Beach ready!

THE Costa del Sol is set to sizzle as the hot, dry wind known as the terral sweeps Malaga Province. With the mercury expected to soar to 34°C today (Thursday) and tomorrow, sun-worshippers are expected to hit the beach in droves ahead of the weekend.

But the blast of heat will only affect the local area, with most of Spain suffering the effects of a mass of cold air that will see daytime temperatures on the Costa del Sol plummet to around 25°C from Saturday.

Culture vulture

Thousands of non-resident British who own property on the Costa del Sol are probably unaware that an IBI property tax revamp could see their council bills double.

One British retiree has hit out at the Spanish law change that saw him facing increased charges after being automatically removed from council databases.

"The annoying thing is that they don't send invoices or inform anyone so a lot of people might not even realise," said 68-year-old Derek Needham who owns an apartment in Benalmadena which he visits "four, five or six times a year."

Derek, who lives near Great Yarmouth in East Anglia, bought his home in Puerto Marina 20 years ago and had been enrolled on the padron, or council register, as doing so entitled him to a 50 per cent discount on his IBI payments.

But when the first of this year's three instalments was taken by standing order in May, the payment was twice

as much as he expected.

After calling Benalmadena Council, Derek was told that non-residents had been removed from the padron and are no longer entitled to IBI discounts and other similar benefits.

"We ought to pay less as we don't use local services as much as residents," said Derek, who is fighting to get his money back.

"I've sent various letters to

throughout Spain, it has nothing to do with the mayor or council here."

When quizzed why non-residents received no notification of the changes, or why Derek's emails remain unanswered, he declined to comment further.

In 2014 the Spanish government was found guilty of overcharging thousands of non-residents for inheritance tax by the European Court of Justice, entitling at least 30,000 Britons to refunds.

"I can't understand why this is different," said Derek. "It all just feels a bit unfair."

A Benalmadena Town Hall official confirmed: "If somebody is non-resident, they can no longer be on the padron, and if they're not on the padron they must pay the full IBI amount."

"This instruction came from the central government last October and is applicable

Beer brand returns home

CERVEZA VICTORIA, the historic Malaga beer brand, opened their new factory back on home soil last week following a €6 million investment.

The new factory was ready for its official inauguration on Wednesday September 6, to coincide with the day of Malaga's public saint, despite only being in the works for 10 months.

The opening was attended by executives of the Damm Group, who own the brand, as well as prominent figures from the city council and local businesses.

The event was significant for many as it marked the first time the beer has been produced in Malaga since the original factory on the Guadalhorce estate closed its doors over 20 years ago.

NEW FACTORY: Beer enthusiasts are able to visit and taste.

Cerveza Victoria was originally founded in 1928 by the Franquelo family, several members of which attended the new factory's launch nearly 90 years later, and became a popular brand in the 1960s.

Over 40 employees will work at the new brewery, with the possibility of more jobs as production increases.

The new site has the capacity to produce 1.2 million litres a year, while any extra demand will continue to be made in the Murcia factory where the beer was brewed for the last two decades. The company aims to eventually move all production back to Malaga, however, which will require further investment of around €15 million.

Beer enthusiasts are able to visit the factory located on Avenue Velazquez which also boasts an onsite museum and a large room designed to host tastings, events and even concerts.

Brothel shooting arrests

FIVE suspects have been held in connection with a shootout at a Costa del Sol brothel. It comes after police launched a probe in the wake of the attack, which hospitalised two men, aged 23 and 35, and two women aged 30 and 31, mostly of French-Algerian origin.

One victim remains in critical condition after at least three bullets slammed into his chest and stomach, while the others are reportedly stable.

The gunfire broke out at 9am at an establishment on Calle Víctor O'hayon Taplero in the La Carolina urbanisation on Marbella's upmarket Golden Mile.

Police said in a statement that a fight had broken out between two groups inside the club, leading a man to leave and return brandishing a gun.

Long arm of the law

A POLICEMAN from Coin managed to stop a thief from stealing his belongings while on holiday in Dublin, Ireland. Upon returning to his hotel room, the officer found a strange man inside who claimed to be a member of staff. The copper restrained the looter when he tried to flee and turned him over to local authorities.

Blazing squad

A FIRE in the grounds of an abandoned house in the Calle Rio Odiel Ronda was spotted by the Local Police who then alerted the fire brigade.

An appliance from the Ronda Fire Station attended the scene and after 50 minutes managed to put the fire out leaving little damage to the property, although the open area where the fire started showed some signs of the blaze.

Horny problem

A SERIOUS bullfighting injury saw a man airlifted to hospital. The 37-year-old from Malaga endured a five-centimetre goring to his left thigh from a 630 kilogram bull named 'Principe' in a bull run in the Toro de la Vega festival in Tordesillas, Valladolid. He was treated by medics at the scene before being taken by helicopter to hospital.

Tourist trap

MORE than 12,000 people visited the Hedionda Roman Baths near Manilva in August. Spanish, British and French tourists were the most frequent day-trippers. Tourism councillor Rocío Ruiz has announced that an improved security plan will be implemented next year in an effort to control traffic whilst preserving the bath's historical status.

Fatal plunge

A MAN has died after his car drove off a bridge onto train tracks in Campillos. The 39-year-old had to be cut free from the vehicle by firefighters but unfortunately he died at the scene.

The incident took place at around 5pm and also caused hours of delays to the train service.

Music teacher accused of sexual assault

A MUSIC teacher who was accused of sexually assaulting one of his students could still be working with children, according to local media sources. The professor, who used to work at the Costa del Sol Music Conservatory in Fuengirola, was held by police following accusations of sexually assaulting an eight-year-old girl in his class.

The mother of the girl initially reported the incident to the police based on the information her daughter had told her. Officers then interviewed the child to find out more details surrounding the incident, which happened while she was left alone with the teacher.

The minor reported to the officers that the man assaulted her, forced her to watch pornographic videos and threatened to kill her if she told anybody.

The National Police arrested the 35-year-old teacher on Monday September 4 on charges of sexual assault and corruption of minors. The man was released three days later with a restraining order preventing him from approaching the girl.

Authorities are unable to confirm, however, whether the man has been prevented from working in other schools in the province.

Tomorrow (Friday) is Queen Letizia of Spain's birthday, this most modern of royals having charmed the world with her grace, compassion and stylish wardrobe.

Crowning glory



QUEEN LETIZIA is known as much more than the consort to King Felipe VI and mother to her two daughters Leonor (11) and Sofia (10). A style icon, philanthropist and Special Ambassador for the UN, she has built a reputation for being elegant, kind and socially aware, and gave the Spanish Royal Family's declining image a much-needed boost when she was crowned Queen in 2014.

Not your average royal!

Like the Duchess of Cambridge Kate Middleton, Letizia does not have royal blood by birth, being the daughter of a journalist and a nurse from Oviedo, while her grandfather worked as a taxi driver.

She is the first non-noble person to be crowned Queen of Spain.

Letizia is known for her fashion sense and is often praised by fashion bloggers for her flawless outfit choices. She is a loyal Hugo Boss fan but also steps out in high street brands while on official duty.

Among her many duties as Royal Consort to the King, Letizia focuses her attention on many charitable causes and is particularly passionate about campaigning for children's rights, culture and education.

Women of means

- Isabella I (1451-1504) was the Queen of Castille and responsible for the political unification of Spain following her marriage to Ferdinand II of Aragon. She lowered the country's crime rate and unburdened the kingdom of the debt her brother had left behind.

- Mary I (1516-1558) was the daughter of King Henry VIII's Spanish wife, Catherine of Aragon. As well as reigning as Queen of England and Ireland, she was the Queen consort of Spain following her marriage to King Phillip.

- Isabella II (1830-1904) was crowned Queen at just three years old, but her succession was disputed by those who refused to recognise a female sovereign and led to the Carlist wars. She was eventually deposed in the 1868 Glorious Revolution.

- Queen Sofia (1938-), Letizia's predecessor still takes an active role in royal duties and remains dedicated to her passions such as art, sport and charity work. She is the executive president of the Reina Sofia Foundation which raises money to fund international projects in education, healthcare, environment and women's rights.

Baby death trial

PROSECUTORS are demanding a seven-year jail sentence for a girl who allegedly killed her baby during childbirth. The 18-year-old said her baby had fallen on the floor when she appeared in the emergency room of a

Costa del Sol hospital. Doctors tried to save the little girl but she later died from injuries to her head and throat.

Toxic treats

TWO children were taken to hospital after eating a bag of poisoned sweets.

The minors, who have already been

discharged, apparently found the bag of confectionary in front of the football field in Benalmadena last Monday. An adult woman is also believed to have fallen ill.

Police are currently investigating where the mystery candy came from.

Fine vintage

WINE exports in Malaga have increased by €23m in the last year. The market has experienced an 83 per cent growth over the last decade, and there are now nearly 30 companies specialising in the trade. Russia purchased the most exports, valued at more than €10.8m, followed by the USA (€4.8m).

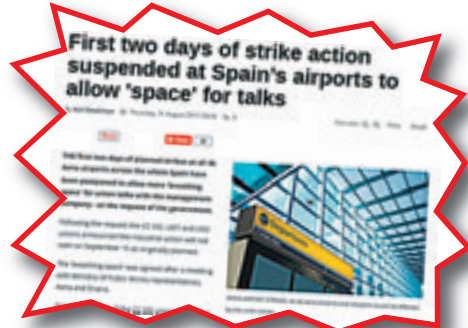

Rooney girl hits Spain

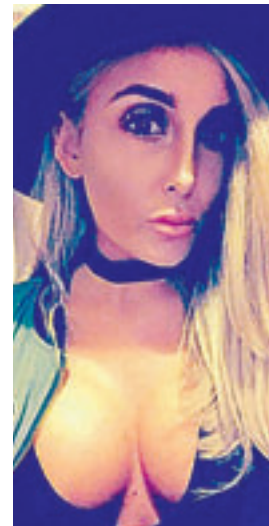
LAURA SIMPSON, the 29-year-old girl Wayne Rooney was caught sharing a 'kiss and cuddle' with, has been photographed in Marbella.

Catalan problem

AS the Spanish Foreign Minister gets ready to visit the Campo de Gibraltar to discuss the future of the area after Brexit, he has greater problems on his mind.

If the Spanish government expends so much time on trying to recover a tiny enclave at the southernmost tip of the country, it now has to look elsewhere to an area that covers 32,000 square kilometres and has a population of 7.5 million.

The Catalanian Parliament is simply ignoring instructions received from the national government and the majority ruling party no longer recognises the legitimacy of Spain in the area.

It intends to proceed with what is regarded by Spain as an illegal referendum as it wants to declare independence and has even indicated that it intends to retain the euro as the official currency in the event that it does secede from Spain.

The European Union has made it clear that it would not recognise a new Catalan State and that it would not be able to officially use the euro as its unit of currency.

As police officers raid offices in Barcelona, there have been demonstrations on the streets but we can only hope that if the referendum goes ahead, there will be no independence majority otherwise the country runs the risk of falling into total chaos.

‘She was taken’

Family dispute police view

FRANCISCO HIDALGO, the grandfather of tragic toddler Lucia Vivar, has insisted that her case remains open.

As reported in the *Euro Weekly News* (issue 1677), the three-year-old was found dead four kilometres from her Pizarra home after disappearing from the local train station, around 30 minutes inland from Malaga.

