unable to agree a workable power sharing

Under the current arrangements, there has to be an agreed position between the 'protestant' DUP which wants to remain part of the UK and the 'catholic' Sinn Féin which wants to see union with the Irish Republic in order for government to remain at Stormont in

The parties have three weeks to come to form a government or there will be another election, but the Sinn Féin leaders object to the re-appointment of Arlene Foster as First Minister which is why they caused this election because of an investigation into what is

> referred to as the Renewable Heat Incentive scandal.

Should the next election see Sinn Féin obtain the majority of seats, then it would almost certainly demand immediate union with Eire, the DUP would refuse to form a government in the minority and the logical outcome is that the power to rule would then return to Westminster.

The roofs of the Church of Santa Maria de la Encarnacion la Mayor, the tallest of the historical monuments in the town, have been prepared for visits through a €140,000 project designed by local architect Sergio Valadez.





Best possible deal all important - envoy

British ambassador gives Brexit insight in exclusive EWN interview

THE pressures of being British Ambassador to Spain during the ongoing Brexit complexities are intense. But Simon Manley showed cool professionalism openly answering concerns of British expats put to him by Caroline Tyszka in this exclusive EWN interview at the Melia Villaitana hotel complex in Benidorm.

Brexit does not mean Britain is leaving Europe, merely that it is coming out of the European Union and becoming a sovereign independent United Kingdom "tolerant at home and confident abroad."

Spelling this out, Ambassador Manley was also keen to ease other concerns of the tens of thousands of British expatriates who call

southern Spain home in the count-down to the triggering of Article 50 to Brexit.

> My priority is to ensure that in the negotiations we secure the best possible deal for British people living in Spain."

Spain does not recognise dual nationality. What do you recommend to Britons considering applying for a Spanish passport?

"It is a matter for the individual. As British Ambassador for Spain I am not going to be recommending

people take another nationality. My priority is to ensure that in the negotiations we secure the best possible deal for British people living in Spain - and anywhere else in the EU - and that we secure that deal as soon as possible. I know through all the contacts we have had. and talking to British people across Spain, of the uncertainty they feel. I know people are very worried about reductions in their British pensions because of the fluctuating currency, and they are concerned about continuing healthcare. We are expressing these concerns to the Spanish government."

How often do you receive updates from the UK government regarding the Brexit process and negotiations?

"All the time, from both the Foreign Office and the new Brexit department. We are in close contact with all

our European colleagues as well as understanding the position of the Spanish government, plus Spanish media and Spanish businesses. We spend a lot of time talking to Spanish investors in the UK and British investors in Spain, having a very fluid interchange with all parties."

■ There appears a positive message from Spanish regional governments, with the Valencian authorities seeking to assure the British that they will still be welcome and valued. Is this the message you are getting?

"That's right. My own

contact with regional presidents all over Spain is that they are very keen to see the British here and contin-He to attract new business and tourism. It matters to them. The main problem is rumours and speculation via the British media which

then get picked up by their

Spanish counterparts, making what is fact and what is fiction blurred. I recommend people keep an eye as a 'one-stop-shop' for accurate information - on the British government's website and Facebook page.

The most important thing is to prepare for the negotiations."

Have you been told to prepare for a worst-case scenario in the event of a hard Brexit?

"The most important thing is to prepare for the negotiations. We want to make sure they are a success, in that we come out with a sovereign independent United Kingdom which is tolerant at home, confident abroad, and engages in free trading across the world. This will give prosperi-

ty to the British people whilst having a close, constructive relationship with the European union, because we voted to leave the EU not Europe, and we will all continue to face the same threats, whether through terrorism or Russian aggression, and we need to work together to face those threats."

■ Do you think the House of Lords' decision has complicated things for the public and their understanding of what this means for Brexit, and with Tony Blair speaking out, did this detract from the inevitable?

"It's really important that we realise we have a democratic parliamentary process going on, we are the world's greatest democracy, I am confident we will bring that process to a successful conclusion this month, and that Theresa May will be writing to her EU colleagues shortly. I recognise some of these developments make people wonder what is happening, which makes me come back to the British government website for updates, ensuring the things people read are the whole truth and nothing but the truth.

■ If you were a retired expat in Spain, how would you be planning for the potential changes?

"Firstly I would make sure that I was on the padron to ensure continued access to healthcare and also registering that I was legitimately here. I would also be thinking ahead and planning my finances for the future.

"It is important to remember that whilst we are leaving the EU we all face many similar challenges; combating terrorists, ageing populations and active labour markets, issues that we share and work closely together with, and will continue to do so."



MARCH is Brain Tumour Awareness Month and, appropriately, four-year-old Leo Bermejo from Almeria is about to embark on what could be lifesaving treatment in the States.

Doctors at the Oklahoma clinic have now completed their assessments with Leo and consultations with cancer experts on each side of the Atlantic.

