Brit holidaymaker killed by drink driver

Heartfelt tributes have flooded in for a British man killed by a driver high on drink and drugs in Magaluf.

Father-of-two Adrian O'Kane was enjoying a stag weekend with friends when he was mowed down by a speeding car at around 3am on Sunday April 23.

The 40-year-old had just flown over from Birmingham where he lived with family and worked on a building site. He had two young daughters and was described as a true gent by his friends, who knew him as Swanny.

Mr O'Kane did not have travel insurance, but a Just Giving page set up to repatriate his body to the UK has seen a terrific response. Organised by Fiona Riordan. the fundraising target was set at £8,000 but at the time of writing the total was well



above £25,000.

The much-loved father died instantly when a car driven by a Palma resident careered into him on Calle Pinada in Punta Ballena, throwing him several feet into the air. Police received several calls about an out-of-control car just moments before the Ford Focus tore down the packed party

Some reports suggested that the driver pleaded with a local taxi driver not to call the police after the horrific incident. The

39-year-old tested positive for alcohol and unspecified drugs before being arrested.

A court denied him bail on Monday (April 24) and he is expected to be charged with manslaughter and dangerous driving while under the influ-

It was the second time in less than a week that a British tourist was killed on Mallorca by a driver high on alcohol and drugs. Cycling safety campaigner Bryan Stout, 86, died in Alcudia on April 18 in the middle of a month-long bike tour of the island. See page 5 for more.

POLITICIANS have once again caused the King of Spain's state visit to the UK to be postponed.


The planned June visit by King Felipe VI and his wife Queen Letizia has been rescheduled to avoid clashing with the snap General Election called by Prime Minister Theresa May.

Buckingham Palace said in a statement: "Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and His Majesty King Felipe VI of Spain have agreed that, in light of the General Election, the planned State Visit to the United Kingdom from June 6 to 8 by King Felipe and Queen Letizia should be postponed. The visit will now take place from July 12 to

The rejig came after Spain's foreign minister, Alfonso Dastis, indicated that the country would not find it appropriate for the visit to go ahead during an election campaign.

This is the second time in just over 12 months that politicians have been responsible for a state visit cancellation, as the King was supposed to visit in March last year.

On that occasion, the visit was axed due to political uncertainty in Spain, after a spate of inconclusive General Elections soured by bickering and



failed deals left the country without a

King Felipe's UK state visit will be

the first by a Spanish monarch since that of King Juan Carlos and Queen Sofia in 1986.

Princess backs down

INFANTA CRISTINA of Spain will not appeal the judgement in the Noos case, the infamous corruption trial which took place in Palma last year. The princess, who is sister to King Felipe VI, was acquitted of criminal charges but ordered to pay €265,000, money she accrued through her husband's illegal dealings.

It had been expected the disgraced princess, who was stripped of her dukedom by her furious brother, would attempt to fully clear her name. Instead she appears to be trying to put the case behind her.

Cristina's husband Inaki Urdangarin was found guilty of conspiring with former Balearic president Jaume Matas to embezzle around €6 million of public funds destined for sporting events. Urdangarin is serving six years but plans to appeal.

Taxi driver troubles carry on

NO matter how many meetings occur between representatives of the taxi drivers and local authorities the protests

One union is still opposed to the new bus services to be introduced on two routes from resorts to the airport in a few days and two more will follow in June.

None of these are non-stop routes and will take in a number of different resorts with prices ranging from € 5 to € 12 which has angered the remaining union despite the fact that the council has made some major concessions of the routes.

Timetables are due to be made available on www.tib.org and it is expected that if the routes prove popular (with an expected 330,000 during the summer) then the service will continue in the winter but with fewer buses running.

In the meantime, other drivers are expected to participate in a nationwide protest against what they say are the wholesale granting of licences for private hire which they fear will open the market to companies such as Uber.

New species

A NEW species of fish has been discovered in the waters around Mallorca.

A joint team from the Rijeka Natural History Museum in Croatia, the Balearic Oceanographic Centre (BOC) and the Bayarian State Zoological Collection discovered the species, which belongs to the goby family.

It was captured during several research missions led by the Spanish Oceanographic Institute, which studied the aquatic fauna found around the island. The fish has been named Buenia massutii in honour of Enric Massuti, a BOC researcher.

It grows to just three centimetres long and appeared in samples collected at a depth of 50-70 metres where the seabed is composed of deep sand on top of which grow beds of red algae which provides cover for the fish.

People power fighting pollution

TRANQUIL hamlets and villages across Mallorca are already planning to thwart the invasion of thousands of tourist cars over summer. Last year Deia sneakily managed to block countless cars at the gates of the village by trapping them outside with emergency traffic lights.

Other places took note and soon there were judicious traffic control measures sprouting up in Valldemossa, Esporles and Soller. This year promises more of the same, only with the backing of the Balearic government.

Tourism minister Biel Barcelo praised the creative traffic mischief and said similar schemes are working wonders on Ibiza and Minorca. EU laws dictate you can't restrict the free movement of people, he said, but there's nothing in the law about restricting cars

Fed up residents who deal with car fumes blighting the fresh air are now demanding limits on the number of cars allowed into villages on a given day. In Es Trenc they have reduced the number of parking spaces from 4,000 to 1,500.

Postscript to ponder

The number of lifts per 1,000 Spanish citizens, placing the country at the top of the global ranking, owing to the fact that 65 per cent of the population live in apartments, the most in Europe.

Spain shows WhatsApp

SPAIN'S National Police triggered an international investigation into a paedophile network using WhatsApp to distribute images of child pornography; leading to the arrest of 39 suspects.

The force discovered dark web sites directing users to private WhatsApp groups used to share illicit images. Arrests in Europe and South America followed after action involving Europol and Interpol. Searches of homes led to the seizure of hundreds of devices containing images of child sexual exploitation.