Francisco and a number of private investigators who have combed the area are adamant that the three-year-old would have fallen several times due to the rough terrain and the fact that she would have been walking at night in an area without street lights.

He said: “It is impossible. Lucia would never have fled the light by herself to enter the darkness.

“She did not travel alone, she was taken. She was placed there to make it look like the train killed her.”

Guardia Civil detectives maintain the view that the blow to the head which an au-

topsy report confirmed as her cause of death came as a result of her being hit by a train as she huddled next to the tracks.

Ana Belen Ordoñez, the lawyer representing the family, said:

“We do not understand how a practically closed hypothesis could be established barely an hour after finding Lucia.”

Another issue raised is that trains continued travelling in the morning despite police having promised the family they would remain stationary during the search.

Forensic calculations are another bone of contention as the time of death is determined by Lucia’s body temperature which was taken in the autopsy room instead of at the scene.

The investigating judge has ordered that all evidence be reviewed and for three potential witnesses who have contacted the family to be interviewed.

He has also requested to personally view all security footage available as Lucia’s family remain determined to seek answers.

The neighbours are shown to interrogate the man who claimed to be homeless and proceeded to walk off with a bag of possessions.

The video, which made the rounds through social media, helped the officers to pin down the perpetrator two days later. Officers noted the

man was carrying the same backpack as shown in the video, and stopped the man to question him.

It is reported that the thief reacted violently and tried to headbutt one of the officers, who was able to seize the man and arrest him.

When shown the images in the video, the man confessed to committing the crime and police found several items in his backpack thought to have been taken during the robbery.

Officers have also pinned the man to four other robberies committed in the area around the same time.

€60k to save animal shelter

TWO people have raised more than €16,000 in 12 days to save an animal sanctuary on the verge of closing.

Triple A helps care for and re-home abandoned and ill-treated animals but has been struggling financially.

Susi Berman and Nicole King have set up crowdfunding (internet fundraising pages) accounts in a last-ditch effort to keep the sanctuary open. Using the crowdfunding website Go Fund Me, the pair have attracted donations from 190 people, amassing €16,400 between them.

They each want to raise €30,000 which they claim is the amount Triple A spends on animal care each month.

As well as rehoming animals,

Triple A runs campaigns on sterilisation and animal care.

Located between Marbella and San Pedro de Alcántara, the centre is home to more than 400 dogs at their centre, 150 cats and a pig, all of whom are ready for adoption having been vaccinated, microchipped, neutered and de-wormed.

Their funding comes entirely from donations, event collections or membership fees and the centre is almost entirely run by volunteers.

A plea on the Go Fund Me page said: "We desperately need funds to keep our charity going as otherwise we may have to close our doors. If this happens all of the animals will be sent to the killing station by the authorities as there is nowhere else for them to go."

City council protests regional flood plans

THE mayor of Alhaurín de la Torre, Joaquín Villanova, revealed that the town council is waiting for the result of a lawsuit they filed regarding flood plans in the area.

The lawsuit against the Andalusian government, who approved the plans, will be decided by the Spanish Supreme Court.

The council claims the flood prevention measures have cut

around 40 per cent of the area set aside for the new Airport City project - not to mention the serious damage they have caused for farmers in the affected fields.

Villanova protested that the regional government's restrictions on local development plans are "just another example of the prejudice of the politicians in the Andalusian government, who want Sevilla to be the hub of the airport sector, to the detriment of Malaga."

As well as fresh bodies being taken to the morgue, she also witnessed funeral directors collecting the cadavers from the Maritimo Cita Previa hospital.

The Glaswegian grandmother-of-two claims she was forced to put towels across the windows to obscure the view but was still haunted by the rattling trolleys each night.

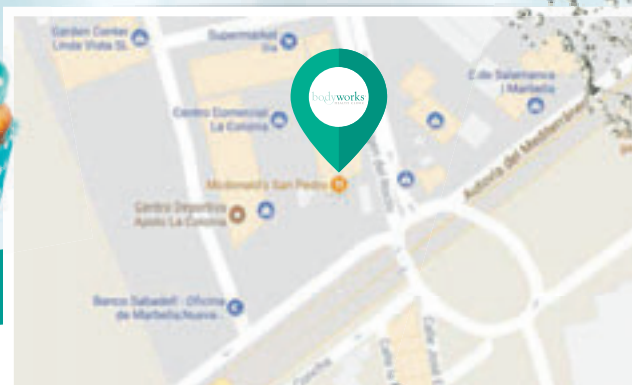

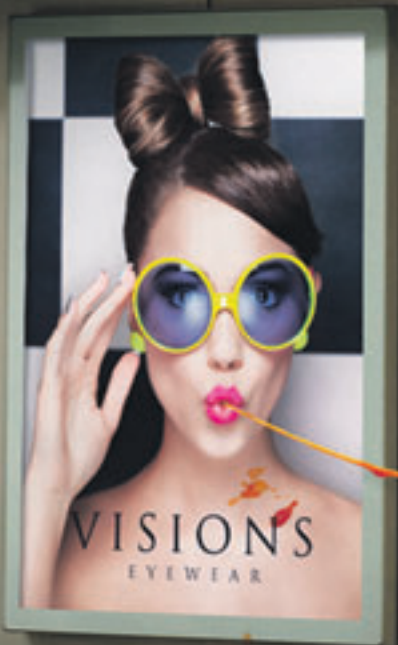

MALAGA Airport has been ranked in the top four Spanish airports and one of the top 35 in Europe.

With more than eight million passengers in the first half of the year, its growth of 13.7 per cent from 2016 has seen it ranked number 34 by the Association Airports Council International (ACI).

Eat what you're given!

THE return to school did not go smoothly for a number of young children who suffer from gluten and celiac intolerances as well as allergies as a number went hungry.

Two schools in particular, in the Marbella area, Pinolivo and Xarblanca were especially hard hit with no suitable food delivered for their allergic children last Monday or Tuesday.

Parents of children at the Xarblanca School were upset that some were left to eat bread and water and when they complained were told that the food for Monday and Tuesday had actually been delivered the previous Friday and that the company supplying the food Perea Rojas had not been advised of the need for special food.

In addition, it has been suggested that when the company does get round to producing special food, it will not have separate kitchens which means that there are fears of cross-contamination.

In the other school most affected, Pinolivo, a decision was made for staff to go to a local supermarket to purchase food appropriate

for children who were gluten and lactose intolerant which temporarily resolved the problem.

The company involved explained that it had lost one of its delivery lorries which added to the problem as it had to send food to 200 different kitchens in Malaga Province and further afield although it said that neither school

had formally complained although it did acknowledge that a number of parents had.

A complaint has been made by some parents to the Junta de Andalucia about the problem and it has responded confirming that the matter is under review.

Schools kitchen panic

THE Izquierda Unida Councillor in Marbella has put out an alert regarding the lack of staff in school kitchens.

Victoria Morales, who represents the political party locally, stated that schools have started the year with only half the cooks needed to provide quality meals for students. She pointed out that a minimum of four chefs are needed in the kitchens and several schools in the area are already failing to meet this requirement.

Allegedly the Juan Ramon Jimenez school is missing one cook; Rafael Fernandez Mayoral is missing two and Vicente Alexandre is missing three - therefore operating with only one chef in the kitchen.

The councillor has asked the City Council to take the necessary steps to hire the cooks needed to cover this essential service so students will be provided with the dining service

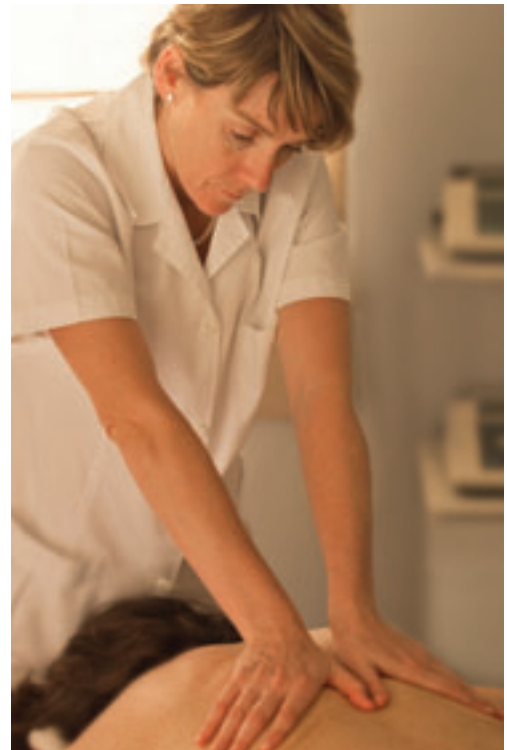

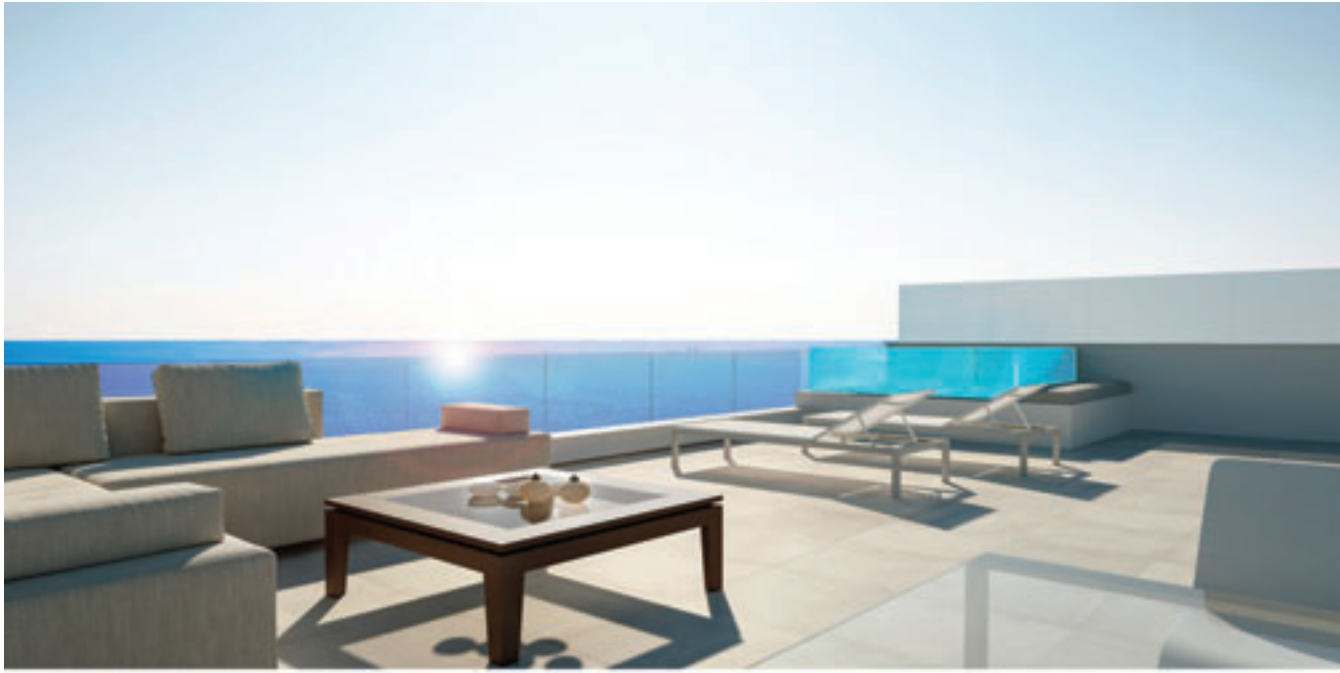

A JUNTA DE ANDALUCIA accounting boob will see councils throughout southern Spain receive millions.

