

#### Olive 'ebola' confirmed

## **Red alert!**

The Valencian Community's first known case of the Xvlella fastidiosa bacterium was detected in Guadalest to send the region's olive farmers into a panic.

The pathogen, which has wiped out hundreds of olive groves in Italy and the Balearics. was confirmed in Mallorca last November.

Losses to owners of olive, almond and citrus plantations can amount to millions as crops are lost and trees must be uprooted and destroyed to prevent the disease from spreading.

Elena Cebrian, who heads the regional government's Agriculgency meeting of the Vegetation Health committee after the bacterium was found in adult almond trees of the Marcona variety in Guadalest.

The seven-hectare plantation has been sealed off and contingency procedures applied.

"Eradication measures will be used," announced Cebrian who said that this would mean allocating the economic resources to compensate growers faced with an invasion of the bacterium.

The Guadalest grower suspected in December last year that his trees could be infected after he noticed an unexplained reduction in the crop.

Samples were taken but proved negative although a second analysis produced conflicting results.

In June the regional government's Vegetation Health Service found that of 17 samples taken from almond trees last June, 12 tested positive.

The aggressor has been held and charged for the crimes of animal abuse and beating a witness.

With over 70 million tourists visiting the country in 2016, Spain's airports are booming, as Madrid and Barcelona both ranked in the 2017 global Top 10 compiled by travel compensation experts AirHelp.

### **Flying** visit!

MADRID'S Adolfo Suarez Madrid-Barajas and Barcelona's El Prat airports placed seventh and eighth respectively in AirHelp's passenger satisfaction survey.

The former remains the most sizeable airport in Spain covering 3.050 hectares, and also includes the country's biggest terminal. The iconic T4 building was designed by Rogers Stirk Harbour and Partners and features a bamboo linear roof structure, plus a series of cutting-edge environmental measures designed to significantly reduce energy consumption.

In addition to trailing Madrid in the

MADRID-BARAJAS airport topped the 2016 passenger chart, after 50.4 million travellers passed through the hub, while 44.2 mil-

lion were handled by Barcelona-El Prat in sec-

Completing the top five were Palma de Mallorca with 26.2 million, Malaga-Costa del Sol with 16.7 million and Alicante-Elche with 12.3 million vovagers.

Among these, Madrid was the only airport to register annual growth of less than 10 per cent, with Malaga and Alicante both increasing by more than 15 per cent.

The Huesca-Pyrenees Airport saw the least traffic with just 95 passengers, a nosedive of 193.7 per cent since 2010. It was designed to carry snow-seekers to Pyrenean



ski resorts, but there are none within 100 kilometres.

#### Silly money

WITH a population of 46.5 million, Spain has more airports (52) than provinces (50).

Among these, 47 are managed by state air navigation manager AENA, but only six - Palma de Mallorca, Malaga, Gran Canaria, Alicante-Elche, Tenerife Sur, Gerona, Bilbao and Murcia - are profitable.

## Preyed on vulnerable pensioner

A 36-YEAR-OLD woman received an eight-month prison term for fleecing a relative with Alzheimer's.

She and her mother, aged 62, lived with 73-year-old Juan Bautista in his Riola (Valencia) home, with the younger woman eventually controlling his finances.

She persuaded him to make her his sole heir and by the time he died had appropriated € 105,000 of Juan's money, spending €5,115 on breast implants, according to his sister Teresa.

She was named his legal guardian in 2013 when it was obvious that he could no longer manage his own affairs.

"They gave him drops to make him sleep and then went out partying," said Teresa.

"The niece and her mother never had anything to do with Juan Bautista and then they turned up overnight. We finally got them out of his house with a court order but by then they had emptied his bank accounts," Teresa

It comes as witnesses reported the attacker fleeing in a high-end sports car and he remains at large, while the wounded man was taken away in an ambulance with one leg covered in blood.

The owner of the halal business is a cousin of Adil Anouar Merabet, an alleged jihadist, who was last year held for using social media to indoctrinate potential militant

At the time of his arrest in October, detectives raided the butcher's and seized a computer hard drive thought to contain evidence regarding the suspect's links to Daesh.

MEMBERS of a residents association representing people living in the busy Rincon de Loix area of Benidorm are becoming increasingly angry at the lack of control over excessive drunken behaviour of mostly British tourists in their local area.

Citizens action group Ciudanos de Benidorm are upset that their town is quickly becoming a destination of 'Uncontrolled disprepair and dirt,' with the Levante beach area as the epicentre of the drunken tourist prob-

Twelve months ago after a meeting with the group, Benidorm Council officials agreed to draft a plan to increase police controls, improve safety and introduce by-laws to curb drunkenness on the streets.

However, leader of Ciudanos, Juan Balestegui, speaking to Spanish press, said the current situation is lamentable.

"A year after the approval of the civic motion proposed by Ciudanos to bring laws against tourist drunkenness, nothing has been done about it." he said.

"We are forced to watch in amazement how children or old people run into sexual or pornographic scenes, with people wandering naked or in flimsy clothes.

"Every wild drunk is a drag to the recovery of quality tourism in Benidorm," said Balestegui.

The decision to draw up the draft plan was agreed last year, by all parties on the town council, therefore the leader of Ciudanos is calling for the plans, which include a greater police



RESIDENTS and visitors to Benidorm will now have to pay to park in zones of the town which, had previously offered free parking.

Areas affected are predominantly roads in the Rincon de Loix and La Cala de Benidorm zones of the town.

The charges will be levied during the peak three months of summer, when tourist numbers swell the population of the town significantly.

Parking charges within Benidorm, are levied by the concessionaire, Sice-Auplsa UTE, who won the contract to run the town's public parking in 2015.

Councilor for Mobility, Jose Ramon Gonzalez de Zarate, indicated that the concession was awarded in 2015 by the former government team.

He also explained that, although the current PP party voted against the proposals when they were introduced, "there is a contract in force and we have to comply with the measures."

Consequently, as they are the incumbent town council, they have a requirement to "inform citizens and visitors that, from last Saturday, there will be new regulated charging zones that were previously free."

The affected zones will return to their previous free status in September, at the end of the peak months.

De Zarate also revealed that the council are studying the possibility of converting current free, white parking zones within Benidorm to green zones.

Some of the proposals include charging visitors to park in the new zones, but allowing residents to apply for free parking permits.

## New arrivals as two new pairs of exotic birds land

TERRA NATURA has taken delivery of two new breeding pairs of South American birds.

