Language plan to go ahead Final straw

Vicent Marza has sparked new outrage among parents.

The Education councillor for the Valencian region apparently plans to push ahead with the controversial plurlingüismo plan to increase the amount of the Valenciana language spoken in schools despite strong opposition.

"He doesn't care," said Kristin Tennebø, a Norwegian mum of three who represents the Idiomas y Educacion campaign group.

It comes after the regional court of justice temporarily suspended the scheme at the beginning of June, while the national Education Ministry has also waded in, referring to it as "a source of discrimination in the exercise of the right to education."

Alicante Provincial Council has also offered its support and recently lodged an appeal with the regional authority.

Under the proposed new rules, the number of classes taught in Spanish will gradually be reduced, although there are three different levels - basic, intermediate and advanced - with schools required to choose one depending on their needs.

At basic level Spanish remains the standard language, at intermediate there is supposed to be an even split between Spanish and Valenciana, while at advanced the latter becomes the principle lan-

As reported in the Euro Weekly

News issue 1663, outraged parents claim that not all schools have been given an option, with many having the advanced level "forced" onto them.

Official State Visit underway

Dueens of hearts

QUEEN LETIZIA and Queen Elizabeth have been wowing fans during the official State Visit of the Spanish royals, which ends tomorrow (Friday).

The newest consort to a European monarch and the longestserving British sovereign are clearly enjoying the first official trip by the Spanish Royals for over 30 years, which is taking place at the third time of asking after two earlier cancellations.

It comes as the glamorous exjournalist and husband King Felipe VI prepare to visit Westminster Abbey accompanied by Prince Harry today, where they will lay a wreath at the Grave of the Unknown Warrior before touring the Abbey with the Dean.

The king will also be joined by Prince Andrew, Duke of York, at

a meeting between Spanish and British business leaders, before enjoying dinner with Lord Mayor of the City of London, Andrew

After tomorrow's official farewell by Queen Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh, Felipe and Letizia will visit researchers at the Francis Crick Institute, a biological research institute, before heading to Oxford University to view Spanish artefacts.

The regal couple arrived at Luton airport last Tuesday, where they were greeted by Lord-in-Waiting Viscount Brookeborough, before being collected from their hotel by Prince Charles and the Duchess of Cornwall yesterday morning.

This was followed by a Ceremonial Welcome with the Queen and Prince Phillip at Horse Guards Parade and private lunch at Buckingham Palace before tea at Clarence House, but the main event of the day was the glittering state gala dinner at which both the British and Spanish rulers made speeches.

In particular, reports in the Spanish media have highlighted the trip as an opportunity to lay the groundwork for bilateral relations between the two countries in the wake of Brexit.

There are reportedly three main themes that the royals hope to tackle during the course of the visit, with the futures of expatriates in both countries top of the list, closely followed by business and future relations.

It comes after British Ambassador to Spain, Simon Manley, confirmed prior to the visit that the UK's approach to talks will focus on education, trade and science.





Change of tack

THE Generalitat agreed to revise the dues paid by yacht clubs and ports whose concessions have now expired. These cannot be definitively renewed until the regional government, which controls ports, harbours and marinas, introduces fresh legislation which initially included a steep price hike. However, the 11 clubs and two ports in the region's three provinces, can continue to operate by renewing their concession on a temporary basis after all submitted complaints.

A CYCLIST run over between Albal and Catarroja, Valencia, has launched an appeal to find the driver who caused the accident. He was hit when a car overtook him only 10 metres from the cycle lane that he was making for. Although he lay unconscious on the ground the motorist fled the scene instead of stopping to help.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...20

Spain is the largest olive oil producer in the world, accounting for 44 per cent of the world's annual supply, and the country's love affair with the diminutive fruit shows no sign of decline despite new challenges.

Liquid gold

WITH an estimated 340 million olive trees, Spain produces around 1.2 million tonnes of olive oil per year, enough to fill 400 Olympic swimming pools.

About 45 per cent of the country's olive oil is produced in the Andalucian province of Jaen, where olive plantations occupy 590,000 hectares including 66 million trees.

These account for a fifth of the global olive oil supply, with the region producing more than the entire country of Italy, the world's second-largest manufacturer.

Olive trees are said to have been introduced to Spain by the Phoenicians almost 3,000 years ago, but it was the Romans who started large-scale production, with the Moors later introducing improved growing methods.

Fruity facts

- There are over 100 varieties of olive grown in Spain, but only 24 are regularly used to make oil.
- Olive trees live on average for 3-600 years, with some of the world's oldest examples found in Spain. One individual in Tarragona is said to be over 2,000 years old
- Despite leading the global production ranking, Spain with 11.3 kilos is runner-up to Greece (12.8 kilos) in terms of per capita consumption.
- The Spanish word for oil, aceite, is derived from the Arabic word al-zait, which literally translates as
- There are four types of virgin olive oil, extra virgin, virgin, ordinary virgin and lampante, all of which differ in acidity with extra virgin, the highest grade, having the least.

