Illegal drinks sellers owe thousands

Feeling fine

Fines totalling more than €400,000 handed to illegal street and beach vendors in Benidorm are unlikely to ever be paid, police say.

The shocking claim comes after two officers were physically attacked by a dozen hawkers as they tried to issue a penalty, leading to a brawl.

Five policemen were eventually injured, with three assailants arrested and provisionally jailed as they await trial.

But a spokesperson for the local force said that the latter decision is just an "oasis in the desert of impunity" in which illegal vendors operate.

Almost 1,400 penalties, an average of 18 per day, have been lodged by Local Police in Benidorm since June 1, with hawkers caught on the street fined €1,200 and those on the beach €300.

However, as with the notori-

ous pea and potato men, con artists who set up illegal gambling games on the city streets, or the looky-looky men who sell counterfeit jewellery and clothing, a lack of firm legislation means that those who sell mojitos and other drinks on the

beach are unlikely to ever be punished.

Investigators say that because the hawkers have no payroll or declared income, they simply declare themselves insolvent on arrival at the station to pay a fine.

In addition, they never possess anything in their name meaning no property can be seized, and they continue to sell drinks.

The only solution appears to be to increase the number of officers patrolling the resort's sandy strips.

Tower power!

ARCHAEOLOGISTS have uncovered a medieval defensive tower on Peñon de Ifach, Calpe.

The latest find comes as a team of 36 headed by experts from Alicante Archaeological Museum (MARQ) assisted by students from a number of Spanish and European universities prepares to complete a two-month dig on August 31.

It brings the total of towers identified at the site to 10, plus 800 metres of wall, as the 13th century medieval village continues to reveal itself.

The dig is the 13th organised by MARQ alongside Calpe Council and the Penyal d'Ifac Natural Park, and the tower is the most important discovery so far.

It is more than four metres wide and located close to the car park allowing walkers to enter the natural park.

MARQ technician Jose Luis Menendez said that its function was defence of the main entrance to the settlement, and that it can be seen in a famous 1809 engraving of the limestone outcrop by French traveller Alexander of Labourde.

The latter appears in a book entitled 'A Descriptive Itinerary of Spain,' the

original of which can be seen in the French Natural History Institute's library in Paris.

Rafael Perez, head of the provincial architectural department, has been a driving force behind exploring the remains of the town, which was built by

Calabrian Admiral Roger de Lluria.

Taste of freedom

ALICANTE National Police have deported Said Afif, who planned to blow up the National Court, after 10 years imprisonment.

In 2004, investigators uncovered a plot to blow up the National Court using a lorry full of explosives. The courts convicted 20 of the 43 arrested for the terrorist conspiracy, but were eventually overruled by the Supreme Court, which led to 14 of the accused being released.

In addition to his 10-year sentence for belonging to a terrorist organisation, Jean Provincial Court added 18 months after he attempted to escape from two police officers when taken to hospital.

Following his release from Villena prison, Afif was summoned to Alicante Court and informed that he was to be extradited to Morocco.

Afif was transferred from Alicante airport to Barajas airport to await transfer to his country.

The Osborne group - founded in 1772 and now the second oldest business in Spain - may be famous for its brandy-sherry, but it's the Osborne Bull silhouettes that constantly steal the national limelight.

Load of national pride

THE Osborne Bull is a symbol of Spanish culture, both nationally and abroad.

With black bull silhouettes on hilltops and roadsides in many, but not all regions of Spain, the first was erected 60 years ago, 12 months after the Osborne group of wineries - originally founded in Cadiz - ordered an artist to promote a 'Veteran' brandy.

It was set in motion by Manolo Prieto, a prolific Andalusian artist who died in 1991. He remains famous for the roadside monuments even though a personal source of disappointment given other works of which he was proud failed to gain recognition.

The Osborne Bull silhouettes started life as four-metre-high wooden figures, but in 1961 they were made from metal sheets to better withstand the weather and their height was increased to seven metres.

However, one year later new advertising rules forced the Osborne company to move them away from roadsides, and they were consequently increased in size to their present-day 14 metres so that they would be more visible.

Then in 1994 the EU banned roadside advertising of alcohol, but despite an initial campaign to see all the bulls re-

moved, public outcry saw them retained, but blacked out to remove all reference to the original advertisers.

The ruling in their favour was on the grounds that they had become part of the landscape with 'aesthetic or cultural significance.'

Their wide distribution means the Osborne bull is now associated with Spain itself, with its silhouette seen on national football flags, t-shirts, caps, towels and key-rings.

Where to find the bulls

Osborne Bulls in Spain include those in the following locations:

23: Andalucia, 14: Castilla y Leon, 13: Castilla-La Mancha, 11: Valencia, 6: Aragon, 3: Asturias, Extremadura and Galicia, 2: La

Rioja and Madrid, 1: Basque country, Canary Islands, Mallorca, Melitta, and Navarre.

In addition a few are in Mexico, though with a different design and with an advertising function rather than a symbol of past culture!

culture's campaign to combat the annual plague of fruit flies, with 111 traps installed free of charge throughout the area since June. The pests wreak havoc on the crops year-on-year.

The traps last for four months and have been proven to rapidly reduce the effects of the flies.

Marina Alta men live longer

MEN born in the Marina Alta live the longest in the Valencian region, according to figures released by the Valencian Health Observatory.

Life expectancy for men born in the Marina Alta is 80.91 years, ahead of Baix Segura (80.71 years) and Camé de Turia (80.55 years). Life expectancy for both sexes in the Valencian region is currently among the highest in Europe - it is 83.3 years in Spain, 82.3 in the Valencian region and 82.1 in Europe.

Rescue success

A HELICOPTER was dispatched by the Alicante Fire Rescue Consortium in a search and rescue operation for a French hiker on the cliffs of Benitachell. The hiker, aged between 60 and 70, is reported to have lost his way. He was rescued in good health.

Strike talks continue

TALKS between airport manager Aena and the security staff unions have been described as "positive" but the proposed national airport strikes have not been called off.

Both Aena and the air navigation manager ENAIRE have agreed that there needs to be increases in wages and staff numbers, and have already forwarded plans to Hacienda in order to implement them.

They state the increased air traffic, which is expect-

ed to keep growing over the next few years, as the main reason more staff is needed.

More meetings have been scheduled, one with the secretary of State Transport, Infrastructure and Housing, Julio Gomez-Pomar.

Aena has said that dialogue between the unions and its company will always remain open.

Although these talks continue, security staff who are threatening the strikes are actually employed by private contractors appointed by Aena.

Death plunge witness sought

AN alleged mystery witness is being sought after a hotel balcony death plummet.

Kirsty Maxwell fell to her death from the 10th floor of Apartamentos Payma during a Benidorm hen party in April, as reported in *Euro Weekly News* (Issue 1661).

Now her husband, Adam, is making a plea to help find a female witness.

Previous appeals for witnesses and information have been made since the tragedy occurred but Adam believes this woman, who he claims was staying on the same floor, could provide important information regarding his wife's final

moments.

Speaking to British newspapers, he said:

"This woman has been identified as a witness and we're asking her to come forward with information - we don't know her name.

"We also have been giv-

en hotel room numbers and we are desperate to speak to some of the people who stayed in these rooms."

A post has also gone up on the 'Kirsty Maxwell Information Appeal Facebook' page appealing for this apparent witness.

Caretaker abuse allegations

A 59-YEAR-OLD Spanish man, accused of sexually abusing a girl of nine, was arrested in Campello.

Employed as a caretaker in the urbanisation where the girl lives, he allegedly went up to her as she played on the swings in the

gardens only to then act inappropriately.

Two more children saw what was happening, shouting at the man to allow for the girl's release. The caretaker was arrested and released on bail after he was brought up before a local judge.

TV presenter and model Vogue Williams has arrived in Ibiza with the man she met taking part in *The Jump* where she was injured and he was declared winner.



Tunnel breakdown brings traffic chaos

A CAR that broke down inside the San Juan tunnel caused a three-kilometre tailback that lasted 30 minutes.

The breakdown occurred at 7.40pm when the A-70 ring road was saturated with traffic. The driver attempted to

steer the vehicle to one side of the tunnel but instead it came to a halt across two lanes.

The traffic lights controlling each lane at the entrance function independently and both lights automatically changed to red as the car was

straddling two lanes.

Traffic in the Valencia direction continued to build up until the Guardia Civil arrived and succeeded in moving the car to one side, so that one lane was usable until it could be towed away.

Baby hurt in blackspot collision

FOUR people including a baby of three months were seriously injured in a multiple collision on the N-344 in Villena.

Two others, including a minor, also suffered minor injuries in the crash involving two cars and a lorry.

According to witnesses the collision was caused by a fourth vehicle, a Mercedes which fled the scene, Emergency Services and Guardia Civil sources revealed.

Although the N-344 which links the A-31 and A-35 motorways with Fuente Higuera is a traffic black spot, the colli-

sion occurred at 2.40pm on a straight section of road with good visibility, the same sources said.

The Guardia Civil did not indicate the causes of the accident but confirmed that they were seeking a foreign-registered Mercedes.

