### Court backs language law legal claim

A group of furious parents have scored a major victory in their battle against the Generalitat Valenciana.

The regional Supreme Court of Justice (TSJ) has stepped in to temporarily suspend the council's decision to phase out the Spanish language in schools by 2019.

It comes after thousands of protesters took to the streets of Alicante and Valencia in recent

### All eyes on UK British poll takes place today

ALL eyes are on the UK as the nation today (Thursday) goes to the polls to select a new government.

By tomorrow (Friday) the British electorate will know who is to lead them from 10 Downing Street for up to the next five years, with Theresa May heading the Conservative Party, Jeremy Corbyn the Labour Party, Tim Farron the Liberal Democrats, Nicola Sturgeon the Scottish National Party, Leanne Wood Plaid Cymru, and Paul Nuttall UKIP, with Caroline Lucas and Jonathan Bartley jointly leading the Green Party.

While in recent General Elections and other national votes opinion polls and national forecasts have frequently been inaccurate. in the countdown to to-

day's election they have pointed to a Conservative victory despite the Labour party making up ground.

Thousands of British expats in Spain will have taken part in today's vote if they have only left to live abroad within the last 15 years, although there have been mixed reports concerning the arrival of ballot papers with some councils sending them out very quickly and others taking their time.

Both leaders consider this the most important General Election for years, and while politicians call for a united country, the result is more likely to highlight deep divides between many UK regions.

### Court probe into death plunge

THE last five people to see tragic Kirsty Maxwell alive before she fell to her death from a 10th-floor Benidorm hotel apartment are being formerly investigated.

A judge investigating the death of the 27-year-old Scot on April 29 has ordered the men - dubbed the 'Benidorm Five' by the British press - to return to Spain for questioning.

Judge Ana Isabel Garcia-Galbis has ordered the five men to appear before her on July 26 following an appeal by the Spanish lawyer acting for the dead woman's family after they were allowed to go back to

### SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...15

Whether avoiding the colour yellow or placing cacti on windowsills to ward off evil spirits, there are rafts of superstitions in Spanish culture, and none are more popular than fear of Tuesday 13th.

### Unlucky for some

WHILE Friday the 13th is considered an unlucky day in most Western countries, superstitious souls in Spain view Tuesday as the day to dread.

This is because Tuesdays are said to be dominated by Ares, the Greek God of War, who was known as Mars in Ancient Rome and gave his name to dies martis (Tuesday) in Latin, which later became martes in Spanish.

Events such as the fall of Constantinople to the Fourth Crusade, which happened on Tues-

day April 13, 1204, and the fall of Constantinople to the Ottomans on Tuesday May 29,

1453, added more weight to the belief that bad things happen on a Tuesday.

In Greek, Tuesday is known as Triti, meaning the third of the week, and this has further boosted the superstition since bad luck supposedly 'comes in threes.'

There is even a traditional Spanish proverb which warns: 'En martes, ni te cases, ni te embarques, ni de tu casa te apartes' [On Tuesday, don't get married, don't get on a boat, don't even leave your house].

Occurring in months which start on a Thursday, next Tuesday marks the first and only occasion that sufferers of trezidavomartiofobia (fear of Tuesday 13th) need fret this year.

Very superstitious

OTHER widespread superstitions in Spain include an aversion to the colour yellow, which is traditionally said to represent sulphur and the devil. Thus, Spaniards will not wear yellow in certain situations including job interviews and exams,



while it is considered bad luck to gift friends or family members, especially babies, with vellow clothes.

Cacti are popular window plants in Spain, and while this has plenty to do with the dry, sunny climate it is rooted in the long-established belief that the spiky succulents ward off evil spirits. The theory is that the plants absorb moisture from the air, drowning fiendish phantoms as they try to cross the threshold.

Wicked spirits are also thought to dwell in human hair, from where they are easily transferred to headwear, so leaving a hat on a bed in Spain is also considered a bad omen.

### Fatal accident went unnoticed

THE body of a 44-year-old dustbin lorry driver was discovered at the bottom of a ravine near Jijona.

Neither he nor his vehicle, which overturned after running off the road in the early hours of the morning, were found until the afternoon.

The victim, who had set out from Almoradi, was bound for the Piedra Negra landfill site in Jijona which is reached via the CV-800 road that links the town to Muchamiel.

The lorry left the road on a bend not far from the plant and a few metres from the bridge over the Torremanzanas river.

Police had already been notified after the lorry failed to return to Almoradi but neither the overturned vehicle nor the driver's body were immediately visible from the road.

At around 4pm the Guardia Civil and Local Police went to the scene after a driver reported seeing a lorry in the gully.

The driver's body, which was found 20 metres away in an inaccessible spot, had to be removed by firemen.

### **Key witness**

SPANISH Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy will appear as a witness in a major corruption trial involving members of the governing conservative Partido Popular.

Spain's High Court called on the politician to give evidence in person at the so-called Gurtel trial and it is expected he will appear at a court in San Fernando de Henares near Madrid in July.

The case centres on a vast cash for contracts kickback scheme that is alleged to have helped finance Mr Rajoy's PP, which has faced repeated accusations of corruption. The 62year-old leader is not accused of wrongdoing but it is believed as the head of the party since 2004, he could provide key evidence.

### Curry favour

INDIA'S Prime Minister Narendra Modi has urged Spanish firms to invest in his country saying it was "an enormous country" and there were "many opportunities" as his government set out a massive infrastructure programme.

The politician met with Spanish government representatives and business leaders. India plans to build six massive sea ports, 250 airports, 27,000km of roads, and modernise 400 train stations by 2025. Mr Modi said Spain was a global leader in areas India needed as a priority.

THE medieval city of Caceres has a starring role in the new series of the award-winning Game of Thrones, its stone walls and fortifications making it an ideal choice to be cast

Early in the morning or at dusk, visitors almost feel they have stepped into a time machine and returned to the Middle Ages, such is the feel of history all around.

A lively university city with a population of 95,814, its old town Ciudad Monumental is a UNESCO world heritage site and is an impressive reminder of the past. It is 300km south west of Madrid, in the region of Extremadura, a drive of about three hours.

It is a mixture of gothic and renaissance architecture and the narrow cobbled streets twist and climb amongst the ancient stone walls, a skyline decorated with turrets, gargoyles and enormous stork nests.

The streets are packed with shops and taverns; people can enjoy full-bodied red wines, cherry, blackberry and chestnut liqueurs and cheese made from the milk of Merino sheen. Caseres is also famous for its food: stews, roast meats - especially pork, lamb and game - all recipes with a rich country tradition.

The provincial capital of the province of Caceres, it has been home to Romans, Visigoths, moors and Spanish after the reconquest and it is situated on the Via de la Plata, the pilgrims' route from Sevilla to Santiago de Compostela.

People travelled from across the country to join the protest, walking behind a banner reading: 'Bread, work, homes and equality.'

## Party venue under fire over barmaid advert

NIGHTCLUB Benidorm has been slammed for an online job advert calling for barmaids 'without jealous boyfriends.'

The advert sought 'good looking and experienced' waitresses who were 'responsible and single' as they did not want 'jealous boyfriends waiting for them at the door at 5 am.

The Facebook post has since gone viral with many complaining about its sexist nature. It also says candidates who are not tall 'must wear high heels or platform shoes at all times.

Julio Granado, the manager of the nightclub, has since pulled the advert due to the abuse he has allegedly received.

"I've been insulted, called a sexist pig and worse. I've even had death threats," he said in a video message.

"We don't want girls working while their boyfriends come in and watch them, sick with jealousy," he said. "It's happened before and it causes fights."

