## Green new world

### City to roll out public bicycle system

Almeria is finally jumping on the biking bandwagon.

The council will follow examples set by Murcia, Malaga and Madrid by installing hundreds of public bicycles at key points across the city.

The new scheme involves 400 bikes scattered around 61 locations which can be accessed by a one-off card payment, or by paying €40 for an annual pass.

With the pass users can ride 30 minutes for free, allowing them to hop on, ride to a market, and hop off

again at the nearest bike sta-

On a pay-as-you-go basis bikes will cost just €1 for a half hour ride, with a €10 maximum fee for 24 hours use. The total investment is €600,000, money that mayor Pacheco expects to be well worth the reduction in pollution and improvement of public health.

City officials conducted a major survey to ensure that the green scheme was popular with residents. They found that 48 per cent said they were 'likely' to use it, while 16 per cent would definitely take part.

The most conservative estimate predicts that between 32-35,000 people will use the bike fleet often.

Experiments in Sevilla and Malaga found that many people who start using the public bikes soon decide to buy their own and take up cycling

Bikes will be available for hire 24 hours a day and 365 days a year.





### Immoral porpoises

A SPEEDBOAT owner is in trouble after using his vessel to harass a pod of bottlenose dolphins near the port of Aguadulce.

Marine conservation group EQUINAC has filed an official complaint against the skipper of the boat, whose identity is known to investigators, since the species is protected by Spanish law.

EQUINAC coordinator, Eva Moron, witnessed the incident first hand as she returned from an observation trip, and she said: "We spotted a motorboat near the fish farm which sped up and passed through the farm illegally at a high speed, cutting off the path of the dolphins, then giving chase as they swam away.

"We waved our arms and shouted but they ignored us at first, but then they stopped what they were doing to see why we were upset."

Moron explained how the pod had a calf with them and were "dispersed and frightened," before the boat sped off and stopped right in front of a beach bar "right next to bathers" in another illegal

When it finally reached its mooring in Aguadulce port, the boat was met by two Guardia Civil cars, with patrols in the area having been tipped off by the EQUINAC team.

## Night of legends

The gala event was filmed live on national television and saw some of Europe's finest singers perform works made immortal by the great Padilla. He was one of the top composers of the 20th century who saw his music performed in London, New York and Buenos Aires.

Perhaps his most famous piece was La Violetera which was infamously used in a Charlie Chaplin film by Paramount Pictures without Padilla's permission. Singer Nuria Fergo performed La Violetera in front of thousands of fans and before the

#### Huge hammock howlers' hubbub

SOCIALIST politicians have savaged the annual beach plan for Mojacar put forward by the ruling Popular Party. Opposition councilors from the PSOE claim that the 'retrograde' plan smacks of the influence of a mayor, Rosmari Cano, who has spent too much time in city politics.

They argue that the beach plan favours some businesses over others as Mojacar prepares for an immensely busy summer season. Worse, they accuse Mayor Cano of granting licences to local enterprises on a corrupt, jobs for the boys basis.

PSOE spokesman Manuel Zamora said that new laws would restrict business and reduce employment. Specifically he refers to limits on beach hammocks, and open decks and chairs.

Businesses who want hammocks now have to go through a bizarre bureaucratic ordeal, requesting permission from the Andalucian regional government.

Hammocks are also restricted to between March 15 and October 15 under the ordinance. Critics argue that this sabotages attempts to have Mojacar declared a 365-day destination thanks to its gorgeous weather.

In turn the Popular Party argue the measures are to ensure tourists enjoy the utmost comfort during their stay in Mojacar, with safety being a top priority.

### **Bloody** history not forgotten

IT was the 36th anniversary of the notorious 'Almeria Case' on May 7, and families of the victims held a memorial and called for justice to finally be served.

The shocking incident was one of the most brutal acts of violence during Spain's long war against Basque separatists ETA.

On May 7, 1981 a group of Guardia Civil officers in Almeria abducted three young men from the Basque Country they suspected of being connected to an assassination attempt against the King.

They tortured the trio to extract information but soon realised they were innocent civilians. To cover their tracks they brought the men to Gergal on the outskirts of the Taberna Desert, shot them dead and burned their bodies in a Ford Fiesta. Three days later they claimed they had killed three terrorists during an explosive fire fight.

Only three officers were convicted of the crime, despite 11 being involved. They were jailed for terms ranging from 12 to 24 years, but treated leniently in what the courts described as manslaughter rather than murder.

#### Tune in, turn off

A TUNA company from Vera is under fire following accusations that it sold contaminated fish to shops in Granada and Jaen. At present there are 21 confirmed cases of histamine intoxication suggesting an entire batch of tuna was contaminated before reaching the public.

Samples have been taken from the Garciden factory, which is now under full investigation.

Experts believe it is likely a question of poor hygiene. The firm has been told to recall all unsold from tuna from buvers across the region. Consumers across Almeria and Andalucia who bought fresh tuna between April 25 and May 5 should consult their fishmonger and ask whether it came from Garciden.

None of the 21 people poisoned have severe symptoms. Health problems include headaches, an itchy throat, sweating and redness. Extreme symptoms may include nausea and vomiting. Only between 30 and 40 kilos of the batch is thought to be contaminated.

SPAIN SO CHEESY! Spaniards love their local cheeses as much as their nationally produced wines, with a Denomination of Origin upholding quality nationwide of some leading brands.

### Cheesy cheer

AROUND 100 different varieties of cheese are produced in various regions of Spain ranging from fresh to cured and some fermented to blue.

The key characteristic of each is the type of milk used with currently 13 cheeses with Denominations of Origin - or DO - across the country.

Dependent on the area, time of year, climate and tradition, cheese is produced with milk from cows, goats or sheep, and some products include a mixture.

Each cheese also differs due to varying ageing or curing production processes, with these frequently decades old and identifying with local history and tradition.

Flavours normally fall within three



categories: light, medium or strong, with the latter typically produced with a long curing process and from sheep's milk or a blend.

The Spanish frequently eat cheese daily, and as a general rule, cheese from cows' milk comes from the north in inland areas from Cantabria and the

Basque Country to Castilla-Leon, Castilla La Mancha, Aragon and Extremadura

The Mediterranean coast from Catalonia to Andalucia is mainly famed locally for goats-milk cheese, while the Canary and Balearic Islands are largely known for goats' cheese.

## Majestic Manchego

MANCHEGO is the most famous Spanish cheese, wholly made from the ewe's milk of the Manchega breed of sheep. It is firm and aged from two months to two years.

Protected under the DO classification schemes of both Spain as well as the European Union, it is named after the La Mancha Province where it is produced and which was the home of Don Quixote.

Mild with a taste of salty nuts, it was originally produced to barter at market and to provide a durable food for Spanish shep-

#### Fairground horror

A COURT has been set up to establish whether there is any criminal responsibility regarding an accident at an Almeria fairground, after a teenage girl with dwarfism was thrown out of a ride, plummeted to the ground and broke her leg.