At 8.30pm on the same day, a man of 40 lost his life in a head-on collision on the CV-800 road between Muchamiel and Jijona near the Bonalba by-pass. The other driver involved was taken with minor injuries to San Juan hospital, where he refused to undergo a breath-test.

All caged up

Local connection to mystery death

ANTONIO NAVARRO CERDAN, found murdered in Valencia City over a week ago, was Novelda-born and only moved there a year ago, following his marriage.

His body was found by a neighbour in the garage of the apartment building where he lived in the Patraix district. First he noticed blood on a car bonnet and then saw Navarro Cerdan slumped between two cars with several stab wounds, one of which had pierced his heart, emergency services sources later revealed.

Aged 35 and a civil engineer with Ferrovial, he left work each day at 7am but his wife told police that by 3.30pm when his body was found she was already "very worried" as he had not answered his mobile phone all morning.

Investigators were unable to locate the weapon used or find a motive for the killing.

"He was absolutely normal and apparently had no problems," neighbours said, leading police to rule out a settling of accounts.



Instead, to the relief of neighbours who questioned the wisdom of giving a snake to an 11-year-old, the python reappeared, coiled on the pipe under the bathroom wash-basin.

Snowflake hiker causes forest fire

A HIKER was arrested in Benicassim (Castellon) after causing a fire that destroyed 500 square metres of pines and scrub.

He was slightly injured after falling and a companion set out to find help as neither was carrying a mobile. Meanwhile, and despite a region-wide ban on bonfires of any kind, the injured man lit a fire presumably intended to help rescuers pinpoint his location in the Desert de les Palmes.

The Emergency Services answered a call at

around 5pm, requesting help for someone who needed rescuing in the Desert de les Palmes. Fifteen minutes later they received another call, reporting a fire in the same area, which eventually required three firefighting aircraft and five fire engines to extinguish.

Sources later revealed that the injured person, who was able to leave the scene unaided, was arrested by the Guardia Civil.

The provincial Fire Consortium later emphasised the public's need to be aware of the risk of fire in woodland zones and above all in a protected area like Desert de les Palmes.



Five minutes for Barcelona



HONOUR: Five minutes' silence for Barcelona victims.

HUNDREDS of people gathered at the Plaza SSMM Reyes de España last Friday to pay tribute to the victims of the Barcelona terror attack.

A five-minute silence was led by Mayor Toni Perez and was followed by a speech in which he sent condolences to the families and friends of the victims and the city itself, saying: "We have to continue striving for democracy and freedom... What these warriors want is not only to dampen our spirits, but to change our habits and we will not let this happen."

La Vuelta take two

LA VUELTA will pass through Benidorm this Sunday.

Cyclists are expected to cross the Paseo de Poniente and the Parque de Foietes (Avenidas Jaime I, Alfonso Puchades and Comunidad Valenciana) at around 3.35pm during the ninth stage, which runs between Orihuela and Benitachell.

The race will be screened live to viewers in 190 countries worldwide, with 1.4 million people in Spain expected to tune in.

Around 90 minutes before the cyclists arrive in the city, La Vuelta representatives will hand out banners and flags to spectators.

Traffic will be cut in the streets where the race passes 30 minutes before the cyclists arrive and will be reopened 15 minutes later. Councillor Jose Ramon Gonzalez de Zarate has indicated that this should not cause too much disruption since it is a Sunday with less traffic.

Councillor of Sports Arturo Cabrillo said that "it is a real pleasure that La Vuelta will pass through Benidorm" whilst de Zarate thanked the Alicante Provincial Council for "sticking with the city," after it hosted the penultimate stage of the race last year.

Days earlier another swarm took refuge on Playa de San Juan, again on a

beach umbrella.

This occurred when the Local Police were called after a swarm of 50,000 bees was discovered at a Playa San Juan apartment. The police contacted an apiarist who was able to remove most of the bees early in the morning while they were still in the hive.

Later that day the remainder swarmed on the beach, choosing the beach umbrella

of a family who were in the water at the time.

This time firemen specialists were brought in and, as they did a week later in Campello, were able to box and remove the bees.

“Because they were moved from one place, the bees looked for another,” explained Charo Beresaluze, a biologist and environment technician from the Red Cross in Alicante.

“It would have been a young queen who chose the umbrella as a safe refuge,” she said.



An agricultural emergency

FARMERS in Alicante have been forced to move away from traditional crops due to rising temperatures and droughts brought about by climate change.

According to research carried out by the Agrarian Association of Young Farmers, Asaja, produce grown throughout the province has dropped by 35 per cent.

“The land devoted to growing potatoes will shrink to under 500 hectares this year, compared to the 888 used last year,” explained Eladio Anorte, president of the association.

“The winters are now warmer, it rains less and

heat waves are becoming increasingly more frequent,” he added.

In a bid to survive climate change, many farmers have opted for fruits that are better adapted to the heat, such as avocado or mango.

General Director of the Agricultural Counsel for the Valencian government, Maria Chafer, stated that the government are looking into reviving traditional crops to tackle the rising heat.

“The traditional crops of the province, such as grapes, olive trees or nuts, are more adapted to the heat, so it is necessary to consider facilitating their recovery,” Chafer explained.






Files incomplete

SAN VICENTE'S municipal archive is still unused, 18 months after the building was completed.

The Partido Popular party, in opposition on the local council, complained that documents and papers are

still stored in different municipal offices as well as rented premises.

The archive building cost €894,991 to build, of which €392,000 came from the provincial council, the Diputacion.

Human Resources councillor Manuel Martinez explained that the town hall would have to pay a monthly €5,500 to staff the archive in addition to overheads like electricity, water and internet.

In contrast, the only non-municipal premises that the town hall rented for the archive cost a more affordable €400 a month.

Meanwhile the archive would remain closed until the town hall could hire the necessary staff, Martinez said, although he confirmed that the requirements for the post of archivist have now been published. Terms for the secondary position of archive auxiliary would be published once these were agreed, the councillor said.

New trains for Line 9

LINE 9, which runs between Benidorm and Denia, is to have six entirely new trains.

The regional rail operator FGV has awarded Stadler Rail Valencia a €43.3 million contract to supply six dual-mode trains, replacing the existing diesel trains.

Although their bodywork is relatively new, the engines and chassis were originally built between 1966 and 1973 and require constant repairs.

The new fleet can also operate on electrified tracks, FGV said, and will still be usable when electrification eventually reaches Line 9.

The new trains' dual mode will also allow FGV to go ahead with plans for an electrified

tram system at the entrance to Denia, the rail operator said, with tracks integrated into urban surroundings for the benefit of pedestrians and vehicles.

Platforms at stations and halts along the 50 kilometres of track have been, or will be adapted to accommodate the new trains in Line 9's multimillion overhaul.

Modernising tracks, bridges, viaducts, safety systems and signals between Calpe and Denia was due to start last autumn but FGV instead closed the line in July 2016 on safety grounds, covering the route between both towns with buses.

All Line 9 work should be finished by 2019 when the new trains will come into service.

Third time unlucky

PARISH priests at Villajoyosa's Asuncion church confirmed that it could not be used for an October music festival.

For the last two years the church has been the setting for the Ateneu d'Historia d'Art's La Vila del Joy festival of ancient music.

The organisers had assumed that they would be allowed to use the church once more, but were informed in July that this would not be possible.

An online petition requesting a change of heart received 700 signatures but the priests once again refused, setting out their reasons in a two-page statement.

They indicated that according to diocesan guidelines, churches "could not be considered public places used for all types of meetings." The statement conceded that concerts could be held in churches in circumstances for "exclusively sacred or religious" music and pointed out that

this could not be said of all classical music.

It was not true that the Asuncion church turned its back on culture as the petition claimed, the statement contin-

ued. It also queried the association's claims that the parish received public money for the church's upkeep or that the previous concerts had raised money for restoration.

Did you sell your property at a loss and still have to pay plusvalia tax?

A new ruling could see you receive this.

Plusvalia tax is the amount of tax that a vendor needs to pay when selling a property.

It taxes the increase in the value of land over a maximum period of twenty years, from when it is sold, and until now, irrespective of whether there was an increase in the value of the land or not, the vendor had to pay plusvalia tax.

NEW RULING of 11th MAY 2017 by Spain's Constitutional Court declared that if a property is sold at a loss, there is NOTHING to pay.

Although this has been approved, it cannot be enforced until the Spanish courts declare the previous law null and void. This means that for the time being, local town halls will continue to charge plusvalia tax to all vendors, irrespective of whether there is a loss or a gain.

- The property was sold at a loss from May



2013

- Refunds are estimated to be on average 1,000€+
- There is an estimated 10,000 million

euros – more than 550,000 vendors who will qualify for this refund.

- You must have paid the plusvalia tax in the first instance.
 - Hire a lawyer to lodge the claim.
 - Only claim back this tax dating for the last four years. Any plusvalia tax paid before May 2013 cannot (at the moment) be claimed back.

Yacht club fears for its future

AMENDED Generalitat fees could compromise the survival of Altea's Club Nautico.

