Unhappy hunting ground

DECEASED and elderly residents are alleged to be victims of identity fraud for the creation of an illegal hunting reserve.

Guardia Civil arrested four people in Crevillente on suspicion of falsifying documents, theft of civil status and coercion.

The gang, who may be part of a criminal organisation, reportedly attempted to create a 353 hectare hunting area in the village of San Felipe Neri.

One of the men arrested is president of the association El Rincon, an irrigation company, and police are probing if he dishonestly used data he had access to.

The defendants are also alleged to have contacted several complainants, encouraging them to withdraw their complaints.

The probe began when residents reported that their land had been included on a private hunting ground without their consent.

One furious local told Spanish media that hunters were laying down bait for birds and rabbits on his

€1.6 million mafia fruit sting

ange crus

AN Italian mafia boss and five gang members have been held for allegedly stealing fruit and vegetables worth €2.5 million in Alicante Province.

Officers of the Guardia Civil received a number of complaints from a fruit and vegetable grower in Cox who had been persuaded to sell 1.6 million kilos of produce to a group claiming to represent a large UK supermarket chain, but no payment was received.

When the documents accompanying the shipments were investigated, investigators found a number of irregularities which revealed that rather than being sent to the UK, the con-

signments were shipped to France, Italy and Romania and sold on the black market.

With the help of INTERPOL and the Romanian Police, the Guardia Civil was able to identify the transport company used to ship the bulk of the produce.

Detectives were able to piece together the way in which the scam operated, with the producer being sent apparently credible orders before the fruit and vegetables were collected in lorries bearing fake number plates and false livery.

These were driven to a warehouse in Real, Valencia Province, before the goods were loaded onto new vehicles

bearing legal number plates.

Apart from the members of the gang, they also arrested two Italians, one of whom has been identified as the head of a Sicilian mafia group who had, according to the Guardia Civil previously been involved on a bombing attack on his own

Clean sweep! Conservation group visits town

ACTIVE for 40 years, the Mare Nostrum project operated by the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society visited Santa Pola to assist in the clearing up of the sea bed.

Its main vessel, the Brigitte Bardot which has been travelling the Mediterranean is dedicated to the removal of plastic waste, broken nets and other detritus which is dangerous to marine life.

Working with Héctor Blasco, the driving force behind the Clean Beach Santa Pola Project as well as the Fishermen's Guild of Santa Pola and the Anthias diving centre, the vessel spent a day and half in the local waters clearing rubbish and analysing the local water.

Divers removed discarded nylon fishing nets from the sea bed as well as dangerous hooks and other rubbish, all of which can damage marine life of all kinds as well as sea birds that can swallow floating hooks or be caught up in

Earth moves

Crowning glory



OUEEN LETIZIA is known

as much more than the consort to King Felipe VI and mother to her two daughters Leonor (11) and Sofia (10). A style icon, philanthropist and Special Ambassador for the UN, she has built a reputation for being elegant, kind and socially aware, and gave the Spanish Royal Family's declining image a much-needed boost when she was crowned Queen

Not your average royal!

Like the Duchess of Cambridge Kate Middleton, Letizia does not have royal blood by birth, being the daughter of a journalist and a nurse from Oviedo, while her grandfather worked as a taxi driver.

She is the first non-noble person to be crowned Queen of Spain.

Letizia is known for her fashion sense and is often praised by fashion bloggers for her flawless outfit choices. She is a loyal Hugo Boss fan but also steps out in high street brands while on official duty.

Among her many duties as Royal Consort to the King, Letizia focuses her attention on many charitable causes and is particularly passionate about campaigning for children's rights, culture and education.

Women of means

- Isabella I (1451-1504) was the Queen of Castille and responsible for the political unification of Spain following her marriage to Ferdinand II of Aragon. She lowered the country's crime rate and unburdened the kingdom of the debt her brother had left behind.
- Mary 1 (1516-1558) was the daughter of King Henry VI-II's Spanish wife, Catherine of Aragon. As well as reigning as Queen of England and Ireland, she was the Queen consort of Spain following her marriage to King Phillip.

• Isabella II (1830-1904) was crowned Oueen at just three years old, but her succession was disputed by those who refused to recognise a female sovereign and led to the Carlist wars. She was eventually deposed in the 1868 Glorious Revolution.

> • Queen Sofia (1938-), Letizia's predecessor still takes an active role in royal duties and remains dedicated to her passions such as art, sport and charity work. She is the executive presi-

dent of the Reina Sofia Foundation which raises money to fund international projects in education, healthcare, environment and women's rights.



by cast members and friends.


Rooney girl hits Spain

Spy game!

FACEBOOK has been slapped with a €1.2 million fine after breaking Spanish law.

The Spanish Data Protection Agency (AEPD) claimed in a report that the social media site had violated their users' privacy on multiple accounts by exploiting their personal data for advertising purposes.

The AEPD focused on how Facebook harvests information on people's sexuality, religious beliefs and ideologies without informing them how it plans to use this information. The agency said that users did not give the social network consent to manipulate their information for these purposes and revealed that the company broke more laws by not deleting the data once it was no longer useful.

