



Don't forget Mother's Day

MOTHERING SUNDAY in the UK and Gibraltar is the fourth Sunday in Lent and differs from the date of Mother's Day in Spain (first Sunday in May) and the USA (second Sunday in May) but although this is in some ways a relatively new holiday, its roots go back to Ancient Greece.

More recently, it became a regular celebration in the UK as early as the 17th century, when following a church service where prayers were dedicated to the Virgin Mary it became traditional to give flowers and small gifts to mothers of all

The practice died out in the UK by the 19th century but was promoted in the USA by Julia Ward Howe, composer of the iconic 'Battle Hymn of the Republic' and by 1914, it was officially recognised in the USA.

Today, Mother's Day is recognised in at least 50 countries throughout the world and it is likely that restaurants and flower shops in certain parts of Spain will be particularly busy on Sunday March 26 as British residents and visitors take the opportunity to celebrate and thank their mothers.

Rare find near river

NATURE group Heliaca has located Europe's largest orchid near Monovar.

Club members found two specimens of the Giant Orchid (Himantoglossum robertianum) in a stream that feeds the River Vinalopo.

Although this type of orchid can grow to almost one metre in height, the two Monovar examples measure around 50 centimetres at present.

The orchid is included in the Valencian Community's catalogue of Endangered Plants, meaning that both the plant and its surroundings are protected.

It is not usual to find the Giant Orchid in this part of the Vinalopo as it needs very damp conditions to grow, Heliaca said.

"Once we stop polluting the Vinalopo, it could become an expansion area for these streams with species that have disappeared from the river itself," an association spokesman said. But for that to happen it would be necessary to eradicate fly-tipping and control how the streams are used,

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...6

SPAIN'S Michelin starred restaurants have been making global headlines for two decades, and with 30 new stars awarded for 2017, the trend looks set to continue. There are now nine restaurants in Spain with the maximum three-star rating for "exceptional cuisine with a special journey," placing the nation fifth in world rankings behind Japan (26), France (25), the U.S. (14), and Germany (10).



LEGENDARY Basque chef Martin Berasategui is the holder of eight Michelin stars, more than anyone else in Spain.

He began to work at his parent's restaurant at the age of 14, when there were no Michelin stars in the Basque Country, but by 25 he owned the restaurant and had gained his first star.

He opened his eponymous eatery in Lasarte-Oria, near San Sebastian, in 1993 and it was awarded its third Michelin star in 2001.

Berasategui holds three more stars at Lasarte in

WITH 30 stars across the city. Barcelona heads Spanish city rankings with the most Michelin awards. However, only one eatery - Berasategui's Lasarte - eniovs the top accolade, collecting its third star in this year's awards, the first addition in this category since 2014. Full to bursting

LAST November levels at the Amadorio dam in Villajoyosa were lower than anyone ever remembers.

Four months later the reservoir is at 90 per cent capacity following periods of torrential rain in December, January and earlier this month.

The last downpour deposited 100 litres of rain per square metre in some Marina Baja areas and the Confederacion Hidrografica del Jucar (CHJ) sluice gates for several hours.

A learning curve for schools

JUST 28 per cent of Alicante Province state schools opted to teach mainly in Spanish.

Under the Valencia region's tri-lingual programme, schools can choose how much is taught in Valenciano, English and Spanish.

The Generalitat has introduced a carrot-and-stick formula, so that more classes in Valenciano automatically bring more in English.

The advanced level of four subjects taught in Eng-

lish, one in Spanish and the remainder in Valenciano was chosen by 164 schools, 40 per cent of the total.

In contrast, 132 schools - 32 per cent of the total will teach in both languages at intermediate level with two subjects in Valenciano, one or two in English and the rest in Spanish.

A further 119 schools (28 per cent) chose the basic level taught in Spanish with one subject in English and one in Valenciano.

Postcard from CÓRDOBA



ANDALUCIA'S third largest city, Cordoba with a 350,000 population and a fascinating mix of old and new is the globe's largest urban space to be declared a World Heritage Site by Unesco.

Despite mercury levels from June to September at times rising to 45° it is a year-round favourite with national and foreign tourists partly due to excellent road, rail and air links.

With its history dating to pre-Roman times. Cordoba fell under Moorish domination as early as 711 and by the 10th century was one of the largest cities in the known world.

Unlike in some parts of Spain, Christians and Muslims existed alongside each other and at one time worshipped in the same building. The building of the great Mosque ended this practice though when the city was restored to Spanish rule, the Mosque became a Cathedral and is still a place of worship today.

Near to the Cathedral is the old Jewish Quarter and the city also boasts seven bridges, and an annual Patio Festival, in addition to hundreds of jewellery manufacturers and superb restaurants which blend the influences of Moorish and Spanish culinary tastes. Popular dishes include Salmorejo and Rabo de Toro.

Colombian hitman is ruled out

A COLOMBIAN criminal was arrested three days after Maria del Carmen Martinez's murder in Alicante City last December.

The wealthy 72-year-old businesswoman, widow of former CAM Bank president Vicente Sala, was shot in the head at close

Although this is the trademark of a hitman, police looked towards Maria del Carmen's family circle from the outset and her son-in-law Miguel Lopez is currently on remand.

They nevertheless arrested and questioned a 39year-old Colombian, who had fled from Germany where he is wanted for attempted murder, serious bodily harm and breaching firearms regulations.

Aware that much of the Sala family's fortune is based on its business interests in Latin America, including Colombia, police located the wanted man and searched his home.

They found computers, phones, several memory sticks and 20 grammes of cocaine but nothing connecting him to Maria del Carmen's murder.

The die is cast

Spring clean for rivers

THE Limne Foundation is organising another of its river-cleaning operations in the Valencian Community.

Last year 588 volunteers removed 4.5 tons of rubbish from the rivers in the 20 municipalities participating in the 'Manos al Rio' scheme and with 24 municipalities and more volunteers this year, an even bigger haul is expect-


The demolished section of the wall that protects the Raco de l'Albir has now been repaired by national government's coastal authority, Costas. The beach has also been levelled after

"We want everything in perfect order for Easter, which is just round the corner," the councillor said. "The beach is an important attraction for residents and visitors but it's also an important source of earnings," she added.



VALENTINA and her partner chose the worst possible night to camp out on 730-metre Montgo, she admitted afterwards.

