Sound of silence for the summer

CALPE Town Hall has made changes to its noise-pollution laws to guarantee peace for residents and tourists during the high season.

The ordinance already regulates the use of heavy machinery during the summer season, however changes will prohibit all construction/building works throughout the municipality between August 1 and August 31.

After August, between September 1 and September 15, all construction/building works throughout the municipality, whether public or private, should be carried out between 9.00am and 2.00pm and again between 5.00pm and 8.00pm, allowing for afternoon siestas.

Works of public interest - required for reasons of necessity or safety - will be exempt from the regulations.

The ordinance provides clarification on the different activities causing noise-pollution as well as advice on how to minimise their effects.

The council appeals to all Calpe residents to familiarise themselves with the ordinance to allow the high season to pass with as little discomfort as possible.

Putrid pool filled in

THE city of Denia has completed its work to cure stagnant water in the most affected area of the beach of Marineta Cassiana, next to the southern breakwater.

The work done sees the area where the water was stagnant elevated in height after some 700 tonnes of sand were deposited.

The sand deposited in the Marineta Cassiana comes from the surplus accumulated in the port area, which had arrived from the Cagarritar beach during the storms

The barrier erected on the beach throughout the winter to curb the regression of the coast helped to retain sand in the area, however the storms of December last year and January this year caused the submerged sand bar to emerge, occluding sand-algae which, due to lack of oxygen, caused bad odours and gas.

SPAIN SO CHEESY! Spaniards love their local cheeses as much as their nationally produced wines, with a Denomination of Origin upholding quality nationwide of some leading brands.

Cheesy cheer


AROUND 100 different varieties of cheese are produced in various regions of Spain ranging from fresh to cured and some fermented to blue.

The key characteristic of each is the type of milk used with currently 13 cheeses with Denominations of Origin - or DO - across the country.

Dependent on the area, time of year, climate and tradition, cheese is produced with milk from cows, goats or sheep, and some products include a mixture.

Each cheese also differs due to varying ageing or curing production processes, with these frequently decades old and identifying with local history and tradition.

Flavours normally fall within three



categories: light, medium or strong, with the latter typically produced with a long curing process and from sheep's milk or a blend.

The Spanish frequently eat cheese daily, and as a general rule, cheese from cows' milk comes from the north in inland areas from Cantabria and the

Basque Country to Castilla-Leon, Castilla La Mancha, Aragon and Ex-

The Mediterranean coast from Catalonia to Andalucia is mainly famed locally for goats-milk cheese, while the Canary and Balearic Islands are largely known for goats' cheese.

Majestic Manchego

MANCHEGO is the most famous Spanish cheese, wholly made from the ewe's milk of the Manchega breed of sheep. It is firm and aged from two months to two years.

Protected under the DO classification schemes of both Spain as well as the European Union, it is named after the La Mancha Province where it is produced and which was the home of Don Quixote.

Mild with a taste of salty nuts, it was originally produced to barter at market and to provide a durable food for Spanish shep-

that she ignored a stop sign.

The garage, 'built like a bunker' according to police, was used as a greenhouse equipped with thermostats, ventilation, heating and an irrigation system.

Most of the dried leaves were already packaged and police also found plants growing in three of the villa's rooms.

As well as drugs charges, the arrested

man is also accused of defrauding Iberdrola by consuming €29,000 worth of electricity via an illegal connection to the public grid.

Baby abused

A COUPLE has been sentence to five and a half years in prison for abusing their three-month old baby.

The parents would 'habitually mistreat' their child and broke several bones on numerous occasions.

The Torrellano couple have been prohibited from seeing or communicating with their child for seven and a half years and have been ordered to pay €2,670 in compensation.

The pedestrian crossing appeared the following morning and was used for some days by locals who were un-

Despite its apparent usefulness, the improvised crossing could endanger those using it, the Local Police explained, as there were no signs warning drivers of its presence. It has now been removed although bollards have been placed in front of the stadium exit.

This was a provisional measure and there are plans to install a pedestrian crossing and improve pavements in the area adjoining the football stadium.

Bitter pill to swallow

CATALONIA has introduced a controversial sugar tax on a range of soft drinks including some of the world's most famous brands.

Already tagged a 'soda tax,' it could raise as much as €41 million a year for the regional government's coffers, despite an insistence the aim was to improve public health by reducing sugar consumption according to World Health Organisation recommendations.

The tax hike depends on the amount of sugar in a drink, and customers will have to pay more for products like energy drinks, fruit juices made from concentrate, chocolate drinks, sports, and cold tea and coffee drinks

The central government has previously looked to introduce such a levy nationwide - it is already policy in France and Denmark – but has always backtracked.

USA, USA, USA

MANY students aim to work abroad after finishing studying, and 70 per cent of those graduates look to the USA.

A study by a prestigious Barcelona university found more than half preferred to work overseas, with just 46.6 per cent wanting to find a job in Spain.

From a poll of 500 it was discovered only 8.56 per cent wanted to work in Britain and 6.6 per cent in Germany.

Donkey work

VANDALS poured yellow paint onto a donkey's back and released it from its enclosure, with its young, in La Pereda de Llanes, in Spain's Asturias region.

They sneaked into the enclosure and poured several litres of plastic paint on the back of four-year-old donkey, Marina, before destroying the enclosure allowing the animal and its two offspring,

The Temple of Diana.

A UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1993, Merida is renowned for its Roman architecture and was built as a stylised provincial capital of Rome, centre of an empire.

Founded in 25BC, with the name Emerita Agusta, it has some of the most well-preserved archaeological remains in Spain and was once the most important city in Roman

The city was founded by the Emperor Augustus and his discharged soldiers were employed to protect a pass and bridge over the river Guadiana; the Puente Romana is still used by pedestrians and is the longest of all existing Roman bridges.

Merida remains the capital of Extramadura. Historically its strategic importance was one end of the Silver Way the Via de la Plata - the route between the gold mines of Asturica Augusta and Rome.

Visitors can explore Roman reservoirs still in use, the aqueduct, the Circus Maximus - one of the best examples in the world - and villas with precious mosaics. The Forum includes the Temple of Diana and the theatre is still used to stage Greco-Roman classics or modern plays set in

After the Romans, Merida was important to the Visigoths and by the sixth Century was dominated by bishops as the capital of Hispania and the occupation of the Moors meant the ancient buildings were re-used or expanded but maintained their splendour.

Following a series of accusations against political parties, unions, and companies, corruption has become a main concern for Spaniards after the country's ongoing unemployment

Free Press

WORLD Press Freedom Day has prompted calls for journalists in Spain to be free of the 'pressures and threats' of political parties.

The Madrid Press Association accuses politicians of trying to undermine the work of the press and calls for the right of the media to comment on events without being bullied.

It has also demanded the repeal of the so-called 'gag law' to allow free speech to be protected to the same standards as under international law.

Two killed in road accident

Three Guardia Civil roadside tests were being carried out in the area on Sunday morning but she avoided all of them before ploughing into the riders, instantly killing Eduardo Monfort Gasent, 28, and 50-year-old Luis Alberto Contreras.

