Outcry at water use decisions

CONTROVERSY surrounds a government water decision.

Water that has been denied to Alicante and Murcia has been given to Castilla-La Mancha and Madrid, despite them having access to other reservoirs.


Water from the Tagus river is stored in the reservoirs of Entrepeñas and Buendia which are supposed to have been closed since May until further rainfall brings their levels up to a sufficient standard once again.

It has now been revealed that the water reserves have dropped by 115 cubic hectometres (hm3) as water that is desperately needed in Alicante and Murcia is being given to other cities with more natural resources at their disposal.

Farmland in Alicante and Murcia requires about 300hm3 per year but without water from the Tagus river, they have to rely heavily on the desalination plant of Torrevieja which only produces 30hm3 per year.

This is due to the fact that it only operates at approximately 40 per cent of its capacity due to being so expensive to run that it only functions at night when electricity is cheaper.

The Institute of Geography of the University of Alicante, suggested the government enable a connection to the Segura from the Tajo-Medio in the Sierra de Gredos, where the rainfall per year is roughly 2,500 litres per square meter per year and the flow is mineral, but it never went ahead.



A woman filmed fighting on a Ryanair flight from Newcastle to Alicante before brawling in baggage reclaim says she was defending herself.

with another woman in the airport, the pair rolling on the floor and pulling each other's hair.

Witness Rachel Burns, 35, said: "I saw her just go up to a lady who had been one of the people telling her to sit down. Then they were going at it on the floor."

Ryanair communications chief Robin Kiely said: "The crew of this flight from Newcastle to Alicante (August 31) requested police assistance upon arrival after a passenger became

Attempted kidnapping foiled

A MAN charged with the attempted kidnapping of a two-year-old girl in Torrevieja has been admitted to a hospital psychiatric unit.

It comes after the coroner in charge of the case ordered his release after a Local Police officer and a tour guide teamed up to stop him running away with the infant.

The shocking incident took place on La Cura beach, popular with British holidaymakers and expatriates, as the victim was walking with her grandmother

Witnesses described how a well-built man aged around 60 approached the pair before swiping the toddler and fleeing on foot.

Two women, one of who arranges trips from Benidorm to La Cura, were alerted by the older relative's screams and grappled with the man as he neared the local tourist office.

As one grabbed him from behind the other snatched the youngster from his arms.

He tried to run away but was pursued by the policeman who had also been

drawn by the shouts and pinned him to the floor.

After he was taken into custody by the Guardia Civil it emerged that the alleged abductor has a history of mental health issues.

He has been charged with attempted kidnapping, police said in a statement.

An ambulance was also called to attend to the grandmother who suffered a panic attack in the wake of the commotion, while the child was reportedly unharmed.

One dead in horror smash

AN alcohol and drugfuelled driver who killed a teenager has been imprisoned without bail while he awaits trial.

A 17-vear-old died at the scene while two others, aged 15 and 17, were hospitalised after the accused careered into them in Santa Pola.

AMONG Spain's oddest laws is one in Els Alamus, Catalonia, which rules that all prostitutes - plying the oldest profession in the world - must wear high visibility vests when seeking clients on roadsides, with fines of up to €40 for those not doing so.

Police stress the law is to protect the women from the danger they can pose to drivers.

Meanwhile in Cadiz it is illegal to throw rice at bridal couples, in part to safeguard wedding guests slipping, and also to prevent pigeons flocking outside

Then in Madrid it's illegal to ask what time it is

there from 3.29pm - 6.47pm according to a centuries old law that appears to have never been removed from the city statutes.

Also in the capital city it is illegal to walk more than eight dogs at once. Three years ago Mallorca, seeking to attract more discerning tourists to the island, introduced a law banning people from going shirtless in public. Those ignoring it can be fined up to €600.

A similar law also exists in Barcelona, and Marbella is now said to be considering introducing such a law, though it has not been proved whether such laws have led to classier tourists visiting.

A SPANISH man has been arrested after leaving his child home alone in Guardamar.

Leader of the pack

BRITAIN'S Chris Froome remains on course to be the first man to win both the Tour de France and Vuelta a España in a single season since 1978.

The 32-year-old Team Sky rider dominated the stage 16 time trial to leave him almost two minutes ahead of his nearest rival, the Italian Vincenzo Nibali.

He picked up his second stage victory of this year's race, with only one of his rivals. Dutch Team Sunweb rider Wilco Kelderman, within

30 seconds of the four-time Tour winner.

Following vesterdav's (Wednesday) stage 17, a 180.5kilometre run from Villadiego in Burgos to Los Machucos in Cantabria, there are just four stages remaining.

Today's stage 18 sees the peloton follow a semi-mountainous 169-kilometre route from Suances to Santo Toribio de Liebana as the race remains in Cantabria

ahead of Sunday's finish in Madrid.

In the wake of Froome's stage 16 time trial victory last Tuesday, Team Sky boss Dave Brailsford said: "The course suited him [Froome] but you still have to time it well and he showed again why he is considered to be one of the world's best time triallists today.

