Police hold Saudis at gunpoint

No royal pardon

The King of Saudi Arabia has vowed to stay away from Spain after police held his family at gunpoint while dining in Marbella.

Armed officers stormed a luxury restaurant where Prince Abdullah, son of Saudi ruler King Salman Abdulaziz, was dining with his wife.

They then swooped on a second eatery where Abdulla's daughter, Princess Susu, was celebrating her 17th birthday.

Prince Abdullah has complained to the Spanish Interior Ministry, describing "the humiliating treatment by police to my family and entourage in the Finca Besaya and El Ancla restaurants."

A Saudi Royal House member since the 1980s present at Finca Besaya said he had never seen police behaviour like it.

"They treated us as if we were terrorists, pointing weapons at us, and Princess Susu, the king's granddaughter, cried in terror.

"King Salman no longer wants to come to Spain and will make sure that his children don't want to visit Marbella either," he added.

"These people spend an average of €15-20,000 per day when they are in Marbella. This is the type of tourism that they should be taking care of."

The police action came after a probe revealed four royal family security team members did not have professional qualifications. The National Police press department said both operations were carried out "without violence or intimidation... the Territorial Security Unit was pursuing an irregularity in terms of false security guards."

But this was denied by the entourage

member saying "the police acted unreasonably."

"They asked for our passports and documentation without letting us explain while pointing machine guns at us."

"The prince was dining under the watch of the security we have used for years, which include an ex-soldier and two police officers."

A fellow diner at the restaurant said some tables left when they saw the police arriving: "We were eating dessert and thought there had been an attack or something."

Fake claims crackdown

MEASURES introduced by the British government have seen a reduction in fake sickness claims this summer, say Costa del Sol hoteliers.

Hotel Association president Luis Callejon Suñe praised the UK authorities for "acting firmly to produce positive results over this thorny issue."

It comes as a holiday sickness claims firm was stripped of its licence by the Claims Management Regulator in the UK

BRITISH cyclist Chris Froome is hoping to break his Vuelta a España hoodoo as the second week of racing draws to a close.

It comes as the peloton head for Malaga Province after tackling the Costa Blanca, Murcia, and Almeria earlier this week.

The four-time Tour de France winner is looking to become the first rider to win both the French flagship event and Spanish tour in the same season since the latter was moved to August and September from April in 1995.

Having consolidated his position in the leader's red jersey on last Saturday's challenging stage 8 from Hellin to Xorret de Cati, the Team Sky leader opened up an even larger gap after winning Sunday's stage 9 from Orihuela to Cumbre del Sol.

Following a rest day the battle resumed on Tuesday with stage 10 from Caravaca de la Cruz to Alhama de Murcia.

Despite challenging conditions at the start of the day, with heavy rain lashing the riders, Froome managed to stay out of trouble ahead of yesterday's stage 11 from Lorca to the Calar Alto Astronomical Obser-

vatory in Almeria, located at 2,168 metres above sea level in the Sierra de los Filabres.

Miguel Lopez took the win on the first summit finish of this year's Vuelta, but Froome finished second to extend his lead to one minute and 19 seconds over the Italian Vincenzo Nibali

after the dramatic final climb fragmented the race.

Today (Thursday) the race resumes in Motril, Granada, before heading along the Costa Tropical and inland to Antequera in Malaga.

The stage is due to get underway at 1.15pm with ideal van-

tage points including Nerja (2.23pm), Torrox Playa (2.35pm), Velez-Málaga (2.50pm), Puerto del Leon in the Montes de Málaga (4pm) and Puerto del Torcal (5.01pm).

Tomorrow's stage 13 starts in Coin (12.43pm) and ends in Tomares, Sevilla.

Tidy sum

FAMILIES of the India car crash victims have raised almost €17,000 for charity.

As reported in *Euro Weekly News* (Issue 1675), a truck collided with a minibus in India, killing four Spaniards who were on a humanitarian trip to aid those in need. Three of those who died were from Ronda, and their families have been raising money for the Vicente Ferrer foundation, which helps the impoverished in India.

Heat is on!

SUMMER heat is set to return over the weekend.

With the rise in temperature set to begin today (Thursday), Malaga will see a further increase over the weekend.

The mercury is expected to hit 30 degrees Celsius and higher along the coast, though some inland areas may see showers. A temperature of 18.2°C was recorded during the recent cold snap, the coldest for 11 years in August.

Towering costs

MILLIONS will be spent on finishing an 18th century cathedral.

A tower in Malaga cathedral that was left incomplete and the diocese are looking to obtain funding of €11.4 million to finish it off.

The figure could rise by several more million as the works progress.

Plans have been put forward to the Andalucian government in an effort to protect and preserve the historic town centre edifice.

Off the map

A TEENAGE female Romanian beggar has been arrested after allegedly robbing tourists whilst asking for money.

At least half a dozen complaints were made to police of robberies in Malaga City centre, all of which used the same method. The suspected thief would ask for handouts whilst holding a map, underneath which she would steal whatever was in her reach, usually mobile phones.

A bit rich

A WORLD-FAMOUS yacht has arrived in Malaga. The 138-metre-long vessel is one of the 12 largest private yachts in the world. Rising Sun is owned by David Geffen, head of the record label which bears his surname as well as being a co-

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...27

On the last Wednesday in August, revellers in Buñol, near Valencia, bombard each other with tomatoes to celebrate La Tomatina - the world's most famous food fight.

A fruity fiesta indeed

BUÑOL, a small town just 38km inland from Valencia, has received global fame in the past few decades for hosting one of the world's most enjoyable yet bizarre festivals, La Tomatina. Thousands flock from all corners of the globe to take part in the city's annual tomato fight, during which participants hurl over 100 metric tons of ripe tomatoes at each other in the streets.

Before 2013, up to 50,000 people would descend on the town to take part in the festivities, dramatically increasing the town's modest population of 9,000 citizens. In order to protect the town from over-expansion, an official ticketing system is now in place which limits the numbers to just 20,000 blessed participants.

FUN FACT: These days, the tomatoes used in La Tomatina are usually imported from Extremadura where they are less expensive.

Tomatoes, tourists and turmoil

THE flavoursome festivities normally commence around 11am, this year with the ignition of a firework. Once trucks

have hauled the prized tomatoes into the central square, Plaza del Pueblo, chaos ensues and the streets turn into a saucy warzone where it's every man for himself.

After an hour of madness, fire trucks hose down the streets while locals offer their garden hoses to participants so they can wash the tomato debris off their bodies.

The legend begins

URBAN myth claims that the festival started in 1945, after a vegetable stall fell in the way of disgruntled locals during a parade and they proceeded to pelt each other with its contents. The next year, the same participants deliberately brought along tomatoes with the intention of starting a fight and La Tomatina was born.

Although initially banned by the police, the residents continued to take part in the festival despite some even being arrested for doing so. When the festival was cancelled in 1957, the locals held a tomato burial as a sign of protest, marching a giant tomato in a coffin through the streets of Buñol. This unusual demonstration actually worked and La Tomatina was finally recognised as an official festivity.

The festival has gained international recognition, and is now as famous as the Running of The Bulls in Pamplona - another outlandish Spanish festival. The festival has also inspired imitations in towns in the US, China and Colombia.

A DOCTOR working an illegal shift sent social media into meltdown. The Malaga medical practitioner's video went viral as he filmed himself working a 24-hour shift, which is against the law in Spain and has been outlawed by the European Court of Justice. Within a matter of hours the video had thousands of views on Facebook page Marbella se Queja.

Knives out

NATIONAL POLICE detained a 26-year-old Spanish man for attempted murder after he allegedly stabbed another man in the chest and abdomen on Calle Fernan Nuñez in Malaga City.

Parents demand answers

THE parents of a toddler who died near a train track do not believe that she travelled alone.

As reported in *Euro Weekly News* (Issue 1677), an autopsy found no evidence of a sexual attack on Lucia Vivar, the three-year-old who was found dead after disappearing from Pizarra railway station, around 30 minutes inland from Malaga.

Police say she walked 4.2 kilometres alone at night before falling asleep and being hit by a train.

Speaking to the *Sur*, Mum Almudena said: "It is impossible that my daughter, Lucia, made this trip at night and without light." Dad Antonio insisted that he would make the journey over and over until he finds out what went on.

He added: "I may not have a career in police investigation, but I'm not a fool. Things do not fit. I just want to know what really happened to my daughter."

"It is impossible for a child so small to walk all this way alone, four kilometres."





Inspirational local snapper returns Hero's welcome

IT is just over a year since he was involved in a horrific motorbike accident which left him paralysed in all four limbs.

But after displaying remarkable courage over the last 12 months professional photographer David Toms today (Thursday) will move one step closer to home as he returns to southern Spain.

He will be housed in a fully-equipped private residence in Granada while his family and friends continue the search for a flat with 24-hour care in the Marbella-San Pedro area.

