Trousers down

British stab suspect collared

By Andy Mansell

Benidorm police have arrested David Grundy, 53, who is wanted in connection with the stabbing of his partner at their home in the Orihuela Costa.

The Local Police officers apprehended Grundy when he returned to a car parked outside the Aparthotel Bermudas in the Rincon de Loix neighbourhood.

He was pinned to the ground by the officers with his trousers around his knees as they checked for weapons, before being handcuffed.

Inside the vehicle, which belonged to neighbours whose house he was looking after, the officers discovered clothes and €4,600 in cash, which they believe he intended to use to leave the country.

Juan Carlos Moragues, a Spanish government representative for the Alicante area, confirmed last Thursday that an international arrest warrant was out for Grundy with an accompanying photo.

He had been missing for five days after his partner, 42-yearold Nicola Anne Walker Houghton, was found with a knife embedded in her back at the home they shared in Orihuela

Her daughter alerted police and paramedics after she found the victim lying on the floor with a large kitchen knife em-

bedded in her back.

The victim, is still in hospital, in a condition described as "serious but stable," after an operation to remove the weapon.

Expat Grundy, who worked as a taxi driver and gardener, is understood to have been arrested as he returned to the stolen car. in which he is thought to have been sleeping.

The clock is ticking

THERE are just 645 days left until the UK officially leaves the European Union with or without a deal. Already it is 85 days since the triggering of Article 50 and one year since the referendum and there has been little or no definitive action from the British government.

The recent disastrous election result for the Conservatives, which saw them fall from a parliamentary majority to only the leading minority, has weakened the country's control over Brexit proceedings. This is despite assurances from Prime Minster Theresa May that the election would strengthen the UK's hand.

Within the Conservative Party alone there is a confused message about the UK's stance in negotiations. Mrs May has insisted that "no deal is better than a bad deal"; whilst the Chancellor Phillip Hammond recently

stated that no deal from the European Union would be "a very, very bad outcome."

With such a short time frame in which to untangle a 43-year relationship with the EU, the complications in the UK government question how prepared it is to handle the most difficult diplomatic negations in UK or EU history, in what will be a 27

versus one discussion.

In contrast, EU negotiators appear prepared and well organised. Europe's chief negotiator Michel Barnier, following his 2016 tour of member states has outlined key priorities which must be settled before moving on to trade talks. These include citizen's rights, the state of the Irish border and the contentious Brexit bill.

The complexity of such negotiations will not be complete until October 2017 at the earliest, but could run into early 2018. Barnier has stated that the talks will not progress until all 27 member states are satisfied with the outcomes

Despite assurances from David Davis that Barnier's plans were negotiable and could turn into the "row of the summer," the UK Brexit secretary immediately caved in to EU demands following the first round of talks on Monday June 19.

Time for talks are further limited as the European Union aims to conclude negotiations by October 2018, which leaves the UK with less than a vear to form trade arrangements before it is ejected with a deal in place or not.

With Westminster in chaos and time marching on, the door to the EU remains open only until the day it is slammed firmly shut.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...17

Spain's seafaring traditions date back centuries, from the Conquest of the Americas started by Christopher Colombus in 1492 to having one of Europe's largest fishing fleets today, and close to shore mariners continue to be guided by a legendary lighthouse which is steeped in folklore.

Tower of strength

THE Torre de Hercules (Tower of Hercules) near the city of A Coruña in Galicia is the most ancient Roman lighthouse still in use today and widely considered to be the oldest in the


According to a myth mixing Celtic and Greco-Roman themes, it marks the resting place of the grotesque giant Geryon, who was slain by the hero Hercules after a three-day battle.

Hercules then buried the head of his foe alongside his weapons and ordered the lighthouse to be built on top, with an image of the structure atop a skull and crossbones appearing on A Coruña's coat of arms.

Another legend is recounted in Lebor Gabala Erenn, an 11th-century book, which tells how King Breogan, founding father of the Galician Celtic nation, built a tower so tall that his sons were able to spy a distant green land from the top, and that this vision lured them to sail to Ireland where they became ancestors of the Irish people.

The tower is known to have been in use by the second century, when it was

built, or possibly rebuilt, under the emperor Trajan (53-117 AD) following a Phoenician design which may have been modelled on the Lighthouse of



Alexandria.

From 1788-1791 the original 34metre tower was restored in a Neoclassical style which included a new 21-metre extension following an order from King Charles IV of Spain.



No let up for historic heatwave in Spain

peratures for the month of June across the whole of Spain look set to continue this week broken only by occasional thunderstorms.

The whole of Spain remains on a high level of alert for wildfires - especially after the tragedy that swept Portugal at the weekend.

Madrid set an all-time June high temperature on Saturday when the temperature reached 40.3°C (104.5°F) at Madrid-Bara-

And last week also saw 44°C (112°F) recorded in Cordoba

Emergency services continue to warn of the dangers of the intense heat and have issued information about how to cope with the heat.

The only relief from the higher than normal temperatures will be isolated afternoon and evening thunderstorms that devel-

However, a storm system approaching from the Atlantic could finally bring relief from this dangerous heat wave early next week.

Advice to beat the heat

427 marihuana plants in chalet

A 40-YEAR-OLD Spanish man and a 20-year-old French woman were arrested recently after Guardia Civil officers found 427 marihuana plants in their home

The investigation first began at the end of May after a report was filed with the Guardia Civil in El Verger regarding an unusual increase in visitors to a chalet bordering Gata de Gor-

Officers carried out surveillance in the area and both the smell of the marihuana that came from the chalet and the sound of the equipment inside was blatant.

They also detected that the electricity being supplied to the chalet was illegally hooked up to the streetlights and called in an engineer who confirmed this was the case

With the evidence in hand. officers entered the chalet together with the Citizen Security Unit (USECIA) of Calpe and found 427 marihuana plants, 27 heaters, 22 light transformers, six carbon filters, five air conditioners, fans, timers and humidity meters.

Also found were 28 grams of cocaine, 300 grams of marihuana buds, elements for distribution including scales, plastic bags and seals, an assortment of anabolic steroids and another 38 tablets of unknown substance currently being tested.

