



Serial child abuser held Text horror

A furious father from Almeria has helped expose an alleged paedophile who may have abused hundreds of children in the province. as well as in Cadiz and Malaga.

Guardia Civil officers arrested the former youth camp monitor at his Cadiz home after acting on intelligence provided by colleagues in Almeria.

Officers found more than 5,000 sexually explicit photos and videos on the 26-year-old's computer hard drive. An estimated 1,000 involved children.

They were tipped off by a man who found highly sexual messages on his child's phone. The messages asked for photos of the girl's private parts and also asked her physical questions about her

They came from a man who once worked at a summer camp the girl attended in Malaga. Once investigators had this link they began an exhaustive search for the suspect, finally identifying their man, whose initials are AIDC.

The suspect has worked as a nurse and volunteer at summer camps across southern Spain since 2013. Police estimated that he had been in direct contact with at least 2,000 children during that time.

After conducting interviews and searching his phone conversations, officers believe he has contacted roughly 100 children by phone. At least 13 responded, complying with his request for graphic photos. Many of them are likely keeping the conversations

The man is believed to have used his position to stay in the children's dorms during the popular camps. He befriended many and took their phone numbers, added them on Facebook and asked them not to tell anyone about

their relationship. See us on page 34





Smart beach changes

A NEW scheme is set to explore how to make Almeria's dozens of beaches more accessible to disabled people and those with reduced mobility. The Verdiblanca Association of Persons with Disabilities has asked different councils to establish a working group to explore smart ways of opening beaches to a sizeable proportion of the population.

Verdiblanca want an exhaustive survey to be carried out of local beaches this summer to identify problems and solutions to make life easier for Almeria's disabled residents.

Toilets without seats, staggered ramps, railings at impossibly high heights, dodgy benches, and 'shaded' areas with no actual shade are among the variety of problems the group has already requested help fixing.

Verdiblanca would also like to see pedestrian walkways expanded to create more space, an earlier schedule for lifeguards, and the keys to toilets to be made more easily available.

Suicide rescue squad

GUARDIA CIVIL officers rescued a man who slit his wrists and wandered into the campo in an apparent suicide bid. They managed to track him using flashlights to follow a trail of dripping blood leading into a mountainous area near Vicar.

They rushed to the scene after receiving a frantic call from the man's girlfriend. He had sent her a video showing him ingesting dozens of sleeping pills and cutting his wrists at three o'clock in the morning.

When police arrived at his home they discovered the bloody trail leading outside. They found the man lying in some bushes half-conscious

Official State Visit underway

Queens of hearts

QUEEN LETIZIA and Queen Elizabeth have been wowing fans during the official State Visit of the Spanish royals, which ends tomorrow (Friday).

The newest consort to a European monarch and the longestserving British sovereign are clearly enjoying the first official trip by the Spanish Royals for over 30 years, which is taking place at the third time of asking after two earlier cancellations.

It comes as the glamorous exjournalist and husband King Felipe VI prepare to visit Westminster Abbey accompanied by Prince Harry today, where they will lav a wreath at the Grave of the Unknown Warrior before touring the Abbey with the Dean.

The king will also be joined by Prince Andrew, Duke of York, at

a meeting between Spanish and British business leaders, before enjoying dinner with Lord Mayor of the City of London, Andrew

After tomorrow's official farewell by Queen Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh, Felipe and Letizia will visit researchers at the Francis Crick Institute, a biological research institute, before heading to Oxford University to view Spanish artefacts.

The regal couple arrived at Luton airport last Tuesday, where they were greeted by Lord-in-Waiting Viscount Brookeborough, before being collected from their hotel by Prince Charles and the Duchess of Cornwall yesterday morning.

This was followed by a Ceremonial Welcome with the Queen and Prince Phillip at Horse Guards Parade and private lunch at Buckingham Palace before tea at Clarence House, but the main event of the day was the glittering state gala dinner at which both the British and Spanish rulers made speeches.

BEYOND the glamour of the ceremonial events, King Felipe and Queen Letizia travelled to the UK with specific agendas.

In particular, reports in the Spanish media have highlighted the trip as an opportunity to lay the groundwork for bilateral relations between the two countries in the wake of Brexit.

There are reportedly three main themes that the royals hope to tackle during the course of the visit, with the futures of expatriates in both countries top of the list, closely followed by business and future relations.

It comes after British Ambassador to Spain, Simon Manley, confirmed prior to the visit that the UK's approach to talks will focus on education, trade and science.



An 82-year-old Garrucha resident is being charged with allegedly killing a dog by throwing it from a third-floor balcony.

Witnesses say the man, who suffers from Alzheimer's and dementia, tied an old dog in a thick bin bag, took him to a family member's apartment and casually threw the bag from a great height.

