Father's pain

Anguish over police shooting of mentally-ill son

By Matthew Elliott

A schizophrenic man was shot by police officers in Estepona after stabbing one in the chest with a metal spear. The officer's bullet proof vest saved his life, while the disturbed young man, identified as Leandro, is in an induced coma at the Costa del Sol hospital.

Leandro's father has expressed his anguish that officers didn't immediately call for an ambulance, or aim for his legs. The 28-year-old was shot once in the hand and twice in the stomach. There is severe damage to his liver and spleen. It is unclear whether he will survive.

The tragic incident unfolded in La Joya, Estepona at around 6pm on March 16. The young man who, according to his father suffers from paranoid delusions, slept in a cave near the banks of the Guadalmansa river. He is incredibly anxious around people and especially fearful of police officers.

The metal spear was a makeshift tool used for fishing and hunting small game.

Scruffy, hairy, and slightly manic looking, that day he was practising throwing his spear at



a nearby tree. Unsurprisingly he caught the attention of a passing patrol car which doubled back to investigate. Officers beckoned him towards the car and he immediately fled.

When they cut him off in the car he threatened them with the spear and fled to swim across the river.

With one officer almost up to his neck in water, Leandro struck him with the spear. The second officer fired a warning shot into the air and Leondro scrambled onto the embankment. When the policeman

made it across he was stabbed in the chest. Left with little option, his colleague fired a round of bullets at Leandro.

The police are adamant that they had no idea of their suspect's medical condition.

Leandro's father believes, however, that the problem is systemic. He claims to have tried to get his son sectioned for years but, with no blood spilled or threats made, the authorities were reluctant to help.

Don't forget Mother's Day

More recently, it became a regular celebration in the UK as early as the 17th century, when following a church service where prayers were dedicated to the Virgin Mary it became traditional to give flowers and small gifts to mothers of all

The practice died out in the UK by the 19th century but was promoted in the USA by Julia Ward Howe, composer of the iconic 'Battle Hymn of the Republic' and by 1914, it was officially recognised in the USA.

Today, Mother's Day is recognised in at least 50 countries throughout the world and it is likely that restaurants and flower shops in certain parts of Spain will be particularly busy on Sunday March 26 as British residents and visitors take the opportunity to celebrate and thank their mothers.

Robbery of the century

A TRIAL over what has been described as the 'robbery of the century' has begun.

Five men stand accused of brazenly breaking into a police building at the port of Malaga and stealing 162 kilograms of Class A drugs worth tens of millions on the streets.

There are now nine restaurants in Spain with the maximum three-star rating for "exceptional cuisine with a special journey," placing the nation fifth in world rankings behind Japan (26), France (25), the U.S. (14), and Germany (10).



LEGENDARY Basque chef Martin Berasategui is the holder of eight Michelin stars, more than anyone else in Spain.

He began to work at his parent's restaurant at the age of 14, when there were no Michelin stars in the Basque Country, but by 25 he owned the restaurant and had gained his first star.

He opened his eponymous eatery in Lasarte-Oria, near San Sebastian, in 1993 and it was awarded its third Michelin star in 2001.

ANDALUCIA'S third largest city, Cordoba with a 350,000 population and a fascinating mix of old and new is the globe's largest urban space to be declared a World Heritage Site by Unesco.

Despite mercury levels from June to September at times rising to 45° it is a year-round favourite with national and foreign tourists partly due to excellent road, rail and air links.

With its history dating to pre-Roman times. Cordoba fell under Moorish domination as early as 711 and by the 10th century was one of the largest cities in the known world.

Unlike in some parts of Spain, Christians and Muslims existed alongside each other and at one time worshipped in the same building. The building of the great Mosque ended this practice though when the city was restored to Spanish rule, the Mosque became a Cathedral and is still a place of worship today.

Near to the Cathedral is the old Jewish Quarter and the city also boasts seven bridges, and an annual Patio Festival, in addition to hundreds of jewellery manufacturers and superb restaurants which blend the influences of Moorish and Spanish culinary tastes. 

Major sheikh-up for luxury marina

AFTER the debacle surrounding the purchase of Marbella's La Bajadilla port by a rich Arab sheikh, the once beautiful marina is now back in public hands. Sheikh Nasser Al-Thani, who owns Malaga FC, left the port in such a terrible state of disrepair that the Public Agency of Ports of Andalucia (APPA) had no choice but to step in.

The decision is likely to escalate ongoing tensions between the Sheikh, a billionaire member of Qatar's autocratic royal family, and Marbella. Jose Bernal, mayor of the Costa del Sol city, had refused to meet with Al-Thani, claiming he has insulted Marbella with his antics over the port.

On paper La Bajadilla is a golden egg, an investment dream with berths for 270 sports boats and covering a huge amount of prime fishing territory. A consortium run by Al-Thani took over management of the port in a multi-million euro deal in 2011. Initial plans promised a conversion of the harbour into one of the most luxurious boating facilities on the Mediterranean.

But the sheikh instead backpedalled on payments, igniting a court case that runs to this day. He has all but ignored the port, infuriating boat owners who have to deal with dirt and dilapidation rather than prestige and splendour. Even basic services such as cleaning and security have been neglected.

Fears over marine invasion

CLIMATE change is posing a serious threat to the famous Costa del Sol coast. A panel of scientists visiting the area heard how a dangerous rise in water temperatures harms the fishing industry and lures invasive species such as jellyfish and exotic fishes to the waters.

Experts from the Oceanographic centre and other European institutes examined just how badly global warming might affect Spain's southern coastline during the Sea Week conference in Malaga.

There was no debate between the scientists as to whether there is a serious problem. The only question was 'how bad is it?' There have already been deep shifts in the fundamental makeup of the Mediterranean caused by rising temperatures.

Marine life indigenous to the Indian Ocean has drifted through the Suez Canal in Egypt, tempted by the warmer European waters. Their arrival poses a serious threat to local ecosystems forced to compete for resources against the new

Anchovy, sardine, mullet and hake populations are under substantial pressure, while whales and dolphins are forced to come ever

closer to the shore to find food.

Earlier this month there was a sighting of a whole pod of long-finned pilot whales just off Marbella's Capobino beach.

Rare and beautiful to be sure, but also extremely alarming from an ecological perspective.

Tragic trip for woman

AN inquest in Gloucester has heard how an English lady tragically died during a trip to the Costa del Sol. Tracey-Anne Fox flew out for just two days in June 2016 but slipped into a deep coma after a fall and never recovered.

The 44-year-old who was checking on a Spanish property she owned, fell in Malaga airport. Too shaky to travel she stayed the night with a friend.

In the morning her friend found her in a coma. Her father and sister flew out and were informed that she had an advanced blood clot on her brain. Treatment was impossible.

Ms Fox was in a coma for five days before her life support was switched off. An accidental death was recorded.

