Fears are growing after new cases of the bacterium Xylella fastidiosa were detected in El Comtat and Marina Alta.

The European Commission said in a statement that Spain is "losing the battle" against the bug that is "officially out of control" after the number of cases in Mallorca rose to 156.

The disease which has been dubbed olive Ebola was previ-

ously confined to Guadalest, where emergency action has been taken, but it has now spread to 26 almond orchards in Balls and Alcanali.

It has had a devastating effect on almond trees and has wiped out more than a million olive trees in Italy and the Balearic Islands in recent years, but these new cases represent only the second record on mainland Spain.

Insecticide will now be applied to everything within 100 metres of the newly-infected trees in the hope of destroying vectors carrying the disease, before the trees themselves are destroved.

Regional Environmental councillor Elena Cebrian met with the mayors of the affected villages in order to try and calm local growers, but she also confirmed that biologists have not as yet identified which insect species is carrying the deadly disease to new areas

Ferreting around

SAN VICENTE firemen rescued a ferret from drowning in a Muchamiel irrigation water deposit.

They were alerted after a resident saw it fall into the deposit while chasing a duck. Firefighters found the ferret clinging to a floating container but after they removed it with a long-handled pool-cleaning net it fled and disappeared from sight.

Still precarious

UNEMPLOYMENT in Campello fell to 9.68 per cent in July, the lowest in four years.

The majority of the town's 1,712 unemployed were female, although 427 of July's 817 new jobs went to women.

Of these, 511 were part-time and 306 full-time but practically all new contracts were temporary, with only 67 permanent posts.

Damages slashed

THE San Juan crematorium will receive €47,563 compensation instead of €658,000 set by an Alicante court.

This amended amount is based on deterioration between 2006 and 2011, not lost earnings, Valencia judges said. The crematorium reclosed in 2016 when the town hall rescinded its licence as a precautionary measure on health grounds.

BEWARE: Wandering shirtless in Mallorca can lead to a hefty fine.

AMONG Spain's oddest laws is one in Els Alamus, Catalonia, which rules that all prostitutes - plying the oldest profession in the world - must wear high visibility vests when seeking clients on roadsides, with fines of up to €40 for those not doing so.

Police stress the law is to protect the women from the danger they can pose to drivers.

Meanwhile in Cadiz it is illegal to throw rice at bridal couples, in part to safeguard wedding guests slipping, and also to prevent pigeons flocking outside

Then in Madrid it's illegal to ask what time it is

there from 3.29pm - 6.47pm according to a centuries old law that appears to have never been removed from the city statutes.

Also in the capital city it is illegal to walk more than eight dogs at once. Three years ago Mallorca, seeking to attract more discerning tourists to the island, introduced a law banning people from going shirtless in public. Those ignoring it can be fined up to €600.

A similar law also exists in Barcelona, and Marbella is now said to be considering introducing such a law, though it has not been proved whether such laws have led to classier tourists visiting.

IT is not only local laws that create some surprises, with national rules governing certain names that children cannot be named, including a ban on Mandarina and Judas.

Meanwhile it is illegal to drive anywhere in Spain in flip flops with a fine of €600 for drivers caught doing so.

But perhaps the oddest national law of all is the mysterious one that appears to prevent children from buying watermelon without their parents being present.

However, nothing appears on public records as an explanation.

Murder family shuts business down

THE Sala family, whose matriarch Mari Carmen Martinez was murdered last December, have closed their Novocar car showroom.

Mari Carmen was the widow of Vicente Sala, a former president of the now-defunct CAM bank. After his death she headed the family's business interests, assisted by her son Vicente, but was allegedly at loggerheads with her daughters by the time she died.

She was shot at point blank range while inside her vehicle at the Novocar salesroom and her son-in-law Miguel Lopez was arrested and charged with her murder. After some months on remand, he was later released on bail.

Lopez was in charge of both Novocar as well as the Solmar car-hire firm and despite falling profits, had increased his pay from an annual €45,000 to €99,999 in 2015.

Both companies had run at a loss since 2013 and it was known that Mari Carmen had discussed winding up the companies before she was killed.

The wealthy family, which also owns lucrative chemical firms, has sold its remaining vehicles to a leading Alicante Province dealer. Solmar, not yet extinguished, is practically inoperative.

Leader of the pack

BRITAIN'S Chris Froome remains on course to be the first man to win both the Tour de France and Vuelta a España in a single season since 1978.

The 32-year-old Team Sky rider dominated the stage 16 time trial to leave him almost two minutes ahead of his nearest rival, the Italian Vincenzo Nibali.

He picked up his second stage victory of this year's race, with only one of his rivals, Dutch Team Sunweb rider Wilco Kelderman. within 30 seconds of the four-time Tour winner.

Following yesterday's (Wednesday) stage 17, a 180.5-kilometre run from Villadiego in Burgos to Los Machucos in Cantabria, there are just four stages remaining.

Today's stage 18 sees the peloton follow a semi-mountainous 169-kilometre route from Suances to Santo Toribio de Liebana as the race remains in Cantabria before moving to Asturias ahead of Sunday's finish in Madrid. In the wake of Froome's stage

time trial victory last Tuesday, Team Sky boss Dave Brailsford said: "The course suited him [Froome] but you still have to time it well and he showed again why he is considered to be one of the world's best time triallists to-

"But there are still some really hard stages coming up, the climbs are so steep and intense that there is no time to relax. It's a difficult day tomorrow, and for the

guys who went full today, we'll see how that them."



Child's murder shocks inland

EIGHT-YEAR-OLD Dominique was strangled and a pregnant woman, Alejandra, tied up and beaten in Elda.

Hearing a loud scream and seeing their apartment door half-open, a concerned neighbour decided to enter.

She was confronted by the child's half-naked body in the hallway and in an adjoining room found four months pregnant Alejandra, who was bound and gagged and had been beat-

The neighbour called the emergency services who tried unsuccessfully to revive the child and took the woman, who was in shock, to Elda General Hospital.

