### No place to hide

**Dangerous British fugitive** apprehended in Benidorm

BENIDORM'S Local Police force has apprehended Gareth Edwards, one of Britain's most wanted criminals.

Classed as "very dangerous," he is one of 10 British fugitives named in Operacion Captura National Police campaign launched last November. The European arrest warrant issued against him warned he was possibly armed and in possession of drugs.

The 25-year-old, who faces three life sentences for robbery with violence and intimidation in the UK, was detained in a Calle Mallorca pub in the resort's Eng-

Local Police officers had been working on the case for some weeks after receiving informaand swooped when a man answering his description entered

He did not put up any resistance when police approached him but showed them a passport with such an unconvincing photo they told Edwards they were taking him in for identification.

He managed to escape as they moved towards the patrol car but was found shortly afterwards,

hiding in the empty swimming pool of some nearby apartments.

Once at the police station his fingerprints confirmed him as Gareth Bryan Edwards and he was transferred to the National Police, who later revealed his passport was genuine but issued to another person.

Edwards was supporting himself by dealing drugs and was carrying cocaine when arrested.

### Dangerous dam

THE Jucar Hydrographic Confederation was forced to open the floodgates of the Guadalest Reservoir after it became dangerously full following the recent storm. The artificial lake had

been sitting at a historically low level in late 2016 following several dry years, but 5-12,000 litres of water per second was discharged into the Mediterranean on Monday and Tuesday.

THE northern Costa Blanca is facing another clean-up operation after a 12hour rainstorm deposited more than 100 litres of water per square metre in some places on both Sunday and Mon-

Denia was particularly affected, and shop owners and parents alike were up in arms over the council's decision to keep Calle Marques de Campos closed despite installation of decorations for the Fallas celebrations being cancelled due to the bad weather.

"The need for water is so great that anything falling from the sky is welcome," said Aniorte. "It is a real won-



### **Night** climb goes wrong

A GUARDIA CIVIL mountain rescue unit had to rescue two climbers

Ignoring bad weather warnings, the couple aged 28 and 39 decided in the evening to climb the 730metre mountain that separates

Once there, they put up a tent to protect them from the wind and rain but later called the emergency services asking for help. They were unable to get down and were suffering from hypothermia, they

Scaling the mountain from the Javea side the Guardia Civil unit found them at around 10.30pm near the parking area. Neither needed medical attention.

The Guardia Civil reminded the public afterwards that they should first consult the weather forecast before undertaking any outdoor ac-

If conditions are unfavourable they should change their plans: "Their lives and the lives of the people who have to rescue them are at stake," they warned.

### **Browned**

RESIDENTS who live near to the narrow beach at Portet de Moraira had a bit of a surprise when 8,000 tons of sand from a quarry was deposited with the approval of the Alicante authorities on the beach and into the water.

Suddenly, the delightful blue waters of the area started to change to a muddy brown and the sand itself also looked a lot browner whilst the beach became larger.

Although some are worried that this will change the area on a long term basis, environment studies are taking place and it is believed that the natural colour of the water will return as the new sand settles on the ocean bottom as has happened in the past.

### SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...5

Father's Day in Spain is celebrated on St Joseph's Day, which this year falls on Sunday March 19. This Catholic feast day celebrates the life of Mary's husband Joseph, whose role within the Holy Family is seen as the epitome of what a good husband and father should be.



FATHER'S DAY (Dia del Padre) started in the United States in 1910, when Sonora Smart Dodd, a 27-year-old woman from Spokane Washington, proposed a male equivalent to Mother's Day.

After pushing for local support, she convinced the state governor to establish an official celebration on July

Fifteen vears later, President Calvin Coolidge turned the fledgling Father's Day into a national event, before Richard Nixon confirmed it as a federal holiday in 1972.

In Spain, the first Father's Day took place in 1948 after Manuela Vicente Ferrero, a teacher and author in Madrid, was approached by disgruntled fathers jealous of the annual Mother's Day celebrations.

The celebration featured a mass, gifts handmade from materials recovered from a nearby landfill by girls from Manuela's school, and a children's festival with poetry. dancing and theatre.

### Beach tourists asked to behave

A NUMBER of new regulations are being introduced for the beaches at Benitachell in order to ensure that tourists and residents can enjoy a safe and undisturbed visit to the area.

Although actually banned already by statute, it was noticed last year that some visitors were jumping from cliffs or rocks into the sea and that is strictly forbidden with possible heavy fines for those who ignore the rules.

In addition, not only are visitors not allowed to bring glass bottles to the beach areas but they must remove any rubbish when they leave the area, especially as there are no litter bins in Llebeig and els Testos coves.

No-one is allowed to camp overnight on the beaches or to light fires and fines for those guilty of breaking the rules can range from €750 to €3,000.

### **Dramatic** rescue for hikers

TWELVE hikers, including four minors, lost on the Peñalara peak in the Sierra de Guadarrama National Park (Madrid) had to be rescued by a Guardia Civil air rescue team.

A helicopter had to make several flights through a narrow pass due to poor weather to rescue the hikers who were then driven from Valsain to Cotos where they had left their vehicles.

### Something fishy!

TWO tonnes of live eels, €540,000 cash and several gold ingots were seized by Guardia Civil officers when they arrested eight people from Sevilla, Tarragona and Valencia, including two Chinese allegedly for obtaining illicit funds from Hong Kong to pay for the fish. The operation also saw nine additional arrests in Greece.



### **Postcard** from LEON



A FAMED stop on the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage trail, Leon like many settlements in the north was founded during the reign of Julius Caesar by Octavian, who later became the **Emperor Augustus.** 

The original simple encampment grew as retired Roman legionaries settled and by 910 it was the capital of the Kingdom of Leon. After being conquered it later became a kingdom again until the 19th century.

The present-day city with a 120,000 population contains spectacular classical buildings including the nation's only true Gothic cathedral plus a private building - the Casa de los Botines - designed by architect Antoni Gaudi and said to be the inspiration for the famous Disney Castle.

Like many Spanish cities, Leon has an unusual procession. Named the 'Burial of Genarin,' it is in memory of an alcoholic beggar believed to have been run over in 1929 by the first local motorised rubbish cart. Many nowadays treat the event as an excuse to get drunk.

With good air, rail and road links, Leon is popular for visits.

#### Cocaine alert

A CARTEL thought to have shipped almost 400 kilos of cocaine into Europe using Las Palmas as a staging post for drug trafficking and money laundering led to 12 arrests when 10 properties were raided by Guardia Civil officers in the Canaries. Items seized included two speed boats, €500,000 in cash and documentary evidence.

#### State visit

FORCED to cancel state visits when there was no elected government, King Felipe and Queen Leticia are now rearranging official trips including one to the UK where they will meet the Queen and the king will address parliament.

#### Terror find

A HIDEOUT possibly used by the ETA terrorist group in Irun, Basque Country, and containing seven drums of explosives has been discovered, although there is no evidence of recent activity according to the Home Office.

### Help with utility bill reduction

CALLOSA residents have until June 30 to apply for Plan Renhata grants for improvements to their homes.

Help is available for replacing water heaters and windows and at a later date this will extend to improving kitchens and bathrooms built before 1996.

Replacing windows for better-insulated ones and substituting old water heaters for condensing boilers, will reduce energy consumption as well as citizens' utility bills, said Town Planning councillor Lumi Puigccerver.

The regional government has allocated €750,000 for windows and €200,000 for boilers. The grants are available to owners and tenants independently of income.

### Free juice in school campaign

YOUNG pupils in Gandia were given free orange juice for a week, as part of a campaign promoting healthy eating.

The educational authorities teamed up with the Safor Agricultural Cooperative in an initiative which seeks to educate the younger children about good food habits.

Xavi Rodenas, mayor said: "We are really grateful to the cooperative for their contribution, and recently bought a juice machine so that we can also offer the freshly squeezed local produce at events organised by the council."

