Costa's Welsh hero

Seafaring legend honoured during ceremony

A Welshman considered a hero among the people of Alicante was honoured as the Costa Blanca city paid tribute to the 15,000 Republicans trapped during the fascist blockade of the port during the Civil War.

Captain Archibald Dickson is credited with personally saving the lives of 2,683 refugees desperately fleeing the advancing fascist army in the spring of

Shocking behaviour

FOUR people have been arrested and charged with using electric weapons during an armed robbery spree targeting innocent residents of Torrevieja. The sadistic villains had managed to get hold of a taser, a weapon often used by police which discharges violent electrical shocks.

The incredibly dangerous device has controversially caused many deaths in police custody as victims suffer cardiac arrest. But that prospect didn't bother the thieving quartet, who managed to steal dozens of cars and thousands of euros in just a few weeks.

In one shocking incident they approached a Lithuanian man, shocked him with the taser and stole his briefcase, which contained €1.500 in cash and 15 car keys for work purposes. Police believe the attacks weren't random but were specifically targeting people the crooks knew were in possession of valuable items.

Electric avenue

A CAMPAIGN to collect electronic junk has resulted in an incredible three tons of appliances being handed in to green bin men across Alicante. The recycling project is soon due to hit all the small towns and villages across the southern Costa Blanca.

Collectors have expressed their amazement at both the value of the items found and the general ignorance as to how much environmental damage electrical products can cause. Part of the campaign involves giving people an incentive to recvcle. Those handing over electronic waste are automatically entered into a competition to win an iPhone 7, which they won't throw away so easily

The recycling campaign will focus on towns with populations greater than 50,000, which includes Torrevieia and Orihuela, before summer. and smaller towns and pueblos during autumn.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...8

WATER, WATER, EVERYWHERE. With most of Spain experiencing a relatively dry climate, water resources for irrigation and public supply are heavily dependent on an extensive reservoirs network. With 1,300 dams, the country places fifth in global rankings, including almost 1,000 'large' dams, more per inhabitant than any other nation in the world.

Towering above

LA SERENA reservoir in Badajoz Province, Extremadura, is the biggest in Spain and third largest in Europe. Built on the Rio Zujar, a tributary of the Rio Guadiana, between 1985 and 1990, it can hold 3.219 cubic hectometres of water and is so vast that the adjoining comarca of La Siberia has more kilometres of freshwater coastline than anywhere else in the country.

The tallest dam in Spain is the 202-metre Salto de Villarino, also known as the Almendra dam, on the Rio Tormes in Salamanca, Castilla y Leon. Completed in 1970, it towers almost 50 metres above any other dam in the country, and locks in 2.586 cubic hectometres of water when at capacity.

Dams in their dotage



While most Spanish dams were constructed during the 20th century, some have a far longer history.

The Cornalvo and Proserpina dams near Merida, Extremadura, date to the first or second century AD and are considered the oldest European dams still in use.

Built to supply the Roman colony of Emerita Augusta. founded in 25 BC, they now belong to the Archaeological Ensemble of Merida, one of the largest and most important archaeological complexes in Spain.

ess means more in Galicia

IN January this year, a seven-month drought in Galicia, the driest period since 1981, revealed the remains of lost towns and villages that hadn't been seen in decades. As capacities dropped below 25 per cent, locals were able to walk streets that were flooded during the 1960s and even check out forgotten Roman ruins.

The arid conditions were linked to climate change, and with the prospect of further extended dry periods as global temperatures rise, the Spanish National Dams Committee has recommended that 50 more large dams be constructed as soon as possible.

The raider struck during Sunday Mass and worked to a clear plan to make off with cash stored in a wooden drawer, forcing open locked doors with a screwdriver or jemmy. He was in and out before the 17-minute service was over.

Over 100 accused of child abuse

THREE Murcia men, aged 24-46, were nabbed in a string of arrests across Spain as police swooped on a sophisticated paedophile network. Addresses in Los Alcazares, Cartagena. and Alcantarilla were targeted in the coordinated dawn raids.

A total of 102 suspects were arrested in 38 provinces with a staggering 450,000 photos and videos seized from hundreds of laptops, computers, phones and hard drives. The operation was codenamed Pilumnus, after the Roman god in

charge of helping children grow healthily.

For the time being only three of the 102 suspects have actually been imprisoned. The rest are under investigation with their movements strictly controlled while the authorities collate evidence. Guardia Civil officers have publicly revealed that some of the suspects are employed in positions of trust such as teachers, swimming monitors and other careers involving exposure to children.

WITH one million residents in the metropolitan area, Bilbao - the largest city in the Basque Country - traces its history back to the 14th century and is now a major industrial area.

There is a mixture of architecture from Gothic to Art Deco to Modernist, and the city centre attracts tens of thousands of visi-

One of the most important cultural magnets is the Guggenheim Museum famous not just for its displays, but also for the impressive design created by architect Frank Gehry.

Boasting eight Michelin starred restaurants, the city offers a fantastic range of bars and restaurants offering typical Basque cuisine which includes a style of tapas known as pintxos which often marries bread or toast with a mixture of different toppings.

The Port of Bilbao is meanwhile an important conduit for the import and export of goods and additionally operates a ferry terminal for car passengers who wish to travel between Britain and Spain without having to drive the length of France.

WITH the spring weather in full gear Semana Santa in Torrevieja is set to be a fantastic and fantastically busy affair.

It begins on Sunday April 9 with the Palm Sunday procession and floats marching from the Sagrado Corazon to Church of the Immaculate Conception. Later that evening the festivities will really begin with drums and the Los Salerosos brass band covering most of the town, including Constitution Square.

Though relatively quiet during the day, Holy Monday to Wednesday will see loud, vivacious processions begin each evening at 10pm. Each evening will see a different circuit around the town centre as all entertainment venues dim their lights in respect and cars are asked to leave the procession routes free.

Holy Thursday's silent procession begins at 11pm and is fittingly quiet ahead of an extremely busy weekend. It is the Holy Burial procession on Good Friday which begins at 8pm from the Church of the Immaculate Conception and winds through the town taking in Constitution Square twice

Saturday is by far the loudest day. Anyone who so wishes can bring along a drum for the great drum roll procession kicking off at 10.30pm at the Cultural Centre Virgen del Carmen. It will last until the early hours, finishing just in time for rest before the 8am Easter Sunday parade which saves the most magnificent floats for last.

Stunning show in Orihuela

ORIHUELA'S Semana Santa is widely considered one of the finest in Spain with a history exceeding 500 years. Palm Sunday's procession gets underway in time honoured fashion from the Parish Church of Saints Justa and Rufina at 11am, concluding at the Cathedral.

Later that evening sees the stunning self-whipping procession from the Brotherhood of the Flagellation beginning at 22.15pm from the Our Lady of Mercy

church. As in Torrevieja, on Holy Monday - Wednesday there will be evening processions commencing at 10pm, all taking in Plaza Nueva and Avenida de la Constitucion.

Holy Thursday's procession of the Brotherhood of Silence begins at 11pm from the Church of Santiago and winds its way through the town centre. Good Friday promises a very late night for urbanites. The general procession of the Passion of the Christ begins at 6.30pm from Our Lady of Monserrate. But the later procession from the Brotherhood of the Good Death doesn't begin until 2am!

Saturday's procession of the Holy Burial starts at 7pm from the Church of Saints Justa and Rufina and leads to the Cathedral. The last of the main processions is technically on Easter Sunday but really later that night. The resurrection procession starts at 12.30am and takes in most of the town centre before the week's conclusion.