Jewel of the Costa

AN iconic Costa del Sol landmark built in the 19th century will be renovated as part of new plans to spruce up Torremolinos.

Casa Maria Barrabino is a magnificent building that has housed politicians, entrepreneurs and all manner of wild parties during the

wild west years of the early Costa

The house has been unoccupied since 1997 and since then fallen into a terrible state of disrepair. Local architect, Salvador Moreno Peralta, who will mastermind the rejigging of the Costa del Sol square, will also renovate the building.

He describes it as having enor-

mous symbolic power through its history and architectural strength. With its huge ceilings, frescos, lounges and tiles it is emblematic of another freewheeling era in the history of the region.

Peralta envisages Casa Maria Barrabino as being the antique jewel of the new, pedestrianised Torremolinos city centre.

Brit on trial

A BRITISH criminal standing trial for the murder of an Irishman in a Benalmadena bar told jurors he had no intention of killing his victim.

A defence lawyer claimed Darren O'Flaherty from Liverpool had a hazy recollection of the summer 2010 shooting outside a Benalmadena bar. The violent con admits being high on a cocktail of cocaine and booze at the time.

O'Flaherty, who faces 44 years in prison if found guilty, claims the five shots he fired into the packed bar, filled with British and Irish holidaymakers, were only meant to intimidate, not kill. He said he was clouded with rage after being kicked out of the bar.

O'Flaherty was extradited to Malaga in 2015 after spending three years on the run and spending 30 months locked up in a British prison for his part in an armed hijacking.

His victim was Jock O'Neil, 41, a popular family man from Dublin on holiday with his partner and two young children to attend a friend's wedding. O'Neil was allegedly targeted after trying to defuse a brawl. in the pub's toilets involving O'Flaherty and another man.





Fury over airport parking

CAR rental companies launched a protest campaign against traffic changes at Malaga airport forcing them to wait and drop off using the

Rental heavyweights Aesva and Aeca, together with businesses operating in external car parks (which opt for shuttle buses into the airport),

have called for a demonstration at the entrance to terminal 3. They are expecting at least 100 business owners to join in with the protests.

Ana Maria Garcia, president of Aesva, explained that like private cars, rental cars have the right to 15 minutes of free parking, but must pay the full amount for any time once that expires.

"The changes have affected

us badly, it's chaotic and the busy season hasn't even started." Garcia believes that as well as problems caused by delayed flights, not having a designated drop off is sparking criticism from tourists who feel nervous waiting in parking queues. "A place to load and unload cars is essential."

The affected companies are currently preparing a formal complaint against the managers of Aena. "The people are furious, we are concerned with the image that the changes will give the Costa."

Those responsible for this change in infrastructure maintain that the works to widen the road are fundamental in order to guarantee it remains accessible with the increase in traffic, and the current parking solution is the only option.

Storms cause ecological disaster

AN award-winning ecological group in Marbella has issued a dire warning over the state of the area's famous sand dunes The Pro Dunas Marhella Association claims devastation caused by storms over the last three winters, including the wild 2016/17 season, is so severe it amounts to an ecological dis-

Scientists from the group, which

won the Andalucian Environment Prize in 2012, warn that, in just a few years, the sand dunes of La Vinora may disappear completely. The beautiful dune belt along the Las Chapas coast has lost metres of mass from some of the most vicious storms in living memory.

Spokeswoman for Pro Dunas, Susanne Stamm, notes that the dunes form a crucial bulwark in protecting the Marbella coastline from the advancing Mediterranean. Losing them could seriously threaten homes, businesses and the fundamental attraction of Marbella's economy - the beaches.

Pro Dunas has implored the government to fund urgent protection measures across Marbella's beaches or risk losing one their most iconic natural wonders forever.

One proposed solution is the use of artificial reefs, which may also help recover lost marine ecosystems.

Ms Stamm also indicated that the dunes are not only under threat from the sea, but also from people. There has been an unconscionable upsurge in vandalism in recent months aimed at destroying protected areas and disabling access points.






Be safe and love your skin

Car theft crackdown

WITH the participation of the both the National and Local Police, officers of the Guardia Civil have smashed a gang involved in the theft of motor vehicles in Malaga Province and have arrested 25 people.

The investigation commenced when it was realised that a number of thefts of quad bikes and motor bikes had taken place in Alhaurin el Grande, Coin, Marbella, Mijas, Monda, Ojen and Torremolinos as well as burglaries at a number of isolated

houses in the area.

The forces concluded that the thefts were being undertaken by members of a family living in a number of different locations so that nine simultaneous raids had to be made in Malaga Province and Sevilla which netted a pleasingly large amount of

The haul collected following the raids included 28 vehicles, more than €100,000 in cash, a revolver with ammunition, four airguns, approximately one kilo of marihuana and 200 grams of hashish, precision scales, nu-

merous gardening and agricultural tools, high-end watches and motorcycling equipment which came from at least 30 robberies.

Some of those arrested were known to be expert mechanics and it is believed that many of the stolen vehicles were stripped down and their parts sold as spares.

Between them the alleged crooks were charged with belonging to a criminal organisation, armed robbery, possession of illegal weapons, theft of vehicles, document fraud and receiving stolen



Horse and carriage ride petition grows

MORE than 2.000 people have signed a petition on *Change.org* to eradicate Marbella's horse and carriage rides

The driving force behind the petition, Belen Padilla, believes the tourist attraction constitutes animal cruelty and is urging the

council to intervene and improve conditions for the horses. "We want to be a modern society, but we still have traditions which belong in the middle ages."

Padilla alleges that "the horses are left immobile for hours, leading to medical complications caused by muscle stiffness and swelling. They are often left without food or water in extreme temperatures, since the law does not allow the feeding of animals on public roads."

She believes that the council must get involved and make changes to the conditions of the horses, allowing them more time out and moving, with food and water available at all times.

The carriage drivers have de-

fended themselves, stating the horses are in good shape and have adequate care at the two stops in the city, in Calle Miguel Cano and on Avenida España. They also claim the council do limit activity during the summer when temperatures are at their most extreme.

Other drivers have pointed out the horse-drawn carriages have been in the city for more than 60 years, with business passing from fathers to sons, making it a valid livelihood.

Claiming the animal activists want to 'remove everything that makes Spain unique,' such as bullfighting and the carriages, they assert that the horses are well cared for in stables and deny that they are exploited.

Nothing will change overnight, but as will be demonstrated in the summary of 2016 results, a number of small steps can mean a lot.


This is a free forum where all are invited to attend and to share their ideas and although it will be conducted in English, pupils from Laude College





Boxing clever in Marbella

BRITISH heavyweight boxing hopeful Adam Machaj has moved to the Costa del Sol believing that the change of scenery and weather when compared to his Lancashire home town will help him to achieve his immediate aim of becoming a British Champion.