Granado also explained the high heels requirement was because "if they are

short they won't reach over the bar, so they have to wear high heels otherwise it gives a bad image."

He further protested in his video that had he posted the same advert but for men, which he claims he does, "no-one would say a thing."

And the Andalucian helped ensure his team did not fall short after they became the first club to retain the European Cup since AC Milan in 1990.






### Partial solution for Emaus

THE Generalitat's Social Services department continues to seek a solution to Emaus's problems.

The bankrupt organisation, which was founded in 1979, has children, the elderly, the disabled and gender violence victims in its

Beset by financial problems for the last six years, Emaus owes more than €5 million in Social Security payments and employees are owed up to seven months' wages.

Regional Social Services chief Helena Ferrando said her department hoped to avoid having to relocate all those currently living in Emaus centres in the Marina Baja and Marina Alta.

Meanwhile a solution has been found for the Les Boqueres residence for the elderly in Altea, Ferrando revealed.

A company came forward last month and announced that it was prepared to take over Les Boqueres and also pay off its €1.7 million Social Security arrears.

More than three weeks ago an Alicante court temporarily halted the redun-

dancy order hanging over the Emaus employees in hopes of finding other businesses willing to take over the centres and their Social Security debt.

The Alicante court and the official receivers agreed to wait until the end of June when the school year finishes before deciding the fate of the children and vulnerable adults in

Emaus's care.

There was also brighter news for the 230 Emaus employees after the Generalitat released cash from the Regional Liquidity Fund (FLA) to pay their December 2016 and January 2017 wage. The remaining pay cheques should be up to date by the end of the summer, the regional govern-

### Justice call for mayor's murder

THE daughters and widow of Alejandro Ponsoda, late mayor of Polop, want sentences totalling 180 years for his seven alleged killers.

They are accused of plotting or carrying out the shooting that ended Ponsoda's life in October 2007

Ponsoda was gunned down in October 2007 as he parked outside his Chirles home, dying a week later in hospital.

The principal suspect, Juan Cano, succeeded Ponsoda at the town hall.

The Villajoyosa judge investigating the case concluded last September that Ponsoda's murder was planned in the Mesalina club, a Finestrat brothel.

Leaked details of the judge's summary tallied with allegations made by the club's former doorman, now a protected witness, that Cano was a regular client.

"The mayor won't see the year out," Cano supposedly said shortly before Ponsoda's death.

He and a local businessman allegedly offered to pay the Messalina doorman €35,000 to kill

### Bag disposal

AS more councils in Spain tighten up their regulations concerning dog ownership and traceability, a new phenomenon seems to have appeared.

One of the aims of the regulations is to cut down the amount of dog excrement seen on the streets and to some extent this is working, but there is a hidden surprise.

Whilst owners have started to carry 'poop bags' with them and do stop to pick up the faeces, many appear to be unable to decide where to safely dispose of the bags and suddenly there are lots of little black bags appearing on pavements, roads or thrown onto

It's a double-edged sword as there are fewer piles of poo on the streets which must make it safer for children, but there is the problem of cute little bags waiting to be picked up and opened.

At least when it rained heavily or when the sun was at its strongest, the dog mess was either washed away or petrified, but now it has the potential to sit and fester within its own little home.

Karen, who works closely with the British Consulate in Alicante and British Embassy in Madrid to help improve safety within Benidorm, was able to tell Chris about the many improvements that are being made to assist anyone in crisis whilst in the resort.

This included the new SATE office - currently under construction in the Rincon de Loix area of the town - more lighting for areas

such as the locally known 'yellow brick road,' increased policing in the Guiri area (British square) and how tourists could help themselves by being vigilant regarding their personal safety in addition to protecting their belongings.

# Town wins 'smart' money

CALPE Town Hall has won European Union cash to help fund the resort's transformation into a 'smart city.'

The project has been given a green light by Europe to forge

ahead with the €6.1 million project for a Sustainable and Integrated Urban Development Strategy (eDUSI); the only town in the Marina Alta to get approval.

The local authority is one of five towns within the Valencia Community to be given EU support and will have to find €3.067 million of its own money to support the five years of the programme.

At the heart of the scheme are moves to connect the tourist areas of Calpe with its historic old town, helping 'revitalise' the centre, while securing green areas for residents and visitors.

Mayor Cesar Sanchez said the plan has "vital importance to get the model of a city we want for the future of Calpe" and he thanked everyone who had taken part in drafting the successful EU application.

Underpinning the concept is converting Calpe into a smart city, improving the use and quality of information and communication for everyone.

Councillor Carole Saunders said the project also involved "promoting a local economy low in carbon emissions, protecting the environment, and improving the efficiency of local resources: it also promotes social inclusion and the fight against poverty.

Calpe from the

Penon de Ifach.

She added: "The programme has to be run until 2022 and the EU money will be received in stages, as does the contributions made by the town hall, the first year is really setting up the pro-

The next stage involves making people aware of the need to use transport that does not "contaminate the atmosphere" said Mrs Saunders. "We have to look to find ways of improving mobility and accessibility and we hope to improve the town's bus service.'

She said eDUSI also included the promotion of awareness of renewable energy within the town, as well as improving awareness and protection of Calpe's cultural and natural heritage.

"There will also be money available to be invested to help the commerce of the town, helping small businesses flour-

"Helping the economy, helping improve the work place, and finding work within the town for people without jobs; helping 'young' businesses will also create new jobs."

Mrs Saunders said the application was put together from Calpe's own research and communication with resident groups and associations under the Agenda 21 concept she had worked on for six

### Anti flood project one step closer



FLOODING of the Calle Murtal area of Poniente beach, Benidorm, will be prevented by the one million euro project.

ALICANTE Provincial Council has released €13,000 to draw up a plan to end flooding in the La Cala area of

The Barranco de Murtal ravine, which runs down to the sea at the end of Poniente beach experiences regular flooding, particularly in periods of heavy rain.

The project which is expected to cost €1 million, will include an underground pipeline to direct excess rainwater into the sewerage system rather than onto the Poniente beach zone, plus a tank to collect water than can later be used for street washing or the watering of landscaped areas of the city. Once completed, the work will ensure the 190 metre stretch of Calle Murtal, that regularly faces closure in periods of severe, heavy rain, will remain unaffected in future.

The funds received from Alicante will pay for a company to draw up a plan for the project, which the council hopes to have in place before the end of the year.

Benidorm councillor responsible for water, Jose Ramon Gonzalez de Zarate, explained that, "Calle Murtal is one of the few roads that we have to close in torrential rains."

### Drug detection course for Local Police



### The Air BnB effect

president Benidorm's Hotels association has blamed unregulated operators for a sharp drop in domestic tourists visiting the city this year.

Tourism figures released for visitors to Benidorm in May show that whilst holidaymakers from Britain and other European countries are on the increase, tourists from within the rest of Spain have dropped by 12 per cent on the same period of 2016.

Almost 54 per cent of all visitors to the city in May came from the UK, and 9 per cent from Belgium, Netherlands and France, meaning two out of three tourists were from outside Spain.

Whilst welcoming the encouraging figures from post Brexit Britain, Toni Mayor, president of the HOSBEC Benidorm hotels association. expressed his concern at the official drop in numbers of domestic visitors.

He believes the overall picture is muddled by the rise in unregulated operators such as Air BnB and Home and Away, which allow people to rent out rooms in private houses and apartments.

"It is possible that Spanish

tourists are coming to a type of accommodation much less sustainable, such as the illegal housing market, which competes with us in our same market but benefits from our promotion work and modernisation of business practices without contributing to advertising costs or paying taxes," he warned.

