Man kills girlfriend and runs

A 22-YEAR-OLD man is set to be charged for the murder of his girlfriend in

The shocking attack came less than an hour after she had lodged a police complaint about him.

The attacker is from Malaga and had reportedly travelled to Murcia in search of his partner after she left him, but she reported him for harassment.

But as she arrived home he stabbed her in the neck and chest before trying to flee across nearby balconies as police arrived.

He was then caught by a group of residents who became suspicious of his blood-stained clothes.

Bather drowns

A POLICE probe has been launched after a 60-yearold bather was found dead. The victim vanished from Postiguet beach in Alicante but his body was not recovered for more than 12 hours, eventually being spotted several hundred metres from the coast by a fire and rescue helicopter.

A search was mounted the previous evening after his daughter alerted authorities to his disappearance.

Outrage over animal welfare

Substandard conditions and poorly trained staff pose a serious threat to security at Torrevieja's animal shelter, say trade unionists.

The furious campaigners have reported the facility to the

A delegation from the CSIF union found leaks, exposed electrical panels and wiring, and unprotected personal data in the client files. Their damning report claimed that workers lacked protective equipment for dealing with animals. Most also had 'no training or qualifications' whatsoever.

The shelter has no access for people with reduced mobility. It is a hazard for staff, visitors and the animals, the delegation con-

Particular concern was expressed over the role of volunteers. Inspectors found that untrained, and unaccountable, volunteers had access to the personal information of people considering adopting animals.

By law, only registered and paid staff should ever process private information.

The shelter was inspected by Seprona, the Guardia Civil's animal protection unit, a few months ago. Similar safety issues were raised at the time. Mayor Carmen Morate has admitted that the facility is in bad shape and pledged further investment.

Around 500 animals enter the Torrevieja shelter each year.

Countdown to crisis

Plans for outlawed poll continue

CATALUÑA appears set for a head-on clash with Spain.

It comes as the regional council prepares to defy Madrid next Sunday by holding an independence referendum which the national government insists is illegal and will be stopped.

Spain's attorney general Jose Manuel Maza refused to rule out the possibility that Catalan president Carles Puigdemont could be held and charged with unlawful behaviour.

Maza claimed in a radio interview that the regional president could be charged for disobedience, breaching public duties, and misusing public funds after he financed the vote despite it being banned by the Spanish constitutional court.

The bombshell comes days after Spanish police swooped to arrest 14 Catalan officials and seize almost 10 million ballot papers in a series of raids which sparked furious protests in Barcelona after tens of thousands poured onto the streets.

Madrid's finance ministry also put the squeeze on the region's finances to prevent government money from being spent on the campaign as the crisis deepened, before chartering ferries to transport thousands of extra police officers sent to the troubled region.

TRAVEL chaos in Spain could be avoided at the last-minute after a deal 'in principle' was agreed between workers' unions, airport operator Aena and air navigation manager Enaire.

The parties have signed a deal which must now be ratified by the Ministry for Devel-

Specific terms of the deal had not been confirmed as the Euro Weekly News went to print but the CCOO, UGT and USO unions had been calling for pay increases and more staff.

Airport workers - including firefighters and air traffic controllers had threatened 25 oneday strikes in the months leading up to Christmas.

Aena operates 46 airports across Spain. The operator saw 230.2 million passengers pass through its airports in 2016, when it made a net profit of €1.164 million.

Quake survivor

A COSTA BLANCA entrepreneur travelling to Mexico for business survived the deadly Mexico City earthquake. Jose Martinez de los Santos, aged 37 and from Alicante, described the experience as like being on a bouncy castle. It was the second time he'd escaped an earthquake. He and his wife thought they would die, he said on his return.

Squashed bog

DISASTER was narrowly averted when a 15 kilo slab of concrete crashed into the toilets of a Costa Blanca primary school. Luckily the Don Juan Manuel school in Villena was closed at the time. The hefty chunk of cement fell through the ceiling and destroyed a toilet. Technicians are inspecting the school for other potential dangers.

Major mistake

A RANTING and raving drunk man broke a policeman's leg when he resisted arrest in Orihuela Costa. The San Miguel de Salinas resident was threatening a group of people outside Villamartin Plaza when police stepped in. The bulky assailant threw himself against one officer, breaking his leg in two places, before being subdued.

Railway rally

A PETITION to speed up the arrival of the Mediterranean Corridor highspeed railway connecting Almeria to Murcia has now received more than 12,000 signatures. It has the strong backing of the Valencian Association of Entrepreneurs which is in Madrid this week lobbying for more investment to help transport Costa Blanca produce to Europe by train.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...31

AS the largest producers and the number one consumers of cured ham in the world - it's safe to say that ham is a pretty big deal in Spain.

The whole hog!

EACH Spaniard eats, on average, a whopping five kilograms of cured ham per year but a long and detailed method is followed to produce the high-quality jamon that Spain is

um ham its renowned nutty taste.

Rich history

SPANISH cured ham has been a delicacy since the Roman times and was traditionally made in mountainous regions in the south-west. Families would breed and fatten their own pigs domestically and just one pig was often enough to last the household for a year.

Each year, all the family members participated in the matanza (sacrifice) sometime during the first few weeks of November. After the legs were packed in sea salt and hung to dry in the cool, winter air, the rest of the carcass was used to make chorizo, salchichon and morcilla sausages

Cut above the rest

THE most expensive ham - Jamon Iberico de Bellota comes from the black Iberico pig, which is fed a diet of acorns, or bellotas, and reared on fresh mountain air until it reaches the optimum weight and is taken to be 'sacrificed.'

Iberico pigs can eat up to 10 kilos of acorns a day, so they are normally much fatter than normal swine. This allows the meat to be cured for longer - usually between two to four years - and results in a more intense flavour that is unparalleled in the ham world. The acorn diet also gives the premi-

High quality

JAMON SERRANO (literally ham from the sierra, or mountains) encompasses all the other types of dry-cured ham made from other breeds of pigs. Although less expensive than Jamon Iberico, it can still be quite costly outside of Spain and is usually served in thin slices as a tapa. These hams are dried for up to 18 months in sheds built high in the hills to help the curing process, which is why it became known as 'mountain ham.'



