## Security footage leads police to gang Caught on camera

Three men have been held and two women are being investigated in connection with a spate of robberies in El Vergel Falls, Teulada and Benissa.

After a lengthy probe, Guardia Civil officers tracked down the group whilst they were in the process of stealing a car from a mechanics workshop in Teulada.

They are believed to have smashed windows to get inside before stealing tools and hot-wiring the vehicle.

Their escape was prevented due to the car not having suffi-

cient fuel, while security footage captured the entire event, leading to a series of police raids.

Several bicycles were recovered at one property and further

investigations led police to an address in Benissa which, when searched, was found to have more stolen objects inside which resulted in the arrest of a Lithuanian man.

## Police on lookout for thieves

THE Guardia Civil called on growers and cooperatives to report suspicious vehicles or persons loitering near vineyards.

This was especially important in the L'Alacanti and Medio Vinalopo areas where more than 150 officers are keeping watch as this year's dessert grapes are brought in.

"Basic information orientates us and details are important," said Francisco Rodriguez, Head of Operations at the Alicante Province headquarters.

The Guardia Civil has prepared a list of security measures that growers should take, which includes changing their work rou-

tines at least once a week as grapes are picked.

Jose Miguel Saval, the national government's subdelegate in Alicante Province, also stressed the need for growers to report all thefts "even if it's only

## Hidden store revealed

THE area known as the Cova de les Bruixes in the Poble Nou of Benitachell continues to reveal secrets about its magical past as new archaeological sites are discovered.

The latest discovery is thought to be at least 2,000 years old and is a silo which was used by ancient Andalusian farmers to store wheat, barley or other grain in dry and warm surroundings following the harvest.

If the grain was to be used quickly then it was stored in sacks or ceramic jars but for long term use especially through the winter, the silo was ideal and would be covered with straw and olive branches in order to keep the contents protected.

As well as early Iberian and Andalusian remains, researchers have also found examples of Roman ceramics and imported amphora from Italy.

FIREMEN using a 30-metre ladder platform removed fig trees sprouting from the top of the 18th century parish church in Alfafara. The saplings had begun to grow spontaneously on the belfry and tower but their roots had begun to loosen the stonework and the firefighters needed to stabilise both structures before returning to the ground.

She is the first non-noble person to be crowned Queen of Spain.

Letizia is known for her fashion sense and is often praised by fashion bloggers for her flawless outfit choices. She is a loyal Hugo Boss fan but also steps out in high street brands while on official duty.

Among her many duties as Royal Consort to the King, Letizia focuses her attention on many charitable causes and is particularly passionate about campaigning for children's rights, culture and education.

### Women of means

- Isabella I (1451-1504) was the Queen of Castille and responsible for the political unification of Spain following her marriage to Ferdinand II of Aragon. She lowered the country's crime rate and unburdened the kingdom of the debt her brother had left behind.

- Mary I (1516-1558) was the daughter of King Henry VIII's Spanish wife, Catherine of Aragon. As well as reigning as Queen of England and Ireland, she was the Queen consort of Spain following her marriage to King Phillip.

- Isabella II (1830-1904) was crowned Queen at just three years old, but her succession was disputed by those who refused to recognise a female sovereign and led to the Carlist wars. She was eventually deposed in the 1868 Glorious Revolution.

- Queen Sofia (1938-), Letizia's predecessor still takes an active role in royal duties and remains dedicated to her passions such as art, sport and charity work. She is the executive president of the Reina Sofia Foundation which raises money to fund international projects in education, healthcare, environment and women's rights.

# Roundabout route for cocaine stash

MORE than 200 kilos of cocaine were found inside a containerload of almonds delivered to a well-known Altea processing plant.

On opening the container, workers saw backpacks thrown close to the doors amongst the almonds and immediately contacted the Guardia Civil.

Officers from the Altea post removed the eight backpacks which contained 226.5 kilos of a 'suspicious substance' that proved to be cocaine.

The shipment had come from Oakland (California) but according to the Guardia Civil the cocaine would have

travelled only part of the route between Oakland and Altea.

The container's original security seal had been cut and its serial number had changed, although this is usual if there is a customs inspection during a stopover. It was likely that the drugs they were thrown into the back of the container with the connivance of a worker at port of call on its journey to Altea, the Guardia Civil sources said.

The cocaine was transferred to the Generalitat's Health department where it has now been destroyed.

## Police officer killed

A POLICE OFFICER who stopped a suspect in the streets of Sueca has been knifed to death and his assailant was shot by another officer last Tuesday.

The investigation started when an officer spotted a suitcase in the street very early that morning and when he opened the case he discovered the torso of an unidentified dismembered man riddled with stab wounds.

As officers searched for clues concerning this murder, one pair had suspicions about an individual who they spotted in the streets and when they went to talk to him, he drew a knife and stabbed the 51-year-old officer, piercing his heart.

The officer's partner immediately drew his gun and fatally shot the killer then called the emergency services but they were unable to resuscitate the officer who was declared dead at the scene of the attack.

Representatives of the regional and national government have attended to pass on their respects and messages of sympathy for the officer and his family have been posted on social media by the National Police and Guardia Civil.

# Ecological waste disposal

A BLACK kite has been spotted at Alcoy's vulture colony, breaking its journey south.

A carrion-eater like the vultures whose Sierra Mariola habitat it visited, the sighting is significant, ornithologists said, as black kites neither inhabit nor nest in the Valencian Community.

The Canyet project, which protects the vulture colony, recently held an open day for all those in-

terested in learning more about the reintroduction of vultures in the l'Alcoia and El Comtat areas.

Alcoy City Hall supplies the vultures' food while the local branch of the Wild Animal Protection Fund (FAPAS) deals with the educational, scientific and technical aspects of the programme. Finally, the Generalitat's Environment department is responsible for the upkeep of the area.

Alcoy's Environment councillor Jordi Martinez

emphasised that despite problems earlier this year when FAPAS could no longer feed the vultures, the joint project was progressing satisfactorily.

"At no time was the vultures' presence compromised," Martinez said.

The councillor also pointed out that the vultures disposed of 6,000 ki-

los of offal and meat leftovers between June and August, avoiding the release of three tons of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere.





## Rooney girl hits Spain



Transport regulations do allow a certain degree of flexibility but there is a clear stipulation that the maximum number of hours allowed is nine hours per day with a rest period of 45 minutes every four and a half

hours. After that, professional drivers must take a rest of 11 hours before getting behind the wheel again.

### Catalan problem

AS the Spanish Foreign Minister gets ready to visit the Campo de Gibraltar to discuss the future of the area after Brexit, he has greater problems on his mind.

If the Spanish government expends so much time on trying to recover a tiny enclave at the southernmost tip of the country, it now has to look elsewhere to an area that covers 32,000 square kilometres and has a population of 7.5 million.

The Catalanian Parliament is simply ignoring instructions received from the national government and the majority ruling party no longer recognises the legitimacy of Spain in the area.

It intends to proceed with what is regarded by Spain as an illegal referendum as it wants to declare independence and has even indicated that it intends to retain the euro as the official currency in the event that it does secede from Spain.

The European Union has made it clear that it would not recognise a new Catalan State and that it would not be able to officially use the euro as its unit of currency.

As police officers raid offices in Barcelona, there have been demonstrations on the streets but we can only hope that if the referendum goes ahead, there will be no independence majority otherwise the country runs the risk of falling into total chaos.

# Tug-of-war over threatened trees

MAYORS from towns in and around the Guadalest Valley want more flexibility over the Xylella Fastidiosa plague.

