Countdown to crisis

Plans for outlawed poll continue

CATALUÑA appears set for a head-on clash with Spain.

It comes as the regional council prepares to defy Madrid next Sunday by holding an independence referendum which the national government insists is illegal and will be stopped.

Spain's attorney general Jose Manuel Maza refused to rule out the possibility that Catalan president Carles Puigdemont could be held and charged with unlawful behaviour.

Maza claimed in a radio interview that the regional president could be charged for disobedience, breaching public duties, and misusing public funds after he financed the vote despite it being banned by the Spanish constitutional court.

The bombshell comes days after Spanish police swooped to arrest 14 Catalan officials and seize almost 10 million ballot papers in a series of raids which

sparked furious protests in Barcelona after tens of thousands poured onto the streets.

Madrid's finance ministry also put the squeeze on the region's finances to prevent government money from being spent on the campaign as the crisis deepened, before chartering ferries to transport thousands of extra police officers

Meanwhile, Spain's Prime Minister Mariano Rajov last Tuesday paid a visit to the White House to discuss defence spending and the EU with US President Donald Trump.

While the international community has so far yet to get involved in the dispute, a split would likely impact Spain's relationships with countries like the USA, one of Spain's largest

trading partners, since Cataluña generates around 20 per cent of the country's wealth.

Rajoy has repeatedly declared the vote is unlawful and a clear breach of the constitution but Puigdemont has vowed the region is ready to declare independence within 48 hours of a yes victory.

Catalan activists said more than 6,000 ballot boxes are ready to be used on Sunday.

Airport drama dodged

TRAVEL chaos in Spain could be avoided at the lastminute after a deal 'in principle' was agreed between workers' unions, airport operator Aena and air navigation manager Enaire.

The parties have signed a deal which must now be ratified by the Ministry for Development.

Specific terms of the deal had not been confirmed as the Euro Weekly News went to print but the CCOO, UGT and USO unions had been calling for pay increases and more staff. Airport workers - including firefighters and air traffic controllers - had threatened 25 one-day strikes in the months leading up to Christmas.

Aena operates 46 airports across Spain and saw 230.2 million passengers pass through its airports in 2016.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...31

AS the largest producers and the number one consumers of cured ham in the world - it's safe to say that ham is a pretty big deal in Spain.

The whole hog!

EACH Spaniard eats, on average, a whopping five kilograms of cured ham per year but a long and detailed method is followed to produce the high-quality jamon that Spain is

High quality

JAMON SERRANO (literally ham from the sierra, or mountains) encompasses all the other types of dry-cured ham made from other breeds of pigs. Although less expensive than Jamon Iberico, it can still be quite costly outside of Spain and is usually served in thin slices as a tapa. These hams are dried for up to 18 months in sheds built high in the hills to help the curing process, which is why it became known as 'mountain ham.'



Rich history

SPANISH cured ham has been a delicacy since the Roman times and was traditionally made in mountainous regions in the south-west. Families would breed and fatten their own pigs domestically and just one pig was often enough to last the household for a year.

Each year, all the family members participated in the matanza (sacrifice) sometime during the first few weeks of November. After the legs were packed in sea salt and hung to dry in the cool, winter air, the rest of the carcass was used to make chorizo, salchichon and morcilla sausages

Cut above the rest

THE most expensive ham - Jamon Iberico de Bellota comes from the black Iberico pig, which is fed a diet of acorns, or bellotas, and reared on fresh mountain air until it reaches the optimum weight and is taken to be 'sacrificed.'

Iberico pigs can eat up to 10 kilos of acorns a day, so they are normally much fatter than normal swine. This allows the meat to be cured for longer - usually between two to four years - and results in a more intense flavour that is unparalleled in the ham world. The acorn diet also gives the premi-

Treats in store

VALENCIAN community meteorologists are predicting 'heavier than usual rain' from November and December onwards. Jorge Olcina, director of Alicante University's Climatology Laboratory, confirmed their predictions. Weather on the Mediterranean coast always tended to be extreme, he said, and climate change meant that intense or torrential storms would inevitably become more frequent in future decades.

SIXTY bicycles from Campello's defunct rent-a-bike scheme have been stored for four years in the Social Centre's underground car park. Responding to the EU opposition party's suggestion that the scheme should be reactivated or the bikes put to better use, the Services councillor explained that the town hall is currently negotiating to sell them.

Another bull-running death

BOUS AL CARRER claimed their latest mortal victim in Pucol (Valencia).

Amadeo, a 46-year-old local man taking part in the bull-running, was taken unawares and knocked down by the bull when it charged suddenly and then returned to gore him, severing his femoral artery.

For a long while the bull had remained deceptively immobile and the victim, who also suffered a fractured skull and spinal injuries, was talking to a friend at the time, witnesses said.