The good news comes as the David Toms Support Fund, which has raised almost €20,000 to date, launched a fresh appeal for donations after his move was confirmed, with the residence set to cost at least €2,500 per month.

Biking enthusiast David was on his way to deliver some pho-

tos when he hit a patch of sand dropped by a lorry and lost control before a car slammed into him.

He suffered grave spinal injuries that initially left him unable to breathe independently, but after six weeks in intensive care he was transferred from Malaga to a specialised spinal injury unit in Toledo.

Since then he has shown in-

credible resolve and has made strong progress, regaining some movement of his left leg and arm.

And he will now continue his encouraging rehabilitation while he seeks suitable accommodation on the coast.

Lack of respect for the victims

WHEN it was announced there was to be a major demonstration in Barcelona against terrorism it appears that different ideological factions saw opportunities to advance their agendas.

THE Spanish government has scheduled more talks with airport unions to avoid the proposed 25 days of strikes.

The secretary of State Infra-

structure, Transport and Living, Julio Gomez-Pomar, said after last Tuesday's meeting that both sides are willing to reach an agreement.

He added that the state needed more time to fully respond to the union's requests as it affects various governmental bodies.

The Secretary General of the CC OO union, Francisco Casado, said the requests that all the workers present are considered fair and "adequate."

The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday September 7 but the proposed strikes would run from September 15 to December 30.

Port in a storm

A SERIES of reported sexual assaults has hit the Costa del Sol after a Marbella attack claim became the third report of

its kind within the space of a week.

The alleged victim, a young girl aged between 25 and 30 claims a taxi driver abused her.

The girl was on holiday with a group of friends in the resort of Puerto Banus. They had been out

drinking and at 4am, she decided to get a taxi back to the hotel.

Upon entering the taxi, she told the driver what hotel she wanted to go to and he allegedly ignored this, taking her to an area of wasteland and abusing the girl before returning her to a street near to the hotel where she was staying.

The girl reported the alleged incident to the police straight away and an investigation was opened immediately.

It has since been passed to the Family and Care Unit for Women (UFAM) who are specialists in such complaints but

the girl has suffered from gaps in the memory of that evening which make it difficult for police to investigate.

A 52-year-old Moroccan man was arrested following another incident during the same week in Puerto Banus when a girl of the same nationality claimed she was sexually assaulted aboard a ship docked in Marbella.

Another case within the seven-day period saw a 15-year-old girl jump out of a first floor window as she fled a 32-year-old man who has been arrested and is suspected of drugging and sexually abusing her.

Tunnel trouble

ONE person died in a traffic accident in the A7 road tunnel near Churriana, Malaga travelling in the direction of Almeria.

Emergency services attended the accident and firefighters worked to release the sole occupant of the foreign-plated vehicle which appeared to have hit the side wall of the tunnel at kilometre 227.

The accident forced the closure of two lanes but the Direccion General de Trafico, the government department responsible for the Spanish road network, indicated that no serious traffic delays were reported in the area.

WHILST supporters of Marbella Mayor José Bernal stood forlornly outside the town hall, former mayor Angeles Muñoz successfully saw him kicked out of office.

This means that after serving from 2007 to 2015, Ms Muñoz will return as the Partido Popular mayor of Marbella with the certainty of ruling

for the next 21 months provided that the San Pedro Independence Party doesn't have another change of heart in the meantime.

When the 2015 council election results were revealed, although the PP had the largest number of seats, they no longer had a majority and a tripartite group headed by the socialist PSOE party and supported unofficially by two Podemos councillors took power.

The balance sat with the San Pedro Independence Party and its leader Rafael Piña had consistently railed against Ms Muñoz in the past calling her an "Agent of Luxembourg" and a "dictator."

A promise of greater self-autonomy and €18 million does however seem to have swayed Mr Piña and led him to support the PP in a vote of no confidence.

Whilst this appears to have been something of a bloodless coup with neither leader damning the other and both acting relatively graciously in the short term following the result, time will tell whether there will be any significant differences in the way that Marbella is run prior to the next election.

On the mend

A THREE-YEAR-OLD has been discharged from intensive care after being found unconscious at a private pool in Campillos, Malaga and transferred to hospital via helicopter.

Corking win

A HAUL of cork is expected to sell for €800,000. Ronda Town Council made the prediction following a slightly higher than anticipated harvest from the cork oak trees in the hills of Cortes de la Frontera.

Ghost town

RUINS have emerged due to drought after the Guadaleba reservoir dried up so much that the remains of Pañarrubia village, which was flooded by the reservoir, can be seen.

No-confidence vote

CHEATS have hacked a voting system in a bid to bag a €3,750 prize.

A total of 741 fraudulent votes have been detected so far, leading the council to report the matter.

Feeling down in the dumps

PARTS of Alhaurin de la Torre, close to Malaga airport, are being used as dumping grounds.

Local Police have received a large number of reports from residents after areas such as Camping Morales and El Lagar-Cortijos del Sol were filled with potentially hazardous household and industrial waste.

Fly tipping can carry a fine

of more than €30,000 yet those unwilling to take it to the designated recycling point in the industrial estate of La Moraga, less than five kilometres away, remain undeterred.

The town council suspects that a sizeable portion of the rubbish is coming from people and even companies in other municipalities such as Cartama or Alhaurin el Grande.

It's set in concrete

ANTI-TERRORISM measures are being ramped up across the Costa del Sol.

Barcelona, Paris, London, and Berlin have all suffered terrorist attacks during which vehicles ploughed through pedestrians.

The Spanish Interior Ministry has made a number of recommendations in the wake of the Barcelona attacks.

Security experts are now aiming to close off popular places across the Costa del Sol that are lacking in counter-terrorist measures.

The most populated areas are generally seafront promenades and methods are being studied that will allow them to be blocked off to all except emergency vehicles.

A number of municipalities already have such measures in place.

Huge concrete blocks were installed in Malaga City centre during events such as Semana Santa and the August fair.

Marbella, Puerto Banus, Torremolinos, Fuengirola and Benalmadena have long followed the advice of the Interior Ministry, enclosing pedestrian zones with concrete barriers and increasing the number of these as well as the number of police officers patrolling during fiestas and other celebrations.

their son cannot.

Speaking tearfully to *Euro Weekly News* Lynn explained that she and Russell had not had a holiday for 20 years and following Brendon's death, they had saved for 18 months to book themselves on a holiday of a lifetime for them, a short cruise.

Now having already paid €270 to renew their passports, they have to find another €270 to replace them and there is no guarantee that they will be returned from the UK Passport Office in time for the trip.

They can still travel on emergency documents issued by the British Consulate in Malaga but that will cost another €234 so this loss and also some of her late mother's jewellery is bad enough, but to lose so many photographs of the family is devastating.

Hindsight is a great thing and they both regret that they had

left a full memory card in the camera case, together with another with many pictures on in the camera itself.

Hopefully, the person who stole the camera or someone who knows them will read this and will understand that for parents to lose their child at the age of 19 is a

terrible blow but at least they gained some comfort from keeping his memory alive by having the photographs to hand.

They appeal to the burglar to return the photographs if nothing else so that they don't suffer a second heartbreak in just over a year.



Just walk on by

A CONTROVERSIAL pedestrianisation plan has sparked a debate. The Spanish Socialist Workers Party (PSOE) has criticised plans to pedestrianise part of Alameda Principal in Malaga City as they believe sufficient study has not been carried out.

Concerned greatly about traf-

fic flow, with 60,000 vehicles frequenting the road on a daily basis, the PSOE have demanded to see the plans as well as studies carried out.

A PSOE spokesperson said: "We are completely in favour of the pedestrianisation of the north and south sides of Alameda

Principal. We voted in favour of it but must warn the PP that it is necessary to present rigorous traffic and mobility studies for a space that supports the order of 60,000 vehicles per day and is a central point of connection between the east and west areas of the city."

No direct terror threat

A GOVERNMENT official has insisted that the Andalusian community is not under any direct terrorist threat.

Antonio Sanz has advised that residents and tourists remain relaxed, claiming that the anti-terrorist forces of Andalusia are some of the best in the world.

He conceded that there is no such thing as zero threat but has asked for the public to help in detection of radicalism and suspected terrorism.

Sanz was keen to point out that experts have always placed Andalusia and Barcelona as two of the strategic objectives for Daesh Islamist-style terrorists.

Recent Daesh videos have backed this up with threats against Granada and Cordoba specifically,

but the anti-terrorism official has insisted that the threat remains nationwide and another attack could occur anywhere within the western world.

Though a large amount of terrorists have passed through the Andalusian community, Sanz highlights that many of them have not had intentions of conducting or developing activity there.

He insisted that the close proximity to Morocco is not an issue and that border security is a priority throughout Spain, not just with Africa.

A considerable amount of information on radical jihadism comes from citizens

and Sanz both praised and highlighted the need for such information, citing it as a key factor of intercepting terrorism.