The pairs of Urrucas and Teros, were kept in quarantine, while awaiting health checks from vets at the nature park, on the edge of Benidorm.

After receiving a clean bill of health, the birds were transferred to the 4,000 square metre aviary, which recreates their native South American habitat and will be-

The pair of Urrucas, also known as San Blas Jays (Cyanocorax sanblasianus). are endemic to Mexico.

With their distinctive black heads and blue bodies, these sociable magpies are considered, along with parrots, to be one of the most highly intelligent species in the bird world and can be spotted in trees at mid height in the aviary.

The Teros (Vanellus chilen-

sis) are two-year-old, south ern lapwings, found throughout South America, particularly Chile, Peru and Bolivia.

They are small, terrestrial, wading birds, happy to spend their time foraging on the floor of the aviary.

## Spanish man among 19 arrested in New York mafia crackdown

A SPANISH man is among 19 members of the Cosa Nostra, held in New York after a

major sting by United States law enforcement agencies and the Guardia Civil.



Most of those arrested belong to the Lucchese, one of the five main Sicilian mafia families operating in the Big Apple, while others are associated with the Bonnano and Genovese clans.

They face a raft of accusations including murder, conspiracy, extortion, assault, fraud, drug smuggling, money laundering and illegal gambling.

It comes as one of those arrested has been named as Carmelo Garcia Babarro, a 65-year-old Basque from Bilbao, who has US citizenship and occupied the position of associate, the highest possible ranking for a non-Italian, within the Bonnano group.

He was involved in a plot to transport large quantities of cocaine to Spain from Argentina dissolved in bottles of wine, working alongside Lucchese second-in-com-

mand, Tindaro Corso.

Babarro, who the Italians nicknamed 'Spanish Carmine,' made two trips to Alicante in 2016, during which he was tracked by Guardia Civil investigators following an FBI tipoff.

During the second of these, he stayed with Corso in the

Melia Hotel near Postiguet beach, the pair spending several days together with visits to Benidorm, cocktail bars and a local strip club.

Both men now face life imprisonment after two Guardia Civil officers crossed the Atlantic to assist in their arrests.

10% of all inheritances in Spain were renounced last year, with the number of people choosing not to accept their inheritance reaching the record figure of 38,791 in 2016. In 2007 it was 11,048.

The main reasons are the debts inherited along with the assets, and high levels of Spanish succession tax payable by the inheritors.

Spanish succession and gift tax is calculated on and paid by each recipient. It is due where the recipient is resident in Spain, or if any asset being inherited or gifted is a Spanish asset.

Under state rules the applicable rates range from 7.65% to 34%, and tax free personal reductions vary from €15,957 for descendants, ascendants and spouses, to €7,993 for siblings, nephews and nieces, step-children etc, to nil for everyone else. Multipliers can take the tax rate higher in some cases.

The autonomous communities are allowed to amend the rates, allowances and rules in their area, and some regions have higher tax burdens than others. You need to be clear on whether local or state rules apply to your heirs, and keep up-to-date as local rules can change

The region with the highest percentage of rejections in 2016 was Asturias with 16% and the lowest Aragón with 7%. Murcia had the 5th highest percentage with 12.5% (1,080 people renounced their inheritance compared to 208 in 2007) and Comunidad Valenciana was 11th with 8.7% (3,609 people

compared to 851 in 2007).

Spanish succession tax must be paid within six months of the date of death. This does not leave much time for heirs to sort out the paperwork and find the funds to pay the due tax.

When calculating the tax liability, debts are deductible from the amount inherited. However, the recipient also inherits the debt associated with the asset and is responsible for paying it off, as well as the tax bill on the balance. It is possible to accept an asset without having to pay creditors more than its value.

You can opt to renounce an inheritance in Spain, and avoid taking on the debt, but you have to renounce the whole inheritance.

If you simply renounce the inheritance, you are not liable to the succession tax. But if you renounce

it in favour of another person two tax liabilities arise - you still need to pay succession tax, and whoever you pass it to has to pay gift tax. This is why 'deed of variation' does not work in Spain. Let's say you leave a Spanish property equally to your children John and Mary. John decides to renounce his inheritance in favour of Mary. He will pay succession tax on his half, while Mary pays succession tax on her half, plus gift tax on the amount she receives from John.

Structure your assets to remove debt where possible, and take steps to lower succession tax for your heirs using compliant arrangements. There are more compliant opportunities to mitigate tax on investment capital than on property. Some people opt to downsize in their later years or sell and move into rental property so

they can invest the funds in taxefficient structures.

DENIA'S town fiestas begin this Saturday July 8 and as always bulls will be involved.

Accounts of bull-running and bullfighting in Denia go back to the 17th century although its Bous a la mar (Bulls in the sea) are comparatively recent and began when the port was built in the early 1920s.

Since then the running and grappling has taken place in an arena enclosed on three sides, with the harbour quay forming the fourth.

Males young and not-soyoung can pretend to be toreros for a few minutes as they dodge the bulls while enticing them as close as

possible to the edge. The bull ends up in the water

and so, very often, do they.

Habitually referred to as bulls, the animals supplied by cattle breeders are often cows. They and the bulls do the rounds of local fiestas and having learnt by experience can be astute and smarter than their assailants.

A handful of participants are gored or break bones each year, but what of the bulls hauled out of the sea with a rope attached to their

According to the animalprotection group PACMA, the already-frightened animals are panic-stricken as they try to stay afloat. They have drowned in the past or died of a stress-induced heart attack as happened in 2012, PACMA said.

Despite political changes at the town hall in 2015 Bous al mar were not tampered with. There were no

plans to eliminate them. pledged the then Fiestas councillor Eva Ronda. She belonged to the Compromis party, which opposes all public spectacles involving animals, but Ronda described bulls as the essence of the July fiestas. "We don't believe they are as illtreated as they are in other types of fiestas," she added.

Despite demonstrations from animal rights protesters, the town hall has kept its word and the Bous re-

For the members of the peñas who each try their luck down at the harbour, their activities do not end when the bulls are returned to the stock farms. Each of

the associations has its own temporary headquarters or caseta where they and their guests eat, drink and make merry when not grappling with the bulls.

There was consternation last year when coastal authority Costas refused permission to install the casetas at the harbour and they were relocated to a car park behind the Town Planning department.