Amadeo was initially taken by private ambulance to Sagunto hospital but owing to the severity of his injuries, he was transferred to the Hospital Clinico in Valencia City where he died that night.

Wonderland is the second circus to give up its animals in recent months and its decision came at a time when a growing number of regional and local governments are banning all spectacles that involve animals.

"That one of the most impor-

tant circuses in Spain should take this step illustrates the situation perfectly," said Pablo Delgado who is responsible for the centre's felines. "Fortunately the days of wild animals in circuses are numbered, like the bearded lady of the past."

An entire day was spent sedating, loading and driving the felines to Villena where they were released in the Primadomus quarantine section. They will spend the next four weeks there to ensure they are free of contagious diseases before continuing the rehabilitation process on the centre's 20 hectares of land in Sierra Sali-

Primadomus, which was opened by Queen Sofia in 2016 now has 32 felines, most of them from circuses.

Stay of execution for threatened trees

AN Alicante City judge ordered a halt to felling healthy almond trees adjoining those affected by the Xylella fastidiosa plague.

The court ruled in favour of Guadalest Town Hall and growers who stand to lose trees and crops as the regional government complies with stringent European Union directives for dealing with the bacterium.

The first known case on the Spanish mainland was detected in Guadalest, arriving via Mallorca and Ibiza after the disease known as tree-Ebola presumably travelled from Italy where millions of olive trees were lost.

Acting on EU instructions, the regional government has cordoned off, felled and destroyed all trees within a 100metre radius of those infected with the bacterium.

"This opens the door to seeking alternatives, as the authorities have done in Baleares," said a Guadalest Town Hall spokesman. "The EU approved their plans to contain the disease by eliminating only affected trees."

The Guadalest growers, backed by the Asaja agricultural union, also want a less aggressive approach.

"This would involve eradicating all possible hosts and containing the plague without exterminating agriculture and deforesting the area," the Guadalest spokesman said.

Preserve the peace

AS the proposed referendum in Cataluña draws ever closer we can only speculate as to whether we will see tanks stationed in the Plaza de Cataluña next Sunday.

The Spanish government is becoming more belligerent towards the Catalan parliament and the Catalonians appear unwilling to back down in any way.

If this was happening during the Arab Spring then western newspapers would surely be forecasting revolution and anticipating an armed struggle.

It is just 78 years since the Spanish Civil War finished, only 40 years since the return to democracy and the revelation of abortive plot to overthrow the king and 36 years since the attempted coup which saw Guardia Civil officers enter the Cortes with guns drawn.



SOS for Spanish

Progress for language fighters

PLURILINGUALISM plans for teaching all classes in state and state-aided schools in Spanish,

Valenciano and English remain on hold.

Schools were to be allowed to choose their levels of Valenciano or Spanish with lessons in English linked to the chosen level of

The Education department's programme, due to start with three-year-olds, was opposed by many Alicante Province parents, both Spanish and foreign, who complained that Valenciano was being foisted on pupils.

Norwegian-born Kristin Tenenbaum was prominent amongst them: "There were two options: uncross my arms and fight or sit and wait. I chose the former without knowing what I was getting into," she recently told the Euro Weekly News. Kristin soon made contact with the Idiomas y Educacion organisation: "This was my lifeline and gave me the strength to defend these fundamental rights," the concerned mother said.

Help was also at hand from the Alicante Province council, the Diputacion, which formally appealed against the regional law, claiming that it was discriminatory and ignored the province's "special characteristics" which include schools in

southern Alicante towns a few hundred metres from the Murcia boundary where Valenciano is never spoken.

The Diputacion's appeal was upheld by Valencia's Upper court (TSJCB) which temporarily halted the new law, ruling that schools should revert to the 2016-2017 model with lessons in Spanish or Valenciano.

Education chief Vicent Marza countered with a decree, lasting 12 months, that introduced the programme for three-year-olds only. This was done to ensure that children could remain enrolled in the schools chosen by parents, Marza maintained.

There was one major concession, as the number of subjects taught in English is no longer tied to the chosen level of Valenciano. It now remains to await a definitive decision from the courts, but meanwhile the Hablamos Español project, backed by Idiomas y Educacion is collecting 500,000 signatures for a legislative initiative enabling them to propose a new law in the national parliament.

"We want to protect Spanish, not only in schools but all public institutions, hospitals," Kristin

Obsessed officer faces jail

A GUARDIA CIVIL officer accused of poisoning a female colleague and her family faces a 30-year sentence if convicted.

Both were stationed at the Guardia Civil headquarters in Villajoyosa and the Brigada (equivalent to a Warrant Officer) was obsessed by her, according to the Public Prosecution department.

2010 when the woman was posted to Villajoyosa and in 2011 after she was assigned to Citizens' Attention, he was her immediate superior.

Until 2016 when the Brigada was promoted and posted elsewhere, both lived in apartments attached to the Villajoyosa headquarters.