Getting older in Malaga

MALAGA has an ageing population.

A COLLISION on the AP-7 motorway near Marbella left a 53-year-old man dead and a 31-year-old man transferred to the Costa del Sol Hospital. Reasons for cause of the accident are currently being investigated.

CCTV cover

ONCE approval is received from the Junta de Andalucia, Marbella Council intends to install 12 temporary CCTV cameras to cover vital areas during the San Pedro Alcántara Fair. Officers from Local and National Police will monitor the images.

Top catch

AN international fishing event proved a success in its 24th instalment after 30 boats took part in the Benalmadena Altura Fishing Tournament which attracted contestants from across Europe who endeavoured to win the top prize of a golden hook.

Hooked up

FUENGIROLA will welcome the 8th Fishing Championship, a regular event which will take place from today until Sunday. After a meal to welcome participants they will spend most of their time at sea.

Safer farms

GOOD news for farmers as it has been revealed for the fifth year running agricultural and livestock thefts have continued to drop. The first six months of 2017 saw a 29.8 per cent drop in thefts.

NEWS EXTRA**Million grant**

A GRANT of €1.1 million has been given towards recruitment and community social services. The Andalusian government has gifted Marbella the funds via two autonomous programmes this year which will be managed by the City Council.

Black out

A POWER cut hit part of Manilva leaving the area between Camino del Tranche and la Higuera without electricity. The fault was traced to transformers on a pylon and power was restored several hours later.

Minor gang

AFTER receiving reports of three attacks upon people including a British man walking his dog in La Linea, National Police officers have arrested five minors. The gang stole mobile phones.

Animal abuse probe

THE Seprona branch of the Guardia Civil has undertaken a massive check on the treatment of animals in Malaga Province with more than 300 thought to be the subject of abuse.

Working with a team of veterinarians, the Junta de Andalucía regional council and animal protection societies, officers suspect 50 people of mistreatment or abuse and visited 200 premises public and private.

The main problems appeared to be with the poor conditions in which the animals (mainly dogs) were being kept, lack of hygiene and treatment when injured or ill, animals allowed to run

wild without receiving regular food or water and in some cases deliberately caused injuries from beatings.

Those animals which were clearly in a very poor state were removed whilst others were left with their owners who will be checked to ensure that they are being treated properly.

Those who are found guilty of deliberately mistreating their animals could face fines of up to €30,000 and for the worst cases imprisonment of up to 18 months.

What is not clear however is what the eventual fate of those removed from their owners will be.

Culture club

ALMOST half the population of Manilva are not Spanish.

The town has one of the highest proportions of registered foreigners in Spain, with 16,184 residents and a total of 79 nationalities.

There are 6,593 non-Spanish-nationals living there, making up 40.75 per cent of the town's inhabitants.

British make up the majority at 2,800 followed by Moroccans at 653, Romanians at 510 and Italians at 274.

Manilva's British residents are mainly retirees with an average age of 60 to 69 years.

Residents from Morocco and Romania have an average age of 30 to 39 years, with many of them in the area for work.

To help cope with the growing multiculturalism, the town has taken actions such as printing some administrative documents in English as well as hiring two new police officers, one of French nationality and one of Romanian.

In 20 years the population of Manilva has almost trebled rising from 5,486 in 1997 to more than 16,000 in 2017.

The mayor, Mario Jimenez, has requested the Spanish government acknowledge this and provide a Guardia Civil station as it is currently the only municipality on the Costa del Sol without one.

Hard rock help for tigers

HARD ROCK CAFE have signed a funding agreement for endangered tigers.

The world-renowned restaurant chain will sponsor a tiger breeding programme in Malaga.

Bioparc Fuengirola, Malaga is home to 'Harau' who is part of an important European breeding programme for Sumatran tigers, of which there are less than 300 left in the world.

The park has participated in this scheme since it opened in 2001 with 'Rokan' and 'Asmara' having served as iconic symbols of Bioparc throughout its history.

They enjoyed success with two offspring, one of whom now resides in the Japanese zoo of Yagiyama and the other in

Belfast zoo, Ireland.

Rokan recently died at the age of 17 and the European Tiger Conservation Programme selected Fuengirola as the ideal location to host a new, young tiger of two years.

Harau arrived from Le Pal zoo in France and zoologists are working on ways to help him adapt to live with Asmara, the female.

They have described this endeavour as 'being full of challenges' due to the fact that tigers are very territorial animals who may tolerate being close to other tigers or different species but the initial approach is of pivotal importance.

Bioparc are hoping that they can put the two together very soon.

Business growth continues in the province

MALAGA has the fifth highest business growth in Spain.

Enterprise and employment opportunities are thriving as Malaga proves the most dynamic province in Andalucia.

Results from the Central Business Directory (DIRCE) and the National Institute of Statistics (INE) indicate a 3 per cent rise in active companies compared to 2016, amounting to approximately 4,000

new businesses in a year.

As well as the fast pace of business creation, many companies are reaching a large size.

The statistics revealed that 296 companies in the province had more than 100 employees, an increase of 38 against 2016 figures.

There are also 15 companies with more than 500 workers, a growth of five from the previous year as well as seven that exceed 1,000 workers.

Despite these results, one of the key problems is the fact that many companies only have a small

number of employees with 83 per cent employing two workers or less, a figure that is similar throughout Spain.

Of companies with more than 100 staff, hotels, retail and administration are the top three.

The highest level of new business growth was in the real estate sector, followed closely by bars and restaurants as well as construction.





ONCE again the San Roque Council has to face the possibility for being fined having made the decision to dredge the mouth of the Rio Guadiaro.

logical nightmare, but it does so in the belief that it is not its duty but that of government following a 2011 agreement but the problem has been left with San Roque to either ignore the problem or do something about it.

Local residents and en-

vironmental groups have themselves helped out in the past by digging channels in order to let the waters flow, but they complain that this ongoing problem has to be resolved and not just left to volunteers and the town council.

First Russian Orthodox Church for Andalusia

AS the population in Marbella of Russian nationals grew, so it was agreed in principle in 2013 to build the first Russian Orthodox Church in Andalusia.

Now, four years later, a decision has been made by the Church and the Estepona Council for an area of 6,000 square metres in the Arroyo Las Cañas on the way to the Selwo Park to be allocated for the construction of the church and a cultural centre.

Originally it has been intended to build the church in the Azalea Beach area of San Pedro Alcántara where there are already a large number of

Russian owned businesses but local residents objected to the proposed building and the council appeared unwilling to do anything to help.

Thus the reason for the move to a town which appeared more sympathetic to the needs of the Orthodox worshippers and plans are already drawn up for approval prior to the building being put out to tender as it is to be erected on a council site.

There will reportedly be a 75-year lease on the use of the land and once the church is built it is likely to become an important meeting place for the local Russian community.

What is the legal situation with regard to the Ground Clause?

Currently a Spanish case from the Supreme Court (and many others from lower courts) on May 9, 2013, has declared ground clauses void.

Road legal?

Brits fail Spanish theory test

BRITISH drivers do not understand Spanish road laws, new research suggests.

Despite thousands of Brits choosing to visit Europe by car every year, almost one in three (29 per cent) said they are not confident driving on foreign motorways.

Over 1,000 UK drivers were quizzed in an international theory test which revealed that UK drivers would fail similar exams for Spain, France, Germany, Sweden and the USA.

Brits were least likely to know the correct answers for Spanish road laws; the average score was just 5/10, 36 per cent less than

what would be needed to pass based on the 86 per cent pass mark for UK theory test standards.

Over a third (35 per cent) of those quizzed were unable to identify the right answer to 'What distance are you required to leave between you and the car in front of you in most situations,' and 32 per cent were unable to correctly answer 'Child seats must be provided for children under 1.35m tall and under what age?'

Brits were most familiar with German road laws, with the average person getting 75 per cent of the answers right, followed closely by the USA (70 per cent) and France (69

per cent).

On average, men (62 per cent) scored higher than women (58 per cent), with those aged 55 - 65 coming out on top with 6.3 out of 10.

The 26 - 35 age group got a meagre 5.5, suggesting they need to brush up on their international road laws knowledge before heading abroad.

Vehicle parts distributor Euro Car Parts (www.europarts.com) created the International Theory Test, the first of its kind, surveying 1,019 UK adults.



A COMPETITION has revealed the best espetero (sardine griller) on the Costa del Sol.

Jose Antonio Moreno from the chiringuito (beach bar) Dieguichi, Manilva won the prestigious award by beating 30 other hopeful sardine masters.

A quintessential part of Malagan cuisine, Espeteros cook sardines using large skewers or reeds across grills, boats or sand pits full of coal.

The tradition dates back to the 19th century and the skills of 'amoradores' (grillmasters) have been passed down through generations.

The third edition of the Espetos City Competition of Torremolinos followed the usual format

where each participant cooks two skewers, one of sardines and one of a fish of their choosing.