Spar blaze

DOZENS of people were evacuated when a fire broke out at the Spar supermarket in Orihuela's Plaza de San Sebastian. Plumes of black smoke flooded the packed shop near closing time on Saturday night. Around 40 people were rushed out by firefighters to avoid smoke poisoning. The cause of the blaze is be-

Magic milk

CHILDREN who drank artisanal milk from Elche saw their sports performance improve by 20 per cent. Those given the unpasteurised milk from Vaqueria del Camp d'Elx were faster, stronger, and leaner than their classmates who drank regular supermarket milk. The study was carried out over six months by the Uni-

Life saver

GPs will soon offer ultrasounds during routine appointments at Costa Blanca South surgeries. The move will save patients from wasting time booking multiple appointments with specialists or hospitals. Physicians will be able to detect kidney stones, joint injuries, and thyroid and urinary problems more quickly.

Space farming

TWO young engineers have created a new system that allows local farmers to monitor their crops from outer space. The system uses satellites to detect pests or a lack of nutrients. It allows farmers to get a detailed bird's eye view.

Murder mystery probe launched

A MANAGER was found murdered outside his quiet Petrer restaurant. The body of Fernando Millan Chocero, aged 56, was discovered at 8am on Sunday morning by a colleague.

A preliminary police report suggests that he was struck on the head with a large rock at around 6.30am that morning as he went to open the restaurant, located in the Rabosa area.

He died of a traumatic head injury. At first doctors believed he had suffered some kind of freak accident.

But police now say the evidence points towards mur-

They are exploring different motives, including robbery and a personal vendetta. One person has already told police that the victim had received death threats over a workplace dispute. Whether there was one or more assailants also remains a mystery.

Chocero, an Elda resident, had managed the mountain restaurant owned by the Centro Elder Excursionista for five years.



After the August incident the residents' association held an emergency meeting. They voted to ban the garment, which exposes only the hands, feet and face of wearers, from the Alicante urbanisation.

Thirty people voted in favour of the ban, eight against and four abstained. But now a new challenge to the vote has come from the landlord who rented his property to the tourist and her three children.

Antonio Aledo denounced the decision as "xenophobic" and is threatening to take the community to court


over the ban. At the same meeting sports and street clothes were also banned from the pool for 'hygiene reasons.' He claims this was simply to mask the vote's true purpose.


"Several neighbors have publicly supported this woman in suffering what we consider to be a xenophobic, stale, cheating, sexist and illegal act," he said. "In Washington no-one berated or banned her from wearing the bathing suit."

He said it was depressing that children in the community were being exposed to "disrespect and fear of the other" and that this outlook was now officially approved by the residents' association

But other residents have stood by their vote, calling the burkini a macho symbol of oppression towards women. One said it was shameful to force a woman to bathe that way during her

Residents also voted by a strong majority to allow topless bathing in the pool.

Justice for homeowners

Courts order banks to pay out over abusive mortgages

By Matthew Elliott

HOMEOWNERS ripped off by banks have begun receiving compensation. Nine judgements in support of homeowners affected by abusive mortgage clauses have now been issued across Alicante Province.

The amounts of compensation awarded range from €638 to €9,543. In each case banks have been ordered to pay back money illegally charged, plus interest.

The cases refer to the socalled 'floor clauses.' These saw banks set a minimum interest rate buyers would have to pay back on mortgages, even if the benchmark rate, the Euribor, fell below it.

Last year the European Court of Justice ruled that the clauses were illegal and insisted that all Spanish banks give their customers a full refund. Spain's Supreme Court

made the order in February and now justice is finally being dealt out on the Costa Banca South.

The nine cases so far are just the tip of the iceberg. Numerous other out of court settlements have already been reached between the banks and local residents. Banks which have taken cases to trial and lost include Bankinter,

BBVA, and Caja Rural Cen-

Though the European and Supreme Court judgements appear clear, the legal waters get muddy when it comes to taxes. Different provinces and regions have different regimes, meaning residents of some parts of Spain may receive more compensation that

AS the proposed referendum in Cataluña draws ever closer we can only speculate as to whether we will see tanks stationed in the Plaza de Cataluña next Sunday.

The Spanish government is becoming more belligerent towards the Catalan parliament and the Catalonians appear unwilling to back down in any way.

If this was happening during the Arab Spring then western newspapers would surely be forecasting revolution and anticipating an armed struggle.





If you were offered £300,000 now or £10,000 a year for life, what would you choose?

Residents told not to worry

VEGA BAJA residents can rest assured that Spanish won't be replaced with Valencian anytime soon. President of the Valencian Community, Ximo Puig, had a special message for the people of Torrevieja and Orihuela Costa.

"No one in Vega Baja should have the slightest fear," he said. "We absolutely respect the language of the Vega Baja, which is Castilian. We want it."

Puig made it clear, however, the grand project of educating children in three languages, Spanish, Valencian and English, will be implemented across the Community, which includes southern Vega Baja.

He accused political rivals of cynically trying to cobble votes together by engineering controversy over the increasing influence of Valencian in public life.

"Languages unite and our goal is for the children and young people of the Community to know Valencian, English and Castilian," he said during a visit to two Los Montesinos schools.

His message comes one week after it was revealed that only a tiny minority of Vega Baja schools are following the trilingual education model. Many students in the area come from Murcia.

The Valencian culture appears distant to many teachers and students, who hail from a wide range of countries.

A state of emergency

EMERGENCY drought measures have been extended for another year across the Costa Blanca South. Despite better than expected rainfall in 2017, reservoirs are still operating below safe levels.

The next hydrological year begins on October 1. The national government has agreed to extend the state of drought until October 2018. This will be the third consecutive year exceptional drought measures have been enforced in the province.