Fury over filthy river

VEGA BAJA residents are voluntarily cleaning up waste from the mouth of the River Segura as local activists desperately seek proper investment in and cleaning of the iconic landmark. Now they have a local political party on

Izquierda Unida (IU) a left-wing party will demand answers from ministers in Madrid over several key questions related to the fate of the river and local residents. The government will be asked directly whether it is budgetary constraints that have caused the river's abandonment? What does the government intend to do about waste? And

what preparations are being made in the increasingly likely event of a flood?

After consulting with irrigation experts and voices on the ground, IU revealed that only a few weeks ago more than 2.5 tons of waste was collected at the mouth of the river in Guardamar del Segura. An astonishing situation which provoked legions of local volunteers digging trenches to help remove it.

Help was outright refused from the Segura Hydrographic Confederation which IU accuses of completely abandoning its responsibilities to the Vega Baja and Murcia. Naturally the situation is also having a hugely detrimental impact on harvests and the local economy.

Huge haul of drugs discovered in Alicante Province

A TOTAL of 13 people, (11 Spaniards, one Moroccan and one Russian) have been arrested by the Guardia Civil after it was discovered that they were involved in the cultivation of cannabis and the sale of cocaine.

Officers first became aware of the activities of a well-known drug dealer in the town of Alpera in Albacete who appeared to be selling quite large volumes of high quality cocaine to local individuals and they established that his 'gang' consisted of several members of his family.

After keeping a watchful eye on the dealer, he was followed to Villena in Alicante where he was purchasing cocaine as well as marihuana from three individuals with whom he had a close relationship and then selling it in his home town.

Whilst the officers kept the expanding ring under surveillance, they became aware of a third location, this time a warehouse in the Cañada area of Alicante and they then decided that it was time to put a stop to this business.

After arresting three of the gang on the A7 motorway, they seized $\leq 60,000$ in cash and at the warehouse which was illegally connected to external electric lines they discovered a plantation containing 54,000 grams of cannabis which they discovered was mainly due for export to Holland and Italy using foreign registered vehicles with secret compartments.

As the raids continued, taking in 13 properties in all, the total haul amounted to 469 grams of high purity cocaine, 496 marihuana plants, 1,501 grams of amphetamines, one 9mm pistol and ammunition, \in 105,738 in cash, five cars used for the transport of the drugs, computers and mobile phones.







Orihuela: City versus Costa

A LOCAL political party formed to fight for the interests of Orihuela Costa has denounced the lack of funding the Costa receives for cultural affairs. CLARO, formed by residents in 2006, has given a rather astonishing example of just how skewed culture funds are in Orihuela City's favour, at the expense of Costa residents.

Hall tried to arrange a tribute concert in honour of hometown hero, the poet Miguel Hernandez to commemorate the 75th anniversary of his death at Flamenca beach. Only 12 people showed up, mainly the councillor in charge and her assistants according to CLARO.

There was hardly any advertising, chairs or a proper stage. A fiasco to put it simply. CLARO contrast the shambolic affair with a proper concert held in central Orihuela that had professional lighting and a famous singer performing.

The independent political party notes that Orihuela has a cultural budget of €1 million, most of which goes to the city, despite the Costa population now being bigger. They are campaigning for Orihuela Costa to be granted its own Cultural Centre with space for at least 400 people to give local residents the chance to integrate and enjoy a proper commu-

IBI tax challenge

THE Independent Party of Camposol and District (CDiP) is considering taking legal action against Mazarron Council. Following many serious complaints from residents of the urbanisation, CDiP has enlisted the help of a top law firm to demand lower IBI rates.

Given the extremely poor infrastructure and property conditions seen in some parts of the community, the CDiP initially consulted with the lawyers as to whether it was even legal for Mazarron to continue taking IBI payments from residents.

They were informed that IBI is an essential tax owed by all property owners but that the rate should be proportionate to the physical services provided. Since the CDiP claim there are in effect absolutely no services provided whatsoever, they are seeking a substantial reduction in the amount paid and a four year rebate for historical overcharges.

A highly successful fundraising campaign has been launched to help with the legal battle, which Camposol residents are fighting out of their own pockets.

DURING a conversation with Sue Wilson the chair of pressure group Bremain in Spain, she told Euro Weekly News she had been very pleased with the fact more than 100,000 people had taken the trouble to attend the Unite for Europe march.

According to Sue, she felt part of a large upswell of people who are opposed to the decision for Britain to leave the European Union and although she is not a public speaker she was delighted to address those attending alongside MPs Tim Farron and David Lammy as well as former deputy Prime Minister Nick Clegg.

Sue told EWN that "this was just one demonstration of the depth of feeling which is growing and will without doubt be repeated."

As far as the actual triggering of Article 50 is concerned, she refuses to be downbeat as her group knew that it was coming but in her words it is "certainly not the end of the argument."

Indeed she is excited that members of the coalition onposed to Brexit managed to meet with the leader of the EU negotiating team Michel Barnier, even before the British government had done so.

She believes the meeting was the reason for a sudden decision by the Ministry for Exiting the European Union to agree to have face to face discussions with three representatives from the coalition on April 10, although they wait to find out who they will meet, as it appears Secretary of State David Davis will not be available.

Representing the coalition. British in Europe, the delegates will be Jeremy Morgan (Italy), Jane Golding (Germany), Fiona Frank-Godfrey (Luxembourg) and Margaret Hales (Spain).

One of the opinions Sue has was quite interesting as she feels it would appear European Union representatives have a greater interest in the protection of the rights of British citizens within the EU than the British government does.

Return of the beehive



BEEHIVES: Spring has been especially chaotic thanks to the heavy winter rains.

FROM Torrevieja to Elche and Alicante City the beehive is making a comeback. But unfortunately it's not the hairstyle but actual swarms of bees that have been terrifying neighbours. Firefighters have been dispatched to multiple locations across the southern Costa Blanca and dozens of people have been treated for stings.

The revenge of the beehives began innocently enough in late March when an Elche woman found a swarm nestled inside her jeans on the terrace. But as April began the pest became dramatically more serious.

One wandering swarm of thousands of bees required serious intervention from fully protected firefighters in an Alicante park. They were also called to an address in Torrevieja and and arrived in full space-age garb, equipped with pheromones to lure the Queen away.

Six firemen attended another swarm in a Torrevieja park, while several vehicles were called out to Pilar de la Horadada where there were reports of stings.

Though bees usually set up new hives at this time of year, spring 2017 has been especially chaotic thanks to the heavy rains of winter. Authorities advise anyone coming across a beehive to contact emergency services immediately and do their best not to disturb it.



Bronze Age wonder

HUTS dated to more than 4,000 years, millennia before the Romans set foot in southern Spain, have been uncovered in Monteagudo, Murcia. Years of intensive archaeological excavations led to the discovery of the ancient ruins, which will soon be on public display.

The discoveries, which continue to astound archaeologists, have been made as Murcia invests serious funds in renovating the old Monteagudo Castle. Dating from the Argaric

Continuing IKEA saga

RIVAL politicians are ganging up on Alicante mayor Gabriel Echavarri to demand that he stop 'fooling around' and sign a deal with Swedish furniture giant IKEA.

The PSOE-led city council has been involved in lengthy negotiations with IKEA with results that have swung from the head-scratching to the bizarre.

There is little doubt that there is huge popular support for the city's first IKEA. But the obstacle concerns where to put it. Strict urban planning laws have enabled the council to shrug their shoulders but that is no longer enough for the PP and Ciudadanos.

The opposition parties have joined forced to demand that an urgent meeting be called to discuss the fate of IKEA's flagship Alicante store. Executives from IKEA have already agreed in principle to consider other sites than their first choice.