A problem shared

SOARING rent prices are forcing many to house share.

This forced coexistence in Malaga comes as a result of low salaries and an increase of more than 23 per cent in rental fee inflation.

Housemates are no longer an experience reserved solely for students, many full-time adult workers now resort to such measures as sharing living quarters in order to lead a better quality of life than shelling out extra to live solo.

Property website Idealista.com indicated that a study showed the demand for shared housing has skyrocketed by 78 per cent in the last year and is another of the sudden changes that the real estate market has experienced since the crisis of 2007.

Pisos.com is another property website which ranks Malaga as seventh in the list of Spanish provinces where house and apartment sharing is in greatest demand.

The site also states that the majority of those wishing to share fall into the 18 to 25 age bracket who make up 54 per cent of the demand, but 26 per cent of the demand is now for ages 26 to 35 years.

Those wishing to share between the ages of 36 and 60 has also seen an increase and many cite that it is because they are unable to cope with the costs of renting a place on their own.

Other issues include landlords only making their properties available during low-season which leaves full-time residents unable to secure long-term abodes.

Idealista highlight washing machines, wifi and televisions are among the most popular requirements of the modern renter and those sharing tend to prefer pet-free, non smoking flatmates.

Juana Rivas alleged victim of gender violence and facing four years

MANY of those who have supported her will be feeling sorry that mother of two boys Juana Rivas has decided to hand her children over to the authorities.

After being told by the Granada court that any decision concerning custody of her children must be made by the Italian authorities, Juana Rivas has accepted that decision.

She has voluntarily surrendered her two children to the Guardia Civil today and it is reported that they have now been handed over to their father.

Spanish born Juana married an Italian who she met in London whilst studying English and they subsequently had two children.

They finally settled in Sardinia but she returned to Spain late last year taking their two children without her husband's agreement as she

claims that he had attacked her mentally and physically and also abused the oldest son.

Her case having been seen as being of major importance to women fighting against violence has caused a flurry of social media activity and once the children were handed over to the Guardia Civil, women's groups started to protest the decision.

Complaints have been presented already to the General Council of the Judiciary (CGPJ) questioning the decision to hand back the children without giving them a chance to testify and demanding that the father - who denies violence against Juana - be refused permission to return to Italy with them.

In addition, the associations complain that neither the Public Prosecutor nor the Office of the Prosecutor for Gender Violence have acted properly during the course of the investigations and subsequent decision making process.



Burundanga story wouldn't wash

➤ A CAMPELLO delivery driver was charged with inventing a sham robbery to mask his own crime.

The 28-year-old Spanish man who works for a drinks distribution firm went to the Guardia Civil, claiming that he was robbed of €1,000 after an Italian couple sprayed him with scopolamine.

This drug, made from the burundanga plant and known as devil's breath, overrides the will of the consumer who submits to the orders of others. It can cause sleepiness and memory loss, making it a choice drug for criminals and sex offenders.

Although the man could describe the man and woman with Italian accents in detail he remembered nothing about their car and the Guardia Civil, made suspicious by other inconsistencies, contacted his employers who had been given an entirely different story.

Checking the man's route investigators failed to find any witness to the incident and discovered he had instead been fined for double parking.

Unlucky break



EU passports for sale

IF you are worried about the future after Brexit and want to have an EU passport, then for €880,000 you can become a Maltese citizen.

Most of that money will go to a Maltese government social fund but you are required to use up to 25 per cent to rent a property for a minimum of five years and also invest in interest bearing government bonds.

Money buys most things and the Maltese offer even anticipates that your citizenship will be granted

within 12 to 18 months, but other EU members offer similar if not so inexpensive deals and you can also purchase the rights to carry an Austrian, Bulgarian, Cypriot or Hungarian passport.

That means that there are five EU members simply selling national passports and more may follow if there is a demand for them.

Currently British passport holders who can prove direct family

links with Ireland can apply for a change of citizenship and those, mainly of Jewish origin, whose forebears lost their German passports during the Nazi regime can also apply for a German passport.

Other countries offer the opportunity to obtain rights of residency such as Spain and its 'Golden Passport' programme aimed mainly at wealthy Chinese, but these are all significantly more expensive and take a considerable length of time for grant of a passport.

Idea is appealing

ORANGE growers in Spain should be taking an interest in a number of developments on the Italian island of Sardinia to dispose of orange peel discarded in production of juice.

It is estimated that the total cost of disposal of peel and pips amounted to €14 million per annum but now it is being used to make yarn for fabric, fat-free flour and even biogas which is then turned into electricity.

A juicy opportunity to make money out of waste.

Pound struggling, the euro steady

A FEW key factors have been driving pound, euro and US dollar exchange rates over the last month - with central bank monetary policy speculation and political uncertainty being the two main ones.

Over the past four weeks the GBP/EUR exchange rate has fallen from highs of €1.1432 to historic lows of €1.1035, GBP/USD peaked at \$1.3256 before drifting to \$1.3020 and EUR/USD advanced from \$1.1385 to highs of \$1.1900.

What's been happening?

While the Federal Reserve piled pressure on the US dollar by dwelling on low US inflation (leading many to suspect that the central bank will refrain from increasing interest rates for a third time in 2017) the Bank of England (BoE) sent the Pound reeling with its own interest rate decision.

The BoE sent the pound to a 10-month low

against the euro and drove GBP/USD from an 11-month high. While the bank was split 6-2 on whether or not to increase interest rates, its decision to slash UK growth forecasts for 2017 and 2018 was enough to dash hopes that borrowing costs would be increased soon and Sterling spiralled lower in the wake of the announcement.

A lack of progress in the UK's Brexit negotiations also limited the pound's appeal.

Meanwhile, the euro was supported by a

stream of upbeat economic releases from the Eurozone and comments from European Central Bank (ECB) President Mario Draghi.

Hints from the ECB chief that policymakers will begin discussing the tightening of stimulus in the autumn bolstered the common currency, keeping it elevated against the pound and helping it achieve its best levels against the US dollar since January 2015.

Over in the US, the dollar also had to contend with the fallout from yet another drama at

the White House. The sacking of Communications Director Anthony Scaramucci after just 10 days in office elevated concerns that all the upheaval will prevent President Donald Trump from making good on his promised tax and spending plans.

What do you need to look out for?

If ecostats from the Eurozone keep impressing in the weeks ahead it will up the odds of the ECB opting to reign in its quantitative easing programme in September. Good news for the euro, but bad news for the GBP/EUR exchange rate.

The pound may also be pressured lower against the euro and US dollar if Brexit negotiations fail to move forward in a positive way.

UK data will be an additional driver of GBP exchange rate volatility, with less-than-impressive results weighing on BoE rate hike expectations and leaving Sterling struggling.

Industry warns government control electric costs or expect exodus

AEGE which represents major manufacturers who use electricity in Spain has complained that members who turnover €20 billion could be forced out of the country.

According to the recently appointed president of the association and president of Air Liquide, Teresa Rasero, electricity prices in Spain are so high that they are making major companies consider moving abroad to try to save costs and become more competitive.

The 27 member companies between them employ 66,000 workers directly and a further 120,000 indirectly and should even a few of them look to close their businesses within Spain, it could be very damaging for the economy.

In an interview with the *Expansión* financial paper, she explained that when compared to Germany, itself a major industrial economy, electricity costs in Spain are 30 per cent higher which means that business is potentially being lost.

While the government of Mariano Rajoy appears to favour Spanish

electricity companies, even considering punitive taxes on those generating solar power, a plea to make the public utility companies reduce their charges is likely to fall on deaf ears.

AEGE speaks with some strength as its members control 83 major industrial plants across Spain producing a range of products from chemicals to metals and steel to gas and account for 11 per cent of total electrical consumption in the country.

Up until recently, the members were more worried about uninter-

rupted supply rather than simple cost but as the delivery of power has become more reliable, so prices have risen and unlike neighbours in the European Union, these companies receive very little state assistance.

There has been some improvement when the market opened up to allow an auction system whereby utility companies were encouraged to bid against each other to supply power on an annual basis but AEGE don't think that this is enough.

Ms Rasero believes that with the need to produce much greater volumes of environmentally friendly electricity the government needs to introduce a coherent and harmonised policy which will ensure green energy in sufficient amounts at prices which are competitive when compared to other EU states.

If this proves to be impossible, then she believes that Spanish heavy industry in particular will become less competitive and will have little option other than to move to areas where costs are lower and greater profits can be made.

Bank sale controversy

THE European Commission has refused to release certain relevant documents to lawyers representing investors in Banco Popular who are trying to recover lost funds.

According to a document issued by the CEO of one of the arms of the Commission, the reasons given are that the release of the Deloitte's report on the Bank as well as reports from the European Central Bank and Spanish Single Board of Resolution could hurt purchaser Santander.

Part of the document states that the decision has been made in order 'not to harm Santander's commercial interests' and 'protect the financial stability of the eurozone.'

