Kidnap sex ring smashed

A NIGERIAN human-trafficking gang has been smashed by Almeria police. Working with colleagues in Madrid, police rescued four victims of the gang and arrested five of its members.

An investigation into the group's activities was launched by National Police in Almeria. A house in Nijar was identified as a stepping stone used by traffickers to smuggle victims to Madrid.

Police unravelled a network of kidnapping, trafficking and prostitution that destroyed the lives of countless victims and raked in millions for the gangsters.

African women were either lured to Europe under false pretences, or simply beaten, captured and trafficked. Boats took them across the Mediterranean to Italy to safe houses.

Dogs suffer horrific conditions

Seven deadly sins



STARVED: All seven dogs were malnourished and carried disease.

Animal abuse charges have been brought against a Sorbas man who kept seven dangerous dogs in atrocious condi-

Guardia Civil officers raided the Sorbas farm after being tipped off by suspicious local residents. They found seven dogs of dangerous breeds requiring special permits.

All of the animals were in obvious physical stress. They were unable to stand, badly malnourished and dehydrated. One Rottweiler with untreatable gangrene was later put down by a vet.

A Bullmastiff had a serious wound in its neck from being tied so tightly to a chain. Another crossed mastiff was on the verge of starvation and needed urgent medical atten-

Only four of the dogs were microchipped and the other three had no vaccinations. The farm owner could not provide the proper paperwork or permits

The animals were kept behind fencing and separated from one another. This was to prevent them from fighting said the owner, but police

noted they could hardly move, let alone fight.

Sanitary conditions were extremely poor and each dog was tied to a different part of the square enclosure. Within the perimeter there was untreated faeces, pools of urine, scraps of hair, empty paint cans, and bones, possibly from other dogs which perished at the farm.

The owner has been reported to Almeria's criminal court. But it is extremely unlikely that he will face any iail time. Fines for animal abuse can be as little as a few hundred euros.

crisis escalates

Migrant



HUNDREDS of people have been rescued drifting in Almeria's waters in recent days. The dozens of rescue operations come as the United Nation's refugee agency warned that Spain lacks the capacity to deal with the crisis.

In the middle of the Alboran Sea roughly 200 adults, including just 14 women were rescued by maritime agents and brought to Almeria Port. Just 15 miles south of the Cabo de Gata beaches, 21 men, a woman and her baby were saved by a Guardia Civil plane from their stranded vessel.

In another incident 25 people were found aboard a fishing boat 24 miles south west of the Cabo de Gata coast. Dozens of other small rafts and boats carrying five to 10 people were spotted by coastguards.

The Red Cross and police in Almeria have frequently decried the situation as untenable and warned they lack the capacity to handle arrivals at this rate.

A report from the UN published last week agrees. Spain has suffered as authorities crack down on the Libva to Italy route. Almost 10,000 migrants have reached the Spanish shore in

Froome favourite as Vuelta returns

On your marks!

ONE of the world's top three cycling contests charges through Almeria this week. On Wednesday competitors take on Stage 11 of the Vuelta a España, a tough 187.5km ride from Lorca, Murcia to Calar Alto in Almeria's Sierra de losFilabres

Cyclists, including British favourite Chris Froome, will push past major towns and villages on the route. They depart Lorca at around 12.28pm and are expected to finish the torturous climb up Calar Alto by 5.40pm.

Residents of Garrucha, Mojacar, Turre, and Sorbas will be very close to the action. Riders are expected to reach Garrucha at around 2.15pm and pass through Sorbas just over an hour later.

At Mojacar racers are scheduled to appear on the AL-6113 and at Turre on the AL-6111, though locations are

The most competitive parts are the climbs. There will be two key uphill battles on Stage 11. The first is the 30km climb up Alto de Velefique and the second is the final 15.5km stretch up to the Calar Alto

Parking can be awkward on the climbs and it is always wise to get there a few hours ahead of schedule to secure a decent spot. Official cycling photographer and verified diehard fan Beardy McBeard

will be heading up Stage 11 early with his carayan and equipment.

Chris Froome is among favourites to win Stage 11, and the tournament overall after reigning champion Nairo Quintana chose not to compete. Victory would make him

only the third man to win both the Tour de France and the Vuelta in the same season.

Lower level labour

POLICE investigating electricity fraud stumbled across a huge marihuana plantation hidden in a cellar. Two men were arrested and 621 plants seized when Guardia Civil later raided the property.

Both were Spanish nationals, from Berja and La Moionera. aged 21 and 48. They stand charged with drug production and

distribution, and electricity fraud.

Officers were originally dispatched to the property to investigate extremely high electricity usage from a property hooked up illegally to the public supply, a telltale sign of drug production.

Before knocking, they peeked into the basement and saw signs of what appeared to be a sophisticated drug lab. For weeks Guardia Civil officers staked out the property, identifying key comers and goers and establishing the full scale of the operation.

When they made their move they were able to catch the two main players at the peak of production. Both men have been denied bail and await a hearing at El Ejido criminal court.

Baywatch bodies

TANNED torsos were on display as hundreds of athletes from across Spain played beach volleyball in the Almeria

Competitions took place in both Pulpi and the Cabo de Gata-Nijar Natural Park. Teams travelled from Madrid and Malaga to play more than 60 matches.

Even strong winds couldn't curb enthusiasm as Almeria cemented its place as the country's beach volleyball capital.

Terror tribute

ALL events were suspended during the first day of the Almeria Fair as the city paid its respects to victims of the Barcelona terrorist attack.

Five minutes of silence were observed in the mayor's office and the town hall flag hung at half-mast.

Elsewhere across the province, from Mojacar to Albox, town halls followed suit, observing an official mourning period set by the government.

Hidden history

ARCHAEOLOGISTS digging deep beneath Almeria have uncovered a treasure trove of ancient artifacts. They are using 3D modelling and laser scanning to get a fuller picture of what is described as the find of the century.