Mainland Spain's first cases of the blight that killed millions of trees in Italy before reaching the Balears were detected in almond trees in Guadalest and nearby Benimantell last June.

More Xylella Fastidiosa has since been found in Balones (El Comtat) and Alcanali (Marina Alta), bringing a total of 26 affected plots.

The mayors and residents of inland towns met

recently in Benimantell to discuss the Xylella Fastidiosa outbreak. An Asaja agricultural union representative explained that there are three methods of combatting the deadly bacterium and the Generalitat has chosen the most radical.

This involves fumigating, felling and shredding all trees within a 100-metre radius of an identified outbreak.

"There are not three options under EU directives," declared Roger Llanes, the regional Environment de-

partment's director, the following day. "There is only one and that involves eradicating the focus of infection and its radius.

"The Consell did not enjoy taking these steps but did so because non-compliance meant EU sanctions," Llanes said.

"Failure to do so could also produce a situation like Italy's where millions of olive trees were lost to the bug.

"A group of experts are on the ground now, investigating this bacterium and its consequences for the Generalitat. If they find a solution they will take it to Brussels and suggest that as an alternative," Llanes added.

# Investigation hangs fire

AFTER twice reconstructing the crime scene, police investigating eight-year-old Dominique's possible murder are concentrating on his immediate circle.

Dominique was found dead on the floor of the apartment where his foster father, Dani, lives with his new partner Alejandra who is four months pregnant. According to Alejandra, she and Dominique were leaving the apartment when they were forced back by two men wearing motorcycle helmets.

Without uttering a word

they tied her up and sat her in a chair. Although they had put a plastic bag over

her head before hitting her, she could make out flashes as they took photos, she said.

Despite the ordeal her unborn child was not harmed, doctors confirmed afterwards.

Dominique often visited his father but normally lived with his permanent foster mother who was holidaying at the time.

Initial medical reports established that the child, who was autistic and had a heart

condition, died from asphyxiation.

Investigators await DNA results in order to determine the exact causes of death but have ruled out a settling of accounts as initially suggested by Alejandra's version of events.

She has a child from a previous relationship with Raul, a local boy with a police record for drug trafficking although at the time of the attack, the boy of three was staying with her parents.



## Have you registered on the Padron?



### MORE REGISTRATIONS, MORE MONEY: Benidorm Town Hall.

BENIDORM is encouraging its citizens to register on the Padron as resident figures have dropped by over 7,000 in just four years.

According to the National Institute of Statistics (INE), Benidorm had 73,768 officially registered residents in 2013 and had 66,763 on January 1 this year.

The city is hoping to have 70,000 officially registered residents by January 1, 2018, meaning at least 3,267 new registrations in the next three and a half months.

To promote the campaign, posters will be distributed in Spanish, Valencian, English, French, German and Romanian.

Aside from being needed for many personal administrative and bureaucratic processes, the more people that are registered on the Padron, the more funds the city will have to maintain and improve public services - the government of Spain allocates funds to each individual municipality based on the number of officially registered residents showing on the Padron.

Mayor Toni Perez explained that 75 per cent of the nation's taxes are distributed according to population - funds totalling €15 million were received in 2015, with €11.5 million being directly linked to the Padron that, at that time, showed just over 69,000 officially registered residents.

# Solution to last-minute strike action

EMPLOYEES of San Juan's rubbish collection and street cleaning service called off their threatened strike at the last moment.

This was due to start at midnight but they reached agreement with the FCC staff over a requested pay rise three hours before the deadline.

San Juan's mayor Jaime Albero and Eva Delgado, councillor responsible for Rubbish Collection and Street Cleaning, were present at the talks.

The employees had asked for a 25 per cent rise over the next four years but finally accepted FCC's offer of 3 per cent spread over three years

as well as a 0.64 per cent seniority bonus.

The employees announced afterwards that they intended to request a review in 2020 when the town hall contract came to an end. On this occasion they would ask for a "sizeable" rise of 20 per cent, a spokesman said.

Meanwhile the town hall has committed to investing €100,000 in improvements to the service between now and 2020. This would include adding more streets to the cleaning service, buying new containers for organic materials and increasing wages, Albero announced.

after Brexit. New mutual agreements should lay out how processes like acquiring residency, visas and permits will work in a post-Brexit world. ## Some travellers can reclaim VAT

BRITISH tourists spend an average €1,013 per visit to Spain, more than twice as much as non-EU visitors spend.

This could however change if visitors understand how much they can obtain in VAT refunds when they leave Spain and return to non EU countries.

Under current European Laws, individuals from member countries within the EU may not reclaim VAT on goods purchased in Spain but anyone departing for a non-EU state may obtain a refund on certain goods being exported with them.

Global Blue, an international operator specialising in tax free purchasers believes that if this was more widely known and promoted accordingly, Spain might see an increase in wealthier tourists from countries in Asia and indeed all

parts of the world.

Gibraltarians do benefit from this opportunity and may reclaim tax when they import goods from Spain into the Territory although it needs to be remembered that many countries do levy import duty on goods being brought into their country so wise shoppers will need to weigh up the VAT savings against the import duty.



# Spy game!



FACEBOOK has been slapped with a €1.2 million fine after breaking Spanish law.

The Spanish Data Protection Agency (AEPD) claimed in a report that the social media site had violated their users' privacy on multiple accounts by exploiting their personal data for advertising purposes.

The AEPD focused on how Facebook harvests information on people's sexuality, religious beliefs and ideologies without informing them how it plans to use this information. The agency said that users did not give the social network consent to manipulate their information for these purposes and revealed that the company broke more laws by not deleting the data once it was no longer useful.

In a statement, Facebook rejected the accusations and claimed that the AEPD was wrong to accuse the company of showing advertising based

on sensitive personal information. They assert that their ad-targeting was solely based on content people 'liked' on the site.

However, under EU law, 'any information relating to an identified or identifiable natur-

al person' qualifies as personal data, which includes the content people 'like.'

Spain has followed the example of France, Belgium and Germany who have also taken action against the company in recent months.

LITTLE conclusive emerged from Generalitat president Ximo Puig's recent visit to Madrid.

He came away from his meeting with Mariano Rajoy, president of the Spanish government, with promises for a review of regional funding but only as part of 'global' negotiations.

Meanwhile, Ministry of Finance figures for 2014 detailing the funds that autonomous regions contribute and receive in return, showed yet again that the Valencian Community draws the short straw.

Although the region's per capita income is below the national average, in 2014 the region sent Madrid €1.7 billion more than it received.

Valencia has the third-highest negative balance in Spain after the Madrid Community, which received €19.2 billion less than it gave and Cataluña with €9.9 billion.

These official figures demonstrated yet again the Valencian Community's "systematic ill-treatment" and discrimination, Generalitat sources said.

### Autumn itch

THERE were 3,913 divorces in Alicante Province during 2015 according to latest available statistics. Most proceedings began in September after the summer holidays and at the start of the school year.

### High risk

FOUR of the five people who died of heatstroke in the Valencian Community between June 15 and August 31 lived in Alicante Province and were working out-of-doors at the time.

### Dodgy fruit

MONFORTE police impounded 1,100 kilos of giant melons crammed into a BMW and Audi. Their four occupants, ethnic gypsies with records for similar offences, were arrested after failing to present a bill of sale.

## Zero tolerance for gender violence

LA NUCIA is backing the Marina Baja Against Gender Violence initiative organised by the area Health department.

Members of the Dones de La Nucia association, together with personnel from La Nucia's health centres and the town hall's Equality department, have joined the campaign to raise social awareness and "banish the scourge of gender violence."

