Anti-terror flower pots roasted **Stumbling block**

Firefighters have launched a scathing criticism of the new anti-terrorism concrete barriers and flower pots set up in Palma in the wake of the Barcelona terror attack.

The force claims the blocks, designed to prevent terrorist lorry massacres, make it impossible to respond quickly to an emergency.

"In trying to solve one problem, the city has created another one," read a statement from Palma fire brigade. Only smaller vehicles can fit around the concrete buffers and giant flower pots, meaning firefighters will be forced to remove them before accessing fires.

The town hall has admitted that the bumpers will impede fire engines and ambulances. But it was described as a 'minor evil' worth paying the price.

A press release suggested the barriers were ordered by Spain's Interior Ministry. It remains unclear whether they are temporary or will become permanent fixtures at Placa d'Espanya and on the Sant Miquel shopping street

Meanwhile political party Mes per Mallorca has attacked the King of Spain for entertaining Saudi princes. The island-focused group, which is part of the ruling Balearic coalition, also denounced the welcoming of superyachts owned by Arab despots.

Spokesman David Abril accused Saudi Arabia and Qatar of sponsoring terrorism and Islamic extremism. It is intolerable to continue with lucrative arms deals and diplomatic fawning in the aftermath of the Barcelona terrorist attack, he argued.

"We welcome yachts from the emir of Qatar, or prince of Saudi Arabia with open arms because they bring money," he said. "Even though that money is stained with blood."

Killer driver freed

A LORRY driver accused of causing a fatal accident on the MA-13 road to Alcudia has been released on charges

According to witness reports the 54-year-old Chilean ploughed headlong into three cars after driving

on the wrong side of the road, leaving three people dead and six injured.

After expressing his regret for the victims he tested negative for drugs and alcohol, and his mobile phone will be checked to see if it was in use at the

time of the incident last Monday.

A 10-year-old German girl who lost her father in the smash remains in Son Espases hospital alongside her mother, while a Spanish woman and Colombian man were also killed.

'Hate group' plots sky protest

ULTRA-conservatives are planning to fly over Mallorca in a plane carrying a banner with anti-transgender slogans. The right-wing Catholic protest group Hazte Oir is known for its touring bus, described as a 'hate bus' by opponents, which was repelled by Palma activists last year.


Hazte Oir organise regular tours across Spain protesting a perceived increase in transgender influence. They want parents to have the right to keep children out of classes which 'normalise' transgenderism and oppose gay marriage.

Their 'hate bus' slogan read 'Boys have a penis, girls have a vulva, do not be deceived'

'No sexual relations with that woman'

THE former chief of Palma's Local Police has denied snorting cocaine and boozing in a brothel owned by the city's alleged underworld godfather. Antoni Vera was the only one of 28 police officers summoned to testify in court who volunteered to show up.

Prosecutors believe that an entire unit of the Local Police operated under the thumb of nightclub boss Tolo Cursach for years. They suspect the officers of participating in alleged drug trafficking and extortion rackets that raked in more than €1 million a day.

Judges have demanded that 28 suspended officers appear to face questioning. The other 27 have either postponed dates or taken a vow of silence.

Ex-chief Vera instead took the opportunity to deny all charges against him. One former brothel madam claims to have seen him regularly participating in drug-fuelled orgies with prostitutes paid for by Cursach.

She also claims he took thousands of euros of bribes from brothel and nightclub managers. The same witness has accused two senior politicians of cavorting with escorts and has been violently assaulted by henchmen.

The police chief has submitted hair samples which came back negative for the use of drugs. Results only account for a few months and Vera has been under investigation since 2013.

His court appearance is a prelude to the trial of Cursach, which will be by far the biggest in Mallorca's criminal history. The millionaire nightclub owner is charged with murder, sexually abusing a child, drug trafficking, extortion, and pimping. He faces 80 years in prison.

Public enemy

TELEPHONE providers are public enemy number one for Mallorca residents according to consumer complaint data. More than 4,000 people have lodged official complaints with the government this year.

Airlines are the second biggest offenders, while third place goes to providers of electrical appliances, including fridges and washing machines. A new online system to register complaints can be found at portalconsum.caib.es. Spanish or Catalan is required.

Money spinners

A HIKING lodge in Deia is the latest property to fall foul of Mallorca's crackdown on illegal tourist renting. Technically the lodge is open to all members of the public, but that didn't stop managers making a profit on the side.

Monk's chambers in the Valldemossa monastery were recently found to be a hotbed of illegal tourist accommodation. They were even advertised online.

Sober shopping

BOOZE has been banned from shop windows in Magaluf. Drinks machines selling alcohol will also be removed from public spaces.

Calvia mayor Alfronso Rodriquez is leading negotiations to ban all-inclusive drinks offers from hotels. Happy hours are also under threat. Rodriguez says it is ridiculous to moan about drunkenness while plying tourists with cheap drink 17 hours a day.

