False hope

Doctors defrauded over € 600,000

Two university professors are among five arrested in a €600,000 fake anti-cancer drug scandal.

The accused allegedly exploited facilities at the Universitat de les Illes Balears (UIB) to produce a fake anti-cancer drug that they sold online across Spain.

Xavier Busquets and Pablo Escriba founded Lipopharma, a biopharmaceutical company based on the university campus, 15 years ago.

They have been working

with an 'artificial molecule' which has not passed the necessary tests to obtain accreditation from the Spanish Medicine's agency. Despite the drug not having been authorised for sale, it has been patented by the UIB and given the commercial name Minerval.

Investigators from the National Police's Economic Delinquency unit also detained the company's business manager and two others linked to the non-profit Marathon Glioma Foundation.

Glioma is a particularly aggressive form of cancer that typically appears in the brain or

spine, and Minerval has been marketed to sufferers, with one parent having paid €25,000 in an attempt to save his daughter.

The accused are suspected of defrauding clients of at least €611,000, but the prosecution believe there may be more victims, who are now being encouraged to step forward.

Flights cancelled in Palma



NIGHTMARE: Thousands have been affected by the delays and cancellations.

IT took four hours to regain normality at Palma Airport after computer problems halted all flights into and out of the city on Wednesday April 12.

The problem, which affected the control centre managing air traffic over the Balearics, began at 1pm and was resolved shortly after 5pm.

The incident caused delays

of up to five hours, affecting 79 take offs and over 40 land-

The timing couldn't have been more inconvenient, in the middle of Semana Santa, on a day where 484 flights were planned and 80,000 people were due to pass through the airport.

Chaos began when a

Ryanair flight destined for Bologna, scheduled to leave at 1pm, didn't take off until 3pm. From there, everything spiralled out of control. The air traffic control tower suspended flights, giving priority to planes already in the air and destined for Palma

Meanwhile, on the ground, AENA, the company that man-

ages the airports, coordinated with airlines to try and reschedule flights. The decision was made to cancel connecting and low cost flights, while other operators sent their passengers to hotels.

As EWN went to print, work was underway to reschedule almost 100 flights affected by the technical difficulties.

Coo much

SOLLER Council has exterminated 300-400 house pigeons which were living in abandoned buildings and public spaces.

The town hall says that the birds were killed for public health reasons after their population exploded in highly populated areas.

The reason for the upswing is thought to be the loss of the traditional dovecotes, which were used to collect pigeon eggs for human consumption.

Environmental councillor, Josep Lluis Puig, explained that his team had counted "well over 1,000" pigeons, leading to the cull.

Working alongside the Natura Parc Foundation, the council placed traps in disused buildings, removing the animals over a period of several weeks.

The campaign has not ended, with Port de Soller next on the agenda.

Bus fuss

In a recent press conference, Noguera, who will assume the position of mayor in two months, was asked about the impending visit and replied with just three words, 'bus not welcome.

It should be noted that local campaigners 'Valores en Baleares,' who describe the vehicle as 'the freedom bus,' have requested that it visit Palma. Their next president, Juan Jose Tenorio, said that "freedom in Spain is threatened under the guise of discrimination on the grounds of sexual orientation and the combating of LGBTphobia."

In his opinion, Spain is approving 'laws of sexual indoctrination' that, 'far from promoting equality and nondiscrimination, try to impose a new and relentless ideology,' and attack 'against the freedom of parents, educators, journalists and health professionals.

Spain's jet set

A RECORD number of international visitors flew into Spain during 2016, and more than 80 per cent touched down at one of operator AENA's 46 airports.

Last year 75.6 million tourists visited the country, with 60.6 million travelling by plane.

Spain remains among the world's top holiday destinations for UK travellers, as more than 17.8 million holidaymakers arrived last year, with 11.4 million from France and 11.2 million from Germany comprising the three key markets.

Spanish airports registered two million flights last year, a 7.5 per cent rise on 2015, and the total volume of passengers increased by 11 per cent compared to the previous 12 months.

Madrid and Barcelona, historically Spain's rival cities, remain the busiest airports and intercontinental hubs. Adolfo Suarez Madrid-Baraias and Barcelona-El Prat airports are ranked fifth and sixth in the EU in terms of passenger numbers, behind London's Heathrow, Charles de Gaulle in Paris, Schipol in Amsterdam, and Germany's Frankfurt Airport.

In Spain, airports serving popular holiday destinations make up the remainder of the 'Top 10' of the country's busiest commercial airfields, including Palma de Mallorca, Malaga, Alicante, Gran Canaria, Tenerife South, Ibiza, Lanzarote and Valencia.

Ghost in the airport machine

BUDGET carrier Rvanair came to the rescue of much-maligned Castellon Airport when it began flying from Stansted and Bristol to the Valencian destination in September 2015.

Officially opened four years earlier, the facility cost more than €150 million to build. Until scheduled Ryanair flights arrived, Castellon's runways were used only by flights chartered by football team Villarreal to travel to away matches.

Ciudad Real airport, located 235km south of Madrid, cost more than €1 billion to build and was designed to process 2.5 million passengers a year.

Seen as a white elephant, it opened in 2008 but its independent operator went bust and it shut down in 2012. Spanish budget carrier Vueling was the last airline to use the runway and it is hoped a potential €56 million sale, approved almost a year ago, eventually comes to fruition.

THE government team at Palma City Council has expressed its total condemnation of an attack on a Local Police officer.

The victim was an officer who is currently investigating police corruption. He was shot at by a motorcyclist with a shotgun, who fled the scene when the officer fired two warning shots into the air with his weapon.