Head of Education Laura Morant highlighted that many of the schools in Gandia already offer juice one or two days a week.

DESPITE recent rain, the La Marina fire brigade is already concerned about forest fires.

brigade chief Javier Fayos.

Urbanisations in Javea, Calpe, Benissa, Moraira and Les Rotes in Denia could be particularly vulnerable, he

"Most of the properties are surrounded by trees and plants that are often only a few centimetres away from the houses," Fayos pointed out.

Few town halls have prepared emergency plans in areas like Javea, Pego, Les Valls or Denia where homes have been affected in catastrophic fires in recent years.

Procedures should be in place for clearing woodland,

creating firebreaks and establishing an evacuation plan for residents if the worst happens. Town halls still lack specific plans with the exception of Javea, Fayos said, although even these are not entirely fin-

The likelihood of fire was not taken into account when these urbanisations were built. the fire chief said. Hydrants are a problem and on many callouts firemen find that they are badly positioned or unusable.

On other occasions fire engines are faced with too many obstacles to enter streets and evacuate residents.

### Running dry

THE Marina Alta has water but it comes from over-exploited aquifers.

These also suffer from marine intrusion and salinisation which became even more pronounced during the recentlyended drought, said Bruno Ballesteros, head of the Valencia University's Geological and Mining Institute.

He was addressing SOS Natura Marina Alta, a group that advocates better use of the area's aquifers and warns against a return to tourism model that is unsustainable and based on construction.

Water extraction is unbalanced, Ballesteros told the meeting, as the supply along

the coast, where most water is consumed, comes from only a few wells. The area was not affected by a water deficit but suffered from 'water stress' and bad planning, Ballesteros said.

Each year approximately 179.6 cubic hectometres of water is extracted from the Marina Alta's 17 aquifers for agricultural irrigation and a further 96.5 cubic hectometres for urban use. This is twice as much as is strictly necessary.

The Albuerca, Gallinera and Mustall wells in Almudaina, Alfara and Segaria wells have the most water while those of Pego-Denia and Montgo are always the first to suffer salinisation as levels drop, he added.

### Cash claim for lost business

THE developers of the El Messell shopping complex are suing Campello Council and the regional government for €2 million.

Campello's PGOU town plan was annulled on a technicality last year and the Constitutional Tribunal, Spain's highest court, rejected the appeal by Campello Town Hall.

The ruling has affected

several development plans, municipal sources revealed. and the town hall was expecting the protest that has now arrived from Profusa.

The company is part of Grupo Fuertes, which owns the El Pozo meat processors as well as much of the land involved in the cancelled PGOU. This directly affected not only its El Messell shop-

ping centre but also the site of the private Mare Nostrum University where the group also owns land.

The €4.4 million shopping complex would have been located on a 145,000 square metre plot on the outskirts of Campello and Profusa is now claiming €2 million to compensate for the damage to its projects.

### Female-friendly protection needed

Only La Nucia, Denia, Campello and Orihuela have protectors designed to be worn by women. No other police forces have specific vests for women and no town hall Public Safety departments are currently intending to acquire them.

forces their use is not obligatory and in San Vicente where officers have the choice, women who request them use the men's standard model after having rejected the female version.

Alcoy provides men's vests in a variety of sizes, while Benidorm has smaller sizes for women.

### Reminder to register

By Linda Hall

THE Alicante Diputacion is reminding all foreign residents to renew their registration on their local town hall's Padron.

The campaign addressing residents from the European Union, Norway, Switzerland and Iceland, asks them if they are aware that they should confirm their entries on the Padron.

All residents of these countries who live in Spain for more than three months should be registered with the Central Registry of Foreign Nationals (RCE). Their registry number then figures on the

municipal Padron.

"If this is your case and you continue to live in the province you must confirm this situation so that the town hall has an up-to-date record of your registration," the Diputacion said.

"If you are already included in the RCE you should confirm it to the town hall every five years. If you are not yet included in the RCE you must confirm it every two

A change of address or any personal information that European citizens report to their town hall will have the same effect as expressing confirmation, the Diputa-

"Confirmation of residency may consist of express declaration by the citizen or verification of residency by the local town hall. If a European national fails to confirm his residence, the local council will instigate official proceedings to cancel that citizen's registration and contact the person in question."

Foreign residents not from the EU or the other countries cited need to renew their Padron registration every two years.

### Culture centre works to resume

PLANS to recommence work on a half built culture centre in Benidorm are in the final stages of approval.

### Villagers' plea to be free from relative isolation

RESIDENTS in the isolated valley of Vall de Guadalest have demanded that the CV-70. closed since January, be reopened.

Since the storms in January, which caused severe damage to many of the region's infrastructures, one area is still waiting for repairs to be completed on the main route which serves five villages.

The CV-70 road, which links Benidorm and Alcov, is closed between Benimantell and Benifato, resulting in an alternative route being in force. This diversion takes vehicles along narrow rural roads and streets barely wide enough for anything bigger than a people carri-

Now, almost two months later, the 1,200 residents have launched a campaign demanding that the Public Works De-

partment complete the repairs quickly. Whilst repair work has already begun the residents claim this is only happening at 'a very slow pace.'

Simple journeys, such as pupils travelling to school, have become a logistical nightmare with parents having to arrange car sharing as buses cannot access the narrow streets within the diversion

Residents are extremely concerned that supply vehicles are

unable to make their deliveries, including the pharmacy vans, but also that should an ambulance or fire truck need to attend an emergency it would be impossible for them to access many areas

David Blanes, Benifato mayor, has joined with the residents to propose a temporary solution to the Department of Works, which would see one lane of the affected CV-70 being opened and controlled with traffic lights, even if only over the weekend period.



At one point the A-7 motorway to Alcoy was closed to

Lower down on the coast, snow turned to overnight rain heralded by a fierce

AEMET put the northern Costa Blanca on Yellow Alert, forecasting 80 millimetres of rain within the next 12 hours and winds of up to 90 kilometres an hour.

As temperatures plummeted by half AEMET announced that although the gales and torrential rain would remit, showers are expected until this Saturday,

"There is nothing unusual about the wind, rain and snow of the last few days, only the extreme heat that preceded them," said Jorge Olcina who heads Alicante University's Climatology Laboratory.

### How are your savings protected?

When you have worked hard to build up your savings, it is important to understand what level of protection you will receive in the event the financial institution is unable to repay your money.

#### Spain banks

Deposits are covered per depositor, so couples with joint accounts have €200,000 protected. The guarantee is per banking group, not per bank account or even per

bank - some banks with different names form part of the same banking group, so be careful.

#### UK banks

In the UK, accounts in regulated banks are protected by the Financial Services Compensation Scheme. The amount protected should be the same as offered in the EU and is currently £85,000.

As in Europe, protection is per depositor and per banking institution. Halifax and Bank of

Scotland, for example, are part of the same institution.

The length of time each claim takes to process depends on a number of factors, but the FSCS will aim to pay compensation within seven days. More complex claims will be paid within 20 days.

The FSCS now provides a £1 million protection limit for temporary high balances.

#### UK offshore centres

Banks in the Channel Islands and Isle of Man are not covered by the UK scheme, even if they are divisions of UK banks. You would need to rely on their local guarantee schemes, which offer lower levels of protection.

The Isle of Man provides compensation of up to £50,000 for covered banks. If a bank fails a fund will be created to pay depositors, with a maximum fund of £200 million. There is no guarantee when you will receive your compensation.

The limit in Jersey and Guernsey is also £50,000, capped at £100 million in any five year period. An interim payment of up to £5,000 will be made within seven days and the balance within three months.