In the chalet, there were also two knuckledusters - considered a prohibited weapon, a bow with two metal arrows without a licence 44 '32 S and WL' cartridges and a large

A dramatic rescue

FOUR walkers were rescued by helicopter and fire crews from Benidorm on Sunday af-

The hikers, aged between 30 and 62 had set off to walk the well-known seven peak trail across the Sierra Helada mountain to Albir at 6.30am. but got into difficulties around 12.30pm when one of them fainted from heat exhaustion.

Rescue services were called by the group and a helicopter was scrambled, dropping medics down to the unconscious man, a 62-year-old

After rehydration treatment on the ground the man was winched onto the helicopter and airlifted to a waiting ambulance before being transferred to the Marina Baixa Hospital in Villajoyosa.

The remaining walkers were taken off the mountain by National Police and fire rescue vehicles.

Despite setting off early in the morning, the hikers struggled with the lack of shade on the mountain and unseasonably high temperatures, well in excess of 30 degrees.

The Barcelo Hotel group buy Selomar

THE derelict Hotel Selomar on Benidorm's Levante beachfront is to receive a multi-million euro renovation.

New owners Barcelo Hotels. backed by the Hispania group, bought the abandoned building for €15.6 million a few days ago and have pledged to spend around the same amount to return the hotel to its former four star glory.

The Selomar, originally built in 1973, offered 245 rooms across eight floors and under-

went a refurbishment in 1992

However, since closing its doors for the last time in 2007, the hotel gradually fell into disrepair, until a devastating fire, thought to have been started by squatters, gutted the building in October 2015.

There has been much speculation regarding the future of the building over the years, but any potential developer has been hindered by a ruling from the Costas organisation which governs construction on the coastline of Spain.

Costas have declared that the front of the Selomar, in particular, the balconies, protrude too far out and are in breach of the Coastal Law and this coupled with a dispute within the Almodobar family who own it, has prevented any development until now.

Hispania, backed by billionaire investor George Soros, and Barceló have been partners since 2015, through its subsidiary, Bay Hotels & Leisure and are currently listed as the biggest hotel group in Spain, with 38 establishments totaling 11,021 rooms.


THE first stone has been laid on the new €210 million shopping centre on the edge of Benidorm.

General Directorate of Traffic (DGT) figures showed that 2.442 cyclists were killed on Spain's roads in 2006. By 2015 this had risen to 7,000, a 186 per cent increase.

Five cyclists have lost their lives on the N-332 since May. Four of them, out for a Sunday ride, were killed in two separate accidents on the same stretch of main road in Oliva (Valencia).

Paradoxically Sunday is dangerous for cyclists, especially early in the morning as clubbers and disco-goers who have been out all night drive home high on drink and drugs.

The Generalitat has now announced it intends to introduce. legislation to protect cyclists.

"I don't want to give the impression that we are improvising, but we have given ourselves a month to come up with an action plan," the regional

president Ximo Puig said.

He was speaking after meeting representatives from cycling and triathlon associations as well as officials from the regional government, the national government's Valencia Delegation, the region's three Diputaciones and the DGT.

Jose Sauri, Cycling Federation spokesman in the Valencian Community, wants a harsher response from the authorities. "Unless they confiscate offenders' cars as well as their driving licences, we might as well be dead," he said.

Ana Novella, spokeswoman for Stop Accidentes, agreed that cars should be impounded or fitted with an Alcoholock system linked to the ignition.

Novella also suggested that a reckless driver responsible for a road death should be automatically remanded, "Prison would make offenders think twice,"

In the aftermath of the UK general election, we reach the one-year anniversary of the Brexit vote. But do we know more today about how Brexit might affect expatriates in Spain?

Has the UK election changed anything?

Theresa May's failure to secure a majority is generally considered a public rejection of her hard-line Brexit strategy. The big question now is whether she will yield to pressure for a 'softer' Brexit. This could mean keeping access to Europe's single market and staying in the European Economic Area (EEA), including freedom of movement.

How long until things change?

With Article 50 triggered, Britain is still on course to leave the EU by April 2019. Meanwhile, EU membership and associated rights for expatriates in Spain remain. But the nature of Brexit will only become clearer as negotiations begin, scheduled for late June.

Reassuringly, the 27 EU states announced that securing reciprocal citizens' rights is "at the very top of our agenda" as part of "an ambitious solution where those affected continue to enjoy their rights."

Theresa May has made it clear she agrees, provided guarantees are mutual.

What Brexit answers do we have post-election and one year on from the referendum?

The terms of new agreements, however, could prove less favourable than today. It may be worth reviewing your residency, estate planning, investments, pensions and tax planning options now, before anything changes.

Should you expect higher taxes?

With taxation being a domestic – not an EU – matter, the tax treatment for Spanish residents should not change post-Brexit. The UK/Spain double tax treaty will continue to set the rules for

taxing expatriates. However, if the UK leaves both the EU and the EEA – and no equivalent arrangements are in place – non-residents with Spanish income and/or assets could pay more in taxes. Currently, non-EU/EEA residents are charged higher income tax rates and cannot qualify for the generally lower wealth tax and succession/gift tax rates offered by the regional autonomous communities. Also, once the UK leaves the bloc, Britons aged under 65 selling a Spanish main home to reinvest into a British property may attract full capital gains tax charges.

Pounds or euros?

Following the election news, the pound slumped 2% against the euro and remains vulnerable during Brexit uncertainty.

While currencies can swing both ways, if you have no choice but to convert at a particular time – by withdrawing UK pension income, say – this can be costly. Reduce currency exchange risk with investment

structures that let you hold multiple currencies or consider transferring UK pensions to arrangements offering currency flexibility.

What about UK pensions?

Brexit should not affect accessing or transferring UK pension funds. However, expatriates outside the EEA do not receive annual inflation increases in State Pension payments, so extending this post-Brexit could be a cost-saving opportunity for the Treasury.

The UK's new 'overseas transfer charge' may suggest post-Brexit changes for private pensions. Many expatriates transfer to Qualifying Recognised Overseas Pension Schemes (QROPS) to benefit from taxefficiency and flexibility. However, since 9th March, some transfers attract 25% taxation.

Currently, this does not affect transfers to QROPS based within the EEA, including Gibraltar. However, Brexit offers the Treasury more scope to widen penalties on overseas transfers or to make it harder to cash in 'defined benefit' pensions. Consider acting now under current rules, but take personalised, regulated advice to avoid pension scams and ensure a suitable approach.