They have recommended 31 proton sessions, which will be given Monday to Friday, so once it begins it will involve approximately six weeks of treatment.

The consensus is that Leo needs full brain and spine proton therapy with a boost to the tumour bed. As mum Karen says, "The treatment needs to be aggressive to kill this beast."

Leo will be given a lower dose to the healthy brain and he will not be any worse than he is now. Karen added: "The doses that we have dis-

cussed are the same doses that another child has had who had the closest condition I could find to Leo.

"I have been in contact with the mother of this child who also had weakness in one side and loss of speech but he is progressing and now goes to a normal school.

Rapper's petition

MALLORCA

ALMOST 8,000 people signed the change.org petition asking for the acquittal of Majorcan rapper known as Valtonyc. A bank account accepting donations has been set up to aid in the rapper's legal costs.

Best ensimada

A TOTAL of 10 finalists competed for the title of 'best ensimada in the world' on Balearic's Day. First prize went to the bakery Forn de Sant Francesc in Inca, winning 1,000 kilograms of flour from Hijos de Romon Oliver, the company that organised the event.

Popular parliament

AROUND 2,000 people visited the headquarters of the Balearic Island's Parliament on Balearic's Day. The president of Parliament Baltasar Picornell personally received all groups of visitors.

Saving lives

THE town of Calvia along with Mayor Alfonso Rodriguez Badal recognised and honoured the civil protection and emergency services. Volunteers worked 8,755 hours in 2016 in both preventative and emergency capacities.

Dockers strike

DOCKWORKERS called off their planned strikes on March 6 and 8 in the hope that the national ministry for development will enter into real negotiations

Out of work

UNEMPLOYMENT rose very slightly in Almeria in February, with 383 more people registered as out of work than at the end of January, bringing the total in the province to 63.047.

Naval visit

FOUR minesweeper ships, the Segura, Sella, Tambre and Tajo, currently carrying out exercises in Murcia region and Gulf of Vera waters, were docked in Almeria City port and open for visits, the Ministry of Defence reported.

Too much smoke

A WOMAN had to be taken to Torrecardenas Hospital after inhaling large amounts of smoke when her fourthstorey flat in the city centre caught fire, Almeria fire brigade reported.

Another death

EOUINAC volunteers were called out to Cabo de Gata when a twometre dolphin was washed ashore. The ecologist group is concerned about the high numbers of dolphins and turtles appearing dead on the province's beaches.

Migrants spotted

POLIMNIA lifeboat was sent out after a dinghy with 32 African migrants (30 men and two women) was spotted by a patrol ship near Alboran Island.



Agent Provocateur in 'pre-pack' deal

NEVER one to shy away from controversy, Mike Ashley, owner of Sports Direct and a number of other businesses is said to be in the process of purchasing luxury lingerie brand Agent Provocateur much to the disgust of one of its original founders

Joe Corré, the son of Dame Vivienne Westwood and the late Malcolm McLaren of Sex Pistols fame, cofounded Agent Provocateur in 1994 with his former wife Serena Rees and the brand currently employs some 600 people and has 11 shops in the UK.

In 2007, the couple split and at that time sold their business to private investment company 3i for a reported £60 million (€69.5 million) and Corré went on to become involved in other fashion and cosmetic operations from 2009, but he is clearly unhappy with the decision to allow Mike Ashley to become involved in his former com-

Known for his ability to obtain publicity, in late 2016 with the co-operation of his mother, the designer and entrepreneur arranged to burn an archive of punk memorabilia said to be worth £6 million (€6.95 million)

on a barge in the River Thames.

Now he has described the sale of his former 'baby' as "a disgrace to British business" and "preposterous" and has intimated that he will take further action after previously taking legal action against 3i and Ashley.

What he seems to object to is the fact that the sale is being made via a contentious financial vehicle known as a 'pre-pack administration' whereby 3i - originally founded in 1945 by the

Bank of England and various banks under a different name in order to stimulate the British economy - has allowed the sale of the company.

This type of sale means that many creditors including HM Revenue and Customs will remain unpaid whilst a major creditor, thought to be Barclays Bank may take the majority of the revenue and Corré believes that other 'safer' purchasers have been side-

3i may well lose most of their investment but will no longer have to support the struggling brand and they argue that the decision has been made by AlixPartners, the administrators of Agent Provocateur not themselves.

The purchase is actually being made by Four Holdings, the parent company of Four Marketing, which is 25 per cent owned by Sports Direct which gives rise to the accusation that Mike Ashley who is the director of 218 companies is behind the purchase.

Whilst it would seem a strange 'bed fellow' to market besides the sporting clothes and utilitarian underwear sold in the Sports Direct shops, the owner, Mr Ashley has recently taken an interest in designer clothing brands such as French Connection.