But relations are already strained. IKEA reps walked right out of an earlier meeting with top council chiefs after Alicante invited the paparazzi along for what was supposed to be an informal chat. The Swedes have suggested neutral Madrid as the venue for future talks, much to the exasperation of local leaders who just want the deal done.

Five councillors from the Guanyar Alicante platform are also deeply opposed to any IKEA being built, believing it to be bad for small enterprise and the environment. But it appears as though Echavarri is set to bend to demand to 'act like a mayor and get the job done,' especially given the thousands of jobs an IKEA would create.





Cyclists' sweet spot

SPAIN'S official Organisation of Consumers has released a new survey showing the best and worst cities in the country for cyclists. Alarmingly, despite millions in investment. Murcia is near the bottom.

The group interviewed 3,685 residents of 10 Spanish cities to get their thoughts on cycling in their city. They specifically wanted thoughts on bicycle routes, safety, climate, geography, rental services and parking.

Across the board residents said that Spain needs better urban cycling infrastructure and public promotion. Roughly one in four regular cyclists said they had experienced either a crash or theft in the past five years.

Murcia stood out for having the worst cycling network of all the surveyed cities and is also considered the worst signposted and least comfortable for cyclists, although the proportion of people who regularly ride is

The findings aren't great news for the founders of Murcia's MuyBici bike rental scheme but the research does suggest that with more bike lanes and safety protocols, Murcia may soon top the list.

The problem is financing, as MuyBici has already spent much of its initial capital on replacement bikes, vandalism and theft.

Across Spain Sevilla and Valencia are currently cream of the cycling crop.

Attention shoppers

A BRAND new Carrefour has opened on the Orihuela to Bigastro road on the site of the old Eroski.

After months of preparation, the grand opening finally took place on Thursday April 6, inviting hungry shoppers to explore an entirely reformed 5,700 square metre space.



Missing person: Time is o

By Costa Blanca Missing People

TIME is of the essence when a person goes missing as the first few hours after someone disappears are crucial.

Voluntary Facebook group, Costa Blanca Missing People, has been set up to support and help anyone affected by a missing person and is headed up by Deborah Law, Jacqui Perkins and a range of professional people with expertise in the field of locating missing persons.

Over the last few months the group has had to deal with some cases that have not been reported correctly and this has hindered with getting some investigations started. The group would like to draw attention to this issue by raising awareness of what you should do in the event that a loved-one or friend goes missing.

In order to get the investigation moving the group needs facts and once information is received the group sometimes rely on support from the police and often attend the scene of where a person went missing.

Recently there have been two cases where the group found this difficult since a denuncia (the official missing person report) had not been filed with the police and this greatly hindered the group as they had to put other actions into

For example, with the Tony Ahmid case support had to be requested from the consulate in order to clarify with the police, on behalf of the family, that Tony was indeed a missing person. Up until that point it was only the Costa Blanca Missing People team who were searching for Tony as the police were unaware he was missing so had no reason to look.

In another case, the family of a bereaved Venezuelan lady thought they had reported her missing but in fact had not because the report had not been completed correctly and therefore no police search took place for 11 days.

Thankfully Costa Blanca Missing People located the lady within 24 hours and made contact with her family. However, when the police were contacted to inform that she had been located they confirmed that no official report had been made.

Outlined below are some steps to follow if you suspect someone to be missing and how you can ensure you submit the correct information. If at any point you feel unable to carry on or need help, advice or just someone to make some calls for you then please contact Costa Blanca Missing People who will help you.

- Get a pen and paper as at this stage it will help you keep things clear in your own mind and note the following:
- When was the last time you saw this per-

- What was the location?
- Who were they last seen with?
- What were they wearing?
- Does this person have any illness or medical conditions?
- How tall is the person?
- How old is this person?
- Where are they from and where were they
- Have you called the hotel or place they were

staying? Does anyone else living or working there know where they've gone or whether they have returned since your last known whereabouts of them?

- Have you tried their phone and sent a text, WhatsApp message and messages via social media eg Facebook?
- Can you see any recent interactions on Facebook or other forms of social media? Is there any information as to where this person

was going and perhaps who with?

• Have you tried calling or speaking to all people they were travelling/ staying /living with?

If the answers above draw a blank call the police and hospitals in the area to see whether they've taken ill, been involved in an accident or perhaps got into a bit of trouble.

Once you have exhausted all of the above and the person has still not been found then it's time to report it to the police. Stay calm and go to a National Police station (not Local Police) to make a missing persons report, also known as a denuncia. This is very important so a reference number is obtained that allows all of the necessary organisations to work together.

You will receive a copy of the official denuncia report with the reference number on it. It is very important you keep this.

You will need to give the police as much of the following information as possible:

- Full name (as given on the person's passport);
- Date and place of birth;
- Insurance details:
- Travel itinerary;
- Time, date and place of when the person was last seen or contact with them;
- Contact details for the missing person eg mobile phone number, email address or any other method you use for contacting them.

Once you have made the official police report you should then call the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) on 020 7008 1500 and ask for Consular Support in Spain for the area of Spain you are in.

They will offer you advice and support and check to see if the person has come to their attention. This means whether the British Embassy has been notified of any accident, hospitalisation, arrest, etc and can quickly ascertain the person's whereabouts. If they don't have any record they will take details and alert the Embassy and keep you updated if something does come on to the system.

Your next step should then be to report the person missing to your Local Police force in the UK. This can sometimes be difficult to do but the key is in getting the right person. Costa Blanca Missing People suggests you ask to speak to an International or Interpol Liaison Officer, or someone who at least has experience of international missing cases. They should then take the same details as the FCO and inform the UK National Centre Bureau of Interpol who will also liaise with foreign police forces.

Your Local Police force may assign you a family liaison officer (FLO) to give you support.



Reuniting lost family

COSTA BLANCA families are continuing to be reunited with loved ones lost abroad thanks to the Alicante Red Cross' incredible campaign.

One case for instance saw an English woman travel to the Costa Blanca to seek help finding her father, an Alicante man who had romanced her mother while she studied in 1960's Barcelona. 



Jaw-jaw is better than war-war

THE last week fuelled a feeding frenzy for the press around the world and for politicians in Spain and the UK as following the triggering of Article 50 all eyes were on Gibraltar and its apparent importance to the Brexit agreement.

Point 22 of Donald Tusk's response, which is effectively the draft for European Union negotiations, caught most of Parliament and Gibraltar by surprise as it stated 'After the United Kingdom leaves the Union, no agreement between the EU and the United Kingdom may apply to the territory of Gibraltar without the agreement between the Kingdom of Spain and the United Kingdom.'

The press in Britain had a field

day about the machinations of the conniving Spanish who were already making a bid to take over the role from the UK as a major player in the EU top echelon and despite the fact that Alfonso Dastis, the Spanish Foreign Minister, has repeatedly said that Gibraltar would not be a pawn in the Brexit negotiations, he seemed to have possibly achieved quietly what his noisy predecessors had not.

Gibraltar Chief Minister, Fabian Picardo who has visibly risen to the challenge, according to some papers suggested that Spain was behaving like a 'cuckolded husband,' a deadly insult had it been true but in actual fact he was talking about Donald Tusk, President of the European Council, in reaction to his use of

family oriented references.

Much was also made of the fact that Gibraltar was not specifically mentioned in the 'divorce' letter although Mr Picardo, appearing on BBC TV brushed that aside, inferring that the wording was deliberate and produced with the agreement of the Gibraltar government as the important thing was that Gibraltar is

covered in the White Paper.