He allegedly stalked her for three years, sneaking into her apartment to steal posunderwear and intimate photos stored on a pen drive.

The obsession took a different direction in 2016, the Public Prosecutor claimed, when the Brigada entered the woman's home and began adding insecticide to food she had prepared for her husband and three-yearold child.

Noticing for some time that the family's food tasted and smelt unpleasant, she installed a home security camera. This showed her superior entering her apartment and adding something to the food which analysis revealed as insecticide

The Public Prosecutor recommended that the Brigada stand trial on three counts of attempted murder, breaking and entering and invasion of the woman officer's privacy.

Less of a waiting game

OPERATING theatres at San Juan hospital are now in use on Saturdays for scheduled operations.

The regional government's Health department has taken this step to reduce waiting lists and San Juan ophthalmic surgeons have already performed the first six weekend operations. Another six are scheduled for this Saturday.

In October the programme will extend to include maxillofacial surgery.

The Health department has contracted an additional 103 surgeons to create new surgical teams or augment existing units throughout the Valencian Community and San Juan has been authorised to engage a surgeon, an anaesthetist, two nurses, and an auxiliary for the Saturday maxillofacial operations.

JIJONA Town Hall is taking steps to reduce the number of pigeons in the Old Town.

The specialist firm that has been brought in will install cages to trap the pigeons and will also release birds of prey in the area

The town hall embarked on the three-month project costing

€3,900 in response to residents' complaints that the pigeons' "excessive" presence is damaging buildings owing to the acidity of their droppings, which also block storm drains.

They are carriers of parasites and germs, a spokesman for the residents said, and could infect humans with psittacosis.

The town hall has asked residents to assist by allowing cages to be installed on their terraces and balconies, said Health councillor Cristian Sir-

The councillor also asked owners of empty houses in the Old Quarter to block all holes or gaps on facades and roofs and fix mosquito netting over windows and doors to prevent the birds from entering and nesting in the properties.

Marble industry demands recycling

Written in stone

MEDIO VINALOPO's quarry owners want to reuse the 500,000 tons of 'marmolina' or marble dust produced each year.

Producers recently met officials from the region's Environment department as well as mayors from towns along the Marble Corridor: Pinoso, Algueña, La Romana and Monovar.


The Pinoso meeting was the first step towards solving a 'historic and complex problem' by classing the marble dust as a by-product.

Pinoso's mayor Lazaro Azorin explained to regional government representatives that research by the town hall's own Environment department and Alicante University had shown that the marble dust could be used as a filler to rehabilitate disused quarries and block hollows used to dump rubbish.

"This would prevent the fly-tipping that affects our principal source of income and also the environment," Azorin said.

Regional government officials congratulated the local marble industry for its commitment but explained that the process of reclassifying the marmolina rested with the national government's Ministry of the Environment.

The regional authorities are to accompany the delegation of local mayors and marble quarries to Madrid in their bid to reuse the marmolina and reduce its impact on the Medio Vinalopo countryside.

Non-resident tax in Spain: Income tax form

Every year before December 31st all non-residents in Spain must complete a non-resident income tax form

So who does this tax apply to?

This applies to anybody who is not legally a resident in Spain, but who has assets such as property in Spain, income from rental of property, income from bank deposits when applicable, royalties from intellectual property, etc...

What do I need to do?

You will need to fill out a 210 form with all of your personal details, bank account number, and the details of any assets you have in Spain. If there is one or more owner of your property, each owner must complete their own tax form.

You will require the following information:

- Address of your Spanish property, and your address in your country of residence.
- The date of purchase of the property.
- The valor catastral of your property.
- Name, date and place of birth and tax number of each owner of the property.
- Any other information regarding the above mentioned items of income.



What happens if I don't do a tax return?

When you sell your Spanish property, 3% of the sale value will be automatically withheld by the tax office. In most cases the 3% sales value will be more than the capital gains tax due, so you may be able claim back a

substantial amount. This process is slow and if you have not summited your annual tax returns, the process will become much slower. What's more the tax office may subject you to fines for not presenting your annual tax returns or for late submission.

Dust-up over cover-up ban

RESIDENTS in a Muchavista residential complex near Alicante City disagreed with a ban on burkinis in the communal swimming pool.

Last August the president of the Residents' Community asked a summer visitor to leave the pool where she was swimming in a burkini that left only her face, hands and feet bare.

As not all residents backed the ban, the Community president called an extraordinary general meeting

The recently-leaked minutes revealed that the woman, a US Muslim, also attended the meeting and complained that she had no problems when swimming where she lived in Washing-

When a vote was taken, 30 people backed the burkini ban, eight opposed it and four abstained.

Outdoor clothes, sportswear and swimsuits worn on top of underwear were similarly banned on hygiene grounds. Neoprene suits and



proved with 17 votes for, 13 against and seven abstentions.