Meanwhile, he confirmed the association is aware that the rise in tourists from elsewhere in Europe will not be indefinite, therefore an advertising campaign to attract Spanish tourists is planned for the near future.

REACHING the Marina Baja hospital in Villajoyosa by road has been complicated for years.

The hospital has its own tram stop but no direct road link and approaching from the N-332 bypass requires concentration to ensure not missing the turning for the old main road.

Ignoring the bypass and reaching the hospital via the old N-332 is simpler but the road has heavy traffic and whichever route drivers choose they must still negotiate the hazardous

### Rocky route to hospital

In theory this should be easier now that an industrial zone between the old road and the hospital has been provided with infrastructure that includes a roundabout giving access to the medical centre. When work began in March 2016, the town hall announced that the route for traffic

approaching from both directions would be temporarily modified.

This was supposedly returning to normal after three months but although work finished two months ago, the modifications remain in place.

The roundabout is closed to traffic, obliging ambulances as well as motorists to detour along

winding roads with curves, potholes and a 30kilometre per hour speed limit.

"A hospital's access should take priority," said Marisa Corcostegui, the Comisiones Obreras delegate. A road used by thousands of people each day should be "clear of obstacles and rapid," she claimed. "This should have been carried out years ago without having to wait for a development plan that is currently not pro-

to a working session for engineers attending the 15th Coastline and Ports Conference.

### 100 months of ultra-low UK interest rates

5th June 2017 is a notable anniversary for the Bank of England and British savers - it marks 100 months since the Sterling interest rate was cut to the historic low of 0.5%.

It has also been 10 years now since we saw a UK interest rate hike. The last time the Bank's Monetary Policy Committee raised its rate was in May 2007, from 5.25% to 5.5%.

Then the financial crisis hit and rates kept falling until they reached 0.5% in March 2009. They remained frozen for years until last summer when the bank rate was cut to 0.25% in the wake of the Brexit referendum.

The last time rates were kept low for so long was around the Second World War. Then the rate was held at 2% (which actually sounds good today!) from 1939 to

and the negotiations likely to be challenging for the UK economy, few would be surprised if we hit another anniversary, this time 10 years of 0.5% or lower rates.

While businesses and borrowers have benefited from low rates, it has been detrimental for savers. In March 2016, Hargreaves Lansdown calculated that seven years of record low rates and quantitative easing resulted in savers losing out on £160 billion

- an average of £6,000 for every household.

The firm observed that while the monetary policy had supported strong increases in share, bond and property prices, it had 'annihilated' returns on

In contrast, the FTSE 100 index has increased 109% over the eight years since interest rates were cut to 0.5%, rising from 3530 on 5th March 2009 to 7374 on 5th March 2017.

The situation is actually getting worse for UK savers as inflation is rising, meaning savers are earning negative rates of return. Data released on 16th May showed that UK inflation, as measured by the Consumer Price Index, hit 2.7% in April – the highest level since September 2013. There were virtually no savings accounts offering a rate higher than 2.7%.

Inflation across the EU as a whole was 2% in April, and 2.6% in Spain.

In the UK, the National Institute of Economic and Social Research (NIESR) warned that inflation will hit 3.5% by the end of the year, before falling back, while ultra-low interest rates will remain in place for another two years, until the UK has exited the EU.

After its monetary policy meeting on 11th May, BoE Mark Carney governor commented that "this is going to be a more challenging time for British households". Real income growth will be negative and wages will not keep up with prices.

It is not all bad news. The Bank expects the slowdown in economic growth and rise in inflation to be temporary, and that the next three years will see wages recover and a slow but steady economic growth. It indicated that, if the economy lives up to the forecasts and Brexit

talks go well, it would be in a position to raise interest rates from 0.25%. This is, however, based on the assumption that "the adjustment to the UK's new relationship with the EU is smooth."

With no compelling signs of a rise in interest rates any time soon, this is a good time to review how you structure your finances and consider alternative options for investing. The first event was a conducted tour to the top of La Serreta with a commentary by the Alcoy archaeologists Ignasi Grau and Josep Maria Segura. Before leaving they deposited a wreath of aromatic plants at the foot of the monolith which

marks La Serreta's highest point and is also a monument to Camilo Visedo.

The La Serreta settlement, which was first inhabited around 2,500 years ago and included a sanctuary and burial ground, was declared a National Monument in 1931.

It immediately attracted international attention owing to important finds of votive terracotta statues, imported ceramics and lead plaques engraved with Iberian script.

Safe from **bullets** 

CALLOSA has acquired 10 new bulletproof vests for the Local Police.

The €6,594 investment means that all officers can now count on this piece of equipment as six vests were purchased at the end of last year, covered by the municipal budget for 2016.

"This outlay was necessary to ensure the safety of all officers," said Josep Saval who is Public Safety councillor as well as Callosa's mayor.

"The Local Police force now awaits delivery of two new vehicles, four-wheel drive

Nissan Qashquais which will replace existing vehicles," Sava said.

These have been acquired through Banco Santander's leasing system, one of which will cost the town hall €47,730 for four years. The other, equipped for detainees, will cost €51,730 during the same period of time.

### Prime site taken over by town hall

AFTER a legal battle lasting years, Villajoyosa Town Hall recovered a 1,400-square metre plot of municipal land in La Cala.

The seafront plot with an uninterrupted view of the beach was occupied until now by an industrial unit surrounded by hoardings. This belonged to the company developing the Atrium hotel complex, a project that was halted in 2003.

Although the town hall has finally recovered the land, the cost of dismantling the eyesore, demolishing its concrete base and removing the hoardings must be met from municipal funds.

The developers have continually refused to carry out the work, which the council has now contracted to an outside company although it will reclaim the €11,400 cost.

In response to constant complaints from La Cala residents, the town hall of the day ordered the Atrium developers to remove the makeshift building in 2014. The owners denied occupying the site, claiming that a subcontractor who used it to store building materials, had received municipal permission although no record was ever found of this.

In 2015 the developers ignored an order to leave the site within three months and at the end of last year, the town hall decided to take matters into its own hands.

La Cala residents expressed satisfaction with the demolition and said they hoped that the town hall would use the land for infrastructure improvements or the leisure and sports facilities they have been requesting for years.



### What does an owner of a property in Spain need to do, when their property belongs to another person on the Land Registry?

ment.

My mother bought a property in Spain many years ago. The purchase agreement was never recorded at the Land Registry, and the sale was never signed before a Spanish public notary. The truth is that for years, she has lived on the property without problems, but now that she has passed away, I am told, that I cannot inherit the house because it is registered at the Land Registry in the name of the person who sold it to her years ago. I have tried to contact this person but it is not possible, and it is very likely that he has passed away. I am the heir of my mother, what can I do?

Dear Reader, thank you for your inquiry. First, note that it is important to know if you have kept a copy of the sale contract signed between your mother and the owner of the property, and if this contract existed, or if for example, it was just a verbal agree-

If it is not possible to find the seller or his heirs, or they refuse to recognise the sale and sign it in front of a notary in Spain to make it official (public) so the property can be regis-

tered in the name of the real owner; your mother, or in your case, you as her heir, will need to go to court.

If you do not know if the seller is alive or not, it is advisable to claim against him as a registered owner at the Land Registry, but also against his inheritance (herencia yacente) or potential heirs in case he may have died.

Legally, there are several actions that could be filed for, depending on the situation:

1. Declaratory action of dominion: based on article 348 of the Spanish Civil Code, you could, as inheritor of your mother. the real owner of the property, request it be declared, regardless of what appears in the Land Registry, the real and actual owner is your mother, and ask the court to declare it.