This decision will not please any of those affected by the sale or those who believe that the Commission should be transparent.

VANILLA which was introduced to the 'old world' by Spanish explorer Hernán Cortés in the 16th century is the second most expensive spice in the world after saffron.

The English name comes from the Spanish word vainilla meaning little pod (as its seeds are contained in a long black cylinder) it is used to add taste to a variety of desserts and ice creams, but the wholesale price has tripled to more than €500 per kilo in the last three years.

Although only native to Mexico, 80 per cent of the world's commercially grown vanilla comes from the African island of Madagascar and annual sales of €550 million contribute 5 per cent of GDP to what is one of the poorest countries in the world.

A simple oil contract nearly caused a war in Asia

WHAT appeared to be a simple contract between the Vietnamese government and giant oil Company Repsol has had a ripple effect bringing the communist state closer than ever to the USA.

Traditionally, Vietnam has seen China as a natural partner in Asia and over a period of years imported increasingly large amounts of goods from China whilst exporting what it manufactured to the USA.

The decision made by Vietnam in June to appoint the Spanish firm Repsol to undertake drilling in the South China Sea brought an immediate and unexpected response from China which threatened military action if the work continued.

Within a week, the contract was cancelled and the Vietnamese government was forced to pay millions of dollars to Repsol by way of compensation.

This also led to a senior Chinese official cancelling a planned visit to Hanoi whilst the staunch Vietnamese Communist Minister of Defence flew to Washington within a matter of weeks for what were described as friendly talks with his counterpart in America.

As the old guard in Vietnam age and begin to retire from power, it is clear that the country is moving towards a freer state with elements of capitalism creeping in, but those still in power are wily enough to only encourage the USA when China treads on their toes.



AT a time when the UK media are going into overdrive with yet more speculation about who did or did not say what about Brexit, and what it may or may not mean, we have to take our hats off to the Spanish police for the speed and decisiveness of their actions in Barcelona following, just this year alone, terrorist attacks in London, Manchester, Stockholm and Paris.

But Spain's geography and history make the terrorist outrage in Barcelona not entirely unexpected. The surprise might be that Spain has mainly escaped the recent activities of Islamic extremists, its last major

terrorist attack the 2004 Madrid bombing.

No European country is closer to North Africa than Spain. Hence thousands of migrants try to enter Spain's North African territories, Ceuta and Melilla, to seek asylum. And later - like the Barcelona massacre mastermind, a convicted Moroccan imam - use human rights to avoid deportation.

Terrorism won't go away anytime soon. So what can we do? Try to minimise the risk. We need to alter our attitudes and our way of life. We need

secure borders and some straight talking by our political leaders who should drop all the PC nonsense, tell it like it is and get on with protecting not only our towns, cities and citizens, but our valued, civilised western standards.

It's time to allow the security services to compel phone companies and internet service providers to record and hold pro tem all conversations so they can be accessed at any time for 'persons of interest.'

Walk a dog on a Saturday - each animal needs exercise and without volunteers that's not possible. This is a great way to help but also to meet like-minded people and make friends.

Donate supplies - Food supplies, blankets, towels are always welcome but bleach and cleaning materials and products are also important, as are office supplies.

Donate clothes and items for the Triple A events to be raffled and auctioned.

Go to the Triple A events which are always fun, a great way to meet lovely people and help an animal at the same time (many being organised 'as we speak' so watch the Triple A Facebook page for further details!).

Help rehouse the animals by explaining to people that animals should not be bought in stores but adopted from rescue centres and shelters.

Historical elegance



CULTURE AND HISTORY: The breathtaking city of Antequera.

A ROMANTIC and elegant city, the first impression of Antequera is the magnificent view of 'Peña de los Enamorados' (lover's rock) a magnificent mountain with the silhouette of an Indian's face, set in a vast area of flat land with neat rows of olive trees. Folklore legends say that a young Christian man from Antequera and a Muslim girl from nearby Archidona held hands and threw themselves from the top of the mountain, as they could not be together.

The ancient Moorish Alcazaba and its castle walls look down over Antequera. The steep climb to it is worth a visit, with views of the whole of Antequera. Archaeologists have uncovered Roman mosaics in the grounds below and right next to it is the 15th century church of Santa Maria, the first Renaissance style church in Andalusia. There are, in fact, 33 churches in Antequera, making it the city with the most churches per capita than anywhere else in Spain.

A bronze Roman sculpture 'El Efebo' was discov-

ered in Antequera by archaeologists in 1955. It is 1.43m tall and perfectly preserved and can be seen in the local museum along with other interesting artefacts.

Last year UNESCO named two sites in Antequera as World Heritage Sites; the dolmens and El Torcal. The dolmens are ancient burial tombs dating back to 4,000 BC and recently named a UNESCO World Heritage Site. There are three dolmens, Menga, Viera and El Romeral. Entrance is free and there is an information centre.

A short drive up the hills just out of Antequera leads to the natural park of El Torcal, an area of curious, impressive Jurassic age limestone formations which are 150 million years old and one of the most impressive karst landscapes in Europe.

In the past, the whole area was under the sea. Those feeling energetic may want to hike up the mountain. There are three guided routes: green, orange and red, the latter being the most difficult. Per-

fect for nature lovers and all types of birds, eagles and even vultures can be seen. Afterwards why not have a refreshing drink and traditional tapas in the restaurant.

A few local delicacies include 'porra Antequerana,' a cold dish of blended tomatoes and bread served cold with one of their famous 'molletes,' delicious soft, white bread rolls, usually eaten for breakfast or 'merienda' (high tea).

Gazpachuelo is a white soup with fish, garlic, prawns, potato and mayonnaise and for the sweet toothed 'bienmesabe,' literally meaning 'it tastes good to me,' an ancient dessert of Arabic origin, made with ground almonds, honey, egg yolk and cinnamon.

Antequera, being the centre of Andalusia, is easily accessible by car from Malaga, Cordoba, Sevilla, Granada and Cadiz provinces, or by air from airports across both the UK and Spain. The nearest airport is Malaga, just a 45-minute drive or just over an hour by train.





What will the next round of Brexit talks mean for the Pound?

AFTER a break for the summer, negotiating teams from the EU and UK will meet again on August 28 for the third round of Brexit talks.

Convergence and divergence in second round of talks

At the close of the second round of talks in mid-July, both Michel Barnier and David Davis acknowledged the need to provide certainty for EU citizens in the UK and UK citizens in the EU.

They stated that this will be a priority for the next round of talks.

Shortly afterwards, the parties issued a joint technical note, showing a comparison between the EU and UK posi-

tions on citizens' rights, which will be used to prioritise future discussions.

Both parties claimed that areas of common ground had been identified. But disagreements remain on points such as how to guarantee rights, what rights future family members should receive and voting rights.

It appears that further work is also required on financial settlement, Ireland and the future role of the European Court of Justice.

The timetable for negotiations means that 'sufficient progress' must be made in these areas before discussions about the future relationship, including a new

trade deal, can begin.

Brexit uncertainty puts pressure on the Pound

During the second round of talks, the continuing uncertainty around the negotiations, combined with apparent divisions within the UK government, had a dampening effect on the Pound.

Sterling came under further pressure at the conclusion of talks, amid speculation that British ministers might walk away without a deal.

It is possible there could be more volatility to come as talks resume at the end of August.

While the currency markets are keen

for certainty, Barnier and Davis have stated that incremental progress shouldn't be expected from every round of the talks.

Spanish annual fiestas

TOP 5

1. El Entierro de la Sardina, Murcia

A centuries-old tradition that may appear odd to outsiders, literally translating as ‘the burial of the sardine.’ Some believe it to have been created by students who wanted the Semana Santa fiestas to go on for longer but others claim it dates back to Carlos III having ordered fish to celebrate the end of the festival period. Legend says the heat made the fish go off and the foul stench caused them to be buried. The grand finale sees a giant paper mache sardine set alight.

2. Holi Run, Madrid

A Spanish take on the Hindi festival, participants run through the street whilst being showered in coloured powder. The festival combines sport, fun, happiness, music and a plenty of colour. A five-kilometre race with no time limit where thousands are covered from head to toe with different coloured powder every kilometre.

There are over 40 variants of this event throughout Spain but the Madrid version is the original and attracts the greatest numbers. The festivities continue all day until the climax sees a host of colours fill the sky.

3. San Fermín and the Running of the Bulls, Pamplona, Navarre

Quite possibly the most world-renowned fiesta in Spain, bulls are let loose in the streets

chasing men dressed in traditional white and red. Celebrations take place between July 6 and 14 each year and begin early on with participants lining the streets, enjoying sangria and various tapas. The deadly beasts are not to be trifled with and every year there are injuries and even fatalities as people are gored and trampled. The origin comes from when the cattle need-

ed to be transferred from the fields to the bullring to be killed by a matador that afternoon, a practice which Pamplona still maintains to this day.