The evidence suggests Almeria was a glamorous jewel in the Moorish empire in 955, with 200 military vessels in the port and a population of 27,000.

Tourist lovefest

WHILE Spain revolts against rampant tourism, Almeria bucked the trend with a rally in favour of more foreign visi-

Members of neighbourhood association Casco Historico marched with placards reading 'Here we like tourists.' They want greater investment in Almeria's historic quarter to attract more offseason business.

Association president Magdalena Cantero said it was surprising to see tourists still regarded as "exotic elements" in the city.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...26

The Osborne group - founded in 1772 and now the second oldest business in Spain - may be famous for its brandy-sherry, but it's the Osborne Bull silhouettes that constantly steal the national limelight.

Load of national pride

THE Osborne Bull is a symbol of Spanish culture, both nationally and abroad.

With black bull silhouettes on hilltops and roadsides in many, but not all regions of Spain, the first was erected 60 years ago, 12 months after the Osborne group of wineries - originally founded in Cadiz - ordered an artist to promote a 'Veteran' brandy.

It was set in motion by Manolo Prieto, a prolific Andalucian artist who died in 1991. He remains famous for the roadside monuments even though a personal source of disappointment given other works of which he was proud failed to gain recognition.

The Osborne Bull silhouettes started life as four-metre-high wooden figures, but in 1961 they were made from metal sheets to better withstand the weather and their height was increased to seven metres.

However, one year later new advertising rules forced the Osborne company to move them away from roadsides, and they were consequently increased in size to their present-day 14 metres so that they would be more visible.

Then in 1994 the EU banned roadside advertising of al-

moved, public outcry saw them retained, but blacked out to remove all reference to the original advertisers

The ruling in their favour was on the grounds that they had become part of the landscape with 'aesthetic or cultural signifi-

Their wide distribution means the Osborne bull is now associated with Spain itself. with its silhouette seen on national football flags, t-shirts, caps, towels and

Serious wealth

A LUXURY estate in Rodalquilar worth a cool €12 million is the most expensive property in Almeria according to Idealista. The 19-hectare estate is at the heart of the Cabo de Gata-Nijar Natural Park and has three separate villas.

It has been on sale since 2014 and is almost three times as expensive as Almeria's nearest competitor, a €4.65 million villa, also in Nijar, with views overlooking Aguamarga Bay.

Barrier reef

AN underwater reef park is on the cards

for Aguadulce. The green light has been given for creative diving company Acebal Asempal to explore the project.

An artificial barrier reef would be built on a vast 6,000 square metres underwater space. If successful it will attract adventurous divers and tourists from across the world.

Druggy drivers

POLICE detected 258 drunk or druggedup drivers on Almeria's roads in just five days. The Guardia Civil said it was extremely worrying to find 156 drivers high on cocaine, amphetamines or marijuana across the province.

Checks coincided with the Dreambeach dance music festival.

EU funds rescue river

AN expansion of the EL Bobar wastewater treatment plant will help rescue the badly polluted Andarax river. An investment of €23 million will improve the collection of waste water from roughly 200,000 people across Santa Fe, Pechina, Gador, Viator and Benahadux,

With less dirty discharges being leaked into the river, residents can expect an end to the stench and mosquito colonies which have endured for years. It will take some time, however, for the expansion to take shape,

with 23 kilometres of new waste tunnels needing to be

The project is being financed by European FEDER funds, which help investment blackspots improve essential infrastructure. Purifiers in Nijar and Huercal-Overa will also be modernised.

Almeria has been forced to turn to Europe for help after the Spanish government slashed the infrastructure budget for the province by 80 per cent this year.





Cleaners in revolt

HOSPITAL cleaners have refused to take on nursing roles on top of their usual work. The cleaner's union at Poniente say its members are often asked to perform tasks well outside their contracts.

This includes cleaning medical equipment, patient's beds, incubators and pharmacy carts. Such jobs are usually performed by nurses who have more medical knowl-

The cleaning committee is also angry over staff shortages. With 60 personnel, there are 45 less cleaners than at Torrecardenas hospital. During the night shift there is only one cleaner in charge for emergency service areas, wards, intensive care, theatres and dialysis according to the committee.

They argue that too much money is being spent subcontracting nurses and nursing auxiliaries, who then pile more work on the poorly-paid

Residents demand action

A FACEBOOK group has been set up to campaign for a cleaner Vera. Named 'Vera

It calls for a grassroots

dents to demand action. Photos depict crooked trees, broken street-lamps, mattresses dumped on the beach, rampant weeds, and faded road signs.

The group has also established a Twitter account and has launched a petition to the mayor on Change.org. Hundreds of people signed the petition or to join the Facebook page within hours.

Key demands include the maintenance of public gardens, clean streets, and new payements, sewers and bins.

Members want improved road safety and cycle lanes on the AL-7107, streets to be properly signposted and zebra crossings repainted.

A dedicated cleaning budget should also be established each financial year to ensure consistency and transparency.

The petition notes that many residents owning second homes in Vera pay taxes but cannot vote, making it hard for their voice to be heard. It identifies Salinas as an area of acute concern, alongside the beach at the entrance to the pueblo.

In need of As record numbers of tourists touch down on Spain's shores, David Noon examines how the plastic problem is worse than ever plastic surgery...

AMILIES basking in glorious sunshine, children digging for buried treasure beneath golden sands and loved-up couples frolicking in the shallows are all things you'd expect to find on Spain's beaches this summer.

However, there is one unwanted visitor that is making a repeat appearance: plastic. (And no, we don't mean TOWIE stars in Marbs or the latest batch of Love Is-

This year - more so than ever before - tourists along Spain's coastlines and its islands are having to wade their way through plastic bottles, bags and packaging as they attempt to enjoy a dip in the Med.