Water reserves in the Vega Baja, lower Vinalopo and l'Alacanti are dangerously low. The situation is marginally better in the upper Vinalopo.

Farmers in the south of the province are faring the worst. They rely entirely on the Tajo-Segura water transfer, which is currently under enormous pressure due to drought.

Age of Empires

A SOLID gold pendant dated to the sixth century BC was found by archaeology students at La Isla beach in Mazarron. The incredible find is believed to be further proof of a major Phoenician presence in ancient

Non-resident tax in Spain: Income tax form

Every year before December 31st all non-residents in Spain must complete a non-resident income tax form

So who does this tax apply to?

This applies to anybody who is not legally a resident in Spain, but who has assets such as property in Spain, income from rental of property, income from bank deposits when applicable, royalties from intellectual property, etc...

What do I need to do?

You will need to fill out a 210 form with all of your personal details, bank account number, and the details of any assets you have in Spain. If there is one or more owner of your property, each owner must complete their own tax form.

You will require the following information:

- Address of your Spanish property, and your address in your country of residence.
- The date of purchase of the property.
- The valor catastral of your property.
- Name, date and place of birth and tax number of each owner of the property.
- Any other information regarding the above mentioned items of income.

What happens if I don't do a tax return?

When you sell your Spanish property, 3% of the sale value will be automatically withheld by the tax office. In most cases the 3% sales value will



be more than the capital gains tax due, so you may be able claim back a substantial amount. This process is slow and if you have not summited your annual tax returns, the process will become much slower.

What's more the tax office may subject you to fines for not presenting your annual tax returns or for late submission.



Husband on trial

A HUSBAND who tried to murder his wife with a shotgun is to go on trial.

Prosecutors have requested an 18 year sentence for Gonzalo AF, who shot his wife in the buttock before being disarmed by her father.

The incident took place at her parent's home in El Altet, near the airport. After dealing with his abuse, the woman left her husband and their Zaragoza home. She took their young son to stay with her parents in Alicante.

Weeks later, the suspect told neighbours that he was travelling to Galicia. But in reality he had acquired a shotgun and ammunition and was on his way to the Costa Blanca. Police later found a handwritten note laying out his intentions.

He snuck into her parents finca and hid underneath the guest bed where he expected her to sleep. But she had gotten wind of his departure and

decided to sleep in the main building.

Wearing a balaclava he began roaming around the estate until he found his wife. He fired two shots, striking her in the buttock and back. As he reloaded the weapon to finish the job, her father pounced on him and seized the gun.

Police were called and the suspect arrested just south of Elche. He was already under a restraining order to stay clear

Companies face cyber threat

LOCAL companies should invest in their cybercrime defences, a leading Costa Blanca policeman has said. Lieutenant Colonel Juan Sotomayor heads the Guardia Civil's special cybercrime

He gave a speech to a group of business leaders from Alicante Province at the city's university. Sotomayor urged them to invest in cyber security and train their employees to cope with the emerging threat.

Major threats include ransomware, whereby hackers blackmail a company using a virus, and

industrial espionage, said Sotomayor. He said it was essential for a responsible company to have a contingency plan for the 'day after an attack.'

If a business isn't prepared to defeat an attack within 24 hours, he warned, the entire company will be crippled for days. The results can be catastrophic, with client data, banking details and other secure information up for grabs. Smaller companies may never recover.

Sotomayor advised local businesses not to put their employees' personal data on their

A plea for mercy

Cull of trees could decimate industry

FARMERS will not be compensated for lost profits if the EU decides to destroy thousands of diseased olive and almond trees.

The Costa Blanca South is the latest Spanish region to be threatened by the dreaded Xylella fastidiosa bacteria, also known as 'olive ebola.'

There are serious concerns throughout the province that the EU could order a preemptive cull of infected trees and all other fruit trees within a 100metre radius

Recently the EU backed down from such dramatic action in Mallorca. There only infected trees will be destroyed. But those trees still number in their thousands and scientists will address the Costa Blanca situation on its own merits.

There is no known cure for Xvlella fastidiosa, which is believed to have been accidently

imported into Spain on crates from North Africa.

So far only Italy has seen the full consequences of the disease. In 2013 more than one million olive trees were destroyed and the olive oil industry devastated.

Costa Blanca farmers have anxiously appealed to the EU for more information on a potential cull. The only solid response came last week when they were informed that, should a cull go ahead, they will not be compensated for profit losses.

That leaves wiggle room for compensation for the destroyed trees. But that will be little consolation for local farmers, who are already contending with drought and irrigation issues.

Xylella fastidiosa is also extremely contagious. Though known for its devastation of olive trees, it can also infect and destroy almond, orange, vine, and lemon trees.



A CIRCUS has donated seven tigers and one lion to the Villena animal rescue centre. The Wonderland circus has voluntarily decided to stop using wild animals in its Spanish

Wonderland is giving away all of its big cats to Primadonus, the Spanish headquarters of animal foundation AAP, which will then send them to different rescue centres. The Villena rescue facility is the largest of its kind for exotic animals in southern Eu-

The entire process of transporting the tigers and lion to their new home will take up to four weeks. The big cats must be sedated, placed in cargo, then transported to Primadonus, where they will be placed in quarantine to ensure they carry no diseases.

Once certified they will be taken to the 20-hectare natural



FRAUDSTERS based in Elda conned hundreds of people by using the identity of dead people to rent out non-existent Costa Blanca apartments.

The gang swindled at least €45,000 from unsuspecting punters, who thought they were getting bargain deals on Benidorm apartments.

National Police have revealed that there are 149 confirmed victims of the fraud. Some are foreigners, but the majority are from different provinces across Spain.

The crooks advertised fake apartments online through the Milanuncios website. They doc-

tored photos of attractive beachside holiday homes and offered them at knockdown prices.

They used names, email addresses and phone numbers of deceased Costa Blanca residents to provide a veneer of credibility.