It was too far from the action, peñas representatives complained, and although the Costas veto remains, this year's casetas have been set up nearer the port in the pedestrian area between the station and the Hotel Costa Blanca.

They can still be rowdy. explained Denia's current Fiestas councillor Oscar Mengual, although the caseta permits impose a 1am curfew instead of 4am.

The first Rous a la mar session starts at 7pm on Saturday and the bulls will first be run along Calle Marques de Campo.

July 10 to 14: Bous at 1pm and 7pm.





## Council asks when money will arrive

CALLOSA'S Council voted to ask the public Administrations for the funds promised for repairs to local infrastructure.

The motion, proposed by the PSOE socialist party, had the backing of the council's one UPyD councillor and another who is non-aligned, but the Partido Popular abstained.

Torrential rain and gales in December and January caused more than €9 million of damage in Callosa, leaving the agricultural town's irrigation systems and rural roads, as well as public and private buildings, in need of urgent repairs.

Six months later, the town hall has so far received only the €1.5 million that came from the Generalitat.

This was used to restore irrigation and water supply infrastructure, but repairs at the Font Major, now being carried out by publicly-owned Tragsa, will cost much more than the origi-

nal estimate. Damage was more far-reaching than initial estimates suggested, explained the local mayor, Josep Saval.

He has now approached the public Administrations once more and in particular, the Alicante Diputacion and national government. None of their promised help has materialised, Saval said, and it is still badlyneeded if solutions are to be found for damage suffered last December and again in January.

## Yacht club becalmed by increased fees



ALTEA: Club Nautico must pay more.

**UNCERTAINTY** surrounding their expired licences has been temporarily resolved, but there are still problems ahead for some yacht clubs.

In Altea, the Club Nautico has seen the annual dues it pays to the regional government, rise from  $\leq 50,000$  to  $\leq 350,000$ .

Even its renewed licence arrived "late and badly" according to the club. "It is so extremely provisional, that it hinders even minimal invest-

ment for the future, or repairs to installations that are obsolete after so many years," the club complained.

The present three-month authorisation must be renewed each month for a maximum of three years, pointed out Jose Roman Zurutuza, president of Altea's Club Nautico. "There is no guarantee of continuity," he said. "It is evident that what they really want is to choke us."

The club's committee in-

creased general tariffs and mooring fees by 10 per cent and reluctantly, decided to reduce some social activities including recruiting young people for the rowing club. The number of official competitions will also be reduced

The club is awaiting the results of a financial and nautical management study for 2018-2020 but Zurutuza warned the situation will bring new cut-

## Something fishy going

VILLAJOYOSA is uneasy about plans for another fish farm off Playa Centro, the town's most popular beach.

The present installation raises 400 tons of gilthead

bream, 700 tons of seabass and 400 tons of seatrout in 30 cages that are each 25 metres in diameter.

The company running the fish farm already has permission to add another 24 cages following a favourable report from the regional government. Now, according to a communique from the Partido Popular, the company wants to install another farm.

The project is far advanced, maintained Jaime Lloret, the PP's spokesman at the town

hall. "There is a great deal of confusion over this. An extension is one thing but a macro-farm opposite the Playa Centro is another."

Lloret went on to claim that the local mayor and the councillor for Commerce and Beaches knew about the fish farm at least six weeks ago after receiving a report from the regional government's Agriculture department.

Villajoyosa's mayor Andreu Verdu nevertheless said that the town hall would fight to change the location of another installation.

The town hall would not object to an extension but was opposed to a new farm near Playa Centro, he said, due to its impact on the protected Bou Ferrer wreck, a Roman cargo galley that sank there around 1AD

There was also concern regarding the visual impact of the fish farm and its environmental effect on the quality of the water and other species, Verdu added.

## Negligence and liability of financial advisers (for expatriates) in Spain



IN future no organised sporting events and trials may be held in Sierra Mariola national park between February and July.



SAN VICENTE Council does not intend to buy the abandoned cement works owned by the Mexican company Cemex.

"The town hall is not going to buy the land because Cemex merely wants to take the money and run," said Urban Development councillor Marilo Jorda.

The multinational, which intends to demolish the cement works that for decades was San Vicente's principal industry, has offered to sell the installation for €15 mil-

"We have no intention of getting a bank loan in order to buy the plant," Jorda added.

## Guardia Civil launch summer campaign for safer vacations

THE Guardia Civil has launched a campaign, with the title Ten Hints, which seeks to encourage responsible behaviour while tourists and residents enjoy their well-deserved vaca-

They have produced 17 short video clips which look at safety for individuals and regard for the environment in public and holiday areas.

ADVICE: Be careful on the water.

The advice has been placed in five different categories, all of which appear to be overlooked at times during the summer and when an ele-

ment of holiday 'excitement' makes people forget the obvious. In addition to the actual advice, suggestions are made as to the specialist divisions of the Guardia Civil, who are responsible for different areas of polic-

Firstly, the organisation reminds holidaymakers of the importance of protecting the envi-

ronment and animals. This includes not leaving dogs in hot cars without water and ventilation, individuals not throwing burning cigarette ends away (due to the strong possibility of starting a wildfire) and reminding all that rubbish of any type (including dog excrement) needs to be removed and disposed of properly.

The next topic covered is that of travel by road - which many people do - from holidaymakers travelling to second homes on the coast, to first time visitors driving hire cars.

The most important advice is never drive having taken alcohol or drugs, use seat belts at all times, respect the speed limits and never text or use a mobile phone when driving.

Don't make it easy for burglars, especially at home in this very hot weather, by leaving windows and doors open, (particularly when you are sleeping) and be alert to possible thefts on the streets, as mobile phones and bags can disappear in the blink of an eye.

Many tourists enjoy the outdoor life but too many go hiking or climbing with inadequate clothing, (especially footwear).

The advice is to always take sufficient liquid and wherever possible, a mobile phone in case of accidents.



The water can be dangerous

so don't drink and then go swimming at night and be careful when out with boats or hiring jet skis.

All of the hints are really quite obvious - but for some reason, when holidays come, common sense can be in short supply - so remember to be careful and save expense, discomfort and possible death as well as upset for all of the family, be sensible!

#### Taking preventive fire measures

ALL agricultural bonfires are banned in Alfaz until September.

Given the current high risk of woodland and wild-fire there can be no exceptions, announced the town hall's Environment and Urban Development departments.

Bonfire permits have been suspended, partly because not all wooded areas have been cleared or maintained, the town hall explained.