As they reached the top a storm broke out, temperatures plummeted and Valentina, 28, and her 39-yearold partner had to huddle in their tent with their three dogs. "My hands are still swollen from the cold," she said three days later.

"It was a terrible night. We suffered very much," Valentina com-


brigade, maintaining they told her they could not come out. Instead they recommended the couple kept warm and spent the night as best they could.

Valentina also claimed the firemen told her they were foolish to climb Montgo during bad weather. "It was our fault, of course it was. But they totally abandoned us," she

When the wind ripped their tent at 3am they decided to leave by the Javea path where they were found cue unit who had gone out to find them. Valentina said.

Fire brigade sources confirmed later they did not go out as it was dark by then and the helicopter could not fly. They had also made certain the couple were not injured or ill.

The next morning, despite filthy weather with practically nil visibility, the helicopter did go out although flying over Montgo was still risky. "They didn't even advise us they had decided to get themselves down," the same sources said.

Mother of home alone child faces prosecution

AN Alicante City mother faces prosecution for leaving her small daughter alone in their apartment.

As previously reported in the Euro Weekly News a video of the girl, who recently celebrated her sixth birthday, went viral as she was seen balanced on a narrow ledge seven storeys above the ground late at

The young girl had climbed through the apartment window when she woke to find that her mother

She was rescued by firemen minutes after horrified passers-by in Plaza de Luceros in central Alicante rang the emergency services.

Shortly afterwards, the Local Police located the child's mother who explained that she had left the apartment to pick up her partner, who is not the child's biological partner, from the gym.

The mother was called to declare before the judge two days later and allowed to go after admitting that she had made an error of judgement.

but took longer than she thought. She didn't imagine the child would open the window as it's difficult and she'd never done if before," her lawver said.

The investigating judge has now finished his enquiry and concluded that there are indications of crime on the mother's part as her daughter's life was in danger.

The child's biological father also announced that he would take the part of the private accusation allowed by Spanish law.

Cracking down on fruit thieves

By Caroline Tyszka

THE Guardia Civil has allocated 150 officers to a protective security unit, to prevent nispero thefts during the upcoming harvest season.

The unit will monitor the

cultivation of six towns' crops within the Marina Baixa, with particular attention being paid to Callosa d'en Sarria where most of the fruit is grown.

Part of the remit for the police will be to watch markets,

warehouses and other areas where thieves can sell their stolen produce.

The operation, designed by the Guardia Civil, will cover about 3.000 hectares scattered between the towns' of Bolulla, Alfaz del Pi, Altea, La Nucia, Polop and Callosa d'en Sarrià.

The Seprona division of the Guardia Civil will provide dogs to support the officers along with air support from the region's helicopter.

In 2016 54 thefts were recorded, of which 19 took place in Callosa, Guardia Civil reported that in most of these cases the thieves were men, of Spanish, Romanian or Bulgarian nationality and working in pairs.

Officers, working in collaboration with the local farmers, hope that this campaign will see a reduction in

Anyone who witnesses unusual or suspicious behaviour relating to the picking, or sale of the delicate fruit, can either contact the Guardia Civil directly at their barracks, via the internet or through the 'Alertcops' app which sends

the number of thefts for 2017, but highlighted the importance of farm workers being extra vigilant, and reporting anything that seemed suspicious, even if they felt it was insignificant.





IT is now less hazardous for Benimagrell residents to cross the old N-332 to reach San Juan

There is a new zebra crossing with traffic lights, plus a speed bump to slow down traffic, on the former main road now renamed Avenida Miguel Hernandez. The existing pedestrian underpass will remain open for the time being, but is to be sealed off once the public becomes used to the zebra crossing, the town hall explained.

Measures to control traffic on the road, which is still busy despite the bypass, began by slowing traffic to 30 kilometres an hour inside the centre of San Juan and 50 within the town limits.

There are plans for a further crossing connecting San Juan with the Cines Anna shopping area, revealed Traffic councillor Eva Delgado.

Help for genetic heart conditions

THE Marina Baixa hospital's new genetic testing programme has shown promising results.

The Cardiology department at the Villajoyosa hospital has, since June 2016. been offering consultations for families with a history of heart disease, in order to detect any other family members suffering from the killer condition.

Doctor Mateo Rodriguez, consultant for the study, has now been able to reveal the data obtained from the first patients.

Since its inception the Cardiology specialist team has evaluated 16 families and a total of 156 cardiological studies have been carried

out on 46 people.

Of the 46 cases half now have a confirmed diagnosis of heart disease, which would not have been discovered until much later had it not been for the early warning detection. Of the affected patients, evenly divided between men and women, the average age was 41 years old.

Describing the results as 'promising' the department of Cardiology at the hospital are confident that they will be able to 'adapt resources to the needs of the community.'

The importance of the teams work regarding sudden deaths is highlighted by the fact that it is the leading cause for deaths in the under 35's population.



If you've sold or will sell a property in Spain at a loss you may not need to pay the Municipal Plusvalia

ABOUT three years ago, on our website, we answered a query made by an expatriate from Javea, who told us that despite having lost money in the sale of his property in Spain, the town hall had asked him to pay the local tax known as Municipal Plusvalia.

In that article, we explained the difference between the Capital Gains Tax (state tax payable if there is real gain at the time of the sale or transfer of the property) and the tax known as Municipal Plusvalia, whose real name is Tax on Increase Value of Urban Assets (IIVTNU), which is paid to the town hall. This tax is paid every time and in every transfer, since its amount has nothing to do with the real value of the property but with the cadastral value and the years in which the property has been owned by the owner.

Thus, in 2014 we said that we understood that the payment of the Municipal Plusvalia should not be demanded, or that its return could be claimed, when there exists a real loss in the transmission of the property, since the economic reality of each transfer or sale cannot be ignored by the town hall, and we mentioned a Judgment of the Superior Court of Justice of Catalonia of July 18, 2013 which had already ruled in this sense.

Now, just few weeks ago, the Constitutional Spanish Court in its judgment of the February 16, which has been reported by numerous media, declared unconstitutional several articles of the regulations applied by the municipalities of Guipuzcoa, relative to this plusvalia municipal tax, noting that they are against the Spanish Consti-

This is because the Spanish constitution in its article 31.1, in

what is known as the Principle of Economic Capacity, states:

All will contribute to the maintenance of the public expenses according to their economic capacity through a fair tax system...