With so much uncertainty ahead and current opportunities potentially expiring in around 18 months, now is the time to review your financial planning and explore your options so you can plan accordingly as Brexit unfolds.

No plain sailing for local yacht clubs

ELEVEN Valencian Community yacht clubs with expired licences applied for renewals while the Generalitat prepares the conditions for new concessions.

"The increased levies that each Club Nautico must pay will make access to sailing impossible for many enthusiasts and numerous activities will disappear," Mas warned

It was illogical that due to its own inactivity the Administration now stood to make money out of the situation, maintained Club Nautico presidents and the board of the region's Association of Yacht Clubs (ACNCV).

"It looked as though the regional government wanted to give ports and marinas an elitist image," said ACNCV president Jose Mas.

"Everything suggests that the Generalitat wants a transition to privatisation of these spaces, as has happened with Gandia's Club Nautico," he added.

CAMPELLO Town Hall halted construction work on a path above the Almadraba beach.

Planning permission for three villas above the beach is in order, the Urban Development department clarified, but no application was made for the path which has approval from coastal authority, Costas.

A small section of beach was also closed off as workmen were told to down tools until the legal position was cleared up.

The cliff below the villas has caused problems for some time and the development project includes stabilising the crumbling rockface as well as building a path between both

Beaches' councillor Cynthia Alaves explained that possibly the project was presented directly to Costas and should eventually reach the town hall via the regional government.

Despite this legal hitch, Alaves stressed that the project, which is perfectly legal, will solve 10 years of instability in the area adjoining the steps and the Torre de la Illeta zone.

Residents in the area are unconvinced and claim that the developers wish to provide the three luxury villas with direct access to the beach. The path will do little to prevent the danger of landslips, they predicted.

IN today's article, we would like to share with our readers the recent judgement granted by the Denia Court Number 4, Judgement number 119/17, dated June 8, 2017, by which the court of this municipality of the Costa Blanca has accepted the court claim presented by this law firm: White Baos Lawyers, on behalf of the British expatriate marriage, of Mr I M and Mrs K M.

Expenses Clause. On the aforementioned court decision, it has been accepted. at our request for the annulment of the expenses clause, by which the bank, in this case Banco Sabadell, imposed the payment to my clients of all expenses arising from the mortgage loan.

Thus the court of Denia, confirms that said clause is null and void because it is abusive and generic; lacking any distinction or specification. It also imposes and forces the consumers to pay for all the expenses, taxes, and cost consequences of the mortgage loan, whatever they are, although

High-rise fire no problem

FIREFIGHTERS from Alicante and Valencia provinces recently tested their readiness to control fire in a high-rise building.

The Alicante and Valencia Firefighting Consortiums, together with Alicante City's own fire brigade, tested equipment and resources at Edificio Bahia de los Pinos, in Cabo de las Huertas.

The building's 23 storeys make it one of the city's tallest buildings and firefighters from the three forces confirmed that their hoses can deal with fires up to a height of 25 storeys.

"Above this, different tactics are required," said Juan Miguel Suay from Alicante's Consorcio de Bomberos.

The fire hoses' reach is only one problem, as fire engines encounter many physical obstacles when called out to urbanisations, explained another expert, Lucio Garcia. Regulations

introduced in 2006 are not retrospective and cannot be applied to many older buildings without rehabilitating them, Garcia added.

The Cabo de las Huertas exercise was prompted not

only by the fire that recently engulfed Grenfell Tower Building in London, but another that affected Edificio La Chicharra in La Albufereta last April.

The blaze, which began in

90 minutes to control. "In a normal fire we use

some 150 litres of water per minute but a big fire like this needed 500 litres a minute.'

Untroubled waters agreement made

ALCOY'S San Jorge bridge will close to traffic and pedestrians once renovations start this coming Monday, June 26.

It will remain closed until September while the roadway is resurfaced, balustrades are repaired, pavements widened and traffic lanes reduced from the present three to two.

This work should have begun months ago but problems detected during routine work on the city's Fernando Reig suspension bridge last summer meant that the €280,000 San Jorge project had to be delayed.

All of the Fernando Reig cables need replacing and the bridge will remain closed for another 12 months at least.

The council has deliberately chosen to wait until schools

close and traffic hold-ups are less likely, explained Transport councillor Jordi Muñoz. Traffic will be rerouted with signposted details of detours and the Local Police will regulate all problematic crossings.

"Roadworks are always a nuisance but we have tried to minimise problems with alternative routes at a time of the year when there is less traffic," Muñoz said.

Forty-six municipalities across the Valencian Community presented their beaches to the FEE and 45 were awarded with blue flags, representing 21 per cent of all blue flags in Spain.

The province of Alicante boasts the most flags in Spain, with 78 awarded in total

Four arrested in Benissa drug bust

FOUR Spaniards have been detained by the Guardia Civil in Benissa after being linked to a drug preparation and distribution operation. After the first arrest, 149 grams of cocaine were seized after being found hidden in a bag of rice.

Authorities have detected a rise in drug sales in Benissa since February, most notably in the areas surrounding bars and businesses.

Following this, an investigation was established aiming to local the main sites of distribution and production of the drugs.

The first arrest took place as one suspect left a house in order to make a sale. Cocaine was found hidden in each of his

trouser legs. The house was then searched and officers uncovered a camping refrigerator full of bags of rice, at the middle of which were hidden two rocks weighing 56.2 grams and 35.2 grams respectively.

Additional findings include various pieces of equipment to produce and distribute narcotics, four grams of hashish, pre-weighed bags of cocaine and €1,717 in cash.

The second arrest uncovered three marihuana plants, 30.1 grams of pure cocaine and 59 grams of marihuana.

The two registered owners of these homes were arrested in connection with drug offences.



So, Rosemary turns her attention to his wife, Sheila. She says how very sorry she







A coach with all seats covered in plastic transported members back to the start, to



Night of fire!

A celebration defined by fireworks, jumping in the sea at midnight and leaping over flames, the San Juan bonfires festival is one of the main events on the Spanish cultural calendar. Taking place on June 23, the shortest night of the year, it is a magical celebration that ushers in the summer season.