Rajoy star witness

PRIME MINISTER Mariano Rajoy will have to appear as a witness in the ongoing Gurtel corruption trial, the huge investigation into 'kickbacksfor-contracts' that has plagued the Spanish leader's Partido Popular.

Rajoy was general secretary of the PP while Luis Barcenas, who is accused of running a massive slush fund and squirreling away millions of Euros in tax havens, was treasurer.

Power surge

PEOPLE in Catalonia want greater powers for the region rather than independence from Spain, new opinion polls suggest.

The results indicate 46 per cent of Catalans would support remaining within Spain if the region was granted new and guaranteed exclusive powers. This and the 19 per cent said to be against independence is seen as weakening the case for the region to go it

The poll is said to show pro-independence leaders have misjudged the



Postcard from San Juan de la Pena



THE religious complex of San Juan de la Pena, a medieval mountainside monastery in Aragon, is once said to have sheltered the Holy Grail.

Part of the community of Santa Cruz de la Seros, the spectacular site is around 90km from the provincial capital of Huesca.

Legend is that the chalice used at the Last Supper was sent to the monastery for protection and to prevent it being captured by Moorish invaders. It is said Alfonso V of Aragon presented the cup to Valencia Cathedral in 1438.

One of the most important monasteries in Aragon and within the Pyrenees; it is partially carved into a cliff face that overhangs the buildings; the name translates as 'Saint John of the Cliff.

The original monastery was built in 920, devastated by fire in 1675, but then restored, with the older parts declared a national monument in 1889.

In the 11th century the monastery became part of the Benedictine Order, and it is believed to have been the first monastery in Spain to have used the Latin Mass.

The cloister was built around 1190 and features biblical scenes.

The second floor of the monastery contains a royal pantheon of kings of Aragon and Navarre; and is a final resting

Modern marble and stucco work recalls historic battles and were added during in the time of Charles III of Spain; around 1770.

Police protest

BAYERN MUNICH has accused Spanish police of 'violent attacks' on supporters during its Champions League defeat at Real Madrid at the Santiago Bernabeu.

The club filed an official complaint to UEFA saying riot police actions were "completely misplaced and excessive" and demanded an explanation. Witnesses claimed police stormed the visitors' section to remove a banner and Bayern fans retaliated; there were some 4,500 at the

Big Foot

SCIENTISTS say a fossilised footprint discovered in the north eastern Pyrenees in Spain was left by a previously unknown species up to 248 million years ago.

The print was amongst other tracks made by the ancestors of crocodiles and dinosaurs, a group known as archosauromorphs – and the reptile looked like a crocodile but had wider legs and measured 1.5 metres long.

MORE than half of Spaniards continue to believe homeopathy remedies work and have a basis in science.

In a survey by the Spanish Federation for Science and Technology (Fecyt) 6,300 people were asked if they believed Homeopathic products work.

Despite a lack of scientific evidence to support the curative properties; more than half of the sample group believed the remedies could make a difference.

Sad irony of Brit's death

THE British cyclist killed on Mallorca by a drunk and drugged up driver was a well known campaigner for cyclist safety in the UK. It is an ironic twist to the tragic passing of Bryan Stout, who was hit from behind while cycling peacefully, and perfectly legally in Port d'Alcudia.

An outpouring of praise and respect for the 86-yearold has been expressed in cvcling communities across the UK following his death. Stout was a member of Stop Killing Cyclists and was on a month-long biking holiday to Mallorca when he was killed by a local man on April 18.

The 48-year-old driver tested positive for alcohol and cocaine. He fought with police and claims to have been grieving the death of his mother the day before. Mr Stout died at the scene from his injuries.

Air disaster averted

A FEARLESS flight attendant helped land a plane carrying 195 passengers from Hannover to Palma after the co-pilot suddenly fell ill. The cool headed stewardess played an essential role in preventing disaster, working with the captain to safely land the plane at Son Sant Joan.

The facts have now been released by German investigators. The near escape occurred on October 11, 2016 while the aircraft, a Boeing 737-800, was still in French airspace.

A sudden onset of low blood pressure at around 5.30am caused the co-pilot to pass out. Descent to Mallorca had just begun and the captain called in the flight attendant to help guide the manoeuver.

The plane landed smoothly in Palma, with passengers on the Tuifly flight none the wiser.

Still disenfranchised

ON more than one occasion Theresa May said she would not call an early election, but she now believes she can defeat Labour.

MOUNTAIN rescue experts warned that there are simply not enough troops or medics to cope with the huge number of high altitude accidents which occur each year on Mallorca.

The Guardia Civil has its own specialist Mountain Rescue and Intervention Group (GREIM). Di-

Rescue danger warning

rector Pere Perello has admitted that his men are overwhelmed by the sheer volume of accidents they

Last year GREIM agents worked with firefighters to intervene in 156 rescue operations, al-

makes them the busiest mountain rescue force in all of Spain, carrying out even more rescues than units in the Pyrenees.

This year is shaping up to be even busier with 40 rescues already taking place. Four people have died on Mallorca's mountains since January. With spring arriving and millions set to hike, swim, climb and cave dive over the coming months, GREIM is concerned that it doesn't have the

manpower to properly do its job.

The vast majority of incidents are concentrated around summer weekends, meaning there can be four or five a day. Some are mild. involving twisted ankles or disorientated tourists. But others, including frequent heart attacks and falls, require substantial rescue operations, often in difficult loca-

Five evil fraudsters face jail

TWO university professors accused of fleecing desperate families out of their life savings selling scam 'miracle' drugs will not be charged with crimes against public health. Investigators found that the supposed cancer and Alzheimer's cures are harmless and therefore posed no threat to the victims or general public.

The prosecution will instead focus on claims that the experimental drugs allegedly punted by Pablo Escriba, Xavier Busquets and three others, were fraudulently marketed as miracle drugs. They are accused of selling the useless pharmaceuticals to desperate sufferers and their families at an enormous mark up, pocketing more than \leq 600,000 profit.

