Animal attacks slammed oisoned

A spate of animal poisonings has sparked outrage.

Two dogs were killed within a week in the Pintor Sorolla area of Santa Pola, leading furious animal activists to organise a petition which has already attracted hundreds of signatures.

They claim that the lack of a quality dog park in the town centre means they are forced to exercise their pets in parks and other open spaces, aggravating certain residents.

Both of the dead animals reported to have consumed poisoned bait while being walked, and the Association of Pet Owners of Santa Pola and Gran Alacant claims the product used is also dangerous for wildlife and children playing in the area.

"There is just one small dog park in El Calvario and it is not big enough or accessible for

forest fires in Abaran and Blanca.

many people, and the one in Gran Alacant is very far away," the group said in a statement.

"In addition, there are two species of protected gulls in our town, and if any individual of these was damaged the culprit would face a severe punishment."

The council say dog-owners are well-catered for with two parks plus Caleta dels Gossets beach, however, despite recent concerns the latter is dangerous after a dog was killed by a car.

In Orihuela Costa, the Guardia Civil has launched a probe after seven stray cats were found dead or dying on Calle Langosta.

A local woman has apparently been infuriating some neighbours by providing daily meals for up to 20 of the animals. Feral cats are a major issue along much of the Costa, and a number of councils are now taking steps to stop them multiplying.

Dirty money! Cash scammers held

TWO men have been held in connection with a counterfeit money scam in Elche.

The men - both Nigerian nationals - were detained at a routine checkpoint when their car was searched and a complete set of equipment needed to produce fake notes to avoid them being detected. They found a plastic bag hidden in the car containing three bottles of special liquid and a large, sealed pack of paper cut to the exact size of a €50 note. The method is known as 'wash-wash'

The 'wash-wash' is a scam consisting of offering the victim a large amount of fake money assuring them they are legal tender notes protected with a dye that allows passage through the customs without arousing suspicions.

During their first meeting, the conmen convince the unwary customer that the dye works as they demonstrate it on a genuine €50 note. They then distract the victim and swap

Drug family detained

A FAMILY dedicated to the cultivation of marihuana has been arrested in Mur-

Officers of the Guardia Civil arrested three people on the premises and seized over 100 marihuana plants and 1.5 kilos of prepared packages ready for onward distribution and selling. The operation known as 'ARKAIX' began last month when investigations pointed the police to a family living in the village of Sangonera la Seca.

Cartagena migrants

A FURTHER three boats carrying migrants has arrived on the Murcia coast. A total of 31 people came in two separate waves from North Africa and were spotted arriving at the pier of Santa Lucia close to the port of Cartagena. They were rescued by the ship Mimosa from the maritime rescue unit, and a team from the Cruz Roja were on hand to attend to the migrants.

Lottery success

LUCK has shined on the city of Alicante as it scooped almost €5m on the National Lottery. The winning number of 52490 was held by 82 people in the city who each had a 10th of a ticket which equates to winnings of €60,000 each and sharing a pot of €4,920,000. The winning tickets were sold from the lottery office found in Calle San Vicente.

Fishy business

GUARDIA CIVIL officers are investigating whether a large tuna fish discovered in the boot of a Seat Ibiza car had been illegally caught in a Murcia port. Initial investigations have led officials to believe that the fish had been landed by at least three people who fled the Portman area which is well-known as being a popular place for illegal fishing of large bluefin tuna.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...26

The Osborne group - founded in 1772 and now the second oldest business in Spain - may be famous for its brandy-sherry, but it's the Osborne Bull silhouettes that constantly steal the nation-

Load of national pride

THE Osborne Bull is a symbol of Spanish culture, both nationally and abroad.

With black bull silhouettes on hilltops and roadsides in many, but not all regions of Spain, the first was erected 60 years ago, 12 months after the Osborne group of wineries - originally founded in Cadiz - ordered an artist to promote a 'Veteran' brandy.

It was set in motion by Manolo Prieto, a prolific Andalucian artist who died in 1991. He remains famous for the roadside monuments even though a personal source of disappointment given other works of which he was proud failed to gain recognition.

The Osborne Bull silhouettes started life as four-metre-high wooden figures, but in 1961 they were made from metal sheets to better withstand the weather and their height was increased to seven metres.

However, one year later new advertising rules forced the Osborne company to move them away

from roadsides, and they were consequently increased in size to their present-day 14 metres so that they would be more visible.

Zig Zag accident

TWO children have been injured in an accident on Calle Alfonso Palazón Clemares in front of the Zig Zag shopping centre in Murcia. The teenagers aged 15 and 16 were hit by a vehicle as they crossed the road and according to witnesses, the driver of the vehicle "didn't stop at the zebra crossing and didn't see the two boys crossing the road."

All stored together

THOUSANDS and thousands of documents generated over many years in Orihuela will be moved to a central storage centre. They are currently distributed across the municipality in a series of locations and the centralisation plan will save €17,000 in rental costs. The new location is only a few metres from the town hall and occupies a site previously used as a supermarket and a cinema.

International software

THE Dar al Shifaa Hospital in Abu Dhabi, has implemented software developed in Torrevieja by technology company Tich Consulting. The hospital can computerise all information, management procedures and care processes and has been adopted in medical centres in Morocco, Mexico and Azerbaijan.

Mayor urges fine action

JOSE MANUEL DOLON, the mayor of Torrevieja has urged the Local Police to enforce substantial fines against those people ignoring warnings on the

This call comes in the wake of record numbers of bathers needing the help of the lifeguards after finding themselves in difficulties after defying the yellow and red flags.

Current fines for such infringements can range from €750 to €1,499.

The mayor said that the request to carry out these sanctions is not a new order or a change in the law, but just a reminder to the police.

"This is for the safety of both bathers and the lifeguards," he added.

As part of its continual monitoring of the beaches, the Local Police has a dedicated group of officers assigned to the zones and their brief is to report and issue appropriate fines to those that show no regard for the warnings.




as part of the tour.



Three stabbed in port fight

A WOMAN has been arrested following a fight in the port area of Alicante that ended up with three people being stabbed.

Two of the victims are Algerian nationals of 17 and 29-years-old and a 20-year-old Spanish woman, with one of the men needing emergency surgery at the Alicante General Hospital after receiving a stab wound to the stomach.

The incident happened after an argument in one of the bars in the popular nightlife area in the port which ended up as a major fight.

At first, the detained woman - who was apparently with her own friends in the bar - fled the scene but was later found and arrested by police.

Hot pursuit

A CAR thief is awaiting trial following a dramatic high speed chase in Santiago de la Ribera.

He almost caused a series of crashes and was close to ploughing through a group of young people walking along the promenade. A member of the Local Police was also yards away from being knocked down.

The incident had its beginnings when the owner of a Toyota Land Cruiser report-

ed his car stolen from in front of his house. Within minutes of the alarm being raised, a police patrol car in San Javier tried to intercept the vehicle but the driver took flight at high speed along the AP-7 at Sucina in the direction of San Pedro del Pinatar.