Dominique had been permanently fostered four years earlier but his parents later separated. Custody went to the foster-mother but he often visited his foster-father, Dani, who now lived with Alejandra in the centre of Elda.

The investigation is focusing on two men wearing motorcycle helmets who intercepted the woman and child as they left the apartment at approximately

9pm. They pushed them back indoors, hitting Alejandra until she lost consciousness. She came round to find herself tied up, gagged and hooded but although she is hearing-impaired, she can speak and lip-read and managed to call her mother, who in turn alerted Dani.

Discovering that she had used her phone the two attackers hit her once more but fled. assuming that she had called the police.

According to sources close to the case, Dominique was 'violently asphyxiated.' On the higher end of the autism spectrum, he had also been diagnosed with epilepsy and investigators did not rule this out as contributing to his death.

Ban the bomb

AS life goes on around the world, the news that North Korea has undertaken its sixth test of a nuclear bomb has been met with universal criticism.

For some time, President Kim Jong-un has warned that another nuclear test was imminent and this one has come at a time when the US and South Korean forces have been undertaking their annual war games close to the border with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK).

A MONTH-OLD baby is in intensive care with brain damage after cocaine was found in his system.

His Spanish parents, a woman of 22 and her 36-year-old partner from Alaquas, were remanded after taking him to a Valencia City hospital, where doctors immediately noticed inconsistencies in their story.

Cocaine baby's parents remanded

The parents claimed they noticed an alarming deterioration in his health following an allergic reaction to ointment they had put on small sores on his mouth.

The parents' explanations did not convince the paediatrician attending the baby, as he displayed classic symptoms of drug intoxication. An emergency blood test confirmed the presence of cocaine, which was corroborated by National Police investigators attached to the Minors Unit.

As the baby was bottle-fed he could not have absorbed cocaine through his mother's milk and the police are attempting to establish how it entered his system.

The baby remains in intensive care and doctors have revealed that he shows signs of life-changing, permanent brain injuries. Now in the temporary care of the regional government, he is still in the private clinic, but will be moved to a state-run hospital when his health permits.





Regional president wants fair dos

XIMO PUIG, Valencian Community president, had a crunch meeting in Madrid with Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy.

Via simple arithmetic, he demonstrated to the president of the national government that the Generalitat no longer receives enough from Madrid to cover basic needs.

Puig and his government claim that following agreements with the national government in 2002 and 2009, the gap between the Valencian Community and other Spanish regions has

Based on the region's present census of 4.9 million the shortfall accumulated since then has reached €26.9 billion, meaning that during this period every man, woman and child in the Valencian Community has received €5,443 less from Madrid.

This €26.9bn could have been used for education, health, roads and social services, Puig said. It is 60 per cent of the region's public debt of €44.1bn and the Generalitat's account books would be healthier if the region were fairly financed.

Price is simply nuts

THE best almond crop in five years will not be reflected the price it fetches.

Production in Alicante Province centres principally on the l'Alcoia, El Comtat and Foia de Castalla areas and growers expect to pick 2,300 tons.

This is double last year's

20

crop thanks to abundant rainfall this winter but the most they can hope for is €4 a kilo, compared with €8 two years ago and €6 in 2016.

"That's an incredible drop," said Juan Pastor of the La Unio growers' and farmers' union.

Pastor maintained that in-

creased production by foreign growers was partly responsible for the falling Spanish prices but he also blamed the commercial strategies of operators on the international markets.

"They base prices on those they pay for US-grown almonds which are cheaper but inferior to Spain's," Pastor said. "We have been saying for some time that ours should be more expensive."

My father's son' claim

JAVIER SANTOS, a 42-yearold from Valencia, is determined to prove that he is Julio Iglesias's son.

He claims he is the result of a night of passion and has a sample of the singer's DNA, scavenged from rubbish left outside his Miami home, to prove it.

Santos first went to court 25 years ago, claiming that Iglesias was his father. On this oc-

casion the crooner refused to undergo tests, prompting a Valencia judge to rule in 1992 that his reluctance was proof that he had fathered Santos.

The singer appealed to the Valencia High Court who reversed the ruling, maintaining that Iglesias' refusal to comply did not necessarily imply that he was Santos's father. This verdict was later confirmed by Valencia's

Supreme Court.

The same case cannot be heard twice but Santos and his lawyer Fernando Osuma now hope that the DNA evidence will persuade the Valencia courts to reopen the case.

If there is another hearing and Iglesias once again refuses to cooperate, Santos and his lawyer will ask the judge to order DNA samples from other members of Iglesias' family. This could involve the exhumation of the singer's father, Julio Iglesias Puga, Os-

LAND at Villajoyosa's Roman baths was cleared of weeds and litter during routine cleaning of municipal plots.

The work, which was carried out by specialised operatives, included the Barberes Sur Roman villa, said Pedro Alemany, La Vila's Environment councillor.

The baths in Calle Canaleias in the centre of Villaiovosa were discovered in 2006 and the extensive site points to the importance of the town, which was then called Allon and was the fourth-most important in Alicante Province.

Excavations have revealed that the baths, built in the first century AD and in use until the fourth, possessed a swimming pool and what archaeologists believe was a bar.



Mortgage expenses back

Refund mortgage costs and the purchase expenses

AFTER coming back from holiday, our office received a court order regarding a mortgage loan expenses and costs claim, that we understand is very interesting, and that has been granted by the court no 3 of Denia, judgment number 179/17, where the court estimates the claim I presented as a lawyer of the White Baos Abogados, in my own name, Carlos Baos as a consumer.

What makes this very interesting is:

1. The clause imposing all the costs is abusive regardless of the background and knowledge of the consumer, even if he is a lawyer. In the case said. the respondent bank that has been finally considered responsible, Bankinter, based part of its defence on the fact that since I, the consumer affected by the expenses clause, am an expert lawyer in real estate law and banking law, I was clearly aware of the economic consequences and accepted it.

As we argued the judgment with the court in agreement, this clause is objectively abusive and therefore void, because it is disproportionate and imposes some expenses on the consumer that do not belong to him/her, regardless of the consumer's background.