A fictitious increase in value or a profit according to the cadastral value may have nothing to do with the reality of the facts nor with the economic capacity or consequence of the transfer.

Thus, as we thought and pointed out three years ago, and confirmed now by the Constitutional Court, in cases where there is a patrimonial loss yet the town hall is charging for this IIVTNU tax, without taking into account the capacity and real economic situation of the particular transmission, then there could be grounds to challenge, since there is no difference in what would be paid by those realising a real gain compared with those suffering a real loss.

Therefore, if you are going to pay or have paid this Municipal Plusvalia, whether for a sale, gift, inheritance, etc., and wish to know whether you can challenge the same or ask for its return, or if you have any questions, contact us, we are experts, and we will help you.


THE Showboat fundraiser, for Benidorm Dog Homing, helped one lucky dog find its forever home.

Reaching the lookout above the cave which


is located on the Moraig beach has been tricky in the past but is less of a risk now that the platform has been equipped with wooden handrails and railings.





New beach care station

TEULADA-MORAIRA Council has started work on installation of a first aid and rescue station on Platgetes beach.

The 48 square metre site will contain public toilets, a store room for equipment, and an area covered by a pergola, at a cost of just under €145,000.

Once the installation is complete, the beach will qualify for blue flag status, since in 2013 a rule was introduced whereby beaches must offer a care station for lifeguards and other emergency services.

The chosen site is close to local car parks and offers good access for emergency vehicles, plus it will be fully-integrated into the local environment, according to a council press release.

RAISED flowerbeds in Calle Almacenes and Calle Iglesia in Moraira have been replanted with Mediterranean species.


The native plants are longer-lasting and need less care as they are better adapted to the climate, the council's Image and Urban Quality department explained.

The revamp has cost the town hall approximately €18,000, an outlay covered by the first phase of improvements and general smartening up to the Old Town

Next in line are Calle La Mar, Avenida Madrid and Calle Barranquet.

Image and Urban Quality councillor Raul Llobell explained that Calle Almacenes residents had been asking for a revamp to the flowerbeds for some time.

Calle Iglesia had also been a town hall priority, Llobell said, owing to its position at the heart of Moraira's Old Town and one of Moraira's busiest streets.

El Portet waters muddied

COSTAS, the Environment ministry's Coastal Authority, has replenished El Portet beach with 8,000 tons of sand.

The ministry concluded after the January storms stripped sand from the beach that natural regeneration would take too long. Costas brought in sand from the Quintanes quarry in Altea which immediately turned the usually clear waters brown.

Residents and local environmentalist groups now fear that Costas and the Ministry failed to take into account the effect that the new sand could have on the underwater meadows of Posidonia (Ocean Grass) growing near the shore.



They also complained that this is coarser than the Portet beach's fine sand, prompting the town hall to issue a public statement.

"Owing to consultations and suggestions regarding the El Portet regeneration, the town hall wishes to share its information," a council communique stated.

It went on to explain that Costas began following an environmental monitoring programme even before the first lorryloads of sand arrived at El Portet, using GPS to locate posidonia and fan mussels.

"Ministry experts have assured municipal services that the waters will be adjusting for three or four weeks."

Similar regeneration is being carried out at numerous Alicante Province beaches the town hall pointed out. What was more, it added, El Portet was regenerated in 1989 and 2003 using more sand than at present.

Cast-iron argument

LITTER BINS had to be removed from Calle Doctor Calatayud owing to accessibility issues.

The Moraira shopping street received a revamp in 2015 to improve its 'aspect and functionality' and make it more accessible, according to the then mayor Antoni Joan Bertomeu.

The wrought iron litter bins by Javea artist Toni Mari, created to evoke the sea, have been vetoed on health and safety grounds as their spiky design has caused accidents. They are also easily damaged, public administration sources revealed.

The future of the cast-iron sculptures at the entrance to Calle Doctor Calatayud has also been questioned. They are not popular with all members of public, claimed Paqui Romaguera, who heads the PSPV-PSOE party's Equality section.

They depict a stylised woman ecstatically carrying shopping bags opposite a similarly stylised man laden with the results of her retail therapy.

"Women are tired of having to live with and put up with chauvinist symbols and stereotypes," Romaguera said when the sculptures were first installed.

"Do shopkeepers in this town really want to be represented by this kind of outdated and class-ridden symbolism?"

Life's a beach in wi

JAVEA is to have a year-round beach.

"We intend to make Javea attractive all year round," said local mayor Jose Chulvi. "As well as guaranteeing its protection and sustainability we need to provide facilities and infrastructure that make rational use of what the sea has to offer outside the summer season."

The Beaches and Environment department had this in mind when preparing the €463,634 project for buoy installation and floating games platforms, councillor Doris Courcelles explained.

La Grava, the most protected of Javea's beaches and least vulnerable to storms and high seas, will become a 'winter beach.' Buoys 50 metres from the shore will remain in place all year round, making the beach a safer place to swim as boats will have to remain at a distance.

Buoys elsewhere along Javea coastline will, as they are at present, be installed between June 1 and October 15.

A canal will be marked out for the Club de Piraguismo canoeists at the mouth of the River Gorgos which will remain throughout much of the year. Arenal will have another canal, this time for paddle surfers, during the high season when there are most people in the water.



Town hall buys up two prime sites

JAVEA Town Hall has purchased two plots of government-owned land in Granadella and La Plana.

The sale agreement was signed recently by Javea mayor Jose Chulvi and Antonio Rodriguez Laso, the national government's Economy and Treasury delegate for Alicante Province.

The 985 square metres in Granadella cost €13,805 and the La Plana plot, which covers a 1,200-square metre area, cost €11,681.

Negotiations with the national government began in 2016 and the town hall was anxious to acquire the strategically-situated plots and ensure that they remained public property. Both will be used for community purposes.

The La Plana land is located inside the Montgo National Park and the other plot is close to the Granadella beach.

The La Plana building, which was later extended by the Guardia Civil, is in ruins and nothing remains of the Granadella station.

Article 50 to be triggered March 29

THE good news is that the European Union will be allowed to enjoy its 60th birthday celebrations without the announcement of the triggering of Article 50 but the bad news is that because the formal date won't be until March 29, almost six weeks of negotiating time will be lost.

The British government, through its Ambassador to the European Union Sir Tim Barrow, advised the EU as a matter of courtesy that the trigger date would be Wednesday March 29 and this has resulted in a number of 'pithy' observations from various European leaders.