Former Tory leader Michael Howard jumped into the melee on the exact 35th anniversary of the start of the Falklands War by suggesting that Theresa May could well be strong enough to follow in the footsteps of Margaret Thatcher in order to protect the integrity of the Rock.

The prime minister however decided to emulate an earlier conservative hero by suggesting that the matter would be resolved by "jaw-jaw (rather than war-war)" and with Boris Johnson, never short of a chirpy 'bon mot,' he wrote on Facebook "I wanted to reiterate that the UK remains implacable and rock-like in our support for Gibral-

It is still early days and all 27 members of the European Union have to approve the Tusk letter, so possibly Gibraltar will turn out to be a bit of a 'storm in a teacup' but there is no doubt that negotiations will be testing for both sides and will require give and take, especially as a Commons committee has just stated that there is no justification for suggesting that "no deal is better than a bad deal.'

Komsomolskaya Pravda notes that kicking a robot only hurts your feet and recommends smoke grenades and rubber bullets to disperse angry mobs. Tens of thousands have marched in recent weeks.

Unpopular patriots

CINEMAS are fuming over the Ministry of Culture's decision to postpone the release of American blockbuster The Fast and the Furious 8. Ministers don't want the popular franchise to conflict with First Time, a state-funded film about a Russian cosmonaut expected to bomb at the box office.

Paid pregnancy

SURROGATE pregnancies may soon be banned all across Russia. A new bill before parliament describes it as a violation of children's rights. Unlike in the UK, surrogacy is an industry in Russia, where surrogate mothers can be paid handsomely. Fundamentalists fear that homosexual couples might pay for children.

Check mate

■ A BIZARRE controversy has engulfed the World Chess Federation. It released a statement saying that its president, Russian politician Kirsan Ilyumzhinov, had resigned. But Ilyumzhinov popped up a day later denouncing the news as 'fake.' The colourful leader also claims to have once been abducted by aliens.

Underdog iailed

KEY opposition leader Alexei Navalny was arrested for inspiring huge anti-corruption protests across Russia. Navalny was jailed for 15 days and fined 20,000 roubles. In 2018 he plans to run for president against Vladimir Putin, Pollsters give him almost no chance of pulling the upset.

Coffee kingdom

COFFEE sales are soaring in Russia while the tea trade plummets. Russia is one of the world's biggest instant coffee exporters, despite not a single bean growing there. Tea drinkers are also switching to alternative herbal concoctions.

Cult chaos

■ MOSCOW police launched a raid on a church of Scientology straddling the outskirts of the city. Russia and the Americanbased cult have a difficult relationship after lawmakers stripped Scientology of its religious status. Some politicians began treating its preaching as potentially seditious, along with Islam and Hinduism.

Stock Exchange merger blocked

FOR the third time, the planned merger between the London Stock Exchange (LSE) and the Deutsche Boerse has fallen through, this time because it has been blocked by the European Commission in order to stop what it considered to be a potential financial monopoly.

To some extent it is ironic that the decision was announced so close to the triggering of Article 50 and it must have passed through the minds of exchange executives who 'regret'

would have been the value of the combined London Stock Exchange and Deutsche Boerse merger.

the decision that Brexit may have been partly responsible.

What would have seen the creation of a strong financial operation which straddled the European Union and post Brexit Britain is now unlikely to ever come to fruition, but it does leave the door open for other organisations to cast their eyes over the London Stock Exchange in particu-

Over the past 20 years, apart from the three failed attempts to merge, the LSE has rejected takeover bids from Australia, Sweden and the USA as well as almost merging with the Canadian Stock Exchange.

In the event of a hostile or even friendly bid, the LSE may be helped or frustrated by the government as it has recently introduced new rules concerning the take-over of British companies by foreign ones.

Real Madrid sponsor

IN what is a slightly unusual move, Spanish telecoms giant Telefonica will become a major sponsor of Real Madrid's basketball and football teams in a two year multi-million euro deal whereby it will supply WiFi at the Bernabeu stadium.

In addition it will launch an exclusive Madrid App but it will not gain the benefit of seeing its logo on the shirts of the players, as that right continues to remain with Emirate Air-

Lloyds move

AS previously predicted, now that Article 50 has been triggered, Lloyds of London, the world's largest insurer has announced it will open a subsidiary office in Brussels in order to avoid losing EU business. It is not intended to be the start of a major move out of the UK but is a precautionary decision, made to ensure ongoing access to the EU market.

All Uber

SOMEWHAT controversial but highly successful cab hire firm Uber have announced after three years they will close their operation in Denmark in April due to newly introduced laws that require cabs to have fare meters and seat sensors. The company which has 2,000 drivers in Denmark will not see a huge profit

New coin

THE UK has introduced a new 12 sided £1 coin which is said to be much more difficult to counterfeit than the old round pound. Operators of vending machines have faced large bills for converting their machines to recognise both coins.

Focus on Brexit, nine months after the UK referendum



IT'S been over nine months since the UK referendum on Europe took place, and Brexit is about to get real, so markets are trying to figure out what this means for the UK. Theresa May is entering divorce proceedings with the EU in a position of strength that was unimaginable in the chaotic aftermath of the June 23, 2016 referendum. All the doom and gloom scenarios predicted failed to materialise.

Even in the face of legal challenges that a parliamentary assent is required for the government to trigger Article 50 of the Lisbon Treaty, notifying the EU of the decision to leave, there has been no constitutional crisis and the Parliament as well as the House of Lords have not revolted against the government, despite a think majority.

Theresa May has been lucky so far and the economy has been resilient despite all the challenges and uncertainties ahead. Growth remains buoyant, unemployment has continued to fall and house prices remained steady as consumers' confidence stays surprisingly strong.

One might think that the Prime Minister could not ask for more as she prepares for negotiations, but it would be naïve of Mrs May to forget that Brexit hasn't happened yet and firms are contin-

As the first quarter of 2017 comes to an end, the recent slight deterioration in data and the prospect of slower growth post-Brexit might really mean that uncertainty is starting to have a real impact. Inflation hit its highest level in February as rising fuel prices bumped up the cost of living. The staggering 20 per cent devaluation of

Sterling since the referendum is now filtering through the real economy as households start to crack under inflation pressures.

There are no more talks of a hard of soft Brexit in the news, but businesses are starting to adjust to the prospect of new barriers to trade with the EU as Mrs May seems willing to walk out from negotiations if the deal offered to the UK isn't right. Ahead of triggering Article 50, the challenges and uncertainties of the negotiation are laid bare by the government's own revised economic forecasts, which now expect growth to slow to 1.6 per cent in 2018 and 2019.

Economic slowdown is not the only concern posed by Brexit as the government might potentially face constitutional crises on two fronts. The Scottish First Minister Nicola Sturgeon has now confirmed she will be calling for a new Scottish independence referendum.

Although the economic case for a Scottish referendum is not as strong as it was in 2014, the Scottish voters' commitment to the UK looks shakier now after Scotland voted overwhelmingly to stay in the EU. A bigger threat in a post Brexit world will be Northern Ireland, which will be the only part of the UK sharing a border with the EU. A hard border and barriers to trade with the Republic of Ireland could be economically damaging and there are fears new tensions could destabilise the region.

Brexit is for sure the biggest challenge facing the UK in a long time and Mrs May is not in such an enviable position as it might seem. Her own party keep her in check as the hardliners dictate their line of uncompromising attitude toward the EU and are prepared to walk away from negotiations if they don't what they want. As we are about to find out what Brexit is all about, Mrs May will have to rise to the challenge and show she has the political clout to strike the deal the UK needs in a post Brexit world.