Best beaches

PALMA is the third best beach city in Europe according to a poll from GoEuro. It came just behind Alicante and Catania in Sicily. Cities were marked on water warmth and quality, nightlife and shopping

A poll from Trivago found that four Mallorcan beaches were considered among the top 10 in Spain. Playa de Muro, Cala Millor, Colonia de Sant Jordi, and Port d'Alcudia scooped the awards.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...26

The Osborne group - founded in 1772 and now the second oldest business in Spain - may be famous for its brandy-sherry, but it's the Osborne Bull silhouettes that constantly steal the national limelight.

Load of national pride

THE Osborne Bull is a symbol of Spanish culture, both nationally and abroad.

With black bull silhouettes on hilltops and roadsides in many, but not all regions of Spain, the first was erected 60 years ago, 12 months after the Osborne group of wineries - originally founded in Cadiz - ordered an artist to promote a 'Veteran' brandy.

It was set in motion by Manolo Prieto, a prolific Andalucian artist who died in 1991. He remains famous for the roadside monuments even though a personal source of disappointment given other works of which he was proud failed to gain recognition.

The Osborne Bull silhouettes started life as four-metre-high wooden figures, but in 1961 they were made from metal sheets to better withstand the weather and their height was increased to seven metres.

However, one year later new advertising

rules forced the Osborne company to move them away from roadsides, and they were consequently increased in size to their present-day 14 metres so that they would be more visible.

Then in 1994 the EU banned roadside advertising of alcohol, but despite an initial campaign to see all the bulls re-



Naughty Brits

MALLORCA and Ibiza were singled out in a BBC survey as among the top destinations for badly behaved Brits. The number of arrests for drunkenness at UK airports has shot up by 50 per cent in the past year.

Palma, Ibiza and Alicante were the worst offending routes. A total of 387 disorderly Brits were arrested in just 12 months, not including those detained in Spain.

BRITISH naval destroyer the HMS Duncan is anchored in Palma Port until Sunday.

Kingpin locked up

A NOTORIOUS drug kingpin has been thrown back in prison for weapons possession. Pablo Campos Maya, formerly one of the biggest traffickers in Palma, was found with two revolvers and a stockpile of ammunition by police

He has been jailed for two years, alongside his son, who was locked up for drug dealing offences. Police raided several addresses linked to the gangster, known simply as Pablo, in the La Soledat district, uncovering

drugs and the 38 calibre guns.

Pablo was detained in 2013 during Operation Nero, one of the biggest drugs raids in Mallorca's history. The gypsy patriarch controlled an entire street which stank of marihuana and where cocaine was sold openly.

His slum mansion had satin curtains and a jacuzzi. He previously served 15 years in prison for trafficking and even escaped on horseback from Picassent prison while out on leave.

Rolex robbers' Mafia link

ANOTHER gang of Rolex rogues has been smashed by Spanish police. This time the watch thieves were based on Ibiza. The multiple arrests come just weeks after Mallorca police detained nine suspects following a wave of violent watch robberies in July.

Police on Mallorca's sister island recovered two watches, valued at €50,000 and €8,000. and shed some light on the crook's wider strategy.

The suspects are young Italian men from Naples. Dozens of them are dispatched on ferries to Palma, Ibiza and Barcelona over summer. They stay in their destinations for one or two weeks and target tourists and residents, usually Germans on Mallorca, with expensive watches.

Mafia gangs provide them with false IDs, cash, accommo-

dation, bike and scooter rental.

In the vast majority of cases two men approach their targets on a 125cc scooter. One jumps off and snatches the watch then hops back on the bike. They often employ violence.

Police believe the operations on Mallorca, Ibiza and the mainland are part and parcel of a large mafia conspiracy.

In total watches worth well over €100,000 have been stolen and never recovered.



She was later taken to hospital by ambulance to receive treatment. Investigations continue as police are working with evidence to hunt the offenders.



Increasing frequency

THE insolvency of Air Berlin has encouraged another German budget airline Germania to look to increase the frequency of its flights to Mallorca.



Daredevils' red tape anger

HUNTERS, hikers and other outdoorsy types are set to protest against tightening restrictions on adventure activities.


A loose collective of horse riders, cave divers, climbers, hunting associations and mountaineers met in the Ses Torres restaurant between Santa Margalida and Manacor to discuss their outrage.

They announced a demonstration in Palma for September 30 where they will make their feelings crystal clear outside the offices of Balearic president Francina Armengol.

Most are angry about the extreme red tape involved in getting permits for their pastimes, and in some cases, jobs. Horse coachmen fighting for their livelihoods oppose new animal rights laws. Meanwhile health and safety requirements and enhanced environmental protection make many adventure sports either prohibitively expensive or outright illegal. The law now favours organised tours under licensed operators, and punishes independent adventurers.