Spain is the largest olive oil producer in the world, accounting for 44 per cent of the world's annual supply, and the country's love affair with the diminutive fruit shows no sign of decline despite new challenges.

Liquid gold

WITH an estimated 340 million olive trees, Spain produces around 1.2 million tonnes of olive oil per year, enough to fill 400 Olympic swimming pools.

About 45 per cent of the country's olive oil is produced in the Andalucian province of Jaen, where olive plantations occupy 590,000 hectares including 66 million trees.

These account for a fifth of the global olive oil supply, with the region producing more than the entire country of Italy, the world's second-largest manufacturer.

Olive trees are said to have been introduced to Spain by the Phoenicians almost 3,000 years ago, but it was the Romans who started large-scale production, with the Moors later introducing improved growing methods.

Fruity facts

- There are over 100 varieties of olive grown in Spain, but only 24 are regularly used to make oil.
- Olive trees live on average for 3-600 years, with some of the world's oldest examples found in Spain. One individual in Tarragona is said to be over 2,000 years old
- Despite leading the global production ranking, Spain with 11.3 kilos is runner-up to Greece (12.8 kilos) in terms of per capita consumption.
- The Spanish word for oil, aceite, is derived from the Arabic word al-zait, which literally translates as

Prolific crooks captured

A PAIR of thieves believed responsible for an incredible spate of thefts across the provinces of both Almeria and Granada were arrested by the Guardia Civil.

The two men are career criminals and are charged with 23 robberies of shops, warehouses, homes and cars, Police have been hunting them for months, following a trail of crime leading from El Ejido, up the Andarax river and into Granada.

Once they identified their suspects, police placed a tracking device on their car, hoping to catch them committing a criminal act. They followed the men to a suspicious looking building in Almerimar and gained a search

Inside they found a vast haul of stolen goods of every description. The men claimed to have bought them from various markets across the provinces but officers matched the items to crime reports and arrested them.

The two men are Romanian nationals aged 45 and 27. They have been denied bail. Police are now busy returning the stolen loot to its rightful owners.







to demolish the Azata del Sol hotel on El Agarrobico beach in Carboneras

The hotel, considered one of the great eyesores of the modern era, is already slated for demolition after its construction was declared illegal. But Greenpeace are growing impatient with court delays and worry that, unless a strong protest movement arises, the hotel could stand for another decade while lawyers fill their pockets.

The hotel was built less than 20 metres from the shore on a pristine, protected beach within one of Spain's most famous natural parks. Its audaciously, unnatural positioning made it a symbol for environmental warriors across the world, with Greenpeace at one point draping an enormous flag over the abandoned 400-room building.

The group has asked followers on social media for the most original and exciting idea on how to destroy the hotel once and for all. Those with a repressed destructive streak can participate on Facebook, Twitter and Youtube.

The winner with the brightest idea will get to spend a day aboard the group's Esperanza ship, which is currently moored near Cartagena. Activists also hope to use the campaign to remind the public that the battle to clean up El Algarrobico beach is still far from over.

No hate in nude beach brawl

A FATHER who violently objected to a gay couple walking naked on an Almeria beach near his children was sentenced to three

months in prison for assaulting the men. His father-in-law, the children's grandfather, is awaiting his sentence for his own role in the attack.

The defendant received a

less harsh penalty than that urged by prosecutors, who accused him and his father-inlaw of a violent hate crime. The victims alleged that he called the men 'faggots' and 'pigs' and made other crude

references to their sexuality.

"Fortunately we have had the testimony of third parties outside the two groups that intervened" ruled the judge, deciding that witness accounts that there was no reference to the pair's sexuality were credible.

The incident took place on Torregarcia beach in 2014 and has invoked a complex set of legal arguments concerning whether it was a hate crime, or just handbags between two groups of men at the beach.

The gay couple, identified as Luis and Ricardo de Fru-

An argument ensued, during which father punched Luis. A wider fight involving all four men then broke out but the judge could make little sense of what exactly happened through the conflicting testimony.

There were no serious injuries and the father was singled out as the primary addressor. He has also been ordered to pay Luis €210 in compensation.

A LIST of the most fine-friendly speed cameras in Almeria Province has now been made available by the Guardia Civil. There are 11 fixed radar cameras installed in the province with the ability to issue automatic fines.

Of the 13,610 speeding fines dished out to drivers last year, 7,681 came from one of the 11 radars, an average of 21 every day. Little wonder that Almeria's drivers have lost a collective 50,000 points from their licences in the past decade.

By far the most active radar in the province is on the A-7 as it passes through El Ejido just after the exit to Balerma. The camera snapped an average of 12 times a day in 2016, racking up 4,608 speeding fines, more than all the other cameras combined.

