Taking care of numero uno

A DOZEN councillors in Almeria Province, and the mayor of the capital. Ramon Pacheco, earn more than the president of Andalucia. Newly released salary figures show a variety of oddities and also just how residents pay their public servants.

Mayor Pacheco is the highest paid civil servant in Andalucia. His €76,908 gross annual income is just €3,100 shy of the maximum permitted by law for mayors.

His closest counterpart is Malaga mayor Francisco de la Torre who earns substantially less at €63,428.

Pacheco's closest adviser and spokesman, Miguel Castellon, earns €74,490 per year.

He has three other assistants who earn €68,462 per year. Nowhere else in Andalucia do such unelected city officials earn more than €60.000.

Meanwhile 12 city councillors earn more than Andalucia president Susana Diaz, who is paid €64,446 before taxes.

Last year Almeria politicians paid consultants a total of €1.01 million from the public purse.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...15

Whether avoiding the colour yellow or placing cacti on windowsills to ward off evil spirits, there are rafts of superstitions in Spanish culture, and none are more popular than fear of Tuesday 13th.

Unlucky for some

WHILE Friday the 13th is considered an unlucky day in most Western countries, superstitious souls in Spain view Tuesday as the day to dread.

This is because Tuesdays are said to be dominated by Ares, the Greek God of War, who was known as Mars in Ancient Rome and gave his name to dies martis (Tuesday) in Latin, which later became martes in Spanish.

Events such as the fall of Constantinople to the Fourth Crusade, which happened on Tues-

day April 13, 1204, and the fall of Constantinople to the Ottomans on Tuesday May 29,

1453, added more weight to the belief that bad things happen on a Tuesday.

In Greek, Tuesday is known as Triti, meaning the third of the week, and this has further boosted the superstition since bad luck supposedly 'comes in threes.'

There is even a traditional Spanish proverb which warns: 'En martes, ni te cases, ni te embarques, ni de tu casa te apartes' [On Tuesday, don't get married, don't get on a boat, don't even leave your house].

Occurring in months which start on a Thursday, next Tuesday marks the first and only occasion that sufferers of trezidavomartiofobia (fear of Tuesday 13th) need

Very superstitious

OTHER widespread superstitions in Spain include an aversion to the colour yellow, which is traditionally said to represent sulphur and the devil. Thus, Spaniards will not wear yellow in certain situations including job interviews and exams, while it is considered bad luck to gift friends or family



members, especially babies, with yellow clothes.

Cacti are popular window plants in Spain, and while this has plenty to do with the dry, sunny climate it is rooted in the long-established belief that the spiky succulents ward off evil spirits. The theory is that the plants absorb moisture from the air, drowning fiendish phantoms as they try to cross the threshold.

Wicked spirits are also thought to dwell in human hair, from where they are easily transferred to headwear, so leaving a hat on a bed in Spain is also considered a bad omen.

Skinchecker campaign for cancer

THE climatic peculiarities of Almeria make risk factors high for skin cancer. That, together with rapidly rising rates, has led the Official College of Pharmacists of Almeria to launch a new public campaign focused on prevention.

Incidence of the disease continues to increase around the world, now accounting for more than one in three cancer diagnosis. But pharmacists and doctors across Almeria want to spread the message that it's fortunately also the most visible and easily detectable.

They have collaborated with a laboratory to generate the new campaign, named Skinchecker. It hopes to raise awareness throughout the community about the risks of sun exposure, good habit, and how you might evaluate risks on a given day from the weath-

An estimated 50-70 per cent of diagnoses in Almeria are directly related to overexposure to UVB and UVA radiation. A recent survey found that, while 88 per cent of the Spanish population is fully aware of the risks, just 22 per cent use daily protection.

Key witness

SPANISH Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy will appear as a witness in a major corruption trial involving members of the governing conservative Partido Popular.

Spain's High Court called on the politician to give evidence in person at the so-called Gurtel trial and it is expected he will appear at a court in San Fernando de Henares near Madrid in July.

The case centres on a vast cash for contracts kickback scheme that is alleged to have helped finance Mr Rajoy's PP, which has faced repeated accusations of corruption. The 62year-old leader is not accused of wrongdoing but it is believed as the head of the party since 2004, he could provide key evidence.

Curry favour

INDIA'S Prime Minister Narendra Modi has urged Spanish firms to invest in his country saying it was "an enormous country" and there were "many opportunities" as his government set out a massive infrastructure programme.

The politician met with Spanish government representatives and business leaders. India plans to build six massive sea ports, 250 airports, 27,000km of roads, and modernise 400 train stations by 2025. Mr Modi said Spain was a global leader in areas India needed as a priority.

THE medieval city of Caceres has a starring role in the new series of the award-winning Game of Thrones, its stone walls and fortifications making it an ideal choice to be cast

Early in the morning or at dusk, visitors almost feel they have stepped into a time machine and returned to the Middle Ages, such is the feel of history all around.