The victim, 13, suffered the injury during the San Marcos celebrations in mid-April, and judges are now investigating.

She lost consciousness before falling

but it is unknown why. Investigators believe she wasn't belted in properly which would suggest a case of negligence rather than criminal responsibility.

#### Royal genius

A TOP scientist from Almeria has won the prestigious honour of being named a Foreign Member of the Royal Society of United Kingdom, the oldest scientific institution in the world. Gines Morata is only the fifth Spaniard to join the illustrious club of intellects, including the Nobel Prize winning Severo Ochoa.

He has won the Prince of Asturias Scientific award in 2007 and the King James I award for research in 1996.

#### Fruity festival

ONE of the biggest fruit and veg festivals on the planet takes place in Almeria this weekend. Exhibitors from dozens of countries, including the UK, Saudi Arabia and Mexico are in the province for the second edition of Infoagro. The festival runs from May 10-12 where some of the most exciting farming technologies are showcased.

### The German connection

DIRECT flights with key cities will help the Costa de Almeria attract more German tourists than ever before this year. Tickets have already been sold for a record 9,000 seats on flights from Munich, Dusseldorf, Hamburg and Stuttgart.

Though a fraction of the number of Brits who swarm to the province each year, it's a major boost for Almeria, which was until very recently invisible to the German market. In 2011 the number of German tourists was virtually zero.

Since then tourist chiefs have buttered up German tour op-

erators at top global events and established direct flights from Almeria airport to the country. Around 50,000 Germans have arrived since 2011, with numbers growing each year.

On average German tourists spend five nights in Almeria. Their numbers will help the province surpass the total of 5.5 million overnight stays enjoyed by tourists last year. Germans also spend highly and are already devoted to Spain. Almeria tech wizards hope to encourage those bored with regular jaunts to Mallorca to try somewhere more exciting.

### Postscript to ponder

The average number of sun-filled hours on the Costa del Sol, making it the sunniest place in Spain with nearly 100 hours more than the Canary Islands in second spot.

#### Bitter pill to swallow

CATALONIA has introduced a controversial sugar tax on a range of soft drinks including some of the world's most famous brands.

Already tagged a 'soda tax,' it could raise as much as €41 million a year for the regional government's coffers, despite an insistence the aim was to improve public health by reducing sugar consumption according to World Health Organisation recommendations.

The tax hike depends on the amount of sugar in a drink, and customers will have to pay more for products like energy drinks, fruit juices made from concentrate, chocolate drinks, sports, and cold tea and coffee drinks.

The central government has previously looked to introduce such a levy nationwide - it is already policy in France and Denmark – but has always backtracked.

#### USA, USA, USA

MANY students aim to work abroad after finishing studying, and 70 per cent of those graduates look to the USA.

A study by a prestigious Barcelona university found more than half preferred to work overseas, with just 46.6 per cent wanting to find a job in Spain.

From a poll of 500 it was discovered only 8.56 per cent wanted to work in Britain and 6.6 per cent in Germany.

#### Donkey work

VANDALS poured yellow paint onto a donkey's back and released it from its enclosure, with its young, in La Pereda de Llanes, in Spain's Asturias region.

They sneaked into the enclosure and poured several litres of plastic paint on the back of four-year-old donkey, Marina, before destroying the enclosure allowing the animal and its two offspring,

A UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1993, Merida is renowned for its Roman architecture and was built as a stylised provincial capital of Rome, centre of an empire.

Founded in 25BC, with the name Emerita Agusta, it has some of the most well-preserved archaeological remains in Spain and was once the most important city in Roman

The city was founded by the Emperor Augustus and his discharged soldiers were employed to protect a pass and bridge over the river Guadiana; the Puente Romana is still used by pedestrians and is the longest of all existing Roman bridges.

Merida remains the capital of Extramadura. Historically its strategic importance was one end of the Silver Way the Via de la Plata - the route between the gold mines of Asturica Augusta and Rome.

Visitors can explore Roman reservoirs still in use, the aqueduct, the Circus Maximus - one of the best examples in the world - and villas with precious mosaics. The Forum includes the Temple of Diana and the theatre is still used to stage Greco-Roman classics or modern plays set in

After the Romans, Merida was important to the Visigoths and by the sixth Century was dominated by bishops as the capital of Hispania and the occupation of the Moors meant the ancient buildings were re-used or expanded but maintained their splendour.

WORLD Press Freedom Day has prompted calls for journalists in Spain to be free of the 'pressures and threats' of political parties.

The Madrid Press Association accuses politicians of trying to undermine the work of the press and calls for the right of the media to comment on events without being bullied.

It has also demanded the repeal of the so-called 'gag law' to allow free speech to be protected to the same standards as under international law.

**Brexit backlash?** 

THE 62nd edition of the world's longest running annual singing contest will take place this Saturday in Kiev, Ukraine, but Britain's entry is not the bookies' favourite.

Ahead of the spectacle, bookmakers Ladbrokes have reported that the UK are looking fairly friendless, with the odds on them taking home the title being bigger than ever before at 50/1.

The bookmakers have even taken several bets on UK entrant Lucie Jones receiving nil points at odds of 14/1.

Nicola McGeady of Ladbrokes told TellyMix: "Punters are preparing for a Brexit backlash from voters judging by the lack of support coming in for Lucie Jones. Usually we are knocked over with patriotic support, but for the first time ever, punters aren't getting behind the UK."

BBC Eurovision host Graham Norton previously admitted he didn't rate Lucie's chances at Eurovision 2017.

He told the Daily Star newspaper: "I'm just not sure it will happen for us this year. I mean, I could be wrong as Germany have won, Austria have won. So, I suppose people who never win, win.

Eurovision 2017 will air on Saturday on BBC One from 8pm.

### Street spirit







## Simply the best

CONSTRUCTION of a new roundabout in Mojacar has been organised by a specialist architect using materials donated by Almanzora Valley quarry king Francisco Cosentino. Part of the roundabout, including the

Indalo at the top, is made from Dekton, a strong new material developed from stone quarries in Macael.

Dekton is considered one of the strongest materials in the business and has revolutionised urban construction across the world. Mojacar has perhaps the most expensive and unbreakable roundabout in Spain, which is saying something.

The Cosentino group is headquartered in Cantoria but has offices throughout the globe. It is best known for its Silestone quartz surfaces for expensive kitchens.

## Punching above their weight

ALMERIA received just 6.6 per cent of the tourists who swarmed into Andalucia last year but came top of the table in traveller reviews. Researchers found that guests in Almeria gave an average mark to the province of 8.4 out of 10.

Sevilla, Malaga, Cadiz and Granada all scored less. Only Cordoba tied with Almeria on 8.4. Visitors to Almeria also stay longer, averaging 8.3 days, than anywhere else except Malaga. The only area Almeria falls short is how much tourists spend, though of course lower prices might be why they give such high marks.

Tourists spend an average of €58.46 in the province each day compared to the Andalucia average of €65 and a hefty €89.23 in Sevilla.