The second most trigger-happy camera is found on a dangerous section of the A-334 road which connects Baza with Huercal-Overa. It fired off 1,123 fines last year.

On the same road, but as it passes through Purchena at kilometre 49, the radar slapped fines on more than 400 drivers who exceeded the tight 60 kph limit.

Close behind was the radar at kilometre 391, on the A-92, just before the Viator exit. More than

350 people whizzed past the 120 kph speed limit last year.

The fifth snappiest offender is

installed at kilometre 468.7 of the Autovia Mediterraneo as it passes through Nijar. It can catch drivers travelling in both direc-

It is worth noting that, in 2015, the General Traffic Directorate reduced the leeway given to drivers who exceed the limit, helping raise the number of fines. Whether filmed by a fixed radar or a Guardia Civil camera, the law of seven applies. Those travelling under 100 kph must not exceed the limit by more than 7 kph. Those travelling faster than 100 kph have a leeway of seven per cent.



AN official day of mourning was held across Almeria to pay tribute to the 49 migrants who drowned at sea trying to reach the province.

The city council held a minute's silence as the tragedy provoked a fresh bout of soul searching over what Almeria should do about the humanitarian catastrophe on its

Tragedy at sea

Only three survivors were found floating near the Alboran Sea shipwreck last week when a sudden strong current capsized the ramshackle vestims, even their age or gender, is unknown

The disaster has done nothing to stem the tide of new arrivals. Over the weekend al-

most 150 people were rescued in Almeria's coastal waters. The number of boats arriving from Africa in 2017 is already triple last year's total.

Almeria mayor Ramon Fernandez-Pacheco warned that the coast around the province could not become a 'landfill' for dead immigrants. He said the tragedy would only deepen if Europeans become impassive on hearing such news and called for action against the people trafficking mafias.

Gines Parra, a director of Almeria human rights group Acoge, called on Spain to open its borders to "people fleeing from misery, wars and injustice."

But Spain's interior minister, Juan Ignacio Zoido, said human rights groups should stop encouraging immigration by launching rescue and aid operations, or the problem will only get worse.

Regardless of the moral debate, the boats continue to arrive and the police, coastguard and Red Cross have all warned that they are woefully unprepared to cope with the crisis.

More than 2,000 people have arrived in Almeria since January. The National Police Union has admitted it cannot offer an 'effective response' to the problem.



The young animal was dodging traffic in terror.

Vets dewormed, hydrated and fed the dog, which didn't have a microchip. After a brief search for an owner or missing reports, they decided the dog was abandoned and the officer adopted him on the spot.

This summer, the Guardia Civil is running a special campaign urging the public to look out for animal abuse and report it to the authorities should they see any examples of neglect or violence.

Genital disaster damages

A WOMAN who endured genital injuries, during a gynaecological exam in 2007, has been offered €20,000 damages by the Andalucian High Court of Justice. She suffered burns when concentrated acetic acid was applied during the routine operation at an Almeria hospital.

The acid indicated on the label a concentration of five per cent but in reality was much higher. The court criticised the medical centre for not checking the strength but fell short of a harsher judgement.

The Andalucian Health Service was declared ultimately responsible for the mishap. The court noted that the victim had tested negative for any allergies and that her injuries were entirely caused by the acid.

The killing of Miguel Angel marked a turning point in ETA's battle against Spain. The youth and popular councillor was just 29 when he was kidnapped and executed when Madrid didn't meet demands to release ETA prisoners. His murder sparked criticism even among the groups most ardent supporters.







DEMANDS for a new pet law to govern abandoned animals across the province are gaining traction as questions

grow over the fate of thousands of animals at Almeria's pet sanctuary.

Firebrand Socialist council-

lor Ines Plaza has been fighting a one-woman war against the city's Zoosanitary centre which she accuses of needlessly killing thousands of stray and sick cats and dogs.

She has urged the council to abandon the practice and adopt her new proposal for an animal protection law before the National Veterinary Congress is held in Almeria next month

Plaza, a PSOE member, said it would be "an exercise in unbearable cynicism" for the mayor to slap medals around vets at a PR-friendly meeting, while the city routinely kills healthy animals simply because there is no room.

Several months ago Euro Weekly News ran a story on Plaza's expose of the Zoosanitary centre. The councillor's team exhaustively analysed the centre's intake of animals and the number of deaths and adoptions.

The found a major discrepancy, suggesting that thousands of animals were killed but the deaths not recorded on the books. Many were euthanised but Plaza believes a substantial number were healthy.

Photos of the centre's interior have also shown cats and dogs forced to endure filthy, overcrowded conditions. The facility has come under fire for its lax security, with five dangerous dogs stolen overnight from the premises in the past month.

Ms Plaza is also demanding a solution to Almeria's cat colony problem and has accused the council of organising what are effectively death squads to wipe out wild populations rather than establish safe havens outside the city limits.






