With 10 fights under his belt, six of which have been straight knock outs, the 29-year-old revealed to Euro Weekly News that after a short period of inactivity, he is now due to box at the Macron Stadium on May 20 as part of a card organised by his promoters VIP Boxing Pro-

The six foot eight inch boxer, known as the 'Heat Seeker'- as he enters the ring to the AC/DC track of the same name weighs 120 kilos and has an incredible 88 inch reach but he knows that he has to be in peak form and since arriving in Fuengirola where he is living, he has been training twice a day in the boxing club in Marbella.

When asked about his diet.

(who incidentally are meeting in an IBF, IBO and WBA title fight at Wembley Stadium on April 29) he has not only improved his boxing, but learnt a great deal about what to eat.

As well as being a professional heavyweight boxer,

Adam is a qualified personal trainer and understands nutrition so doesn't follow any particular diet but just knows to eat well and healthily and has taken a part-time job as a personal trainer in a gym next to his boxing club to help with the finances and to add to his own personal fitness as well as obtaining advice from Phosh Foods

When asked what his current ambition is, he explained that in order to step up into the international boxing world, you have to become one of the very best in your country and his ambition is to take the British title within 18 months so that he can then make the transition to world competition.

Having won eight out of his 10 professional fights, this giant of a man knows that 2017 is going to be a make or break year and he now has to move into the top 10 of British heavyweights if he is going to make a success in the 'sport of gentle-

AS reported in last week's *EWN*, Benalmadena has established a brand new citizen's portal bringing direct democracy to local residents. People are now able to propose new laws and regulations to improve the community. If there is enough support, and the law is within the powers of the council, proposals will go to public vote online.

After the first week of the pioneering initiative there has already been an avalanche of suggestions.

By far the most popular is improving access to Arroyo de la Miel from the A-7 motorway,

although there is little that Benalmadena can do other than pressurise the government for action.

Other popular proposals include a special beach for pets, more cultural activities on the streets, sports facilities for children and the promotion of electric vehicles.

If 1 per cent of the population, roughly 580 people, support a motion it will be voted on publicly and considered by the council. So far participation rates have been very promising.

If the project is a success Benalmadena will earmark funds in its yearly budget for the most popular suggestions.

Other towns and cities across the Costa del Sol may also follow suit.



Article 50 to be triggered March 29



BREXIT PAGE

THE good news is that the European Union will be allowed to enjoy its 60th birthday celebrations without the announcement of the triggering of Article 50 but the bad news is that because the formal date won't be until March 29, almost six weeks of negotiating time will be lost.

The British government, through its Ambassador to the European Union Sir Tim Barrow, advised the EU as a matter of courtesy that the trigger date would be Wednesday March 29 and this has resulted in a number of 'pithy' observations from various European leaders.

Gianni Pittella, the president of the socialist bloc in the European parliament is quoted in The Guardian as saying "Congratulations, Theresa May. Nine months to give birth to a

date for Article 50 notification. We will make sure that Brexit won't affect EU and UK acquired citizens' rights.

"Before negotiating the new relationship with UK, first and foremost we want substantial progresses on the withdrawal agreement to be ensured."

The date is important as the leaders of the 27 remaining states had hoped to discuss the whole situation at a special summit due to be held on April 6 and 7 but the short time frame between the triggering of Article 50 and the summit makes it highly unlikely that any formal response will be made and therefore negotiations are unlikely to start for about six weeks and some believe that it could take even longer.

Whilst president of the European Council, Donald Tusk has promised to send his observations on the matter to the 27 leaders within 48 hours of the formal declaration. European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker who has been a consistent critic of Britain since David Cameron tried to block his appointment said

"Britain's example will make everyone else realise that it's not worth leaving.

In the meantime, Mrs May set off on a whistle stop tour of the regions to try to ensure a measure of unity, with Wales her first stop even though there is no formal power sharing agreement in Stormont in Northern Ireland and Nicola Sturgeon First Minister of Scotland has made it clear that she is looking for a second independence referendum prior to Brexit.

The Prime Minister insists that she will be looking to obtain the best deal for Britain including a free trade arrangement but lead negotiator for the EU, Michel Barnier indicated in a tweet that there was no certainty over such an arrangement and customs controls would have to be considered as one option.

One thing is certain, the initial period of waiting and speculation is now over, to be replaced by a further period of waiting and speculation but at least the British government will be likely to give regular updates on discussions rather than simply indicate what it considers possible although it may take more than two years to resolve all outstanding matters.

Can the president of a community just resign?

THIS is a question often not fully understood, sometimes even by presidents themselves. Firstly it is compulsory under Spanish law that all communities of owners throughout Spain have a president and that the president must own or co-own a property within that community.

Secondly once president, the post cannot be transferred from one owner to another, even temporarily. each president has to be elected or appointed by the community. A tenant or the spouse of an owner cannot be the president but an owner who is a debtor can, as president they can attend, speak and even oversee meetings but not vote.

The law prevents debtors from voting on community matters. Ideally the president is just elected from one of the owners who is willing to take on the posi-

However it can happen that there is no-one who wants to be the next president. This is understandable, the role of community president comes with serious responsibilities, legal



implications, generally extra work and in some communities, unwarranted re-

Article 13.2 of The Law of Horizontal Property, the law that governs all communities in Spain explains; the president shall be appointed from among the owners by election or if this cannot be achieved, by rotation or drawing lots.

So if no owner wants to be the next president, the community must either appoint a president from a rotating list of owners or draw lots. In an apartment block for example the list might start with apartment 1A. The presidency is usually for one year but if again no one comes forward voluntarily, the process is repeated, the following president being the

owner of apartment 1B etc, the community can decide

Interestingly the community could appoint someone not actually at the general meeting to be the president. However if that person was not appointed as part of a rotation etc and does not want to accept the post, they can apply to the courts to have their appointment annulled. This must be done within one month however unless the court gives their approval they must continue in the role of president. These situations are often very unsatisfactory and can do considerable damage to a community either as a result of umbrage or ineptitude.

To appoint a president a double majority vote is needed ie a majority of owners - owning a majority of the property. Occasionally a majority of owners will vote for one person to be president and other owners owning a majority of the property (a larger coefficient) will chose another, without a double majority being achieved there is a stalemate, if this is the case

sought.

Although the usual term of office of all governing bodies is for one calendar year things can change. A displeased community can remove a president before the one year is up and a replacement found. If the president dies or sells their property then usually the vice president takes over until a replacement is

And finally can the president of a community just resign? Unfortunately for some presidents no, the law prohibits a community from being without a president. Until the community accepts the president's resignation at a general meeting, the existing president is still held responsible and must carry on the role. The presidency does not automatically cease after one year, there always has to be a replacement or a court ruling that releases the president from their duties.

vae can cause rashes in adults, severe breathing problems in children and even kill small pets. More than one in 10 people in rural communities may be affected by the poison, though they may not know

The caterpillar is arriving earlier with each passing year courtesy of climate change. Outbreaks have already been reported in Benalmadena and Torremolinos.