State lawyers are developing a case to prove that the University of the Balearics professors were instrumental members of a large scale, long-term and sophisticated scam terrifying clueless patients into paying huge sums for the drugs.

Some individuals paid as much as €25,000 for small batches.

The five accused who. as EWN reported, were arrested in early April, have reportedly exercised their right to silence. If found guilty of aggravated fraud they each face between six and eight years in prison.

Brexit likely to decide General Election

AS the various political parties gear up to campaign for the General Election, Brexit will form an important platform for each of them.

Currently, opinion polls which have been notoriously inaccurate over the past few years indicate that the Conservatives are gaining ground in both Scotland and Wales with potential losses for the SNP in Scotland and Labour in Wales.

SNP leader Nicola Sturgeon has come out, suggesting that the calling of the snap election was a cynical ploy by the government to be re-elected prior to the prosecution of current Tory MPs for election irregularities although this is denied by the party which accepts that its 'battle bus' is being investigated.

The Lib Dems are appealing to



Bremainers and promise to run a second referendum if they are elected and many 'big names'

such as Nick Clegg, Vince Cable and Ed Davey, who lost their seats in the last election, are expected to stand again with a much better chance of getting back into parlia-

> Labour in the meantime had been accused of not knowing what to do but its shadow Brexit Sir Keir Starmer has confirmed that if elected it would honour the referendum result but would effectively scrap the government's current Brexit plans and focus on protecting the rights of EU residents as well as British passport holders in the EU.

The Labour party clearly recognises that those areas in the Midlands and the North of England which voted to leave the EU are vulnerable to a Conservative party which is determined to take Britain out of the EU and is trying to maintain its traditional blue collar support.

UKIP in the meantime is planning to ban the burka and full face covering in the event that it comes into power. However, more importantly, in real terms the party has indicated that it will not field candidates in marginal areas where the sitting MP is known to be strongly pro-Brexit.

Both major parties united in support

THE next six weeks will see plenty of bitter rhetoric and fights between political parties but little in the way of Brexit progress.

Even though the current Conservative government seems likely to return to power, possibly with an increased majority, it is highly unlikely that there will be any headway in negotiations with the European Union until the result of the General Election is

What is almost certain however is that unless the Lib Dems surprise everyone and are elected as the next government, Brexit will go ahead and the only question will be whether it is negotiated by Mrs May or Mr Corbyn as Labour will not ignore the will of the referendum.

EVEN cycling is contributing to environmental devastation on Mallorca according to local activists.

Two major ecological groups have denounced the Mallorca 312 cycling tour, accusing organisers of making the island their own personal velodrome.

On Saturday April 29 almost 7,000 cyclists will begin a 300km route that encompasses almost the entire northern half of Mallorca, passing through Pollensa, Andratx, Sa Pobla and Arta.

GOB, the Balearics most

ride ahead of residents daily needs. They are joined by Ter-

raferida, activists who regularly expose environmental crimes on the islands. Both accuse the 312 tour of helping convert Mallorca into an 'island hotel.' Together they will launch a new social media campaign fighting back against this and any future mass cycling frenzies with the hashtag #HotelMallorca.

Critics have argued that cyclists are generally far more environmentally conscious travellers than the regular summer hordes and

should be welcomed rather than protested.

But Terreferida claims its real battle is against the conversion of Mallorca into a giant amusement park, regardless of who the tourists are. There is also anger that Mallorca 312 will donate €2 for every registered cyclist to UNICEF, rather than to helping repopulate trees in the Tramuntanas, as is usually the case.

Sterling has the best result

EUR weekly currency update

In view of the potentially worrying developments over the last fortnight investors have been remarkably sanguine in their attitude to risk. North Korea, Syria and Ukraine are just three of the areas investors are refusing to worry about.

They were positively joyful when the British prime minister announced a general election at short notice, even though they can have no idea what she intends to do, Brexitwise, with her presumably increased majority. Over the two weeks the euro strengthened by two thirds of a US cent and lost two and a quarter cents to the charging pound.

There is a degree of unease about this weekend's first round of voting in the French presidential election. It is possible that two anti-euro candidates - Jean-Luc Mélenchon and Marine Le Pen - could survive to fight it out in round two. Were that to happen the euro would likely come under pressure.

USD weekly currency update

Although the US dollar had a better fortnight than its northern neighbour it did not do particularly well, losing two thirds of a cent to the euro and three and a quarter cents to sterling. It was not that investors became suddenly concerned about the US economy, more that they struggled to be enthusiastic about it. Jobs, inflation and re-

tail sales data all failed to meet expectations. The White House is still banging the drum about tax cuts but, after the fiasco of the health care bill, the market will believe them when it sees

Sterling had its best result in ages after the British prime minister called an early general election. Investors are not quite sure what she will do with her perceived increased majority in the Commons but they are hopeful that it will strengthen her hand in the Brexit negotiations.

CAD weekly currency update

The shape of the Loonie's movement over the last two weeks bore a striking similarity to the direction oil prices were taking; initially higher then lower. It was the weakest among the major currencies losing half a US cent and falling by five and a quarter cents against the resurgent pound. The Canadian economic data looked reasonable enough, though the Bank of Canada governor did not wholly agree. One Canadian economist described Stephen Poloz as having a 'cup half empty view of the economy.

Sterling leapt ahead after the British prime minister called a general election at short notice. Investors expect her to win a much-increased majority. That, in turn, should give her more clout in the Brexit negotiations and so allow her to secure a better deal than she would otherwise

have been able to achieve. At worst, a bigger majority would banish any fears of a government defeat in the Commons.

AUD weekly currency update

For the Aussie the two most striking moves were the way it strengthened last Thursday and weakened a couple of days later. The upward move was prompted by an unexpectedly strong set of Australian employment figures. The subsequent decline, which gave back most of the gain, came ironically after the Reserve Bank of Australia expressed concern about the labour market. Over the fortnight the Aussie was unchanged against the US dollar and it lost four and a half cents to sterling.