#### Protecting yourself

Luxembourg provides very robust protection for life assurance policy There is the legal holders. requirement that all clients' assets must be held by an independent custodian bank approved by the state regulator. The bank is required to ring-fence clients' securities so that

they are off its balance sheet. 100% of the policy holder's securities are protected (excluding cash deposits, but cash held in monetary funds are treated as securities and so protected.)

In any case, you should always ensure you have adequate diversification across different investment assets. This reduces risk and increases the potential for improved returns.

### Danger of illicit weekend mountain races

THE problem of improvised and illicit motorcycle races on the La Carrasqueta mountain has reached the Senate.

Compromis senator for Alicante Province Carles Mulet will ask Interior minister Juan Ignacio Zoido what steps he is taking to solve the problem of motorbike races on the CV-800 in Jijona.

Last October Valencia's regional parliament approved a Compromis proposal ask-

ing the General Directorate of Traffic to install speed traps on La Carrasqueta to dissuade bikers from staging impromptu races at 'exorbitant' speeds.

The motion was presented by Compromis MPs Mireaia Molla and Francisco Javier Garcia Latorre but all political parties voted in favour of urging the government to take action.

La Carrasqueta is not a racing circuit,

they said, but this is what it becomes each weekend: "There are grave speeding excesses, illegal manoeuvres and constant overtaking on the Carrasqueta pass although this is permitted in only one section."

A month later Mulet submitted written questions regarding the high accident rate on La Carrasqueta and l'Alt de Tibi (CV-810), to the national government. He

should have received a response by February 13 but as none arrived he now hopes to get a reply from Zoido during a Senate control session

"There is an 80 kilometre per hour limit and these races put other people at risk, especially as these roads are used by cyclists and hikers who usually coincide with the motorcyclists at the weekends and in the holidays," Mulet has said.

### Spanish State Visit to the UK

THE Spanish State Visit will celebrate close ties between our two countries and our two peoples, says British Ambassador to Spain, Simon Manley, who has welcomed the announcement of a State Visit to the United Kingdom from June 6 to 8

"In this Sapphire Jubilee celebration year for Her Majesty the Queen, I am delighted that Their Majesties King Felipe VI and Queen Letizia of Spain have accepted her invitation to visit the UK" said Mr Manley.

"This State Visit will celebrate not only the long and deep royal and historic ties between our two countries, but also our strong relationship as partners bilaterally, within Europe and on the global stage. We enjoy close connections in terms of culture, commerce, education, science and innovation. This is an opportunity to celebrate and deepen those links."

The Ambassador was speaking from Santander, where he is touring the north of Spain to promote education, tourism and investment in the UK.

Today, the United Kingdom and Spain are close partners in NATO and the United Nations, among numerous international organisations. We also continue to cooperate in the European Union, and once we leave the EU we want to strengthen our strong and constructive bilateral



relationship with Spain.

The two countries are also major partners in trade, with £40 billion ( $\le 45.6$  billion) of trade in 2015, including British goods and services worth almost £15 billion ( $\le 17.1$  billion) exported to Spain, and imports from Spain to the UK worth £25 billion ( $\le 28.5$  billion).

Nearly 300,000 Britons are registered as resi-

dents in Spain and 18 million visitors came from the UK last year, whilst more than 132,000 Spaniards are resident in the UK and two million visited in 2015.

On top of that, we share close educational connections, with nearly 11,000 Spanish students studying at UK universities and 50,000 students attending British schools in Spain.

This is the first State Visit by King Felipe and Queen Letizia to the UK and they will stay at Buckingham Palace. The programme will be announced in due course.

The last State Visit was when King Juan Carlos I and Queen Sofia visited in 1986. HM Queen Elizabeth II and The Duke of Edinburgh returned with a State Visit to Spain in 1988.

Since then the Spanish and British royal families have paid a number of formal visits to each other's countries. In 2002, King Juan Carlos and Queen Sofia attended the annual Order of the Garter Ceremony at St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, including a dinner at Windsor Castle given by The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh.

In 2011, The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall paid a three-day official visit to Spain that was hosted by Prince Felipe and Princess Letizia. A few weeks later Queen Sofia, Prince Felipe and Princess Letizia attended the wedding in London of Prince William to Catherine Middleton.

The British and Spanish Royal Families are directly related through the marriage of Alfonso XIII of Spain to Princess Victoria Eugenia, known as Ena, granddaughter of Queen Victoria, in 1906. Victoria Eugenia is the great-grandmother of King Felipe.

### New environmental control technology

The next generation air quality sensors provide accurate information and as they are easily transported they can be located wherever needed. All information is transferred to secure servers which process the data before storing it in the Cloud.

La Nucia is already one step ahead as from January 1 next year, European Union directives will require all large municipalities to perform air quality checks each day.



Envirodata is also installing a state-ofthe-art Early Warning Alert to notify the municipality of any unauthorised spills affecting the sewage network. ## Model 720: Declaration of assets and ownership overseas

For those who are fiscal resident, please find below a reminder, in case you need to complete the 720 form this year.

#### When does it apply?

The period for presenting the model 720: declaration of assets and rights located abroad (for the year 2016) is from 1 January to 31 March 2017.

#### What information is needed?

Three distinct groups define this declaration:

- 1) Bank accounts.
- 2) All types of financial assets.
- 3) Real estate.

#### Who is obliged to submit the Model 720?

Those who have overseas assets that fit into any of these three groups and amount to or exceed 50,000€, and only for the group in which this amount is exceeded.

#### Do I need to submit it every year?

Once you have made the 720 declaration, regarding your assets overseas, you then only need to declare your overseas assets in subsequent years, when:

- 1) any of the above 3 distinct sectors experiences an increase in value greater than 20,000€.
- 2) you are no longer the owner of the aforementioned assets (sale, transfer, etc... even if you made a loss).
- 3) in any of the 3 sectors, you did not previously have to declare that you had assets to the value of 50,000€, if you NOW (2014 YEAR) do have assets to the value of, or exceeding 50,000€.

Failure to meet this tax liability might be penalised by the Spanish tax office

Remember it is important for all residents to be fiscally resident in Spain and make their annual tax return known as Declaracion de Renta.

### Problems with a co-owner of your property in Spain?

QUESTION:

Dear Lawver.

I have been served in the UK with a claim coming from a Spanish court, where the co-owner of my Spanish property is making a claim against me, trying to force the sale of the property we jointly own in Spain. What should I do?

Dear Reader.

Thank you for your enquiry.

First of all, we must point out that without seeing the claim and documents served to you, we cannot give you any legal advice.

However, for your information, we can confirm generally that:

- It is probable that an Ordinary Court Case has been filed against you. As per the Spanish Civil Jurisdiction Law (LEC), you have 20 working days to answer to the claim.
- If this is the case, the **legal action** started against you is what we call: action for the division of the common ownership of property.

Legally as per the articles 400 and those following of the Spanish Civil Code, no co-owner can be forced to remain in co-ownership, therefore, any owner of a property can claim for the co-ownership to be terminated.

If the property can be divided in two parts, each party should get its part of the property. Normally however, urban planning does not allow for the property to be divided 50/50 and create two new properties from the existing one. If that is your case, the only solution is for one of the parties to buy the other out, or sell the property, normally through the court, and split the proceeds of the sale.

- Possible answer to the claim: If the property due to the planning, or any other reason cannot be divided, and bearing in mind that the Spanish Civil Code allows the other party to finish the coownership at any time, possibly the only good option for you, would be to agree with the claim to finalise the court case, and try to come to an agreement or sell the property.

- Legal Costs: the main risk of these kind of claims lies in the legal costs. Normally the claims are valued according to the value of the property jointly owned, so the legal costs could be really high. In your case, it is essential even if you agree with the claim, to try, as per the article 395 of the LEC, for the court to rule that you do not have to pay the legal costs of the claimant, as you were not aware of his intention to stop the co-ownership, and you have not been formally requested regarding this.
- Other Costs: If you paid some of the property costs such as local taxes (IBI), garbage collections, etc., you can claim that the other party pay you back 50 per cent of these expenses.