According to the council, the officer was subjected to 'unprovoked act of intimidation' and they wish him

In a statement, they said that they "in no way consent to any threat or attack on officials or police officers who are doing their jobs, depending on the public's compliance with the law.'

They have reiterated their "support and gratitude" towards the Local Police officers for their continued work, as well as their willingness to clarify exactly what happened during the incident.

Violent robbery gang arrested

A GANG consisting of 23 minors and three young adults alleged to have carried out several robberies has been detained.

National Police arrested the 26 perpetrators in Palma who were apparently dividing into groups of five or six to intimidate and rob their victims, usually between the ages of 15 and 22-years-old.

Some of the offenders have previous history of criminal activities such as housebreaking and vehicle theft. Many of the incidents coincided with the release dates of some of the perpetrators from a juvenile detention centre.

Reports indicate that multiple victims were still attacked even though they gave up their valuables

The National Police confiscated a large amount of stolen property, along with drugs and weapons including a simulated revolver and a knife that were used in the attacks. All of the stolen valuables had been taken to one home in Son Gotleu neighbourhood of Palma.

The charges against the gang include 41 robbery crimes involving violence, 29 vehicle related thefts, three house burglaries, one home robbery with violence, and numerous non-violent thefts.

The prosecution believes that there will be more crimes as the investigation continues.

Marriages of convenience

THE leader of a network of marriages of convenience has been sentenced to 11 months in prison by a court in Palma.

The plot paid Spanish women to marry immigrants, commonly Hindu men in this network, so they could receive a permanent residence card.

Several participants of these fraudulent marriages were convicted within the last few weeks, but many were given fines instead of jail time.

One of the women was convicted of participating in three

marriages of convenience. The unnamed leader was a wanted fugitive until he was arrested last week.

Members of the network were alwasy married in churches, and presented false baptismal certificates. A local diocese first detected the fraud and contacted the National Po-

According to the prosecutor, at least seven fraudulent marriages can be proven linked to this fraudulent net-

ETA finally disarms for all

800 deaths in Spain have been caused by Basque terrorist group ETA.

Over a period of 40 years the organisation was also believed to have injured thousands of people and whilst it initially attacked politicians and police officers, it soon transferred its attacks to areas where tourists flocked.

In the same way that Tunisia and Turkey have lost thousands of visitors due to recent Daesh activity, Spain saw similar losses when the ETA attacks were at their height.

The past few years have seen a major softening of the position of ETA, brought about in part by the success that French and Spanish police have had in arresting militant members. In 2011, it declared a permanent truce with Spain, but the group still maintained its arms.

However, the group has now publicly confirmed that it has 'disarmed,' so at least there is one piece of positive news in what continues to be a world still suffering from conflict between groups with differing ideals and

Ryanair strike



GROUND handling staff for budget airline Ryanair at Alicante-Elche airport are set to go on strike over the Easter weekend in a dispute over unpaid wages, with certain flights to Mallorca likely to

The 230 Ryanair and Lesma staff have called for four days of 24hour strikes from 00.01 on Friday April 14 and will last until 23.59 on Monday April 17.

Holiday and overtime payments and workers' rights are also disputed. Worker representatives claim that some of the part-time staff are owed up to €1,000 and 100 per cent of the staff are behind the

Alicante-Elche Airport, originally named El Altet, is the fifth busiest airport in Spain based on passenger numbers, and the main airport serving the Valencian Community and the region of Murcia.

The airport is also a base for Air Nostrum, Evelop Airlines, Norwegian Air Shuttle and Vueling.

In 2016 it set a new, consecutive, record with almost 12,350,000 passengers, making it one of the 50 busiest airports in Europe.

Up to 80 per cent of all passenger flights are international.

The largest numbers of passengers arrive from the United Kingdom, Germany, the Netherlands, Norway, Belgium and Sweden.

Homelessness in Mallorca

A STUDY undertaken by the Mallorcan Institute for Social Affairs, which was undertaken in March of this year, reports that there are 209 homeless in Mallorca.

Some 200 volunteers agreed to walk the streets of Palma and other towns in the hours of 9pm to 1am in order to record the number of people who appeared to be living on the streets in order to be able to advise the authorities on how to identify and best cope with the problem.

In the last study of this type, which took place in 2015, just 156 people were counted and this has now increased with the majority of the homeless being found in Palma.

The majority are also males

aged between 40 and 59 years old although some of the homeless don't just sleep in the streets, but have tents or sleep in groups to protect their belongings and animals.

Wherever possible, those identified were interviewed and it transpired that of the 144 who agreed to discuss their situation, 95 had been living on the streets for 10 years or more.

The bulk of those interviewed were Spanish followed by other Europeans and just 12 originally came from Africa whilst at least half confirmed that they were still in contact with their families.

The two main reasons for homelessness were recorded as lack of work, followed by lack of money.

Masseuse fined for minor massage

THE Provincial Court of Palma has fined an erotic masseuse €2,430 after he performed services on a minor. The defendant was aware his client was under 13 years old, but still went

ahead with the appointment.

The court heard that the minor called the masseuse in September of 2013, asking to hire his services. Although he hung up on the first phone call, the defendant called back and they arranged an appointment, taking advantage of the child be-

ing at home alone. He stole various items of jewellery from the child's mother, valued at \in 722.

After handing over € 90 for the massage, the child took off his clothes, except for his socks, and lay face down on his parent's bed.

The accused began to work on the back and

buttocks, and it was at this moment the minor became frightened and decided to end the activity. He asked the masseuse to leave which he did.