The regional council's blunder will see Malaga Province alone benefit from an additional €51.83m.

The Ministry of Finance will make the final settlement, ensuring that local councils are compensated for the incorrect tax forecasts.

In total 67 local constituencies will receive a boost from the Ministry of Finance for having collected more than legally stipulated, though a total of 33 local administrations will be required to reimburse funds resulting from overpayments totalling €226,191.

Among these are Alameda, which owes €65,202, Arenas (€15,158) and Cortes de la Frontera (€12,011).

The reason for this is that each year, when the Junta prepares the General State Budgets, it determines the funds that will be transferred to local entities based upon a number of factors, this includes the economic forecast of the country and the population.

The bills need to be sanctioned by the Congress of Deputies as well as the Senate and, once received, the Ministry of Finance pays the amounts monthly through the so-called on-account deliveries.

The system is usually liquidated two years later and then it is determined whether the correct amounts were allocated or if a miscalculation occurred

and there was an offset.

Usually the municipalities manage to raise more money than the central government envisages and are compensated but if they raise less, they have to pay back the amount overpaid.

A Junta priority is to reform the financing of local entities of the country and all provincial councils and, in March, the

Committee of Experts was formed to help achieve this.

In any case, the government has among its priorities the reform of the financing of the local entities of the country and of all the provincial councils.

In total, it has 10 members, five of them proposed by the Spanish Federation of Municipalities and Provinces (FEMP). The rest were appointed by the General State Administration. Another commission has also been created for the autonomic financing.

Drought debate rages on

INCREASED water consumption over the summer has severely reduced the region's water reserves and there are now fears that the Andalucian regional government will have to establish restrictions.

The province ends the summer with only 238 cubic hectometres left in its reservoirs - around 35 less than the same time last year. The drop in reserves has been attributed to the high increase in tourists to the region this year.

Acosol, the public water company for the western Costa del Sol, has declared they will launch a series of measures to guarantee water supply during the coming winter - such as extracting water from the Arcgisa and Fuengirola aquifers and ensuring that the desalination plant is fully operational.

While water supply will be guaranteed on the Costa del Sol, several neighbouring municipalities remain on high alert. In Axarquía, the reservoir level fell by more than 50 hm³ in July and August alone. The situation has also been declared severe in La Viñuela, where the dam has been on alert since the second half of July after crossing the drought threshold.

Migrant chaos

IMMIGRATION by boat has almost doubled this year.

Over 1,000 illegal migrants entered Malaga Province from January to August, compared with 774 using the same method for the whole of last year.

At least 27 pateras (boats or dinghies usually used for immigration) have reached the Malaga coast so far in 2017.

With the recent increase, immigration associations have speculated that the Andalucian route to Europe

could become the second most popular, behind Italy.

As reported in *Euro Weekly News* (issue 1679), Cruz Roja (the Spanish Red cross) have called for a dedicated centre on Malaga port in order to deal with the increasing number of people applying for international protection.

In the past, the boats were smaller, raft-like vessels with fewer people but recently, larger boats full of people are being brought.

Cruz Roja claim that the living conditions of those making the trip must be incredibly poor for them to un-

dertake a life-threatening journey.

Most pateras are spotted from a distance as their crews are rescued and transferred to Malaga Port, with only one having made it to a beach this year in Benajarafé.

The immigrants are given a maximum of 60 days in the shelters and provided with food, bathing facilities and shelter whilst their asylum applications are processed.

The City Council were strongly against a new centre being opened in Malaga after the last one was closed in 2012 but despite this, the Ministry of the Interior have announced a new centre will open in Malaga.

A PLAN to rid Marbella of abandoned cars has been announced.

The derelict vehicles will be removed from streets as the destruction of the 1,132 vehicles currently in the scrap yard will be stepped up a gear.

Residents can email vehicles.policia@marbella.es to report any abandoned vehicles or concerns.

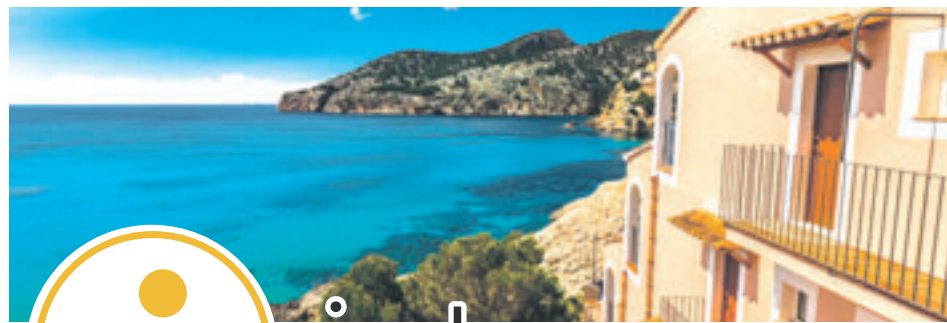

Bridging the gap

THE Town Council in Ronda is one step closer to finalising plans to build a footbridge at the bottom of the Tajo de Ronda - the town's famous ravine.

The local authorities have drafted the plan required by the Junta de Andalucía in order for the provincial council to approve the project and finance the infrastructure.

Over €300,000 had already been committed to

the development but these funds were frozen until the correct documentation had been submitted and approved.

It is estimated that the footbridge will attract over half a million visits a year and will help to manage the high traffic of tourists who visit the town. The bridge will be around 330 metres long and will also make the area of Ocho Caños, in the Padre Jesus neighbourhood, more accessible to visitors.

Organisers hope that the

bridge will enhance the town's safety features around the river Guadalevin - which remains a popular spot among tourists.

Just recently, members of the local fire brigade had to rescue a visitor who fell into the river near the spot where the bridge is expected to be built.

The council expects the new footbridge will rank amongst the town's most visited attractions, such as the bullring and the New Bridge, once it is complete.

A GIANT advertising screen has enraged Marbella residents.

Those who live on Avenida Julio Iglesias in Puerto Banus have claimed that they are forced to live with their blinds down and curtains closed due to the strong light produced by the display.

The screen, which was installed in July, has caused a number of resi-

dents to write a letter to the Municipal Delegation of Industry and Public Roads requesting its immediate removal due to its location and intensity.

Turning on at dusk, it continues to function for the majority of the night.

Those worst

affected are in the north wing of the building whose windows face the flashing screen directly.

According to Spanish media, the letter stated that many residents feel as though they have a "disco in their apartments."

One woman, whose home is directly opposite the screen, said:

"It's horrifying. You cannot be at home, you cannot have dinner or sleep."

Residents have remained in stark opposition to the commercial screen since it was put in place and investigations are being made as to what can be done about the issue.

Green light!

Home owners get go ahead

MARBELLA City Council representatives have given the go-ahead for building permits that affect 2,500 homes and over 140 plots of land.

The ruling, announced last Monday, will grant homeowners permission to modify or extend their properties - including adding on solar panels - which had previously been restricted. Houses in over 14 neighbourhoods will be affected by the changes, including those in El Arquillo, the Linda Vista Alta urbanisation, Los Verdiales, and Huerto del Cafe.

The board's approval means that 142 new homes can now be built on empty lots that had previously remained vacant, revealed town planning councillor Francisca Caracuel.

A dozen plans for urban de-

velopment have also been allowed to proceed, including work on the Arcos de San Enrique, improvements to the local stadium's soccer field and the remodelling of the Divina Pastora Church's square.

Seeking approval for building permits in Marbella was

once a difficult business as, on average, only one in 10 appeals succeeded. Felix Romero, a government spokesman, declared that "the former management of the department was misguided and we understand that now we have to accommodate this."

Global ambition

THE newly-installed Marbella City Council has stressed that efforts to improve police presence and the natural surroundings in Puerto Banus are aimed at recovering its "position of international leadership."

For the next year and a half, the Marbella City Council plans to recover their position as an 'international leader in tourism.' City representatives will attend three international tourism fairs this month, in Germany, France and Holland, in order to attract more visitors from these countries.

The new mayor Angeles Muñoz has also proposed that Marbella hosts its own tourism forum to put the town back on the map.

The international forum proposed by Muñoz would become a permanent annual event in Marbella and would serve to 'reflect the work already begun to improve Puerto Banus and the work of the Local Police in guaranteeing citizen security.' The Marbella mayor says her aim isn't to dismiss efforts made by the previous government, but to reinforce them.

Events such as the annual Starlight Festival have already begun to put Marbella back on the international map and helped the city to alleviate some of the unemployment numbers it suffers even during high season. The current number of unemployed in the locality currently stands at 10,000 people.

The Marbella local council began its promotional tour in the German city of Dusseldorf last week, whose tourism fair received over 44,000 visitors. The Tourism and Planning Department will then travel to similar events in Utrecht (The Netherlands) and Paris later in the month.

Alfonso Dastis due next Saturday

AFTER much discussion about the likely date for his visit, Spanish Foreign Minister Alfonso Dastis will be in the Campo de Gibraltar next Saturday (September 16).

Whilst a longer visit undertaken during the working week had been anticipated, this is not the case and he will be flying to New York the following day to attend a General Assembly of the United Nations.

Councils in the area have been worried about the potential disruption for local workers in the run up to and following Brexit in case the Spanish government pushes dual sovereignty over Gibraltar as part of its

own negotiations.

Following the departure of the somewhat bombastic former foreign minister Margallo however, Mr Dastis who is a

long serving diplomat has been much more conciliatory in his observations on Gibraltar and with the current situation in Catalonia, understandably appears more concerned with the potential break up of Spain than the acquisition of the Rock.

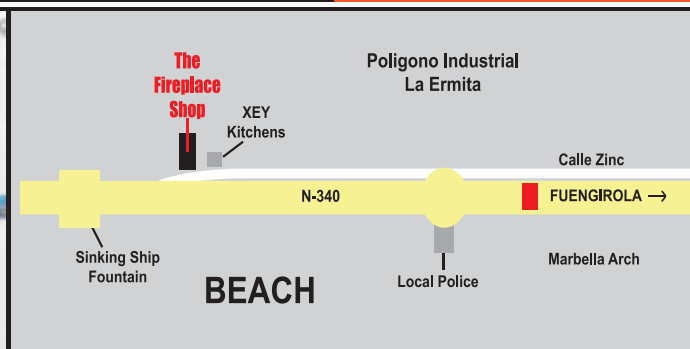

Shooting clubs under fire

SHOOTING clubs have been accused of causing environmental damage.

The firing ranges surrounding the clubs of Alhaurin de la Torre in Malaga Province are believed to be contaminated by lead and dangerous remains of shooting activity.

Left-wing groups Izquierda Unida (IU) and Alhaurin Awakens as well as Podemos Party activists have demanded that the council take action as they state the shooting could be affecting streams and aquifers (bodies of permeable rock which can contain or transmit groundwater).

The area is home to two shooting clubs, Jarapalo and Torrealqueria, which the campaigning groups suspect have been operating without

the required licences.

IU councillor, Javier Caravia, said: "Due to soil and stream contamination where ammunition and dishes fall, we request that the City Council open an information file to regulate the situation and sanction or even close the facilities which are violating some regulations, both at the shooting activity and at the on-site restaurant."