Elda police began investigating earlier this year when they were contacted by a victim. Gradually they were able to work out the scammers' modus

operandi. Last week they tracked one fraudster to an ATM in Benidorm where he withdrew money from an account connected to the gang.

Further arrests were made and the investigation remains open. Police believe there could be dozens more victims. All of those affected were asked to send half the rental fee by bank transfer. Most lost between €500 and €900.

Living on a prayer

A DESPERATE young couple took to the streets of Murcia to complain that the city is forcing them to commit crime. They are facing eviction from a bank-owned home they have squatted in for 18 months.

Santiago and Azahara have an infant son. Neither are employed or have any immediate or extended family to turn to. They receive €400 per month in benefits for the boy and have spent two years on Murcia's social housing waiting list.

Occupying the abandoned house was the

only way the couple say they could get a roof over their and the baby's head. But if they are found guilty of squatting they face a fine, further destitution, and the prospect of losing their

Now the couple are protesting daily outside Murcia's housing department. They have placards which are slowly drawing a crowd to support their cause. They argue that the city's points system to secure social housing is unfair and tilted against people with children to favour those not in such desperate need.

Despite having access to a fire extinguisher, officers had to call the fire brigade. By the time they arrived the car was



British conman admits guilt

Extinction threat raised

SCIENTISTS have warned that an endemic Mediterranean mollusc is at dire risk of extinction. A so-called 'mass mortality event' is underway in the seas of Murcia, Torrevieja, Almeria and Ibiza, according to Spain's fisheries ministry.

Their alarming report is supported by findings from the Spanish Insitute of Oceanography and Centre for Marine Research. It concerns the Pinna Nobilis, also known as the fan mussel, a species of clam whose shell can reach 120 centimetres in length.


The fan mussel is immensely important to marine ecosystems and its loss therefore far more than an isolated concern. It promotes biodiversity and is considered an indicator of a healthy ecosystem.

Samples of 'sick' mussels have been taken from Costa Blanca seas to determine the precise cause of the ongoing marine catastrophe.

It is believed to be some kind of pathogen. The extinction

threat level has now been raised to 'critical.' Recently the Spanish Society of Malacology

named the fan mussel its 'Mollusc of the Year 2017' in the hope of raising awareness.



Back from the brink


So far this year more than 1,000 building licences have been granted. It is a remarkable improvement, says Navarro, especially given the region's life and death property struggle after the crisis.

Poverty's lasting legacy

MORE than a quarter of Alicante Province households are in poverty.

The poverty line is set at 60 per cent of the average Spanish income. Around 26 per cent of Alicante homes fall below this level.

Worse, the percentage of Costa Blanca South families in poverty has shot up by six points since the crisis bit. New research from the University of Alicante found that, despite the economic recovery, the province's poorest residents have seen no improvement in living standards.

Professors Francisco Juarez and Paloma Taltavull have published a monstrous paper entitled Crisis and Recovery of the Spanish

across the board, the disposable income of the province's households has plummeted by 8.4 per cent in the past decade. The average across Spain is 7.2 per cent.

Worryingly, the report suggests that, while 26 per cent of households are poor, a total of 36 per cent struggle to pay their bills. More than a third of the population is one missed salary away from disaster.

Children and the elderly are the Costa Blanca South's most vulnerable residents when it comes to poverty, the report found.

An estimated 40 per cent of workers don't receive the minimum wage once job related expenses such as transport are taken into account. Also one in three work only part-time.

Alzheimer's breakthrough hope



LEADING THE WAY: Miguel Hernandez University

WORLD Alzheimer's Day was celebrated with good news from scientists at Elche's Miguel Hernandez University.

They have discovered a new way of detecting the disease before it manifests in the brain.

The research team announced that it was able to detect an over-abundance of a precursor protein that confirmed the disease's dormant existence. Its presence is an incredibly accurate indication that the disease is on its

With early detection, said lead researcher


Javier Saez, doctors can act faster to slow the disease's progression and dramatically extend a patient's healthy life span.

Though far from a cure, it is a gamechanger for both patients and doctors. Around 10 per cent of Alzheimer's patients in Alicante Province were given their diagnosis aged under 65. For those in their 50's, early diagnosis offers hope of decades of mental health.

Still the wider prognosis isn't good. Commemorating Alzheimer's Day last week, researchers at Spain's Institute of Neurosciences said that cases are expected to double in the next 20-30 years.

Worst funded residents in Spain

RESIDENTS of the Costa Blanca South receive less bang for their tax buck than the Spanish average. Both Murcia and the Valencian Community, which includes Alicante Province, receive less funding per person from the national government than most other regions.

The revelation comes courtesy of a new report from major bank BBVA. It is an analysis of the financing of Spain's autonomous regions over the course of 13 years from 2002

Published this week, the comprehensive report concludes that Murcia and the Valencian Community are the two worst funded regions in the country.

Residents of Alicante Province received just €2.178 from Madrid each year on average. Murcians didn't fare much better, with an average payout of €2,236.

In Andalucia people also have cause for complaint. There funding equates to €2,272 per person. The best funded region is Cantabria, where locals get €2,906 per year, more than €700 compared to their compatri-


Angel de la Fuente, chief author of the report, described the extreme differences between regional funding as "barely justifiable." These systemic inequalities put some communities in a better starting position than others, he said.

The fault isn't solely Madrid's he noted. Bargaining between regional politicians and the national decision makers determines spending levels. Arguably, Costa Blanca South politicians are selling their people

The set up goes against the basic principle of equality, de la Fuente argued. He has called for a radical overhaul of the system to ensure equal per capita spending from parliament.

Horse rescue centre welcomes donation

TEN exquisite quilts have been donated by Barbora Dick of Skalabara Quilts to raise desperately needed funds for new internal fencing at Easy Horse Care Rescue Centre near Alicante

Czech-born Barbora, who now lives in Alicante, doesn't know Easy Horse Care founders Sue and Rod Weeding personally, but learnt of their work and funding struggles through longtime supporter of the charity, Kate Cammish, and local English newspapers.