In total, researchers estimate that there is around 3,000 tons of plastic floating on the surface of the Mediterranean Sea, with more added to the fray every year. (No doubt, the travel agents didn't mention that to the record number of tourists expected to touch down in Spain this

And because the Med is almost enclosed the plastic is effectively trapped, taking decades to be broken down.

However, it is not just the tourists affected by the plastic floaters. Marine life is also suffering as sea turtles mistake bottle tops for crustaceans and Mercadona bags €0.05

EU tax imposed on each plastic bag purchased

Scientists at the Society for the Protection of Turtles have been keeping a close watch on the Med and are alarmed by what they are seeing.

Robin Snape, project co-ordinator for the group, said: "In the green turtle (the presence of plastic is) really common. The vast majority of them have some plastic in their gastro-intestinal tract. It's more than 90 per cent of the population."

And it is not just turtles that are mistakenly chomping down on the plastic at sea.

In 2013, a whale beached in Almeria with 17kg of plastic waste inside its stomach.

The sheets of plastic discovered inside the whale were strikenly similar to those used in Almeria's infamous plastic greenhouses - of which 45,000 tons of plastic waste is produced each year.

Conservationists are attempting to compensate for the deaths of the sea turtles by protecting nesting sites that are often dug up by dogs and foxes. But is that really the answer? Shouldn't we all be doing more to prevent the plastic waste in the first place?

While the likes of US president Donald Trump dismiss plastic waste, ocean pollution and global warming as 'fake news,' there are others doing their best to raise

In Mallorca, conservation group OceanCare is attempting to raise awareness through its 'I Care' cam-

"People are becoming increasingly aware that our throw-away plastic culture needs to change fundamentally," Fabienne McLellan of OceanCare said.

"This is why OceanCare launched the 'I Care' movement which unites people around the world who want to tackle one of the most pressing challenges of our time: to put an end to the age of single-use plastic and thereby limiting the amount of plastic debris ending up in our

One (unconventional) way in which OceanCare is attempting to motivate people to join the cause is through

Dirty little secret

SPAIN has almost 300 known illegal landfill sites, according to the

Earlier this year, the EU courts ruled that Spain was in breach of the European body's Waste Framework Directive for failing to bring 61 landfill sites in line with EU environmental safety rules.

Moreover, the EU has alerted Madrid to a further 230 landfill sites that are in breach of environmental regulations.

The European Commission has been attempting to stamp down on Spain's landfill problems for more

In 'an effort to urge Spain to speed up the process' of dealing with its landfill sites, the Court of Justice of the EU has ordered the 61 illegal landfills to be 'closed. sealed and restored, without further delays.'

In the meantime, the EU expects Spain to look into further illegal waste sites after an EU executive sent a formal notice to Madrid over 'at least 291 identified uncontrolled waste landfills across Spain.'

But as policy officer for Zero Waste Europe Ferran Rosa says, the problem is not just limited to Spain.

"The Spanish case highlights a problem that exists to a varying degree across Europe, and the difficulty of enforcing existing legislation, said Rosa.

"Just taking this example, the infringement procedure for Spain is open since 2007 and even if the commission is willing to push for the implementation, potential sanctions take years to come," Rosa

Collaborating with German rock band Itchy, OceanCare supported the band's efforts to shoot its video for campaign song 'The Sea.'

Set in Mallorca, the German rockers' music video attempted to motivate its young fans by exposing the consequences of plastic pollution.

McLellan added: "With these activities, we not only wish to raise awareness, but to also invite people to rethink their behaviour and join our movement - without pointing fingers but rather, with empowering them.'

But while OceanCare is doing its bit in the Balearics, the mainland is facing a slap on the wrists for failing to meet an EU order on plastic bags.

Supermarkets across the country may have started implementing a five cents charge per bag, but that falls far short of the EU's Plastic Bag Direc-

The EU Commission has sent Spain a final warning, informing the member state that it must either implement EU rules on lightweight plastic carrier bags or face infringement proceedings before the European Court of Justice.

the Med.



two months to satisfy the Commission if it wishes to stave off a court case.

The Commission maintains that the member states have not properly implemented the Plastic Bags Directive which is intended to dramatically cut the consumption of carrier bags with a wall thickness of less than 50 microns within

And in typical 'mañana, mañana' fashion, Spain has missed the deadline and some. Adopted more than two years ago, the deadline for transposition expired on November 27, 2016. Nine months later and Spain is still dragging its heels.

In the long run, the ruling hopes to drastically cut down the number of plastic bags circulated in Eu-

The Directive obligates member states to take measures which may include requiring that a price be charged for these bags and/or introducing national reduction targets that ensure that no more than 90 lightweight carrier bags are consumed per person and year by the end of 2019 and no more than 40 bags by the end of 2025.

Spain may or may not receive a financial telling off by the EU courts for its failure to curb the plas-

Eating your problems

EVERYONE has been guilty of tucking into a tub of Ben & Jerry's or gorging on a packet of crisps in an attempt to eat their problems away.

Now scientists think they have discovered one hungry critter who is ready, and willing, to eat away our plastic problems.

Wax moth larvae are usually bred as fish bait, but a chance discovery has revealed their taste for plastic - which could be used to beat polluting seas.

In the wild wax worms live on beeswax, making them a constant pest for beekeepers across Europe

When Federica Bertocchini a scientist and amateur beekeeper - removed an infestation from one of her hives and put them in a plastic bag, the worms simply ate their way

"I went back to the room where I had left the worms and I found that they were everywhere," she said. "The bag was full of holes."

The prison break led Bertoc-

chini, a researcher at the Spanish National Research Council, to investigate the feeding habits of the centimetre-long Galleria mellonella grubs.

To her surprise lab tests revealed that 100 worms can devour 92 milligrams of polyethylene in as little as 12 hours.