Andres Contreras, the son of Luis Alberto, Scotsman Scott Gordon and Jose Antonio Albi, were also seriously injured and remain fighting for their lives in hos-

The accident occurred at kilometre 206 of the N-332 between Oliva and Denia, and the six cyclists were all from the Llebeig de Javea Athletics Club.

A helicopter was dispatched and it is believed one of the men had to be revived at the scene after going into cardiac arrest before being airlifted to hospital.

The driver was arrested at the scene after testing four times over the legal alcohol limit, and it was later confirmed that she had also taken cocaine.

She faces two counts of involuntary manslaughter, along with three of injury, and remains in custody pending conclusion of the trial.

In a statement to the press, former Llebeig de Javea Athletics Club president Julio Almazan said the driver was on the wrong side of the road when she careered into the cyclists.

He said: "We're all still in a state of shock. I've been told the driver hit the members of our club head-on after crossing into their lane, and she tested positive for cocaine as well as failing a drink-drive

The only member of the group who escaped serious injury is Jaime Escortell, the current club president.

Will Eurovision Brit face Brexit backlash?

THE 62nd edition of the world's longest running annual singing contest will take place this Saturday in Kiev, Ukraine, but Britain's entry is not the bookies' favourite.

Ahead of the spectacle, bookmakers Ladbrokes have reported that the UK are looking fairly friendless, with the odds on them taking home the title being bigger than ever before at 50/1.

The bookmakers have even taken several bets on UK entrant Lucie Jones receiving nil points at odds of 14/1.

Nicola McGeady of Ladbrokes told TellyMix: "Punters are preparing for a Brexit backlash from voters judging by the lack of support coming in for Lucie Jones. Usually we are knocked over with patriotic support, but for the first time ever. punters aren't getting behind the UK"

BBC Eurovision host Graham Norton previously admitted he didn't rate Lucie's chances at Eurovision 2017.

He told the Daily Star newspaper: "I'm just not sure it will happen for us this year. I mean, I could be wrong as Germany have won. Austria have won. So, I suppose people who never win. win.

"On the night, anything can happen. I'm just not sure it will for us, though."

Celebrities across Europe are preparing for the showdown.

Enrique Iglesias has shirked Spain in favour of Montenegro's Slavko Kalezic

Enrique is no stranger to Eurovision. His dad Julio Inglesias represented Spain in 1970 but only finished in fourth place, and Enrique himself was the interval act at the first Eurovision Dance Contest.

Meanwhile, Russia's 2009



winner Dima Bilan is backing 17-year-old Bulgarian superstar Kristian Kostov. He mentored Kristian on the children's version of The Voice Russia and the pair performed an incredible duet together.

Hope may not be lost for Lucie Jones as former One Direction singer Liam Payne cheers her on. Liam's girlfriend Cheryl was Lucie's mentor on The X Factor in 2009 and they're getting behind the UK's Eurovision

Prank wasn't desecration

A 16-YEAR-OLD girl was responsible for inverting crosses in Santa Faz monastery and defacing the urn containing its venerated relic.

Her handiwork was discovered when the locked doors to the church were opened, ready for the morning service. Seven of the small crosses marking the Stations of the Cross had been inverted and 666 was scratched into the armoured glass protecting the relic.

A prayer book was missing as well as a diary listing services although neither are of value, diocesan sources revealed.

Footage from CCTV cameras confirmed that the perpetrator remained in the church overnight, as a young woman was seen entering shortly before the doors were shut. Once inside she turned



the security cameras to the wall and slipped out unnoticed the following morning when the doors were unlocked.

Police soon traced the girl who had also sent the chaplain a text message in the early hours of the morning, telling him: 'Satan is doing something inside the church.'

The case was referred to the Juvenile Public Prosecution Service and the girl could be charged with committing an offence against religious beliefs.

According to tradition the scrap of linen guarded inside a bulletproof urn was part of the cloth used by St Veronica to wipe Christ's face. And as they have done for the last 536 years, thousands of Alicantinos and visitors recently walked the eight-kilometres between the city and monastery on the second Thursday after Easter.







Plenty of fish in sea

CAMPELLO and Villajoyosa are progressing with their joint plans for extending Campello's existing marine reserve as far as La Vila.

Mayors and councillors from both towns as well as representatives from their fishing guilds met for the second time in Villajoyosa to discuss creating a Fishing Marine Reserve. The initiative is also backed by the Institute of Coastal Ecology.

Extending the reserve is intended to create a larger protection area for the underwater meadows of posidonia or Neptune grass that support the Mediterranean's marine diversity.

This in turn would guarantee a sustainable future for the fishing industry in Campello and Villajoyosa while protecting the environment and providing another tourism asset. Catches should increase in quantity and quality with the presence of larger fish and species like grouper.

Fishing would be barred in some zones but allowed in others during specified times of the year, using only traditional driftnets.

By encouraging the presence of more fish, catches in zones immediately adjoining the protected area would also increase, the Campello representatives pointed out.

The next step involves hearing the opinions of Villajoyosa's fishing sector and learning whether or not it wishes to go ahead.



Hellish fall in Hell's Ravine



AN Alicante Fire Consortium helicopter rescued a 33-year-old from Alfaz who was injured while hiking in the Barranco del Infierno.

He slipped and fell while on the path that leads from Felix to the notorious Hell's Ravine with his girlfriend, sources revealed afterwards.

Suspecting that he had broken his leg in two places, the couple contacted the 112 emergency services number who mobilised the Fire Consortium helicopter.

Given the severity of the Alfasino's injury, a

paramedic was included in the crew along with three mountain rescue experts.

Once the climber was sedated and the leg stabilised, he was winched up to the helicopter in a stretcher and flown to the Denia fire station where he was transferred to an ambulance and driven to the local hospital.

Consortium sources said later that the Alfaz resident had left the path to get a closer view of a dried-up cascade and had probably slipped on the mossy stones there.

Vultures won't go hungry

ALCOY City Hall is now feeding the colony of vultures on Sierra Mariola.

In the past Fapas-Alcoy supplied carrion for the birds but said recently that it could no longer do so, having failed to reach an agreement with city hall. The local association is a branch of a non-profit making organisation based in the north of Spain that protects vultures and wild animals.

Fapas is responsible for Projecte Canyet, the programme that reintroduced vultures in the area at the end of the 90's. "Thanks to this project there are now more than 100 fully-established birds. The results have been very positive," a spokesman said.

"Unfortunately Fapas is in a difficult situation

sources," he added. "Much to our regret we shall stop taking food up to the colony in the Sant Cristofol quarries."

Unless the Administrations stepped in and adopted the necessary measures, this could impact negatively on the vultures and endanger their medium term future, Fapas warned.

In reponse, Jordi Martinez, Alcoy's Culture councillor, said that a town hall employee had been leaving offal and dead animals on Mariola for some time now and was responsible for the area's upkeep.

Changes to the UK domicile regime other reforms unexpectedly been put on hold in the lead up to the snap General The UK Election in June. government removed these clauses from the 2017 Finance Bill on 25th April - 19 days after they were scheduled to start.

