King and premier take on island issues

Royal summit

King Felipe VI and Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Raiov discussed the key issues facing Mallorca during lunch at Palma's Marivent Palace. The annual summer summit has taken place for decades.

At a press conference after Monday's meeting, Rajoy warned against the radical anti-tourist violence that has shaken Palma.

He noted that tourism accounts for 2.5 million jobs nationally and 11 per cent of Spain's gross domestic product (GDP). "I'm not saying tourists should be welcomed with signs reading 'Welcome Mr Tourist,' he quipped, but it was "crazy" for "leftist groups" to attack visitors."

The leaders discussed Catalan independence, regional financing and the Venezuelan crisis. Rajoy

criticised Balearic plans to take joint control of Palma airport.

Following the Canary Island model, PSOE hope to gain more financial control and a more favourable tax regime in Mallorca. The prime minister stressed the importance of unanimity on the subject. His own Popular Party is currently in opposition in the Balearic parliament and largely opposed to increased regional autonomy.

Abusive artist blotted

A TROLL who sent obscene drawings, guinea pigs and homophobic messages to political leaders has been identified by Soller Town Hall. The individual's name has not been released but legal action is pending.

The most prominent tar-

gets of the abusive messages were Soller mayor Jaume Servera, Palma mayor Antoni Noguera, and the president of the Mallorcan Consell, Miquel Ensenyat.

All three were subjected to insults, homophobia (despite none being openly gay) and obscene sketches.

Servera was also reproached for removing the Cross from the Monument to the Fallen, dedicated to Francoist soldiers during the Spanish Civil War.

Soller Town Hall said the individual responsible is a local artist with known nationalist sympathies.

Daring rescue heroes

A NINETY-YEAR-OLD woman with severe disabilities was rescued from a serious fire at a care home. The Santa Maria del Cami resident was trapped by flames and smoke, being remembered by the caretaker after everyone else had been evacuated.

With no time for a fire crew to arrive, Local Police and Guardia Civil officers performed the rescue themselves, smashing through a rear window.

They had no masks or breathing equipment and had to enter and leave the building several times, holding their breath while identifying the woman's location. Moments after they rescued her, local firefighters extinguished the blaze, which had consumed a large part of the building.

Midnight meteor shower

STARGAZERS from Mallorcan illuminated towns and villages can catch a glimpse of the Perseids meteor shower this weekend. The trail from the Swift-Tuttle comet will come very close to the earth's atmosphere. On Sunday, visitors can view the Perseids shower at the Costitx Astronomical Observatory through powerful telescopes from 10.30pm until 5am. Other events are taking place at the very remote Cuber Reservoir on Saturday night, and the Bellver Castle on Fri-

Playing with fire

FIVE British tourists sparked a mini forest fire after sneaking onto Porrassa Island in Magaluf Bay. Ignoring heat warnings, they lit a small camp fire which quickly spread to dry grass.

Panicked they tried to put out the blaze but needed help from Ibanat park rangers. The shaken tourists then tried to high tail it back to Magaluf in two pedal boats but were arrested by Local Police.

Electric Avenue

NIFTY new LED street lamps are being installed in Andratx. The old mercurypowered lamps will be replaced with 900 of the super-efficient and eco-friendly lights.

Andratx's maze of lamps will be rearranged over the next 10 weeks to make sure all popular areas are covered. Lighting will be slightly dimmer at night, saving €40,000 a year on the electric bill.

Hot weather may be what tourists want, but at this time of year millions of others just pray wild fires will not break out. Ian Relf reports.

Living in fear of fire

SPAIN'S southern residents view long dry periods as frequently a harbinger and sometimes killer, and all too often totally destructive, wild forest fires

The average total burnt area in the EU Mediterranean countries - Spain, Greece, Italy, Portugal and France - has quadrupled since the 60's, with about 1.5 per cent of woodlands lost

Research shows that rural depopulation leads to an increasing number of wild fires, and climate change - with more frequent droughts and rising temperatures - an added factor.

Arsonists, cigarettes, out-of-control garden fires, barbecues, sun shining off a piece of glass: there are many causes of the terrifying annual wild fires that Spain suffers

Modern firefighting methods see yellow fire planes and helicopters swooping down to collect sea, lake and at times pool water to then drop on out-of-control blazes... but it is often a mammoth and always scary operation that puts lives and homes at risk, as well as valuable natural



I FOREST FIRES: Can be totally destructive.

