# Going down 

Owners of killer dogs sued

By Linda Hall

The family of Jose Selles are taking legal action against the owners of the six dogs who killed him.
They were not entered on the Dangerous Animals Register and their owners had neither licences nor civil liability insurance for them, the family claimed.
The Boxer-American Staffordshire crosses set upon the frail 74 -year-old as he pruned vines at his home in El Faldar, Pinoso last October. He died later in hospital of shock and the severity of his wounds.
Selles's family as well a neighbour who was bitten by the dogs on a previous occasion and the vet in charge of the animals immediately after the attacks have now made statements to an investigating judge in Novelda.

At first the animals were confined to their enclosure on their owner's property where they were kept under surveillance by the Local Police. They were later taken to a local vet and finally to an animal shelter where they were put down in January.

THE Catalonian city of Valls is famous for its calcots - a type of scallion or green onion - and the tradition of building human towers, known as castells. With a population of 24,285 , it is capital of the Alt Camp comarca and lies 69 km from Barcelona and 26 km from regional capital Tarragona.

The feasting on calcots is known as a Calcotada. The large sweet-flavoured green onion is barbecued and dipped into a special sauce. The traditional meal continues with the onion being served with meat and sausages grilled over the same coals, washed down with locally produced wines.

Calcots are available December to May and people travel from Barcelona to sample the crop. Grown locally, the vegetable has a protected geographical status in the same way as many wines.
Valls is also the birthplace of castells, a tradition of human tower building that has spread across Catalonia. Historically a small tower was made at the end of a traditional dance but because of the rivalry of different groups taking part - known as colles - the constructions became higher and more complicated.
The festival of Sant Joan in June is the start of the human tower season and the first Sunday after Santa Ursula's Day on October 21 in Placa del Blat there is perhaps the most important exhibition of castells.
Valls is the birthplace of composer Robert Gerhard, 1896-1970, and visitors can enjoy exploring an old town and its historic churches, chapels and the Call Jueu, the Jewish ghetto near the gothic church of San Joan.

THE Valencian Community's Upper Court of Justice (TSJCV) suspended the regional Education department's programme for multilingual teaching in state schools.
The TSJCV ruling is a precautionary measure while the tribunal examines the Alicante Province Diputacion's appeal against the new system.
Regional Education chief Vicent Marza intends that classes in state schools will eventually be taught in different combinations of Spanish, Valenciano and English. The scheme is due to start with reception classes in September and should be fully in place by 2020 .

Preference clearly goes to Valenciano as schools can choose their level of each language, but those opting for more classes taught in Spanish than Valenciano lose out on English.
"This is a triumph for the Diputacion's defence of the interests and identity of Alicante province," said its president Cesar Sanchez following the court decision.
"Society cannot be built by only focusing on what separates us, but by looking at what unites us and what we have in com-

"Nor could this be achieved by attacking the sociological reality that Alicante Province speaks both Spanish and Valenciano," Sanchez continued.
As reported recently in the Euro Weekly News, many parents and parents' associations
are now demonstrating against the multilingual programme.
Resistance to the regional government's plans is particularly noticeable in zones where little Valenciano is spoken but exists even where it is more often heard than Spanish.
Many foreign residents feel

Marza has lodged a counter appeal against the suspension. He called for calm, declaring

## Disappearing drugs mystery

ANAESTHETICS and drugs used during operations disappeared for years from the pharmacy of a Valencia City hospital.
The shortfall at the Doctor Peset teaching hospital was so conspicuous that Health department inspectors alerted the Public Prosecution's anti-drug section to the need for an in-depth investigation.
"A considerable quantity of opiates were dispensed without therapeutic justification or a personalised doctor's prescription as required by standard practice," the inspectors reported.
Investigators have now spent months trying to discover who took thousands of doses of fentanyl, pethidine and morphine dis pensed for the Anaesthetics and Recovery department and why they were taken. Over the last few weeks a Valencia City court has been taking statements from those in charge of the hospital departments involved.
According to sources quot ed in the national daily $E l$ Mundo they put the disappearances down to defective record-keeping and labelling.
"A considerable number of documents do not correspond to actual prescriptions," investigators found. Double prescriptions, missing prescriptions and in some cases prescriptions with very high doses were incorrectly dated, making the mystery still harder to unravel. Many were not administered to patients and added together they exceeded the phar-
macy's stock of opiates. One line of enquiry believes there could be a connection between the missing drugs and the death of a hospital doctor. He was under investigation for "drug abuse" and committed suicide in 2014
Asked to comment by El Mundo the hospital said it preferred not to make declarations until the enquiry was over.

## Inland wells are running dry

THE Villena-Benejama aquifers supplying Alto and Medio Vinalopo towns will begin to run dry by 2031.
Some urban areas along the Alicante coast and Marina Baja
municipalities also use this subterranean water but the state of the interconnected and over-exploited wells is no longer worrying but 'alarming.'
Experts from the Central Committee of Vinalopo, L'Alacanti and Marina Baja Users

said that levels at these vital wells would start to descend in 2031. By 2040 they will have fallen so much that they will no longer supply water fit for human consumption or irrigation purposes, they predicted.
Each year their levels drop by 10 metres and although abundant rain and snow last winter provided some respite, the experts dismissed this as "a fleeting mirage.'

The Central Committee presented these statistics to the Va lencian Community's parliament, Les Cortes, warning the different public administrations involved of the critical situation that will face inland towns unless significant and urgent steps are taken.
"To guarantee the recovery of these wells, it is necessary to stop extracting water for agriculture which consumes huge amounts of water. This could easily be substituted with water from the Jucar," said regional MP David Cerdan.
The politician also suggested a restriction on water extracted for urban use.

BRITISH Consul Sarah-Jane Morris remains "optimistic" Britain and its former European Union partners will quickly strike a deal over expats rights after Brexit.
She was visiting Calpe and told a meeting all parties were "keen" to protect the interests of UK citizens living in Europe and EU citi-

zens living in Britain.
"We in both the British government and members of the EU are very keen to get a result on citizens' rights as soon as possible; I am optimistic we will find something out in the next few months," said Mrs Morris.
"They will probably fall out over fishing rights for some years to come but on citizens' rights, everyone is on the same page."
"For European citizens who are not living in their home countries, their rights will be respected; I am confident their position will not change; although we do not know what the final deal will look like yet."
Mrs Morris and Calpe Councillor Carole Saunders were guests of Calpe's Association of Foreign Property Owners; the consul returning to speak about Brexit after last joining AF-

PO in October.
She said the consulate network in Spain would continue to look at numbers of British nationals living in the country, where they were living and what their situation was; feeding information back to the government's Department for Leaving the EU.
"I listen to your concerns, go back and speak to the ambassador; concerns I pick up and the mood on the street, and what specific issues come up, some were flagged up right at the beginning," said Mrs Morris.

And she said there were a number of pressure groups that had launched after last year's referendum aimed at protecting expats' rights in Europe, such as the Madrid-based Eurocitizens and ECREU.
"If you do have concerns, you might want

to look at some of these groups and make sure your local council, certainly the Costa Blanca councils, are aware of what the Brexit implications might be," she added.
Mrs Morris said if people picked up things "on the rumour mill" and were concerned; they should contact the consulate or visit the official 'gov.uk' web site.

She said health, pensions, education, and property rights were among the top concerns and would be addressed.
"It is in Spain's interest to get as many Brits to stay here as possible; you are helping keep these local towns afloat; it is in Spain's interest that you don't go anywhere," she said.
And Mrs Morris said the UK's close relationship with Spain dated back to
before Spain became a member of the EU. "I think common sense will prevail, that's just my take but I
would like to think people are in a similar position; people will want to carry on with the current position be-
cause it works very well." Mrs Saunders said Calpe Mayor Cesar Sanchez was also the president of the provincial government and it was estimated there were between 250,000 and 300,000 British citizens in Alicante. "Everyone I meet says 'don't worry' we will get it organised," she said. "I think
they know we are important.
"The amount of British people coming on holiday to the Costa Blanca is still rising; there was a boom in house sales in the last year, it has gone down but only because people are doubtful about the future. Please don't worry. They cannot do without us and they know it."

Back to nature

AN AID package of almost $€ 400,000$ has been pledged to a Marina Alta town hit by a devastating forest fire last September.

The Valencia regional government and the provincial council of Alicante will commit the cash to help recovery of a fragile eco-system and help prevent a repeat of the natural disaster which hit Javea's Granadella.

Javea Town Hall hosted a meeting of local councillors, The Generalitat Valenciana, the Diputacion de Alicante, and a number of advisors to

discuss the recovery of the protected land.
The local authority has already earmarked $€ 200,000$ to the rehabilitation of the area; work so far has involved the felling and removal of burnt trees and strengthening of historic terraces to help prevent erosion.
And biologists Jaume Soler and Ignasi Astor remain optimistic about the recovery of the forest because of the quality of the soil and sufficient rainfall; however, they advise against the return to the previous pine woods and the density of the trees.

They hope to see typical Mediterranean species replanted, recreating a unique character and helping guard against a repetition of similar fire sweeping across the area.

Mr Soler said a forest fire on Javea's La Plana September 2014 - the other side of
the municipality - had proved to be a "laboratory" for regeneration and had shown "very positive" recovery.
Valencia has promised around $€ 150,000$ to helping the landscape recover, the continued removal of fire debris and preventing harmful erosion through storms and wind.
Alicante will add another $€ 200,000$ to help protect the unique urban-forest areas of southern Javea, also taking in Cansalades. A further $€ 42,000$ will be spent in areas escaping the fire, thinning out woodland to reduce the density of the trees, encouraging other fauna, and helping prevent a similar disaster.
A series of meetings with residents has also taken place as part of an inclusive fire prevention scheme designed to help protect the countryside and private and public property.

Benidorm school tender


SCHOOL: Work needs to begin for improvements, as four classrooms have been closed due to cracks.


BENIDORM City Council has released details of a tender, asking interested parties to to bid for reconstruction work at the Vasco Nuñez de Balboa school.
The work is to include repairing of cracks which have forced the closure of four classrooms, demolition of an office, and the replacement of wooden flooring in the gymnasium.
In December 2015, the council committed a figure of $€ 300,000$ for improvements to be made at the school, but this is the first sign of any work taking place.
Closing date for tender bids is Friday June 3 and the council have set a maximum figure of $€ 34,500$ for the completed work.

A new skyscraper for Benidorm beachfront

A CONSTRUCTION company is planning to build an ambitious frontline tower block, the first one to be built on the Poniente beachfront of La Cala de Benidorm.

Goya Real Estate revealed the plans to opposition members of the city council last week, having already received approval from the ruling PP party.

The company has purchased a plot of land previously belonging to the Gran Hotel Delfin at the end of Poniente beach immediately on the beach.
They are looking for unanimous backing from all parties within the city council before they can submit a design for the construction, as they currently do not even have the authorisation to complete the segregation of the land from the hotel.

They are proposing a single, tall, candle-shaped tower, similar in design to the famous ' $W$ ' hotel in Barcelona, with 22 floors, housing around 44 apartments, although plans are subject to changes depending on approval.
They envisage the 140 square metre, luxury apartments will have a price tag in the region of $€ 700,000$, in line with the cost of similar homes in the Intiempo and Sunset Drive developments, close by, but further back from the beach.