Many members are themselves dedicated environmentalists. One is Bartomeu Llinas, chairman of a platform dedicated to preserving horse trails who described the current regime as a "dictatorship."

"We are environmentalists, who actually live in nature," he said, "but the Ministry of the Environment is packed with people who refuse to listen to us and instead follow the advice of outside experts."

Free travel under threat

AN eleventh-hour court ruling has thrown free passage through the Soller tunnel into doubt. Fare-free journeys were promised to drivers from September after the Mallorca Island Council announced plans to buy the tunnel over.

Tolls were due to be abolished a week on Friday but a lingering legal dispute between the concessionaire, Globalvia, and the Council, has gotten more complex.

A court has ruled that the compensation paid to Globalvia is too low. The company has always demanded €31 million, but the Mallorcan authorities are only willing to pay €17 million.

Under the original agreement, Globalvia owned the rights to the tunnel until 2022. Despite charging hefty tolls it failed to make the tunnel a success. Local de-

mand encouraged Mallorca to terminate the contract five years early, pay compensation, and abolish the toll.

The €17 million payment was a take it or leave it offer but Globalvia has been fighting it in the courts since June. With the latest ruling it is possible that terminating the contract might be delayed,

maybe even cancelled altogether.

Globalvia will remain in control during the legal wrangling and is certain to continue charging drivers. There is also political opposition within Mallorca. Both the conservative Popular Party and Ciudadanos were against buying out the contract.

ALMOST 3,000 people have signed a petition against the planned Llucmajor-Campos motorway expansion. An online campaign has been launched to oppose the project and demand an alternative with less social and environmental cost.

Named Sense Limit No Hi Ha Futur (No future without limits) the movement has secured 2,900 signatures in just a few weeks.

It opposes plans to widen the current road from 10 metres to 42, making it an enormous dual carriageway. An extra 3,000 cars will drive down the road daily if all goes to plan.

The blueprint allows for the seizure of 222 fincas to make way for miles of cement. An estimated 53 hectares of pine forest, fruit trees and cereal crops will be destroyed

In their petition the group claims the extra traffic will be directed to mega shopping centres that are destroying traditional businesses.

They claim the €43 million to be spent on the road is a total waste on an "obsolete transport model with no future."

Plastic sea threat

NOWHERE in Mallorca's extensive coastal waters is free from plastic pollution. A study from the Spanish Marine Research Institute found that Balearic waters are universally contaminated with either micro-particles of plastic, or big chunks of it.

These are preliminary results, with the conclusion expected in September. Samples have been taken from all across the islands,

including at Cala Ratjada, Cala d'Or, C'an-Picafort, Soller, Andratx, and Palma.

Scientists are investigating the origin as well as the distribution of the plastic, which can severely threaten marine wildlife populations. Decomposing plastic waste drifting across the Mediterranean in record volumes is one culprit. Another is abrasion from fishing nets.

POLICE divers extracted an illegal fishing net five metres deep on the Cala Ratjada coast.

Two dead turtles were found in the net and moved to the Palma Aquarium.

ONLINE SHOPPING BECOMES EASIER Retailers build better sites

A NEW report suggests that with up to 80 per cent of the Spanish population having access to the internet, e-commerce is about to accelerate dramatically.

Currently Amazon Spain is estimated to be the largest internet seller in the country with turnover in excess of $\in 3$ trillion, followed surprisingly by Chinese site Alibaba which operates in Spain under the name Aliexpress at just over $\in 1$ billion, whilst el Corte Ingles trails in third place at \notin 530 million.

As more retailers offer an online purchasing service, so more consumers are purchasing through them but what isn't known or even understood is how many of these sales would have been made in store and therefore how profitable these sites really are.

For small retailers online outlets such as Amazon are without doubt an ideal option as consumers can compare prices and read service reviews.

This also becomes an attractive option for larger stores but whilst they benefit from their strength in purchasing in bulk, they have to ensure that their operating costs don't make them uncompetitive.

Stores such as those owned by the Inditex and Mango groups are able to reach customers in areas where shops are spread thinly and they have invested large amounts into ensuring that their sites are quick, efficient and easy to use.

Supermarket sites, which are very popular in the UK, are perhaps not so profitable here and appear in some cases to have been introduced for the sake of having an online site rather than actually planning them out properly.

The Mercadona group is a perfect example as it has had to be redesigned and responsibility for this has been handed to the founder's



youngest daughter Juana Roig, but the results suggest Mercadona is well ahead of its competitors with growing purchases online.

Having said this, it is estimated that total turnover is somewhere between \notin 170 million and \notin 190 million which is just 1 per cent of annual turnover and this division currently trades at a loss.

Conversely however, customers tend to buy larger amounts of goods than they would in store in order to justify the delivery and handling charges.