## Cat wars commence

BITING criticism of cat colony treatment has seen the official policy of Almeria's ruling Popular Party described as absurd. Socialist councillor Ines Plaza said it is crazy to concentrate colonies of wild cats around only a few key areas.

She claims that the government should take a leaf out the book of other major European cities which embrace their street cat populations, putting

them to good use. She argues that the very idea an entire population of cats can simply be moved to different areas, without them returning, betrays a basic ignorance of the animal.

It would be far better, Plaza argues, to encourage community solutions and take advice from the hundreds of anonymous caregivers who help look after wild cats, feeding and sterilising them.

The capture, sterilise, release programme has seen many neighbourhoods embrace their pest killing cat populations. Plaza fear that plans to create giant colonies will destroy all this good work.

Under council plans the super cat colonies will be moved to the outskirts of the city and largely left to fend for themselves.

## Mafioso mayor faces jail

THE former mayor of Zurgena and his lackies face a combined total of 180 years in prison and 1,050 years disqualification from public service.

Candido Trabalon and his associates are accused of conspiring to grant hundreds of illegal licences for building homes.

At least 120 homes built illegally across Zurgena during his tenure are thought to have earned him substantial payments.







## The missing Mediterranean Corridor link

**HUNDREDS** of top business leaders from across Almeria and southern Spain protested against systematic neglect of the so-called Mediterranean Corridor, the profitable rail link from Cadiz all the way to France.

The Corridor is a vastly more efficient way to transport goods, particularly fruit and veg, than using thousands of trucks each day to ship Spanish produce to Europe. But its weakest point is in Almeria which has no high speed rail connections,

and Barcelona.

The delay, expected to last until 2023, means that the Almeria-Murcia link is the weakest in the Mediterranean chain, and costing billions in lost revenue each

Almerian businesses are furious about the delay, but the meeting on May 10 saw 600 attendees, many from as far as Barcelona, who are also disgusted by the lost prof-

The large meeting was held under the auspices of the Valencian Association of Entrepreneurs, which has long urged the national government to invest in Almeria. The 600 enraged businessmen heard how much time and money is wasted under present circumstances.

For instance the distance as the bird flies from Almeria to Murcia is just 173 kilometres. Yet by travelling between the cities by train you would have to cover 732 kilometres of track, a trip which easily takes nine

At almost six hours, it now takes much longer to

travel from Almeria to Seville than it does from Glasgow to London.

The entrepreneurs aren't concerned about the effect on travellers or families. Their key concern is the

waste this entails for the transport of millions of tons of goods for export to the EU each year.

Trucks are used for speed, despite the technology for a quick rail network being available for decades.

They have already formed an association In Defence of the Railways, calling for urgent investment and have called for more protests until their voice is heard.




## From dusty desert to national park

ALREADY world famous for its natural parks, Almeria could have another in its midst. There are talks on combining the Tabernas desert and Sierra Alhamila park to create a 'single protected space' under the umbrella of a national natural park.

The prospect has the support of both the Andalucian government's natural resources department and Tabernas mayor Jose Diaz. Local scientists are also delighted by the progress, having urged protective measures for quite some time.

The only true desert on continental Europe, Tabernas has a protected space of almost 12,000 hectares while the Sierra Alhamila park covers more than 8,000. They are very much intertwined but protective measures vary wildely.

Critics have argued the current protection regime is insufficient to properly protect the unique ecosystems seen throughout the desert. Exceptions are presently made for hunting, tourism and adventure sports. A strong filming industry using the spectacular scenery also enjoys more freedom than



conservationists would like.

Under the new plans, hunting would be permitted only as a means of controlling and protecting local wildlife populations. Money from tourism and filming would be used to protect the area, while strict new

measures would be in place to preserve the area's heritage.

If the move goes ahead the expanded area will be Almeria's third protected natural park after the Cabo de Gata-Nijar and Sierra Maria-Los Velez.

## **Brexit overshadowed by General Election**

TO a great extent, Brexit news has taken a back seat to General Election news as the various parties prepare to launch their manifestos.

What is clear is that the Conservatives appear to enjoy a significant lead in the somewhat tarnished opinion polls but that both Labour and the Tories are united in the decision to push Brexit through, if either party is elected to govern.

Only the Liberal Democrats of the 'main' parties who would have to make a comeback akin to David against Goliath want to see a second referendum on the Brexit decision and whilst the SNP are quite determined that they want Scotland to remain in the EU, it appears that their talk of a second independence referendum might just help the Scottish Conservatives.

The French Presidential election could have had a

major effect on the British General Election as if Marine Le Pen had become president, there could well have been a new 'Exiteer' but the success of Emmanuel Macron, leader of La Republique En Marche (Republic on the Move) could help the Conservatives almost unintentionally.

He will be anxious to see whether at the upcoming parliamentary elections, his party can gain any seats but he is already talking about closing down British customs and immigration posts in Calais and making Britain cope with asylum seekers in Dover.

In such a scenario and perhaps because Theresa May has called, once again, for the reduction of migrants to the tens of thousands annually, the British public might consider her to be stronger in the face of a new 'invasion' than Jeremy Corbyn.



BRAVE cancer battler Leo Bermeja is back in Almeria after undergoing six weeks of ground-breaking proton beam therapy in the United States, and the Euro Weekly News was on hand to join the celebrations at his homecoming party.

A sizeable group of friends, family members and supporters gathered at the Laguna restaurant in Las Marinas, Vera, to welcome him back from his six weeks of treatment in Oklahoma and wish a belated happy birthday to big sister Sofia, who recently turned nine.

Among the many gifts on display was a framed copy of one of the first double-page spreads that we ran as part of our ongoing Leo the Lion campaign.

Leo, mum Karen and Sofia were all in high spirits despite suffering from jetlag, having only travelled to Spain from Canada three days beforehand and losing some luggage along the way.

Karen kindly agreed to an exclusive chat with us, during which she explained what will happen next as four-year-old Leo's fight against a rare form of brain cancer continues.

"We're still catching up to be honest," she laughed. "Over the next two weeks I'm planning to let Leo chill a bit and get over the jetlag.

## Property help for young and elderly

IN an effort to assist those who have found it difficult to find affordable accommodation, the Spanish Minister of Development has unveiled the 2018 plan.

Iñigo de la Serna has made it clear that the government is dedicated to helping those that need it the most, namely the young, the elderly and those who have been evicted.

In the case of those aged under 35, the state will make up to €10,800 available to anyone with a salary of less than €22,365.42 so that they can purchase a property, but the maximum of the grant will not exceed 20 per cent of the purchase price.

Provided that recipients earn less than €1,597.53 per month (which is three times the average monthly rent) then financial aid will be made available to assist in the rental of a

So for this group, if they are not purchasing, the government recognises that rental prices are increasing dramatically, especially in certain areas of Spain and will aid those renting a property and pay 50 per cent of the cost of rent which does not exceed €900 per month

for three years.