A lively university city with a population of 95,814, its old town Ciudad Monumental is a UNESCO world heritage site and is an impressive reminder of the past. It is 300km south west of Madrid, in the region of Extremadura, a drive of about three hours.

It is a mixture of gothic and renaissance architecture and the narrow cobbled streets twist and climb amongst the ancient stone walls, a skyline decorated with turrets, gargoyles and enormous stork nests.

The streets are packed with shops and taverns; people can enjoy full-bodied red wines, cherry, blackberry and chestnut liqueurs and cheese made from the milk of Merino sheen. Caseres is also famous for its food: stews, roast meats - especially pork, lamb and game - all recipes with a rich country tradition.

The provincial capital of the province of Caceres, it has been home to Romans, Visigoths, moors and Spanish after the reconquest and it is situated on the Via de la Plata, the pilgrims' route from Sevilla to Santiago de Compostela.

People travelled from across the country to join the protest, walking behind a banner reading: 'Bread, work, homes and equality.'

Summer fire ban

ANDALUCIA'S fire ban is to be enforced until at least mid-October.

The Ministry of Environment and Spatial Planning has banned the use of fire in all fields throughout Andalucia as well as banning motor vehicles from driving through forested areas.

The 2009 legislation activates the ban every summer to try and reduce the number of wildfires in the region.

It also prohibits the burning of vegetation or agricultural waste and the use of barbeques even in designated areas at camping resorts and any area within 400 metres of a forest.

A spokesperson for the Environment councillor, Juan Servan, said areas "will be monitored" by authorities to ensure the rules are en-

Barbecues will only be permitted in tourist establishments, rural restaurants. educational camps and traditional ovens and boilers used for distillation. Prior authorisation from provincial Environmental delegations will however be required.



Free roaming charges may not be so free

MUCH has been made by the EU decision to scrap mobile phone roaming charges from June 15, but Spanish customers may be in for a surprise.

At least one Spanish media source suggests that in order to offset any loss of income caused by this decision, a number of mobile

line suppliers are considering increasing their base tariffs for Spanish subscribers.

Effectively the decision to allow regular travellers to save on their mobile calls whilst travelling within up to 30 countries in Europe could mean that their gain will be subsidised by those who don't travel and those who do travel may have to pay more for their package as well.

Those with British phones will be able to benefit by using them anywhere within the European Union and paying the same as if they were calling from the UK but no-one is able to confirm whether this is likely to continue after Brexit.

There may also be a 'fair use' agreement which means that those who use their phones more than would be reasonable to expect whilst abroad may have to pay an additional charge, but the EU has pegged this at a maximum of 3.2 cents for a call and one cent for a text message.

The cost of data roaming will also drop by a third from June 15 for each gigabyte used and will continue to drop until 2020 when it should cost no more than €2.50 per gigabyte.

Every phone company is required by law to advise customers of any new or special charges before imposing them.

Brazen dog centre thefts

By Matthew Elliott

TWO dangerous dogs were stolen from Almeria's Zoosanitary Centre in a brazen attack on the province's biggest stray

and abandoned animal facility. The dogs are extremely dangerous and likely to fail any physical or psychological testing, meaning they will probably be kept or sold illegally.

It is the second time in months the Zoosanitary Centre has been targeted.

In December last year thieves stole six dogs, five of them dangerous, killed one pup, and released two ponies. During both incidents the attackers caused serious material damages.

Ines Plaza, a Socialist councillor for Almeria said, "it is unacceptable that the animals are kept in such a vulnerable location." She told an investigative committee that there are no cameras, alarms or even proper nighttime guards to protect the centre from thieves.

Worse, there is no guarantee that the dangerous animals will not end up in the hands of unfit people, with no insurance or expertise, who may use them for illegal purposes, including fights.

It is the second time in recent months that the centre has come under the spotlight. Councillor Plaza is still investigating a discrepancy in the centre's accounting figures.

She suspects that the deaths of hundreds of animals have been kept under wraps.





RURAL Almeria has been singled out as being on the verge of a demographic disaster. Ageing populations and migrating youngsters mean a growing proportion of municipalities have less than 1,000 residents.

President of the Andalucian Federation of Municipalities and Provinces (FAMP), Fernando Villalobos, claims depopulation poses a severe threat to the survival of hundreds of villages across the province.

Villalobos notes that today in Andalucia one in four councils govern a population of less than 1,000 people. But in Almeria the figure is almost half at 49.5 per cent. Only Granada at 39 per cent comes anywhere close to this level of sparse population.

The very future of Almeria's unique culture is threatened by these developments said Villalobos, who is set to speak at a special regional congress on depopulation next week. He will pledge FAMP's support in combating depopulation and the economic decline that often accompanies it.

The problem is one which affects all of Spain. Younger generations are increasingly moving from rural province to major cities for jobs and opportunities. Meanwhile millions of Spaniards continue to seek higher wages in the UK and across Eu-

Nuclear panic over briefcase

The warning was issued by the Nuclear Safety Council (CSN) last Thursday. Top scientists classified the loss as a Level One incident on the International Nuclear Event Scale, which sounds terrifying but is actually the lowest threat level.

