Killer disease spreading Fears grow

Deadly Xylella Fastidiosa, first detected in Guadalest after reaching the Spanish mainland from Baleares, is now in Beni-

After the first case was confirmed in a Guadalest Valley almond grove, two more were located in nearby Benimantell.

The bacterium which eventually kills trees by stripping them of all moisture reached Europe in October 2013 when it appeared in Apulia (Italy).

It was found in Baleares last November and Brussels-approved controls have not prevented the plague from travelling in a straight line from Ibiza to the Marina Baia.

The Guadalest case was found in December but early tests were inconclusive and Xvlella Fastidiosa not confirmed until June. According to sources

quoted in the local Spanish press following reports of the Benimantell discoveries, more Marina Baja cases could follow.

The pathogen spread by numerous species of insects that include cicadas and froghoppers affects practically everything grown in this area with olives. almonds, all types of fruit trees and ornamental plants at risk.

The regional government is complying with EU procedures that involve eliminating all trees and crops within a 100-metre radius of a Xylella Fastidiosa outbreak. In Guadalest this has affected seven hectares of almond trees whose crop would have been ready in a month's time.

Not only growers are worried by the probable outbreak as local mayors fear that large-scale eradication will affect a tourist area famed for its scenery and luxuriant vegetation.

Both have now asked the Generalitat to follow the measures used in Ibiza by removing only affected trees instead of destroying those on many hectares of surrounding land.

BEACHGOERS are advised to be on red alert over the coming weeks after experts revealed that iellyfish are present in above-average numbers across 5-10 per cent of Spain's Mediterranean coastline.

The news comes as the stinging blobs have been reported from Malaga Province for the first time since 2015, as an expert in Alicante confirmed that certain beaches seem to attract them more frequently and in higher densities.

A new EU-funded report compiled by the Spanish Institute of Marine Sciences analysed sting data from more than 70 per cent of the country's 1.200 lifeguard towers and highlighted a series of black spots.

Cesar Bordehore, a researcher at the University of Alicante's Ramon Margalef Institute of Environmental Studies confirmed "we now know that between 5-10 per cent of Spanish Mediterranean beaches show an over-population, and we are now studying these cas-

Awkward little stingers

THE most common species in the Spanish Mediterranean is Pelagia noctiluca, the purple or mauve stinger, most easily identified by its pink to purple


It is an offshore species that is sometimes swept into shore. sometimes in massive numbers.

The sting from its tentacles is venomous but not especially dangerous, normally producing a whip-like scar.

Mr Bordehore said that if stung, the tentacle should be removed without rubbing using a plastic bank card or small pliers and cleaned with salt water.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...23

Spain is the second-largest producer of cork in the world after Portugal, with 27 per cent of the world's 2.2 million hectares of cork forest, and the annual harvest is in full swing.

Popping the cork!

TAKING place from June 15 to August 15 each year, the cork harvest is the ultimate example of an environmentally-friendly industry which still employs ancient methods.

It is considered sustainable because the trees are not cut down to obtain the product, rather the bark is stripped from the trunk by highly-skilled workers known as corcheros who wield specialised tools and must train for around eight years.

Normally working in teams of five, they each have a specific role, from using an axe to strip the cork to stacking the planks in piles or loading it onto mules once it is cut.

At the factory, the planks are boiled in a deep water vat, which renders it soft enough for flattening and processing.

A fine vintage

THE trees cannot be harvested until they are 30 to 40 years old and have a minimum circumference of 60cm at

After being cut they are left alone for nine-12 years to allow the cork to grow back, the harvest taking place in a different area each year following a cyclical pattern.

The first and second harvests produce low quality cork, but from the third onwards it is of sufficiently high grade to use for the production of corks for around 60 per cent of the world's wine.

Although cork oaks can live for more than 300 years, some even reaching 500, they are not usually exploited after they reach 200 years of age.

70-year-old Brit saved by police in Benissa

TWO Local Police officers from Benissa helped save a 70-year-old British man's life last weekend.

The incident occurred in the Masia de Sant Jaume restaurant as officers were called to the aid of the man - from Teulada-Moraira - who was lying unconscious on the floor in the toilets.

The man was purple in the face and despite having a pulse and still being able to breathe, he was very weak.

After a few minutes, the man stopped breathing and

as the health services were yet to arrive, officers performed CPR to recover his pulse.

A few minutes later, the man entered cardiac arrest again and officers resumed CPR until a SAMU ambulance arrived.

After 30 minutes of work between the officers and SAMU medics, the man was stabilised and taken to Hospital de Denia-MarinaSalud before being transferred to Hospital Universitario San Juan De Alicante.







The love birds were snapped at a nightclub before Lucy paraded on a hotel balcony in a bright red lace-up bikini which left little to the imagination.



No let-up in Valenciano skirmishes

LAST May, Valencia's Upper Court of Justice (TSJ) halted Education chief Vicent Marza's plans for multilingual education in state schools.

The TSJ has now given Marza a five-day deadline to demonstrate that he is complying with the order to suspend the scheme after it was challenged by the Alicante Province Diputa-

Marza's plans gave precedence to Valenciano and reduced English classes for schools teaching predominantly in Spanish, a system challenged by many parents in Alicante Province.

Although the Generalitat's Education department claims to be complying with the TSJ's suspension, the teaching community "has serious doubts" according to some sources.

Schools whose Infants' classes were due to introduce the three-language regime next September have been told to adopt the system "authorised by the regional Education department" without expressly citing the Marza's Multilingual plans.

Alicante Province schools that opted for an advanced level of Valenciano appear to be ready to follow the Education department's recommendation, the same sources said.

Schools, which in the past had separate streams for Spanish and Valenciano, are said to be "waiting prudently" until the legal situation has been clarified.

Harvest brings fire worries

THE regional government's Agriculture department advised cereal farmers to take extreme care while using combine harvesters this summer.

The department acknowledged that combine harvesters do not cause a significant number of fires but warned of "important" potential risks.

Cereal is grown on a total of 24,000 hectares of land in the Valencian Community's three provinces and harvest time is invariably accompanied by high temperatures and extremely dry vegetation, the department said.

As well as servicing harvester engines to avoid overheating and installing spark-arresters, the department also warned against close-cutting to avoid stone strikes that could also produce sparks.