The Chancellor and the lady are for turning after budget goof

JUST a week after announcing that there would be significant increases in the cost of National Insurance contributions for the self-employed, Chancellor of the Exchequer Philip Hammond has had to make a humiliating U-turn.

He announcement that he will not now increase such contributions during the lifetime of this parliament and the confidence that he appeared to show when delivering the spring budget soon started to unravel when it was pointed out by a journalist that this was a breach of the election manifesto that saw the Conservatives obtain a majority in

After first trying to bluff his way out by denying that any promise had been made with regards to the self-employed, he found himself receiving criticism from his own back-benchers, some of whom, it is suggested, don't trust his position on Brexit which he was against and want to see the back of

Reports also suggest that the influential 1922 Committee of Conservative MPs had indicated to Prime Minister May that this was a very unwise course of action to follow and it would appear that she took their advice.

The official explanation is that the government wants to stick to the spirit of its manifesto pledge but doesn't explain why nobody remembered what the pledge was beforehand.

Labour scored a few points when Shadow Chan-

cellor John McDonnell described Mr Hammond's reversal as "humiliating" and his plans being in "chaos," suggesting he should have spent less time on writing "stale jokes" which Mrs May enjoyed, "guffawing like a feeding seal."

EU causes strike action in the docks

IT has been widely reported that stevedores in Spain had been threatening strike action in protest against sweeping new changes in the law which will see their terms of employment swept away.

Prior to the new legislation, ports in Spain were required to only employ stevedores who belonged to SAGEP, to guarantee minimum numbers at all times and to pay them in accordance with union rates.

Thanks to the intervention of the European Union, the European Court of Justice has ruled that this practice is in breach of EU legislation and therefore the Spanish Government was required to effectively break the current monopoly and allow ports to employ whoever they want and on terms to be agreed between the parties.

A further problem affected the legislation as Podemos and PSOE vote against the law and Ciudadanos decided to abstain which meant that the Spanish government was unable to push it through.

Spanish Bernie Madoff going to jail

THE financier, Germán Cardona Soler, often described as the Spanish 'Bernie Madoff' has been convicted of a number of crimes based on fraudulently taking money from investors under false pretences and will be going to prison.

It is claimed that **180,000** investors lost amongst themselves €350 billion.

Considered to be the leader of this long term fraud which crossed national boundaries. Soler has been sentenced to 13 and a half years imprisonment and a fine of €300 million, which is only a tiny percentage of the actual money lost by his in-

His partner, Lina Maria Matilla received a much lighter sentence of three years imprisonment and a fine of €900,000, whilst two other defendants were acquitted of all charges.

The basis of the trial was that in 2007, the two who have been found

guilty, set up a company called Forex Finances which was supposed to invest money received from members of the public on purchasing and selling, but it transpired that they used the money for themselves and to purchase real estate.

Like many of these 'pyramid schemes' they needed new investments all of the time to allow them to pay dividends to early investors and produced grossly exaggerated advertising material in order to attract more

Although they indicated that investors could expect a 20 per cent return or more, only a tiny part of the money received went into genuine currency investments and a great deal of the money that didn't find its way into their pockets was spent on rewarded for finding new investors.

There is no doubt that some of them enjoyed some high value returns in the form of gifts to reward them for bringing in ever increasing amounts of money, but they were few and far between and did not realise that they were supporting a fraud.

Eventually, the group started to move its registration and targets to Latin America and large numbers of members of the Colombian Armed Forces and Police were encouraged to invest in their business.

It is claimed that 180,000 investors from 10 different countries, lost amongst themselves €350 billion during the life of the scam but now all funds including gold bars, cash and property that could be recovered is to be distributed by the courts to those investors by way of partial compensation for their losses.

Although much larger, this is in many ways similar to the scam operated by Spanish stamp investment company Afinsa who went under in 2006 having taken more than €3.5 billion from Spanish pensioners and investors who were encouraged to invest in what turned out to be worthless philatelic confections.

Good and bad news for Volkswagen

THERE have been mixed blessings for the Volkswagen Group over the last week as it has suffered another police raid in Germany, saw its SEAT group return to profit for the first time in a decade and seen a distributor sued in

German investigators descended on nine different Audi and Volkswagen factories in Germany as part of the ongoing investigation into the installation of devices that cheated emission tests and on this occasion, they were acting on behalf of the US authorities.

Questions had arisen over the sale of 80,000 three-litre diesel cars manufactured and sold by the group between 2009 and 2015 who may not have realised that their cars could have been affected and the investigators wanted to establish who in the company had provided false information on these cars.

Despite all of the troubles and the huge financial burden created by fines and reparations, Volkswagen still managed to report a €3 billion profit for 2016 and part of this was thanks to a turn-around in the fortunes of Spanish subsidiary SEAT.



After a decade of reporting significant losses, SEAT which is a major employer in Spain announced a staggering profit of €153 million, mainly due to the introduction and success of its' first SUV the Ateca and its margin of profit was only 0.1 of a per cent less than the Volkswagen brand.

One piece of slightly less helpful Spanish news was that an 83-year-old woman in Santander was granted a 10 per cent refund on the cost of a vehicle she purchased in 2013 because it came with Volkswagen engineered gas emission software.

The case is up for appeal, but if finally successful, could lead to a number of new claims for compensation.

ABTA site is hacked

THE Association of British Travel Agents (ABTA) which is a body representing customers and travel businesses has just discovered it has suffered a cyber-attack on its website and details of up to 43,000 people and companies may have been compromised.

It appears the hacking occurred on February 27 but the organisation has only now released the information.

Whilst it will do everything it can to assist those who are affected, it appears the information taken is not in itself of sufficient importance to allow hackers to obtain benefit from identity theft or online fraud.

Basically, they mainly stole email addresses and passwords although information on some complaints as well as certain members has been taken.

Anyone who registered on the site after January 11, 2017 is advised to change their password and advised to monitor their bank, social media and email accounts.

Needless to say we are not using this plumber any more but I am meeting him for a drink next Friday and we will see where it goes from there!



LEGALLY SPEAKING

New measures to check ITV validity

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



ITV TESTS: A new database will record vehicle movements and history.

AS part of the new wave of reforms aimed at modernising traffic monitoring and safety, the DGT has announced the creation of a database of vehicle movements and history, which will then be able to check ITV tests.

The technology behind the scheme will see cameras installed around the road network and at entrances and exits of towns and cities which will record the registration numbers of vehicles as they pass.

This database will then link to the ITV test reports and will collate information from traffic incidents, crashes and repairs. Workshops and garages will be given a deadline to adapt to the new and appropriate computer technology for reports to be logged about vehicles.