But the "excessive growth of vegetation" and very high temperatures have also contributed to the fire risk, the town hall explained.

The bonfire ban follows work carried out last month on clearing undergrowth, weeds, deadfalls and excess vegetation from paths, publicly-owned land and streambeds. Special attention was paid to zones much-used by pedestrians

as well as traffic.

The Valencia Region is currently on high alert for forest and wildfires and it is vital to anticipate problems and take appropriate action to prevent them, Environment department head Rocio Guijarro said in June.

## Man arrested on harassment allegations

## From 'rescued' to 'rescuer'

JULIAN PASCUAL - the Benitachell skipper of Ricardo Noveno that sank leaving himself and two friends stranded at sea for 18 hours - helped rescue five men last week, whose boat sank just like his did last month.

Moraira residents Iban Rafael Garcia, his son Jorge and brothers Guillermo, Pablo and Vicente set sail from the Club Nautico Moraira on Iban's 8.4 metre Sandy Hook last Thursday morning.

The group were heading out to the waters of Brumeo to fish for tuna as the boat began to sink some seven miles off the Cap de la Nau.

"In five minutes, the boat had sunk. We had just enough time to grab the life jackets and make two emergency calls," Guillermo told the Spanish press.

One of the emergency calls was to the Club Nautico Moraira.

The club immediately sent out a warning to its members, which was received by Julian Pascual as he sailed some 20 minutes away with four friends, also fishing for tuna.

Pulling in their lines,

Julian and his friends raced back to the aid of Sandy Hook shipwreckers and pulled them aboard.

Julian told the Spanish Press that the group were "very lucky" as the sea con-



ditions that day were much worse than the day Ricard Noveno sank.

Back on dry land, an ambulance was waiting, however none of the men suffered any injuries.







# The green card system includes 40+ countries

#### **International Insurance Card**

THE Green Card or International Insurance Card is an internationally recognised document that proves the holder has the minimum compulsory insurance required by law of the country visited. It helps facilitate the movement of their vehicle across international borders. It also guarantees that victims of road traffic accidents involving foreign registered vehicles are compensated in the country of the accident.

#### The Green Card System

The Green Card System comprises over 40 countries. National vehicle organisations within the Green Card System include the EU, the EEA, Switzerland, Russia and several countries around the Middle East and North Africa. However, a Green Card is not required to travel through the EEA, Andorra, Norway, Croatia and Switzerland.

#### The Green Card Bureau

Each Green Card Bureau is responsible for handling and guaranteeing the settling of claims arising from traffic accidents caused by visiting motorists.



side the European Community to one of the countries listed as requiring a Green Card, you will need to ask your insurance company to issue you a Green Card beforehand.

#### Road accident

If you're involved in a road traffic accident in a country requiring a Green Card, make sure the police are called to the scene of the accident. You will need a copy of the police report. If you don't understand what you're being told, request an interpreter.

We also advise that you contact your insurance company as soon as possible, whether you want to make a claim or not. Make notes of what happened. Take photographs of the accident, including plates of vehicles involved.

Exchange insurance details as you would in Spain. Take down the names and addresses of any witnesses. Never admit liability or apologise.


Amen brought the audience to their feet, which ended the evening and the choir's season on a high.





## Spanish Costas are busier, brighter...

# In living

Has life become better or worse on the Spanish Costas over the past 30 years? Armed with industrial quantities of Factor-50, author and former resident Terence Kennedy hit the carretera to find out.

IN the early 80's, hit by a super sales pitch so hard that if it had been the Titanic the iceberg would have sunk, we bought 'our dream home on the Costa,'

Back in the old days some property salesmen were so persistent that once they got a foot in the door, they would keep it there until gangrene almost set in.

We quickly realised - after buying while still a few years short of our 40th birthdays - that we had personally iumped the gun in our own life pattern, and in doing so only succeeded in bringing down the average expat age in our urbanización from 66 to 65.5.

So after completing a book project we eventually sold up and moved on.

Last month - three decades on - we returned to a noticeably busier, brighter and bronzer coast. But has life improved in southern Spain over all those years... for more than perhaps the cement manufacturers?

According to the famous French proverb, 'Plus ça change, plus c'est la même chose': the more things change, the more they stay the same.

Well hasta la vista baby; if it weren't for the street sign where we once called home, we felt we could have been on a different planet entirely.

Where our hills were alive with cicadas, now it's cement mixers and a toll road, and what we paid for our house now barely buys a bike-rack.

Where Brits formerly arrived at the airport laden with baked beans, Angel Delight and Marmite, those who still insist they won't eat 'foreign muck' can now buy their own imported choice items in even the smallest supermercados.

#### Tourism magnet

The statistics are truly astonishing: when we left 30 years ago, officially there were just 250,000 foreignborn people living in Spain.

Today, deep breath, it's 4.5 million, or some 10 per cent of the nation's entire population. The UK's Financial Times says Spain is the most favoured destination for other Europeans considering moving, chas-

# Si señor! A truly enviable lifestyle

THERE'S no denying the magnificent quality of life in southern Spain today, with more foreigners than ever able to enjoy it in an era of enormous mobility and cheap

It actually cost us on our visit more to park our car at our home airport Toulouse than the price of the flights from France.

And once settled into the holiday mode where else, for instance, could an everyday gal afford to buy a 'genuine' Gucci bag on the beachfront or if you prefer Louis Vuitton - with the label changed following a quick dab of glue.

"No problem señor!"

Where else can one live in a t-shirt and shorts for the majority of the year... and skin-cancer be damned?

Where else can you browse happily in fleets of shops called 'Toda Una Euro' and not actually find anything priced at a euro?

Where else can you brave the throngs of car-hire touts at the airport on arrival and be offered a week's rental for a breathtaking €1.80 (but then read the [very] fine-print: 'Mandatory insurance

Looking back to the 80's and crossing the dreaded coastal carretera used to be a dice with death. But now all you have to conquer is vertigo as you stride across the overpasses.

There are also many more shops of more variety including the top designer brand names as well as numerous Chinese bazaars that are the equivalent to the 'open-allhours' corner-stores in the

Further food for thought is provided with more restaurants and cafes of every tomer on steroids could han-

There's a lifestyle our forefathers could only dream of, in a country where many still believe it is one's birth-right to sleep for three hours in the afternoon and keep the children out long past midnight.