It is most important in this kind of dispute, as soon as problems start, to send a formal request to the other party, if it is not possible to come to an agreement, then to be the first to claim, in order to avoid the risk of being asked by the court to pay the legal fees of the claimant. THE Line 9 trenet will become a tram on the approach to Denia and inside the town.

The €2 million project, which will be completed before the end of the year, affects the section between the Line 9 terminus and Calle Diana. This is covered by regional rail provider FGV's €6.4 million programme to renew track and infrastructure at Benidorm, Teulada, Gata de Gorgos and Denia stations.

The entire Benidorm-Denia line is under-

going a €42.7 million facelift that began in 2014, with a further €50 million to be spent on replacing the existing diesel-electric

Bringing the tram to Denia was a longawaited response to 'historic' requests for a solution to the succession of level crossings on the outskirts of town, said Denia's mayor Vicente Grimalt.

These will be replaced by roundabouts or crossings with traffic lights and the walls and fences that currently isolate the railway track from the town's roads will be removed. Instead the tramlines will be integrated into the urban landscape with two traffic lanes on either side and low platforms for easy access.

Grimalt also asked FGV to carry out a second phase by taking the tram out to the future La Pedrera bus station.

The Calpe-Denia section of Line 9 was closed last July on safety grounds. Despite earlier fears that the closure could be permanent, FGV pledged that the entire Benidorm-Denia line would be operational



ALFAZ DEL PI Council will debate its Budget this month.

Continuing the cost-cutting measures introduced in 2012 this maintains budgetary and financial balance combined with a reduction in expenditure. Savings will be increased, while paying off the town hall debt and attending to interest payments.

The €21 million Budget foresees a 13.11 per cent reduction in the cost of financing and will pay off €1.9 million of the town hall's public debt, explained Treasury councillor

Toni Such. "As in previous years social spending and generating employment are priorities," the councillor added. "At the same time investment will increase by 7 per cent and staff costs cut by 1.51 per cent."

This year's Budget must also make provision for paying off debts run up by the current town hall's predecessors from 2003 to 2007, Such said.

"We have to pay €3 million to SAV for expenses incurred outside the street cleaning contract to comply with court decisions," the councillor said.



### Residents choose a park



TEULADA-MORAIRA town will buy privately-owned land for a new park.

This proposal has local backing as residents themselves chose the project from a shortlist of six options for spending a  $\leq$  300,000 council allocation.

Of the 1,219 people who took part in the popular ballot last October, 233 voted to acquire 34.66 square metres of land at El Pinaret between the railway station and the Instituto high school.

Once the purchase is finalised paths and benches will be added, with play and leisure areas as well as a dog park.

## Victory for no parking

AN Alicante court ruled that land used for parking at El Portet beach must be fenced off

The decision was a victory for a local resident who lodged a formal complaint after the town hall refused to close the car park in Calle Puerto Espindola.

He and others in the area had complained repeatedly about the dust caused by vehicles and complained that the car park was unlicensed, the Alicante court heard.

The land was irregularly used as a car park for some years, the judge agreed, and the town hall knew this, putting up notices to that effect although it was not municipally-owned land.



# Problem pigs take a trip

THE Vietnamese pigs that colonised El Saladar in Javea have now moved on to Pou de la Font in Benitachell.

Twenty of the El Saladar pigs were adopted by Rachael and her daughter Hannah, two Britons living in Javea, who found a landowner in Pou de la Font willing to give the animals a home in a securely fenced plot.

Rachael and Hanna attend to the pigs each day, spending a daily €40 on their feed. Unfortunately the pigs are escape artists who regularly go AWOL once they have eaten.

According to the local Spanish press the Local Police in Benitachell have been called to Pou de la Font several times by residents worried that the pigs could get onto the roads and cause an accident.

There are also fears that the Vietnamese pigs could mate with wild boar in the area, producing hybrids known as Cerdolies. Experiences in other parts of the province have already shown that these inherit the worst of both species, as they are as aggressive as the boars and breed as easily as the Vietnamese pigs.

The landowner admitted that the pigs were becoming a problem but no one in the area wants them to be harmed. A solution could be in sight as several people have come forward offering to adopt one of the animals.

"It's not their fault," she said.
"And we don't want any hunters coming here to kill them."

# For whom the bells toll

BELLS at Javea's Nuestra Señora de Loreto church no longer mark the hours.

The bells will ring for religious services only after a nearby resident's eight-year battle. He repeatedly complained about the bells and Masses to the town hall and the Valencian Community's ombudsman, the Sindic de Greuges.

The bells doubled the legally permitted levels, the Local Police found after taking decibel levels.

"Since taking over at the town hall the present local government has asked the parish church to lower the volume and attempted to me-

diate between the two parties," municipal sources said.

Until now, however, the neighbour has not been satisfied with the parish church's

offers to reduce the noise pollution and provide a volume regulator for the loadspeaker system.

The town hall has now is-

sued a schedule that limits bell-ringing to announcing services according to the church's summer and winter timetables, as well as fiesta days. The bells can also toll for funeral services.

"The only thing different is the bells will no longer mark the hours," a town hall statement said. This also emphasised the notification was not a ban but a schedule of exceptions to authorised use for the Loreto bells, which were not legal as they exceeded permitted levels.

The communique also stressed the decision was not a town hall decision, but the result of official complaints.

# Second Scottish Referendum could now be on the cards

PRIOR to the UK Parliament meeting to consider the Lords amendments to the proposed Article 50 White Paper. the general consensus of opinion (which proved correct) was that the Commons would reject the two amendments and then the Lords would capitulate.

Anticipation of this, and therefore the imminent triggering of Article 50, prompted Scottish First Minister Nicola Sturgeon to confirm that she intends to request a second Independence Referendum for Scotland within a week

It would follow that the Scottish Parliament would approve such a re-

quest as the Greens have already indicated that they would support the SNP over such a request which then means that Scotland would send what is known as a Section 30 order to

In such a scenario, it may be politi-

cally difficult for the Conservative government to reject the request but a huge amount will rest on the timing of such a referendum with the SNP wanting it to take place prior to Brexit and the British government more likely to argue it could only reasonably

take place after the UK leaves the EU.

Leader Sturgeon believes that she and her advisors have found a way for an Independent Scotland to remain within the single market whilst Prime Minister May could well argue that she has enough to do to negotiate a workable agreement without the additional problem of Scotland getting in

It doesn't appear that the Scots expect to achieve immediate membership of the EU, but would effectively continue to enjoy a number of the economic benefits if it could remain in the single market.

In the event that Scotland does get its right to a second referendum based on the fact that such a large percentage of voters wanted to remain part of the Union, there could well be further protests from those who didn't wish to leave or have changed their mind, plus politicians in Northern Ireland could well call for union with the Republic.

The next week may be very interesting for all concerned.

## Approval of Article 50

TO steal from TS Eliot, the peers Brexit revolt ended "not with a bang but with a whimper" and those expecting some drama before the inevitable agreement to the passing of the Article 50 White Paper were left disappointed.

Earlier on Monday March 13, the House of Commons had rejected the amendments sent back from the Lords with very few objections from tory backbenchers and 'ping ponged' it back to the Lords who, after a little deliberation (perhaps including some on their own future), decided to pass it without the amendments.

This means that the bill will receive Royal Ascent very shortly and the government has indicated that it will stick to the original timetable of triggering Article 50 at the end of this month.

Those UK passport holders living in Spain and other European Union countries will now hope to obtain positive information concerning their future once negotiations commence rather than current unsubstantiated promises of protec-







IT has been confirmed that the discussions between GM, owners of Opel and Vauxhall, and PSA, owners of Citroen and Peugeot, have been finalised and as expected PSA will take over the entire European operation.