"I have decided to donate the quilts to Easy Horse Care because I think both Sue and Rod are doing an incredible job with the charity," Barbora said. "I honour their enthusiastic work of the charity. So why not help a local charity that is entirely dependent on donations?"

Barbora's donation has come at a fortuitous time, as the rescue centre looks to raise funds for new, permanent internal fencing.

The existing fencing is made largely of electric tape and plastic posts, which degrade rapidly in the Spanish sun and require constant upkeep. The new fencing will be strong and permanent, made from 1,500m of Tornado Wire. But at €40 per metre, it doesn't come cheap.

Sue and Rod aim to replace the fencing in stages as they raise the needed money and to minimise disruption to the rescued horses.

All proceeds from the quilts will go towards the fencing fundraiser and will help purchase nearly 50m of fencing for the first 128m stage. The quilts are available for purchase at easy horsecare.net/shops/online-shop/homewares. Monetary donations can also be made at easy horsecare.net/donate/help-build-fences.

The sanctuary is entirely reliant on donations not only for maintenance projects, but also for the ongoing care of the rescued equines, estimated to cost nearly €150,000 per year.

Sue expressed her gratitude to Barbora saying, "Without the support from the public and their kind donations of furniture, clothes and now quilts, we wouldn't be able to do what we

The need for these donations has only grown with increasing numbers of horses, ponies and donkeys being abandoned to the streets.

"It's hard to imagine what it would be like if the police weren't taking quick action to rescue these animals and we weren't here to provide them a home," Sue said.

"The government don't have any facilities to house these animals, so we're not just saving them, we're providing a public service to get them off the street."

Recent rescue Pee-wee, a miniature pony, is just one example of this disturbing trend. He was left tied to railings in Lorca for a week, before a neighbour reported him and the police acted to save him from starvation.

Arriving at the centre in a skeletal state, with serious health issues including a mouth infection, many rotten teeth, blood coming from his penis and a tumour pushing one eye out of its socket, Pee-wee has now gained 20 kilograms and is going from strength to strength. But he has a long way to go.

Of most concern is the tumour, which needs to be removed before it causes further damage. The operation will happen as soon as Pee-wee is strong enough to handle it.

"I'm overjoyed at the progress he's made. He's absolutely beautiful and a pleasure to look after, but I still worry about him constantly,"

A NEW EU law will help stop the mutilation of dogs in Spain.

The cruel practice of severing of tails and ears of hunting dogs has gone on for years in Spain, with another recent trend occurring to cut their vocal chords to prevent nuisance barking.

Much of this is done by the

hunters themselves using a razor or a similarly crude cutting tool.

Many of the animals mutilated in this way suffer from pain, infection and other health problems due to the lack of veterinary knowledge or qualifications of their owners.

Until recently, Seprona agents (the Guardia Civil's animal protection

branch) did not deal with such incidents as a criminal offence despite laws which clarified the acts as such.

The European Convention for the Protection of Companion Animals is soon to enter into force in Spain, an act that will greatly aid the prosecution of those who abuse animals.

No cover for Ryanair flight cancellations

INSURANCE experts are warning that not all travel policies will cover your costs if you're one of the hundreds of thousands of passengers affected by Ryanair's cancellation of 40-50 flights a day until the end of October.

A survey of travel insurers has found that most standard policies will not cover 'consequential losses' such as hotels and car hire as a result of flights being cancelled by an airline.

Insurance professional Fiona Macrae, of the Travel Insurance Explained campaign, said unless a policy specified cover for cancelled flights, claims were unlikely to be successful.

Ryanair claim that the cancellations, due to a 'mess up' over the holiday roster for its pilots, amount to less than 2 per cent of its over 2,500 daily flights.

The low-cost airline is offering €13,500 (£12,000) tax-free bonuses to its pilots to tempt them to give up days off and holiday and avoid further cancellations.

EU compensation rules for cancelled flights are:

- Passengers are entitled to assistance and compensation, if the disruption was within an airline's control.
- Airlines have to offer full refunds, paid within seven days, or re-bookings for a flight cancelled at short notice.
- In addition, passengers can also claim compensation.
- Cancellation amounts are: €250 (£218) for short-haul, €440 (£384) for medium-haul and €600 (£523) for long-haul.
- Passengers who reach their destination more than three hours late can be compensated from €200 to €600, depending on the length of flights and delay.

Consumer organisations have called on Ryanair to automatically compensate affected passengers.

UK company boss held over terror link

ARMED officers of Spain's National Police have raided a property in Merida and arrested Ataul Haque who is accused of financing DAESH and sending 'technological material' to Syria for weapons purposes.

It is also claimed he was working on developing drones for combat purposes.

Haque, 34, is linked to a network of front companies that specialised in computer support, run from an office in Cardiff.

The Bangladeshi lived with his partner in a rented flat and has two young children.

The complex investigation has been carried out by the National Police with the collaboration of the National Intelligence Centre (CNI) and the Bangladesh security services.

Several relatives of the arrested man have also been detained.

Since June 26, 2015, when the Ministry of the Interior raised the Anti-Terrorism Alert Level (NAA) to 4, security forces have arrested 202 terrorist jihadists in operations in Spain and abroad.

French fugitive found

AFTER officers of the Guardia Civil received a complaint of sexual assault from a tourist, they discovered a Frenchman wanted for murder in France living in a commune.

A group of people had settled in the forests around the Beneje de Cañar area of Granada amongst whom was the wanted man, who when arrested was found to be in possession of the dead person's mobile phone.

As well as the alleged sexual assault, two members of the community were also accused of attacking a third party and as officers searched the area, so they discovered that the area was being used to grow cannabis plants.

Rather than having one large plantation, the 24 people arrested and accused of cultivating the illegal plants had spread them around the forest in small groups to avoid discovery alongside some 40 illegally diverted water catchments.

In all, 2,320 marihuana plants were removed for destruction, with officers establishing that 103 environmental violations had taken place within the Sierra Nevada Natural Park.