The key clauses affecting British expatriates in Spain that have been removed include:

Deemed domicile rules for inheritance tax, income tax and capital gains tax - This includes the 15 out of 20 years deemed domicile rule as well as the formerly resident domicile rule. The 17 out of 20 years in the UK rule remains in place for now.

Protection of overseas trusts -Affecting those with a UK domicile of origin who returned to the UK after acquiring a domicile of choice elsewhere and settling a trust, the trust would no longer be excluded property while the settlor is resident in the UK, and so would become liable to inheritance tax. Since this is on hold, such trusts remain excluded property for now.

Various UK reforms on hold, including domicile changes

Inheritance tax on enveloped residences - Where a UK residential property is held within a corporate structure (an 'envelope') this would be exposed to UK inheritance tax. So these properties continue to be outside UK inheritance tax for the time being.

Dividend nil rate band - Scheduled to reduce from £5,000 to £2,000 from

Money Purchase Annual Allowance

- The amount that people who are already drawing their pension can put back into their pension tax free was due to be cut from £10,000 to £4,000.

£1,500 pension advice allowance -The ability to withdraw up to £1,500 from a pension fund tax free to pay for advice will now not be applied.

What happens next?

A new government could either keep the changes and implement them in a future finance bill, or revise or scrap some of the reforms. The next finance bill should be issued later this fiscal year, especially bearing in mind some of the clauses were supposed to have taken effect from 6th April 2017, or in 2018 or beyond.

The Financial Secretary stated that, if re-elected, the government will

legislate at the earliest opportunity for the dropped reforms, but did not confirm a timetable.

QROPS transfer charge goes ahead

One reform to survive the cull was the surprise new 25% levy on transferring UK pension funds to Qualifying Recognised Overseas Scheme (QROPS), Pension announced in the spring budget. This tax remains in place.

It only applies to transfers taking place from 9th March 2017 onwards. And you escape liability if both you and your QROPS are in the European Economic Area (including Gibraltar for this purpose) or you are both in the same country. So if you live in Spain and are transferring to a QROPS in say, Malta or Gibraltar, you are not affected.

Liability lingers for five years for transfers from 9th March 2017, so if

that time you risk taxation.

If you were going to be affected by any of these reforms, particularly the domicile ones, keep in touch with your wealth management adviser to remain up to date. Domicile is a complex enough issue, without the uncertainty caused by putting the reforms on hold. Getting domicile planning wrong could easily result in larger tax bills, so specialist advice is essential.

La Nucia's Scout Troop recently repaired and restored the box that had been dented and damaged by vandals. Now climbers and hikers who reach the top of one of the Marina Baja's most emblematic mountains can once again sign the Llibre del Ponoig.

The 1,180-metre mountain has never had an official geodesic marker at its highest point although back in the 90's the Centro Excursionista de Alicante set up a copper marker there.

They also left a book with blank pages so

that climbers who reached the top could record the feat and leave a written comment.

In 2008 the Scouts found the book, wrapped in a plastic bag and stored inside a battered biscuit tin. Later that year the book was stolen so the troop replaced it, putting it inside a metal postbox to keep it safe. Since then they have climbed Ponoig each year to replace the book which disappears regularly.

The scouts also make sure that the postbox is in good condition and can protect the book from the wind, rain and snow that pound Ponoig each winter.

To help solve this problem and allow families to rent these properties and occupy them legally, the Generalitat's Infrastructure Organisation (EIGE) began a round of talks for mayors and town hall officials from Alicante Province municipalities.

After taking over in 2015, the regional government found that its predecessors' lack of housing policies had prompted a rise in squatters, explained EIGE director general Helena Beunza.

Cooperation and direct participation from

the town halls were indispensable, she added, as they had first-hand knowledge of the realities and circumstances of their local population.

The talks are "fundamental" to the regional government's commitment to managing social housing, Beunza stressed.

"Informing, clarifying, clearing up doubts and delivering efficient guidelines will allow us both to fulfil our obligations and comply with the law," she said.

One way to catch a tiger mosquito

SAN JUAN Town Hall has a secret weapon to combat tiger mosquitoes.

The Environment department is encouraging house martins to colonise the town by installing 30 nesting boxes in public buildings throughout the town.

House martins eat up to 1,000 insects a day and by protecting and encouraging them, the town hall hopes they can help to control mosquitoes and particularly the tiger mosquitoes that plague the town.

The nesting boxes continue the initiative that the Environment department started last year by installing drip irrigation in some areas to produce muddy patches that would encourage the birds to build nests nearby.

The project continues this year in Rajoletes, Lo Romero, Belucha, the Courthouses, Lo Pagan park and beneath the Miguel Hernandez walkway.

The town hall has also launched an awareness campaign, warning that house martins' nests are protected and should not be destroyed.

There will also be talks at local schools which will explain to pupils the birds' special features and the need to preserve the town's wildlife.

If you are resident in Spain for 183 days or more, you are considered a Spanish Tax resident. As such, you are required to submit an annual Spanish resident tax return know as a "Declaración de la Renta" as long as you comply with certain levels of income. The cut-off point is 11,200€ which applies to income from employment and pensions as long as have not been monthly taxed in Spain (including those from overseas). In any case a return becomes obligatory in certain circumstances however low your earnings.

- If you have a claim for double taxation.
- If you are due a refund.
- If you have made pension contributions.
- If you are claiming deductions for cost of buying your main residence.
- If you have capital gains or income above certain limits.

Remember that it may be in your interest to make a tax return when your earnings are low, for example if you have worked for only part of the year and may therefore be due a rebate. Also there are advantages of being fiscally resident in Spain specially when applying the Inheritance Taxes.

When is it due? NOW until the 30th of June 2017 (for the year 2016)

NON RESIDENTS income tax liability

Non-residents are liable for tax on any income arising in Spain, such as a money deposit with a Spanish bank, a property in Spain, or income derived of any business in Spain. Should you fail to pay this tax, you will be charged and penalised by the Spanish Tax Agency if you try to sell your property.

When is it due? NOW until 31st December 2017 (for the year 2016)

New success: Bank P and C Bank asked to pay back money lost by our client, on her purchase at Valle de Calpe (from Gardema)

THE Appeal Court of Alicante (Section 8), in its judgement 222/17, of April 11, 2017, asked that Bank P and C Bank pay back money lost by Mrs G, client of our firm, in her purchase of an off-plan property in the urbanisation, Valle de Calpe, developed by Gardema Developments SL, which was never handed over to her.

In today's article, we want to reiterate to everyone who bought an off-plan property in Spain and have never received it, either because it was never finished, or had disappeared or was in an insolvency process: that it is possible to claim for the return of the deposit and money lost, from the de-

The developer received the money in their bank account but had failed to make sure that the money and deposits were paid and secured by means of a bank guarantee or insurance policy, as required by law 57/68 and the LOE.