4. Fiesta de San Juan, Spanish coastal towns

Not all Spanish may know about Guy Fawkes and the gunpowder plot but they do have an annual celebration involving bonfires. Though celebrated throughout Europe, the Spanish like to add a touch of fire to beaches and create a host of small fires along the coast each June 23. Unlike many Saints days which mark the death of a saint, the feast of St Joseph marks his birth. Dancing, singing and parties generally carry on until the early hours as well as barbecues and tapas.

5. La Batalla de Vino, Haro, La Rioja

Each year between June 27 and 30, thousands of thirsty Spaniards and a healthy collection of tourists climb a mountain in La Rioja and spray wine all over each other as part of the celebration of the feast of St Peter.

Locals start the party the night before, taking to the streets whilst drinking and dancing. They then ascend the hill during the early hours of the morning and cover each other in the sweet red liquid.

Small is not always beautiful

SMALL anti-system party CUP, which shores up the Junts pel Si coalition in Cataluña's regional parliament, enjoys making political gestures.

After the jihadi killings in Barcelona the party shunned Mass in the Sagrada Familia Basilica and the minute's silence that followed because King Felipe and Mariano Rajoy were there.

CUP does not have an abundance of voters - only 336,375 of Cataluña's total franchise of 5,510,798 - but some would have been present at the minute's silence if not Mass.

Couldn't Anna Gabriel and her fellow politicians have gritted their teeth as regional president Carles Puigdemont and vice-president Oriol Junqueras did by representing their party at events where respect for the dead outweighs politics?

Alternative facts

IN the immediate aftermath of the Barcelona massacre a Mexican television presenter referred to the arrest of a "Moroccan citizen, probably from Melilla which is Spanish territory in Morocco."

Speaking on Mexico's El Financiero Bloomberg channel, he commented that another suspected terrorist had also been detained,

"a Catalan, judging by the name Carles Puigdemont," who "possibly" came from Barcelona or Tarragona "or some other part of Cataluña."

The El Financiero channel later apologised profusely via the social media - where else? - for the impressively negative achievement of upsetting Cataluña, Spain and Morocco in one sentence without the excuse of a language barrier.

Wise after the event

AS happened in the first anguished hours after the Manchester and Borough Market terrorist attacks, there were calls not to politicise the Barcelona carnage. Before the minute's silence in the Plaza de Cataluña the following day, a woman began waving a small Spanish flag only to be told by those near her, "No flags! No flags!" Answering, "I'm Catalan" she put it away to general applause.

But once the numb horror wore off, questioning voices were heard. The ideologue who allegedly radicalised the young jihadists, the imam Abdelbaki es Satty, should have been deported after leaving prison for drugs offences in 2014.

Instead Es Satty appealed and a Spanish judge allowed him to remain, ruling that he did not threaten public order. Es Satty's jihadi recruits, apparently off the radar, were seen near Paris on August 12, days

before the attack. They stockpiled gas canisters without arousing suspicions while Younis Abouyaaqoub's inflammatory social media comments went unseen. Possibly there would have been more awareness of what was going on under the noses of the authorities if Carles Puigdemont and Oriol Junqueras were as interested in running the region as they are in running out of Spain.

It takes two to tango

OSCAR PUENTE, spokesman of the PSOE's Federal Executive Committee, said not long ago that there was collective responsibility for the Venezuela crisis. "A society does not reach this point purely because of what a government does," he said.

Agreed, it takes two to tango but it only takes one to incarcerate opponents and torture them.

Could a late meal be bad for you?

THE Spanish lifestyle is known for embracing late meals, particularly during the summer months when it is not unusual for Spanish families to be seen dining out and eating after 10pm.

Whilst they are clearly used to it, it may be more difficult for expats to follow suit and in fact, a study claims that changing your body clock and eating a late dinner, could have negative effects on the skin and make it

more vulnerable to sun exposure leading to burns and ultimately, skin cancer.

A study by the O'Donnell Brain Institute and the University of California Irvine, in the USA, carried out on mice, has shown that eating poorly could have negative effects on the skin and make it more vulnerable. People who delay their evening meal would be more vulnerable to such effects as

their biological clock of the skin is affected. This change can throw the daily cycle of an enzyme responsible for repairing skin damage by ultraviolet (UV) rays, out of sync.

However, despite these findings, the researchers have said that further research is needed to understand feed patterns and UV damage in people, especially how they affect the pigment cycles.



LATE DINING: Could have a negative effect.

Are we better with the traditional roles?

IN today's modern world, more traditional male and female roles have switched and the lines blurred.

Encouraging women to stay at work and men to become house husbands has become the norm with many advocating the role reversals, but is that they really the answer? New research claims that switching these 'conventional' roles is actually making both sexes unhappy.

Researchers at the University of Illinois examined data of nearly 1,500 men and 1,800 women aged between 52 and 60. They reported that when females were the main breadwinners, there was an increased level in symptoms of depression with the opposite occurring in men.

When they were the main earners, their psychological well-being was found to be at its highest. A man's well-being decreased when they left the workforce to become home-makers but for women, their well-being was not affected by leaving their jobs to stay at home.

Concerns raised over couch potatoes

LAZINESS seems to be spreading almost like an epidemic as Public Health England (PHE) say they are concerned about the amount of adults who are doing no form of exercise.

It is claimed that 45 per cent of over-16s are so sedentary they do not even manage a health-boosting 10-minute walk every day and half of adults do not even manage a brisk walk once a month. A brisk walk where the heart rate

increases and you can feel your heart pumping more.

PHE officials claim there are six million inactive people aged between 40 and 60 who are putting their busy lives first and neglecting their health, failing to get any form of exercise.

The NHS has long since recommended around 150 minutes of moderate exercise or activity each week, but now, such is the concern over the state of the health of adults

in Britain, people are being asked to do just a brisk 10-minute walk each day at least. This, it is hoped, will be more manageable and attainable and help encourage more activity, warning that cancer, diabetes and heart disease await those who do not get up off the sofa.

The PHE said the British population was 20 per cent less active now than in the 1960s, and the average person walked 15 miles less a year compared to 20 years ago.

Some 67 per cent of adult men and 57 per cent of adult women in Britain are overweight, a figure well above the global average and of these, 24 per cent of British adults (around 12 million people) are considered obese.

What is gout?



SPECIALIST: Doctor Luis Perez Belmonte.

GOUT is a type of arthritis in which small crystals form inside and around the joints. It causes sudden attacks of severe pain and swelling.

What are its symptoms?

Any joint can be affected by gout, but it usually affects joints towards the ends of the limbs, such as the toes, ankles, knees and fingers. Some of the symptoms of gout include severe pain in one or more joints, the joint feeling hot and very tender, swelling in and around the affected area and red, shiny skin over the affected joint.

Symptoms develop rapidly over a few hours and typically last three to 10 days. After this time the pain should pass and the joint should return to normal. However almost everyone with gout will experience further attacks at some point, usually within a year.

What causes gout?

Gout is caused by the build-up of a substance called uric acid in the

blood.

If you produce too much uric acid or your kidneys don't filter enough out, it can build up and cause tiny sharp crystals to form in and around joints. These crystals can cause the joint to become inflamed and painful.

If a person has high blood pressure, diabetes and/or is obese this may increase their chances of getting gout. Having relatives with gout, kidney problems and drinking too much beer or spirits can also increase the likelihood of suffering from gout.

How can you treat it?

During an attack, placing ice packs and taking medications such as non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs, colchicine or corticosteroids will help relieve symptoms.

You can also prevent it through a combination of lifestyle changes, such as losing weight and changing your diet, and taking medication that lowers uric acid levels eg Allopurinol.





Freedom isn't just another word

WHEN Dutch charity worker Arjan Erker joined the Médecins Sans Frontières team in Dagestan, a wild Russian Republic, he didn't expect to be kidnapped.

That however is what happened to this softly spoken aid worker whose car was stopped by Muslim 'freedom fighters' and after beating him up, they kept him in confinement, underground and alone for 20 months.

Confinement

After he came to terms with his imprisonment, he started to build a form of relationship with his captors who eventually gave him access to a few books which he read over and over again and to a backgammon board which became his constant companion.

Eventually, a ransom of €1 million was paid by the Dutch government and the charity and Arjan was released and then had to adjust to returning to 'normality.'

Having experienced the loss of freedom and the degradation and inability to doing anything about it, he vowed to try to help others who have been taken from their families and set them free.

Free a Girl

Arjan founded the Free a Girl charity in Holland alongside CEO Evelien Hölsken and Yolande Sneijder Cabau, the Spanish born wife of international footballer Wesley Sneijder, who previously played for Real Madrid and now turns out for Nice.

The concept is simple, the charity does all that it can to free girls who have been sold or cajoled into prostitution and started working in India where many underage girls serve in squalid, almost cell like conditions.