"But there are still some really hard stages com-

ing up, the climbs are so intense that there is no time to relax."



Bite back time

LIFEGUARDS and their back-up teams on beaches controlled by the municipality of Elche have helped more than 1,000 people with bites this summer.

An overall total of 1.300 people have been attended to after being bitten by mainly jellyfish and other fish; other bites have been carried out by various in-

Figures just released show an average of 17 incidents

per day throughout the summer which is on par with the number experienced in previous vears.

There have been a high number of children that have been bitten as they don't see the approaching dangers of jellyfish particularly as adults do, although the creatures themselves don't make any distinction as to who they attack... young or old.

Jellyfish numbers have

been down and Elche hasn't needed to raise the red flag for reasons of infestations: only on occasions when the surf was strong and danger-

Apart from bites, there have been 230 cases of minor accidents cuts and abrasions to the hands and feet and many of these have occurred off the beaches of El Altet or El Carabassí where some of the hidden rocks cause swimmers to fall.

The day the rains came

RECENT rainfall in Alicante has broken all previous records for August.

According to information released by the State Meteorological Agency (AEMET), Alicante-Elche Airport recorded 42.1 litres per square metre which beat the previous record of 32 litres in

During the 24-hour period of almost continuous rain, Alicante City registered their own record levels of 46 litres per m2 and further up the coast the beach at San Juan registered 53.6 litres per m2.

Climate experts at the University of Alicante have confirmed that these are the highest amounts of rainfall since records began in 1939.

The highest level recorded


along the Costa Blanca during the recent storms was in Javea that saw 70 litres per m2 fall in just one day.

Whilst the August 2017 levels of rainfall have been above normal, it hasn't quite beaten those of March when the strong Gota Fria conditions hit the area and left a series of devastation.

Professor Jorge Olcina from the University said: "We must not forget that 43 litres per m2 fell in August 2013, and that in 2002 36.8 litres per m2 of rainfall was recorded, so whilst this year's figures are significant they're not exceptional for the month. In fact, since 2000, August has been behaving more like an autumn month rather than summer."

Mystery sea death



SANTA POLA: Identity of woman victim sought.

A WOMAN has been found dead in the sea off the coast of Santa Pola.

Believed to be between 70 and 80-years old. the victim was found on the Levante beach and at the time of her discovery the green flag was flying. Initial reports suggest the woman had died of natural causes and had probably suffered from a heart attack while out swimming.

When the alarm was first raised, firefighters, Local Police and members of the Guardia Civil found the woman's body caught and trapped between rocks and so what at first looked like a rescue ended up as a recovery.

The local Cruz Roja tried for over 30 minutes to revive the patient after she had been transferred to the shore by using oxygen and defibrillators, but their attempts proved unsuccessful.

The deceased was transferred to the local funeral parlour and the Guardia Civil have taken over the case to identify the woman



Plastic poison

Bottle build up sparks fear



| BLOCKED: Bottles clog up the River Segura.

MANY thousands of plastic bottles have built up in the River Segura following the recent storms. The section of the river where it enters Rojales from Benijofar close to the main commercial area has suffered the most.

As well as the plastic, the river has dragged grass, canes and other weeds along the flow and caused blockages in some areas. Local environmental groups have been quick to point some of the blame at the Segura Hydrographic Confederation (CHS), saying that this has happened so many times in the past when it rains

and nothing has been done to prevent it occur-

Social media, especially Twitter, has been full of comments and images of the current state of the river and its own hashtag of #Ro jales became a trending topic for a short time.

Foam has also been detected along the River Segura in both Rojales and Orihuela which is believed to be caused by the amount of liquid detergent bottles caught up in the storm rather than from any contamination; a fact later confirmed by a series of tests.





Pressure group comments on Brexit

AS the third round of talks took place between British and European Union Brexit negotiators in Brussels, campaigning groups made their voices heard.

British in Europe, an umbrella body lobbying for citizen's rights includes Bremain in Spain which looks to try to protect British citizens living in Spain and as the name suggests is generally opposed to Brexit.

The coalition has assessed the joint UK/EU technical note on citizens' rights, which displays some agreement concerning recognition of professional qualifications and the right to set up businesses after Brexit.

It has come to the conclusion in both cases that this right will probably only be valid in the country of residence and not across the EU 27, thereby affecting cross-border workers.

Chair of British in Europe, Jane Golding, comments: "Both parties agreed that frontier workers should be covered by any agreement but we're concerned that this definition is too narrow to cover the myriad ways in which UK citizens work cross-border."

Sue Wilson, Chair of Bremain in Spain, comments: "Before the negotiations even started this week, both

sides were suggesting that the expectations for progress were low. We saw little to convince us otherwise.

"The EU has constantly stated that the burning issues of citizens' rights. Ireland's border and the exit bill must come first, and that talks on any future relationship cannot start until 'sufficient progress' has been made on these issues. However, the UK continues to want to focus on trade

"When I listened to David Davis and Michel Barnier speaking at the press conference on Thursday August

31, it was hard to believe they were discussing the same negotiations. While Davis insisted there had been 'concrete progress,' Barnier said there had been 'no decisive progress on the key issues'.'