In a statement, Facebook rejected the accusations and claimed that the AEPD was wrong to accuse the company of showing advertising based

on sensitive personal information. They assert that their adtargeting was solely based on content people 'liked' on the

However, under EU law, 'any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person' qualifies as personal data, which includes the content people 'like.'

Spain has followed the example of France, Belgium and Germany who have also taken action against the company in

Attack trial delayed

A TOTAL of eight years imprisonment has been requested by the prosecution after an attack on a nightclub doorman.

The 57-year-old man was accused of 'glassing' the victim in the face and left him with lasting damage to both eyes when the doorman asked him to leave the premises in Torrevieja. The trial has only now come to court in Elche so that a full account of the events can be established from a number of witnesses.

So severe were the injuries to the man that he was off work for over six months and he is still suffering as a result of the attack with sight issues in both eyes that required emergency surgery at the time.

The prosecution is seeking compensation of €190,000, plus interest to cover the intervening years since the incident, and a further €8,730 for the injuries. They are also seeking the payment of court costs and other legal expens-

The attack took place during a stag night that was being celebrated at the well-known venue in the Vega Baja area which has recorded a number of similar incidents in recent years that have been put down to the amount of people in the venue and the effects of alcohol.

If the Spanish government expends so much time on trying to recover a tiny enclave at the southernmost tip of the country, it now has to look elsewhere to an area that covers 32,000 square kilometres and has a population of 7.5 million.

The Catalonian Parliament is simply ignoring instructions received from the national government and the majority ruling party no longer recognises the legitimacy of Spain in the area.

It intends to proceed with what is regarded by Spain as an illegal referendum as it wants to declare independence and has even indicated that it intends to retain the euro as the official currency in the event that it does secede from Spain.

The European Union has made it clear that it would not recognise a new Catalan State and that it would not be able to officially use the euro as its unit of cur-

As police officers raid offices in Barcelona, there have been demonstrations on the streets but we can only hope that if the referendum goes ahead, there will be no independence majority otherwise the country runs the risk of falling into total chaos.

Fires in the city

FIVE fires broke out in the space of just three hours in the centre of Alicante.

All were found in rubbish containers in different parts of the city and it is believed they were all started deliberately, possibly by the same person as they made their way on foot around the streets. Emergency services were called to the scenes between 4.15am and 7am.

The first was in the Gran Via in a bin found on the corner of Calle Rafael García Vidal, and the second at 5.30am on Calle Quevedo. An hour later, firefighters were called to another container on fire on Calle Santa Marta by the Plaza Gabriel Miro, followed by two more in the space of a few minutes on Calle Gerona and Calle Bazán.

Six firefighters needed to be sent to each fire and became a strain on the resources of the city's fire service during the three hours of the incidents.

Three patrols of the Alicante Local Police also joined the firefighters to cut off the affected streets which didn't cause too much inconvenience to traffic at that time of the morning.

Collision results in four injured

A 24-YEAR-OLD man was seriously hurt and three others were left with minor injuries following a collision between two cars on the N-

The events occurred when an Opel Corsa was involved in a head-on crash with a Fiat 500 on the N-332 road in Santa Pola adjacent to the Pola Park amusement cen-

tre. Emergency services attended the scene and members of the fire brigade were called to disconnect the cars' batteries to prevent the possibility of fire breaking

All four people involved in the accident - three in the Opel Corsa and the driver of the Fiat 500 - suffered various injuries with the

most serious of them needing to be freed after being trapped in the back of the car. They were all taken to the Elche General Hospital.

The other occupants of the Opel were men aged 25 and 27 who both suffered bruises and minor abdominal pain. The driver of the Fiat - a 59-year-old woman - also suffered bruising.

First 'hostel' complaints

CARTAGENA will be getting a boost to its hospitality sector with a new 47 room hotel.

Planned to open in time for next Easter, the completely new building will be more of a 'hostel' that offers multiple rooms for sharing although there will be a number of single and double rooms. The works have already begun and the promoters behind the project - Gestión Hotelera SL - want to have everything ready in time for the Easter parades.

The location for the hotel is on the empty 341 square metre plot in Calle San Crispín, close to Calle San Diego, and classed as an important tourist area for Cartagena as well as attracting students and friends of the Cartagena University. The plan is to create special packages during this time.

The completed hotel will comprise four floors and a basement level with 47 rooms covering a total of 1.900m2. Two of the rooms will accommodate eight people, one for six, 25 for four people to share, 16 double rooms and three singles. There will

also be one especially adapted for disabled use and all rooms will have a bathroom, air-conditioning and a WiFi connection. Extra facilities in the building will included a gymnasium, games room and a solarium.

This will be one of the first of its kind to open in the Murcia region that will have official 'hostel' designation. The sharing rooms will have very cheap rates - between €17 and €20 a night - while the rest, intended for the

use of families and businessmen will cost around €40.

RYA Gestión Hotelera SL has also announced that similar hostel-type projects will shortly be announced for Madrid and in Estepona in Málaga.

The project in Cartagena has not been welcomed by all, with some locals believing that the amount of young people in the area using the facilities can only lead to trouble and noise at night.