Above all, the region's farmers were advised to consult the fire-risk level that is updated daily on the Generalitat website before harvesting.

The right to live or die

THE sad story of Charlie Gard has been heartbreaking, not just for his parents but for tens of thousands of people who followed the case.

No parent ever wants to outlive their child and in this particular case, the agony of the parents who have tried everything to prolong his life is quite clear.

The Great Ormond Street Hospital has a fantastic record of improving the life of so many children but does appear to have been involved in a number of legal battles over the rights of parents to keep their children

More than £100,000 (€110,000) was raised by donation to help support Charlie's parents but all of this money and the legal costs of the hospital have effectively been wasted whilst the various court cases were heard.

There is a terrible dilemma here as to who should have the right to decide the life or termination of a child.

The hospital has experts who believe that their recommendation to terminate Charlie's life was correct, yet past cases have shown that miracles can occur as in the case of Aysha King whose parents were arrested for taking him out of the UK.

This is not the first or the last case of this kind, but in the meantime, we certainly feel immense sorrow for Charlie's brave parents.

Open letter from HMA Simon Manley

GIVEN the success of the Spanish State Visit to the UK the week before last, which, among other things, highlighted the importance of people to people links between our two countries, I thought it timely to return to the subject of citizens' rights in the negotiations on our departure from and future partnership with the EU.

In the year since the EU referendum, I've had the pleasure of meeting many of you across the country, from the Balearics to the Canaries, along the Costas and in Madrid, and our consular teams have met many more.

I know from those conversations that there has been uncertainty for many of you. My teams and I have listened to your concerns about the future, including about your residency status in Spain, the level of your UK pensions, and your access to Spanish health and other social services, and have noted the questions you have about tax, inheritance, right to work and the implications of applying for Spanish nationality.

At our meetings, on our social media and in interviews, I have also pledged to keep you up to date as negotiations on our exit from the European Union continue. So, let me update you on where matters stand now. in light of the latest negotiation round in Brussels last week.

The UK government has been clear that citizens are our top priority in the exit negotiations. We want an agreement that provides citizens with greater certainty about their future.

Last week we held constructive and substantive discussions with the European Commission on the bulk of the issues underpinning our respective positions on citizens' rights. Together we have taken a big step forward.

There is a much clearer understanding on the detail of the positions on both sides and significant convergence on the key issues that really matter to citizens. You can read this technical note which compares the UK and EU positions on these issues here. It is clear both sides want to move towards an agreement.

As you know, on June 26, the Prime Minister outlined to Parliament an offer to protect the rights of EU citizens in the UK. We are entering the negotiations with the European Commission and the other 27 EU Member States constructively and we therefore hope that the EU27 will offer reciprocal treatment for British nationals resident in the other Member States.

Many of you will have seen press reports of our June 26 offer, whether in the UK or Spanish media. I hope you will also have read the detailed proposals which are set out in 'Safeguarding the position of EU citizens in the UK and UK nationals in the EU' (https://www.gov.uk/govern ment/policies/brexit) and I would encourage you to sign-up for email alerts (you can do so on the Home Office gov.uk page) to receive updates, to ensure that you are receiving information and guidance from official

The first key element of the new proposal is residence status and working rights. Until the UK's exit, EU citizens in the UK will continue to enjoy all the rights they currently have under EU law: they can continue to live and work in the UK just as they do

The same rights also apply to you, British residents in Spain. You can continue to live and work here in Spain as you always have done. After the UK's exit from the EU, we are proposing a reciprocal deal that would protect the right of UK nationals already in the EU to continue to live

and work in the EU. We hope that the European Commission and the 27 other Member States will agree to

The second key element is healthcare, pensions, education and access to benefits. It is our intention to treat EU citizens with settled status in the UK in the same way as if they were UK citizens for the purposes of access to education, benefits and pensions.

For you, the government has announced that the UK will continue to export and uprate the UK State Pension and provide associated healthcare cover within the EU, issues which I know from my conversations over the last year were important to many of you.

At the moment, those of you who are UK pensioners and resident in Spain access healthcare through the S1 form. This means the UK reimburses Spain the cost of providing medical treatment.

After the UK leaves the EU we want to continue your healthcare entitlements on the same basis. Healthcare in Spain was indeed one of the case studies cited in the detailed proposals made by the British Government on June 26 (see link).

Subject to negotiations, we want to continue participating in the European Health Insurance Card scheme meaning EHIC holders continue to benefit from free, or reduced-cost, needs-arising healthcare while on a temporary stay in the EU - and vice versa for EU EHIC holders visiting the UK. We hope the European Commission will agree to this.

The British government has repeatedly said that, until exit negotiations are concluded, the UK remains a full member of the European Union and all the rights and obligations of EU membership remain in force. You can continue travelling throughout the EU on your UK passport, without any visa requirements. You can continue to access Spanish healthcare and draw your UK pension. If you have any difficulties accessing those rights, do please let our Consulates know

I will continue to engage with you and listen to you, as will my consular teams across Spain. Guarding the guards

GUARDS at Alicante II prison in Villena claimed they are regularly attacked by inmates.

Assaults average one a month, maintained the CSI-F prison guards' union which called on the management to lodge a penal complaint on each occasion.

Instead the prison board ignored the "chaotic situation" experienced by staff, said CSI-F, which accused the Administration of passivity "in the face of grave and intolerable episodes."

They were obliged to endure verbal as well as physical abuse from prisoners, CSI-F claimed. The last attack occurred almost two weeks ago when a prisoner with psychiatric problems attacked a guard who is still off

"This prisoner had a long history of aggression towards staff and prisoners in other centres" the union said

A similar attack had occurred a month earlier, again by a mentally ill prisoner. Instead of seriously overcrowded Alicante II, prisoners like these should be admitted to centres where their psychiatric problems could be attended to, the union

Something fishy in Altea

ALICANTE'S Guardia Civil found nearly 300 kilograms of illegally caught young fish in a routine inspection at the Puerto Deportivo Luis Campomanes in Altea last week.

Officers, along with the Fisheries Inspectorate of the Generalitat found the fish - mostly whiting in addition to monkfish and octopus - hidden in 54 unlabelled containers in the port.

Inspectors, on account of the size and weight of the fish, confirmed they had been illegally caught and it was presumed the fishermen were intending to sell them on the black market.