She continues: "One of those key issues is citizens' rights. We have repeatedly been told we are number one priority. Yet, after the third set of negotiations, we are not much further

British in Europe is, however, pleased that the third round of negotiations saw pension aggregation confirmed and that discussions concerning mutual healthcare arrangements for pensioners and others in receipt of benefits will continue.

Sue Wilson says: "Despite some examples of progress, Bremain in Spain members remain concerned. Some have been reassured by the progress made but many are still wary and distrustful of anything the UK government is promising."

She concludes: "So, the third round of negotiations is over, 15 months have passed since the referendum, yet we have not travelled so far.'





The works will be financed entirely by the municipality and want to respond to the need of the locality as the current cemetery doesn't have enough space for the amount of people dying in the locality. The councillor responsible for cemeteries, Miguel Angel Gambín, said that the construction has become a "pri-

The extension will be carried out on land next to the current cemetery that is already owned by Cox. Each new plot will have four niches that can be acquired by a single family

"In other municipalities individual niches are sold which means families can find themselves laid to rest at different places across the cemetery. This new scheme allows for four niches per owner," explained the mayor of Cox, Paco Cámara.

Once the contracts for work have been formalised, the plan is that the work will begin during October.

EU fishing regulations formalised


THE Spanish Military of Agriculture and Fisheries has held a meeting with its regional counterparts in Almeria, Murcia and Andalucia to formally transfer the new national regulations that will regulate fishing in Mediterranean waters.

The new rules are part of a series of requirements set by the European Union (EU) but they have attracted criticism from the regional council in

They have pointed out that the limits imposed by the EU must be based on the individual region's production needs and the fact that efforts have already been made to achieve a sustainable level; something that, in their opinion, other autonomous communities have not yet done.

A follow up meeting will be held later this month to discuss how the new measures are progressing and to get feedback on the proposals.

The waiting gets longer



PATIENTS have to wait longer and longer for a specialist appointment or surgery in

According to a report drawn up by the CC OO Union, almost 15,000 people are now on a waiting list for a specialist appointment or surgery.

The majority of those waiting to go into the operating theatre total just short of 5,000with 1,135 of those waiting between three and six months. Some 360 patients have been waiting for over a year.

These figures show that far from improv-

ing, the numbers on the list in the centre of Alicante have worsened in recent years and are higher than when a series of cuts were made. For example, in September 2013, only 3,500 were awaiting surgery; 11,500 less

Patients with the greatest delays are those awaiting vascular surgery, neurosurgery, general surgery, ophthalmology and traumatology. Analysis of the figures show the average waiting time for the Alicante General is 135 days, compared to the national average in Spain of 115 days.

The data from the report also shows that there are 10,000 awaiting their first consultation with a specialist or a diagnostic test. Of these, more than 2,000 are waiting between three months and a year. The average waiting time to see a specialist has increased to 93 days in Ali-







New electric cars for Madrid

AN agreement between Spanish Service Company Ferrovial and Renault has been signed to launch a car sharing service in Madrid called Zity.

It will operate from October with a fleet of 500 Zoe electric cars and will initially service the area within the M-30 beltway.

The Zoe has a theoretical maximum coverage of 400 kilometres but is more likely to need recharging after 300 kilometres based on normal traffic conditions within the capital.

This will be the third electric car sharing scheme operating within Madrid as both Citroen and Mercedes with their electric Smart car are using the city to demonstrate their ability to run non-polluting vehicles.

With various countries promising to phase out 'gas guzzlers' in the future, this type of experiment could have important financial implications for manufacturers looking to win drivers over to their mod-

Phone House new home

Diesel loses out to petrol

EU BANS ENERGY GOBBLING VACUUM CLEANERS Making Europe greener

AN important new European law banning the sale of vacuum cleaners using more than 900 watts of power and emitting more than 80 decibels is now in ef-

Manufacturers and stores who still hold stock of these machines will be able to sell them until stocks are exhausted but may not produce or import additional machines into the European Union.

With the number of bazaars in Spain that import electrical goods from China, it may be the banned cleaners have a longer shelf life here than in other parts of the EU.

According to a consortium of environmental organisations, the European Environment Bureau, it is perfectly possible to produce a good quality vacuum cleaner without a large motor or making a loud noise.

Former UKIP MEP Roger Helmer told the BBC "By all means let's make pathetic under-powered vacuum cleaners for export to the EU.

"But we must retain the right to make and use sensible full-powered appliances in the UK. This shows why we

Car sales soar in August

ONE sign of an economy in recovery is the number of cars sold and August has seen 72,470 new Spanish registrations.

This is a 13 per cent increase over the same month last year and with 849,912 sold in the first eight months of 2017, there is an overall increase of 7 per cent.

Despite all of the negative publicity received by the Volkswagen Group over the diesel scandal, its Spanish subsidiary SEAT actually took 17 per cent of the entire new registrations with Volkswagen also performing well.