With so many countries being beset with

the problems of 'pressganged' initially innocent girls, the scope of the charity has expanded to try to assist unfortunates in India - where it is estimated that more than one million minors are prostitutes - Bangladesh, Brazil, Cambodia, Thailand and The Netherlands.

Lock me Up

Some funds are given to the charity by the Dutch government and others are raised by two main events in Holland, one a traditional gala dinner and the other a much more unusual event called Lock Me Up.

Cages about the size of the average living accommodation of these girls are placed in 25 select restaurants and a volunteer who will collect money for the charity has to sit in the cell for 12 hours without eating and watch-

ing others enjoy themselves.

Each volunteer commits to raise at least €2,500 and the overall income from this concept is the region of €500,000 each year.

Spanish Gala

With a large relatively afflu-

ent Dutch population living on the Costa del Sol, Arjan in conjunction with the Marbella Dutch Business Groups is planning a gala evening at the picturesque Hotel Castillo de Monda on November 1, which is why he visited Spain and wanted to discuss the project with the largest English language newspaper *Euro Weekly News* about his plans.

The concept is to host 200 people in a night of good food and fine music with a planned 12 dishes to be offered by waiters as a finger buffet with music by supporter George McCrae of Rock Your Baby fame as well as other acts and a DJ.

School for Justice




ISRAEL has expressed anger to the Swiss government over a hotel's sign that told Jewish guests to shower before using the swimming pool. The sign in English, at Apartmenthaus Paradies in the mountain resort of Arosa, triggered much criticism.

Another sign told Jewish guests to use a refrigerator only at certain times.

Israel's deputy foreign minister called it "an anti-Semitic act of the worst and ugliest kind." Reports say the hotel has now removed the signs.

A photo of the shower sign was tweeted, after an Orthodox Jewish guest spoke about it on Israel's Channel 2 TV. The Israeli interviewee told the TV: "The staff were really very nice to us. But one morning I came down and saw this sign. I was shocked!"

'To our Jewish guests, women, men and children, please take a shower before you go swimming,' it said, adding that 'if you break the rules I'm forced to close [sic] the swim-

ming pool for you.'

Israeli Deputy Foreign Minister Tzipi Hotovely said she had discussed the "anti-Semitic" case with Israel's ambassador to Switzerland, who told her the signs had now been removed. However, she said those responsible should be punished, as a deterrent.

Correspondents say the instruction to Jewish guests to have a shower touches raw nerves about the Holocaust, because Nazi death camp guards sent Jews to 'showers' that were actually gas chambers.

The sign in the hotel kitchen said: 'To our Jewish guests: You are allowed to approach the fridge between the hours: 10.00-11.00 in the morning and 16.30-17.30 in the evening. I hope you understand that our team does not like to be dis-

turbed every time.'

Reports say the hotel often has guests from Israel, some of whom are Orthodox Jews. The hotel management was quoted as saying there was "no anti-Semitic intent" and "we have no problem with Jewish guests at the hotel."

Ruth Thomann, responsible for the shower sign, said her choice of words had been a mistake. She said some Jewish guests had gone swimming with clothes, such as t-shirts, on and had not showered first. As for the fridge, she explained, Jewish guests - but not other guests - had been allowed to use it to store kosher food.

"MONEY find its way to money." This must be the case with Donald Trump, as the Trump Turnberry hotel has received a £109,530 business rates rebate as part of an emergency bailout plan for Scottish hospitality firms.

The rebate plan was intended to help struggling businesses in Scotland, but has been criticised for aiding profitable businesses such as Donald Trump's Turnberry hotel.

The payment, uncovered by the *Guardian* newspaper in the UK, has led to a 13.5 per cent reduction in the hotel's annual business rates bill, which was £811,850.

Opposition MSPs told the paper that the rebate was not intended for thriving businesses.


Scottish Green Party leader Patrick Harvie said: "Trump's brand is toxic. It's bad enough that he has a business presence in Scotland. It's galling to learn that the public purse is giving him a helping hand."

Labour MSP Lewis Macdonald added: "The Turnberry case highlights the unfairness of the current system and the urgent need for reform."

The news comes as the Scottish government yesterday published the Barclay Review into business rates in the country, which has made proposals including the cutting of the revaluation period to three years and suggested a one-year delay before rates liability is incurred when a property is improved.

Meanwhile, the US President Donald Trump has resigned as director of his Scottish hotels and golf courses, according to filings at Companies House.

The documents show Trump resigned his directorship of Trump International Golf Club Scotland, which owns the course and hotel at the Menie Estate in Balmedie, Aberdeenshire, on January 19 - the day before his inauguration as president.

He also resigned from SLC Turnberry and Golf Recreation Scotland, which own and operate the five-red-AA-star, 157-bedroom Trump Turnberry course and hotel in Ayrshire that he bought in 2014 and reopened in June following a £200m refurbishment.

Although there was no legal requirement for Trump to step aside from his companies, presidents traditionally pass over their business interests to an independent manager to avoid any conflict of interests, which Trump himself committed to during his election campaign.

Trump's children, Eric, Ivanka and Donald Jr have retained their directorships at SLC Turnberry and Trump International Golf Club Scotland. Eric Trump is also a director at Golf Recreation Scotland.

Somehow I think he may have renounced his directorships, but I can't really see him handing over the reins completely can you? But why are the Scottish MPs really angry about the fact that he has invested money into Scotland. Is it purely that they don't want foreign investment or have they just joined the 'let's knock Trump for all we can' brigade!

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Are you allowed to speed whilst overtaking?

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



SPEED LIMIT: Depends on the road.

MANY people are unsure if they are permitted to exceed the speed limit whilst overtaking and the answer is both yes and no, but mostly no.

According to Article 51 of the Reglamento General de Circulacion, 'The maximum fixed speeds for conventional roads which do not pass through urban areas may only be exceeded by up to 20km per hour by saloon cars and motorcycles, whilst overtaking other vehicles travelling at lesser speeds.'

This clause first came about to allow cars to pass a slower moving vehicle in the shortest possible time, allowing an increase in speed to enable the move to be carried out quickly.

However, the rule does exist and does allow drivers to go over the speed limit, but only in certain circumstances.

First, the rule is only ever applied to cars and motorcycles. There are also limits to the type of road it is applied to. It does not permit the speed increase on motorways or on dual carriageways so faster moving roads are excluded straight away. The clause also does not apply in towns or cities. This just leaves the

'conventional' roads, such as single carriageways with no central reservation and those roads that are outside of towns.

The clause also does not apply if you see a speed limit sign as this limit overrules the clause. So for example, if you see a sign (which is called the R-301) that limits the maximum speed of a road to 70km p/h then the maximum speed is 70km and this exceptional speeding clause does not apply and you are not permitted to exceed the speed limit for any reason, including overtaking.

So the circumstances where this clause can be applied are few and far between in reality as the clause only applies on a conventional road where there is no overruling speed limit and where overtaking is allowed.

And remember, overtaking is one of the most dangerous manoeuvres we carry out. In the event of a head-on collision, our speed is added to that of the oncoming vehicle and so a crash where two vehicles are travelling at 90km per hour is the equivalent of crashing at 180km per hour when the two are combined.

Lavender is a must for your garden

LAVENDER is a must for every Mediterranean garden design to be complete. It is a native plant to the region and the naturally occurring species are perfectly adapted to the alkaline soils, summer sun and periods of low rainfall.

This is a great plus for one of the most pleasantly fragrant small shrubs with natural oils that are very soothing and relaxing from the aroma emitted from the whole plant.

The bluish to violet

coloured flowers are a rarer shade of colour for flowers and they are prominently displayed on long stems extending out from the plant for all to see.

If you grow your own it is very easy to take cuttings and tie a bunch to hang in the house to make the home more fragrant. The Spanish lavender, *Lavandula stoechas*, is my favourite in the ornamental garden for its wonderful scent but the English lavender (*Lavandula angustifolia*s and hybrids) is best for the culinary herb garden.

They love to be in the sun and become scraggly in areas of too much shade where the bushes do not thicken up enough to have dense flowering.

To grow lavender, the natural soils being alkaline in Spain are ideal and just a few handfuls of compost mixed into the surrounding soil may be needed to ensure good

drainage, some water retention and nutrients.

Lavender do not like wet feet and too many nutrients promotes growth but fewer flowers. More lavender are killed off by overwatering than dryness as they prefer a dry environment and too much water encourages fungal problems.

To keep the plant strong, pruning off the spent flower

heads is necessary if you haven't already harvested them for use elsewhere. Usually this is done in autumn all at once as the plants flower uniformly and finish flowering at the same time so you can wait for the last ones to finish.

If you wish to reduce the size of the plant it is best left until spring when the plant

starts to reshoot to ensure a quick recovery from the pruning. Normally you should only cut about one third to a half of the plant each season.

If you want to grow them in containers, choose a compact variety. Use a well-drained potting mix with at least 10 per cent sand or fine gravel added.