"We must join forces in the fight against this blight on society until there are zero cases in La Nucia, the Marina Baja, the Valencian Community and Spain," declared Gemma Marquez, councillor responsible for Equality.

"Any initiative can count on our support and we should never forget, whatever the day or month of the year, that gender violence deserves

zero tolerance," Marquez said.

Together with her fellow-councillor Eva Maria Naranjo, Marquez and local medical staff were photographed at the town's old Llavador washhouse.

Lifting hands painted purple - the colour that expresses rejection of gender-violence - placards also demanded an end to gender violence.

Meanwhile doctors at Marina Baja primary care health centres are asking women patients if they know what gender violence means and if they have ever been subjected to it.

These questions, asked 2,488 times since the beginning of the year, received 89 affirmative replies and identified 51 possible victims in the largest screening of this type in the Valencian Community.

## Can Spanish assets in Spain be left to whoever you want?

Foreigners should be aware of legal obligations when making a will

SINCE European Regulation 650/2012 applies in Spain, foreigners with assets and rights in the Spanish territory, whether they are residents or not, must be aware that the law applicable will be the law of the place of their habitual residence at the time of death, although it is possible for the testator or testatrix to choose to make the will recognising his or her national law.

Therefore, the law of the place where individuals have their regular residence will apply to the inheritance unless they have opted for their national law to apply to their will.

**Why is it so important that the law should govern succession or inheritance?**

It is important to be aware that it is possible to choose an inheritance law which will allow

the deceased to leave their bequests in accordance with their preferences. That means the testators can leave their assets to whoever they want; to a spouse, to children, to just one child, to charities etc.

In some countries there are certain people who by law must receive a part of the inheritance. Therefore the applicable law will determine whether or not there are restrictions on the freedom to dispose of assets upon death, and therefore the limitations when making a will.

**What are these limitations when making a will?**

There is a very useful website, the European e-justice portal ([www.e-justice.europa.eu](http://www.e-justice.europa.eu)) which analyses the existing limitations in legal systems of the member of the European Union and perhaps most useful for foreigners living in Spain is the following information;

**Belgian law** states that the descendants must receive at least half of the assets if there is one child, and 2/3rds if there are two or more children whilst the spouse is entitled to the life interest (usufruct) of half of the estate, or at least the use on the main home. Therefore, there is no absolute freedom when making a will to distribute the assets.

**French law** requires that a share of the estate is held in favour of the descendants, and the spouse only receives everything when there are no descendants. Thus if there is one child they will inherit half of the estate and if there are two or more children 2/3rds.

**Spanish law** requires that 2/3rds of the inheritance is reserved for descendants but in the absence of descendants it passes to the parents or grandparents if still alive and the spouse.

**German law**, although in

principle there is freedom to distribute the assets, if the spouse and/or the descendants are excluded from the inheritance they have a right to claim a share equivalent to half the value.

**English law** recognises the freedom to dispose of the assets as the person wishes, although dependents of the deceased have the possibility of lodging a claim for some financial provision.

**Scottish law**, although in principle there are no restriction, there is a legal right to descendants and the spouse to claim for some rights on movable property (money, investments, etc).

# Trees and money to burn

TWENTY-FIVE years ago, three fires in Sierra Cortina behind Benidorm devastated 400 hectares of woodland in under a week.

The fires in the Murtal, Moralet and Foietes districts now partly occupied by Terra Mitica were deliberately started, investigators soon discovered.

More than 10,000 pines were devastated, ruining plans for an arboreal park in the protected, non-development forest area.

Benidorm's mayor, Eduardo Zaplana, ordered the Local Police to keep "a permanent and uninterrupted" watch on the area following conflict with regional govern-

ment's Environment department. Each accused the other of hindering extinction operations and politicising the fire.

That year, 1992, the regional parliament passed a Bill preventing the reclassification of rustic land for development and Zaplana denied rumours of possible reclassification.

It would be "ridiculous" as Benidorm needed green zones, he declared.

By 1995 the Generalitat had changed hands, with Zaplana as its regional president.

Backing local businessmen's plans for a Benidorm theme park, Zaplana explained that land was available as the fire zone could be reclassi-

fied since the project was "of special interest to the Community."

Publicly-owned Valencian Community Themed Projects (SPTCV) was a major shareholder in the park, the first of the pharaonic projects which practically bankrupted the region. The Generalitat severed its connection but conservative estimates claim that Terra Mitica has cost the region's taxpayers €500 million since it opened in 2000.

## Change of address for feud family

THE Samar Internacional offices are moving from the Alicante City estate of the strife-ridden Sala Martinez family.

Following the murder last December of matriarch Maria del Carmen Martinez the prominent family wound up its loss-making car sales and car-hire firms which were in any case secondary to Samar Internacional.

The plastics and chemicals company, together with subsidiaries in the UK, Germany, the US, Morocco and Latin America, are the basis of the family's wealth and the decision to make the move was approved at a July board meeting.

The first since Maria del Carmen was shot twice in the head in the Novocar salesroom, the

meeting was held at a notary's office. The only suspect, her son-in-law Miguel Lopez, was remanded for several weeks and later released on €150,000 bail.

The idea of moving originated with Maria Carmen's son, Vicente Sala, but despite constant disagreements with his three sisters before and after their mother's death, the proposal went through without opposition.

The Samar Internacional headquarters were situated on a floor of the mansion on the extensive Avenida de Denia estate that also houses the homes of the four Sala Martinez offspring.

The Samar Internacional officers are now moving to the city centre, family sources said.

## Traffic flows as bridge reopens



**IN PROGRESS:** Work has now finished on San Jorge bridge.

ALCOY'S San Jorge bridge reopened to vehicles and city traffic is now more fluid.

The bridge, a principal access to the city centre, was closed for 10 weeks obliging drivers to make lengthy detours while it was resurfaced, reinforced and pavements widened.

All went according to plan, Public Works councillor Raul Llopis announced, although city hall reconsidered its decision to remove the guardrail from the pavements following last month's terrorist attacks in Barcelona and Cambrils.

Llopis confirmed that the guardrails will not return but acting on the recommendations of the na-

tional government's Alicante delegation, bollards will be installed to prevent vehicles from mounting the pavement.

Although holdups have eased with the reopening of the San Jorge bridge, the city still has traffic problems.

The Fernando Reig suspension bridge remains closed while its 38 cables are substituted, while one lane of La Beniata has been closed to traffic since January after a retaining wall collapsed along part of its embankment.

This has now been repaired and city hall awaits an official inspection declaring it safe.




Any registered citizen of Teulada-Moraira aged 16-or-over will be able to vote.



## Residents disappointed meeting with mayor

Steve explained the highly hazardous nature of what had been done and the necessity to bring the car parking area up to approved European standards.

A petition with 652 signatures was presented to the mayor to highlight the serious and strong opposition to the car park.

An open forum of questions and answers followed and the mayor and the councillor revealed that they did not believe it necessary to consult residents on the creation of the car park as the law allowed the council to use 40 per cent of any green zone in Javea for the purpose of parking.

However, they conceded that going forward, Costa Nova residents will be engaged and invited to future meetings.

The mayor and the councillor said that two alternative sites had been considered but the Costa Nova site was chosen as the lower cost option and they also believed fewer residents would be impacted.

They said that the police visit the car park every 20 minutes, a claim which was strongly refuted by residents living close by.

Afterwards, attendees said they did not feel their questions were answered satisfactorily.

## No bail

A JUDGE has refused provisional bail for the driver who killed three cyclists and severely injured another two as she ploughed her Ford Mondeo head-first into them on the N-332 in May.