Currently there are 24 factories in the group which are situated in Austria, Germany, Hungary, Poland and the UK employing 34.800 workers of whom 4.500 are in Britain and 5,000 in Spain,

With this takeover, which appears likely to be approved by

state governments as well as the European Union, PSA will become the second largest vehicle manufacturer in Europe after the Volkswagen group but in order to maintain its position and expand, it is looking to make savings of €1.73 billion per year.

One telling fact is that under GM ownership, the group had never made a profit, although it was on target to break even in 2016 had it not been for the drop in the value of sterling following the referendum vote.

# Carrefour to expand business

WHEN the Carrefour Group decides to open a new hypermarket, it invariably obtains a site with sufficient space to allow it to create a mini-mall or retail park where other independent companies can offer a range of different products to visitors.

This is a symbiotic relationship whereby the tenants have access to the Carrefour shoppers and the fact that there is a range of generally noncompeting products under the same roof often aids in the decision making process as to which supermarket consumers will visit.

Up until now, the management of the shopping centres and in some cases retail parks adjacent to the Carrefour stores has been undertaken by two separate real estate companies, Carmila and Cardety, but it has been announced (subject to shareholder approval) that Cardety will take over Carmila in a three for one share ex-

It is planned that the combined operation will take the Carmila name and will be floated on the French Stock Exchange with an expected worth of some €3 billion but interest-

ingly, Carrefour has significant shareholdings in both companies and will participate heavily in the newly

Although initially a French company, Carrefour has expanded signifi-

cantly into Spain and Italy as well as other countries around the world fuelling its expansion through takeover of companies, development and recently, the absorption of several Eroski super-stores throughout Spain.

The new group plans a number of new retail parks centred around Carrefour stores as part of a new five year plan which will also see significant development in the area of online shopping.

## **Sterling loses** 3.5 per cent against euro

AFTER significant losses following the Brexit result, the pound started to recover against the euro in particular returning to a level of around €1.19 which was maintained for several

Suddenly however it has taken a slow but sure backwards step dropping down to €1.145 at the time of writing this article and the reasons are not totally clear.

Different analysts expound different reasons, one being that the Lords amendments to the Article 50 White Paper are to blame, whilst others suggest that the pound is undervalued against the dollar but is simply finding its correct level against the euro, especially as the Eurozone appears to be relatively sound at the moment.

Those of us who receive pensions and investment payment in sterling are less interested in the reason and more interested in seeing it stronger.

# AirBnB at the crossroads

councils in many areas, especially Barcelona. Madrid and Mallorca believe that San Francisco based home rental company AirBnB continually encourages those renting properties to flout the laws, the company has just raised another \$1 billion (€940 million).

Only launched in 2008 by Brian Chesky and Joe Gebbia, the company charges letters 3 per cent of the value of the let and between 6 and 12 per cent to those renting and is now valued at \$31 billion (€29 billion) with operations hitting 65,000 cities worldwide.

Whilst the concept is very clever, there is no doubt that the company is managing to make enemies in very large cities which enjoy huge numbers of tourist visitors. Hotels are up in arms over the way in which the company takes business away from them and it is being blamed for the difficulty that many renters are having in finding long-term accommodation in London.

So worried was the British government about this situation, that the matter has been raised in parliament and the company has agreed to stop renters from letting their properties out for more than 90 days in a year unless they are registered with local councils.

Spain recently introduced some relatively draconian restrictions on short term letters requiring registration, air conditioning, free wifi and a number of other regulations in order to both support their tourist industry and to ensure that those letters actually pay tax on what they earn.

The Barcelona City Council believes that rentals via AirBnB do not recognise the laws in place and has levelled significant fines on the company which have been appealed, but fines have also been levied on property managers in New York City for using the company to advertise entire apartments for rent.

This highly successful company has gone from strength to strength and has received investment from the founder of Amazon as well as celebrities and movie stars, but doesn't appear ready as yet to float on the stock market especially as its high development and expansion costs have finally taken it into significant profit.

The company is at the crossroads, facing continued growth in the market and profit or being shut down due to alleged multiple breaches of laws around the world.

## **JD Sports new** Iberian deal

JUST one day before it is due to open its new store in Cordoba, JD Sports has announced that it intends to enter into a partnership through its Sprinter brand with Portuguese retailer Sport Zone owned by the Sonae group.

This new joint venture to be known as the Iberian Sports Retail Group will manage and operate more than 250 stores in Portugal and Spain with an annual expected turnover of €450 million, although the British group has been expanding steadily within Spain and currently sells goods to the value of €40 million.

The agreement appears to give JD Sports a 50 per cent ownership of the new company whilst its Spanish division Sprinter will have 20 per cent and Sonae are to take 30 per cent. If this deal is finalised, then the new group will become one of the largest sporting goods retailers in Spain and Portugal, competing directly with French-owned

Not content with expansion in Europe, JD Sports is also expanding its business in Australia and despite regular negative media coverage, appears to continue to enlarge and discover new outlets for its goods.

# The UK's spring budget and Spain

CHANCELLOR Philip Hammond presented his first budget on March 8 and whilst a great deal of it won't have any effect on British passport holders living in Spain, there are a few developments which will be of interest.

It was unfortunate that Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn tweeted just prior to the budget, exhorting supporters to "Sign the petition against Osborne's cuts" and although technically correct, it gave ammunition to certain parts of the media to suggest that he didn't know that Osborne had been replaced.

In general terms, Hammond took a fairly upbeat position with regards to the economy and the fact that Britain needs to borrow less money than originally forecast although growth is expected to slow down over the next few years until expanding in 2021.

He allocated more money to adult social care over the next three years with £2 billion (€2.3 billion) put to one side and did not introduce a retroactive claw back of monies spent on social care from inheritances which came as a relief to

The NHS didn't fare so well and despite the 'promises' (or were they just suggestions?) that many pro-Brexit campaigners - many of whom are now Cabinet Ministers - gave concerning massive monthly payments to the NHS, he was only able to find £425 million (€489 million) over three years for the countries health.

**Britain needs** to borrow less money than originally forecast.

The chancellor did however find around £1 billion (€1.15 billion) for education and the creation of even more selective schools as well as granting poor 11 to 15 year olds free transport to their schools as long as they are eligible for free school dinners.

Investors can earn 2.2 per cent on a new Investment Bond but tax-free dividend allowance

will be reduced from £5,000 (€5,750) to £2,000 (€2,300) from April 2018.

The area that has caused the largest furore concerns National Insurance contributions for the self-employed which, according to detractors, marks a direct U-turn from pre-election promises that there would be no new taxes with the government explaining that that wasn't quite what they meant really and was down to a matter of interpretation.

There should be a few more pubs left open for visitors to the UK as they will receive some rate relief for one year. Those living in Spain however can congratulate themselves on the fact that they are in a country where drinking alcohol and smoking cigarettes is still considerably cheaper than in the UK.

Finally, only a cynic would complain about the £5 million (€5.75 million) found on International Women's Day to celebrate the Centenary of the Representation of the People Act which in 1918 led to the eventual granting of votes to


# Stop press! Is Theresa May after a hard Brexit or soft crexit?



Given the way the political parties are organised, they have the last word even though sidelined Iñigo Errejon is preferred by Podemos-inclined voters. Almost 43 per cent would have voted for Errejon had they participated in last month's party conference, Sigma Dos pollsters found, compared with almost 26 per cent backing Iglesias.

It's no different with the PSOE socialists' ex-secretary general Pedro Sanchez. Revered by the aptlynamed militants, he is planning a comeback, presumably to lead the party to another worst-ever defeat.

Sigma Dos also found that PSOE voters prefer Errejon, hardly surprising as they have nothing to thank the Podemos supremo for. If Iglesias had backed the PSOE instead of manoeuvring for a second general election in March 2016 Pedro Sanchez would now be Spain's president.