THE cost of the extra hours worked by members of the Local Police, firefighters and certain council workers in Cartagena will cost €1,000,000 more than originally budgeted.

This was acknowledged by Councillor Francisco Aznar in answer to a question raised during a council meeting by the opposition Partido Popular (PP)

Due to the ongoing level four security alert throughout Spain, there will be a need for a further 71,000 hours of work to be undertaken by the three main groups of workers which has resulted in the overall budget now standing at €2,560,000.

Broken down, an additional 18,000 hours are to be worked by municipal workers, 29,000 by Local Police and 24,000 by firefighters, but the councillor did emphasise the €2.56m budget was the same as last year. Those costs were €1.3m for Local Police €755 000 for the fire brigade and €515,000 for municipal services.

THE famous Plaza de Santo Domingo in Murcia will see an increase in the amount of space available for pedestrians and the accessibility of

emergency vehicles.

The projected extra 330 square metres will be achieved by asking restaurants in the square to reduce the current number of 186 permitted tables to 106, and the affected establishments will be given three months to remove the offending pieces of street furniture.

The stated aim of the local council is to come to an acceptable agreement with the business owners to balance their needs to attract customers with those of passing

pedestrians and the requirement of vehicle access in accordance with the existing

The logistics of such a move have been studied in great detail. Therefore, the current 19 establishments that have 186 tables between them will be reduced by 44 per cent and left with 106.

The Plaza de Santo Domingo is the latest in the city centre to have its seating capacity reduced following on from the Plaza de Europa. That saw its number of tables being reduced by 20 per cent to 45 from 60. Next on the list for revamping will be the areas of Cristo del Rescate and Cristo del Resucitado.





created in the industry which accounted for the extra 7.222 work contracts.





Farmers do give a fig

THE annual harvesting of the fig in Elche has come to an end with a slight increase in the number of the fruit picked compared to last season.

The extra figs have been caused by the increased rainfall during the winter but this has been counteracted by the very dry spring and summer which reduced the overall quality and calibre of them.

Another consequence of

the extra production has been the reduction in price and according to the main producers in Elche, Cambayas, the 670 tons harvested this year will probably reach a market price of less than €1 per kilo.

It may only be a few cents lower than last year, but translated into hundreds of thousands of kilos, it marks a significant drop of income for the producers.

Despite the increase in the harvest, the fact is that many figs have been left unpicked from the trees or simply left to rot in the orchards due to their lack of quality, and these account for about 10 per cent of the production.

More than half of the figs are exported to other European countries with France and Switzerland being the main purchasers.

explosion of cases reported

CASES of Hepatitis A have jumped to very high levels in the Murcia region this year.

This is believed to be as a result of an outbreak that began last November and has intensified in the 10 months since. Between January and August, a total of 155 people have been diagnosed with the condition compared to only 16 in the corresponding period of time last year.

The figures in Murcia are mirroring increases in other parts of Spain in particular, and in the rest of the world in general, and is of growing concern to the World Health Organisation (WHO).

Hepatitis A causes acute inflammation of the liver, and although unlike hepatitis C it is not chronic, it can become serious, especially in adults and is mainly contracted by men having sex with other men.

Therefore, the health authority has initiated a vaccination campaign with the support of a number of LGBT organisations directly aimed at men who are sexually active in this way.

However, this latest outbreak of hepatitis A has coincided with an overall shortage of vaccines due to a lack of supply from the pharmaceutical industry, which at one point left the local health service with almost zero vaccines for several months. The issue was solved in June of this year when they acquired a further consignment of 3,500 doses.

Hepatitis A virus is present in faeces, so it can be transmitted during unprotected sex. In addition there is also a minimal risk of catching the virus from using towels in shared bathrooms. In Spain, unlike many less developed countries in the world, it is highly unlikely that contamination would come from water or the food



union are currently waiting for the official announcement from the hospital as to exactly when it's planned to open operating theatres on a Saturday. They are looking to see how the shifts are going to be reorganised which will need to take into account that following a surgical procedure, the patients then need the care of nursing staff that are traditionally reduced at the weekends.

The new operation schedule would need, according to the unions, an extra nurse on duty on a Saturday afternoon and evening.

ALICANTE: Tourist offices still popular despite mobile apps.

City tourist office records

THE Alicante tourist board has announced that the tourist offices of Alicante have received a total of 43,243 visitors during the months of June, July and August; a figure that represents an increase of 17 per cent when compared to the same period in 2016.

Councillor Eva Montesinos, pointed out that the increase this year is due to the more than 5,000 extra foreign visitors coming mainly from the United Kingdom - up by over 12 per cent - and Italy with 3.6 per cent, who chose Alicante as a tourist destination during their holidays.

Of the total of 43,243 people that visited the tourist offices during the three month summer period, 21,983 of those - accounting for 72 per cent - were foreign visitors made up of those from France (27 per cent), UK (24 per cent) and Italy (12.7 per cent) with Germany, the Netherlands, Russia and Sweden following up behind.

Spanish tourists from Madrid made up 37.1 per cent of the tourist office trade and

20.4 per cent from Alicante itself.