The 28-year-old Spanish woman, who was under the influence of alcohol and drugs, has been held in custody since the accident and is awaiting trial.

She is charged with triple reckless homicide and two crimes of causing injury by serious recklessness.

Her lawyer addressed a letter to the judge in early June requesting that the woman be released on provisional bail until the trial.

He claims she does not pose a flight-risk and said she will appear at court on a weekly-basis to sign a register.

The judge has refused provisional bail, saying the woman poses a threat to public safety.

At the time of the accident, not only was the woman under the influence of alcohol and drugs but she was also banned from driving.



## FRANCE

### French union

FRENCH workers protested against Macron's labour reforms last Tuesday. More than 4,000 strikes were called by the CGT, France's biggest trade union, with over 180 street protests attended nationwide.

### Banksy blanked

THE owner of a house in Calais, France painted over a mural by the British street artist Banksy, whose work can sell for thousands of euros, because he thought the building looked too shabby.

### Wolves back

WOLF numbers in France are on the up, with over 360 predators now thought to roam the French countryside, and seven new packs reported since last year.

### Tensions mount

A SENIOR North Korean official has criticised France for claiming that the country's nuclear ambition poses a threat to Europe while Paris remains in full possession of their own nuclear arsenal.



## BELGIUM

### Mayor murdered

THE murder of a 71-year-old Belgian mayor, whose throat was slit in the Mouscron graveyard where he acted as caretaker, has sent ripples of shock throughout the country.

### Suburb shooting

AN elderly man was shot dead by his 74-year-old neighbour who also wounded another man. The perpetrator, from Linkebeek, has since been arrested by police.

### Gymnast gold

TWO Belgian gymnast pairs have taken home gold medals following their performances in the 2017 Acrobatic Gymnastics World Cup, the finals of which were held last weekend in Lisbon, Portugal.

### Refugees rejected

A BELGIAN NGO has described the increased police action against refugees taking shelter in parks and transport hubs as "inhumane." The Humain organisation claims that those detained by police only visited the areas to receive food donations.



## NETHERLANDS

### More millions

THERE are now over 106,000 millionaires in the Netherlands - and a fifth of these are farmers. The number has increased by almost 25 per cent over the past decade, with their combined assets now totalling €309 billion.

### Monument men

NEARLY a million people visited a monument during the Netherlands' Open Monument Day. Over 4,000 monuments that are normally closed to the public were open free of charge last weekend.

### Dutch reach

CYCLISTS are campaigning for learner drivers to be taught the 'Dutch reach' - a way to safely open car doors while checking the blind spot - to cut down on the number of cyclists injured by careless motorists.

### Irma strikes

KING WILLEM-ALEXANDER made a trip to the former Dutch colony Saint Martin which was hit hard by Hurricane Irma last week. The Dutch King visited the hospital to meet those injured.



## SWEDEN

### Gun spike

POLICE are cracking down on gun crime following 81 shooting incidents over the summer. Most of the incidents happened in Stockholm and almost all were a result of gang-related crimes.

### Reckless roads

ACCORDING to a new survey, almost one in 10 Swedish road users skip red lights. The worst offenders are pedestrians, of which 26 per cent were discovered to cross roads before getting the green light.

### Cash-free

SWEDEN is now the most card-friendly nation on the planet, with only 1 per cent of the nation's payments made using cash in the past year.

### Picture protest

RENOWNED Swedish photographers are coming together to launch an exhibition to protest Donald Trump's criticisms of the nation's immigration policies. The artists seek to counter this by showing a more diverse image of the country.



## NORWAY

### Election victory

NORWAY'S Prime Minister Erna Solberg was re-elected into power following a campaign fought on oil and taxes. Solberg's right-wing Conservative party narrowly defeated the Labour-led opposition with promises of steady regulation on the oil-fuelled economy.

### Wealth record

THE largest sovereign wealth fund in Norway hit \$1 trillion for the first time in history. The record-breaking fund was established in 1998 to safeguard oil and gas proceeds for future generations.

### Homeless goals

OSLO hosted the Homeless World Cup this year which gathers players from over 50 nations with the aim of ending homelessness for good. Brazil took home the prize after narrowly beating champions Mexico.

### Black gold

NORWAY is struggling to phase out its dependence on oil due to the sharp fall in prices. Over 50,000 jobs have already been erased from the industry which inflated the nation's wealth in recent decades.



The account, set up by Russia Today, a propaganda network, was supposed to represent British actions in Russia at the height of the 1917 Revolution. Moscow's real British Embassy wasn't happy.

■ A RUSSIAN astronaut has returned to Earth after spending years in outer space. Fyodor Yurchikhin spent 673 days on a variety of extra-terrestrial missions. He spent most of the time with American astronauts on the International Space Station, including Peggy Whitson who, at age 57, has now completed 10 space walks.

■ A FLIGHT attendant who claimed she was discriminated against for being unattractive has won her case. ## Better credit rating for bank

THE American credit rating company Moody's has reacted well to Liberbank's announcement that it intends to raise €500 million on the Spanish stock exchange.

Coupled with its decision to dispose of some of its toxic real estate and bad loans more quickly than initially expected, Moody's has given it a B1 debt rating.

This will come as welcome news to what has been regarded as the most vulnerable medium-sized bank still trading in Spain.

# Spanish rich get richer

THOSE Spaniards with money are seeing their worth expand more quickly than ever and there are now 549 taxpayers with fortunes worth more than €30 million.

Unlike most of the other members of the European Union, Spain still operates a wealth tax and requires anyone with a gross taxable wealth in excess of €1 million to register and pay the additional tax.

The latest report from Spanish Tax Agency shows that 188,680 individuals signed declarations to establish their obligation to pay this tax and of

those, approximately one third had cash and assets in excess of €1.5 million which is a 10 per cent increase over figures from five years earlier.

One reason may be that the Tax Authorities have taken action to identify wealth within the country following much publicised alleged evasion often from politicians and more recently footballers.

In addition, a tax amnesty which allowed the rich to pay only a small proportion of tax owed may have

'flushed out' rich residents who had not previously been registered for the wealth tax.

The combined assets of all of those who have registered to pay wealth tax totals €582 billion which equates to nearly 50 per cent of Spain's Gross National Product and a single individual, Amancio Ortega founder of Inditex accounts for €71 billion of that total.

Whilst those with few investments see a slow growth, there seems to be some truth in the old saying that 'money attracts money.'

## US firm promotes Santander

MORGAN STANLEY the powerful American investment company is very bullish about the potential for rises in the shares of Spanish bank Santander.

It has upped its target price for the shares three times in the last six months even though actual price on the stock exchange has not matched the forecasts.

It is suggested by outside analysts that the decision to recommend the shares is based on expectations of medium-term increased profits thanks to the takeover of Banco Popular.

### Quote of the Week

# Airline pilots go on strike

PILOTS at the Thomas Cook airline which flies to parts of Spain from British regional airports walked out on a 12-hour strike last Friday.

Those pilots who are members of the British Airline Pilots' Association (Balpa) voted to strike and walked out although the company insists that all flights will operate.

This is believed by the union

to be the first UK pilots' strike for nearly 50 years and is only a token stoppage so that passengers are inconvenienced as little as possible.

According to the union, the pilots have seen a deterioration in their terms and conditions as well as real-term pay cuts and even though they have been offered a 4 per cent pay rise over two years feel they have to take this action.

## Faster growth

THE economy of the eurozone is growing at a quicker rate than forecast with forecast growth of 2.2 per cent during 2017. If correct, this will be the fastest growth in a decade with Spain being one of the leaders.