But it is important at this point to remember that the af-

fected consumers, in order to be able to claim successfully, must be an individual (no companies) whose mortgage is not related to their commercial, professional activity etc, while the training or experience of the consumer is irrelevant.

2. The sentence condemns the bank to reimburse us the expenses paid in connection with the mortgage loan, except for the Stamp Duty tax.

3. Also the court order asked Bankinter to refund part of the expenses we paid for the registration of the deed of purchase.

We understand this is something new and unprecedented because as we proved before the court, the bank forced us, as all banks do in Spain, to use a company chosen by the bank, called Brand, to deal with the registration at the land registry, not only of the mortgage loan deed, but also the purchase deed (escritura) signed before, imposing yet another expense upon the customer.

Thus, the judge has asked the bank, to return the amount of €508 that the bank agency charged us to process with the registration of the deed of sale at the land registry.

Marza now gets his way

THE regional Education department skirted the courts' suspension of its plurilingual teaching programme with a parliamentary decree.

Education chief Vicent Marza's plans to teach all subjects in state schools in Valenciano, Spanish and English were scuppered by Valencia's Upper Court of Justice (TSJCV).

Schools were given the option of teaching mainly in Valenciano or Spanish but the number of classes taught in English was linked to the level of Valenciano chosen.

The TSJCV judges ruled

that Marza was discriminating against schools choosing Spanish over Valenciano and temporarily suspended the law, ordering a return to lessons in Spanish or Valenciano.

The regional parliament has now approved Marza's recent parliamentary decree. allowing schools to introduce the plurilingual programme for three-year-olds. This will have a year's duration, affecting 5 per cent of pupils at state schools.

There is a significant difference, nonetheless, as the number of subjects taught in English will not be tied to the level of Valenciano chosen.

Alicante Province schools are mostly happy with the decree, unlike the Partido Popular and Ciudadanos parties or the provincial

Parents' Federation of Associations

Beatriz Gasco, the PP's spokeswoman in the regional parliament accused Marza of "laughing" at the TSJCV while Marta Marin from Cs described the decree as "improvised."

Alicante Province parents' associations went further, condemning it "unprecedented in our democracy.'

Pressure group comments on Brexit

AS the third round of talks took place between British and European Union Brexit negotiators in Brussels, campaigning groups made their voices heard.

British in Europe, an umbrella body lobbying for citizen's rights includes Bremain in Spain which looks to try to protect British citizens living in Spain and as the name suggests is generally opposed to Brexit.

The coalition has assessed the joint UK/EU technical note on citizens' rights, which displays some agreement concerning recognition of professional qualifications and the right to set up businesses after Brexit.

It has come to the conclusion in both cases that this right will probably only be valid in the country of residence and not across the EU 27, thereby affecting cross-border workers.

Chair of British in Europe, Jane Golding, comments: "Both parties agreed that frontier workers should be covered by any agreement but we're concerned that this definition is too narrow to cover the myriad ways in which UK citizens work cross-border."

Sue Wilson, Chair of Bremain in Spain, comments: "Before the negotiations even started this week, both

sides were suggesting that the expectations for progress were low. We saw little to convince us otherwise.

"The EU has constantly stated that the burning issues of citizens' rights. Ireland's border and the exit bill must come first, and that talks on any future relationship cannot start until 'sufficient progress' has been made on these issues. However, the UK continues to want to focus on trade

"When I listened to David Davis and Michel Barnier speaking at the press conference on Thursday August

31, it was hard to believe they were discussing the same negotiations. While Davis insisted there had been 'concrete progress,' Barnier said there had been 'no decisive progress on the

She continues: "One of those key issues is citizens' rights. We have repeatedly been told we are number one priority. Yet, after the third set of negotiations, we are not much further forward."

British in Europe is, however, pleased that the third round of negotiations saw pension aggregation confirmed and that discussions concerning mutual healthcare arrangements for pensioners and others in receipt of benefits will continue.

Sue Wilson says: "Despite some examples of progress, Bremain in Spain members remain concerned. Some have been reassured by the progress made but many are still wary and distrustful of anything the UK government is promising."

She concludes: "So, the third round of negotiations is over, 15 months have passed since the referendum, yet we have not travelled so far."



After vehicle repairs are complete, they send a list of the OEM parts used for you to keep in your log book. It's one less thing to worry about.

DO ALL INSURANCE COMPANIES USE OEM PARTS?

At the time of publishing this article, no other insurance company in Spain guarantees the exclusive use of OEM parts in their repairer network. Some insurance companies rely on after market parts and used parts to keep the repair costs to a minimum, only paying for

OEM parts if no other parts

made by a company other than your vehicle's manufacturer. They are new and the spec should be very close to the original specs. However, some minor fitting adjustments may be required by the body shop. Used parts come from the scrap yard. Cars involved in accidents, engine trouble or age, mean that scrapped cars will have some working parts, which can be resold. The used parts are usually OEM parts.







A year on from the fires

THIS Monday September 4 marked a year since the beginning of the Benitachell and Javea fires.

The fires destroyed 687 hectares of forest and 122 non-forest hectares. Across the eight days before the fires were pronounced extinguished, 400 personnel worked tirelessly and 1,400 people had to be evicted.



Who do you think you are?

Provinces need help

FINANCE

SINCE 2012 the National Government has given Catalonia €68.5 billion, saving it a colossal €18 billion in interest if it had borrowed at commercial rates.

The Finance Minister Cristóbal Montoro stated this when appearing before the Treasury Committee in Congress and went on to claim that this proved Catalonia did not have the financial strength to leave Spain nor the legal power to hold a referendum.

Both Andalucia and Valencia have benefited from similar financial support which has seen a total spend of €220 billion amongst the provinces.

Sterling might look up

AS inflation in the eurozone rises more quickly than expected, the European Central Bank (ECB) may stop quantative easing which sees the printing of millions of euros.

World financial analysts forecast that sterling which has been falling dramatically against the euro is undervalued and is due to bounce back by a few percentage points in the near future.