If growing them alone in a container, make the container a minimal size larger than the root ball as excessive pot space invites fungus to move in. Make sure the container is placed where there is sunlight and if using a drip tray elevate the pot or container a little in the tray so that it does not sit in the excess water.

Lavender provides the ideal atmosphere for relaxing, drowsing around and enjoying the Mediterranean garden.

When life gives you lemon balm

NOT many people may have heard of lemon balm, but everyone should have this pleasant herb in their gardens.

Once named 'Herb of the Year' by the International Herb Association, this plant has so many uses you'll wonder how you lived so long without it.

The plant is a member of the mint family and grows up to two feet high. In the spring and summer, the plant produces lovely clusters of small yellow flowers and it's possible to detect the lovely lemon aroma by rubbing the leaves together.

Lemon balm has been used for centuries for its many healing properties and is believed to help reduce anxiety and stress. You can make the most of the calming elements of this plant at home by boiling the leaves in hot water to make tea, or rubbing directly onto your skin.

Signs a pet is struggling in the heat - what to do

THE Spanish heat can often be relentless in the height of summer and though experts advise keeping our four-legged friends cool, it is often easier said than done.

One of the first things to do is to try and identify when your pet is hot so as to deal with the issue early.

Cats cope slightly better with the heat than dogs but both show similar signs of overheating such as dizziness and stumbling when walking, vomiting, loss of appetite and excess lethargy.

Dogs may tend to lift their feet awkwardly which can indicate the floor is too hot and action must be taken to avoid blistered paws.

Cats can often seem restless when trying to find a cool spot, they may groom more than usual and can even get sweaty paws.

A common misconception is that dogs and cats do not sweat because they pant but both creatures have sweat glands in their paws and a cool floor is always welcome.

Panting in cats is more related to fear or nerves than overheating. When they are hot they tend to breathe through their mouths and let their tongues hang out.

Providing clean, fresh drinking water is always a must and chilling it or adding ice where possible will help cool the animal but don't let them guzzle too much too quickly or they will lose even more water through vomiting.

Avoid taking your dog out or letting the cat out during the afternoon and if leaving them in, if possible, leave windows open with the security grills across.

Dogs with dark, thick coats will overheat more quickly but dogs with short, light coats can suffer sunburn. Trimming the coats of long-haired breeds can be beneficial as well as daily grooming.

Fans and air conditioning are ideal, even if just for the initial cooling down.

Never, ever leave your pet in a car in the sun because even a short 15-minute stint can prove fatal.

Acupuncture for animals



ALTERNATIVE medicine has seen a resurgence of popularity in recent years, and it seems this growing trend is having an impact on the animal kingdom as well. Acupuncture has remained a popular alternative treatment for humans for some time now, but you probably weren't aware of its growing popularity among pet owners too.

Although originally introduced several decades ago, it remains uncommon for vets to use this practice, seeing it as alternative and unconventional.

However, in 2015 the American Association of Feline Practitioners (AAFP) and the American Animal Hospital Association (AAHA) put forward new guidelines stating that acupuncture is a 'compelling and safe method for pain management.'


Many pet owners and practitioners are certain the procedure dramatically makes a difference to the animal's lives, especially older animals or those with chronic illnesses such as arthritis. Research into the treatment has suggested that the pain re-

lief acupuncture provides is the result of a natural painkiller called adenosine being released at the point of insertion.

The increase in popularity stems from clients asking their vets if there is anything to be done to reduce the amount of drugs their pets are given.

While critics believe the positive results are nothing more than a placebo effect on the owner, many claim that their pets are able to live more comfortable, pain free lives thanks to the procedure.

FOR years it has been medically documented that companion animals, like dogs, cats, rabbits and birds, help people live longer and healthier lives.

Being responsible for caring for an animal often gives new meaning to someone who is living alone or who is far from loved ones. Pets can help elderly people keep an active lifestyle and may help fill a void left by living alone or away from family.

Seniors should not be encouraged to take on a large dog, many seniors take on a dog far too powerful for them, which become unmanageable. Obviously if you live in an apartment then you have a small dog.

Dog's lives evolve around odour; I always recommend bathing a rescue pet as soon as possible. By doing this you

wash away the old identity and allow the dog to get his new identity. Most dogs will roll in the ground to get their new identity.

Take your new pet for a walk around the area of your street near your home as soon as you are able. This allows your new pet to learn the new smells of the area.

Ensure that all doors, gates etc to the home are secure and that you have apart from a microchip a tab on the collar with your telephone number.

Emotionally you will feel very sorry for the little fellow and often new owners can overdo the attention. Best not to smother the dog and keep in mind that now is the time to set the rules of your home.

Scrap battle begins

by Matthew Elliott

FORD has joined BMW in launching a scrappage incentive scheme. BMW and Vauxhall have offered drivers a £2,000 discount in the UK to exchange older models for new, more eco-friendly ones.

Ford goes one better. It is allowing motorists to exchange any brand of car or van, and get a discount on a new Ford model. The initiative is expected to be rolled out across Europe next year. Discounts will be at least €2,000, depending on the country.

Only old vehicles registered before 2009

and which precede Euro V engine emission standards can be exchanged for the discount. Germany is leading the way in offering financial incentives to scrap polluting vehicles. In the UK flagging car sales have also inspired the offer, with

many buyers hesitant to buy diesel, and waiting to see how Brexit irons out.

Ford has promised it will scrap all trade-in vehicles. There are almost

20 million cars on British roads that aren't up to Euro V standards. The latest standard

is Euro VI, engines which emit 90 per cent less nitrogen oxides than standards I to IV.

Mini Countryman

HOW big can a Mini be before it is no longer mini? Looks like the German owners of the Mini brand feel there is no upper limit, for the latest Mini Countryman is even larger than before and can now be regarded by many as a mid-size family car.

With famous brand image and build-quality, plus increased practicality, the new Countryman is certainly going to please existing customers and win over a lot of potential new buyers.

Six Countryman variants are available, all with the Cooper prefix, with different engine outputs spanning 136 hp to 228 hp, and there is also the option of a plug-in hybrid. All except the hybrid have a six-speed manual gearbox though there is the option of an automatic, and all-wheel-drive.

To Mini purists, the Countryman's exterior styling may look a little awkward but there will be no complaints about the larger interior space, which allows it to rival crossover models such as Audi Q2, Mazda CX-3, Peugeot 3008 and SEAT Ateca.

Prices start at €24,753 (£22,695) for the model featured, the entry level Countryman Cooper with the 1.5 litre three-cylinder petrol engine and standard six-speed manual gearbox. Top speed is 202 kph

(126 mph), the 0-100 kph time 9.6 seconds. Fuel economy is 18.2 kpl (51.4 mpg).

While this larger Mini is heavier than the standard car and therefore is not quite as nimble, it is still nippy enough to add a fun factor to the driving. The steering is precise and reacts swiftly, giving good grip and composed handling. The ride is on the firm side, but acceptably so and overall, noise levels are low and the driving feel quite refined.

This entry model is well-kitted with alloy wheels, touchscreen, sat-nav, DAB ra-

dio, Bluetooth, air-con, cruise control, roof rails, auto lights and wipers and rear-view camera. Standard connected services on all models include compatibility with an iPhone via MINI's Connected app.

The larger cabin means four adults can travel in comfort, and five if the rear occupants are prepared to squish. The 40/20/40 rear seat fold configuration is useful for occupant and load variation and the boot space, up from 350 litres on the previous model to 450 litres on the latest, can extend to 1,390 litres with rear seats down.

Interior materials have a quality look and the dashboard is lifted by chrome detailing, big dials and chunky switchgear. The overall impression is of classy durability.

This new Countryman will be a hit with loyal fans and will convert others. While not as practical as some crossovers/compact SUVs, it has the bonus of a cool image and BMW-Mini build integrity.

China coy over Jeep takeover

A CHINESE takeover of Fiat Chrysler is on the cards. China's Great Wall Motors put the Shanghai Stock Exchange on notice when it announced interest in a bid for Jeep, a Fiat brand.

The largest SUV producer in China has since said that no formal talks have been held with Fiat. Although it has also floated the notion of buying out the biggest Italian car producer in its entirety, not just the Jeep brand.

Fiat Chrysler is the world's seventh biggest car maker and has a huge share of the American market, with a major presence in Detroit, Motor City. Chief executive Sergio Marchionne has openly expressed a willingness to welcome investors or even take-over bids as Fiat struggles to keep up with recent innovations.

Great Wall is emerging as a

major global player. Sales rose by 26 per cent last year to push past the one million mark, compared to Fiat Chrysler's 4.7 million. If Great Wall took over Jeep it would be on course to become the world's biggest

SUV manufacturer.

Meanwhile, in China itself, Ford has entered into a partnership with Anhui Zotye to develop a new line of electric cars in what is now the world's biggest motor market.