The an average gain of 2%

over the two weeks - came after the British prime minister called an early general election. Investors believe she will win comfortably with a commanding majority in the Commons. It will strengthen her hand in the forthcoming Brexit negotiations and so, they hope, allow her to come away from Brussels with a better deal.

NZD weekly currency update

The NZ dollar performed slightly better than the other commodity-oriented currencies, all of which were hampered by mostly lower energy and commodity prices. It added a quarter of a US cent and lost four cents to the pound. The few NZ ecostats were generally helpful to the Kiwi: private sector businesses were more upbeat, milk prices moved higher and inflation accelerated from 1.3% to 2.2% in the first quarter

The pound shot higher when Theresa May called an early general election. The assumption is that she will win a much-enhanced majority in the commons, neutralising the threat of opposition from within her own party and from the Opposition itself. With her hand strengthened in parliament investors hope she will be able to come away from the forthcoming Brexit negotiations with a better deal than she might otherwise have been able to secure.





Special treatment Private firms taking over for new alliance

A NEW lobby fighting for the rights of European islands will emerge from the Smart Island World Congress held in Magaluf. With the support of the EU secretary of state, Jorge Toledo, the new alliance will demand special treatment for the unique economies and habitats of the continents' islands.

More than 1,000 delegates from islands around the planet gathered in Magaluf for the conference, the first of its kind.

They discussed sustainability, tourism, connectivity, food supply and other challenges unique to island residents.

European representatives agreed to form a common front to lobby the EU for special needs, much as oil producing countries or agricultural companies do on a daily basis.

Toledo noted that 15 million Europeans today live on islands and contribute 3 per cent of the EU's total GDP. Presumably

The decision harks back to moves made last year to establish a western Med island union with Mallorca, Corsica and Sardinia. An agreement was signed in Palma to establish a united front in dealing with EU regulations on fishing and other topics with a profound impact on island economies.

THE Spanish government has pulled out of the consortium formed to modernise the Playa de Palma. National tourism secretary Matilde Asian broke the news in Santa Ponsa, saying that state treasurers couldn't justify the expense.

The consortium was set up 10 years ago to pool public and private investment in transforming the iconic seafront into a stylish promenade befitting of the new cosmopolitan Palma.

Almost all of the public funding has now been withdrawn. Private enterprises, especially hotels have stepped in to fill the void and undoubtedly shape Palma according to their own

Calvia's latest urban planning initiative talks boldly of parks, pedestrians, bike lanes, beach connections and massively reduced traffic.

IMF comments Bare metal on Spain growth



SPANISH ECONOMY: Was discussed by IMF.

DURING an International Monetary Fund (IMF) briefing on the April World Economic Outlook, much mention was made of the Spanish economy.

It was suggested by a member of the invited audience that one possible reason for the recent growth in the Spanish economy was thanks to the increasing inequality of wages, the decline of collective agreements and the weakening of the trade unions.

Responding on behalf of the IMF, Gian Maria Milesi-Ferretti gave some historical insight for the reasons of the sudden decline in the economy and acknowledged that wage inequality was bound to become a factor as unemployment grew so

Spain has suffered from the fact that as part of the eurozone it has been unable to benefit from the usual advantages of declining exchange rates when the economy was bad and therefore the only way to regain competitiveness was to see wages decline.

As the economy continues to recover, so he believed that inequality would shrink, but one of the ongoing problems in Spain is the fact of the volume of seasonal work.

House prices on the up

SPANISH bank BBVA has released a fairly upbeat report on the property market and forecasts overall price rises of 2.5 per cent in 2017.

Perhaps not a huge amount but certainly positive if you are a seller and unlikely to put off those who want to purchase a property in Spain.

Not only does the bank see a likely increase in prices but it expects a significant increase in the number of transactions around the country with an uplift of some 7 per cent to nearly 500,000 sales during the year.

In support of this view, a second report, this time by property valuers Tinsa has already seen an overall increase of 1.8 per cent in prices for the first guarter of 2017.

Despite restrictions oil price remains volatile



INTERNATIONAL oil prices are currently quite erratic due to mixed messages from suppliers.

The Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) has indicated that it intends to continue to restrict production in order to force prices of crude oil up, but there have been as

many drops in the wholesale price as rises in the past few weeks.

All eyes are now on the OPEC conference to be held on May 25 to which non-OPEC members will be invited to agree continued cuts in supply, but with plenty of US shale oil being made available, their efforts may well

Iran has benefited from the removal of international export restrictions and has assisted in keeping prices down with its large scale exports in a bid to bolster its economy, but prices of fuel in Spain appear to have drifted upwards rather than stabilise.

One 'ghost' airport may see life

SPAIN has a reputation for building regional airports which never open but now it appears that Corvera in Murcia might just.

At the time that work started on the airport in 2008, it appeared that by the time it opened in 2013 it would be able to take over all of the internal flights from San Javier airport which is limited by the fact that it is shared with the Spanish Air Force.

All seemed to be going to plan and an agreement was reached with a management company to allow for the opening and at the same time, negotiations commenced with international airlines who were interested in operating new European routes.

Unfortunately, nothing was completed and the government of Murcia was forced to cancel the contract with the intended management company due to the fact that they did not comply with

Whilst this is the matter of a legal dispute, the government has decided to issue a new tender inviting bids to manage the renamed Region de Murcia International Airport which will need

According to the call for tender, those who are interested will have until early May to register for the opportunity to obtain a franchise to run the entire airport for 25 years, but they will be required to submit a bond in the sum of €9.917.752 in order to establish their

seriousness and financial worth.

The local government believes that there is a need for this airport which has the ability to handle hundreds of thousands of passengers each year through its single terminal and that over a period of four years it would generate €1 billion in income through taxes and handling fees and create

20,000 jobs for the region.