Sex trio arrested

THREE members of a sex trafficking network in Ibiza have been arrested

Police have also released seven young women who were held captive by the Romanian organisation two were in Spain and five in Romania

The organisation allegedly lured young women in Romania from low social and economic backgrounds and promised them a better life but instead forced them into prostitution.

If the victims tried to leave they suffered all manner of threats and abuse from their 'controllers.'

Any women who tried to contact the police were sent back to Romania and also held captive.

Goat to be kidding

A PILOT programme in Girona is using hungry goats to prevent forest fires. Known as 'Goat Fire Brigades' the Pau Costa Foundation sends goats to munch through overgrown scrubland.



■ A STATUE erected in central Moscow pays tribute to the inventor of the Kalashnikov rifle. The 30-foot-tall statue of Mikhail Kalashnikov was unveiled with a great deal of pomp. It was blessed with Holy Water by a Russian Orthodox priest who thanked Kalashnikov for defending the motherland.

Putin's protégé



Gold is still popular

BULLION COINS ARE AN EASY WAY TO INVEST

IN times of international trouble and dispute, investors like to head towards gold as an alternative option to traditional stocks and shares.

The precious metal has enjoyed a buoyant few months especially with the 'disagreement' between North Korea and the USA having gained 12.9 per cent so far in 2017.

The current price of €1,090 for a troy ounce of fine (24 carat) gold is only slightly down on its highest price this year but for the small investor, spot price and actual cost to purchase can be quite different.

In many ways the most sensible way of purchasing old is to buy bullion coins from reputable dealers and the larger the coin, the smaller the percentage over spot price they cost.

Countries such as Australia and South Africa which produce a great deal of gold are happy to use some of it in bullion coins in order to obtain foreign currency and the Kangaroo and Krugerrand amongst other gold coins are easily traded as well as being VAT free.

Investors are advised to keep well away from gold proof coins as although they are sold with pre-announced issue limits, they are sold at large percentages over spot and with so many being issued by literally hundreds of countries worldwide, the chance of a profit is very

There are other precious metal coins available, particularly platinum and silver but neither has the allure and general investment fol-

In addition to coins, it is possible to invest in bullion bars which have no legal tender status and may, in some countries be subject to

Spain does not produce any gold bullion coins and the only regularly produced coins from European Union countries are from France

and the United Kingdom.

Whilst it is attractive to regard jewellery as an investment, it is worth noting that modern jewellery tends to be sold at up to 300 per cent more than spot, is generally made from a mix of gold and a second metal in order to add strength and also attracts VAT.

Jewellery is certainly an attractive way of owning precious metal but as an investment is not as certain as bullion coins which are portable and easily obtained, but like all investments, gold prices can go down as well as up.

Ryanair tries to sort out mess

SPEAKING at the Annual General Meeting of Ryanair in Dublin, Michael O'Leary CEO admitted that the cancellation of flights would cost the airline at least €25 mil-

He accepted that the problem was one caused within the airline as pilots tried to take 12 months of holidays in nine months due to an enforced change in the leave year and sympathised with passengers who had been af-

The company is trying to persuade pilots to give up one week of their holiday in exchange for a cash payment which could be as much as €12,000 but both they and first officers are trying to hold out for new contracts and better condi-

BRITISH BANKS TO CHECK IMMIGRATION STATUS New law effective January

ALTHOUGH legislation has existed since 2016, it will not be until January 2018 that banks will be required to check on the immigration status of cus-

The decision has been made in order to try to identify whether bank customers are resident in the UK legally or if they have either overstayed their visas or absconded from immigration checks.

Information on the identities of known persons due for deportation from the UK will be supplied by not for profit organisation Cifas to the banks who will then be required to close or freeze accounts for anyone appearing on the lists.

As Cifas is primarily an anti-fraud and money-laundering operation and as banks are likely to have to check up to 70 million accounts each quarter, it is suggested by observers that this may not be the best way to police the system.

With such a large number of accounts to check, the fear is that the banks and Home Office which will also supply information could make mis-

takes, leading to perfectly honest customers having their accounts frozen, especially as the banks are likely to err on the side of caution in order to ensure that they are not penalised.

Chief Executive of the Joint Council for the Welfare of Immigrants Satbir Singh told The Guardian: "The government's own record shows that it cannot be trusted even to implement this system properly.

"Immigration status is very complex, and the Home Office consistently gives out incorrect information and guidance.

This crackdown which seems more likely to affect those with common ethnic names or multiple accounts, may go some way to stopping some fake accounts, but with advance notice, anyone who is illegally in Britain will have time to close their bank accounts and remove their cash.

Indeed much of the 'black economy' operates with cash and sees those without papers working for third parties cash in hand.

The government however also plans to crack down on landlords and employers who do not obtain proper documentation from those who have no right to be living or working in the UK.

It is to be hoped that those expatriates living in Spain but with bank accounts in the UK will not fall foul of this new investigative procedure, although possession of a UK passport should go a long way to proving right of abode in the UK and Spain.

Spain's two top brands

IN an international review of the value of brands, the leader once again is Apple with a declared worth of €154.65 billion.

There are just two Spanish brands in the top 100, Inditex, owner of Zara comes in at number 24 with a value of €15.6 billion although it still sits one place behind Scandinavian competitor H&M.

The other Spanish success is the Santander banking group which sits in 68th place with a value of just €5.6 billion although it is the 10th most valuable group in finance and is beaten by global brands such as American Express and Visa.

Sky TV now online

WHILST many English speaking residents in Spain have been eager to learn details of the new Sky online package, it now appears to be cheap but not very inclusive.

The Spanish service is now available without contract at a cost of €10 per month with the first month free and a box costing €25.