What the blazes?

traced back to an ancient Pagan tradition, centred around the belief that the shortest night of the year meant the least amount of time that evil spirits were able to roam freely, which was a cause for cel-

In later years, this festival merged with the Catholic celebration of Saint John the Baptist giving the festival its name.

The memorable image of the bonfires on the beach started as a symbol of worship to the sun at the beginning of its most powerful months. It is also a way to ward off the evil spirits and witches who were thought by the Pagans to be at their most powerful as the sun started it's movement southwards.

The burning of effigies over the flames,

originally of Judas Iscariot who betrayed Jesus, has in recent times transformed into setting likenesses of local and national celebrities alight, and is said to bring

Jumping over the open flames of the bonfire will bring luck and clean the soul for the year to follow.

San Juan is all about fresh starts and plunging into the sea at midnight is a key part of this. According to legend, washing your face three times in the water will allow you 12 months of happiness and luck, eternal beauty, and three wishes which will come true before the next year.

Wherever San Juan is celebrated, it's important to remember the ancient superstitions which surround this magical night.

Stay safe for San Juan

THE Spanish love affair with grand spectacles based around fire is reflected in most of the nation's summer

San Juan is perhaps the biggest of them all with many of the key attractions involving fire, fireworks and pyrotechnic marvels.

These displays are among the reasons that San Juan is such a popular event, but it is important to stay safe when on the beach.

Lighting bonfires is strictly prohibited in most areas. This rule is in place to protect environments which are

fragile and stop fires from being lit where they are likely to spread out of con-

The San Juan celebrations in 2011 earned notoriety after six people were killed across Spain.

Authorities also recorded many injuries most of which were burns.

The Spanish government's desire to protect their own culture resulted in them overturning an attempt by the European Union to improve fire safety in 2009 which could have contributed to avoiding instances like those which occurred in 2011.

The EU directives included banning under-12s from handling fireworks and requiring that everyone stands at least 15 metres from firework displays.

These measures were deemed to be an attack on Spain's cultural heritage and resulted in protests across Mediterranean regions.

However, over the last 15 years the number of injuries has been declining and on the whole safety during San Juan is improving, according to local authorities.





From Malaga to Mallorca

Most towns and villages will stage their own version of the San Juan celebrations, with local council websites tending to be best for information.

ALICANTE is known for the sheer size of the San Juan festivities which take place there. Celebrations commenced last Tuesday with bonfires on the beach which are lit in the evening and continue until Saturday.

Every year since 1932, Alicante has elected a Bellea del Foc (Beauty of the Fire) to lead the celebrations. The job requires the chosen lady to host events and kick start festivities all over the city. This year's representative is Sofia Escoda, aged 22.

In the Plaza de los Luceros from today (Thursday) to Saturday an impressive pyrotechnic display, known as a mascleta, will take place at 2pm. Introduced by the Bellea Del Foc this event follows in the San Juan tradition of being very busy and extremely

The international Folklore Parade takes place down the main street in Al-



icante on Friday June 23. This parade is a celebration of mostly Latin American cultures, with displays from Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Mexico, and Peru. For a few hours bands, floats, and dancers will move down the street in an intense display of colour and life.

The Brazilian dancing ladies are the last performers every year and are known to be the highlight of the event.

At a minute past midnight on Saturday spectators gather on Postiguet beach for an enormous fireworks display followed by the traditional dive into the sea.

Nightly firework displays will then continue until Thursday June 29 as part of an international competition.

SAN JUAN is a huge part of the local culture in Malaga, where locals tend to build many smaller fires on certain permitted beaches.

The most popular city beaches to visit are Misericordia and La Malagueta, where fireworks and bonfires will draw huge crowds.

Free access to an event organised by MegaStar FM Radio will start at 9.30pm on Malagueta beach. Musicians and DJs will perform throughout the night including Borja Rubio, Henry Mendez, Feder, DJ Valdi, Barei, Alex Guerro, K-Narias, and Calum.

At a minute to midnight tomorrow (Friday) the rag dolls, known as Juas,



shaped like different characters will be burned on the Misericordia beach, followed by the midnight plunge.

Music and dancing will continue through to the early hours of Satur-

PALMA DE MALLORCA is the site of the main San Juan celebrations on the island. With events taking place in clubs and across the city it has earned a reputation as the party location for San Juan. DJs and music will fill venues until the early hours of the morning both tomorrow (Friday) and

In Parc de la Mar, the main attractions will take place. These include street parties, firework displays, music, and of course devils running through the city with firecrackers trying to scare tourists and create a ghoulish atmosphere.

For a more peaceful celebration,



visitors can head to Son Severa. The celebration of their patron saint, John the Baptist, takes place in the weeks leading up to Saturday June 24 and ends on this night. Visitors can expect to find agricultural markets, fairs with local games and competitions, and regional dance demonstrations.

IF you live in a town full of little blue men and women you probably enjoy a drink or two so Juzcar leads a bar league table.

According to a survey produced by Coca Cola based on statistics released by the National Institute of Statistics, the Smurf village in the Serrania de Ronda has statistically the most number of bars per 1,000 people in Malaga Province at 8.77, although this is somewhat skewed as there are less than 250 inhabitants.

With more than 16,000 bars, Andalucia has more places to drink than any other community but the number per thousand is much lower than the national average at 1.95 with many of the highest scoring towns being in Axarquia.

The problems with statistics is that they often don't actually mean anything as this particular survey records the number of bars per thousand, not the actual number in any particular area.








■ A WEEK after its release in America, The Putin Interviews, Oliver Stone's series of sit downs with the Kremlin chief has shown on Russian television. The American director, who has done features on Hugo Chavez and Fidel Castro, gained unrivalled personal access to Putin over the course of months.

Ash cloud

■ A VOLCANO erupted in Russia's far-eastern Kamchatka region, showering dozens of villages with ash and forcing evacuations. The 70,000-year- old Shiveluch volcano, which stands over 3,000 metres tall, turned the sky black with the eruption according to witnesses as ash flew12 kilometres above sea level.

Stadium fire

■ FIREFIGHTERS extinguished a blaze at Volgograd's World Cup football stadium, which is still in construction. An area in excess of 100 square metres was destroyed but no casualties reported. Volgograd stadium, like many others, is in a race against time to be finished for the 2018 World Cup next summer.