With so many tourists visiting the country, car hire companies have increased their purchases by more than 40 per cent when compared to last year.

MAJOR FINE FOR ONLINE BETTING COMPANY

Problem gamblers worry

A GIBRALTAR-based online gambling firm is being fined a record £7.8 million (€8.5 million) by the UK Gambling Commission.

The regulator insists that firms that take bets have an obligation to protect their more vulnerable clients from spending more than they can afford which 888 have allegedly not done.

The most obvious example of this was 7,000 customers who had voluntarily recorded they had a problem and should not be allowed to bet any longer, but were still allowed to take part in the company's bingo games.

Another problem area highlighted was inability of the company to spot problem gamblers and in one case a customer lost £100,000 (€108,000) a month for 13 months before they recognised his vulnerability.

Although the penalty is high, it won't revert to the Gambling Commission as £3.5 million (€3.8 million) will be refunded to the 7,000 who had barred themselves from gambling but were still allowed to carry on.

The balance will be passed to a

charity involved in helping the estimated two million British gamblers who may be addicted or be likely to face financial or social problems.

Gibraltar has benefited considerably from the influx of offshore betting companies who have decided to make their base on the Rock and does have legislation in place to police their activities, but with the bulk of gambling revenue coming from the UK it is left to the British regulator to take action.

There is something of a problem for the various betting companies as they need punters to lose as much as possible in order to boost their profits but have to be careful not to 'kill the goose that lays the golden egg.'

Public opinion means a great deal to these companies and if they are considered to be responsible for the break-up of families and leaving individuals bankrupt they will face a significant backlash as well as further fines from the Gambling Commission.

Although these are multi-million pound companies some have suggested they are still trying to develop policies which will identify and protect vulnerable customers but this is a slow process.

Spain is believed to have a huge interest in sports betting but is regulated by the Spanish Gambling Act which prohibits all forms of online betting and bingo, but due to an anomaly in the law, certain provinces can licence this.

Richest man for hours

ON average, once a year, Amancio Ortega, founder of the Inditex fashion chain is declared the richest man in the world but only for a few hours!

So much depends on the value of shares that the mega-rich own in their companies and the prevailing stock market prices, so for three hours he was estimated to be worth \$85 billion (€71.5 billion) but then his shares dropped.

Sadly at that time he then plummeted to become just the third richest man, behind the usual leader Bill Gates of Microsoft and Amazon boss Jeff Rezos

One thing is certain however and that is Mr Ortega is without question the richest man in Spain and Europe.

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

My friend then set about completing the formalities that were required to foster the child on a more permanent basis. And that's where the problems began. Before any negotiations could begin, there were a few unshakable ground rules.

One. The boy had to be free to pray five times a day.

Two. He had to have the facilities of a local Mosque on a Friday. Three. He could only be fed on Halal meat. And four despite my friend wanting to pay for an extremely well-established and expensive local private college, had to ultimately be taken to a Muslim learning facility some miles away.

Somewhat taken aback by this list of requirements my friend attempted to negotiate.

He had no problems with items one and two. However, although he would of course make sure the lad was never offered, or obliged to eat pork, preparing Halal food was far too disruptive to the family's way of life and routine.

As far as the Muslim school was concerned, it was miles away and would present insurmountable problems with school runs etc.

His appeals fell on deaf ears. Compromises were out of the question. In the end the boy had to move out (forgetting to take his Koran I may add!) and return to whatever institution he had emerged from.

Is that sad or what!? Not only is it sad, it is a positive disgrace when compared to the young white Western girl, who was moved in with a Muslim family, had her cross removed and was made to live with people with whose culture, faith and even language was alien to her.

KING FELIPE and the president of the Spanish government Mariano Rajoy got the bird at the pro-peace, antiterrorist march in Barcelona.

The placards and banners suggested that this was because Felipe cosied up to the Saudis - who doesn't? - and sweet-talked them into arms deals while Rajoy's government is responsible for Spain's arms sales.

Barcelona mayor Ada Colau and regional vice-president Oriol Junqueras said afterwards the recriminators were only exercising their right to freedom of speech. Maybe, but many spent so much time protesting about the Spanish they forgot why they there were there to begin with.

Border problem

ANGST and anger about the border

between northern and southern Ireland is a huge problem that the Brexiteers forgot to solve beforehand.

If the Catalan secessionists' wildest dreams come true and turn into their worst nightmare, they will face a similar situation.

Despite hard-done-by insistence to the contrary from the separatists, the region has never endured anything approaching Ireland's troubles. A hypothetical border issue would not stir up murderous centuries-old conflicts but the border problem would exist for an independent Cataluña.

As Brussels has repeatedly told the Catalan government, leaving Spain automatically means leaving the EU.

One more question for Carles Puigdemont and his vice-president Oriol Junqueras to ponder on and answer before October 1. Or. more importantly, on October 2.

Standing a head taller

THE Spanish population were never close to their monarchs and the

House of Borbon was largely unloved. This was especially true of Spain's Levante and Cataluña which suffered three centuries ago for backing the losers, the Hapsburgs, in the War of Succession.