■ THE Russian army responded to a sly dig from British defence secretary Michael Fallon.

Heart friendly

■ MINISTERS have urged their countrymen to swap vodka and moonshine for wine. Agriculture chief Alexander Tkachyov said the state would provide financial incentives for the local wine industry to help boost the country's health. Vodka and other strong spirits were devastating populations, he said.

He said Britain's new aircraft carrier, the €7 billion HMS Queen Elizabeth would be the envy of Moscow. But Major-General Igor Konashenkov retorted that the shiny new vessel was merely a "convenient naval target."

■ AFTER months of speculation over the Kremlin' role in last year's US presidential election, Vladimir Putin and Donald Trump finally met in person at the G20 summit in Hamburg. Though the countries are on the brink of a new cold war, many believe the leaders share similar goals.

Pilot pardon

■ A RUSSIAN pilot serving 20 years in an American prison has begged Donald Trump to let him return home. Konstantin Yaroshenko was snatched in Liberia six years ago and flown to the US on drug trafficking charges. His lawyers submitted an Independence Day request for a pardon to the White House.

Swiss invest €450m in Spain

Having raised € 1.4 billion from investors around Europe, including Spain as well as the USA, the company believes that their clients are more than comfortable with investment in Spanish real estate.



REVENUE FROM ICE CREAM TAKES SOME LICKING As the sun shines sales rise

GLOBAL WARMING is helping to encourage the sale of different types of cold and refreshing desserts around the world.

There is evidence of the production of frozen desserts thousands of years ago with the Ancient Greeks and Romans adding flavours to ice brought down from the mountains, although the invention of the modern version is credited to China, with the concept brought to Europe by Marco Polo.

Despite the Chinese involvement, the market has until quite recently been led by the West according to a recent Mintel report but this is now changing with the huge populations of China, India and Indonesia seeing a major growth in consumption.

China is now the world's biggest ice cream market, with sales estimated at 4.3 billion litres in 2016, followed by the US (2.7 billion litres) and Japan (756 million litres) but by head, the biggest purchasers of ice cream are in Norway, Australia and Sweden.

Despite the fact that there seem to be increasing numbers of ice cream parlours opening across Spain, the Spanish are far less adventurous than many of their European cousins in wanting to try new, eth-

The production of unusual flavoured ice cream started in the Far East with such exotic flavours as Wasabi, Green Tea, Goat's Cheese and Avocado but moved rapidly to the USA and then Europe particularly Germany, Italy and Poland.

It's not just ice cream that is seeing a growth in popularity as anything iced or frozen, be it cream, sorbet, yoghurt, semifreddo or even gin and tonic lollies are becoming increasingly more popular in the East whilst the West is importing exotic ideas.

Kulfi is coming from India, moochi a frozen rice doughnut filled with ice cream from Japan, rolled ice from Thailand and even booza, a

traditional type of ice cream from Syria and Lebanon which is very slow to melt.

Whilst some health conscious consumers are consciously reducing their ice cream intake, others are involved in the launch of Vegan versions which are seeing a considerable growth in sales as they manage to find entry into national outlets.

One thing that Spain seems determined to do, regardless of trends, is to keep its deep freezes within restaurants and to offer a whole range of frozen desserts to child and adult diners, with the added bonus that guests can still often take the clay containers

Butter shortage forecast

ONE of the largest producers of dairy products in Britain, Arla has warned that there could be a Europe wide shortage of butter in particular by the end of this year.

For a number of years, there was an excess of milk production which when coupled with EU subsidies led to the creation of butter mountains and milk lakes, but with a deliberate sharp reduction in milk yield, the pendulum has started to swing the other

Many countries are moving away from margarine and back to butter which means that manufacturers are stretched and although Spain tends not to rely on fresh cream, it is suggested that expatriates' mince pies and Christmas pudding may have to be served with custard rather than cream.

Green coins for a green plan

TURNING waste plastic into green monev works in Amsterdam and an environmental organisation wants to see Spain follow suit.

The Dutch capital has a reputation for being one of the most environmentally friendly and alert capitals in Europe with a huge number of bicycles reducing pollution in the air and much being done to remove waste sensibly.

Appropriately named Wasted Lab has produced a series of green coins which it makes from the plastic handed in to it and in turn, it has negotiated with various stores and organisations around the city to accept the green coins in part payment for products, services or meals.

Anyone who wants to join in has to register with Wasted and receive special bags in which to place plastic of different types for recycling and the positive result is not only do those collectors bring their own plastic but they also pick up plastic in the streets in bins and by canals, increasing the amount that is recycled.