There is a general feeling that currency speculators may have over reacted to the possibility of a Hard Brexit and the apparent lack

of agreement between British and EU negotiators at the moment which saw the pound fall.

The ECB says that it wants to see close to 2 per cent inflation across the eurozone, but the problem is that individual state economies do not act in concert with each other and employment figures are also erratic with both Spain and Germany seeing less unemployment whilst France sees more out of work.

New electric cars for Madrid

AN agreement between Spanish Service Company Ferrovial and Renault has been signed to launch a car sharing service in Madrid called Zity.

It will operate from October with a fleet of 500 Zoe electric cars and will initially service the area within the M-30 beltway.

The Zoe has a theoretical maximum coverage of 400 kilometres but is more likely to need recharging after 300 kilometres based on normal traffic conditions within the capital.

This will be the third electric car sharing scheme operating within Madrid as both Citroen and Mercedes with their electric Smart car are using the city to demonstrate their ability to run non-polluting vehicles.

With various countries promising to phase out 'gas guzzlers' in the future, this type of experiment could have important financial implications for manufacturers looking to win drivers over to their mod-

WHILST tourism to Spain continues to boom, the introduction of online booking of accommodation and even rides can cause problems.

Two American concepts, represented by Airbnb and Cabify are thorns in the sides of councils and licensed taxi drivers.

According to Mintel, the world's largest market intelligence agency with global offices in Europe, the Far East and Asia, a growing number of Americans are using new technology to plan and book their holidays.

Some 19 per cent of young American travellers have booked home share accommodation which is great for the websites, but possibly illegal if accommodation owners don't bother to license their properties for short term letting.

Diesel loses out to petrol

THE three largest oil refiners in Spain, Cepsa, Repsol and BP are preparing for a steady decline in demand for diesel within the country.

At one time, diesel was the 'in demand motor fuel' and they invested heavily in refineries able to cope with the number of diesel cars being sold.

Within the last five years however, diesel power has gone out of favour, even though it remains cheaper than unleaded petrol and the oil companies now recognise that car sales in Spain will continue to reflect the change.

EU BANS ENERGY GOBBLING VACUUM CLEANERS Making Europe greener

AN important new European law banning the sale of vacuum cleaners using more than 900 watts of power and emitting more than 80 decibels is now in ef-

Manufacturers and stores who still hold stock of these machines will be able to sell them until stocks are exhausted but may not produce or import additional machines into the European Union.

With the number of bazaars in Spain that import electrical goods from China, it may be the banned cleaners have a longer shelf life here than in other parts of the EU.

According to a consortium of environmental organisations, the European Environment Bureau, it is perfectly possible to produce a good quality vacuum cleaner without a large motor or making a loud noise.

Former UKIP MEP Roger Helmer told the BBC "By all means let's make pathetic under-powered vacuum cleaners for export to the EU.

"But we must retain the right to make and use sensible full-powered appliances in the UK. This shows why we



part of the Union, it will enforce this and other laws.

The driving force behind this new law is the need to reduce the amount of electricity used in the home and the European Commission states that by switching to one of the most energy efficient vacuum cleaners, consumers can save €70 over the lifetime of the product.

Car sales soar in August

ONE sign of an economy in recovery is the number of cars sold and August has seen 72,470 new Spanish registrations.

This is a 13 per cent increase over the same month last year and with 849,912 sold in the first eight months of 2017, there is an overall increase of 7 per cent.

Despite all of the negative publicity received by the Volkswagen Group over the diesel scandal, its Spanish subsidiary SEAT actually took 17 per cent of the entire new registrations with Volkswagen also performing well.

With so many tourists visiting the country, car hire companies have increased their purchases by more than 40 per cent when compared to last year.

Problem gamblers worry

A GIBRALTAR-based online gambling firm is being fined a record £7.8 million (€8.5 million) by the UK Gambling Commission.

The regulator insists that firms that take bets have an obligation to protect their more vulnerable clients from spending more than they can afford which 888 have allegedly not done.

The most obvious example of this was 7,000 customers who had voluntarily recorded they had a problem and should not be allowed to bet any longer, but were still allowed to take part in the company's bingo games.

Another problem area highlighted was inability of the company to spot problem gamblers and in one case a customer lost £100,000 (€108,000) a month for 13 months before they recognised his vulnerability.

Although the penalty is high, it won't revert to the Gambling Commission as £3.5 million (€3.8 million) will be refunded to the 7,000 who had barred themselves from gambling but were still allowed to carry on.

charity involved in helping the estimated two million British gamblers who may be addicted or be likely to face financial or social problems.

Gibraltar has benefited considerably from the influx of offshore betting companies who have decided to make their base on the Rock and does have legislation in place to police their activities, but with the bulk of gambling revenue coming from the UK it is left to the British regulator to take action.

There is something of a problem for the various betting companies as they need punters to lose as much as possible in order to boost their profits but have to be careful not to 'kill the goose that lays the golden egg.'

Public opinion means a great deal to these companies and if they are considered to be responsible for the break-up of families and leaving individuals bankrupt they will face a significant backlash as well as further fines from the Gambling Commission.

Although these are multi-million pound companies some have suggested they are still trying to develop policies which will identify and protect vulnerable customers but this is a slow process.

Spain is believed to have a huge interest in sports betting but is regulated by the Spanish Gambling Act which prohibits all forms of online betting and bingo, but due to an anomaly in the law, certain provinces can licence this.

Richest man for hours

ON average, once a year, Amancio Ortega, founder of the Inditex fashion chain is declared the richest man in the world but only for a few hours!

So much depends on the value of shares that the mega-rich own in their companies and the prevailing stock market prices, so for three hours he was estimated to be worth \$85 billion (€71.5 billion) but then his shares dropped.

Sadly at that time he then plummeted to become just the third richest man, behind the usual leader Bill Gates of Microsoft and Amazon boss Jeff Rezos

One thing is certain however and that is Mr Ortega is without question the richest man in Spain and Europe.