CLIMATE change and growing global demand are putting the squeeze on the industry, but the main threat to the future of Spanish olives may be microscopic.

Dry conditions ravaging the country severely impacted production in 2016, with global supplies down by 11 per cent, and this year's harvest - which takes place in October and November - is expected

An even bigger threat may be the destructive bacterium Xvlella fastidiosa, which has been described as 'olive ebola' after devastating around a million trees in Italy and appearing in Mallorca last year.

The plague was last month detected in mainland Spain for the first time after it was found to have infected almond trees in Guadalest, Alicante, sparking widespread fears.

Swimmer loses rag over red flag

A CAMPELLO man, aged 53, was arrested after confronting two Local Police officers on Carrer la Mar beach.

Earlier he had refused to leave the sea after lifeguards warned him that swimming was banned as the red flag was flying. Instead he remained in the water, clinging to a buoy as he mocked and insulted the lifeguards, shouting that he would not allow them to tell him what to do.

At one stage he removed his swimming trunks and put them on his head, witnesses said.

When he finally returned to the shore he tried unsuccessfully to evade two police officers who were waiting for him. Refusing to identify himself, and claiming he lived on Tabarca Island, he kicked, head-butted and tried to bite the policemen even after he was handcuffed.

He spent the night in the cells at Campello's Guardia Civil post and was brought up before a Alicante City judge the next day. The man had an alcohol problem, family members explained the next day: "When he drinks he loses his head."





Big brother banished

FOLLOWING union complaints, Elda Town Hall was ordered to remove security cameras from several offices.

The government's Work Inspection department upheld the CCOO union's claim that the CCTV cameras were installed without informing employees beforehand, as required by law.

"Quite by chance, three of those filmed were three CCOO delegates," the union pointed out.

Work Inspection rejected the town hall's claim that the cameras were installed to avoid theft or damage to computer equipment as the decision did not arise from a "serious, solid and corroborated suspicion."

The tribunal also made the point that there was a difference between installing cameras at entrances or exits to much-transited offices and rooms and "permanently and directly recording workers' faces."

The cameras have now been removed, the town hall's Human Resources department said, but continued to insist that they were not installed to spy on employees but to safeguard computer equipment.

The properties have been specially selected for having Arab roof tile.





PENSIONERS: Keep the low season ticking over.

50 cents and in the red

THE Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs has agreed to increase the amount that hoteliers receive for Imserso clients.

The subsidised pensioners' holidays keep Costa Blanca hotels ticking over but they do not break even, say hoteliers who are pushing for a daily rate of €25 per person.

The ministry has now agreed to a 50-cent increase from a

daily ≤ 21 to ≤ 21.50 , meaning they will still run at a loss during the low season, the hotel owners maintained.

Meanwhile, Costa Blanca hotels are working out the basis for a new agreement with the ministry which should be ready by the end of the year. They intend to ask €25 per person per day while suggesting that Imserso places left vacant in other parts of Spain could be diverted to Alicante Province.

Costa Blanca resorts account for 80 per cent of the Valencian Community's 180,000 Imserso places but these fall short of demand, hoteliers claim.

The province's hotels also hope to persuade the government to revert to the annual €100 million that was allocated to the programme in 2007.



Raking over the region's fires

INVESTIGATING a forest fire is more complex than unravelling a crime, according to the Guardia Civil's nature protection unit Seprona.

But establishing whether a fire is deliberate, the result of negligence or produced by natural causes is less complicated, officers said

Figures from the Valencia region's Environment department provided by forest rangers and the Guardia Civil show that more than 2,000 fires - either deliberate or the result of negligence - destroyed 19,311 hectares of land between 2001 and 2015.

In 70 per cent of cases, no



reasons were found for the 1,400 fires that destroyed 14,000 hectares of land.

Of the remaining 600, firebugs with psychological problems were responsible for 174 fires that burnt more than 1,100 hectares of land.

Sixty-four fires that consumed another 500 hectares began when bonfires lit by growers and farmers got out of

hand and spread to woodland and scrub.

On 61 occasions, land deliberately burnt by cattle farmers, shepherds and goatherds to regenerate pastures resulted in the loss of 273 hectares.

There were 38 cases of outright vandalism during this 14year period and Environment figures show they destroyed 24 hectares

Valencian Community hunters started 30 fires "to facilitate their activities" while 14 fires were started "in rejection of protected natural spaces," the Generalitat said.