He certainly appears to want to expand and move upmarket although there is some fear that he might just take the name and existing stock and dump everything else.

Lego NASA female pioneers

AFTER introducing such legendary fictional characters as Darth Vader, Harry Potter and Batman and to coincide with International Women's Day on March 8, Danish company Lego has announced that it will produce a set of NASA female pioneers.

Spain consulted over Opel sale

US firm raided by tax authorities

CATERPILLAR INC, an American company and the largest manufacturer of industrial machinery and trucks in the world has had three of its premises in the US raided by the authorities apparently investigating alleged tax evasion.

This follows an investigation into its Swiss subsidiary CSARL by the American authorities who accused the company of diverting funds to the semi-tax haven and supposedly

saving \$2.4 billion (€2.28 billion) in tax which should have been paid going back to 2000.

An earlier senate paper suggested that having negotiated a special tax rate of 6 per cent with the Swiss government, Caterpillar regularly reported large amounts of profits earned through CSARL even though it had transferred no staff or ongoing business to the Swiss company.

Not as many unemployed

UNEMPLOYMENT continued to drop significantly in Spain during the last quarter of 2016 to its lowest level of 18.6 per cent and represented the lowest number of unemployed since 2009, although the fourth quarter of every year sees large numbers of seasonal jobs created which then disappear in the following month.

February figures however showed a positive result with 9,355 fewer people registered as unemployed taking the total for Spain to 3.75 million although it does appear the number who are eligible for employment has dropped as well.

According to the Ministry of Employment there are now 17,748,000 people actual registered with social security as being employed and this does not take into account those receiving cash in hand.

Overall, things are continuing to look positive although interestingly, there were 2,859 more foreign workers registered as unemployed.

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad



MANY UK expatriates living in Spain own properties in the UK and have pensions and investments in the UK. They rely on their UK assets to maintain their lifestyles (and those of their families) in Spain. If they can no longer manage their affairs in the UK due to a loss of mental capacity, it can cause many difficulties.

You can choose a person or people, who you trust, to act for you when you are no longer able.

The best way to avoid the legal and practical difficulties that can occur with the loss of mental capacity is to plan for it in advance by drawing up a document called a 'Lasting Power of Attorney' ('LPA').



An LPA must be made while you have full mental capacity.

Unfortunately there is no international type of LPA which is guaranteed to work in both the UK and Spain.





LEGALLY SPEAKING

Tyre checks

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



TYRES are arguably one of the most important elements of a vehicle, but many drivers neglect them.

Through the intense daily wear they receive in hot and cold conditions, going over potholes and kerbs, they can become easily damaged so drivers are urged to carry out regular checks on their tyres to ensure they are in optimum conditions for safe driving. But what do you need to look out for?

Tyres must have enough tread to maintain grip, requiring a minimum tread depth of 1.6mm across the central area. At 1.6mm tread in wet weather it takes an extra two car lengths, around 8m, to stop if travelling at 50mph, compared to if the tread was 3mm.

Over or under inflated tyres will cause uneven wear on the tread which can also cause problems. An under inflated tyre can result in more wear on the edges of the tyres and over inflation could result in more wear in the centre. You should also check the tyre's pressure with most vehicles having a metal plate on or near the driver's inside door which will indicate the optimum pressure, which is stated as PSI. Always check tyres when they are cold for an accurate reading.

There are also calls to ban the sale of used tyres amid increasing safety fears from industry professionals.

It is estimated that hundreds of thousands of vehicles on the roads of Spain are fitted with used tyres, a figure which has increased in recent years due to the financial crisis. One mainstream supplier states that 80 per cent of their business is in the sale of used, rather than new tyres. In addition, it is believed that 60 per cent of all cars over 10 years of age are fitted

Accident investigators say that tyres are a factor in three out of four road traffic incidents, and point out that tyre wear and tear is different on all vehicles, makes and models.

As a result, industry professionals are now lobbying for the sale of used tyres to be prohibited to ensure safer conditions for drivers.

Now he's standing there staring at this place where he thought he left his car, then pacing up and down because his pea size brain is now trying to remember if it was here he parked or not. Then he will realise it was and he has been towed away ... oh how I am smiling as I type this.

I've read this week that Malaga airport is

doing away with their free drop off point at departures. This, along with having to pay for parking at hospitals, is a diabolical liberty. For as many years as I can remember I have never seen a real problem at the airport. It's pretty free flowing most of the year.

Obviously late July and August it's crazy busy but even then I've never had a problem dropping off or even picking up. I'm not sure how it's going to work yet but I can't see the Spanish just accepting this, up to now free service, becoming a pay to drop off. One of the big problems is going to be that you get 15 minutes free then one second over and you have to pay.