Gianni Pittella, the president of the socialist bloc in the European parliament is quoted in The Guardian as saying "Congratulations, Theresa May. Nine months to give birth to a

date for Article 50 notification. We will make sure that Brexit won't affect EU and UK acquired citizens' rights.

"Before negotiating the new relationship with UK, first and foremost we want substantial progresses on the withdrawal agreement to be ensured."

The date is important as the leaders of the 27 remaining states had hoped

to discuss the whole situation at a special summit due to be held on April 6 and 7 but the short time frame between the triggering of Article 50 and the summit makes it highly unlikely that any formal response will be made and therefore negotiations are unlikely to start for about six weeks and some believe that it could take even longer.

Whilst president of the European Council, Donald Tusk has promised to send his observations on the matter to the 27 leaders within 48 hours of the formal declaration. European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker who has been a consistent critic of Britain since David Cameron tried to block his appointment said

"Britain's example will make everyone else realise that it's not worth leaving.

In the meantime, Mrs May set off on a whistle stop tour of the regions to try to ensure a measure of unity, with Wales her first stop even though there is no formal power sharing agreement in Stormont in Northern Ireland and Nicola Sturgeon First Minister of Scotland has made it clear that she is looking for a second independence referendum prior to Brexit.

The Prime Minister insists that she will be looking to obtain the best deal for Britain including a free trade arrangement but lead negotiator for the EU, Michel Barnier indicated in a tweet that there was no certainty over such an arrangement and customs controls would have to be considered

One thing is certain, the initial period of waiting and speculation is now over, to be replaced by a further period of waiting and speculation but at least the British government will be likely to give regular updates on discussions rather than simply indicate what it considers possible although it may take more than two years to resolve all outstanding matters.





The Chancellor and the lady are for turning after budget goof

JUST a week after announcing that there would be significant increases in the cost of National Insurance contributions for the self-employed, Chancellor of the Exchequer Philip Hammond has had to make a humiliating U-turn.

He announcement that he will not now increase such contributions during the lifetime of this parliament and the confidence that he appeared to show when delivering the spring budget soon started to unravel when it was pointed out by a journalist that this was a breach of the election manifesto that saw the Conservatives obtain a majority in

After first trying to bluff his way out by denying that any promise had been made with regards to the self-employed, he found himself receiving criticism from his own back-benchers, some of whom, it is suggested, don't trust his position on Brexit which he was against and want to see the back of

Reports also suggest that the influential 1922 Committee of Conservative MPs had indicated to Prime Minister May that this was a very unwise course of action to follow and it would appear that she took their advice.

The official explanation is that the government wants to stick to the spirit of its manifesto pledge but doesn't explain why nobody remembered what the pledge was beforehand.

Labour scored a few points when Shadow Chan-

cellor John McDonnell described Mr Hammond's reversal as "humiliating" and his plans being in "chaos," suggesting he should have spent less time on writing "stale jokes" which Mrs May enjoyed, "guffawing like a feeding seal."

EU causes strike action in the docks

IT has been widely reported that stevedores in Spain had been threatening strike action in protest against sweeping new changes in the law which will see their terms of employment swept away.

Prior to the new legislation, ports in Spain were required to only employ stevedores who belonged to SAGEP, to guarantee minimum numbers at all times and to pay them in accordance with union rates.

Thanks to the intervention of the European Union, the European Court of Justice has ruled that this practice is in breach of EU legislation and therefore the Spanish Government was required to effectively break the current monopoly and allow ports to employ whoever they want and on terms to be agreed between the parties.

A further problem affected the legislation as Podemos and PSOE vote against the law and Ciudadanos decided to abstain which meant that the Spanish government was unable to push it through.

Spanish Bernie Madoff going to jail

THE financier, Germán Cardona Soler, often described as the Spanish 'Bernie Madoff' has been convicted of a number of crimes based on fraudulently taking money from investors under false pretences and will be going to prison.

It is claimed that **180,000** investors lost amongst themselves €350 billion.

Considered to be the leader of this long term fraud which crossed national boundaries. Soler has been sentenced to 13 and a half years imprisonment and a fine of €300 million, which is only a tiny percentage of the actual money lost by his in-

His partner, Lina Maria Matilla received a much lighter sentence of three years imprisonment and a fine of €900,000, whilst two other defendants were acquitted of all charges.

The basis of the trial was that in 2007, the two who have been found

guilty, set up a company called Forex Finances which was supposed to invest money received from members of the public on purchasing and selling, but it transpired that they used the money for themselves and to purchase real estate.

Like many of these 'pyramid schemes' they needed new investments all of the time to allow them to pay dividends to early investors and produced grossly exaggerated advertising material in order to attract more

Although they indicated that investors could expect a 20 per cent return or more, only a tiny part of the money received went into genuine currency investments and a great deal of the money that didn't find its way into their pockets was spent on rewarded for finding new investors.

There is no doubt that some of them enjoyed some high value returns in the form of gifts to reward them for bringing in ever increasing amounts of money, but they were few and far between and did not realise that they were supporting a fraud.

Eventually, the group started to move its registration and targets to Latin America and large numbers of members of the Colombian Armed Forces and Police were encouraged to invest in their business.

It is claimed that 180,000 investors from 10 different countries, lost amongst themselves €350 billion during the life of the scam but now all funds including gold bars, cash and property that could be recovered is to be distributed by the courts to those investors by way of partial compensation for their losses.

Although much larger, this is in many ways similar to the scam operated by Spanish stamp investment company Afinsa who went under in 2006 having taken more than €3.5 billion from Spanish pensioners and investors who were encouraged to invest in what turned out to be worthless philatelic confections.

Good and bad news for Volkswagen

THERE have been mixed blessings for the Volkswagen Group over the last week as it has suffered another police raid in Germany, saw its SEAT group return to profit for the first time in a decade and seen a distributor sued in

German investigators descended on nine different Audi and Volkswagen factories in Germany as part of the ongoing investigation into the installation of devices that cheated emission tests and on this occasion, they were acting on behalf of the US authorities.

Questions had arisen over the sale of 80,000 three-litre diesel cars manufactured and sold by the group between 2009 and 2015 who may not have realised that their cars could have been affected and the investigators wanted to establish who in the company had provided false information on these cars.