Prefab protest

■ LAWMAKERS are going ahead with the

controversial demolition of dozens of iconic Moscow housing estates built during the Soviet era. Huge opposition has emerged to the plans with the prefab buildings cherished for their cultural and historical value. But parliament rejected the protests, planning to convert the homes into modern buildings.

Prime target

ANTI-CORRUPTION protests raging across Russia have seen thousands of people arrested. Rallies in Moscow, St Petersburg, and even in Vladivostok in the Far East, attracted legions of furious protestors, mostly young. Anger has settled on prime minister Medvedev, who is accused of funnelling public funds for a personal empire.

Birth control

■ WORRYING new statistics confirm fears that Russia is heading for a demographic crisis. From January to April 2017, there were 70,000 fewer births than the same period last year. The population is expected to fall by 300,000 this year despite the government rewarding women who have more than two children.

Siberian slackers

NATIVE Siberians are getting heavier, sparking interest among Russian scientists. The first cases of clinical obesity were diagnosed among the indigenous Yamal people this year. Doctors believe a more sedentary, modern lifestyle has caused weights to rise. Previously they walked miles a day and had a diet of largely raw meat.

Spanish tax evasion fears

ACCORDING to the Spanish General Council of Economists association (CGE), tax evasion is costing the economy more €25 billion a year.

The main problem appears to be the fact that many Spaniards believe that tax evasion in one form or another is fair game, especially when so many politicians and industrialists have been proven not only to be tax evaders but in many cases have got away with it. Whilst foreign-born footballers

is the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of Spain of which 16 per cent is estimated to be subject to no payment of tax.

may be targeted and are to some extent an easy option worth many column inches in newspapers. even the High Court has condemned the 2012 tax amnesty that allowed those with large unde-

clared incomes to pay less tax than those who were much poorer yet had been honest in their decla-

The general conclusion is that Spanish tax law is confusing and ask for assistance because of bureaucracy and the high level of fines if a simple mistake is dis-

This means that many companies employ people 'off the books' saving social security payments and not deducting income tax and in numerous cases accepting payment in cash so that IVA is not charged.

There are also a number of manual workers, particularly in construction and domestic employment who work cash in hand.

Spain threatens loan to Greece

SPANISH Finance Minister Luis de Guindos speaking on behalf of Spain, Italy and Slovakia has threatened to veto a new €8.5 billion

A major row has broken out over a decision made several years ago to charge officials from those three countries who sat on a privatisation panel.

They are accused of alleged embezzlement and breach of duty but the accusation which is supported by a number of Greek lawyers has dragged on since 2015 without going to trial.

Now the three countries have lost patience with the Greek government and want the matter resolved if the loan is to proceed.

Taxi drivers and councils complain

European Parliament wants to control sharing economy

WHILST the concept of the 'sharing economy' seemed like a good idea at the time, the European Parliament feels that new legislation is needed.

The definition of a sharing economy is an economic model in which individuals are able to borrow or rent assets owned by someone else.

The two most obvious examples of this concept are best represented by companies like Airbnb and Uber and these two companies as well as others offering similar services have been the cause of much criticism as well as some praise in Spain.

The concept is social media based and sees individuals able to rent properties in major cities and towns or order 'mini cabs' for transportation.

In the case of private room hire, both local authorities and many residents are opposed to the concept as the authorities argue that the rentals avoid tax and flout rental regulations whilst locals see long term rental prices either increasing or the availability of property decreasing.

With private car hire, taxi drivers are up in arms as they are not only being undercut, but the value of a taxi licence which can be sold on, has been seen as a form of pension as at one time it was worth well in excess of €100,000 and is now dropping in value.

The European Parliament passed a non-binding resolution asking for measures across the Union in order to fight abuse and ensure that these platforms respect workers' and consumer's rights as well as ensuring that they also meet their tax obligations.

To some extent, a number of countries don't feel that there is a major problem with these companies, as they tend to generate new employment opportunities but others are concerned that they need to be regulated to ensure that taxes in particular are paid by both the companies finding the clients and those performing the service.

There is also a need to ensure that consumers are protected in the event that anything goes wrong as it is feared that adequate insurances may not be in place nor are there clear paths for complaints or

It is also felt in Brussels that there is a need to differentiate between individual providers of services and professionals as it appears that in Barcelona alone, a high proportion of the properties advertised for short term let are owned by just a few professionals who give the impression that they are private individuals.

City finance danger

IT is being suggested that the European Commission will require oversight of major euroclearing operations currently undertaken in London following Brexit.

To a government that has indicated that it wants to leave the European Union in order to gain more freedom, such a demand will most likely be anath-

The problem however is that if it can't agree to this demand then a number of firms currently operating in London are likely to have no option other than to move their euro dealing to an EU member state.

This will have an immediate impact on the importance of London as a major currency centre which will see a loss of jobs and the disappearance of hundreds of billions of euro deal transactions

At the end of the day, whilst not the friendliest of moves, the EU negotiators will argue that their role is to do what is best for the remaining 27 states, even if the UK loses out.

CRANES SIGNAL BETTER TIMES ON COAST Sky-high sign!

CRANES on Costa del Sol skylines are a clear indication that after years of hard times, things are steadily returning to more normality locally, especially in construction.

While things may generally be in a state of flux in the UK with the General Election and the lengthy Brexit negotiations still to take any definite direction, sky-high cranes on building sites in southern Spain are an indicator that the local building industry and property are in healthy recovery.

No-one politically or in property is saying it is back to the boom times in Spain of the early noughties (2000 -2006), but more than fledgling shoots are now apparent of a recovering healthier construction industry.

"In the last eight years cranes on the sky-line have been basically non existent," said one local developer who asked not to be named said.

"But just look around, now there are cranes everywhere, a sign that the con-

"It's not like Dubai where I once counted 39 cranes on the sky-line, but things are definitely moving positively, which is great to see.'

There is a certain irony that the 'Bad Bank' Sareb which is managed by a consortium of 'Good Banks' and the Spanish government has a huge stock of older property which was surrendered during the financial crisis, but people appear more interested in purchasing brand new property.