On second thoughts, perhaps Iglesias' strategy did us a favour.


# Too much salt for most Spaniards

SPANIARDS consume nearly double the recommended daily amount

The World Health Organisation (WHO) recommends that adults should consume less than 5g of salt per day, but data published by the Spanish Agency for Food Safety and Nutrition (AESAN) indicates that the Spanish population consumes an average of 9.7g of salt per

The report said that 72 per cent of ingested salt comes from processed foods such as sausages, breads, cheeses and ready-made meals, with many Spaniards not aware of the salt content in the foods they buy.

Experts explain salt can be consumed as 'visible' and 'invisible' salt. In contrast to the popular belief that salt added during the cooking and seasoning of the dishes ('visible' salt) constitutes the highest percentage of salt consumption, this represents only 20 per cent. It is the 'invisible' salt, which comes from food, that is the most concern, accounting to around 80 per cent of total salt consumption.



per cent of ingested salt comes from processed foods like sausages, cheese and ready-made meals.

Salt is essential, but large amounts can have a detrimental effect on health if consumed in excess. For some years now, Spain has joined the National Salt Reduction Plan of the European Union.

This plan includes studies to know the consumption of salt in the Spanish population and the main sources of salt, the application of public awareness actions and the promotion of food education in the



# Sciatica

Sciatica is a name that is used for many discomforts in the lower back. The real cause of Sciatica is an irritation of the sciatic nerve. This nerve runs, with its branches, from the spine through the pelvis to the leg. If the nerve gets irritated somewhere from the spine before it enters the leg, it is officially called

Normally this kind of sciatic pain is accompanied with low back pain.



A misalignment of the pelvis can cause pressure on the nerve and prolonged misalignment can even cause spasms and scar tissue in the pelvis, which in turn may compress the nerve. This complaint normally starts on one side of the lower back going into the buttock and then further down into the leg.



### Casual attitude to casual sex

NEW research reveals just 72 per cent of under-25's believe it is important to have regular sexual health screening if in casual relationships.

The Mintel research, which questioned nearly 2.000 internet users, indicates that young men are the most likely to adopt a relaxed attitude towards screening with just two thirds (67 per cent) of 18 to 24-year-old men agreeing that it is important to have regular sexual health screening, compared to 81 per cent of Brits overall.

Further highlighting an 'act now and think later' approach, 41 per cent of 18 to 24-year-olds and 49 per cent of 18 to 24-yearold men, agree that it is only necessary to see a doctor if they have symptoms following unprotected sex. Young adults, and young men in particular, display a worrving lack of concern over the dangers of unprotected sex and the consequences of not taking care of sexual health."

She added that the "rapid growth of free dating apps has facilitated a culture of casual sexual encounters, particularly amongst adults under-35."

## **Understanding** hay fever and how to treat it

#### WHAT is hav fever?

Hay fever, or allergic rhinitis, is an over-reaction of mucous membranes in the nose to certain particles such as dust, pollen and sometimes even the cold which mainly affect the nose and eves.

#### What causes it?

Hay fever is caused by allergens that trigger the release of chemicals, such as histamines. which in turn cause the symptoms of an allergic reaction.

#### Is it worse at certain times of the day?

Depending on the type of allergy, symptoms might be worse at certain times of day. Pollen for example, is most abundant in the early morning, although the weather can also affect levels throughout the day.

#### What are the symp-

The allergic reaction may cause an itchy and

runny nose throughout the months when plants are in flower. Other symptoms include nasal congestion, headaches and in some cases dizziness similar to when one suffers from vertigo.

#### How is it treated?

There are different ways of treating hay

Antihistamines, decongestants and corticoids are the most common as they help manage the symptoms. It is also advisable to avoid exposure to the substances which trigger the reaction when possible.

### Are there other reme-

A person can receive several vaccinations. known as immunotherapy, to help the body tolerate allergens and improve the symptoms; however this course of treatment must always be prescribed and managed by a qualified allergist.

# Intense cycling could help ward off ageing

A QUICK, intense, four minutes of cycling could help stop the ageing process.

It could be the news everyone who hates long workouts has been waiting for, as a US study found that short bursts of intense exercise, such as spinning classes, which are fast cycling classes, can help reverse damage to cells which decline with age.

High-intensity interval training, or HIIT training, helps halt the damage to the cells which start the ageing

The Mavo Clinic in Minnesota signed up 72 men and women aged between 18 and 30 and 65 to 80 for HIIT exercises, resistance training using weights, and combined training with longer bouts of cycling and fewer weights sessions.

**High-intensity inter**val training, or HIIT training, helps halt the damage to the cells which start the ageing process.

As well as helping cell ageing, they found that short bursts of exercise improved fitness, cut body fat and can help to prevent diabetes, but it was not so effective at improving muscle strength which declines with age.

The volunteers with the greatest improvement in reversing cell damage, carried out four minutes of intensive cycling, followed by three easier minutes, 12 times a week, along with another 90 minutes walking on a tread-

The researchers are using their findings to try and develop a drug that will mimic the effects of exercise in warding off old YOUTHFUL SPIN: Short bursts of intense exercise helps slow down ageing.



"This has been a way of promoting the integration of our residents and I would like to thank all the associations who have participated, and made the event the success that it is."






# Ambitious or capricious?

Success is born out of arrogance - but greatness comes from humility. Marco Pierre White

GOOD FOOD. **GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS** GARRY WAITE

HAVE BEEN watching a three-part series called The Replacement. It's very good and tells the story of a woman architect who is pregnant and needs to find someone to take her place in the practice while she goes on maternity leave. In her absence it would appear that the replacement has eyes on her job, position and reputation within the practice.

Although not as dark and well scripted as this programme, I experienced something similar many years ago.

I was looking for an assistant food and beverage manager for the hotel where I was the Food and Beverage Manager. A colleague of mine was aware of my search and put me in touch with an experienced and ambitious young man.

This guy was a very personable chap and had the qualities I was looking for. I took him on. The General Manager liked him as did the area director and soon he proved himself to be a good addition to the team.

He was always volunteering to take on some of my load and in return for his enthusiasm I imparted as much knowledge of the business and the operation in particular as I could.

Months went by and I was due a holiday, I hadn't had one for over a year and I was looking forward to it. I knew the place would be in good hands so I went with the confidence that all would be well in my absence.

Unfortunately while away I contracted some sort of virus and on my return was not able to go back to work for a further 10 days. When I eventually said that I was free to come back, I was informed that in my absence they had reorganised the hotel's management structure and - you guessed it! - my position was no longer!! I had been replaced!!

I had turned him into a mini me, he had met my clients, was playing tennis with the boss and generally making himself indispensable. The pole to success can be slippery, in order to climb it, it pays to have the right gloves!! Perhaps boxing gloves?

The irony of this story is, I met up with my nemesis a couple of years later. I asked how things were going and he told me a familiar story. He had done with another exactly what I had done with him. Trusted him, encouraged and taught. Obviously too well. Had he learnt anything? "Yes," he said, "don't be generous with your knowledge and play everything close to your chest" - 'et tu Brute?' comes to mind!!

THOSE READERS FROM the west of England may well remember Thornbury Castle just outside of Bristol. The castle was built as a residence in 1511 for Edward Stafford the then 3rd Duke of Buckingham. However the Duke ran into a spot of bother with Henry VIII being accused of treason and so met his demise at the end of the executioner's axe. Henry confiscated the house and used it himself. staving there in 1535 for 10 days on his honeymoon with new bride Anne Boleyn.

Following the English Civil War, the castle fell into disrepair, but was renovated in 1824 by the Howard family. Between 1966 and 1986 the castle was operated as one of the UK's top restaurants by Kenneth Bell MBE with staff that included a soon to be food writer Nigel Slater and now a MasterChef New Zealand judge Simon Gault, honing their culinary craft.