With such a voracious appetite for plastic, the worms could be put to good use, the scientists reasoned.

And with 3,000 tons of plastic floating atop the Med and thousands more tons sitting in landfills in Spain and across Europe, scientists are now pushing these plastic-eating

worms as a way to tackle the

"We want to know if they're munching the plastic to use as a food, or just because they want to escape," said fellow researcher PaoloBombelli. "If they just want to escape, they are going to get fed up very soon. But if they're munching it to use as an energy source it's a completely different ball game. We are not yet able to answer this, but we're working on it."

While more tests are currently being carried out, a beekeepers nightmare could soon be heralded as an environmental



ONLINE SHOPPING BECOMES EASIER Retailers build better sites

A NEW report suggests that with up to 80 per cent of the Spanish population having access to the internet, e-commerce is about to accelerate dramatically

Currently Amazon Spain is estimated to be the largest internet seller in the country with turnover in excess of €3 trillion, followed surprisingly by Chinese site Alibaba which operates in Spain under the name Aliexpress at just over €1 billion, whilst el Corte Ingles trails in third place at €530 million.

As more retailers offer an online purchasing service, so more consumers are purchasing through them but what isn't known or even understood is how many of these sales would have been made in store and therefore how profitable these sites really are.

For small retailers online outlets such as Amazon are without doubt an ideal option as consumers can compare prices and read service reviews.

This also becomes an attractive option for larger stores but whilst they benefit from their strength in purchasing in bulk, they have to ensure that their operating costs don't make them uncompetitive.

Stores such as those owned by the Inditex and Mango groups are able to reach customers in areas where shops are spread thinly and they have invested large amounts into ensuring that their sites are quick, efficient

Supermarket sites, which are very popular in the UK, are perhaps not so profitable here and appear in some cases to have been introduced for the sake of having an online site rather than actually planning them out

The Mercadona group is a perfect example as it has had to be redesigned and responsibility for this has been handed to the founder's

youngest daughter Juana Roig, but the results suggest Mercadona is well ahead of its competitors with growing purchases online.

Having said this, it is estimated that total turnover is somewhere between €170 million and €190 million which is just 1 per cent of annual turnover and this division currently trades at a loss.

Conversely however, customers tend to buy larger amounts of goods than they would in store in order to justify the delivery and handling charges

Those with an eye for a bargain however have discovered that some (although not all) sites outside Spain will deliver via couriers, often free of charge, so it is possible to purchase perfume from the UK, costume jewellery from Germany or even clothing from Debenhams online with substantial savings over Spanish retail prices.

Beatles' relics still popular

ALTHOUGH it is nearly 50 years since the Beatles split up, they are still the most collected group worldwide with a page of lyrics likely to sell for €20,000

This is the amount expected to be paid in auction in September for Paul McCartney's handwritten score of Eleanor Rigby which has been signed by the 'fifth Beatle,' producer, the late Sir George Martin.

This is believed to be a piece handed to one of the backing octet consisting of violins, violas and cellos who helped record the original version of

Coincidentally, a bible owned by Eleanor Rigby whose name on a gravestone inspired the song - has just been found and is also included in the auction.

John Lennon famously spent some time in Spain and who knows whether other forgotten Beatles' treasures are waiting to be found here and in the UK.

Repsol share forecasts

BARCLAY'S BANK differs from other investment advisors although downgrading its forecast for Spanish oil company Rep-

Whilst it doesn't believe that Repsol will generate large amounts of dividend in the immediate future it has indicated a target price of €19 which is hugely higher than any other fore-

According to the British Bank, it expects to see a growth by Repsol of 35 per cent and its share forecast price compares to an average of €14.57 and a low of

At the time of writing, the actual share price was €14.01 and had seen some decent growth in the last few weeks but it is unusual to see such diverse opinion amongst investment houses.

AMERICANS BEEF UP MARKET **Huge growth for burger chains**

A SIMPLE piece of minced beef in a bun is fuelling a whole new revolution in the fast food market in Spain.

For generations, the vast majority of restaurants and food outlets in Spain sold traditional Spanish food and to a great extent older generations of Spaniards have remained loyal to this cuisine.

As with so many other European countries however, the American way of eating started to spread and by the middle of the 1980s, both Burger King and McDonald's were firmly entrenched in the Spanish psyche.

The concept of this type of fast food spawned a number of local eateries such as Vip although other American food outlets including KFC and Friday's promoted the opening of franchise operations around the country.

The two big burger giants saw off the presence of Wendy's American burgers but are now facing an onslaught of beefy competition.

In many towns, local, un-franchised burger restaurants with names like Gourmet Burger and American Burger have opened up. These offer a burger ex-

Having seen the success of McDonald's with its 500 branches and Burger King with 700, at least three US chains have now decided that the time has come to expand their empires within Spain.

Although not household names in Europe, Steak 'N Shake with 544 outlets in the USA, Five Guys with 700 and Carl's Jr leading the way with 1,385 have started to test the Spanish waters by opening restaurants in some

of the main cities in Spain.

Clearly if these are successful then there is likely to be a massive expansion especially in areas with shopping centres where each of these operations would fit

One of the problems that the existing companies running burger outlets may face is the cost of franchising as it appears that the 'new boys on the block' are prepared to undercut McDonald's and Burger King with lower start-up costs in order to gain a speedy increase in market share.

RYANAIR ACCUSES GERMAN GOVERNMENT OF CARVE UP

Angry at Lufthansa support

ACCUSATIONS are flying across borders as one of the main carriers of German tourists to Spain applies for

Air Berlin which was the largest carrier serving the Balearics and Mallorca in particular was supported for some time by Abu Dhabi-based airline Etihad but with their financial backing withdrawn, the airline can't continue.