Those with an eye for a bargain however have discovered that some (although not all) sites outside Spain will deliver via couriers, often free of charge, so it is possible to purchase perfume from the UK, costume jewellery from Germany or even clothing from Debenhams online with substantial savings over Spanish retail prices.

AMERICANS BEEF UP MARKET Huge growth for burger chains

A SIMPLE piece of minced beef in a bun is fuelling a whole new revolution in the fast food market in Spain.

For generations, the vast majority of restaurants and food outlets in Spain sold traditional Spanish food and to a great extent older generations of Spaniards have remained loyal to this cuisine.

As with so many other European countries however, the American way of eating started to spread and by the middle of the 1980s, both Burger King and McDonald's were firmly entrenched in the Spanish psyche.

The concept of this type of fast food spawned a number of local eateries such as Vip although other American food outlets including KFC and Friday's promoted the opening of franchise operations around the country.

The two big burger giants saw off the presence of Wendy's American burgers but are now facing an onslaught of beefy competition.

In many towns, local, un-franchised burger restaurants with names like Gourmet Burger and American Burger have opened up. These offer a burger ex-

perience rather than simple fast food and attract a trendy audience.

Having seen the success of McDonald's with its 500 branches and Burger King with 700, at least three US chains have now decided that the time has come to expand their empires within Spain.

Although not household names in Europe, Steak 'N Shake with 544 outlets in the USA, Five Guys with 700 and Carl's Jr leading the way with 1,385 have started to test the Spanish waters by opening restaurants in some of the main cities in Spain.

Clearly if these are successful then there is likely to be a massive expansion especially in areas with shopping centres where each of these operations would fit in well.

One of the problems that the existing companies running burger outlets may face is the cost of franchising as it appears that the 'new boys on the block' are prepared to undercut McDonald's and Burger King with lower start-up costs in order to gain a speedy increase in market share.

Beatles' relics still popular

ALTHOUGH it is nearly 50 years since the Beatles split up, they are still the most collected group worldwide with a page of lyrics likely to sell for €20,000.

This is the amount expected to be paid in auction in September for Paul McCartney's handwritten score of Eleanor Rigby which has been signed by the 'fifth Beatle,' producer, the late Sir George Martin.

This is believed to be a piece handed to one of the backing octet consisting of violins, violas and cellos who helped record the original version of the song.

Coincidentally, a bible owned by Eleanor Rigby whose name on a gravestone inspired the song - has just been found and is also included in the auction.

John Lennon famously spent some time in Spain and who knows whether other forgotten Beatles' treasures are waiting to be found here and in the UK.

Repsol share forecasts

BARCLAY'S BANK differs from other investment advisors although downgrading its forecast for Spanish oil company Repsol.

Whilst it doesn't believe that Repsol will generate large amounts of dividend in the immediate future it has indicated a target price of €19 which is hugely higher than any other forecast.

According to the British Bank, it expects to see a growth by Repsol of 35 per cent and its share forecast price compares to an average of \in 14.57 and a low of \in 10.89.

At the time of writing, the actual share price was €14.01 and had seen some decent growth in the last few weeks but it is unusual to see such diverse opinion amongst investment houses.

RYANAIR ACCUSES GERMAN GOVERNMENT OF CARVE UP Angry at Lufthansa support

ACCUSATIONS are flying across borders as one of the main carriers of German tourists to Spain applies for liquidation.

Air Berlin which was the largest carrier serving the Balearics and Mallorca in particular was supported for some time by Abu Dhabi-based airline Etihad but with their financial backing withdrawn, the airline can't continue.

It has already passed some of its routes to former subsidiary Austrian airline Niki (originally founded by Formula 1 driver Niki Lauda) and now with a €150 million grant from the German government, it hopes to continue to fly until it is taken over by Lufthansa.

This support has infuriated Ryanair which is currently the second largest operator in Mallorca and the Irish company has accused the German airlines and government of what it calls 'a carve up' which will be to the advantage of Lufthansa.

In a statement, a spokesperson for Ryanair said "This artificially created



In accordance with this belief, the company has filed a complaint with the German Federal Cartel Office as well

as with the EU Competition Commission

Ryanair which has been trying to increase the number of airports in Germany from which it can operate suggests that the demise of Air Berlin and take-over of 'cheap aircraft' by Lufthansa will reduce competition and see higher fares on routes which were previously run on a competitive basis.

The German government rejects all of Ryanair's accusations but the European Commission decision may play an important part in seeing how matters progress in the German market which is so important to Lufthansa.

Unions at Eurowings, a low cost carrier which is a subsidiary of Lufthansa also criticise the deal, believing that it will allow the German parent to take over Air Berlin staff on terms which are potentially worse than those who work for the company.