Equally intriguing - especially to anyone 'of a certain age' - is that in the main all bar and restaurant toilets can be used by the public, whether customers or not.

That dovetails perfectly with the first rule of becoming a senior citizen: never pass a public toilet...

ing what The Economist in London says is now the world's 10th-highest quality of life.

The British authorities estimate that the real population of Britpats living in Spain is far bigger than official Spanish figures suggest, at anywhere up to a million. And around 800,000 are permanent residents.

Are you as gobsmacked as I was to learn from the BBC that, contrary to popular belief, only 21.5 per cent are in fact over the age of 65?

Never mind the residents, how about the tourists? As the world's second-biggest tourism magnet af-

ter France, Spain has seen numbers rocket to a staggering 75 million annually. That's a whole heap of suntan lotion and Ambar Especial Lager, especially

But let's not wear any rose-tinted glasses. The Spanish coast in the 80's was already far from resembling that fabled and quaint little fishing port with a few bobbing boats that was Torremolinos,

when its first hotel opened on the Costa del Sol in 1960 and helped along with other key resorts of the time to unleash today's torrent of tourists.

Even by the time we hit the coast in the days when shoulder pads and big hair dos were in fashion, and when Wham, Donna Summers and Stevie Wonder were in the British pop charts, you had about as much chance of finding a summer car park space in the major resorts as you did of winning El

The song of the cement mixer was already pervasive, as Spanish speculators fell over each other to colonise vast tracts of coastline and were steadily forced further and further inland.

As land pressure increased, buying into a complex which 'overlooks the sea' could mean you'd need to drag your bucket and spade several kilometres each way to get there, up hills which would make ideal Land Rover testing ground.

To an outside eye at least, the worst of the excesses are now past though the development continues apace (and amazingly to this once-burned writer at least, the often-maligned timeshare is actually experiencing a resurgence).

Fewer deserted building skeletons bear witness to the at-times greed and hopeless optimism of the

#### Amazing beaches

EU rules have made it marginally less of a paperchase for expats to live here (but who knows for the Brexpats from 2019!).

Additionally much of the previous corruption has been stemmed as some of the worst offenders - including many mayors and compadres - languish under the state's hospitality.

Polish up the crystal-ball and what might the Costas look like in another 30 years, when the only way this observer might be around is in an urn?

Residents and visitors alike will certainly be fatter, echoing the global obesity trends which are already so flabbily obvious here. It will be (even) hotter thanks to climate change, with Mr Trump's petulant blocking antics a mere speed-bump in history.

Contrary to what you might expect, the currently at times choked summer highways will be quieter and the air will be healthier, once the dawning of the electric car truly has broken.

And keeping fit might mean power-gliding along the growing boardwalk networks along the Costas on walker-drones.

The amazing beaches will still be packed, the beach bars passed from generation to generation will no doubt still be doing a roaring trade, the UK's Daily Mail will still insist Germans are buying up 99year leases on beach deck chairs, and among more sensible Europeans, the Brits will still be burning to a bright-crimson crisp as further proof of constantly living the dream or of a great holiday visit.

# Sunny outlook to taxing thoughts

IN a globalising world Spain may cling on to its unique and familiar

But for how long?

One amazing change noted since the 80's is how industrious the otherwise laid-back Spanish appear to have become.

The Spanish actually spend more time working than many of their counterparts in Europe: 1,691 hours each year while the British put in 1,674 and the Germans just 1,371, says the OECD.

These days statistics also show that almost 60 per cent of Spaniards never have a siesta.

Yet some things have stayed stubbornly the same, including Spain's agonised relationship with

I found it almost comforting that, just as decades ago, one can still whizz along the carretera and see The Rock rising magnificently out of the mist, yet not encounter a single road-sign pointing to it until virtually within sight of its 'OTT-English' teashops and red telephone kiosks.

Nor are many expats (here's looking at you, the Brits) apparently any more fluent in the local language than they were 30 years

One quick survey recently showed that a third rarely or never meet Spanish people, apart from in shops and restaurants, and that 60 per cent speak little or no

Indeed, we met one Brit who is

endearingly restricted to ordering petrol in one of the three or four amounts he can actually ask for in

Even so he has comfortably lived life in Spain for more than 15 years after a near lifetime working in the Far and Middle East after heading abroad following the still clearly remembered UK miners' strikes and three-day

Having at times lived in tax-free states he wistfully points out the only thing nowadays easily obtainable untaxed in Spain - following the 2008 recession and a tightening of council belts - is the sun.

"But hey ho," he jokingly says.

"That's a small price to pay to feel the sun on my back for eight months of every year and to have London less than three hours away."



ABOUT THE AUTHOR IRISH journalist, author and addictive traveller Terence Kennedy lived briefly on the Spanish coast with his Dutch wife Elise in the early 1980s, after crossing some 76 countries in a







# Pound stumbles on GE2017 result



ONCE again the currency market has been rocked by UK political uncertainty, with the general election triggering notable shifts in the pound.


In the two weeks surrounding the result of GE2017, the GBP/EUR exchange rate shifted by more than €0.026. The euro's gains against the pound may have been more substantial if not for the European Central Bank's (ECB) latest interest rate decision.

#### What's been happening?

The year 2017 is certainly shaping up to be as full of twists and turns as 2016.

While election campaigning was suspended in the wake of horrific terror incidents in Manchester and London, the election was held on June 8 as planned. However, the outcome certainly wasn't what Theresa May had planned when she called for the election in April.

Initially the Conservatives were expected to walk the election, increasing their majority and

strengthening Prime Minister Theresa May's hand in Brexit negotiations in the process.

But the tide of public opinion turned, and in the end May failed to secure the 326 seats needed to form a majority government.

The result wasn't the continuation of the status quo some investors were hoping for and the pound fell by around 2 per cent as a result.

Although the GBP losses were nowhere near as dramatic as the ones recorded in the wake of Brexit, the UK's even more uncertain outlook did leave Sterling struggling despite Theresa May's swift decision to form a coalition with the Democratic Unionist Party (DUP).

The euro did come under some pressure of its own however as the European Central Bank (ECB) cut inflation forecasts. The reduction in expectations for inflation reduced the odds of the ECB opting to reduce quantitative easing or increase interest rates in the near future, limiting the euro's gains.

What do you need to look out for?

It will be interesting to see what happens to the pound as the dust settles over the next few

Although it was boosted by the fact that a higher-than-expected number of Bank of England policymakers had voted in favour of raising interest rates, it was also unsettled as the decision to Brexit negotiations are just beginning, and Theresa May had asserted her commitment to continuing with the discussions as part of a minority government.