The stolen car continued along the motorway at maximum speed evading the three chasing police vehicles until it took the exit to Santiago de la Ribera. The car then mounted the pavement on Calle Querubina Jimenez and continued along to the Yacht Club before ending up on the beach front and coming to an abrupt stop.

The car thief - a 32-yearold Ukrainian national - fled the area on foot and was eventually caught and restrained with handcuffs after a heavy struggle during which three police officers suffered minor injuries.

Cod do better

FURIOUS locals have demanded the closure of a public aquarium in the centre of Alicante.

It comes after tens of outraged residents gathered in front of the structure in Plaza Nueva in protest against the alleged abuse suffered by the fish and the amount of money that has been wasted on the project. The aquarium reopened in April after being closed for more than a year following the unexplained death of over 150 fish.

Protesters have declared the aquarium as nothing other than a "glass prison in the middle of Alicante" where fish will continue to die. They are also disgusted that €150,000 was reportedly spent on the renovation works during the closure while the estimated annual maintenance cost is €30,000. They believe a cheaper and more ecological alternative would have been to install high resolution TV screens to show live images from the marine reserve off the nearby island of Tabarca.

Demonstrators hung several banners on the railings surrounding the aquarium which at one point provoked a confrontation with someone who believed they were being denied access to see the fish.

The aquarium has suffered from regular controversy and activists have previously covered it in graffiti.

Plusvalia tax is the amount of tax that a vendor needs to pay when selling a property. NEW RULING of 11th MAY 2017 by Spain's Constitutional Court declared that if a property is sold at a loss, there is NOTHING to pay. Although this has been approved, it cannot be enforced until the Spanish courts declare the previous law null and void. This means that for the time being, local town halls will continue to charge plusvalia tax to all vendors, irrespective of whether there is a loss or a gain.

Bring light into people's lives

RESIDENTS of San Pedro de Pinatar will shortly be experiencing a brighter time of things in future.

According to sources at the municipality, an investment of €353,000 is being made to renew the lighting in more than 80 streets with the aim of improving energy efficiency and reducing light pollution.

The Director of Local Administration, Manuel Duran, visited the areas that are due to benefit from the upgrading and announced that the improvement work will be carried out in two separate phases; one of 50 streets - part of last year's budget - and then the remaining 30 from the 2017 allocation.

The new LED technology will be more energy efficient and reduce the current levels of intrusive and annoying street lighting that cause complaints from locals.

The first part of the renovation plan will take in roads in the areas of Calle Escribano and Calle Galicia.

Rental subsidy deadline extended

CITIZENS of Murcia have been given an extra 10 days to apply for their rental subsidies.

The original closing date was last Monday - August 21 - but that term has now been extended until Friday September 1.

Minister Pedro Rivera said in a statement that "our purpose is to make the application process for

these rent subsidies easier, so that the families of Murcia, young people and people with limited economic resources can access these grants." The subsidy amounts to €200 per month and is payable quarterly over a 12-month period, which for many people covers up to 40 per cent of their total rent payable for a year.

Priority in the award of these subsidies goes to those in the most need, with large families, people affected by evictions and victims of gender violence.

To qualify for the monthly grant, the people must be in possession of a signed and formal rental contract of at least one year, be in the Murcia region and the permanent residence of the applicant. Their annual income must be more than €7.519 and less than €22.500 and the monthly rental payable on the property must be less than €500.

Beneficiaries must also have Spanish nationality or of one of the member states of the EU. Any non-EU nationals must have legal residency to qualify for the grant.

According to data issued by the Spanish National Federation of Autonomous Workers Associations (ATA), for the first six months of this year, Orihuela took an average 143 days to pay their bills although down eight days compared to

At the other end of the scale, Torrevieja has gone from an average of 38 days to pay in the first half of last year to 105 in the first quarter of this year.

Among other municipalities who take longer to pay are Elche with 68 days on average in the second quarter and up 21 days on last year.

Hotels showing high occupation for August

FOR the first two weeks of August, hotels along the Costa Calida are reporting higher than expected levels of occupation.

Last year was a record year for tourism in the area and the average occupancy of 90 per cent 12 months later has delighted hoteliers both in La Manga and in the cities.

Manuel Fernandez-Delgado, from the Institute of Tourism, said: "The occupancy in the hotels of the Costa Calida exceeded the expectations of the hoteliers before the start of the summer season, and now the first half of August is similar to last year and higher than that of 2015." He added that

increases in popularity in the resorts of Archena and Fortuna have added to that success.

Hotels in Mar Menor have returned an occupancy of 92 per cent, such as those in Aguilas, although slight decreases have been reported in Mazarron and La Manga. These are explained by increasing the numbers of beds available by 350 and 700 respectively, particularly with the renovation of the Hotel Roc Doblemar.

Lorca's occupancy figures showed an increase from 83 per cent to 93 per cent; Cartagena from 60 to 69 per cent and Murcia City from 51 to 56



Insurance doesn't have to Costa lot

Beach access for all

LOCAL Alicante political party Ciudadanos (C's) have highlighted the problems experienced by people trying to access one of the city's most popular beaches.

Councillor María Jose Molina spent two days with a group of locals with reduced mobility checking on the ease of access to the main Postiguet beach.

"The difficulties encountered by these people are more than obvious, starting with the fact that there is only one access point at the opposite end of the beach to where the bus stops are which, in the circumstances, is quite contradictory," said Molina.

"Special covered areas that have been installed this year, unlike in previous years, are a long way from the beach front which has made access to the toilets much more difficult," explained the councillor.

She lamented the lack of privacy in the communal area to allow people to change which highlighted that more needed to be done to aid those with special needs and limited mobility.

Councillor Molina concluded by saying that the wooden duckboards allowing beach access were installed on the Postiguet late in the season and that they are too narrow to cater for wheelchairs.

More help for quake homes

THE municipal council of Lorca are requesting that the central government in Madrid approve a reduction in tax for a further

Once again, they will be asking for 50 per cent reduction in the amount of annual council tax (IBI) paid by residents of the city that were most affected by the earthquake in 2011.

Lorca's mayor, Fulgencio Gil. said that the measure had met with the full approval of the local council and it's hoped that it will be formally agreed to by Madrid at a future meeting with the Treasury Minister planned for Sep-

Gil said that the continued initiative "will directly benefit almost 44,000 people in Lorca, and the eighth year in succession that a discount has been offered."

The cost of the 50 per cent discount will cost €7,263,678, but Lorca will be compensated for the amount from Madrid as in previous years which has totalled just short of €72m. lived from 1901 to 2016.

2017 - only half would be due.

The mayor stressed the commitment of the Lorca Council to help those affected by the 5.1 earthquake, adding that the process of reconstruction of the city continues at "a positive pace." He concluded: "We will continue to work to ensure that all those that lost their homes will be rehabilitated and until that is achieved. Lorca's reconstruction will not be complete."

All talk and no texting

A SURVEY contained in the annual report by telephone provider Masmovil has provided some interesting insights into the people of Murcia.