Also, it is possible to claim against the bank or insurance company who granted a general bank guarantee or insurance policy. to guarantee the money paid by the off-plan

purchaser, even if they did not hand them over, in the names of each buyer, declared the Spanish Supreme Court on several oc-

Thus, Mrs G paid €65,000 for the purchase of a property in the urbanisation, Valle de Calpe, to the promoter Gardema Developments SL. This promoter had the account with C Bank and received the money from our client in that account. Also, we are able to prove to the court, that Bank P granted a general bank guarantee line, in favour of the purchasers of this complex.

Before starting the court process, we sent a request to C Bank, who received the money paid by our client; in order for them to confirm which company it was, that obliged to guarantee the money paid, but they didn't

We also sent a request before claiming, to Bank P, asking them to confirm that they did grant a bank guarantee line, and they didn't answer, although in court it was proven that they did.

Finally, the Appeal Province Court of Alicante, on the said Court Decision, accepted in full our appeal, and revoked the court decision granted by the first instance court, and declared that both banks are responsible to refund to my client the money paid

One bank because they granted a general bank guarantee for the buyers on this complex, and the other bank because they received the money in their bank account without knowing and asking if the guarantees required by the law were granted by the developer.



a tub of Brylcreem which she duly collected.


Afterwards Carole, who had spent a lot of time in the frozen aisles, was happy with her half-full trolley, but regretted she never made it to





Bigger benefits with bigger 'padron' Bloody marvellous!

CASH from the Municipal Cooperation Fund will be used for improvements to Albir. "The council has several proposals in mind that range from street repairs to restoring public buildings," said Alfaz mayor Vicente Arques

Alfaz can expect €196,548 from the fund, which is a Generalitat initiative with input from the Diputacion councils in the Valencia and Castellon provinces. Alicante's Diputacion declined to join the project, meaning that municipalities here can access only half the funds available in Valencia or Castellon.

The Municipal Cooperation Fund was created to compensate for underfunding from the national government in Madrid. It sets out to boost towns' autonomy regarding investments and expenditure, as the Fund allows them to make their own decisions on spending the money.



Allocations are based on the registered population, Arques said, prompting him to emphasise the importance of a 'padron' that reflects the municipality's true size.

The town recently launched a campaign aimed at Alfaz's foreign residents, urging them to register on the 'padron' which will also increase funding from Madrid.

"A significant proportion of Alfaz's population is not reflected in the census," the mayor continued. "That means the town hall has to provide services with a lower budget that does not correspond to the real number of inhabitants."

THERE was a 'spectacular' increase in blood donors for Alfaz's 2017 Donation Marathon.

This year saw 71 donations and 17 donors who had never given blood before, announced Alfaz's Health councillor Marisa Cortes.

The Alicante Transfusions Centre had anticipated a maximum of 60 donors but 86 people turned up instead. Seventy-one of these were able to give blood after medical staff, following established procedures, ruled out 15 potential donors.

What set this year's Marathon apart from previous editions was the call for potential bone marrow donors, which was answered by 13 people.

"The Transfusions Centre has stressed that anyone can do this at any time," Cortes explained. "They only need to mention this when donating blood," she said. "It is a very simple process that consists of extracting a phial for later analysis and inclusion on REDMO, the bone marrow data base. Donors will then be contacted if they can provide a match for a patient needing treatment."

Cortes thanked all those who took part as well as the 20 people who arrived towards the end of the session and were unable to donate as the Transfusions Centre staff were having to cope with an unexpectedly high number of donors.

CONSUMERS in Alfaz and Albir complained more about telephone companies than any other service.



In 1937 the family moved to a larger property in Lenzie, near Glasgow, which allowed a piano to be installed although early piano lessons halted abruptly when they had to move to North Wales.

Gordon attended Rydal School from 1943 until 1950 before achieving a minor scholarship to St John's Cambridge in 1950. Staff at Rydal and Cambridge had an enormous influence on the



aspiring musician.

Gordon left university in 1954 with two degrees, the second of which awarded him a starred first in composition.

For two years he was barren of music while he completed his National Service.

In 1956 Gordon became assistant director of music at Ellesmere College in Shropshire before

moving to Malvern College where he learned what was needed to become director of music.

Five years later he relocated to Brighton College where he was head of music until 1987. During this time he also wrote for the college and became an examiner for the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music, travelling throughout the UK and also to Malaysia and Hong Kong until retiring in 1996.

From 1991 until 2002 he was an organist and choirmaster in two East Sussex churches where he devoted much more time to composition, a discipline in which he is still very active. He also


It has flourished under his directorship and is now a highly-respected musical body in the area. It has also raised a considerable amount of money over the







Property help for young and elderly

IN an effort to assist those who have found it difficult to find affordable accommodation, the Spanish Minister of Development has unveiled the 2018 plan.

Iñigo de la Serna has made it clear that the government is dedicated to helping those that need it the most, namely the young, the elderly and those who have been evicted.

In the case of those aged under 35, the state will make up to €10,800 available to anyone with a salary of less than €22,365.42 so that they can purchase a property, but the maximum of the grant will not exceed 20 per cent of the purchase price.

Provided that recipients earn less than €1,597.53 per month (which is three times the average monthly rent) then financial aid will be made available to assist in the rental of a

So for this group, if they are not purchasing, the government recognises that rental prices are increasing dramatically, especially in certain areas of Spain and will aid those renting a property and pay 50 per cent of the cost of rent which does not exceed €900 per month

for three years.

For those aged 65 with income also less than €1,597.53 per month and a net worth of less than €100,000, they will receive a similar amount to cover rent up to €900 per month for three years or if the property is owned, there will be a

contribution of up to €200 to help with maintenance and utility bills.

There will be cash assistance to companies building apartments to house low income families and the ministry will also help those who have lost their properties or been evicted from rental accommodation

by taking properties held in the Sareb 'property bank' and renting them out at heavily subsidised

With this plan to run from 2018 to 2020, the government expects to spend €321 million a year in overall support and assistance.

Spanish banks to be questioned over movement of funds for HSBC

ALTHOUGH British-based high street bank HS-BC came through the banking crisis relatively unscathed, it has been accused of a number of irregularities over the years.

Having been fined billions of dollars by the US authorities and also shelling out to the British government, it is now under investigation in France and Spain.

The various bankers will be questioned about their knowledge and involvement.

The Spanish High Court has ruled that seven current and former employees of Banco Santander and three from BNP Paribas Spain must be questioned over allegations of collusion in moving funds for HSBC to an account in Switzerland.

According to the judge who made the decision, the transfers estimated at €74 million were made in a manner which protected HSBC customers from national tax authorities and as such could be considered money laundering once the whole trail is unravelled.

This current investigation started as long ago as 2008 when a self-proclaimed whistle blower Hervé Falciani leaked details of large numbers of customers who had accounts with HSBC's private bank in Switzerland and details were sent to tax authorities in a number of different

The Swiss responded by sentencing the French citizen 'in absentia' to five years imprisonment for industrial espionage.

The various bankers will be questioned about their knowledge and involvement in this matter by way of assistance to the French investigation which is concentrating on the period between

Should any evidence of wrongdoing emerge concerning the Spanish banks involved, a decision will then have to be made as to whether the courts will need to consider further action to establish if any Spanish laws have been broken.