The fish were seized and later delivered to charitable centres across the province.

By law, there are set limits and restrictions on the fish you can catch and keep in Spain.

Any fish caught against the catch and/or possession limits and/or size restrictions must be immediately released.

"Approving an action plan of this importance would give us access to countless possibilities," said Altea's mayor Jaume Llinares.

"It would be invaluable in acquiring comprehensive first-hand knowledge of the challenges facing the municipality and the best way of tackling them in a sustainable manner."

Finance councillor Pere Lloret outlined four objectives that must be met if the town hopes to receive the EU funds.

Improved access to new technologies, facilitating transition to an economy based on low-level greenhouse gas emissions plus conserving and protecting the environment were the first three objectives, Lloret explained.

"But the fourth and probably the weightiest is the need to promote social inclusion and fight against poverty in the disadvantaged areas in our town," the councillor stressed.

"If progress is not made on these four points, our DUSI strategy will not have EU support or funding," he said.







Listed as an asset of cultural interest (BIC) it sank in 1AD and is one of seven archaeological sites included in UNESCO's Catalogue of Best Practices related to Underwater Cultural Heritage.

Generalitat permission is unlikely, municipal sources added, as the region's Culture and Heritage department advised against the plan after consulting the Ministry of Culture.

Experts in the conservation of submerged archaeological remains from the University of Cadiz opposed the project, as did members of Valencia University's department of Prehistory, Archaelogy and Ancient History who said the fish farm would be "a grave error."

All agreed that the installation would create cloudy water saturated with plankton that would alter the chemical composition of the seabed. This would then be absorbed by the wood of the sunken galley and its 3,000 or so remaining amphorae, causing serious short-term and long-term

Province on overload

FIREMEN are being called out to an increasing number of fires in electricity meters and installations.

This year's first occurred in January when the generators at an Orihuela sports club caught fire and the most recent was reported earlier this month in San Vicente.

Alicante Province has already seen 50 of these fires this year, compared with 29 during the same period in 2016, the Provincial Fire Consortium announced.

"Fires of this type are always spectacular because they produce black smoke that is often toxic, filling stairwells and hindering rescues," Suay

This occurred in the San Vicente fire when firemen had to ask the apartment building's 100 residents to remain on their balconies until the smoke had cleared before they could be evacuated.

Although fires caused by faulty electrical equipment or installations are not habitual. homes often have too many appliances connected at the same time and in many cases the electrical installation is old, with inevitable overloads and short circuits.

This is a particular hazard at this time of the year with air conditioning going full-blast, explained Juan Miguel Suay, responsible for Consortium's New Technology division.

people of all ages were arrested that night.

The gypsies arrested in the Valencian community and the surrounding provinces received different treatment according to their age and gender: men, boys and children over seven years old were sent to Santa Barbara castle in Alicante, while

women, girls and children under seven years of age were imprisoned in Denia

Last Thursday, representatives of FAGA joined staff from the town hall at the tribute which was led by Denia Mayor Vicent Grimalt.

The group then moved on to Denia castle where historian Martinez Martinez gave a presentation.



Runs are also limited to 10 minutes per bull, and 30 minutes total. Blood doping for both professionals and the animals has also been prohibited, and the bulls must spend 48 hours in a pen - rather than a small compartment where they are kept in the dark before a run - and taken directly to the starting point of the run.

The new law has faced harsh criticism, with some calling the law "unenforceable" and unconstitutional. Ciudadanos spokesman Xavier Pericay has also gone as far as to call the changes "traitorous" by attempting to "ban a culture without people realising."

Driving a bargain

Price steers tourists to car hire choice

SIX out of every 10 British holidaying abroad and seeking car hire choose the cheapest vehicle

Additionally many look for early deals and generally go for the cheaper locations, including Spain and Portugal.

This is spelled out in findings from research company Mintel which has offices worldwide, including London.

A Mintel report on car hire just published advises hire firms to change their marketing strategies to appeal to tourists looking for a leaner holiday package where every penny counts.

Transparent pricing and special deals would go far in appealing to this new demographic, the report says.

Also, overall British holidaymakers are losing some of their appetite for car hire when travelling abroad with steep prices and

bad experiences taking their toll, making a car on holiday now viewed by many as an unnecessary expense.

The Mintel findings reveal that the number of British tourists hiring a car abroad has dropped 6 per cent in 12 months

to 33 per cent in 2017.

Young tourists have led the change in habits for while more than 40 per cent aged 18-24 rented a car when travelling abroad in 2016, this year the figure is under 30 per cent.

Bad experiences and the per-

ception of being ripped off is partly blamed with four in 10 saying they were charged more than expected, and almost as many claiming a negative experience.


The research indicates that the car hire industry is now exposed to the same market forces that have transformed flights and accommodation. Low-cost airlines and a thriving tourist home rental industry have knocked major airlines and hotels from their previous perch.

Though appetite for car hire may be waning, cars themselves haven't lost their magic. Researchers found that the majority of British like the idea of a road trip abroad with friends and family.

Almost nine in 10 of those with incomes above €56,000 have considered the idea, with this group also more likely to crank their car choice up a gear, with 65 per cent saying they would consider hiring a sports car to give their holiday an edge.

Car hire firms should capitalise on this by better advertising their product, the report concludes. Emphasising cars as a means of transforming a standard holiday into an independent adventure free from the limits of distance and bus schedules, would encourage people to spend more on the car they really

If hire companies can manage this they will tap into a huge market. The research found that 63 per cent of Brits have holidayed abroad in the last three vears



Evening open to everyone

THE coronation ceremony for Alfaz's Fiestas queens will be a little different this year.

It will be held on August 5 in the open air at 10pm on the Casa de Cultura esplanade with a charge of only €5 per chair or €7 for a chair with table.

The mayoralas organising the event decided to set a low entrance fee so that cost would not prevent anyone from enjoying such a special evening for the queens, their attendants and everyone involved in the fiestas, they explained.

This year's queen is a Briton, Shannon Abbott, while the junior queen is Maia Skarveland, a Norwegian.

"At the very least this is a departure from usual practice," said Fiestas councillor Marisa Cortes. "And of course it is a very good idea."

The innovation would turn the coronation into an event that would be different, entertaining and open to all the public, she stressed.