The opponents to the burkini ban intend to challenge the majority decision, claiming that describing the garment as unhygienic was camouflaged xenophobia.

"The example that my urbanisation is giving to children and adolescents is particularly upsetting," said resident Antonio Aledo. "Lack of respect and fear of others have become norms approved at a residents' meeting.

Few agreed with him: "The burkini is a clear example of machismo and oppression of women that we cannot support," one man

Consortium to the rescue

ALICANTE Province's Consortium of Fire Brigades answered 2,522 calls between June 15 and September 14, compared with 2,022 in 2016.

Despite this increase only 25 hectares of woodland were burnt this summer although the Consortium put out 700 fires, 38 of which were caused by traffic accidents.

Firefighters were called to 150 road accidents where they were needed to cut free 55 trapped drivers or passengers, disconnect car batteries and hose down roads and pavements after a crash.

The Consortium brigades also secured the fa-

cades of buildings, cleared blocked roads and cleared railway lines

Hikers, climbers and others in difficulties needed the assistance of the Consortium's rescue experts and helicopters on 31 occasions. These included a Jijona man who was unhurt but had to be airlifted out after a house collapsed round him, blocking the narrow access

The Consortium firefighters removed several beehives and nests with the assistance of beekeepers. They also rescued 66 animals last summer which including a ferret on the point of drowning and a snake found on an Elche pavement.

IT looks as if the problem is that the foundations are not properly dug bearing in mind the soil on which the house is built (clay). Who is liable? What can we do?

Dear Reader.

Thank you for your enquiry

As mentioned in previous articles for construction works in respect of which planning permission was requested after May 2000 the Law of Construction Planning (LOE) applies.

We understand that missing or incorrect inclusion in the project of the property of the soil material, problems and other circumstances etc are within the responsibility of the senior

architect (arquitecto superior) as he, as author of the project, should assess the quality and type of soil and make decisions concerning proper construction.

Therefore, the senior architect should have taken into account the circumstances of the plot, but not only that he should also have been able to foresee whether these would affect the future of the building and if so he should have taken the necessary steps to design a solution that would avoid what unfortunately appears to have occurred.

On numerous occasions, different Courts have referred to this and the Supreme Court of Spain declared: "the prior examination of the soil, verifying it or at least checking its analysis and subsequent ge-

ological survey personally is a fundamental obligation of the senior architect's obligations that in any case are demanded by the dignity and competence inherent to their profession."

The fact that the senior architect is responsible does not mean that you cannot claim against the other persons involved in the construction process as per the LOE such as the technical architect, contractor, insurance company, etc. All possibilities should be studied.

Regarding the next steps to be taken, we recommend you to call in an architect expert in building defects to ascertain whether the cracks are still moving as well as the reasons, causes, consequences and possible solutions of the problem. The expert report is key in the

event of a future claim.

We understand that you must get expert legal advice on building defects, as a legal strategy must be set up, in order to determine against who you can and should claim. It is essential to notify the potential respondent of the damages as soon as possible, as there are some deadlines to claim that must be fulfilled.

As in previous articles, we recommend a visit to our office or to another lawver expert in this feel, to examine your case thoroughly. It is sensible to involve the lawver from the beginning, even before contacting the developer or the rest of the parties involved.



ALFAZ continues to support alternative transport with Bicycle Day on October 1.

"The bicycle fits in perfectly with our plans for a sustainable

and environmentally-friendly town," said Genoveva Tent and Luis Miguel Morant, respective councillors for Transport and Sport.

They went on to explain that they had decided not to

change the date of Alfaz's Bicycle Day although this comes so soon after the recent Mobility Week.

"You could say that we're extending it by a week to give more impact to our campaign encouraging people to cycle," the councillors said.

Alfaz has an extensive network of bicycle lanes that include the Cami la Mar which connects Alfaz and Albir and the Sierra Helada Ciclovia between Albir and Benidorm.

"These cycle lanes mean residents and visitors can park their cars and use a means of transport that is healthier and more sustainable," Tent said.

No more leaks or damp

WORK on renewing main drainage in El Cautivador should be completed within days.

The urbanisation's oldest drainpipes have been replaced in a €413,876 outlay that will put an end to problems caused by leaks and damp affecting properties in Avenida Cautivador, Calle Pics d'Europa and Calle Aneto.

The cash will come from the Fondo de Inversion agreement with Hidraqua, which supplies Alfaz's domestic water and maintains the main drainage system, explained Town Planning councillor Toni Such.

The work now nearing completion involved replacing the network of pipes in a




FINISHING TOUCHES: Work almost finished at El Cautivador.


RAFA FER-NANDEZ has been crowned the new king of underwater photography in Europe.

He told the Spanish press: "I have competed to a good level, it was an unknown race course and to achieve a bronze here is a success."



FIREFIGHTERS rescued a British hiker who was in serious danger of falling from the Portixol cliffs.