The firing ranges are considered to be exceptional sources of pollution due to their use of heavy metals in the form of ammunition and the plates which serve as targets and consist of oil or coal.

Juan Manuel Mancebo, councillor of Alhaurin Awake, said:

"For 40 years, tons of lead and hydrocarbons have been dumped in the vicinity of the two firing ranges and remain there, uncollected, contaminating the land and putting the environment and people at risk."

Spy game!

FACEBOOK has been slapped with a €1.2 million fine after breaking Spanish law.

The Spanish Data Protection Agency (AEPD) claimed in a report that the social media site had violated their users' privacy on multiple accounts by exploiting their personal data for advertising purposes.

The AEPD focused on how Facebook harvests information on people's sexuality, religious beliefs and ideologies without informing them how it plans to use this information. The agency said that users did not give the social network consent to manipulate their information for these purposes and revealed that the company broke more laws by not deleting the data once it was no longer useful.

In a statement, Facebook rejected the accusations and claimed that the AEPD was wrong to accuse the company of showing advertising based

on sensitive personal information. They assert that their ad-targeting was solely based on content people 'liked' on the site.

However, under EU law, 'any information relating to an identified or identifiable natur-

al person' qualifies as personal data, which includes the content people 'like.'

Spain has followed the example of France, Belgium and Germany who have also taken action against the company in recent months.

Teen spirit

80% admit to drinking alcohol

ACCORDING to a study by the Malaga Provincial Drug Addiction Centre, around 80 per cent of children between the ages of 12 and 18 in the region say they have tried alcohol.

Many of these teenagers participate in the 'botellon' - a practice where the youth of Spain gather in public spaces to consume cheap alcohol - in order to socialise and not to feel excluded.

The study also reveals that the closer young people get to the legal drinking age, the more frequent and intense these drinking sessions become.

Juan Jesus Ruiz, the manager of the Proyecto Hombre centre which provides treat-

ment for alcohol and drug addiction, claims that young people are now seeking to get drunk as fast as possible, consuming as many as five alcoholic beverages in less than two hours.

Society's acceptance of alcohol consumption in Spain means it is easier for adolescents to slip into patterns of abuse as it is an integral part of many religious and festive celebrations.

Ruiz notes that many teenagers who start treatment at the centre assert that their aim is not to stop drinking altogether, but to learn to consume it in moderation as those who choose not to participate in the 'botellon' are often rejected by their peers.

Road closure protest

RESIDENTS have protested the closure of a road that has been used for more than 40 years.

Residents of Las Chapas, Marbella are furious that the 20 metre lane which connects the A7 to their urbanisation as well as two schools, has been closed-off due to roadworks.

The owner of a nearby area of land, has obtained a judicial order to carry them out, despite the Provincial Court of Malaga ruling in 1991 the road must remain open. A 2009 government report also confirms this but the owner believes the land is his and has sealed it off whilst asphalt and pipes are replaced.

Backed by lawyer, Dumet Grayeb, the group of residents say ownership is not the concern, just that the road remains open.

Turfed out

SQUATTERS have been evicted in Malaga Province. Police turfed out the illegal dwellers after council cleaning vans removed the settlement in Baños del Carmen. The action came as a result of complaints from local residents.

Cash boot

TORREMOLINOS Council will invest €1.1m in a historic building. Casa Maria Barrabino will be refurbished and used once again. This purchase spearheads the pedestrianisation of the centre.

Better credit rating for bank

THE American credit rating company Moody's has reacted well to Liberbank's announcement that it intends to raise €500 million on the Spanish stock exchange.

Coupled with its decision to dispose of some of its toxic real estate and bad loans more quickly than initially expected, Moody's has given it a B1 debt rating.

This will come as welcome news to what has been regarded as the most vulnerable medium-sized bank still trading in Spain.

Spanish rich get richer

THOSE Spaniards with money are seeing their worth expand more quickly than ever and there are now 549 taxpayers with fortunes worth more than €30 million.

Unlike most of the other members of the European Union, Spain still operates a wealth tax and requires anyone with a gross taxable wealth in excess of €1 million to register and pay the additional tax.

The latest report from Spanish Tax Agency shows that 188,680 individuals signed declarations to establish their obligation to pay this tax and of

those, approximately one third had cash and assets in excess of €1.5 million which is a 10 per cent increase over figures from five years earlier.

One reason may be that the Tax Authorities have taken action to identify wealth within the country following much publicised alleged evasion often from politicians and more recently footballers.

In addition, a tax amnesty which allowed the rich to pay only a small proportion of tax owed may have

'flushed out' rich residents who had not previously been registered for the wealth tax.

The combined assets of all of those who have registered to pay wealth tax totals €582 billion which equates to nearly 50 per cent of Spain's Gross National Product and a single individual, Amancio Ortega founder of Inditex accounts for €71 billion of that total.

Whilst those with few investments see a slow growth, there seems to be some truth in the old saying that 'money attracts money.'

US firm promotes Santander

MORGAN STANLEY the powerful American investment company is very bullish about the potential for rises in the shares of Spanish bank Santander.

It has upped its target price for the shares three times in the last six months even though actual price on the stock exchange has not matched the forecasts.

It is suggested by outside analysts that the decision to recommend the shares is based on expectations of medium-term increased profits thanks to the takeover of Banco Popular.

Quote of the Week

"Discussions will probably take place in the autumn," European Central Bank President Mario Draghi on the decision to reduce quantitative easing (the amount of money being pumped into the eurozone).

Airline pilots go on strike

PILOTS at the Thomas Cook airline which flies to parts of Spain from British regional airports walked out on a 12-hour strike last Friday.

Those pilots who are members of the British Airline Pilots' Association (Balpa) voted to strike and walked out although the company insists that all flights will operate.

This is believed by the union

to be the first UK pilots' strike for nearly 50 years and is only a token stoppage so that passengers are inconvenienced as little as possible.

According to the union, the pilots have seen a deterioration in their terms and conditions as well as real-term pay cuts and even though they have been offered a 4 per cent pay rise over two years feel they have to take this action.

BUSINESS EXTRA

Faster growth

THE economy of the eurozone is growing at a quicker rate than forecast with forecast growth of 2.2 per cent during 2017. If correct, this will be the fastest growth in a decade with Spain being one of the leaders.

Less profit

MADRID-based industrial investment company Sacyr has reported a profit for the first six months of the year of €60 million, a drop of 6.3 per cent over last year. Income has dropped as 2016 saw major sales of assets.

Rail strike

THE rail union CCOO has called a strike over job losses at railway companies Renfe and Adif on Friday September 29. The 23-hour long strike will be a protest against making an ageing and reduced workforce support an unsustainable system.

Catalan situation slows investment

FINANCIAL institutions around the world have not reacted positively towards the vote by the Catalan Parliament to push forward with the Independence Referendum.

Whilst many believe Catalonia will remain part of Spain, they are also uncomfortable with the conflict between the National government and the

Catalan Parliament which is reflecting in an immediate migration, albeit slow, from Spanish bonds.

It is now cheaper to buy Italian government bonds and Spanish banks which have a strong presence in Catalonia such as La Caixa immediately saw pressure on their share values. Spain's rating is to be reviewed in the next six weeks.

Fear of new bank failures

ECB wants control over client deposits

ONE of European banking's most powerful women, Daniele Nouy wants to introduce fresh powers to prevent depositors from removing funds from struggling banks.

The European Central Bank's (ECB) Chair of Banking Supervision wants to have the right to temporarily suspend the ability of customers to withdraw their money from banks facing financial difficulty.

This ban would cover cash withdrawals at the bank, through cash machines and by online transfer.

She explained in a letter to a Member of the European Parliament that due to the fact a problem within a bank could quickly see a run on its liquidity which could be fuelled by social media comment and the ease of internet banking.

The recent problems with Banco Popular in Spain and Monte dei Paschi di Siena in Italy are examples of how matters can escalate quickly, although in the case of Banco Popular, current and imminent law suits from disgruntled investors suggest the final decision to demand its quick sale may have been premature.

In 2016, the ECB had tried to introduce a restriction on the removal of funds in excess of €100,000, as generally lower amounts are covered by national governments. It has actually even commented that the authorities should have the right to delay payment of lesser funds for between five and 20 days.

The Bank - which is owned by member states of the European Union - only has legal powers over the 19 members of the eurozone and perhaps surprisingly, the third largest shareholder with a 13.67 per cent holding is the Bank of England exceeded only by France and Germany.

The chairman of the ECB is an Italian, Mario Draghi and critics of the bank suggest that he influenced a decision to allow the Italian govern-

ment to circumvent the rules in order to bail out the fast failing Monte dei Paschi di Siena bank.

This proposal to allow the suspension of withdrawals in emergency situations is taken by analysts to suggest the ECB does expect more commercial banking failures in the future and wants to have legislation in place at the earliest opportunity in order to take control, albeit briefly, of deposits placed in good faith by the general public and corporate investors.

CATALONIA BUSINESS TAX PAYER'S DILEMMA

A rock and a hard place

AS the split between the Catalan and national governments gets wider, the latest salvo concerns the payment of income tax and IVA (VAT).

The Spanish Finance Ministry has issued a blunt statement 'reminding' tax payers in Catalonia that any payment should be made to the correct authority which is the national government.

Any company or self-employed person which pays money due for VAT, income tax or corporation tax to the Catalan authority will be considered as having not paid the tax and may be open to criminal charges.

This statement was made in advance of the threatened Independence Referendum which will possibly be held on Sunday October 1 as the Catalan government has created an enlarged Catalan Tax Authority which is ready to divert the collection of national taxes to the 'New Catalan State.'

According to Catalan Deputy First Minister Oriol Junqueras, systems are in place to allow for the collection of some €42 billion of tax as soon as the decision to create an in-

dependent state is taken.

In Spanish law, if VAT is collected and then not paid to the correct authority it will leave the collector open to a charge of theft and if a company, all of the directors could face charges.

The Spanish government appears powerless to stop the proposed referendum although it has been declared illegal for the Catalan Parliament to even buy ballot boxes using Community funds, although it is suspected that the ballot boxes and voting papers are currently being held in a secret location.

As the referendum date approaches, both Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy and Catalan leader Carles Puigdemont regularly indulge in a war of words with each other which is now certain to be fought out in the courts and with potential arrests of Catalan politicians and their supporters.

Demanding Catalan Independence.

Fruit and vegetable imports

MOROCCO was the biggest supplier of fruit and vegetables to Spain in the first half of 2017 with exports totalling €404 million.

This shows a 33 per cent increase on the previous six months and Spanish purchases have increased generally with large volumes also being imported from Brazil and Costa Rica.

According to a report issued by the Spanish Federation of Associations of Producers and Exporters of Fruits, Vegetables, Flowers, and Live Plants (FEPEX) imports from the European Union are also up by 8 per cent with France and Italy being the two major suppliers, closely followed by Portugal and the Netherlands.

Potatoes and tomatoes were the major products exported to Spain, although fruits were also high on the list.

Tourist spend up again

VISITORS to Spain spent €49 billion in the first seven months of the year, an increase of 15 per cent over the same period in 2016.

The July total was slightly less than €12 billion according to the National Statistics Institute.