Kirsty Maxwell's mother speaks out

THE mother of tragic Scot Kirsty Maxwell has spoken out for the first time since her daughter's unexplained death.

Kirsty's family flew to Benidorm after the 27-yearold's fall from a 10th floor balcony at the Payma Apartments on April 29.

Hundreds of posters and leaflets were distributed to those living in the area while the family also visited a variety of people and organisations including Victim Support.

Speaking for the first time to

the Scottish press, Kirsty's mother Denise said the family are returning to Scotland with renewed hope but reiterated she will return to Spain if the case is not

"We have been putting leaflets around the pubs.

"A lot of the people are Scottish and Spanish. They all know about it.

"They all know Kirsty's face from the picture.

"We would like to think they would get in touch."

During their return to Benidorm, the family tried to find the person who took a photograph of her body lying next to a swimming pool.

Consultant David Swindle said: "It is a devastating thing for the family to see. This could be something that leads to more information that helps gets the truth.

"We are not satisfied that the police have interviewed everyone that stayed in these apartments and that is a big issue."

Man dies on the beach

A SEVENTY-FIVE-YEAR-OLD man died after getting into difficulties while swimming in the sea off Benidorm's Poniente beach last Wednesday.

The incident occurred at around 7.30pm as bathers alerted a lifeguard to the man's predicament.

The lifeguard pulled the unconscious body ashore and immediately began to attempt to resuscitate the man, which continued after the emergency services arrived at the scene.

After attempts to revive the body for an hour failed, the man was pronounced dead at around

He was a resident of Benidorm and whilst the autopsy results have not yet been released, the police revealed he may have drowned after suffering a heart attack whilst swimming.

Mountain village aims high

ALCOLEJA will take its plans for the disused Aitana air base to Brussels.

The mountain village adjoining the base hopes to turn the disused installation into a € 10 million tourism and leisure complex.

Originally built as a US Air Force base and radar station in 1957, it was handed over to Spain in 1968.

Ever since the Spanish Air Force decided 11 years ago to

the town hall at Alcoleja (population 194) has pressured for the base to be put to public use.

Last year the Alicante Province Diputacion - similar to a county council - expressed support for the project and is prepared to assist Alcoleja's plans for restoring the base.

The village, backed by neighbouring towns and villages, intends to approach the European Union for help in executing plans drafted by the Alcoy campus of Valencia's Polytechnic University

These envisage a 78-room hotel, a campsite and a mountain refuge, explained Alcoleja's mayor Francisco Fenollar.

The town hall will now apply for EU funds for which it needs local backing as the type of subsidy that Alcoleja is seeking are awarded in areas with a total population of more than 50,000 inhabitants.





Mortgage with a floor, expense or multicurrency clause? The new courts with exclusive competence

THE General Judiciary Council has approved, by an agreement on May 25, 2017, the specialisation of 54 courts (about one per province) to be responsible for dealing with court proceedings concerning floor clauses, mortgage expenses, delayed interest, multi-currency etc and clauses of loans and credits, guaranteed with a mortgage - that means mortgages where the borrower (client) is an individual and not a company.

Territorial competence: these courts will have exclusive jurisdiction to hear the affairs on the territory of the whole province, in relation to these clauses or general conditions. That is (for example for the province of Alicante) it will be only one court which must judge all court cases about floor clauses, mortgage expenses etc of the entire province.

Temporality: this exclusive competence, for the whole province, began in the month of June and will finish on December 31, 2017, although this period may be extended.

In the province of Alicante (municipalities of Denia, Javea, Jalon, Alicante, Elche, Calpe, Orihuela, Torrevieja, etc), the competent court is, in the first instance, court number five-bis(?) of the city of Alicante.

Although the idea is to speed up the handling of these court matters, everything indicates that it is very possible that there will be an avalanche of thousands of court claims presented in front of these specialised courts, so it is very possible that they would be overcharged(?) and very important delays could take place...

What should be done by those affected by these types of clauses who are going to file a court claim?

It is very difficult to know what will happen, but there are two options:

- 1. Claim now before court number five of Alicante. This will mean that it will be a specialised court dealing with the case, but there may be a significant delay in the procedure and resolution of the court case
- 2. Wait until January 2018, where it is foreseeable that it would be possible again to claim in front of the courts of your area (judicial party) courts of Denia, Torrevieja etc - depending on the domicile of the plaintiff or claimant.

In any case, the problem is the uncertainty, because the truth is:

- 1. It is not known if the specialised court will work well or not, whether it will be fast or slow, whether its criteria would be more or less favourable to the consumers etc.
- 2. We also do not know if these specialised courts, as initially foreseen, will have exclusive jurisdiction only until December 31 or not, because it is possible that some people affected will decide to wait, but if the exclusive jurisdiction is extended beyond that date, the wait will not make any

CALPE AND DISTRICT 41 CLUB was established in 2005, and formally chartered by the UK national association less than a year later.