Delighted sources from the Alicante Council said: "The high increase in the number of visitors to the tourist offices in Alicante confirms that both their location and opening times are popular. Since visitors are increasingly using mobile apps to find out the information they need about tourist attractions and locations, a 17 per cent increase to the tourist offices is very positive."

Party incensed by 'unfair' budget

DISPROPORTIONAL allocation of an €83 million budget has infuriated a Costa Blanca party.

CLARO are furious at the latest budget and have called for major increases in Orihuela Costa funding which they believe is considerably out of proportion with the amount Orihuela City receives.

The political group are neither left nor right and their sole goal is to make the region a better place to live.

The proposed budget has increased €8.8 million this year, largely due to an increase in local property tax (IBI) and the sale of coastal land for investments.

Orihuela Costa contributes 60 per cent of the municipal income and CLARO claim that the region receives an unfair return.

New houses keep getting built on coastal land but the party say efforts should be made to greater accommodate residents already in the

They suggest projects such as a day centre for retired residents, extra personnel for the Playa Flamenca Town Hall,

reduced sports centre fees, as well as measures to reduce traffic congestion by completion of Via Parallela, the system of linked roads running parallel to the N332.

They also highlight the need for more pedestrian bridges over the N332 where many people are risking their lives running across the mo-

The Popular/Citizens coalition government claim that Orihuela Costa will get an extra €1.8 million towards maintenance of parks, gardens, streets and beaches compared to the 2016 budget.

But CLARO state that this increase is not in proportion with an ever-increasing popu-

A particular factor they ridiculed was the €1 million cut to street cleaning and rubbish removal which they say is already inadequate with many areas having rubbish and garden waste lying outside for days

All parties agreed in 2012, when CLARO had an elected councillor, that 40 per cent of investments would go to Orihuela Costa in recognition of the sizeable contributions it makes coupled with a history of neglect from the city.

With 2017 investments standing at €13 million, Orihuela Costa are receiving no more than 20 per cent, half of that which was agreed.

CLARO also ridiculed the €50,000 allocated towards the study of a cultural centre and library, speculating that it will prove as drawn out as the still-incomplete emergency services centre, which has its foundations laid 10 years ago.

The party believes that if a cultural centre and library had been built on land opposite Zenia Boulevard, which currently serves as a car park, the imbalance would not be so significant compared with the similarly-populated Orihuela City which has three libraries. and two (soon to be three) cultural centres.

Claro have insisted that they will continue to fight for Orihuela Costa and that major demonstrations such as the recent ones at the town hall and during the La Vuelta cycle race will keep taking place until they believe justice and equality have been achieved.

Better credit rating for bank

This will come as welcome news to what has been regarded as the most vulnerable medium-sized bank still trading in Spain.

Spanish rich get richer

THOSE Spaniards with money are seeing their worth expand more quickly than ever and there are now 549 taxpavers with fortunes worth more than €30 million.

Unlike most of the other members of the European Union, Spain still operates a wealth tax and requires anyone with a gross taxable wealth in excess of €1 million to register and pay the additional tax.

The latest report from Spanish Tax Agency shows that 188,680 individuals signed declarations to establish their obligation to pay this tax and of By John Smith

those, approximately one third had cash and assets in excess of €1.5 million which is a 10 per cent increase over figures from five years earlier.

One reason may be that the Tax Authorities have taken action to identify wealth within the country following much publicised alleged evasion often from politicians and more recently footballers.

In addition, a tax amnesty which allowed the rich to pay only a small proportion of tax owed may have not previously been registered for the wealth tax

The combined assets of all of those who have registered to pay wealth tax totals €582 billion which equates to nearly 50 per cent of Spain's Gross National Product and a single individual, Amancio Ortega founder of Inditex accounts for €71 billion of that to-

Whilst those with few investments see a slow growth, there seems to be some truth in the old saying that 'money attracts money.'

US firm promotes Santander

MORGAN STANLEY the powerful American investment company is very bullish about the potential for rises in the shares of Spanish bank Santander.

It has upped its target price for the shares three times in the last six months even though actual price on the stock exchange has not matched the forecasts.

It is suggested by outside analysts that the decision to recommend the shares is based on expectations of medium-term increased profits thanks to the takeover of Banco Popular.

Fear of new bank failures

ECB wants control over client deposits

ONE of European banking's most powerful women, Daniele Nouy

wants to introduce fresh powers to prevent depositors from removing funds from struggling banks.

The European Central Bank's (ECB) Chair of Banking Supervision wants to have the right to temporarily suspend the ability of customers to withdraw their money from banks facing financial difficulty.

This ban would cover cash withdrawals at the bank, through cash machines and by online transfer.

She explained in a letter to a Member of the European Parliament that due to the fact a problem within a bank could quickly see a run on its liquidity which could be fuelled by social media comment and the ease of internet banking.

The recent problems with Banco Popular in Spain and Monte dei Paschi di Siena in Italy are examples of how matters can escalate quickly, although in the case of Banco Popular, current and imminent law suits from disgruntled investors suggest the final decision to demand its quick sale may have been premature.