The DGT will also carry out intensive campaigns to remind vehicle owners of the legal requirements to ensure their vehicle has passed the ITV tests. It is estimated there are currently between 1.5 and 2 million vehicles in Spain on the roads without a valid certificate.

At the moment, when speed detecting radars spot a vehicle that exceeds the speed limits, it automatically checks to ensure the ITV has been passed, but now, taking this idea one step further, the new equipment installed at the entrances to towns and cities will scan licence plate numbers and detect vehicles that have an out of date ITV certificate or have been for an inspection and failed and where appropriate, action will be taken and a fine issued.

Can vice-president resign?

I currently hold the position of Vice President in our Community and I understand that, if our President resigns and no one else accepts the position at the AGM, then I will automatically be installed as President for at least one year.

I do not want to hold that position. In fact, I am considering selling up to return to the UK. How can I resign before the AGM is held? Is it just a case of writing to the administrators and the President?

R P (Costa Blanca)

YES, the Vice-President can resign at any time, simply by writing to the President. Keep in mind that the President is an officer of the Community. The Administrator is an employ-



ee. There is no provision in law that says a Vice-President can automatically be installed as President. He may be assigned the duties of the President, but only the AGM can elect the President of the Community, who is legally responsible for his actions

SPAIN, probably better known for its long beaches packed with sunloungers and all-inclusive holidays, has much more to offer and you only have to travel inland a few kilometres to get a real feel for nature and tran-

One such area is the municipality of Alhama de Murcia where vou will find the Sierra Espuña Regional Park which

is surrounded by small villages such as Gebas and El Berro, both situated alongside the hills that make the nature reserve.

Gebas, which has a population of around 20 full time residents, is surrounded by gullies, canyons and ravines, giving it a spectacular look not dissimilar to a lunar landscape, it also has forested areas with formations of grasses and pine trees, a magnificent contrast offering stunning views.

El Berro, just a few kilometres away from Gebas is again a small village, although slightly larger than Gebas with approximately 100 residents. It has cafes, restaurants, and a bakery.

The stunning area caters for all types of visitors, with hotels and campsites nearby offering activities that include rock climbing, water rafting, quad bike hire or just somewhere to relax and un-

The Sierra Espuña Natural Park

which was protected in 1992 has also been classified as a Special Protection Area for Birds (SPA) as well as a Site of Community Importance (SCI).

The many pine trees were famously planted, in almost a regimented fashion, by the Spanish engineer Ricardo Codorniú with the aim of helping the landscape which suffered from landslides and erosion in the latter part of the 19th and early 20th century.

The fauna in the area is rich and var-

ied, it's not hard to find squirrels, mouflons (wild sheep), wild boars or golden eagles, although in 2015 the authorities had to organise a cull of the wild, goat looking, sheep whose population had expanded. Of the 1,400 only 300

WILD, windy, raw and exotic, Cadiz was one of the first parts of Spain to welcome western civilisation as we know it, but today stands firmly at the far edge of the tourist and travel experience. The province is sprawling with hot, dusty, coastal towns separated by pine forests and sublime beaches.

The skies are a deep, daily blue, which is why this is the Costa de la Luz. From the beaches and surrounding mountains you can easily see Africa. Yet it is the Arab and Gitano vibe which dominates through the splendid architecture and pulsating flamenco.

Fish of course is the prime dish at almost any restaurant. Across Cadiz you can be certain of enjoying local, freshly caught fish on demand, washed down with the region's acclaimed wines. Unaccustomed to tourists to the same extent as other Spanish hotspots, you can't always

expect good English or standard service. What you can expect is an excellent, hearty meal and an experience you won't soon forget.

Cadiz is easily accessible by car from Malaga Province, or by air from airports across both the UK and Spain. The nearest airport is Jerez, which Ryanair flies out of, and which is just over a half hour drive or one hour train ride away from Cadiz city.

ON the same day that the British Ambassador to the European Union as a courtesy told the EU that Article 50 would be triggered on March 29 and Prime Minister May was in Wales, drumming up Brexit support, a delegation from Gibraltar visited Dr Liam Fox.

Fabian Picardo and Richard Garcia arrived in London for a meeting with the Secretary of State for International Trade who has visited Gibraltar on a number of occasions in the past whilst Secretary of State for Defence before resigning over a personal matter.

According to a press release issued by the government of Gibraltar, he is already



well-informed about Gibraltar issues and said that he is very keen to make sure that the interests of Gibraltar were fully taken into account going forward.

The Chief Minister took the opportunity to discuss the potential inclusion of Gibraltar in whatever trade deals the United Kingdom might conclude with the rest of the World in a post-Brexit scenario whilst Dr Garcia met with the Liberal Democrat Leader in the House of Lords, Lord Newby, in order to brief him on the impact of Brexit on Gibraltar.

IN a short press release issued by the government of Gibraltar on behalf of the Chief Minister, it has been announced that at the next meeting of Parliament he proposes to move the following motion:

'This House appoints Mrs Kaiane Lopez GMH to be mayor of Gibraltar and Mr John Gonçalves MBE GMD to be her deputy as from Tuesday April 4, 2017.'

The role of mayor is an unpaid one with mainly duties of a ceremonial nature and the person chosen is appointed for one year periods by parliament. Although not the first female mayor of Gibraltar, Mrs Lopez, then Miss Aldorino, came to world notice when she was crowned Miss World in 2009.

Fleet flagship visits the Rock

AFTER spending six months on deployment with the last three being spent in the Gulf, HMS Ocean, the largest warship currently in the British Navy called in to Gibraltar for a few days en route to her home base in Devonport.

In the meantime, however, many of the crew took the opportunity to climb to the top of the Rock, enjoy the delights of some of the bars and restaurants and get in some last minute shopping before returning to the UK for some well-earned leave.

Some will remember the embarrassment caused in 2002 when a detachment of Royal Marines from the same vessel mistook the beach at La Linea de la Concepcion for Gibraltar and their unannounced landing in Spain gave rise to considerable embarrassment consider-



ing that the Rock is quite a good landmark!

Commissioned in 1998 and with an expected life of just 10 years the helicopter and troop carrier which has a complement of 720, will actually be decommissioned next year and as part of cost savings will not be replaced on a like for like basis.

It is however intended that one of the two major aircraft carriers currently due for completion, HMS Prince of Wales, will be upgraded to allow for the inclusion of a Royal Marine amphibian unit.



Nearly 300,000 affected by Parkinson's

NEARLY 300,000 Spaniards are suffering from Parkinson's disease according to a study by the Compultense University of Madrid (UCM).

They studied and reviewed almost 100 papers and reports to analyse the incidence of the disease in Spain and concluded that it affects around 300,000 people with a new case being diagnosed per 10,000 inhabitants each year.