Albert Rivera confirms support of budget

IN a slight spirit of self-congratulation, Albert Rivera, leader of the Ciudadanos political party has announced that he has negotiated a deal with Mariano Rajoy and the government which will see real benefits for Spain.

Mr Rivera explained that in order to support the proposed budget, he has secured an additional €4.1 billion (a similar amount to that granted to Catalonia) to help the working and middle class without the need to increase income tax or IVA.

Of the €4.1 billion promised, €1.915 will be aimed directly at the working and middle classes and €2.1 billion is intended to help in the modernisation of the country

According to him, he has achieved more than originally expected when he agreed to support the minority government and has secured a number of advantages in social measures as well as reversing cuts in such vital areas as education as well as seeing increased investment for future economic development.

The Ciudadanos leader also said that he can see that there is a new dynamic in which "two parties with different ideas can agree to take the budgets forward. It's a shame that the PSOE will not approve the most social budgets of recent years.'

Having seen that the government can easily lose important votes if opposition parties act together or

even abstain, a great deal does depend on the main opposition, the PSOE, as if it votes against the budget, despite or perhaps because it is currently being run by a committee, the position of the minority government would be difficult, especially as the European Union wants to see a strong and clear financial policy.

It may well be that the PSOE decides to abstain en masse in order to allow a new leader to be elected, especially as Mr Rajoy has hinted at the possibility of another election, which the main opposition would want to avoid at this time, especially if it was blamed by the public for causing the elec-

Toshiba face serious financial problems

ONE negative side to globalisation has just emerged at a stormy meeting of shareholders in the giant Toshiba company which has revealed that its US business arm Westinghouse has just filed for bankruptcy protection.

In order to meet some of the projected annual losses of one trillion yen (€8 billion) it is looking to sell its valuable memory chip business which may be worth as much as €16 billion and this has reluctantly been approved by shareholders as Toshiba desperately needs to add liquidity to its business.

Westinghouse has suffered huge cost overruns at two US nuclear reactor projects in Georgia and South Carolina, so by applying for protection in the US, Toshiba hopes to reduce its future financial liabili-

Coffee cups can help the environment

THE western world is besotted with the idea that purchasing coffee from one of a plethora of coffee shops is a cool and sensible activity but few give too much thought to the amount of waste that is created once the coffee is drunk.

Use of plastic bags from supermarkets has been dramatically reduced following the imposition of a charge and whilst you can't really take your coffee away without a container, a joint university study suggests that a charge could cut usage dramatically.

The concept is very simple and that is that a charge would be made for any disposable cup that was taken, but if a reusable cup was offered at no additional cost then people would be likely to think positively and would recognise the environmental benefits and financial advantage.

It would be naive to think that every reusable cup would be used again but the researchers who worked with students purchasing coffee in three universities around the UK and in other businesses believe that up to 12.5 per cent of the cups would be used again.




I THINK Gibraltar is about to become a huge and potentially highly dangerous issue between Spain and the LIK

FROM Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, thrones bearing lifelike effigies of Christ and the Virgin Mary are carried through towns and cities the length and breadth of Spain. Semana Santa represents the journey that Jesus took from his arrival in Jerusalem to his death and resurrection.

Spain is internationally acclaimed for its Easter celebrations and Semana Santa is a big deal in the yearly event calendar.

Entire cities come to a standstill as grand processions make their way through the streets, men and women bearing floats upon which stand depictions of stories from the gospel.

In some cases, these floats have been preserved for cen-

The history surrounding the celebration is tangible

The origins of Semana Santa in Spain lie all the way back in the early 1500s and the celebrations we see today are the result of centuries of evolution. For example, it wasn't until the 17th century that the 'cofradias,' or brotherhoods, began to divide and organise themselves into the factions which are now essential to celebrations.

For spectators who expect every Spanish celebration to be a flamboyant fiesta, the first experience of a Semana Santa parade can be a little daunting. Depending on where you are in Spain, the celebrations can differ in both piety and vibrancy. Across Andalucia, the week is a jubilant celebration of religion, with incredibly detailed and elaborate floats held up by different church brotherhoods. These men and women are so in sync with one another that the effigies they carry look eerily lifelike.

The further north you travel, the more solemn and sombre the tradition becomes. Compared with the festival atmosphere in the south, some would describe Spain's northern towns as having more authentic and historical Semana Santa parades.

The processions are sober and regal, emphasising devotion, remembrance and silence.

Semana Santa in Malaga

WITH over 500 years of history, Malaga is one of the most popular destinations for visitors who wish to see the religious, social and cultural spectacular that is Semana Santa.

Semana Santa on the Costa del Sol is often considered a little livelier than celebrations in the north of Spain.

There is no doubt that Malaga comes alive as the brotherhoods make their way through the streets bearing their thrones, overwhelmed by the sounds of joy and applause. but there is still an element of religious pious evident throughout the week.

In fact, variety defines Semana Santa in Malaga, with old and new brotherhoods coming together to mix the luxury of the ornate thrones with a great emphasis on the penitential spirit.

Every year, Malaga-born actor Antonio Banderas makes an effort to spend Semana Santa in his hometown, where he leads the Virgin de las Lagrimas y Favores procession.

Battling brotherhoods

IT may be bigger in Sevilla or Malaga, but Holy Week in Almeria is actually considered one of the best, and most important, in all of Spain. In fact the event itself is officially considered to be of National Touristic Interest, one of the exclusive

> few in the country to win such an accolade. First and foremost is the fascinating rivalry be-

tween the brotherhoods.

Due to occupation by the Islamic Moors, Semana Santa didn't get off the ground in Almeria until the 16th century.

A century later different brotherhoods began competing for influence and souls during an economic and demographic crisis which saw many people set sail for the new world.

> The brotherhoods became alternative power structures with incredible influence which lasts to this day.

Today there are more than 20 across the city and Semana Santa is made infinitely more fascinating as the different sects try to outdo one another with separate parades spread out across the week.

Community camaraderie in Calpe



Costa Blanca

The passion comes alive

SEMANA SANTA on the southern Costa Blanca is truly a sight to see. Incredibly, the region has four different celebrations which are each officially recognised as festivals of international significance.

The entire Easter Week in Orihuela, Crevillent and Alicante are considered events of such special standing, as is the Palm Sunday procession in Elche.

And that's not even to mention spectacular affairs in Torrevieia and Murcia that are considered emblematic of Semana Santa in their own right. But it is in Alicante, the largest city of the southern Costa Blanca that Easter's profound yet bloody history is most chaotically celebrated.

Throngs of people, numbering well above 20,000 will set the city alight with colour amid the beating processionary drums.

A deeply religious place, especially during the darker ages of history, the Costa Blanca's proximity to the sea marries its maritime myths with passionate Catholicism. A past bloodied with conquest by the Moors means that Easter is celebrated even more fervently here.

Easter on the island

A LITTLE more subdued than the celebrations on the mainland, Mallorca takes the tradition of Semana Santa to

One of the most significant and memorable weeks on the island, processions begin on Palm Sunday at churches everywhere with the bearing of palm branches, and continue throughout the week.

Brotherhoods dressed in penitential robes and conical hoods proceed through the streets accompanied by sombre music, taking hours to complete their penitentiary route.

The town of Pollensa is the location for one of the most incredible Semana Santa traditions in the world.

Thousands travel to the town to watch the dramatic recreation of the descent from the cross, where a figure of Christ is carried down the 365 Calvari steps after a mock crucifixion. The tone is sombre as the body is taken down by torchlight.