Those companies who accept the green coins are then able to use them to get Wasted to collect their rubbish and dispose of it and in the case of plastic, they will re-

The plastic collected by the Wasted company is used as the main source of material for their range of products. They specialise in the manufacture of recycled and recyclable building block, furniture, facilities for local market stalls and children's games.

So successful has this project been that the company reports that they continue to expand the number of outlets that accept the coins, have an ever-growing army of plastic collectors and the value of the coins is now common knowledge so that the coins themselves are likely to be digitised

by the end of this year.

For countries like Spain who have been lagging behind in the recycling of waste generally and are not on course to comply with European Union directives this could be an ideal way of meeting the requirements at least in the case of plastic and making it worthwhile for individuals to take the trouble to become involved.

Collection of waste in Spain is very regular but in a large number of cases, quite indiscriminate with waste of different types simply being dumped together meaning that recycling is a haphazard and somewhat inefficient undertaking.

Santander additional share sale

IGNORING the fact that disgruntled former Banco Popular shareholders are working together to try to recover lost money, Santander has invited them to invest more.

All of those former shareholders are being given preferential treatment by way of a discounted price of 17.75 per cent in this new offering to cover the €7 billion needed to cover the acquired bank's estimated bad debts.

The management of Santander is confident that it will sell all of the new shares, but as is normal, has effectively insured itself against being left with shares at an estimated cost of €70 million.

Santander has also indicated that there will be positive trading contribution from Banco Popular of more than €30 million this year.

Those who will be participating include Ana Botín, president of Santander; José María Álvarez-Pallete, president of Telefónica; Ignacio Sánchez Galán, president of Iberdrola: Pablo Isla, president of Inditex; Rafael del Pino, president of Ferrovial and Josep Oliu, president of Sabadell,

When one considers that between them they own Santander UK, O2, Heathrow Airport, Zara UK and TSB Bank, their influence in the British economy is significant and they are clearly interested in the future of their investments in the run up to and post

Whilst the King and Queen will be enjoying the pomp and ceremony of the first Spanish Official Visit in 31 years, the business owners will be discussing

matters with local executives as well as diplomats and political heavyweights.

There was a very exclusive breakfast when the most important of the Spanish industrialists met with Dr Liam Fox. Minister for International Trade who was accompanied by his Spanish opposite number Marisa Poncela García.

This 'closed' meeting was followed by a larger address at the Mansion House where the 'great and good' from both countries had a chance to discuss possible future opportunities and there was a short address from King Felipe.

Whilst Spain and the UK are economically close, there was bound to be some jostling for position, especially as Spain would be happy to take over the role of hosting some of the European Union organisations currently headquartered in

The position of Gibraltar will almost certainly not be allowed to become a major point of public disagreement although it will be discussed in private as it is does play an important financial role in the economy of the Campo.

The British Ambassador in Madrid had already been briefed to discuss the Catalan independence situation and to distance it from comparison with Scotland and it is probable that the British government will repeat this position dur-

The position of expatriates in both countries will be a major topic of conversation as will movement of money and people across borders following Britain's eventual resignation from the 28.

With British industrialists calling for a delay in leaving the Free Trade Agreement, it is also possible that the Spanish visitors will reinforce this suggestion.

Wheat price to increase

ALREADY the largest importer of wheat in the European Union, it appears that Spain will have to increase imports by 43 per cent this year.

The cause of this is the continuing dry weather which means that forecast production in Spain is down by 1.8 million tonnes.

It isn't just wheat however which will affect the balance of payments as significant increases are expected in importation of both barlev and corn, the latter now looking as if it will take over first place in the production of animal feed.




Ric Polansky moved to Mojacar in 1969 as a pioneer America panning gold and looking for El Dorado.



LEGALLY SPEAKING

Don't be guilty of animal abuse this summer

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



A RECENT case has highlighted the dangers of leaving your pet in a vehicle and it could result in the owner being jailed.

The Canine Unit of the Local Police in Alicante have denounced a person for an alleged crime of animal abuse for leaving their dog locked in a vehicle in temperatures above 36 degrees for some time.

Concerned local residents alerted the police of the presence of the dog in a car in a car park which was showing signs of distress and severe discomfort. Police immediately arrived at the scene and seeing the dog was on the brink of suffocation broke the rear window of the vehicle to gain access and successfully rescued the animal. Legal proceedings have now been opened and a formal complaint filed against the owner who is charged with a crime of ani-

mal abuse. The dog is now safe and well and a campaign has started to find it a foster family to care for it.

In addition, the officers who broke into the vehicle discovered it did not have a valid ITV so the car was seized and removed with a tow truck. The owner also faces separate charges for vehicle offences.

As the summer heat continues, police remind all pet owners again about the dangers of leaving animals inside cars where temperatures inside can quickly increase putting the animal's life at risk. In endangering the life of an animal, the offence can carry a prison sentence as well as fines.