Following an official inspection, the regional government plans to increase the club's current fees for occupying its seafront site by 700 per cent, said the club's president Jose Roman Zurutuza.

"We are being persecuted by the regional authorities," claimed Zurutuza who awaits the results of an appeal against the sevenfold rise.

As a result the club needed to modify its budget and cut down on spending for sporting activities while increasing tariffs and quotas, he warned.

These measures were necessary to guarantee the viability of the club until 2020, although the last word rested with members, he said earlier when calling an extraordinary general meeting to debate the emergency plan.

After what Zurutuza described as a "multitudinous, intense and very enriching" meeting, club members voted in favour of the increase.

The change in economic circumstances meant that not only the Club Nautico in Altea but all of the region's non-

profitmaking yacht clubs "were on the edge of the precipice," he declared.

All were being hounded by a regional Administration that ignored the clubs' social and sporting functions, Zurutuza said.

"What is happening is unjust and the merciless attitude of the Valencia Administration compares unfavourably with policies in Balears and Murcia, where they are renewing yacht club licences because they are aware of their importance."

Plenty of fish in the sea

THE regional government is expected to rubber stamp an application to enlarge a fish farm off the Villajoyosa coast.

Latest changes will include another 12 cages, each with a 38-metre diameter, which will be added to the existing 30 cages where sea bass, gilthead bream and corvina are raised.

The extra area will allow the fish farm to increase production to 1,050 tons of sea bass and gilthead bream and 1,400 tons of corvina.

The new section will cover 280,000 square metres on the seaward side of the present installation and the paper work is practically complete.

Once the Generalitat's permission comes

through, those opposed to the scheme will have a month in which to appeal.

There is less opposition to this extension than plans for an entirely new installation in front of La Vila's El Centro beach.

This has been challenged not only by Villajoyosa Town Hall and the local fishing guild but national and international archaeologists and academics.

A new fish farm would adversely affect the Bou Ferrer wreck, a sunken Roman galley still laden with amphorae and lead ingots. Now a protected archaeological site, this would be rendered "unviable" by another fish farm, the Heritage General Directorate announced.



Pay rise causes tension

THE four-party coalition at San Juan Town Hall approved an 8 per cent pay rise for councillors.

This will come into force once the 2017 Budget has been approved, but the news was not welcomed by all members of the council.

Three of the parties belonging to the coalition - the PSOE, Esquerra Unida and Decido - are in favour of the increase. The fourth member, Compromis considered that the extra €30,000 a year this will cost should be used for the benefit of San Juan's population.

Compromis also maintained that the salary increase breached the four-party pact signed after the 2015 municipal elections when it was agreed that wages would be reduced by 20 per cent.

The new mayor's monthly salary of €1,650 was slashed to

half of his predecessor's while full-time councillors received €1,550. The savings made were allocated to local employment and social welfare.

As policy decisions need the backing of three-quarters of the coalition members, the pay increase will go ahead despite opposition from Compromis.

San Juan's mayor Jaime Albero and Human Resources councillor Antoni Manel Giner expressed surprise at the stance taken by Compromis.

"This isn't a pay rise. It simply brings earnings into line with minimum wages which have risen 7 per cent for all Spanish employees, plus a 1 per cent cost of living increase," Giner said.

"The pact hasn't been modified by even one comma," he insisted.

Grapes for dessert

RABBITS are still proving a nuisance to Novelda grape growers.

Authorised hunting reduced the local rabbit population by 2,500 over the last month but there are still too many around.

They are still gnawing the trunks of the vines and are now gorging on grapes as well as damaging drip irrigation systems, growers complained.

For the last six years, rabbits have been affecting local agriculture but the situation worsened

three or four years ago due to drought and food shortages.

Growers recently received the help of the local hunting association, Sociedad Cinegetica Noveldense, but the rabbits reproduce so quickly that the problem still exists.

The hunters are also encountering problems as there are fenced-off areas that they cannot enter and in others, they cannot take aim at the rabbits for fear of damaging the espaliered method used for growing the local dessert grapes.

Growers and hunters have arranged to meet next month to discuss removing the rabbits.

THE British government recognises that no-one in the UK has any experience in negotiating trade deals outside of the European Union.

For this reason therefore, it has appointed New Zealander Crawford Falconer as Chief Trade Negotiation Adviser and Second Permanent Secretary for the Department of International Trade.

The former ambassador to the World Trade Organisation (WTO) will be the principal adviser to the International Trade Secretary (Dr Fox) on striking trade agreements and market access deals with the UK's global trading partners.

A New Zealand/UK dual-national, he was recently Professor of Global Value Chains and Trade at Lincoln University following a career in New Zealand's Foreign Office, as Deputy Secretary for International Trade and Foreign Affairs.

Next round of Brexit talks about to start

IN anticipation of the next round of Brexit meetings due next week, Britain is in the process of publishing a number of position papers highlighting government hopes.

When the parties meet in Brussels, the Minister responsible for Exiting the European Union, David Davis will propose that goods already on the market should be allowed to remain on sale in the UK and EU without additional restrictions and wants to see existing consumer protections remain in place.

In addition, he will propose that both sides should continue to keep shared official confidential documents secret in the future.

On the face of things, these are both relatively benign requests which the EU should have no problem with, but the next paper concerning the European Court of Justice, could be the first of a number of hurdles which could stall talks even at this early stage.

Britain is intent on trying to obtain per-

mission to start to negotiate future trade deals prior to Brexit, but the EU has made it very clear that it will not agree to even discuss the possibility until the matters of citizens' rights, the UK's 'divorce bill' and the Northern Ireland border have been resolved.

Mr Davis appears confident that this series of position papers will be welcomed by the European Union negotiators and that this should allow talks to progress to what he refers to as the "next stage of talks."

The initial EU response is that the framework for negotiation has been set by the EU27 and that they currently have no intention of deviating from that structure, which once again leads back to the three main topics have been settled.

With week-long meetings once a month between the two parties, with one looking for agreement in one area and the other looking for concessions in a different area, meetings during the next 18 months could be contentious.



"The town hall is allied to the sector and its sole aim is bringing to light unfair competition that damages the efforts of those who work each day to offer high standards," Arques said.

No big deal

A SUPERMARKET on a Teulada-Moraira urbanisation reopened its doors on Monday after being temporarily shut down by Sanidad last week.

Concerns were raised over the supermarket not having the correct licences in place for their bakery and butchery departments and it was shut by Local Police last Thursday.

As the supermarket reopened on Monday, its owner confirmed to the Spanish press that the deficiencies had been resolved and this issue was due to a change of licences not having been made.

Complaint against mayor

SOS Moraira has filed another complaint in the court of Denia against Head of the Provincial Service of the Coasts of Alicante - Rosa de los Rios, Teulada-Moraira mayor - Carlos Linares, Councillor Nieves Rodriguez and others who ordered the dissemination of 8,000 tonnes of artificial sand along the beach of Playa Portet.

The artificial sand was scattered in March in a bid to recover the beach after the January storms, despite the fact the beach did not suffer like others of the Marina Alta as the Cap d'Or protected it.

At the time, Ecologists in Action (EIA) demanded the halting of these actions which they warned would have a serious effect on the sur-

rounding ecosystems of Moraira, specifically the posidonia meadows.

SOS Moraira believe that the posidonia meadows have now been affected.

Concerned residents have supported SOS Moraira, with at least 10 properties in the area adorned with home-made 'SOS el Portet' flags.

In its 49th edition, the event ran a 1920s cabaret theme for the senior queen election and a circus theme for the junior queen election.



Copper thief caught

A 38-YEAR-OLD Bulgarian man was arrested for posing as a municipal gas engineer and stealing more than 700 kilos of copper pipes from residents in Teulada, Moraira and Benissa.

The thief caused over €20,000 damage stealing from at least 32 homes.

The investigation, led by the ROCA team in El Verger, learnt how the man had gone to considerable lengths to disguise himself as he fooled residents - wearing a uniform just like the ones municipal engineers wear as he made his way around urbanisations in a white Seat Toledo.

He took time to study the homes from which he would steal, before jumping the gates and cutting the copper pipes - which could have caused an explosion given the pipes were cut without the gas being shut-off.

The thief was caught on one occasion by a home-owner, who he fooled into thinking he'd been sent to the property with a municipal works order.

After several incidents, offi-

cers were able to obtain an image of the man from a security camera at one of the urbanisations.

With the image, officers visited local scrapyards where he had been trying to sell the pipes on.

At one of the scrapyards, where the thief had sold on a considerable number of the pipes, officers were able to fully identify him and contacted the

Bulgarian authorities, who verified his whereabouts.

The man was arrested at his home in Teulada and will be detained in prison before facing trial.



In need of plastic surgery...

As record numbers of tourists touch down on Spain's shores, David Noon examines how the plastic problem is worse than ever

FAMILIES basking in glorious sunshine, children digging for buried treasure beneath golden sands and loved-up couples frolicking in the shallows are all things you'd expect to find on Spain's beaches this summer.