From the different articles studied, the scientists have made an estimate of the cost of therapies for each patient, concluding that if some of the most advanced therapies are used, such as deep brain stimulation and duodopa gel, this can amount to between €17,000 and €50,000 per patient per

However, these patients are usually a minority within the group, since only a small number of patients meet the appropriate requirements to qualify for these treatments.

The study also highlights that the highest incidence of the disease is in people between 70 and 79 years. In the case of women, the highest prevalence occurs up to 85 years. In addition, the mortality from this disease is double that of people who do not suffer from the disease and their quality of life deteriorates acutely as the condition progresses.

Controlling your weight

ACCORDING to the UN Food and Agriculture Organisation, one in every four British adults is obese, with more than half the population predicted to be excessively fat by 2050.

The cause of the rapid rise in obesity has been associated with modern life trends, such as our increasing reliance on cars, television, computers, desk jobs and high calorie food.

What is obesity?

Obesity is a chronic illness characterised by an excessive accumulation of fat in the body, both on an external level (under the skin) and an internal level (between and entering vital organs). This causes an increase in body weight and volume which affects peoples' lives.

What's the difference between being overweight and being obese?

There are different levels of excess fat and obesity. The easiest way to differentiate and classify the problem is known as the corporal mass index, which is calculated by dividing weight by the square of height in metres. If this gives a number between 25 and 29.9 then the person is overweight, if the result is more than 30 they are considered obese.

Is obesity dangerous?

Obesity is considered to be a major cardiovascular risk, meaning people with obesity are more likely to have heart attacks, strokes, etc. Today it is considered the most frequent preventable cardiovascular risk and has virtually become the epidemic of the 21st century. It is not just an aesthetic problem, it is a real health risk. Also, type two diabetes is usually associated to obesity.

What can I do to control it?

There are various difference causes but most are down to an imbalance between the amount of energy we put into our bodies and how much we use each day. The best way to control obesity and lose weight is by following a balanced, low calorie diet and increasingyour daily exercise.


Sabina to play on the Costa del Sol





So what the bloody hell was I think-ing of in Liverpool ordering a boting of in Liverpool... ordering a bottle of la-di-bloody-da rosé wine? Ordering Whispering Angel in Liverpool is like a Liverpudlian strolling into the Savoy at teatime, in a shell suit, and demanding seven pints of Jeremy Clarkson, The Sunday Times,

HERE HAS BEEN MUCH discussion over the last few years, as to what will happen when Britain leaves the European Union, Understandably people in Spain are concerned for their positions. Will they be able to stay? Will they be able to work? How safe are their properties? Well, I am no politician and have no insight into the machinations of such things, but personally I can't see the Spanish government spitting out their dummies to lose the investments and current taxes etc that the expats provide to their economy.

But of course it is not just the expats in Spain and the rest of Europe it is those that are from Europe and living and working in the UK. The very far right and the racist element have been shining on their policy 'all the foreigners are taking our jobs!!' I think that could be a gross exaggeration. The Eastern Europeans - and there's a lot of bad 'uns!! - usually are hard working and yes they will work for less than maybe their British counterparts, but the British themselves can be work shy, preferring over generous benefit pay outs to an actual job.

God knows what would happen to the NHS in the UK if it were not for the thousands of expat doctors and nurses. BUT, the catering industry would be hit even harder. And it's not that employers are trying to find the cheapest employee.

We do know however that 'immigrant' workers will work harder and longer so as to ensure they can live in their new found home. That applies to those that live and work here and I am sure many other European countries.

AN AMUSING LOOK: At a Prêt a Manger sandwich.

A case in question is the Prêt a Manger fast food sandwich chain. Only one in 50 people that apply for jobs are British, according to the company's HR Director Andrea Wareham.

Speaking at a House of Lords economic affairs select committee investigating Brexit and the labour market held on March 8 this year, she said it was a difficulty in attracting, rather than selecting, British workers, and that 65 per cent of Pret's workforce is made up of EU nationals.

She said the company would struggle to fill its vacancies with British-only applicants. Her concern was not just the chance of losing her workforce if it was a hard Brexit and EU nationals were refused permission to stay, but how she would fill the vacancies if no more 'Europeans' were allowed in.

It would not seem to be a question of salaries either. The average worker gets around £16,000 a year including free lunches and paid breaks. Managers earn around £33,000. But it is hard to get people into the Hospitality industry as many people still do not consider it a 'cool' career. I suppose it's back to the old acorn of unsociable hours. I have always found the hours very sociable as when everyone is having a good time, I'm sharing it with them!!

SPEAKING OF SOMEONE WHO HAS MADE THE JOB COOL, Gor-

don Ramsay! Despite his 'effin and blinding he is a great Chef and a successful businessman. At first it has to be said probably because of the backing of his father-in-law, Chris Hutcheson, as Managing Director of Gordon Ramsay Holdings.

But things went sour in 2010 when there was a public spat as Gordon fired his father-in-law for embezzlement. The now 67-year-old was accused of hacking into his private and company computers and stripping the company of more than £1.4 million.

It would appear that Tana Ramsay's father has been living a double life and had another family for more than 30 years that produced more children to add to the four he already had. He even paid his mistress £5,000 a month. He also put his son and wife on the payroll and wrote himself five figure cheques.

After an acrimonious split which left Tana siding with Gordon after finding out what her cheating father had been up to Gordon paid Hutcheson £2 million in severance and share purchase in 2010, but in December of 2012 Ramsav was awarded £250,000 compensation when a judge ruled that the Hutcheson family were in breach of confidence as they hacked into

the company computers.

This story has taken a twist now, as Chris Hutcheson - along with his sons Adam and Chris Hutcheson Jnr and daughter Orlanda Butland - has been charged under Operation Tuleta with conspiring to cause a computer to access programs and data without authority, between October 23, 2010 and March 3, 2011.

All four appeared at Westminster Magistrates' Court on March 14 of this year and spoke only to confirm their names and addresses. Prosecutor Dan Suter told the court that the prosecution was brought by the International Justice and Organised Crime Division.

Describing it as a "convoluted" case with voluminous amounts of paperwork, he said it concerned "hacking of a computer system of Gordon Ramsay Holding Ltd and email accounts of company em-

How to grow Aloe Vera with flowers

HAVING an attractively sculptured flowering cactus type plant that is easy to grow with minimal watering and care makes the Aloe Vera a perfect addition to any balcony, terrace or garden.

Aloes grow very well in pots, containers and planter boxes indoors or outdoors and any well drained areas of the garden with shade. It doesn't grow very big when restricted to a smaller container and it will not become invasive in the garden. The difficult thing however is to obtain its flow-

The yellow tubular flowers of Aloe Vera, borne on an up to 90 centimetre branched panicle or stem, are striking but there is an art to encouraging it to form flowers. The plants usually need to be more than four years old to flower. Aloes must be kept healthy by not exposing to cold in winter or sunburn in summer.



They need plenty of light but not direct summer sun for very long in the day as the leaves will become burnt and. as they are long lasting leaves,

it can take a long time to recuperate with new leaves.