Worst blazes this century!

THE most remembered wild fires in Spain this century include:

2003. A late August thunderstorm in Extremadura led to 35,844.19 acres being destroyed.

2004. In total 29,867 acres of forest burned for nine days from July 27 in Huelva with two elderly people killed trying to leave their properties.

2005. A Guadalajara fire caused by a hiker's barbecue burned more than 13,000 acres and killed 11 firefighters.

2006. A total of 95,947.38 acres of forest burned in Galicia, with 281 fires recorded on August 10.

2009. A July forest fire in Tarragona destroyed 2,718 acres in Els Ports Park, with five firemen losing their lives.

2012. One fire destroyed 13,000 acres in Empordà. while violent wild fires in Valencia that summer burned 45,000 acres in Cortes de Pallas and Andilla.

Commission announced massive logging is needed to combat the 'olive ebola' bacteria attacking Mallorca's fauna.

There are hundreds of confirmed cases of the killer disease, which is spreading quickly across the island. Containment is impossible say scientists, and thousands of hectares of trees will need to be burned to eradicate the

WEBSITES advertising tourist apartments have two weeks to get in line with new rental laws or face fines up to €400,000. Companies, including Airbnb and Homeaway, are the main targets. Both slammed the new legislation as

Landlords face fines of between

€20,000 and €40,000 if they are caught renting to tenants staying for less than one month, unless they can prove they are not travellers.

Pirates pinched

POLICE seized almost 6,000 pirate goods from dozens of stalls and shops across Palma in coordinated raids. They made 15 arrests and blitzed a warehouse where counterfeit purses were manufactured.

Airguns and other toy weapons were confiscated, as were hundreds of fake football jerseys and other brand items. Street sellers in Arenal and Cala Major were rounded up during the crackdown.

Music linked to pain

A SCIENTIST at the University of the Balearic Islands has shown that musicians are more sensitive to pain than non-musicians. Neuroscientist and physiotherapist Anna Zamorano found that musicians are so attuned to the rhythms of their own bodies that pain is felt with particular acuteness.

The Palma-based doctor evaluated the brain waves, heart beats, and subjective pain responses of hundreds of subjects with 80 per cent feeling higher degrees of pain than non-musicians despite good health.

Reasons include the awkward postures musicians hold or their sensitivity to rhythm including their internal heartbeat. Musical activity can also replicate the changes to brain elasticity of chronic pain suffer-

The practical implications include using music therapy to activate neural connections among patients who have suffered a stroke, or have Parkinson's disease.



Royals steal the show

BULLFIGHTS and Sunday strolls through Soller were on the agenda as Spain's royal family continued their Mallorca holiday.

While King Felipe recovered from his Copa del Rey exploits and met senior politicians, Queen Letizia was seen shopping and relaxing with their two daughters.

Last Friday, the royal cou-

ple held a cocktail reception for 500 Mallorcan Guests of Honour at La Almudaina Palace. Antoni Noguera became the first sitting Palma mayor to be personally received by the royals. Balearic president Francina Armengol also attended.

Over the weekend, the King's sister Elena took her children to see the last real bullfight held in Mallorca after the passage of a new law

banning the spilling of blood.

The Princess courted controversy last year when she broke the law to take her underage daughter, Victoria Federica, to a Palma bullfight.

On Sunday, the King and Queen were pictured with their two daughters strolling around Soller, greeting locals, staying at the Marivent Palace, which closes to the public over summer.



BRITISH tourist Stewart Draper was welcomed at Palma airport by easyJet directors after becoming the 20 millionth flyer to Palma since easyJet's low-cost Mallorca routes opened in 1997.

HOTEL guests staged a large protest outside a three-star establishment in Cala Millor. The 30-strong group, comprised entirely of Spaniards, vented their fury at alleged bad treatment by the Hotel Vista Blava Elegance.

The demonstrators, all guests at the hotel, stood near the gates chanting 'Vista Blanca rob-

bery!' They claimed to be sick and tired of just about every feature of the hotel's service.

One guest reportedly suffered a heat stroke in the dining room due to a lack of air conditioning and was taken away in an ambulance. A woman took a screen shot of her phone show-

ing that it was 34 degrees inside at the time.

Similar temperature were reported in rooms, with dozens of guests finding it impossible to sleep. Others said they rushed to the bathroom to relieve themselves after eating the breakfast churros.