Another bank will transfer staff to Frankfurt

ONE of Britain's largest banks Standard Chartered has confirmed that it will be moving several hundred jobs to Frankfurt in advance of

This announcement follows one from US financial giant JP Morgan, which employs about 16,000 people in Britain, which is also planning to move hundreds of jobs from London to Frankfurt, Luxembourg and Dublin.

Although considered a UK bank, Standard Chartered which recently appointed former Deputy Governor of the Bank of Spain and Director of the International Monetary Fund Jose Vinals as Chairman only receives about 5 per cent of its income from the UK market.

Although it currently intends to keep its headquarters in London, its interests in Asia and Europe mean that it cannot afford to chance any banking restrictions following Brexit.

Airbnb still under review

FOLLOWING the example of the Barcelona City Council, Madrid is investigating ways of 'policing' untaxed property rentals.

Although there are a number of property portals which offer short term rentals in Madrid and other large cities in Spain, American company Airbnb is the most prolific and successful in the market place.

As previously reported, Barcelona has tried to levy significant fines of the company which has successfully appealed against them, but it has also offered a compromise whereby it will not accept multi-property lets from professional landlords.

The main bone of contention appears to be the fact that significant amounts of local tax may be evaded if short term lettings are made through these portals.

FOOTBALL finance just can't keep out of the news and it has been confirmed that Barcelona star Nevmar will be charged with fraud and corruption.

Like so many South American superstars, the Brazilian's parents are involved in his management as well as day-to-day financial affairs and his father at least will also be charged.

The reason for the prosecution centres on Neymar's transfer from Santos in 2013 with his transfer fee being declared at €17 million, when it was once suggested that the actual fee was €57 million. However the court now suggests the real fee was nearer €25 million.

Following the example of a number of other players, Neymar had a deal with a third party group, in this case the Brazilian investment company DIS which was entitled to 40 per cent of any transfer fee.

The Brazilian's parents are involved in his management.

They received €6.8 million but the court believes that they were 'short changed' by €3.5 million which is the reason for the charges which also include Barcelona president Josep Maria Bartomeu and his predecessor Sandro Rosell, who it is suggested were aware of the de-

Originally in 2016, a Spanish

court ruled that the matter should be subject to a civil action but has now been persuaded by the prosecutor that the player and his father were aware of an allegedly fraudulent arrangement between Barcelona and Santos to defraud DIS.

Prosecutors are calling for a two-year prison sentence and €10 million fine for Neymar whilst DIS want to see five years and at the very least a suspension of his right to play in Spain for the period of any sentence, even if a suspended one.

The Barcelona club has already paid a €5.5 million fine in order to settle a different case with similar circumstances, but these accusations still continue to arise and there is a separate investigation taking place in

BRAVE cancer battler Leo Bermeja is back in Almeria after undergoing six weeks of ground-breaking proton beam therapy in the United States, and the Euro Weekly News was on hand to join the celebrations at his homecoming party.

A sizeable group of friends, family members and supporters gathered at the Laguna restaurant in Las Marinas, Vera, to welcome him back from his six weeks of treatment in Oklahoma and wish a belated happy birthday to big sister Sofia, who recently turned nine.

Among the many gifts on display was a framed copy of one of the first double-page spreads that we ran as part of our ongoing Leo the Lion campaign.

Leo, mum Karen and Sofia were all in high spirits despite suffering from jetlag, having only travelled to Spain from Canada three days beforehand and losing some luggage along the way.

Karen kindly agreed to an exclusive chat with us, during which she explained what will happen next as four-year-old Leo's fight against a rare form of brain cancer continues.

"We're still catching up to be honest," she laughed. "Over the next two weeks I'm planning to let Leo chill a bit and get over the jetlag.

"After that we'll see how he is about starting at the special needs school in Vera again, then once we've got the clear scan over with we're thinking about hyperbaric oxygen therapy, which they have in Malaga.'

She went on to explain how this type of treatment exposes the patient to high oxygen concentrations, which can help stimulate the growth of new brain cells before the delayed effect of the proton therapy kicks in.

Due to a lack of knowledge about the type of cancer he has. Leo must also undergo a brain scan every six weeks for the next two years before any definitive evaluation can be made, and he

Overall though, Karen remains incredibly upbeat despite the family's ordeal, and she was keen to express her gratitude to EWN readers and others who have helped Leo's cause.





THERESA MAY'S searing attack on unelected Eurocrats for trying to sabotage both the general election and Brexit is unprecedented. WORLD ASTHMA DAY has been marked in Spain as experts say there are currently around 235 million asthma patients around the world.

According to the World Health Organisation, (WHO) asthma deaths will increase by almost 20 per cent in the next 10 years if no urgent action is taken. Another frequent error is that the condition can have phases of stability, resulting in the patient deciding not to take their medication. However, this can lead to a long term worsening of the condition.

Asthma is one of the most prevalent chronic respiratory diseases in Spain, affecting around 5 per cent of adults and 8-10 per cent of chil-

The link between smoking and sight loss



MEN could be lonelier than you think. A report has concluded that as many as 35 per cent of men in the UK feel lonely at least once a week, while 11 per cent admitted to feeling lonely most days.

The study was carried out by social media site Gransnet, which reported that the older generation are suffering from an 'epidemic of loneliness' with almost three-quarters describing themselves as lonely. Almost two in five said they could go for days without speaking to anyone and nearly half said they had felt lonely for years as the study authors warned that many, particularly pensioners, were suffering in si-

lence with over 70 per cent saying their family would be shocked to learn they felt lonely.

Over 25 per cent of men aged 65 to 69 blamed retirement for their loneliness as they had lost that connection with going to work and being around colleagues, although the study found that 35 was the age when a man felt the loneliest.

Moving away from family and friends was also a main cause of loneliness in respondents, as well as going through a break up, being unemployed and the death of a family member.

1. What is sciatica and when does it usually occur?

Sciatica is simply pain felt in the lumbar area that can spread to both legs usually caused by a pinched nerve. Although it can happen at any age, it tends to be most common amongst the elderly due to arthritis in the spinal column. It can also appear after strenuous physical activities causing herniated discs.

2. What are the symptoms?

The main symptoms of sciatica are muscle cramps, back pains that can spread to the legs as well as difficulty in making certain movements, and in some cases being unable to move your legs.

3. What causes sciati-

The main causes of sciatica are arthritis and herniated discs in the spine. They are most common amongst the elderly and the young after overexerting themselves lifting heavy loads, or bad posture when sitting, among other things.

4. How can it be treated?

Usually a course of anti-

inflammatories, analgesics, muscle relaxants and rest are effective in managing the symptoms. Depending on the cause of a person's sciatica it may be necessary to have an operation, such as having herniated

Physiotherapy is also very beneficial for sciatica sufferers.

5. Can you prevent having sciatica?

Certain exercises which strengthen muscles. avoiding bad postures, not overexerting when lifting and sitting correctly are all ways to minimise the chances of suffering from sciatica.