A settlement was reached whereby the defendant admitted to crimes of theft and the corruption of minors, receiving fines for both.

1,000 trees for Palma

DUE to the destruction of some 700 infected trees in 2016 the Palma Council will be replacing them this year.

The intention is to plant at least 1,000 trees of different species by the end of May and wherever possible, the council will plant attractive trees that do not have large and invasive roots.

Much has been learned from the problems encountered with some of the trees that had to be removed and the replacements are being targeted in particular areas so that if there is not a great deal of space then they will plant trees that do not spread their branches or grow over large.

Airports to be very busy

THE Balearic airports expect to process more than 630,000 people over Easter.

Airport management company AENA has confirmed there will be 3,945 flights between Thursday April 13 and Monday April 17 with the bulk of visitors coming through Palma airport, subject to there being no further technical problems.

Palma will welcome just under 500,000 passengers in those few days with the busiest time set for Easter Saturday whilst Ibiza comes next with some 105,000 passengers overall.

Flights in and out of Menorca will be less frenetic but will see more than 40,000 passengers in just five days.

Two rescued sea turtles are set free

TWO rescued sea turtles have been released in Dragonera Natural Park. One turtle was rescued near Ibiza with flotation problems, and the other turtle was found in the Bay of Alcudia entangled in plastics.

The programme of monitoring and recovering sea turtles launched years ago by the Balearic Islands ministry of environment is responsible for the rehabilitation of the two turtles.

Primary students from Palma's La Purissima school were able to participate in the process and learn about the importance of preserving sea life and preventing animals from suffering.

Many of the animals from the recovery centre are released in Dragonera National Park, and whenever possible. the release is done with school groups in order to educate and stress environmental conservation.

Many factors have led to the decline

of the sea turtle population in the Balearic Islands in recent decades including being caught in fishing nets, entangled in plastics and debris, and ingesting rotten waste.

The counsel of Mallorca, who co-

manage the natural park with the Balearic government, stress the importance of protecting the local sea turtle. Among other effects, a decline in sea turtles has led to an increase in jelly fish around the islands.

THE city council of Costitx has completed the first stage of formalities to begin the installation of solar panels in the public school Nadal Campaner Arrom.

Little change for the euro

Commentary by Moneycorp

EUR weekly currency update

There was little net change for the euro against the pound and the dollar. It strengthened by quarter of a US cent and lost a fifth of a cent to sterling. That is not to say the week was entirely uneventful. Last Friday the pound extended the rally that had begun after Britain's prime minister sent her Article 50 divorce letter to Brussels. The pound's climb was the result of further unwinding of short positions by investors.

There were more reminders of how monetary policy is pointing in opposite directions on opposite sides of the Atlantic. Mario Draghi at the European Central Bank said for the umpteenth time that it is too soon to reduce stimulus. The Federal Open Market Committee talked of more rate increases and said it was time to think about reducing its stock of bonds, thereby further tightening monetary policy.

USD weekly currency update

A range of less than a cent and a half covered the movement of sterling against the dollar. Eventually the pound booked an almost-invisible net gain of eight ticks while the dollar took a quarter of a cent off the euro. The pound started off well, extending the rally that had begun after Britain's Article 50 divorce letter had been delivered to Brussels. It was the result of investors covering more of their short positions.

Looking at the longer term, the week's most important development was the Federal Open Market Committee minutes. They spoke of beginning to run down the huge stock of bonds amassed by the Fed during its quantitative easing schemes. Investors inferred that this 'balance sheet normalisation' would mean fewer interest rate increases than they had previously bargained for. It did not affect the dollar too much though, because the Fed was vague about when it might begin.

CAD weekly currency update

The Loonie was one of several currencies that spent the week busily going nowhere. It lost a third of a US cent and went down by two thirds of a cent against sterling. The pound spent last Friday extending the gains it had made the previous day after the prime minister's Article 50 divorce letter was delivered to Brussels. Investors who had previously sold sterling in anticipation of its decline continued to cover their short positions by buying back the pound.

Canadian economic data were few: Gross domestic product expanded by a healthy 0.6% in January, RBC's manufacturing sector purchasing managers' index showed a pick-up in activity and Canada logged a small trade deficit for February. There weren't too many UK ecostats either. Fourth quarter economic growth was confirmed at 0.7%. The manufacturing PMI disappointed by

falling slightly while the services sector reading jumped ahead, driven by banks and other financial institutions.

AUD weekly currency update

The Aussie continued its yoyo performance, dropping to the back of the field again after a week in the lead. It lost more than one US cent and fell by a cent and a quarter against the pound. Although it is one of the strongest performers in the year to date the Australian dollar has languished over the last month, losing five cents to sterling. As it does so often, the Reserve Bank of Australia influenced the currency. On this occasion it was the monetary policy statement that hindered it, not because the Cash Rate benchmark was left unchanged but be-

cause the RBA held out no prospect of higher rates.

Economic data from Australia carried no coherent message. Purchasing managers' index readings showed manufacturing activity growing more slowly while firms in the services sector pushed ahead at a faster pace. Retail sales and building permits fell in February, as did imports, but exports increased, widening the trade surplus. NZD weekly currency update

A range of less than two cents covered sterling's movement against the NZ dollar and the two were unchanged against one another. They were also unchanged against the US dollar. Yes, it was a fairly quiet week. Sterling showed early promise, as investors covered speculative short positions following the delivery of Downing Street's Article 50 divorce letter to Brussels. There was no carry through, though, and the pound blotted its copybook with a weaker-than-expected purchasing managers' index reading from the manufacturing sector. It redeemed itself later when the equivalent figure from the services sector came in a point and a half higher than forecast.