"In other words it will be a real fiesta where the mayoralas from the A Patir a la Guerra group can make enough money at the bar to ensure that Alfaz has the fiestas it deserves next November," Cortes continued.

Once the hour-long coronation ceremony is over, there will be live music from the La Gran Babylon a group of local musicians, said Noelia Moruna, president of Alfaz's Fiestas Committee.

Digging up the past

EIGHTEEN young volunteers from Spain, France, Armenia and Serbia were recently working at Albir's Villa Romana archaeological site.

Excavations revealed two more rooms corresponding to the Late Roman Era, revealed Alfaz's municipal archaeologist, Carolina Frias.

As well as helping with the dig, the volunteers documented, surveyed and labelled finds, supported by a team of archaeologists and geologists, Frias said.

Their discoveries included molluse shells, suggesting that shellfish and snails were cultivated at an installation in or adjoining the villa, probably during its last phase of occupation in the seventh century AD.

"We are now cleaning and identifying each species, classifying them as marine or land-based," said geologist Ainhoa Pastor. "Many were raised for consumption but others were probably crushed for dye."

The project, a collaboration between the Valencian Community's youth institute, IVAJ, and Alfaz Town Hall, aims to encourage respect for archaeological heritage in general while learning more about Albir's past.

The site was discovered in 1987 although excavations did not begin until 2008. The villa, now an open-air museum has come to be regarded as a key site in the study of settlements in the northern Alicante province from the fourth century BC onwards, said Alfaz's Culture councillor Mayte Garcia.



New plaza nearly ready

AN unkempt parcel of land in central Alfaz formerly used as a car park has been transformed into a plaza.

The plot was cleared by demolishing an unused municipal depot that adjoined the Escoles Velles cultural centre, a space that can now be recovered for public use, explained Toni Such, councillor responsible for Urban Development.

Revamping the plaza is expected to be completed within a week, Such said: "We shall then be able to make plans for the future on the understanding that these will respond to social demand and ensure the participation of the public."

Basic infrastructure has been brought up to date, with telephone and electricity cables located underground. Steps and ramps have also been added, connecting the plaza to Calle Murcia and making it accessible for those with mobility problems.

The Alicante provincial government provided €240,000 of the €293,159 cost while the town

hall has paid the remainder. Nor will losing the unofficial car park affect residents and visitors as there is free parking less than 50 metres away.

The Department of Tourism underlined that this is only the beginning of what they hope will be an extremely successful campaign and the council is already working on further booklets.





UNABLE TO FACE THE THOUGHT OF JAIL Disgraced banker has committed suicide

FORMER chairman of Spanish savings bank Caja Madrid, Miguel Blesa, was found dead at a country estate in Cordoba after shooting himself.

Blesa, who was released from prison pending an appeal against a sixyear prison sentence after being found guilty in the 'tarjetas black' banking scandal, was discovered with a bullet wound in his chest from a hunting rifle and an autopsy confirmed the belief that death was caused by suicide.

He was on a hunting trip with friends and reportedly said he was going to move his car, when a gunshot was heard.

According to reports from Europa Press, Blesa's inner circle said he was not depressed or feeling defeated in the days leading up to his

The former Caja Madrid boss was one of 64 people accused of misusing €12 million of Caja Madrid and Bankia money between 2003 and 2012.

They were accused of using company credit cards for personal expenses such as luxury holidays and parties without ever justifying them or declaring them to tax authorities

Miguel Blesa had allegedly established the 'corrupt system' while head of the bank before handing the reins over to Rodrigo Rato - also one of the 64 accused - in 2010.

Caja Madrid was once one of Spain's largest lenders, with an estimated seven million customers and annual earnings of over €2 billion during the real estate boom.

In 2011, it merged with other banks to form Bankia, but just one year later needed billions of euros from the state to stay afloat, and eventually asked the EU for a bailout where it received €41 billion.

This was not the first time that he had flirted with scandal as he had

spent 15 days in jail in 2013 with regards to overpayment for the purchase of a Florida bank and was only released when his lawyers had the judge thrown off the case which then collapsed.

A former friend of many politicians who sinecures with his bank, Blesa had fallen so far from grace - especially after boasting about his extravagant life style - that he grew a beard and wore dark glasses in public.

Possibly the final straw may have been that his assets including pension payments had been partly frozen and his properties were used as guarantees to the courts.

BBVA Bank best app

A SIMPLE app from Spanish bank BBVA has been voted the best mobile banking app in the world, leaving 53 leading international banks standing.

The research which was undertaken by Forrester, an international research and advisory company, studied 54 different criteria ranging from ease of registration, security, speed and ease of login to availability of advice and sale of products.

The average score out of 100 for these mobile apps was 63 and the success of the BBVA app at 87 simply left much larger and wealthier banks in the shad-

At the end of the day, customers want to be able to undertake their transactions and manage their accounts with the minimum of difficulty and it would appear from this study that BBVA meets the criteria.

TWO Spanish entrepreneurs were looking for a way to establish a successful business after the collapse of the Spanish economy and came up with a brainwave.

Thus in 2010. Wonkandy world of natural candy - was born with production outsourced to a range of manufacturers leaving the pair to concentrate on marketing and sales.

The home market was still weak despite their launch of an outlet in Sevilla but they discovered that the business could be nurtured through foreign sales and the signing of franchise arrangements.

What really helped the business take off was when their product was picked up by Harrods in Lon-

EWN online Join the conversation on our Facebook page don and with a bit of tweaking to the ingredients, they found that they had a range of sweeties which would appeal to the Halal market in the Middle East.

Candies like jelly beans are generally non Halal because they contain gelatine which is often made in part from pork bones, so they adapted their recipes and obtained a certificate from the Spanish Halal Institute which allowed them to develop business in many Muslim countries.

Now they export to 20 countries around the world and have a number of franchised outlets throughout Spain with some 60 per cent of their income being derived from exports.

With steady growth the company is continuing to expand and is filling a niche role which they hope will see their brand becoming one of the largest exporters of Halal sweets as well as appealing to those who are gluten and lactose intolerant.

To me the adoration of his parents has now become somewhat misguided. Blinded by emotion they are, I feel, in danger of evoking a desire to prove themselves morally right, both in the eyes of the law and their numerous sympathisers than do what is right for their little boy.