Despite all of the troubles and the huge financial burden created by fines and reparations, Volkswagen still managed to report a €3 billion profit for 2016 and part of this was thanks to a turn-around in the fortunes of Spanish subsidiary SEAT.



After a decade of reporting significant losses, SEAT which is a major employer in Spain announced a staggering profit of €153 million, mainly due to the introduction and success of its' first SUV the Ateca and its margin of profit was only 0.1 of a per cent less than the Volkswagen brand.

One piece of slightly less helpful Spanish news was that an 83-year-old woman in Santander was granted a 10 per cent refund on the cost of a vehicle she purchased in 2013 because it came with Volkswagen engineered gas emission software.

The case is up for appeal, but if finally successful, could lead to a number of new claims for compensation.

ABTA site is hacked

THE Association of British Travel Agents (ABTA) which is a body representing customers and travel businesses has just discovered it has suffered a cyber-attack on its website and details of up to 43,000 people and companies may have been compromised.

It appears the hacking occurred on February 27 but the organisation has only now released the information.

Whilst it will do everything it can to assist those who are affected, it appears the information taken is not in itself of sufficient importance to allow hackers to obtain benefit from identity theft or online fraud.

Basically, they mainly stole email addresses and passwords although information on some complaints as well as certain members has been taken.

Anyone who registered on the site after January 11, 2017 is advised to change their password and advised to monitor their bank, social media and email accounts.

Direct current accounts away from charges

Avoiding bank charges

A number of banks have a variety of current accounts. It would appear that customers are not always advised by their bank what is the best account for them.

For many expatriates, especially those buying and selling property, when money is paid into or from a bank account, the charges made by banks can be huge. It is quite common for charges to be made on both the money entering the account, after a sale of a property, and then again on the same money when a new property is purchased and money is transferred to another party.

Some banks have accounts which do not attract fees. There will almost certainly be conditions such as a minimum deposit into the account each month. However, and for many retired expatriates, these conditions are not likely to be too difficult to satisfy. You may even be paid interest on balances or receive bonuses on direct debits.

Make certain that the account you have is the best for you.

Paying too much tax on pension income

When submitting an annual tax return in Spain, there are (at least) two ways of calculating the tax due on UK sourced income. One way is to tell your accountant how many pounds you received and the accountant will convert this into euros using the exchange rate from the previous 31st December. For example, the exchange rate used for annual tax returns submitted in June 2017 will be based on the rate as at 31st December 2016.

The problem is that, with fluctuating exchange rates, one could be paying tax on money that was never received. Let's say that each month from January to November you received monthly income based on an exchange rate of 1.15 but then by 31st December it had increased to 1.20 euros to the pound. Your tax bill will be based on 1.20 even though you had only received 1.15 for

11 months.

The alternative way of submitting the return is to ignore P60s etc. and simply submit evidence of exactly what euros you received through the year. If you are not certain, talk to your accoun-

Proving your address

More and more often, financial institutions will be asking for evidence of where you live. In so many

cases, all bills are put in the name of only one partner and in these days of online banking, people are no longer sent bank statements and not all companies accept printouts from the internet.

Make certain you have a bill (not mobile phone) in your name or obtain an updated Padron certificate.




Needless to say we are not using this plumber any more but I am meeting him for a drink next Friday and we will see where it goes from there!

Brits drinking less alcohol

A THIRD of British drinkers have reduced or limited their alcohol intake over the last 12 months, although the survey that revealed this statistic did not question the drinking habits of their expat counter-parts living in Spain.

Research from Mintel reveals that 32 per cent of all British people have reduced or limited the alcohol they drink in the year from November 2015 to November 2016, compared to what they would normally consume. Half (51 per cent) of the nation's beer, wine and cider drinkers say they are drinking less alcohol than a few years ago, confirming Brits are actively moderating their drinking habits.

But why the cutbacks? Is it for health reasons?

Well the survey reported that economical factors were the main reason for consumers to reduce their drinking with over two in four (44 per cent) saying they have done so to save monev, with 41 per cent saving they reduced their alcohol intake to lose or avoid gaining weight.

Additionally, some 14 per cent of all those who have cut back on alcohol have done so because they are worried about becoming dependent on alcohol and the same proportion have cut back to stay within current NHS and government guide-

The consumers most likely

back at some point are those aged 25-34 (35 per cent) and 35-44 (36 per cent); meanwhile, geographically this peaks at 41 per cent in the North East and dips to 27 per cent in the South East/East

Mintel, the world's leading market intelligence agency, said these figures show a significant opportunity for low-alcohol

and alcohol-free beers, ciders and wines.

Today, lower-alcohol beer. cider or wine is drunk by around one quarter (23 per cent) of alcohol drinkers, while overall, 14 per cent of Brits drink non-alcoholic or alcoholfree beer, cider or wine.

Nearly 300,000 affected by Parkinson's

NEARLY 300.000 Spaniards are suffering from Parkinson's disease according to a study by the Compultense University of Madrid (UCM).

They studied and reviewed almost 100 papers and reports to analyse the incidence of the disease in Spain and concluded that it affects around 300,000 people with a new case being diagnosed per 10,000 inhabitants each year.

From the different articles studied, the scientists have made an estimate of the cost of therapies for each patient, concluding that if some of the most advanced therapies are used, such as deep brain stimulation and duodopa gel, this

can amount to between €17,000 and €50,000 per patient per year.

However, these patients are usually a minority within the group, since only a small number of patients meet the appropriate requirements to qualify for these treatments.

The study also highlights that the highest incidence of the disease is in people between 70 and 79 years. In the case of women, the highest prevalence occurs up to 85 years. In addition, the mortality from this disease is double that of people who do not suffer from the disease and their quality of life deteriorates acutely as the condition progresses.





ACCORDING to the UN Food and Agriculture Organisation, one in every four British adults is obese, with more than half the population predicted to be excessively

The cause of the rapid rise in obesity has been associated with modern life trends, such as our increasing reliance on cars, television, computers, desk jobs and high calorie food.

What is obesity?

Obesity is a chronic illness characterised by an excessive accumulation of fat in the body, both on an external level (under the skin) and an internal level (between and entering vital organs). This causes an increase in body weight and volume which affects peoples' lives.

What's the difference between being overweight and being obese?

There are different levels of excess fat and obesity. The easiest way to differentiate and classify the problem is known as the corporal mass index, which is calculated by dividing weight by the square of height in metres. If this gives a number between 25 and 29.9 then the person is overweight, if the result is more than 30 they are considered obese.