Two NZ business confidence measures both showed companies to be less ebullient in March than they had been previously. The fortnightly GDT index showed milk prices rising by 1.6%. There was nothing in those numbers to inflame passions for the Kiwi in either direction.



Care at home project launch

IMAS, the Mallorcan Institute of Social Affairs, has launched its new project, a comprehensive care at home service. The first phase has already begun which includes eight nursing technical assistants and four coordinators. The project is set to gradually grow, adding 48 more assistants.

The new system of care at a person's home will have many benefits including the possibility of living in a comfortable familiar environment because of regular medical visits.

Families and carers will be offered information, training, and specific programmes directly at the patient's home. The home care will also gradually grow in coordination with the patient's needs.

According to the minister of welfare and social rights and president of IMAS, Margalida Puigserver, there are currently 33 people given care to in their homes with this programme, and will expand in May to reach 150 people. The budget for the first year of the project is almost €1.2 million provided by both IMAS and the government.

Recently Puigserver, along with IMAS vice-president Javier de Juan and director of IMAS's care unit Regina Moll met with the nursing technical assistants and coordinators to learn first-hand about their first week with the new programme.




Not fair

Possible return of the blue passport by 2019

THE current contract to print British passports expires in 2019 and many hope that the new tender will require a return to a blue cover.

Reports suggest that it could cost up to £500 million (€575 million) to redesign the passport, but it is more likely that this will be the anticipated total cost of the production of up to six million passports a year during the life of the 10-year contract.

On the side of the Brexiteers, MP Andrew Rosindell MP is quoted as saying "The humiliation of having a

pink European Union passport will now soon be over," whilst Jeremy Corbyn suggested that "The real source of humiliation is a government worrying about the colour of our passports while a social care and NHS crisis rages."

Knowing of the need to produce new passports, design magazine Dezeen sponsored an unofficial competition to design a new version and from hundreds of entries, a short list of nine has been produced from which one will be chosen as winner.

None of the chosen designs are likely to appeal to those who are looking for a return to the old style, but in fairness they may well be somewhat tongue in cheek, especially the FUK-D

One side effect of membership however is that under EU rules, any tender of this type has to be advertised within the European

Union and a situation could arise that the return to the traditional blue passport could see the contract going to a security printer possibly based in France, Holland or Spain.





Safer €50 banknote issued

By Karl Smallman

THE European Central Bank (ECB) has released a new version of the €50 bank note with more security measures that will help prevent counterfeiting.

The new bank note that came into circulation on April 4 is a slightly different colour and has been manufactured on a firmer and more resistant paper and incorporates a hologram. And when you turn it, the silver band on the right shows the value of the note and the euro symbol (€).

It is very easy to check a real euro bank note by using the simple FEEL, LOOK and TILT method.

A special printing process gives the banknotes their unique FEEL.

LOOK at the banknote against the light. The portrait window and watermark as well as the security thread become visible.

TILT the banknote. The silvery stripe reveals a portrait of Europa in a transparent window and the emerald number displays an effect of the light that moves up and down.



NEW NOTE: Has been manufactured on more resistant paper and incorporates a hologram.

The new design, designed by the German Reinhold Gerstetter, follows the line of new five 10 and 20 euro banknotes that have been introduced over the last three years.

In addition, the new bank note includes countries that have joined the European Union since 2002.

And the acronym of the issuer, the ECB, appears in nine linguistic variants, instead of the initial five.

The €50 is the most used bank note in the euro zone, where there are more than 8,000 million, which represents 45 per cent of the total bank notes in circulation.

This change is welcomed by many as the existing €50 note is the most regularly counterfeited and a regular miscreant in Girona has just been arrested with material from which fake notes with a face value of €450.000 could have been

Increase in tourist spending

A REPORT issued by Spanish tourist organisation Exceltur confirms that tourism income has grown in the first quarter of

The bulk of the growth is driven by visitors from overseas and the Brexit result doesn't appear to have discouraged British visitors nor is it likely to this year.

Numbers of foreign visitors have increased and hotel demand has also increased allowing for owners to increase prices and

Whilst the strength of the external market has grown, Spanish holidaymakers are flying internally less often and are also spending less in hotels whilst looking more to make bookings in rental properties.

It is forecast however that the situation will improve in the second quarter as bookings for Holy Week (Semana Santa) were very strong and the most popular areas for the major increase in tourism generally are considered to be Andalucia, the Canaries

Spain facing costly EU fines

THE Spanish government knows it has a very short time before it will be fined by the EU for not passing the 'Stevedore law.'

Minister of Public Works, Íñigo de la Serna has now presented a new plan which whilst not totally in accordance with government expectation may save it from an immediate €23 million fine plus a daily penalty of

The European Union decreed that the stevedores were operating a 'closed shop' within Spanish ports and the government tried to agree new terms with the various unions and other political parties as it proposed major changes in employment status.

It was over this draft law that the government lost its first major vote when opposition parties voted against it and political partner Ciudadanos decided to abstain.

In a press conference held in Barcelona. the minister made it clear that the compromise law had to be pushed through parliament quickly or else these penalties would be enacted.

Having escaped an even larger fine for missing budget targets, the government wants to ensure that it is complying with EU regulations over this particular matter which if allowed to continue unresolved could cost the nation €4 million each month.