6. Is there a specific exercise which helps?

Any form of exercise which does not strain your back is helpful, as it strengthens your muscles and helps improve blood

Generally swimming, yoga, pilates and other similar exercises are all very beneficial.

7. Is it hereditary?

In general it is not hereditary. Just because parents suffer from sciatica it does not mean their children will too.

The Nissan eNV200 has been adapted thanks to the expertise ILUNION Adaptación de Vehículos which belongs to the ONCE group of social enterprises and its Foundation.

ILUNION said the technical department of Nissan was instrumental in developing this first prototype as there are very strict protocols and guidelines to be followed on this type of vehicle.

The Nissan is a five-seater vehicle and has space for a person in a wheelchair.

ILUNION hopes that this could be a 'car of the future' for those with disabilities and opens the door to making electric taxis more accessible in city centres, making services more accessible for all and more environmentally friendly.

A PILL could soon give the effect you have had a workout, without you raising a finger.

Scientists say a chemical called PPARD is linked to aerobic endurance. In tests with mice, the researchers used a smallmolecule drug to activate PPARD in the muscles of mice. It increased the fat burning in their muscles, similar to what happens during exercise, despite them being sedentary, and also increased endurance by up to 70 per cent. It is hoped these findings and their research could lead to an 'exercise pill' that would allow people to reap the benefits of a workout without actually doing one.








Bangers breeze in

MORE than 40 custom vehicles travelling in convoy from the UK, brought the streets of Benidorm to a halt last Saturday afternoon when they arrived in the resort.

The 'Benidorm Bangers' covered the 1,600km since leaving the Ace Café in London on Tuesday lunchtime, to the Spanish resort in just over five days, raising money for their favoured charities on the way.

Organiser of the rally, now in it's second year, Rob Scott, led the way in a bright yellow, converted van, with a propeller on its roof.

He customised the vehicle a couple of years ago, donating it as a fundraising tool to West Yorkshire Air Ambulance.

Since then, Rob has borrowed the van back from the charity on most weekends to visit charity fundraising events, raising around €45,000 in the process.

"West Yorkshire Air Ambulance is one of the most efficiently run charities in the UK," he said, "With over 14 pence in the pound going directly to the charity."

Rob, along with co-drivers and fellow organisers Mick (Sugar) Hammond and Jez Brambles all from Hunmanby. near Filev in Yorkshire collected around €3,500 on their journev down to Benidorm.

The convoy of 45, brightly coloured, wackily decorated cars, was accompanied into town by a police escort arranged by Angelo from The White Hart on Levante Beach, where their journey ended.

Throughout the trip south,

members of the convoy were awarded points by Rob and Sugar, for performing various tasks, which usually involved making as much noise as possible to draw attention to them-

Thank you to all the people from the UK who have donated.

The organisers also awarded prizes for 'Best Vehicle' and the team who showed 'Best Spirit of the Event' plus other awards for fancy dress attire.

Best vehicle was won by a 'Thomas The Tank Engine' themed motor, which certainly drew the crowds for photos on Saturday afternoon.

The owner James Ritchie and his Bloo Toon Loons team raised around €3,500 in cash for Spina Bifida Hydrocephalus Scotland during the rally.

Prize for Spirit of the Event, went to brothers Dave and Steve Sutton and friend Frank Bailey, whose Volvo broke down outside Paris on Wednesday, needing €600 spending on a radiator repair.

Despite only being a short return journey from the channel tunnel, the boys waited around until Thursday afternoon, when the car was repaired, then drove 850km through the night nonstop to catch up with the rest of the convoy.

"It would have been far easier and cheaper for the lads to have gone back to the channel and home" Rob admitted, "But they stuck around, then drove like mad to catch us up, showing the true spirit of the event."

Another happy charity director at the rally on Saturday was Wayne Bellamy-Wright of 'Busy Bees Benidorm' who received donations of clothing, training shoes, toiletries, toys and many other items, which will go to help disadvantaged children at the Emaus Homes in our area.

"Each and every one of the cars brought us a box of stuff for the charity," said Wayne. "Some of them phoned ahead to ask us what we needed." he continued. "It's been amazing. We've got 50 times more stuff than last year and we've had to ask to borrow another car to get it home," he said.

"To say I'm overwhelmed would be the understatement of the century. Having been all day at the car rally I can't believe how much stuff they have donated. Thank you Rob, Scott and all the teams all the people from UK that have donated."

More money was raised later when the rally moved to Jokers Music Pub and final totals will be released soon.

After a few days rest the fundraising drivers will return to the UK, some with their vehicles, some without.

"We only lost one car on the way down, in France," said Rob, and we've arranged for a scrap car person to remove the vehicles not returning to the UK, we won't be dumping any of the cars in Benidorm.

"We will be back again next year in early May and hope to make it an even bigger event."

The Sunday Times Rich List -Just to make you Feel Good

HERE ARE NOW MORE BIL-LIONAIRES living in the UK than ever before despite fears over Brexit, the Sunday Times Rich List has revealed

This year's list found the richest 1,000 people and families have a record total wealth of £658 billion, a rise of 14 per cent on last year's £575 billion figure.

The wealthiest people in the UK are elderly brothers Sri and Gopi Hinduja, whose latest project is to convert the Old War Office in London into a luxury five-star hotel and 88 luxury apartments for the super-rich.

The pair first topped the list in 2014 and now have a fortune of £16.2 billion, made



through investments spanning the oil and gas, automotive, IT, energy, media, banking, property and healthcare sectors.

They are now among 134 billionaires on the list - a record number in the UK and 14 more than last year's.

In today's world, being simply a millionaire no longer secures you a place on the Rich List, with a fund of £110 million now needed to get you a place in the top 1,000. Two decades ago people needed a fortune of only (sic) £15 million to make the cut.

Robert Watts, compiler of the rankings. said: "While many of us worried about the outcome of the EU referendum, many of the richest people just kept calm and carried on making billions."

Gopichand Hinduja, joint richest man, with his brother,

AND SPEAKING OF MILLIONS, regular readers may recall me mentioning about how in the 80's cities were closing banks down and entrepreneurs were converting them into restaurants and fashionable wine bars and brasseries. I commented that the practice had seemed to have faded. So it was with some interest that I read from London that the former Sir Edwin Lutyens-designed Midland Bank building on Poultry, just a minute's walk from the Bank of England, has been turned into a luxury

The Ned - the largest and most ambitious hotel to launch in London this year is set to welcome its first quests.



The Ned - Large in Scale and Delivery.

A former Caterer named Hotelier of the Year 2015, Nick Jones is the man behind the enormous project. He never intended to open a hotel in the City of London. The capital's financial centre is not a typical location for an outpost of Soho House & Co,

the company founded by Jones 22 years ago and renowned for attracting guests and members from the media and entertainment industries.