Many, possibly most, Spaniards are basically republican at heart but softened when Juan Carlos opened the door to democracy after Franco died in 1975. Sentiments hardened after the King Emeritus broke his hip while elephant shooting with his mistress in 2012 in Zimbabwe. The economic crisis was then at its most brutal and it did not improve matters that Juan Carlos was there at the invitation of a Saudi businessman.

His son Felipe VI is regarded with respect and amiable neutrality, plus a general perception that he does his best. But it's easy to see why Catalan republicans dislike him and why the regional president, mop-headed Carles Puigdemont, avoids being photographed with him. Felipe is almost two.metres tall and standing beside him at the Barcelona peace marches, Puigdemont barely reached his ear.

Double objective

BY slaughtering tourists in Turkey and Egypt and compromising the industries that serve them, Daesh and its acolytes and successors achieved two goals.

Much of their tourism has been diverted to formerly secure Spain which, after the Barcelona and Cambrils attacks, now begins to look less safe.

But Spain is not Turkey or Egypt, both of which have politicians whose unspoken sympathies lie with jijad. Spain does not and, unhampered by ambivalence, it can do a more sincere job of protecting the population and tourists than Egypt or Turkey.

Hoteliers' most worrying problem right now is the puny, Brexitweakened pound sterling which is more likely to deter British tourists than jihadists.



Cool welcome despite the sun

DO the airport workers along with the taxi men who are threatening strike action really care about Spain's tourists?

While I enjoy visiting Spain on a frequent basis, I am not so in love with the place that I am not tempted to think of seeking a new destination where I will be welcomed properly, not by industrial action that can ruin visits.

BEING comfortable when driving is essential

to staying safe on the roads, as when we feel uncomfortable the situation can lead to distractions. If we start to feel too warm or overheated, this can lead to lethargy which can also be potentially deadly when driving.

SUMMER HEAT: Tempers

can become easily frayed.

In order to stay cool try and keep the car as cool as possible. If you have a garage or shaded area for your vehicle use it, or try and park under a tree or shadow of the building, remembering the sun moves round throughout the day so make the most of where the shadow will be. However, be aware that parking under trees can result in deposits from birds or even the sap of the tree itself so ensure windscreens are clean before driving off.

Use reflective screens on your windows when the vehicle is parked to help reduce the build up of heat. It is quite common for the interior of a car to reach 10 degrees more than outside quite quickly, so remember this and never leave animals or humans inside vehicles.

Many modern vehicles are equipped with air conditioning which can help keep the vehicle at a more comfortable level, but remember to get it checked and gassed to ensure optimum performance.

It is also advisable to try and avoid driving at the hottest time of the day when possible. Driving at sunrise and sunset can also pose a problem largely because of the position of the sun which can cause extreme glare and dazzle leaving drivers temporarily blinded by the sun.

Remember summer can also bring extra vehicles on the road and when temperatures rise. so can tempers. Always try and remain calm and alert as tempers can become easily frayed with increased incidents of road rage.

Can one owner enlarge his door?

If an owner wishes to enlarge the French doors, such action would alter the facade of the block. Does he need the agreement of the adjacent owners? Does he need permission from the Community? Does it

need a unanimous vote or 60 per cent of all owners present or represented? If the work was done without the agreement of the owners, what action can be taken against the owner?

PS (By email)

Properly, an owner who wishes to enclose his terrace or enlarge his glass doors must seek the permission of the Community. This permission requires a 60 per cent vote of owners present or represented in favour. Until 2013, this required a **David Searl** You and the Law in Spain

unanimous vote. Properly, the owner should also have a building permit from the town hall. Permission from the neighbours is not necessary. If the owner carries out the work without permission, the Community can obtain a court order to restore the original condition of the door or terrace.

They should also seek court costs against the offending owner.







Hearing aids can be of great benefit for sensorineural hearing loss

SENSORINEURAL hearing loss occurs when a breakdown in the hair cells in the inner ear results in them being unable to convert sound waves into the nerve impulses that are recognised by the brain as sounds.

High-frequency hair cells (carrying the information of speech) are more susceptible to damage than the low-frequency hair cells (background noise, deep sounds) and usually go first meaning that the majority of hearing losses detected tend to be sensorineural.

This type of hearing loss cannot be remedied surgically or medically and this is where hearing aids come into their own and can be of great benefit.

Generally, someone suffering from a sensorineural hearing loss can hear in a quiet room one-to-one, face-to-face, but tends to struggle in background noise as the low-frequency background noise is heard perfectly well and tends to overwhelm the speech, which is heard poorly. Sufferers can tend to shout because they of-

An increase in volume will not necessarily improve clarity, because all sounds including the ones heard well are increased at an equal rate. The sensorineural hearing loss sufferer requires more amplification in the high frequencies than in the low in order to maintain clarity.

Inner ear hair cell damage can be caused by noise - prolonged exposure to damaging levels of noise at work (machinery, engines, etc) or leisure (nightclubs, rock bands, shooting, etc), or short exposure to very high-intensity levels (explosions, etc).