Anyone who takes on the project will be required to pay a number of fees to the government and apart from leasing costs it will make a payment for each passenger who travels through the airport, although as passenger number increase so the individual fee will

New green taxes being introduced

AS Britain prepares to penalise drivers of diesel cars entering into polluted cities, the EU continues to encourage 'green taxes.'

A report based on 2015 data compiled by the Institute for Economic Studies compares the percentage of such taxes collected by all member states and shows that a number of the most successful economies such as France and Germany are below the EU average of 6.8 per cent.

Spain sits relatively comfortably at 5.6 per cent but has already announced that it will be introducing new 'green taxes' which should raise income and combat some environmental prob-

Safer credit cards

WITH banks and consumers around the world worried about credit card fraud, MasterCard has unveiled a new safer card.

After trialling the concept in South Africa it has announced that it will be introducing a new style of card which includes a fingerprint sensor whereby users hold their fingers over the sensor whilst making a payment.

It is not completely fool proof as fingerprints can be removed from glass objects, but it is believed to be much safer than the current pin and chip cards currently in

This is believed to be the first card of its type that does not require a separate fingerprint sensor but there is one drawback as it can only be used for 'in-store' purchases and gives no additional safety for online transactions.

The card should find its way into Spain as it is rolled out throughout Europe, but retailers will need to obtain adapted card read-

Hundreds of jobs saved in Avila

FOR 60 years, there has been vehicle production in Avila but in September 2019 this will all come to an end.

Unable to justify the cost of converting the NT500 truck engine to meet new European Union regulations, Nissan Spain announced in February of this year that it would discontinue that model and that it was also reviewing the future of the factory as the NT400 was due to be discontinued in 2019.

There appeared to be every likelihood that the eventual decision would sound a death knell for the Avila plant, but

the president of the Renault-Nissan Alliance in Spain, José Vicente de los Mozos has announced that the factory will remain open protecting the 471 workers currently employed there.

The NT500 will be phased out but the company has, after discussions with the Junta de Castilla y Leon, agreed to invest €40 million in retooling the factory so that it can produce spare parts for Al-

The involvement of the Junta was important as there will be a need to build a stamping plant and to expand the overall size of the facility, so in principle planning permission was vital but with assurances from the authorities, the jobs and the factory are now safe.

This will mean that those who are currently employed will have to enter into new work agreements with the company, but it is likely that they will be no worse than those entered into by workers in other Alliance factories in

Production of the NT400 will cease as planned in 2019 and it is expected that by 2020, the new facility will be producing 80,000 spare parts per month of which 70 per cent will be for Renault cars and the balance for Nissan.

I am grumpy this week!



AS I've said many times I love living in Spain but there are still some things here that I don't think you could get away with living in the UK.

I've found out this week that along the paseo where we like to go to walk the dog and have a coffee, the town hall has said that over the next few years every cafe, bar and restaurant has to change their frontage to have raised wooden floors, glass curtain style fronts and different seating areas outside. I'm not saying it won't look nice but, me for one, I actually like the rough and ready looking tapas bars and the little family-owned cafes that I have been visiting for years. It's something that happens a lot here that you are forced to do things with no consideration to the expense involved.

I had a shop in the square in Fuengirola buying and selling gold and jewellery. Some of you might remember it. It was called the Old Gold Company. When we opened it we had to jump through hoops to get the four or five licences you needed just to get going. We had to do so much paperwork just to buy a single item it was crazy. But then it seemed that every week they changed the rules. In the end it was getting impossible to actually abide by all the regulations.

One, for instance, was that you couldn't buy broken jewellery. How crazy is that? Much of the time people wanted to sell us stuff that was broken and which couldn't be repaired but which, as it was gold, had scrap value. Sometimes the value was even more than when the item was new because, at that time, gold prices were rocketing. People in the UK who were doing the same thing laughed at me when I told them about all the Spanish red tape.

Another thing that happened recently was that we had some work done on our pools where we live and, to be honest, we were conned. (Mrs S wasn't President then) We called the company back to tell them there were some problems with the work and they just looked at us like we were mad. They did the 'shrug' and told us the bits that had gone wrong was nothing to do with them it was some other reason blah, blah, blah and they were absolutely not interested in doing anything about it. Denounce them, you might say. Everybody throws that word around like it's some kind of magic wand. Have you ever tried it? It's not that easy to get any type of result.

The UK system of the county or high courts was much better and didn't take the years that it takes to get things done through the legal system here. Needless to say we just had to leave it because here everybody knows the system of not paying if you don't want to.

Smart roundabouts

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



RAMP METERING: Could restrict access when traffic is too busy on roundabouts.

ROUNDABOUTS are often a cause of consternation for many drivers. But despite them causing confusion and dread to some, they provide a unique way of allowing traffic to flow freely through road intersections. However, when the volume of traffic is high, congestion can result which can end up in big traffic jams with no vehicles able to move.

Now, researchers from the Politecnica University of Valencia (UPV) have come up with what they think is a revolutionary system of implanting sensors in the road to ease congestion. These sensors would detect the passage of vehicles and determine when the volume of traffic was very high. At this point, they would then activate traffic lights to slow down vehicles on approach, allowing extra time for those in the area to manoeuvre through the roundabout, and in some cases, stop traffic on quieter roads to allow the con-

gestion to ease. This would then in theory, prevent a situation in which the excessive entry of vehicles causes such a jam that no one is able to move in any direction. The sensor system would allow for normal traffic flow to be restored in a short space of time, managing the troublesome situations in a simple and effective way.

The system used, known as ramp metering, is already used in some countries on access routes to motorways and main roads, restricting access when traffic on the main roads is too busy. Now the team at the UPV believe they can adapt and customise the system so it can be used on roundabouts.

Easter deaths

Figures from the DGT show that a total of 29 people lost their lives in road traffic accidents during the busy Easter weekend. This is a fall of 12 deaths compared to last Easter.

Can they re-assess the value?