However, there is one unwanted visitor that is making a repeat appearance: plastic. (And no, we don't mean TOWIE stars in Marbs or the latest batch of Love Islanders in Mallorca.)

This year - more so than ever before - tourists along Spain's coastlines and its islands are having to wade their way through plastic bottles, bags and packaging as they attempt to enjoy a dip in the Med.

In total, researchers estimate that there is around 3,000 tons of plastic floating on the surface of the Mediterranean Sea, with more added to the fray every year. (No doubt, the travel agents didn't mention that to the record number of tourists expected to touch down in Spain this summer.)

And because the Med is almost enclosed the plastic is effectively trapped, taking decades to be broken down.

However, it is not just the tourists affected by the plastic floaters. Marine life is also suffering as sea turtles mistake bottle tops for crustaceans and Mercadona bags for jellyfish.

Scientists at the Society for the Protection of Turtles have been keeping a close watch on the Med and are alarmed by what they are seeing.

Robin Snape, project co-ordinator for the group, said: "In the green turtle (the presence of plastic is) really common. The vast majority of them have some plastic in their gastro-intestinal tract. It's more than 90 per cent of the population."

And it is not just turtles that are mistakenly chomping down on the plastic at sea.

In 2013, a whale beached in Almeria with 17kg of plastic waste inside its stomach.

The sheets of plastic discovered inside the whale were strikingly similar to those used in Almeria's infamous

plastic greenhouses - of which 45,000 tons of plastic waste is produced each year.

Conservationists are attempting to compensate for the deaths of the sea turtles by protecting nesting sites that are often dug up by dogs and foxes. But is that really the answer? Shouldn't we all be doing more to prevent the plastic waste in the first place?

While the likes of US president Donald Trump dismiss plastic waste, ocean pollution and global warming as 'fake news,' there are others doing their best to raise awareness.

In Mallorca, conservation group OceanCare is attempting to raise awareness through its 'I Care' campaign.

"People are becoming increasingly aware that our throw-away plastic culture needs to change fundamentally," Fabienne McLellan of OceanCare said.

"This is why OceanCare launched the 'I Care' movement which unites people around the world who want to tackle one of the most pressing challenges of our time: to put an end to the age of single-use plastic and thereby limiting the amount of plastic debris ending up in our oceans."

One (unconventional) way in which OceanCare is attempting to motivate people to join the cause is through

Dirty little secret

SPAIN has almost 300 known illegal landfill sites, according to the EU.

Earlier this year, the EU courts ruled that Spain was in breach of the European body's Waste Framework Directive for failing to bring 61 landfill sites in line with EU environmental safety rules.

Moreover, the EU has alerted Madrid to a further 230 landfill sites that are in breach of environmental regulations.

The European Commission has been attempting to stamp down on Spain's landfill problems for more than a decade.

In 'an effort to urge Spain to speed up the process' of dealing with its landfill sites, the Court of Justice of the EU has ordered the 61 illegal landfills to be 'closed, sealed and restored, without fur-

ther delays.'

In the meantime, the EU expects Spain to look into further illegal waste sites after an EU executive sent a formal notice to Madrid over 'at least 291 identified uncontrolled waste landfills across Spain.'

But as policy officer for Zero Waste Europe Ferran Rosa says, the problem is not just limited to Spain.

"The Spanish case highlights a problem that exists to a varying degree across Europe, and the difficulty of enforcing existing legislation, said Rosa.

"Just taking this example, the infringement procedure for Spain is open since 2007 and even if the commission is willing to push for the implementation, potential sanctions take years to come," Rosa said.

the medium of rock music.

Collaborating with German rock band Itchy, OceanCare supported the band's efforts to shoot its video for campaign song 'The Sea.'

Set in Mallorca, the German rockers' music video attempted to motivate its young fans by exposing the consequences of plastic pollution.

McLellan added: "With these activities, we not only wish to raise awareness, but to also invite people to rethink their behaviour and join our movement - without pointing fingers but rather, with empowering them."

But while OceanCare is doing its bit in the Balearics, the mainland is facing a slap on the wrists for failing to meet an EU order on plastic bags.

Supermarkets across the country may have started implementing a five cents charge per bag, but that falls far short of the EU's Plastic Bag Directive.

The EU Commission has sent Spain a final warning, informing the member state that it must either implement EU rules on lightweight plastic carrier bags or face infringement proceedings before the European Court of Justice.

Spain - along with Greece, Italy, Poland and Cyprus - now has just

two months to satisfy the Commission if it wishes to stave off a court case.

The Commission maintains that the member states have not properly implemented the Plastic Bags Directive which is intended to dramatically cut the consumption of carrier bags with a wall thickness of less than 50 microns within the EU.

And in typical 'mañana, mañana' fashion, Spain has missed the deadline and some. Adopted more than two years ago, the deadline for transposition expired on November 27, 2016. Nine months later and Spain is still dragging its heels.

In the long run, the ruling hopes to drastically cut down the number of plastic bags circulated in Europe.

The Directive obligates member states to take measures which may include requiring that a price be charged for these bags and/or introducing national reduction targets that ensure that no more than 90 lightweight carrier bags are consumed per person and year by the end of 2019 and no more than 40 bags by the end of 2025.

Spain may or may not receive a financial telling off by the EU courts for its failure to curb the plastic flow. But it is not the public coffers nor the politicians who are the real sufferers here.

For every day that plastic regulations are ignored, the Mediterranean's remarkable sea life will continue depleting.

Eating your problems

EVERYONE has been guilty of tucking into a tub of Ben & Jerry's or gorging on a packet of crisps in an attempt to eat their problems away.

Now scientists think they have discovered one hungry critter who is ready, and willing, to eat away our plastic problems.

Wax moth larvae are usually bred as fish bait, but a chance discovery has revealed their taste for plastic - which could be used to beat polluting seas.

In the wild wax worms live on beeswax, making them a constant pest for beekeepers across Europe.

When Federica Bertocchini - a scientist and amateur beekeeper - removed an infestation from one of her hives and put them in a plastic bag, the worms simply ate their way out.

"I went back to the room where I had left the worms and I found that they were everywhere," she said. "The bag was full of holes."

The prison break led Bertoc-

chini, a researcher at the Spanish National Research Council, to investigate the feeding habits of the centimetre-long Galleria mellonella grubs.

To her surprise lab tests revealed that 100 worms can devour 92 milligrams of polyethylene in as little as 12 hours.

With such a voracious appetite for plastic, the worms could be put to good use, the scientists reasoned.

And with 3,000 tons of plastic floating atop the Med and thousands more tons sitting in landfills in Spain and across Europe, scientists are now pushing these plastic-eating

worms as a way to tackle the waste.

"We want to know if they're munching the plastic to use as a food, or just because they want to escape," said fellow researcher Paolo Bombelli. "If they just want to escape, they are going to get fed up very soon. But if they're munching it to use as an energy source it's a completely different ball game. We are not yet able to answer this, but we're working on it."

While more tests are currently being carried out, a beekeepers nightmare could soon be heralded as an environmental saviour.

THE Netherlands experienced fewer killings last year with 110 people murdered, 10 less than in 2015. Figures show that a quarter of the men murdered in the past five years died in gang-related violence.

Egg crisis

MPs are returning from their summer break early to discuss the growing egg crisis with millions of eggs believed to be contaminated with a fertiliser. It is estimated the crisis is set to cost the Dutch egg industry €150 million.

Booming breweries

AROUND 500 breweries are now based in the Netherlands thanks to the increase in small local beer markets. At the beginning of the 1980s there were just 20 breweries.

Radio hostage

A WOMAN was held hostage at a radio station after an armed man stormed the building. The 3FM station continued broadcasting as police brought the situation under control and arrested the man.

SWEDEN**Asylum rejected**

ONE of the world's oldest asylum seekers could be deported back to her home in Afghanistan. The 106-year-old fled her home in 2015 with her son and grandson but it seems her asylum application has been rejected by authorities.

Rare find

IMAGES have been captured of Sweden's rare white moose by a man who spent three years trying to spot it. There are around 400,000 moose in the country but only around 100 of them are white.

Summer snow

WHILST Spain still basks in summer, Sweden has experienced its first snow fall of the season. It was registered at Sweden's highest mountain station at 1,228m above sea level.

Maternity protests

PROTESTS are planned against the 'chaos' in maternity care. Demonstrations have been organised in 15 towns and cities to highlight the strain in the industry amid cost-cutting measures.

NORWAY**Poll results**

AHEAD of the elections, the latest opinion polls have shown the opposition Labour Party has its worst poll results in four years. The poll showed just 27.1 per cent of voters supporting Labour.

English concern

CONCERNS have been raised by the Language Council of Norway over the amount of English used in courses at Norwegian universities and colleges, with some being entirely taught in English.

Pay inequality

FEMALE managers and executives earn around 77 per cent of what their male colleagues earn in the same positions according to a report highlighting wage inequality.

Clean energy

AN energy think tank believes Norway can become the world's first fully electric-powered country by 2050. Hydro power provides over 96 per cent of Norway's electricity and there are more than 110,000 electric cars already in use.