It can also be caused by the side-effect of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, chemicals, pollutants, or by viral infections (mumps, measles and shingles amongst others), Menière's disease,

circulatory disorders, strokes, tumours, heredity, or just plain wear-and-tear.

The sensorineural hearing loss sufferer is often accused of having selective hearing because in some circumstances (absence of background noise) and at some frequencies (low/deep sounds) they can hear as well as if not better than many others.

Sensorineural hearing loss is the curse of a noisy world; inner ear hair cells do not regenerate in humans: once it's gone, it's gone.



A study found that four times more children in the UK suffer alcohol-related birth defects than the global average and ranked seventh out of 195 countries worldwide for the proportion of children born with foetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD). This is a series of developmental problems caused by being exposed to alcohol in the womb, being linked to autism and growth difficulties.

The study was carried out by the Canadian Institute for Mental Health Policy Research with the lead author saying the issue should become a priority for public health to reinforce the dangers of drinking during pregnancy.

The study found that 32 in every 1,000 Britons have FASD compared to the global average of eight per 1,000. It also concluded that one in every 13 women who drink during pregnancy will have a child with FASD.

Previously, medical guidelines allowed one or two small glasses of wine once a week, but in 2016 the Department of Health changed the advice and recommended women abstain completely from drinking, however recent research revealed that 28.5 per cent of pregnant women in the UK drank alco-

AS everyone is back to school this month, I wanted to focus on the important issue of children's eye health. If visual problems aren't identified early it can affect the child's development, how well they do at school and how they experience the world around them, so it's an important issue.

■ WHEN should I start taking my child to the opticians?

We believe that children should have their first eye examination at around three years old but if you are concerned, don't wait until then

The earlier any vision

problems are discovered, the better the chance of correcting them.

How can the optometrist examine my toddler's eyes when she can't read?

Opticians can assess which kind of lenses, if any, are needed without your child having to read by:

- Measuring the focusing ability by looking into each eye using an instrument called a retinoscope
- Using shapes, picture books and other materials to help children indicate what they can see and how clearly
- Checking whether the eyes work properly together
- Using special charts for young children who don't know their alphabet
- Checking health of the eyes using an instrument called an ophthalmoscope.

Are there any signs I can look for to suggest there is a problem with my child's eyesight?

There are a few signs which could indicate a vision problem in children including: sitting too close to the TV, rubbing their eyes repeatedly, complaining of headaches, being clumsy or squinting.

■ What is the relation between eye sight and performing well at school?

Experts believe that many learning disabilities could be vision related as they may not be able to read the blackboard or text books, so it's vital to identify problems early.

Tuberculosis

WHAT is tuberculosis?

Tuberculosis is an infectious and contagious disease which tends to affect the lungs but can also spread to other areas.

What are its symptoms?

The symptoms can vary but when it affects the lungs a person can cough blood, have a high fever, pains in a person's side and diarrhoea

How can you treat it?

Tuberculosis can be cured in most cases by going on a course of antibiotics. It is a long treatment process that can take months involving three or four different drugs.

What causes tuberculosis?

Tuberculosis is caused by a bacterium called Mycobacterium tuberculosis that tends to affect those with

weaker immune systems and sometimes the elderly.

Are there ways of preventing catching the disease?

The disease is spread through the air, so being in an area with someone who has tuberculosis will significantly increase the risk of catching it as the air an infected person expulses spreads the disease. In order to avoid it a person should not expose themselves to that environment.

Is it a common disease in Spain?

For many years tuberculosis was almost eradicated in Spain, only affecting those with immunodeficiency such as HIV sufferers or people undergoing chemotherapy.

However the increase in immigration has caused cases of tuberculosis to appear more frequently.

Go for a middle row seat

FAN of priority boarding on a plane? Well you may want to rethink paying that bit extra to get on first if a study by Arizona State University is to be be-

Their study concluded that priority boarding is bad for your health as it increases the likelihood of spreading diseases. They studied boarding scenarios to see how a disease would spread if one person was infected. With priority boarding the passenger is seated first towards the front of the plane meaning they are likely to come into contact with more people as other passengers go past them to find their seat, increasing their risk of coming into contact with an infected person.

They recommend using a twozone boarding process, which is used by some companies who still board planes via external stairs directly into the plane.

This allows to seat half the plane from the front and half from the back, which would lower passenger contact by around

But there are things you can do to protect yourself against infection on a plane:

Avoid the aisle seats. They offer the opportunity to stretch out a little more but you come into contact with more people passing through the aisle.

Disinfect your seat. Whilst

planes are cleaned between flights it is unlikely they are cleaned as extensively as we would like to think so having a small pack of disinfectant wipes in your hand luggage to wipe around the seat and tray will reduce the risk.

Avoid sitting at the back of the plane as this is where the bathrooms tend to be and people congregate there to wait in line putting you in contact with more

Pop a pill. Try taking a multivitamin or vitamin C tablet or sachet for your drink to increase your immune system to help protect it against any possible infections ahead of the flight.