It has already passed some of its routes to former subsidiary Austrian airline Niki (originally founded by Formula 1 driver Niki Lauda) and now with a €150 million grant from the German government, it hopes to continue to fly until it is taken over by

This support has infuriated Ryanair which is currently the second largest operator in Mallorca and the Irish company has accused the German airlines and government of what it calls 'a carve up' which will be to the advantage of Lufthansa.

In a statement, a spokesperson for Ryanair said "This artificially created

insolvency has obviously been set up so that Lufthansa can take over a debt-free Air Berlin and this is contrary to all competition rules of Germany and the ELL'

In accordance with this belief, the company has filed a complaint with the German Federal Cartel Office as well as with the EU Competition Commis-

Ryanair which has been trying to increase the number of airports in Germany from which it can operate suggests that the demise of Air Berlin and take-over of 'cheap aircraft' by Lufthansa will reduce competition and see higher fares on routes which were previously run on a competitive basis.

The German government rejects all of Ryanair's accusations but the European Commission decision may play an important part in seeing how matters progress in the German market which is so important to Lufthansa.

Unions at Eurowings, a low cost carrier which is a subsidiary of Lufthansa also criticise the deal, believing that it will allow the German parent to take over Air Berlin staff on terms which are potentially worse than those who work for the company.

Cabin crew are now considering whether it would be appropriate to take strike action in support of their pay claims which have coincidentally bro-

Go slow at airports

AS the strike of security staff at Barcelona El Prat airport is called off temporarily, staff at other Aena managed Spanish airports have announced their own programme.

Whilst Barcelona was the touch paper and an arbitrator is likely to be appointed by central government, the explosion of anger by staff could bring a winter of delays and irritation to passengers.

It is expected that Marcos Peña, who was involved in trying to resolve the recent Stevedore's dispute will be appointed to try to get the parties to agree on a way forward.



LEGALLY SPEAKING

Documents to carry

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



A COMMON question that often crops up for drivers in Spain is what documents must be carried in the car with you. Here the N-332 team have the answers...

The ITV card

This is the official document which relates to the technical inspection of the vehicle.

Once your vehicle is four years old it is required to have the mandatory ITV test and the report which states what happened during the inspection and confirms it is road worthy, and it must be carried in the vehicle.

Permiso de Circulacion

The Permiso de Circulacion is similar to a log book for a vehicle and contains information such as the number plate, vehicle owner and other details relating to the vehicle.

There are also some other documents which are not compulsory, but it is advisable that you carry them with you. These include:

Insurance policy

This is not compulsory as all the information is contained on a central computer, however, if you are involved in an accident you will need to know your policy details so it is easier to have them to hand.

European Accident Agreement

Again, this is not compulsory, but it is advisable to carry the European Accident form as it will help you ensure data is recorded correctly in the event of an incident. The forms are available in a number of languages but are all laid out the same so it bridges any language

Copies of your Suma annual tax which is paid to municipal town halls is also not com-

Remember that the documents you carry must be the originals, not photocopies. Notarised copies are allowed, but this is the only

We need your advice on a problem with a detached property behind our house with private pool. The owner lives in Scandinavia and rents out this property for most of the year. It is advertised on websites. They have a local property manager who welcomes the people and handles cleaning. We and other neighbours have been kept awake by loud partying around the pool long after midnight.

Who is responsible?

Should we notify the town hall or the police?

As this is a business, is there a way to formally complain?

Should the house be registered with the local authority for rental and how can we check if it is?

PS (By email)

Try phoning the property manager after midnight when the noise becomes loud. Then call the Local Police. Encourage your neighbours to call too. If your absent owner advertises on



the web, his advert must feature his registration number for tourist rentals. If he does

not have this, he can be subject to heavy fines. The website can also be fined. If your property manager is a business, you can complain to the OMIC, consumer advice municipal office.



This follows another £10,000 bogus food poisoning claim against Thomas Cook by tourists who didn't mention food poisoning at the time, had no medical verification, and after their return (from Gran Canaria) returned to work and their children to school.

What is wrong with people? I know of a woman who sued a

previous employer because she slipped on a staircase in the workplace and hurt herself (no broken bones). She also sued the local council because she had fallen after tripping on an uneven paving stone. Why? Sometimes it isn't anyone's fault. Other than, occasionally, someone's own clumsiness.

The whiplash industry and its successor, the holiday enteritis industry, form part of the UK's ever growing compensation culture where companies actively try to encourage people to make bogus claims. And you don't need to have been in any sort of accident - car crash scammers call at random.

I've written about this before. About British travel agents said to operate an annual £1m fighting fund to cope with huge personal injury payouts to 'aggrieved' holidaymakers. About teaching staff securing major compensation for minor accigrants for 'unlawful detention' while awaiting deportation.

I've said this before as well but I'll say it again anyway the UK's thriving compensation culture is not only still keeping the door wide open for all these claimants but continuing to carry them over the threshold too. Solution? Make it harder for those keen to exploit the system for profit at the slightest excuse.

Enough to drive the rest of us crazy! Which reminds me of a joke. A pair of cows are talking in a field. One says, "Have you heard about the mad cow disease that's going around?" "Yeah." The other cow says, "I'm glad I'm a penguin."


Ric Polansky moved to Mojacar in 1969 as a pioneer developer. He reads extensively and has travelled in Sout America panning gold and looking for El Dorado.

Some even question whether they are still in Spain because as you well know, Spain has always been a partial project in progress forever - threatening to complete


the task mañana (which, like free beer, never comes). Mojacar sparkles, glows and is most liveable, most likeable and easy to

18 to 25 about their TV habits in the past month to learn about how this affected their sleep quality, insomnia and fatigue.

The study found that 81 per cent had binge-watched and 28 per cent did so more than once and 7 per cent admitted they did it nearly every day. Men were found to do it less but when they did their viewing sessions were almost double those of women.

Researchers said that many shows are created to entice the viewer to want to continue watching the next episode and with this, many get absorbed into the show delaying their sleep and affecting their natural sleep pattern.