The briefcase contained radioactive materials and a computer system for measuring soil density. Both radioactive sources are classified as category four on a scale of 1-5, with five being the least harmful. Exposure to humans would unlikely result in damage unless





The two faces of Naseema

NASEEMA CARLISLE was born and will die a Muslim.

However, her life in reality has two faces, for when in Spain - where she mainly lives - few but her closest friends realise her faith, even though she is proud of

When residing in Spain she assimilates her attire to match Western customs.

But when she annually visits family in her native Malaysia each winter for up to two months she wears a headscarf when out with aunts and uncles and goes dry, not drinking any alcohol.

She dresses and acts exactly the same as many other local Muslims in Malaysia.

While not choosing to wear a burka, she covers her hair with a full scarf when out with family 'and I wear only a little make-up.'

This is a far cry from when she is in Spain, for though she dresses conservatively compared to many Spanish and visiting tourists (not wearing short skirts or tight skimpy tops) Naseema does not purposefully hide her religion.

"The global call that we should wear a burka and cover up in public totally to me is mainly driven by frequently uneducated men who seek to control women so that it is of benefit to them, but of no benefit to the women," she says.

But this does not mean that when in Spain, Naseema forgets her reli-

She regularly gets out her prayer mat at her smart three-bedroom duplex apartment in Calpe, on the Costa Blanca, 'especially when [she is] feeling down.'

Living alone having separated from her British-born husband of more than 20 years prior to her own move to Spain from Thailand eight years ago, the couple met when both were working in Singapore. They later married in a civil ceremony in

the UK where they then settled to bring up their own now grown-up daughters..

Now aged 53, Naseema has in fact spent around half of her life living abroad in non-Muslim countries.

Shortly after meeting Alan some of her former school friends who wore burkas and sarongs (traditional Malay attire) 'began to distance themselves,' as 'they did not see me as the same person.'

Some of the burkas are very colourful and appear to have become

a fashion statement."

"But I still respect my religion and though I choose not to wear a sarong when in Malaysia I fully respect my local culture."

Even so she feels many of the Muslim girls in Malaysia 'cover up to be the same as friends and to compete on how they look.'

"Some of the burkas are very colourful and appear to have become a fashion statement."

Viewing life internationally, Naseema supports the belief that people living in foreign countries should follow local traditions.

"If I was in Saudi Arabia, I would cover up fully as it is part of the local culture," she adds.

"But in Spain I have no desire to wear my religion so firmly on my sleeve and show Lam Muslim, I have no need. I dress conservatively and make sure I do not stand out, but enjoy wearing jeans, dresses and high fashion clothes, depending on the occasion.

"I also drink in bars with friends, wear more make-up than I do in Malaysia, and occasionally eat bacon which I love.

"When I die it will be between me and my God," she concludes.

The big question

Does outlawing the Muslim headdress improve security or alienate a vulnerable minority? David Noon weighs up the pros and cons of a burka ban

FOR more than a decade, Spain has tussled with the idea of banning the burka.

Those for the ban argue that burkas support outdated sexist ideologies and pose a security threat.

While those opposed to it say that outlawing the burka will alienate a vulnerable minority and gives Islamist extremists further ammunition to carry out acts of terror.

While some towns (mainly in Cataluña) have enforced a partial ban, a nationwide blanket ban on the Muslim headdress has yet to come to fruition.

The debate has failed to go away for 10 years and looks likely to rumble on for some time yet. What Spain does next is anyone's guess.

Tensions between European Muslims and non-Muslims have never been as high as they are right now.

A spate of terrorist attacks by Islamist extremists in France, Belgium and the UK - including the London Bridge killing rampage at the weekend - has only intensified the arguments of those claiming that burkas should be banned across Europe.

But is it the time to risk further alienating a culture that is already feeling cut-off or is it time to put political correctness to one side and stop worrying about hurting people's feelings?

In Cataluña, as many as a dozen municipalities have laws against the face coverings including the burka and the niqab.

The town of Lerida was the first to do so in 2010, introducing a ban on the headwear in municipal buildings.

In the same year, a similar ban was introduced in Coin in Andalucia's Guadalhorce

However, just three years later Spain's Supreme Court overturned the law in both towns, ruling that it 'limits religious free-

Even so other areas have continued to implement their ban, bolstered by a 2014 ECHR (European Court of Human Rights) ruling that banning the veil does not breach human rights.

In the same year, Spain's interior minister Jorge Fernández Díaz said that the government was considering including a burka ban in national security reforms.

In fact, proposals for a ban were part of a draft bill but were eventually knocked on the head before it passed through parlia-

And while Spain has debated the issue (almost to death), its European neighbours

have been clamping down.

France - most notably - outlawed the burka in 2011, with Belgium, the Netherlands and Bulgaria following suit.

Germany is about to make it illegal to wear burkas while driving.

And just last month, the Austrian parliament passed a bill banning the burka in public, issuing fines of up to €150 for those wearing full-face veils.