Based on figures for the first six months of 2017, more than 300,000 people in the region who use their mobile phone services, the citizens talk for an average of 167 minutes per month, consume 1GB or data but only send five SMS mes-

Equivalent data from the fourth largest telecoms operator in Spain showed that in 2016 the average monthly talking rate of 100 minutes which was a slight increase over previous years. The 67 per cent increase for 2017 is a significant rise.

Data consumption also experienced sharp growth, going from an average of 780MB to 1GB for the first half of the year.

At the national level, among the autonomous communities that speak the most, Melilla tops the list with an average of 264 minutes a month, followed by Madrid with 229 minutes and Andalucia with 199 minutes.

At the other end of the scale. people in Galicia talk for 149 minutes, Canarias 147 minutes and Ceuta 144 minutes. An interesting statistic is that it's the two Spanish territories in Africa that consume the highest and the fewest number of talking minutes

Christmas '18 date for pedestrian zone

IF deadlines are met, the works to pedestrianise an area of Murcia will be completed in time for Christmas 2018.

This is the forecast announced when approval for the tender for the first phase of development between Plaza de Santo Domingo and the Jaime I was given. When the official tender document is published in the near future, companies will have a period of 40 days to submit

The total works will cover an area of

14,000m2; the opening phase, whose tender already

drafted, will cover 7.600m2 with the second covering the zone from Jaime I to La Redonda. The initial work - renewal of water, gas, and telephone networks - is due to begin in late September / early October and continue throughout autumn and winter. The budget for the first phase is €3.19m.

On completion of this work, the thoroughfare will be divided into three parts so that it's not completely closed to pedestrians and vehicles. As each one of the three zones is worked on. the other two will remain open.

Once the entire project is finished, Murcia will be able to boast 50,000m2 of pedestrianise zones in its historic city centre.

Snowflake hiker causes fire

A HIKER was arrested in Benicassim (Castellon) after causing a fire that destroyed 500 square metres of pines and scrub.

He was slightly injured after falling and a companion set out to find help as neither was carrying a mobile. Meanwhile, and despite a region-wide ban on bonfires of any kind, the injured man lit a fire presumably intended to help rescuers pinpoint his location in the Desert de les Palmes.

Fifteen minutes later they received another call, reporting a fire in the same area, which eventually required three firefighting aircraft and five fire engines to extinguish.

Sources later revealed that the injured person, who was able to leave the scene unaided, was arrested by the Guardia Civil.

The provincial Fire Consortium later emphasised the public's need to be aware of the risk of fire in woodland zones and above all in a protected area like Desert de les Palmes.

Social housing sold

has finally been able to sell 52 homes as part of its Infrastructure Entity (EIGE).

Director of EIGE, Helena Beunza, said that the housing found on the Orihuela Costa wasn't selling as quickly as

had been hoped due to the high price of the properties putting families off: the precise people these homes were intended for.

Since the policy of reducing the prices came into force, 52 of the 63 apart-

have been sold. Forty-eight of them are three-bedroom properties, six have one-bedroom and three have two.

Beunza proceeded to explain that they adapted the eventual sale prices to the budget of families rather than base them on the property market, which can fluctuate. Now they have been sold, the Valencian government will save the annual cost of €1m spent on maintaining the block and paying a private security firm to prevent attempts by squatters to get in.

In May 2015, when the present governing party took over the Valencian community, much of social housing

Now, two years later, 70 per cent is occupied amounting to 747 homes in total, 150 of which have been rented out since the election. In addition, 142 of the 373 homes that were previously uninhabited and up for sale have also now been sold.

Instead, to the relief of neighbours who questioned the wisdom of giving a snake to an 11year-old, the python reappeared, coiled on the pipe under the bathroom washbasin.

Council cuts bullring budget

ORIHUELA Council have made a significant cut to the amount of money that it had previously assigned to a major redevelopment programme.

They have slashed €33,000 from the original budget of €403,564 by raising the amount of IVA (VAT) from 10 per cent to 21 per cent. In effect, the project approved back in June to reform the old bullring cost - without IVA -€366,877 which, taking into account the measures now introduced, reduces those outgoings to €333,524

In order to get the final cost at the same level approved two months ago the €403,000 figure - the municipality has considerably reduced the budget available for materials from €308,000 to **€**280,000.

Despite this cut, the architect had earlier warned that the original budget would be short of what was actually required and needed for the project. The majority of the bullring is to be demolished, save those parts that must be preserved by law, and then be converted into an entertainment venue that will seat 2,800 people, with green areas, a cafe and a small bullfighting museum.

Members of the opposition Socialist PSOE party are asking the mayor for an explanation of this sudden change of direction, and particularly asking why the original budget wasn't set at €280,000 from the outset.

FAST Camposol

FAST (First Aid Support Team) are a group of volunteers who reside on Camposol near Mazarron. They respond to medical emergencies around Camposol for residents and visitors alike.

There are currently seven new recruits being trained by in-house instructors. The training team led by President Barry (Baz) Hamilton will instruct the new recruits in life saving techniques and first aid.

For the last few months the group has not been able to provide the 24-hour cover that they did in the past. Some responders returned to the UK or stopped responding for other reasons. FAST is always looking for new recruits who can spare a few hours to help the people of Camposol, and the cover of 12-hour duties can now be split to suit responders' availability.

It is very rewarding and you get to meet a great group of people who are all good friends and meet regularly for training and social events. Why not come along and give it a try? No previous first aid experience is required. Among the group of supporters and responders are ex-police, ex-army, navy, teachers, engineers and social workers.

When numbers have increased the group hopes to be able to give 24-7 cover again.

In July, FAST responded to 11 calls of which three required an ambulance. If you require medical emergency assistance on Camposol, you should call 112 first and ask for someone who can speak your language. you should explain the problem to them.

John and Paddy have now left Camposol for the UK after living in Spain for 14 years. During their time with FAST, John compiled the responder monthly duty roster. He was official photographer and also Matron to the FAST nurses as well as collecting as a nurse. 



EVERY year the small town of Aspe holds a fair at the beginning of September. This year the town hall has decided to make it a real Craft Fair, with demonstrations of old crafts, workshops for children and lots of entertainment, from cabezudos (people walking in the street wearing gigantic papier mache heads) and music at the official opening, to puppet shows, stilt walkers and, in the evenings, fire juggling.

Visitors will be able to choose from ceramics and pottery, hand-made felt bags, soft toys, funny hats, leather belts made to measure and much more. There will be several stalls with designer jewellery in alpaca, macrame, porcelain, ceramics and paper.

The fair opens on Saturday September 2 at 11am with music and cabezudos before a break from 2-5pm after which it will reopen until 10pm. Aspe is a small town eight kilometres from Elche and can be reached easily from the A7 or A31 motorways.