Household insurance



JEREMY CORBYN, is a salutary example of what happens when the membership chooses the party leader. And we probably have him to thank for Brexit as his Remain campaign fell flat and lacked an ounce of passion, possibly because his famed integrity made him reluctant to align with Cameron & Co.

Corbyn is a politician whose credentials look good on paper, who remains faithful to his beliefs and does a thoroughly mediocre job of leading the UK's Socialist party. A photo of him should be prominent wherever PSOE primaries are held.



New campaign highlights the danger of mobiles

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

THE DGT has launched a new campaign to stop people from using their mobile phones whilst driving

The campaign has engaged the comedic skills of comedy group Tricicle, Joan Gracia, Paco Mir and Carles Sans, to deliver the message of the dangers of distractions during driving, especially the increasingly frequent use of mobile phones.

It is hoped by using humour to raise awareness of the dangers, the campaign will become a viral message spread across social media.

Minister of the Interior, Juan Ignacio Zoido said: "We want to universalise a simple, friendly and cordial gesture that serves to warn drivers or pedestrians who are using their mobile phone whilst driving or crossing the road, of the risk involved and there is no one better than Tricicle for expressing the message.'

A video has been released to accompany the campaign with the simple message 'At the wheel, don't use your mobile' which is available on various social media accounts.

It is reported that distractions cause around 30 per cent of all fatal incidents, meaning that at least 500 people die each year in traffic incidents where distraction was a concurrent factor.

Mobile phone use is cited as the most frequent distraction, an action that is classified as a very dangerous practice by 94 per cent of drivers according to a study by the RACC.

Another survey of more than 6,000 young Europeans found that despite the danger, 43 per cent of young people admitted to using What-

sApp instant messaging service whilst driving.

When dialling a number on a phone in a vehicle travelling at 120km per hour, a distance of 429m is travelled, the equivalent of around four football fields. Whilst writing a message, your vehicle can travel 660m blind whilst you are distracted typing.

According to the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety, sending messages has three forms of distraction; the actual visual distraction, the manual distraction of the fingers typing on the keypad and the mental distraction as drivers are concentrating on the message rather than the road. These combined can multiply the possibility of an accident by up to 23 times.

Zoido wants to encourage drivers to make a simple hand gesture to phone users they spot on the roads to remind them to hang up.

He added: "We have an important awareness ahead of the real risk of using the phone whilst driving. Nothing is so urgent it cannot wait a

Must they take down their shed?

room on the roof. Since then our estate agent has been contacted by the maintenance company and he said we would have to take down the room. If we do not, we will be taken to court. My question therefore is: If this is an illegal Complex building, are the Committee legal? Can they make us take down the room on the roof?

YOUR building may be 'illegal' but your Community of Property Owners is perfectly legal and, yes, they can order you to take down your shed-type construction on the roof.



In fact, the roof area actually belongs to the Community, with 'exclusive use' assigned to you.

Properly, you should have requested permission from the Committee or the President before you put up any structure.

SPACE... the final frontier. It's 56 years since Russian cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin became the first human in space when he orbited Earth in the Vostok I spacecraft. Here we take a look at some cosmic facts about space. space travel and astronauts that will take you to infinity and beyond!

1. The centre of the Universe

Astronomers once thought Earth was the centre of the Universe but it is now known the Sun is the centre of our Solar System and the planets orbit it. The surface temperature is 5,500°C and at its centre it reaches 15 million °C. The Sun is 4.6 billion years old and it will eventually die.

2. Rocket fuel

ace shuttles need to reach speeds of around 28,000 kilometres an hour to be able to remain in orbit. That means they need more than 500,000 gallons of fuel. This is stored in a large external tank which is loaded with super-cold liquid oxygen and liquid hydrogen. The fuel for the rocket engines is created when these are mixed and burned together.


3. Take a load off

We all know that there is no gravity in space and therefore astronauts float weightlessly around. They are obviously not walking and bearing weight on their feet like they do on earth. This means the skin on their feet starts to soften and flake off so they need to be very gentle when taking off their socks. They wear the ame socks (and underwear) for several days!

4. Some like it hot

Most people presume the hottest planet is Mercury as it is the closest to the Sun but it's not as it has no atmosphere, so it is only hot during the day when it faces the Sun. Temperatures during

the day can reach 425°C while at night they can plummet to -180°C. The hottest planet is Venus which is a blistering 500°C all of the time due to the thick clouds that trap the Sun's heat.

5. Keep it clean

here is no shower on a space shuttle so astronauts have to have a sponge bath. When astronauts need to go to the loo they use a toilet which is similar to what we use on Earth but instead of water moving waste through the system it uses flowing air. Waste water gets vented into space whilst solid waste gets compressed and

stored onboard until they return to Earth

6. Save your tears

Astronauts will still feel the same emotions that they do here on Earth and being so far away from their family and friends it would only be natural to feel a little tearful at times. However, any tears that they cry won't fall as water floats like bubbles or spheres so the water will cling to a surface. Tears therefore form bubbles around the eves in the weightless environment.

The International Space Station (ISS) The ISS has had to be built piece-by-piece in or-

more than 40 missions. Situated approximately 400km above the Earth's surface it weighs nearly 400 tonnes and covers an area the same size as a football pitch. Travelling at 28,000 kilometres per hour it covers a distance equivalent to the Moon and back every day.

Batten down the hatches

The weather here on Earth can be horrendous at times, but it is nowhere near as extreme as some of the other planets in our Solar System, Uranus, Saturn and Jupiter all have fast winds and Jupiter has a massive hurricane storm called the Great Red spot which has raged there for 300 vears. Neptune sees the fastest winds at 2,500 kilometres per hour.

Back to Earth with a thump

Astronauts, regardless of how long they have been in space are a bit off-balance when they return home. Floating about in space means your inner ear doesn't need to keep you balanced and astronauts take time to readjust to Earth's gravit. When they try to stand up for the first time they feel about five times heavier and after a long duration in space may even need to learn to walk again. They often feel dizzy and sick too.

. Walking on the Moon

Very few people will not know that Neil Armstrong was the first man to walk on the moon along with fellow Apollo 11 astronaut Buzz Aldrin. Many however will be unaware that those footprints will remain on the moon for at least 100 million years. This is because the moon has no atmosphere, so there is no wind or water to erode or wash them away, although they will eventually disappear.





Treatment for ingrown toenails

AN ingrown toenail occurs when the nail grows into the skin surrounding it. Eventually, the nail pierces the skin, causing it to redden and become swollen and tender.

The big toe is most commonly affected, with other typical symptoms including pain when pressure is applied to the toe, inflammation of the skin, a build-up of fluid beneath the skin, bleeding, an overgrowth of skin around the end of the toe, or the excretion of pus.

What causes an ingrown toenail?

It comprises excessive growth of the skin around the nail, causing it to become red and inflamed. and even becoming infected with accumulation of

How do you treat an ingrown toenail?

First of all you should ensure proper foot hygiene. You can reduce inflammation using warm salt baths or taking anti-inflammatory drugs, although in some cases this is insufficient and surgery may be required.

What type of surgery?

When surgical intervention is necessary the idea is to free the nail and eliminate any infected areas. In rare cases the infection can be so severe that antibiotic treatment is required after surgery.

Can an ingrown toenail occur more than once?

It can happen many times if you do not take care of your feet and use appropriate footwear.

What can I do to avoid ingrown toenails?

It is best to take care of your feet avoiding the accumulation of dirt or moisture. You must also choose footwear that does not rub when you are walking or running.

Spain remains meat eaters

IN Spain, 8 per cent of 16-24year-olds say they are vegetarian, and 7 per cent say they follow a vegan diet.