If anyone sees an animal left inside a vehicle they are urged to call the police and emergency services straight away.

Cyclists have alcohol limits

Two weeks ago, we responded to a series of questions about riding a bicycle. We said that no alcohol limits applied to riders of bicycles. We have now

been corrected by a friend who teaches the rules at a Spanish driving school. We express our thanks to her for setting us

THE same alcohol limits that apply to drivers of automobiles also apply to riders of bicycles and even to pedestrians.

These limits would come into effect if an inebriated cyclist causes an accident which involves motor vehicles, or if a drunken pedestrian wanders into the road



and causes an accident to happen.

It is unlikely that the police would stop and fine a bicycle rider who is weaving a bit in the road or

someone stumbling along the beachfront promenade, but the possibility is there.

If a bicycle rider has no automobile licence, he cannot lose any points, but he can be fined.

And if it can be shown that he is the direct cause of an accident, other charges can be brought against him.

Are we that phone obsessed we can't even walk in a straight line now?

DO you feel like you are old before your time? Could your mobile be to blame? It may sound a little far-fetched but scientists are claiming that our increased use of mobile phones, particularly as we are out and about walking down the street, is making us walk like pensioners. Taking slower steps, hunched over our phones as we send messages or check emails en route, is beginning to take its toll on the body and could lead to back and neck problems in the long term.

Scientists from the Anglia Ruskin University in Cambridge carried out a study where they fitted 21 people with eye trackers and motion analysis sensors, while negotiating an obstacle similar in height to a kerb. Over 250 separate scenarios were examined as participants read a message on their phone, wrote a message, spoke on their phone and in which they did not use their phone at all.

The researchers found that writing a text was the most demanding activity and led to people looking down at their phone 46 per cent

more and they looked down 45 per cent longer when reading a message. They also walked slower whilst reading a message and whilst talking on the phone. It also found that participants using their phone were less able to walk in a straight line leading them to be more at risk from bumping into other pedestrians, lamp posts and other obstacles in the street they would not necessarily notice when looking down on their phones.

The researchers said whilst using their devices they were walking like someone in their 80's and this could affect their lower back and neck by altering their posture over time.

Using phones in the street is already changing some country's policies and in China segregated footpaths have already been introduced in some towns with special lanes for those us-

In the Netherlands, traffic lights have been added into the pavements for phone users who are always looking down for increased safety when crossing the road.

SPAIN is leading assisted reproduction in Europe with almost 110,000 treatments a year. This puts the country ahead of Russia and France, according to the European Society of Human Reproduction and Embryology (ESHRE)

The institution has compiled data from national records of assisted reproductive treatment cycles in Europe since 1997 and in its latest report, relating to 2014, concluded that 109,275 cycles have been performed in Spain. This was followed by Russia with 94,985 cycles and France with 90.434, which was the former leader in the field. The figures related to treatments with in vitro fertilisation (IVF), Intracytoplasmic Sperm Injection (ICSI), egg donation and intrauterine insemination (IUI). However, the data did not yet include figures from the UK, but in 2013, the UK performed 61,000 assisted reproduction treatments.

The ESHRE report confirms that European clinics continue to favour ICSI or IVF treatment in a ratio of two to one and European re-

sults consistently show that the pregnancy rate (by embryo transfer) is higher with IVF (34.6 per cent) than with ICSI (33.1 per cent).

The percentage of double or multiple pregnancies continues to decline in Europe and was found in 2014, to be at approximately 17 per cent.

How can vou relieve back pain?

Back pain can come about due to many different types of illness, but in the majority of cases rest, avoiding heavy lifting or straining postures, analgesics, anti-inflammatories, muscle relaxants or physiotherapy have all proven to be effective in alleviating back pain.

In extreme cases surgery may also be a solution but is only used in a small number of cases where back pain is caused by a specific medical condition.

When should you seek medical attention?

pool, tropical gardens and birds. While we did not eat there - having already had lunch - we did have an after lunch drink and I, of course, had to look at the menu. There is a very heavy Lebanese influence and peculiarly mixed with Spanish dishes and just for fun, theres some Greek, Hungarian and even an Oriental Chicken Salad. The restaurant is open for non residents, but they do not normally serve drinks to non residents or non diners. Obviously my sister

In the blue and red

REGULAR readers may remember me mentioning about a wine that I was given a few weeks ago that was disarmingly coloured blue. I said it had a 'nose' like nail polish remover so I didn't drink it, but I did decide I would cook with it. So a chicken dish in white wine (well blue!) was prepared. And guess what? You're right; it turned the chicken - blue!