I think this is going to cause more problems than they bargained for. I am not sure how it is going to work for disabled people that can't park and get bags and wheelchairs out in 15 minutes. Will there be wardens walking up and down or will it be a CCTV operation? If it is there are going to be murders with the rental car companies because if someone drops off someone and doesn't pay, the hire company will get charged.

They in turn will then have to charge their customer's credit card and, of course, there will be a service charge for that. Hertz charge 50 quid! I will keep you informed as I'm off to the airport on Wednesday after my 2.30pm afternoon appearance on the Selina McKenzie show on Talk Radio Europe.

Lost in translation

COMMUNICATION is one of the hardest things to master as everything can be interpreted in so many ways, even when speaking the same language. Manners and customs also vary so greatly that simple situations can lead to misunderstandings and false conclusions.

As a child I remember my family thinking that our Spanish exchange student had bad manners for not saying please and thank you for every single thing she was served. When I moved to Spain the locals made fun of me for saying please and thank you all the time when 'once is enough'!

Every story has more than one 'truth' so the art of communication also requires us to actually listen to what is being said in order to have a chance at correctly translating the intent of the message.

A few years ago I and members of local international associations were invited to the town hall of Marbella for a meeting at 9am with the mayor and Tourism councillor of the time.



Even though the mayor was delayed I'm sure she envisioned us all mingling, drinking coffee and happily munching on the croissants that were laid out in the corner of the room where we waited

Finally one of the guests broke the spell, stood up and started bringing people coffee but we were still unsure if this was meant for later or someone else? No one had told us it was for us.

Ironically I'd also been guilty of this same oversight at the informal pre-launch cocktail for Mi Marbella Radio. The theme for 2017 was 'Be Bold For Change' and has inspired this week's top 10 as we take a look some of the women who implemented change when they became the 'first' in what were seen as traditional male roles or activities.

Marie Curie


A great role model for women scientists the Polish born physicist and chemist became the first woman to win a Nobel Prize and indeed went on to win another. Her first, the Nobel Prize in Physics, was awarded to her in 1903 recognising her services as a joint researcher on the radiation phenomena. In 1911 she received her second, the Nobel Prize in Chemistry, which recognised her discovery of polonium and radium which became instrumental in pioneering treatment for

2. Elizabeth Blackwell
Although born in England she moved to the United States with her family when she was 11 where she became the first woman to graduate as a doctor on January 23, 1849. Showing true grit she overcame the challenges and prejudice she faced to graduate top of the class with her medical degree. She was also the first female to be included on the UK Medical Register.

Gertrude Ederle

Nicknamed as the 'Queen of the Waves' the American competitive swimmer was the first female to swim across the English Channel. She set off from Cap Gris Nez in France on August 6, 1926 at 7.08am and after 14 hours and 24 minutes she arrived at Kingsdown in Kent.

Swimming the front crawl she used motorcycle goggles, sealed with paraffin, to protect her eyes from the salty water.

4. Amelia Earhart

Flying the flag for women around the world the American aviation pioneer became the first female aviator to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean. She took off from Newfoundland on May 20, 1932 and landed in Ireland after 14 hours and 56 minutes of flying through strong winds, icy conditions and mechanical problems. Unfortunately she went missing, presumed dead, in 1937 whilst she was attempting to circumnavigate the globe.

Barbara Mandell

The British journalist became the first female newsreader in the UK when she presented the

Midday News on the new TV channel Independent Television (now ITV) which launched in 1955 to rival the BBC. However her stint was short-lived after ITV, due to financial difficulties, pulled the plug on the Midday News in January 1956. She also helped to pioneer the new concept of interviewing members of the public in the street which became known as 'Vox pop'

Valentina Tereshkova

The Russian cosmonaut boldly went where no woman had gone before as she became the first woman to travel into space on June 16, 1963. She was 26 years old when she was chosen from a field of over 400 applicants and five finalists. During her three-day visit to space she completed 48 orbits of the Earth and took photographs of the horizon which were then used to identify aerosol layers within the atmosphere

Margaret Thatcher

A pioneer for women in politics in May 1979 she made history by becoming the first female British prime minister. The longest-serving prime minister of the 20th century she held office for three terms serving a total of 11 years and 208 days, announcing her resignation on November 22, 1990. Nicknamed 'The Iron Lady' she certainly ruled with an iron fist and some of her policies made her deeply unpopular.

B. Karren Brady

Having joined Birmingham City FC as Managing Director in March 1993 at the age of 23 she became the first female to have held this position at a Premier League club when the club was promoted in 2002. Affectionately termed as 'The First Lady of Football' she remained at the club until 2009. She is currently the vice-chairman of West Ham United FC.

9. Kathryn Bigelow

At the 82nd Academy Awards ceremony in 2010 she became the first woman to win the Oscar for Best Director. Although she had directed many great films such as Point Break and Near Dark it was The Hurt Locker that clinched her this award. To date she remains the only woman to have achieved this accolade.