Struggling mums stay silent

THERE is still a stigma surrounding postpartum or postnatal depression. As new mothers coo and adore their newborn, those who are struggling remain silent as a new

study reveals that one in five new mums suffering from depression keep their anxieties to themselves. Of these, around half of women claim to have at least one barrier that makes

asking for help 'extremely difficult' or 'impossible,' including inadequate social support.

The study was carried out by the North Carolina State University and found that many women who would benefit from treatment are not receiving it as they keep quiet about their feelings rather than admitting to suffering from symptoms.

As part of the study, researchers analysed over 200 women who had given birth in the last three years, asking if they had experienced symptoms of postpartum depression

symptoms and, if so, whether they confided in a healthcare


Meanwhile a separate study has concluded that mothers with postnatal depression are more likely to have difficult children, as sufferers who are insensitive towards their children are more likely to have youngsters with difficult temperaments. The researchers said their findings highlighted the importance of supporting families after the birth of a new child to help both the mother and baby develop close, strong bonds.

Come all without, come all within

You'll not see nothing like the mighty Quinn

(Manfred Mann/Bob Dylan)

IT was announced last month that former Ritz Hotel head chef and Ark Foundation founder Michael Quinn had died aged 71 after a long battle with ill health.

'The Mighty' Quinn came to promi-

nence in 1980 when. having already achieved a Michelin star as head chef at Gravetye Manor in Sussex, he was named the first British head chef to hold the top job at the Ritz hotel.

He was credited with turning the London landmark into one of the city's top dining destinations through innovative cuisine that was much copied.

It was an achievement that helped to win him an MBE, along with celebrity status, countless television and radio ap-

pearances, and invitations to cook for royalty and stars all over the world.

But his remarkable success made Ouinn's fall even more dramatic. No one. not least Quinn, would have dreamt that by 1990 he would be a homeless drunk, sleeping in doorways, parks and Salvation Army hostels.

He had lost contact with most of his family and friends, and at the age of 48 the chef who once had everything was being given the last rites by a priest as he lay dying in hospital with liver failure. Alcoholism had stripped him of fame, fortune, family and almost his life.


In 1990 he was told that he would lose

everything if he didn't stop drinking - and most of it came true. Alcohol took him from the pinnacle of the catering world into treatment centres, hospitals and then back into the pub. If he had gotten well

> when he had the chance, his sons would have known him as a top chef at the Ritz. But now they can't.

However in that year Michael took the first steps to sobriety and realised that there was little help for those suffering from alcohol related problems in hospitality, so he set up the Ark Foundation.

The organisation was established to educate the hospitality through awareness seminars on alcohol and drug abuse

He spent the rest of his life not as the amazingly talented Chef that he was, but as an ambassador and lecturer for the Ark Foundation. Regretfully, especially among chefs, alcohol and drugs in our industry is a major problem - a lot to do with the stress and long inhospitable hours - and there was never any help or

The foundation did a great deal to help many hundreds of young people. Michael was lucky I suppose to have made it to 71 given the beating that his body endured in the early years.

Making your garden more useable

By Dick Handscombe, now enjoying his 30th summer gardening and residing in his once rural hideaway



DURING August the population of our now expanded and internationalised rural hamlet and urbanisation has more than doubled and a dry September might well follow the hot drought driven June to August summer to date. As the temperatures and multinational populations rose one could hear the multilingual mutterings about the inadequacies of summer gar-

'We live in what was a green rural active agricultural valley, but now it's like a suburban urbanisation.

'Oh isn't it hot after the air conditioning. I've been indoors for three days without going out.'

'We don't sit out much in the summer it's boring. There is not much to see except the pool and its large terrace and the wooden decking is so hot to walk on. But some autumn colour should open up as temperatures fall.'

Fortunately any urban looking pool can be converted into a natural pool surrounded by oxygenating bog plants and some some exotic flowers. An interesting book 'Converting your conventional pool' can be obtained via www.ecodesignscape.co.uk.

'Oh I wish we hadn't cut down those trees and replaced them with Australian sails - the shade is not as natural or as deep as it used to be swinging in the hammock strung between two thick branches of the carob tree.

'I spend all my time watering the plants but

the garden is not as colourful as it was in northern Europe. Perhaps we should have used the TerraCottem soil improvement product, produced in Belgium and now used by gardeners and agriculturalists in some 40 countries, when preparing a productive water retaining soil where flower, shrub beds and vegetable raised beds were intended and when making new plantings in later years.' Interestingly a new five kg box has just arrived from TerraVida the Spanish distributor.

I had to stop typing for a few minutes to take delivery and will shortly use a tablespoon in potting up some lemon flavoured basil plants for neighbours to give a new touch to their tomato salads or cooked dishes.

'Oh! I can't stand another barbecued dinner.' But there is no need for summer boredom. During September I plan to make good use of the solar cooker, the Mexican terracotta cooker, an assortment of Moroccan terracotta tagines, the paella kitchen and cold salad dishes.