I did contact the bodega a couple of times to find out more details of Baltar de Alort but I did not receive a reply. I wonder if it is actually a white wine with colourant? If not what makes it blue. I shall have to ask my maestro friend Pancho Campo I'm sure he

While we are talking about wine, I may as well throw my wine corner in and this week I am going to celebrate the Bodega Muga, probably one of the best and most well-known of the Rioja, but on this occasion I am going to talk about their Prado Enea 2009. The interesting thing about this particular wine is that they do not always make it unless it's particularly good. For instance they didn't make it in 2007/8 or 2012/13.

Robert Parker was suitably impressed awarding it 97 points and commented:

"The most classic cuvée was not produced in 2007 or 2008, so

we jumped to the phenomenal 2009 Prado Enea. It was produced with grapes from cooler vineyards that enjoyed 20 extra days of slow ripening compared with warmer zones, which provided them with perfect ripeness and deep flavours. This blend of 70 per cent Tempranillo, 20 per cent Garnacha and the remaining 10 per cent between Mazuelo and Graciano had an extended élevage, in this case no less than three years (alternating newer and older barrels). This is still a baby and I know Winemaker Jorge Muga would like to keep it in bottle for longer before selling it, but the commercial pressure is tremendous, as there has been no wine since 2006. The wine has 14.1 per cent alcohol and a surprising 3.34 pH, especially considering 2009 was generally a warm and ripe year. But somehow this cuvée seems to work very well in ripe vintages. The wine feels even younger on the palate, and it still needs to develop some further complexity and the silky texture for which this wine is famous. There is good balance here and all the elements are in place for a nice development in bottle. In fact, it feels like one of the great recent vintages of Prado Enea."

As I said there was no Prado Enea in 2012 or 2013 but it was produced in 2010, 2014 in small quantities and in 2015. At this quality it represents pretty good value. But again it's not a quaffing wine at 40€ a bottle.

Dodgy mayor sent down for six years


THE former mayor of Zurgena has been sentenced to six years and six months in prison after being found guilty of corruption in the notorious Costurero case.

Candido Trabalon has also been banned from holding public office for 18 years for the crimes committed during his tenure between 2003 and 2007.

A Huercal-Overa court convicted him and former Urban Planning councillor Manuel Tiieras of corruption, bribery, and falsifying public documents. Dozens of other politicians, businessmen and officials are awaiting punishment.

The case involved the granting of building licences on land where construction was prohibited. Trabalon knew that building was illegal but dished out licences regardless in exchange for cash and other benefits.

Trabalon has been heavily fined and will see five properties owned by him and his extended

Trouble over sneaky tactics

Debt disaster at town hall deepens



WORKERS: Albox has hired plenty of people but is facing debt crisis.

LAST week's revelations that Albox is the third most indebted municipality in Almeria has sparked a great deal of debate among councillors and critics. The town now owes in excess of €21 million to banks.

With roughly 11,000 residents, if the debt was evenly spread out then each would owe roughly €1,800, one of the highest rates in the

Popular Party (PP) spokesman Juan Perez savaged the town hall upon hearing the news. Describing the PSOE-led council as the "worst management in the history of the city of Albox" he said the debt had risen by 480 per cent since their watch began in 2007.

Worse, the actual debt is far

more than that owed only to the banks. The €21 million figure does not include €8 million owed to finance company, Gestagua, or a million euro property debt related to the school of music.

The PP believe the true figure is closer to €45 million and accused the town hall of lying when it spoke of a surplus in the council budget.

Tech advantage in real estate

ONE of the more popular container plants in warm to temperate climates, and a favourite in the Mediterranean region is the Weeping Fig (Ficus benjamina).

It is a very strong growing plant but unfortunately it must be kept in a container unless you have a place that can maintain a 30 metre high and up to 40 metres wide tree with roots so strong they can lift up pavements and strangle underground pipes.

This strength however is why it is so good in a container. It has the ability to grow in adverse conditions of minimal water and direct sun for long periods without expiring. It does have its limitation though which, when understood, allow it to grow happily on your porch, terrace or balcony providing its bright green dense foliage reminiscent of a tropical jungle environment.

Its most basic need is to have

drenching assists with leaching

an appropriate soil mixture that permits free drainage of water while having the capacity to retain moisture in the mix. A good potting mixture with an equal part by volume of pine bark mixed with it can be a good blend. Stones can be used instead of pine bark but as they don't retain moisture the container will need more regular watering.

Light is also an important issue. They will tolerate full sun when established but do well in light shade as a house plant. If you move them from a very light position to one of low light they will most likely lose many leaves but generally recover. Loss of leaves indicates a change of environment for the Weeping Fig but usually they reboot once a balanced environment for them is re-established.