Other studies have shown that binge-watching can have other numerous effects. Researchers from the University of Queensland found that it led to a lower muscle strength in participants who watched a lot of TV in one go and another study from the University of Toledo found watching two or more hours of television a day was linked to higher levels of depression, anxiety and stress.

Researchers at the National Cancer Institute in Michigan said that those who watch more than three-and-a-half hours of television a day are at a higher risk of cancer and heart disease.



Sea urchins

WHAT are sea urchins?

Sea urchins are some of the strangest animals known due to their physical characteristics. Starting from the Echinodea family, the sea urchin has been around for more than 200 million years.

Where are they usually found?

They are usually found on the sea bed, close to coastlines. Bathers tend to find them after they have trodden on one of their spines. They can live up to 2,500 metres below sea level and are usually found in between rocks and crevices.

Is their sting dangerous?

Sea urchins are covered in large, sharp spines and are sometimes venomous. Touching or treading on them is usually very painful as they tend to break off and become lodged in a person's skin. This can

lead to chronic pain and swelling if they are not removed. They can also cause pain in a person's muscles and eruptions on the skin.

How can you treat their sting?

A sea urchin sting needs to be removed immediately. Vinegar dissolves most spines, and washing or bathing the area in it should usually be enough to treat the area unless it has gone deep into the skin. For lodged spines, surgery may be necessary. Soaking the area in warm water will alleviate the pain. Sometimes anti-inflammatories. analgesics and antihistamines are also needed to manage symptoms.

Should you seek medical aid if you are stung?

Whenever you are stung by a sea urchin you must go to the nearest medical centre so they can assess the situation.

mechanism of skin protection from the sun's harmful rays with sunburns caused by excessive exposure to the ultraviolet (UV) rays. Whilst they may appear to be only a temporary irritation, they can actually cause life-long damage, due to the 'memory' of the skin.

The American Skin Cancer Foundation savs that the most vulnerable are children and those who suffer from blisters caused by sunburn in childhood or adolescence

have double the risk and chances of developing melanoma later.

The Spanish Academy of Dermatology and Venereology (AEDV) adds that a person's risk of developing melanoma also doubles if they have five or more burns during their lifetime as melanomas are associated with intermittent and

very intense exposures to the sun. The AEDV explains that sunburns take place because the 'ultraviolet B' radiation causes a lesion of the epidermal cells. This can be in the

form of redness or the appearance of blisters, which would be a classed as a second degree burn.

When treating these burns there are a number of tips to advise on the best skin care:

Hydrate both inside and out. Drink plenty of water and also treat the burn with calming

as aloe vera and store in the fridge for an even better cooling sensation. In the case of serious burns, a doctor may prescribe something stronger to help reduce inflammation and ease the pain.

Avoid the sun. Following serious sunburn avoid further exposure.

Wear clothes with natural fibres to avoid further irritation to the skin.

But the AEDV advises prevention is always better than cure and you should always wear a high protection sunscreen and if your cream is lasting the whole summer you are not using enough of it.

Heat can increase car accidents


AROUND 17 per cent of traffic accidents may be due to excessive temperatures, according to studies conducted by Prevensis, a company specialising in the analysis of driver behaviour. When the temperature of a car reaches 30 degrees Celsius, it increases the risk of making errors during driving by 20 per cent and can also reduce the reaction time by 22 per


Experts at the Ouironsalud Hospitals of Torrevieia and Valencia warn that heat affects the driver's capabilities and behaviour with the excess temperatures in our body surface affecting the area of the brain which controls our moods, modulates sleep and our reactions to certain unexpected circumstances. When the heat affects this gland in the brain it can lead to feelings of tiredness, drowsiness, aggressiveness and even reduces the capacity of concentration and attention, which can limit the reaction times when driving.

In addition, it is believed that having an interior temperature of the vehicle between 35 and 40 degrees Celsius is just as dangerous as having drunk five beers.

For safer driving, it is advised to try and park cars in shady areas if possible and use sunshades which can reduce the temperature in a vehicle by up to 15 per cent compared to the outside temperature.

Remember when driving long distances to stop every two hours or around every 200km to rest and eat light foods to help stay hydrated such as salads and fruit.

ITHOUT sounding too much like my esteemed cocontributor Mike Senker, I want to have a bit of a moan. There are certain bits of equipment that I found annoying and pointless. I have never been a lover of dishwashers.

The domestic version I mean. We couldn't do without them commercially - but in the home? I accept that, not being a family man, there is normally only one or two of us contributing to dirty cutlery and crockery in my household so it is no hard task to wash by hand and of course saves piling the machine daily until you have sufficient to turn on a machine that is going to take hours to complete to say nothing of water and electric consumption!



Railway resurrection

DEMANDS are growing to reopen the Guadix-Baza-Almanzora-Lorca railway line, which once stopped at Olula del Rio and Huercal-Overa. Running from Granada to Murcia through the Almanzora Valley, the line was shut down 32 years ago.

A petition to reopen it on Change.org has gathered hundreds of signatures and the support of various railway platforms.

The Association of Friends of the Railway in Baza is working with partners in Almanzora and across Almeria. Together they have called for public protests and marches demanding the return of the historic line.

The Andalucian parliament has commissioned a survey into the feasibility of the project, which would dramatically improve transport links for Olula del Rio residents.

Fabric of village life

A SPECIAL series of workshops examined the architectural history of Oria. A conference was held by architect Jorge Moya Muñoz on the town's interesting heritage and the construction techniques which built it.

The event was coupled with a photography exhibit showcasing Oria's architectural passage through time. People were invited to ask any questions they had about various civil, religious and military buildings, with experts on hand to share the story behind

An underlying theme was how older artefacts and buildings in Oria, and across the Almanzora Valley are threatened by modern

Muñoz shared his concerns about a lack of contemporary respect for local heritage and fears that a cheaper, less passionate modern architecture could ruin smaller towns and

Funding and maintenance are also lacking due to economic difficulties and a lack of political willpower.