The drawback is that there will only be 12 local pay-TV channels included in the package all broadcast in Spanish plus a limited number of 'box

Channels supplied with this new service include Comedy Central, Nickelodeon, Disney's XD and Disney Junior, Syfy, TNT, TCM and Fox which will allow subscribers access to The Walking Dead and Big Bang

Due to licensing arrangements, there is no offer of Sky Sports or Sky Movies and although inexpensive, the whole package will have to compete with Amazon, HBO and Netflix as well as the English-speaking channels supplied unofficially via VPN or IPTV.

Spanish government has not spent EU youth grants

CRITICS of the Spanish government claim that they are running the risking of further alienating unemployed under 25s even though the EU had granted €1.9 billion.

Despite the fact that the Spanish economy is recovering more quickly than most of the eurozone, the huge number of young people still unemployed is close to 40 per cent and many who do have jobs have short term contracts which pay badly.

The European Union youth jobs and employment programme was launched in 2014 but because Spain was required to spend the money first and then reclaim, it was initially reluctant to spend more money as it was being threatened with fines if it didn't reduce the public

Now with the economy in a much happier state, it has to spend €1 billion by the end of 2017 and the balance in 2018 and opponents suggest that the government doesn't have a proper plan in place and therefore is sponsoring useless training which youngsters only apply for because they are bored.

If this suggestion is based on fact, then there is a distinct possibility that the European Union will refuse to refund the money spent as it will be reviewing the effectiveness of the training programmes put into place.

There was some thought of using the funds to 'top up' low youth salaries, but this may not be acceptable under EU budgetary guidelines.

WE all have different ideas as to what constitutes the first signs that Christmas is on the way, although the seemingly unrelenting high temperatures being experienced at the moment may well see some wishing their lives away for the cooler times around that time of the year.

I've only been in Spain full time for a handful of years - since 2009 - and Christmas takes some getting used to with neighbours and friends planning big events on the beach in glorious sunshine for most of the time.

In my final years in the UK, I knew I was counting down to the festive season when the X Factor auditions and the announcement of partners for Strictly Come Dancing were announced. Now, it's the annual announcement of the El Gordo (The Big One) Christmas Lottery tickets going on sale!

Even though it's not drawn until December 22 every year (a Friday for 2017), the world famous state lottery tickets always go on sale in July. The aim of making them available so soon is to encourage holidaymakers to buy one of the décimo, or 10th of a ticket which are sold at a set price of €20 per ticket. This is the price charged in the official lottery offices but you may see some in other venues for €22 or €23. Usually, these tickets have been purchased by a club or fundraising society and they are allowed to add an extra couple of euros.

Christmas is coming

Why put them up for sale so early? The official line is to 'encourage tourists to take a piece of Spanish luck home with them.' Also, it will help cash flow for year-round residents who would otherwise decide not to buy an El Gordo ticket in December as the usual extra Christmas expenditure means €20 is harder to find. Many local people form syndicates and pay in so much a week to buy the tickets from different parts of Spain, and I can remember delighted customers in my local asking me to get a couple of El Gordo tickets for them when I announced I was

off to Barcelona for a weekend!

The 2017 draw will see 170 million 10ths of a ticket put on sale - five million more than last year - of numbers ranging from 00000 to 99999. The total value of prize money available will be €2.380.000.000 and €70,000,000 more than in 2016.

However, because a full ticket costs €200, most people only buy a décimo, or 10th of a ticket at €20, meaning the first prize equates to €400,000.

Second prize is €1.25m for a full ticket or €125,000 for a 10th, whilst for third place; the pot comes to €500,000 for a ticket or €50,000 for a 10th. There is a selection of fourth or fifth prizes too and if your ticket is picked out among the hundreds of individual numbers drawn, that 10th is worth €200.

Remember, if you don't see the five-figure number you want hanging up in the lottery offices, ask the person behind the counter if yours is available and they can print one out especially for you.

The traditional singing of the lottery numbers on December 22 by children of the San Ildefonso School in Madrid is, for many, and probably me too after my eight years the real start of Christmas.

LTHOUGH it is easier to purchase citizenship in the smaller European Union states such as Cyprus and Malta, Spain also offers succour to wealthy foreign-

Just four years ago, the Spanish government introduced legislation to grant residency permits (known as Golden Visas) to foreign nationals who were either prepared to invest large amounts of money or were highly qualified in professions that Spain needed.

Crowdfunding attracts investors in property

UST over two years ago, 49 investors raised €80,500 via crowdfunding to purchase an apartment in Madrid which was the first reported example of use of this internet phenomenon within the Spanish propertv market.

The concept is relatively simple in as much as different investors commit different amounts of money in order to be able to afford the purchase of property in the expectation that in a rising market they will be able to receive income either from property rental or eventual sale.

This could however be a dangerous operation if complete strangers try to invest together, with no strategic plan or anyone to control the property or properties.

Certain companies such as Housers have



been set up to take advantage of this opportunity and they promote particular properties, encouraging small investors to place

funds with them in order to purchase properties around Spain where they believe there is a potential for profit and of course take a percentage for themselves.

Recently they have gone further and raised nearly €2 million to purchase land in Madrid and they will use the balance of the funds raised to build the properties and expect to sell them at a 30 per cent uplift.

There are of course risks to any investment as prices can go down as well provided that any company involved in this type of business is properly structured then those committing funds should be relatively well protected as the property itself should have an intrinsic value.

The other danger is that the huge stockpile of old and unsold properties held by the Spanish 'Bad Bank' Sareb are released and depress the market, although this is considered highly unlikely as the Spanish government would not wish to see the blossoming market crash again.

China State to buy out Spain's OHL

THE Spanish building company Obrascon Huarte Lain (OHL) is in talks with China State Construction Engineering (CSCE) over selling a stake of the company.

NEARLY half a million passengers hit by Ryanair's cancellation fiasco, half a billion pounds wiped off the airline's value and CEO Michael O'Leary's own admission: 'it's a mess-up'!

But knowing Ryanair, I'm sure it already has a plan to restore its fortunes. After all, you've only got to look for clues at O'Leary's own past announcements:

1. On upright seating: "I'd love to operate aircraft where we take out the back 10 rows and put in hand rails. We'd say if you want to stand, it's €5. People say: 'Oh, but the people standing may get killed if there's a crash.' Well, with respect, the people sitting down might get

killed as well."