In 2016, the ECB had tried to introduce a restriction on the removal of funds in excess of €100,000, as generally lower amounts are covered by national governments. It has actually even commented that the authorities should have the right to delay payment of lesser funds for between five and 20 days.

The Bank - which is owned by member states of the European Union - only has legal powers over the 19 members of the eurozone and perhaps surprisingly, the third largest shareholder with a 13.67 per cent holding is the Bank of England exceeded only by France and Germany.

The chairman of the ECB is an Italian, Mario Draghi and critics of the bank suggest that he influenced a decision to allow the Italian govern-

ment to circumvent the rules in order to bail out the fast failing

This proposal to allow the suspension of withdrawals in emergency situations is taken by analysts to suggest the ECB does expect more commercial banking failures in the future and wants to have legislation in place at the earliest opportunity in order to take control, albeit briefly, of deposits placed in good faith by the general public and corporate investors.

Fruit and vegetable imports

MOROCCO was the biggest supplier of fruit and vegetables to Spain in the first half of 2017 with exports totalling €404 million.

This shows a 33 per cent increase on the previous six months and Spanish purchases have increased generally with large volumes also being imported from Brazil and Costa Rica.

According to a report issued by the Spanish Federation of Associations of Producers and Exporters of Fruits, Vegetables, Flowers, and Live Plants(FEPEX) imports from the European Union are also up by 8 per cent with France and Italy being the two major suppliers, closely followed by Portugal and the Netherlands.

Potatoes and tomatoes were the major products exported to Spain, although fruits were also high on the

CATALONIA BUSINESS TAX PAYER'S DILEMMA

A rock and a hard place

AS the split between the Catalan and national governments gets wider, the latest salvo concerns the payment of income tax and IVA (VAT).

The Spanish Finance Ministry has issued a blunt statement 'reminding' tax payers in Catalonia that any payment should be made to the correct authority which is the national govern-

Any company or self-employed person which pays money due for VAT, income tax or corporation tax to the Catalan authority will be considered as having not paid the tax and may be open to criminal charges.

This statement was made in advance of the threatened Independence Referendum which will possibly be held on Sunday October 1 as the Catalan government has created an enlarged Catalan Tax Authority which is ready to divert the collection of national taxes to the 'New Catalan State.'

According to Catalan Deputy First Minister Oriol Junqueras, systems are in place to allow for the collection of some €42 billion of tax as soon as the decision to create an in-



In Spanish law, if VAT is collected and then not paid to the correct authority it will leave the collector open to a charge of theft and if a company, all of the directors could face charges.

The Spanish government appears powerless to stop the proposed referendum although it has been declared illegal for the Catalan Parliament to even buy ballot boxes using Community funds, although it is suspected that the ballot boxes and voting papers are currently being held in a secret loca-

As the referendum date approaches, both Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy and Catalan leader Carles Puigdemont regularly indulge in a war of words with each other which is now certain to be fought out in the courts and with potential arrests of Catalan politicians and their supporters.

Tourist spend up again

VISITORS to Spain spent €49 billion in the first seven months of the year, an increase of 15 per cent over the same period in 2016.

The July total was slightly less than €12 billion according to the National Statistics Institute.

The figures show that the United Kingdom accounts for the highest spend by tourist visitors, parting with €9.9 billion which was 20.2 per cent of total spend, followed by the Germans at €6.86 billion (14 per cent) and Scandinavians at €4.16 billion (8.5 per cent).

The three most popular destinations were Catalonia, Canary Islands and the Balearics which between them saw 58 per cent of the total amount of holidaymakers money spent.

AUGUST is a weird month for employment. Statistics are promising early on thanks to the people engaged in July to serve beer to tourists and make hotel beds.

Boots on the other foot


POLLS show that the Basques are more concerned about employment than independence.

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Back to school

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by $members\ of\ the\ Guardia\ Civil\ based\ in\ Torrevieja,\ Costa\ Blanca,\ who\ set\ up\ the\ N332\ web$ site and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



IT'S that time of year once again when the summer is coming to a close, and attentions start to turn back to yet another annual phenomenon, back to school time.

Although it might be a relief for some parents, it might also be a disappointment for some children, in road safety terms we have to be aware that the characteristics of the road network will once again change.

Firstly, we have an increase in traffic at certain times of day as parents resume the school run. It is quite normal for traffic to increase in the mornings because of this, which in turn can result in delays. The same situation applies at the end of the school day, but at what time? Often, in Spain, schools operate a less robust timetable, adapting to such things as weather conditions and light, and so the school day often varies from season to season. All non-parents can do to prepare for this is be aware of the changing timetable and allow extra time for all journeys.

If you are taking your children to school by car, remember that children under 1.35

metres in height are not allowed in the front seats of the car. There are one or two exceptions, which you can read about on the website. n332.es.

Children must be secured in the vehicle, by means of a seatbelt, or specially designed retention system suitable for them. Any objects they are carrying must also be secure in the vehicle.

When you arrive at the school drop off point, remember that the laws still apply to you, the same as any other driver. You are still not allowed to double park, block entrances, or park in an illegal place with your hazard lights on just because you are dropping off your children for school. You must choose a safe, convenient and legal place to drop off your children. Where possible, ensure that they exit the vehicle on the pavement side, still warning them to be aware of their surroundings before opening the door.