## Less profit

MADRID-based industrial investment company Sacyr has reported a profit for the first six months of the year of €60 million, a drop of 6.3 per cent over last year. Income has dropped as 2016 saw major sales of assets.

## Rail strike

THE rail union CCOO has called a strike over job losses at railway companies Renfe and Adif on Friday September 29. The 23-hour long strike will be a protest against making an ageing and reduced workforce support an unsustainable system.

## Catalan situation slows investment

FINANCIAL institutions around the world have not reacted positively towards the vote by the Catalan Parliament to push forward with the Independence Referendum.

Whilst many believe Catalonia will remain part of Spain, they are also uncomfortable with the conflict between the National government and the

Catalan Parliament which is reflecting in an immediate migration, albeit slow, from Spanish bonds.

It is now cheaper to buy Italian government bonds and Spanish banks which have a strong presence in Catalonia such as La Caixa immediately saw pressure on their share values. Spain's rating is to be reviewed in the next six weeks.



# Fear of new bank failures

## ECB wants control over client deposits

ONE of European banking's most powerful women, Daniele Nouy wants to introduce fresh powers to prevent depositors from removing funds from struggling banks.

The European Central Bank's (ECB) Chair of Banking Supervision wants to have the right to temporarily suspend the ability of customers to withdraw their money from banks facing financial difficulty.

This ban would cover cash withdrawals at the bank, through cash machines and by online transfer.

She explained in a letter to a Member of the European Parliament that due to the fact a problem within a bank could quickly see a run on its liquidity which could be fuelled by social media comment and the ease of internet banking.

The recent problems with Banco Popular in Spain and Monte dei Paschi di Siena in Italy are examples of how matters can escalate quickly, although in the case of Banco Popular, current and imminent law suits from disgruntled investors suggest the final decision to demand its quick sale may have been premature.

In 2016, the ECB had tried to introduce a restriction on the removal of funds in excess of €100,000, as generally lower amounts are covered by national governments. It has actually even commented that the authorities should have the right to delay payment of lesser funds for between five and 20 days.

The Bank - which is owned by member states of the European Union - only has legal powers over the 19 members of the eurozone and perhaps surprisingly, the third largest shareholder with a 13.67 per cent holding is the Bank of England exceeded only by France and Germany.

The chairman of the ECB is an Italian, Mario Draghi and critics of the bank suggest that he influenced a decision to allow the Italian govern-

ment to circumvent the rules in order to bail out the fast failing Monte dei Paschi di Siena bank.

This proposal to allow the suspension of withdrawals in emergency situations is taken by analysts to suggest the ECB does expect more commercial banking failures in the future and wants to have legislation in place at the earliest opportunity in order to take control, albeit briefly, of deposits placed in good faith by the general public and corporate investors.

## CATALONIA BUSINESS TAX PAYER'S DILEMMA

# A rock and a hard place

AS the split between the Catalan and national governments gets wider, the latest salvo concerns the payment of income tax and IVA (VAT).

The Spanish Finance Ministry has issued a blunt statement 'reminding' tax payers in Catalonia that any payment should be made to the correct authority which is the national government.

Any company or self-employed person which pays money due for VAT, income tax or corporation tax to the Catalan authority will be considered as having not paid the tax and may be open to criminal charges.

This statement was made in advance of the threatened Independence Referendum which will possibly be held on Sunday October 1 as the Catalan government has created an enlarged Catalan Tax Authority which is ready to divert the collection of national taxes to the 'New Catalan State.'

According to Catalan Deputy First Minister Oriol Junqueras, systems are in place to allow for the collection of some €42 billion of tax as soon as the decision to create an in-

dependent state is taken.

In Spanish law, if VAT is collected and then not paid to the correct authority it will leave the collector open to a charge of theft and if a company, all of the directors could face charges.

The Spanish government appears powerless to stop the proposed referendum although it has been declared illegal for the Catalan Parliament to even buy ballot boxes using Community funds, although it is suspected that the ballot boxes and voting papers are currently being held in a secret location.

As the referendum date approaches, both Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy and Catalan leader Carles Puigdemont regularly indulge in a war of words with each other which is now certain to be fought out in the courts and with potential arrests of Catalan politicians and their supporters.

## Fruit and vegetable imports

MOROCCO was the biggest supplier of fruit and vegetables to Spain in the first half of 2017 with exports totalling €404 million.

This shows a 33 per cent increase on the previous six months and Spanish purchases have increased generally with large volumes also being imported from Brazil and Costa Rica.

According to a report issued by the Spanish Federation of Associations of Producers and Exporters of Fruits, Vegetables, Flowers, and Live Plants (FEPEX) imports from the European Union are also up by 8 per cent with France and Italy being the two major suppliers, closely followed by Portugal and the Netherlands.

Potatoes and tomatoes were the major products exported to Spain, although fruits were also high on the list.

## Tourist spend up again

VISITORS to Spain spent €49 billion in the first seven months of the year, an increase of 15 per cent over the same period in 2016.

The July total was slightly less than €12 billion according to the National Statistics Institute.

The figures show that the United Kingdom accounts for the highest spend by tourist visitors, parting with €9.9 billion which was 20.2 per cent of total spend, followed by the Germans at €6.86 billion (14 per cent) and Scandinavians at €4.16 billion (8.5 per cent).

The three most popular destinations were Catalonia, Canary Islands and the Balearics which between them saw 58 per cent of the total amount of holidaymakers money spent.

## Bank shareholders are set to vote for final merger

TODAY (Thursday) the shareholders of Bankia and Mare Nostrum Bank (BMN) will attend extraordinary general shareholders' meetings to vote to merge.

The Bankia meeting is being held in Valencia whilst the BMN meeting is being held in Madrid with the expectation that the vote will be positive following the announcement of the intent to merge last June.

Once the formal votes are confirmed, then the two banks will be able to present the proposal to the various authorities in Spain for approval, which should be something of a formality as Bankia is currently effectively owned by the taxpayer.

Shareholders in BMN will receive

shares in Bankia but they will be hoping that the new operation will be successful as they are only receiving about 40 per cent of the book value of BMN which has assets of €38 billion, although most of that is in customer deposits.

The advantage for Bankia is that the merger will increase its coverage in the Balearics, Granada and Murcia whilst BMN shareholders will receive an almost immediate cash dividend with the anticipation that the government will start to release the shares that it holds onto the market.

It is believed that a stronger Bankia will attract financial investors and that share prices will increase to the benefit of all existing shareholders.

# Making the best of a bad job

AUGUST is a weird month for employment. Statistics are promising early on thanks to the people engaged in July to serve beer to tourists and make hotel beds.

Then August 31 arrives and most of the workers return to the out-of-work wasteland.

Hauling Spain out of the economic crisis and putting people back into employment is Mariano Rajoy's favourite "Look what I've done!" cry but new jobs are mostly short-term, part-time and precarious.

Better than nothing, but not as good as Rajoy makes out when he bats away corruption accusations and launches into his "Yes but..." rebuttal.

This year 313,141 people were sacked on August 31, the worst single-day figure ever known. Unfortunately for Rajoy 59,563 lost jobs - more than anywhere else - were in

Cataluña. That's one less argument in Spain's favour and yet another weapon for the secessionists.

## Boots on the other foot

POLLS show that the Basques are more concerned about employment than independence.

It's a long time since the lehendakari, regional president Juan Jose Ibarretxe, proclaimed the Basques' right to vote for "free association with the Spanish state," a proposal voted down in the national parliament in 2005.

End of story, notwithstanding earlier chapters written by the ETA separatists.