Is obesity dangerous?

Obesity is considered to be a major cardiovascular risk, meaning people with obesity are more likely to have heart attacks, strokes, etc. Today it is considered the most frequent preventable cardiovascular risk and has virtually become the epidemic of the 21st century. It is not just an aesthetic problem, it is a real health risk. Also, type two diabetes is usually associated to obesity.

What can I do to control it?

There are various difference causes but most are down to an imbalance between the amount of energy we put into our bodies and how much we use each day. The best way to control obesity and lose weight is by following a balanced, low calorie diet and increasingyour daily exercise.

Also avoid computers, tablets and mobiles before bedtime as the blue light they give off suppresses the production of melatonin which helps you to sleep.

Gender violence seminar

PROFESSOR Johan Galtung's March seminar tackles gender violence this weekend. Entitled 'Violence against women: how to end the continuing slaughter' it will be held on March 24 and 25 at the Playa de Albir Social Centre. Galtung, a Norwegian sociologist, mathematician, is

the principal founder of the discipline of peace and conflict studies.

"Twenty women have been killed so far in 2017, the worst start of the year for gender violence in a decade," said Alfaz's Presidency councillor Rocio Guijarro.

Sexist violence also took the life of a baby killed by its father with the sole purpose of hurting the mother and a further five children are now motherless, Guijarro added. "Children are the least visible victims of these conflicts," she said More than 800 women have died at the hands of partners since Spain introduced the current Gender Violence Law, a sobering figure that needs an immediate response from society, Guijarro continued.

Galtung's International Centre for Conflict Resolution Alpha, Delta, Pi in collaboration with Alfaz Town Hall has decided to "to address this social scourge and try to shed some light on the issue from the perspective of mediation and dialogue," Guijarro announced.

A TWO-HOUR walk through Altea's rural areas this Sunday, March 26, centres on local gastronomy.



We do know however that 'immigrant' workers will work harder and longer so as to ensure they can live in their new found home. That applies to those that live and work here and I am sure many other European countries.

AN AMUSING LOOK: At a Prêt a Manger sandwich.

A case in question is the Prêt a Manger fast food sandwich chain. Only one in 50 people that apply for jobs are British, according to the company's HR Director Andrea Wareham.

Speaking at a House of Lords economic affairs select committee investigating Brexit and the labour market held on March 8 this year, she said it was a difficulty in attracting, rather than selecting, British workers, and that 65 per cent of Pret's workforce is made up of EU nationals.

She said the company would struggle to fill its vacancies with British-only applicants. Her concern was not just the chance of losing her workforce if it was a hard Brexit and EU nationals were refused permission to stay, but how she would fill the vacancies if no more 'Europeans' were allowed in.

It would not seem to be a question of salaries either. The average worker gets around £16,000 a year including free lunches and paid breaks. Managers earn around £33,000. But it is hard to get people into the Hospitality industry as many people still do not consider it a 'cool' career. I suppose it's back to the old acorn of unsociable hours. I have always found the hours very sociable as when everyone is having a good time, I'm sharing it with them!!

SPEAKING OF SOMEONE WHO HAS MADE THE JOB COOL, Gor-

don Ramsay! Despite his 'effin and blinding he is a great Chef and a successful businessman. At first it has to be said probably because of the backing of his father-in-law, Chris Hutcheson, as Managing Director of Gordon Ramsay Holdings.

But things went sour in 2010 when there was a public spat as Gordon fired his father-in-law for embezzlement. The now 67-year-old was accused of hacking into his private and company computers and stripping the company of more than £1.4 million.

It would appear that Tana Ramsay's father has been living a double life and had another family for more than 30 years that produced more children to add to the four he already had. He even paid his mistress £5,000 a month. He also put his son and wife on the payroll and wrote himself five figure cheques.

After an acrimonious split which left Tana siding with Gordon after finding out what her cheating father had been up to Gordon paid Hutcheson £2 million in severance and share purchase in 2010, but in December of 2012 Ramsay was awarded £250,000 compensation when a judge ruled that the Hutcheson family were in breach of confidence as they hacked into

the company computers.

This story has taken a twist now, as Chris Hutcheson - along with his sons Adam and Chris Hutcheson Jnr and daughter Orlanda Butland - has been charged under Operation Tuleta with conspiring to cause a computer to access programs and data without authority, between October 23, 2010 and March 3, 2011.

All four appeared at Westminster Magistrates' Court on March 14 of this year and spoke only to confirm their names and addresses. Prosecutor Dan Suter told the court that the prosecution was brought by the International Justice and

Organised Crime Division.

Describing it as a "convoluted" case with voluminous amounts of paperwork, he said it concerned "hacking of a computer system of Gordon Ramsay Holding Ltd and email accounts of company em-

Senior district judge Emma Arbuthnot granted unconditional bail to all four defendants until April 11 when a preliminary hearing has been scheduled at the Old

Aloe Vera flowers

By Graeme Tyrrell

HAVING an attractively sculptured flowering cactus type plant that is easy to grow with minimal watering and care makes the Aloe Vera a perfect addition to any balcony, terrace or garden.

Aloes grow very well in pots, containers and planter boxes indoors or outdoors and any well drained areas of the garden with shade. It doesn't grow very big when restricted to a smaller container and it will not become invasive in the garden. The difficult thing however is to obtain its flowers.

The yellow tubular flowers of Aloe Vera, borne on an up to 90 centimetre branched panicle or stem, are striking but there is an art to encouraging it to form flowers. The plants usually need to be more than four years old to flower. Aloes must be kept healthy by not exposing to cold in winter or sunburn in summer.

They need plenty of light but not direct summer sun for very long in the day as the leaves will become burnt and, as they are long lasting leaves, it can take a long time to recuperate with new leaves.

They should, however, have maximum exposure to bright indirect or filtered sunlight. The flower buds form in late winter for blooming in spring so this is the time to allow the maximum exposure to sunlight



with periods of direct sunlight from some milder winter sun. In the garden under a deciduous tree is perfect for this to occur naturally. This will encourage flowers to form.


They require minimal fertiliser if you use a good quality soil mix and repot with new mixture every couple of years. An annual weak liquid fertiliser in early spring will help inspire the flowers and healthy growth.