Shopping centres proving to be attractive investments

This year will see the opening of 21 new shopping centres in Spain together with the expansion of six existing facilities and with nearly 20 per cent of all of these centres, estates and malls in Spain being based in Andalucia it is clear that they play an important part in the local economy.

A new centre will bring employment for a range of construction workers and decorators followed by large numbers of shop assistants, general finance staff and a relatively prosperous management struc-

The amount of income tax and IVA that is collected from the 106 outlets in Andalucia is a regular and welcome addition to the local and national economy especially as much of the spend comes from foreign tourists.

Spain tops world tourism report







Clampdown on fines

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



ROAD SAFETY: Brussels denounced the lack of cooperation between countries.

THERE are calls for stronger actions to be implemented to simplify sanctions of foreign drivers after Brussels denounced the lack of cooperation between countries.

DGT officials from Spain were in Malta to the attend the EU High Level Road Safety Group meeting. The officials said the high volume of the fines processed makes the system insufficient 'in terms of efficiency' as they reported that only 50 per cent of the files opened end with the fine paid according to a Brussels report as in many cases it can be foreign drivers who are fined, who then return to their home country and the information is lost and the fine never received.

The request from the Spanish Government comes after a report found that the 28 countries had not 'exploited the full potential' of the electronic system designed to exchange information on traffic offences between countries.

Brussels denounced this lack of cooperation, eg Portugal, which does not exchange data.

The Spanish DGT also wants stronger cooperation and wants to take action against more dangerous foreign drivers who do not maintain the safety distance, carry out dangerous manoeuvres or who put safety at risk. Currently these are not considered in the present directive, which only provides data for speeding. failing to stop at a traffic light, riding without a helmet, using a mobile phone, not wearing a seatbelt and driving whilst under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

Gregorio Serrano, the Director General of the DGT, said they are working on being the first country to share this additional data, adding that Spain's roads were amongst the safest: "We were told at the meeting of the European Union that Spain is the fourth safest country in road safety."

creased fees. The majority of us had no idea that these items were to be discussed and voted on. A few weeks later a mass of information was distributed, so the majority finally were put in the picture. This is clearly unsatisfactory. Are some specific laws or regulations being flouted?

When the AGM of A. the Community is called, the members should receive a copy of the Agenda, which lists the items to be discussed and voted on. Properly, no item can be



voted on unless it appears on the official Agenda. This ensures that the members

have time to study the issues beforehand. Members who could not attend the AGM can protest after they are officially informed of the results and it seems you have grounds for protest.

ARE you one of the lucky ones who sleeps like a baby, or know someone who can 'sleep for England'? Well it could be in their genes.

Scientists claims that some people are born with a gene that helps them sleep better at night. The scientists at the Washington State University in the USA looked at how genes change during the sleep-wake cycle and



found one called FABP7 which changed over the day throughout the brain of mice. They looked at how the gene affects sleep and then analysed data from nearly 300 Japanese men who took part in a sleep study and DNA analysis.

Researchers found that those with a variant of the FABP7 gene tended to have irregular

sleeping patterns. Whilst normally getting around the same amount of sleep as the others, they would often wake up regularly throughout the night.

Meanwhile, a study has suggested that sleeping less than five hours a night makes you twice as likely to develop prostate can-

Food allergies are on the rise

FOOD allergies are increasing amongst the Spanish population and the country is not alone. According to the EAC-CI (European Academy of Allergy and Clinical Immunology), it is estimated that by 2025, one in every two Europeans will suffer from some form of allergy.

Hospital admissions in children due to anaphylactic shock have risen in recent years. Although the data varies according to the age group or geographical area, in Spanish children, eggs and cow's milk are the most common allergies, followed by fish.

Some 1.3 million Spaniards

are affected by allergies of some sort with nuts and seafood the most common amongst the adult population.

The figures were released during World Allergy Week.

Wine's flavour is formed in the brain

A REPORT suggests that wine could give your brain a work out.

A leading neuroscientist believes that drinking a glass of wine sparks a reaction in the sensory and emotional parts of the brain and it is this brain activation that actually constructs the taste of the wine. The neuroscientist believes the flavour is constructed in the brain but is also impacted by the drinker's emotional connection to the wine as it conjures up memories and emotions.

Factors such as gender, age and even the genetic make-up of saliva can impact how wine tastes, in a term called 'neurogastronomy' which describes how the brain creates the perception of





Exercise - a load of hot water?

RESEARCH at the National Centre of Sport and Exercise Medicine at the University of Loughborough in the UK has concluded that soaking in a hot bath achieves similar health benefits to that of exercise, such as a 30-minute walk or jog.


Dr Steve Faulkner conducted the study in which 14 men cycled for one hour and then soaked in a 40°C bath for the same duration: both activities intended to raise participant's body temperature, allowing the study team to monitor and compare the calories burned between the two tests.

Although cycling was shown to burn more calories, the hot bath burned as many calories as a 30minute walk, which is around 140 calories.

Dr Faulkner told UK charity The Conversation that "Many cultures swear by the benefits of a hot bath, but only recently has science began to understand how passive heating (as opposed to getting hot and sweaty from exercise) improves health."



Type 2 diabetes



SPECIALIST: Doctor Luis Perez Belmonte.

I'M a 50-year-old woman who has just been diagnosed with type 2 diabetes. I'm a little overweight but have never eaten many sweets. Can I do anything to fix it or will I need insulin?

Diabetes is a chronic illness which overweight and obese people are more likely to develop, regardless of how many sweets or cakes they eat. Usually it can be kept under control with pills, daily exercise and diet and insulin is kept for the most severe cases.