ONLINE SHOPPING BECOMES EASIER Retailers build better sites

A NEW report suggests that with up to 80 per cent of the Spanish population having access to the internet, e-commerce is about to accelerate dramatically

Currently Amazon Spain is estimated to be the largest internet seller in the country with turnover in excess of €3 trillion, followed surprisingly by Chinese site Alibaba which operates in Spain under the name Aliexpress at just over €1 billion, whilst el Corte Ingles trails in third place at €530 million.

As more retailers offer an online purchasing service, so more consumers are purchasing through them but what isn't known or even understood is how many of these sales would have been made in store and therefore how profitable these sites really are.

For small retailers online outlets such as Amazon are without doubt an ideal option as consumers can compare prices and read service reviews.

This also becomes an attractive option for larger stores but whilst they benefit from their strength in purchasing in bulk, they have to ensure that their operating costs don't make them uncompetitive.

Stores such as those owned by the Inditex and Mango groups are able to reach customers in areas where shops are spread thinly and they have invested large amounts into ensuring that their sites are quick, efficient

Supermarket sites, which are very popular in the UK, are perhaps not so profitable here and appear in some cases to have been introduced for the sake of having an online site rather than actually planning them out

The Mercadona group is a perfect example as it has had to be redesigned and responsibility for this has been handed to the founder's

youngest daughter Juana Roig, but the results suggest Mercadona is well ahead of its competitors with growing purchases online.

Having said this, it is estimated that total turnover is somewhere between €170 million and €190 million which is just 1 per cent of annual turnover and this division currently trades at a loss.

Conversely however, customers tend to buy larger amounts of goods than they would in store in order to justify the delivery and handling charges

Those with an eye for a bargain however have discovered that some (although not all) sites outside Spain will deliver via couriers, often free of charge, so it is possible to purchase perfume from the UK, costume jewellery from Germany or even clothing from Debenhams online with substantial savings over Spanish retail prices.

Beatles' relics still popular

ALTHOUGH it is nearly 50 years since the Beatles split up, they are still the most collected group worldwide with a page of lyrics likely to sell for €20,000

This is the amount expected to be paid in auction in September for Paul McCartney's handwritten score of Eleanor Rigby which has been signed by the 'fifth Beatle,' producer, the late Sir George Martin.

This is believed to be a piece handed to one of the backing octet consisting of violins, violas and cellos who helped record the original version of

Coincidentally, a bible owned by Eleanor Rigby whose name on a gravestone inspired the song - has just been found and is also included in the auction.

John Lennon famously spent some time in Spain and who knows whether other forgotten Beatles' treasures are waiting to be found here and in the UK.

Repsol share forecasts

BARCLAY'S BANK differs from other investment advisors although downgrading its forecast for Spanish oil company Rep-

Whilst it doesn't believe that Repsol will generate large amounts of dividend in the immediate future it has indicated a target price of €19 which is hugely higher than any other fore-

According to the British Bank, it expects to see a growth by Repsol of 35 per cent and its share forecast price compares to an average of €14.57 and a low of

At the time of writing, the actual share price was €14.01 and had seen some decent growth in the last few weeks but it is unusual to see such diverse opinion amongst investment houses.

AMERICANS BEEF UP MARKET **Huge growth for burger chains**

A SIMPLE piece of minced beef in a bun is fuelling a whole new revolution in the fast food market in Spain.

For generations, the vast majority of restaurants and food outlets in Spain sold traditional Spanish food and to a great extent older generations of Spaniards have remained loyal to this cuisine.

As with so many other European countries however, the American way of eating started to spread and by the middle of the 1980s, both Burger King and McDonald's were firmly entrenched in the Spanish psyche.

The concept of this type of fast food spawned a number of local eateries such as Vip although other American food outlets including KFC and Friday's promoted the opening of franchise operations around the country.

The two big burger giants saw off the presence of Wendy's American burgers but are now facing an onslaught of beefy competition.

In many towns, local, un-franchised burger restaurants with names like Gourmet Burger and American Burger have opened up. These offer a burger ex-

Having seen the success of McDonald's with its 500 branches and Burger King with 700, at least three US chains have now decided that the time has come to expand their empires within Spain.

Although not household names in Europe, Steak 'N Shake with 544 outlets in the USA, Five Guys with 700 and Carl's Jr leading the way with 1,385 have started to test the Spanish waters by opening restaurants in some

of the main cities in Spain.

Clearly if these are successful then there is likely to be a massive expansion especially in areas with shopping centres where each of these operations would fit

One of the problems that the existing companies running burger outlets may face is the cost of franchising as it appears that the 'new boys on the block' are prepared to undercut McDonald's and Burger King with lower start-up costs in order to gain a speedy increase in market share.

RYANAIR ACCUSES GERMAN GOVERNMENT OF CARVE UP

Angry at Lufthansa support

ACCUSATIONS are flying across borders as one of the main carriers of German tourists to Spain applies for

Air Berlin which was the largest carrier serving the Balearics and Mallorca in particular was supported for some time by Abu Dhabi-based airline Etihad but with their financial backing withdrawn, the airline can't continue.

It has already passed some of its routes to former subsidiary Austrian airline Niki (originally founded by Formula 1 driver Niki Lauda) and now with a €150 million grant from the German government, it hopes to continue to fly until it is taken over by

This support has infuriated Ryanair which is currently the second largest operator in Mallorca and the Irish company has accused the German airlines and government of what it calls 'a carve up' which will be to the advantage of Lufthansa.

In a statement, a spokesperson for Ryanair said "This artificially created

insolvency has obviously been set up so that Lufthansa can take over a debt-free Air Berlin and this is contrary to all competition rules of Germany and the ELL'

In accordance with this belief, the company has filed a complaint with the German Federal Cartel Office as well as with the EU Competition Commis-

Ryanair which has been trying to increase the number of airports in Germany from which it can operate suggests that the demise of Air Berlin and take-over of 'cheap aircraft' by Lufthansa will reduce competition and see higher fares on routes which were previously run on a competitive basis.

The German government rejects all of Ryanair's accusations but the European Commission decision may play an important part in seeing how matters progress in the German market which is so important to Lufthansa.

Unions at Eurowings, a low cost carrier which is a subsidiary of Lufthansa also criticise the deal, believing that it will allow the German parent to take over Air Berlin staff on terms which are potentially worse than those who work for the company.

Cabin crew are now considering whether it would be appropriate to take strike action in support of their pay claims which have coincidentally bro-

Go slow at airports

AS the strike of security staff at Barcelona El Prat airport is called off temporarily, staff at other Aena managed Spanish airports have announced their own programme.

Whilst Barcelona was the touch paper and an arbitrator is likely to be appointed by central government, the explosion of anger by staff could bring a winter of delays and irritation to passengers.

It is expected that Marcos Peña, who was involved in trying to resolve the recent Stevedore's dispute will be appointed to try to get the parties to agree on a way forward.



In need of As record numbers of tourists touch down on Spain's shores, David Noon examines how the plastic problem is worse than ever plastic surgery...

AMILIES basking in glorious sunshine, children digging for buried treasure beneath golden sands and loved-up couples frolicking in the shallows are all things you'd expect to find on Spain's beaches this summer.