This compares to the rest of Europe where in Germany, 14 per cent of those in this age category call themselves vegetarian and 10 per cent are vegan. In Italy and Poland 11 per cent are vegetarian, with 9 per cent being vegan in Italy and 10 per cent in Poland.







AN enormous music festival looks set to bring 15,000 revellers to Sant Joan, Alicante on the day of the region's famous Santa Faz pilgrimage.

A group of local businessmen have petitioned Alicante Council for permission to set up a vast music and party extravaganza to coincide with the April 27 pilgrimage.

Every year hundreds of thousands of people journev to Alicante for the traditional eight-kilometre pilgrimage on the second Thursday after Easter. It has a history spanning more than 500 years and is undoubtedly one of the biggest attractions across Europe.

This year roughly a quarter of a million people are expected to walk from the Cathedral of Saint Nicolas to the Monastery of Santa Faz near San Juan. Buses help transport pilgrims back to Alicante and there are dozens of markets along the way.

GOOD FOOD, **GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS** WITH GARRY WAITE

FEW YEARS AGO there was a super trendy tapas bar that opened behind the gas station on the 'Ronda roundabout' near San Pedro, called Biznaga. It was a forerunner for lots of new trendy tapas bars and was even around before Funky Tapas. It was run by a Spanish couple (no relationship - just working partners!), he front of house and she was in the kitchen. He was a very knowledgeable wine enthusiast and she was a damn good cook.

The combination was great and the place became very popular. Every client was made welcome and suggestions and specials, were made daily.

It was no longer the place it was and eventually it closed. Sometime later it re opened as Friends. I popped in one day to check it out and was not impressed. It took me ages to get a glass of wine (there was only three clients in the place) the wine was undrinkable and the service and attitude were not good. Some several weeks later a friend of mine who used to go with me to the previous operation asked me to join him for lunch. I told him I was not over impressed on my one and only visit. He said it had become quite good.

We have now been using it for some time but recently the guy who seems to be running the place has developed an attitude which is in keeping with the stereotypical bad Spanish waiter. He hardly smiles, makes you as about welcome as a f..t in a spacesuit! And his attitude is dreadful. When you order your food you ask for it in an order of some sort.

I don't want to eat meat while I am still waiting for fishy bits! "It's a tapas bar, you get it when it's ready" he would say. He would take last orders at 3.30 despite the fact they say 4.00. Even if you only wanted a drink! A couple of the other waiters made up for this ignoramus which encouraged

Anyway after a catalogue of disasters over the last few months a visit the other day proved yet again a problem for 'Mr Personality' when we asked for a plain mixed salad to go with the steak. They sent out a salad with tuna.

When we asked for the tuna to be removed as we only wanted a simple salad he said that was a mixed salad and that is 'what we serve.' Needless to say we did not eat it but of course paid for it, as we were charged for it. On Wednesday last week we popped in for a glass of wine before moving on to two different appointments. We replied that we did not, but were only stopping for a glass of wine and my colleague wanted a quick tapa. Apart from about six people in the place - it was empty. "There are no tables for you two here!" came the astonishing reply. We had been banned!! Incredible. This is the sort of attitude I have not seen in many, many years and I can't wait to write to the owners if I can be bothered. After all, it's probably their fault for employing such a twerp! (the nicest word I could come up with!!).

Well, there is a consolation, in as much as I don't have to see his ignorant face again and also can take pleasure in the fact I have been banned from far better places than that!!

THERE CAN'T BE MANY FOODIES who have not heard of Le Gavroche, one of London's premiere restaurants, once the holder of three Michelin stars under the guidance of its original

family team of Albert and Michel Roux. This iconic eatery is celebrating its 50th anniversary, having first opened in Lower Sloane Street in

In 1974 it gained a Michelin Star (the first in Britain) and in 1977 made it two. In 1981 it moved to Upper Brook Street and the following vear achieved the highest accolade of Three Michelin Stars. In 1991 Le Gavroche was

restaurants in the world.

50 years 1967 - 2017. taken over by the very amiable Michel Roux Jr and despite receiving only two stars in 1993 the family tradition continues and in a climate where quality restaurants come and go it is wonderful to see such an institution still respected as one of the consistently finest

But in true controversial style, since the end of January 2017 Michel has removed the 13 per cent service charge from its menus. In a bid to explain this move he claims that the addition of a service charge confuses the clients as they believe it to be a tip!! Well hang on a bit Michel, I think the majority of diners probably do, especially when the words 'optional' or 'voluntary' are added to the words 'service charge'!

This takes me back to the early days in hotels in the 60's when a 10 per cent or 12.5 per cent service charge was added to all bills, the explanation being that everyone from the kitchen porter to the Head Housekeeper received a share.

The truth was though, that this charge was used to pay wages and although staff did receive a 'payment' as part of their salaries it was certainly not an 'equal' split.

Nowadays, to my knowledge and professional experience adding a 10 per cent or

> charge for parties of seven or more' is fairly common practice - and it does get added to the tips and is distributed as such. When explained as a charge that includes the preparation, presentation and service of food I would have thought that was part of the workload

of a restaurant. After all I

have a suit made and the tailor telling me it was 300 pounds for the suits and 15 per cent service charge for making it!!

So guests at Le Gavroche can now leave a tip without being encumbered as to whether or not to leave a voluntary or optional service charge not tip!! - as Michel Roux explains:

"For me, tipping and service charge are two different things but by removing the service charge and incorporating it into the cost of the menu then it is clear, clean, and unambiguous. Then if diners wish to leave a tip on top of that it is up to them. I think this is something we should do in the restaurant industry. It is not clear for the customer whether or not they should leave extra on the table or whether or not it is going to all the staff or how it is being distributed. I daresay some restaurateurs have been abusing that."

Ahhhh! Now I get it! It ain't voluntary any more - you've got to pay it!! Oh well, you win some, you lose some!!

ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE COIN, my appointment that same day meant meeting a colleague for a late lunch in San Pedro. So we paid a visit to an Indian restaurant. Nothing spectacular from the outside but a pleasant terrace on which to enjoy the spring sunshine!

But most importantly was the welcome from the young Indian manager, Fahim. "Whichever table you would like," he offered, immediately clearing the tables from the departing clients. An hour ago I had been treated with such contempt, but now was being treated with such respect. The menus arrived and wine was served.

Apart from the menu being artistically well put together it also contained some dishes not normally seen in a bog standard Indian eatery. I was intrigued

with the dishes on offer and asking the young man what he considered the specialities of the house to be, he enquired as to my personal taste in Indian food. I told him what style I liked and he immediately offered to create something he felt sure I would like. Filled with confidence, my colleague said they would leave him to create something as well. The food arrived, excellent!

But the care for his clients was as it should be. Up until then I thought he was the owner and asking if he was, was when I was told that he was only the manager. As I told him, if you look after your guests as if you were the owner, an owner can ask no more of a manager than that.

So pay a visit to the Bombay Grill Indian restaurant (number 15 out of 147 restaurants in TripAdvisor) and ask for Fahim and avoid the aforemen-



Spain has become a mature marketplace for property

ECONOMISTS at the EU and IMF have warned that housing bubbles may be forming in Australia, Sweden, the UK and the Netherlands. Yet Spain is enjoying growth rates not seen in a decade and far outstrips the UK in the speed of the market's resurgence. So why are there no fears of a Spanish bubble developing?

In 2006 the Spanish property platform Idealista was roundly mocked for warning that the market was about to collapse. Needless to say they were correct. In 2017 Idealista are bullish about the future prospects for Spanish real estate. Head of research Fernando Encinar laughs at the prospect of a bubble in a country of 45 million people where just 100,000 homes are built each year and access to mortgage credit is now strictly regulated.