For those aged 65 with income also less than €1,597.53 per month and a net worth of less than €100,000, they will receive a similar amount to cover rent up to €900 per month for three years or if the property is owned, there will be a

contribution of up to €200 to help with maintenance and utility bills.

There will be cash assistance to companies building apartments to house low income families and the ministry will also help those who have lost their properties or been evicted from rental accommodation

by taking properties held in the Sareb 'property bank' and renting them out at heavily subsidised

With this plan to run from 2018 to 2020, the government expects to spend €321 million a year in overall support and assistance.

## Spanish banks to be questioned over movement of funds for HSBC

ALTHOUGH British-based high street bank HS-BC came through the banking crisis relatively unscathed, it has been accused of a number of irregularities over the years.

Having been fined billions of dollars by the US authorities and also shelling out to the British government, it is now under investigation in France and Spain.

The various bankers will be questioned about their knowledge and involvement.

The Spanish High Court has ruled that seven current and former employees of Banco Santander and three from BNP Paribas Spain must be questioned over allegations of collusion in moving funds for HSBC to an account in Switzerland.

According to the judge who made the decision, the transfers estimated at €74 million were made in a manner which protected HSBC customers from national tax authorities and as such could be considered money laundering once the whole trail is unravelled.

This current investigation started as long ago as 2008 when a self-proclaimed whistle blower Hervé Falciani leaked details of large numbers of customers who had accounts with HSBC's private bank in Switzerland and details were sent to tax authorities in a number of different

The Swiss responded by sentencing the French citizen 'in absentia' to five years imprisonment for industrial espionage.

The various bankers will be questioned about their knowledge and involvement in this matter by way of assistance to the French investigation which is concentrating on the period between

Should any evidence of wrongdoing emerge concerning the Spanish banks involved, a decision will then have to be made as to whether the courts will need to consider further action to establish if any Spanish laws have been broken.

#### Another bank will transfer staff to Frankfurt

ONE of Britain's largest banks Standard Chartered has confirmed that it will be moving several hundred jobs to Frankfurt in advance of

This announcement follows one from US financial giant JP Morgan, which employs about 16,000 people in Britain, which is also planning to move hundreds of jobs from London to Frankfurt, Luxembourg and Dublin.

Although considered a UK bank, Standard Chartered which recently appointed former Deputy Governor of the Bank of Spain and Director of the International Monetary Fund Jose Vinals as Chairman only receives about 5 per cent of its income from the UK market.

Although it currently intends to keep its headquarters in London, its interests in Asia and Europe mean that it cannot afford to chance any banking restrictions following Brexit.

#### Airbnb still under review

FOLLOWING the example of the Barcelona City Council, Madrid is investigating ways of 'policing' untaxed property rentals.

Although there are a number of property portals which offer short term rentals in Madrid and other large cities in Spain, American company Airbnb is the most prolific and successful in the market place.

As previously reported, Barcelona has tried to levy significant fines of the company which has successfully appealed against them, but it has also offered a compromise whereby it will not accept multi-property lets from professional landlords.

The main bone of contention appears to be the fact that significant amounts of local tax may be evaded if short term lettings are made through these portals.

## Barcelona star Neymar is to be charged with fraud

FOOTBALL finance just can't keep out of the news and it has been confirmed that Barcelona star Nevmar will be charged with fraud and corruption.

Like so many South American superstars, the Brazilian's parents are involved in his management as well as day-to-day financial affairs and his father at least will also be charged.

The reason for the prosecution centres on Neymar's transfer from Santos in 2013 with his transfer fee being declared at €17 million, when it was once suggested that the actual fee was €57 million. However the court now suggests the real fee was nearer €25 million.

Following the example of a number of other players, Neymar had a deal with a third party group, in this case the Brazilian investment company DIS which was entitled to 40 per cent of any transfer fee.

The Brazilian's parents are involved in his management.

They received €6.8 million but the court believes that they were 'short changed' by €3.5 million which is the reason for the charges which also include Barcelona president Josep Maria Bartomeu and his predecessor Sandro Rosell, who it is suggested were aware of the de-

Originally in 2016, a Spanish

court ruled that the matter should be subject to a civil action but has now been persuaded by the prosecutor that the player and his father were aware of an allegedly fraudulent arrangement between Barcelona and Santos to defraud DIS.

Prosecutors are calling for a two-year prison sentence and €10 million fine for Neymar whilst DIS want to see five years and at the very least a suspension of his right to play in Spain for the period of any sentence, even if a suspended one.

The Barcelona club has already paid a €5.5 million fine in order to settle a different case with similar circumstances, but these accusations still continue to arise and there is a separate investigation taking place in

To go with this news is an announcement from the Ministry of Employment and Social Security which says that unemployment in Spain fell by 129,281 in April which is a record.

Whilst encouragingly, unemployment amongst those under 25 has dropped, the percentage of young unemployed is still at a high level.

Following some poor figures recently, Andalucia has been one of the leading areas for the fall in the unemployed with its drop exceeding the combined drops of Barcelona and Madrid

So, another day, another EU threat/leak - the dirty games of a rattled European Commission. My boots are worn out with quaking. Soon I'll be terrified of Timmy Far-


Finally, it's interesting that all French politicians end speeches with 'Vive la République' and Americans with 'God bless America.' What's the British equivalent?







Ric Polansky


Ric Polansky moved to Mojacar in 1969 as a pioneer developer. He reads extensively and has travelled in South America panning gold and looking for El Dorado.

THE Utopia that we have today in Mojacar started way back in the 60's when the derelict place was resettled.

A kaleidoscope of fortune hunters arrived along with a gaggle of remittance men, busloads of colourful hippies, dark travellers and societies' usual drop outs all found their way to the hilltop village. Drawn by magnetic waves or spiritual lay lines - they just came.

The itinerant Spanish suddenly noted a confabulation of strangely dressed folk, humble, noisy but not bothersome in the least. No remorse was felt by the locals for the intrusion. It could have been a passing fad of those times or just another circus passing through that had decided to make camp at the Hotel Indalo in the main village plaza.

The colourful costumes worn by the invaders were as pleasant as



their custom to be free with their money and invites. In every case the offer of food or drink was automatically extended to anyone and everyone within listening distance.

Wine no longer became something for just sipping or to drink during fiesta days but, a main staple of daily life; along with the

chance to laugh without examined conscience or dance in public without regard or contrivance.

Young Paco Haro, a barman then at his father's hotel and the author of the recent book witnessed the entire daily show from dawn until sometimes dawn again. He quickly picked up on the programme; all

were to participate or at least watch while the main foreign actors strutted and fretted their hours upon stage and then slumped into a quiet corner than hadn't been peed in.

Within months the street wise Spaniards had understood the concept and soon began participating, that is inviting their distant rela-

tives to the village to observe the shows and share in the tidal wave of free drinks that were flowing.