THE bus stop at San Juan hospital will return to its original site outside the main entrance within days.
The road in front of the hospital was in such bad condition that drivers and pedestrians were at risk, said the Local Police who recommended closing it until repairs were carried out.

The hospital management complied, spending $€ 120,000$ on improving the road while relocating the bus-stop.
This was moved to the Centro de Transfusiones and complaints have flooded in since the change. The hospital serves not only San Juan but also the L'Alacanti area and patients
and visitors who use the bus to reach the hospital objected that the new stop was particularly inconvenient for those with reduced mobility.

After talks between the hospital management, San Juan Town Hall and the regional government, it was agreed the stop could return to its old site. All that now remains is to reach agreement with the regional government over who is responsible for the upkeep of the road.

# Storm over port 



I PUERTO BLANCO: The harbour has been closed for safety reasons.

CALPE Town Hall is demanding to know the future of its second harbour Puerto Blanco; closed more than a year ago by the government.
Calpe councillor Ana Sala has written to the Director General of Ports to ask for information about the future of the marina, closed in February 2016.
The entrance was sealed and the harbour closed for safety reasons after complaints about the general condition of the marina and the deterioration of its sea wall and breakwater; the concession to run the facility
had also expired.
The local authority is concerned that after 12 months it is not aware of any progress towards the beginning of a work programme that would allow the reopening of Puerto Blanco; and believes as time passes the condition of the marina worsens.
And the town hall said the apparent state of "total abandonment" was also concerning local neighbours and the town's residents in general, worried about the affect the condition of Puerto Blanco - which is situated next
to one of Calpe's smaller beaches, was having "on the image" of the community.
The local authority is seeking information regarding the tender for repairs, a start date, and a timetable for the necessary work; and if the government will also offer a new concession to run the port facility.
Calpe complains the closure of Puerto Blanco hit the number of mooring places it was able to offer; especially at a time it was advertising the town as a first class destination for tourism and sports.

stones and soil from the Senillar was built, allowing the environmental protection office to test whether the water could be held and the flow reduced to increase the water level.
The test results were positive and work will start soon.
The provisional dam will be removed and pre-fabricated
structures will be used.
The current studies show that a low water level is less damaging and doesn't cause as many alterations of the natural characteristics of the Senillar, as ph levels and conductivity do.
The Senillar wetland is regarded as one of the most precious ecosystems on the Marina Alta coast and has been under protection since 2014 when it was declared as a wildlife reserve by the Environmental Protection office.

## Mouth swabs to

## prevent accidents

MUCHAMIEL'S Local Police have undergone specialised training to carry out drugs tests on drivers.
Using specifically-designed mouth swabs, officers will be able to detect the presence of cannabis, cocaine, methamphetamines and LSD. Initial results will later be confirmed by a second saliva sample sent for an analysis to an authorised laboratory.
When drugs are found to be present, the least that drivers can expect is a $€ 1,000$ fine and losing six points off their driving licences.

In cases where testing positive involves a criminal offence, this could involve a prison sentence.
The Muchamiel force hopes in this way to put an end to local traffic accidents where drugs have played a part. According to a recent police survey, controls show that drivers who test positive for drugs now double the number of those over the drink-driving limit.
It has also been shown that drugs were present in the bodies of 16 per cent of the drivers who died in road accidents in the last four years.

# More protection for gender violence victims 

CAMPELLO has joined the Vio Gen protection programme for gender violence victims.
This will enable the Local Police to access the Ministry of the Interior's Gender Violence Monitoring System and provide essential help in tackling abuse, said Campello mayor, Benjami Soler.

Vio Gen sets out to analyse and prevent the risks that each of the women faces while following up changes in the circumstances of both the victims and their aggressors.
A total of 363 Spanish municipalities in 14 autonomous communities belong to the programme, including 18 towns and cities in the Valencian Community. Vio Gen was first introduced 10 years ago and
each case is treated individually, explained Jose Antonio Nieto, junior minister at the Ministry of the Interior.

At present the programme is available to almost 40,000 users from public bodies and institutions that include the National Police, Guardia Civil, Spain's Prison Service, Local Police forces, judges, public prosecutors, social services and regional governments' Equality depart ments.

## Reclaims for the refund of deposits paid off plan - New success in Almanzora Country Club

IN today's article we would like to re mind all the buyers who bought property off plan in Spain, where the developer failed to hand over the property to them; according to Spanish Law 57/68, the banks who hold the bank account of the developer into which the money was paid, are liable to refund the money to the buyers, if the money was not guaranteed by means of an insurance policy or a bank guarantee.

In accordance with the law 57/68 regarding the bank that prepared the account into which the purchaser paid their deposit; they should have taken the responsibility of making sure that the developer had secured in place, the guarantees for the money. If these measures have not taken place, then the bank is liable for the damages caused to the purchaser, regarding the monies that were paid, including the cost of legal interest.
It is better to claim before the 1st of January 2018

As per the Law 20/2015 that came into effect on the $1 / 1 / 2016$, the new deadline to claim for this kind of legal action is two years. This probably does not apply to contracts and money paid before 2016, as per the Legal Principle and general
rule of non-retroactivity of the laws, foreseen in the Spanish Legal System.
In any case, if you or someone you know have lost the money in a purchase of an off plan property in Spain, our advice is to claim if possible before $1 / 1 / 2018$, two years after the legal changes came into effect.
What are the cases where it could be more difficult to get the money back?
Although now the court precedents and interpretation of the law 57/68 is clear, this does not mean that all court cases will be won, as there are some cases, where it could be more difficult to get the money back, for example when:

- the purchaser is not a consumer: ie is a company or an individual speculating.
when it is not possible for the bank to know that the money paid, was part of an off plan purchase in some particular cases.
when the money paid to the developer was in cash.
In these and other cases, the case must be studied with more detail and the claim presented more carefully.

## What is public liability in regard to home insurance?

IF someone slips or falls and suffers an injury whilst on your property, they could make a claim against you for damages. Public liability insurance will cover you against these types of potential third party claims. The Generalitat's latest response to Alfaz came from its Transport department last March, stating that at present there were no plans to modify the Marina Baja joint service.
"Should the regional government turn down this latest request, the council will then authorise the town hall to start legal proceedings to protect municipal interests," Such added

## A case of 'money is no object'

U3A MARINA Baixa heard press officer Colin Butterworth give an interesting and entertaining presentation of his years working on special projects with Rolls Royce and Bentley Motor Cars.

Between 1992 and 1999, a total of 337 cars - 228 of which were unique - were built, generating over $£ 200$ million for the company.

Colin said on one occasion a representative from Saudi Arabia ordered 12 black Rolls Royce touring limousines and

10 Bentley touring limousines. He said in 1991 at the Geneva Motor Show the same person offered half a million pounds for the Bentley Continental R prototype on display but was refused. The customer continued to discuss price and finally offered $£ 2$ million.
Colin said in addition to this; he had to pay for a team of tradesmen to fly out with the vehicle to complete it on site and to pay for a replacement development vehicle. It was a

case of "money no object."
On one of Colin's secondments to Brunei, he discovered all the limousines built the previous year parked up on the many roads within the Palace grounds in temperatures exceeding 45 degrees.
He expressed his concern over the damage being caused to the vehicles in such high temperatures and the following year five large showrooms had been built on two levels to accommodate 300 vehicles.
Colin said again, it was "money no object." In addition to the numerous cars owned by the Sultan of Brunei and his family, who all lived in separate palaces, each had a coach and racing boat in their own colour scheme.

A team of workers washed and polished the boats every day but they never reached the water in the eight years that Colin was there.

and Chinese economies as well as problems in the US and the UK, sensible money has headed to a safe haven such as Aena which manages airports in Spain and overseas.
Recently, one of the world's largest credit ratings firms, Fitch upgraded Aena's rating to A and the
company continues to turn in increased revenue figures and forecast profits every quarter so whilst other analysts suggest that the shares are over-valued, such a suggestion is being ignored by the large corporate investors.
Latest valuation based on share
price which has increased by 14 per cent in the last month shows that Aena is within the top 10 most valuable companies on the Spanish stock market (IBEX) index, being worth more than a number of Banks and other household names.
The reason for the escalation in the price of shares in the company is simply explained by the fact that there are considerably more potential purchasers than sellers and the only way that shares can be obtained is to encourage profit taking with higher bids.

## Bid for renewable energy projects

ALERT to the fact Spain needs to increase its production of renewable energy in order to meet EU requirements, new suppliers are being sought.
The government will hold an auction to receive bids for new wind and other renewable projects shortly according to Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy. He made it clear one of the stipulations for the award of any contract would be consumers would not have to pay more for the electricity produced as development costs would be for the winning bidders.
The government hopes that by 2020 renewable projects will account for 10 per cent of Spanish energy production.

## A hard Brexit is scaring majority

What worries them most is the possibility of a hard Brexit with 82 per cent saying that the consequences of this, especially the shielding of migratory flows or access to the common market, as well as the establishment of tariff barriers to imports and exports of goods, could negatively affect
their businesses.
They are however more optimistic about the option of a soft exit as more than half believe that it would have no effect or could even be positive for their business.
Importantly however almost all the companies consulted agree that Brexit will have negative consequences on the Spanish economy as it may be more difficult for British companies to invest or want to invest in Spain.

Over the past four weeks the GBP/EUR exchange rate has fluctuated between $€ 1.1723$ and $€ 1.1990$ (a difference of over two cents per pound) while GBP/USD has recovered from a low of $\$ 1.2520$ to hit highs of $\$ 1.2985$ (a difference of four cents per pound).
Although the news that centrist Emmanuel Macron won the second round of the French Presidential election (beating far-right Marine Le Pen) gave the euro a little boost, the currency's gains weren't as impressive as some had expected.
Concerns the European Central Bank (ECB) plans to keep monetary policy accommodative for some time to come kept the euro under pressure. That being said, the past month has seen

EUR/USD see a surge of four cents per euro. The EUR/GBP has recovered from a low, with an improvement of about one penny per euro.

Meanwhile, over in the US President Donald Trump lived up to his reputation for making rash and unexpected decisions by unceremoniously sacking the director of the FBI. Trump's decision raised serious concerns about his leadership and weakened demand for the US dollar, leaving the USD/EUR exchange rate weaker.

What do you need to look out for?
Without doubt, the main pound-moving event
on the horizon over the next four weeks is the UK's general election. The British public will be taking to the polls again on June 8 and as the outcome of the election could significantly change the shape of the UK's Brexit negotiations, considerable GBP exchange rate volatility can be expected.
A Conservative win is expected to be the most pound-positive outcome, while a Labour victory or coalition outcome may send Sterling spiralling lower.

Political motivations will remain one of the
main causes of EUR fluctuations in the weeks ahead as the French legislative elections take place in June. Macron's 'Republic on the Move' party will need to gain support if the new President hopes to push through some of his planned policy changes.
Signs that Macron will struggle to enact change would be euro-negative. Any reports which support the ECB's current plans to leave monetary policy unchanged would also weigh on EUR exchange rates.
The Federal Reserve's hotly-anticipated June interest rate decision on the 14th could also cause euro movement. If the Fed does increase interest rates the US dollar could surge, sending the euro lower in the process. However, if rates remain unaltered or if the central bank indicates that the June rate adjustment could be the last one of 2017, EUR exchange rates may jump as the US dollar falls.