It's holiday time again. Have you got that Liberty feeling?

ONCE again, summer is here with a vengeance. Temperatures soar and with the influx of tourists, you have to keep your wits about you at all times when driving.

Holidaymakers who rent a car, may also be driving on the opposite side of the road to their home country, like the British, so you need to be extra vigilant and try to anticipate their possible mistakes. One very common incident happens on roundabouts where drivers take the wrong lane. For example, if you want to carry straight on then it's best to take the outside lane, and if you intend to turn left, take the inside lane.

Needless to say, check the tyres too and make sure they are in good condition with enough tread. Also check the car's radiator water level: the last thing you want is to overheat if

you're stuck in a queue and worse still have to wait for a breakdown truck. It's also illegal to run out of screen-wash so keep this topped up.

Driving with flip-flops or shoes without backs is not permitted either. Obviously seat belts must be worn all round and children need safety harnesses. And stating the obvious too, mobile phones must not be used for speaking (unless using a built-in hands-free device) and definitely no texting!

If you do have an accident, remember

Stay calm and use the reflective vest.

Use your vehicle's emergency flashers and use two warning triangles at appropriate distances from the vehicle. Stay away from oncoming traffic.

Call 112 if necessary.

Take photos of the incident when safe to do so. Get statements and contact information from any witnesses

Complete the accident report forms.



LEGALLY SPEAKING

Driver's performance

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



A MOBILE app which assesses and records a person's driving performance has revealed that drivers in Spain don't quite perform as they believe.

DriveSmart is the mobile app that measures the driving style of the user and compares it with the assessment of other drivers. The survey revealed that drivers in Spain believed themselves to be generally 'good drivers' however, after the analysis of the results it revealed that they are actually even better than they

To run the application it needs to be activated at the beginning of the trip and then it automatically collects the data on a person's driving performance using the phone's internal sensors such as accelerometer, compass and GPS for example, without the driver having to use or manipulate the phone during the journey.

Drivers are asked to create a profile before and after the trip, depending on the characteristics and conditions of the road, DriveSmart evaluates the journey and shows results on how the driver performed behind the wheel and how they could improve.

In the self-assessment only one in three Spaniards considered themselves to be a 'good driver,' while 12 per cent thought they were 'excellent.' Only 1 per cent said they were a 'bad driver.'

However despite these modest results, the app gave these drivers an average rating of 95.99 out of 100, an improvement on the ratings of 94.6 from last year. Across the regions, drivers in Cantabria scored the best with an average rating of 97.7, followed by the Canaries and Baleares with 97.55 and 97.44 respec-

Is chimney flue legal?

My neighbour in the Community has fitted an outside chimney flue to some type of internal fire. My house is a three-storey terraced house. The neighbour had a canopy above his ground floor window, over the short original flue. This area is now very black. Now he has extended the flue to above the first floor. The bedrooms of

my house and the other neighbours are exposed to smoke or fumes from this flue. By the black deposit already left on his wall, this could be very toxic. In England this would not pass building or public health regulations. What I would like to know is, to which authorities do I report this?

K.A. (Costa Blanca)

In a Community of A. Property Owners, you should first discuss this flue with your President or Administrator. Your neighbour should have obtained permission from the Commu-



nity in order to place anything on the outside of his wall.

You and other affected neighbours can also bring up the matter at the AGM, by asking the President to put it on the official Agenda. If none of this gives results, you have final recourse to your town hall.

Are you one of them?

MANY adults are turning away from gyms due to back

Around two-fifths of adults in the UK said they avoided exercise because of pain in the lower back according to a survey of more than 2,000 adults which was commissioned by the British Chiropractic Association.

However they said that the spine is naturally strong and moderate exercise, when done correctly, can help to build and maintain its strength and posture and actually protect you from further pain in the long run.

Meanwhile the Association reminds people that changes in lifestyle are also affecting back health, with fashion maybe more a concern than hitting the gym.

Current fashions are changing the way women walk and this is having a detrimental impact on their health. Skinny jeans for example, restrict the movement of the knees and hips which puts extra pressure on the back. High heels are also often criticised for the pressure they put on feet and back when walking.

Mobile phone use has also recently been highlighted as a cause of back pain with people hunched over looking at their phone screens.

Back pain is one of the

most common ailments with four in five people expected to suffer at some point in their lifetime. So what can you do to help prevent aches and pains in your back but still want to work out?

Be safe. If you exercise at the gym make use of the professional staff they have. When signing up for the first time, everyone should be shown how to use the equipment efficiently and safely by a qualified instructor.

Don't overdo it. Your body can do a lot and whilst you need to push it at times, remember you are not an Olympic athlete and listen to your body. Take things slowly, particularly when starting out and ask an instructor to advise on a safe way of training to push yourself without going beyond your body's limitations.

Warm up and cool down. Most injuries are caused not from the actual exercise itself but from the body's muscles not being correctly warmed up and cooled down before and after.

Try yoga. Yoga is now being widely recommended by experts to strengthen the back and medical professionals are even 'prescribing' it to ease pain rather than handing out painkillers and medication.



Heat rash

WHAT is heat rash?

Heat rash is an eruption of red skin that can sometimes be itchy but generally doesn't have any symptoms. It usually appears in areas where skin rubs on a surface, and from high body temperatures in areas such as the armpits, inner thighs, elbows, knees and also in the torso where more sweat accumulates

What are its symptoms?

Usually heat rash appears as patches of bumpy, red skin in areas where the body sweats the most. In general it does not tend to hurt, however the areas can become itchy and irritating when they are still wet from sweat or from wearing tight fighting clothes. It very rarely gets infected.

How can you treat

Heat rash tends to dis-

sipate without any treatment, however in some cases ointments with antibiotics and anti-inflammatories help reduce the swelling. In extreme cases corticoids or antihistamines may need to be used to combat swelling and itching.

Who are the most likely to get heat rash?

Anyone can get heat rash however those who are most at risk tend to be people with very light skin, children and the elderly.

Can it be prevented?

You can prevent, or reduce the frequency of heat rash. Firstly it is essential to keep your skin clean and completely dry. Fresh cotton clothing avoids irritation caused by rubbing. Always keeping your skin hydrated also helps, as well as avoiding overexposure to heat and staying in cool areas.