NEW archaeological findings could push back the consensus view of when Moscow was established by a century. The city's head archaeologist Leonid Kondrashev said that new evidence suggests Moscow was a thriving town during the reign of Prince Iziaslav I. He ruled 100 years earlier than the accepted date of 1147.

THOUSANDS of Russian men of all shapes and sizes have been whipping off their tops to pose for Putin-style photos. The humorous campaign was inspired by the president's recent Siberia holiday which was spent half-naked by a lake. The #PutinShirtlessChallenge forbids flexing and photoshop manipulation.

Poet battle

A VIDEO of two Russian rappers battling each other with lyrics gained more than 10 million views in just 24 hours. Veteran rapper Oxxxymiron was defeated by Slava KPSS by dint of public reaction. The pair skillfully insulted one another in Russian-flavoured English rhyme.

Silent film

A BLOCKBUSTER film about the Russian annexation of Crimea is unlikely to receive international release. Western and Ukrainian fury about the 2014 move means the film is set to be screened only in Russia and Belarus. It depicts a love story amid the return of Crimea to Russian control.

More Indian tourists

WHILST much is made of the love that fellow Europeans have for Spain as a holiday destination, an estimated 1.8 million travellers from India are expected in 2017.

With such a huge population and a growth in an affluent middle class, many Indians have decided to take holidays in Europe and can obtain Schengen visas relatively easily which will often allow them to travel between countries once they are in the Schengen zone.

Spaniards will emigrate

RESEARCH suggests that up to 60 per cent of Spain's workforce would be prepared to move overseas to take up a new position should the opportunity arise.

This means that if the answers received are accurate, some 11 million Spanish workers would be quite content to move abroad if their ideal job became available.

When one considers the high unemployment rate amongst younger people, it is not surprising that the analysis by Randstad - a leading company in human resources solu-

tions in Spain - identifies the under-25s as the group most likely to look to travel abroad for work.

In the 1960s and 1970s, a large number of Spaniards travelled across Europe to find work which resulted in many waiters and hotel staff arriving in the UK, saving money and in many cases returning to their homeland to retire.

The situation today is somewhat different as those who have moved through to higher education in Spain

have studied one or more foreign languages which means that they are better equipped than their parents and grandparents to find work abroad and apart from the UK, many who speak English and Spanish are attracted to the USA.

Understandably, the older workers grow, the less inclined they are to want to cope with the upheaval of moving abroad but overall, Spaniards appear to be the most likely to be prepared to move to a new country when compared to citizens of most other Western European countries.

Outrage affects bonds

INVESTORS have started to take a major interest in what are known as 'safe haven' bonds within the eurozone.

This move towards euro bonds reflects certain investor worries about the US economy and has been exacerbated by the Catalan terrorist attacks.

Money tends to flow into what are regarded as secure areas during times of economic or general turmoil which has meant Spanish government bonds will have to increase rates to attract new sales.

means that UK prices for walnuts have increased by a fifth in the last few months.

This price rise has had a knock-on effect on the production of Walnut Whips - a British favourite for more than 100 years - making manufacturers Nestlé introduce a new range of Whips flavoured with caramel, mint and vanilla but without the traditional nut on their peak.

The traditional Whip, complete with walnut will continue to be sold singly and at Christmas, there will be a special six-pack.

Spanish airline shares fall

TERRORIST attacks in Barcelona immediately caused a drop in the value of shares in Spanish airlines as well as airlines who serve Spanish airports.

This only adds to the perceived problems of travelling in and out of Spain by air with record

queues of people waiting to have their passports checked and a decision by security staff to hold 25 days of strikes leading up to the Christmas holidays.

It is hoped that some settlement will be reached before the next peak travel season.

ONLINE SHOPPING BECOMES EASIER

Retailers build better sites

A NEW report suggests that with up to 80 per cent of the Spanish population having access to the internet, e-commerce is about to accelerate dramatically.

Currently Amazon Spain is estimated to be the largest internet seller in the country with turnover in excess of €3 trillion, followed surprisingly by Chinese site Alibaba which operates in Spain under the name Aliexpress at just over €1 billion, whilst el Corte Ingles trails in third place at €530 million.

As more retailers offer an online purchasing service, so more consumers are purchasing through them but what isn't known or even understood is how many of these sales would have been made in store and therefore how profitable these sites really are.

For small retailers online outlets such as Amazon are without doubt an ideal option as consumers can compare prices and read service reviews.

This also becomes an attractive option for larger stores but whilst they benefit from their strength in purchasing in bulk, they have to ensure that their operating costs don't make them uncompetitive.

Stores such as those owned by the Inditex and Mango groups are able to reach customers in areas where shops are spread thinly and they have invested large amounts into ensuring that their sites are quick, efficient and easy to use.

Supermarket sites, which are very popular in the UK, are perhaps not so profitable here and appear in some cases to have been introduced for the sake of having an online site rather than actually planning them out properly.

The Mercadona group is a perfect example as it has had to be re-designed and responsibility for this has been handed to the founder's

youngest daughter Juana Roig, but the results suggest Mercadona is well ahead of its competitors with growing purchases online.

Having said this, it is estimated that total turnover is somewhere between €170 million and €190 million which is just 1 per cent of annual turnover and this division currently trades at a loss.

Conversely however, customers tend to buy larger amounts of goods than they would in store in order to justify the delivery and handling charges.

Those with an eye for a bargain however have discovered that some (although not all) sites outside Spain will deliver via couriers, often free of charge, so it is possible to purchase perfume from the UK, costume jewellery from Germany or even clothing from Debenhams online with substantial savings over Spanish retail prices.

AMERICANS BEEF UP MARKET

Huge growth for burger chains

A SIMPLE piece of minced beef in a bun is fuelling a whole new revolution in the fast food market in Spain.

For generations, the vast majority of restaurants and food outlets in Spain sold traditional Spanish food and to a great extent older generations of Spaniards have remained loyal to this cuisine.

As with so many other European countries however, the American way of eating started to spread and by the middle of the 1980s, both Burger King and McDonald's were firmly entrenched in the Spanish psyche.

The concept of this type of fast food spawned a number of local eateries such as Vip although other American food outlets including KFC and Friday's promoted the opening of franchise operations around the country.

The two big burger giants saw off the presence of Wendy's American burgers but are now facing an onslaught of beefy competition.

In many towns, local, un-franchised burger restaurants with names like Gourmet Burger and American Burger have opened up. These offer a burger ex-

perience rather than simple fast food and attract a trendy audience.

Having seen the success of McDonald's with its 500 branches and Burger King with 700, at least three US chains have now decided that the time has come to expand their empires within Spain.

Although not household names in Europe, Steak 'N Shake with 544 outlets in the USA, Five Guys with 700 and Carl's Jr leading the way with 1,385 have started to test the Spanish waters by opening restaurants in some

of the main cities in Spain.

Clearly if these are successful then there is likely to be a massive expansion especially in areas with shopping centres where each of these operations would fit in well.

One of the problems that the existing companies running burger outlets may face is the cost of franchising as it appears that the 'new boys on the block' are prepared to undercut McDonald's and Burger King with lower start-up costs in order to gain a speedy increase in market share.

Beatles' relics still popular

ALTHOUGH it is nearly 50 years since the Beatles split up, they are still the most collected group worldwide with a page of lyrics likely to sell for €20,000.

This is the amount expected to be paid in auction in September for Paul McCartney's handwritten score of Eleanor Rigby which has been signed by the 'fifth Beatle,' producer, the late Sir George Martin.

This is believed to be a piece handed to one of the backing octet consisting of violins, violas and cellos who helped record the original version of the song.

Coincidentally, a bible owned by Eleanor Rigby - whose name on a gravestone inspired the song - has just been found and is also included in the auction.

John Lennon famously spent some time in Spain and who knows whether other forgotten Beatles' treasures are waiting to be found here and in the UK.

Repsol share forecasts

BARCLAY'S BANK differs from other investment advisors although downgrading its forecast for Spanish oil company Repsol.

Whilst it doesn't believe that Repsol will generate large amounts of dividend in the immediate future it has indicated a target price of €19 which is hugely higher than any other forecast.

According to the British Bank, it expects to see a growth by Repsol of 35 per cent and its share forecast price compares to an average of €14.57 and a low of €10.89.

At the time of writing, the actual share price was €14.01 and had seen some decent growth in the last few weeks but it is unusual to see such diverse opinion amongst investment houses.

RYANAIR ACCUSES GERMAN GOVERNMENT OF CARVE UP Angry at Lufthansa support

ACCUSATIONS are flying across borders as one of the main carriers of German tourists to Spain applies for liquidation.

Air Berlin which was the largest carrier serving the Balearics and Mallorca in particular was supported for some time by Abu Dhabi-based airline Etihad but with their financial backing withdrawn, the airline can't continue.

It has already passed some of its routes to former subsidiary Austrian airline Niki (originally founded by Formula 1 driver Niki Lauda) and now with a €150 million grant from the German government, it hopes to continue to fly until it is taken over by Lufthansa.