## Storage wars as police investigate possible scam

AN investigation into fraudulent pension schemes is being undertaken by the British and Spanish authorities with at least $€ 148$ million thought to have been lost.
The investigation has been mounted by the Serious Fraud Office of the Metropolitan Police into at least four UK based companies who have targeted investors overseas, many in Spain, persuading them to buy long leases on rooms in storage houses between 2011 and 2017.
The proposal to these investors was that if they rented at one price, they could then sub-let at a higher price but in most cases this was not possible and often the only beneficiary was the investment company.

A number of companies promoting this type of scheme were made insolvent in 2016 and one adviser has been banned from being a director of a company for nine years after 300 of his clients lost $€ 14$ million in a similar scheme.
The investigation will decide whether individuals, many of them pensioners, were deliberately misled and if so, those responsible may well be prosecuted.

# Have work will travel for Spanish youths seeking jobs in the US 

WITH the lack of work for youngsters in Spain, many have decided, like past generations that they will need to look for work elsewhere.

The stereotype 'Manuel' the good hearted but almost unintelligible waiter in Fawlty Towers reflected the fact that in the early second half of the 20th century, huge numbers of Spaniards who could barely speak English found their way to the UK looking for a better life.

Many returned home to enjoy their retirement but there is now a large new breed of well-educated younger people looking to find work and a career outside of Spain and with the uncertainty of future options in the UK, the USA is becoming a very attractive option.
Despite the fact that there has been a serious division in American society with the presidential election results, a recent Mintel survey suggests that a high percentage of Americans believe that they represent a vibrant middle class and at the end of each month have paid their bills and have cash to spare.
The Spanish language is the second most spoken in the USA and at least 41 million peo-

ple count Spanish as their primary language and as there is some perceived conflict between Anglo-Saxons and Mexicans within the country, educated Spaniards who speak both English and Spanish are often able to find work.

There are immigration requirements to be overcome but those qualified in Spain and currently with little hope of long term employment here are certainly eyeing up 'the land of opportunity.'

## Two troubled banks all set to merge

THE first steps to amalgamate Bankia and Banco Mare Nostrum (BMN), two troubled banks owned by the Spanish government are underway.
BMN was created in 2010 by merging four regional savings banks whilst Bankia was saved by the government as it was crippled by billions of euros of debt.
It is believed by the Fund for Orderly Banking Restructuring (FROB) that merging the two operations will make it easier for the repayment of at least some of the funds pumped into them during the banking crisis although the path to unification will be long.
The first step is for due diligence to be undertaken to ensure that there are no financial restrictions or hidden losses in either organisation now and each will be undertaken by a different set of international accounting firms.
Assuming all proves to be in order the first stage is expected to be confirmed within two weeks and completion should take place by end of 2017.

## Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

# Successful Spanish women 

SPAIN has its own list of some highly powerful and successful women, here are some of them at the top of their game.

## ■ Queen Letizia

Perhaps none are more successful than Letizia Ortiz, now Queen of Spain.

She was a successful journalist in her own right, completing a masters degree in audiovisual journalism before working in Mexico and then returning to Spain to work for the Spanish version of the Bloomberg channel. She went on to work for TVE and was anchor of the evening news programme Telediario 2, one of the most watched news programmes in Spain

She has reported from America on the presidential elections and following the 9/11 attacks in New York. But it was per-
haps her marriage to the heir of the throne, Prince Felipe, in 2004 that catapulted her from a 'commoner' to one of the most famous women in the world. She became Queen in 2014 when Prince Felipe ascended to the throne after the abdication of his father, Juan Carlos.

As Queen consort she shares her husband's social rank and status, representing Spain and the monarchy worldwide. Her first overseas trip as monarch and consort was to meet Pope Francis in the Apostolic Palace.

In 2015, she was named Special Ambassador for Nutrition for the UN Food and Agriculture Organisation.

## ■ Penelope Cruz

Now a famed Hollywood actress, some would say Penelope Cruz is one of the most recognisable Spaniards in the world.

Born in 1974, she began her career at a young age. She was signed by an agent at the age of 15 and made her acting debut on television at the age of 16 . She has gone on to have an enviable CV of starring movie roles and was the first Spaniard ever to be nominated for a best actress Oscar for her role in 2006 film Volver. She went on to be the first Spanish actress to win an Oscar for Vicky Cristina Barcelona in 2008.

She is a member of Spanish Royal Academy of Sciences, European Academy of Sciences and Arts and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, among others.

She still works at the Autonomous University of Madrid.

CATH KIDSTON, the brainchild behind some of Britain's brightest and most cheerful designs, has built up an empire worth an estimated $£ 250$ million.
Influenced by her idyllic upbringing in the Hampshire countryside, Kidston says, "I’ve always been interested in houses and homes. From my earliest memories, I've liked re-arranging my room and was one of those children who was always restyling my bedroom." She adds, "I always loved to play shop, I loved trading, drawing and doing all the stuff I love to do today."
The former shop assistant turned her passion into a business when she opened her first shop in Holland Park 1993, selling hand embroidered tea towels and shabby-chic furniture. Her inspiration for selling products came after making an ironing board cover for her own flat. She explains, "I thought it would be the perfect product, because there I was, at home, doing my ironing on a grey ironing board. My flat was quite small and I had it hanging on the back of the door. I thought it was a really good idea."


Subsidising her first venture, which she describes as a "glorified junk shop," with interior design, Kidston decided to focus solely on selling her own creations after surviving cancer at 37. She explains the ordeal, "changed my attitude to risk within a business. It was a really positive turning point. It really helped me think, 'I'm just going to make the most of it and get on'."

Her passion paid off and her designs are
now sold in over 200 shops across 16 countries.

With an MBE for Services to Business to her name, Kidston, who has also raised large sums of money for cancer charities, has now sold the majority stake in her company. She says "having a business is a bit like having a child. As they grow up, you don't want them to be too reliant on you, but you want to remain on very good terms with them."

This led to a strong working relationship with the Emaus group as, through Make a Smile, they work to help provide for the children in the Emaus group at the homes which are severely under funded and for mentally handicapped youngsters.
For every project they are involved with, they ask the advice of the children's carers about what the home and the youngsters need and every cent donated goes to the cause.
Whilst Lucy dedicates every spare moment she can to the charity, she recognises it is thanks to the help of the community and the many fundraisers who provide important funds for the projects. The volunteers from up and down the coast
give up their valuable time to run coffee mornings, parties in bars, dancing marathons and hold stalls at large fairs to get the word out and sell donated items.
One of the projects they are most proud of is the Relleu Self-Sufficiency project for the centre for mentally challenged youngsters in Relleu. Using existing land and equipment Make A Smile has created a farm. This provides occupational therapy for the youngsters in residence there and is run by volunteers.
The farm now produces 750 eggs a week from 220 chickens that have been sponsored by the public and sells these in their popular weekly veggie bags. It grows olive trees and once the olives are harvested, turns them into olive oil that the homes use and sells the surplus. The farm also has 1,000 olive trees at various stages of growth that are available for an annual sponsorship to help with running costs. These trees are proving popular as a gift or in mem-
ory of a lost loved one. Lucy has a lot to rightly be proud of but what advice would she give to others looking at setting up a business on the Costa Blanca? "Work hard, don't take any short cuts and learn the language. Most important of all is customer service. This must always be the focus." ## FIDELMA'S advice is stick to your goals and what you believe in

FIDELMA MATTHEWS is the female force behind Solar in Spain, the successful solar company she formed with her husband. Jo stayed on as the company's Creative Director, taking the range even further with face products and exfoliators before leaving in 2011.
Jo describes fragrance as like a 'best friend.'
She then created her next line, Jo Loves, a smaller offering, featuring limited edition scents like Fresh Sweet Peas.
Her new line is sold in her shop in Chelsea's chic Elizabeth Street.

# In good company

WHEN Chrissie Rucker, owner and founder of upmarket furnishings chain, The White Company, left school at 16 , she could hardly have known she would one day become one of Britain's most successful businesswomen.

Even several years after leaving school, following stints in PR and journalism, Chrissie was still looking for direction in her life. Working 16 hour days and delivering goods in her Mini, Chrissie sent out her first catalogue to 500

people and promoted it with a press release she wrote herself. Her hard work paid off and she turned over $£ 80,000$ that first year.

It was only after six years that The White Company opened its first store, which Chrissie credits with securing the brand's identity.

Over the ensuing years, her business grew stratospherically. The White Company now has 53 stores in the UK and sells adults' and children's clothes, as well as furnishings. It has also recently launched in America and now ships worldwide.
The chain has lived through four recessions and Chrissie says this has helped her hone the brand's identity, ensuring it was different to other stores.

She explains "it's crucial to have a clear brand vision so you have something to stick to when times are hard."
Still owning 99 per cent of her company, the other 1 per cent belonging to her husband after she gifted it to him as a wedding present, Ms Rucker is believed to have paid herself $£ 6.5$ million in 2015.

The White Company now has around 1,000 employees and Chrissie received an MBE in 2010 for services to retail.

#### Abstract

WE'VE heard of the women who beat all the odds to become top of their game and highly successful in their own right, from overcoming poor education and childhood problems to fighting against male dominance. But for those looking for a head start which countries are best for women in terms of gender equality? Well according to the 2016 report by the World Economic Forum, Iceland took the top spot. The 'Global Gender Gap' report looked at 144 economies and found that, for the eighth consecutive year, Iceland was the best for women, based on how well they use the female workforce. The report looked at a number of economic, educational, health-based and political indicators, comparing them with statistics from the World Economic Forum, UNESCO Institute of Statistics and the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD). The Nordic states appear to be the best countries for women, continually coming in the top spots since the report was first produced in 2006. Finland came in second spot in the 2016 report, overtaking Norway in third and Sweden was in fourth place for the eighth year running. Rwanda has closed the gender gap coming in fifth. Meanwhile the UK dropped to 20th place and the USA dropped 17 places to 45 .

# Women start ups on the increase 

IT is the age old question; can women have it all? Juggling a career and perhaps the hardest job of them all, being a full time mother, is not easy. Many women report having to give up their jobs as it was simply not viable to work around child care, particularly in Spain as summer holidays can be almost 12 weeks long.
So it comes as no surprise to read reports of business being blooming for female start ups. By setting up their own business, women are able to be their own boss and juggle the demands of work and family a little bit easier.