Evidence gathered from around 12,500 women in 16 countries found that mothers-to-be who do gentle exercise during their pregnancy such as aerobics, walking or using a bike machine, and eat a healthy diet are more likely to have a natural birth.

Currently, around one in four births in the UK are by Caesarean which, although regarded as very safe, can carry the risk of complications.

Experts said that many women wrongly believe they should be 'eating for two' when pregnant and 47 per cent of women put on too much weight, raising the risk of a Caesarean. But regular exercise signifi-

cantly reduces the moth-

er's weight gain and babies are not at risk from exercise. Although, it is always advised to stop exercising if you feel unwell or become so breathless vou cannot talk.




A thumbs up for Pastori in Benidorm






GOOD FOOD, **GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS** WITH GARRY WAITE



OOD poisoning is one of the most dreaded illnesses and is a nightmare for hoteliers and restaurateurs. But, despite the UK having the highest food handling standards, caterers are still making hazardous mistakes in the kitchen according to the Royal Society for Public Health (RSPH).

Here in Spain we also have very high standards for handling and storage. But despite continuous training and impressing on staff how important food hygiene and handling is, basic mistakes are still made. Most of those mistakes could be avoided if common sense (that wonderful oxymoron) was

Washing your hands when going to the loo might be the obvious, but more germs are picked up from the door handles than anything so best to keep an antibacterial wash - like hospitals use - outside of the toi-

The invention of hand driers was meant to cut the bacteria down but it was soon discovered that if not used properly the heat on the moist hands actually increased germ spread. They are now much more efficient and hotter - which tends to kill most bacte-

On that subject staff who contract sickness and diarrhoea, in an effort to prove what good workers they are, come back to work too early. Severe attacks take longer than 48 hours to clear the system and de-



Party time for germs! Bleach those boards

spite feeling better, bacteria can still be transmitted through body pores and finger

Personal hygiene - or lack of it - is one of the many causes of illness but the handling of food can be far more dangerous. Bacteria thrives at temperatures of between 5°C and 63°C so buffet restaurants which leave their dishes out for more than an hour or two is one practice putting people's health in danger. Never did like buffets or carverys!!

Kitchens that leave food out too long without preparing it or returning it to the fridge is another. Cross contamination when preparing different foods. Preparing raw chicken then picking up another product without washing hands thoroughly.


Chopping boards that are used for the same products. Restaurants have different colour boards for different preparations. Fridges are checked regularly but staff have to be aware that the food inside should be probed as well.

There is an ad on TV at the moment for

Dettol (I think) where a woman is seen to be wiping down a surface with a piece of raw chicken, claiming that that is as dangerous as using a dirty dishcloth! How many of us wash our dishes and surfaces and then leave the cloth to dry overnight? Thus spreading pathogens when re-used the next

I remember when I employed a young chef, who had been working in a UK hospital, many years ago he said he was disillusioned with hospital kitchens as the standards of hygiene were not up to what he had been taught at college. The final straw, he said, was when the chef told him to unwrap the frozen chickens, put them on trays and put them straight into the oven. Well they do say in the UK if you want to get ill, go into a hospital.

CHUCK IT: Plastic or biodegradable? SUCK IT.

IN a bid to further reduce the amount of plastic that litters our world, some pub chains in the UK have replaced their plastic drinking straws with biodegradable paper straws. The Liberation Group claims that it is the largest pub group to make such a move, phasing plastic straws out from all of its 100-strong pub estate across the Channel Islands and the West Country.

Explaining their decision, Liberation pointed out that plastic straws are made from polypropylene - a petroleum product designed to last forever. The straws are particularly harmful to marine life, with more than one million sea birds and a hundred thousand marine mammals killed by plastic waste each year.

As discussed on this page over recent months, there are more than five trillion pieces of plastic floating in the world's oceans, according to a 2014 study published in a Public Library of Sci-

Marine experts fear there could be more plastic than fish in the ocean by 2050, measured by weight, according to a factsheet from the Ellen MacArthur Foundation, a UK-based charity working to end waste in the economy. As part of Plastic Free July, the Liberation Group is supporting the local 'Straws Suck!' campaign. The campaign involves stopping the use of plastic straws and switching to biodegradable alternatives. Liberation pubs will be encouraging their customers to join the campaign and cut plastic waste through social media and on its pub blackboards with the #refusethestraw hashtag.

Jayson Perfect, - great name - managing director - Pubs and Inns said: "Our pubs use millions of straws each year, so we see the switch really benefiting the environment. Plastic straws are a blight on our coastlines, marine life and our oceans. This is a problem which is entirely avoidable. As an Island company who supports many charitable organisations, I feel we also have a moral obligation to support helping marine mammal life

Liberation Group's move follows a similar one by Oakman Inns and Restaurants, which banned plastic straws in April this year. It also offers eco-friendly alternatives.

WHEN I first came to this part of the world we had little choice at the time but to drink Rioja. That or we were sufficiently uneducated as to the other wines available, although most restaurants and supermarkets relied heavily on the wines from this area. One of the wines that was among our favourites - and I can't remember the last time I drank a bottle - was CVNE. Which is also the name of the bodega (Compania Vinicole del Norte de Espana). While CVNE itself was a good drinking wine the bodega produces some of the finest Riojas available, quality price into consideration The best known being Imperial and Viña Real.

I suppose the reason we liked these wines, having been more accustomed to drinking French wines, was that

Imperial had a very Bordeaux style and the Viña Real, Burgundy. Years 2009/2010 are two of the best vintages in the Rioja; and the Gran Reservas of both these wines have made their mark on the wine buffs; With Robert Parker and James Suckling both rating them in the high nineties. While buying a very quaffable CUNE roble or crianza will only set you back seven or eight euro, the Gran Reservas will be a special treat at around 50€ a bottle. Saludos.



Cheapest place on the coast



WITH prices soaring along Spain's Mediterranean coast there is now only one province where a decent-sized apartment can be rented for less than €500 per month on average.

A 90 square metre apartment in Castellon, just north of Valencia, will set beachgoers back €477 per month, the cheapest average on the whole coast spanning from Girona to Cadiz.

The data comes from real estate portal Fotocasa, which periodically publishes rental costs and their evolution over time.