Staff were filmed shaking tablecloths rather than cleaning them, bathroom towels had stains, reception staff claimed to be 'interns' with no knowledge of hotel policies, one guest slipped on the floor, and others were met with a "back in 10 minutes" sign for half an hour.

Others complaints included rooms going dirty for days due to the cleaners being on holiday, the pool being closed while staff ate, and a lactose-intolerant woman being handed a cheese sandwich. One man said he would need psychological counselling to get over the stress of his stay, indicating future lawsuits are likely.



Tourist out!

POLITICAL and business leaders have denounced the anti-tourist attacks launched by a radical, separatist outfit in Mallorca in recent weeks. The group, named Arran, has pledged further acts of protest in its quest to sharply reduce tourist numbers in Mallorca and Barcelona.

Hooded activists from the Cataloniabased group threw confetti over restaurant guests in Palma and targeted yachts with flares and smoke bombs. In Barcelona they slashed the tyres of a tourist bus and sprayed it with grafitti reading 'Tourism is killing our city.'

After days of silence, Palma mayor Antoni Noguera released a statement describing the attacks as "reprehensible." He added that tourist saturation was a real problem and that, without an upper limit, "the city could die of its success."

Tourism minister Biel Barcelo conceded the Balearic tourism and economic model was subject to a legitimate debate but condemned Arran's aggressive approach.





PROTEST: Arran activists have promised more anti-tourist action.

In parliament, the Popular Party and Ciudadanos were united in their disgust, and called on Podemos, whose position remains ambiguous, to condemn the violence.

On its Twitter account, Arran claims mass tourism has led to vulnerable working conditions, the displacement of local residents from their homes, overcrowded streets and a plague of tourist trinket shops.

They have promised more action "to paralyse mass tourism that is destroying



Guardia Civil officers interviewing captured migrants say they are now paying €500 a head for a place on the boats. This is roughly half the former price, indicating that the Algerian gangsters behind the trade are feeling the heat of market competition.

New fleets of modern and mobile boats are easily capable of making the 265

kilometre journey from the Algerian coast to Mallorca, even in adverse weather conditions.

A total of 156 migrants have been arrested across the Balearic Islands this year. The adults are disnatched to detention centres on the mainland and then repatriated.

Children not accompanied by parents are allowed to stay. A growing number of underage, but fertile, girls are

being trafficked, as they are more likely to gain residency. They can then be dispatched across Spain for arranged marriages, while their children will be citizens.

The number of migrants who have made it to the islands undetected is a mystery. From their interviews, Guardia Civil officers believe Mallorca is typically treated as a stopover, with most intent on moving to mainland Spain or France.

Water crisis edges closer

DROUGHT warnings have been issued as reservoirs quenching Palma and the Tramuntana mountains run low. The Balearic executive has called on residents to monitor their water usage and avoid waste.

In a press release issued on Monday, the regional body said "the situation is still much better than last summer" but cautioned against

excess use of water.

Drought warnings have been in place in the north of the island since May. This year the threat has greatly diminished due to heavy rains over winter.

Towards the end of January, the gates of two overflowing dams were opened in the Tramuntanas such was the extent of the downpour.

In July Mallorca's key

reservoirs were 60 per cent full on average, slightly above critical levels. Last July they sank to just 44 per cent and a state of emergency was declared across the island

Water reserves regularly dwindle during the summer, not simply due to the weather, but also courtesy of millions of tourists using hundreds of litres each per day.



Iconic racer buried at sea

Royal respect for MotoGP champion after crash



I ICON: Angel Nieto's ashes were scattered in sea as thousands paid tribute.

THE ashes of Grand Prix motorcycling icon Angel Nieto were scattered in the Mediterranean on Saturday, nine days after an Ibiza quad bike crash put him in an induced coma.

Hundreds of motorcyclists gunned the engines of their bikes in a full-throttled tribute to the Spanish MotoGP champion who succumbed to serious brain injuries last Thursday.

On Sunday a ceremony was held at the Santa Eulalia church. It was attended by close family and friends, including legendary pop singer Rafael. The King and Queen of Spain sent flowers and Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy expressed his deepest condolences to the family.

A minute's silence was held during Sunday's Czech Republic Grand Prix and southern Spain's iconic Jerez track will be named after the motoring maestro, who leaves behind his wife and three adult children.