Many of the people on the stalls bring their tools and can add a name or a detail to a chosen item, or, if you can wait a few days, you can get them to make something to order.



Heart friendly

■ AFTER months of speculation over the Kremlin' role in last year's US presidential election, Vladimir Putin and Donald Trump finally met in person at the G20 summit in Hamburg. Though the countries are on the brink of a new cold war, many believe the leaders share similar goals.

Pilot pardon

■ A RUSSIAN pilot serving 20 years in an American prison has begged Donald Trump to let him return home. Konstantin Yaroshenko was snatched in Liberia six years ago and flown to the US on drug trafficking charges. His lawyers submitted an Independence Day request for a pardon to the White House.



Unfair charges questioned

THE European Court of Justice has made a ruling which may assist travellers within the EU who are penalised for cancelling flights. Swiss invest €450m in Spain

REVENUE FROM ICE CREAM TAKES SOME LICKING As the sun shines sales rise

GLOBAL WARMING is helping to encourage the sale of different types of cold and refreshing desserts around the world.

There is evidence of the production of frozen desserts thousands of years ago with the Ancient Greeks and Romans adding flavours to ice brought down from the mountains, although the invention of the modern version is credited to China, with the concept brought to Europe by Marco Polo.

Despite the Chinese involvement, the market has until quite recently been led by the West according to a recent Mintel report but this is now changing with the huge populations of China, India and Indonesia seeing a major growth in consumption.


China is now the world's biggest ice cream market, with sales estimated at 4.3 billion litres in 2016, followed by the US (2.7 billion litres) and Japan (756 million litres) but by head, the biggest purchasers of ice cream are in Norway, Australia and Sweden.

Despite the fact that there seem to be increasing numbers of ice cream parlours opening across Spain, the Spanish are far less adventurous than many of their European cousins in wanting to try new, eth-

The production of unusual flavoured ice cream started in the Far East with such exotic flavours as Wasabi, Green Tea, Goat's Cheese and Avocado but moved rapidly to the USA and then Europe particularly Germany, Italy and Poland.

It's not just ice cream that is seeing a growth in popularity as anything iced or frozen, be it cream, sorbet, yoghurt, semifreddo or even gin and tonic lollies are becoming increasingly more popular in the East whilst the West is importing exotic ideas.

Kulfi is coming from India, moochi a frozen rice doughnut filled with ice cream from Japan, rolled ice from Thailand and even booza, a

traditional type of ice cream from Syria and Lebanon which is very slow to melt.

Whilst some health conscious consumers are consciously reducing their ice cream intake, others are involved in the launch of Vegan versions which are seeing a considerable growth in sales as they manage to find entry into national outlets.

One thing that Spain seems determined to do, regardless of trends, is to keep its deep freezes within restaurants and to offer a whole range of frozen desserts to child and adult diners, with the added bonus that guests can still often take the clay containers

Butter shortage forecast

ONE of the largest producers of dairy products in Britain, Arla has warned that there could be a Europe wide shortage of butter in particular by the end of this year.

For a number of years, there was an excess of milk production which when coupled with EU subsidies led to the creation of butter mountains and milk lakes, but with a deliberate sharp reduction in milk yield, the pendulum has started to swing the other

Many countries are moving away from margarine and back to butter which means that manufacturers are stretched and although Spain tends not to rely on fresh cream, it is suggested that expatriates' mince pies and Christmas pudding may have to be served with custard rather than cream.

Green coins for a green plan

TURNING waste plastic into green monev works in Amsterdam and an environmental organisation wants to see Spain follow suit.

The Dutch capital has a reputation for being one of the most environmentally friendly and alert capitals in Europe with a huge number of bicycles reducing pollution in the air and much being done to remove waste sensibly.

Appropriately named Wasted Lab has produced a series of green coins which it makes from the plastic handed in to it and in turn, it has negotiated with various stores and organisations around the city to accept the green coins in part payment for products, services or meals.

Anyone who wants to join in has to register with Wasted and receive special bags in which to place plastic of different types for recycling and the positive result is not only do those collectors bring their own plastic but they also pick up plastic in the streets in bins and by canals, increasing the amount that is recycled.

Those companies who accept the green coins are then able to use them to get Wasted to collect their rubbish and dispose of it and in the case of plastic, they will re-

The plastic collected by the Wasted company is used as the main source of material for their range of products. They specialise in the manufacture of recycled and recyclable building block, furniture, facilities for local market stalls and children's games.