He was told about the availability of the building by the landlord of Little House, one of 18 members' clubs owned and operated by Soho House & Co worldwide. "I wasn't particularly keen to go along, but I didn't want to appear rude," he recalls. "The banking floor was jaw-droppingly beautiful," he said. "I clambered up on the roof, with its views over St Paul's, and immediately saw the huge potential the property offered as a hotel and collection of restaurants "

The hotel features 252 bedrooms, nine restaurants, two swimming pools - one on the rooftop and one in the basement - a spa, members' club and much more. The Ned is a beautiful, multifaceted beast, which required the help of a partner to create. After speaking to Ron Burkle, the American investor who acquired a 60 per cent stake in Soho House & Co in 2012, Jones met with Andrew Zobler, the founder and chief executive of Sydell Group. Burkle is also the main financial backer of Sydell Group, a company that has experience of grand renovation projects through the opening of six hotels in the US during the past five years.

"That was the start of our collaboration and it's been fantastic," enthuses Jones. "We love each other more than we did at the beginning, which is unusual when you're involved in a project of this scale."

While Soho House & Co has extensive experience of developing a variety of hospitality businesses - as well as the members' clubs (12 of which feature bedrooms and welcome non-members), it has also created 16 restaurant brands nothing comes close to the scale of the Ned, which covers nearly 30,000 square

Jones and his team made the most of the building, encouraging him to look to its banking heritage for design cues. Hence, much use has been made of the banking hall's original walnut-panelled counters, used by tellers, repurposed as bar counters and dividers between the different restaurants.

Once bustling with bank customers, the space will now buzz with some 850 restaurant customers at any one time. Meanwhile, in the basement, the bank vaults feature a lounge bar, containing more than 3,000 original stainless steel, engraved safety deposit boxes that once stored gold bullion deposits of £335m (£15b in today's money) and the two metre-wide doors have been retained.

The £220 million investment is now in the hands of Gareth Banner, the managing director of the Ned, who was appointed from his former general manager role at the Renaissance St Pancras hotel, London, and is the person responsible for the hotel on a day-to-day basis, who explained the logistics. "We have a central production kitchen, which feeds into all the restaurants, and a specific kitchen for each restaurant," he says. "The restaurants will all be run independently with their own head chef, restaurant manager and team, while behind the scenes there will be a lot of shared services - such as purchasing."

Staffing the Ned with a team of 800 is what has kept Banner awake at night. The process, however, has been on track, with many individuals being recruited directly from Europe, despite the uncertainty of what Brexit will mean in the long-term

with regard to employing staff from within the EU. Teams of recruiters have appointed in Rome and Barcelona through the offer of attractive packages, rather than wait for individuals to come to the UK and for the Ned to then compete with another 10 businesses for their services.

"It is a worry and a concern for everyone in our industry how the government is going to deal with the immigration situation," says Jones. "Over 75 per cent of the people who work for Soho House in the UK weren't born in this country. I'm sure the government will consider a way around it - they are going to have to."

Once again, the Hospitality Industry in the UK shows its concern for the future of employment of foreigners after Brexit. But for the time being the Ned will no doubt thrive in the competitive world of London hotels. It is still one of Europe's top destinations. The City has never been considered a leisure area especially in the evenings, up until about 10 years ago bars closed at 8.00pm. But with the dining experiences and entertainment on offer at this luxury hotel, it will surely be at the hub of the financial district. The old bank may well welcome more bankers as customers. than used to work there!

AMERICAN developer the Cordish Companies is continuing to insist that its proposed mega-project in Madrid go ahead. The Spanish capital had rejected Cordish's ambitious plan on the grounds that it would cost too much money.

Cordish has now offered to sweeten the deal, which would be among the biggest real estate developments in Spanish history. As well as a massive shopping complex with a cinema and hotels, they want to build a six hectare lagoon with an artificial beach where people can play volleyball and even surf and swim.

The government had been asked to contribute €340 million to the project, together with the €2.2 billion Cordish have at the ready. Madrid thought this figure excessive but, together with the new lagoon

Mega shopping back on track



concept, Cordish has also said that all the city has to contribute is planning permission. They will do the

The ball is now back in the city's court. There are fears that the project could take longer than expected and fill an appetite that doesn't exist in a huge city with its fair share of mega shopping centres.

But Cordish points out that this is no ordinary shopping centre. Like other hundred hectare estates planned for Valencia and the Costa del Sol it will feature luxury suites, a convention centre, sports centre, even museums and concert halls.

They estimate that nine million people would visit the centre each year, while the knock-on effects for Spain's booming construction industry would be enormous.

A demand for luxury

THREE villas on Campello's Muchavista beach in Alicante have been pulled down to make way for 10 luxury apartments.

Campello's General Development Plan (PGOU) drafted in 2011 originally intended to give planning permission for a hotel on the site. Instead, the PGOU was revoked last year by the Supreme Court on a technicality pointed out by a local business-owner who would have been adversely affected by it. For the time being at least, any future development will be in line with the 1986 PGOU.

Although the Supreme Court ruling put the brakes on the local construction sector last year and at the beginning of 2017, there is still a demand for frontline luxury properties. Three villas built last year above the l'Almadrava beach each sold for almost €1.8 million, sector sources said.

The new apartment building will have two 400square metre apartments costing €1 million on each floor. The plans still have to go through as the developers were granted a permit only to demolish the three villas in the La Zofra neighbourhood. Although they now await planning permission some apartments have already been sold.

Going for gold

THE vast majority of foreigners who decide to buy a home in the Spanish sun choose second hand properties rather than new builds.

Latest breakdown figures show that 83.7 per cent of the homes bought by expats last year were second hand. meaning not only that they'd had more than one owner but also weren't built in the past year or two.

That meant that just 16.3 per cent of the 56,000 homes bought by foreigners were new builds. Oddly

enough the statistics suggest that expats favour second hand homes more than Spanish nationals, 81.2 per cent of whom chose older properties.

But further breakdowns can be made between foreign nationalities. For instance the Irish, French and Italians overwhelmingly prefer second hand homes. Norwegians, Belgians and Swedish opt for new builds.

Alternatively Brits and Germans typically don't put too much currency on the

age of the home. Rather they choose size, opting for homes with more than 100 square metres of space.

Regardless of whether the homes favoured are old or new, big or small, foreigners are continuing to buy Spanish in record numbers.

They bought almost 8,000 more homes last year than in 2015. That meant that 13.2 per cent of homes were bought by foreigners, a huge increase from the 4.2 per cent recorded in 2009.

Poppies are beautiful in full wer

THE spring flowers that grace the landscape at this time of year in areas where there has been good winter rain are a marvel to behold.

There is a plethora of colours and forms of flowers from tiny Scarlet Pimpernel to various types of the prominent Chrysanthemum family. An outstanding flower that catches the eye, especially when dominating a field, and that is very symbolic for many people is the poppy.

Poppies have a short lived flower but produce new ones consecutively to give the appearance of flowering for a long period during spring. The typically red common poppy is normally an annual plant of less than a metre in height but if you are cultivating poppies there is a wide range of different colours, sizes and forms available.

They make a great container plant to add colour to a balcony or terrace and in the garden they will brighten up an area where you visit frequently. I have the wild varieties coming up in my vegetable garden, but I let them stay and brighten up the garden during the establishment of the summer vegetable crops until the vegetables need more space.

The true poppies are Papaver species, of which there are over 70, but other families in-



cluding the blue Meconopsis, plumed Macleaya and tree Romneya also have poppy as a common name.