After all, this is a nation of fiestas so adapting to the latest variety came as easily as smiling. Yet, personal decorum wouldn't yield to random conversation and both armies continued to use outrageous hand signals and arm waving to communicate (a popular contrivance that continues to this day).

In fact, English is a difficult language to learn compared to a world of lexicons, while Spanish is amongst the easiest. But, better than all was the instant acceptance of the other presumed traditions and respect for their past culture.

Everyone got along famously especially as the English insisted on always paying for the drinks. More smiles all around.



### Speeding fines

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieia, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



DURING the latest seven-day campaign focusing on speeding motorists, the Guardia Civil checked some 581.294 vehicles on Spain's roads. Officers found 31,086 were in breach of the law, however the controls conducted by the various local and regional police force also need to be added to these figures, so it is expected to be considerably higher.

The campaign targeted mainly the secondary road network where the majority of serious and fatal incidents occur.

Four of the drivers stopped now face criminal proceedings after they were found to be exceeding the maximum permitted speed limit by more than 80km per hour.

Drivers caught speeding face fines of between €100-600 plus the loss of between two and six points. Exceeding the speed limit by

more than 60km per hour on urban roads, or 80km per hour on major roads, then becomes a criminal offence with the offender facing between six to 12 months in prison, community service and the loss of the driving licence for up to four years, as well as a substantial

Remember, the DGT traffic department website has extended its information into English, French and German, to greater advise and inform foreign drivers.

Via www.dgt.es information is available in English which tells you what to do in the event of receiving a traffic violation ticket. It includes details on what to do if the offending driver is not the vehicle owner, how to pay the fine, either online or in person or at a bank, or appeal it, as well as contact details for speaking to someone about your fine.

The President does not appoint the Administrators. The Community must do that by majority vote at the AGM. The same goes for the naming of auditors.



### Games we played in childhood

IT'S National Children's Day UK this Sunday which aims to highlight the importance of a healthy childhood. Nowadays, with the increasing amount of technology available, it is rare to see children out playing in the street. Remember the fun you had as a child playing games outdoors? Here's a nostalgic look at some of the fun games we used to play.

#### 1. Skipping

Whether you mastered it or not skipping was a great outdoor activity that you could enjoy on your own. It was even better fun though when, armed with your mum's washing line, you and your friends teamed up to jump together. Jumping in, jumping in twos or threes, jumping to rhymes or, for those who were really good, double Dutch!

#### 2. Hide and seek

Who hasn't played this game? It was a great game to play indoors when the weather wasn't great but outside opened up a whole new plethora of hiding places. While the 'seeker' counted to 20, 50 or even 100 (whatever your 'rules' were!) everyone else would run and hide in the hope of being the last person to be found. 'Ready or not, here I come.

A football, a friend and a quiet road is all that was required. Standing opposite each other the aim was to throw the ball off the edge of the kerb so it bounced back to you. If you managed to catch it on the rebound you got points



and the chance to stand in the middle of the road for more points until you missed... then it was your friend's turn. Darn those cars who got in the way of an important game!

#### 4. Tig (or Tag)

A game that favoured the more athletic, most of us will have played this at some point. There really aren't any rules other than run as fast as you can and try not to get caught! The person who was 'it' had to try and catch up with someone else in order to 'tig' or 'tag' them saying 'you're it' when they managed to. Exhausted just thinking about this game

5. Hopscotch (or Peever if you're Scottish!) Remember pavements covered in chalk from hopscotch grids? The game was played by throwing an object (stone/shoe polish tin) and trying to land on a number (eg one). If you did you hopped on one leg, jumping over number one, up to the end and back stopping on number two (and so on) where you had to pick up the object while balancing on one leg, lose your balance and your turn was over! The winner was the first to get all the way to nine and back.

#### Red Rover/British Bulldog

Each group would stand in a line and make a chain (holding hands) and face each other. Each team then took it in turns with one person running towards the other team to try and break through their chain. If you did you rejoined your team and if you didn't you joined their team against your old team. A good old arm bruising game of rivalry!

#### 7. What's the Time Mr Wolf?

Another great chasing game. Players would stand in a line with the 'wolf' standing a few metres away with his back to everyone. Players chanted 'What's the time Mr Wolf?" and the wolf replied a time eg two o'clock. Players then took steps to towards the wolf until he decided 'it's dinner time!' and gave chase. If you didn't make it back to the start without being caught you then became Mr Wolf.

#### Clapping Games

How many hours did you play with your friend clapping hands together in a pattern while chanting a rhyme? Some were easy and some were more complicated. Rhymes will have differed depending where you lived but 'A sailor went to sea, sea, sea...' and 'Under the bramble bushes...' are just two that spring to mind. What was your favourite?

#### 9. Kiss, cuddle, torture

Another chasing game...with a twist! Similar to 'tig' or 'tag' someone was 'it' and had to chase and catch someone else. If you got caught you then had options... kiss, cuddle or torture. What did you choose?

#### 10. Rounders

Basically the UK's version of baseball without a baseball pitch. Any decent sized space was used for an impromptu game using items of spare clothing as bases. One team threw the ball and the person batting tried to hit the ball as far as possible before trying to run round all of the bases and back home before the other team retrieved the ball and put them out.



WORLD ASTHMA DAY has been marked in Spain as experts say there are currently around 235 million asthma patients around the world.

According to the World Health Organisation, (WHO) asthma deaths will increase by almost 20 per cent in the next 10 years if no urgent action is taken. Asthma cannot be cured, but with proper diagnosis and treatment and patient education, it can be controlled and a good quality of life enjoyed. One of the main forms of treatment is through the use of an inhaler, however, reports say that only 9 per cent of asthma patients in Spain, use their inhaler correctly.

A specialist department at Barcelona's Hospital de la Santa Creu i Sant Pau, said inhaled therapy is recommended for asthma as it directly reaches the lungs, but many people do use the inhaler correctly and the medication does not reach the respiratory tract. The Respiratory Group of the Spanish Society of Family and Community Pharmacies, added that many patients also have more than one inhaler to use and often forget which one to use when.

They stress that the use of inhalers requires greater teaching and control by medical staff, both doctors, nurses and pharmacists, at the time of prescribing the device, to ensure it is correctly and effectively used.

Another frequent error is that the condition can have phases of stability, resulting in the patient deciding not to take their medication. However, this can lead to a long term worsening of the condi-

Asthma is one of the most prevalent chronic respiratory diseases in Spain, affecting around 5 per cent of adults and 8-10 per cent of chil-

MEN could be lonelier than you think. A report has concluded that as many as 35 per cent of men in the UK feel lonely at least once a

week, while 11 per cent admitted to feeling lonely most days

The study was carried out by social media site

Gransnet, which reported that the older generation are suffering from an 'epidemic of loneliness' with almost three-quarters describing themselves as lonely. Almost two in five said they could go for days without speaking to anyone and nearly half said they had felt lonely for years as the study authors warned that many, particularly pensioners, were suffering in silence with over 70 per cent saying their family would be shocked to learn

they felt lonely.