- So will I be on a diet for the rest of my life?

Yes, in that you will have to learn to follow a correct. balanced diet as this is an important part of treating diabetes.

- Will I have to stop drinking alcohol too?

You can drink without overdoing it. Two glasses of beer or wine (preferably red) are fine but stronger drinks should be left for special occasions.

- I've heard it's hereditary. Will my children get it too?

There is indeed an inherited genetic predisposition, vet weight is a more important factor. It's very rare for people who aren't overweight to develop this type of diabetes.

- I've heard diabetes can lead to other health problems. What are they and

how can I avoid them?

Type 2 diabetes is a chronic illness which can cause inflammation of the arteries. This can lead to eyesight problems, kidney problems, affect nerves and increase the risk of heart attacks and strokes. The best way to reduce these risks is to keep up treatments, diet and exercise to keep your diabetes under control.

You should also stop smoking and keep an eye on your cholesterol and blood pressure levels.

A specialist in internal medicine can help you control all these factors

- I didn't notice any symptoms before my diagnosis. Are there any warning signs?

Diabetes is tricky as there are often no symptoms initially. When they do appear they can range from a dry mouth, extreme tiredness. frequent urination and frequent infections to those of complications such as a heart attack or stroke.

If you have any symptoms something is amiss you should consult your specialist in internal medi-



The port's sailing and paddle surfing school will lead children to clean plastic off nearby beaches. There will be educational workshops in the port and informational tents at the Palma Aquarium.


The event will also showcase three sculptures made ourt of recycled plastics.

ON'T GET ME WRONG! I'm not accusing beer drinkers of being 'dirty'! We are actually talking about the beer itself. I am not a beer drinker as such, but admit in the summer to be able to sink a couple of draught



On the few occasions that I have ventured back to the UK the first thing that my dear late father and I would do was to go to a local country pub where he would have a small 'boy's beer' - obviously the least potent on offer, normally a pale ale type beverage!! - and I would go for one of the highly popular selections of real ales now in abundance especially in the South West of England.

Two pints of that - in a mug not a sleever - and that would be my craving for 'English Beer' satisfied and would probably be my last visit to a pub that trip!

But a recent report discovers the following little known facts that have further fuelled the 'North-South' divide!!

Pubs in the city of Bath serve the least clean beer in the UK, while the South West is the worst region for unclean beer lines (with 40 per cent of lines unclean).



Meanwhile, Newcastle and Warrington are where the cleanest beer can be found, with the North East the cleanest region with only 27 per cent of beer lines adjudged to

These bombshell findings came into the public arena thanks to the findings of the Beer Quality Report 2017. Apparently, researched by that internet of things provider Vianet, that monitors the flow of beer through lines in pubs across the country, together with beer quality accreditation and training firm, Cask Mar-

Any bar man/pub landlord should know that the cleaning of pipes and equipment should take place every seven days.

As a trainee in the UK we had to clean pipes after the weekend which was done on a Monday morning by the staff. Over here the cleaning is undertaken by the suppliers of which ever beer that the establishment uses. Obvious the light beer/ lager style that we serve in Spain does not create as much grime as a real ale, so greater care has to be given to the great British beer!!

> Whichever way you like to drink it - you pays your money and makes your choice.

The report found while beer may be substantially more expensive in the South - in some cases almost £1 a pint more quality can be substantially lower. Another fact that confirms what many visitors coming to the UK unaccustomed to Britain's Real Ale Drinking Culture know, is in many cases the beer is served too warm.

In other findings, one in four pubs were found to have major temperature issues with 6 per cent of all pints served too warm with the West Midlands most likely to keep their beer at the right temperature and Scotland was the region with the highest percentage of beer served too warm! Well I suppose it's cold enough at the best of times north of the bor-

The story of Drouin Calvados started around 1960. Apart from a love of good food and fine wine, there was nothing to suggest that Christian Drouin the elder, an industrialist from Rouen, was destined for a career in spirits. Despite this, he purchased a farm in Gonneville with one aim - to produce the very best spirit he could from the cider apple orchards. Fast forward almost 60 years and his Calvados' are now some of the most sought after and awarded in the world with the 1989 being the pick of the bunch.

For a Calvados to be classified as 'Pays d'Auge,' it must adhere to various rules, including being double distilled and being aged for a minimum of two years in oak barrels. It is also limited in the production area to the east end of the department of Calvados between Caen and Rouen. Due to this permitted delimited area, production and availability is always limited. However, that hasn't stopped it picking up the award for 'The World's Best Calvados' at the recent World Drinks Awards which is amongst the most coveted awards on the planet. To win this award is to be up there with the greatest achievements that any product can receive. The 1989 Pays d'Auge will now join an elite group of other Calvados' to achieve such heights

Tasting notes: "Restrained on the nose with baked apples and light vanilla notes. Almost lemon zest freshness. Lean and zesty with a sharpness of fruit. Well paired with pastry or crumble based desserts."

THERE'S PLENTY MORE FISH IN THE SEA, as the age old expression goes!! But I never wanted to go out with a fish!! But in reality there is 'something fishy going on in the state of'... well in this case - Norway!

Three fishing areas in the North Sea have seen haddock sustainability downgraded after a fall in stocks but the downgrading of haddock does not apply to any Norwegian fishing grounds. Norway is home to one of the largest haddock stocks in the world, but this is no coincidence. It takes a lot of hard work and a strict quota system to maintain.