As a cultivated plant the Iceland poppy is a favourite with many gardeners. It lasts for a couple of years so there is not the need to replant each year and the range of different coloured flowers is extensive.

The seed of poppies is very small and grows best when sprinkled on a cultivated soil surface or a potting mix with only a fine coating of mix to cover them or just press them into the soil in early winter and spring.

They sprout naturally in fields that have been cultivated or disturbed because they need to be near the surface and exposed to some light to germinate, so don't bury the seed. The association of the poppy with remembrance is that it grew so prolifically in areas of soil disturbance after military activities and burials in the natural soil.

They can be transplanted but do better

grown from seed in their chosen spot. They grow very quickly, emerging one to two weeks from planting the seed, and can start flowering within weeks.

They don't need much care to grow other than to maintain moisture if they are grown in a good soil mix. A light liquid feed may help if they are not performing so well.

Grow them in a place with plenty of sunlight to maximise flowering and they will be a delight worth remembering.

The sanctuary of the bathroom



Summer days in the shade

The pergola is an extension of living space but can also be freestanding. The structure is based on posts and covered with a roof or arch, made of wood or

edge off the heat of the sun.

Pergolas have been around for a long time and their original purpose was to provide protection from the sun. The origin of the word dates back to 1645-55 from the Italian Latin word, 'pergula,' which means protruding roof, arbour. Their beauty comes in their simplicity, a framework that's waiting to be dressed either with fabric, natural wood or live foliage.

strips that are woven through and look very stylish. Other options are to use retractable canopies that are waterproof and have sun protection factor or to go for ultra luxury with pergola curtains that will give privacy and make you feel rather special.

those decorated with climbing plants, which look and smell beautiful. The plants that can be used are the Chinese Trumpet vine; the Golden Hop, the Morning Glory; the common jasmine, climbing roses, 'Albertine'; Paul's Himalayan Musk, black grape, 'Brant'

Some garden ideas for vertical walls

Trauma in pets - part 3 - some guidelines

IF your cat or dog has a history of trauma, whether suspected or confirmed, here are some guidelines to remember.

1. The cat or dog determines what's traumatising, not you. While you may not have thought that holding your pet down for a simple nail trim was that big a deal, your cat or dog may have a different opinion. Watch your dog's body language for signs of stress such as lip licking, yawning, slower or faster movement, freezing, and turning away so that you can intervene if a situation starts to go south.

2. Create safe places. One of the reasons to teach a dog to go to his or her mat is it is helpful for many dogs due to its clear structure of safety

The mat is a positive place where treats, relaxation, and massage take place. Once the mat becomes a safe place, make sure to keep it that way. Do not allow anything bad happen to your dog on the mat. You can create other safe spaces as well - places in your dog's environment where only good things occur.

3. Give your cat and dog choices. One of the fastest ways to traumatise any mammal is to take away all of his or her choices. Create opportunities for your dog to make choices about his or her environment. schedule, and care as much as possible. Whether you let your dog decide which way to turn at the end of the block, wait for your dog to offer a foot for nail trimming, play with nose work, or give your dog several different beds to choose to sleep on. Cats decide where they are going to sleep.

4. Always try to end on a good note. Research has shown that people who have experienced identically unpleasant

procedures created very different memories of those procedures depending on how traumatic the final moments of the procedure were.

For example, most dogs are concerned about having their feet handled. I file nails instead of clipping them because this is more comfortable for the dog and the dog is in control of how fast or slow nail trimming sessions go. Y

our pet is also free to leave at any time if he gets too scared. At the end of every nail-trimming session, I practise simply

touching the nail file to her toenails for less than a second, followed by a food reward. Because each session ends with these quick successes, they are more comfortable allowing us to handle their feet at the next session.

5. If your pet has a history of trauma, it's important to be aware of that past, but equally important to help your pet succeed in the present.

Mobile phone signal shield

TROUBLE caused by mobile phones could soon be a thing of the past. Nissan claims to have developed new technology which acts as an electromagnetic shield blocking calls and any other notifications.

Drivers would simply drop their phone into the so-called Signal Shield sunk in the armrest and no longer have to worry about being distracted. Crucially for many people, especially those in business, they wouldn't have to switch their phones off altogether and risk losing critical messages.

All of the hundreds of various apps, from weather updates to email messages, would be blocked by the Signal Shield. Many drivers have reported feeling the urge to check their phone each time it buzzes, even

when the vast majority of notifications are useless updates rather than important messages.

The sheer number of beens and buzzes emitting from modern smart phones has led to a huge rise in the number of deaths and injuries on the roads caused by 'distractions.' It's no longer people chatting on the phone that is the deadliest, but those reaching for

The technology also fills a smart and selfish purpose. Users can virtually guarantee that they won't be caught or fined for using their phone.

Recent smart cameras wheeled out onto Spanish roads can check for phone usage, even seatbelt wearing. Police technology to catch offenders is quickly growing stronger.

Mitsubishi Outlander 4

RAPID expansion of new SUV models has meant that one of the long established contenders in the class, the Mitsubishi Outlander, can sometimes be

However, you miss the Outlander at your peril, for it provides a formidable package from a company noted for rugged build quality and excellent reliability. Latest versions have had a recent makeover, delivering smoother styling and equipment upgrades, with prices starting at €29,524 (£24,999).

in petrol hybrid or a seven-seat 2.2 litre diesel, the Outlander is more roomy and more economical than some rivals. All

versions have all-wheel-drive. and it also scores well for levels of standard equipment, with entry versions getting features such as cruise control, auto lights and wipers, dual-zone climate control and electronic parking brake.

My test model, in four trim and with automatic gearbox, was one of the top versions with a wealth of extra kit including premium sat-nav and audio system, 360-degree parking camera, heated steering wheel, rear cross-traffic alert. LED headlamps and daytime running lights, power tailgate, leather upholstery, electric sunroof and alloy wheels. It costs €39,562 (£33,499).

The Outlander has a tougher and more imposing exterior look than most rivals and underway, proves to have good road

manners, with well-weighted steering and a suspension setup which nicely balances ride comfort with cornering poise.

The vehicle is a tad noisier at motorway speeds than some, much of it tyre noise, but in urban areas is quiet, agile and very car-like to drive.

The 147 hp diesel unit pulls strongly and has a nippy 0-100 kph time of 10.2 seconds in manual form, and 11.6 seconds as an automatic. Top speed is 190 kph (118 mph) and the fuel economy is 17.2 kpl (48.7 mpg). The Outlander is also very capable off-road, with a locking centre differential adding to its ability.

The cabin is well built and robustly finished with a quality look, though the overall design is rather plain and functional.

Five adults can be accommodated in comfort - the third-row seats are really just for children. The boot has 590 litres of space if the third row seats are not in use, and this can be boosted to 1,022 litres with the mid-row folded down.

Summing up, the Outlander comes across as a more serious, more capable SUV than some of its trendier rivals and while it has been around for quite a while, in latest revamped form it certainly deserves more at-






Close finish in Spring Triples