If it appears that May has lost some of her sway in Brussels as a result of the election outcome, fears that the UK will emerge from Brexit with a bad deal could put the pound under further pressure.

However, some suggest that Theresa May has indeed altered her approach and intends to target a 'Soft Brexit,' which could help GBP climb

## WARNER BROS -v- WANDA GROUP Potential Clash of the Titans

A MAJOR disagreement has broken out between movie giant Warner Bros and Spanish cinema chain Cinesa over the inclusion of a trailer with Wonder

The Chinese-owned Cinesa is furious that the Digital Cinema Package file that was supplied to its 45 theatres included a trailer for King Arthur: The Legend of the Sword which is the latest 'blockbuster' from director Guy Ritchie, due for August release in Spain and forecast to lose € 130 million.

Warner's have taken this action to embed the trailer with the hugely successful Wonder Woman film to try to promote King Arthur and has refused to remove the trailer from the copies supplied to

In retaliation, Cinesa has either covered the screen with an apology for a technical problem or let the trailer run without sound or in some cases vision which spurred Warner Bros Spain to issue a tweet giving details of competitor cinemas which screen the trailer in full.

Cinesa which is owned by Chinese entertainment company, Wanda has deplored the decision to embed the trailer

and to tweet the detail of competing cinemas but has also gone on to publicly blame Warner Bros for making it impossible for Spanish audiences to benefit from special offers.

The reason for this, according to Cinesa is the fact that rather than take a percentage of the ticket sales for its movies it instead charges a fixed fee for the screening of films, meaning that unless any cinema is prepared to reduce profits. then no special offers can be made.

Whilst looking at this dispute from a purely national perspective, with just 45 Cinesa cinemas in Spain, Warner Bros is hardly likely to be particularly worried.

However in China, Wanda owns 497 cinemas and 3.947 screens, 661 cinemas and 8,200 screens in the USA and 244 cinemas with 2.200 screens across Europe and this could become a major battle between two giant organisations, especially as the Chinese corporation is also a major producer of films.

Time will tell whether this spat becomes a major war or simply disappears with both sides claiming the moral high

#### Germany calling Catalan unemployed

AS the economy in Germany continues to boom, there is a skills shortage which has led companies to recruit workers from Catalonia.

The state of Baden-Württemberg is acutely aware of the lack of young skilled technicians and engineers and has entered into an agreement with the Catalonian government to train youngsters and then offer them jobs.

This is quite a challenge for technicians as they need to be able to speak good German. but the Goethe Institute in Barcelona has been assisting with intensive language courses and provided that applicants accept that the weather in Germany can be less clement than that of Spain, this could be a way forward for the well-educated yet unemployed.

Salaries and living standards are good and it is only a 12hour drive or two-hour flight from Stuttgart to Barcelona.

# PSOE abstain on CETA vote

AFTER initially indicating that it would vote in favour of the EU-Canada Trade Treaty (CETA), the PSOE Party decided to abstain.

This decision upset the minority ruling PP government as Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy accused the main opposition of potentially making Spain a laughing stock amongst its colleague states in the European Union.

In the event, when the vote was held in the lower house of the Spanish Parliament, it went through with 179 votes in favour and 79 against, so the abstention of the 81 PSOE MPs effectively made no difference.

The upper house is dominated by PP senators, so its vote is a foregone conclusion.

The European Union voted to enter into this agreement which would make trade between the EU and Canada easier and with less restrictions, but each member state must approve the agreement and then a vote in the European Parliament must ratify the decision before the agreement can enter into

# Young people earn less than those they replace

THERE have been winners and losers in the growth of employment in Spain with workers under 40 seeing a real drop in the value of wages.

According to the INE report, those who are older and have greater experience are in the main valued by employers whilst vounger people are prepared to take lower wages initially in order to obtain work and to start their careers.

#### ITV tests to become stricter

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



THE ITV test, the Spanish equivalent of the MOT, is set to become much stricter from 2018. Elements being toughened up in particular is the area of pollutant emissions as well as a large part of the vehicle's security systems that are controlled electronically.

The process to enforce the tests began almost three years ago with the publication of a European directive. The Spanish government hopes to have passed the legislation via Royal Decree before this summer to come into force in 2018. The process has been accelerated and reinforced as a result of the so-called 'dieselgate' surrounding Volkswagen and the resultant doubts that arose over diesel emissions.

Although the changes, aimed at improving inspections of emissions, still have to overcome pitfalls, as they were originally not looking at the control of nitrogen oxide (NOx) emitted by cars, which is classed as one of the worst air pollutants and which was the main focus of the Volkswagen emissions violations.

Now the CITA, an international working group that works on improving vehicle inspections, has developed its own protocol to adequately measure the NOx as well as detect possible fraud or manipulation in a vehicle's readings. Field tests are expected to be completed next month and by the end of the year, along with a manual with the maximum NOx limits, the protocols for its measurement and the procedures to verify that anti-pollution devices have not been manipulated, should be in place. With this, Luis Gutierrez, president of the association Aeca-ITV, said the goal of the industry would be to incorporate these protocols "as soon as possible" across ITV stations.

In 2018 it is also expected for ITV tests to greater assess security systems under electronic control such as airbags and seatbelt pre-tensioners. However, to do this, access to the vehicle's switchboard would be needed and information about the systems shared, which some say will mean an increase in ITV fees.

#### Inheritance tax in Mallorca?

MY wife and I are residents in Mallorca and I want to ask about inheritance tax.

We are in our 70s and we have a finca here worth about €500,000, and life insurance for €20,000 each. We would like an idea of what the survivor would have to pay. Many years ago we made Spanish wills.

M.B. (Mallorca)

EACH individual Autonomous Region of Spain has control over inheritance tax. In the Balearics, as of January 1, 2016, rates have been lowered. When a resident bequeaths the principal residence to a spouse, it is free of tax up to €180,000. If your house is valued at

€500,000 and your wife inherits your half, this is €250,000. Take away  $\in$  180,000 and you have a tax base of  $\in$  70,000. A spouse has a further deduction of  $\in 25,000$ ,

bringing the base down to €50.000. The Balearics Region now applies a tax rate of one per cent to estates up to  $\in$  700,000. This gives you a tax of  $\in$  500. Whoops, we forgot the insurance policy. The first  $\in 12,000 \text{ of your } \in 20,000$ is tax exempt, so you must pay one per cent of  $\in 8,000, or \in 80, more.$





# **Naturist Beaches in Spain**

#### 1. Costa Natura Nudist Resort, Estepona, Costa del Sol


# Replacement metal hips may cause problems according to UK agency

# HOW much alcohol can a person safely have?

The amount can vary depending on the person. Their age, weight and any pre-existing conditions alongside the situation it is consumed in (with or without food) and the timeframe of the activity (whether it's quickly in a short period of time, or slowly throughout the day).