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

SOME years ago, a colleague of mine sought to foster a Muslim child.

One. The boy had to be free to pray five times a day.

Two. He had to have the facilities of a local Mosque on a Friday. Three. He could only be fed on Halal meat. And four despite my friend wanting to pay for an extremely well-established and expensive local private college, had to ultimately be taken to a Muslim learning facility some miles away.

Somewhat taken aback by this list of requirements my friend attempted to negotiate.

He had no problems with items one and two. However, although he would of course make sure the lad was never offered, or obliged to eat pork, preparing Halal food was far too disruptive to the family's way of life and routine.

As far as the Muslim school was concerned, it was miles away and would present insurmountable problems with school runs etc.

His appeals fell on deaf ears. Compromises were out of the question. In the end the boy had to move out (forgetting to take his Koran I may add!) and return to whatever institution he had emerged from.

Is that sad or what!? Not only is it sad, it is a positive disgrace when compared to the young white Western girl, who was moved in with a Muslim family, had her cross removed and was made to live with people with whose culture, faith and even language was alien to her.

KING FELIPE and the president of the Spanish government Mariano Rajoy got the bird at the pro-peace, antiterrorist march in Barcelona.

The placards and banners suggested that this was because Felipe cosied up to the Saudis - who doesn't? - and sweet-talked them into arms deals while Rajoy's government is responsible for Spain's arms sales.

Barcelona mayor Ada Colau and regional vice-president Oriol Junqueras said afterwards the recriminators were only exercising their right to freedom of speech. Maybe, but many spent so much time protesting about the Spanish they forgot why they there were there to begin with.

Border problem

ANGST and anger about the border

between northern and southern Ireland is a huge problem that the Brexiteers forgot to solve beforehand.

If the Catalan secessionists' wildest dreams come true and turn into their worst nightmare, they will face a similar situation.

Despite hard-done-by insistence to the contrary from the separatists, the region has never endured anything approaching Ireland's troubles. A hypothetical border issue would not stir up murderous centuries-old conflicts but the border problem would exist for an independent Cataluña.

As Brussels has repeatedly told the Catalan government, leaving Spain automatically means leaving the EU.

One more question for Carles Puigdemont and his vice-president Oriol Junqueras to ponder on and answer before October 1. Or. more importantly, on October 2.

Standing a head taller

THE Spanish population were never close to their monarchs and the

House of Borbon was largely unloved. This was especially true of Spain's Levante and Cataluña which suffered three centuries ago for backing the losers, the Hapsburgs, in the War of Succession.

Many, possibly most, Spaniards are basically republican at heart but softened when Juan Carlos opened the door to democracy after Franco died in 1975. Sentiments hardened after the King Emeritus broke his hip while elephant shooting with his mistress in 2012 in Zimbabwe. The economic crisis was then at its most brutal and it did not improve matters that Juan Carlos was there at the invitation of a Saudi businessman.

His son Felipe VI is regarded with respect and amiable neutrality, plus a general perception that he does his best. But it's easy to see why Catalan republicans dislike him and why the regional president, mop-headed Carles Puigdemont, avoids being photographed with him. Felipe is almost two.metres tall and standing beside him at the Barcelona peace marches, Puigdemont barely reached his ear.

Double objective

BY slaughtering tourists in Turkey and Egypt and compromising the industries that serve them, Daesh and its acolytes and successors achieved two goals.

Much of their tourism has been diverted to formerly secure Spain which, after the Barcelona and Cambrils attacks, now begins to look less safe.

But Spain is not Turkey or Egypt, both of which have politicians whose unspoken sympathies lie with jijad. Spain does not and, unhampered by ambivalence, it can do a more sincere job of protecting the population and tourists than Egypt or Turkey.

Hoteliers' most worrying problem right now is the puny, Brexitweakened pound sterling which is more likely to deter British tourists than jihadists.


Go for a middle row seat

FAN of priority boarding on a plane? Well you may want to rethink paying that bit extra to get on first if a study by Arizona State University is to be believed.

Their study concluded that priority boarding is bad for your health as it increases the likelihood of spreading diseases. They studied boarding scenarios to see how a disease would spread if one person was infected. With priority boarding the passenger is seated first towards the front of the plane meaning they are likely to come into contact with more people as other passengers go past them to find their seat, increasing their risk of coming into contact with an infected person.

They recommend using a twozone boarding process, which is used by some companies who still board planes via external stairs directly into the plane. This allows to seat half the plane from the front and half from the back, which would lower passenger contact by around 27 per cent.

But there are things you can do to protect yourself against infection on a plane:



AISLE SEAT: You come into contact with more people passing through the plane.

Avoid the aisle seats. They offer the opportunity to stretch out a little more but you come into contact with more people passing through the aisle.

Disinfect your seat. Whilst planes are cleaned between flights it is unlikely they are cleaned as extensively as we would like to think so having a small pack of disinfectant wipes in your hand luggage to wipe around the seat and tray will reduce

Avoid sitting at the back of the plane as this is where the bathrooms tend to be and people congregate there to wait in line putting you in contact with more germs.

Pop a pill. Try taking a multi-vitamin or vitamin C tablet or sachet for your drink to increase your immune system to help protect it against any possible infections ahead of the flight.

Are there ways of preventing catching the disease?

The disease is spread through the air, so being in an area with someone who has tuberculosis will significantly increase the risk of catching it as the air an infected person expulses spreads the disease. In order to avoid it a person should not expose themselves to that environment.

Is it a common disease in Spain?

For many years tuberculosis was almost eradicated in Spain, only affecting those with immunodeficiency such as HIV sufferers or people undergoing chemotherapy.

However the increase in immigration has caused cases of tuberculosis to appear more frequently.

UK women most likely to drink whilst pregnant

PREGNANT women in the UK are among the world's worst for drinking during pregnancy and harming their unborn

A study found that four times more children in the UK suffer alcohol-related birth defects than the global average and ranked seventh out of 195 countries worldwide for the proportion of children born with foetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD). This is a series of developmental problems caused by being exposed to alcohol in the womb, being linked to autism and growth difficulties.