The figures show that the United Kingdom accounts for the highest spend by tourist visitors, parting with €9.9 billion which was 20.2 per cent of total spend, followed by the Germans at €6.86 billion (14 per cent) and Scandinavians at €4.16 billion (8.5 per cent).

The three most popular destinations were Catalonia, Canary Islands and the Balearics which between them saw 58 per cent of the total amount of holidaymakers money spent.

Supported by the Malaga Council, the conference is co-hosted by the Eisenhower Fellows of Spain and Jordan.

Bank shareholders are set to vote for final merger

TODAY (Thursday) the shareholders of Bankia and Mare Nostrum Bank (BMN) will attend extraordinary general shareholders' meetings to vote to merge.

The Bankia meeting is being held in Valencia whilst the BMN meeting is being held in Madrid with the expectation that the vote will be positive following the announcement of the intent to merge last June.

Once the formal votes are confirmed, then the two banks will be able to present the proposal to the various authorities in Spain for approval, which should be something of a formality as Bankia is currently effectively owned by the taxpayer.

Shareholders in BMN will receive

shares in Bankia but they will be hoping that the new operation will be successful as they are only receiving about 40 per cent of the book value of BMN which has assets of €38 billion, although most of that is in customer deposits.

The advantage for Bankia is that the merger will increase its coverage in the Balearics, Granada and Murcia whilst BMN shareholders will receive an almost immediate cash dividend with the anticipation that the government will start to release the shares that it holds onto the market.

It is believed that a stronger Bankia will attract financial investors and that share prices will increase to the benefit of all existing shareholders.

Keep the faith.

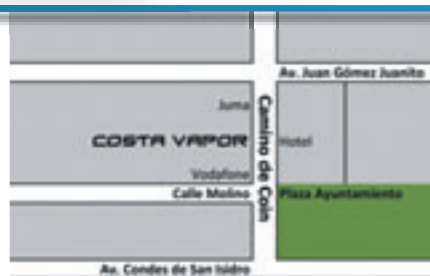

THE 12th Marbella International Film Festival of which *Euro Weekly News* is proud to be a sponsor will take place from October 4 to 8.

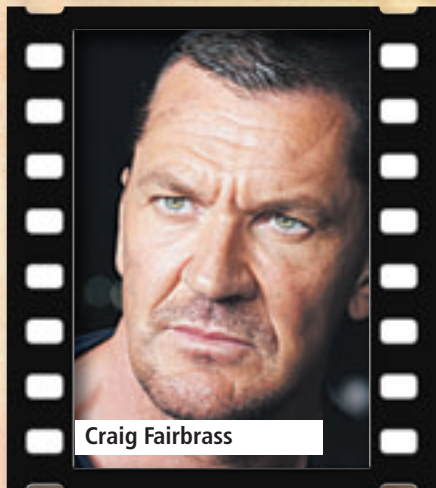

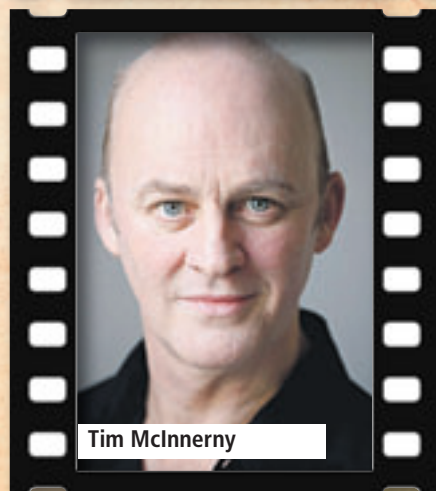

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Back to school

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



DROP OFF: The laws still apply.

IT'S that time of year once again when the summer is coming to a close, and attentions start to turn back to yet another annual phenomenon, back to school time.

Although it might be a relief for some parents, it might also be a disappointment for some children, in road safety terms we have to be aware that the characteristics of the road network will once again change.

Firstly, we have an increase in traffic at certain times of day as parents resume the school run. It is quite normal for traffic to increase in the mornings because of this, which in turn can result in delays. The same situation applies at the end of the school day, but at what time? Often, in Spain, schools operate a less robust timetable, adapting to such things as weather conditions and light, and so the school day often varies from season to season. All non-parents can do to prepare for this is be aware of the changing timetable and allow extra time for all journeys.

If you are taking your children to school by car, remember that children under 1.35

metres in height are not allowed in the front seats of the car. There are one or two exceptions, which you can read about on the website, *n332.es*.

Children must be secured in the vehicle, by means of a seatbelt, or specially designed retention system suitable for them. Any objects they are carrying must also be secure in the vehicle.

When you arrive at the school drop off point, remember that the laws still apply to you, the same as any other driver. You are still not allowed to double park, block entrances, or park in an illegal place with your hazard lights on just because you are dropping off your children for school. You must choose a safe, convenient and legal place to drop off your children. Where possible, ensure that they exit the vehicle on the pavement side, still warning them to be aware of their surroundings before opening the door.

During late September, there will be an awareness campaign focusing on seatbelt and child restraint use, and the use of seatbelts on school buses (where fitted).

Does he need a Spanish licence?

Q. Yesterday I was stopped by the Guardia Civil, who asked to see my vehicle documents. They then asked my date of birth and then went back to their car and were on the radio for about five minutes. When they returned I was presented with a €500 fine for not having a Span-

ish driving licence. They never asked to see my licence at all. I do not have residence in Spain as I have only been here a few months, so I was shocked. On the back of the form it says I can appeal within 20 days. Any advice?

P W (Costa Blanca)

A. Yes, appeal immediately. You do not say, but whether you are an EU citizen or a non-EU citizen in Spain, you can use your home country driving licence for six months, which is

the legal limit for a tourist stay. If you are an EU citizen, you can use your EU

driving licence in Spain until it expires, even if you obtain a residence certificate. If you are not EU, you must obtain a Spanish driving licence when you become a resident.

AUGUST is a weird month for employment. Statistics are promising early on thanks to the people engaged in July to serve beer to tourists and make hotel beds.

Then August 31 arrives and most of the workers return to the out-of-work wasteland.

Hauling Spain out of the economic crisis and putting people back into employment is Mariano Rajoy's favourite "Look what I've done!" cry but new jobs are mostly short-term, part-time and precarious.

Better than nothing, but not as good as Rajoy makes out when he bats away corruption accusations and launches into his "Yes but..." rebuttal.

This year 313,141 people were sacked on August 31, the worst single-day figure ever known. Unfortunately for Rajoy 59,563 lost jobs - more than anywhere else - were in

Cataluña. That's one less argument in Spain's favour and yet another weapon for the secessionists.

Boots on the other foot

POLLS show that the Basques are more concerned about employment than independence.

It's a long time since the lehendakari, regional president Juan Jose Ibarretxe, proclaimed the Basques' right to vote for "free association with the Spanish state," a proposal voted down in the national parliament in 2005.

End of story, notwithstanding earlier chapters written by the ETA separatists.

The present lehendakari Iñigo Urkullu has even less motivation to emulate Ibarretxe.

The PNV is going strong, unlike CiU, the party in power when Catalan

independence rumblings loudened to murmurs and then shouts. Now defunct thanks to disagreements over independence it morphed into PDeCat, which is giving ground to the ERC republican separatists and the CUP anti-system party.

Urkullu would not want to be in Carles Puigdemont's shoes right now and who knows if the Catalan president won't soon be needing a change of footwear himself.

Not today, thanks

CATALUÑA'S president Carles Puigdemont recently visited Denmark to open the region's Copenhagen delegation, but he was not received by the Danish government.

Yet again, his hard sell received the 'not today' treatment reserved for fast-talking commercial travellers in the past and importunate cold-callers like Puigdemont now.

Knock knock, who's there

CIUDADANOS leader Albert Rivera agreed to back Mariano Rajoy's investiture at a price that included a long list of concessions.

These included allowing national and regional presidents only two consecutive terms but, like many of Rajoy's concessions, this has not materialised.

Now Rivera is again resurrecting an unthinkable and unspeakable prospect that could show Mariano Rajoy the door. Nevertheless, behind that closed door the Partido Popular has spoken and thought about this in the past and at present.

And depending on what happens or does not happen on October 1, a kindly but inexorable defenestration could be under discussion in the very near future.

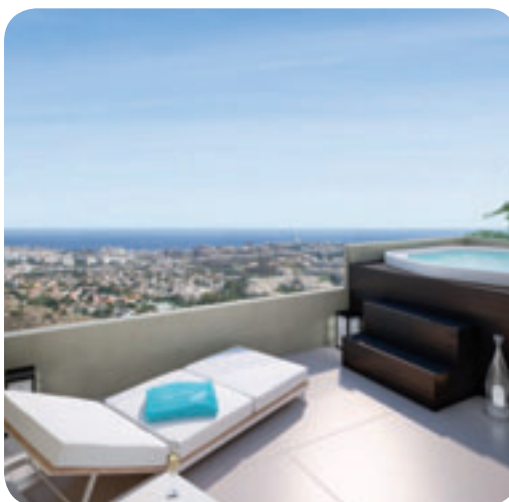

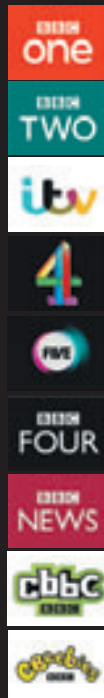

I'm 50-years-old and have been a strict vegan since changing my diet after a cancer scare a decade ago.

I've been staying with my Spanish partner's family for three months per year for the last couple of decades and we've recently been using a local Thai restaurant, Wai Wai Wok on Burriana Beach. Up until this year we were in love with the place for providing amazing service and food exactly as we ordered.

This year, however, something has gone horribly wrong. We've been in Nerja since early June and have visited the restaurant six times plus ordered a takeaway for lunch. Every meal we've ordered has had to be sent back because we have found meat in the food. They are obviously cooking a standard batch of, for example, Pad Thai, and then just removing the meat.

I advise dozens of clients a week all across the world on nutrition so I feel it

We normally take out holiday insurance but forgot this year which created a problem with receiving free NHS cover as expats, being told we would have to pay for aftercare and be treated as private patients unless we presented an S1 form.

Following extensive research we discovered that the S1 is a replacement for the E121 form we completed when registering

with the Spanish NHS.

Following heated discussions with various hospital staff my wife was finally given the NHS cover that she was entitled to.

The word of warning is that

when visiting the UK take out holiday insurance, obtain the S1 form, carry your EHC card and be of pensionable age currently receiving the State Pension.