In September a formal funeral will be held in

Madrid for the Zamora-born racer, who spent much of his retirement residing on Ibiza.

Nieto, aged 70, suffered serious brain damage when a car struck his quad bike at the end of July. Doctors were planning to gradually wake him up when he died last Thursday with his family by

The Spanish motorcycling legend had 13 world championships to his name, although he superstitiously insisted on his record being reflected as 12+1. He won world championships in the 50cc, 80cc and 125cc classes, also competing at 250cc in a racing career spanning from 1964-1986.

Spanish stars including actor Antonio Banderas and Real Madrid captain Sergio Ramos, paid tribute to Nieto on social media. MotoGP expressed its "deepest condolences to Nieto's family and friends as we bid farewell to a true giant of motorcycling history who will be greatly

Panama Canal claim rejected in Miami

A BRIEF statement on the Facebook page of Jorge Quijano, Chief Executive of the Panama Canal Authority revealed that a claim for \$192.8 (€163) million has been rejected.

This will come as bad news to Spanish company Sacyr SA which alongside Belgian, Italian and Panamanian companies had claimed this amount for additional work undertaken on the Panama Canal in 2016

According to this consortium, the amount represented an unexpected overspend when required

to create a temporary water infrastructure on the Pacific entrance of the canal.

The matter had been passed to an arbitration organisation in Miami who according to Quijano not only rejected the claim but found that the consortium should pay more than \$23 (€19.5) million to the authority to cover its arbitration expenses.

None of this has been formally confirmed by the Miami based organisation, nor has there been any comment at the time writing from the consortium.

pany that manages security at Barcelona El Prat Airport could be fined

Security staff are in conflict with employers as they demand better working conditions and more staff, but this breakdown could cost Eulen dearly as it works under contract from AENA which has overall management of the airport.

The existing agreement allows AENA to take direct action against Eulen and, as its staff are about to undertake a number of potentially crippling strikes during the airport's busiest time, the courts have been asked to approve the levy of two fines, each of €150,000.

Ironically, AENA had already approved an exceptional payment of €425,000 effective from Saturday July 1 in order to allow for the recruitment of additional staff, to ensure that passengers were able to proceed through the airport without unnecessary delay.

AENA has also rejected a request from Eulen to assist in the mediation procedures with its employees, which would be a complete change of procedure, as it has never been involved in trying to settle a dispute between a contractor and their employees.

With the bad publicity arising from passenger delays for passengers from non-Schengen countries, caused by new EU passport checking regulations and now possible long delays to leave, Barcelona could find itself losing a large number of visitors who could easily go elsewhere in

The local government has become involved and demanded that a minimum level of service is maintained over each 24-hour period, but as the workers' representatives and the employer appear to be at loggerheads, long delays in very hot conditions will do nothing to sooth passenger

Higher costs for firms

THE 2017 budget deadlock meant that new social security charges for self-employed had to be suspended, but they will now cost an average of €100 per annum.

Many were taken by surprise when they discovered that their monthly payments had risen by 3 per cent after the increase was approved by Congress, although there was a corresponding uplift of the minimum income to be required to pay this contribu-

The actual amount involved will vary depending upon declared income and, as with the UK, the more you earn, the more you pay and even the reduced rate for those aged over 48 has been increased in line with other

IMF SURPRISED BY ECONOMIC GROWTH As some pensioners benefit from new rules

THE International Monetary Fund (IMF) is the latest group to upgrade expectations for the Spanish economy by the end of 2017 by half of 1 per

It now forecasts that growth will rise to 3.1 per cent from its original forecast of 2.6 per cent and confirms that it is surprised how well a number of EU economies, namely, Spain, France, Germany and Italy are doing.

Next year, it expects Spain to lead economic growth within the European Union with a slightly lower 2.4 per cent which will be well above the average, and even beat former 'power house' Germany.

Despite the positive news, the IMF report warns that there are potential pitfalls ahead due to excess capacity, ageing populations and delays in investment, leading to little advance in productivity.

Focusing on Spain, the organisation worries about the high public pension payments - the value of which is higher than the European average - and wants to see an increase in private pension schemes.

Clearly, this and the demand that pension rises should be capped and IVA be further increased are not popular with Spanish residents, and the National Government, ever-decreasing in popularity, will have to be very careful about its actions.

As opposition parties complain that the new growth in the economy has not been reflected in the day-to-day affairs of those who are in work, one

group will be pleased with the government, as 252,000 women will see additional payments with their pensions.