According to the BBC, new research from Oxford Economics shows that one in 170 people in the UK now works for a small creative business, making and selling unique products or gifts. The report was commissioned by notonthehighstreet.com which now has more than 5,700 creative entrepreneurs and partners using its services to sell their products and some 89 per cent of these are owned by women.
But this is going a step further than simply crafting things part time and selling them on Facebook to friends and family as real money can be made. Simon Belsham, chief executive of notonthehighstreet.com told the BBC that last year more than 20 businesses made more than $£ 1$ million in sales: "It's a genuine way to make a living."

ing, flexible working, maternity and parental leave as well as childcare and benefits.
It noted a report on flexible working which was being offered more to try and retain women in the workplace, being particularly suitable for those wanting to work after childbirth. According to the report by Dr Heejung Chung from the University of Kent however, it found that home working is not such an easy solution for working mothers. The study did find that it reduced the likelihood of women dropping out of work but it also found that remote workers were more likely than others to worry about work when they are not at work and are more likely to work in their free time and also did more overtime. This was speculated that it could be in part due to the stigma still attached to working from home with home workers feeling the need to work harder to compensate for this.
It comes as last month the UK marked Work Wise Week which culminated with National Work from Home Day. Workingmum.co.uk's recent employer survey found that most think flexible working will increase in the future with more in favour of home work-

Workingmums.co.uk is a site offering part time and full time jobs to working mums. It also gives women wanting to get back into the work place guidance and advice on home work-
ing which can only mean a good thing for those looking at juggling work and home life.

# Women who make a difference

As Melinda got older she later met Theo, her husband and opened up a restaurant called 'The Captain's


Table' in the harbour of Molyvos, which serve Greek and international food.

After being on the island for many years, Melinda and her family became well known through the restaurant and for some volunteering work.

In 2015 when refugees arrived in the port of Molyvos for asylum, the
coastguard contacted her, asking if she could provide them with food and clothing and she found somewhere for them to live, which was on a piece of rented land behind the restaurant, which can accommodate 180 people.
Melinda was able to provide them with food and supplies, due to donations from locals, tourists and people
from all over the world.
Melinda recently attended the 'Women who transformed the World' conference in Segovia, on March 20, where she talked about the experience of helping so many refugees and the Starfish foundation that was set up by volunteers to continue helping them.
In September 2015, the foundation
opened a transit site 'OXY,' for refugees arriving in the north of the island, which prepared them for the journey to the south where they could register. Over 130,000 passed through the site that met international humanitarian standards. They have also worked closely with the Red Cross, UNHCR and the International Rescue Committee.

Melinda is the perfect example of someone who can multi-task as she cooks in the restaurant and is also ready to take calls concerning any new refugees. She is an inspiration to us all and didn't let anything stand in the way of her helping the refugees. It was a job that had to be done and it was possible and made easier by putting the bureaucracy of Greece on hold for a while and dealing with the paperwork later.

Melinda shows us it is possible to be successful in business and make time for those less fortunate. She shows us we have a responsibility and owe it to ourselves to help others, as this is the true meaning of success.

## Women in business

THE phrase 'women in business' covers the history of women taking leadership roles in commerce.
In 1972 Katharine Graham became the CEO of The Washington Post newspaper in the USA, making her the first female CEO of a Fortune 500 company as she somewhat paved the way for fellow women to follow her into business. But it wasn't all easy sailing. In her memoir she highlighted personal struggles she faced which left her often looking for reassurance from male colleagues.
Ursula Burns w named CEO of Xerox in 2009. It was previously run by Anne Mulcahy and it was the first time a female CEO had chosen another female to take over. Burns was also reported as the first black female to be heading a Fortune 500 company and told Leanin.org it was a great achieve-
ment: "Many people told me I had three strikes against me: I was
 black. I was a girl. I was poor."

Despite a growing number of females holding top positions there is little discrimination against today's female society, or is there? As of 2016, Wikipedia reported that women only account for around 20 per cent of all S\&P 500 company directors, which are companies listed on the American stock market, despite making up 47 per cent of the US workforce.

As of 2014, nearly 60 per cent of 22,000 global firms had no females on the board and less than 5 per cent had a female CEO.

However for females looking to succeed, try Norway, Latvia, Bulgaria and Slovenia as it is reported that in these countries there is at least 20 per cent female representation on boards and in senior positions.

## A helping hand

THE number of female business owners is growing at unprecedented rates across the globe, thanks to new funds and sites encouraging women to start or expand a business.
Investment in these funds doesn't just benefit women. According to Forbes 'about $\$ 60$ billion worth of impact investment assets are under management... in sectors ranging from agriculture to education. Some of the big-gest returns lie with women.'
Websites such as Kiva.org and shared-interest.com allow individuals to provide loans to specific businesses or projects while Forbes has suggested some of the most effective ways to invest in femaleowned businesses.
According to Forbes, farmers in Third World countries are typically male but there are some crops favoured by
women because they both feed their own families and can be sold for profit, providing women in some of the most impoverished places with their own income.
Marianne Haahr, director of the Global Opportunity Network said "crops like maize, cassava and millet are popular among female farmers" and "some women form cooperatives so they can market their produce at better prices. This gives rural women a stronger voice locally."
Forbes also explains for those around the world who rely on agriculture for their income, one of the most useful types of investment is microinsurance which protects against crop loss due to bad weather or pestilence. Several sites allow investors to choose from many individual projects benefiting women.

# Potty for pottery 

CREATING her business in 1985 with just $£ 450$ in savings Emma Bridgewater, the famous ceramics designer whose mugs and plates are sold in their millions across the UK, now turns over $£ 14$ million each year.
Growing up in a large, Bohemian household in North Oxford, Bridgewater, now 56, says it was trying to find a birthday present for her mother Charlotte that sparked the idea for her hugely successful company. She says, "I was looking for a really special cup and saucer, but everything was either too formal or too clunky."
Hugely ambitious, Emma had been looking for a business idea which could turn over a lot of money quickly. Having failed to find the right gift for her mum, she explains, "that was my eureka moment. I realised there was a gap in the market for pottery that was beautiful and practical.'

Creating a prototype at the Potteries in Staffordshire, Bridgewater started decorating her first mugs with spongeapplied designs. She began by selling the end product in Covent Garden, where buyers lapped up her informal designs, such as Toast \& Marmalade.

After a few years happily married to Matthew Rice, now the company's CEO, Emma says she put the business on a back-burner, just making enough to live. When four children came along, however, she says she quickly had to earn more money, explaining, "I had to get back into the saddle or else
the roof would have fallen in."
A sad twist of fate increased her resolve even further when her mother suffered a brain injury after falling whilst horse-riding in 1991. She says the sudden responsibility of caring for her mother, as well as her own young family, spurred her on, adding "unhappiness is a great driver.'
After several years building up the business, commuting miles each week between Stoke-on-Trent, London and Norfolk, Emma realised she needed to slow down when diagnosed with arthritis at 31 . She says she was advised to "take the stress out of my life" and decided to hand the company over
 informal designs. to her husband, an experienced busi-
nessman who helped David Linley found his furniture company.

# The top job 

## WOMEN are taking politics by storm

FROM Brexit to Donald Trump as President of the United States, it might feel like the world is currently in a state of flux.
But if there is a wave of change making its way around the globe, one positive has certainly come out of it; the rise of women in politics.

Since Indira Gandhi became India's first and only female prime minister in 1966, women have increasingly been filling the top roles in government. Of the last 50 years, Iceland has had female premiers for 20 of those, and in Rwanda 62 per cent of all representatives in the government's lower house are women.
Closer to home, women are taking politics by storm, with Germany's Chancellor, Angela Merkel, leading her country for 12 years. And in the UK, five of the major political parties, from all corners of the map, are led by women.
Take Nicola Sturgeon, the first female leader of the Scottish National Party, as well as the first woman to become Scotland's First Minister, who led her party to an incredible victory in the 2015 General Election,
winning 56 out of 59 seats; far more than her predecessor, Alex Salmond. Known for being tough and straighttalking, Sturgeon was named as BBC Radio 4 Woman's Hour's most powerful woman in the UK in 2015.

In Northern Ireland, Arlene Foster is the 46 -year-old leader of the Democratic Unionist Party. Foster, who has been a politician since 2003, got involved after her father, a Royal Ulster Constabulary member, was the subject of an assassination attempt, and later when a school bus she was travelling on was bombed by the IRA.
She eventually became the first female First Minister of Northern Ireland, winning the election with a comfortable margin in 2016, before resigning in January 2017.
Leanne Wood, Plaid Cymru's leader since 2012, is another female politician at the top of her field. The Rhondda born 45-year-old, who was formerly a probation officer, has campaigned for Wales' criminal justice system to be reformed as well as for the regeneration of former coalfield areas. She also used Freedom of

## It's a woman's world

JAMES BROWN might have sung that it was a man's world, but with increasing numbers of woman taking over traditionally male professions, now more than ever, he could not have been more wrong.
From the beginnings of higher education onwards, women now often outnumber their male counterparts. In the 2010 to 2011 academic year in the UK, 55 per cent of university students were female, with the highest proportion of women studying subjects such as veterinary science and medicine.
And it seems the trend extends to those qualifying for professional roles too, including accountancy, which in the US is made up of 61.8 per cent women, stretching to 73.8 per cent in the case of tax examiners.
Women in the UK now make up 51 per cent of all qualifying doctors, and in law the figures are even more surprising, with 62.8 per cent of solicitor training schemes taken by women, to 37.2 per cent of men. In the US, 54.7 per cent of financial managers are also now women.

But why the sudden change? Some put it down to the rise in flexible working hours and decreasing pay gap, meaning women are increasingly taking advantage of the high wages attached to jobs in the financial, legal and medical sectors.
Large firms such as Price Waterhouse Cooper and Allen and Overy are also now making it easier for women to take on senior roles after having children, with innovations such as emergency child care facilities and mentoring for women going on maternity leave.
Women are also putting off having children until later in life, allowing them to climb further up the professional ladder before potentially taking a career break for maternity leave. The average first-time mother in the UK is nearing 28 , while for university graduates that figure leaps to 35 -years-old. The rising costs of housing also means more mothers are continuing in their careers after having children.
There is still room for improvement though, with only 8 per cent of engineers being women.

The figures are similar for scientists at 12.8 per cent. Women are also more likely to be given zero-hours contracts than men and suffer the consequences of economic downturns; during the recession in 2009, 53,000 of women left full-time work, compared to only 36,000 men.
The good news is that these gaps are growing, however. The number of female scientists increased by 11 per cent between 2001 and 2010, while the number of journalists and editors increased by 14.8 per cent in the same period. And while men generally out earn women for the same roles, the gap is as low as 0.2 per cent for some professions, and women earn more than their male counterparts in others.
Female social workers benefit the most, typically getting paid 7.8 per cent more than men doing the same job. In traditionally male roles too, such as medicine, men are now only out earning women by 0.6 per cent in senior roles.
All of which can only mean one thing; there has never been a better time to be 'a woman or a girl.'

## In figures

AS of June 2016, 23.3 per cent of all parliamentarians around the world were women, compared to just 11.3 per cent in 1995. Scandinavian countries have the highest proportion of women in parliament at 41.7 per cent.

The first woman elected to the UK Parliament was Constance Markievicz in 1918, although as a member of Sinn Fein she did not take her seat. Nancy Astor became the first to sit in the House of Commons the following year.
In the world's smallest country, Vatican City, women still cannot vote.
It took until 1928 for woman to be afforded the same voting rights as men in the UK.

In January 2017, nine women were heading up their governments around the world.

Rwanda has the highest proportion of female parliamentarians of any country.

Pacific countries have the lowest proportion at 15 per cent.