Outside Europe, the burka is banned in many African countries (including Morocco) for security reasons.

Last month, the Iraqi government even took the unprecedented step of banning the burka in the city of Mosul in a bid to clamp down on Daesh militants using the headdress as a disguise.

But does that mean Spain should follow suit? While the threat of a terrorist attack in Spain has remained high since Daesh rose to prominence a couple of years ago, none has been carried out on mainland Spain since the Madrid train bombings in 2004.

Instead of improving security, introducing a ban now could have the opposite effect and make Spain a target.

It also has huge social implications which undermine the freedom of daily life

By outlawing certain clothing, the free-

dom that Europe prides itself on would be ironically undermined. The only time the government should re-

strict personal choice is if it can cause considerable harm to others.

Maybe the burka does, maybe not?

And that is the conundrum that Spanish politicians have been wrestling with for a

Many point to the limitations of identifying people wearing a burka as being conducive to terrorism.

While at the same time, implementing a ban undermines freedom of choice and punishes all Muslims for the actions of a minority of extremists.

The best estimates state that 106,000 of the 1.6 billion Muslims worldwide are members of designated Islamic extremist groups, meaning just 0.006 per cent of the Muslim population are extremists.

Yet, some Muslim women value the sense of privacy that comes with the burka.

For every reason to ban the burka there is a contradictory argument why it shouldn't be outlawed.

If Spain takes the bold decision for such a ban it needs to be for the right reason. Not just a knee-ierk reaction to fear.

Maybe - for once - Spain's slow and steady judicial process is the right action to take.

When a burka isn't a burka

THE term burka is largely used in non-Muslim countries to label all forms of Muslim

In reality, burkas themselves are infrequently worn and there are dozens of forms of headdress sported by Muslim women.

Knowing the difference is important before casting any judgement or passing any laws. The most popular headdresses are the burka, the niqab, the hijab and the chador.

Burka bans around Europe

WHEN France outlawed the burka in 2011, it came under immense pressure from global bodies to reverse the decision.

However, as the threat of terrorist attacks from Islamic extremists continues to mount, a raft of European neighbours have quickly come round to the French

Hot on the heels of the French, Belgium outlawed the headdress later in 2011. By 2015, the Netherlands had outlawed the burka along with Latvia and Bulgaria.

A year later and Switzerland was in on the ban, imposing fines of up to €10,000 for those wearing full-face veils in public.

Meanwhile in some parts of Italy, local authorities banned 'burkinis' or full Islamic swimming costumes last summer.

Austria is the latest country to ban the burka (imposing the law last month) and Germany is pushing through a bill to ban the headdress while driving.

Which European countries follow suit remains to be seen.

CHINESE conglomerate Wanda decided that it had made a mistake in purchasing the Edificio España in Madrid and has sold it at a loss of €7

agreement with the Baraka Group headed by eccentric millionaire Trinitario Casanova 10 months ago, it finally completed the sale in Madrid this week with the new purchaser turning up wearing a Matador's jacket.

Having paid €272 million for the property without bank borrowing, he unexpectedly announced that rather than lease the property to the Riu Hotel chain from Mallorca as previously

announced, he was actually selling it to them but his company will be managing a 15,000 square metre shopping centre within the building.

The Mallorcan hotel group was set up as a private company in 1953 and family members are still involved in its management but sold a percentage of its shares to Europe's largest tour operator, the German company Tui.

It is planned that the new four star hotel will have 650 rooms, restaurants, a conference centre and a rooftop swimming pool.

Spain tries to repay euro debt

WHEN the Spanish banks suffered so badly from the financial downturn, Spain borrowed €41.3 billion from the eurozone

Now it has requested and received permission from the European Stability Mechanism (ESM) to repay €1 billion, taking the total repaid so far to €7.6 billion.

As the economy is relatively buoyant, the government wants to repay a further €2 billion later this year but has had to apply to the MEDE, a division of the fund for permission to do this and any payment will depend upon the amount fitting in with the fund's finance plans.

May the cash be with you

THE Spanish Post Office has jumped on the Star Wars wagon and could make €1 million from a single stamp.

It has just released a sheet containing one postage stamp with a face value of €5 and five labels which look like stamps but are simply unvalued labels in a 'limited edition' of 300,000 which means that if all are sold, the Post Office will receive €1.5 million.

The cost of the sheetlets is unlikely to be more than 20c per sheet, but the main cost will be the licence fee.

A postage stamp is a receipt for a service yet to be fulfilled and by producing the sheetlet in this manner using a value that doesn't actually cover any postal rate (the nearest being €4.85 and €5.25), it has been suggested that this is purely a money making operation.