However, there is one unwanted visitor that is making a repeat appearance: plastic. (And no, we don't mean TOWIE stars in Marbs or the latest batch of Love Is-

This year - more so than ever before - tourists along Spain's coastlines and its islands are having to wade their way through plastic bottles, bags and packaging as they attempt to enjoy a dip in the Med.

In total, researchers estimate that there is around 3,000 tons of plastic floating on the surface of the Mediterranean Sea, with more added to the fray every year. (No doubt, the travel agents didn't mention that to the record number of tourists expected to touch down in Spain this

And because the Med is almost enclosed the plastic is effectively trapped, taking decades to be broken down.

However, it is not just the tourists affected by the plastic floaters. Marine life is also suffering as sea turtles mistake bottle tops for crustaceans and Mercadona bags €0.05

EU tax imposed on each plastic bag purchased

Scientists at the Society for the Protection of Turtles have been keeping a close watch on the Med and are alarmed by what they are seeing.

Robin Snape, project co-ordinator for the group, said: "In the green turtle (the presence of plastic is) really common. The vast majority of them have some plastic in their gastro-intestinal tract. It's more than 90 per cent of the population."

And it is not just turtles that are mistakenly chomping down on the plastic at sea.

In 2013, a whale beached in Almeria with 17kg of plastic waste inside its stomach.

The sheets of plastic discovered inside the whale were strikenly similar to those used in Almeria's infamous plastic greenhouses - of which 45,000 tons of plastic waste is produced each year.

Conservationists are attempting to compensate for the deaths of the sea turtles by protecting nesting sites that are often dug up by dogs and foxes. But is that really the answer? Shouldn't we all be doing more to prevent the plastic waste in the first place?

While the likes of US president Donald Trump dismiss plastic waste, ocean pollution and global warming as 'fake news,' there are others doing their best to raise

In Mallorca, conservation group OceanCare is attempting to raise awareness through its 'I Care' cam-

"People are becoming increasingly aware that our throw-away plastic culture needs to change fundamentally," Fabienne McLellan of OceanCare said.

"This is why OceanCare launched the 'I Care' movement which unites people around the world who want to tackle one of the most pressing challenges of our time: to put an end to the age of single-use plastic and thereby limiting the amount of plastic debris ending up in our

One (unconventional) way in which OceanCare is attempting to motivate people to join the cause is through

Dirty little secret

SPAIN has almost 300 known illegal landfill sites, according to the

Earlier this year, the EU courts ruled that Spain was in breach of the European body's Waste Framework Directive for failing to bring 61 landfill sites in line with EU environmental safety rules.

Moreover, the EU has alerted Madrid to a further 230 landfill sites that are in breach of environmental regulations.

The European Commission has been attempting to stamp down on Spain's landfill problems for more than a decade.

In 'an effort to urge Spain to speed up the process' of dealing with its landfill sites, the Court of Justice of the EU has ordered the 61 illegal landfills to be 'closed. sealed and restored, without further delays.'

In the meantime, the EU expects Spain to look into further illegal waste sites after an EU executive sent a formal notice to Madrid over 'at least 291 identified uncontrolled waste landfills across Spain.'

But as policy officer for Zero Waste Europe Ferran Rosa says, the problem is not just limited to Spain.

"The Spanish case highlights a problem that exists to a varying degree across Europe, and the difficulty of enforcing existing legislation, said Rosa.

"Just taking this example, the infringement procedure for Spain is open since 2007 and even if the commission is willing to push for the implementation, potential sanctions take years to come," Rosa



the medium of rock music.

Collaborating with German rock band Itchy, OceanCare supported the band's efforts to shoot its video for campaign song 'The Sea.'

Set in Mallorca, the German rockers' music video attempted to motivate its young fans by exposing the consequences of plastic pollution.

McLellan added: "With these activities, we not only wish to raise awareness, but to also invite people to rethink their behaviour and join our movement - without pointing fingers but rather, with empowering them.'

But while OceanCare is doing its bit in the Balearics, the mainland is facing a slap on the wrists for failing to meet an EU order on plastic bags.

Supermarkets across the country may have started implementing a five cents charge per bag, but that falls far short of the EU's Plastic Bag Direc-

The EU Commission has sent Spain a final warning, informing the member state that it must either implement EU rules on lightweight plastic carrier bags or face infringement proceedings before the European Court of Justice.

two months to satisfy the Commission if it wishes to stave off a court case.

The Commission maintains that the member states have not properly implemented the Plastic Bags Directive which is intended to dramatically cut the consumption of carrier bags with a wall thickness of less than 50 microns within

And in typical 'mañana, mañana' fashion, Spain has missed the deadline and some. Adopted more than two years ago, the deadline for transposition expired on November 27, 2016. Nine months later and Spain is still dragging its heels.

In the long run, the ruling hopes to drastically cut down the number of plastic bags circulated in Eu-

The Directive obligates member states to take measures which may include requiring that a price be charged for these bags and/or introducing national reduction targets that ensure that no more than 90 lightweight carrier bags are consumed per person and year by the end of 2019 and no more than 40 bags by the end of 2025.

Spain may or may not receive a financial telling off by the EU courts for its failure to curb the plastic flow. But it is not the public cof-

Eating your problems

EVERYONE has been guilty of tucking into a tub of Ben & Jerry's or gorging on a packet of crisps in an attempt to eat their problems away.

Now scientists think they have discovered one hungry critter who is ready, and willing, to eat away our plastic problems.

Wax moth larvae are usually bred as fish bait, but a chance discovery has revealed their taste for plastic - which could be used to beat polluting seas.

In the wild wax worms live on beeswax, making them a constant pest for beekeepers across Europe

When Federica Bertocchini a scientist and amateur beekeeper - removed an infestation from one of her hives and put them in a plastic bag, the worms simply ate their way

"I went back to the room where I had left the worms and I found that they were everywhere," she said. "The bag was full of holes."

The prison break led Bertoc-

chini, a researcher at the Spanish National Research Council, to investigate the feeding habits of the centimetre-long Galleria mellonella grubs.

To her surprise lab tests revealed that 100 worms can devour 92 milligrams of polyethylene in as little as 12 hours.

With such a voracious appetite for plastic, the worms could be put to good use, the scientists reasoned.

And with 3,000 tons of plastic floating atop the Med and thousands more tons sitting in landfills in Spain and across Europe, scientists are now pushing these plastic-eating

worms as a way to tackle the

"We want to know if they're munching the plastic to use as a food, or just because they want to escape," said fellow researcher PaoloBombelli. "If they just want to escape, they are going to get fed up very soon. But if they're munching it to use as an energy source it's a completely different ball game. We are not yet able to answer this, but we're working on it."

While more tests are currently being carried out, a beekeepers nightmare could soon be heralded as an environmental

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Documents to carry

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



A COMMON question that often crops up for drivers in Spain is what documents must be carried in the car with you. Here the N-332 team have the answers...

The ITV card

This is the official document which relates to the technical inspection of the vehicle.