Cabin crew are now considering whether it would be appropriate to take strike action in support of their pay claims which have coincidentally broken down recently.

Go slow at airports

AS the strike of security staff at Barcelona El Prat airport is called off temporarily, staff at other Aena managed Spanish airports have announced their own programme.

Whilst Barcelona was the touch paper and an arbitrator is likely to be appointed by central government, the explosion of anger by staff could bring a winter of delays and irritation to passengers.

It is expected that Marcos Peña, who was involved in trying to resolve the recent Stevedore's dispute will be appointed to try to get the parties to agree on a way forward.

If the staff in Barcelona can be placated, then it is possible that staff in the other airports will be likely to settle.

Documents to carry

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



A COMMON question that often crops up for drivers in Spain is what documents must be carried in the car with you. Here the N-332 team have the answers...

The ITV card

This is the official document which relates to the technical inspection of the vehicle.

ITV report

Once your vehicle is four years old it is required to have the mandatory ITV test and the report which states what happened during the inspection and confirms it is road worthy, and it must be carried in the vehicle.

Permiso de Circulacion

The Permiso de Circulacion is similar to a log book for a vehicle and contains information such as the number plate, vehicle owner and other details relating to the vehicle.

There are also some other documents which are not compulsory, but it is advisable that you carry them with you. These include:

Insurance policy

This is not compulsory as all the information is contained on a central computer, however, if you are involved in an accident you will need to know your policy details so it is easier to have them to hand.

European Accident Agreement

Again, this is not compulsory, but it is advisable to carry the European Accident form as it will help you ensure data is recorded correctly in the event of an incident. The forms are available in a number of languages but are all laid out the same so it bridges any language gaps

Copies of your Suma annual tax which is paid to municipal town halls is also not compulsory

Remember that the documents you carry must be the originals, not photocopies. Notarised copies are allowed, but this is the only exception.

THE number of people dying from bowel cancer in the UK has fallen more than 30 per cent in the last 20 years. According to new figures

According to new figures from Cancer Research UK in 1995 the disease caused 38 deaths per 100,000 people which fell to 26 deaths per 100,000 people by 2015, with experts believing better treatment is behind the drop along with better awareness and bowel screening with early diagnosis crucial for survival.

However, despite the figures, bowel cancer is still the second most common cause of cancer death in the UK.

Both men and women have an almost equal risk of

developing bowel cancer and it usually occurs in those aged over 60. The latest figures show that 8,613 men and 7,152 women died from it in 2015, but if caught early there is a strong chance of survival.

There are some main symptoms which if any are present for a continual period, you should seek medical advice; first, if you regularly have blood in stools; a persistent change in toilet habits, lower abdominal pain and bloating and unexplained weight loss.

UK residents aged between 60 and 74 are invited to have bowel cancer screening every two years to check for signs.

Sea urchins

WHAT are sea urchins?

Sea urchins are some of the strangest animals known due to their physical characteristics. Starting from the Echinodea family, the sea urchin has been around for more than 200 million years.

Where are they usually found?

They are usually found on the sea bed, close to coastlines. Bathers tend to find them after they have trodden on one of their spines. They can live up to 2,500 metres below sea level and are usually found in between rocks and crevices.

Is their sting dangerous?

Sea urchins are covered in large, sharp spines and are sometimes venomous. Touching or treading on them is usually very painful as they tend to break off and become lodged in a person's skin. This can lead to chronic pain and swelling if they are not removed. They can also cause pain in a person's muscles and eruptions on the skin.

How can you treat their sting?

A sea urchin sting needs to be removed immediately. Vinegar dissolves most spines, and washing or bathing the area in it should usually be enough to treat the area unless it has gone deep into the skin. For lodged spines, surgery may be necessary. Soaking the area in warm water will alleviate the pain. Sometimes anti-inflammatories, analgesics and antihistamines are also needed to manage symptoms.

Should you seek medical aid if you are stung?

Whenever you are stung by a sea urchin you must go to the nearest medical centre so they can assess the situation.

After a quiet build up through early August, the festival really exploded last Saturday with fire-breathing demons running amok under a sky filled with the sound of fireworks and firecrackers.

Today is a calmer affair which stresses the religious tradition of St Bartholomew, one of the 12 apostles of Jesus. At 11am there is a mass at St Bartholomew's Church, which was built soon after the Christian conquest of Mallorca in 1229.

Tonight there will be live, free music from the Soller municipal band at 8pm at l'Alameda. Then at 10pm just outside the town hall there will be a performance of Broadway: The Musical, for all the family.

Though the headiest days of the festival will be over by the weekend,

there's still plenty of exciting, free events in the pipeline. Tomorrow, throughout the day,

there is a free art exhibition at l'Alameda. At 6pm there will be tasting sessions of local produce at stalls scattered through the town. A live acoustic performance from Argentine singer Gustavo Churruarin starts at 8.30pm, followed by music and entertainment from 11.30pm outside the town hall.