The study was carried out by the Canadian Institute for Mental Health Policy Research with the lead author saying the issue should become a priority for public health to reinforce the dangers of drinking during pregnancy.

The study found that 32 in every 1,000 Britons have FASD compared to the global average of eight per 1,000. It also concluded that one in every 13 women who drink during pregnancy will have a child with FASD.

Previously, medical guidelines allowed one or two small glasses of wine once a week, but in 2016 the Department of Health changed the advice and recommended women abstain completely from drinking, however recent research revealed that 28.5 per cent of pregnant women in the UK drank alco-



Struggling mums stay silent

THERE is still a stigma surrounding postpartum or postnatal depression. As new mothers coo and adore

their newborn, those who are struggling remain silent as a new study reveals that one in five new mums suffering from depression keep their anxieties to themselves. Of these, around half of women claim to have at least one barrier that makes asking for help 'extremely difficult' or 'impossible,' including inadequate social support.

The study was carried out by the North Carolina State University and found that

many women who would benefit from treatment are not receiving it as they keep quiet about their feelings rather than admitting to suffering from symptoms.

As part of the study, researchers analysed over 200 women who had given birth in the last three years, asking if they had experienced symptoms of postpartum depression symptoms and, if so, whether they confided in a healthcare worker.

Meanwhile a separate

study has concluded that mothers with postnatal depression are more likely to have difficult children, as sufferers who are insensitive towards their children are more likely to have youngsters with difficult temperaments. The researchers said their findings highlighted the importance of supporting families after the birth of a new child to help both the mother and baby develop close, strong

It displays a selection of 58 drawings by the Irishborn British figurative painter, dating from 1977 to

Francis Bacon (October 28, 1909 - April 28, 1992) was known for his bold, grotesque, emotionally charged, raw imagery.

He was best-known for his depictions of popes, crucifixions and portraits of close friends. His abstracted figures are typically isolated in geometrical cage like spaces, set against flat, nondescript backgrounds. Bacon said that he saw images "in series" and his work typically focuses on a single subject for sustained periods, often in triptych or diptych formats.

The art critic Robert Hughes described him as

"the most implacable, lyric artist in late 20th-century England, perhaps in all the world" and along with Willem de Kooning as "the most important painter of the disquieting human figure in the 50's of the 20th century."

Since Bacon's death his reputation and market value have grown steadily and his work is among the most acclaimed, expensive and sought-after. In the late 1990s several major works, previously assumed destroyed, re-emerged to set record prices at auction. In 2013 his Three Studies of Lucian Freud set the world record as the most expensive piece of art sold at auction.








Come all without, come all within

You'll not see nothing like the mighty Quinn

(Manfred Mann/Bob Dylan)

IT was announced last month that former Ritz Hotel head chef and Ark Foundation founder Michael Quinn had died aged 71 after a long battle with ill health.

'The Mighty' Quinn came to promi-

nence in 1980 when. having already achieved a Michelin star as head chef at Gravetye Manor in Sussex, he was named the first British head chef to hold the top job at the Ritz hotel.

He was credited with turning the London landmark into one of the city's top dining destinations through innovative cuisine that was much copied.

It was an achievement that helped to win him an MBE, along with celebrity status, countless television and radio ap-

pearances, and invitations to cook for royalty and stars all over the world.

But his remarkable success made Ouinn's fall even more dramatic. No one. not least Quinn, would have dreamt that by 1990 he would be a homeless drunk, sleeping in doorways, parks and Salvation Army hostels.

He had lost contact with most of his family and friends, and at the age of 48 the chef who once had everything was being given the last rites by a priest as he lay dying in hospital with liver failure. Alcoholism had stripped him of fame, fortune, family and almost his life.


In 1990 he was told that he would lose

everything if he didn't stop drinking - and most of it came true. Alcohol took him from the pinnacle of the catering world into treatment centres, hospitals and then back into the pub. If he had gotten well

> when he had the chance, his sons would have known him as a top chef at the Ritz. But now they can't.

However in that year Michael took the first steps to sobriety and realised that there was little help for those suffering from alcohol related problems in hospitality, so he set up the Ark Foundation.

The organisation was established to educate the hospitality industry through awareness seminars on abuse

He spent the rest of his life not as the amazingly talented Chef that he was, but as an ambassador and lecturer for the Ark Foundation. Regretfully, especially among chefs, alcohol and drugs in our industry is a major problem - a lot to do with the stress and long inhospitable hours - and there was never any help or

The foundation did a great deal to help many hundreds of young people. Michael was lucky I suppose to have made it to 71 given the beating that his body endured in the early years.

Spain choosing fixed rate deals for mortgages

FIXED rate mortgages are in vogue. Caixabank has revealed that two out of every three of its new mortgages are now fixed

rate. It's a 45 per cent rise on the number of fixed rate mortgages granted last year. They now account for €2.2 billion worth of the bank's current

Caixa CEO Gonzalo Gortazar said the refined new product "offers greater security to families, shielding them from possible rate hikes and allowing better management of the household budget."

Fixed rate mortgages have been on the rise nationally since Spain emerged from the financial crisis. Last summer they accounted for roughly 30 per cent of new mortgages. If Caixa's findings are replicated across the board that proportion will have more than doubled in iust a vear.

It's an astronomical rise given that fixed rate products accounted for just 3 per cent of the total granted in 2009.

Fixed rate mortgages see the banks set an interest rate which is higher than the euribor, thus raising their profit margins in the short term. Families are guaranteed fixed fees and no surprises during the loan period.



Sales soar as demand rockets

SALES of second-hand homes have now reached the level seen just before the Spanish housing boom really took off in

Figures from the second quarter of 2017 show a total of 119,408 residential property transactions. Of them 99,343 were secondhand properties, comparable to the roughly 100,000 being sold from April to June 2007.

The sale of newly constructed homes is still well behind the heights of a decade ago. With just over 20,000 sales in three months, new homes remain slow sellers. In 2007 more than 110,000 sold in the second quarter.