# Sexism via the backdoor 

IT is 2017. Women are running multi-billion pound businesses, leading countries and increasingly making their mark in traditionally male-orientated professions.
Gone are the 1960s 'Mad Men' days of blatant sexual harassment or chauvinism. No longer would any man find it acceptable to, for example, call a woman 'baby' in an office environment. But does that mean sexism is truly dead?
While perhaps not as barefaced as it once was, growing numbers of women in different sectors are now speaking out about rising 'backdoor' sexism.

As Jessica Williams, head of Sidekicks recruitment agency says, "I believe that the secretarial industry harbours one of the last bastions of 'acceptable' sexism. A lot of agencies like to pretend this doesn't exist any more, it does."
She says it is not uncommon for employers seeking secretaries or receptionists to automatically call prospective hires 'she' before even learning their gender, or even to specify what
colour hair they would like their employee to have.
Even high-profile companies under the full glare of public scrutiny can come unstuck. Take PriceWaterhouseCooper, one of the world's biggest accountancy firms, which in December 2015 attracted criticism around the globe for sending home a receptionist from its London office for not wearing high heels.
The 27-year-old worker, Nico1a Thorp, had her pay withheld after refusing to buy and wear two-inch heels for the role, prompting a debate in the House of Commons about ensuring employers comply with equality laws.
And while at the time it was argued that male employees are also required to dress smartly, why should
it be
t r u e

smarter' than flat shoes? Is requiring female employees to wear shoes which lengthen the legs and look feminine but are often impractical and difficult to walk in really necessary or do they simply perpetuate a 'sexy secretary' ideal from a bygone era?
Even the language commonly used in offices suggests that sexism, while improving, is still alive and well. As writer Mark Peters says, phrases referencing men often denote something positive, such as right-hand man, poster boy and wingman. 'In comparison, those citing women are often negative; take, prima donna, drama queen or mean girl.

Daniel Godsall, founder of WOMBA (Work, Me and the Baby), a business supporting mothers in the workplace, claims the problem is even wider spread, with employers still holding women back by refusing to help working mothers. He explains of the women he had spoken to, "without any formal

sideration, some had been primed that requests for flexible working were unlikely to be granted. And when one asked for a four-day week, she was told that it would damage her career and instead she should just work from home on her 'day off.'
From women earning an average of 9.4 per cent less than men, to being interrupted by male colleagues, having credit taken for their ideas, or be-
ing
asked to make the coffee every time, there are a multitude of examples of backdoor sexism, and it is too often up to individuals to fight their own corner.
So what is the solution? Businesses such as Daniel's are increasingly hitting back, helping women stand up for their rights. He claims the initiative is a success, saying, "I am particularly proud that we have recently supported two women in achieving promotion during maternity leave."
But perhaps Jessica Williams’ tactic at Sidekicks is best when she questions employers' stereotypes, simply asking "why?" She says the approach works, claiming, "it forces clients to question whether their prejudices are out of date. Finally, they begin to grasp just how embarrassing and unprofessional those prejudices are."

A brave new world

WARIS DIRIE is a shining example of a woman who has triumphed over adversity in what for her was very much a man's world in which decisions were made on her behalf whether she agreed with them or not.
At the tender age of just five years old she was subjected to the dreadful and inhumane practice of female genital mutilation (FGM). Then at the age of 13 her father told her that he had arranged for her to be married. Not only was this to a man whom she had never met before, the man was also old enough to be her grandfather.

This was the turning point for Waris who decided that this was not what she wanted for herself so she fled her family and the small village in the Somali desert where she had lived. At first her father pursued her and so she ran, and ran, and ran until she could no longer see him.
After a few weeks she managed to

make it to her aunt's house, her mother's sister, and it was whilst living there that an opportunity arose which took her to London. Waris overheard the Somalian Ambassador for London, who was married to another of Waris' aunts, saying that he needed to find a servant for his four-year diplomatic appointment in London. Having volunteered herself Waris found herself
working for him in London.
Waris had managed to turn her life around for the better and that was only the start. At the age of 18 she was discovered by Terence Donovan, a famous British photographer, and became a model. She became one of the first African supermodels and moved from London to New York and appeared on the front pages of all the major magazines
In 1997 Waris gave an interview to Marie Claire magazine in which she bravely decided to open up to the world about her own experience of FGM. There was a huge outcry of sympathy for her after this appeared in the magazine and it also resulted in worldwide protests against FGM.
Waris was then invited by the United Nations Population Fund to join the fight to stop FGM. UN Secretary Kofi Annan appointed her as the goodwill ambassador in the fight against FGM
and she now travels around the world in her role as ambassador.
In 2010 Waris started the Waris Dirie Foundation in her fight against FGM. Now known as the Desert Flower Foundation, Waris' name means desert flower, the organisation aims to raise awareness of gender equality, human rights and FGM and works hard to prevent and protect young girls in Africa from having an FGM procedure carried out against their will. It also tries to help and support victims of FGM.
Waris is an exemplary role model of how women can fight and win in an often male dominated society and that change can and will happen. She is an unstoppable woman who is using her own experience and passion to make a difference to the lives of others and who surely offers hope and courage to young girls and women around the world.

## Planet superstar

BEAUTY pageant contestants are rarely noted for their medical expertise or business acumen but Debbye Turner bucked that trend in true pioneering style.
The Hawaiian won Miss America in 1990, becoming just the third black woman to do so, and the following year was awarded a doctorate in veterinary medicine, going on to have a successful career as a vet and becoming a spokeswoman for Purina.

Started in Paltrow's kitchen, GOOP has grown from its original weekly newsletter and now has a shop, full-time staff of content writers and web designers, and even its own organic skin care range. The site also offers guides to the best hotels, restaurants and attractions around the globe, as well as recipes and tips on making the best cocktails. From yoga lessons to investment tips, there is advice for the modern woman trying to have it all.
And while some of the website's suggestions (such as lessons on the correct way to yawn) have attracted scorn, and in some cases outright criticism from the medical community,

GOOP has certainly gone from strength to strength, out-performing similar lifestyle sites.

The now 44-year-old mother of two, to the imaginatively named Moses and Apple, has just been announced CFO to the site, which in 2016 raised between $\$ 15$ and $\$ 20$ million in venture capital.
The site has also now launched a quarterly magazine, also titled GOOP, which will be published by Conde Nast, and is branching out into selling vitamins (a $\$ 36$ billion dollar business in America).
So as her lifestyle brand goes from strength to strength, Paltrow demonstrates you really can have your macrobiotic cake and eat it. As she says, "I grew up in an acting family... but right now, I just like this better."

WHILE office life can be trying at the best of times, juggling meetings, business deals and deadlines in the scorching Spanish heat only makes life more difficult.

Here we have put together some suggestions on how you can beat the heat at work this summer, ensuring you stay cool, calm and collected in the office this season.
Feed your brain. You might have heard it a thousand times before but keeping your fluids up is one of the number one ways you can look after yourself. When you overheat, your body produces sweat which cools the skin as it evaporates. If your fluid levels are not high enough, this task becomes much harder. If you can't face the thought of chugging endless glasses of water, why not try eating some watermelon or cucumber, both of which are full of H 2 O ?

Cool and classy. We all have to look appropriate at work but the Spanish sun can be simply too hot for normal office attire. If you normally wear a suit, why not switch to a linen one? In place of shirts, keep cool by exposing the arms with a sleeveless alternative or even a chiffon equivalent; a thinner fabric which will allow more air to reach your skin. Go for lighter shades too, such as white or pastels as these block out infrared rays which heat you up. If you have to wear closedtoe shoes for work, make sure they are made from a breathable fabric such as leather to avoid hot toes!
No more patches. Is there anything worse than walking into a work meeting over-hot and worried it shows with dreaded under arm sweat patches? Natural fabrics, such as cotton, bamboo or linen, breath, allowing more air to come into contact with the skin, will keep you cooler. Most pharmacies in Spain also stock medicated antiperspirants which work for between 24 and 48 hours, allowing you to feel a little more confident meeting a new client in the heat.

Cool car. Make sure you are not travelling to and from the office or meetings in a stifling car by placing a foil screen across your windscreen and use a Japanese trick to cool down your vehicle before you get in by opening a window and wafting the opposite door several

times, allowing cooler air to circulate.
Nice shades. Once you are in the office, keep any shades or blinds you have closed, blocking out up to 40 per cent of the heat that might otherwise get in. To introduce a breeze, open up as many windows as you can and consider a small desk fan, even cheap models can be fixed to your computer and angled for the optimum position.

Go green. On your lunch break, stay cool by finding a spot of grass in the shade to eat on, Stan Cox, a plant breeder at the Land Institute in Salina, Kansas, says plants not only block out the sun but also provide "evaporative cooling" by taking up moisture from the ground and "exhaling" through their leaves, meaning that patch of grass will cool you down.
Cool breeze. Finally, if you can, switch on that air conditioning. It may not be great for the environment but you can lessen your carbon footprint by only turning it on when there is a certain number of people in the office and by keeping it on a higher setting for longer. Using it in conjunction with a fan will also increase its efficiency and use less energy than keeping you're air conditioning on at arctic temperatures.

Consider a small fan.

WHEN the late first lady of Rockocracy Linda McCartney launched her vegetarian and vegan food brand in 1991, few could have predicted its impact, as it kick-started a revolution of choice in the food industry, with many more vegetarian products widely available seemingly overnight.
Linda became vegetarian in the 1980s, after she and husband Paul spotted some young sheep frolicking in the sun as they were tucking into a plate of lamb, and following the runaway success of her vegetarian cookbooks she signed a deal with a frozen food company, since she had always wanted to provide an easy alternative.
The introduction of the brand contributed greatly to bringing vegetarianism into vogue, and within a year of its debut, it was bringing in more money than her

husband's music.
Such was Linda's impact on
meat-free eating, in 1995, Paul and Linda were invited to make
a guest appearance on The Simp-
sons in an episode entitled 'Lisa

The Vegetarian.'
The McCartneys were happy to oblige with one condition; Lisa must always maintain a vegetarian diet.
The company was sold to Heinz in 2000 , before being bought by the Hain Celestial Group, although the McCartney family are still involved in its development, with husband Paul pledging to keep it free of genetically modified ingredients.
As a strong advocate for animal rights, Linda also lent her support to many organisations such as People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA), for whom she narrated a TV advert, in which she said: "Have you ever seen a fish gasping for breath when you take it out of the water? They're saying, 'Thanks a lot for killing me. It feels great, you know.’ No! It hurts!"

# Mind <br> the gap

THE UK'S gender pay gap may be closing, but there is still a long way to go. Make sure you are earning the same as your male counterparts with the suggestions below on how to ensure you are paid your true worth.
Be seen. Before you even ask for a rise, make sure you are being seen and heard, and therefore valued, in the office. In meetings, sit at the middle of the table and speak up if you want to make a point.

Women can also sometimes be instinctively being asked to take on more of the 'traditional' secretarial roles, including organising meetings or taking notes. Unless this is your specific role, be conscious about whether you end up doing more of this than your male counterparts, and do not be afraid to step back if you think the balance is unfair.