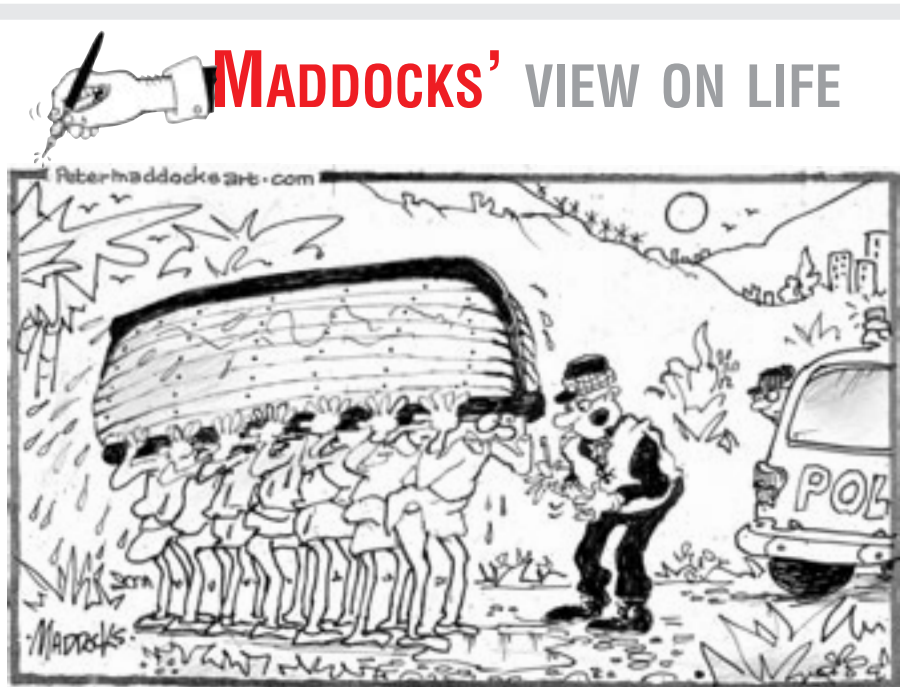

Birds of prey in Spain

TOP 5

SPAIN is among the best places in Europe to see these majestic creatures.

1. Egyptian Vulture

This vulture species is smaller than the other European vultures with a wingspan of up to 170 centimetres.

This species is endangered due to power lines and poisoning but conservation efforts and breeding programmes have been implemented across Europe.

2. Eurasian eagle owl

The Eurasian eagle owl is one of the largest species of owl. It is found in many habitats but mainly mountain regions, forests and other relatively remote places. The Eagle owl hunts mainly small mammals but also birds of varying sizes, reptiles, amphibians, fish, large insects and other assorted invertebrates. It typically breeds in concealed locations such as cliff ledges or among rocks with nests averaging two eggs which hatch at different times.

3. Black Vulture

The black vulture is one of the largest scavengers in Spain with a wingspan that can reach up to three metres.

It typically lives in mountainous regions and is an increasingly common sight in Spain due to conservation projects having been cited as an endangered species since the 1970's, threats include farmers poisoning the prey upon which it feeds as well as wind farms.

Its beak is dark in colour, as well as being sharp enough to allow it to cut through carcasses with ease.

4. Spanish Imperial Eagle

This eagle is entirely brown minus a cream-coloured head and neck with white patches on the shoulders and a gray upper tail. Its wingspan can reach up to 210 centimetres and it mainly inhabits woodland, plains and marshes. It lives on a diet mainly of rabbits

but also smaller birds and reptiles and has even been known to feed on flamingos in wetter areas.

Mainly nesting in trees, they avoid cliffs altogether unlike most eagles.

Deforestation, electrocution, hunting and poisoning have all contributed to make the Spanish imperial eagle an endangered species.

5. Bonelli's Eagle

With a wingspan of up to 172 centimetres, it is mainly found in mountainous habitats with rocky walls and generally close to woodland.

The upper plumage is dark brown whilst it has a white underbelly patterned with dark bands. The tail is also white with a single black band at the end. Young eagles lack the black band and have much less striking plumage with a beige underbelly and wings.

It is named after the Italian ornithologist, Franco Andrea Bonelli.

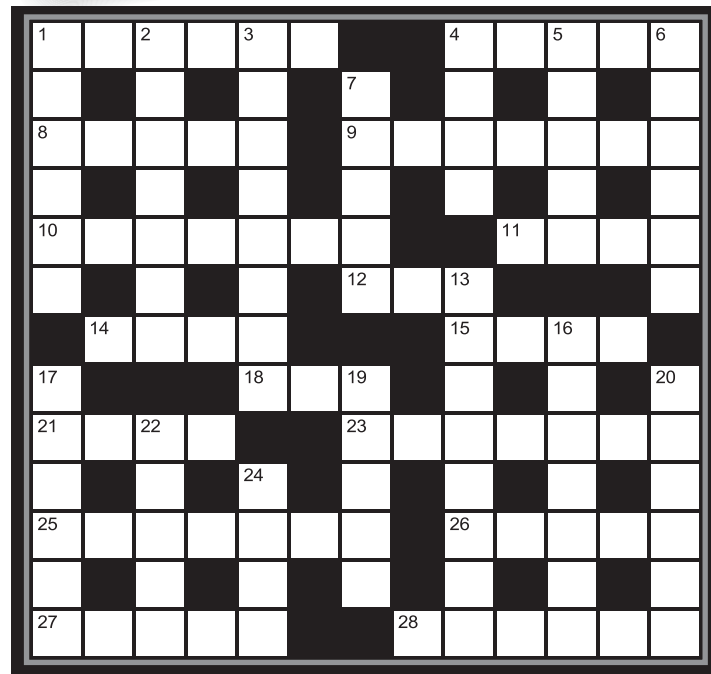

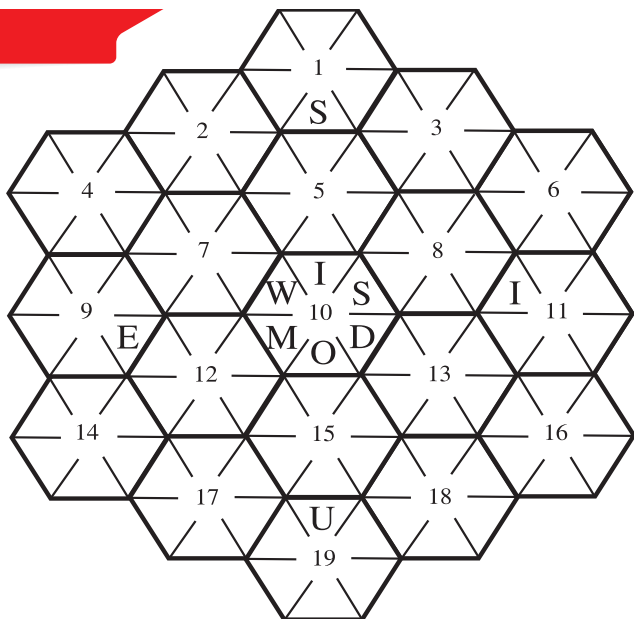

Pilates: A study published in the International Journal of Cardiology revealed that doing Pilates regularly is actually great for reducing blood pressure.

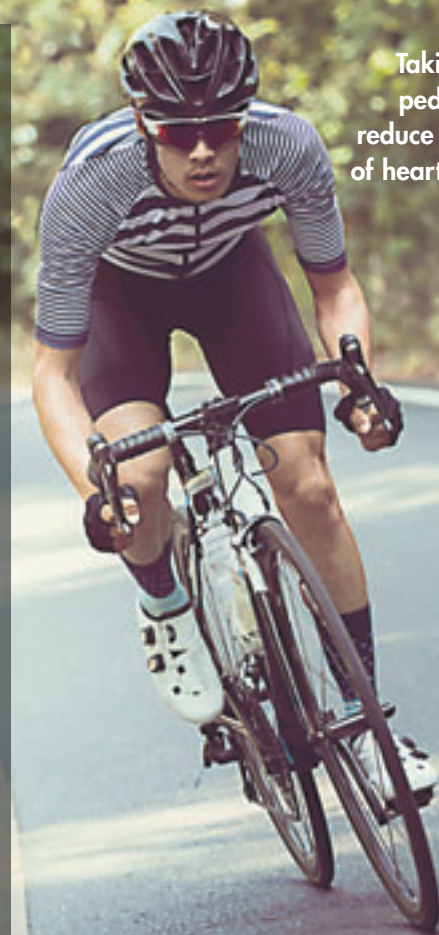
It also increases flexibility, improves hand strength and puts minimal pressure on muscle and joints.

What are haemorrhoids?

Haemorrhoids are venous dilatations that appear in the area of the anus. Normally they do not cause any problems, however they can get inflamed and cause a lot of pain, and form clots that become infected which cause bleeding.

What are its symptoms?

Some of the symptoms of haemorrhoids may include bleeding after passing a stool, an itchy bottom. A lump hanging down outside of the anus, which may need to be pushed back in after passing a stool and/or soreness, redness and swelling around your anus.

What causes them?

These dilatations can be caused by a number of things including straining, recent surgery in and around the area and illnesses that cause the intestinal walls to weaken are among them.

How can you treat haemorrhoids?

There are various ways of treating haemorrhoids. Bathing in warm water, some medicines and ointments usually help circulation which can fix the problem however sometimes surgery is the only solution.

When should you seek medical attention?

You should always see your doctor if you feel your symptoms are serious or even contact emergency services.

Can it be prevented?

There are certain situations which increase the chances of haemorrhoids appearing, and certain people who are more likely to get them due to weaker intestinal walls. In general, avoid straining excessively and sitting on the toilet to defecate with your legs flexed helps prevent haemorrhoids appearing.

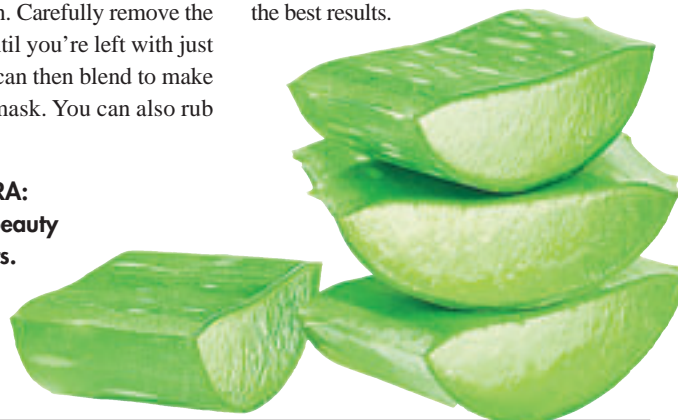

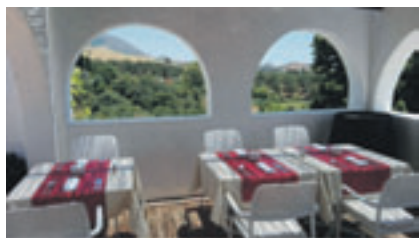

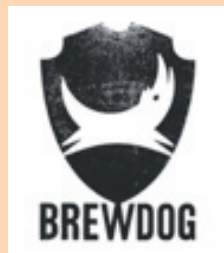

A TOAST TO GOOD FOOD, GOOD WINE AND GOOD FRIENDS



WITH GARRY WAITE

It is eight years ago today that the world of television lost one of its greatest and most successful food presenters.

Dubbed the first celebrity chef, Keith Floyd redefined the way that cookery programmes were presented. Away from the clinical studio style of Fanny and Johnny Craddock and even the delightful Delia Smith, Keith brought 'personality' to food.

His apparently bumbling, sometimes incompetent preparation and presentation of food delighted millions of viewers.

Keith was born in Exmoor and went to Wellington School. He first started in journalism before joining the army, the Third Royal Tank Regiment, in 1963.

Sadly this was not to last and the army's loss was the catering world's gain. Keith started his catering career like most of us in those days by washing up and preparing vegetables in restaurants in France (where he learnt

to speak virtually fluent French) and London before opening his first restaurant in Clifton, Bristol in 1966 at the age of 23.

Floyd's Bistro opposite the Grand Spa Hotel and close to the famous suspension bridge had long wooden tables and benches and served inexpensive 'French' Bistro type food. Very popular with young people who used to queue outside to wait for a space in the refectory style dining room.