2. Notarise the sale agreement: also based on article 1279 of the Spanish Civil Code, as heir of your mother, you could ask the seller or his heirs to notarise and confirm in front of a Spanish Public Notary, the agreement signed with your mother, so your rights can be registered at the competent land registry.

3. Other actions.

There are also other legal actions that

could be linked to these types of issues, such as the declaration of the acquisition of the right of ownership through the possession or use, known as usucapio or acquisitive prescription, by which, the property right is acquired by using the property, according to article 1957 of the Spanish Civil Code.

In your case, it is not possible to advise you without studying your situation in detail, but in any case, it is not true that you cannot do anything, as there are various legal actions, which even jointly (cumulative) you can use before the courts, in order to claim your rights to the property, as heir of the real owner, therefore legally recognised and pro-

# Pups on the dhole

A CLAN of wild dogs is helping babysit four baby dholes born at the Terra Natura, another breeding success for the Benidorm theme park.

The pups were born in a burrow dug by parents Lennon and Nina in their enclosure of the prairie zone following a 60-day pregnancy.

And while keeping a distance from the pack of Cuon alpinus - the species is also known as the Asiatic wild dog, the whistling dog and the red wolf - keepers and vets have maintained a close watch on the new arrivals.

Pups are normally around 200g at birth but quickly grow and can be seen around the mouth of the den, watched by the parents or members of the pack.

The dhole is a social animal, the clan has a strict hierarchy and in the wild will normally be made up of around 12 animals but groups of up to 40 have been noted, despite the dog now being

classed as endangered.

A Terra Natura spokesman said because of the 'natural' development of the litter, the sex of each pup was not yet known.

"Dholes are social animals where the dominant pair of the clan reproduces, although the other members of the clan collaborate in raising the offspring," he said.

"Therefore, it is not uncommon to see the rest of the pack poking their heads into the burrow or taking the babies outside until Lennon or Nina put them back into the den."

Once weaned, the litter is currently suckled by Nina; the pack will be fed by the entire group, regurgitating meat. At six months, the quartet will be large enough to 'hunt.'

Terra Natura first successfully bred dholes in 2006, about a vear after the arrival of the species at the park.

Dholes are called whistling dogs because of their wide range of audible communica**DHOLES:** The sex

tion and are known as gregarious hunters capable of bringing down prey much larger than themselves. In tropical forest, they compete with tigers and leopards.

The species appears in

Rudyard Kipling's book Red Dog where a group meets Mowgli and a pack of wolves; rather than being given a friendly character they are depicted as aggressive and bloodthirsty.

In practice little will change under the new law, explained lawyer Paula Grau although since babies must be registered within three days of birth freeing the mother from the need to be present in these cases was an advance in equality, she said.

In cases where a couple cannot reach an agreement over the order of surnames, a decision can be taken by the Registry official. According to official guidelines the child's interests must come first but the problem can be resolved by putting the surnames in alphabetical order, casting lots or taking into account which combination sounds better 'on aesthetic grounds.'

### **Yacht club all at sea**



ALTEA'S Club Nautico has until June 19 to renew the contract allowing it to function as it does now.

In less than two weeks its concession from regional government is due to run out and after 40 years the vacht club's future is uncertain if the Generalitat does not renew.

The Valencian Community's Ports Law passed in 2024 states that negotiating concessions with non-profit making bodies with a social base like the Club Nautico, which encourages water sports, "is obligatory."

The club generates employ-

ment and even during the worst years of the crisis no-one was sacked. "We are a motor of the economy with thousands of visiting boats tying up here each year," Club Nautico sources said.

For the last 17 years the Club Nautico, which has 340 members, has had to overcome Generalitat obstacles they added: "We do everything we're asked, and even more."

Despite this, "nothing is moving," they lamented.

Since 2000 when the original concession expired the club's management has unsuccessfully asked successive regional governments to renew the concession.

"June 19 is approaching and we know nothing. They don't answer," the club's president Jose Roman Zurutuza told the Spanish daily, El Mundo. "We are on the edge of the precipice."

The president went on to say that this was incomprehensible because the club has received both personal and public support from all local and regional

"We don't know what is happening or the reason for the delay when the deadline is so close," Zurutuza continued.





### Closing in on spray artists

MORE than 60 graffiti artists were identified through handwriting tests in San Vicente.

The Local Police have now written out 120 charges for defacing public and privatelyowned property that includes bridges, hoardings, vehicles and even an ambulance.

Nine of the identified graffiti artists did not limit their work to Alicante Province, the San Vicente police revealed. Their work has been found in Madrid, Barcelona, Murcia and Badajoz with some as far away as cities in the UK.

San Vicente by-laws contemplate fines of up to €700 for graffiti, which is now classed as an offence in Spain's revised Penal Code. Culprits are also responsible for repairing the damage they cause.

"The Local Police have done a painstaking job. The

handwriting analyses together with information on our data base were key to identifying the graffiti-artists," said San Vicente's Public Safety councillor Maria Isabel Martinez.

"So too was the collaboration between the different police forces so that we could close in on the grafiteros who have done so much damage to the municipality," Martinez





### Clean-up for rubbish containers

ALFAZ and Albir's 350 communal rubbish containers recently had a thorough going-over. Once emptied, along came a specialised vehicle to clean the containers inside and out in a procedure that the driver controls via a television camera.

The operation will be repeated several times this summer, explained Oscar Perez, Alfaz's councillor responsible for street-cleaning and rubbish collection.

This will ensure that the containers do not become a focus for dirt and bad smells during the hot weather, said Perez who was given a demonstration by the rubbish-collection concessionary, SAV.

Perez also stressed the importance of respecting the timetable for putting out rubbish. "It's important always to leave the containers tightly closed after leaving rubbish and to do this between 8pm and mid-



night, especially in the summer."

The councillor went on to explain that it was essential to separate rubbish at home before taking it to the appropriate recycling points. Perez also asked residents not to leave garden waste in rubbish containers as this is not organic refuse but needs to be treated with rubbish destined for composting.

"Residents shouldn't put out grass cuttings or prunings from ornamental plants and fruit trees with household rubbish," Perez explained. "Instead they should take them to one of the specific containers."

There are 25 recycling points for garden waste and residents can call 900 102 952 to find out which is nearest to them.

### Don't strike a light

ALFAZ DEL PI celebrated World No Tobacco Day by swapping cigarettes for fruit at L'Arabi high school.

Giving out the fruit was also aimed at promoting a healthy lifestyle, explained Alfaz's Health councillor Marisa Cortes.

They visited the school at break-time, reminding pupils of the dangers of smoking and encouraging them to break a habit that could seriously affect their health

"Unfortunately, statistics show that the number of young people who smoke continues to be high," said Youth councillor Isabel Muñoz.

More than 12 per cent of the 14 to 18 age group smoke on a daily basis in Spain, she added.

The Marina Baja Public Health department organised a competition for the over-12s at local schools, inviting them to illustrate how smoking endangers health and wellbeing.

Each pupil could present up to three entries based on photography, collages, gifs and minute-long videos. For Alfaz pupils participating in the project there was a prize of a €100 voucher.

### Funds for job training

A REGIONAL government grant will fund jobs for 10 young unemployed Alfaz residents.

They will receive the minimum basic salary for 12 months as they alternate training with work experiences as carers.

The course is part of the T'Avalem programme backed by the Europe Social Fund and coordinated by the Valencian Employment and Training Service, SERVEF. Classes will be held at Alfaz's Occupational Centre.

The Generalitat has provided €195,529 of the €230,529 total cost of the scheme, with Alfaz Town Hall paying the remaining €35,000.

Alfaz mayor Vicente Arques expressed satisfaction at obtaining Generalitat funding.