The present lehendakari Iñigo Urkullu has even less motivation to emulate Ibarretxe.

The PNV is going strong, unlike CiU, the party in power when Catalan

independence rumblings loudened to murmurs and then shouts. Now defunct thanks to disagreements over independence it morphed into PDeCat, which is giving ground to the ERC republican separatists and the CUP anti-system party.

Urkullu would not want to be in Carles Puigdemont's shoes right now and who knows if the Catalan president won't soon be needing a change of footwear himself.

## Not today, thanks

CATALUÑA'S president Carles Puigdemont recently visited Denmark to open the region's Copenhagen delegation, but he was not received by the Danish government.

Yet again, his hard sell received the 'not today' treatment reserved for fast-talking commercial travellers in the past and importunate cold-callers like Puigdemont now.

## Knock knock, who's there

CIUDADANOS leader Albert Rivera agreed to back Mariano Rajoy's investiture at a price that included a long list of concessions.

These included allowing national and regional presidents only two consecutive terms but, like many of Rajoy's concessions, this has not materialised.

Now Rivera is again resurrecting an unthinkable and unspeakable prospect that could show Mariano Rajoy the door. Nevertheless, behind that closed door the Partido Popular has spoken and thought about this in the past and at present.

And depending on what happens or does not happen on October 1, a kindly but inexorable defenestration could be under discussion in the very near future.

I advise dozens of clients a week all across the world on nutrition so I feel it

As with many cancers, when detected early, it is clearly curable. If the tumour has not spread outside the prostate gland, either radiation or surgical removal will cure the cancer very frequently. Other treatments for the disease include; Chemotherapy, Cryotherapy and Hormonal Therapy.

# Haemorrhoids

### What are haemorrhoids?

Haemorrhoids are venous dilatations that appear in the area of the anus. Normally they do not cause any problems, however they can get inflamed and cause a lot of pain, and form clots that become infected which cause bleeding.

### What are its symptoms?

Some of the symptoms of haemorrhoids may include bleeding after passing a stool, an itchy bottom. A lump hanging down outside of the anus, which may need to be pushed back in after passing a stool and/or soreness, redness and swelling around your anus.

### What causes them?

These dilatations can be caused by a number of things including straining, recent surgery in and around the area and illnesses that cause the intestinal walls to weaken are among them.

### How can you treat haemorrhoids?

There are various ways of treating haemorrhoids. Bathing in warm water, some medicines and ointments usually help circulation which can fix the problem however sometimes surgery is the only solution.

### When should you seek medical attention?

You should always see your doctor if you feel your symptoms are serious or even contact emergency services.

### Can it be prevented?

There are certain situations which increase the chances of haemorrhoids appearing, and certain people who are more likely to get them due to weaker intestinal walls. # Celebrating 100 years



DENIA'S Casa de Cultura will play host to a photographic exhibition celebrating 100 years since John Dos Passos visited the town.

John Dos Passos (January 14, 1896 - September 28, 1970) was an American novelist and artist active in the first half of the 20th century.

Considered one of the Lost Generation writers, Dos Passos published his first novel in 1920, *One Man's Initiation*:

1917. It was followed by an anti-war story, *Three Soldiers*, which brought him considerable recognition. His 1925 novel about life in New York City, titled *Manhattan Transfer*, was a commercial success and introduced experimental stream-of-consciousness techniques into Dos Passos' method.

His major work is the USA trilogy, comprising *The 42nd Parallel* (1930), *1919* (1932), and *The Big Money* (1936). Dos

Passos continued to use experimental techniques in these novels, incorporating newspaper clippings, autobiography, biography, and fictional realism to paint a vast landscape of American culture during the first decades of the 20th century.

Though each novel stands on its own, the trilogy is designed to be read as a whole. Dos Passos' political and social reflections in the novel are deeply pessimistic about the political and economic direction of the United States, and few of the characters manage to hold onto their ideals through the First World War.

The exhibition will be open from September 15 - September 30, from 11.00am - 2.00pm plus 5.00pm - 9.00pm Monday - Friday and 11.00am - 1.30pm plus 6.00pm - 9.00pm on Saturdays.



# A past of pirates and chocolate

VILAMUSEU has received a donation of Moors and Christians costumes worn by a member of the Catalans company in 1926.

Albert Alcaraz, director of Villajoyosa's Municipal Archive, confirmed that this was the only time that the fiestas were held between 1912 and 1947. The Catalans, one of the oldest Christian companies, did not participate again until 1950.

The costumes donated by Francisca Llorca Soriano belonged to her father, Valeriano Llorca Lopez, who was born in La Vila in 1901 and fought in the 1920-1926 Rif War.

At that time Villajoyosa manufactured most of Spain's chocolate and on his return Llorca Lopez, whose

grandfather founded the Valor brand, left for Madrid where he sold the local products.

The Catalan costumes, which join those of the Artilleria Cristiana company donated by Vicenta Perez Lloret and others from local families, can be seen in the Guardianes de Piedra exhibition.

This focuses on the province's defence system and includes a section linking Villajoyosa's Moors and Christians celebrations to parades in the 1700s by the town's armed militias which defended the town against pirate attacks.

# Gone but not gorgotten - ever!

**A TOAST TO GOOD FOOD, GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS**



WITH GARRY WAITE

IT is eight years ago today that the world of television lost one of its greatest and most successful food presenters.

Dubbed the first celebrity chef, Keith Floyd redefined the way that cookery programmes were presented. Away from the clinical studio style of Fanny and Johnny Craddock and even the delightful Delia Smith, Keith brought 'personality' to food.

His apparently bumbling, sometimes incompetent preparation and presentation of food delighted millions of viewers.

Keith was born in Exmoor and went to Wellington School. He first started in journalism before joining the army, the Third Royal Tank Regiment, in 1963.

Sadly this was not to last and the army's loss was the catering world's gain. Keith started his catering career like most of us in those days by washing up and preparing vegetables in restaurants in France (where he learnt

to speak virtually fluent French) and London before opening his first restaurant in Clifton, Bristol in 1966 at the age of 23.

Floyd's Bistro opposite the Grand Spa Hotel and close to the famous suspension bridge had long wooden tables and benches and served inexpensive 'French' Bistro type food. Very popular with young people who used to queue outside to wait for a space in the refectory style dining room.

Keith's life became synonymous with hard drinking and heavy smoking as the years rolled on, but in the early days a glass of wine and a good meal were his *raison d'être* and his first marriage in 1967 at the tender age of 24 to Jesmond Rutledge boded a step into what could be called a normal life.

However there were two things that Floyd was not too good at - relationships and business. After three years of marriage he and Jess split up, he having become a father to Patrick. In the early 70's he sold the restaurant to another friend of mine Neil Ramsay (no relation to Gordon) who increased business at the already successful bistro and through the latter years he reformed it until it became more of a fine dining restaurant which his son Peter eventually took over.

It certainly did Neil well - enough to retire very early!!

With the proceeds from the sale of his restaurant, Floyd 'broke free' and bought himself a yacht and sailed the Mediterranean. After 18 months and not having seen his son for that time he returned to spend more time with him but this time with a new woman in his life. That didn't last too long either and he soon met Paddy, the editor of the paper for whom he first wrote.

They took the brave move of opening a restaurant in his beloved France, in the Provençal town of L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue. Things didn't go well and so they returned to the UK and went their separate ways.


## Floyd moved to Ireland

ON what he called a 'Murphy's inspired whim' but that didn't work out either. In an effort to get back on track Keith opened the Maltser's Arms in Tuckenhay in Devon, the sign outside saying Floyd's Inn (sometimes). Even with a young talented French chef in the form of Jean Cristophe Novelli, the pub was to go the same way as his other ventures.