Once your vehicle is four years old it is required to have the mandatory ITV test and the report which states what happened during the inspection and confirms it is road worthy, and it must be carried in the vehicle.

Permiso de Circulacion

The Permiso de Circulacion is similar to a log book for a vehicle and contains information such as the number plate, vehicle owner and other details relating to the vehicle.

There are also some other documents which are not compulsory, but it is advisable that you carry them with you. These include:

Insurance policy

This is not compulsory as all the information is contained on a central computer, however, if you are involved in an accident you will need to know your policy details so it is easier to have them to hand.

European Accident Agreement

Again, this is not compulsory, but it is advisable to carry the European Accident form as it will help you ensure data is recorded correctly in the event of an incident. The forms are available in a number of languages but are all laid out the same so it bridges any language

Copies of your Suma annual tax which is paid to municipal town halls is also not com-

Remember that the documents you carry must be the originals, not photocopies. Notarised copies are allowed, but this is the only

Should the house be registered with the local authority for rental and how can we check if it is?

Try phoning the property manager after midnight when the noise becomes loud. Then call the Local Police. Encourage your neighbours to call too. If your absent owner advertises on



the web, his advert must feature his registration number for tourist rentals. If he does

not have this, he can be subject to heavy fines. The website can also be fined. If your property manager is a business, you can complain to the OMIC, consumer advice municipal office.

Solution? Make it harder for those keen to exploit the system for profit at the slightest excuse.

Enough to drive the rest of us crazy! Which reminds me of a joke. A pair of cows are talking in a field. One says, "Have you heard about the mad cow disease that's going around?" "Yeah." The other cow says, "I'm glad I'm a penguin."

Some budgets won't stretch to one in each ear and someone with a very quiet lifestyle doesn't need one in each ear: others simply just don't want to wear one in each ear: it's different in each case as Michael Burke from Digital Hearing explains: "Nature has given us two ears; they work together as a team. There must be a reason. There are three main needs of the human hearing system: first the ability to localise sound; secondly, the ability to discriminate wanted from unwanted sounds; and, thirdly, the abili-

ty to detect very faint sounds.

"You do not hear with your ears; you hear with your brain. All your ears do is feed pressure differences to the brain, where they are interpreted. If you have two good ears working together, your brain will

use them independently. In a noisy environment your brain will switch one ear to low-frequency background noise (the hubbub, crowd noise, chatter, etc) and pull the volume control on this ear down. It will delegate the other ear to concentrate on high-frequency oscillating speech and it will push the volume control on that ear up, the result being that with two good ears working well together you can talk to someone in a noisy environment and their voice can

be up to 20 decibels quieter than the background noise and you can hold a conversation.

"If the brain only has one good ear to work with it cannot do this, and the person you are speaking to always has to be louder than the background noise before you can fully understand them.

"The same applies to identifying where a sound is coming from. This can be vital in picking up the first few syllables of speech. With two good ears the brain can zero in to within three degrees horizontally of a sound. With only one good ear it can only manage to zero in to approximately 30 degrees horizontally of a sound source. (Oddly enough, on a vertical plain (up/down) the difference is much less: seven degrees with two ears and 11 degrees with one ear.)

"Try closing one eye. You can see, but you lose depth, accuracy and span of vision. If you have a hearing loss in both ears, aiding one ear is better than none; aiding both is three times better than one.

"The human head casts a sound shadow, so that sound coming in on one side is heard approximately 6 dB lower in the ear on the other side but can be as much as 25 dB at 6.000 Hz. Depending on its frequency, a faint sound on the shadowed side of the head might not be detected at all if only one ear is operational.

"Hearing is a very subjective thing and what suits one person won't necessarily suit another"

Is too much TV affecting

IS binge-watching your favourite TV shows affecting your sleep?

With an increase in the popularity of being able to watch several episodes of TV shows in one go through internet streaming and the likes of Netflix, it can have a negative effect on your health compared to watching TV for shorter periods of time.

Researchers at the University of Michigan in the USA and the Leuven School for Mass Communication Research in Belgium found that binge-viewing can lead to poorer sleep quality and increased insomnia.

They surveyed over 400 adults between the ages of 18 to 25 about their TV habits in the past month to learn about how this affected their sleep quality, insomnia and fatigue.

The study found that 81 per cent had bingewatched and 28 per cent did so more than once and 7 per cent admitted they did it nearly every day. Men were found to do it less but when they did their viewing sessions were almost double those of women.

Researchers said that many shows are creat-

ed to entice the viewer to want to continue watching the next episode and with this, many get absorbed into the show delaying their sleep and affecting their natural sleep pattern.

Other studies have shown that binge-watching can have other numerous effects. Researchers from the University of Queensland found that it led to a lower muscle strength in participants who watched a lot of TV in one go and another study from the University of Toledo found watching two or more hours of television a day was linked to higher levels of depression, anxiety and stress. Researchers at the National Cancer Institute in Michigan said that those who watch more than three-and-a-half hours of television a day are at a higher risk of cancer and heart

mechanism of skin protection from the sun's harmful rays with sunburns caused by excessive exposure to the ultraviolet (UV) rays. Whilst they may appear to be only a temporary irritation, they can actually cause life-long damage, due to the 'memory' of the skin.

The American Skin Cancer Foundation savs that the most vulnerable are children and those who suffer from blisters caused by sunburn in childhood or adolescence

have double the risk and chances of developing melanoma later.

The Spanish Academy of Dermatology and Venereology (AEDV) adds that a person's risk of developing melanoma also doubles if they have five or more burns during their lifetime as melanomas are associated with intermittent and

very intense exposures to the sun. The AEDV explains that sunburns take place because the 'ultraviolet B' radiation causes a lesion of the epidermal cells. This can be in the

form of redness or the appearance of blisters, which would be a classed as a second degree burn.

When treating these burns there are a number of tips to advise on the best skin care:

Hydrate both inside and out. Drink plenty of water and also treat the burn with calming

as aloe vera and store in the fridge for an even better cooling sensation. In the case of serious burns, a doctor may prescribe s o m e t h i n g stronger to help reduce inflammation and ease the pain.

Avoid the sun. Following serious sunburn avoid further exposure.

Wear clothes with natural fibres to avoid further irritation to the skin.

But the AEDV advises prevention is always better than cure and you should always wear a high protection sunscreen and if your cream is lasting the whole summer you are not using enough of it.

Heat can increase car accidents

AROUND 17 per cent of traffic accidents may be due to excessive temperatures, according to studies conducted by Prevensis, a company specialising in the analysis of driver behaviour. When the temperature of a car reaches 30 degrees Celsius, it increases the risk of making errors during driving by 20 per cent and can also reduce the reaction time by 22 per

Experts at the Ouironsalud Hospitals of Torrevieia and Valencia warn that heat affects the driver's capabilities and behaviour with the excess temperatures in our body surface affecting the area of the brain which controls our moods, modulates sleep and our reactions to certain unexpected circumstances. When the heat affects this gland in the brain it can lead to feelings of tiredness, drowsiness, aggressiveness and even reduces the capacity of concentration and attention, which can limit the reaction times when driving.