The public toilets will remain open





### **FEES WERE SO HIGH!"** By Sam Kelly, Managing Partner, Chorus Financial

"JOHN HAD NO IDEA HIS INVESTMENT

Last week, a gentleman, we'll call him John, (I've changed his name to protect his identity) came to see me. ## The two faces of Naseema

NASEEMA CARLISLE was born and will die a Muslim.

However, her life in reality has two faces, for when in Spain - where she mainly lives - few but her closest friends realise her faith, even though she is proud of

When residing in Spain she assimilates her attire to match Western customs.

But when she annually visits family in her native Malaysia each winter for up to two months she wears a headscarf when out with aunts and uncles and goes dry, not drinking any alcohol.

She dresses and acts exactly the same as many other local Muslims in Malaysia.

While not choosing to wear a burka, she covers her hair with a full scarf when out with family 'and I wear only a little make-up.'

This is a far cry from when she is in Spain, for though she dresses conservatively compared to many Spanish and visiting tourists (not wearing short skirts or tight skimpy tops) Naseema does not purposefully hide her religion.

"The global call that we should wear a burka and cover up in public totally to me is mainly driven by frequently uneducated men who seek to control women so that it is of benefit to them, but of no benefit to the women," she says.

But this does not mean that when in Spain, Naseema forgets her reli-

She regularly gets out her prayer mat at her smart three-bedroom duplex apartment in Calpe, on the Costa Blanca, 'especially when [she is] feeling down.'

Living alone having separated from her British-born husband of more than 20 years prior to her own move to Spain from Thailand eight years ago, the couple met when both were working in Singapore. They later married in a civil ceremony in

the UK where they then settled to bring up their own now grown-up daughters..

Now aged 53, Naseema has in fact spent around half of her life living abroad in non-Muslim countries.

Shortly after meeting Alan some of her former school friends who wore burkas and sarongs (traditional Malay attire) 'began to distance themselves,' as 'they did not see me as the same person.'

Some of the burkas are very colourful and appear to have become

a fashion statement."

"But I still respect my religion and though I choose not to wear a sarong when in Malaysia I fully respect my local culture."

Even so she feels many of the Muslim girls in Malaysia 'cover up to be the same as friends and to compete on how they look.'

"Some of the burkas are very colourful and appear to have become a fashion statement."

Viewing life internationally, Naseema supports the belief that people living in foreign countries should follow local traditions.

"If I was in Saudi Arabia, I would cover up fully as it is part of the local culture," she adds.

"But in Spain I have no desire to wear my religion so firmly on my sleeve and show Lam Muslim, I have no need. I dress conservatively and make sure I do not stand out, but enjoy wearing jeans, dresses and high fashion clothes, depending on the occasion.

"I also drink in bars with friends, wear more make-up than I do in Malaysia, and occasionally eat bacon which I love.

"When I die it will be between me and my God," she concludes.

# The big question

Does outlawing the Muslim headdress improve security or alienate a vulnerable minority? David Noon weighs up the pros and cons of a burka ban

FOR more than a decade, Spain has tussled with the idea of banning the burka.

Those for the ban argue that burkas support outdated sexist ideologies and pose a security threat.

While those opposed to it say that outlawing the burka will alienate a vulnerable minority and gives Islamist extremists further ammunition to carry out acts of terror.

While some towns (mainly in Cataluña) have enforced a partial ban, a nationwide blanket ban on the Muslim headdress has yet to come to fruition.

The debate has failed to go away for 10 years and looks likely to rumble on for some time yet. What Spain does next is anyone's guess.

Tensions between European Muslims and non-Muslims have never been as high as they are right now.

A spate of terrorist attacks by Islamist extremists in France, Belgium and the UK - including the London Bridge killing rampage at the weekend - has only intensified the arguments of those claiming that burkas should be banned across Europe.

But is it the time to risk further alienating a culture that is already feeling cut-off or is it time to put political correctness to one side and stop worrying about hurting people's feelings?

In Cataluña, as many as a dozen municipalities have laws against the face coverings including the burka and the niqab.

The town of Lerida was the first to do so in 2010, introducing a ban on the headwear in municipal buildings.

In the same year, a similar ban was introduced in Coin in Andalucia's Guadalhorce

However, just three years later Spain's Supreme Court overturned the law in both towns, ruling that it 'limits religious free-

Even so other areas have continued to implement their ban, bolstered by a 2014 ECHR (European Court of Human Rights) ruling that banning the veil does not breach human rights.

In the same year, Spain's interior minister Jorge Fernández Díaz said that the government was considering including a burka ban in national security reforms.

In fact, proposals for a ban were part of a draft bill but were eventually knocked on the head before it passed through parlia-

And while Spain has debated the issue (almost to death), its European neighbours

have been clamping down.

France - most notably - outlawed the burka in 2011, with Belgium, the Netherlands and Bulgaria following suit.

Germany is about to make it illegal to wear burkas while driving.

And just last month, the Austrian parliament passed a bill banning the burka in public, issuing fines of up to €150 for those wearing full-face veils.

Outside Europe, the burka is banned in many African countries (including Morocco) for security reasons.

Last month, the Iraqi government even took the unprecedented step of banning the burka in the city of Mosul in a bid to clamp down on Daesh militants using the headdress as a disguise.

But does that mean Spain should follow suit? While the threat of a terrorist attack in Spain has remained high since Daesh rose to prominence a couple of years ago, none has been carried out on mainland Spain since the Madrid train bombings in 2004.

Instead of improving security, introducing a ban now could have the opposite effect and make Spain a target.

It also has huge social implications which undermine the freedom of daily life

By outlawing certain clothing, the freedom that Europe prides itself on would be ironically undermined.

The only time the government should restrict personal choice is if it can cause considerable harm to others.

Maybe the burka does, maybe not?

And that is the conundrum that Spanish politicians have been wrestling with for a

Many point to the limitations of identifying people wearing a burka as being conducive to terrorism.

While at the same time, implementing a ban undermines freedom of choice and punishes all Muslims for the actions of a minority of extremists.

The best estimates state that 106,000 of the 1.6 billion Muslims worldwide are members of designated Islamic extremist groups, meaning just 0.006 per cent of the Muslim population are extremists.

Yet, some Muslim women value the sense of privacy that comes with the burka.

For every reason to ban the burka there is a contradictory argument why it shouldn't be outlawed.

If Spain takes the bold decision for such a ban it needs to be for the right reason. Not just a knee-ierk reaction to fear.

Maybe - for once - Spain's slow and steady judicial process is the right action to take.



### When a burka isn't a burka

THE term burka is largely used in non-Muslim countries to label all forms of Muslim

In reality, burkas themselves are infrequently worn and there are dozens of forms of headdress sported by Muslim women.

Knowing the difference is important before casting any judgement or passing any laws. The most popular headdresses are the burka, the niqab, the hijab and the chador.

### Burka bans around Europe

WHEN France outlawed the burka in 2011, it came under immense pressure from global bodies to reverse the decision.

However, as the threat of terrorist attacks from Islamic extremists continues to mount, a raft of European neighbours have quickly come round to the French

Hot on the heels of the French, Belgium outlawed the headdress later in 2011. By 2015, the Netherlands had outlawed the burka along with Latvia and Bulgaria.

A year later and Switzerland was in on the ban, imposing fines of up to €10,000 for those wearing full-face veils in public.

Meanwhile in some parts of Italy, local authorities banned 'burkinis' or full Islamic swimming costumes last summer.

Austria is the latest country to ban the burka (imposing the law last month) and Germany is pushing through a bill to ban the headdress while driving.

Which European countries follow suit remains to be seen.