The man was walking down the cliff when the ground beneath him fell away, leaving him clinging to a ledge.



Gold is still popular

BULLION COINS ARE AN EASY WAY TO INVEST

IN times of international trouble and dispute, investors like to head towards gold as an alternative option to traditional stocks and shares.

The precious metal has enjoyed a buoyant few months especially with the 'disagreement' between North Korea and the USA having gained 12.9 per cent so far in 2017.

The current price of €1,090 for a troy ounce of fine (24 carat) gold is only slightly down on its highest price this year but for the small investor, spot price and actual cost to purchase can be quite different.

In many ways the most sensible way of purchasing old is to buy bullion coins from reputable dealers and the larger the coin, the smaller the percentage over spot price they cost.

Countries such as Australia and South Africa which produce a great deal of gold are happy to use some of it in bullion coins in order to obtain foreign currency and the Kangaroo and Krugerrand amongst other gold coins are easily traded as well as being VAT free.

Investors are advised to keep well away from gold proof coins as although they are sold with pre-announced issue limits, they are sold at large percentages over spot and with so many being issued by literally hundreds of countries worldwide, the chance of a profit is very

There are other precious metal coins available, particularly platinum and silver but neither has the allure and general investment fol-

In addition to coins, it is possible to invest in bullion bars which have no legal tender status and may, in some countries be subject to

Spain does not produce any gold bullion coins and the only regularly produced coins from European Union countries are from France

and the United Kingdom.

Whilst it is attractive to regard jewellery as an investment, it is worth noting that modern jewellery tends to be sold at up to 300 per cent more than spot, is generally made from a mix of gold and a second metal in order to add strength and also attracts VAT.

Jewellery is certainly an attractive way of owning precious metal but as an investment is not as certain as bullion coins which are portable and easily obtained, but like all investments, gold prices can go down as well as up.

Ryanair tries to sort out mess

SPEAKING at the Annual General Meeting of Ryanair in Dublin, Michael O'Leary CEO admitted that the cancellation of flights would cost the airline at least €25 mil-

He accepted that the problem was one caused within the airline as pilots tried to take 12 months of holidays in nine months due to an enforced change in the leave year and sympathised with passengers who had been af-

The company is trying to persuade pilots to give up one week of their holiday in exchange for a cash payment which could be as much as €12,000 but both they and first officers are trying to hold out for new contracts and better condi-

BRITISH BANKS TO CHECK IMMIGRATION STATUS New law effective January

ALTHOUGH legislation has existed since 2016, it will not be until January 2018 that banks will be required to check on the immigration status of cus-

The decision has been made in order to try to identify whether bank customers are resident in the UK legally or if they have either overstayed their visas or absconded from immigration checks.

Information on the identities of known persons due for deportation from the UK will be supplied by not for profit organisation Cifas to the banks who will then be required to close or freeze accounts for anyone appearing on the lists.

As Cifas is primarily an anti-fraud and money-laundering operation and as banks are likely to have to check up to 70 million accounts each quarter, it is suggested by observers that this may not be the best way to police the system.

With such a large number of accounts to check, the fear is that the banks and Home Office which will also supply information could make mis-

takes, leading to perfectly honest customers having their accounts frozen, especially as the banks are likely to err on the side of caution in order to ensure that they are not penalised.

Chief Executive of the Joint Council for the Welfare of Immigrants Satbir Singh told The Guardian: "The government's own record shows that it cannot be trusted even to implement this system properly.

"Immigration status is very complex, and the Home Office consistently gives out incorrect information and guidance.

This crackdown which seems more likely to affect those with common ethnic names or multiple accounts, may go some way to stopping some fake accounts, but with advance notice, anyone who is illegally in Britain will have time to close their bank accounts and remove their cash.

Indeed much of the 'black economy' operates with cash and sees those without papers working for third parties cash in hand.

The government however also plans to crack down on landlords and employers who do not obtain proper documentation from those who have no right to be living or working in the UK.

It is to be hoped that those expatriates living in Spain but with bank accounts in the UK will not fall foul of this new investigative procedure, although possession of a UK passport should go a long way to proving right of abode in the UK and Spain.

Spain's two top brands

IN an international review of the value of brands, the leader once again is Apple with a declared worth of €154.65 billion.

There are just two Spanish brands in the top 100, Inditex, owner of Zara comes in at number 24 with a value of €15.6 billion although it still sits one place behind Scandinavian competitor H&M.

The other Spanish success is the Santander banking group which sits in 68th place with a value of just €5.6 billion although it is the 10th most valuable group in finance and is beaten by global brands such as American Express and Visa.

Sky TV now online

WHILST many English speaking residents in Spain have been eager to learn details of the new Sky online package, it now appears to be cheap but not very inclusive.

The Spanish service is now available without contract at a cost of €10 per month with the first month free and a box costing €25.