In addition, it is believed that having an interior temperature of the vehicle between 35 and 40 degrees Celsius is just as dangerous as having drunk five beers.

For safer driving, it is advised to try and park cars in shady areas if possible and use sunshades which can reduce the temperature in a vehicle by up to 15 per cent compared to the outside temperature.

Remember when driving long distances to stop every two hours or around every 200km to rest and eat light foods to help stay hydrated such as salads and fruit.

Are women suffering more than men?

WOMEN are now twice as likely to take antidepressants compared to men according to figures in the

Data collected by the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention shows a significant increase in both

men and women taking the drugs compared to 15 years ago with antidepressants, now one of the three most commonly used drugs.

Experts say the figures show that whilst depression rates may have risen generally, the substantial increase in the use of the drugs can be accounted for the fact that doctors are becoming better at recognising and treating mental health disorders such as depression and anxiety. Women may also be more forthcoming in seeking help and treatment which could be a reason why they are more likely than men to be taking antidepressants.

The drugs work by helping to balance certain chemicals in your brain called neurotransmitters and can help ease depression symptoms. They are also often prescribed to help treat anxiety disorders and chronic pain, although many are calling for more natural ways of treating depression without the use of drugs such as through exercise and yoga.

WHAT are sea urchins?

Sea urchins are some of the strangest animals known due to their physical characteristics. Starting from the Echinodea family, the sea urchin has been around for more than 200 million years.

Where are they usually found?

They are usually found on the sea bed, close to coastlines. Bathers tend to find them after they have trodden on one of their spines. They can live up to 2,500 metres below sea level and are usually found in between rocks and crevices.

Is their sting dangerous?

Sea urchins are covered in large, sharp spines and are sometimes venomous. Touching or treading on them is usually very painful as they tend to break off and become lodged in a person's skin. This can lead to chronic pain and swelling if they are not removed. They can also cause pain in a person's muscles and eruptions on the skin.

How can you treat their sting?

A sea urchin sting needs to be removed immediately. Vinegar dissolves most spines, and washing or bathing the area in it should usually be enough to treat the area unless it has gone deep into the skin. For lodged spines, surgery may be necessary. Soaking the area in warm water will alleviate the pain. Sometimes anti-inflammatories, analgesics and antihistamines are also needed to manage symptoms.

Should you seek medical aid if you are stung?

Whenever you are stung by a sea urchin you must go to the nearest medical centre so they can assess the situation.





The sound of music

THE sound of music: is it just music to our ears or can it really heal our bodies too?

As most of us know, music lifts the spirits. Stress relief melodies, calming background psalms, euphoric power ballads. Music could most definitely be considered food for all tastes.

However, science now shows that music actually has a bio-chemical effect on our autonomic nervous system, which is responsible for controlling blood pressure and heartbeat, not forgetting the limbic system which is at the source of our feelings and emotions.

To consolidate studies, scientists conducted various studies on choir members noting that their heart rates beat in unison in relation to the speed of their breathing which moved in a cadential pattern with the music. More surprisingly, heart rates of the group were quick to slow down and become synchronized. Reads from pulse monitors clearly indicated what moved from a jumble of jagged lines to a series of uniform peaks. This synchronization creates a sense of well-being. This age-old tradition of choral singing has been transferred to schools to promote good feeling at the start of the school day.

Further studies have equally indicated the mental health benefits of singing. Oxytocin levels which help control stress and anxiety have been proven to be enhanced to the tune of stretched vocal chords.

Ground-breaking new evidence could even pave the way for therapeutic treatment for Parkinson's and lung disease due to an increase in expiratory capacity.

Sufferers noted the sensation of a strengthened voice, despite receiving a diagnosis of Parkinson's five years earlier. Reasons for the improvement have been suggested as deep breathing and the extended use of the vocal chords.


this year will be no different," he said.

The domestic version I mean. We couldn't do without them commercially - but in the home? I accept that, not being a family man, there is normally only one or two of us contributing to dirty cutlery and crockery in my household so it is no hard task to wash by hand and of course saves piling the machine daily until you have sufficient to turn on a machine that is going to take hours to complete to say nothing of water and electric consumption!

The only time that there would be more is if I hold the occasional dinner party, but even then I tend to try and wash up as I go. It must date back to when these machines first became popular. If I remember rightly one used to have to swill plates etc before putting them in the machine. This seemed a dou-



heating up after the American company revealed it connects properties in every single neighbourhood in Madrid to tourists. There are 13,335 homes in the capital being used to accommodate travellers on the Airbnb platform alone.

The firm's main competitors, HomeAway and Rentalia, are no slacks either. The result is tens of thousands of properties are now almost exclusively devoted to the tourist market.

Just three years ago Airbnb had less than 5,000 homes. They have since tripled their supply and no single district of Spain's biggest city is free from Airbnb apartments.

Madrid's situation, and that of Barcelona, is profoundly different to that experienced by smaller cities across Spain. The original aim of Airbnb tourists renting an apartment to escape the city centre hotel experience - still holds true on the costas and campo, but not in Spain's

In both Madrid and Barcelona, city centres are reserved for offices, the wealthy and tourists. Protests from residents fighting expulsion to the outskirts of the city have convulsed the Catalan capital but been absent in Madrid.

That looks set to change as

the scale of Airbnb's impact on Madrid becomes clear. Last week it was revealed more than 23,000 long term residents have been forced to leave central neighbourhoods since 2010.

Such is the demand that even quieter working-class districts just outside the city centre are being swamped with tourist

apartments. More than 640,000 Airbnb'ers visited Madrid last year, an increase of 78 per cent

The city's powerful hotel lobby has taken note. They are seeing little profit from the huge rise in tourist numbers and are piling pressure on the government to impose a crackdown.

A second British invasion underway

WAVES of retired Brits are set to settle in Spain and other sunny EU countries as a final Brexit deal looms in the near

Since the referendum websites and property portals advertising Spanish homes have seen the number of British visitors skyrocket.

Nor is the phenomenon restricted to pensioners. Young professionals willing to dive head first into a new life abroad while keeping their EU passports are also gazing enviously at Spain's thriving property market.

But Brits who have long eyed a sun-soaked retirement are the likeliest buyers. Thousands who were planning to move in the next decade or two now have just a few years to decide as any final deal looks certain to make a fresh start harder and more expensive.

These were called early with the intention of obtaining an independence mandate which did not materialise and the coalition is in power only thanks to CUP.


The price of CUP's support was the exit of the PDeCat leader and regional president Artur Mas, who was substituted by Carles Puigdemont.

Espalier: a two dimensional garden


THERE are so many different opportunities to garden in the Mediterranean that the keen gardener may find that they don't have enough space for all the plants they would like to have growing

Nothing tastes better than fresh fruit from your own garden but of course a fruit tree can take up a lot of space and usually has more fruit than necessary when mature.