During late September, there will be an awareness campaign focusing on seatbelt and child restraint use, and the use of seatbelts on school buses (where fitted).

Does he need a Spanish licence?

Yesterday I was stopped by the Guardia Civil, who asked to see my vehicle documents. They then asked my date of birth and then went back to their car and were on the radio for about five minutes. When they returned I was presented with a €500 fine for not having a Span-

ish driving licence. They never asked to see my licence at all. I do not have residence in Spain as I have only been here a few months, so I was shocked. On the back of the form it says I can appeal within 20 days. Any advice?

PW (Costa Blanca)

Yes, appeal immediately. You do not say, but whether you are an EU citizen or a non-EU citizen in Spain, you can use your home country driving licence for six months, which is



the legal limit for a tourist stay. If you are an EU citizen, you can use your EU driving licence in Spain until it expires, even if you obtain a residence certificate. If you are not EU, you must obtain a Spanish driving licence when you become a resi-


found the new flight, I changed the old one, I did it all myself. So what service am I getting?



Up until this year we were in love with the place for providing amazing service and food exactly as we ordered.

This year, however, something has gone horribly wrong. We've been in Nerja since early June and have visited the restaurant six times plus ordered a takeaway for lunch. Every meal we've ordered has had to be sent back because we have found meat in the food. They are obviously cooking a standard batch of, for example, Pad Thai, and then just removing the meat.

I advise dozens of clients a week all across the world on nutrition so I feel it

What are haemor-rhoids?

Haemorrhoids are venous dilatations that appear in the area of the anus. Normally they do not cause any problems, however they can get inflamed and cause a lot of pain, and form clots that become infected which cause bleeding.

What are its symptoms?

Some of the symptoms of haemorrhoids may include bleeding after passing a stool, an itchy bottom. A lump hanging down outside of the anus, which may need to be pushed back in after passing a stool and/or soreness, redness and swelling around your anus.

What causes them?

These dilatations can be cause by a number of things including straining, recent surgery in and around the area and illnesses that cause the intestinal walls to weaken are among them.

How can you treat haemorrhoids?

There are various ways of treating haemorrhoids. Bathing in warm water, some medicines and ointments usually help circulation which can fix the problem however sometimes surgery is the only solution

When should you seek medical attention?

You should always see your doctor if you feel your symptoms are serious or even contact emergency services.

Can it be prevented?

There are certain situations which increase the chances of haemorrhoids appearing, and certain people who are more likely to get them due to weaker intestinal walls. In general, avoid straining excessively and sitting on the toilet to defecate with your legs flexed helps prevent haemorrhoids appearing.

Gluten-free: friend or foe?

THE demand for gluten free-food has exploded in recent years. Ten years ago, anyone with gluten intolerance had to pre-order certain foods to maintain a varied diet but now you can walk into almost any supermarket and find bread, biscuits, cakes and even chicken nuggets all marked with the desired label.

This is all thanks to the gluten-free diet craze that has swept the western world, particularly the US and UK. Nowadays, people who do not even test positive for celiac disease, or any kind of intolerance, are choosing to cut it out of their diets completely,


claiming that they experience notable health improvements as a result.

As research is ongoing, there is evidence to support both sides of the debate over whether cutting gluten out of your diet is actually good for you. A TOAST TO GOOD FOOD. **GOOD WINE** AND GOOD **FRIENDS**

WITH GARRY

T is eight years ago today that the world of television lost one of its greatest and most successful food presenters.

Dubbed the first celebrity chef, Keith Floyd redefined the way that cookery programmes were presented. Away from the clinical studio style of Fanny and Johnny Craddock and even the delightful Delia Smith, Keith brought 'personality' to food.

His apparently bumbling, sometimes incompetent preparation and presentation of food delighted millions of viewers.

Keith was born in Exmoor and went to Wellington School. He first started in journalism before joining the army, the Third Royal Tank Regiment, in 1963.

Sadly this was not to last and the army's loss was the catering world's gain. Keith started his catering career like most of us in those days by washing up and preparing vegetables in restaurants in France (where he learnt

to speak virtually fluent French) and London before opening his first restaurant in Clifton, Bristol in 1966 at the age of 23.

Floyd's Bistro opposite the Grand Spa Hotel and close to the famous suspension bridge had long wooden tables and benches and served inexpensive 'French' Bistro type food. Very popular with young people who used to queue outside to wait for a space in the refectory style dining

Keith's life became synonymous with hard drinking and heavy smoking as the years rolled on, but in the early days a glass of wine and a good meal were his raison d'être and his first marriage in 1967 at the tender age of 24 to Jesmond Ruttledge boded a step into what could be called a normal life.

However there were two things that Floyd was not too good at - relationships and business. After three years of marriage he and Jess split up, he having become a father to Patrick. In the early 70's he sold the restaurant to another friend of mine Neil Ramsay (no relation to Gordon) who increased business at the already successful bistro and through the latter years he reformed it until it became more of a fine dining restaurant which his son Peter eventually took over.