The cost of production of the sheetlets which use a form of lenticular (adding depth to an image) printing developed several years ago by the Spanish State Printers is unlikely to cost more than 20c per sheet, but the main cost will be the licence fee charged by The Walt Disney Compa-

Normally, licence deals require a recoverable advance guarantee and a percentage of revenue earned but assuming that this is no more than 25

per cent, then the total cost of production and licence fee if all sheetlets are sold to Star Wars collectors rather than for postage would be €435,000, leaving the Post Office with a profit

Even more unusual is the fact that customers can also spend €20 on purchasing two different Star Wars cash cards to which they can add funds and use in any outlet that accepts Master-

Numbers of unemployed still falling

THE month of May is historically a good one for employment and 2017 is no exception with a fall in unemployment of 111,908 people.

This takes the number of unemployed to 3,461,128, the lowest level in eight years and to add to the good news, 223,192 new workers were added to the Social Security

Whilst the fall in unemployment is without question helpful to the economy, much of the work created will last for the summer only and then these figures will creep up again before falling in the run up to

More young people are being employed, but the increase is smaller in percentage terms than for older people and many who have good skills but no work are looking to other parts of Europe and the USA as potential work places, making it more difficult in some areas of industry and hospitality to recruit good quality staff.

Spanish budget for 2017 has finally been accepted

THE 2017 Spanish budget was finally approved last Thursday even though Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy voted against an amendment by mistake.

From an economic point of view this was a very important vote and the minority ruling party had to offer a number of 'sweeteners' to smaller and regional parties in order to gather sufficient votes to carry the

With a renewed opposition now that Pedro Sanchez has been re-appointed as leader of the PSOE - even though he is no longer an MP - the government can expect a much harder time in the future.

Under the Spanish Constitution however, if the government continues to hold power as there may be a vote of no confidence in it shortly - and its 2018 budget is voted down, it

India looks to Spain for investment in economy

SOON after she became Prime Minister, Theresa May travelled to India to try to obtain business, but in contrast the Indian Prime Minister has visited Spain.

The visit by Narendra Modi is the first official visit by an Indian leader to Spain for 30 years and is part of a short tour of Europe which included France, Germany and Russia, but ig-

Whilst Britain is hoping to increase direct trade with India, the Indian government has its eyes firmly fixed on investment from Europe and Mr Modi met with a number of CEOs from major Spanish companies inviting them to considering investing in the growing Indian economy.

He went on to meet King Felipe and discussed the need for India to develop its railways, and infrastructure which were two of a number of areas where Spanish companies could find opportunities to create new companies in the sub-continent.

gus, BA, Iberia and Vueling has announced that this new option attracted 134,000 advance ticket purchases prior to the first flight departure to Los Angeles last Thursday and will attract a whole new group of travellers flying long haul for the first time.

Passengers can pay extra for seat choice, food, drink, wifi, in-flight entertainment and a blanket.

Whilst much has been made of the need to pay for everything and the lack of trolleys going through the cabin, the new airline is introducing a fleet of new A330

Airbuses and there are all inclusive options in economy and premium economy plus Avios points which can be used on any airline in the group will be awarded.

The initial launch saw no frills flights as cheap as €149 one way but even paying full fare, costs are considerably cheaper than other airlines offering similar facilities.

Seeing off the first flight, Willie Walsh, IAG's chief executive said: "This is the start of a fantastic new adventure for IAG. The brand has resonated with a new audience, many of whom are flying long haul for the first time.



Do you need a hat?

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 web-



A REGULAR question that occurs is 'do you need to have some sort of hat protection when driving in a convertible?'

According to the N332 Guardia Civil team, no. Hat protection is not required when in an open top car. In fact, there is a chance that wearing a hat would prove dangerous if not worn correctly and it blows off potentially blocking the view of other drivers.

However, not talking legally, it does make sense to wear a hat to protect yourself from the sun and its harmful rays whilst driving, but it is not a legal requirement.

Convertible cars are designed to be as safe as cars with full roofs. They are often fitted with strengthened supports around the windscreen and roll bars although these are not often as clearly fitted as those you see in rally cars. So as long as drivers and passengers are

positioned correctly, sat down, wearing seatbelts in the correct manner, open top cars are usually perfectly safe. As in all vehicles, it is when passengers don't follow the design and safety guidelines that problems occur and accidents can happen.

It is becoming more increasingly common to see occupants with their arms out of the windows or doors and legs up and feet on the dashboard, particularly during the summer months, but this is a dangerous and illegal practice. The legs and feet can obscure the driver's view, but also, in the event of a collision. as the airbag is deployed, legs over the airbag will feel the full force which can result in seri-

The only safe way to sit in any vehicle is within the design of the seat, with the seatbelt securely fastened.

TO mark World No Smoking Day, Spain has released figures that show around 60,000 people die every vear in the country as a result of tobacco. Worldwide, tobacco kills more than seven million people, with around 890,000 of these being non-smokers exposed to secondhand tobacco smoke according to data from the World Health Organisation (WHO).

Around 27 per cent of the Spanish population are still daily smokers spending an average of €282.39 each year on tobacco. The average smoker has 1,264 cigarettes a year.

NATIONALLY, Spain has an average of 4.7 doctors and 5.5 nurses per thousand inhabitants.