This support has infuriated Ryanair which is currently the second largest operator in Mallorca and the Irish company has accused the German airlines and government of what it calls 'a carve up' which will be to the advantage of Lufthansa.

In a statement, a spokesperson for Ryanair said "This artificially created

insolvency has obviously been set up so that Lufthansa can take over a debt-free Air Berlin and this is contrary to all competition rules of Germany and the EU."

In accordance with this belief, the company has filed a complaint with the German Federal Cartel Office as well

as with the EU Competition Commission.

Ryanair which has been trying to increase the number of airports in Germany from which it can operate suggests that the demise of Air Berlin and take-over of 'cheap aircraft' by Lufthansa will reduce competition and see higher fares on routes which were previously run on a competitive basis.

The German government rejects all of Ryanair's accusations but the European Commission decision may play an important part in seeing how matters progress in the German market which is so important to Lufthansa.

Unions at Eurowings, a low cost carrier which is a subsidiary of Lufthansa also criticise the deal, believing that it will allow the German parent to take over Air Berlin staff on terms which are potentially worse than those who work for the company.

Cabin crew are now considering whether it would be appropriate to take strike action in support of their pay claims which have coincidentally broken down recently.

Go slow at airports

AS the strike of security staff at Barcelona El Prat airport is called off temporarily, staff at other Aena managed Spanish airports have announced their own programme.

Whilst Barcelona was the touch paper and an arbitrator is likely to be appointed by central government, the explosion of anger by staff could bring a winter of delays and irritation to passengers.

It is expected that Marcos Peña, who was involved in trying to resolve the recent Stevedore's dispute will be appointed to try to get the parties to agree on a way forward.

If the staff in Barcelona can be placated, then it is possible that staff in the other airports will be likely to settle.

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad




to voice opinions, which, as long as they don't incite riotous behaviour, can be discussed and argued about among our peers without fear of arrest or legal proceedings.



Its 10 seats currently shore up Junts pel Si in the regional parliament because DXJpS - a coalition of centre-right PDeCat and Oriol Junqueras' left-wing nationalists ERC - failed to win a majority in the 2015 regional elections.

These were called early with the intention of obtaining an independence mandate which did not materialise and the coalition is in power only thanks to CUP.

The price of CUP's support was the exit of the PDeCat leader and regional president Artur Mas, who was substituted by Carles Puigdemont.

Sanchez hopes to wedge his own people onto provincial committees, come the primaries in Andalucía's eight provinces next month.


In the national primaries last May, Sanchez suffered resounding defeat only in Andalucía, the home ground of his rival candidate, the regional president Susana Diaz.



LEGALLY SPEAKING

Documents to carry

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

DON'T FORGET: The necessary documentation to have in your car.

A COMMON question that often crops up for drivers in Spain is what documents must be carried in the car with you. Here the N-332 team have the answers...

The ITV card

This is the official document which relates to the technical inspection of the vehicle.

ITV report

Once your vehicle is four years old it is required to have the mandatory ITV test and the report which states what happened during the inspection and confirms it is road worthy, and it must be carried in the vehicle.

Permiso de Circulación

The Permiso de Circulación is similar to a log book for a vehicle and contains information such as the number plate, vehicle owner and other details relating to the vehicle.

There are also some other documents which are not compulsory, but it is advisable that you carry them with you. These include:

Insurance policy

This is not compulsory as all the information is contained on a central computer, however, if you are involved in an accident you will need to know your policy details so it is easier to have them to hand.

European Accident Agreement

Again, this is not compulsory, but it is advisable to carry the European Accident form as it will help you ensure data is recorded correctly in the event of an incident. The forms are available in a number of languages but are all laid out the same so it bridges any language gaps.

Copies of your Suma annual tax which is paid to municipal town halls is also not compulsory.

Remember that the documents you carry must be the originals, not photocopies. Notarised copies are allowed, but this is the only exception.



Is too much TV affecting your health?

IS binge-watching your favourite TV shows affecting your sleep?

With an increase in the popularity of being able to watch several episodes of TV shows in one go through internet streaming and the likes of Netflix, it can have a negative effect on your health compared to watching TV for shorter periods of time.

Researchers at the University of Michigan in the USA and the Leuven School for Mass Communication Research in Belgium found that binge-viewing can lead to poorer sleep quality and increased insomnia.

They surveyed over 400 adults between the ages of 18 to 25 about their TV habits in the past month to learn about how this affected their sleep quality, insomnia and fatigue.

The study found that 81 per cent had binge-watched and 28 per cent did so more than once and 7 per cent admitted they did it nearly every day. Men were found to do it less but when they did their viewing sessions were al-

most double those of women.

Researchers said that many shows are created to entice the viewer to want to continue watching the next episode and with this, many get absorbed into the show delaying their sleep and affecting their natural sleep pattern.

Other studies have shown that binge-watching can have other numerous effects. Researchers from the University of Queensland found that it led to a lower muscle strength in participants who watched a lot of TV in one go and another study from the University of Toledo found watching two or more hours of television a day was linked to higher levels of depression, anxiety and stress. Researchers at the National Cancer Institute in Michigan said that those who watch more than three-and-a-half hours of television a day are at a higher risk of cancer and heart disease.

Stay safe this summer

TANNING is a natural mechanism of skin protection from the sun's harmful rays with sunburns caused by excessive exposure to the ultraviolet (UV) rays. Whilst they may

appear to be only a temporary irritation, they can actually cause life-long damage, due to the 'memory' of the skin.

The American Skin Cancer Foundation says that the most

vulnerable are children and those who suffer from blisters caused by sunburn in childhood or adolescence have double the risk and chances of developing melanoma later.

The Spanish Academy of Dermatology and Venereology (AEDV) adds that a person's risk of developing melanoma also doubles if they have five or more burns during their lifetime as melanomas are associated with intermittent and very intense exposures to the sun. The AEDV explains that sunburns take place because the 'ultraviolet B' radiation causes a lesion of the epidermal cells. This can be in the form of redness or the appearance of blisters, which would be classed as a second degree burn.

When treating these burns there are a number

of tips to advise on the best skin care:

Hydrate both inside and out. Drink plenty of water and also treat the burn with calming products such as aloe vera and store in the fridge for an even better cooling sensation. In the case of serious burns, a doctor may prescribe something stronger to help reduce inflammation and ease the pain.

Avoid the sun. Following

serious sunburn avoid further exposure.

Wear clothes with natural fibres to avoid further irritation to the skin, particularly at bed time when sunburn pain can become more prevalent.

But the AEDV advises prevention is always better than cure and you should always wear a high protection sunscreen and if your cream is lasting the whole summer you are not using enough of it.



Incentives no good

STRUGGLING to find the motivation to get to the gym? It seems even being paid won't get people to break a sweat every day.

Researchers said that adults who signed up for a new gym membership made just the equivalent of seven extra sessions on the treadmill each year with the promise of financial rewards. The findings have led the authors of the study at the Case Western Reserve University in Ohio, USA, to conclude that perhaps the best way to get people to go is to leave them alone.

Their findings come after an Australian study warned that going to the gym could give you body dysmorphia with those exposed to muscle-bound bodies in the gym distorting people's body perceptions.

Bowel cancer deaths fall

THE number of people dying from bowel cancer in the UK has fallen more than 30 per cent in the last 20 years.

According to new figures from Cancer Research UK in 1995 the disease caused 38 deaths per 100,000 people which fell to 26 deaths per 100,000 people by 2015, with experts believing better treatment is behind the drop along with better awareness and bowel

screening with early diagnosis crucial for survival.

However, despite the figures, bowel cancer is still the second most common cause of cancer death in the UK.

Both men and women have an almost equal risk of developing bowel cancer and it usually occurs in those aged over 60. The latest figures show that 8,613 men and 7,152 women died from it in 2015, but if caught early there is a strong chance of survival.

There are some main symptoms which if any are present for a continual period, you should seek medical advice; first, if you regularly have blood in stools; a persistent change in toilet habits, lower abdominal pain and bloating and unexplained weight loss.

UK residents aged between 60 and 74 are invited to have bowel cancer screening every two years to check for signs.

Sea urchins

WHAT are sea urchins?

Sea urchins are some of the strangest animals known due to their physical characteristics. Starting from the Echinodea family, the sea urchin has been around for more than 200 million years.

Where are they usually found?

They are usually found on the sea bed, close to coastlines. Bathers tend to find them after they have trodden on one of their spines. They can live up to 2,500 metres below sea level and are usually found in between rocks and crevices.

Is their sting dangerous?

Sea urchins are covered in large, sharp spines and are sometimes venomous. Touching or treading on them is usually very painful as they tend to break off and become lodged in a person's skin. This can

lead to chronic pain and swelling if they are not removed. They can also cause pain in a person's muscles and eruptions on the skin.

How can you treat their sting?

A sea urchin sting needs to be removed immediately. Vinegar dissolves most spines, and washing or bathing the area in it should usually be enough to treat the area unless it has gone deep into the skin. For lodged spines, surgery may be necessary. Soaking the area in warm water will alleviate the pain. Sometimes anti-inflammatories, analgesics and antihistamines are also needed to manage symptoms.