Over 25 per cent of men aged 65 to 69 blamed retirement for their loneliness as they had lost that connection with going to work and being around colleagues, although the study found that 35 was the age when a man felt the loneliest.

Moving away from family and friends was also a main cause of loneliness in respondents, as well as going through a break up, being unemployed and the death of a family member.

#### Pain of sciatica

#### 1. What is sciatica and when does it usually occur?

Sciatica is simply pain felt in the lumbar area that can spread to both legs usually caused by a pinched nerve. Although it can happen at any age, it tends to be most common amongst the elderly due to arthritis in the spinal column. It can also appear after strenuous physical activities causing herniated discs.

#### 2. What are the symptoms?

The main symptoms of sciatica are muscle cramps, back pains that can spread to the legs as well as difficulty in making certain movements, and in some cases being unable to move your legs.

#### 3. What causes sciatica?

The main causes of sciatica are arthritis and herniated discs in the spine. They are most common amongst the elderly and the young after overexerting themselves lifting heavy loads, or bad posture when sitting, among other things.

#### 4. How can it be treated?

Usually a course of anti-

inflammatories, analgesics, muscle relaxants and rest are effective in managing the symptoms. Depending on the cause of a person's sciatica it may be necessary to have an operation, such as having herniated

Physiotherapy is also very beneficial for sciatica sufferers.

#### 5. Can you prevent having sciatica?

Certain exercises which strengthen muscles. avoiding bad postures, not overexerting when lifting and sitting correctly are all ways to minimise the chances of suffering from sciatica.

#### 6. Is there a specific exercise which helps?

Any form of exercise which does not strain your back is helpful, as it strengthens your muscles and helps improve blood

Generally swimming, yoga, pilates and other similar exercises are all very beneficial.

#### 7. Is it hereditary?

In general it is not hereditary. Just because parents suffer from sciatica it does not mean their children will too.

THE first electric car in Spain adapted for people with reduced mobility, has been created.

The Nissan eNV200 has been adapted thanks to the expertise of ILUNION Adaptación de Vehículos which belongs to the ONCE group of social enterprises and its Foundation.

ILUNION said the technical department of Nissan was instrumental in developing this first prototype as there are very strict protocols and guidelines to be followed on this type of vehi-

The Nissan is a five-seater vehicle and has space for a person in a wheelchair.

ILUNION hopes that this could be a 'car of the future' for those with disabilities and opens the door to making electric taxis more accessible in city centres, making services more accessible for all and more environmentally friendly.

### Popping a pill to replace the treadmill

A PILL could soon give the effect you have had a workout, without you raising a finger.

Scientists say a chemical called PPARD is linked to aerobic endurance. In tests with mice, the researchers used a smallmolecule drug to activate PPARD in the muscles of mice. It increased the fat burning in their muscles, similar to what happens during exercise, despite them being sedentary, and also increased endurance by up to 70 per cent. It is hoped these findings and their research could lead to an 'exercise pill' that would allow people to reap the benefits of a workout without actually doing one.

### Mutual massage is good for both of you

GIVING a massage will not only make your partner feel good, but it will make you feel pretty good too.

That's according to researchers who got couples to spend 15 minutes giving their partner a massage two or three times a week. They found that couples who did this showed significant improvements in their well-being, stress and relationship satisfaction.

The study, which involved 38 couples, reports those who gave the massage felt around 9 per cent better overall, compared to 12 per cent for those who received the massage. It measured their mental well-being during a three-week course where they were taught massage skills and three weeks after it had finished.

Nine out of 10 couples in the study said they would recommend mutual massage.

### The Sunday Times Rich List -Just to make you Feel Good

HERE ARE NOW MORE BIL-LIONAIRES living in the UK than ever before despite fears over Brexit, the Sunday Times Rich List has revealed

This year's list found the richest 1,000 people and families have a record total wealth of £658 billion, a rise of 14 per cent on last year's £575 billion figure.

The wealthiest people in the UK are elderly brothers Sri and Gopi Hinduja, whose latest project is to convert the Old War Office in London into a luxury five-star hotel and 88 luxury apartments for the super-rich.

The pair first topped the list in 2014 and now have a fortune of £16.2 billion, made



through investments spanning the oil and gas, automotive, IT, energy, media, banking, property and healthcare sectors.

They are now among 134 billionaires on the list - a record number in the UK and 14 more than last year's.

In today's world, being simply a millionaire no longer secures you a place on the Rich List, with a fund of £110 million now needed to get you a place in the top 1,000. Two decades ago people needed a fortune of only (sic) £15 million to make the cut.

Robert Watts, compiler of the rankings. said: "While many of us worried about the outcome of the EU referendum, many of the richest people just kept calm and carried on making billions."

AND SPEAKING OF MILLIONS, regular readers may recall me mentioning about how in the 80's cities were closing banks down and entrepreneurs were converting them into restaurants and fashionable wine bars and brasseries. I commented that the practice had seemed to have faded. So it was with some interest that I read from London that the former Sir Edwin Lutyens-designed Midland Bank building on Poultry, just a minute's walk from the Bank of England, has been turned into a luxury

The Ned - the largest and most ambitious hotel to launch in London this year is set to welcome its first quests.

A former Caterer named Hotelier of the Year 2015, Nick Jones is the man behind the enormous project. He never intended to open a hotel in the City of London. The capital's financial centre is not a typical location for an outpost of Soho House & Co,

the company founded by Jones 22 years ago and renowned for attracting guests and members from the media and entertainment industries.

He was told about the availability of the building by the landlord of Little House, one of 18 members' clubs owned and operated by Soho House & Co worldwide. "I wasn't particularly keen to go along, but I didn't want to appear rude," he recalls. "The banking floor was jaw-droppingly beautiful," he said. "I clambered up on the roof, with its views over St Paul's, and immediately saw the huge potential the property offered as a hotel and collection of restaurants "

The hotel features 252 bedrooms, nine restaurants, two swimming pools - one on the rooftop and one in the basement - a spa, members' club and much more. The Ned is a beautiful, multifaceted beast, which required the help of a partner to create. After speaking to Ron Burkle, the American investor who acquired a 60 per cent stake in Soho House & Co in 2012, Jones met with Andrew Zobler, the founder and chief executive of Sydell Group. Burkle is also the main financial backer of Sydell Group, a company that has experience of grand renovation projects through the opening of six hotels in the US during the past five years.

"That was the start of our collaboration and it's been fantastic," enthuses Jones. "We love each other more than we did at the beginning, which is unusual when you're involved in a project of this scale."

While Soho House & Co has extensive experience of developing a variety of hospitality businesses - as well as the members' clubs (12 of which feature bedrooms and welcome non-members), it has also created 16 restaurant brands nothing comes close to the scale of the Ned, which covers nearly 30,000 square

Jones and his team made the most of the building, encouraging him to look to its banking heritage for design cues. Hence, much use has been made of the banking hall's original walnut-panelled counters, used by tellers, repurposed as bar counters and dividers between the different restaurants.