In 2015 we purchased a house in Guardamar Del Segura. We paid €85,000, which was entered on the 'escritura.' We paid €3,000 extra for furniture, wardrobes, and white goods. This was not entered on the escritura. Now we have received a notice from Valencia regional tax office to say they want to re-assess the value of the sale. I am told this may be because they think the amount declared in the escritura was too low. Can they do this?

R W (Costa Blanca)

Most of Spain's individual regions have established a list of official property valuations for tax purposes. Have your lawyer consult the Valencian Region list to discover what is the minimum value you can de-



clare for your purchase. You should have done this before you went to the Notary. And,

yes, if the value declared is too low, the tax office can claim tax on the difference. This official list was established because people formerly declared ridiculously low amounts on property sales to minimise transfer tax.







Work and bullying a concern for students

SCHOOL work, anxiety and bullying are the main causes of concern in the life of teenagers. That's the findings from a 'Student's Well-being' study carried out by the OECD (Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development.

The study analysed for the first time students' motivation to perform well in school, their relationships with peers and teachers, their home life, and how they spend their time outside of school. The findings are based on a survey of 540,000 students in 72 participating countries and economies.

The study found that many students are anxious about school work and tests and the analysis reveals this is not related to the number of school hours or the frequency of tests, but with how supportive they feel their teachers and schools are.


On average across OECD countries, 59 per cent of students reported they often worry that taking a test will be difficult, and 66 per cent reported feeling stressed about poor grades. Some 55 per cent of students said they are very anxious for a

test even if they are well prepared.

In all countries, girls reported greater school work-related anxiety than boys.

But teachers and parents can make a difference. Students whose parents reported "spending time just talking to my child," "eating the main meal with my child around a table" or "discussing how well my child is doing at school" regularly were between 22 per cent and 39 per cent more likely to report high levels of life satisfaction. The academic impact is also significant; students who spent time talking with their parents were two-thirds of a school year ahead in science learning.

Bullying was seen as an issue in schools. On average across OECD countries, around 4 per cent of students, roughly one per class, reported that they are hit or pushed at least a few times per month. Bullying is low-

How can I protect my eyes from allergies this spring?

habilitative Training (EX-PERT) is a digital instrument that specifies the ideal exercise type, intensity, frequency, and duration needed to prevent a first or repeat cardiovascular event in each user.

"Exercise reduces cardiovascular risk, improves body composition and physical fitness, and lowers mortality and morbidity," said lead author Professor Dominique Hansen, associate professor in exercise physiology and rehabilitation of internal diseases at Hasselt University: "But surveys have shown that many clinicians experience great difficulties in prescribing specific exercise programmes for patients with multiple cardiovascular diseases and

be installed on a laptop or PC and during a consultation, a doctor can input the patient's characteristics and cardiovascular risk factors, their cardiovascular diseases and other chronic conditions, medications, adverse events during exercise testing, and physical fitness.

EXPERT then uses this data to design a personalised exercise programme for the patient.

"This tool is the first of its kind," said Professor Hansen: "It integrates all the international recommendations on exercise to calculate the optimum training programme for an individual patient. It really is personalised medicine."

The next step is to test the impact of EXPERT on patients in a clinical trial.

Figures for Zika are way off the mark

CLAIMS are being made that Puerto Rico is hiding the number of babies born on the island with Zika in a bid to prevent a potential loss in tourism.

According to official data, just 16 Zi-ka-infected children have been delivered since the mosquitoborn illness struck South America last year, but a former US official said this figure could be well off as some 3,300 pregnant women had the virus.

There were 63 Zika births in mainland America out of 1,300 Zika-infected pregnant women.

The former US official said the country is in denial over the problem and in a year or two from now there will be many more babies who aren't learning and developing correctly and all these problems will come to light.

The World Health Organisation declared a global health emergency in February last year due to Zika, and declared it over in mid-November. They said they don't expect a possible vaccine to be available until 2020.

Zika can be particularly dangerous for pregnant women and during the outbreaks last year, women were advised to not get pregnant for six months after travelling to affected countries.

Arthritis care

AROUND 10 million people, including many children, suffer from arthritis in the UK alone. Here, our resident doctor answers some frequently asked questions.

What is arthritis and when does it usually appear?

- Arthritis is the term we give to inflammation of the joints. Not all joint pain has to be arthritis, in fact most joint pain is due to other causes which are not really arthritis.

The reasons it can appear are varied and it can be caused by many things ranging from autoimmune inflammatory conditions, infections, systemic illnesses to trauma etc therefore the moment it appears depends on the type of arthritis. Joint pain can be influenced by weather changes, diet, exercise and other factors meaning it can worsen in the winter.

What are the most common symptoms?

- Arthritis causes joint paint along with swelling in the joints and surrounding areas which can lead to redness, increased temperature, stiffness and is also sometimes related to fevers and a general feeling of being unwell. It can appear in one or more joints and can affect any joint in the body.

How is it diagnosed?

- Diagnosis is initially reached by examining the patient's medical history and listening to a specialist. This is followed by blood tests, x-rays of the affected joint and sometimes analysis of liquid from within the joint although this depends on the

area and whether it is safe to draw off liquid.

Are there any good treatments?

- The usual treatment for arthritis involves resting the joint/s and use of anti-inflammatory medications to reduce the pain. Sometimes the joint can be injected with specific medication and in severe cases surgery is an option.

What about diet?

- Diet is important for almost all ailments. In this case it is of importance especially for those who suffer secondary arthritis due to gout. These patients should avoid products high in uric acid such as red meat, seafood and alcohol.

Is exercise helpful or will that make it worse?

-Exercise should be avoided while the pain is at its worst but added gradually to daily life as swelling reduces.

Is there any way of preventing arthritis before it appears?