The drawback is that there will only be 12 local pay-TV channels included in the package all broadcast in Spanish plus a limited number of 'box

Channels supplied with this new service include Comedy Central, Nickelodeon, Disney's XD and Disney Junior, Syfy, TNT, TCM and Fox which will allow subscribers access to The Walking Dead and Big Bang

Due to licensing arrangements, there is no offer of Sky Sports or Sky Movies and although inexpensive, the whole package will have to compete with Amazon, HBO and Netflix as well as the English-speaking channels supplied unofficially via VPN or IPTV.

Spanish government has not spent EU youth grants

CRITICS of the Spanish government claim that they are running the risking of further alienating unemployed under 25s even though the EU had granted €1.9 billion.

Despite the fact that the Spanish economy is recovering more quickly than most of the eurozone, the huge number of young people still unemployed is close to 40 per cent and many who do have jobs have short term contracts which pay badly.

The European Union youth jobs and employment programme was launched in 2014 but because Spain was required to spend the money first and then reclaim, it was initially reluctant to spend more money as it was being threatened with fines if it didn't reduce the public

Now with the economy in a much happier state, it has to spend €1 billion by the end of 2017 and the balance in 2018 and opponents suggest that the government doesn't have a proper plan in place and therefore is sponsoring useless training which youngsters only apply for because they are bored.

If this suggestion is based on fact, then there is a distinct possibility that the European Union will refuse to refund the money spent as it will be reviewing the effectiveness of the training programmes put into place.

There was some thought of using the funds to 'top up' low youth salaries, but this may not be acceptable under EU budgetary guidelines.

Jubilant secessionists threw their Catalan-Phrygian caps in the air before Juncker got to the end of the sentence and were crestfallen when they learnt that the EU president had used the conditional tense and the adjective 'legal.'

The separatists have only even listened to what they wanted to hear and never did manage to get the message sent by the poor turnout for the November 9 mini-referendum in 2014 and the discouraging 2015 regional elections.

EIGHT of the 12 ministers in Rajov's first government were lawyers and two - including the vice-president Soraya Saenz de Santamaria - were State lawyers. snowball-throwers that they must face the legal consequences



LEGALLY SPEAKING

Driving classic cars

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



I CLASSIC CARS: Governed by the same rules as normal vehicles.

A NUMBER of classic car owners and associations have asked about the laws that refer specifically to this type of vehicle and what provisions the drivers must make when driving on Spanish roads.

Royal Decree 1247/1995, deals with the reglamento de vehículos históricos, rules for historic vehicles, or classic cars, under article 10 of the Normas de circulación.

First and foremost, unless rules are specifically in place for this type of vehicle, classic cars are governed by the same laws and rules as normal vehicles, including the requirement of liability insurance.

The rules relating to the technical inspection and registration are also applicable, as per normal vehicles. The period of the technical inspection also remains the same, unless otherwise indicated in the official report.

Those vehicles which, on account of their age or constructive characteristics, do not have lights or indicators as are normally required by law, are not allowed to travel between sunset and sunrise, or in circumstances which would normally require the use of these lights and indicators.

Historic vehicles that are not able to exceed the speed of 40 kilometres per hour should drive on the shoulder, if practicable, or, alternatively, as close as possible to the right outside edge of the roadway, except when overtaking or turning left, manoeuvres which may force other drivers to abruptly change the direction or speed of their vehicles. Historic vehicles are not allowed on the motorway if they are unable to reach a speed of at least 60 kilometres per hour.

The Dirección General de Tráfico also reserves the right to prohibit classic cars on certain dates and routes, if they are not able to exceed the speed of 80 kilometres per hour.

As for situations when classic cars can travel on the roads as a group, Annex II of the Reglamento General de Circulación, article 32 of section 3 details Participación de vehículos históricos and refers to group activities.

Where are his title deeds?

How can I find the title deeds for my apartment in Alcudia, Mallorca? We left them with Halifax Bank España, with whom we had a mortgage. This was paid off several years ago but we let the

bank hold the deeds for us. As far as I can ascertain the branches in Mallorca have now closed, leaving us with no one to contact.

PC (Baleares)

When you purchased your flat, you signed the deed at a Spanish Notary, at the same time you signed the mortgage deed.

This Notary has your original title deed in his computer. The bank has an authorised copy. The



piece of paper is not important. Go to the Notary and get an authorised copy of your deed. Be alert. Even if your mortgage is paid, it is quite possible that the bank has not officially cancelled it in the Property Registry.

The Notary or your lawyer can check on this. You might need to contact Halifax Lloyds Bank to find out. Try calling 902 024 365.

Pain around the hip joint

A common complaint that is often seen in our practice is a pain around the hip. This pain often radiates to the buttock, groin and through the outside of the upper leg towards the knee. In addition, it is often noticed that the knee gives way and lying in bed on the painful side is almost impossible.