Pick your moment. When you know you want a rise, make sure you are given a quiet moment with your boss, without
other workplace distractions. Ask for a face-to-face meeting by email, making it clear you would like to talk about pay. That way the ice is already broken when you get in.
Do your homework. Research what those in similar roles are paid using websites like Glassdoor, PayScale and LinkedIn, or online job adverts. This gives you facts to back up your position if you are under-paid. Also make a list of your achievements and duties in the company to demonstrate what you bring to the business.
Princess charming. While it is important to be firm, Deepak Malhotra, the author of Negotiating the Impossible, says it is also vital not to "underestimate the importance of likeability." He says it is about balance, explaining, "this is about more than being polite; it's about managing some inevitable tensions in negotiation, such as asking for what you deserve without seeming greedy, pointing out deficiencies in the offer without seeming petty,
and being persistent without being a nuisance."
Survey the scene. If you work for a small business, or even a large company, you may not get what you want or deserve if the financial environment is not right. If the company is currently going through cut-backs or you know it is struggling, pick a time when things are looking more positive financially if you can. When you do have the discussion, you can always point out that you were mindful enough of the business to wait for the right time.
If you really cannot wait, or you feel a pay rise may not be forthcoming, consider asking for other benefits instead, such as increased annual leave, childcare or working from home some days.

And finally. If you do not get what you want and feel you deserve, be gracious, email your boss to thank them for their time and use the chance to restate your position. It may just be that they need more time to think about what you have proposed.

In 1972 as a tribute to Madame Clicquot the Veuve Clicquot Business Woman Award was developed to honour other successful women.
Previous winners have included Debbie Moore, founder of Pineapple Dance Studios and Anita Roddick, founder of The Body Shop.
This year, Alison Brittain has been named Veuve Clicquot Business Woman of 2017.
She is chief executive of Whitbread which owns Premier Inn, Brewers Fayre and Beefeater Grill restaurants as well as Costa Coffee. The panel said she was a role model for those women wanting to reach the top of large organisations.

As part of her prize, she will visit Veuve Clicquot in France and have a vine named after her.

# What women want and need

FOUNDING one of the world's most famous shoe brands at the tender age of 27, British-born Tamara Mellon, now 49, has learned a thing or two about the rise and fall of a business empire.

It was in 1996 that Tamara, then an accessories editor for Vogue, teamed up with Jimmy Choo, an East End cobbler she often used to create one-off shoes for fashion shoots. Saying she realised, "I was never going to earn the money I wanted to earn," by writing, she approached Choo to set up their own company.

Luckily for Tamara, an entrepreneurial streak was in her nature; her father Tom Yeardye was a founder of Vidal Sassoon as well as a restaurateur. Miss Mellon put together a business-plan which caught her dad's eye, encouraging him to invest $£ 15,000$, which she and Choo used to order their first series of shoes from Italy.

The company went from strength to strength, selling thousands of pairs to the world's wellheeled and featuring prominently on cult shows like Sex and the City. Other investors soon took note and in 2001 the company was taken over by a private equity firm.

filing for bankruptcy after only two years and losing Mellon $\$ 10$ million personally.
Not discouraged, she jumped straight back on the horse, training up shoe factories in Italy to create designs to her exacting standards, and then selling them directly to her customers online, costing the consumer half what they would normally pay for high-end shoes.
Tamara's new venture now has never-say-die, feminist vibe, in which she describes herself as knowing "what women want and need." She markets her shoes as being for, "leaning in, climbing ladders, shattering ceilings, walking out, school dropoffs, making an entrance, and re-writing rules."
Older and wiser, Mellon says she has learned it is important to never give up control of her company, stating, "you can bring in partners but 51 per cent is the golden rule." She adds, "make sure you have a team that understands your vision and believes in it."
Considering herself a feminist, Tamara, now says it is important to give other women a hand up and encouragement, saying the most important thing in business is, "you need resilience and perseverance and you need not to give up."

# More in the driver's seat 

RANKED near the very bottom of the Global Gender Gap Index, Saudi Arabia has never exactly been viewed as a bastion of female independence, but could the trend be changing?
Women under 30 are not allowed to drive, and even then they cannot wear make-up in their car, or drive after 8 pm . They are expected to wear full robes and head scarves in public and cannot work, travel, marry and divorce or have elective surgery without permission from their wali; a related male guardian.
But while Saudi Arabian women may not legally be able to get behind the wheel, they are increasingly in the driver's seat when it comes to business.
Bit by bit this ultra-conservative country is allowing its female citizens more rights, and many women are turning this to their advantage. Since December 2015 women have the right to vote and stand in municipal elections, while women have been allowed to practise as lawyers since 2013.

A total of 15 per cent of all women in the sovereign state are now employed, and this growing freedom is even being reflected in female fashion. While women are mostly expected to wear heavy opaque, black
robes, known as abayas, these garments are increasingly being sold in other colours, patterns or a closer fit. One Saudi news reporter even appeared on the Al Ekhbariya state television channel in 2014 without her headscarf.
Now increasing access to mobile phones and social media has opened up a whole new avenue for women, with 63 per cent of them starting up their own business, according to Facebook, which has taken note of the phenomenon and is planning to train 10,000 women entrepreneurs in the Middle East.
According to Abeer Mohammed, one of Saudi Arabia's growing number of female business owners, "the traditional attitudes toward females starting their own businesses have changed for the better, and society is becoming very welcoming to us now." She says, "starting a handmade jewellery business with the help of social media while bringing up two children was not an easy task at first. But with my gradual increase in customers and the setting of a schedule for myself, I can now manage both of these tasks confidently. Several local accessories businesses even want to collaborate with me these days."
Commenting on the growing trend, business consultant, Noor Khaled, explains,

"Saudi businesswomen rely on personal savings to fund their businesses and do not seek external financing to start and manage their endeavours, which shows that it's not only about deploying money alone, but about taking an interest in nurturing a business with efficient management."

Some women have faced opposition however, with interior designer, Haya Sohail, commenting, "when I told my family members that I wanted to start a business they were all against it for several reasons like the fact that the job required meeting strangers. They questioned why I would want to do such work for the sake of money. But gradually people understood that the reason behind the idea was so that I could take my hobbies and excellent skills to the next level."

But despite criticism from some quarters, it seems the number of women starting their own businesses in Saudi Arabia will continue to grow, with Safiah Alaquil, a fashion designer, explaining, "things have changed now for women in the Kingdom. They are given the chance to be at the forefront in every sector. Besides, the idea of entrepreneurship has grasped the attention of everyone and is catching on like a fever!"
This change can only be a good thing; according to research carried out by McKinsey \& Co, " $\$ 12$ trillion could be added to global GDP by 2025 by advancing women's equality," so for each Saudi woman gaining some financial independence, the rest of the globe benefits too.
But with women in the Kingdom still confined to female quarters in their own homes, 'family sections' in restaurants, and even women-only banks when it comes to their finances, the sovereign state still has a very long way to go before women are afforded the same equality as in most Western countries.
In September 2016, over 14,000 Saudi women signed a petition calling on the government to end the practice of male guardians. Let's hope those in power take note.

SARA BLAKELY, the brain behind world-famous body shapewear, Spanx, became the world's youngest self-made billionaire in history using just $\$ 5,000$ of her own savings.

Born in Clearwater, Florida, to an attorney father and artist mother, Blakely was a faxmachine saleswoman, wearing tights daily for work when she realised there was a gap in the market for the hosiery that offered support without having to actually cover the whole leg.

Believing firmly in her idea, the then 27-year-old moved to Atlanta, Georgia, and wrote a patent herself after discovering it would cost between $\$ 3,000$ and $\$ 5,000$ to hire a lawyer. She then drove to the heart of hosiery company in North Carolina and pitched her idea. She was turned down by every mill, which were all male-run and did not believe there was a market for her product.

Arriving home though, she was contacted by one owner who had shared the idea with his daughters and had seen sense. Over the next year, she created a prototype using herself, friends and families as models. On finishing her product, Blakeley chose bold colours and pictures of different-sized models to set herself apart from the beige packaging available on the market. After a year and a half of development, though, she was still struggling to find the right name and, believing that ' $k$ ' sounds, used by mega-brands, Coca-Cola and Kodak, resonated with consumers, she thought up the

name Spanx while in her car.
Setting up a meeting with buyers from Neiman Marcus, she modelled the product
herself, demonstrating its shaping properties, and securing a deal in seven of its stores. Soon after, she also sold her shapewear
in Saks, Bergdorf Goodman and Bloomingdales and before long Spanx was named by Oprah Winfrey as one of her "favourite things."

With sales skyrocketing, Blakeley's company turned over $\$ 4$ million in its first year and $\$ 10$ million the following year. When the product launched on QVC in 2001, 8,000 pairs were sold in the first six minutes of the show.
With Spanx now worn by celebrities all over the globe, Gillian Anderson to Eva Longoria, Blakeley's magic pants have become a staple in many wardrobes. Gwyneth Paltrow even admitted to wearing two pairs to a redcarpet event after giving birth.
Now a philanthropist, encouraging other women to start their own businesses, Blakely says one of the most important tools she used to succeed was the ability to fail. She explains her father used to ask his children every day what they had failed at, in order to show them mistakes were something to be moved on from.

She also claims visualising where you want your product or company to be is vital, saying she could see herself on Oprah Winfrey's couch 15 years before it ever happened. She also advises keeping fledgling to oneself until they are less "fragile." She says, though wellmeaning, criticism can easily put people off a brilliant idea. Her final advice? "believe in your idea, trust your instincts, and don't be afraid to fail."

# If you can't stand the heat... 

## DESPITE a lack of support, a rising number of female chefs are taking the industry by storm

GORDON RAMSAY. Jamie Oliver. Rick Stein. The list of worldfamous male chefs is seemingly endless. But how many of their female counterparts could you name? Of the UK's 250,000 chefs, a mere 18.5 per cent are female. In terms of Michelin stars, women are even worse represented, with only 10 of the UK's 172 Michelin Starred restaurants being headed by a female chef.
But why is this the case when historically women have done so much of the cooking, particularly in a domestic setting? Some put the discrepancy down to the long, unsociable hours - sometimes 70 hour weeks - worked by chefs.

Or perhaps it is comments from famed male chefs, such as Gordon Ramsey who said, "there are a huge number of women who know how to mix cocktails, but can't cook to save their lives," that are responsible for putting off more women going into the profession. Worse still, renowned French chef, Fernand Point, claimed in the 1950s, "only men have the technique, discipline and passion that makes cooking consistently an art."
Despite a distinct lack of support from some corners though, it is not all bad news and a rising number of female chefs are taking the industry by storm.

Clare Smyth is now the first
woman in the UK to obtain three Michelin stars, while Helen Darroze at the Connaught Hotel, has two. Meanwhile London's Savoy Grill is headed up by Kim Woodward, after she was discovered on Masterchef.

Further afield, Karen Keygnaert, the Flemish-speaking head chef at A'Qi, which has an all-female staff, was offered a Michelin star but turned it down, believing the system is outdated.