Swiss bank buys in Madrid


SWISS Bank UBS has spent €35.15 million to purchase two large warehouse properties in Madrid through its Asset Management division.

Using clients' funds to purchase the properties, it has already secured tenants on long term leases which will generate a regular income for its investment clients.

This is a very attractive market for the bank as the Spanish economy recovers and industry needs to expand but may not have funds available in order to purchase property, so leasing is a work-

Spanish to be busy in Africa

AFTER 30 years of planning, the government of the Democratic Republic of Congo is slightly closer to building a colossal dam with Spanish help.

The intention has been to create a huge hydro-electric facility to increase the power supply to the capital Kinshasa and also to allow the Congolese to export electricity to South Africa.

There are currently two companies bidding for this construction work, ACS from Spain and the Three Gorges Corporation from China and in an unusual

move, the Congolese government has asked the two competing companies to work together in order to undertake and complete the job more quickly.

Although no decision has been made as yet by the two corporations, the concept may be attractive as it would cut the financial risk to each company as the country has a history of instability and as recently as last year, the World Bank withheld a \$73 million (€65 million) grant which was to be put towards the project.

The fall out starts for **Banco Popular directors**

ALTHOUGH the decision to sell the Banco Popular to Santander for €1 was prompted by the European Central Bank, repercussions are now being felt.

Even the Spanish government appears in hindsight to question the hurried decision and now wants to know the thinking behind the accountants Deloitte's review of the Bank which supposedly had € 1.3 billion of assets at the time of the sale.

This report was not immediately published, but has been criticised by Banco Popular shareholders and privately in part by the Bank of Spain according to reports.

Almost 10,000 private shareholders, represented by the OCU consumer body are suing the directors of Banco Popular in respect of their losses as their shares are now worthless and other parties are accusing the board of false accounting and possible fraud.

Emilio Saracho the Spanish businessman and adviser to the hugely successful Inditex was appointed as President of Banco Popular in December 2016 and claims that in the runup to his appointment, he was not aware of the real financial state of the bank,

He admits that he may have made mistakes, especially at an April shareholder meeting where comments made led to the start of the fall of the bank's shares, but he will work with Santander for three months as the hand over continues.

Discovering Sierra Espuña

SPAIN, probably better known for its long beaches packed with sun-loungers and all-inclusive holidays, has much more to offer and you only have to travel inland a few kilometres to get a real feel for nature and tranquillity.

One such area is the municipality of Alhama de Murcia where you will find the Sierra Espuña Regional Park which is surrounded by small villages such as Gebas and El Berro, both situated alongside the hills that make the nature re-

Gebas, which has a population of around 20 full time residents, is surrounded by gullies, canyons and ravines, giving it a spectacular look not dissimilar to a lunar landscape, it also has forested areas with formations of grasses and pine trees, a magnificent contrast offering stunning views

El Berro, just a few kilometres away from Gebas is again a small village, although slightly larger than Gebas with approximately 100 residents. It has cafes, restaurants, and a bakery.



LEGALLY SPEAKING

Fines for not moving

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



NOT washed your car in a while? Well be careful, you could be fined for that! Many drivers are unaware they could be fined without even being on the road or moving their car, but these fines do exist and are real.

Even if the vehicle isn't moving, the lights, reflectors and number plates must be kept clear and if the vehicle is moving, the windows must be clear also. A fine of €80 can also be issued if officers decide your number plate is in a poor condition.

If you do need to wash your car, be careful where you do it, hand washing a vehicle in the street or carrying out repairs can also result in a penalty for the owner. Water, oil and other deposits can interfere with the road surface and can become a risk. There are also environmental concerns over the disposal of waste such as water or other fluids.

Car wash facilities have complex recycling and drainage systems so as to minimise waste of the precious commodity of water.

Remember you can also be fined for smoking at petrol stations which poses a serious safety risk, but also for leaving your engine running, your radio or or for using your mobile. Any of these activities can result in a fine of up to €200 and the loss of

You can also be fined for moving house and not informing the DGT of your new ad-

In the event of an accident or breakdown. you can be fined for not wearing a high visibility face or for not placing the warning triangles around the vehicle warning others of vour presence.

So remember, whilst speeding and driving whilst using a mobile phone are the two most common reasons to be fined, there are also ways you can be fined without even moving.

The downside of this is that we're in danger of turning food shopping into just another app for our phones. Con-

> sumers have an expectation that they can have whatever they want whenever they want.

With current research showing 47 per cent of us give up because the checkout process took too long, we are now too impatient to even wait in a virtual queue!

In the UK, grocery shopping is just another thing to fit into an already hectic schedule. In Spain, I have fallen in love with food again and now, my grocery shopping might take an entire morning as I amble round the market and catch up with the butcher in my best Spanish.

While for me this is infinitely preferable to a packed supermarket or frustrating keyword search, I realise that I'm fortunate in that I have the time for it.

FIGHT or flight? When it comes to a mother's love, it's almost certainly fight.

Scientists say they have conducted a series of experiments that shows a mother's defensive behaviour to protect their child and this is caused by the release of oxytocin, or the so-called 'love hormone.' On a study of rats they found that

> when in the face of danger, rather than fleeing, there was a release of oxytocin as the defensive mechanism to protect her

pups came into force. When researchers blocked the oxytocin they found that mothers immediately froze when they detected threat.

It is believed this action would be similar in humans with this oxytocin release causing a mother to fight to protect her child, giving a true idea of a mother's love.

Get active to boost your mood

EXERCISE has always been cited for boosting your mood and reducing stress levels, but the good news is it's never too late to start as researchers claim just one workout can show immediate positive effects.

A new study carried out at New York's Centre for Neural Science, claims just one workout that leaves you sweating is enough to boost your moods when previous studies claimed it had to be continual, regular exercise to have similar results.

The researchers looked at how exercise impacts the brain and found after one workout it can have neurological changes and be seen as a stepping stone for greater benefits.

Working out releases a feeling of euphoria and triggers the brain's cannabinoid receptors.

Melanomas

What is melanoma?

Melanoma is usually, but not always, a cancer of the skin. It begins in melanocytes - the cells that produce the pigment melanin that colours the skin, hair and eyes. Melanocytes also form moles, where melanoma often develops.

How can you spot it and what are its symptoms?