A key symptom of a housing bubble is the expansion of credit to people who simply can't afford it, combined with the overvaluation of homes. In 2008 for instance almost one million mortgage contracts were signed, an obviously absurd figure in hindsight. In 2016 the figure was just above 280,000, a far healthier and more sustainable number.

Express financing and easy loans are on the backburner as the banks come to grips with a new regulated reality, consumer protection laws and the prospect of huge payouts over unfair mortgage clauses in the past. Today any talk of bubble is limited to the most desirable neighbourhoods of Madrid and Barcelona.

Research from BBVA indicates that real estate growth will continue its smooth growth in 2016. Sales will increase by around 7 per cent and level out at about 600,000 in the short term. Prices will rise between 3 and 4 per cent per annum until 2020.

No Vegas to be built in Spain

THE search for Spain's first big Vegas-style property theme park goes on. A proposed multibillion super complex planned for Torres de la Alameda, Madrid has fallen through.

It was due to be built by American giant, the Cordish Companies, but the Community of Madrid ultimately baulked at the public cost of €340 million needed for infrastructure. The Cordish Companies, which runs more than 40 million square feet of real estate worldwide, is still interested in setting up the macro-complex somewhere else in Spain.

They are prepared to invest €2.2 billion in a facility boasting hotels, restaurants, shops, cinemas, theatres, convention centres, casinos and even a circus. It would be an alternative to the failed Eurovegas concept planned by American gambling magnate Sheldon Adelson. Only 10 per cent of the enormous leisure centre would be devoted to casinos to get around strict Spanish gambling regulations.



The failure to reach a deal is the latest in disappointments for American companies trying to construct spectacular gambling resorts across Spain. Eurovegas collapsed due to Adelson's demands on the Spanish parliament, even demanding it reverse anti-smoking laws for his premises alone.

Chinese group Wanda has

seen a similar project vanish. Another consortium tried to open 32 casinos in the Tabernas desert but again the deal fell through

'Barcelona World' has been put on the backburner and, perhaps fortunately, plans to recreate the Lord of the Rings on the Costa del Sol never saw the light of day.

Keyhole gardens offer a new option

CREATING a vegetable garden with limited space, time, soil materials and water available can make it a difficult decision for many aspiring, or even seasoned, gardeners.

There are many ways to grow plants in containers and raised beds that have advantages over the natural garden soil which always needs the adding of nutrients through compost and other soil improvement materials to make

Having gardens above soil height makes it easier to access the plants without creaking joints and strained backs and they reduce weed, pest and soil condition management problems due to greater ability to control the environment of the

Containers and raised beds have the big disadvantage in the Mediterranean climate of needing more regular watering due to the long, hot and often dry summers. In cooler, wetter

climates containers and raised beds have the advantage of good drainage but as most popular vegetables are grown in the summer months it is not a great advantage here.

A great solution for making a raised garden with its own nutrient production from compost and higher water retention is a keyhole garden.

Keyhole gardens are generally a raised circular garden, around two metres in diameter with a central half metre diameter funnel for filling with compost that has an access path within the circle for adding the compost and accessing the garden.

The design gives the look of a keyhole which is the reason for its name. The border of the garden can be made from any suitable local material capable of retaining the soil mixture.

The selected materials for the border should also consider the permanency of the garden. Stone walls are strong, allow drainage and last for years, but

an organic wall made of hay bales for example or untreated wood will decompose over a couple of seasons, which is fine if the garden is also for making compost to add to other gardens or for remaking new keyhole gardens.

The central funnel should be of a material to hold back the soil of the garden to allow the adding of compost in the centre. The funnel wall can be made of wire for more permanent gardens or materials such as bamboo or other types of wooden stakes that can eventually be a part of the compost in


The gardening area between the border wall and the funnel can be filled with organic soil and amendments with a base of coarse material such as

branches and twigs topped with manures, compost, washed sand, seaweed, mulching materials, other organic soil amendments and natural soil with the finer material at the top for preparing the garden bed.

The purpose of all the organic material is to provide good water retention and provide nu-

The central funnel compost is also a way to add nutrients to the garden, recycle organic material into the garden and allow water penetration deeper into the garden during hot dry periods. The funnel can be capped with a lid to prevent saturation of the compost during wet weather and to reduce unwanted insects access

The result is a highly productive small garden to grow vegetable, flowers, herbs or a combination of the various plants you may wish to grow at an easily accessible height and with a means to add recyclable organic material to the garden.

on pests that are small and slow, like aphids, which can decimate flower beds. These little red bugs are attracted by dill and dandelions and can be great friends in the garden.

Feared by many, the misunderstood common spider is a fantastic member of the insect pest control team, so leave the webs untouched and let them help you out. Spiders have a wide range of prey, including caterpillars, aphids and fruit flies.

If you want a beneficial bug that you don't have to see very often, maybe consider introducing some ground beetles into your garden. Typically only active at night, these critters will eat slugs, caterpillars and some species of worm.

If you want something a little more interesting, a praying mantis could be the answer to your problems. Just be aware that these ferocious predators will attack just about any insect in its path, including the good guys.

BITCHES are more affectionate and easier to control than the male dog. They are about 30 per cent smaller than the male and whatever their breed, tend to be more gentle with children.

The bitch will come into season about every six months and this will last for around three weeks. The female is receptive to mating and extremely attractive to dogs that will instinctively try to mate with them.

A good clear sign that a bitch is coming into 'season' is that she will produce a discharge; initially a bloodstain, that will be deposited wherever she sits or lays. She will spend a great deal of time licking her vagina.

Be assured that your home will attract local male dogs that will camp outside your home for about three weeks. Expect howling throughout the night to attract her attention.

The female will when on heat attempt to escape at the first possible opportunity, so it is wise to keep all doors closed and secure, especially when greeting your guests. I have known bitches that have chewed their way through doors during the night to escape to get



male dogs

Do not underestimate the great heights that male dogs can climb and jump to reach a bitch on heat. During this period it is well-known that the male dog can be extremely aggressive and could well attack you if you tried to send him away.

If you are not going to breed from your bitch it is best to consider having her neutered a few months before her first season. Veterinary Colleges have endless scientific proof that the female will live longer and the likelihood of mammary tumours is negligible. She will certainly not put on weight.

Male dogs whatever their breed tend to be more dominant than the female. The adult male has an instinctive urge to escape and wander free from home for periods ranging from an hour to several days or weeks.

Often a clear sign of a dominant male although house trained will show when he starts to lift his leg in the house and urinate on walls and furniture. He does this to scent-mark his territory and to affirm his dominant status. This type of

trated.

Owners of dominant dogs should spend time re-enforcing their own dominance and insisting on absolute obedience. This can be achieved through a training club where you can learn how to control the dominant male when he meets another dominant male dog.

Dogs that are confined and not allowed to roam can develop sexual frustration and will mount the human leg and even mount children who crawl on the floor. This is intolerable and very dangerous to a child.

The best way to deal with this is to discuss the problem with a vet who might consider either using a female hormone to try to counteract the condition or to castrate the dog.

I personally recommend castration for all dogs not being bred. A castrated dog is happy and free from worry and frustration. He'll be more pleasant to have around, less likely to fight other males and more submissive to the wishes of the human nack leader.

The best time to castrate a male dog is around five to six months before he starts to lift his leg. Your vet will advise when it is suitable for this minor operation. Within 24 hours your dog will have fully recovered.





THE Los Amigos de Mazarron FC's eight annual gala week events between March 18-21 were a great success smashing all previous records.