Should you seek medical aid if you are stung?

Whenever you are stung by a sea urchin you must go to the nearest medical centre so they can assess the situation.

Solution? Make it harder for those keen to exploit the system for profit at the slightest excuse.

Chance to see cycling greats

AS IN 2015, the Vuelta a España bicycle race will cross Altea on its route to Benitachell on August 27.

The cyclists set out from Orihuela at approximately 1.30pm, reaching Altea between 3.45pm and 4pm. This will be the ninth of the 21 stages in the race, which left Nîmes (France) on Saturday August 19 and finishes in Madrid on September 10.

Nairo Quintana, last year's winner is not competing, but there will be a chance to see British rider Chris

Fróome, three times winner of the Tour de France. This year he is hoping for victory in the Vuelta which has until now eluded him.

It will also be the last-ever race for Alberto Contador, the Spanish rider who twice won Italy's Giro, the Tour de France and the Vuelta in the same year.

Altea's Sports councillor Pere Barber called on residents and visitors to line the N-332 on August 27.

"This will be a unique chance to see

some of the best cyclists in the world," Barber said, although he pointed out that the winner of this ninth stage would almost certainly be decided in the gruelling ascent of Puig Llorença in Benitachell.

Traffic will be halted on the N-332 for some time before the cyclists arrive and all crossings and traffic lights would be controlled by the Local Police. "The best way of helping them and avoiding unnecessary hold-ups is by not using the N-332," Barber added.

Going with a bang at Ibi festival

IBI has issued 342 licences to use gunpowder in next month's Moors and Christians celebrations.

Despite stricter rules and an obligatory course in the correct use of explosives, there was no fall in applications, municipal sources said.

Ibi will be the first town in the province to allocate four ki-

los of gunpowder to each of the participants using muzzle-loading weapons during the mock Moors and Christians' battles.

The town hall will distribute the gunpowder in two quotas to comply with the law which bars fiestas' members from having explosives in their own homes for more than 72 hours.


MJ is honoured the Latin way



WITHOUT sounding too much like my esteemed co-contributor Mike Senker, I want to have a bit of a moan. There are certain bits of equipment that I found annoying and pointless. I have never been a lover of dishwashers.

The domestic version I mean. We couldn't do without them commercially - but in the home? I accept that, not being a family man, there is normally only one or two of us contributing to dirty cutlery and crockery in my household so it is no hard task to wash by hand and of course saves piling the machine daily until you have sufficient to turn on a machine that is going to take hours to complete to say nothing of water and electric consumption!


On a positive side

than 7,500 hotel bedrooms opened in the UK during the first half of 2017 - the highest figure for the first six months of the year since 2012.

The number of openings is also 40 per cent higher when compared to the same period last year, according to the Q2 2017 Hotel Bulletin.

The figures are slightly behind those forecast in the Q4 2016 Hotel Bulletin that suggested 20,000 hotel bedrooms would open in the UK during 2017, representing a supply growth of 3.3 per cent, which is more than double the average net increase of 1.6 per cent.

The budget sector has continued to account for a significant proportion of new hotels and is expected to continue to do so in the future, with 43 per cent of all openings over the next three years expected to be budget properties.

Budget hotels currently make up 33 per cent of the

current hotel supply, with the four- and five-star sectors accounting for 31 per cent and 5 per cent of the market respectively. The four- and five-star sectors are forecast to make up 32 per cent and 9 per cent of all new openings between now and 2020.

Premier Inn, the UK's largest hotel brand with 67,000 bedrooms across more than 760 hotels, is highlighted in the report as continuing its 'unyielding brand roll-out.' Key openings for the Whitbread-owned brand in Q2 2017 included a 613-bedroom hotel at London Heathrow Airport Terminal 4 and the fifth Hub by Premier Inn with 389-bedrooms in London's King's Cross.

Premier Inn intends to have 85,000 bedrooms open by 2020. Should keep Lenny Henry busy!!



AMID heatwaves and regular high temperatures, Spanish homeowners are hunting for alternatives to air conditioning. Formerly considered a God-send in the summer months, air con now stands accused of all manner of crimes.

There is growing awareness in Spain over its effects on health. Cheaper systems in particular can cause throat pain, muscular contractions, even lead to pneumonia. Meanwhile a standard-

sized conditioner recycling air for five or six hours during a hot August day can set a household back by €60 a month.

Enter a growing number of Spanish companies offering specialised tweaks to more efficiently chill homes, while also adding value.

Proper awning for instance is growing in popularity. It can reduce the need for electric air conditioners by up to 80 per cent simply by neutralising the sun's rays.

A more traditional method, the fan, is also making a comeback. Slow spinning and

whirring ceiling fans are a thing of the past. Today's contraptions can adapt their motion and speed to take account of room dimensions. They have far greater range and hum along almost in silence.

Spanish homeowners are also experiencing the benefits of aluminium windows. Modern version use crystals to protect the windows from high temperatures.

THE debate over Airbnb is heating up after the American company revealed it connects properties in every single neighbourhood in Madrid to tourists. There are 13,335 homes in the capital being used to accommodate travellers on the Airbnb platform alone.

The firm's main competitors, HomeAway and Rentalia, are no slacks either. The result is tens of thousands of properties are now almost exclusively devoted to the tourist market.

Just three years ago Airbnb had less than 5,000 homes. They have since tripled their supply and no single district of Spain's biggest city is free from Airbnb apartments.

Madrid's situation, and that of Barcelona, is profoundly different to that experienced by smaller cities across Spain. The original aim of Airbnb tourists - renting an apartment to escape the city centre hotel experience - still holds true on the costas and campo, but not in Spain's major metropolises.

In both Madrid and Barcelona, city centres are reserved for offices, the wealthy and tourists. Protests from residents fight-

ing expulsion to the outskirts of the city have convulsed the Catalan capital but been absent in Madrid.

That looks set to change as the scale of Airbnb's impact on Madrid becomes clear. Last week it was revealed more than 23,000 long term residents have been forced to leave central neighbourhoods since 2010.

Such is the demand that even quieter working-class

districts just outside the city centre are being swamped with tourist apartments. More than 640,000 Airbnb's visited Madrid last year, an increase of 78 per cent on 2015.

The city's powerful hotel lobby has taken note. They are seeing little profit from the huge rise in tourist numbers and are piling pressure on the government to impose a crackdown.

Espalier: a two dimensional garden

THERE are so many different opportunities to garden in the Mediterranean that the keen gardener may find that they don't have enough space for all the plants they would like to have growing.

Nothing tastes better than fresh fruit from your own garden but of course a fruit tree can take up a lot of space and usually has more fruit than necessary when mature.

Fruit trees are therefore often a lower priority in the garden unless you have a big garden area and the time to maintain it.

A proficient gardener doesn't let this drive him up the wall though, instead he will train the fruit trees or other space taking ornamental plants up the wall using the art of espalier.

Espalier makes a tree two-dimensional by training it to grow against a wall or support by selectively pruning all but the desired branches to form the pattern required to fit the space selected for it to grow. The tree is al-



lowed to grow up and across but not out from the wall.

It is an ancient garden art form used by the Egyptians, Greeks and Romans that has been well used in Europe for centuries. It requires some skill and understanding of the nature of the trees' growth patterns and of pruning

so you may need to do some research but it is worth the effort to be able to grow trees in this way.

As the trees are more controlled, fruit trees often have bigger and better fruit than standard trees as the energy from the roots is supplied to fewer fruits.

Unless you obtain a tree already prepared to be planted as an espalier, you will need to start with a maiden tree of a year old with no side branching or with branching in the appropriate places. This is to ensure it will have branching that aligns with the supports provided on the wall or structure they are to grow on.

Typically the central trunk will have branching growing horizontally on both sides at the same height and there would be three to five such branching from the trunk at about 30 - 40 cm distance apart the trunk.

Branches need to be tied to the wall or support wires to maintain the integrity of the design for supporting the weight, including the fruit and the direction of growth.

Some trees do not grow naturally to this typical form due to excessive branch forming so it may be necessary to create a fan shape with branches spreading out from the trunk at different angles or other design forms that may be suitable to allow the tree to grow two-dimensionally.

This is where research and imagination are required to form a suitable pattern for the trees natural growth thus making it an art form. It will take more time and planning to get a plant established but once the form is developed it can be less work to maintain than a standard tree and it will display the skills of a proficient gardener.

Damp in Spanish homes

MANY British expatriates may believe that the year-round sun in Spain means waving goodbye to damp problems but those under that illusion are likely to learn otherwise if enjoying a prolonged stay on the continent.

Each year, the average Spanish home copes with around 45,000 gallons of rain water and as many homes are old or not constructed with damp proofing, it can become a problem.

As a tourist destination, the

prominence of high rise hotels and apartment blocks are prone to rising damp as fungal spores can spread through walls and ceilings. Older buildings in particular are more prone.


Signs to look out for include water marks or salt deposits on the inside of walls, stained decoration and damaged and crumbling plaster. This can be gradual but widespread.