The most common sign of melanoma is the appearance of a new mole or a change in an existing mole. This can occur anywhere on the body, but the most commonly affected areas are the back in men and the legs in women. Melanomas are uncommon in areas which are protected from sun exposure, such as the buttocks and the scalp.

In most cases, melanomas have an irregular shape and are more than one colour. The mole may also be larger than normal and can sometimes be itchy or bleed. Look out for a mole which changes progressively in shape, size and colour. See your GP if you notice any of these changes.

What causes melanoma?

Melanoma is caused by skin cells that begin to develop abnormally. Exposure to ultraviolet (UV) light from the sun is the cause of most melanomas. There is also evidence to suggest that some may result from sunbed exposure. The type of sun exposure that causes melanoma is sudden intense exposure.

Such as when a person is sunbathing on holiday, which can lead to sunburn.

How can it be treated?

The main treatment for melanoma is surgery, although your treatment will depend on your circumstances

If melanoma isn't diagnosed until an advanced stage, treatment is mainly used to slow the spread of the cancer and reduce symptoms. This usually involves medicines that target specific genetic changes in the melanoma, such as BRAF inhibitors, or medicines that boost the body's immune responses to the melanoma.


Who are the most at risk of suffering from melanoma?

Certain things can increase your chances of developing melanoma, such as having lots of moles or freckles, pale skin, red or blonde hair and having a close family member who's had melanoma. More than a quarter of skin cancer cases are diagnosed in people under 50, which is earlier than most other types of cancer.

How can you prevent it?

Melanoma isn't always preventable, but you can reduce your chances of developing it by avoiding getting sunburned (even going pink in the sun). Always use adequate sun protection products while outdoors and dress sensibly while in the sun.




Shoulder problems

In practice, I notice that many people needlessly are suffering from shoulder pain. Often a diagnosis has been given as "Frozen Shoulder", "calcification" or "bursitis" and people often think that nothing can be done. Often this is NOT the case.

Shoulder problems are almost always caused by impingement of a structure in the shoulder itself between the shoulder head and roof (acromion). This could be a tendon or bursa. This is because in the shoulder mechanism there is little room for deviations because of lack of space. The cause of an impingement may be multiple minor trauma, such as a tennis player who overloads his shoulder. The most common cause is a movement disorder in the shoulder girdle.

The shoulder girdle consists of a number of bones and joints around the shoulder joint. These joints all work together to move the shoulder smoothly and to give it maximum range of movement. If one link of the chain in this motion is not moving properly, there will be interference with the movement pattern in the shoulder joint itself and impingement can occur.



Thus, a blockage in the neck or the first and second rib can cause serious complaints in the shoulder. Treatment of the shoulder itself gives no result because the cause is situated in a different area. There will certainly be an inflamed tendon or a bursitis because of the impingement, but only by removing the cause this problem can be resolved.

Most people complain about not being able to lift the arm or putting the hand on their back, not being able to fix the bra or cannot comb their hair. Often the pain in the shoulder radiates to the arm or gives pins and needles in the hand. If people have longstanding blocks in the shoulder girdle it is possible it show in the whole body posture due to compensation. This could start off back pain, pain between the shoulder blades and radiation to the hands.

By examining the entire movement chain, really from top to toe, the cause of these complaints are found and can be treated. Only examination on the shoulder itself or an X-ray picture is not enough to find the real cause of shoulder problems.

Red Cross launch project to tackle elderly abuse

THE Red Cross Community of Madrid has launched a new humanitarian project aimed at preventing elderly abuse and social problems suffered by the older soci-

Titled 'Good Treatment of the Elderly: Promotion of appropriate treatment and protection against abuse,' the project aims to promote a

positive framework for coexistence with older people as well as prevent, protect and support those who have suffered from, or could suffer from, any type of ill-treatment.

The Red Cross is carrying out support, training and awareness-raising activities, networking and coordinating with other social organisations and the authorities.

Since the start of the year the Red Cross in Madrid has already contacted 1,135 people over 65, vulnerable to abuse, through a telephone

campaign offering them safety and prevention advice. The next steps of the initiative will focus on sensitisation and information sessions given by the Spanish Red Cross, National Police and Guardia Civil to address all content related to the issue of violence against the elderly.

The Red Cross said the implementation of the project has been possible thanks to the collaboration agreement established with the Secretary of State for Security.

Every year, the Spanish Red Cross serves more than 15,000 elderly people throughout the Madrid region, offering them help, support and advice against loneliness and healthy liv-

Elderly abuse is not just a national issue. It is a social problem that affects the health and human rights of millions of older people around the world. According to the UN, the global population of people aged 60 and over will more than double, from 542 million in 1995 to around 1.2 billion in 2025. It is estimated that between 4 to 6 per cent of older people from all over the world have suffered some form of abuse and mistreatment.








When you travel, remember that a foreign country is not designed to make you comfortable. It is designed to make its own people comfortable. Clifton Fadiman





Aimed at real estate investors from across the world hoping to diversify their portfolios quickly, safely and effectively, the study suggested the Solna district in Stockholm offered the best investment prospects.

Second was Mendez Alvaro in Madrid, followed by central Stuttgart, Hauptbahnhof in Berlin, and Barcelona's Glories.

Mendez Alvaro was singled out for praise due to its close connections to the M-30 and extreme competitiveness. Investors averaged a profit of €192 per square metre last year, while average rents rose by 11.3 per cent compared to just 6.4 per cent

Low maintenance and hardy succulents

GRAEME TYRRELL

IF you love having a garden but have little free time to tend a conventional garden there is a solution.

A garden that, if you forget to water at times, will not have shrivelled up to a stick with dried leaves on it. is a great bonus for a busy person.

If the plants can spring back to life after neglect and produce spectacularly larger than average flowers for the size of the plants it can be amazing.

The plants themselves offer a range of colours that can be contrasted and blended to great effect in containers or the garden. Maybe it sounds too good to

It is possible with the naturally occurring desert and arid zone succulents. These amazing succulent plants have the ability to store water in their leaves, stems and/or roots. They also have an uncanny ability to draw moisture from morning dew and mist.