Those pensioners who had two children will receive at least a 5 per cent bonus and this will be increased for each additional child up to a maximum of four in order to recognise the importance of women who broke their years of social service contributions to increase the population.

More female pensioners in Andalucia than any other province will benefit from this increase.

Beware intelligent appliances

THERE has been a great deal of discussion recently about the safety of intelligent household devices and possible hacking of infor-

Equally worrying for some, according to Mintel, the world's largest market intelligence agency with global offices in Europe, the Far East and Asia, is the fact that different companies can purchase information from manufacturers.

The report suggests that in Britain just 30 per cent of those interviewed believed that insurers could be trusted to manage the data, and more than 75 per cent are apprehensive about theft of the information or the fact that it could be sold

As more of these sophisticated devices find their way to Spain, similar fears are likely to arise.

More foreign investment

SPANISH energy distributor Gas Natural Fenosa is selling 20 per cent of its business to two overseas investors for €1.5 billion.

The agreement with Allianz Capital Partners - a London based operation with offices across Europe - and Canadian pension fund CPPIB is likely to be finalised by early 2018 when approved by the different regulatory bodies.

Currently the company has 5.3 million supply points across 1,100 different towns but wants to use the investment to expand its operation to take in many more locations.

This is the third sale of significant percentages of Spanish energy companies to overseas investors so far this year with a total spend of more than €4.5

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

ONE thing that does surprise me (not really!) is why the media has carefully avoided mentioning the fact that the Grenfell Tower block was filled with 99 per cent of ethnic immigrants?

When they finally moved away, my nephew took up their place and politely explained to the man that he had been out of the country for a year and what was his position regarding any benefits?

Curtly and rudely he was informed he had been out of the country too long and couldn't be helped. Next!

Er, just a minute. The aforementioned woman had never lived in the country.



How come they were entitled to 20 minutes of the clerk's attention, while my nephew, who had been born, bred and previously worked in Northern Ireland, was rudely brushed aside with no explanation whatsoever! Now if that example doesn't smell of reversed racism, I don't know what does.


As more immigrant members of our society move into these higher authorative positions, they have to be monitored very carefully and deterred in the strongest possible way of practising the racism many of them may well have been have been accusing others of for years.

However misdirected, some will be

themselves or as gifts only to find that when it arrives, and sometimes after it blows up or shorts out, that what they have bought is fake and it seems the powers to be can do very little about it.

One of the things to look out for is the price. If you see a brand new iPhone7 for €300 I can almost guarantee it's a fake, even if it's advertised as an unwanted gift. If something looks too good to be true then it most likely is. The other day I was looking for a new keyboard for a Microsoft tablet I have. It's a model which has been superseded but which works perfectly well.

I phoned Microsoft and they didn't have them any more so I looked online and there were loads of them for sale... not one of them real but being advertised as genuine. They were all being shipped from China. I finally found one that actually said it wasn't original but was made to work with the tablet I had, so I've had a punt at that via Amazon. I'll let you know if it works.

It also works the other way round. I put a watch on ebay to sell and the amount of people that tried to get me to deliver it saying payment had been sent was quite astonishing, So be careful when buying and selling. Vehicle transfers

MANY companies and solicitors can arrange for all vehicle transfers to be done on your behalf when buying a new car. But for those wanting to save themselves a few euros, it is not as complicated or as difficult as you may think. Here we explain the process step by step so vou can do it vourself...

If you have bought a new car remember you have 15 days to transfer it into your name. To do this first you must have completed the sales contract and from this date you will be the provisional owner. You then have 15 days to complete the transfer process. During this time you need to collect the following documents: the sales contract signed by both parties; a photocopy of the seller's ID; the original logbook (permiso de circulación) and the ITV paperwork; last year's Suma tax and application to change the ownership which is the 'solicitud cambio de titularidad.' This can be downloaded from the DGT website or obtained from the Traffico office

With these documents in place you can call the 060 number to make an appointment.

Next go to the Tax Office (Hacienda) and pay the Transfer Tax (transmisiones patrimoniales) which is form 620. This form can be downloaded from the Ministry of Treasury website at www.agenciatributaria.es.

After paying the tax, go to the Traffic Office where you will pay a fee, depending on the vehicle you are going to buy, and give them the receipt you got when you paid the 620 form, along with all your documents. In a few minutes the vehicle transfer will be made and you will then be the legal owner.