As well as making a property cold and miserable, it can aggravate respiratory problems.

The best way to eliminate rising damp is to completely scrape off all effected plaster and allow the wall to dry out completely.

Roses can be a tough process



GROWING roses in Spain can be a tough process.

The intense heat of the sun can be too much and can cause shrivelling, especially in the height of summer.

Ideally, they are best placed in an area which becomes shaded for several hours such as next to a wall or in front of some hedging. A quality compost and a good mulch (layer of soil surface material) are recommended for optimal

water retention with seaweed and pine needles being ideal ingredients.

The Mediterranean climate means a long growing and flowering season which lasts approximately from Easter to Christmas.

BLOOMING: Roses are beautiful if properly cared for.

Yet with this climate comes a number of problems such as powdery mildew and rust. The wind carries these fungal diseases which can sit on the soil for some time and then be transferred to the plant during rain showers or when it is watered.

If left untreated they can cause considerable harm to the plant, preventing growth and budding. Sprays can stop the problem but it must be totally eliminated or it will soon return again.

Hot weather also brings more insects and a wider range of the critters. Green, white and black aphids can decimate a rose overnight if in high enough numbers and insecticide sprays are a necessity.

A lot of effort is needed to get the best out of these garden treasures and, if cultivated with care, blooming marvellous results can be enjoyed.

The antioxidants found in garlic can support the body's protective mechanisms.



Food secrets

DOG foods do vary in quality. So do the companies that make the foods. To some companies quality is only a word. To others, it's a way of life many include rice which has no value whatsoever.

Ultimately, the quality of a dog food is best measured by your dog. How your dog performs on the food, how he looks, feels and acts are the best measures of the quality of any food. At least 80 per cent of my clients that report behavioural problems find a change of food changes the unwanted behaviour.

No matter what a food company claims unless your dog has bright eyes, silky hair and supple skin, and is not overweight, then the food is not right for him.

Not all dogs do well on a particular brand of food some dogs simply do better than others.

Most foods are categorised as Economy, Regular, Premium, Super Premium and Performance.

Regular and Premium foods are not formulated like a Super Premium or Performance food.

Dogs have simple stomachs and short digestive tracts for digesting meat. They also lack the saliva enzyme amylase, which is necessary for pre-digesting starch. Dogs have adapted to foods with high vegetable protein levels, however they perform better when fed foods high in meat protein and animal fats.

Checking the label of a Super Premium or Performance food an animal protein will be listed as the first or second major ingredient.

These should include either chicken, or turkey meat, or poultry by-products meals, meat or pork meals or other animal by-products. A least two sources of fat or oil should be included for adequate energy and essential fatty acids.

Fat in food is the dog's source of energy. Animal fat contains essential and non-essential fatty acids as well as provides a highly digestible and easily metabolised energy

source. Generally, poultry, turkey or chicken fat are higher in quality because they have more unsaturated fatty acids and are more digestible than animal tallow.

Vegetable oils, such as soybean oil, lecithin corn oil, wheat germ oil, sesame seed oil or linseed oil all contain high levels of linoleic acid, an essential fatty acid for dogs. These should be combined with animal fats for the best long-term results of a glossy hair-coat and soft pliable skin.

Carbohydrates are the third most important nutrient and ingredient class in modern Super Premium and Performance foods. Simple carbohydrates in dog food come from quality sources like rice, oatmeal, corn or wheat. These are easily digested when properly cooked.

Fibre, a complex carbohydrate is essential for proper digestion and stool formation. Beet pulp and tomato pomace are both high in fibre. Other sources of fibre include rice, soy hulls, oat hulls, wheat bran and peanut hulls.

All these come from the external portion of the seed coat. These sources except peanut hulls have microscopic sharp edges, which can cause small cuts in the intestine.

This reduces the intestine's effectiveness in nutrient digestion. Peanut hulls on the other hand, have the potential of being contaminated with aflatoxins and should never be used in a quality dog or cat food.

Vitamin and mineral fortification is an absolute necessity in nutritionally balancing any food for dogs. While the vitamins and minerals generally, make up less than 2 per cent of the total food by weight, they provide some of the most crucial nutrients.

These include 12 to 16 vitamins and 15 to 25 minerals. Often the list of these micro nutrients is much longer than the list of major ingredients. Expect this list in all dog foods.

Super Premium usually feature more than one source for each vitamin and mineral. The ingredient list will be longer compared to non-premium foods.

STEVE MCQUEEN'S old Porsche was among five cars sold for more than €10 million at the classic Pebble Beach auction in California last weekend. His 1970-built 917K was used in the legend's race film Le Mans and became the most expensive Porsche ever sold, going for around €15 million.

With the cash still rolling in, an estimated €250 million worth of classic cars were flogged at one of the globe's hottest auctions. That figure is down substantially from the highs of 2014 when almost €400 million was raked in.

Organizers say investors and speculators are taking a brief hiatus from the

classic car market. Despite the lower turnover, Pebble Beach has thus become closer to motoring purists.

To hammer that point home the world's only street-legal BMW M1 Procar, produced in 1979, was spotted lounging around the luxurious golf course.

There were also eight cars and motorbikes from the collection of music legend J Geils, who passed away recently.



Among them were a 1967 Lancia Flaminia with a 3.0 litre V12 engine and a Fiat Dino Spyder from the same year, both in mint condition. His 1983 Benelli 900 SEI and 1970 Ducati 350 Demo were also up for grabs.

Over the weekend 18 Porsches, 10 Aston Martins and 29 Ferraris were sold. Aside from the five valued at over €10 million, another 89 cars secured bids surpassing the €1 million mark.

A huge cohort of cars valued at less than €100,000 were snapped up by a new breed of buyers, professionals in

the 30-40 age bracket.

The star of the show was a 1956 Aston Martin DBR1 which went for just over €20 million. It is the very first of the only five DBR1s to have ever been produced. It won the 1959 Le Mans race and was driven by Stirling Moss.



ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

Lexus IS300h

LEXUS is not at all modest about its latest IS 300h model, describing it as 'the most efficient sports saloon available today.'

Hard-headed motoring journalists like to challenge such sweeping statements, but in this instance, it is difficult to dispute. The hybrid Lexus IS competes against more mainstream compact executive saloons such as the Audi A4, Jaguar XE, Mercedes C Class and BMW 3 Series but not all are available in comparable hybrid form and those that are tend to cost more or offer less standard kit.

The IS 300h - also available in non-hybrid turbo-petrol form - is priced from €33,065 (£30,105) and comes with distinctive styling, is laden with equipment, beautifully built and finished.

Its driving experience is quick and quiet and the only minor downside is perhaps that it is so refined, it is not as exciting to drive than some of its rivals. But then the Lexus scores highly for relatively low running costs - 23.2 kpl (65.7 mpg) and very low emissions.

The car has potent styling - the deep gaping grille and narrow headlights make rivals such as the Jaguar XE appear

quite muted - and its performance figures underpin its sporty look with 0-100 kph in 8.4 seconds, top speed 201 kph (125 mph).

The 2.5 litre petrol engine offers 178 hp boosted to 220 hp by an electric motor, and with a revised chassis and slightly firmer suspension, the overall result is smooth rapid progress with seamless multi-mode CVT gearshifts and composed handling.

The cabin has a luxury look which suggests it might belong to a class above, and the seating is exceptionally comfortable. The dashboard looks less conventional than most, with stepped styling dominated by a big 26cm (10.3 inch) screen.

There's good head and leg room front and rear and the

430 litre boot capacity is good given that some space has been sacrificed to accommodate the hybrid batteries. A useful feature on this saloon is split-fold rear seats which means longer items too large for a normal boot can still be loaded.

Standard equipment on the test model (€38,853 - £35,375) includes keyless entry and push-button start, dual zone climate control, adaptive cruise control, front and rear parking sensors and rear view camera, alloy wheels, LED lights, leather upholstery, DAB radio/CD, Bluetooth and USB ports. My test model also had Premium sat-nav with remote computer-mouse style control.

The Lexus IS 300 hybrid is a refined executive express with strong business-user appeal.

Model tested is UK-specification and equipment levels and prices may vary in other markets.

Swanky saloon is a class act

MERCEDES has updated its S-Class for the 2017 market. Adaptations include enhanced safety features, sleeker looks, and a powerful V8 twin-turbocharged engine boasting 600bhp and a fierce 900Nm of torque.

There are LED headlamps, improved radiator airflow, and four exhaust pipes. Inside, passengers enjoy vastly more legroom and heated seats. Boot size remains the same at a relatively deep 510 litres. There is a 12.5-inch control panel in the front. All seats are made with fine leather, and those in the front can enjoy a massage on their warm bottoms.

Drivers can make use of a range of new autonomous technologies. 'Active Distance' and 'Active Steering' controls help out on motorways, even automatically reducing speed on tighter bends. The fiery engine allows for a top speed of 155mph and the new S-Class can crack the 60mph mark from a standstill in 3.3 seconds.

Mercedes are pitching the 2017 model as the classiest, most powerful saloon on the market today costing upwards of €130,000.