In general, it is recommended not to go over 30 grams of alcohol a day for men and 20 grams for women. The way to calculate it is simple. You multiply the amount of alcohol consumed in millilitres by the percentage of alcohol in the drink and times 0.8 and finally divide by 100. This way you can tell how much alcohol you are consuming per drink.

# What are the short term risks of drinking too much alcohol?

Drinking too much alcohol can cause neuropsychiatric disorders which can alter mood and behaviour, cause blackouts and in serious cases lead to comas. It can also seriously affect a person's kidneys and liver.

## What are the long term risks?

In the long term alcohol can affect almost any part of the body. The organ most usually affected by alcohol is the liver, causing cirrhosis.

However the heart, brain, kidneys and nerves can all be severely damaged by the abuse of alcohol and cease to function correctly.

# How can you tell you are drinking too much alcohol?

Although this will vary from person to person, it can be potentially dangerous to exceed 30 grams of alcohol in men and 20 in women. However if you find yourself needing a drink first thing in the morning to steady your nerves or get rid of a hangover, have been criticised by other people for your drinking or feel guilty or bad about your drinking; you may want to consider cutting down on alcoholic drinks.

# Is binge drinking more dangerous than drinking regularly?

The high consumption of alcohol in a short space of time is, as mentioned previously, quite dangerous and potentially life-threatening. However, drinking responsibly without exceeding the limits mentioned above does not necessarily entail high risks. On the contrary, moderate, or even daily consumption of for example half a litre of beer or two glasses of red wine can be beneficial. Drinking high percentage spirits or beverages sporadically is also not considered dangerous.

Are there cancer-causing toxins in sunscreen?

PROTECT, protect, protect. It's drilled into us, particularly at this time of year, but are we doing more harm than good in protecting our skin from the sun with sun-

Researchers say they believe that a compound called avobenzone, common in sunscreen as it blocks the UV rays and helps prevents skin damage, could form cancer-causing toxins when it is exposed to a mixture of sun and chlorinated water in swimming pools.

Experts from the Lomonosov Moscow State University said that based on their experiments they concluded that a generally safe compound transforms in the water and forms more dangerous products with acetyl benzenes and phenols, being quite toxic.

Health experts have urged people not to have a knee jerk reaction and stop using sunscreen altogether, but welcome continued studies on the chemicals we put on

The number of hot dogs consumed during the peak season in the US - from Memorial Day to Labour Day - which adds up to 818 every second.

A LOOMING battle is pitting Spanish professionals and families eager to rent properties against the growing number of tourists holidaying in apartments rather than hotels.

A recent survey found that more than half of people searching for a rental home in Spain in the past year believe the tourist trade is directly responsible for sharply rising prices.

The majority opinion conflicts with data from Fotocasa, a major property portal, which suggests the tourist rental trade influences price rises but is far from the main cause. Market tensions and wider economic shifts are behind the startling 10.5 per cent rental price rises seen across Spain in 2016 according to their analysis.

But that does little to affect perceptions on the ground. The survey found that 75 per cent of would-be renters believe renting to tourists is economically advantageous for landlords. Six out of 10 want tougher restrictions on the tourist rental trade, including higher taxes.

# Ienants versus tourists

Solutions are already being posited on a local level. In Madrid plans to allow neighbourhood communities to vote

on whether homeowners should be allowed to rent properties to tourists are in motion.

If the majority of residents

are opposed then no property owner within that territory will be allowed to advertise tourists. Compromises, such as price fixing or type of tourist rental, could also be imposed.

Though rents have shot up

across Spain in the past year, only in six regional capitals are they higher than before the crisis. With the exception of Barcelona, Madrid, Palma, Las Palmas, San Sebastian and Girona, major Spanish cities actually have lower rents than in 2007.

# Sweet basil - the king of herbs



IF you have a Mediterranean garden of any size or even just space for a few pot plants, then you should seriously consider growing a Basil plant (Ocimum basilicum).

It is one of the most popular herbal plants in the Mediterranean for a number of reasons. There is a large number of Basil type species and varieties with a range of uses, forms and flavours from all around the world.

Its use dates back thousands of years with its earliest reference in Indian literature where the Indian Sacred Basil is recognised as holy plant. The stem is used to make the prayer beads for the reciting of mantras on a mala in a similar way to the rosary. It is widely grown in temples and Indian home gardens for its various benefits. It is not widely used in Indian cuisine but is popular in Thai cooking.

The most popular species in the Mediterranean however is the Sweet Basil. Spanish. Italian and Greek cooking would not be the same without Sweet Basil. Having a plant allows you to add

fresh leaves to garnish and flavour a wide range of recipes to give them a Mediterranean flavour. The leaves can be dried to bring out more flavours before adding to recipes or used as a herbal tea between meals.

Basil is also used to make essential oils with many

benefits and for flavouring

The Spanish have a tradition of placing the small leaved Basil (Albahaca) on window sills to keep away flys and mosquitoes. The leaves can also be used to make a natural insect repellant just by using leaves prepared with water and alcohol.

Placing leaves in the bath will make it more refreshing and may relieve mental fatigue. A few leaves can also be placed in a glass of wine and left to steep for a while to add more flavour to the

Basil has been used in herbal and ayervedic medicine for a wide range of ben-

Just having a plant in the garden, on the balcony or window sill adds aroma to the environment that is refreshing and wholesome. In the garden they can used as

Plants are readily available in nurseries or supermarkets.

border plants that will make a stroll through the garden more worthwhile.

It is easy to grow but is generally an annual unless in tropical like conditions with year round warmth. It grows quickly from spring to autumn in the Mediterranean. It can be grown from seed in a well drained rich soil in a position with plenty of sunlight to partial shade.

Plants are readily available in plant nurseries or even some supermarkets. A range of interestingly different varieties are available from seed suppliers.