Halitosis

WHAT is halitosis?

Halitosis, also known as bad breath, can be defined as the combination of unpleasant odours that are emitted by the mouth. It affects up to half the population.

What causes it?

There are two types of halitosis, oral halitosis and extra-oral halitosis. The first forms in the oral cavity itself, and is usually due to the accumulation of oral biofilm (bacterial plaque) on the tongue.

However it can also be caused by other things such as: Periodontal issues, dental cavities, smoking and others. When halitosis originates from outside the oral cavity, it is called extra-oral halitosis. It tends to be caused by systemic disorders of the upper or lower respiratory tract, the digestive system as well as hepatic or renal illnesses.

Can it be prevented?

Maintaining adequate oral hygiene, including brushing your teeth and tongue, as well as mouth should be enough to prevent hali-

Should I seek medical help?

You should always see a specialist in order to determine the origin of the halitosis and how best to treat it. In most cases it is due to problems within the mouth however sometimes it can be the sign of a more serious illness.

How can I tell if I have halitosis?

In general, halitosis is difficult to diagnose, as it is highly unlikely that a person will notice their own bad breath. In some cases a person merely suspects they have bad breath.

If in doubt, it is worth speaking to people you trust who would be able to notice bad breath. Help from an orthodontic specialist can also aid diagnosis. When diagnosing someone with halitosis, fundamental aspects of their life, such as their general health, their habits, and their oral hygiene are taken into account.

WITH recent reports that men's sperm count is now half what it was in the 1970s, experts recommend simply eating more watercress could help.

Studies have shown the socalled superfood reduces stress-related damage to DNA and has many nutrients that can maintain sperm count levels. A lecturer in sports and exercise nutrition at the Universi-

give them strength and one cup of watercress contains more than 100 per cent of the daily recommended amount of vitamin K. It is also full of calcium, magnesium, and potassium which can help lower blood pressure and contains a

high level of dietary nitrate which is also known to lower blood pressure and reduce the amount of oxygen needed during exercise, therefore enhancing an athlete's performance when eaten in large amounts.



Puffed up, feeling down

DOES it feel like you've put on a few pounds over summer or is the battle of the bulge down to something completely out of your control? With temperatures soaring, swollen ankles and puffy legs might just be down to a simple matter of water.

Water retention, or Edema as it's often known, can affect even the best of us and can sabotage weight loss plans as much as soothe our weight gain woes. It is caused by the accumulation of excess fluids in the circulatory system principally during hotter months when sweating causes the body to overcompensate for lost sodium in liquid.


"But we raised about \$9,000 (€7,600) for women and children at risk, so it was worth it."

Allergy or desire

GOOD FOOD, **GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS** WITH GARRY WAITE



FEW weeks ago we featured an article about allergies. I mentioned there are many restaurants now who take the whole allergy thing very seriously. In fact there are laws that govern menus and menu content here in Spain. Staff has to be trained with regard to this.

But it does get a bit silly at times. A young chef in Australia has got to the end of his tether having received three orders in one evening that proves that some people take the opportunity to use 'allergies' as a way to rewrite the menu! His post on Instagram got a huge response from fellow restaurateurs as well as food writers.

As one contributor wrote, "There is nothing wrong with having a food preference or not liking certain foods. Please don't call it an allergy though. True food allergies are rare, but for those who have them they are

Another said, "As a chef for over 30

years I have had enough of fake allergies, it makes a chef's life so hard and the life of allergy sufferers very hard."

Some of the requests that Chefs get are: 'Shellfish allergy but love oyster sauce' -'Gluten free but love gluten as long as it's not a piece of bread' - 'I'm Vegetarian but I love a chicken wing.' How about Pescateri-

I used to have a delightful young lady client who was Vegan. She used to eat with us a lot because our chefs could always produce something interesting for her. But on some occasions she would order a Fillet

Steak. Her reason for the change of mind was because she claimed Vegan as her sort of detox and her steak an occasional guilty pleasure. That I understand.

The classic of course is a couple on their first date. When ordering, it is not unusual to hear, "I'm allergic to onions" but invariably they just want to avoid onion breath!

So, the moral of this story is if you have a genuine allergy then say so, If you don't like or want a particular thing, just say so. But don't lead the staff and kitchen into the fear there is an allergy - as that entails many different variants!