I first met Kenneth in 1974. No one deserved to be lord of the manor more than him. He had an air of aristocracy about him and was a fine mine host. He also has a major claim to fame in as much as that during his reign the hotel restaurant gained one of the very few Michelin stars in Great Britain at the time.

Kenneth retired after he sold the property for an undisclosed sum and it was eventually owned and operated by Van Essen Hotels. In 2011, following the administration of Van Essen Hotels, the property was on the market for 7.5 million pounds and was bought by Luxury Family Hotels as part of a 30 million pound purchase of a seven strong portfo-

The castle is now for sale again for offers in excess of 8.5 million pounds. Set in 14 acres of landscaped grounds this 28 bedroom Grade 1 listed building has a two rosette restaurant and conference and banqueting facilities. So if your back pocket is bulging and you fancy being 'King of the Castle' then it's being marketed by Savills. I'll just go and check my

IN THIS WEEK'S WINE CORNER I am introducing you to a wine from one of my favourite white wine growing areas of Spain. Galicia! Most enthusiastic consumers will immediately know Rias Baixas famous for Albariño, but not all of our readers will know the other areas of denomination, Monterei, Ribeira Sacra, Ribeiro and Valdeorras.

Galicia is a typically complex wine region, it has a variety of climates (Atlantic to Continental) and soil (granite to slate).

One of the most interesting of these areas is Valdeorras, the easternmost wine region of Galicia, where the best vineyards are planted on terraces on the steep sides of the Sil river.

Like many other wine regions in Spain, the area is being rediscovered by a new, young generation of talented winemakers, willing to make elegant wine with a sense of place. The two best in

Valdeorras are Telmo Rodriguez and Rafael

Rafael grew up in a wine family and, having left the family estate in 2004, settled in the Val do Bibei part of Valdeorras, where he works with terraced plots of Godello grape which are locally known as 'sorte,' some of which are 720 metres high. All vineyard work and harvest is done by hand - crippling, but rewarding, work.

The wine I am writing about this week is As Sortes. Made from a selection of the older vines of each plot, some of which are almost 100 years old. this wine is a benchmark for Godello. Structure, complexity, intensity, character, freshness... it has it all. It bears a great resemblance to Burgundy and I

am sure on a blind tasting even the most competent taster will be surprised to find out it that it's Spanish!

Tasting notes show it has a striking nose showing freshly podded peas, green apple, fresh pastry and toasty citrus - deep and complex but still fresh and inviting.

The palate has that pleasing oiliness which coats the mouth with what can only be described as an 'English garden' crunch, combining gooseberry, Granny Smith apple, and a mineral character that invokes the deep savoury flavour of black kale. It's a savoury, rich beauty that will triumph with food but is complex and satisfying enough to drink on its own.

It has some vintages, most notably 2014 which of course is still drinking well. Again it isn't cheap for a white wine, costing around 25/30€ a bot-

I have said for a long time now that Spain is now producing astonishingly good wines to compete with some of the best in the world. It's hard to think that 30 odd years ago we seemed to be limited to Monopole, Marques de Caceres and Esmeralda. Having said that I do still try and avoid white Rioja!

Did I learn anything from this? Yes, never go on holiday because if you do, when you get back, the chances are you'll find someone sitting at your desk!!

# Mystery owners raise eyebrows

THE cheapest property sold in the UK for a long time was a Birmingham house bought in January. The semi-detached with three bedrooms in Northfield sold for just £14,760 (€17,000). That's a far cry from the most expensive sale of 2017 so far, a Kensington detached mega-mansion that went for a startling £24.2 million (€28 million).

There are hundreds of superrich foreigners with homes

valued at more than €20 million in the UK capital. But, thanks to clever accounting, it's almost impossible to find out who they are.

In 2013 the government decided to put an end to the mystery and impose a huge tax on owners who masked themselves behind offshore companies and other smoke and mirror schemes. But most of the owners have elected to pay an extra  $\leq 250,000$  a year in tax rather than reveal their true identities.

Data from 2016 revealed that there are 210 such properties in London alone, most sitting idle and empty while the mysterious owners stump up huge taxes. At anywhere from €20-120 million it is the property investment that counts, not pesky government charges.

Offshore companies now own almost all of London's most expensive properties. Police have investigated homes worth a combined €210 million for suspected involvement in money-laundering schemes.

# Real estate ramps up

IN a surefire sign that Spanish residential real estate is set for some profitable times ahead, Bilbao-based construction company Neinor Homes plans to float 60 per cent of its share capital on the Spanish stock exchange.

Vast amounts of foreign investment flowing into the country has inspired the move. It represents the first time a residential property developer has gone onto the stock exchange in 10 years.

A statement from Neinor, which specialises in acquiring prime land for development, said that international investors had a powerful vision for the recovery of the Spanish real estate sector, which continues its strong recovery.

The firm counts hundreds of developments and more than 9,000 homes among its assets, valued at more than €1 billion. Residential home construction in Spain has

been humming along nicely in recent years, encouraged by spectacular growth in the commercial real estate sector.

# Stronger than ever before

HOUSE prices in Spain saw their biggest annual rise since the bursting of the housing bubble in 2007. Complete data for 2016 is now in and makes for extremely optimistic read-

It was the third consecutive year of growth and the best since 2007.

Prices rose by a robust 4.7 per cent last year, well above the European average. It was the third consecutive year of growth and the best since 2007 when prices rose by 9.8 per cent. As recently as 2013 they had decreased by 13.7 per cent, which demonstrates the incredible improvements seen in the last three years.

New homes fared especially well last year, with prices rising by 6.5 per cent. The figures may still be some way off those seen in the boom years, but are more sustainable by virtue of their moderation.

At the end of the year the average value per square metre stood at €1,512. In 2008 it reached a peak of €2,101. It may take some time to hit those numbers again but the broader health and global appeal of the Spanish property market is stronger than

The new year has already begun well. House prices clocked a 1.8 per cent year-on-year increase in February. Foreclosures also saw a dramatic drop, 30 per cent lower in 2016 than in 2015, which points to the broader favourability of financial conditions for property investors

### Time to build homes

SPAIN needs to build more than 120,000 new homes every year until 2022 if it is to keep up with demand.

From 2022 to 2026 the country will need another 156,000 per annum, and almost 160,000 after that.

It sounds like a lot but it's not impossible. During the boom years, Spain built almost 300,000 homes. That declined to below 70.000 in the recession and

now the construction industry is once again preparing for serious business.

A level of around 150,000 per year is considered sustainable. Andalucia, Valencia, Madrid and Catalonia will, unsurprisingly, require the most new homes.

An interesting side note is that the Spanish population is expected to decline until 2030 as the country continues to see young people leave and fertility rates drop.

The housing model of the future looks set to see less people in larger homes, contrasting with the past when you might find four generations in two bedrooms. An expanding middle class of childless couples or singles are eager to get on the housing ladder now that the recession is finally over.

With rents reaching record highs and new fixed rate mortgages available, the demand to buy is there. Spain simply needs to

# Water soothes all



tence being a pleasure.

Whilst current properties do not allow for a modern riad and pool within the home, it is still perfectly possible to place a small water feature within an apartment or house and the sound of water can be both comforting and surprisingly pleasant.

If you have a garden, then the options are much greater and a pond or fountain isn't just something to look at, but can add moisture to the air on a very hot day and attract brightly coloured birds and dragonflies.



# Succession planting can show dividends when harvesting


IT is time to start preparing the vegetable garden for the summer harvest. Planting earlier in spring than northern Europe gardens gives a great bonus when living in Spain.

The longer growing season allows for an extended period of harvest of tomatoes, capsicum, and a host of other popular and exotic vegetables. If you want to maximise production, the secret to a prolonged harvest is succession

Succession planting is based on planting enough plants to produce what you need on a regular basis rather than the normal mass planting at the optimum time to fill the garden which creates a feast and famine harvest.