Saturday sees plenty of children's activities throughout the day, including juggling workshops. From 10.30pm at l'Alameda there will be DJs, a calypso orchestra and rock bands providing Soller's soundtrack well into the small hours.

It all ends on Sunday, which starts quietly with a morning chess tournament. Local band Mother Folkers kick off the final festival party with racy folk music from 9.30pm at l'Alameda. The demons and fireworks return for a Correfoc (fire run) at 11pm, with their final, fiery flourish signalling the end of the St Bartholomew party.

Of course, Soller isn't the only place with a strong St Bartholomew tradition. There are other festivals in Cala Ratjada and Montiuri. These slightly quieter, pagan-style festivals feature colourful, cross-dressing male dancers paying homage to female fertility, and should not be missed.

Island's wild weekend

ALL across Mallorca, towns and villages are holding their traditional festivals in the final two weeks of August. Away from the biggest of the bunch, in Soller, curious travellers can find fun, family-friendly affairs in Randa, Sant Joan and Felantitx.

Animal lovers can catch Felantitx's Horse Festival this weekend, one of the most unusual events on the island. The ritual dance performed by skilled locals in horse costume is a tradition stretching back centuries.

There will, of course, be horses too, dressed nicely and shown off to the crowds. There is no cruelty or racing involved. A full schedule of the festival can be found on the town hall website. Tomorrow the small village of Randa, between Llucmajor and Montuiri, begins its annual summer festival. There will be food stalls and live music amid the daily parades.

Saturday evening will see a special market devoted to local goods, while on Sunday there will be midnight fireworks under the stars to cap it all off.

Sant Joan, which many consider to be the true centre of the island, holds its own patron saint's festival in the last two weeks of the month. Like its namesake, the wild parties that take place across Cataluñia and Mallorca in June, this festival features fire runs, fire juggling, demons and lots of face-painting, music and fun.

Classic festival final concerts

THERE are just two more performances before the 56th edition of the Pollensa International Classic Music Festival comes to a close.

The world-renowned festival has been drawing sophisticated crowds since it was started by violinist Philip Newman in 1961. Concerts take place in August, all within the perfect audio

setting of the Santa Domingo Convent, and all at 10pm.

This season features a total of eight concerts and has so far been a remarkable critical and commercial success.

Tickets are still available for the final two performances on Saturday and Wednesday evenings. On Saturday, the Mandelring Quartet take to the Cloister's stage. The group are famed for their interpretative recordings of Shostakovich's string quartets. They received critical acclaim for their Schubert and Schumann recordings and CD boxset of Mendelssohn's chamber music.

Tickets for both concerts range from €25 to €30 and can be purchased online. This year's festival has been a far more exciting proposition, with a broader range of musicians than ever before.

than 7,500 hotel bedrooms opened in the UK during the first half of 2017 - the highest figure for the first six months of the year since 2012.

The number of openings is also 40 per cent higher when compared to the same period last year, according to the Q2 2017 Hotel Bulletin.

The figures are slightly behind those forecast in the Q4 2016 Hotel Bulletin that suggested 20,000 hotel bedrooms would open in the UK during 2017, representing a supply growth of 3.3 per cent, which is more than double the average net increase of 1.6 per cent.

The budget sector has continued to account for a significant proportion of new hotels and is expected to continue to do so in the future, with 43 per cent of all openings over the next three years expected to be budget properties.

Budget hotels currently make up 33 per cent of the



Premier Inn, the UK's largest hotel brand with 67,000 bedrooms across more than 760 hotels, is highlighted in the report as continuing its 'unyielding brand roll-out.' Key openings for the Whitbreadowned brand in Q2 2017 included a 613-bedroom hotel at London Heathrow Airport Terminal 4 and the fifth Hub by Premier Inn with 389bedrooms in London's King's Cross.

Premier Inn intends to have 85,000 bedrooms open by 2020. Should keep Lenny Henry busy!!

Against landlord goldmine

THE debate over Airbnb is heating up after the American company revealed it connects properties in every single neighbourhood in Madrid to tourists. There are 13.335 homes in the capital being used to accommodate travellers on the Airbnb platform alone.

The firm's main competitors, HomeAway and Rentalia, are no slacks either. The result is tens of thousands of properties are now almost exclusively devoted to the tourist market.

Just three years ago Airbnb had less than 5.000 homes. They have since tripled their supply and no single district of Spain's biggest city is free from Airbnb apartments.

Madrid's situation, and that of Barcelona, is profoundly different to that experienced by smaller cities across Spain. The original aim of Airbnb tourists - renting an apartment to escape the city centre hotel experience - still holds true on the costas and campo, but not in

Spain's major metropolises. In both Madrid and Barcelona, city centres are reserved for offices, the wealthy and tourists. Protests from residents fighting expulsion to the outskirts of the city have convulsed the Catalan capital but been absent in Madrid.