10. Libby Lane

After the Church of England voted to allow women to become bishops she was consecrated on January 26, 2015 becoming the first woman to be appointed as a bishop by the Church of England. She officially started her ministry as the Bishop of Stockport on March 8, 2015.





Ask the Optician: Focus on Women's Eyes

THIS year's UK Mother's Day falls on March 26 and as we know many of you celebrate on this special day we want to honour all the great Mums, Grandmas, Sisters and Aunties by answering some questions about how women's eyes are affected by hormones and what eye health conditions can particularly affect women.

- Are women's eyes affected by hormones? Unfortunately women's eyes can suffer when they are menstruating, pregnant or breastfeeding, as they need to retain more liquids and this can affect the eyes as well as giving other side effects such as bloating and swollen ankles.
- Are there any other things that can affect a woman's eyes? The contraceptive pill can often cause changes in your vision, as can antidepressants, anti-anxiety medications and antihistamines.
- Why do my eyes get so dry? The term 'dry eye' is used when we don't produce enough tears or our tears evaporate too quickly. People with dry eyes often have plenty of water in their tears but not enough oil.

Dry eye is three times more common in women than men, as it is affected by hormonal changes during a menstrual cycle, pregnancy, breastfeeding or the menopause. As we age this can get worse, with 60 per cent of women over 50 years old suffering from this uncomfortable condition. To reduce symptoms drink plenty of water, use eye drops and sprays to add extra lubrication, reduce your central heating and avoid direct heat from heaters.

What is conjunctivitis? Conjunctivitis is the most common eye disease in the Western hemisphere and children often get this at school and pass this on to their Mums. It is an inflammation of the conjunctiva, which makes the sclera appear reddened due to an increase in blood supply. The eye feels itchy and watery. Sometimes, there is a sticky discharge, which feels uncomfortable and makes vision blurry. Although conjunctivitis is often referred to as 'pink eye,' this technically only refers to one type of the eye disease, bacterial conjunctivitis. Users of contact lenses should remove them and wear glasses until their symptoms recover.

More middle-aged women are suffering from eating disorders

ACCORDING to research by BEAT, an eating disorders charity, more middle-aged women are suffering from eating disorders. A study found that 15 per cent of women aged between 40 and 50 showed signs of a lifelong eating disorder, but less than 30 per cent had sought help for their problem.

The study by BEAT found that women dealing with an eating disorder at work felt stigmatised due to their illness and felt

their colleagues were uneducated about eating disorders.

So how can you spot the signs that someone you work with could be suffering from an eating disorder?

Look for changes in mood and behaviour as they will appear long before the physical signs. Not eating will leave the body deprived of nutrients making workers perhaps more moody, irritable and socially withdrawn than normal.

Look for signs they are not eating, they may be pushing their food around the plate or cutting it into extremely small pieces, to give the impression they are eating.

They may start wearing baggy clothes in an attempt to hide their weight and shape

Above all, remain compassionate, offer a listening ear and encourage them to seek help



Dealing with high levels of cholesterol

CHOLESTEROL is a word just about everybody has heard of but many people are unaware of what it really is, so this week we've asked the doctor to explain a little.

- What exactly does it mean to have high cholesterol?

If after a blood test you are told that you have high cholesterol, this means that the total cholesterol levels, and in particular the LDL (or socalled 'bad' cholesterol) levels in your blood are higher than they should be.

Although the maximum amount considered normal will vary depending on other medical conditions a patient may have, generally anything over 200 is considered to be high.

However, this is not an exact figure as it depends more on how much of the cholesterol is of the so-called 'bad' variety.

- What are the main causes?

The main cause of high cholesterol is genetic. If you have family members with high cholesterol levels you are likely to inherit this condition. An unhealthy diet, rich in fat, and a lack of regular daily physical exercise are other things which can bring cholesterol levels up.

- Is it dangerous?

Yes, it is, as it can be a cardiovascular risk factor and can increase your chances of suffering heart attacks or strokes

- What can be done to bring it down?

The first thing is to follow a balanced, low-fat diet and get regular physical exercise. If this fails to get the problem under control then medication, known as statins, will be necessary.

- Will I have to be on a diet the rest of my life to keep it down?

Yes. You will always have to stick to a balanced diet, especially as you get older as cholesterol levels tend to increase with age.

Science of eating

THERE are all kinds of fad diets doing the rounds, promising the world only to come crumbling apart like a tender chunk of carrot cake. But changing the focus to when and how often you eat, rather than only what, can bring serious slimming rewards.

The word fasting naturally brings negative connotations to mind. As though you were

punishing yourself, or going on a religious retreat. But when you consider that the benefits of a fast - improved digestion, fat-burning, insulin resistance - come into play after just 12 hours, it's a different proposition.