They should, however, have maximum exposure to bright indirect or filtered sunlight. The flower buds form in late winter for blooming in spring so this is the time to allow the maximum exposure to sunlight with periods of direct sunlight from some milder winter sun. In the garden under a deciduous tree is perfect for this to occur naturally. This will encourage flowers to

They require minimal fertiliser if you use a good quality soil mix and repot with new mixture every couple of years. An annual weak liquid fertiliser in early spring will help inspire the flowers and healthy growth.

Aloe Vera has been grown for thousands of years as a medicinal herb, particularly for the skin for sunburn and as a moisturiser in many parts of the world. It has been in cultivation so long and hybridised that its origins from naturally growing species in the Sahara and Middle East was only determined through DNA test-

Extracts from its colourless gel like inner tissue are extremely popular for use in cosmetics and for a wide range of herbalist applications. Ironically, the skin of the plant has elements that can be a harmful irritant to sensitive people.

To grow Aloe successfully it must have good drainage from the soil mix that it grows in. It is best watered after the soil has become dry as it doesn't tolerate wet feet for

long. Incorporating plenty of composted potting mix, sand and fine gravel will assist with drainage.

Propagation is very easy as offset shoots appear around the mature parent plant.

The plant can be lifted and the offsets removed and placed in a position to grow the new plants. As they transplant easily the parent plant can be returned to its place and will continue to grow happily. Removing the offsets will help encourage the plant to flower.

A trendy fruit

THE last few years the world has gone mad for avocado, with restaurants everywhere incorporating it into their menus, but you could grow your own.

All you need is an avocado pit, water, toothpicks and a warm windowsill! Begin by identifying which end of your pit will sprout and which will root. The tree will sprout from the pointier end of the pit.

Take four toothpicks and place them around the circumference, creating your scaffolding which will allow you to float the bottom half in water. Place in a glass of water and set it on a windowsill with sunlight, changing the water once a week.

Your tree will soon begin to sprout! Once around six inches, you can re-pot the pit in rich soil, leaving the top half exposed. Avocado trees love sunlight, so place it in the sun, water and watch it grow!



That's right, THREE DAYS. I know you think that's impossible or will take a miracle, but I promise you it's true.

Housetraining is easy but only if you do it the right way. The wrong way, yelling, screaming, hitting your dog, creates lasting bad feelings between the two of you and often fails, causing many people to get rid of their new pet.

The right way is quick, easy, stress free and creates the proper, loving relationship between you and your new pet.

Be prepared for this job before you bring your new dog home. You should have a few specific tools for this job as well as a leather leash, leather collar, and proper food for the age of your dog, a food dish and a water bowl.

The tools

There are two essential tools for the housetraining process. One is any of a few products which contain enzymes to remove all traces of the inevitable mistakes that will occur and the second is a 'crate' or 'kennel' to

house your dog when you can't be there to monitor him.

This crate is the key to this method of housetraining. Now I hear many of you protesting, "I don't want to lock my dog up in prison. Won't he resent me if I lock him up? Isn't it cruel? I want him to enjoy life."

Let's think about this for a moment. In the wild where do dogs or wolves live? Don't they seek out small dark dens or caves to seek shelter in? And they seek out the cosy spots, where the ceiling or wall meets the floor. They don't lie down to sleep in the middle, open area of the cave. They go for the tight, secure area.

He wants to feel secure and safe when he goes to sleep. The best way to do this is to provide him with a secure, cave-like area in your home.

Selecting the crate

Crates come in different sizes so you should select one based on the present size of your dog. If you have selected a large breed but right now he's a puppy, don't worry about selecting a crate for his fullgrown size, you won't need it when he's all grown up.

Although many people keep their crates for the life of their dogs. Some dogs come to regard them as the private space and go in on their own if the door is left open.

You can buy a crate for the full grown dog and get spacers to make it smaller for a puppy.

Your crate should be just big enough so your dog can turn around in it. Don't worry that it's too small, too cramped, for the short periods of time that you dog will be in his crate, it will be just fine.

Enzyme products

"What we looked at there was the massive amount of simulations they are doing with the Formula 1, not only looking at their car but at the competition, and then when you start taking data from all the millions of runs that you've done, you can get



so that when something happens, you have

"I used to run Group C cars 20 years ago, also racing Porsches, but then I got too caught up in aviation as a captain for Scandinavian Airlines and then a test pilot, but when we moved to Spain from Dubai I found I had time to get back into things."

■ How did the team itself come about?

"Together with Raul, who was working at Ascari [circuit in Ronda] doing the technical operations but left to form his own company, running everything up to Formula 1 cars, and we joined forces to create

"Last year besides our Le Mans car we ran two Nascars in the European Series and we had eight podiums during the season which was quite fun, although very different to the Ligiers."

■ A little bit more about the Ligier car, and about your plans to compete in LMP-2 next year?

"So, on the racing side we have a fouryear plan, and next year our plan is to go up to an LMP-2 car and run that in the European Le Mans Series and qualify for Le Mans, and longer term we want to race in the World Endurance Championship, which is like Formula 1 for prototypes.

"Within that you have the LMP-1 which is the pinnacle, you have Toyota and Audi and Porsche and Nissan, and it's extremely high tech with energy recovery systems

■ How much input do you have into the current Ligier car in terms of adjustment and tweaking? Is there a series of parameters you have to stay within?

"Yes, there are a set of parameters which you can't adjust, but there

are quite a few you can work with, like the angles, the camber, tyre pressure which is enormously important.

"Last year we had Borja Garcia, ex-Toyota and Williams F1, a brilliant, absolutely fantastic driver, but I drove the car at Ascari after him, and I never, ever felt a car that was so nervous.

"For him, the car was extremely responsive, but I was completely dry in my

■ Is the Ligier difficult to drive?

'With the braking, and I think Steven had the same experience, you have to really push it hard and you can go really deep in, and basically you slam your left leg in as hard as you can and then you have to ease off a bit as it slows down.

"You can drive much, much faster than

"Every lap we take all the data out of the car, so we have the engine parameters, how much braking, we know where you are on the track, so when you look afterwards with the engineer you can see exactly what you did, and how the car behaves if we make a change on the suspension or the angles."

Perhaps one of the most impressive pieces of kit was the Oculus Rift VR headset that the drivers use in conjunction with a mock-up cockpit, and Lars was clearly impressed by the technology.

"With this, you have a complete 3D environment, so the driver can really test and really feel the car, and we can do all the changes on the car virtually, and you can

"We can take data from the car and put it in the computer, allowing the drivers to practise without going on the track."

BRAVING some of the harshest winter weather in Europe, the new BMW X6 M50d Drive passed its icy test with flying colours. The powerful three litre diesel, which has enjoyed critical acclaim since its 2016 release, was in Romania to tackle a high altitude mountain road for a film project.