So successful has this project been that the company reports that they continue to expand the number of outlets that accept the coins, have an ever-growing army of plastic collectors and the value of the coins is now common knowledge so that the coins themselves are likely to be digitised

by the end of this year.

For countries like Spain who have been lagging behind in the recycling of waste generally and are not on course to comply with European Union directives this could be an ideal way of meeting the requirements at least in the case of plastic and making it worthwhile for individuals to take the trouble to become involved.

Collection of waste in Spain is very regular but in a large number of cases, quite indiscriminate with waste of different types simply being dumped together meaning that recycling is a haphazard and somewhat inefficient undertaking.

Santander additional share sale

matters with local executives as well as diplomats and political heavyweights.

There was a very exclusive breakfast when the most important of the Spanish industrialists met with Dr Liam Fox. Minister for International Trade who was accompanied by his Spanish opposite number Marisa Poncela García.

This 'closed' meeting was followed by a larger address at the Mansion House where the 'great and good' from both countries had a chance to discuss possible future opportunities and there was a short address from King Felipe.

Whilst Spain and the UK are economically close, there was bound to be some jostling for position, especially as Spain would be happy to take over the role of hosting some of the European Union organisations currently headquartered in

The position of Gibraltar will almost certainly not be allowed to become a major point of public disagreement although it will be discussed in private as it is does play an important financial role in the economy of the Campo.

The British Ambassador in Madrid had already been briefed to discuss the Catalan independence situation and to distance it from comparison with Scotland and it is probable that the British government will repeat this position dur-

The position of expatriates in both countries will be a major topic of conversation as will movement of money and people across borders following Britain's eventual resignation from the 28.

Are we that phone obsessed we can't even walk in a straight line now?

DO you feel like you are old before your time? Could your mobile be to blame? It may sound a little far-fetched but scientists are claiming that our increased use of mobile phones, particularly as we are out and about walking down the street, is making us walk like pensioners. Taking slower steps, hunched over our phones as we send messages or check emails en route, is beginning to take its toll on the body and could lead to back and neck problems in the long term.

Scientists from the Anglia Ruskin University in Cambridge carried out a study where they fitted 21 people with eye trackers and motion analysis sensors, while negotiating an obstacle similar in height to a kerb. Over 250 separate scenarios were examined as participants read a message on their phone, wrote a message, spoke on their phone and in which they did not use their phone at all.

The researchers found that writing a text was the most demanding activity and led to people looking down at their phone 46 per cent

more and they looked down 45 per cent longer when reading a message. They also walked slower whilst reading a message and whilst talking on the phone. It also found that participants using their phone were less able to walk in a straight line leading them to be more at risk from bumping into other pedestrians, lamp posts and other obstacles in the street they would not necessarily notice when looking down on their phones.

The researchers said whilst using their devices they were walking like someone in their 80's and this could affect their lower back and neck by altering their posture over time.

Using phones in the street is already changing some country's policies and in China segregated footpaths have already been introduced in some towns with special lanes for those us-

In the Netherlands, traffic lights have been added into the pavements for phone users who are always looking down for increased safety when crossing the road.



Follow Med diet to help avoid cancer

THE Mediterranean diet. Yes we all know about it, we all know the potential health benefits of sticking to it, but many of us still struggle to follow it, despite it being readily available in Spain. However, do not fear.

Experts have now said that just making a few changes to your current diet can make major differences to your health, with making just three healthy changes able to reduce the risk of developing cancer by up to 86 per cent; eating more fruit and fish and reducing your soft drinks. Sounds simple right? So start making the changes today.

The seemingly simple and obvious changes have been announced following a study by researchers at the Tel-Aviv Medical Centre. They looked at a

Mediterranean diet includes vegetables, fruits, nuts and seeds, fish and meat.

dietary questionnaire of over 800 people undergoing screening or diagnostic colonoscopies who did not have a high risk of colorectal or bowel cancer.

They found that patients with more advanced polyps, which are small clumps of cells that can, over time, develop into cancer, were eating fewer items recommended within the Mediterranean diet. But eating just two

threecomponents halved the risk of developing advancing polyps compared to having none, with more fruit and fish and lowered soft drink consumption shown to be the most beneficial.

A Mediterranean diet is typically defined as eating above average amounts of vegetables, fruits, legumes, nuts and seeds, whole grains, fish and meat as well as monosaturated fats such as olive oil, rather than butter.



Alert in USA over lethal parasite

AN alert has been raised in the USA after several cases of a lethal parasite being found in people that affects the brain.

Several Florida nationals have been admitted to hospital suspected of being affected by the Angiostrongylus cantonensis parasite.