The word 'breakfast' refers to breaking the evening fast. Try simply leaving a 12-hour space between dinner and breakfast and you'll notice a major difference if you're used to grazing throughout the day. If you're feeling braver then a 14-18 hour fast puts your body into fat-burning mode.

Once you feel comfortable, with reduced hunger pangs and sugar cravings, try a longer fast. Here the benefits are even stronger as your body begins the process of autophagy, renewing and repairing on a cellular level. Speak with your doctor first before attempting such a fast.

THE link between chronic pain and depression is one that is fairly obvious, in fact people with chronic lower back pain are three to four times more likely to suffer from major depression (Sullivan et al 1992).

If your pain means you can't take part in your normal daily activities, golf, tennis or even moving about your house or the supermarket comfortably, then this brings you down even further (Williamson and Schulz, 1992). In fact, limited mobility is the strongest factor associated with depression.

Chicken and egg

People with depression are more likely to have a poor surgical outcome, which we know often leads to chronic pain.

Does depression cause the pain or does the pain cause the depression?

One study suggests that patients with mild to moderate knee osteoarthritis experience far greater pain levels if they are also suffering from depression.

Do patients with depression feel pain more intensely?

You're not making it up

One of the terms we use when talking about chronic pain is 'central sensitisation.'

This means that your entire nervous system becomes super sensitive to the tiniest possible pain signal - you quite literally feel more pain.

It is a key difference between a good result and ongoing issues.

So what do I do?

- **1.** Get help early try and resolve the issue before it becomes chronic.
- **2.** Remember that pain is personal. And you have your own personal pain level. You aren't making it up!
- **3.** Think of your whole body and your whole history and share that with your practitioner if pain messages are long term they get confused, so where you feel pain might not be the original cause.
- **4.** Support and treat the nervous system where these long term pain messages get 'stuck.'
- **5.** Don't get lost in the medical jargon some of the terms can sound scary until you understand what they really mean. Do your research and never be afraid to get a second opinion.

Uniting generations in a unique project

ITALY is bringing together the youngest and oldest generations in a project that sees toddlers and pensioners co-existing together.

The unique experience in Piacenza in northern Italy sees children from the age of three, spend time with the elderly residents of a nursing home, coming together in a day care centre in what is called 'intergenerational education.'

Around 40 children attend, spending time

with the 80 elders, aged up to 90 years old, under the care of 25 skilled and trained workers. It allows children to establish new relationships with adults outside their families, while the elderly feel useful and as if they have been given a new lease of life passing on their wisdom and experience.

The two groups spend time gardening, painting or simply telling stories with benefits being seen in all users.

Choose the right pillow for you

A BAD night's sleep can impact on your physical and psychological well-being, with a good rest essential to health.

The pillows you use are often overlooked but can be essential to helping you get a good night's sleep.

The General Council of physiotherapist's schools of Spain (CGCFE) emphasises that the choice of the pillow should be adapted to the morphology of each individual in order to achieve better sleep and avoid potential injury as you sleep.

President of CGCFE, Miguel Villafaina, recognises that most often people spend more time choosing their mattress but the pillow is just as important: "The right pillow can help improve posture of the head, spine and shoulders and help prevent injury."

For those who often sleep on their backs, the recommended ideal height of pillows is between 10-13cm and up to 15cm for those who sleep on their side. If sleeping on your stomach, pillows show be lower, up to 10cm.



Millions suffering from

osteoporosis

AROUND 3.5 million people in Spain suffer from osteoporosis and in 2010, the World Health Organisation (WHO) estimated that around 22 million women and 5.5 million men in the EU were suffering.

Osteoporosis is a bone disease that occurs when the bone mass breaks away, becoming weakened and brittle. When viewed under a microscope, a healthy bone looks like a honeycomb, but in those with osteoporosis, the holes in the honeycomb are much larger showing a loss in density and mass

It can have serious consequences for sufferers who are much more fragile and can suffer from broken bones from a slight fall or knock, with hip fractures being the most common.

In those aged over 70, around 63,000-65,000 hip fractures occur every year in Spain, related to osteoporosis. In the country, between 20 and 25 per cent of the beds of the Traumatology Services of the hospitals are occupied by osteoporosis patients who have suffered a

In 2010 there were 42,809 deaths directly related to fragility fractures in the European Union. A total of 2,550 of these deaths were in

It can have serious consequences for sufferers who are much more fragile.

The economic burden of osteoporosis is also increasing and recent studies estimate that the direct costs associated with fragility fractures in 2010 amounted to €29 billion in the five largest countries in the EU of France, Italy, Germany, Spain and Great Britain.

Commenting on the figure, the Spanish Society of Geriatrics, believes that more information and advice must be given to osteoporosis sufferers as around 80 per cent of patients discharged after a fracture receive no recommendations to help prevent the onset of a new frac-





Sell-by dates - a necessity or a con?