Haddock has been on the International Fisheries watch list for many years as it has been overfished from the North Sea and the Atlantic Ocean. With the expansion of fish farming things have taken an upward swing. Thanks to Norway's scientifically managed fisheries, haddock stocks re-

main abundant in Norway's cold, clear waters. Which means Britain's staple Haddock and Chips is not in danger yet! Haddock is the usual fish of choice in Scotland, Yorkshire, other parts of Northern England and many parts of the Midlands. Thanks mainly to our affinity to fish & chips (around 382m portions consumed per annum), the UK is the biggest haddock market in the world, consuming around 120,000 tonnes annually. Only 30 per cent of the haddock we eat is caught from UK waters, therefore there is a constant need to source outside the UK to satisfy demand - 70 per cent comes from the Barents Sea (*)

The Good Fish Guide, published by the Marine Conservation Society states: 'Depending on how and where it's caught, this species ranges from sustainable to unsustainable. Check individual options to make the best choice. Norway's haddock stocks, all of which come from the North East Arctic, are classed as 'good sustainable fish to eat' by

(*) The Barents Sea is a marginal sea of the Arctic Ocean located off the northern coasts of Norway and Russia divided between Norwegian and Russian territorial waters.



New investors flood market

WEALTHY Turks and Arabs are snapping up prime Spanish coastal properties as the political situations in their home countries grow increasingly unstable. Those who can afford it are investing in European real estate and Spain is the number one choice for many.

The numbers are high enough to substantially alter the client profile of foreign buyers, which has been traditionally dominated by northern and western Europeans. Today Saudi Arabians, Emiratis, Russians, and Chinese are vying with Europeans on the investment charts.

Not all are new arrivals. The Russians in particular have faded slightly under the tough new sanctions regime. While the Arabs are old hands on the Costa del Sol and in Barcelona and Madrid, the Turks are an

entirely new contingent still finding their feet.

There is change, however, in the manner of Arab investment. In past decades extremely rich buyers sought property for financial reasons and prestige, using it as another pawn in vast monetary empires, rather than an actual place to live. Today many are building garages and storage facilities, eager to take advantage of leasing opportu-

Neither the Turks, nor the Arabs, offer much direct competition to the Brits. French, Scandinavians and Germans who are typically in the market for more affordable properties used as a summer retreat, or permanent home.

Crop rotation in a vegetable garden

FINDING ways to improve the quality of a vegetable garden is every gardener's aim.

A natural method to improve soil fertility, reduce weed proliferation and assist in keeping pests and disease under control can be simply planning the garden to introduce a crop rotation

It works very well for annual vegetables that you replant every year and should be considered when biannual and perennial plants need replacing.

Crop rotation is not essential if you build up the soil with regular composting after each crop and keep your weeds, pests and diseases under control in other manners, such as intermixing plants of different types in the same beds, but if you prefer the convenience of growing rows or blocks of the same plants together for easier planting out and harvest, it is a very beneficial method.



The principles of crop rotation are that the main plant groups of root vegetables, legumes, nightshade (tomato and potato family), onion family, vines (squash, cucumber, melon families), leafy greens and other types of plants, such as herbs, are planted in groups in different beds and each season they are replaced by a different group of vegetables or

plants so that the plant groups are always rotating to different

If you have enough beds it is also a good idea to include a hed as fallow for a season to rest the soil. I usually don't even water the fallow beds to allow the sun to do its work to sterilise the soil as it remains dried out and inhospitable to most bugs and soil borne dis-

There are different ways to categorise the plant groups and each has its advantages but generally I follow the principles of just making sure that something different is planted each time with consideration of what was planted in previous years to fit as best as possible the idea of having constantly changing plant groups.

Each group of plants for rotation have different nutrient requirements, influence the weeds ability to grow differently, thus reducing the ability of domination by any particular weed, have different pest and disease problems so rotating reduces the build up of soil diseases and pests in the garden

So moving the site for growing vegetables each season changes the ecology of the soil system in a way that supports healthier growth for the next crop than is the case when the same plants are continually planted in the same beds season after season.

Legumes are well known to fix nitrogen in the soil which would benefit green leaf vegetables rotated after the legumes. Research has shown that potatoes grow better after a crop of sweet corn.

When potatoes and tomatoes are grown in the same bed for consecutive years they can lose as much as 40 per cent of production even with the same soil improvements added.

It is therefore worth incorporating this method into the gardens routine of planting to gain maximum benefit with just a little more planning and the application of crop rotation.

Versatile pallets - turn them into planters

PALLETS are very useful in the garden, and can be manipulated into a structure that presents plants and flowers in creative ways.

and even used to build a house. A garden that has a patio with a barbecue would find a free standing, pallet herb garden useful. It is a perfect structure to display herbs and also becomes a

decorative feature.


To start off, it's a good idea to choose a kiln-dried pallet that has had heat and chemical treatment. Then remove three of the horizontal boards from one side. Sand down splinters, rough edges and hammer down all nails.

To create a support for the pallet, scrap wood can be used and if this seems challenging, find a friend who is good at DIY.

To protect the wood, it's a good idea to use some wood stain. Finally, take some fabric weed barrier and cut into shape, stapling it into shape between the pallet boards and then fill the pockets with herbs.

The pallet herb planter provides storage for herbs and a stunning display in the garden.





Dog food secrets

DOG foods vary in quality and so do the companies that make them. For some companies quality is only a word, for others, it's a way of life.

Ultimately, the quality of a dog food is best measured by your dog. Evidence of this shows in how your dog performs on the food, and how he looks, feels and acts. At least 30 per cent of my clients, report an improvement in behaviour when they change their food.