Also known as the rat lungworm, the creature can affect the nervous system and cause meningitis and is prevalent in Southeast Asia and tropical Pacific islands. It is believed that the parasite has reached several areas of the US due to global warming. Its life cycle begins in rodents, which causes infections in lungs, blood and brain. The faeces of infected rodents are eaten by snails, freshwater prawns, frogs or crabs, and so gets into the food chain and may even infect vegetables.

If a human becomes infected, symptoms include vomiting, severe headaches, stiff neck and bacterial meningitis.

Test could help couples prepare for miscarriage

COULD a simple blood test help prepare women for the heartbreak of a miscarriage? New research believes it could as they have created a blood test that measures levels of the key hormone that is responsible for maintaining the embryo and helping it survive past eight weeks.

The procedure, costing around £40 (\leqslant 45), was initially developed for IVF treatment, but could be used in natural conception, although it needs to be taken within 15 days of pregnancy which could be difficult to predict in natural conceptions.

By measuring the hormone levels it will help reveal the likelihood of a pregnancy ending in a miscarriage. Whilst it will not prevent it, experts say it can help couples to emotionally and psychologically prepare for the pregnancy potentially ending in miscarriage.

After analysing hormone levels in almost 2,000 women, researchers from the Glasgow Centre for Reproductive Medicine, said low levels of the βHCG hormone show an increased risk of miscarriage.

How can you relieve back pain?

Back pain can come about due to many different types of illness, but in the majority of cases rest, avoiding heavy lifting or straining postures, analgesics, anti-inflammatories, muscle relaxants or physiotherapy have all proven to be effective in alleviating back pain.

In extreme cases surgery may also be a solution but is only used in a small number of cases where back pain is caused by a specific medical condition.

When should you seek medical attention?

You should always seek medical attention if the pain is severe and/or lasts for a long time. You should see your regular doctor first and afterwards, if necessary, a specialist. Seek medical attention immediately if you feel numbness or tingling around your buttocks or genitals, unexplained weight loss, chest pain as well as back pain

or if there is a swelling or a deformity in your back. These problems could be a sign of something more serious and need to be checked urgently.

What causes back pain?

There can be many causes of back pain but the most common causes are strains or sprains in the back. Other causes such as a slipped disc or muscle and tendon contractures also have additional symptoms, such as numbness, weakness or a tingling sensation.

How can you prevent injuring your back?

The best way to prevent it is to have good posture, especially when sitting. Try not to strain your back by lifting heavy loads or by lifting from an awkward position.

Exercise which strengthens your back muscles can also help prevent back pain, but consult a physiotherapist on what exercises are most suitable for you.

While we are talking about wine, I may as well throw my wine corner in and this week I am going to celebrate the Bodega Muga, probably one of the best and most well-known of the Rioja, but on this occasion I am going to talk about their Prado Enea 2009. The interesting thing about this particular wine is that they do not always make it unless it's particularly good. For instance they didn't make it in 2007/8 or 2012/13.

Robert Parker was suitably impressed awarding it 97 points and commented:

"The most classic cuvée was not produced in 2007 or 2008, so we jumped to the phenomenal 2009 Prado Enea. It was produced

with grapes from cooler vineyards that enjoyed 20 extra days of slow ripening compared with warmer zones, which provided them with perfect ripeness and deep flavours. This blend of 70 per cent Tempranillo, 20 per cent Garnacha and the remaining 10 per cent between Mazuelo and Graciano had an extended élevage, in this case no less than three years (alternating newer and older barrels). This is still a baby and I know Winemaker Jorge Muga would like to keep it in bottle for longer before selling it, but the commercial pressure is tremendous, as there has been no wine since 2006. The wine has 14.1 per cent alcohol and a surprising 3.34 pH, especially considering 2009 was generally a warm and ripe year. But somehow this cuvée seems to work very well in ripe vintages. The wine feels even younger on the palate, and it still needs to develop some further complexity and the silky texture for which this wine is famous. There is good balance here and all the elements are in place for a nice development in bottle. In fact, it feels like one of

As I said there was no Prado Enea in 2012 or 2013 but it was produced in 2010, 2014 in small quantities and in 2015. At this quality it represents pretty good value. But again it's not a quaffing wine at 40€ a bottle.

Tech advantage in real estate

NEW technologies are making the experience of buying, selling or renting a home in Spain radically different. Those who have access to such technologies through their real estate agent, or other company, are at a real advantage when playing the property market.

One example is virtual reality. Impressive VR technology uses glasses, a computer and 360 degree vision to offer potential buyers a tour of the home without them having to physically visit. A similar experience can be offered by drones, which can explore roofs and offer aerial views in ways which cannot be rivalled by boots on the ground.

While many might baulk at buying a home without personally investigating every corner, a growing number of wealthier foreign buyers are confident in the technology and charmed by the convenience.