The first man gets the oyster, the second the shell. Andrew Carnagie

Or as Del Boy would say: "The world is your lobster."

Claret or Rioja?

WHEN it comes to Viña Tondonia, most people would not tell the difference. The quality of this wine from Bodega Lopez de Heredia ranks among the best for Rioja aficionados, but with a leaning to French Claret!

In 1877, its founder Don Rafael fell in love with the region and especially with the mythical area around the hilltop town of Haro. He recognised that there was a magical combination of soil and climate which would offer the perfect environment for producing a wine that would eventually become world famous

The fermentation takes place in vast, impressive vats which are up to 140 years old. Beneath the winery is a complex network of underground galleries; hundreds of metres of slowly maturing, home-made barrels filled with ethereal liquid are kept for years before release. They take things to such a distinct level that their Reservas are aged for considerably longer than the minimal legal requirement for Gran Reservas - rather than 18 months + five years, they spend five to six years in barrel, then the same in bottle.

As Luis Gutierrez - robertparker.com says, while awarding 93 points to the 2005 vintage explains:

> "The 2005 Viña Tondonia Reserva is a blend of 70 per cent Tempranillo, 20 per cent Garnacho, 5 per cent Graciano and 5 per cent Mazuelo from their vineyards in the meander of the Ebro River, where they have some 100 hectares of vineyards. The wine fermented in the original oak vats that are now some 140 years of age. There is no temperature control and malolactic was also in the

vat. The wine was transferred to oak barrels

where it slowly matured in their deep, humid caves for no less than six years. After this, it was bottled unfiltered after being fined with egg whites. I think the quality gap between Reserva and Gran Reserva has been getting smaller since the 2001 vintage and this 2005 is nothing short of exceptional. It's clean and complex, with more freshness. The wine is very spicy and with a palate that feels very balanced, livelier than in the past. It has a long finish where the flavours are clean. Easy to drink and very pleasurable."

Not one you pick up from the Supermarket on a daily basis, but available at good wine shops at around 20€ a bottle. Santé.

Apologies and thanks

I WAS a little disappointed, yet pleased, that someone had picked me up on my oyster article of last week.

Perhaps the headline distorted the article. I was not saying that oysters were responsible for food poisoning, but that they did not contribute to the illness any more or less than mushrooms, chicken or shellfish in general.

In fact I think the article showed that oysters were considerably less likely to cause food poisoning than other items. (include mayonnaise and eggs in general)

But I thank Eddie Cheeseman (what a great name for a foodie!) for his contribution to the argument.

A little knowledge can be a very dangerous thing indeed. I used to offer £1,000 to anyone who could find an oyster farmer who told you that you just swallow, and not chew, an oyster,

As you stated oysters are now purified by law, an allergic reaction to them is rare in the extreme. The only thing that can interfere with the cleansing process is unfortunately human intervention.

As you failed to point out there are now many oysters for sale here in Javea in most supermarkets. French mostly but more recently from areas in Spain. Tortosa (just below Barcelona) and Pontevedra on the west coast, all deli-

However, they are often displayed in supermarkets standing on end (so all the water falls out) and still no ovster knives on sale with them?

We like to think we had something to do with the increased sales locally following our oyster hut at a seafood festival here in Javea.

Personally I have introduced hundreds if not thousands of people to the delights of oysters (even in schools) for the first time, explaining fully what they were used for, and are used for now, and to date no-one has ever spat one

You can be assured that over 95 per cent of people who have a negative response such as 'I don't like them' or say 'Ugh!' when you mention oysters have never even tried one.

If you do decide to 'have a go' find someone who knows all about them and can open them in front of you.

As to the difference between the differly one of those that 'spitting them out' or not even attempting to try them - they fall in to the mussels, clams and snail varieties is her defence and she still insists in branding them as 'bogies'!



Examples are Minty Host and Friendly Rentals, which manage hundreds of city apartments each. Typically they charge between 10 and 20 per cent of the rental fee for their services.

They take professional photos and employ wordsmiths to set up an effective

online advertisement for the property. Little details are thrown in to distinguish it from the competition.

Landlords don't have to lift a finger. The rental company will screen potential tourists to suit the owner's preferred profile. They manage payments online and even deal with any legal difficulties arising from noshows or property damage.

At present the new breed of holiday rental companies are strongest in Barcelona, Madrid and Seville. It remains much easier to manage and rent apartments in cities with a large tourist population.