An increasing number of female chefs are also now opening their own restaurants. Such as Monica Galetti, head chef at Mere, a New Zealand inspired eatery which she runs alongside her husband. Or

French-born, Anne-Sophie Pic, the chef patron at the London Four Seasons' Le Dame De Pic. AnneSophie, who has no formal training, is France's only female chef to have three Michelin stars.
Perhaps most impressive is 28 -year-old Elizabeth Allen, who won a Michelin star after just one year at East London restaurant, Pidgin, and is now head chef at restaurant Shibui, an East meets West fusion venture.
It seems the playing field is finally levelling out, therefore, and female chefs are finally receiving recognition. The editor of the Michelin guides, Rebecca Burr, puts the development down to im-
provements in the workplace. She explains, "there is now a move for businesses to improve working conditions, whether that's condensed working hours, reducing bookings, increased pay or closing on certain days."

She adds, "split shifts are becoming a thing of yesteryear and instead working in restaurants is becoming more appealing where staff can be more flexible and may start earlier, but finish at a more reasonable time and can have three consecutive days off and are able to have a more balanced life." A change which can only be good news for both the industry and foodies alike.

# Management styles 

BEING the boss has its perks, but it is possible to work your way to the top without ever having been given formal training in management.

From dictatorial managers to the more laid back, there are various ways of managing others, and each has its bonuses and drawbacks. While a lot of people are comfortable in leadership positions, others find it can be a daunting task. Here we have put together a guide to the most common management techniques and styles.

Interviewed by The Guardian, Stephen Archer, Director of Spring Partnerships, a communications and leadership firm, claimed there are 10 top ways to manage a team.

Lead from the outset. Stephen says "people develop their perceptions of you" in the first few weeks, so you should "set the tone of your leadership style from the outset." He recommends taking others' input on board and creating respectful relationships, explaining, "remember to listen... work hard to earn their trust.'
Goal time. Archer says it is vital to set "bold goals," but advises they need to be "specific enough that everyone in the organisation understands them, buys into them and is willing to work together to achieve them."

Mistakes are ok. Too many managers try to "rescue" their staff, according to Stephen, "wrap ping them in cotton wool," which he says is stunting staff growth. We all had to start at the beginning so allowing your staff to learn for themselves will empower them, and enable them to progress.
Innovate to accumulate. Archer explains it is important to give employees space to "come up with new ideas," which, as well as creating a larger pool of innovations and solutions, will again empower staff, and improve creativity in an office.

Time to trust. Stephen explains it is important to trust others to take on and make a success of tasks. He says "great leaders... surround themselves with talented individuals who can offer their own solutions." He explains the best way to achieve this is to "communicate the vision for the future and if things need changing, tell people and involve them in making the changes.'
Let's stay together. Archer explains sometimes "employees feel distant from senior management." He says it is important to avoid this, allowing staff to feel valued and able to communicate honestly with their managers.
Remember your roots. Businesses may progress, but there will always be a core value

from the time of its creation which will still be relevant today. Archer says this will help to "instil a sense of pride across the organisation."
Decision time. "Being indecisive can undermine confidence and trust," according to Archer. He claims this is vital to instilling confidence amongst staff; even if your decision turns out to be the wrong one. He advises, "make a decision based on the facts to hand," that way you can always be confident you took the right course of action, even if the outcome is not what you wanted.
Act quickly. The world is so fast-paced now that
it is vital to move quickly when the time is right, according to Stephen. He says, "playing it safe is never a good business rule," and leaders should be prepared to take action on a new idea or deal if they feel it is right to stay ahead of the competition.
Passion project. Lastly, Archer claims if you want to inspire your staff, you should be "passionate, enthusiastic and proud," and "practice what you preach." While largely inspiring, work can be a grind unless you enjoy what you do and this rubs off on your employees. Take time to show you love what you do and create an office atmosphere which promotes creativity.

## LEGALLY SPEAKING Nothing to hide, nothing to fear

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.


REGULAR checkpoints are often carried out on roads as part of routine operations such as combating drink driving, or vehicle inspections. Sometimes they are part of an increase in security and sometimes, although very rarely, they are directly related to a specific threat.
Whilst safe and careful drivers have nothing to worry about, these checkpoints can seem daunting as you approach but remember, they are being conducted for your safety. They are there to catch criminals and those risking road safety, but if you have nothing to hide, you have nothing to fear. But what should you do when approaching such a checkpoint?
Firstly, stay calm. Listen to the instructions given to you by the officers. They may usher your vehicle to a chosen place, ask you to exit the vehicle and they may want to check the contents of your vehicle as well as your docu-
mentation. Allowing them to get on with their duties will have you getting on your way as soon as possible.
Secondly, do not share the checkpoint information with others. Posting this information on social media can alert those who have done wrong about the presence of the checkpoint allowing them to get away.
Finally, do not be overly alarmed. The presence of additional security teams on the streets is not a direct indication of an increase in the threat level. The Spanish Interior Ministry publishes the details of the current threat level on their website www.interior.gob.es. On the right of the web page is a green box marked NAA, or Nivel de Alerta Aniterrorista. Click on this to see the current status level. The level has been a stage four 'high' alert for some time, since June 2015, but all the information is listed on the page.

## Plusvalia tax - What next?

On May 11 the Spanish Supreme Court ruled that it is illegal for town halls to collect the Plusvalia municipal tax on transfer of properties when a sale is
actually made at a loss. Sellers have four years to reclaim the tax paid. We have received a number of queries about the best course of action.

A.
The basic rule is to pay the tax now and reclaim it later. However, some municipalities, like Malaga City, have already stopped collecting the tax on new sales.

This saves legal expenses for the town hall in later cases. Malaga is even setting up a system for sellers

to claim back the tax in a simple process without going to court. But most municipalities have not changed anything. They
continue to collect the tax and wait for the claims to come in. You need to check with your own town hall.

It may take a long time before the Spanish government actually changes the law to make it conform to the Court decision. Until then each town hall can set its own programme.

## Enemies united

CATALAN president Carles Puigde mont announced that if Cataluña cannot have a referendum it will declare independence anyway.
If he and his government had a clear mandate they might be forgiven for assuming that all Catalans coincide with their own hunger and thirst for independence.
But as the now defunct CiU party galloped ever faster down the independence route a comfortable overall majority dwindled and its successor now needs the support of anarchists to remain in government.
Outside the 'historic' autonomies there is a tendency to interpret nationalism as a desire for independence. Inside Cataluña its current crop of politicians interpret nationalism as permission for it.

The situation gets uglier by the minute, but fortunately this is 2017 and not 1936 .

## Take a seat

PEDRO SANCHEZ, re-enthroned as
the PSOE secretary general, trotted out the required platitudes after his victory in the primaries.
"The PSOE won, not me," he declared with triumphant and insincere modesty. The primaries vote was a victory for him and for the 73,000 or so paid-up party members who wanted him as secretary general and, presumably, as the PSOE's next presidential candidate.
He and they got what they wanted and now of course, Sanchez will have to find himself a parliamentary seat. Since the two he occupied in the past were his by default and not fought for in a general election, presumably he will benefit in the same way once again. Good at winning primaries, our Pedro, but less nifty when it comes to elections.

## Danger from within

CRISTINA CIFUENTES, regional president of the Madrid Community
had better look out.
Dirt has been dug and now she has been tenuously linked to a minor but dodgy contract awarded years ago when she was regional vice-president.
It's easy to see where the mud was coming from. Cifuentes refused to cover up when she took over from her predecessor Ignacio Gonzalez, remanded for the money-laundering and misappropriation of public funds that are now habitual amongst Partido Popular politicians.
Cifuentes is well-regarded inside the PP and seen as a viable successor to Mariano Rajoy in the unlikely event of his ever resigning.

Severe loss of cartilage can lead to bone rubbing on bone, which can alter the shape of the joint and force bones out of their normal position.
Rheumatoid arthritis occurs when the body's immune system targets affected joints, leading to pain and swelling. The outer covering of the joint, known as the synovium, is the first place affected, causing further swelling and a change in the joint's shape. This can cause the bone and cartilage to break down.
What are the symptoms? The symptoms of arthritis can vary depending on the type, so it is important to get
an accurate diagnosis if you have any of the following: Joint pain, tenderness and stiffness. Inflammation in and around the joints. Restricted movement of the joints. Warm red skin over the affected joint or weakness and muscle wasting. Who are most likely to suffer from arthritis?
Osteoarthritis most often develops in adults who are in their late 40 's or older, and is more common in women and people with a family history of the condition.
Rheumatoid arthritis often starts when a person is between 40 and 50 years old, and women are three times more likely to be affected than men.
How do you treat it? Although there is no cure for arthritis, there are many treatments to help slow down the condition. For osteoarthritis, painkillers, corticosteroids and non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs can be used to manage symptoms. In extreme cases, surgery such as joint replacement can be used.

Treatments for rheumatoid arthritis aim to slow down the condition's progress and minimise joint swelling. Analgesics, physiotherapy and regular exercise all can help.

## Growing trend of the lotus birth

A LOTUS birth, is an increasingly popular trend amongst new mothers. It involves not cutting the umbilical cord after the baby is born and leaving it attached to the placenta until it falls off on its own.

This method is seen by many as a natural and spiritual option and is common in some cultures such as in Bali before the idea was introduced in the 1980s in the USA and Australia. Followers believe it allows the baby to continue obtaining all the nutrients the placenta has to offer, such as stem cells, before the placenta dries up and that cutting the cord can be traumatic for the infant. However studies are still underway on any potential benefits of the placenta and now experts have warned of the risk of leaving the placenta attached. With some leaving it attached for up to two weeks before it drops off naturally, the British Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists warns about the risks of infection and bacteria developing in the placenta and spreading to the baby.

With a growing number of women in the UK reportedly opting for a lotus birth, the British Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists said the placenta is particularly prone to infection as it contains blood and recommends that babies be monitored carefully for any signs of infection.

## Be flexible to get the most out of workers

SPENDING a lot of time commuting to work is more likely to lead to depression.

A study of more than 34,000 British adults found that commutes, either by train or in the car, of more than half an hour are damaging the nation's health, but are also affecting their productivity at work. Those with commutes of more than an hour each way fared the worst mentally as they were 33 per cent more likely to suffer from depression and 12 per cent more likely to report work-related stress.
These longer commutes also meant many workers were having to skip sleep which was affecting their mental state.
In a bid to reduce the impact of long commutes, employers are now increasingly introducing the idea of flexible working hours and allowing them to spend some time working at home.

The study showed that this flexible working has a positive impact on both employees' physical and mental health and their productivity, with them less likely to be stressed or depressed. These employees also had an additional five productive days each year compared to those with no flexible working arrangements.
The study was carried out by VitalityHealth in partnership with the University of Cambridge, across all industries in the UK.

# Few Spaniards claim to be in good health 

SPANIARDS are amongst the most medicated in Europe. Despite many claims it boasts one of the healthiest lifestyles in the world, it seems this health isn't transmitting to much of the population as it has been reported as being one of the countries with the lowest percentage of people aged 50 or over who considers their health status to be 'good.'
This is the conclusion of the report 'Health in adult life and its relation to healthy ageing: current trends, opportunities and future challenges in Spain' carried out by the Mapre Founda-

years or over was the age of people in the study
tion to determine the health status perceived by those aged over 50. It found that many didn't perceive their health to be particularly good with women giving a worse assessment of their physical, cognitive and emotional health compared to men.
According to experts, the way in which citizens perceive their health is an "excellent indicator of the general level of health of the people."