- Many forms of arthritis are unavoidable as it is a sign of other problems. Yet those caused by trauma or substance build-up can be avoided by following a healthy, balanced diet, taking moderate daily exercise such as walking to maintain a healthy weight and avoid overstressing joints and keep joint-supporting muscles toned.

palace gardens

THE official residence of the Spanish royal family on Mallorca is now open for public visits. The Marivent Palace gardens are open for free exploration. The government is also working on a schedule of visits and guided tours for the

The spectacular gardens are on a raised cliff overlooking the gorgeous panorama of Cala Major. They cover almost 10,000 square metres, contain dozens of exotic plant species and have seen some illustrious world figures stroll through over the years.

Prince Charles and the late Diana were famously snapped meandering around the gardens, as were the Clintons, Mikhail Gorbachev and Emperor Michiko of Japan.

The palace itself was built

in 1923 for the famous painter Saradakis. His widow donated it to the government in 1966 and it was granted to the royals, who use it as a summer getaway, in 1973.

Opening the Palace to the public was the brainchild of left-wing party Podemos who convinced King Felipe VI that since €1.3 million is spent on maintenance each year, people have a right to explore the grounds.

Almost €400,000 has been spent on adapting the gardens for tourism with signposting, toilets, bins and benches.

From May 1 until July 15, and between September 15 and 30, the gardens will be open from 9am until 8pm. They will be closed in summer when the royals visit for their annual holidays.





TripAdvisor reviews go over 500 million

GOOD FOOD, **GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS** WITH GARRY WAITE

RIPADVISOR HAS RE-LEASED STATISTICS that show that Aqua Shard in London is the UK's most reviewed restaurant, while Park Plaza Westminster Bridge is the most reviewed hotel.

The news came as the customer driven review platform announced that it now has more than 500 million reviews and opinions on its website, and receives 290 pieces of user-generated content every minute of every day.

Aqua Shard, which sits within the 95storey Shard building in Southwark, has received more than 11,000 reviews and sits 737th out of 17.953 restaurants in the capital. Meanwhile Park Plaza Westminster Bridge has received more than 15,000 reviews and is 192nd out of 1.087 hotels in London.

The most reviewed hotel in Spain would appear to be the Hotel Becquer in Sevilla with 3,866 posts. Locally the lovely Hotel Molino de Santo in Benaoian has 1.119.

The most reviewed UK tourist attraction is the London Eve, which has more than 57.000 reviews.

Worldwide, the most reviewed hotel is the Luxor Las Vegas, with 29,000 reviews. The most reviewed restaurant in the world is Pasteis de Belem in Lisbon, with 26,000 reviews, and the most reviewed tourist attraction is the Basili-

> ca of the Sagrada Familia in Barcelona, with more than 107.000 traveller reviews.

Stephen Kaufer, chief executive officer and cofounder of TripAdvisor, said: "Many savvy businesses report seeing incremental increases in the ratings and rankings

on TripAdvisor when they engage with travellers by responding to reviews and using the feedback to improve their customers' experience."

Nonetheless, not all hospitality businesses are happy with the way in which reviews are handled on the site, with some complaining of difficulties having reviews they see as malicious or inaccurate being taken down by the web-

The reply was more like a Chicken or The Egg conundrum!!

Are traditional pubs losing out to trendy bars and restaurants?

WE CONSTANLY HEAR ABOUT the number of British pubs that close in the UK every year. Now the Mayor of London Sadiq Khan has pledged to help halt the decline in the number of pubs in London, as new figures show the city has lost 1,220 pubs since

That's around 80 a year. There have been many studies about why this has been happening but I'm not sure that anyone has studied the 'fashion' element.

Are there more trendy wine bars/pubs meaning the younger crowd are moving away from the traditional pub? Have communities changed? Are country pubs losing their appeal? Is it the fact that some of the established pubs don't serve food? Or maybe the food they serve is poor.

Or of course there simply could be too many pubs for the amount of people. Lon-

don's population is 10 million. Let's assume that three million of those are children - that leaves, say, seven million adults.

Now, obviously, not all these adults go out to drink, but if they did, with 3,615 pubs in the whole of the city that would mean less than 2,000 customers for each pub. I'm not going to carry on with figures, but you see what I mean?

As the article on this page re TripAdvisor tells you there are nearly 18,000 restaurants in London - five times more than there are pubs! And getting a seat in a restaurant in London is a lot harder than finding standing room in a pub. Must tell us something don't you think?

I remember in the early 80's the trend in the cities was to turn banks into modern pubs. Can we think of something else to reduce the population of bankers?

IN MY WINE CORNER this week, I dusted off a bottle of Corral Gran Reserva 1987. From Rioja Alta and made with 80 per cent Tempranillo, 15 per cent Garnacha and 5 per cent Mazuelo, I was pleasantly surprised that it was in very good condition for a 30-year-old wine. Having said that, while it was still pretty good on the nose it would be fair to say it had lost a little of its finesse. Having left a glass in the bottle overnight (I know!!!) it hadn't kept up the next day despite being vacuumed. It certainly wouldn't last much longer in my opinion. So if you've got any, I suggest you start drinking it!!

Taken from my own 'cellar.' I've had it for more than 20 years.

ON THAT NOTE I will bid you farewell until next week and should aspiring restaurateurs need some help or advice, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Celtis australis - the European Hackberry

THE Hackberry or Nettle tree is one of the Mediterranean's hardiest native large trees that you will probably see lining streets and boulevards and standing as a valued specimen in private and public gardens as well as in native forested areas.



They are a very attractive deciduous shade tree of the Elm family with a smooth greyish bark, small leaves, small edible fruit, long lived (to around 500 years), fast growing in good conditions, drought tolerant once established and will grow in most soils in Spain below 1.000 metres.

If you don't have the space to grow a large tree they are also very hardy in containers, tolerating constant pruning to maintain a suitable size.

They are a favourite for bonsai enthusiasts as the trunk develops strongly but can be supported by a few healthy branches with the small leaves giving the good proportions required for a bonsai tree.

In my vegetable garden, I have a large one that is trained, by pruning, to



act as an umbrella to add shade during the middle of the day in summer but allow morning and afternoon sun.