Once bustling with bank customers, the space will now buzz with some 850 restaurant customers at any one time. Meanwhile, in the basement, the bank vaults feature a lounge bar, containing more than 3,000 original stainless steel, engraved safety deposit boxes that once stored gold bullion deposits of £335m (£15b in today's money) and the two metre-wide doors have been retained.

The £220 million investment is now in the hands of Gareth Banner, the managing director of the Ned, who was appointed from his former general manager role at the Renaissance St Pancras hotel, London, and is the person responsible for the hotel on a day-to-day basis, who explained the logistics. "We have a central production kitchen, which feeds into all the restaurants, and a specific kitchen for each restaurant," he says. "The restaurants will all be run independently with their own head chef, restaurant manager and team, while behind the scenes there will be a lot of shared services - such as purchasing."

Staffing the Ned with a team of 800 is what has kept Banner awake at night. The process, however, has been on track, with many individuals being recruited directly from Europe, despite the uncertainty of what Brexit will mean in the long-term

with regard to employing staff from within the EU. Teams of recruiters have appointed in Rome and Barcelona through the offer of attractive packages, rather than wait for individuals to come to the UK and for the Ned to then compete with another 10 businesses for their services.

"It is a worry and a concern for everyone in our industry how the government is going to deal with the immigration situation," says Jones. "Over 75 per cent of the people who work for Soho House in the UK weren't born in this country. I'm sure the government will consider a way around it - they are going to have to."

Once again, the Hospitality Industry in the UK shows its concern for the future of employment of foreigners after Brexit. But for the time being the Ned will no doubt thrive in the competitive world of London hotels. It is still one of Europe's top destinations. The City has never been considered a leisure area especially in the evenings, up until about 10 years ago bars closed at 8.00pm. But with the dining experiences and entertainment on offer at this luxury hotel, it will surely be at the hub of the financial district. The old bank may well welcome more bankers as customers. than used to work there!

### Mega shopping back on track

AMERICAN developer the Cordish Companies is continuing to insist that its proposed mega-project in Madrid go ahead. The Spanish capital had rejected Cordish's ambitious plan on the grounds that it would cost too much money.

Cordish has now offered to sweeten the deal, which would be among the biggest real estate developments in Spanish history. As well as a massive shopping complex with a cinema and hotels, they want to build a six hectare lagoon with an artificial beach where people can play volleyball and even surf and swim.

The government had been asked to contribute €340 million to the project, together with the €2.2 billion Cordish have at the ready. Madrid thought this figure excessive but, together with the new lagoon concept, Cordish has also said that all the city has to contribute is planning permission. They will do the

The ball is now back in the city's court. There are fears that the project



could take longer than expected and fill an appetite that doesn't exist in a huge city with its fair share of mega shopping centres.

But Cordish points out that this is no ordinary shopping centre. Like other hundred hectare estates planned for Valencia and the Costa

del Sol it will feature luxury suites, a convention centre, sports centre, even museums and concert halls.

They estimate that nine million

people would visit the centre each year, while the knock-on effects for Spain's booming construction industry would be enormous.

### Foreign buyers on the increase

THE vast majority of foreigners who decide to buy a home in the Spanish sun choose second hand properties rather than new builds.

Latest breakdown figures show that 83.7 per cent of the homes bought by expats last year were second hand, meaning not only that they'd had more than one owner but also weren't built in the past year

That meant that just 16.3 per cent of the 56,000 homes bought by foreigners were new builds. Oddly enough the statistics suggest that expats favour second hand homes more than Spanish nationals, 81.2 per cent of whom chose older properties.

But further breakdowns can be made between foreign nationalities. For instance the Irish, French and Italians overwhelmingly prefer second hand homes. Norwegians, Belgians and Swedish opt for

Alternatively Brits and Germans typically don't put too much currency on the age of the home. Rather they choose size, opting for homes with more than 100 square metres

Regardless of whether the homes favoured are old or new, big or small, foreigners are continuing to buy Spanish in record numbers.

They bought almost 8,000 more homes last year than in 2015. That meant that 13.2 per cent of homes were bought by foreigners, a huge increase from the 4.2 per cent recorded in 2009.

Naturally the Mediterranean coastlines continue to be the favourite haunt of expats looking for a home in the sun. Some 47,000 of the 56,000 purchased were on the long glorious coastline be-Gibraltar tween Barcelona

THREE villas on Campello's Muchavista beach in Alicante have been pulled down to make way for 10 luxury apart-

Campello's General Development Plan (PGOU) drafted in 2011 originally intended to give planning permission for a hotel on the site.

#### A demand for luxury

Instead, the PGOU was revoked last year by the Supreme Court on a technicality pointed out by a local business-owner who would have been adversely affected by it.

For the time being at least,

any future development will be in line with the 1986

Although the Supreme Court ruling put the brakes on the local construction sector last year and at the beginning

of 2017, there is still a demand for frontline luxury properties. Three villas built last year above the l'Almadrava beach each sold for almost €1.8 million, sector sources said.

The new apartment building will have two 400-square metre apartments costing €1 million on each floor.

### Poppies are beautiful in bloom

THE spring flowers that grace the landscape at this time of year in areas where there has been good winter rain are a marvel to behold.

There is a plethora of colours and forms of flowers from tiny Scarlet Pimpernel to various types of the prominent Chrysanthemum family. An outstanding flower that catches the eye, especially when dominating a field, and is very symbolic for many is the poppy.

Poppies have a short-lived flower but produce new ones consecutively so appear to flower for a long period during

spring. The typically red common poppy is normally an annual plant of less than a metre in height but if you are cultivating poppies there is a wide range of different colours, sizes and forms available.

They make a great container plant to add colour to a balcony or terrace and in the garden they will brighten up an area where you visit frequently. I have the wild varieties coming up in my vegetable garden, but I let them stay and brighten up the garden during the establishment of the summer vegetable crops until the vegetables need more space.

The true poppies are Papaver

species, of which there are over 70. but other families including the blue Meconopsis, plumed Macleaya and tree Romneya also have poppy as a common

As a cultivated plant the Iceland poppy is a favourite with many gardeners. It lasts for a couple of years so there is not the need to replant each year and the range of different coloured flowers is extensive.

The seed of poppies is very small and grows best when sprinkled on a cultivated soil surface or a potting mix with only a fine coating of mix to cover them or just press them into the soil in early winter

They sprout naturally in fields that have been cultivated or disturbed because they need to be near the surface and exposed to some light to germinate, so don't bury the seed. The association of the poppy with remembrance is that it grew so prolifically in areas of soil disturbance after military activities and burials in the nat-

They can be transplanted but do better grown from seed in their chosen spot. They grow very quickly, emerging one to two weeks from planting the seed, and can start flowering within weeks.

### Shady solution for hot summer days

IN the summer, everyone loves to be outdoors and there's nothing better than sitting under a pergola, to take the edge off the heat of the sun.