BWW brought the cars to the wild mountainous region in freezing temperatures below -20C to shoot it along the Transfagarasan highway, once called the most beautiful road in the world by Jeremv Clarkson.

The short film even includes footage of the gorgeous car, which can reach 100kph in 5.2 seconds, gliding along past the infamous Dracula Castle on the snow-covered road. A total of 10 Translyvanian locations were covered, a distance of 2.5km, reaching altitudes above



2.000 metres. The resultant masterpiece is called Frozen Romania and is available to view online.

The BMW X 6 M50d handles the

THIS correspondent spent a full three days in Barcelona last week for the second and final test session before the Formula One season gets started in Melbourne, Australia this weekend. If you are a McLaren fan things are not looking good! Vibration problem with the new Honda power unit was preventing full power application and also caused huge reliability problems for the team. It must be said that things are not looking good for the Woking team and there appears to be little sign of a fix.

Sky TV presenter, David 'Crofty' Croft, told me that he suggested to team boss, Zak Brown, that it was fair to say that McLaren-Honda are a team in crisis. The response and stock platitudes did little to dispel that statement! Latest news on this is that McLaren have made an approach to Mercedes to explore the possibility of using their engine instead of that of Honda.

Mercedes ran smoothly and reliably for the entire three-day test, putting in a huge number of fast laps and testing all manner of things with both their drivers, Lewis Hamilton and Valteri

Ferrari looked remarkably good and proved fast and reliable. Red Bull didn't seem, at this stage, to be quite as quick or reliable as the Ferrari and Mercedes but this is a team known for their 'sandbagging' at pre-season testing! In fact, Red Bull boss, Christian Horner has suggested that many top teams were 'holding back' to avoid showing their hand in this test!

SEASON: Starts this weekend.

Pleasing for F1 fans was the performance of the Williams team who have pulled Felipe Massa out of retirement to team up with rookie F1 driver Lance Stroll. They were looking very good in terms of performance, reliability and preparation. Watch out for some strong performances from them as the year unfolds.

ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

Renault Grand Scenic

RENAULT was a pioneer of the MPV, introducing its Espace model in 1984 and later its compact MPV the Scenic. Since then, competition in the sector has become much more intense, but the Scenic is still a mainstream contender, available in five and seven seater form, and priced from €26,890 (£23,375).

My test model was the seven-seat Grand Scenic, priced at €32,719 (£28,445) in Dynamique S Nav spec, and with a 1.6 litre diesel engine and 6-speed manual gearbox.

Fuel economy is a pluspoint for this model - 21.7 kpl (61.4 mpg). Top speed is 190 kph, the 0-100 kph time 11.4 seconds.

Striking appearance is also a Grand Scenic

ace card - its sweeping curvy lines give it an eye-catching infusion of French flair. This Grand model is no wider nor taller than the five-seat Scenic, but has a longer rear overhang and longer wheelbase to create the space for a third row of seats.

Entry-level versions include massive 20-inch alloy wheels, active emergency braking, hill start assist, cruise control and a seveninch touchscreen infotainment system with DAB radio and Bluetooth - a lot of kit for the money.

My Dynamique S Nav model adds much more, including head-up display, rear parking camera and panoramic glass sunroof.

On the road, the car gives

a very comfortable ride - not as soft as in the C4 Picasso but nice enough on good surfaces. On rutted or pot-holed roads, the big wheels do feel the bumps. The 1.6 litre diesel unit pulls well, with good mid-range power for safe overtaking.

The cabin has a practical layout but - like so many rival models - looks rather dull thanks to overuse of dark plastics.

There are plenty of places to stow oddments, the rear seats are easy to adjust and fold and the middle-row provides very good leg room. The rear seats are really just

for children, or adults on short journeys.

With the third-row folded flat, there is plenty of luggage space - 765 litres. With all seven seats in use, there is still a useful 233 litres

The Grand Scenic is a very strong contender in its class, and you do feel that you could drive right across Europe in it and still be relaxed on arrival. And its charismatic visual styling ensures that when you do arrive, you'll be noticed!

Sad farewell to a motorsports legend



MOTORCYCLE hero and Formula One legend John Surtees passed away earlier this month. The Brit, who died aged 83, was the only man in history to win both the Motorcycle Grand Prix and Formula One championships.

After his first professional outing as a 15-year-old prodigy in 1949, Surtees went on to win seven motorcycle world championships during a dominant spell in the late 50's, winning the Senior TT at the Isle of Wight three years running from '58 to '60.

He made a surprise switch to Formula One in 1960, debuting at Goodwood before finishing second at the 1960 British Grand Prix. He won his first World Championship in Mexico for Ferrari in 1964, shattered half his body in a crash the following year, and did battle with Jackie Stewart at the 1966 Monaco Grand Prix.

After a frustrating end to the 1960s



Surtees moved on to building his own F1 cars and ran a motorcycle shop and Honda dealership in Kent. He was an MBE, OBE, CBE and official Formula One

Legend inducted into the International Motorsports Hall of Fame. In 2009 his son Henry was tragically killed while racing in the Formula 2 Championships.



After the excitement of FA Cup and European football, we have international action at various levels over the next week or so.

In friendlies last night, Scotland played Canada while in Dortmund, Germany met England whose coach Gareth Southgate was contemplating using Jermain Defoe and four Manchester United players, as well as handing debuts to a couple of others.

Tomorrow, in 2018 World Cup qualifiers, it's Italy v Albania, Spain v Israel and the Republic of Ireland v Wales. Then on Sunday, we have England v

Lithuania, Northern Ireland v Norway and Scotland v Slovenia, followed next Tuesday by the Republic of Ireland v Ice-

Premiership and Championship clubs are 'off duty' this weekend but there are some intriguing matches in the lower divisions including Oldham v Sheffield United and Shrewsbury v Bolton in FL1 and a topof-the-table clash between Doncaster and Plymouth in

After their brilliant win over Sevilla in the last round of the Champions League, Leicester City (UK's sole survivors after Manchester City blew it in Monaco) will face Atletico Madrid in the quarter-finals. The other ties are Barcelona v Juventus (a repeat of the 2015 final), Bayern Munich v holders Real Madrid and Borussia Dortmund v Monaco.

In 2004 he recorded his first win on the tour at the Dunhill Links Championship, which is one of the richest golf tournaments in Europe, and finished the year ranked 15th on the Order of

In February 2013, he ended a 201-tournament wait for his second victory on the European Tour, when he won the Omega Dubai Desert Classic by three strokes. The win moved Gallacher back into the world's top 100.

The following year, Gallacher defended his title with a one stroke victory at the 2014 Omega Dubai Desert Classic for his third European Tour victory. He is the first golfer to ever successfully defend the title.

Gallacher was picked as one of the three wild-cards by Paul McGinley for the 2014 Ryder Cup.