Having paid €272 million for the property without bank borrowing, he unexpectedly announced that rather than lease the property to the Riu Hotel chain from Mallorca as previously

announced, he was actually selling it to them but his company will be managing a 15,000 square metre shopping centre within the building.

The Mallorcan hotel group was set up as a private company in 1953 and family members are still involved in its management but sold a percentage of its shares to Europe's largest tour operator, the German company Tui.

It is planned that the new four star hotel will have 650 rooms, restaurants, a conference centre and a rooftop swimming pool.

### Spain tries to repay euro debt

WHEN the Spanish banks suffered so badly from the financial downturn, Spain borrowed €41.3 billion from the eurozone

Now it has requested and received permission from the European Stability Mechanism (ESM) to repay €1 billion, taking the total repaid so far to €7.6 billion.

As the economy is relatively buoyant, the government wants to repay a further €2 billion later this year but has had to apply to the MEDE, a division of the fund for permission to do this and any payment will depend upon the amount fitting in with the fund's finance plans.

## May the cash be with you

THE Spanish Post Office has jumped on the Star Wars wagon and could make €1 million from a single stamp.

It has just released a sheet containing one postage stamp with a face value of €5 and five labels which look like stamps but are simply unvalued labels in a 'limited edition' of 300,000 which means that if all are sold, the Post Office will receive €1.5 million.

The cost of the sheetlets is unlikely to be more than 20c per sheet, but the main cost will be the licence fee.

A postage stamp is a receipt for a service yet to be fulfilled and by producing the sheetlet in this manner using a value that doesn't actually cover any postal rate (the nearest being €4.85 and €5.25), it has been suggested that this is purely a money making operation.

The cost of production of the sheetlets which use a form of lenticular (adding depth to an image) printing developed several years ago by the Spanish State Printers is unlikely to cost more than 20c per sheet, but the main cost will be the licence fee charged by The Walt Disney Compa-

Normally, licence deals require a recoverable advance guarantee and a percentage of revenue earned but assuming that this is no more than 25

per cent, then the total cost of production and licence fee if all sheetlets are sold to Star Wars collectors rather than for postage would be €435,000, leaving the Post Office with a profit

Even more unusual is the fact that customers can also spend €20 on purchasing two different Star Wars cash cards to which they can add funds and use in any outlet that accepts Master-

### Numbers of unemployed still falling

THE month of May is historically a good one for employment and 2017 is no exception with a fall in unemployment of 111,908 people.

This takes the number of unemployed to 3,461,128, the lowest level in eight years and to add to the good news, 223,192 new workers were added to the Social Security

Whilst the fall in unemployment is without question helpful to the economy, much of the work created will last for the summer only and then these figures will creep up again before falling in the run up to

More young people are being employed, but the increase is smaller in percentage terms than for older people and many who have good skills but no work are looking to other parts of Europe and the USA as potential work places, making it more difficult in some areas of industry and hospitality to recruit good quality staff.

## Spanish budget for 2017 has finally been accepted

THE 2017 Spanish budget was finally approved last Thursday even though Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy voted against an amendment by mistake.

From an economic point of view this was a very important vote and the minority ruling party had to offer a number of 'sweeteners' to smaller and regional parties in order to gather sufficient votes to carry the

With a renewed opposition now that Pedro Sanchez has been re-appointed as leader of the PSOE - even though he is no longer an MP - the government can expect a much harder time in the future.

Under the Spanish Constitution however, if the government continues to hold power as there may be a vote of no confidence in it shortly - and its 2018 budget is voted down, it

Passengers are used to paying for everything on short haul flights but with flights to Buenos Aires, Los Angeles and San Francisco taking up to 13 hours and to the Dominican Republic 11 hours it is likely that passengers will require food and drink at least.

IAG which owns Aer Lin-

gus, BA, Iberia and Vueling has announced that this new option attracted 134,000 advance ticket purchases prior to the first flight departure to Los Angeles last Thursday and will attract a whole new group of travellers flying long haul for the first time.

**Passengers** can pay extra for seat choice, food, drink, wifi, in-flight entertainment and a blanket.

Whilst much has been made of the need to pay for everything and the lack of trolleys going through the cabin, the new airline is introducing a fleet of new A330

Airbuses and there are all inclusive options in economy and premium economy plus Avios points which can be used on any airline in the group will be awarded.

The initial launch saw no frills flights as cheap as €149 one way but even paying full fare, costs are considerably cheaper than other airlines offering similar facilities.



### LEGALLY SPEAKING

### Do you need a hat?

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 web-



A REGULAR question that occurs is 'do you need to have some sort of hat protection when driving in a convertible?'

According to the N332 Guardia Civil team, no. Hat protection is not required when in an open top car. In fact, there is a chance that wearing a hat would prove dangerous if not worn correctly and it blows off potentially blocking the view of other drivers.

However, not talking legally, it does make sense to wear a hat to protect yourself from the sun and its harmful rays whilst driving, but it is not a legal requirement.

Convertible cars are designed to be as safe as cars with full roofs. They are often fitted with strengthened supports around the windscreen and roll bars although these are not often as clearly fitted as those you see in rally cars. So as long as drivers and passengers are

positioned correctly, sat down, wearing seatbelts in the correct manner, open top cars are usually perfectly safe. As in all vehicles, it is when passengers don't follow the design and safety guidelines that problems occur and accidents can happen.

It is becoming more increasingly common to see occupants with their arms out of the windows or doors and legs up and feet on the dashboard, particularly during the summer months, but this is a dangerous and illegal practice. The legs and feet can obscure the driver's view, but also, in the event of a collision. as the airbag is deployed, legs over the airbag will feel the full force which can result in seri-

The only safe way to sit in any vehicle is within the design of the seat, with the seatbelt securely fastened.

## Ways to make an entrance

STEPHEN KING, the horror writer once said, "an opening line should invite the reader to begin the story. It should say: Listen. Come in here. You want to know about this." An author's biggest challenge writing a novel is how to begin. The opening lines are crucial to grabbing the attention of the reader, making it the most difficult stage of the writing process. The success of a novel also depends on what it contains throughout, but the opening lines need to make an entrance.

#### 1. Nineteen Eighty-Four by George Or-

'It was a bright cold day in April, and the clocks were striking thirteen.' This opening line of Orwell's, commands the immediate attention of the reader, with the strange notion of a clock striking 13. The opening makes us feel uneasy and curious to continue the journey into the dystopian world of 1984, following in the footsteps of the main protagonist, Winston Smith.

2. Rebecca by Daphne Du Maurier (1938)

Last night I dreamt I went to Manderley again.' The opening line of this classic Gothic romance novel tells the reader that Manderley holds something of great importance to the dreamer. The reader may become inquisitive to know more about Manderley and to know what is Manderley exactly. Even the title conveys a sense of mystery in the name,

3. Jane Eyre by Charlotte Brontë (1847) There was no possibility of taking a walk



that day.' This novel is considered to be the first to express the modern idea of the self, a radical book for its time. The first line has negativity, suggesting that Jane is restricted in some way. The novel ranks as one of the greatest and most longstanding works of English fiction

#### 4. Twelfth Night by William Shakespeare (1601-1602)

'If music be the food of love, play on. Give me excess of it, that surfeiting the appetite may sicken and so die.' This line is the beginning of Duke Orsini's speech, which is cynical about the inconsistency of love and immediately gives insight into his character as one who is extreme; bouncing from highs to lows throughout the play.