Frequently, it is thought that degeneration of the hip or bursitis in the hip is causing the problem. However, with this combination of symptoms, this is almost never the cause of complaints. After these thorough examination, it is often found that there is a pelvic disorder. Because the hip makes its joint with a pelvic half, the hip joint is put in a twisted state if the pelvis is misaligned. This often causes the hip bursa to irritate and because of this change of position the angle of the knee is altered. This causes instability and often causes people to fall through their knee without pain. The pain on the outside of the leg is caused by the tension of a muscle running on the outer side of the leg (iliotibial band) and attached to the knee capsule.

The change of position has increased the distance between the pelvis and knee and tenses this muscle, the joint capsule and puts more pressure on the bursa in the hip, so lying on that side is impossible. In addition, there



may be an irritation of the sciatic nerve which causes pins and needles or pain in the whole

Furthermore, the pelvic misalignment causes an overload of the SI joint. Due to this overload the muscles around the hip tighten. This constant strain also causes pain in the entire hip region.

This complaint is therefore a complex



Wasp stings

What are the symptoms of a wasp sting?

When you are stung by a wasp on your skin, the area infected will become inflamed and red with a noticeable centre where the sting occurred. In general the reaction is contained to where you are stung, however some people can have reactions all over their body.

Can they be dangerous?

Wasp stings tend to hurt, but are not often dangerous. In some cases, especially with people who are allergic to them, the reaction can be much more severe and can cause death.

How can you tell if you are having an allergic reaction to a sting?

Normally when a person is stung by a wasp the reaction is contained to the area they were stung. However if a person feels generally unwell, begins to sweat, has other skin lesions appear on their body, swollen lips or face, difficulties breathing or loss of consciousness and chest pains, among other things, then it is certainly an allergic reaction.

What should I do if I get stung?

Normally if it only causes a reaction on the skin vou don't need to see a doctor. However if the area stung becomes infected or you notice an allergic reaction then immediately go to accident and emergencies where you will be prescribed with treatments which can include anti-inflammatories, corticoids or maybe even antibiotics.



Pleasure without measure?

A TOAST TO GOOD FOOD. **GOOD WINE** AND GOOD

FRIENDS WITH GARRY

HAVE always been a great lover of 'free pouring' - the absence of using fixed measures of alcohol.

Even though it was technically against the law, it was well practised in my restaurants in the UK. It must have been the Spanish influence even all those years ago. But even with this method it was possible to pour exactly the same measure into each glass. Apart from alcohol, pubs and restaurants started to use legally (or voluntarily) measure marks on the wine

But most bars and restaurants here free pour without such guidelines, which leads to differences that are quite noticeable.

Last week I had occasion to be in three different establishments of varying standard. One was a place I pop into quite often. A family run eatery of few tables and fewer

customers, but a warm welcome and a decent glass of Rosé, well chilled but the measure is half as much again as I would pour. They must be getting four glasses out of the bottle at the most: and at €3.95 a glass they are selling the bottle of wine for €15. Makes sense even if it looks generous.

The second place was a restaurant that is very busy and whose prices are quite high. A glass of red wine from Ribera del Duero (the price I do not know as I was being invited - but I imagine around the €5 mark) came in a modern glass with a wider base and a curved side, the sort of glass used by most upmarket establish-



Too little.

I tell my staff to fill the glass to just above the curve, which gives five good glasses from the bottle. But on this occasion the measure was below the curve which would give the house six glasses to the bottle. Making a bottle of house wine worth around €30 a bottle. which I am sure we would all say is too much.

However I did ask them to fill it to above the curve which they did without question.

The third place was a very modern tapas/raciones/and restaurant operation in Marbella. Very professionally run. We had a bottle of wine which was their house

wine at €21 from Castillo de Mancha, which wasn't particularly good. The red wine by the glass was pleasant enough and at €3.50 a glass was good value. The measures poured were also correct.

Now dear reader, you may have got down to the bottom of this article and ask if there is a point to it? Well, my point is that whatever price you charge, or quantity you give, the chances are it is normally more expensive to drink wine by the glass than the bottle.

This last place was charging less for drinking by the glass than the bottle. White by the glass at €3 means €15 a bottle, red at €3.50 means €17 for the bottle. With the former being €21 a bottle and the latter €25 it's obvious which makes more sense to the

Have you ever been surprised when in the countryside to see flourishing trees and bushes

that receive no water from artificial sources, neither pruning nor maintenance, yet are healthy and happy?

Switch to my terraces and after two years, despite the odd watering ('don't water them too much' said the gardener) and talking to them they have now reached the end of their lives and will be consigned to the garden rub-



However, a thought crossed my mind; if I leave them where they are I could be the only one out of my neighbours that will have a dried cactus display.

Autumn gardening Mediterranean style

GRAEME TYRRELL

UNLIKE northern European regions, autumn is a busy time to clean up the garden and start planting the winter and spring annuals, flowering perennials, herbs and vegetables.