Keith's life became synonymous with hard drinking and heavy smoking as the years rolled on, but in the early days a glass of wine and a good meal were his *raison d'être* and his first marriage in 1967 at the tender age of 24 to Jesmond Rutledge boded a step into what could be called a normal life.

However there were two things that Floyd was not too good at - relationships and business. After three years of marriage he and Jess split up, he having become a father to Patrick. In the early 70's he sold the restaurant to another friend of mine Neil Ramsay (no relation to Gordon) who increased business at the already successful bistro and through the latter years he reformed it until it became more of a fine dining restaurant which his son Peter eventually took over.

It certainly did Neil well - enough to retire very early!!

With the proceeds from the sale of his restaurant, Floyd 'broke free' and bought himself a yacht and sailed the Mediterranean. After 18 months and not having seen his son for that time he returned to spend more time with him but this time with a new woman in his life. That didn't last too long either and he soon met Paddy, the editor of the paper for whom he first wrote.

They took the brave move of opening a restaurant in his beloved France, in the Provençal town of L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue. Things didn't go well and so they returned to the UK and went their separate ways.

Floyd moved to Ireland

ON what he called a 'Murphy's inspired whim' but that didn't work out either. In an effort to get back on track Keith opened the Maltser's Arms in Tuckenhay in Devon, the sign outside saying Floyd's Inn (sometimes). Even with a young talented French chef in the form of Jean Cristophe Novelli, the pub was to go the same way as his other ventures.

Sold in 1996 and by now on his fourth wife and living on the Costa del Sol he was drinking more heavily and he would do a half bottle of Scotch 'before breakfast.' Restaurants were no longer part of his 'portfolio' although he did 'lend' his name to a Floyd's Brasserie in Phuket in 2007 which gave him an excuse to travel a lot to another part of the world he loved.

By 2009 his lifestyle came back to haunt him as he was treated for bowel cancer. He spent a lot of time recovering at the home of mutual friend Paul Hickling, of Roman Oasis fame but spent more time back in the UK. It was there, on September 14, 2009 having been given the 'all clear' from his cancer he went out for lunch with his companion Celia to celebrate. On their return they were expecting to watch a documentary, Keith on Keith (by Keith Allen). But he never got to see it. He died of a heart attack while sitting on the sofa. He was 65. Cheers my friend, I'm just going to pour myself a glass of wine to drink your health.

I first met Keith

WHEN we both had restaurants in Bristol. I also took over one of them in Clifton in the early 80's.

One of his many restaurants, however, was to become the birth place of Floyd's huge rise to TV success. I got a phone call from his able bodied right hand woman, Angie, in a bit of a panic as she was getting ready to open his latest venture in Clifton, but Keith had gone AWOL!!

If I remember she had had a flood in the place and there was no kitchen help and the restaurant had bookings. So I sent up two of my chefs to help her out and we opened Floyd's for him!

One of his regular customers was a chap called David Pritchard, a producer from BBC Southampton TV. Each time he came in Keith would avoid speaking to him as he kept sending messages to the reluctant star asking if he could do a TV programme with him. David's persistence paid off and Keith was persuaded to make a pilot.

Filmed in a domestic kitchen in Southampton, Floyd on Fish was born. Floyd on Food, Floyd on Fire and even Far Flung Floyd were to follow. One day somebody asked him if he had chosen the name Floyd on purpose so as he could match it to the programmes and books!! Success grew and grew.

With his new style of presentation, "Come here Clive (cameraman) focus on the food that's what the viewers want not pictures of me!" But it wasn't really.

The viewers tuned in, in their millions to watch the 'bow-tied' 'shabby-chic' presenter 'slurping' his wine and bossing Clive around.

Success did mean that he left a lot of his old friends behind. In 1985, I interviewed him for my radio show in Bristol at the time. It was an easy interview.

After all it was just two mates sitting discussing one of their lives and good fortune. I

left the UK in 1986 and did not see him again until 1992 while he was filming Floyd on Spain. By then he had started drinking. Not just his occasional wine, but Scotch.

Also he had married again, Julie Hatcher was to provide Keith with his second child Poppy. But success, travelling and drinking took their toll and they eventually divorced.

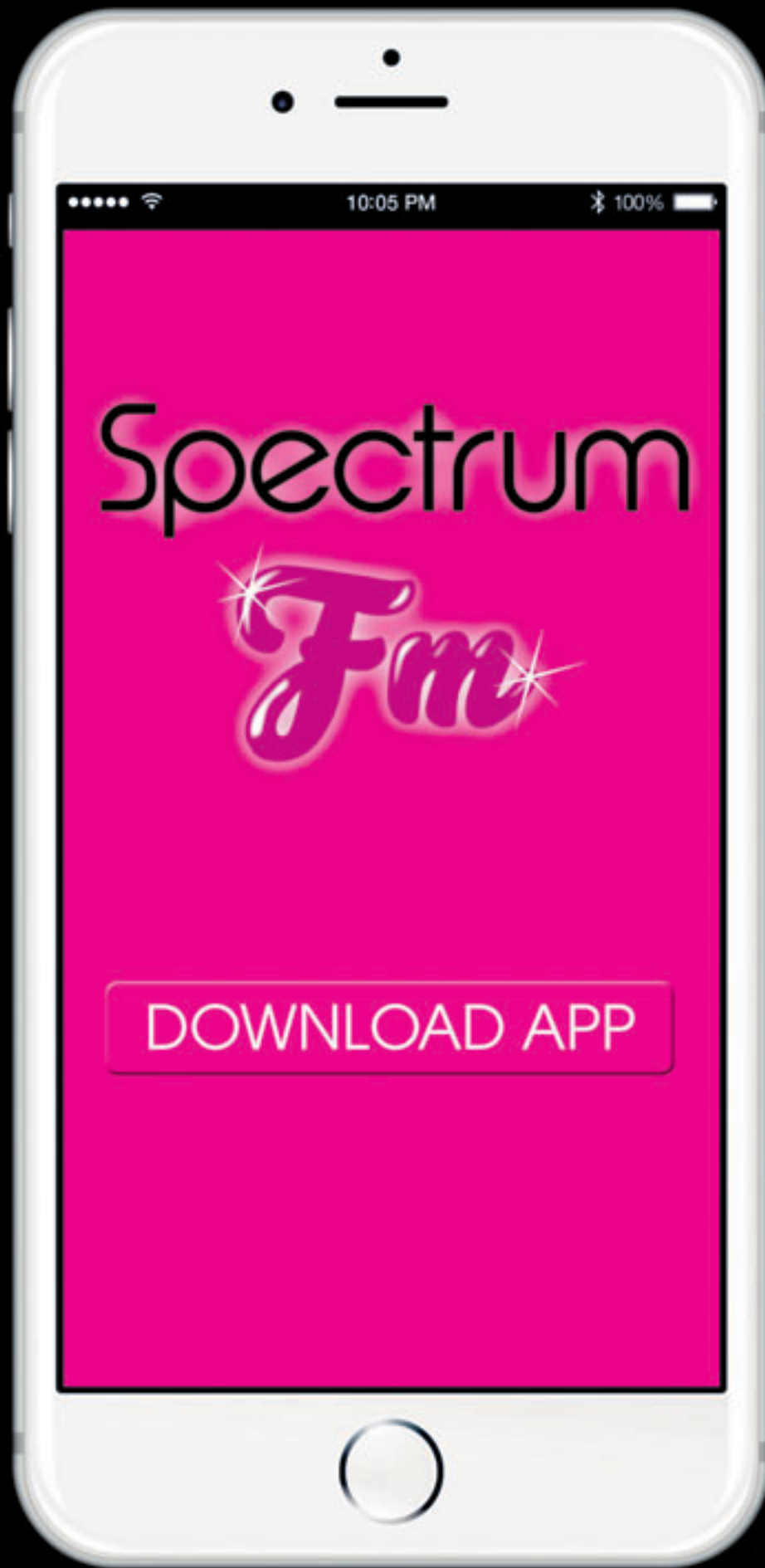

Hot summer nights in the garden

GRAEME TYRRELL

WE all look forward to summer for the bright sunny days and balmy nights to enjoy the outdoors, the beaches and nightlife. The garden is also a favourite place to relax, even more so if you have a pool.

This summer has had hotter than normal night temperatures in many zones of Spain. This has had its effects on the gardens.

Many native plants in our Mediterranean gardens can cope with this heat but the introduced plants from temperate climates and many vegetables can be severely affected by the lack of cooler weather in which they are accustomed to grow.

Many temperate plants in exposed positions have suffered from the heat and will appear drooped and with growth stunted. Watering can assist as it cools the root zone, but a more permanent solution to save water is to surround the plants with mulch to insulate the root zone from direct sun heating up the soil.

Providing shade over the plants during the hot periods of summer is also a good option to ensure the plants pass the summer to thrive the rest of the year. A frame covered in shade cloth is a good option for protecting valuable plants.

With autumn coming the lessons of the summer heat is that new planting, that should be being planned now for a flourish-

ing winter/spring garden, need to include strategies for protecting the delicate plants to be able to pass the next summer without being set back. Make sure that your delicate plants are placed in areas that have shade from the summer midday sun.

If you have found your vegetable garden has suffered with no other apparent cause then it may well be the high night temperatures that have affected tomatoes, pumpkins and many other vegetables to die off earlier this year.

The good thing is that there is space to plant out earlier this year for the autumn and winter crops so they are better established before the colder weather that slows them down sets in.

The summer storms devel-

oped by the summer heat provide a great opportunity for the garden to be prepared for the autumn planting as they stimulate growth and add nitrogen to the soil from the combination of lightning and rain.

Some storms have been very damaging though with hail stones and flooding creating havoc that will take time to repair the damage in the garden. Damaged plants will need to be pruned to remove the damaged branches.

Gardens always recover though with our help and the soil is improved with the rain adding relief for the thirsty trees and plants. After the rains the soil, when moist rather than wet, is ideal for digging over and adding compost in preparation

for the autumn planting of new trees, shrubs, herbs, vegetables and annuals.

Unlike many dormant northern winter gardens, Mediterranean gardens can be at their best during the cooler months.

The use of native Mediter-

ranean plants as a foundation for the garden will ensure the garden will always manage the summer heat and we can prepare our favourite temperate plants with some extra care to also get them through the hot nights.

Creepers and crawlers

IF you have a wall that's looking a bit bare, and would like to add some drama to your garden, try your hand at planting some climbing plants. There are many varieties you can try, and whether you go for something local to get that Mediterranean vibe or choose something a little more exotic, these plants add the perfect backdrop to any home.

To start off, you will need a trellis which you can either build yourself if you're feeling handy or buy from the local garden centre. Bamboo sticks are also quite effective. You can often buy the plant you wish to grow already partly formed, so all you have to do is water it well and then plant it by the wall you want to cover.

The hole needs to be twice as wide as the plant pot and half as deep again. It should also be about 30cm away from the wall to ensure the plant gets plenty of moisture. To make sure the plant thrives, water well for the first few months and make sure to spread out the stems across the trellis as it grows.