It certainly did Neil well enough to retire very early!!

With the proceeds from the sale of his restaurant, Floyd 'broke free' and bought himself a yacht and sailed the Mediterranean. After 18 months and not having seen his son for that time he returned to spend more time with him but this time with a new woman in his life. That didn't last too long either and he soon met Paddy, the editor of the paper for whom he first wrote.

They took the brave move of opening a restaurant in his beloved France, in the Provencal town of L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue. Things didn't go well and so they returned to the UK and went their separate ways.


Floyd moved to Ireland

ON what he called a 'Murphy's inspired whim' but that didn't work out either. In an effort to get back on track Keith opened the Maltser's Arms in Tuckenhay in Devon, the sign outside saying Floyd's Inn (sometimes). Even with a young talented French chef in the form of Jean Cristophe Novelli, the pub was to go the same way as his


'lend' his name to a Floyd's Brasserie in Phuket in 2007 which gave him an excuse to travel a lot to another part of the world he loved.

more time back in the UK. It was there, on September 14, 2009 having been given the 'all clear' drink vour health.

By 2009 his lifestyle came back to haunt him as he was treated for bowel cancer. He spent a lot of time recovering at the home of mutual friend Paul Hickling, of Roman Oasis fame but spent from his cancer he went out for lunch with his companion Celia to celebrate. On their return they were expecting to watch a documentary, Keith on Keith (by Keith Allen). But he never got to see it. He died of a heart attack while sitting on the sofa. He was 65. Cheers my friend, I'm just going to pour myself a glass of wine to



His last couple of years.

I first met Keith

WHEN we both had restaurants in Bristol. I also took over one of them in Clifton in the early 80's.

One of his many restaurants, however, was to become the birth place of Floyd's huge rise to TV success. I got a phone call from his able bodied right hand woman, Angie, in a bit of a panic as she was getting ready to open his latest venture in Clifton, but Keith had gone AWOL!!

If I remember she had had a flood in the place and there was no kitchen help and the restaurant had bookings. So I sent up two of my chefs to help her out and we opened Floyd's for him!

was a chap called David Pritchard.

a producer from BBC Southampton TV. Each time he came in Keith would avoid speaking to him as he kept sending messages to the reluctant star asking if he could do a TV programme with him. David's persistence paid off and Keith was persuaded to make a pilot.

Filmed in a domestic kitchen in Southampton, Floyd on Fish was born. Floyd on Food, Floyd on Fire and even Far Flung Floyd were to follow. One day somebody asked him if he had chosen the name Floyd on purpose so as he could match it to the programmes and books!! Success grew and grew.

With his new style of presentation, "Come here Clive (cameraman) focus on the food that's what the viewers want not pictures of me!" But it wasn't really.

The viewers tuned in, in their millions to watch the 'bow-tied' 'shabby-chic' presenter 'slurping' his wine and bossing Clive around.

Success did mean that he left a lot of his old friends behind. In 1985, I interviewed him for my radio show in Bristol at the time. It was an easy interview.

After all it was just two mates sitting discussing one of their lives and good fortune. I

left the UK in 1986 and did not see him again until 1992 while he was filming Floyd on Spain. By then he had started drinking. Not just his occasional wine, but Scotch.

Also he had married again, Julie Hatcher was to provide Keith with his second child Poppy. But success, travelling and drinking took their toll and they eventually divorced.



Landlords' winter goldmine

LANDLORDS are opening their homes to students in record numbers. Spain's student renters are now among the fastest growing demographics in the property market.

The rise in students searching for their own shared flats has not gone unnoticed by homeowners looking for a solution to the seasonality problem.

Students fit the mould perfectly. Rents are typically from September to May or June, just when rates can be dramatically raised for summer.

Online bookings of rooms in Spanish cities by students has grown 60 per cent in 2017 compared to last year.

On average students also pay more per month than working tenants for their rent.

That gap is emphasised with international students, who pay €392 each month, €30 more than the av-

erage Spanish student. Americans fork out €460 for a room. They spend less time in the country, however, at just five months.

Nor is it just Madrid and Barcelona who are benefiting from the student expansion. Strong student populations exist in Sevilla, Malaga, Valencia, Asturias and Granada.

More and more young Spanish are moving to different cities to

study, away from the parental nest. They also want the independence of distinct accommodation, rather than opting for halls of residence. The halls themselves are being spruced up and advertised to Chinese students at eyewatering prices.

Landlords are able to demand a reference and a parental guarantee to ensure deposits are paid, the rent is timely and the place isn't a mess by the end of the contract.

2017 shaping up nicely

BBVA's Research department has put together its bi-annual Real Estate Observatory of Spain report. The comprehensive analysis draws on data from the General Council of Notaries for the first half of

The report welcomes what it describes as the 'good tone' of the Spanish property market. In six months, 265,000 deeds of sale have been completed. That makes the consensus target of half a million homes sold by the year's end more than likely to be achieved.

BBVA also welcomes the increase in mortgage lending across the board and the continued evolution of Spain's construction industry, especially in the residential sector.