The number of doctors and registered nurses continues to grow in Spain and there are already 247,974 doctors and 291,848 nurses, an increase of 2.1 per cent and 2.7 per cent respectively compared to 2016. That's according to figures from the National Institute of Statistics (INE), which began to collate figures on the number of doctors and nurses in 1952.

The largest increases in the medical professions have been observed in physicians, dietician nutritionists, occupational therapists, dental technicians and physiotherapists.

Figures show that the health world is largely dominated by female workers with speech therapists having the highest percentage of women, being 93.8 per cent of the total. Over 91 per

cent of occupational therapists are women along with 87.8 per cent of nutritional dieticians. However men dominate the fields of dentistry, spepopulation with just four per thousand inhabitants, followed by Murcia with 4.2.



Dealing with the effects of hay fever

What is hay fever?

Allergic rhinitis or hay fever is a reaction in the mucous membrane when it is exposed to dust, pollen, sometimes cold temperatures or other substances that a person is allergic to. It mainly affects the eyes and nose.

What are its symptoms?

The reaction can cause nasal secretion and an itchy nose during the months in which plants are flowering or exposure to other allergen triggers. Other symptoms of hay fever include nasal congestion, headaches and in rare cases nausea similar to when a person is suffering from vertigo

How do you treat it? Can it be cured?

There are various ways of treating allergic rhinitis. The most common are antihistamines, decongestants and corticoids which all help manage the symptoms. Another way to treat it is through the use of injections, known as immunotherapy. The vaccinations help the body tolerate the allergens which trigger allergic reactions and help manage symptoms, in some cases they have been known to cure hay fever.

Is it hereditary?

No, although some people are genetically predisposed, meaning they are more likely to develop hay fever.

Can it be prevented?

The best way to prevent hay fever is to avoid exposure to allergen triggers or to take antihistamines during the periods where symptoms are the worst. In general the best way to prevent it is to see a specialist who will be able to find the best course of treatment for you.



MEETING someone special and falling in love can give the same buzz as being high

Findings have shown that those feelings of excitement, anticipation and butterflies in our stomach triggers certain brain cells and activates the 'feel good' hormone dopamine. This chemical is also released after taking recreational drugs such as cocaine.

Researchers from Emory University in Atlanta, USA, who carried out the study on prairie voles, which, like humans, are one of the few monogamous mammals, say

they believe the findings give insight into how we can influence social interactions. They believe this may one day be used to benefit patients suffering from autism as by controlling the release of dopamine, it may help improve interactions in socially awkward people.



He was a legendary figure in the history of port credited with mapping the upper regions of the Douro, only to be drowned in one of its rapids, allegedly weighed down by the weight of gold he had collected from his tenants. Forrester's life was devoted to improving the quality of port and in recognition of his endeavours the King of Portugal made him

Offley's vintages from the 1960s are a rare treat for Port buyers, as little has appeared under the label since.

Upstairs the focus will be on Galicia and Castile with a menu centred around two specialities from those regions - octopus and suckling pig. Galician octopus will be cooked in traditional copper pans with olive oil and paprika, while a Castilian roast suckling pig will be cooked in the asador (a traditional wood fired

Tour de Sands, held at Avanto Beach restaurant in La Cala. The charity was set up by Sandra Watson's husband Jerry after the premature passing of his beautiful wife from cancer in March 2016.

I met the couple more than 20 years ago on a Classic Eurosport classic car rally through France and Spain where I organised hotels and victualing. Their passion for classic cars and life in general was infectious. I am not going to go into everything as it is too sad for reading in a newspaper, but I would urge you to go to the website and read the uplifting story of Sandra and her family, it is truly inspirational

Full details of the story, blow by blow of the trip, the charity and the people involved can be found there, as can the giving page that at this moment has helped the charity reach more than £70,000 from the event (www.tourdesands.com).

The Charity - to which Jerry's efforts have concentrated - was set up to improve the misunderstanding about lymphedema, the side effects of her type of cancer. Life changing centre

THE first bricks were laid for Albox's new elderly care home in a symbolic ceremony attended by Mayor Francisco Torrecillas. Neighbours, construction workers and local leaders watched as work finally began on the Virgen del Saliente de Albox facility.

The three floor high residence, located just next to the new bridge, will have 25 double rooms and 10 singles, allowing for a total of 60 people. It will be spacious at more than 3,000 square metres inside, and ample outside grounds.

Torrecillas described its construction as "a very important day" for Albox, highlighting the care home's future role in taking care of the town's elderly residents while also providing jobs and a stronger community ethos.

Work is expected to take at least 18 months. Together with the new town hall and other ongoing projects, the care home is one of many aspects of Albox life set to change in the next few years as the town invests deeply in its future.

Perhaps one of the most symbolic, especially for residents of Las Pocicas, is the commencement of renovation works on the doctors office. The old building has fallen into a terrible state of disrepair in the past few years.

Fortunately a €16,000 investment from the Andalucian government and European Social Fund will help overhaul the building and restore it to its essential function in the local community.