A seller who offers virtual reality tours of their home can tap into a vast market of distant buyers who might make only a few physical trips but take hundreds of online tours from the comfort of their living room.

A similar phenomenon is virtual 'home staging.' This technique uses computer augmentations to apply repairs, upgrades, extensions or redecorations to a property so buyers can visualise

exactly what it will look like once they make the changes.

It helps take the guesswork out of imagination, especially for buyers without substantial surveying knowledge. This technology has helped sell properties which were considered almost unsellable in their original state by focusing strongly on their potential.

Property surtax needs to be sorted

POLITICIANS should not take their summer holidays without first resolving the controversial issue of surtax being charged on the sale of properties according to a major public body.

Abel Caballero, president of the Spanish Federation of Municipalities and Provinces (FEMP), said parliament should not be allowed a break until the complex situation is resolved.

The surtax is an extra tax officially imposed on profits made from the sale of a property. But, contentiously, in many cases it applies regardless of whether a profit was made at all. Complex calculations are used to extract a tax even when the seller has made a serious loss on their investment.

The surtax has been successfully struck down by many regional supreme courts in the past year, including in Andalucia. A hefty backlog of cases is now piling up with sellers suing for a return of the tax payment.

A typical amount paid ranges from ≤ 2.000 to ≤ 3.000 .

But without a repeal of the tax by the national parliament, many homeowners exist within a legal limbo. In some provinces the tax is

still charged, in others the situation is entirely unclear. while some have banished it completely, leading to major differences across the coun-

so the mayor of Vigo, wants the government to consult FEMP before August to work towards a uniform revocation of the tax that will ease the uncertainty felt by thousands of people.

Tourist landlords to be named

LANDLORDS who rent out their properties to tourists will no longer have any right to anonymity under a draft bill to regulate the fast-growing industry. Global accommodation platforms operating in Spain, including Airbnb and Homeaway, would be obliged to reveal the identity of any owners posting adverts on their websites.

The companies, which have trampled over the dominance of Spain's hotel industry, would also be compelled to provide the ministry of finance with pe-

riodic market reports exhaustively detailing their activity and market trends.

Preventing tax fraud is a central purpose of the bill, as is more control over the holiday rental scene, which has operated as a largely underground market for years. The bill will be finalised next week and likely be voted on by the end of summer.

In the tax year just passed, a total of 21,500 taxpayers across Spain received a letter from the tax man stating that the government was aware

they had rented rooms or homes to tourists and expected the profits to be included in their annual tax return.

Should the bill become law, it may throw up some interesting facts on the holiday rental phenomenon.

Activists opposed to tourist rentals in major Spanish cities believe that thousands of rented properties are concentrated in the hands of a surprisingly small number of owners, in many cases large companies rather than private

Digital makes Spanish debut

THE digital advance of Spain's housing sector has seen a variety of new, innovative real estate companies move into the marketplace. Most of these newcomers operate solely online and offer an alternative approach to traditional agents.

They offer niche services in the hundreds of mini-marketplaces which exist within the sector. Thousands of Spaniards are now employing normal real estate agents but searching online for more options when it comes to legal advice, property searches, market reports and a huge swathe of other related property services.

This emergent new sector is growing so popular it even has its own name in Spain. It is dubbed 'PropTech,' combining two English words to appear even more modern. It includes a huge range of companies, from those who print nifty attention-grabbing For Sale adverts, to others offering comprehensive personalised property advice.

Few of these developments would be considered new in the UK but are a fresh input to a Spanish property market which is finally enjoying its recovery after losing almost a decade of

There's a darker side to PropTech too though. Ironically it can also be used against the millennial generation who are most technologically equipped to embrace it.

Landlords are now employing PropTech companies to scour social media to perform effective background checks on potential tenants or buy-

With privacy largely a figment of 20th century imagination, it doesn't take long for a professional to piece together a complete picture of an applicant's employment status, personality, music tastes and liability to fall behind on rent or mortgage payments.

Weeping Fig - happy or sad?

GRAEME TYRRELL

ONE of the more popular container plants in warm to temperate climates, and a favourite in the Mediterranean region is the Weeping Fig (Ficus beniamina).

It is a very strong growing plant but unfortunately it must be kept in a container unless you have a place that can maintain a 30 metre high and up to 40 metres wide tree with roots so strong they can lift up pavements and strangle underground pipes.

This strength however is why it is so good in a container. It has the ability to grow in adverse conditions of minimal water and direct sun for long periods without expiring. It does have its limitation though which, when understood, allow it to grow happily on your porch, terrace or balcony providing its bright green dense foliage reminiscent of a tropical jungle environment.