The pergola is an extension of living space but can also be freestanding. The structure is based on posts and covered with a roof or arch, made of wood or metal.

Pergolas have been around for a long time and their original purpose was to provide protection from the sun. The origin of the word dates back to 1645-55 from the Italian Latin word, 'pergula,' which means protruding roof, arbour. Their beauty comes in their simplicity, a framework that's waiting to be dressed either with fabric, natural wood or live foliage.

Ancient Egyptians used reeds or palm leaves and Tuscans used grape vines on their pergolas. You could also use branches or bamboo; lattice panels that have a criss-crossed slat pattern, but don't give full protection; or fixed fabric in one piece or strips that are woven through. Other options are to use retractable canopies that are waterproof and have sun protection factor or to go for ultra luxury with pergola curtains that will give privacy and make you feel rather special.

The most beautiful pergolas are those decorated with climbing plants. Use Chinese Trumpet vine, Golden Hop, Morning Glory, common jasmine, climbing roses, 'Albertine,' Paul's Himalayan Musk, black grape, 'Brant' or Wisteria.

#### Let sleeping dogs lie

THE structure of a dog's sleep is very similar to a human being's sleep. There are stages of wakefulness, rapid-eye-movement REM sleep and nonrapid eye-movement sleep.

While asleep, the dog's brain is trying to find shortcuts or connections between things that they have experienced. The events of the day are put into categories, when in non-REM sleep. In REM sleep there is an opportunity for the dog to explore, in an environment that's free of consequences.

Dogs enter REM sleep about 20 minutes into a snooze session and might stay there for two to three minutes. People and dogs dream in both stages of sleep mentioned, but most dreams are remembered through REM sleep.

IF your cat or dog has a history of trauma, whether suspected or confirmed, here are some guidelines to remember.

1. The cat or dog determines what's traumatising, not you. While you may not have thought that holding your pet down for a simple nail trim was that big a deal, your cat or dog may have a different opinion. Watch your dog's body language for signs of stress such as lip licking, yawning, slower or faster movement, freezing, and turning away so that you can intervene if a situation starts to go south. Pushing through such situations can almost guarantee that they'll create

new fear triggers in many cats

2. Create safe places. One of the reasons to teach a dog to go to his or her mat is it is helpful for many dogs due to its clear structure of safety.

The mat is a positive place where treats, relaxation, and massage take place, we can create a positive conditioned emotional response to the mere presence of this training method. Once the mat becomes a safe place, make sure to keep it that way. Do not allow anything bad happen to your dog on the mat. You can create other safe spaces as well - places in your dog's environment where good things occur and where there is no pressure placed on the dog.

3. Give your cat and dog choices. One of the fastest ways to traumatise any mammal is to take away all of his or her choices. Create opportunities for your dog to make choices about his or her envi-

ronment, schedule, and care as much as possible. Whether you let your dog decide which way to turn at the end of the block, wait for your dog to offer a foot for nail trimming, play with nose work, or give your dog several different beds to choose to sleep on, choice is hugely important. Cats decide where they are going to sleep.

Set your dog up to make good choices, then reward those choices to build the dog's confidence.

4. Always try to end on a

good note. Research has shown that people who have experienced identically unpleasant procedures created very different memories of those procedures depending on how traumatic the final moments of the procedure were. While we don't know whether dogs have the same cognitive

recall abilities, it certainly doesn't hurt to try to make the last few seconds of any unpleasant experience as pleasant as possible.

For example, most dogs are concerned about having their feet handled. I file nails instead of clipping them because this is more comfortable for the dog and the dog is in control of how fast or slow nail trimming sessions go. Your pet is also free to leave at any time if he gets too scared. At the end of every nail-trimming session, I practise simply touching the nail file to her

toenails for less

than a second, followed by a food reward. Because each session ends with these quick successes, they are more comfortable allowing us to handle their feet when it is time for the next session

**5.** Your cat or dog is not his story. If your pet has a history of trauma, it's important to be aware of that past, but equally important to help your pet succeed in the present. Too often, we get caught up with the stories, we tell ourselves about our pets' past, and forget to pay attention to the animal in front of us.

### Phone signal shield

All of the hundreds of various apps, from weather updates to email messages, would be blocked by the Signal Shield. Many drivers have reported feeling the urge to check their phone each time it buzzes, even when the vast majority of notifications are useless updates rather than important messages.

The sheer number of beens and buzzes emitting from modern smart phones has led to a huge rise in the number of deaths and injuries on the roads caused by 'distractions.' It's no longer people chatting on the phone that is the deadliest, but those reaching for it.

The technology also fills a smart and selfish purpose. Users can virtually guarantee that they won't be caught or fined for using their phone.

### Mitsubishi Outlander 4

RAPID expansion of new SUV models has meant that one of the long established contenders in the class, the Mitsubishi Outlander, can sometimes be

However, you miss the Outlander at your peril, for it provides a formidable package from a company noted for rugged build quality and excellent reliability. Latest versions have had a recent makeover, delivering smoother styling and equipment upgrades, with prices starting at €29,524 (£24,999).

Available as a five-seat plugin petrol hybrid or a seven-seat 2.2 litre diesel, the Outlander is more roomy and more economical than some rivals. All

versions have all-wheel-drive. and it also scores well for levels of standard equipment, with entry versions getting features such as cruise control, auto lights and wipers, dual-zone climate control and electronic parking brake.

My test model, in four trim and with automatic gearbox, was one of the top versions with a wealth of extra kit including premium sat-nav and audio system, 360-degree parking camera, heated steering wheel, rear cross-traffic alert. LED headlamps and daytime running lights, power tailgate, leather upholstery, electric sunroof and alloy wheels. It costs €39,562 (£33,499).

The Outlander has a tougher and more imposing exterior look than most rivals and underway, proves to have good

manners, with well-weighted steering and a suspension setup which nicely balances ride comfort with cornering poise.

The vehicle is a tad noisier at motorway speeds than some, much of it tyre noise, but in urban areas is quiet, agile and very car-like to drive.

The 147 hp diesel unit pulls strongly and has a nippy 0-100 kph time of 10.2 seconds in manual form, and 11.6 seconds as an automatic. Top speed is 190 kph (118 mph) and the fuel economy is 17.2 kpl (48.7 mpg). The Outlander is also very capable off-road, with a locking centre differential adding to its ability.

Stats panel:

The cabin is well built and robustly finished with a quality look, though the overall design is rather plain and functional.

Five adults can be accommodated in comfort - the third-row seats are really just for children. The boot has 590 litres of space if the third row seats are not in use, and this can be boosted to 1,022 litres with the mid-row folded down.

Summing up, the Outlander comes across as a more serious, more capable SUV than some of its trendier rivals and while it has been around for quite a while, in latest revamped form it certainly deserves more at-

### Indalo Bowling Club Men's and **Ladies' Pairs Competitions 2017**


TWO of the most keenly fought competitions were held recently at Indalo Bowling Club, the Men's and Ladies' Pairs.