The Picture of Dorian Gray by Oscar Wilde (1890)

'The studio was filled with the rich odour of

roses and when the light summer wind stirred amidst the trees of the garden, there came through the open door the heavy scent of the lilac, or the more delicate perfume of the pink-flowering thorn.' These lines are a perfect set up for what follows and offers a hint to the theme of opposites, foreshadowing doom with the inclusion of the word 'thorn. Moby Dick by Herman Melville (1851)

'Call me Ishmael.' This narrator greets the reader and there is the sense that he is opening up and about to tell you a fishy tale! Ishmael takes the reader on a whaling ship, the 'Pequod,' under the command of the obsessive Captain Ahab who is on a mission to catch the whale that took his leg.

#### The Great Gatsby by F Scott Fitzgerald

'In my younger years and more vulnerable years my father gave me some advice that

I've been turning over in my mind ever since.' This opening line begs the reader to explore further, trusting the narrator to deliver a few words of wisdom.

#### Matilda by Roald Dahl (1988)

'It's a funny thing about mothers and fathers. Even when their own child is the most disgusting little blister you could ever imagine, they still think that he or she is wonderful.' It is obvious by this line that there is a feeling of resentment, confusion and wonder at other children, who can be cruel.

#### 9. A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens

'Marley was dead, to begin with. There is no doubt whatever about that. The register of his burial was signed by the clergyman, the clerk, the undertaker and the chief mourner.' It is clear that Dickens needs the reader to know that Marley is dead and before knowing what happens, you're inclined to think that the emphasis placed on Marley's death is quite significant.


#### 10. I Am Legend by Richard Matheson

'On those cloudy days, Robert Neville was never sure when sunset came and sometimes they were in the streets before he could get back.' Who are in the streets? The lines put the reader in the character's shoes, not really being sure about what will happen next and this is the perfect hook. Truman Capote said, "A truly great novel grabs you by the jugular with its first sentence, those words - its music and never lets you go.



# Stop smoking

TO mark World No Smoking Day, Spain has released figures that show around 60,000 people die every year in the country as a result of tobacco. Worldwide, tobacco kills more than seven million people, with around 890,000 of these being non-smokers exposed to second- hand tobacco smoke according to data from the World Health Organisation

Around 27 per cent of the Spanish population are still daily smokers spending an average of €282.39 each year on tobacco. The average smoker has 1,264 cigarettes a year.

Lung cancer and heart disease are not the only health concerns to worry about. Smoking can lead to a range of other diseases and problems such as osteoporosis, emphysema, loss of hearing,

cataracts, teeth deterioration and psoriasis

But despite these health concerns many continue smoking and even for those who want to stop, breaking the bad habit can be tough. But there are things you can do:

#### Change habits.

Breaking the routine you had as a smoker can help you forget about tobacco and focus on new things. For example if you always have a cigarette with your morning cup of tea try and skip the tea or have something else instead so you don't associate that action with smoking.

#### Make it public.

By telling everyone your intentions you are more likely to succeed as you will engage the support and encouragement of others not to give up quitting.

#### Save the money

#### Hypnotherapy

If you have not smoked for a few days when you feel the urge to light up, breathe and wait for 10 minutes. Have a glass of water and go for a short walk and usually the urge will go, but these short battles will go a long way to helping you achieve your long term

#### What is hav fever?

Allergic rhinitis or hay fever is a reaction in the mucous membrane when it is exposed to dust. pollen, sometimes cold temperatures or other substances that a person is allergic to. It mainly affects the eyes and nose.

The reaction can cause nasal secretion and an itchy nose during the months in which plants are flowering or exposure to other allergen triggers. Other symptoms of hav fever include nasal congestion, headaches and in rare cases nausea similar to when a person is suffering from

#### How do you treat it? Can it be cured?

There are various ways of treating allergic rhinitis. The most common are antihistamines, decongestants and corti-

coids which all help manage the symptoms. Another way to treat it is through the use of injections, known as immunotherapy. The vaccinations help the body tolerate the allergens which trigger allergic reactions and help manage symptoms, in some cases they have been known to cure hay fever.

#### Is it hereditary?

No, although some people are genetically predisposed, meaning they are more likely to develop hay fever.

#### Can it be prevented?

The best way to prevent hay fever is to avoid exposure to allergen triggers or to take antihistamines during the periods where symptoms are the worst. In general the best way to prevent it is to see a specialist who will be able to find the best course of treatment for

## Medical experts on the increase

NATIONALLY, Spain has an average of 4.7 doctors and 5.5 nurses per thousand inhabitants.

The number of doctors and registered nurses continues to grow in Spain and there are already 247,974 doctors and 291,848 nurses, an increase of 2.1 per cent and 2.7 per cent respectively compared to 2016. That's according to figures from the National Institute of Statistics (INE), which began to collate figures on the number of doctors and nurses in

The largest increases in the medical professions have been observed in physicians, dietician nutritionists, occupational therapists, dental technicians and physiotherapists.

Figures show that the health world is largely dominated by female workers with speech therapists having the highest percentage of women, being 93.8 per cent of the total. Over 91 per cent of occupational therapists are women along with 87.8 per cent of nutritional dieticians However men dominate the fields of dentistry, specialist physicians and doctors.


Taking into account the number of professionals active in relation to the population, Madrid has the highest rate of doctors with 5.9 doctors per thousand citizens, followed by

Andalucia has the lowest rate of nurses in relation to the population with just four per thousand inhabitants, followed by Murcia with 4.2.

THE WINE CORNER IS A LITTLE **DIFFERENT THIS WEEK**. I received a letter from Phil who sent me this photo of a bottle of 1960 Offleys port. It was interesting as I had a bottle some years ago which I consumed and found it to be very pleasant. Well it should be, it was one of the finest vintages of the last 60 years or so, 66 was great and 63 generally undeclared but still very drinkable! It's worth about €120 and below is some interesting information regarding the

Quinta Boa Vista (literally Beautiful View Vineyard) hints at the dramatic views enjoyed by one of the most renowned vineyards in the entire Douro valley. Boa Vista is the jewel in the Offley Forrester crown, which is one of the oldest Port Houses (1737) and rose to prominence under Joseph Forrester.

He was a legendary figure in the history of port credited with mapping the upper regions of the Douro, only to be drowned in one of its rapids, allegedly weighed down by the weight of gold he had collected from his tenants. Forrester's life was devoted to improving the quality of port and in recognition of his endeavours the King of Portugal made him

Offley's vintages from the 1960s are a rare treat for Port buyers, as little has appeared under the label since.

Situated in London's Heddon Street it is spread across two floors, the ground floor will feature a dining counter surrounding an open kitchen and fresh seafood display. The kitchen will serve regional dishes from across Spain, including those from the Basque country and Catalonia. A separate bar area will offer Sherries, txakoli, vermouths, beers and wines. Txakoli or Chacolí is a slightly sparkling, very dry white wine with high acidity and low alcohol content produced in the Spanish provinces of the Basque Country, Cantabria and northern Burgos. We don't see much of it here.

Upstairs the focus will be on Galicia and Castile with a menu centred around two specialities from those regions - octopus and suckling pig. Galician octopus will be cooked in traditional copper pans with olive oil and paprika, while a Castilian roast suckling pig will be cooked in the asador (a traditional wood fired

## Luxury that never sleeps

LUXURY homes across coastal Spain are selling like hotcakes, sparking the property market's strong wider growth. Sales of €1 million plus properties have shot up in recent years, with wealthy Brits and Germans powering the trend.

On the Balearic Islands for instance the number of million euro home sales rose by a staggering 50 per cent last year, concluding with a sales volume exceeding €1.5 billion from foreigners alone. Just two years ago hitting the €1 billion mark was considered to be strictly in the realms of fantasy.

Their efforts are being more than matched by a booming Spanish professional class, who bought €1.9 billion worth of luxury properties. That brings the sales total to €3.4 billion, edging close to the record €5 billion set in the halycon pre-crisis days.