Its most basic need is to have an appropriate soil mixture that permits free drainage of water while having the capacity to retain moisture in the mix. A good potting mixture with an equal part by volume of pine bark mixed with it can be a good blend. Stones can be used in-

stead of pine bark but as they don't retain moisture the container will need more regular watering.

Light is also an important issue. They will tolerate full sun when established but do well in light shade as a house plant. If you move them from a very light position to one of low light they will most likely lose many leaves but generally recover. Loss of leaves indicates a

change of environment for the Weeping Fig but usually they reboot once a balanced environment for them is re-established.

Watering ideally requires that the container is drenched and then allowed to become touch dry before rewatering. The plant is tolerant of variations of this but if it becomes too dry it may shed its leaves to reflect the degree of dryness and if too constantly wet it may develop fungal problems in the roots that can cripple the plants vitality.

Allowing water to escape from the container when drenching assists with leaching out accumulating salts in the soil mix. The Weeping Fig is sensitive to salt build up so tap water with high mineral content can be detrimental therefore rain water is better and chemical based fertilisers with high salt content are detrimental in the

long term.

It is best to provide organic fertilisers in liquid form to maintain nutrients but not excessively. As they are inclined to be a large tree, minimal fertilising will assist in managing its

They can be potted up into larger containers as they grow but when they reach the maximum desired size, it will be time to repot into the same sized container by removing the plant from the container flushing away most of the old soil mixture, prune the roots by about a third and return it to the container with a new soil mix. In this way the plant can last for decades.

I have two 1.5 metres tall that are a 15-years-old and as healthy as can be from caring for them in this way. I think my Weeping Figs are happy.

Volvo embraces electric

VOLVO has announced that, from 2019 onwards, all of its new cars will be electric or hybrid. It is the beginning of the end for the combustion engine's dominance, which will be phased out after next year.

"Volvo Cars has stated that it plans to have sold a total of one million electrified cars by 2025," said Chief Executive Hakan Samuelsson, "When we said it we meant it. This is how we are going to do it."

The Swedish manufacturer has five distinct electric models planned for release in the next five years. All other cars built will be hybrids.

It's an ambitious move for a company which has yet to release even one production-ready electric vehicle. Sales of its SUV XC90 hybrid have exceeded expectations, however, boosting confidence that eco-friendly is the future.

The model is substantially more ex-

pensive than the diesel equivalent, at roughly €70,000 drivers are forking out an extra € 15,000 for superior green credentials.

But prices are expected to drop as competition gears up a notch. Toyota, Nissan and BMW are leading the electric revolution, and many analysts expect battery-powered cars to account for the majority of the European market within a decade.

Volvo has another ace up its sleeve. The company is owned by Chinese giant Geely, which can put considerable financial might and electric en-

pertise behind the Volvo revolution. Geely also owns a British factory producing the next generation of electric black taxis set to invade London.

ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

Subaru BRZ SE Lux

SPORTS COUPES are a niche yet important sector of the overall car market, with many models costing north of £40,000, but there are some notable exceptions. At the head of the list is the Subaru BRZ, a sleek head-turning model with plenty of charisma. It is rear-wheel-drive, has a taut chassis and a limited-slip differential which diverts engine power to the rear wheel with most traction, helping provide outstanding handling.

But that's not the best part of the BRZ - what is remarkable is that it costs just €30,190 (£26,495). It's hard to find a more enjoyable and engaging sports coupe at that sort of money.

Power comes from a 2.0 litre 197 hp horizontally-opposed Boxer engine delivering - with six-speed manual gearbox - a quick 0-100 kph time of just 7.6 seconds and top speed of 225 kph (140 mph).

My test model had an automatic gearbox and its figures are 0-100 kph 8.2 seconds, 209 kph (130 mph) and fuel economy of 14.0 kpl (39.8 mpg). With optional sat-nav this version costs $\leq 31,899 \text{ (£27,995)}.$ The slick and responsive auto gearbox still kept plenty of fun in the driving experience, and the driving is what this car is all about. With its ground-hugging stance and improved aerodynamics the car stayed glued to the tarmac and with super-responsive steering, you always feel totally in control.

With its potent styling, sports seats, big alloys, twin exhausts, rear diffuser and a boot spoiler, the BRZ looks an all-out sports car but it does have a practical side too.

For one thing it has four seats, though while Subaru says it will take four people "at a pinch" I have to quibble - anyone aged over 12 will struggle for space in the rear of the car. Boot space is decent at 243 litres and

with the rear seats folded you get a surprising 1,270 litres which can accommodate some bulky items.

Standard kit on the test model included automatic LED headlights, heated leather and Alcantara seats, power windows, automatic air-conditioning, Subaru's Starlink infotainment system with 6.2 inch colour touchscreen, voice recogni-