Sold in 1996 and by now on his fourth wife and living on the Costa del Sol he was drinking more heavily and he would do a half bottle of Scotch 'before breakfast.' Restaurants were no longer part of his 'portfolio' although he did 'lend' his name to a Floyd's Brasserie in Phuket in 2007 which gave him an excuse to travel a lot to another part of the world he loved.

By 2009 his lifestyle came back to haunt him as he was treated for bowel cancer. He spent a lot of time recovering at the home of mutual friend Paul Hickling, of Roman Oasis fame but spent more time back in the UK. It was there, on September 14, 2009 having been given the 'all clear' from his cancer he went out for lunch with his companion Celia to celebrate. On their return they were expecting to watch a documentary, Keith on Keith (by Keith Allen). But he never got to see it. He died of a heart attack while sitting on the sofa. He was 65. Cheers my friend, I'm just going to pour myself a glass of wine to drink your health.

## I first met Keith

WHEN we both had restaurants in Bristol. I also took over one of them in Clifton in the early 80's.

One of his many restaurants, however, was to become the birth place of Floyd's huge rise to TV success. I got a phone call from his able bodied right hand woman, Angie, in a bit of a panic as she was getting ready to open his latest venture in Clifton, but Keith had gone AWOL!!

If I remember she had had a flood in the place and there was no kitchen help and the restaurant had bookings. So I sent up two of my chefs to help her out and we opened Floyd's for him!

One of his regular customers was a chap called David Pritchard, a producer from BBC Southampton TV. Each time he came in Keith would avoid speaking to him as he kept sending messages to the reluctant star asking if he could do a TV programme with him. David's persistence paid off and Keith was persuaded to make a pilot.

Filmed in a domestic kitchen in Southampton, Floyd on Fish was born. Floyd on Food, Floyd on Fire and even Far Flung Floyd were to follow. One day somebody asked him if he had chosen the name Floyd on purpose so as he could match it to the programmes and books!! Success grew and grew.

With his new style of presentation, "Come here Clive (cameraman) focus on the food that's what the viewers want not pictures of me!" But it wasn't really.

The viewers tuned in, in their millions to watch the 'bow-tied' 'shabby-chic' presenter 'slurping' his wine and bossing Clive around.

Success did mean that he left a lot of his old friends behind. In 1985, I interviewed him for my radio show in Bristol at the time. It was an easy interview.


After all it was just two mates sitting discussing one of their lives and good fortune. I

left the UK in 1986 and did not see him again until 1992 while he was filming Floyd on Spain. By then he had started drinking. Not just his occasional wine, but Scotch.

Also he had married again, Julie Hatcher was to provide Keith with his second child Poppy. But success, travelling and drinking took their toll and they eventually divorced.

I'M going away next week and I was going through all my bookings and I was looking at my hotel booking for Las Vegas and noticed that, on top of my room charge, they have an additional item, not the VAT, but something called a 'resort fee' which, in the case of the hotel I'm staying at, is \$29 a night.

When delving further into it I found out it's for use of Wi-Fi in the room which, by the way, is free anywhere else in the hotel. It's also for use of the fitness facility, which I won't be using, unlimited free local calls - well they are included in my phone package so I don't want that - and a newspaper. No thanks! And access to thousands of top magazines and newspapers using some App that I don't have.

Of course, that's really what I want to do whilst staying at a casino hotel is catch up on my reading! I will let you know how I get on with not paying my 'resort fee' when I return.

So this got me thinking about all the other rip off hidden and not so hidden fees we have to pay. Try changing a flight online. Airlines charge a fee, £50 in one I saw, as a 'service charge.' What service charge? I logged on, I

found the new flight, I changed the old one, I did it all myself. So what service am I getting?

It's just another way of getting money for nothing. They sell my seat again and so they don't lose anything. What about fuel surcharge on flights which is another additional cost. I kicked off like you can't believe and told them I wasn't going to pay. I demanded to see the manager who wasn't interested. I never paid another penny and never heard another thing. I think sometimes you have to just stick to your guns.

BBVA's Research department has put together its bi-annual Real Estate Observatory of Spain report. The comprehensive analysis draws on data from the General Council of Notaries for the first half of 2017.

The report welcomes what it describes as the 'good tone' of the Spanish property market. In six months, 265,000 deeds of sale have been completed. That makes the consensus target of half a million homes sold by the year's end more than likely to be achieved.

BBVA also welcomes the increase in mortgage lending across the board and the continued evolution of Spain's construction industry, especially in the residential sector.

Spain's sales volume increase has been accompanied by a GDP growth of 0.9 per cent in the second quarter of 2017. An estimated 377,000 jobs were also created from January to July.

Financing costs to purchase a new home hit a historic low in July. Credit has expanded as consumer confidence grows and lenders fiddle with debt restructuring programmes to make them more secure.

Outside the residential sector the news is also good for the wider property market. Sales of work premises, including offices and industrial warehouses, shot up by 10 per cent in the first half of the year.

The office sector in particular is experiencing major foreign investment as Spain's cities attract more global business.

# Landlords' winter goldmine

LANDLORDS are opening their homes to students in record numbers. Spain's student renters are now among the fastest growing demographics in the property market.

The rise in students searching for their own shared flats has not gone unnoticed by homeowners looking for a solution to the seasonality problem.

Students fit the mould perfectly. Rents are typically from September to May or June, just when rates can be dramatically raised for summer.

Online bookings of rooms in Spanish cities by students has grown 60 per cent in 2017 compared to last year.

On average students also pay more per month than working tenants for their rent.

That gap is emphasised with international students, who pay €392 each month, €30

more than the average Spanish student. Americans fork out €460 for a room. They spend less time in the country, however, at just five months.

Nor is it just Madrid and Barcelona who are benefiting from the student expansion. Strong student populations exist in Sevilla, Malaga, Valencia, Asturias and Granada.

More and more young Spanish are moving to different cities to study, away from the parental nest. They also want the independence of distinct accommodation, rather than opting for halls of residence. The halls themselves are being spruced up and advertised to Chinese students at eyewatering prices.

Landlords are able to demand a reference and a parental guarantee to ensure deposits are paid, the rent is timely and the place isn't a mess by the end of the contract.

## Divided by tourist rentals

TWO more Spanish autonomous communities are on the verge of banning tourist rentals. Galicia and Castile y Leon are considering imposing tough new rules limiting the lucrative industry.

In doing so the regions would follow a trail blazed by Mallorca, which recently imposed a 12-month moratorium on tourist rental licences.

Andalucia and the Valencian Community have also implemented harsh sanctions for homeowners who rent out properties to tourists without having the requisite licence.

The moves from Galicia and Castile y Leon have been opposed by the National Commission of Markets and Competition (CNMC), which argues that extreme regulations interfere with the natural flow of the property market.

The CNMC has taken the Canary Islands to court in the past over similar legislation.

If you have a wall that's looking a bit bare, and would like to add some drama to your garden, try your hand at planting some climbing plants. There are many varieties you can try, and whether you go for something local to get that Mediterranean vibe or choose something a little more exotic, these plants add the perfect backdrop to any home.

To start off, you will need a trellis which you can either build yourself if you're feeling handy or buy from the local garden centre. Bamboo sticks are also quite

effective. You can often buy the plant you wish to grow already partly formed, so all you have to do is water it well and then plant it by the wall you want to cover.

The hole needs to be twice as wide as the plant pot and half as deep again. It should also be about 30cm away from the wall to ensure the plant gets plenty of

moisture. To make sure the plant thrives, water well for the first few months and make sure to spread out the stems across the trellis as it grows.