GOOD FOOD. **GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS** WITH GARRY WAITE

OR YEARS now, discussion has raged as to the amount of food wastage incurred domestically, as well as in our industry, although not so much as the former. The millions of tons representing 12bn pounds per year wasted have a lot to do with sell by/use by/best before dates. I notice the UK milk marketing board has challenged the government's date policy saying that no one need a use by date as it's pretty obvious when you can no longer use/drink milk!!

This is not new, in 2011 the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) said that sell by and display until dates would be replaced with 'use by' and 'best before' dates.

Dates that I do think are useful are packaging and display until/best before dates. For instance if in a supermarket a packet of fish states it was 'packed' say on 6/4 and the 'display until date' says the 8/4 that makes sense. The buyer can then decide if they are going to consume it before say the weekend (in this case 11/4) or whether to freeze it down for later use - or give it to the

One good thing about sell by dates is that shops tend to put those items that are 'out-of-date' as 'bargain buys.' I know people who will not purchase anything past its 'sell by /consume before' dates. But astute shoppers can save quite a lot of money.

In my, not so, humble opinion the information that would be more helpful to the buyer, the supplier and would save tons of wastage are the following:

FISH: Caught/farmed date packed on date - display until date

MEAT: Slaughter date - packed on date - consume preferably by date

DAIRY/VEGETABLES ETC.

Best before date



MILK: That's my style of labelling!

There is a huge difference between the labelling used - and used intelligently could benefit all parties. You pays your money.....!

With frozen/jarred and tinned products that technically will not go passed their best if kept in their original state the date of packaging is the only guide that the buyer needs. We have all heard stories about canned food from the war days still being opened to be found in edible condition. I opened a tin of water chestnuts the other day that I have had in my cupboard for more than 10 years. The only reason I knew how old it was, was because of the 'sell by date'. Totally unnecessary, they were

Most people know that a good quality piece of meat needs to hang for a couple of weeks minimum before eating. Many years ago I met a meat buy-

(in my Nan's kitchen growing up) er for Marks and Spencer. He had to get up at three in the morning to get to the meat market as he had to buy the finest quality of meat available. Nothing strange about that, but he had also


MANY READERS ARE SURE to remember one of the UK's most respected journalists and TV anchor man Bob Friend who from the first broadcast of Sky News in 1989 became the 'Face of Sky News.'

I was going through some old photos the other day and came across a few pictures of us having dinner in Marbella and reflected that he died of a brain tumour more than eight years ago at the young age of 70. He was a great practical joker with a wicked sense of humour.

He told me many stories of his more than 50 years in journalism, many self mocking. Once he had to report the death of a relevantly unknown African figure with an unpronounceable name and despite practising the delivery many times before going on air he just couldn't get the name right, so with his friend and fellow presenter, Lisa Azziz at his side (also with a sense of humour) he began to report on the sudden death of an 'important figure in Africa whose name has not been released until his family have been informed. Classic!!!

One day he was reporting on the fact that hedgehogs were fast disappearing from Britain's countryside. The reason apparently being that the 'Travellers' were eating them. So he invited viewers to send in the recipes for hedgehog!! Later that morning he phoned me and asked if I had heard the broadcast? 'Why don't you send me a recipe?' he asked. So, I did.

Hedgehog, despite being a verminous creature, is quite edible and has a flavour of chicken. The way

they are cooked is by encasing them in clay and baking them in a form of underground fire (earth oven). When cooked one breaks the clay and the spines fall away leaving a cooked 'chicken'! The power of advertising?

I had forgotten how many laughs we had and what an amazingly generous man he was, both professionally and personally. Why do the best go first?

Palm trees ideal for a Mediterranean garden

A PALM tree has always been a must for the ideal landscape design in the Mediterranean

Over the last 10-15 years, the palm tree has been in serious decline due to a ravenous red beetle or weevil (Rhynchophorus ferrugineus) that has decimated thousands of Canary Island palms in Spain and has adversely affected other palm species as well

The outbreak of the weevil is not vet under control in most areas of Spain or other Mediterranean and Middle Eastern countries where palms are prevalent.

Early detection is obtained with a specific pheromone trap for the weevil and just one adult caught indicates action is required to protect the palms in the vicinity. An adult female weevil can lay around 200 eggs. New treatments to combat the weevil are being developed to assist in the battle to save the palms, including chemical and biological agents.

The Mediterranean garden will not be the same if the weevil is not stopped as all susceptible unprotected palms will eventually be lost.