Fotocasa's analysis shows that there has been a 9.4 per cent year-on-year increase in rents across Spain. The average cost is now €8.11 per square metre, which is €730 per month for a 90 square metre flat.

Despite its proximity to the coast, and thriving hubs of Valencia and Barcelona, rents in Castellon are far below the Spanish average. In Girona the same flat would set tenants back €1,158, almost triple the cost in Castellon.

In Alicante and Valencia averages for a 90 square metre flat stand at €587 and €664 respectively.

Castellon, at sub €500, is by far the cheapest on the coast. But it may not last long. The province is also witnessing some of the fastest growing rates. Prices shot up by 5.5 per cent across the province last year, and by 9.1 per cent in the capital, La Plana.

Buying back in vogue

BUYING a home is once again the smart move for the average Spanish resident after a long spell where renting was the only realistic option for younger families and professionals.

Last week BBVA Research presented its annual Real Estate Situation of Spain report. It ran a series of hypothetical scenarios, taking into account various circumstances, including wages, savings, job security and location. In almost all cases it made economic sense to buy rather than rent.

This was culturally and economical-

ly the case in Spain for decades before the worldwide financial crisis. In the past decade more and more adults have been excluded from the mortgage market as banks tightened their belts, prices collapsed and jobs disappeared.

But today steadily rising prices, low interest rates, an economy growing faster than the Eurozone average, and the soaring price of rentals, make mortgages the smart option for younger generations.

Market confidence that house prices will continue to rise is key to the pen-

dulum swing back to buying.

Prices in Spain rose by 5.3 per cent between January and March 2017, compared to the same period last year, exceeding the European average of 4 per cent.

BBVA's report predicts that prices will rise another 3 per cent nationally by the end of the year.

It concludes that one of the most determining factors when investing in real estate is the expectation of a financial award, which is now the case in Spain




Celebs selling in Spain

Lovely Lantana - a colourful shrub

GRAEME TYRRELL

IF you are looking for an attractive, colourful shrub or trailing ground cover with a long flowering season that is hardy, requires minimal soil improvement, is low moisture tolerant and attracts butterflies then you should be considering Lantana.

There are two forms, Lantana camera, the shrub and Lantana montevidensis, the trailing species. Lantana is also known as Wild Sage, Yellow Sage, and Shrub Verbena as it is a member of the Verbena family of plants.

The strikingly bright coloured flowers that form in groups come in many different shades including orange, red, yellow, white, pink and lavender. The colours may vary depending on climate, location, maturity of plant and once pollinated, the colour of the tiny individual flowers change (typically from yellow to orangish, pinkish, or reddish) giving the effect of multi-coloured flowers.

Lantana tolerate a wide range of climatic conditions, including drought, different soil types, heat, humidity and salt, making it a very



suitable addition to a Mediterranean garden. Its downside is that it produces abundant seeds and may escape the domestic garden and colonise open areas where it can become invasive. It is best to prune off as many berries as possible before they mature to reduce the distribution of seed

Many consider it poisonous due to animals consuming large quantities developing fatal liver conditions. Generally the toxicity is very low if accidentally consumed in small quantities, which is not recommended of course, but there are few reports of major incidents from people accidentally ingesting the plant, suggesting it is considered only mildly irritating to most people. Still take care not to allow children and adults to consume any parts of the plant.

It grows well in a container with a well drained potting mix placed in a position with plenty of sunlight. The container should not get too hot though as this will damage the root system. In the garden the shrub looks good alone or in groups and the trailing species makes a great ground cover and overhanging plant on terraced retaining walls or slopes with their white and mauve flowers.

Water them regularly while getting them established but don't saturate the soil. It prefers some moisture but dislikes water logging. Once established they will need to have moisture in the soil to do well but do not need excessive watering.

Keep the plant compact by pruning back a third of the growth in late autumn when the flowering is finished. Regularly deadhead the berries forming after flower petals drop.

The shrub can be shaped into a miniature tree form, or standard. Select a strong branch and remove the other side shoots allowing the branch to become the main trunk to grow and form a canopy of flowers and leaves on its top branches.

It is a lovely plant that I have grown for years to brighten up the sunny areas of my garden and attract a wide range of butterflies to add more life to the garden without much effort.

MANY people have miniature jungles on their balconies and roof terraces but if you're not particularly green-fingered and want to have a crack at 'growing your own,' mini herb gardens are a great way to start.

Balconies can be perfect as usually, they get plenty of

light and sunshine to help out even the most novice gardeners.

Although many supermarkets sell herbs, they have probably been sitting under fluorescent lights for a while so try to buy from a garden centre instead.

If space is limited, try to

buy the same amount of potting mix as you need for your pot. Leftover bags of soil just take up space.

Herbs can be planted in any sort of container - win-

dow boxes, troughs or even a bucket - as long as they have holes in them for drainage. Small buckets are great, as they can be taken straight into the kitchen for cooking. It is easier to plant one herb per pot. If you do mix them in a pot, don't put rosemary and mint together as they have a tendency to take over.

Picking the leaves of your herbs will encourage further growth and you will be rewarded with well-established plants.

Herbs like a lot of water, at least once a week, but more during the peak summer heat.

As it can be easy to confuse certain herbs, keep the information card you get with them for easy reference.

Bathroom blitz

WITH the average person spending 92 days (over their lifetime) in the bathroom, it's a room that gets a lot of use in our homes.

It's also a room that is often neglected when it comes to decorating, as many of us prefer to lavish money on our living rooms and kitchens.

If your loo could use a freshen-up, here are three easy and low-cost ideas to rejuvenate your throne room.

1. Paint the tiles

Before you start, ensure that you clean them thoroughly with a solvent (detergents leave behind residue that will prevent the paint from adhering to the

surface). Once dry, apply a coat of sealant. When ready for painting, ensure you use enamel or special paint for tiles which is quick drying, mould-resistant, washable and most importantly, completely waterproof.

2. Lay vinyl flooring

Tiled floors are great but require maintenance to keep them looking at their best. Vinyl floor coverings can be a better option for some. Calculate your floor space in square metres and allow an additional 10 per cent. Try to choose a vinyl that is at least three millimetres thick for durability.

3. Wallpaper it

If your bathroom is small, you can choose to make one wall a feature instead of doing the whole space.

Make sure the paper has a vinyl layer for easy cleaning and waterproofing. Measure the length and height of each wall to be covered (subtracting doorways and windows from the total).