Watering ideally requires that the container is drenched and

then allowed to become touch dry before rewatering. The plant is tolerant of variations of this but if it becomes too dry it may shed its leaves to reflect the degree of dryness and if too constantly wet it may develop fungal problems in the roots that can cripple the plants vitality. Allowing water to escape from the container when soil mix. The Weeping Fig is sensitive to salt build up so tap water with high mineral content can be detrimental therefore rain water is better and chemical based fertilisers with high salt content are detrimental in the long term.

It is best to provide organic

out accumulating salts in the

It is best to provide organic fertilisers in liquid form to maintain nutrients but not excessively. As they are inclined to be a large tree, minimal fertilising will assist in managing its size.

They can be potted up into

larger containers as they grow but when they reach the maximum desired size, it will be time to repot into the same sized container by removing the plant from the container flushing away most of the old soil mixture, prune the roots by about a third and return it to the container with a new soil mix. In this way the plant can last for

I have two 1.5 metres tall that are a 15-years-old and as healthy as can be from caring for them in this way. I think my Weeping Figs are happy.

MANY folk have so many different opinions of the muzzle. Of course anyone that sees a dog with a muzzle automatically assumes that the dog is dangerous.

There are many types of muzzle, but whatever one you choose make certain that the dog is able to breath.

The muzzle that I recommend is the Baskerville which is marketed by the eminent Roger Mugford. This is a basket design and allows near unrestricted mouth opening for panting and drinking. These are available at most good pet shops and many vets stock them. They come in 12 sizes to ensure that a good fit is available for most breeds of dogs. I encourage all owners to train their dogs to wear a muzzle, the earlier in the dog's life the better. Most young dogs are destructive; a muzzle will protect your home from being eaten. A muzzle will ensure that your dog is unable to eat any rubbish or poison on the ground that alone is worth training for.



DOG MUZZLES: There are many different types.

If you do not have a muzzle vou can always tie the leash around the dog's mouth to prevent it biting.

When visiting the vet it can also be useful for nervous dogs to wear a muzzle and also when a dog has been operated on. Wearing a muzzle is another way to prevent him from licking the wound. In the event of an emergency, if you do not

have a muzzle then one can always tie the leash around the dog's mouth to prevent it biting.

I would add that a muzzle does not cure a bad behaviour, but it is useful whilst an effective therapeutic strategy is developed.



Volvo embraces electric

VOLVO has announced that, from 2019 onwards, all of its new cars will be electric or hybrid. It is the beginning of the end for the combustion engine's dominance, which will be phased out after next year.

"Volvo Cars has stated that it plans to have sold a total of one million electrified cars by 2025," said Chief Executive Hakan Samuelsson. "When we said it we meant it. This is how we are going to do it."

The Swedish manufacturer has five distinct electric models planned for release in the next five years. All other cars built will be hybrids.

It's an ambitious move for a company which has yet to release even one production-ready electric vehicle. Sales of its SUV XC90 hybrid have exceeded expectations, however, boosting confidence that eco-friendly is the future.

ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

Subaru BRZ SE Lux

SPORTS COUPES are a niche yet important sector of the overall car market, with many models costing north of £40,000, but there are some notable exceptions. At the head of the list is the Subaru BRZ, a sleek head-turning model with plenty of charisma. It is rear-wheel-drive, has a taut chassis and a limitedslip differential which diverts engine power to the rear wheel with most traction, helping provide outstanding handling.

But that's not the best part of the BRZ - what is remarkable is that it costs from just €30,190 (£26,495). It's hard

to find a more enjoyable and engaging sports coupe at that sort of money.

Power comes from a 2.0 litre 197 hp horizontally-opposed Boxer engine delivering - with six-speed manual gearbox - a quick 0-100 kph time of just 7.6 seconds and top speed of 225 kph (140 mph).

My test model had an automatic gearbox and its figures are 0-100 kph 8.2 seconds, 209 kph (130 mph) and fuel economy of 14.0 kpl (39.8 mpg). With optional sat-nav this version costs €31,899 (£27.995). The slick and responsive auto gearbox still

kept plenty of fun in the driving experience, and the driving is what this car is all about. With its ground-hugging stance and improved aerodynamics the car stayed glued to the tarmac and with super-responsive steering, you always feel totally in control.

With its potent styling, sports seats, big alloys, twin exhausts, rear diffuser and a boot spoiler, the BRZ looks an all-out sports car but it does have a practical side too.

For one thing it has four seats, though while Subaru says it will take four people "at a pinch" I have to quibble anyone aged over 12 will struggle for space in the rear

Standard kit on the test model included automatic LED headlights, heated leather and Alcantara seats, power windows, automatic air-conditioning, Subaru's Starlink infotainment system with 6.2 inch colour touchscreen, voice recognition, satnav and Bluetooth. You also get cruise control, keyless entry, push-button start and multi-adjustable steering wheel.

No doubt about it, the BRZ offers a lot for the money but more importantly delivers a driving experience which reminds you of just how much