WHILE Albox today is flush with enthusiasm and new construction projects, financial ghosts are coming back to haunt local politicians. Narrowing in on long standing corruption allegations, the Popular Party has identified precise payments of €117,174 for public works which were never completed.

The substantial figure relates to three different projects. These include the legalisation of the Venta industrial estate, extension of the Terdiguera estate, and also its redevelopment.

None of the projects have been completed despite years passing since they were paid for by the PSOE-run council between 2008 and 2011. Needless to say this came at great expense to residents.

The Popular Party investigators believe the money was embezzled and are seeking more evidence to bring the case to court. With the litany of financial scandals in the council's recent history they categorically reject the notion that human or administrative error is to blame.

Sanchez was named as a potential suspect in the alleged diversion of €1.7 million of public funds under the administration of former mayor Jose Garcia.

Though his own reign remains rela-

tively untainted by scandal, current mayor Francisco Torrecillas is feeling the weight of his predecessors. In calling for the public to come forward with donations to help renovate the new town hall, he was forced to reveal that the town has a debt of €22 million. He has heroically tried to avoid discussing how it was his own party which ratcheted up the debt, while asking for public trust.

LUXURY homes across coastal Spain are selling like hotcakes, sparking the property market's strong wider growth. Sales of €1 million plus properties have shot up in recent years, with wealthy Brits and Germans powering the trend.

On the Balearic Islands for instance the number of million euro home sales rose by a staggering 50 per cent last year, concluding with a sales volume exceeding €1.5 billion from foreigners alone. Just two years ago hitting the €1 billion mark was considered to be strictly in the realms of fantasy.

Their efforts are being more than matched by a booming Spanish professional class, who bought €1.9 billion worth of luxury properties. That brings the sales total to €3.4 billion, edging close to the record €5 billion set in the halycon pre-cri-

Price rises have combined with sales volume to present a similar picture across Spain's coastal hotspots, which continue to lure foreign investors eager to snap up a second home in the sun. Red tape has been cut too. Many foreign buyers have enough cash reserves to seal quick deals without recourse to a mortgage.

The luxury home stats also show that Brexit

has had zero impact on the market, which continues to grow with both British and other European buyers at the helm. There has also been a substantial increase in luxury rentals across Spain. Some villas are being taken by wealthy Middle Easterners for up to €50,000 per week.

Spain's real estate ace

IT'S not often you'll hear a government minister confess that things are going better than expected. But that is exactly how Alberto Nadal, budgets chief, sees the ongoing boom in real estate and construction.

Nadal was presenting his outlook for the future at the annual Real Estate Exhibition in Madrid where he noted that GDP growth in Spain this year is expected to exceed the official forecast of 2.7 per cent.

Nadal believes that real estate is set to play a crucial role in Spain's economic rise. The country is already among the fastest growing economies in the EU. In order to reap the benefits of real estate growth, Nadal believes the market should be left to develop organically rather than pushed. The construction of roughly 50,000 homes per year until 2020 would keep it at a reasonable cruise speed, fuelling growth without becoming too large and

Effective watering ideas for the garden

By Graeme Tyrrell

LUSH green gardens and thriving pot plants do not need to have copious amounts of water to keep them that way.

Conserving water is important for everyone to have enough without wasting resources or having unnecessarily high water bills.

Plants need moisture to survive but application of water can be done in numerous ways. Selecting the best method for your garden can make a big difference to the amount of water you need and the time spent providing it for your plants.

Selection of plants that require minimal watering for the climate is fundamental for low maintenance gardens but as we love to grow a variety of plants for their interesting characteristic and culinary uses we need to take care of them.

The most important step to water conservation is to ensure that your soil has water retentive properties to keep the water around your plants where it is needed. Incorporating plenty of organic matter into the soil will greatly

improve the soil's water holding capacity.

For container plants, having a water retaining tray under the container to capture excess water and prolong the period between watering is very beneficial.

Reducing evaporation of the moisture from the soil is important. Keeping the soil covered with a mulch greatly reduces evaporation by reducing soil temperature. It insulates the soil surface and it provides a barrier from the drying effects of direct summer sun.

Evaporation can also be reduced by using a drip watering system that allows water to enter the soil at a point near the plants and spread out underground rather than spraying water on the surface where it can evaporate more easily.

Using a hose can be very effective at just putting water where it is needed and gives a time to review how the garden is progressing but it is time consuming. Using sprinklers is usually wasteful as evaporation is high and coverage may water zones that do not have equal need of the water being applied.

Watering during the cooler periods of the day, ie early morning and evening, will, to a greater degree, allow the water to soak into the soil before it can evapo-

Placing plants in positions where they have shade during the middle of the day when the sun is hottest will also reduce evaporation and overheating of the plants and the soil for plants not well adapted to the Mediterranean summer.

Having a windbreak by planting a hedge, erecting a fence or wall around your garden will greatly reduce evaporation in summer as the wind dries out the garden very quickly. Container plants can be placed in sheltered positions.

Shade trees that are deciduous to allow winter sun into the garden is ideal in the Mediterranean climate.