Not all dogs do well on a particular brand of food; some dogs simply do better than oth-

Most foods are categorised as economy, regular, premium, super premium and performance. Regular and premium foods are not formulated like a super premium or performance food.

Dogs have simple stomachs and short digestive tracts for digesting meat. They also lack the saliva enzyme amylase. which is necessary for pre-digesting starch.

Dogs have adapted to foods with high vegetable protein levels, however they perform better when fed foods high in meat protein and animal fats.

When checking the label of a super premium or performance food, an animal protein will be listed as the first or second major ingredient. At least two sources of fat or oil should be included for adequate energy and essential fatty acids.

Animal fat contains essential and non-essential fatty acids as well as providing an easily metabolised energy source. Generally, poultry, turkey or chicken fat are higher in quality because they have more unsaturated fatty acids and are more digestible than animal tallow.

Vegetable oils, such as soybean oil, wheat germ oil, sesame seed oil or linseed oil all contain high levels of linoleic acid, an essential fatty acid for dogs. These should be combined with animal fats for the best results for a glossy coat and soft pliable skin.

Carbohydrates are the third most important nutrient and ingredient class in modern super premium and performance foods. Simple carbohydrates in dog food come from quality sources like rice, oatmeal, corn or wheat.

Fibre, a complex carbohydrate is essential for proper digestion and stool formation. Beet pulp and tomato promace are both high in fibre. Other sources of fibre include rice, soy hulls, oat hulls, wheat bran and peanut hulls. All these come from the external portion of the seed coat. These sources except peanut hulls have microscopic sharp edges, which can cause small cuts in the intestine. This reduces the intestine's effectiveness in nutrient diges-

Peanut hulls on the other hand, have the potential of being contaminated with aflatoxins and should never be used in a quality dog or cat food.

Vitamin and mineral fortification is an absolute necessity and while they make up less than 2 per cent of the total food by weight, they provide some of the most crucial nutrients. These include 12 to 16 vitamins and 15 to 25 minerals, with more micro nutrients than major ingredients.

MAZDA'S MX-5 RF is the latest winner of one of the world's top design awards. The styish two-seater retractable won the Red Dot: Best of the Best 2017 prize for its visionary design, hailed as a perfect blend of beauty, practicability, and quality.

It's the second time the Japanese brand, which has gone from strength to strength since ending its partnership with Ford, has won the award. The fourth generation MX-5 soft top achieved the same honour in 2015.

The RF is lightweight, fun to drive and can easily back up its claim to be the best roadster in history, design experts claimed. It was selected by a panel of 39 mechanics, design professors and journalists who scoured 5,500 entries, making a shortlist of 102 finalists.

Record UK car sales

CAR sale records were smashed in the UK as British drivers rushed to escape hefty new environmental taxes imposed on all new car purchases from April 1.

Now only cars with absolutely zero emissions are exempt from the punitive tax that previously affected gas-guzzlers but not the average vehicle.

The annual tax now stands at £140 (€164) for standard cars. Though surely not the sole reason, the increase precipitated a huge volume of sales in March as 562,337 new cars were registered more than in January and February combined. In 2016 a record 2.7 million cars were sold.

March's best seller was the evergreen Ford Fiesta which shifted 25,428 units, significantly more than the Focus at 17,119. Volkswagen, Vauxhall and Nissan are the nation's three other favourite brands.

Suzuki S-Cross SZ5

SUZUKI'S original S-Cross didn't look as sharp or as classy as its main rival, the Nissan Qashqai. But now a new version of the S-Cross is available and Suzuki has addressed those styling issues.

New S-Cross has a bigger, bolder and much more noticeable front end, giving the model greater road presence, and inside there is a softer feel and more classy look to the dashboard and upgraded fabrics for the seats. The revised styling comes together well and widens the market for this type of car, which tends to appeal to more image-conscious buyers.

Under the bonnet, the old 1.6 litre petrol engine has gone, replaced by turbocharged 1.0 or 1.4 litre units, with the smaller one offering less horsepower yet delivering better performance, and with reduced emissions and improved fuel consumption.

The new 1.4 does better still in the pulling power stakes as well as offering 138 hp and a little more economy than the previous 1.6 litre engine. There is also a 1.6 litre 118 hp diesel available, mildly modified from last time and with slightly improved emissions. It produces combined fuel economy of 24.3 kpl (68.8 mpg). Four wheel drive is available as an option with all the engines.

S-Cross prices start at €17,583 (£14,999) for a 1.0 litre version that comes with Bluetooth, digital radio, air conditioning, alloy wheels, heated door mirrors and seven airbags.

Mid-range models add satellite navigation, dual zone cli-

mate control, front and rear parking sensors, rear parking camera, rear privacy glass, bigger alloys and LED headlights.

The top-spec S-Cross SZ5 All Grip features extra kit including leather trim, heated front seats, large opening glass sunroof and alloy roof rails among an extensive standard features list. My SZ5 4x4 test model cost € 26,786 (£22,849) and had the 1.4 litre engine and six-speed manual gearbox. The 0-100 kph time is a nippy 10.2 seconds and fuel economy is 17.8 kpl (50.4 mpg).

The cabin is roomy front and rear and the 430 litre boot is a decent size and can be expanded to 875 litres by dropping the rear seats. I found the S-Cross very pleasant to drive - smooth, quiet and responsive, with composed cornering and a comfortable ride. What was especially impressive was its precise light-touch agility making it effortless to drive.

Add that to its attractive new look and Suzuki's excellent reliability record and it is clear the S-Cross is now a strong competitor in the expanding SUV sector.