Stunning climbers to try are Plumbago, which produces a beautiful waterfall of pale blue flowers from May to November, and Bignonia capreolata which spouts flaming red flowers in summer and autumn.

IT feels like only yesterday when gardens were buzzing with the arrival of spring, but soon the nights will get cooler and darker, meaning it's time to have a good tidy up before for winter arrives. Many gardens have erupted into a beautiful mess by the time summer is over, but if you do the work now it will make a big difference when next year rolls around.

First things first, get rid of any dead vegetation and take note of any damage. If the task ahead seems daunting, just take it one bed at a time to make the workload easier.

This is incredibly important as certain diseases and pests can live on what's left over, such as fruit and fo-

liage. You should also make sure to burn any plants that have developed blight, mould or mildew to avoid it spreading, rather than just tossing them on the compost pile.

The next fun task is to get rid of all the weeds. It's important to haul them out now before the seeds start to fall as this will help to slow growth and ensure the right plants are getting access to the nutrients.

If left to germinate until next spring, you run the risk

of them taking over the garden as each plant produces thousands of seeds.

# Hot summer nights in the garden

WE all look forward to summer for the bright sunny days and balmy nights to enjoy the outdoors, the beaches and nightlife. The garden is also a favourite place to relax, even more so if you have a pool.

This summer has had hotter than normal night temperatures in many zones of Spain. This has had its effects on the gardens.

Many native plants in our Mediterranean gardens can cope with this heat but the introduced plants from temperate climates and many vegetables can be severely affected by the lack of cooler weather in which they are accustomed to grow.

Many temperate plants in exposed positions have suffered from the heat and will appear drooped and with growth stunted. Watering can assist as it cools the root zone, but a more permanent solution to save wa-

ter is to surround the plants with mulch to insulate the root zone from direct sun heating up the soil.

Providing shade over the plants during the hot periods of summer is also a good option to ensure the plants pass the summer to thrive the rest of the year. A frame covered in shade cloth is a good option for protecting valuable plants.

With autumn coming the lessons of the summer heat is that new planting, that should be being planned now for a flourishing winter/spring garden, need to include strategies for protecting the delicate plants to be able to pass the next summer without being set back. Make sure that your delicate plants are placed in areas that have shade from the summer midday sun.

If you have found your vegetable garden has suffered with no other apparent cause then it may well be the high night tem-

peratures that have affected tomatoes, pumpkins and many other vegetables to die off earlier this year.

The good thing is that there is space to plant out earlier this year for the autumn and winter crops so they are better established before the colder weather that slows them down sets in.

The summer storms developed by the summer heat provide a great opportunity for the garden to be prepared for the autumn planting as they stimulate growth and add nitrogen to the soil from the combination of lightning and rain.

Some storms have been very damaging with hail stones and flooding creating havoc that will take time to repair the damage in the garden. Damaged plants will need to be pruned to remove the damaged branches.

Unlike many dormant northern winter gardens, Mediterranean gardens can be at their best during the cooler months.

Is it a bitch, is it an entire dog, has the dog been neutered? All will be told in this meet and greet. It will also watch for Calming Signals (another issue) of great importance which can be covered at some other time.

- Watch your dog sniff around before it goes to the toilet. Is it looking for a good spot to go? Is it making enquiries as to who else has used this area as a toilet? Why do many dogs scratch the ground after going to the toilet? Are they spreading their scent further around? Are they marking territory? 'I've been here, I own this

spot.' If they want to claim a particular area, they will most likely spread their urine over the top of any existing urine in the area. They could be declaring to all and sundry - this is mine. I am bigger and stronger than you who have been here before me. Don't challenge me.

- The urine of a bitch in heat is much stronger in scent than normal. This tells the experienced male that she is in a good place for him. If the dog has never had anything to do with other dogs (the domestic pet

which is kept inside), it may not have learnt what this additional smell means. It is difficult for us as humans to really grasp how strong this smell of the bitch is to the dog especially if it is still entire. We, the human, are so bad at using our olfactory systems.

- The bitch in season which is allowed to wander creates absolute chaos in the dog world. Dogs have been known to jump fences, break out of gardens, cars etc, and do considerable damage to their places of usual

confinement even to the extent of throwing themselves through a plate glass window; such is the power of smell.

Male dogs do tend to urinate more frequently than bitches. I

would always teach my pupils it may be a good idea to teach it to go to the toilet on command, rather than just any time it pleases. All working dogs are trained to go on command.

- IF your dog gets badly hurt and injured you should rub firmly the very tip of his tail (the bone part), the rubbing will release endorphins which act like a morphine injection and will give your dog some relief of pain until you can get him to the vets or other area with medical assistance. Cover his eyes and ears at the same time as you transport him and this will settle all his senses and will also help give him relief

- Watch when two dogs meet. They shake hands in their own way just as we do.


# Show on the road!

by two models which couldn't be more contrasting. Bentley is unleashing its heavily-hyped Continental GT, while the British-built Mini Electric could be the definitive car of the next decade.

The sleek Bentley GT has a 6.0 litre W12 turbocharged en-

gine with 635hp. But it also has an electrical component propping up the air con system, making it more eco-friendly than the average Bentley. There are luxury wood finishings, driver assistance programmes and a state-of-the-

art infotainment system including Bang & Olufsen speakers.

Meanwhile Mini's Electric Concept isn't set to hit the streets until 2019, but is already slated for mass production and low-cost success. It boasts advanced aerodynamics which

help the hatchback speed along with a minimum energy expenditure. Mini have promised that it will be a car for the masses, affordably priced and a stalwart of the electric revolution of the 2020s.





# Opel/Vauxhall Crossland X

THE new Crossland X from Opel/Vauxhall is a practical family car with trendy styling which aims to bridge the gap between SUV and MPV models.

Based on a modified Peugeot 2008 platform - the French company now owns Opel/Vauxhall - the Crossland X offers a choice of engines.

The entry level versions have a 1.2 litre petrol unit and there are also turbo-petrol versions and diesels in the range. The starter models have a five-speed manual gearbox though up the range you get a six-speed box, and auto transmission is also available on some models. Prices start at €18,052 (£16,555).

The overall size of the Crossland X is very neat, managing to be quite roomy but with a smaller footprint than many SUV and MPV rivals. It is agile, easy to park, and has a smooth light-touch driving feel. With slightly raised ride-height and softer suspension set-up than many in the class, the Crossland X is a very comfortable car though I felt the front seats required a bit more shoulder support.

My test model was in SE EcoTEC trim, with a 108 hp turbo-petrol engine. This version costs €19,490 (£17,875) and has plenty of standard kit including stop-start system, touch

mph). Fuel economy is 20.3 kpl (57.6 mpg) - very good for a petrol model.

Designed to maximise interior capacity, there is good head and leg room for five adults and the boot holds 410 litres, larger than most rivals, and there is the option of a sliding rear seat which can boost space to 520 litres. Rear seats fold and an adjustable boot floor means no load lip so larger items can be loaded with minimum hassle.

With its potent looks and muscular body-cladding, the Crossland X stands out in an increasing crowded SUV/MPV marketplace and with the visual charisma to attract new buyers to the brand, is likely to be a very strong seller.



• Next for England, the winter Ashes series in Australia.

• Chris Froome (Team Sky) became only the third cyclist to win the Vuelta a España and the Tour of France in the same year. He won the Spanish race in Madrid last Sunday, ahead of Italy's Vincenzo Nibali to collect the €150,000 prize. 