Including both secondhand and new homes. sales shot up by 5 per cent in the second quar-

They are at their highest level since the first quarter of 2011 according to the Spanish Registrar's College.

The group's quarterly report said the results "show a strong market on the demand side" but notes that it is "linked to a single leg of the market, that of used homes."

Co-founder of the Idealista property portal, Fernando Encinar, said used homes are selling because that's essentially all there is on the market. He is critical of delays across Spain in giving permits to new developments, which is holding up the new home market.

Unless the green light is given to new developments, he warns, prices will rise dramatically as supply can't keep up with demand.

It's a proven sales technique

PROPERTIES on the market are more than a third likely to sell if the advert makes use of virtual reality

They will also sell much faster according to findings from a top property firm.

Club Noteges manages a portfolio of more than 50,000 Spanish homes. Among them are 43,000 that are only advertised using photos. From January to July less than 3,000 of those homes sold, roughly 6.6 per

By contrast they sold more than 10 per cent of the 10.600 homes that offer virtual reality tours to prospective buyers online. The more than 1,000 homes sold using virtual reality were gone within an average of 52 days faster than the homes using only photos.

The findings are categorical proof that sellers have more chance of selling if they employ virtual reality in their adverts.

The technology isn't overwhelmingly complicated or expensive. Using record video footage it allows buyers to 'step inside' the home

from the comfort of their living rooms or estate agents.

Virtual reality just looks better to many buyers too. It shows that the seller is serious and confident in their property. Whereas few people would consider a home on a mere description without photos, soon buyers will expect a three-dimensional tour as a given.

It is also especially welcomed by foreign buyers who have to be ex-

tremely selective in choosing which homes to visit in person. In some cases the quality of the virtual reality tours is such that a decision to buy is made without even physically seeing the property.

Community is first to take bank to court

TYPICAL property finances have been flipped on their head in Spain, where it is the banks who now owe householders money. During the crisis the banks embargoed and took over thousands of Spanish properties from owners struggling with debt.

By doing so they took on the responsibility of paying community charges for lighting, cleaning, and the general maintenances of countless urbanisations.

But they haven't bothered paying the bills. A new report from Spain's Council of Administrators (CGCAFE) estimates banks now owe more than €330m to housing communities across the country.

Banks own embargoed properties in a quarter of a million communities, owing each of them an average of €1,100. Salvador Diez, president of the CGCAFE, said payment of these debts could make a huge difference to millions of residential buildings with electricity, insurance or hygiene problems.

"If we talk about the whole country, the collection of these debts would have a very positive effect on the economy since communities of owners are an economic engine in their own right," he said.

The most dramatic example can be found in Madrid. A community of owners in Calle Toledo are owed €17.000 by Bankia in unpaid community expenses. Now they are set to become the first community in Spain to take the bank to court and demand payment of the fees.

Making your garden more useable

DURING August the population of our now expanded and internationalised rural hamlet and urbanisation has more than doubled and a dry September might well follow the hot drought driven June to August summer to date. As the temperatures and multinational populations rose one could hear the multilingual mutterings about the inadequacies of summer gardens.

'We live in what was a green rural active agricultural valley, but now it's like a suburban urban-

'Oh isn't it hot after the air conditioning. I've been indoors for three days without going out.'

'We don't sit out much in the summer it's boring. There is not much to see except the pool and its large terrace and the wooden decking is so hot to walk on. But some autumn colour should open up as temperatures fall.'

Fortunately any urban looking pool can be converted into a natural pool surrounded by oxygenating bog plants and some some exotic flowers. An interesting book 'Converting your conventional pool' can be obtained via www.ecodesignscape.co.uk.

'Oh I wish we hadn't cut down those trees and replaced them with Australian sails - the shade is not as natural or as deep as it used to be swinging in the hammock strung between two thick branches of the carob tree.'

'I spend all my time watering the plants but the garden is not as colourful as it was in northern Europe. Perhaps we should have used the Terra-Cottem soil improvement product, produced in

Belgium and now used by gardeners and agriculturalists in some 40 countries, when preparing a productive water retaining soil where flower, shrub beds and vegetable raised beds were intended and when making new plantings in later years.' Interestingly a new five kg box has just arrived from TerraVida the Spanish distributor.

I had to stop typing for a few minutes to take delivery and will shortly use a tablespoon in potting up some lemon flavoured basil plants for neighbours to give a new touch to their tomato salads or cooked dishes

'Oh! I can't stand another barbecued dinner.' But there is no need for summer boredom. During September I plan to make good use of the solar cooker, the Mexican terracotta cooker, an assortment of Moroccan terracotta tagines, the paella kitchen and cold salad dishes.

'Raking or sucking up fallen leaves and pine needles is an endless task. Must cut some more trees down this winter.' But there is a practical answer, design a natural low maintenance woodland garden. Luckily they survive and are interesting and relaxing to visit in the oldest part of our mountain valley hamlet.

To really enjoy Spain try developing a garden that is different than the general run of the mill.

Why you should branch out with an almond tree, or two

IF you want to add a little more variety to your garden, then you might want to consider planting an almond tree.

Although thought to have originated in China and the Middle East, these trees also flourish in a Mediterranean climate and have become a common feature in gardens across southern Eu-

These elegant trees can reach heights of between four and 10 metres

tall, and produce a pretty pink and white blossom in spring.

Almond trees thrive in hot, arid summers and wet. temperate winters and tend not to set fruit when planted in regions outside these parameters.

They are also averse to overly moist soil and frost in spring. The trees are deep rooted and require planting in well-draining sandy loam. They also have high nitrogen and phosphorus requirements so running organ-

ic fertilizer and nitrogen through the soil will encour-

Most varieties of almond tree can't self-pollinate so you will need to plant two if you want your trees to produce

fruit. If space is an issue, it is possible to plant two trees in the same hole and allow them to intertwine as they grow, enabling the flowers to cross-pollinate.