Listen to David on TRE every Saturday 10am to 11am Costa del Sol (Gibraltar/Sotogrande) 98 7fm (San Roque to Calahonda) 91.9fm (Calahonda to Motril) 88.9, Costa Calida 92.7fm Costa Blanca (Torrevieja to Elche) 105.1fm (Elche to Calpe) 88.2fm, (Calpe to Gandia & Ibiza) (Denia to Valencia) 95.3fm Mallorca 103.9fm

THIS is an exercise that can only be correctly taught if each stage is perfected before continuing on to the next stage. The training for this exercise should be started indoors, the dog on the lead and no distractions. Initially the handler should kneel on the floor with the dog close to the handler's left side.

1. Give the SIT command once only, whilst putting the dog into the sit position at your left side, thereafter NEV-ER re-command, even if the dog moves. Pull up and back with your right hand in the collar, simultaneously push down with your left hand on the dog's back just above the base of his tail. Never apply pressure any higher up the dog's back as this could cause injury.

PRAISE the dog quietly once he is settled and comfortable in the SIT and remains there without any physical restraint from the handler. If the dog moves, replace him into the SIT with no further commands. Do this as often as necessary, until he is sitting still and comfortably, praise quietly, then give the release command and at the same time move the dog from where he is sitting. PRAISE.

2. Repeat stage 1 until the dog is sitting when commanded with confidence. Always use the method described in stage 1 to guide the dog into

the sit position. Gently try to pull or push the dog out of position (the handler should still be kneeling next to the dog), but be prepared to place him back into the SIT should he move. If he resists your gentle attempts to dislodge him, PRAISE and give the release command.

If the attempts to move succeed - place him back into the sit position without commanding and go back to stage 1 and start again, until he is doing the exercise with more reliability.

The more frequently stages 1 and 2 are repeated the easier it will be to progress through this exercise and the more reliable your dog will be.

3. When the dog is doing stage 2 confidently, without moving, the exercise can be expanded. Put the dog into the SIT and with, as little fuss as possible, stand upright. If he moves, put him straight back into the SIT without saying a word. When you are able to stand next to him use the lead, gently applying pressure to the

collar to test the sit. If he moves again, replace him giving no extra commands and start stage 3 again. When he is resisting your attempts to move him from the sit PRAISE and RELEASE.

NB On no account should you proceed any further if he is not reliable on stage 3.

4. When he is doing stage 3 reliably and confidently, the exercise can again be expanded. Place him in the SIT, take a couple of steps away from him, but be ready to put him back just as he moves. Using the lead again, gently apply pressure to the collar, return to the dog immediately, PRAISE profusely and then RELEASE.

NEVER release the dog until you are standing by his side or he will never do a reliable sit

THE DOWN STAY

This is taught in exactly the same stages as the SIT - remember to only command the dog once and only when you are standing next to him, always replace him into position using no extra commands and

technique by gradually increasing the distractions ie rattling a bunch of keys, dropping your hanky etc.

NEVER TEMPT FATE by leaving the dog in a stay where a sudden distraction could cause an accident ie untethered outside a shop.



DRIVING while using a phone will soon become as unforgivable as drink driving according to the UK government. Tough new laws punishing phone offenders came into place on March 1.

New drivers, who have passed their test within two years, could have their licence revoked if caught using a phone just once. Six penalty points and a £200 fine will be imposed on anyone caught. Experienced drivers caught twice face disqualification and a £1,000 fine.

The use of mobile phones on British roads has been described as an epidemic. There were 22 deaths and 99 serious injuries as a direct consequence of phone use in 2016. Research has shown that drivers who text take twice as long to react as those who have drunk mod-

Navara double cab

ONCE, pick-up trucks were just pick-up trucks, rugged workhorses normally seen on building sites. But when double-cab versions began to be produced, the humble pick-up developed an exciting new life as a dual-purpose family vehi-

These days pick-ups are produced by several manufacturers but few can match Nissan for pick-up experience: the company has been making them for more than 80 years.

Nissan's latest Navara underlines just how far the double cab pick-up has come: it has a stylish exterior, a luxury interior, high-spec standard equipment and the driving rewho also use them as family transport and thus require all the comfort and technology now common in most cars. Indeed, Nissan estimates 95 per cent of all Navara models will be double cab

Navara prices start at €28,781 (£24,560) but the luxury versions cost more my flagship Tekna all-wheeldrive with auto transmission cost €38,403 (£32,770). Standard kit includes 18-inch alloy wheels, roof rails, parking sensors, leather seats, four powered windows, air-conditioning, hill-start assist, auto lights and wipers, limited slip differential, cruise control with

CD/USB/AUX and Bluetooth, sat-nav and HD touchscreen.

Tekna models also come with 360-degree camera monitoring, meaning you can see all around the vehicle when manouevering.

That all sounds like the spec of a premium model, and the similarity doesn't end there because on the tarmac, despite its large overall footprint, the Navara has much of the refinement and road manners of a crossover model. And in the cabin, the Tekna's leather seats and classy dashboard styling that makes you think you in in something quite superior.

With four doors, access to the rear seats is easy and there