Multiply the length and width to get the total in square metres/feet. Add the area of each wall for total area and increase this by 15 per cent to account for waste. European standard rolls cover 29 square feet (2.7 square metres). There are several calculators available online where you can add your measurements and they will calculate how many rolls will be required.

Your dog and a new baby

GRADULLY introduce changes in your dog's routine as soon as you know baby is on the way - if he does not connect them with the baby's arrival he has less reason to be jealous.

(a) Your dog should not be the centre of attention at all times, and should not sit on your lap (if at all) only when invited by you.

(b) Get him used to being away from you sometimes in another room, or indoor kennel ('crate'), and ban him from the nurserv.

(c) Take a refresher course at a training school, and think about practice walks with the pram it can be trickier than it sounds! (d) Check with your vet about canine hygiene and worming.

When your baby is born your dog may be left for hours while you are in hospital, or upset by the excitement if you are at

Arrange for someone he knows to look after/walk him. It is an old wives' tale (letting your dog drink breast milk or play with dirty nappies) this will not help your dog and baby to become friends, but sending home a blanket that the baby has slept on may help your dog to get used to the scent.

When you come home let someone else hold your baby while you greet your dog; introduce them later when he is calm.

Do not try to keep your dog and baby completely apart -



you won't be able to keep it up! Teach them both to interact calmly and gently, no licking by the dog or grabbing by the

NEVER EVER leave dogs alone with babies or young children; shut your dog out of the room or pop the baby in a secure play-pen. This applies every time you use the bathroom, answer the door/phone or get a meal. It is NOT a matter of 'trust.' Toddlers can accidentally injure or alarm dogs (eg by falling on them) and startled dogs may react impulsively, lashing out or biting.

Your dog may have to wait

in the queue for love but he still needs you.

Always having the baby nearby when giving him attention encourages your dog to accept having her around.

The most tolerant dog needs peace and quiet sometimes; allow him a place (eg his bed) he can escape to without being followed. Allow the child to go there at other times to prevent it becoming an exclusive area which he feels entitled to de-

When your baby starts to crawl and walk teach your dog to step back out of her way in doorways and on stairs.







A top infotainment system is complemented by 3D satellite mapping. What Jaguar calls its safest car ever has an autonomous emergency braking system and pedestrian detection.

Drivers can choose between a nine-speed automatic or a six-speed manual. A 150hp manual will cost around €35,000, while a 300hp petrol automatic will set buyers back roughly €60,000.

Dubbed the 'cub' while in production, the final version has Jaguar cub designs, including on the windscreen and even the lighting when drivers unlock their car.

Black box is boss

INSURANCE companies have developed a new black box which not only tracks the speed of drivers, but employs context to decide whether the speed is safe. A driver travelling down a winding country road at 70kph may be penalised even if the speed limit is 100kph, if the box determines that most people take the road slowly at 50kph.

New drivers, especially in the UK, are most likely to be affected by the new technology. In order to reduce skyrocketing insurance premiums, many allow a black box to be installed in their car, which monitors their driving habits.

The contextual speed technology is aimed at drivers who may feel compelled to reach the speed limit, even when more experienced motorists know it is unsafe.





ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

THE big-selling Volkswagen Golf has been the benchmark family hatchback for many years, admired and respected for its style and durability, but for those who require more space and versatility, the Golf Estate is the answer.

Recently revised and given a cooler, more classy look, the Golf Estate now has upgraded equipment and new engine options, with prices starting at €21,938 (£19.470) for the S version.

However, many VW buyers are prepared to splash out on higher-spec models laden with extra technology, convenience and luxury features which send prices of the flagship versions soaring.

This was the case with my Alltrack allwheel-drive version, which in 2.0 litre diesel form and 7-speed auto gearbox costs €35,000 (£31,060). For that you get a raft of extra features including adaptive cruise control, climate control, sat-nay with 8-inch touchscreen, more connectivity features than I have the space to list, driver personalisation profile - in essence you can set all the main controls for four different drivers -17 inch alloys, roof rails, front and rear parking sensors and reversing camera, a wealth of safety features including predictive pedestrian protection.

The more distinctive new look adds elegance to this estate model, and its driving feel quickly underlines the good impression this car creates. Smooth, quiet, refined, re-

sponsive, it ticks every box. The auto gearshift is seamless and has an eager kickdown for immediate power when required. The steering is precise, the suspension (raised on the Alltrack for more ground clearance) is still well balanced for cornering grip yet subtle ride quality.

The 2.0 litre 182 hp engine gives sportscar acceleration - 0-100 kph takes 7.8 seconds - with top speed 219 kph (136 mph). Fuel economy is 19.2 kpl (54.3 mpg).

The cabin is straightforward rather than

eye-catching, but everything is easy to find and use. Space for four occupants is very good and while there is room for a fifth, it is a tad cramped. At 605 litres, boot space is among the largest in the class, and boosts to 1,620 with the rear seats folded.

As a stylish practical family estate, there is little to fault on the Golf Alltrack Estate. While the centre rear seat lacks legroom and the rear seats don't fold fully flat, such matters pale when you consider the superb build integrity, enviable reliability record

Scandal strikes Mercedes

MERCEDES is reeling from its own emissions scandal after owner Daimler was forced to recall almost three million diesel cars across Europe. Owners of every diesel-run Mercedes sold in the UK since 2011 have been urged to take their car to a local garage to get a software update.

The update will reduce the amount of toxic pollutants released by the cars after a police investigation uncovered potential manipulation of emissions results. Daimler garages and offices across Germany have been raided.


Charges of fraud and false advertising are being drawn up against company employees. The German giant has pledged to fully cooperate with the police investigation. It faces a €220 million bill to reduce emissions on the three million affected cars on the continent.

A breakdown of the number of cars or vans to be recalled in each country has not been provided. In Spain it is likely to be hundreds of thousands.

Daimler customers can expect an invitation to take their car into an official dealership to receive the software update. The process will take one hour.

It is the second major scandal to drag diesel's name through the mud. In 2015 Volkswagen was forced to confess that it had equipped cars with specialist software to ensure they passed strict emissions controls imposed by EU law.

Daimler said the two situations are not comparable, denying that any top-down conspiracy to manipulate results has