Fruit trees are therefore often a lower priority in the garden unless you have a big garden area and the time to

A proficient gardener doesn't let this drive him up the wall though, instead he will train the fruit trees or other space taking ornamental plants up the wall using the art of espalier.

Espalier makes a tree two-dimensional by training it to grow against a wall or support by selectively pruning all but the desired branches to form the pattern required to fit the space selected for it to grow. The tree is al-



lowed to grow up and across but not out from the wall

It is an ancient garden art form used by the Egyptians, Greeks and Romans that has been well used in Europe for centuries. It requires some skill and understanding of the nature of the trees' growth patterns and of pruning so you may need to do some research but it is worth the effort to be able to grow trees in this way.

As the trees are more controlled, fruit trees often have bigger and better fruit than standard trees as the energy from the roots is supplied to fewer

Typically the central trunk will have branching growing horizontally on both sides at the same height and there would be three to five such branching from the trunk at about 30 - 40 cm distance apart up the trunk.

Branches need to be tied to the wall or support wires to maintain the integrity of the design for supporting the weight, including the fruit and the direction of growth.

Some trees do not grow naturally to this typical form due to excessive branch forming so it may be necessary to create a fan shape with branches spreading out from the truck at different angles or other design forms that may be suitable to allow the tree to grow two-dimensionally.

This is where research and imagination are required to form a suitable pattern for the trees natural growth thus making it an art form. It will take more time and planning to get a plant established but once the form is developed it can be less work to maintain than a standard tree and it will display the skills of a proficient gardener.

Damp in Spanish homes

MANY British expatriates may believe that the yearround sun in Spain means waving goodbye to damp problems but those under that illusion are likely to learn otherwise if enjoying a

prolonged stay on the conti-

Each year, the average Spanish home copes with around 45,000 gallons of rain water and as many homes are old or not constructed with

damp proofing, it can become a problem.

As a tourist destination. the prominence of high rise hotels and apartment blocks are prone to rising damp as fungal spores can spread through walls and ceilings. Older buildings in particular are more prone.

Signs to look out for include water marks or salt deposits on the inside of walls, stained decoration and damaged and crumbling plaster. This can be gradual but widespread.

As well as making a property cold and miserable, it can aggravate respiratory problems.

The best way to eliminate rising damp is to completely scrape off all effected plaster and allow the wall to dry out completely.

Most ferreterias (Spanish DIY stores) will stock products to prevent the problem reoccurring but should there be any uncertainty then it is best to call a professional.

Fat in food is the dog's source of energy. Animal fat contains essential and non-essential fatty acids as well as provides a highly digestible and easily metabolised energy source. Generally, poultry, turkey or chicken fat are higher in quality because they have more unsaturated fatty acids and are more digestible than animal tallow.

Vegetable oils, such as soybean oil, lecithin corn oil, wheat germ oil, sesame seed oil or linseed oil all contain high levels of linoleic acid, an essen-

tial fatty acid for dogs. These should be combined with animal fats for the best long-term results of a glossy hair-coat and soft pliable skin.

Carbohydrates are the third most important nutrient and ingredient class in modern Super Premium and Performance foods. Simple carbohydrates in dog food come from quality sources like rice, oatmeal, corn or wheat. These are easily digested when properly cooked.

Fibre, a complex carbohydrate is essential for proper digestion and stool formation. Beet pulp and tomato promace are both high in fibre. Other sources of fibre include rice. soy hulls, oat hulls, wheat bran and peanut hulls.

All these come from the external portion of the seed coat. These sources except peanut hulls have microscopic sharp edges, which can cause small cuts in the intestine.

These include 12 to 16 vitamins and 15 to 25 minerals. Often the list of these micro nutrients is much longer than the list of major ingredients. Expect this list in all dog foods.







Pebble Beach classics on fire


STEVE MCQUEEN'S old Porsche was among five cars sold for more than €10 million at the classic Pebble Beach auction in California last weekend. His 1970-built 917K was used in the legend's race film Le Mans and became the most expensive Porsche ever sold, going for around €15 million.

With the cash still rolling in, an estimated €250 million worth of classic cars were flogged at one of the globe's hottest auctions. That figure is down substantially from the highs of 2014 when almost €400 million was raked in.

Organizers say investors and speculators are taking a brief hiatus from the classic car market. Despite the lower turnover. Pebble Beach has thus become closer to motoring purists.

To hammer that point home the world's only street-legal BMW M1 Procar, produced in 1979, was spotted lounging around the luxurious golf course.

There were also eight cars and motorbikes from the collection of music legend J Geils, who passed away recently. Among them were a 1967 Lancia Flamina with a 3.0 litre V12 engine and a Fiat



Dino Spyder from the same year, both in mint condition. His 1983 Benelli 900 SEI and 1970 Ducati 350 Demo were also up for grabs.

Over the weekend 18 Porsches, 10 Aston Martins and 29 Ferraris were sold Aside from the five valued at over €10 million, another 89 cars secured bids surpassing the €1 million mark.

A huge cohort of cars valued at less than €100,000 were snapped up by a new breed of buyers, professionals in the

30-40 age bracket.

The star of the show was a 1956 Aston Martin DBR1 which went for just over €20 million. It is the very first of the only five DBR1s to have ever been produced. It won the 1959 Le Mans race and was driven by Stirling Moss.



ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

LEXUS is not at all modest about its latest IS 300h model. describing it as 'the most efficient sports saloon available to-

Hard-headed motoring journalists like to challenge such sweeping statements, but in this instance, it is difficult to dispute. The hybrid Lexus IS competes against more mainstream compact executive saloons such as the Audi A4, Jaguar XE, Mercedes C Class and BMW 3 Series but not all are available in comparable hybrid form and those that are tend to cost more or offer less standard kit.

The IS 300h - also available in non-hybrid turbo-petrol form - is priced from €33.065 (£30,105) and comes with distinctive styling, is laden with equipment, beautifully built and finished.

Its driving experience is quick and quiet and the only minor downside is perhaps that it is so refined, it is not as exciting to drive than some of its rivals. But then the Lexus scores highly for relatively low running costs - 23.2 kpl (65.7 mpg) and very low emissions.

The car has potent styling -

Lexus IS300h

the deep gaping grille and narrow headlights make rivals such as the Jaguar XE appear quite muted - and its performance figures underpin its sporty look with 0-100 kph in 8.4 seconds, top speed 201 kph (125 mph).

The 2.5 litre petrol engine offers 178 hp boosted to 220 hp by an electric motor, and with a revised chassis and slightly firmer suspension, the overall result is smooth rapid progress with seamless multi-mode CVT gearshifts and composed handling.

The cabin has a luxury look

which suggests it might belong to a class above, and the seating is exceptionally comfortable. The dashboard looks less conventional than most, with stepped styling dominated by a big 26cm (10.3 inch) screen.

There's good head and leg room front and rear and the 430 litre boot capacity is good given that some space has been sacrificed to accommodate the hybrid batteries.

A useful feature on this saloon is split-fold rear seats which means longer items too large for a normal boot can still be loaded.