The shade of the trees in summer reduces the temperature of the garden making a more pleasant environment for the garden and the gardener allowing a more productive and healthy place to enjoy the wonderful summer months.

The area of 'catchment attention' where people will listen is when they buy a pet from breeders. The pet shops and breeders are the main area of misinformation. It is a sad fact that all new owners will take advice from breeders when buying a puppy. Anyone can get the title of breeder.

I am of the opinion that a lot of misinformation comes from breeders who know little if anything about canine behaviour. I meet pet owners every week who think it is good for their female to have a litter of puppies. No health tests have been carried out or indeed to check if their behavioural genes are suitable for breeding. Dogs with unhealthy eyes, ears, hips or elbows can have behavioural prob-

I blame lack of training

All breeders and other sources of supply and vets should make their clients aware that a dog needs to be trained. Most people believe that dogs should not be trained until they are six months old. This is nonsense. All dogs should be trained as soon as possible. All dogs should be attending a social class as soon as possible in order to get them used to other dogs, children and people.

I am not advocating that pet dogs should be trained like police dogs. I am of the opinion all owners should be able to walk their dogs without pulling on the lead, and they should be able to make

their dogs

to the vet for its vaccinations most

owners will listen to the vet's advice, it

is at this time training should be discussed. Vets see dogs every day. Vets should recognise owners have no control over their dogs. Vets should be directing owners to training clubs or in my opinion





Triple Crown glory

SPANISH speeder Fernando Alonso astonished spectators with his strong performance in the Indy500. Alonso was so close to victory but his Andretti Autosport Honda retired just 20 laps from the finish.

His strong performance strengthened opinion that the Oviedo man might be the best all-round Formula One driver in the game today. Alonso, gaining confidence from the race, considered among the top three motorsport competitions on the planet, declared his intention to win the prestigious Triple Crown

Only the legendary Graham Hill has ever completed the feat, which involves winning the Monaco Grand Prix. Le Mans 24 Race, and the Indy 500. Alonso, 35, won the Monaco Grand Prix in back-toback races in 2006 and 2007. Last week he showed the Indy 500 is easily within his grasp, leaving only Le Mans.

Only a few months ago Alonso was cracking jokes about winning the Indy500 and



not taken seriously. Mark Webber, a top endurance racer, said he reckons the Spaniard has roughly a decade to win Le Mans and cement his legacy at the very pinnacle of the sport.

At 35, with an already glorious career behind him, and millions in the bank, Alonso is also talking publicly about becoming a free agent. He leaves Honda this summer and has ruled out a partnership with Red Bull. With his name and popularity Alonso might be able to escape the long term contracts most drivers are sub-

Audi shifts gear

AUDI is putting the diesel scandal behind it to become the latest motoring monster to throw its hat in the electric ring. The German giant has unveiled its self described 'strategic transformation,' which involves an exclusive focus on the luxury market this year and a gear change towards electric in 2018.

Audi debuts its glamorous A8 hybrid in Barcelona next month, then will start the hype train rolling on its Q8 and Q4 concepts, set to go into production in 2019.

Both are entirely electric and mark a major shift for Audi, which has been mired in hugely damaging emissions investigations. Last week the group were forced to recall 24,000 A7 and A8 models from the market.

Audi is accused of fraud and criminal advertising for selling thousands of cars at nowhere near the stated emissions levels. The scandal shouldn't hurt Audi's finances but its reputation has taken a pounding alongside Volkswagen.

Chairman Harald Kruger says Audi aim to have 30 per cent of all production vehicles electric by 2025, roughly twice what BMW are aiming for.



Subaru Forester Lineartronic

SUBARU is best-known for its formidable four-wheel-drive models, with its rugged Forester a firm favourite with a very devoted following.

The Forester is a practical and well-equipped model noted for its bulletproof reliability and virtually unstoppable off-road capability, yet it still has enough panache and luxury touches to double up as smartly-styled SUV transport.

Prices start at €30,051 (£26,180) with all models featuring 4WD, air-conditioning. Bluetooth, heated seats and cruise control among standard

dwellers.

The Forester is popular with rural dwellers including the farming community and those needing tough towing capability, and its remarkable off-road credentials mean it can often out-perform rival brands costing almost twice the price.

Petrol and diesel engines are available, and manual or CVT auto gearboxes. My test model was a Forester Lineartronic with CVT and 2.0 litre 146 hp petrol engine. Diesel versions are bigger sellers but petrol versions have a performance pluspoint - 0-100 kph is just 7.6 seconds - better than some sports cars - and top speed 220

kph (137 mph). The fuel figure of 8.9 kpl (25.2 mpg) is its only downside!

On the tarmac, this Forester displays high levels of grip, minimal cornering pitch and has a firm though still comfortable ride. Acceleration is smooth, the CVT transmission seamless and efficient, and coupled with good steering feedback, gives the driver a feeling of full control.

Revised styling a few months ago has given the Forester a classy new look and allows it to compete against SUV rivals such as the Ford Kuga, and Mazda CX-5 which have there own plus-points but none can compete when it