'Raking or sucking up fallen leaves and pine needles is an endless task. Must cut some more trees down this winter.'

But there is a practical answer, design a natural low maintenance wood-land garden. Luckily they survive and are interesting and relaxing to visit in the oldest part of our mountain valley

To really enjoy Spain try developing a garden that is different than the general run of the mill seen through windows between air-conditioned sitcom and sporting events.

Aim for one that draws you out into it at various times of the day throughout the year.

It seems to me you are the perfect person to address this issue if you have not already.

We Brits tend to be natural animal lovers, dogs in particular. But do some animal rescue organisations take advantage of this?

There is a huge inconsistency within the animal rescue community in my opinion.

Some will ask for a donation of whatever you can afford and you will get a dog that is neutered, inoculated with all legal papers in place, including a full pet passport and microchip.

Not all shelters are equal

Others can place you in a position where you have to pay for a considerable part of this and stipulate what you are expected to pay as a donation to the charity.

I recently heard of the situation of some friends in La Marina on the Costa Blanca whereby they fostered a dog to help a charity out in an emergency and paid all the costs for feeding it.

They subsequently became very attached to it and decided to adopt. It was only then that they found themselves having to pay for injections, all documentation. a chip registration change and neutering at a considerable finan-

What do you think about this?

For my part, if someone decides to adopt a dog they should be sure to shop around and learn exactly what is involved as there appears to be no obvious guidelines that ensure a standard and consistent approach in governing these charities, meaning they could end up



paying more than expected.

They have to pay rent and certainly various types of food, cleaning materials and of course veterinary assistance.

Animal shelters need money. when we all enjoy holiday and festive fare at Christmas the dogs and cats still need to be fed and cleaned.

For example, Triple A here on the Costa del Sol urgently needs new members to sign up and pay €5 per month and unless they receive help they may have to close, what will they do with the 500 dogs at the shelter?

The secret life of cats



A STUDY recently published in science iournal PLOS One has given a new insight into the temperaments of cats. The results reveal our feline friends have five main personality traits - Neuroticism, Dominance, Impulsiveness, Agreeableness, and Extraversion. Determining how high a cat scores on each account could help owners to better understand and improve their cat's environment to help reduce stress.

A cat who scores high on Extraversion, for example, would benefit from extra playtime and new toys on a regular basis. whereas a cat who scores high on Neuroticism will be more shy and might benefit from having more quiet spots of his own. The research also revealed cats are more social than most owners recognise. They actually shape their behaviour around their humans or other cats in the area.

Better understanding a cat's personality could also help match him to the right owner when they are looking to adopt. For example, a more extroverted cat might not match well with someone who doesn't intend to play with it on a frequent basis. It is hoped that these personality assessments might help reduce the number of cats who end up back on the streets or passing through multiple homes in their lifetime.

Interact with your pets

HAVE you ever wondered about how much your cat sleeps a day? Or wished there was a way to make sure you dog has access to treats when vou're not at home?

The company Pawbo has come up with two inventive new devices which could change the way owners interact with their pets.

The first is an activity tracker which can monitor sleep pattern, exercise levels and mood. Animal lovers just have to clip the discreet device onto their pet's collar and link it to their phone via Bluetooth.

The accompanying smart phone app will calculate the statistics and show any changes that take place. It can even help to spot the early signs of illness so owners will know when Boris needs a trip

As similar products are already on the market for humans, owners will now be able to get in sync with their animals in ways they never imagined.

The second product is a

smart treat-dispensing system that can be operated either via a remote control or through an app that connects with an interactive camera. It allows owners to select the shape and size of the treat and also comes with a 'slot machine'

style game which rewards animals when symbols are matched.

This new gadget is perfect for pet owners who want to make sure their pets are kept happy while they're not home.

Citroen Berlingo Multispace

THE car world is awash with trendy crossover and compact MPVs, some with more accent on image than practicality, but the Citroen Berlingo Multispace is a notable exception.

The Multispace is van-based and while the designers have made the frontal profile sleek and smart, the rear retains the boxy look of a van, and to many potential buyers this is actually a plus point. For while rival models lose load space due to lower roof lines. sloping tailgates and intruding wheel arches, the taller Multispace offers an amazing 3,000 litres of space, making it attractive to families and business

Available in petrol, diesel and even electric form, and with five or seven seats, the Multispace is priced from €18,847 (£17,510) and ne of the most popular versions features the 1.6 litre diesel unit which offers good fuel economy and low emissions.

My mid-range Flair had this engine, which offers 98 hp and has a reasonable 0-100 kph time of 12.4 seconds and top speed of 165 kph (103 mph).

This Continental GT can reach 100kph from a standstill in 3.6 seconds and will cost around €200,000 when it hits the market next year.

It debuts at the Frankfurt Motor Show this month and is Bentley's biggest play for the modern, tech-focused luxury car market yet.

The first generation, released in 2003, put the British brand back in the driving seat, reinventing the wheel to become a sleeker, cooler version of the oldfashioned Bentley.