Price rises have combined with sales volume to present a similar picture across Spain's coastal hotspots, which continue to lure foreign investors eager to snap up a second home in the sun. Red tape has been cut too. Many foreign buyers have enough cash reserves to seal quick deals without recourse to a mortgage.

The luxury home stats also show that Brexit has had zero impact on the market, which con-

tinues to grow with both British and other European buyers at the helm. There has also been a substantial increase in luxury rentals across

### Spain's real estate ace

IT'S not often you'll hear a government minister confess that things are going better than expected. But that is exactly how Alberto Nadal, budgets chief, sees the ongoing boom in real estate and construction.

Nadal was presenting his outlook for the future at the annual Real Estate Exhibition in Madrid where he noted that GDP growth in Spain this year is expected to exceed the official forecast of 2.7 per cent.

Nadal believes that real estate is set to play a crucial role in Spain's economic rise. The country is already among the fastest growing economies in the EU. In order to reap the benefits of real estate growth, Nadal believes the market should be left to develop organically rather than pushed. The construction of roughly 50,000 homes per year until 2020 would keep it at a reasonable cruise speed, fuelling growth without becoming too large and unwieldy.

## Properties of the future

PROPERTY developers, scientists and architects across Spain are developing incredible new homes that are set to transform the real estate sector and drastically improve people's standard of living.

Construction companies building luxury new builds to meet rising demand are using an exciting variety of new materials. The days of brick and mortar in Spain are well and truly numbered.

Hydroceramics is a new technology created by students at the Advanced Architecture Institute of Catalonia. It is an evaporative cooling system composed of hydrogel bubbles which can hold 400 times their weight in water.

When it detects too much heat or humidity the bubbles evaporate, reducing inside temperatures by five or six degrees. Hydroceramics offers a noise free, sustainable and cheap alternative to air conditioning.

Another nifty new technology is effectively solar power within a spray can. Using a rare mineral called perovskite, users can spray an outside surface with the can and convert it into a solar panel. This 'solar paint' could one day make expensive solar panels a thing of the past.

Or there's 'breathing brick'. a radical new air filtration system that will see the very bricks that make up the property also function as filters, ridding the home of air pollution.

Bricks would absorb all incoming pollution particles and quickly recycle them. In the future buildings could actually become the vacuum cleaners of cities.

## Unhealthy home shock for many Spanish residents

A NEW report found that Spanish residents who live in a building with humidity or a lack of natural light are twice as likely to suffer from health problems. The healthy housing 2017 report from the Velux Group also estimated the health cost across Europe from unsafe properties to be a shocking €84 billion per year.

Researchers analysed 100,000 households across the EU's 27 member states and found that seven in 10 properties are in some need of renovation that the owners can't, or are unwilling, to pay for.

In Spain one in 10 people were found to be living in a building with a leak, inadequate winter heating or temperatures which are unhealthily high in summer.

Associated problems across Europe contribute to asthma and breathing problems. Around €40 billion is spent on medical interventions and another €40 billion lost on indirect costs, including lower productivity.

## Monthly gardening tasks – June

DICK HANDSCOMBE



MANY of us experienced mixed weather during May. Weather that gave some thrills as many flowering shrubs looked their best, but also some disappointments especially when just one windy rainy night decimated record flowerings and fruit formation on avocados and grapes.

So what do we now need to do to improve the chances of wonderfully colourful and productive

Ten important actions for



- 1. Deadheading and tidying pruning regime.
- 2. Watch out for fast growing weeds that escaped your earlier mulching, hoeing and sowing.
- 3. Turn up the frequency and volume settings on watering systems and check throughout the pipe/hose runs for leaks and blockages caused by insects grit or calcium deposits in jets.
- 4. As the heat and humidity rises watch out for signs of insect and fungal attacks and be ready with your eco armouries of garlic, thyme, sulphur, neem and propylis sprays
- 5. Give all plants in pots and other containers a good feed.
- **6.** If you have been growing early vegetables in raised beds of containers such as growing tables and large builders buckets replace eaten crops by immediately filling gaps with seeds or plantlets.
- 7. Be ready to shade the more tender salad crops including tomatoes during the middle of the day to reduce their watering needs, slow down their maturing and lengthening their harvesting

8. Ensure you pull down blinds to provide welcome, even essential shade, to plants in containers on apartment terraces, balconies and windowsills. If you do plan some late window box plantings preferably do this on north and wet facing situations.

#### 9. Late planting of flowering plants

We are now in June and can expect steadily rising temperatures, reducing rain falls, the drying out of soils and lowering water tables so it makes sense to:

- a. Minimise new plantings until the autumn rains,
- b. Restrict new plantings to drought resistant plants,
- c. Buy plants that are not root
- d. Buy plants that have been grown and are being sold in deep
- e. Improve soils in areas in which plants are to be planted to minimise water losses from waterings or rains if they occur from excessive drainage, surface evaporation, running off across hard impermeable soil surfaces, sponging away into super dry surround-

ing soils.

f. Invest in a five-kilo tub of Terra-Cottem water absorbing gel soil improver. Technically minded readers will find the website

g. Immediately mulch well around new plants. Unfortunately more than 50 per cent of mulching that I see is suboptimal.

#### 10. Irreversible fruit losses

Fortunately the yields of early fruits such as strawberries and cherries have in many areas been great, and yields of stone fruits such as apricots, plums and olives, the first time for three or four years, look promising.

However just one windy rainy night in early May destroyed, in many gardens and commercial plantations, next autumn's grape and avocado crops. Unfortunately there is nothing one can do.

The inexpensive book 'Living well from our garden Mediterranean style' describes my personal experiences of living healthily for 25 years after two dangerous cancer operations. Continuing to do so is an important objective beyond 80.

Children must be taught dog's ears are not for pulling, we do not poke the dog's eyes, we do not stick a pencil or pen up the rectum, and we do not pinch dogs.

Any large breeds like the Rottweiler, German Shepherd and Doberman are not suitable for homes with young children. Most parents forget that children have friends. When little Johnny's friend Tommy comes to play, what assurance is there that the dog will like Tommy?

I blame breeders

The area of 'catchment attention' where people will listen is when they buy a pet from breeders. The pet shops and breeders are the main area of misinformation. It is a sad fact that all new owners will take advice from breeders when buying a puppy. Anyone can get the title of breeder.

SPANISH speeder Fernando Alonso astonished spectators with his strong performance in the Indy500. Alonso was so close to victory but his Andretti Autosport Honda retired just 20 laps from the finish.

His strong performance strengthened opinion that the Oviedo man might be the best all-round Formula One driver in the game today. Alonso, gaining confidence from the race, considered among the top three motorsport competitions on the planet, declared his intention to win the prestigious Triple Crown.

Only the legendary Graham Hill has ever completed the feat, which involves winning the Monaco Grand Prix, Le Mans 24 Race, and the Indy 500. Alonso, 35, won the Monaco Grand Prix in backto-back races in 2006 and 2007. Last week he showed the Indy 500 is easily within his grasp, leaving only Le Mans.

Only a few months ago Alonso was cracking jokes about winning the Indy500 and not taken seriously. Mark Webber, a top endurance racer, said he reckons the Spaniard has roughly a decade to win Le

Mans and cement his legacy at the very pinnacle of the sport. At 35, with an already glorious career behind him, and millions in the bank, Alonso is also talking publicly about becoming a free agent. He leaves Honda this summer and has ruled out a partnership with Red Bull.

With his name and popularity Alonso might be able to escape the long term contracts most drivers are subject to, even taking on individual race

Alonso's move has opened the door for other Formula One stars to follow suit, perhaps sparking a new race for Triple Crown glory.