It does have some risks to plant early and late in the season with frosts or adverse weather affecting the production, but as only a small number are planted with each succession, it is a small risk to total production. Harvest is more useful when it is spread over a longer period and you can enjoy the fresh produce more regularly.

This can mean less work to preserve produce and less loss of prime produce as there is less excess production that can often go to seed or pass its best picking time



and become bitter or woody depending on the crop. Succession planting can also be used to ensure your garden is always in production as spent crops are replaced by the next seasonal crop.

I usually plant lettuce every month throughout autumn, winter and spring. I start planting tomatoes in March, usually just a few and then plant more each month until August, changing the varieties from early to late in order to match the planting times. Some years it works wonderfully to have very early tomatoes, other years the first planting fails but the second is soon ready to start picking in just a few weeks more. So I don't miss out on a harvest and always have as long a season as possible for the

It doesn't work with all vegetables to have monthly planting. I find cauliflower and broccoli tend to produce at the same time as those around them even if only

It is best to soil between plantings.

young. For these I don't plant too many and give a two to three month interval of planting. I find this gives a greater appreciation of them when they are available.

Other good examples of succession planting are artichokes and potatoes. They can be planted in two periods, autumn and early spring, to give an early and late harvest thus extending the availability of these fresh veggies over much of the year.

The most successful monthly planting succession vegetables (when in season) are lettuce, beans, peas, corn, carrots, radish, onions, tomatoes, spinach, beets and other salad green.

It is best to add good compost and fertilise the soil between plantings of crops to maintain soil nutrition and health of the ecology to maintain continuous production. It is also important to vary the succeeding crops so as not to just have the same type of vegetable in the same garden beds by following the principles of crop rotation.



# Pack hierarchy can be changed

I HAD a call from a gentleman that informed me he had put his Dobermann to sleep due to illness, the dog was 12 years. Of course he was devastated. They have another four dogs.

A few nights later they were in bed when they heard terrible fighting going on downstairs. The Cocker Spaniel had nearly bitten one dog's nose off and

tantly he took the Spaniel to the vet and put the dog to sleep. He explained that the Spaniel looked at him as if to say Dad why are you doing this? The man was in a terrible state and called me to ask if he had done the right thing.

I immediately said no. The pack hierarchy had now changed and sometimes this causes fights. If dogs start fighting dogs it has to be established which dog is the new leader (in many cases it needs an expert to help you).

The new top dog is to be loved 10 times more and fed first. We keep using his name and touching and cuddling him as a favourite. We are showing this dog that he is a top dog.

The fighting then stops. However I would stress that this does not work with fighting females. There is no

known way to stop fighting and terrible injuries. Best to rehome one of them.

When a dog places his paws and chest on the hindquarters of another dog like mounting this is normal and common canine behaviour. In most cases, it is NOT a sexual behaviour unless the dog is thrusting. In young puppies, it is a play behaviour. In older dogs, it is a method of communication, the dog who is mounting the other dog is generally displaying

Quite often owners who have brought another dog into the family get upset when they see the younger dog mounting or biting the rear legs of the resident dog. It is best not to correct the behaviour, it is very normal. Sometimes this is when the status of the young dog is changing in the pack and the younger dog becomes the top dog.

Trying to understand this behaviour it might be worth thinking how children as they grow into adults sometimes take care and make decisions for their parents as they get old. The human pack also changes!

My daughter always bosses me around!

# Concept and classics

By Matthew Elliott

SOME of the most outlandish concept cars seen in the 21st century made their debut as the 2017 Geneva Motor Show got into full swing.

Though most of the concepts will always be mere ideas rather than reality, they offer a fascinating glimpse into the future landscape of the motoring industry.

Pace, the conceptual forerunner to the firm's first fully electric vehicle.

From Mercedes was a new GT concept, an AMG powered by a 4.0 litre v8 twin-turbocharged engine with an electric motor. Theoretically it can hit 100kph in less than three seconds.

There was the Peugeot Instinct, which brings the 'Internet of Things' into the driver's seat with a speechenabled personal assistant

tonomous and drive modes. Renault raised eyebrows with a lightweight electric four-wheel drive made of carbon fibre and kevlar boasting Formula E standard controls.

But it wasn't just the future being represented at the show. The retroverse was on full display too with a rollicking repertoire of Fords, Monteverdis. Mercedes and Porsches reaching out to classic fans.

A 1968 Mercedes-Benz 280 SL Pagoda stood out with its fresh red paintwork. There was a 1963 Porsche 901, a Monteverdi High Speed 375 C, first unveiled in 1971 and now lingering in a Swiss museum, and a Ford Focus RS WRC originally built for the late Colin McRae in

1999.

The car is earmarked to launch in 2021, two years after its first mid-engined model, the Valkyrie, hits the market in 2019.

488 GTB

It will be built in Gaydon, Warwickshire, alongside the DB11, the Vantage, due to be replaced by a sportier version later this year, and the Vanquish, which is scheduled to move into front-engined supercar territory in 2018.

Also in the pipeline is the DBX SUV, which will be constructed at the company's new factory at St Athan in Wales.

In addition there will be two Lagonda models with a saloon due in 2020 and an SUV in 2022.

# he formidable Subaru Outback

THE Subaru Outback is a formidable off-roader which is also very good to drive on the tarmac, making it ideal for those whose lifestyle mixes urban and rural ac-

It is quite refined to drive, is equipped,

and Subaru has an excellent reputation for reliability so it ticks many boxes for potential buyers, with prices starting from €37,844

While the 2.0 litre diesel will be the choice of many, those seeking

sharper performance can have the 172 hp 2.5 litre petrol model which still offers 14.3 kpl, pretty good for such a large vehicle, and this version - the Outback entry-level model - was the one I tested.

It is labelled SE Lineartronic and has CVT auto transmission with all-wheel-drive, and delivers

and the CVT box changes with minimal fuss. With nicely-weighted steering too, everything combines to give a refined drive on smooth surfaces, though on heavily-potholed roads, you do feel the bumps. The Outback also feels quite nimble in town, easy to handle and park.

engine pulls smoothly and quietly

On the open road it corners well and while, as with most vehicles in this sector, there is an element of body roll, it is well-controlled with reassuring grip and the overall ride quality is very good.

The exterior of the Outback makes a strong and quite classy visual statement, and while the cabin is laid out for functionality rather than style, its understatement is no detriment to the overall good im-

There is plenty of room for five occupants, and the boot space of 559 litres (expanding to 1,848 litres) is substantial.

This entry-level version comes with an extensive standard equipment list which includes alloy wheels, roof rails, powered tailgate, sunroof, body-cladding, touchscreen infotainment system, Bluetooth, satnay, Starlink connectivity, adaptive cruise control, climate control, leather upholstery, auto emergency braking, and engine stop-start.

The Outback comes over as a well-built no-nonsense contender with plenty of standard kit and Subaru's top reputation for de-



Jess Varnish (26) has stated she was the victim of a "coverup... thrown under the bus" by GB Cycling. Speaking for the first time since last April when she accused the governing body of sexism after being dropped from the elite programme, Varnish said she's now "relieved the truth is finally coming out." Former technical director Shane Sutton was said to have used 'sexist language' towards her, but was cleared of eight of nine allegations against him.

Johanna Konta beat Heather Watson in the 'Battle of the Brits' in round two of the Indian Wells tennis tournament. However, GB's trio of Andy Murray, Kyle Edmund, Dan Evans all crashed out of the men's singles early on, Murray against qualifier Vasek Pospisil.

Five-time Grand Slam winner Maria Sharapova will be unranked when she returns to action on April 26 in the Porsche Grand Prix in France after serving her suspension for testing positive for meldonium.