Aloe Vera has been grown for thousands of years as a medicinal herb, particularly for the skin for sunburn and as a moisturiser in many parts of the world. It has been in cultivation so long and hybridised that its origins from naturally growing species in the Sahara and Middle East was only determined through DNA testing.

Extracts from its colourless gel like inner tissue are extremely popular for use in cosmetics and for a wide range of herbalist ap-

To grow Aloe successfully it must have good drainage from the soil mix that it grows in. Propagation is very easy as offset shoots appear around the mature parent



IF you follow this programme you will have a happy, reliable pet in three days. That's right, THREE DAYS.

Housetraining is easy but only if you do it the right way. Yelling, screaming, hitting your dog, creates lasting bad feelings and often fails, causing many

people to get rid of their pet.

The right way is quick, easy, stress free and creates the proper, loving relationship between you and your new pet. Be prepared for this job before you bring your new dog home. You should have a few specific tools for this job as well as a leather leash, leather collar, and proper food for the age of your dog, a food dish and a water bowl.

There are two essential tools for the housetraining process. One is any of a few products which contain enzymes to remove all traces of the inevitable mistakes that will occur and the second is a 'crate' or 'kennel' to house your dog when you can't be there to monitor him.

This crate is the key to this method of housetraining. Now I hear many of you protesting,

"I don't want to lock my dog up in prison. Won't he resent me if I lock him up? Isn't it cruel? I want him to enjoy life."

Let's think about this for a moment. In the wild where do dogs or wolves live? Don't they seek out small dark dens or caves to seek shelter in? And they seek out the cosy spots, where the ceiling or wall meets the floor. They don't lie down to sleep in the middle, open area of the cave. They go for the tight, secure area.

He wants to feel secure and safe when he goes to sleep. The best way to do this is to provide him with a secure, cave-like area in your home.

Crates come in different sizes so you should select one based on the present size of your dog. If you have selected a large breed but right now he's a puppy, don't worry about selecting a crate for his fullgrown size, you won't need it when he's all grown up.

Although many people keep their crates for the life of their dogs. Some dogs come to regard them as the private space and go in on their own if the door is left open.

You can buy a crate for the full grown dog and get spacers to make it smaller for a puppy. It should be just big enough so your dog can turn around in it. Don't worry that it's too small, too cramped, for the short periods of time that you dog will be in his crate, it will be just fine.

There are many enzyme products on the market and they are all good. Use according to the directions, whenever your pet makes a mistake. They are essential to the process. Without them, your dog will be attracted back to the spot where he made his mistake. No amount of scrubbing or cleaning will remove the odour. Make sure you saturate the area of the mistake completely.

Congratulations, almost there. It should only take a few more repetitions before he's locked into the appropriate be-





Wild adventures for BMW

By Matthew Elliott

BRAVING some of the harshest winter weather in Europe, the new BMW X6 M50d Drive passed its icy test with flying colours. The powerful three litre diesel, which has enjoyed critical acclaim since its 2016 release, was in Romania to tackle a high altitude mountain road for a film project.

BWW brought the cars to the wild mountainous region in freezing temperatures below -20C to shoot it along the Transfagarasan highway, once called the most beautiful road in the world by Jeremy Clarkson.

The short film even includes footage of the gorgeous car, which can reach 100kph in 5.2 seconds, gliding along past the infamous Dracula Castle on the snow-covered road. A total of 10 Translyvanian locations were covered, a distance of 2.5km, reaching altitudes above

Renault Grand Scenic

RENAULT was a pioneer of the MPV, introducing its Espace model in 1984 and later its compact MPV the Scenic. Since then, competition in the sector has become much more intense, but the Scenic is still a mainstream contender, available in five and seven seater form, and priced from €26,890 (£23.375).

My test model was the seven-seat Grand Scenic, priced at €32,719 (£28,445) in Dynamique S Nav spec, and with a 1.6 litre diesel engine

and 6-speed manual gearbox.

Fuel economy is a plus-point for this model - 21.7 kpl (61.4 mpg). Top speed is 190 kph, the 0-100 kph time 11.4 seconds.

Striking appearance is also a Grand Scenic ace card - its sweeping curvy lines give it an eye-catching infusion of French flair. This Grand model is no wider nor taller than the fiveseat Scenic, but has a longer rear overhang and longer wheelbase to create the space for a third row of seats.

Entry-level versions in-

clude massive 20-inch alloy wheels, active emergency braking, hill start assist, cruise control and a seven-inch touchscreen infotainment system with DAB radio and Bluetooth - a lot of kit for the money.

My Dynamique S Nav model adds much more, including head-up display, rear parking camera and panoramic glass

On the road, the car gives a very comfortable ride - not as soft as in the C4 Picasso but nice enough on good surfaces. On rutted or pot-holed roads,

the big wheels do feel the bumps. The 1.6 litre

well, with good mid-range power for safe overtaking.

The cabin has a practical layout but like so many rival models looks rather dull thanks to overuse of dark plastics.

There are plenty of places to stow oddments, the rear seats are easy to adjust and fold and the middle-row provides very good leg room. The rear seats are really just for children, or adults on short journeys.

With the third-row folded flat, there is plenty of luggage space - 765 litres. With all seven seats in use, there is still a useful 233 litres.

The Grand Scenic is a very strong contender in its class. and you do feel that you could drive right across Europe in it and still be relaxed on arrival. And its charismatic visual styling ensures that when you do arrive, you'll be noticed!






Farewell to a legend from the world of motorsports

MOTORCYCLE hero and Formula One legend John Surtees passed away earlier this month. The Brit, who died aged 83,

was the only man in history to win both the Motorcycle Grand Prix and Formula One champi-



After his first professional outing as a 15-year-old prodigy in 1949. Surfees went on to win seven motorcycle world championships during a dominant spell in the late 50's, winning the Senior TT at the Isle of Wight three years running from '58 to '60.

He made a surprise switch to Formula One in 1960, debuting at Goodwood before finishing second at the 1960 British Grand Prix. He won his first World Championship in Mexico for Ferrari in 1964, shattered half his body in a crash the following year, and did battle with Jackie Stewart at the 1966 Monaco Grand Prix.