That looks set to change as the scale of Airbnb's impact on Madrid becomes clear. Last week it was revealed more than 23,000 long term residents have been forced to leave central neighbourhoods since 2010.

Such is the demand that even quieter working-class districts just outside the city centre are being swamped with tourist apartments. More than 640,000 Airbnb'ers visited Madrid last year, an increase of 78 per cent on 2015.

The city's powerful hotel lobby has taken note. They are seeing little profit from the huge rise in tourist numbers and are piling pressure on the government to impose a crackdown.

Chilling out in the casa

AMID heatwaves and regular high temperatures, Spanish homeowners are hunting for alternatives to air conditioning. Formerly considered a Godsend in the summer months, air con now stands accused of all manner of crimes.

There is growing awareness in Spain over its effects on health. Cheaper systems in particular can cause throat pain, muscular contractions, even lead to pneumonia. Meanwhile a standardsized conditioner recycling air for five or six hours during a hot August day can set a household back by €60 a month.

Enter a growing number of Spanish companies offering specialised tweaks to more efficiently chill homes, while adding value to the property.

Proper awning for instance is growing in popularity. It can reduce the need for electric air conditioners by up to 80 per cent simply by neutralising the sun's rays.

A more traditional method, the fan, is also making a comeback. Slow spinning and whirring ceiling fans are a thing of the past. Today's contraptions can adapt their motion and speed to take account of room dimensions. They have far greater range and hum along almost in silence.

Spanish homeowners are also experiencing the benefits of aluminium windows. Modern version use crystals to protect the windows from high temperatures.

This smart glass also works to fend off the cold, acting as a dual-purpose system that shaves a huge amount from both heating and air conditioning bills.

Home sales soar

HOME sales shot up by 19 per cent in June according to the latest public release from Spain's National Institute of Statistics (INE). The more than 51,000 registered transactions represent an increase of roughly 10,000 on June of 2016.

May's sales were 25 per cent higher than May of last year. With June's strong performance, sales have risen on a year-on-year basis every month for more than three years.

Good news for developers is that

new home sales rose by 20 per cent in June, the best year on year increase since 2010. Flat sales jumped up by a healthy 18 per cent.

The average price of homes sold in June was \in 1,358, an increase of 1.4 per cent.

Sales volume and prices rose across Spain's Mediterranean coast, with the Balearic Islands, Costa Brava and Costa Dorada clocking up exceptional performances. The pace of sales in Alicante is now over 100 per day, a milestone not hit since 2008.

The number of mortgage loans granted also rose. There were slightly over 33,000 in June alone, with an average of $\notin 162,899$ loaned out, a slight drop on June 2016's average.

Sales are tipped to soar past the half million mark by the end of the year. By 2020 figures above 600,000 are being floated. At the peak of Spain's property bubble a decade ago figures sales surpassed 250,000 per quarter.

A second British invasion underway

WAVES of retired Brits are set to settle in Spain and other sunny EU countries as a final Brexit deal looms in the near future.

Since the referendum websites and property portals advertising Spanish homes have seen the number of British visitors skyrocket.

Nor is the phenomenon restricted to pensioners. Young professionals willing to dive head first into a new life abroad while keeping their EU passports are also gazing enviously at Spain's thriving property market.

But Brits who have long eyed a sun-soaked retirement are the likeliest buyers. Thousands who were planning to move in the next decade or two now have just a few years to decide as any final deal looks certain to make a fresh start harder and more expensive. Whether Spain would welcome and provide services for an older cohort of immigrants, boosting the local economy but not joining the workforce is the question. Madrid may leverage its acceptance of British expatriates against the ease Spanish workers can reside in the UK.

Regardless of the eventual Brexit deal, the news is good for sellers and real estate agents based in Spain, who can expect buyer interest to rise substantially as the negotiations crack on.

Spain dominates online searches for properties abroad among British nationals, well ahead of France, Portugal and Italy. On property portal Rightmove more than 2.5 million searches for Spanish homes are made from UK computers every month.

Espalier: a two dimensional garden

GRAEME TYRRELL

THERE are so many different opportunities to garden in the Mediterranean that the keen gardener may find that they don't have enough space for all the plants they would like to have growing.

Nothing tastes better than fresh fruit from your own garden but of course a fruit tree can take up a lot of space and usually has more fruit than necessary when mature.

Fruit trees are therefore often a lower priority in the garden unless you have a big garden area and the time to maintain it.

A proficient gardener doesn't let this drive him up the wall though, instead he will train the fruit trees or other space taking ornamental plants up the wall using the art of espalier.