But they are already ex-

panding into the Costas and into the slightly segregated villa and finca rental market. Their emergence has been welcomed by many landlords eager to capitalise on tourist money but who don't have the time or inclination to deal with holidaymakers on a weekly, even daily, basis.



Real estate boom



HOUSING PRICES: Are predicted to rise over the coming two years.

INVESTMENT banking company Solvia have predicted that housing prices will rise 7.4 per cent over the coming two

In their latest market report Solvia, a division of the Sabadell banking group, have predicted that property in the strongest economic regions could rise in price as much as 14 per cent. The highest gains are expected in Catalonia and

Madrid, with 11 and 14 per cent climbs respectively.

However, Solvia warned property developers not to expect the similar results to the property boom between 2002 and 2008. Although flourishing economies like Madrid and Barcelona are leading the housing market price boost, property prices in other less developed areas are still suffering a decline.

Spanish bank Bankinter forecasts that house prices nationwide will be up 4 per cent this year, and will rise a further 4-5 per cent next year.

Although liquidity (how quickly a property can be sold for) has stagnated at 10 per cent, investment banks have stated that the housing sector is growing rapidly and will continue its growth over the coming years.

LONG-TERM property rentals along the coast have delivered above average returns consistently over the last two years, according to a new study by the Urban Data Analytics (UDA).

Gross rental yield along the beach are up 5.67 per cent from the 5.37 per cent growth seen in 2016. By region, the

highest growth figures on the beach are seen in the Balearic Islands (7.32 per cent) and Barcelona (7.21 per cent).

The UDA stated that surprisingly "non-tourism residential rentals along the

beach are equally as profitable as tourist rentals.'

Long-term rentals on the beach are rising in price as record demand from tourists is reducing the availability, therefor lifting the price.

The UDA stated that prices have risen to an average of €1,005 per month across the country and that holiday homes with a pool can charge a 14 per cent pre-

Elegant gardens with minimal effort

FOR most readers July was a hot, dry rainless month, the exceptions reported being heavy damaging hail storms in Andalucia and along the northern

Current weather forecasts suggest that the drought conditions will continue but with more clouds around and a slight lowering of temperatures. Gardening should be reasonably comfortable now for first time for some weeks.

Over the past 30 years, successful gardening in Spain has had to concentrate on recognising and focusing on the emergent risks such as:

- Less summer rain and later autumn 'gota frias' as a result of concreting the Mediterranean
- More imported plants as a result of needing to replace the stock of plants killed off in gardens and garden centres by the March 2005 air frosts.



GARDEN MAINTENANCE: Well manicured yet natural gardens require good planning.

- Large forced versus smaller naturally grown plants for sale.
- Plants for sale designed to be grown artificially versus nat-
- Failure to use natural and normally safe insecticides and fungicides on a regular basis
- Increase in non-Spanish gardeners and property purchasers with a genuine interest in gardening.
- Failure for owners and gardeners/odd job men/women to develop garden strategies to-
- Reflecting on this point, what is required from the plots? If undecided or to review your objectives, here is a basic audit:
- Is there shade to be able to sit out during the hottest days or hours?
- Is there colour all year round without enormous water bills? Remember the multitude of greens are the most impor-
- Is food available from the garden? Leaves, flowers, roots, fruits and meats are more im-

portant than local supermarkets or regional macro markets

- In summer, is essential garden maintenance done before the sun is hot and sweltering?
- Are there sheltered windless winter spots to enjoy a rest from eating out and internal/external
- Is eating at home preferred to eating at local restaurants which are struggling to survive?
- Are the kings and queens of the garden the resident owners, family or holidaymakers, pet dogs or invading cats?

While thinking about an overall strategy there are some more mundane things to think about.

- 1. Do watering frequencies and volumes need to be increased?
- 2. Which annuals and perennials need to be pruned to improve their appearance and prolong flowering periods?
- 3. What herbs are ready to cut and dry for the kitchen or pot
- 4. What shrubs require seasonal pruning, the removal of untidy seeds and dead flowers

- 5. Are there signs of insects or fungal attacks that need spraying, preferably with eco sprays like Neem or Propolis?
- 6. What climbers need to be trimmed back, especially if they

overhang paths or terraces?

7. Do paths, terraces and flowerbeds need sweeping, vacuuming or blowing?

But do stick to priorities. © Dick Handscombe August 2017