It is the best time to set out new garden designs to allow new trees and shrubs to get established with the winter rains and cooler weather benefiting them to grow stronger before the onset of the next hot, dry summer season. Pruning back spent flowers and scraggly

growth can also be done

Flowering annuals and perennials to plant now include sweet alyssum, calendula, Canterbury bells, English daisy, African daisy, Iceland poppy, larkspur, lobelia, pansy, annual phlox, ranunculus, stock, sweet pea, sweet william, viola, primroses. cyclamen, and bulbs such as daffodils and jonquils. Having flowers always brightens up the home garden, balcony or terrace and take up only a small area whether in pots, planter boxes or the garden.

Vegetables to plant now

include beet, bok choy, broccoli, brussels sprouts, carrot, cabbage, cauliflower, celery, endive, garlic, kale, kohlrabi, leek, head and leaf lettuce, onion, pea, radish, spinach, snow peas, Swiss chard and turnip. There is nothing like your own fresh vegetables if you have the time and space.

Most herbs are planted at this time but lavender. marjoram, oregano, sage, rosemary, tarragon, thyme, parsley, basil, chives, mints, dill, coriander, are all favourites that have a variety of different forms to add even greater interest to the garden and the

kitchen meals. Herbs can be grown near or even in the kitchen where there is sufficient light so that they can be easy to gather when needed.

The most successful time to plant most trees and shrubs is just after the first good rains have moistened the soil. Add compost in proportion to the needs of the plants' requirements to do their best. Integrate the compost into the natural soil through cultivation.

It is well worth the effort to prepare the soil to allow the plants to have a good start in their new location and the compost will give better water retention to help the soil continue to provide nutrients and moisture more evenly for many years. Mulching the plants is not essential until before the hot weather returns in spring. I prefer to leave the soil free of mulch over winter in case of water logging and introduction of fungal problems to the soil over the cooler wet months.

Plants that have flowered over summer but are now finishing their flowering should be clipped back where necessary and tidied up. It is not a good time for severe pruning as large cuts can allow entry of diseases in large wounds on trees and shrubs while the weather is still warm and humid. It is better to just use clippers and leave the saw in the shed except for dead limbs and fallen trees.

Autumn is a busy time in the garden while the days are still long and warm. The works will pay off with the establishment of a wonderful garden over winter and allow the blossoming in spring and the garden will have gained hardiness for the next summer's heat and dryness.

Many owners think that it is a good idea to let dogs have their

heads hanging out of the window of the car whilst travelling. This is dangerous for the dog and can cause many health problems to the eyes and to the nose. Never let your dog hang his head out of the window. Many a dog has jumped out of a travelling car through the window, resulting in death.

In many parts of Europe, it is an offence to allow dogs to be loose or unsecured in cars and can be very costly in fines.

A dog should never be left in a car during hot weather for longer than a few minutes. Owners should park in shaded areas, keeping in mind that the sun moves. Even if the windows are left open the temperature can reach 35 degrees in a few minutes. Dogs can suffer from heatstroke within 10 minutes or

From a training point of view, it is a good idea to make dogs sit before allowing them into the car. When opening a car door dogs should be trained to stay, so that there is no chance of them jumping out onto a road and causing an accident or indeed killing themselves.



Red lorry, electric lorry



FUTURISTIC: Electric dreams become reality.

AN electric lorry is the latest creation from Tesla wizard Elon Musk. The self-driving lorry could be on American roads from as early as next month.

Musk, the billionaire behind much of the autonomous driving revolution, described the 'Tesla Semi Truck' as a 'beast.' If the vehicle takes off, which it is expected to, then it will revolutionise the commercial trucking industry. The Tesla Semi Truck will be powered by electric battery and ultimately, will require no driver.

It can travel more than 1,000km on a single charge, although a heavy load could be reduced to just 400k but may be used for urban transport, not substantial inter-state journeys at first. Tesla blueprints for future commercial travel envisage a fleet of electric, autonomous trucks, following one lead vehicle, driven by a human.

A BRITISH billionaire is plotting to resurrect the iconic Land Rover Defender. Jim Ratcliffe, CEO of chemical company Ineos, will invest a whopping €700 million in the ambitious project.

The last Defender was produced in 2016. But Ratcliffe wants to bring back the 68-year-old original. It will be a direct replica of the original design, with modern perfor-

mance and safety tweaks.

Oddly, the design isn't trademarked in the UK, though it is in other countries. Ratcliffe wants to produce 25,000 Defenders a year from 2020. He is currently seeking permission to build in the UK, though German factories

are also being considered.

Ratcliffe's Defenders will cost around €40,000. They may face competition from Jaguar Land Rover itself. The manufacturer is reportedly toying with the idea of a sleek, modern Defender due sometime before 2020.