Basil will need the soil to be kept moist but not waterlogged to do best.

The name Basil is derived from Greek origin meaning Royal or Kingly plant. It is sometimes known as Saint-Joseph's-wort. Wort meaning a plant that has been recognised as food or medicinally beneficial.

There is little doubt that it is the King of Herbs.

# Monthly gardening tasks - July



AFTER a sweltering June, weather forecasts, unexpectedly, now indicate that we may have at least two weeks of cooler weather and a few timely thunderstorms to replenish garden water tables.

But we will still need to be daily vigilant as to the survival state of flowering plants, recently planted shrubs and vegetables and water more frequently and deeply where and when required. The compost heap would also benefit from a soaking preferably after a

Apart from the danger of plants drying out there are three other frequently occurring problems to watch out for during July.

Insect attacks of fruit trees. As soon as they occur spray trees with neem or garlic solutions. If some ends of branches are heavily infested prune off and


Honey fungus attacks of pip and stone fruit trees. Honey fungus appears as drips or lumps of a orangey gluey resin emerging from branches or trunks or covering the clumps of leaves. The easiest ecological natural treatment is a spray or painting of affected areas with propolis solutions or painting of affected areas with neat propolis. Heavily affected and dving wood is often best cut out and burned.

Mildew attacks of fruit vegetables, including courgettes, squash, tomatoes, peppers and auber-gines. The easiest treatment is a light dusting of plants with yellow sulphur powder as a preventive treatment or as soon as a problem rears its

If weeds were cleared before or during June these should cause few problems during July but the rampant growth of climbers will need controlling to prevent other plants from being smothered, pathways from being partially blocked and terraces from becoming partially unusable.

Summer salad crops

Provided summer salad crops, especially cut and come again leaf and herb crops such as basil, are located in natural shade for the hottest parts of the day or sheltered with a woven plastic shade they can be nursed through July provided they are watered every day and stems showing



signs of starting to go to seed are eaten first or used for omelettes or soups.

I have now relocated my salad tub garden to make it look better and provide a surround for a boules court for plastic or metal boules depending on ages and fitness of potential players.

Today I was able to prepare a salad with 30 ingredients from the tubs or nearby raised beds.



ers. Great satisfaction can be derived from training a dog. It is not time consuming and most training can be done whilst exercising the dog.

If you do not have the time to exercise your dog then you should not keep a dog.

Training classes undoubtedly contribute to better training of dogs. One great advantage of classes is that they accustom the puppy or young dog to meeting other dogs and owners get an opportunity to meet people with a common interest and often a common problem.

Many people are regarded as

experts when they have trained a dog of one breed to a very high standard. Faced with a difficult dog they would not know where to start. Training methods vary just as much as dogs and their owners do. There are however, many accepted exercises that form a useful basis for most dogs and most owners.

Many people do not fully realise their responsibilities and try very hard to comply and end up with a dog that will bite, causes a road accident, etc. why?

Few owners understand canine mentality.

Owners must not regard dogs as 'almost human' this is an insult to our canine friend. Dog has become man's best friend. not because he is 'almost human' but because he can do so many things that we cannot do. In this day and age we still do not know how dogs do some of these things, such as detecting mines and drugs. Intelligence is not an important factor in a dog's make up.

It is a fact that nearly all problem dogs are very intelligent and certainly a fact that few dog owners understand canine instincts and their importance in the man/dog relationship.

Dogs and indeed all animals learn by association of ideas. animals do not reason at all, they simply react to what is happening and do not think what has happened or is about to happen. It is believed that they do sometimes work out a problem for themselves.

All training should be based on the assumption that the dog does not reason and that he learnt by association of ideas.

For training purposes we try to create associations we want and avoid those we do not want, by what is known as correction and reward. Correction does not mean beating the dog or jerking him on a choke chain it means any act, which forces the dog to obey, like pushing him into the sit position.

Many dog owners will never know or have any idea of the pleasure they are losing in not having a dog that is trained to be a faithful companion and





Volvo has admitted that, 18 months into its Australianbased kangaroo detection and collision avoidance research, they still can't guarantee that self-driving cars won't wallop a wallaby.

Onboard tech is confused by the hopping antics of kangaroos which makes them seem smaller when in mid-air. The emergency brake and steer function isn't applied until the animal lands and it is too late.

Volvo hopes to safeguard all its latest models against kangaroo collisions. There are an estimated 20,000 each year in Australia with tens of millions in insurance claims.

# **SEAT Leon Xcellence Technology**

THE SEAT Leon is a smart, sporty hatchback based on the architecture of its stablemate the VW Golf, and that is a very good starting point.

The Golf is noted for its poised and agile chassis and sets class standards for buildintegrity. SEAT takes those credentials and adds some stylish Spanish flair with a distinctly sporting edge.

The Leon range includes a racy SC coupe and a practical estate but the big-seller is the five-door hatch, which starts at  $\in$  19,759 (£17,455). There is a wide choice of engines -1.0 to 1.8 litre petrol units

and 1.6 and 2.0 litre diesels.

My test model was a 2.0 litre 148 hp diesel in upper range Xcellence Technology trim and priced at €26,975 (£23,830). Standard kit is extensive and highlights include auto lights and wipers, keyless entry, alloy wheels, 8-inch touchscreen with satnav, DAB radio/CD, and connectivity features, climate and cruise control, rear parking sensors and useful smartphone charger pad.

The Leon was revamped last year and has a subtle new look, but its major plus-point is its superb driving dynam-

ics. It is quick, responsive, nimble, composed and has outstanding handling - an overall package very hard to beat in the sector.

The 2.0 litre diesel in the test model delivered its power smoothly and eagerly, and the six-speed gearshift was slick and precise, underlined by a 0-100 kph time of just 8.4 seconds and top speed of 215 kph (134 mph).


However, fuel economy is still exceptionally good -25.6 kpl (72.4 mpg).


The Leon has a sleek exterior which does pull some admiring glances and the revised cabin, which at a glance appears unexception-

about as good as you can get, lots of seat and steering adjustment and excellent allround visibility.

Cabin space is very good, with generous room for four adults, wide rear doors for easy access and a big boot -380 litres expandable to 1,210 litres with the rear seats folded. And - rare in this sector - they do fold flat which aids loading, especially for larger items.

SEAT's reputation for producing value for money models with a sporty persona is well-established and this latest Leon dutifully upholds that with its engaging driving feel and charismatic presence.