Espalier makes a tree two-dimensional by training it to grow against a wall or support by selectively pruning all but the desired branches to form the pattern required to fit the space se-



lected for it to grow. The tree is allowed to grow up and across but not out from the wall.

It is an ancient garden art form used by the Egyptians, Greeks and Romans that has been well used in Europe for centuries. It requires some skill and

understanding of the nature of the trees' growth patterns and of pruning so you may need to do some research but it is worth the effort to be able to grow trees in this way.

As the trees are more controlled,

bigger and better fruit than standard trees as the energy from the roots is supplied to fewer

Unless you obtain a tree already prepared to be planted as an espalier, you will need to start with a maiden tree of a year old with no side branch-

fruits.

ing or with branching in the appropriate places. This is to ensure it will have branching that aligns with the supports provided on the wall or structure they are to grow on.

Typically the central trunk will have branching growing horizontally on both sides at the same height and there would be three to five such branching from the trunk at about 30 -40 cm distance apart up the trunk.

Branches need to be tied to the wall or support wires to maintain the integrity of the design for supporting the weight, including the fruit and the direction of growth.

Some trees do not grow naturally to this typical form due to excessive branch forming so it may be necessary to create a fan shape with branches spreading out from the truck at different angles or other design forms that may be suitable to allow the tree to grow two-dimensionally.

This is where research and imagination are required to form a suitable pattern for the trees natural growth thus making it an art form.

Damp in Spanish homes

MANY British expatriates may believe that the yearround sun in Spain means waving goodbye to damp problems but those under that illusion are likely to learn otherwise if enjoying a

prolonged stay on the continent.

Each year, the average Spanish home copes with around 45,000 gallons of rain water and as many homes are old or not con-

structed with damp proofing, it can become a problem.

As a tourist destination. the prominence of high rise hotels and apartment blocks are prone to rising damp as fungal spores can spread through walls and ceilings. Older buildings in particular are more prone.

Signs to look out for include water marks or salt deposits on the inside of walls, stained decoration and damaged and crumbling plaster. This can be gradual but widespread.

As well as making a property cold and miserable, it can aggravate respiratory problems.

The best way to eliminate rising damp is to completely scrape off all effected plaster and allow the wall to dry out completely.

Most ferreterias (Spanish DIY stores) will stock products to prevent the problem reoccurring but should there be any uncertainty then it is best to call a professional.

Roses can be a tough process

GROWING roses in Spain can be a tough process.

The intense heat of the sun can be too much and can cause shrivelling, especially in the height of summer.

Ideally, they are best placed in an area which becomes shaded for several hours

such as next to a wall or in front of some hedging. A quality compost and a good mulch (laver of soil surface material) are recommended for optimal water retention with seaweed and pine needles being ideal ingredients. The Mediter-

ranean climate means a long growing and flowering season which lasts approximately from

Easter to Christmas. Yet with this climate

BLOOMING: Roses are beautiful if properly cared for. comes a number of problems such as powdery mildew and rust. The wind carries these fungal diseases which can sit on the soil for some time and then be transferred to the plant during rain showers or when it is watered.

If left untreated they can cause considerable harm to the plant, preventing growth and budding. Sprays can stop the problem but it must be totally eliminated or it will soon return again.

Hot weather also brings more insects and a wider range of the critters. Green, white and black aphids can decimate a rose overnight if in high enough numbers and insecticide sprays are a necessity.

A lot of effort is needed to get the best out of these garden treasures and, if cultivated with care, blooming marvellous results can be enjoyed.

Dogs have simple stomachs and short digestive tracts for digesting meat. They also lack the saliva enzyme amylase, which is necessary for pre-digesting starch. Dogs have adapted to foods with high vegetable protein levels, however they perform better when fed foods high in meat protein and animal fats. 

MERCEDES has updated its S-Class for the 2017 market. Adaptations include enhanced safety features, sleeker looks, and a powerful V8 twin-turbocharged engine boasting 600bhp and a fierce 900Nm of torque.

There are LED headlamps, improved radiator airflow, and four exhaust pipes. Inside, passengers enjoy vastly more legroom and heated seats. Boot size remains the same at a relatively deep 510 litres.

There is a 12.5-inch control panel in the front. All seats are made with fine leather, and those in the front can enjoy a massage on their warm bottoms.

Drivers can make use of a range of new autonomous technologies. 'Active Distance' and 'Active Steering' controls help out on motorways, even automatically reducing speed on tighter bends. Pedestrian sensors. set ot be all the rage next vear. allow for an Active Emergency Stop control, to make reversing over shoppers nearly impossible.

The fiery engine allows for a top speed of 155mph and the new S-Class can, unusually for a saloon, crack the 60mph mark from a standstill in just 3.3 seconds.

Mercedes are pitching the 2017 model as the classiest, most powerful saloon on the market today. The price tag matches the ambition. The swanky new S-Class can be bought from upwards of €130,000.