Spain's sales volume increase has been accompanied by a GDP growth of 0.9 per cent in the second quarter of 2017. An estimated 377,000 jobs were also created from January to July.

Financing costs to purchase a new home hit a historic low in July. Credit has expanded as consumer confidence grows and lenders fiddle with debt restructuring programmes to make them more secure.

Outside the residential sector the news is good for the wider property market. Sales of work

premises, offices and industrial warehouses, shot up by 10 per cent in the first half of the year. The office sector in particular is experiencing major foreign investment as Spain's cities attract more global business.

Hot summer nights in the garden

GRAEME TYRRELL

WE all look forward to summer for the bright sunny days and balmy nights to enjoy the outdoors, the beaches and nightlife. The garden is also a favourite place to relax, even more so if you have a pool.

This summer has had hot-

ter than normal night temperatures in many zones of Spain. This has had its effects on the gardens.


Many native plants in our Mediterranean gardens can cope with this heat but the introduced plants from temperate climates and many vegetables can be severely affected by the lack of cooler weather in which they are accustomed to grow.

Many temperate plants in exposed positions have suffered from the heat and will appear drooped and with growth stunted. Watering can assist as it cools the root zone, but a more permanent solution to save water is to surround the plants with mulch to insulate the root zone from direct sun heating up the soil.

Providing shade over the plants during the hot periods of summer is also a good option to ensure the plants pass the summer to thrive the rest of the year. A frame covered in shade cloth is a good option for protecting valuable plants.

With autumn coming the lessons of the summer heat is that new planting, that should be being planned now for a flourishing winter/spring garden, need to include strategies for protecting the delicate plants to be able to pass the next summer without being set back. Make sure that your delicate plants are placed in areas that have shade from the summer midday sun.

If you have found your

vegetable garden has suffered with no other apparent cause then it may well be the high night temperatures that have affected tomatoes, pumpkins and many other vegetables to die off earlier this year.

The good thing is that there is space to plant out earlier this year for the autumn and winter crops so they are better established before the colder weather that slows them down sets

The summer storms developed by the summer heat provide a great opportunity for the garden to be prepared for the autumn planting as they stimulate growth and add nitrogen to the soil from the combination of lightning and rain.

Some storms have been very damaging though with hail stones and flooding creating havoc that will take time to repair the damage in the garden. Damaged

plants will need to be pruned to remove the damaged branches.

Gardens always recover though with our help and the soil is improved with the rain adding relief for the thirsty trees and plants. After the rains the soil, when moist rather than wet, is ideal for digging over and adding compost in preparation for the autumn planting of new trees, shrubs, herbs, vegetables and annuals.

Unlike many dormant northern winter gardens, Mediterranean gardens can be at their best during the cooler months.

The use of native Mediterranean plants as a foundation for the garden will ensure the garden will always manage the summer heat and we can prepare our favourite temperate plants with some extra care to also get them through the hot

- IF your dog gets badly hurt and injured you should rub firmly the very tip of his tail (the bone part), the rubbing will release endorphins which act like a morphine injection and will give your dog some relief of pain until you can get him to the vets or other area with medical assistance. Cover his eyes and ears at the same time as you transport him and this will settle all his senses and will also help give
- Watch when two dogs meet. They shake hands in their own way just as we do. While we use the touch system by shaking the other person's hand, the dog uses his olfactory sys-

tem by scenting the other dog out, particularly in the nether regions. This form of communication between two or more dogs is total and they are getting every piece of information they require from that dog, by what they smell.

Is it a bitch, is it an entire dog, has the dog been neutered? All will be told in this initial meet and greet. It will also watch for Calming Signals (another issue) of great importance which can be covered at some other

• Watch your dog sniff around before it goes to the toilet. Is it looking for a good spot to go? Is it making enquiries as to who else has used this area as a toilet? Why do many dogs scratch the ground after going to the toilet? Are they spreading their scent further around? Are they marking territory? 'I've been here, I own this spot.' If they want to claim a particular area, they will most likely spread their urine over the top of any existing



urine in the area. They could be declaring to all and sundry - this is mine. I am bigger and stronger than you who have been here before me. Don't

• The urine of a bitch in heat is much stronger in scent than normal. This tells the experienced male that

she is in a good place for him. If the dog has never had anything to do with other dogs (the domestic pet which is kept inside), it may not have learnt what this additional smell means. It is difficult for us as humans to really grasp how strong this smell of the bitch is to the dog especially if it is still entire. We, the human, are so bad at using our olfactory systems.

• The bitch in season which is allowed to wander creates absolute chaos in the dog world. Dogs have been known to jump fences, break out of gardens, cars etc, and do considerable damage to their places of usual confinement even to the extent of throwing themselves through a plate glass window; such is the power of

Male dogs do tend to urinate more frequently than bitches. This not really a necessity within the dog, it is usually a dominance, perhaps territorial function it develops when allowed.

I would always teach my pupils that it may be a good idea to teach it to go to the toilet on command, rather than just any time it pleases. All working dogs are trained to go on command, it would not be good for a working dog to just go to mark territory it doesn't really own. I am sure your trainer will give you help on this.