Those who claimed to have better health were speaking in relation to their physical nature, such as not having limitations on being able to perform daily activities or not suffering from illness or pain or anxiety.
In order to produce the report, an international comparison was made that found in Scandinavian and western European countries, the proportion of those over 50 who declare themselves to be in 'good' health is significantly higher than of the countries of south and eastern Europe.
In contrast, Estonia and Italy are the ones with the highest proportion of this population that considered their state of health to be 'bad.'

## Instagram comes out worst for mental health

INSTAGRAM is the social network with the greatest negative effect on mental health and well-being, according to a recent survey of 1,500 teens and young adults. Five social networks were included in the research, with YouTube the only site to achieve a net positive score. Twitter finished second followed by Facebook and Snapchat, with Instagram fifth.

Although the photo-sharing platform received positive marks for self-expression and self-identity, it was also linked to high anxiety levels, depression, bullying and 'a fear of missing out.'
The survey, designed by the UK's Royal Society for Public Health posed questions about how social media affected 14 issues related to mental and physical health.

They processed over $£ 1.5$ b in contactless payments in December alone, with shoppers spending an average of $£ 10.39$ per transaction.

Already more than half of UK shoppers say they'd happily leave their wallet at home and pay for everything on their smartphone instead. It's bad enough to lose your phone at the moment. Not any other, just them. More women than men go gluten free. Celiacs have different sorts of reactions from what they consume than others. Lactose intolerant is another. I had a friend who was allergic to garlic. He only had to smell it and he would come out in a rash.
He's in good company, my friend and colleague, wine aficionado Pancho Campo reacts to garlic and onions. Difficult for a man that loves the Mediterranean diet!! Thankfully he is not allergic to wine!! However a wine merchant friend of mine loves red wine but it gives her an unpleasant reaction so she has to avoid it.
Is there a difference between an allergy and an intolerance? Of course there is. After all we do not refer to Gluten free or Lactose intolerant as allergies, people are just better off without the things that cause them problems. Restaurants are aware of this now, more than ever before. Sandwich group Pret a Manger has seen sales grow 15 per cent to $£ 776.2 \mathrm{~m}$, they claim driven by sales in dairy and gluten-free ranges. They introduced a number of dairy-free products in 2016, including a dairy-free, gluten-free soup range all under 250 calories. This recent offering increased UK soup sales by 16 per cent like-for-like. Their dairy-free, coconut porridge, accounts for one in five porridge sales in the UK, and now coconut milk sales exceed soya milk. (Never did understand that stuff!!)
In this day and age, any restaurant worth its salt grinder has now got allergy symbols on their menus. But is it the responsibility of restaurateurs to inform the clients of ingredients in every dish? It's good that the symbols reflect certain allergies and intolerances, Celiac, Lactose, nuts etc. but I know someone who is allergic - yes allergic - to coriander. But not to flat parsley, which is the same family!! After months of a dry hacking cough, I went to my doctor who had allergy tests done on me and - wait for it - I have a dust allergy!! Who would ever have thought? "Excuse me waiter, I am allergic to dust, was it the coco powder on the chocolate cake or the gold dust on the fish, the crushed rhino horn - or have you just not vacuumed in a while?"

# Buying a house, useful knowledge 

 on requirements, taxes and costs

IN this article, the second of a series I hope to be publishing in $E u$ ro Weekly News, we are going to cover some important considerations on buying or selling a property.
After spending some time in La Marina Alta it may be that you are considering buying a property. As you start visiting properties for sale, on your own or assisted by a professional, you should consider some of the following information:

Taxes: Sales entail taxes for both the buyer and for the seller. Buyers have to pay the onerous Transfer Tax currently 10 per cent of the selling price. The real price paid may be lower than the Tax value, leading to a complementary Tax reclaim (see below).

The deadline is one month from the signing of the deed. Several qualified professionals can as-
sist you over this task.
Sellers pay Plus Valía, a capital gains tax which varies depending on the cadastral value of the house and the year you bought it. When sellers are non-resident, they also have to pay an additional tax over non-resident incomes, at 3 per cent of the price received. Even though this obligation relies on the sellers, normally it's the buyers who fulfil it, retaining the amount from the paid price.
Not to be confused with the above taxes is property tax, paid by the owner of the house the first of January of the current year, at 1 per cent over the cadastral value of the house.
Price: Obtaining a low price, below market, is always good news. Nevertheless, as seen before, when the paid price is lower than tax value, you might receive a tax reclaim. The way to avoid it is to prove tax value is higher than
market value; your lawyer will help you with this task.
Charges and encumbrances: Before signing the deed, a Notary will check that the house is free of charges and encumbrances, so the buyers always know what they are buying, being aware if there are any charges over the house, such as access easements, mortgages or third party rights.
Community expenses and property tax: Your Notary will also ensure that association expenses and property tax are up to date.
After-signature arrangements: Once you have already bought the house, having paid the seller their price, there are still some arrangements left to fulfil, such as tax payment or land registration. Either the Notary or your assessor can complete these tasks for you.

# Nation of homeowners 

SPAIN is a nation of homeowners. New data from a report on the 2017 housing market found that 84 per cent of the population owns at least one home. The figures include couples and adult children who live in the family home.
The figures show a growing property divide with 16 per cent of people owning no home, and another 16 per cent owning multiple homes. One out of every 100 people owns three homes or more. The average number of homes owned by Spanish residents is 1.03 .
In the past year 4 per cent of homeowners have purchased a new property. Meanwhile another 4 per cent of properties are owned but unoccupied by families who neither live there, nor rent it out. Eight out of 10 Spaniards live in mortgaged or
owned property, compared to the two in 10 who now rent.
With growing numbers of renters and landlords, three of out 10 Spaniards now have a direct relationship with the real estate sector. Demand for rented flats now exceeds demand for purchase as younger people leave the parental nest but can't afford to buy.
Roughly 7 per cent of homeowners want to buy again in the next two years, while 34 per cent are considering a long term purchase. Those looking to buy in the short term are, on average, a middle class married couple aged around 43 .
The survey also found that four in 10 Spaniards believe property is the best way to hand over wealth to their children. Similar numbers


A SWEEPING analysis of the Spanish property scene found that prices have recovered to the same levels seen in 2004. The news is the latest milestone in the country's property recovery, which gathers strength with each passing day.

A thorough analysis from the Real Estate Review Report 2017 said the upward trend in property prices seen in the last few years 'can be sustained,' which is terrific news for homeowners and those interested in engaging with the property market.

The report cites the continued strength of second-hand housing over new builds, noting that for every new home sold, another eight old ones change hands. It also noted that the number of transactions taking place is roughly half that seen in 2004, figures which are in line with today's market's more sustainable characteristics.
Spain's 'two-speed' market continues to be a significant issue when trying to generate averages across the country. Runaway property success is being seen in Barcelona, Madrid and Spain's Mediterranean coastal hotspots, favoured by foreign buyers, while the interior progresses less quickly.

Still, overall experts have described Spain's property market as having reached a comfortable cruising speed that, with care and attention, can be maintained for long term prosperity.

# Flying with pets

WITH more and more people owning properties in Spain and spending a large part of their year here, pet travel has increased dramatically with owners preferring to bring their animals with them rather than leave them at home for any length of time.

Pets accompanying their owners on a trip to Spain can be accepted as luggage when the corresponding excess baggage
tariff has been paid (regardless of the class in which the passenger is to fly).
As a general rule, these animals must be checked in and loaded into the hold of the aircraft, where they will be placed in a container (which some airlines can provide) but to be on the safe side it is worth purchasing your own carrier which is IATA approved (and will have a sticker or label stating this).

As only certain airlines and airports in the UK have the facilities to transport pets (BA and Monarch being the main carriers), when making a booking for you and your pet check first that the necessary transport can be arranged.
Animals must carry the correct documentation, either with a pet passport or veterinary certificate or with all required vaccinations (in some countries with an evaluation of antibodies). All animals are identified by a mi-
crochip, and you need the correct documentation for this. Preparing pets for travel can be a lengthy business, with all the health checks, documentation and pet passport. So if you are thinking about bringing your pet into Spain make sure you leave plenty of time to make the necessary arrangements.

You can find more information on the Pets Travel Scheme (PETS) for the UK at $w w w . d e$ fra.co.uk.

Guide dogs trained to accompany a passenger with a disability will usually travel in the cabin, unless prohibited by national regulations or the airlines. The dog's transport, whether in the hold or in the cabin, will not be chargeable.
It is not necessary to carry out any special procedure, but the dog must wear a muzzle, collar and lead. If the dog is to travel in the cabin, it will be placed next to the passenger in a place indicated by the crew.

The expansion gives Geely a major name in Lotus which, despite making substantial losses in recent years, retains a giant reputation in the motoring world. It also gives Geely control of a huge Protonowned production plant in Malaysia with capacity to produce

## ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

THE Jeep brand dates back more than 70 years, and is widely known as "the American legend.' While these days Jeep is owned by the Fiat Group, the marque still retains its tough formidable image.
The Cherokee may be the best-known name in the Jeep line-up, but the smaller Renegade, a compact crossover model, is making its mark, appealing to those who want a cool street image yet when necessary, genuine four-wheel drive capability.
Many models in the SUV/Crossover sector have either two-wheel drive or a rather limited 4WD system which cannot cope with difficult terrain. All Jeep $4 \times 4$ models can calibrate the differential to maximise grip and control in snow, mud or on rough rocky terrain.

But though the Renegade is a rough-stuff mud-plugger, its distinctive visual cachet means you can still park outside a trendy cafe and make a style statement.
Renegade prices start at $€ 21,050$ ( $£ 18,250$ ), with petrol (£29,050).

and diesel options and 2WD or 4WD. Many buyers opt for upper range versions laden with extra kit, and Limited models start at $€ 27,998$ ( $£ 24,265$ ).

My test model was a Limited in 4WD form with auto transmission and with the 138 hp 2.0 litre diesel engine, and that combination costs $€ 33,507$

For that you get a comprehensive spec which includes touchscreen infotainment cen-

tre, DAB radio, Bluetooth and sat-nav, plus alloy wheels, heated leather seats, front and rear parking sensors and plenty of safety features including lane departure and front-collision warnings.
The Renegade's styling is unmistakable - a plus-point in a sector which is quite imageconscious, and while it loves being off road, it is pleasant to drive on the tarmac, at least if the surface is smooth. The firm suspension does jolt in potholes but otherwise, the ride quality
town driving is quite accept able.
The overall driving refinement is not as good as rivals such as the Skoda Yeti, Nissan Juke or Mini Countryman but you have to weigh that against the Jeep's superior off-road ability and its charismatic look. The 2.0 litre diesel engine pulls well, giving a nippy 0 100 kph time of 9.9 seconds and top speed of 182 kph (113 $\mathrm{mph})$. Fuel economy is 17.2 kpl $(48.7 \mathrm{mpg})$. The nine-speed auto gearbox is excellent, giving smooth and fluid shifts.
The cabin has a stand-out radically-styled dashboard, unlike anything else in the class. There is a logical layout of instruments and the touchscreen is quick to respond.
There is space for four adults in comfort. Boot space is adequate at 351 litres and expands to 1,297 litres if the rear seats are folded. Only downsides - a deep load lip and the rear seat doesn't go fully flat.