Attendees heard how Oria's historic architecture is in many ways a reflection of the town and Almanzora life in a distant age. Protecting against humidity using clay and soil is something of a lost art form, but is an immensely important part of the Valley's architectural heritage.

Plot twist for teen chain gang

JUVENILE offenders locked up in the Purchena Internment Centre are being sent out into the fields to learn the value of hard work.

The new programme sees wayward youngsters train as agricultural labourers. They will plant seeds, collect crops, irrigate ditches, and wash, weigh and package produce.

Training begins when jailed offenders reach the age of 16. There are around 70 young offenders living in the centre who are eligible for the programme. They will also be taught painting, gardening, and craftsman-

Already the centre's gardens are well-stocked with fresh produce planted, grown and reaped by the youngsters. The programme teaches them new skills, the value of professionalism and helps control anger and energy levels.

Most are non-violent but repeat offenders who have little in the way of qualifications.

Against landlord goldmine

THE debate over Airbnb is heating up after the American company revealed it connects properties in every single neighbourhood in Madrid to tourists. There are 13,335 homes in the capital being used to accommodate travellers on the Airbnb platform alone.

The firm's main competitors, HomeAway and Rentalia, are no slacks either. The result is tens of thousands of properties are now almost exclusively devoted to the tourist market.

Just three years ago Airbnb had less than 5,000 homes. They have since tripled their supply and no single district of Spain's biggest city is free from Airbnb apartments.

Madrid's situation, and that of Barcelona, is profoundly different to that experienced by smaller cities across Spain. The original aim of Airbnb tourists renting an apartment to escape the city centre hotel experience - still holds true on the costas and campo, but not in Spain's

major metropolises.

In both Madrid and Barcelona, city centres are reserved for offices, the wealthy and tourists. Protests from residents fighting expulsion to the outskirts of the city have convulsed the Catalan capital but been absent in Madrid.

That looks set to change as

the scale of Airbnb's impact on Madrid becomes clear. Last week it was revealed more than 23,000 long term residents have been forced to leave central neighbourhoods since 2010.

Such is the demand that even quieter working-class districts just outside the city centre are being swamped with tourist apartments. More than 640,000 Airbnb'ers visited Madrid last year, an increase of 78 per cent on 2015.

The city's powerful hotel lobby has taken note. They are seeing little profit from the huge rise in tourist numbers and are piling pressure on the government to impose a crackdown.

Chilling out in the casa

AMID heatwaves and regular high temperatures, Spanish homeowners are hunting for alternatives to air conditioning. Formerly considered a Godsend in the summer months, air con now stands accused of all manner of crimes.

There is growing awareness in Spain over its effects on health. Cheaper systems in particular can cause throat pain, muscular contractions, even lead to pneumonia. Meanwhile a standard-sized conditioner recycling air for five or six hours during a hot August day can set a household back by €60 a month.

Enter a growing number of Spanish companies offering specialised tweaks to more efficiently chill homes, while adding value to the property.

Proper awning for instance is growing in popularity. It

can reduce the need for electric air conditioners by up to 80 per cent simply by neutralising the sun's rays.

A more traditional method, the fan, is also making a comeback. Slow spinning and whirring ceiling fans are a thing of the past. Today's contraptions can adapt their motion and speed to take account of room dimensions. They have far greater range and hum along almost in silence.

Spanish homeowners are also experiencing the benefits of aluminium windows. Modern version use crystals to protect the windows from high temperatures.

This smart glass also works to fend off the cold, acting as a dual-purpose system that shaves a huge amount from both heating and air conditioning bills.

A second British invasion underway

WAVES of retired Brits are set to settle in Spain and other sunny EU countries as a final Brexit deal looms in the near future.

Since the referendum websites and property portals advertising Spanish homes have seen the number of British visitors skyrocket.

Nor is the phenomenon restricted to pensioners. Young professionals willing to dive head first into a new life abroad while keeping their EU passports are also gazing enviously at Spain's thriving property market.

But Brits who have long eyed a sunsoaked retirement are the likeliest buyers. Thousands who were planning to move in the next decade or two now have just a few years to decide as any final deal looks certain to make a fresh start harder and more expensive.

Whether Spain would welcome and provide services for an older cohort of immigrants, boosting the local economy but not joining the workforce is the question. Madrid may leverage its acceptance of British expatriates against the ease Spanish workers can reside in the UK.

Regardless of the eventual Brexit deal, the news is good for sellers and real estate agents based in Spain, who can expect buyer interest to rise substantially as the negotiations crack on.

Spain dominates online searches for properties abroad among British nationals, well ahead of France, Portugal and Italy. On property portal Rightmove more than 2.5 million searches for Spanish homes are made from UK computers every month.

HOME sales shot up by 19 per cent in June according to the latest public release from Spain's National Institute of Statistics (INE). The more than 51,000 registered transactions represent an increase of roughly 10,000 on June of 2016.

May's sales were 25 per cent higher than May of last year. With June's strong performance, sales have risen on a year-on-year basis every month for more than three years.

Home sales rise strongly

Good news for developers is that new home sales rose by 20 per cent in June, the best year on year increase since 2010. Flat sales jumped up by a healthy 18 per cent.

The average price of homes sold in June was €1,358, an increase of 1.4 per cent. Sales vol-

ume and prices rose across Spain's Mediterranean coast, with the Balearic Islands, Costa Brava and Costa Dorada clocking up exceptional performances. The pace of sales in Alicante is now over 100 per day, a milestone not hit since 2008.

The number of mortgage loans granted also rose. There were slightly over 33,000 in June alone, with an average of \le 162,899 loaned out, a slight drop on June 2016's average.