In winter there is enough sun after the tree loses its leaves. The leaves provide a very good addition of mulch

I collect the self sown seedlings to make bonsai trees.

The fruit is edible and can be used to make jams. It was a food source when other food was scarce. Collecting the small berries is a lot of work as they are best when black in colour. They ripen at different times so collecting the best ripe fruit is tedious. Many birds are attracted to the trees when the fruit is ripe.

The flower is insignificant in size, with its main interest being that it doesn't have flower petals.

The seed sprouts very easy to grow new trees, in fact birds spread the seed so young trees can appear throughout the gardens when a tree is fruitful.

Fresh seed needs stratification by exposure to cold to simulate winter conditions, such as storing in a fridge for several weeks, before it will

This follows the natural process of the seeds passing winter in the soil and emerging in spring to grow when conditions are more favourable.

The wood of the Hackberry tree is very useful for making tool handles. walking sticks, whips and items made by wood turning.

The qualities of the wood are that it is flexible without splitting easily.

The roots of the tree give a yellow dye that has been used for colouring silk cloth. The leaves and fruit have been used as remedies for various stomach region problems.

They have few pest and disease problems making them a healthy addition to the garden as they require little corrective maintenance other than pruning of excess branches.

Bougainvillea in all their regalia

THE bougainvillea can be found all over the Mediterranean, but it's not originally from this area. These plants are natives of Brazil, a tropical plant that can grow red or purple flowers.

In 1768, it was named by the French botanist, Dr Philibert Commerson in honour of his ship's Captain Admiral Louis-Antoine de Bougainville and became an official species in the 1980s. English and French breeding nurseries sent these plants all over the world.

There are 14 species, but only three types have cultural importance: glabra, peruviana and spectabilis.

To maintain a bougainvillea in a pot, it must be placed in an area that receives at least six hours of sunlight each day. If it's outside, then make sure it's elevated above a drainage dish, so roots can grow out of the drainage holes. The roots need room to spread.

It's important to let the soil dry out between watering. Water the plant until it drips out of the drainage holes, then discard the water in the drainage dish to prevent the soil from remaining soggy.

SOME cats and dogs can have the best start in life and still grow up with behavioural concerns being fearful. Others that missed out on critical socialisation experiences such as puppies or abandoned kittens which impacted their development. But what about dogs who can have it worse?

How does trauma impact our pets?

Some of the cats and dogs we take into our homes don't just come from neglectful pasts but have lived with outright abuse. Sometimes this abuse has been due to mistreatment at the hands of a past owner, and

best intentions. Trauma has a lifelong impact on many cats and dogs. Dog Training is still an

home despite the owner's

unregulated field, which means there are still many so-called trainers who use aversive training techniques to address behavioural problems. This is the reason why there are many organisations for the premier experts in animal behaviour.

Although much progress has been made, many trainers and people have a position statement regarding the use of punishment in train-

Manufacturing fear or avoidance in an already panicked animal does not create an environment where critical learning can take place.

I have heard of trainers in this day and age using electrical collars on dogs who suffer from separation anxiety for barking, hanging dog-aggressive dogs by their neck when they lunged at others, and strapping electronic collars to dogs' genitals in the name of behaviour

vocate. If something doesn't seem right to you, it is up to you to put your foot down and protect your pet. Even something as seemingly mild as squirting a reactive pet with a water bottle or gently placing a frightened cat or dog into a fear-inducing situation and preventing that cat or dog from leaving can have long-lasting conse-

quences.

While you may have had the best intentions when you followed the advice of the trainer on TV or tried a technique that your 'friend' swears by, if your dog responded by panicking or shutting down and if you've noticed your dog's behaviour has deteriorated since then, it's possible that your dog could be experiencing a canine version of Post-Traumatic Stress (PTS). It is time to discuss this with your vet who might well refer you to a behaviour consultant.

Testing out the satnav

BRITISH learners will have to pass satellite navigation tests as part of their official exam. The new law comes into effect in December as part of a testing shake-up from the DVSA.

Studies have found that more than 50 per cent of British drivers now use satnav, making it an essential part of the driving experience.

Distractions are already a major safety issue thanks to mobile phones. The DVSA fear novice drivers messing around with their satnav could seriously threaten other



ITALY supports a number of designers and manufacturers of Superyachts but here is a new concept for cruising.

The new PY Heritage 45 M which is a first time collaboration between designers Zuccon International Project and Picchiotti Yacht. It could easily be classed as a Superyacht in its own right but it is also considered to be a suitable support vessel for one of the even larger Superyachts.



ONE thing that is reinforced each year with the Palma Boat and Superyacht Shows is the fact that Mallorca is wedded

The organisers are very aware of this and whilst those looking to sell their vessels will be exhibiting state of the art vessels, there will be an area dedicated to the traditional boats of the Balearics, some of which have disappeared.

Those who have studied the history of the boats of the islands will remember the xabecs, llaüts viatgers, bergantins and fragates, but to others they will simply be names, assuming that they have heard of them at all.

It is only in the last hundred years or so that it has been possible to travel to the islands by any method other than the sea and the availability of cheap aircraft seats as well as new and stronger materials has led to an inevitable change in the way that the local boating industry operates.

These days, traditional boat building can be seen in the fleet of smaller handcrafted boats including pasteras, gussis and bots which will be on show in the Marina Tradicional zone at Boat Show Palma, a new area that seeks to



highlight the value of the boating tradition that was the forerunner of one of the island's emerging economic sectors.

The Marina Tradicional site. located at the entrance of the Pescadores zone and covering 240 square metres, is intended to be a space to revisit the sailing history of the region. It will also show that there is

still construction of traditional boats which will not only maintain a tradition but will also provide skilled employment.

Visitors to the Marina Tradicional zone will be able to see a gussi, a pastera and two bots together with two fine craftsmen Pep Florit and Joan Portell, who will work on