After a frustrating end to the 1960s Surtees moved on to building his own F1 cars and ran a motorcycle shop and Honda dealership in Kent. He was an MBE, OBE, CBE and official Formula One Legend inducted into the International Motorsports Hall of Fame. In 2009 his son Henry was tragi-

Behind the scenes with SPV Racing

FOLLOWING Euro Weekly News publisher Steven Euesden's recent debut in SPV Racing's Ligier JS P3 European Le Mans Series car, we headed to the Costa del Solbased outfit's Alhaurin el Grande headquarters to chat with manager Lars GV

During our talk, the overriding impression was an admirable attention to detail, as he readily explained.

"In my previous life I worked with the McLaren F1 technical guys, McLaren Applied Technologies, and part of the work there was to take Formula 1 into the avia-

"What we looked at there was the massive amount of simulations they are doing with the Formula 1, not only looking at their car but at the competition, and then when you start taking data from all the millions of runs that you've done, you can get

some real information, **LARS GV** LINBERG:

so that when something happens, you have

"I used to run Group C cars 20 years ago, also racing Porsches, but then I got too caught up in aviation as a captain for Scandinavian Airlines and then a test pilot, but when we moved to Spain from Dubai I found I had time to get back into things."

One of the most impressive pieces of kit was the Oculus Rift VR headset that the drivers use.

■ How did the team itself come about?

"Together with Raul, who was working at Ascari [circuit in Ronda] doing the technical operations but left to form his own company, running everything up to Formula 1 cars, and we joined forces to create

"Last year besides our Le Mans car we ran two Nascars in the European Series and we had eight podiums during the season which was quite fun, although very different to the Ligiers."

■ A little bit more about the Ligier car, and about your plans to compete in LMP-2 next year?

"So, on the racing side we have a fouryear plan, and next year our plan is to go up to an LMP-2 car and run that in the European Le Mans Series and qualify for Le Mans, and longer term we want to race in the World Endurance Championship, which is like Formula 1 for prototypes.

"Within that you have the LMP-1 which is the pinnacle, you have Toyota and Audi and Porsche and Nissan, and it's extremely high tech with energy recovery systems

■ How much input do you have into the current Ligier car in terms of adjustment and tweaking? Is there a series of parameters you have to stay within?

"Yes, there are a set of parameters which you can't adjust, but there are quite a few you can work with, like the

angles, the camber, tyre pressure which is enormously important.

"Last year we had Borja Garcia, ex-Toyota and Williams F1, a brilliant, absolutely fantastic driver, but I drove the car at Ascari after him, and I never, ever felt a car that was so nervous.

"For him, the car was extremely responsive, but I was completely dry in my

■ Is the Ligier difficult to drive?

"With the braking, and I think Steven had the same experience, you have to really push it hard and you can go really deep in, and basically you slam your left leg in as hard as you can and then you have to ease off a bit as it slows down.

"You can drive much, much faster than you think at first.

"Every lap we take all the data out of the car, so we have the engine parameters, how much braking, we know where you are on the track, so when you look afterwards with the engineer you can see exactly what you did, and how the car behaves if we make a change on the suspension or the an-

Perhaps one of the most impressive pieces of kit was the Oculus Rift VR headset that the drivers use in conjunction with a mock-up cockpit, and Lars was clearly impressed by the technology.

"With this, you have a complete 3D environment, so the driver can really test and really feel the car, and we can do all the changes on the car virtually, and

you can feel it!

"We can take data from the car and put it in the computer, allowing the drivers to practise without going on the track."

FOOTBALL

After the excitement of FA Cup and European football, we have international action at various levels over the next week or so.

In friendlies last night, Scotland played Canada while in Dortmund, Germany met England whose coach Gareth Southgate was contemplating using Jermain Defoe and four Manchester United players, as well as handing debuts to a couple of others.

Tomorrow, in 2018 World Cup qualifiers, it's Italy v Albania, Spain v Israel and the Republic of Ireland v Wales. Then on Sunday, we have England v Lithuania, Northern Ireland v Norway and Scotland v Slovenia, followed next Tuesday by the Republic of Ireland v Iceland.

Premiership and Championship clubs are 'off duty' this weekend but there are some intriguing matches in the lower divisions including Oldham v Sheffield United and Shrewsbury v Bolton in FL1 and a topof-the-table clash between Doncaster and Plymouth in

After their brilliant win over Sevilla in the last round of the Champions League, Leicester City (UK's sole survivors after Manchester City blew it in Monaco) will face Atletico Madrid in the quarter-finals. The other ties are Barcelona v Juventus (a repeat of the 2015 final), Bayern Munich v holders Real Madrid and Borussia Dortmund v Monaco.

In the last eight of the Europa League, Manchester United (after overcoming FC Rostov) will face Anderlecht, Celta Vigo play Genk, Ajax meet FC Schalke and Besiktas visit Ly-

As it stands, we could have an all-German or all-Spanish CL final and an all-Belgium EL

final. And for the record, Leicester have met Atletico twice before, in the ECWC of 1961-62 and UEFA Cup of 1997-98, and in 1956, Manchester United beat Anderlecht 10-0 in a European Cup preliminary tie.

On the domestic front. Chelsea (2-1 winners at Stoke) lead the PL by 10 points from Spurs; Hull, Middlesbrough and Sunderland are the bottom three. The top three in the Championship are Newcastle, Brighton (recent 2-0 losers at Leeds) and Huddersfield (despite a 4-0 thrashing at Bristol City) while Blackburn, Wigan and Rotherham are at the bottom, Celtic, 25 points clear. need one more win to clinch their sixth successive SPL title; Real Madrid lead Barcelona by two points in La Liga: Bayern Munich (Germany); Juventus (Italy) and Monaco (France) are eyeing up their domestic titles.

PL/FL managers are still being dismissed thick and fast... the latest being Aitor Karanka by Middlesbrough. He was the 44th boss to lose his job this season and the seventh in March alone, following Gary Brazil (from Nottingham Forest after 59 days), Warren Joyce (Wigan), Steve McClaren (Derby), Alex Neil (Norwich), Graham Westley (Newport) and Russell Slade (Coventry). Who's next I wonder?

HORSE RACING

Race-goers at Cheltenham last week (+ millions of TV viewers) saw some terrific racing with Buveur D'Air (Champion Hurdle), Special Tiara (Champion Chase) and Sizzling John (Gold Cup) winning the top races.

Ruby Walsh (four winners) and Gordon Elliott (six firsts and more seconds than Willie Mullins) won the top jockey and top trainer awards respectively.

The next big meeting is at Aintree, from April 6-9, with Vieux Lion Rouge favourite to win the Grand National.