Succulents differ, in many classifications, from cactus in that they do not have spines or prickles, which makes gardening with them

A most popular succulent in Spain is the Jade Plant (Crassula ovata) which you will often find growing in containers to grand dimensions in historic courtyards all around Spain. Other traditional Spanish favourites include Kaffir Lily - Clivia Miniata and Housetree Leek - Aeonium Arboreum. These all make great outdoor containers plants or contrasting additions to the garden.

There is also a huge range of smaller or more compact succulents that be combined in containers to form a mini landscape. This includes the Paddle plant - Kalanchoe thyrsiflora, various Sedum species (such as Stone Crop, Burros Tail, Propeller

Sempervivum species (such as Cobweb and Red Houseleeks), Portulacaria species (such as Moss Ross, Purslane), Delosperma (Ice Plants) and many more.

These plants store water in their leaves.

They are a great way to have an indoor or balcony garden display.

That they store water means they have to be given water regularly to build up their reserves, but they will tolerate long periods without water if it is not too of ten as they need to become replenished. It is best to water them once the soil starts to dry out so as not to overwater.

The soil mix they grow in should not be too nutrient rich so a well composted soil mixture for pots or lightly improved garden soil for outdoors is sufficient.

If your water quality is tending towards hard water or very alkaline you will need to repot the plant every year or so to reduce the mineral build up. A way to prevent this build up is to use rain water to water your

Succulents need good light but not always direct sunlight so they can do well indoors close to a window or other light source.

DOGS have always been credited with the power of sensing supernatural influences, as well as being able to see ghosts, spirits, faeries or deities which are invisible to human eyes.

The legend of the black dog and others

the death-bringing hounds of Annwn; in ancient Greece the dogs were aware when Hecate was at a crossroads foretelling a death. Dogs are believed to be aware of the presence of ghosts, and their barking, whimpering or howling is said to be the first warning of supernatural occurrences.

In England, there are many instances of black dog ghosts which are said to haunt lanes, bridges, crossroads, footpaths and gates, particularly in Suffolk. Norfolk and the Isle of Man. Some black dogs are said to be unquiet ghosts of wicked

souls, but others are friendly guides and protectors to travellers. The Barguest of northern England could also appear as a pig or a goat, but was most commonly a huge black dog with large eyes and feet which left no prints.

Tales of packs of ghostly hounds have also been recorded all over Britain, often said to be heard howling as they pass by on stormy nights rather than actually seen. These hounds generally foretell death, (or at least disaster) if they are seen then the proper action is to drop face-down onto the ground to avoid spotting them.



When a dog howls in an otherwise silent night, it is said to be an omen of death or at least of misfortune. A howling dog outside the house of a sick per-

son was once thought to be an omen that they would die, especially if the dog was driven away and returned to howl again. A dog which gives a sinthen falls silent is said to be marking a death that has just occurred nearby.

In Scotland, a strange dog coming to the house is said to mean a new friendship; in England, to meet a spotted or black and white dog on your way to a business appointment is considered lucky. Additionally, three white dogs seen together are considered lucky in some areas; black dogs however are generally considered unlucky, especially if they cross a traveller's path or follow someone and refuse to be driven away.

RICHARD HAMMOND is pleased with his new 'Swiss Army knee' and has vowed to return to the motoring frontlines after a catastrophic crash that had Jeremy Clarkson worried his wingman was dead.

Grand Tour star Hammond underwent surgery after his electric Rimac Concept One supercar crashed and burst into flames during a speedy hill climb in Switzerland.

The 47-seven-year-old former Top Gear presenter - no stranger to hospital emergency units - posted photos online of his new metal pins, writing that, while a problem for airport security, his knee was at least rust proof.

The crash, described as 'serious' by Grand Tour executives, has forced a major delay in filming for the Ama-

JAGUAR is making waves with its latest foray into the competitive estate car market. Its muscular XF Sportbrake is based on the Saloon but is much larger and ideal for family buyers.

It might look sporty but it is deceptively powerful. The Sportbrake can tow up to 2,000kg and comes with a variety of engine choices, ranging from a 161HP 2.0 litre diesel to a vastly more powerful 3.0 litre V6 providing 296HP.

The V6 can reportedly reach 100kmph from a dead start in 6.6 seconds. Interior space is very generous, extending to 1,700 litres with all the seats down.

There is an enormous panoramic sunroof which can be opened and closed by hand gestures using state-ofthe-art sensors. Prices start at around €40.000.

ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

Honda Jazz EX Navi

HONDA'S Jazz hatchback has been around since 2001 and has built up a devoted following due to its easy drivability, practical layout and reliability.

However, that following has mainly consisted of older buyers, something that Honda aims to change - the latest thirdgeneration Jazz has sharper, more youthful styling and more connectivity features which should help expand sales to vounger drivers.

The current Jazz has a smoother appearance as well as a spacious and versatile cabin that rivals that of similar cars. Another pro is its Magic Seat system which offers various occupant and load configurations and delivers the largest interior space in the sector.

Prices start

at €15,866 (£13,995) for the standard S model. However, additional features such as alloy wheels, a touchscreen infotainment system, parking sensors and a sat-nav - all included in the EX Navi model - costs €19,347 (£17,065).

All Jazz models use a 1.3 litre 101hp petrol engine with a manual gearbox (a CVT version is available) with a 0-100kmph time of 11.5 seconds and a top speed of 190kmph (118mph). The engine has a fuel economy of 19.6kpl (55.4 mpg).

Similar cars may be slightly cheaper or faster but the Jazz counters that with more space. outstanding reliability and strong resale values.

The non-turbo

Jazz isn't quick off the mark, but most users will find its user-friendliness to be more important. It also offers good seating and visibility, and is agile both in traffic and when parking. Its revised suspension leads to a comfortable ride and nice handling.

Honda also paid attention to the Jazz's image, adding some sportier touches, revisiting the grille and headlights and giving the body a stronger presence.

The dashboard is laid out for ease of use, and the touchscreen is quick and easy to operate. The cabin is durable due to its

use of quality trim materials.

Another impressive aspect is its interior, which provides plenty of room for up to five adults, and big boot space: 1,314 litres compared to the previous 345. The rear seats can also lie flat for additional

Some might point out its single engine as a downside, but most drivers don't need a Diesel engine. Overall, the latest Jazz really impresses and while offering more youthful appeal, still retains all the core features loyal Honda buyers