A little patience is required when tending to your almond tree as it typically takes around five years for them to start producing fruit, although this can be longer depending on the species. These trees can live for up to 40 years, however, so are definitely worth the investment.

Paper wasps

SPAIN is home to numerous species of wasp.

Though they have environmental benefits such as pollination and eating other pests, the general fear of their sting makes them unwelcome visitors to many

One of the most commonly found species in Spain are 'paper wasps.'

Often seen as a terrace, patio and poolside plague, these critters often make their homes in close proximity to people and their nests and colonies are generally small.

One of the most commonly found species in Spain.

Paper wasps are brown in colour with yellow stripes and are at their most active between July and August.

They will visit pools and areas where outdoor dining takes place in search of food and water.

Environmental experts advise that humans and paper wasps can live in coexistence and not to remove nests until they become a problem.

It is important not to anger them, if they appear in large numbers the best option is to exit that area as batting them away will only cause problems.

If they feel in danger they will sting and will release pheromones to call more wasps.

They also release a similar pheromone upon death so bashing one with a rolled up magazine is not advised.

If there are any dead in a swimming pool, do not flick them out as the sting is still effective after death and standing on one barefoot could prove painful.

Nests are best removed at night when the wasps are generally not very active but care is advised and anyone unsure should seek the help of a professional.

DEAR David.

It seems to me you are the perfect person to address this issue if you have not already.

We Brits tend to be natural animal lovers, dogs in particular. But do some animal rescue organisations take advantage of this?

There is a huge inconsistencv within the animal rescue community in my opinion. Some will ask for a donation of whatever you can afford and you will get a dog that is neutered, inoculated with all legal papers in place, including a full pet passport and microchip.

Others can place you in a position where you have to pay for a considerable part of this and stipulate what you are expected to pay as a donation to the charity.

I recently heard of the situation of some friends in La Marina on the Costa Blanca whereby they fostered a dog to help a charity out in an emergency and paid all the costs for feeding it.

They subsequently became very attached to it and decided to adopt. It was only then that they found themselves having to pay for injections, all documentation, a chip registration change and neutering at a considerable financial cost.

What do you think about this?

For my part, if someone decides to adopt a dog they should be sure to shop around and learn exactly what is in-



volved as there appears to be no obvious guidelines that ensure a standard and consistent approach in governing these charities, meaning they could end up paying more than expected.





ASTON MARTIN will invest heavily in Japan, the world's second largest luxury car market. Chief executive Andy Palmer is just back from a Tokyo trade mission accompanying British Prime Minister Theresa May.

The Warwickshire-based car firm snagged a £500 (€540) million trade deal that includes a luxury tech engineering office and brand centre in Tokyo.

Almost €100 million worth of Japan-

ese car components will be shipped to the UK from Mitsubishi, Yazaki and other local firms. Upwards of €400 million of Aston Martin's British built cars and engines will be exported to the far-east from 2019 onwards.

The Prime Minister celebrated the deal as a post-Brexit coup for Britain and called Aston Martin "a prime example of the innovative and world leading firms the UK is proud of."

Meanwhile Mr Palmer posted a picture of himself outside the British Embassy in Tokyo alongside an Aston Martin DB6 once owned by Sir Paul Mc-Cartney and a DB11 set to be delivered

Citroen Berlingo Multispace

MULTISPACE:

Sleek and smart.

THE car world is awash with trendy crossover and compact MPVs, some with more accent on image than practicality, but the Citroen Berlingo Multispace is a notable exception.

The Multispace is van-based and while the designers have made the frontal profile sleek and smart, the rear retains the boxy look of a van, and to many potential buyers this is actually a plus point. For while rival models lose load space due to lower roof lines, sloping tailgates and intruding wheel arches, the taller Multispace offers an amazing 3,000 litres of space, making it attractive to families and business users

Available in petrol, diesel and even electric form, and with five or seven seats, the Multispace is priced from €18.847 (£17,510) and ne of the most popular versions features the 1.6 litre diesel unit which offers good fuel economy and low emis-

My mid-range Flair had this engine, which offers 98 hp and has a reasonable 0-100 kph time of 12.4 seconds and top speed of 165 kph (103 mph). Fuel economy is very good at 23 kpl (65.7 mpg).

The five-seat version costs €21,210

(£19,705) and standard kit includes touchscreen, cruise control and speed limiter, fuel-saving stop-start, air-conditioning, cruise control, aircraft-style folding tables, radio, USB. Bluetooth and media streaming. handy sliding rear doors, alloy wheels, privacy glass, roof bars and plenty of cabin stowage space including a shelf above the

On the road, the Multispace drives well with low noise levels, slick five-speed gearshift, and light accurate steering. The driving position may be a little upright for some but you do get good all-round visibility, and ride quality is comfortable. Its van platform means it doesn't have quite the handling agility of a crossover but that

won't concern potential buyers in this

What will impress them is the amount of money they will save over a comparable crossover or compact MPV, and the amount of load capacity and versatility they will gain. Seating is very comfortable and there is excellent head and leg room for five occupants and a whopping 675 litres of boot space even with the rear seat in use. Folded, you get 3,000 litres.

The Berlingo Multispace is certainly not the best-looker in the sector but it is still attractively styled and offers a blend of true practicality, decent equipment levels and pleasant driving feel at a price that rivals find very hard to match.

Model tested is UK-specification and equipment levels and prices may vary in other markets.



Notts Outlaws won cricket's T20 Blast final, beating Birmingham Bears by 22 runs before 24,000 fans at Edgbaston. Over 1,000 runs were scored on 'finals day' as Notts clinched the 'white ball' double, having earlier in the year won the 50 overs title.

 Lewis Hamilton, starting on pole for a record 69th time, spoiled the Ferrari party by winning the Italian Grand Prix in Monza last Sunday. Mercedes team-mate Valtteri Bottas was second with Sebastian Vettel third. Daniel Ricciardo (4th) had the 'drive of the day,' moving up 12 places. Hamilton leads Vettel in the championship by three points with seven races left. It's Singapore next on September 17.