Sales are tipped to soar past the half million mark by the end of the year. By 2020 figures above 600,000 are being floated. At the peak of Spain's property bubble a decade ago figures sales surpassed 250,000 per quarter.

Espalier: a two dimensional garden


THERE are so many different opportunities to garden in the Mediterranean that the keen gardener may find that they don't have enough space for all the plants they would like to have growing

Nothing tastes better than fresh fruit from your own garden but of course a fruit tree can take up a lot of space and usually has more fruit than necessary when mature.

Fruit trees are therefore often a lower priority in the garden unless you have a big garden area and the time to

A proficient gardener doesn't let this drive him up the wall though, instead he will train the fruit trees or other space taking ornamental plants up the wall using the art of espalier.

Espalier makes a tree two-dimensional by training it to grow against a wall or support by selectively pruning all but the desired branches to form the pattern required to fit the space selected for it to grow. The tree is al-



lowed to grow up and across but not out from the wall.

It is an ancient garden art form used by the Egyptians, Greeks and Romans that has been well used in Europe for centuries. It requires some skill and understanding of the nature of the trees' growth patterns and of pruning so you may need to do some research but it is worth the effort to be able to grow trees in this way.

As the trees are more controlled, fruit trees often have bigger and better fruit than standard trees as the energy from the roots is supplied to fewer

Typically the central trunk will have branching growing horizontally on both sides at the same height and there would be three to five such branching from the trunk at about 30 - 40 cm distance apart up the trunk.

Branches need to be tied to the wall or support wires to maintain the integrity of the design for supporting the weight, including the fruit and the direction of growth.

Some trees do not grow naturally to this typical form due to excessive branch forming so it may be necessary to create a fan shape with branches spreading out from the truck at different angles or other design forms that may be suitable to allow the tree to grow two-dimensionally.

This is where research and imagination are required to form a suitable pattern for the trees natural growth thus making it an art form. It will take more time and planning to get a plant established but once the form is developed it can be less work to maintain than a standard tree and it will display the skills of a proficient gardener.

Damp in Spanish homes

MANY British expatriates may believe that the year-round sun in Spain means waving goodbye to damp problems but those under that illusion are likely to learn otherwise if enjoying a prolonged stay on the continent.

Each year, the average Spanish home copes with around 45,000 gallons of rain water and as many homes are old or not constructed with damp proofing, it can become a prob-

As a tourist destination, the prominence of high rise hotels and apartment blocks are prone to rising damp as fungal spores can spread through walls and ceilings. Older buildings in particular are more prone.

Signs to look out for include water marks or salt deposits on the inside of walls, stained decoration and damaged and crumbling plaster. This can be gradual but widespread.

As well as making a property cold and miserable, it can aggravate respiratory prob-

The best way to eliminate rising damp is to completely scrape off all effected plaster and allow the wall to dry out completely.

Most ferreterias (Spanish DIY stores) will stock products to prevent the problem reoccurring but should there be any uncertainty then it is best to call a professional.

Dogs have simple stomachs and short digestive tracts for digesting meat. They also lack the saliva enzyme amylase, which is necessary for pre-digesting starch. Dogs have adapted to foods with high vegetable protein levels, however they perform better when fed foods high in meat protein and animal fats.



STEVE MCQUEEN'S old Porsche was among five cars sold for more than €10 million at the classic Pebble Beach auction in California last weekend. His 1970-built 917K was used in the legend's race film Le Mans and became the most expensive Porsche ever sold, going for around €15 million.

With the cash still rolling in, an estimated €250 million worth of classic cars were flogged at one of the globe's hottest auctions. That figure is down substantially from the highs of 2014 when almost €400 million was raked in.



Lexus IS300h



LEXUS IS 300H: Has a strong business-user appeal.

LEXUS is not at all modest about its latest IS 300h model, describing it as 'the most efficient sports saloon available today.

Hard-headed motoring journalists like to challenge such sweeping statements, but in this instance, it is difficult to dispute. The hybrid Lexus IS competes against more mainstream compact executive saloons such as the Audi A4, Jaguar XE, Mercedes C Class and BMW 3 Series but not all are available in comparable hybrid form and those that are tend to cost more or offer less standard kit.

The IS 300h - also available in non-hybrid turbo-petrol form - is priced from €33,065 (£30,105) and comes with distinctive styling, is laden with equipment, beautifully built and finished.

Its driving experience is quick and quiet and the only minor downside is perhaps that it is so refined, it is not as exciting to drive than some of its rivals. But then the Lexus scores highly for relatively low running costs - 23.2 kpl (65.7 mpg) and very low emissions.

The car has potent styling - the deep gaping grille and narrow headlights make rivals such as the Jaguar XE appear quite muted - and its performance figures underpin its sporty look with 0-100 kph in 8.4 seconds, top speed 201 kph (125 mph).

The 2.5 litre petrol engine offers 178 hp boosted to 220 hp by an electric motor, and with a revised chassis and slightly firmer suspension, the overall result is smooth rapid progress with seamless multi-mode CVT gearshifts and composed handling.

The cabin has a luxury look which suggests it might belong to a class above, and the seating is exceptionally comfortable. The dashboard looks less conventional than most, with stepped styling dominated by a big 26cm (10.3 inch) screen.

There's good head and leg room front and rear and the 430 litre boot capacity is good given that some space has been sacrificed to accommodate the hybrid batteries. A useful feature on this saloon is split-fold rear seats which means longer items too large for a normal boot can still be loaded.

Standard equipment on the test model (€38,853 - £35,375) includes keyless entry and push-button start, dual zone climate control, adaptive cruise control, front and rear parking sensors and rear view camera, alloy wheels, LED lights, leather upholstery, DAB radio/CD, Bluetooth and USB ports. My test model also had Premium sat-nav with remote computer-mouse style control.