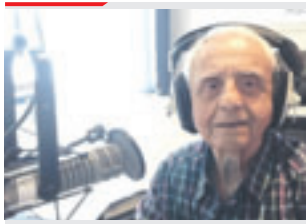

• IF your dog gets badly hurt and injured you should rub firmly the very tip of his tail (the bone part), the rubbing will release endorphins which act like a morphine injection and will give your dog some relief of pain until you can get him to the vets or other area with medical assistance. Cover his eyes and ears at the same time as you transport him and this will settle all his senses and will also help give him relief

• Watch when two dogs meet. They shake hands in their own way just as we do. While we use the touch system by shaking the other person's hand, the dog uses his olfactory system by scenting the other dog out, particularly in the nether regions. This form of communication between two or more dogs is total and they are getting every piece of information they require from that dog, by what they smell.

Is it a bitch, is it an entire dog, has the dog been neutered? All will be told in this initial meet and greet. It will also watch for Calming Signals (another issue) of great importance which can

be covered at some other time.

• Watch your dog sniff around before it goes to the toilet. Is it looking for a good spot to go? Is it making enquiries as to who else has used this area as a toilet? Why do many dogs scratch the ground after going to the toilet? Are they spreading their scent further around? Are they marking territory? 'I've been here, I own this spot.' If they want to claim a particular area, they will most likely spread their urine over the top of any existing urine in the area. They could be declaring to all and sundry - this is mine. I am bigger and stronger than you who have been here before me. Don't challenge me.

• The urine of a bitch in heat is much stronger in scent than normal. This tells the experienced male that she is in a good place for him. If the dog has never had anything to do with other dogs (the domestic pet which is kept inside), it may not have learnt what this additional smell means. It is difficult for us as humans to

really grasp how strong this smell of the bitch is to the dog especially if it is still entire. We, the human, are so bad at using our olfactory systems.

• The bitch in season which is allowed to wander creates absolute chaos in the dog world. Dogs have been known to jump fences, break out of gardens, cars etc, and do considerable damage to their places of usual confinement even to the extent of throwing themselves through a plate glass window; such is the power of smell.

Male dogs do tend to urinate more frequently than bitches. This not really a necessity within the dog, it is usually a dominance, perhaps territorial function it develops when allowed.

I would always teach my pupils that it may be a good idea to teach it to go to the toilet on command, rather than just any time it pleases. All working dogs are trained to go on command, it would not be good for a working dog to just go to mark territory it doesn't really own. I am sure your trainer will give you help on this.

Why does your cat hate water?

WATER has long been the nemesis of most felines, in spite what those cat surfing videos on YouTube may suggest. So are there any cats that actually like water? Is it possible to get your kitty to stop scarping every time you turn the tap on?

It is thought that cats self-domesticated in the Middle East around 10,000 years ago. This offers a big clue as to why they are so averse to water - it's in their DNA. If their ancestors evolved in an arid desert, this means they would have had little experience swimming or being submerged underwater.

Unlike dogs, cats are also not built physically to appreciate getting wet. While dogs' coats repel water, cats' fur absorbs it which then causes their body temperature to drop - and cats hate being cold almost as much as they hate being wet.

Some of domestic cats' more distant relatives, however, actually enjoy taking a dip. Tigers, for example, are known to cool off in the water and even take a swim if the circumstances call for it.

It is possible to get your cat used to water by slowly introducing him to the feel of it, but this is usually most effective when he is a kitten.

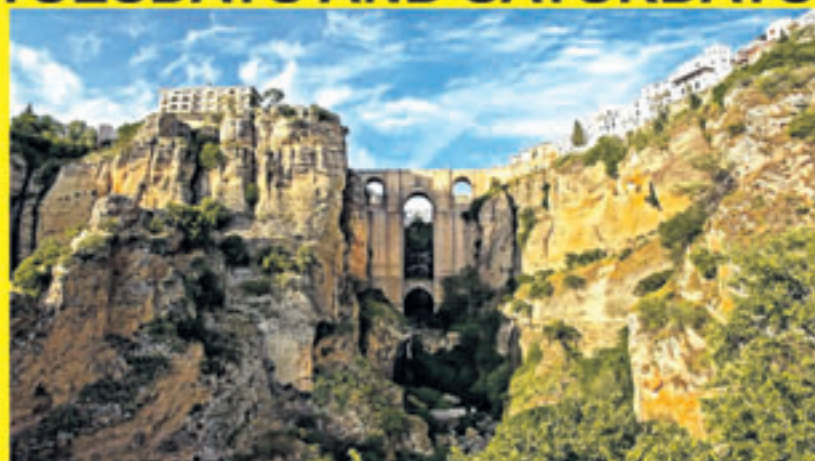

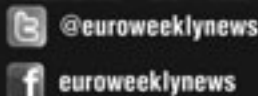

Motoring shorts

Turn a new leaf in GB

NISSAN LEAF will build its flagship Qashqai and X-Trail models in the UK. It's the latest boon for Britain's post-Brexit motor industry, which has been fearful of the impending split.

New Leafs will be built in the UK, US and Japan. The five-door electric hatchback is a frontrunner in the zero-emissions revolution.

The British market is dwarfed by Nissan's sales in America and Japan but that may change when the new Sunderland production facility opens.

Despite warnings from BMW leading to fears of a post-Brexit manufacturers exodus, the future looks bright. BMW will build its electric Mini in the UK, while Toyota will double down on investment in its British plants.

Show on the road!

WITH the Frankfurt Motor Show just around the corner, the full line-up of cars has finally been revealed.

One of the biggest motor shows on the planet, the Frankfurt affair will showcase concept cars of the future as well as the expected heavy hitters of 2018.

It is also the home of special and limited editions, such as the Mercedes AMG G65 and G63 models expected to make an appearance. The G65 is the real head-turner, boasting a raucous 621hp twin-turbocharged V12 engine. Mercedes are also revealing their top secret electric model, the EQ A Concept. It is the manufacturer's answer to the Volkswagen ID and arch nemesis BMW's i3 models.

Britain will be represented

by two models which couldn't be more contrasting. Bentley is unleashing its heavily-hyped Continental GT, while the British-built Mini Electric could be the definitive car of the next decade.

Due for official release in October and available in Radical Red, Sonic Gray, Phantom Blue and Blazing Gray it has been designed with European commuters in mind.

With its sporty double headlights, top quality finishes and distinctive boomerang designs, the Yamaha X-MAX scooters have a unique identity that makes them instantly recognisable.

The 125cc version comes with smart key ignition, LED lights and a new traction control system in order to ensure the safest possible ride.

A set of electronic sensors constantly monitors the rear wheel, and if the wheels are found to slip, the system immediately reduces the force transmitted to the wheel until traction is restored.

At the heart of this sports scooter is a 125cc, four-cycle, water-cooled SOHC single-cylinder engine that complies with EU4 standards, giving the X-MAX 125 a powerful result as its fully automatic V-belt transmission provides smooth, immediate acceleration.

The extremely quiet operation of the injection engine and its low fuel consumption make this the perfect scooter for the urban

ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

Opel/Vauxhall Crossland X

THE new Crossland X from Opel/Vauxhall is a practical family car with trendy styling which aims to bridge the gap between SUV and MPV models.

Based on a modified Peugeot 2008 platform - the French company now owns Opel/Vauxhall - the Crossland X offers a choice of engines.

The entry level versions have a 1.2 litre petrol unit and there are also turbo-petrol versions and diesels in the range. The starter models have a five-speed manual gearbox though up the range you get a six-speed box, and auto transmission is also available on some models. Prices start at €18,052 (£16,555).

The overall size of the Crossland X is very neat, managing to be quite roomy but with a smaller footprint than many SUV and MPV rivals. It is agile, easy to park, and has a smooth light-touch driving feel. With slightly raised ride-height and softer suspension set-up than many in the class, the Crossland X is a very comfortable car though I felt the front seats required a bit more shoulder support.

My test model was in SE EcoTEC trim, with a 108 hp turbo-petrol engine. This version costs €19,490 (£17,875) and has plenty of standard kit including stop-start system, touch

screen, Bluetooth, Apple CarPlay and Android Auto, cruise control, climate control and auto lights and wipers. You also get alloy wheels, and a front-camera system.

The 0-100 kph time is 10.6 seconds, fairly typical of models in this class, and the top speed is 188 kph (117

mph). Fuel economy is 20.3 kpl (57.6 mpg) - very good for a petrol model.

Designed to maximise interior capacity, there is good head and leg room for five adults and the boot holds 410 litres, larger than most rivals, and there is the option of a sliding rear seat which can boost space to 520 litres. Rear seats fold and an adjustable boot floor means no load lip so larger items can be loaded with minimum hassle.

With its potent looks and muscular body-cladding, the Crossland X stands out in an increasingly crowded SUV/MPV marketplace and with the visual charisma to attract new buyers to the brand, is likely to be a very strong seller.

Model tested is UK-specification and equipment levels and prices may vary in other markets.

Royal classic at Goodwood

AMONG the many highlights of the Goodwood Revival motorsport event last weekend was the auctioning of a Bentley Mulsanne once owned by the Queen.

The 2012-built saloon sold for

roughly €200,000 at the event, which combines classic cars and clothing at the iconic Goodwood Estate in southern England.

With less than 10,000km on the clock the Bentley was used to transport the Queen during public events in London from 2012 to 2014.

It was sold by Bonhams, who have kept the satellite navigation's 'Home' setting as Windsor Castle. The personalised car has walnut picnic tables and is a dark green.

Bentley provided the style to TVR's speed at Goodwood Revival, which celebrates cars built from 1948 to 1966. TVR, a British carmaker, showcased its

latest high performance car, which can hit 200mph, as they celebrated their 70th anniversary. It is the first time a new car has debuted at the oldies festival.

The festival, which is a com-

panion to the Goodwood Festival of Speed, was a huge success. Last Friday to Sunday were all devoted to historic motor racing, with parades and aerial displays thrown in for good measure.

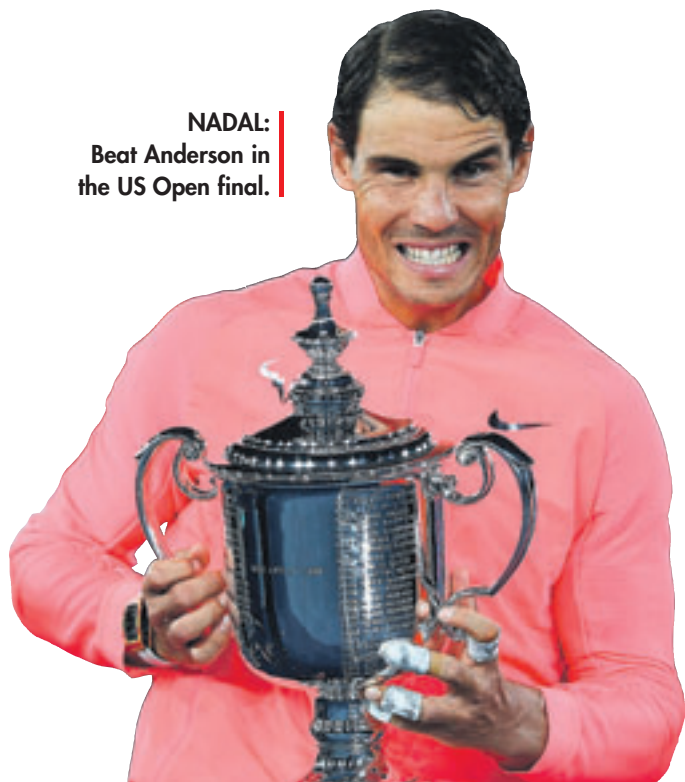