2. On low fares: "I don't see why in 10 years' time you wouldn't fly people for free. Why don't airports pay us for delivering the passengers to their shops?"

3. On turbulence: "If drink sales are falling off we get the pilots to engineer a bit of turbulence. That usually spikes up the drink sales."

Those of you familiar with Ryanair will recall the bad old

days: the no-frills flights but with all the usual trimmings. The constant hard sell from the moment you boarded to the moment you landed: snacks, scratch cards, duty-free goods, rail tickets, babies from East European orphanages. I made the last bit up but you get the mes-

Overall, it's hugely improved. And, generally, it's been punctual, efficient and does what it says on the tin. Trouble is, the

travelling public would love flying to be like it's depicted in the old Hollywood movies. Beautiful, dolly bird hostesses and handsome, square-jawed pilots who never flapped in an emergency. If it was still like that, only oligarchs would be able to fly.

O'Leary put it in a nutshell: nowadays a plane is just a bus with wings and the passengers referred to as SLF (self loading freight). You can expect to get the same treatment as on the number 53 bus.

Bon voyage and happy land-

THEY got Al Capone for unpaid taxes and they're digging for dirt on Cataluña's regional president Carles Puigdemont.

Allegedly Puigdemont can be linked to dodgy deals and contracts in Girona whose mayor he was before being called to greater things in Barcelona.

Puigdemont, incidentally, was never elected president but took over when CUP demanded Artur Mas's head in exchange for their votes in the 2015 regional elections.

Much of CUP's disapproval of Mas resided in his links to the demonstrably corrupt Pujol governments. Now it turns out that Puigdemont isn't exactly lilywhite himself and allowed questionable contract procedures to continue. Hardly heinous but not the best image for someone who enjoys throwing the first stone where corruption is con-

Grammar lesson

JUNCKER said it loud and clear and not for the first time: if Cataluña leaves

Spain it leaves the European Union. Asked if the EU would recognise an independent Cataluña as a country he replied that it would if that were the outcome of a legal referendum.

Jubilant secessionists threw their Catalan-Phrygian caps in the air before Juncker got to the end of the sentence and were crestfallen when they learnt that the EU president had used the conditional tense and the adjective 'legal.'

The separatists have only even listened to what they wanted to hear and never did manage to get the message sent by the poor turnout for the November 9 mini-referendum in 2014 and the discouraging 2015 regional elections.

The snowball and the avalanche

EIGHT of the 12 ministers in Rajov's first government were lawyers and two - including the vice-president Soraya Saenz de Santamaria - were State lawyers. Dolores de Cospedal, Saenz de Santamaria's eternal rival who is also the Partido Popular's Secretary General and Defence minister in the present government, is another

They are the legal representatives of state and public bodies, possessing a prestigious qualification requiring years of study. Rajoy was Spain's youngest ever Property Registrar - another plum post - at the age of 23.

Rajov's government knows the law inside out and sheltering behind the legal system and the courts is its habitual response to corruption scandals and Catalan independence.

Snowballs become avalanches and Catalan independence is enveloping Spanish politics in a whiteout that will not clear whether or not the referendum is eventually held and whatever its out-

The snowball that Mariano Rajoy's government has ducked time and time again is hitting home and it's full of

But instead of reacting with an 'Ouch!' and offering to talk about it, Rajov remained calm and warned the

snowball-throwers that they must face the legal consequences


It didn't work when the Catalan separatists began baying during Rajoy's first term. It has produced disastrous results in the second and no-one, let alone Rajoy and his legal eagles, knows where it is leading to now.

Back to basics

PODEMOS and the small parties under its umbrella are planning a national assembly that will back separatism throughout Spain.

Presumably that will make kingdoms of Valencia, Navarra, Aragon and Castillas with Andalucia reverting to a caliphate. Not so good, though, for Cataluña in the event of a Catflap (Cat-exit, gettit?) as it would be reduced to the vastly inferior status of a measly county.

Venezuelan dictator Nicolas Maduro has expressed his support for the Catalan Proces towards independence. With friends like that who needs an enema, as the poet

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Driving classic cars

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



I CLASSIC CARS: Governed by the same rules as normal vehicles.

A NUMBER of classic car owners and associations have asked about the laws that refer specifically to this type of vehicle and what provisions the drivers must make when driving on Spanish

Royal Decree 1247/1995, deals with the reglamento de vehículos históricos, rules for historic vehicles, or classic cars, under article 10 of the Normas de circulación.

First and foremost, unless rules are specifically in place for this type of vehicle, classic cars are governed by the same laws and rules as normal vehicles, including the requirement of liability insurance.

The rules relating to the technical inspection and registration are also applicable, as per normal vehicles. The period of the technical inspection also remains the same, unless otherwise indicated in the official report.

Those vehicles which, on account of their age or constructive characteristics, do not have lights or indicators as are normally required by law, are not allowed to travel between sunset and sunrise, or in circumstances which would normally require the use of these lights and indicators.

Historic vehicles that are not able to exceed the speed of 40 kilometres per hour should drive on the shoulder, if practicable, or, alternatively, as close as possible to the right outside edge of the roadway, except when overtaking or turning left, manoeuvres which may force other drivers to abruptly change the direction or speed of their vehicles. Historic vehicles are not allowed on the motorway if they are unable to reach a speed of at least 60 kilometres per hour.

The Dirección General de Tráfico also reserves the right to prohibit classic cars on certain dates and routes, if they are not able to exceed the speed of 80 kilometres per hour.

As for situations when classic cars can travel on the roads as a group, Annex II of the Reglamento General de Circulación, article 32 of section 3 details Participación de vehículos históricos and refers to group activities.

piece of paper is not important. Go to the Notary and get an authorised copy of your deed. Be alert. Even if your mortgage is paid, it is quite possible that the bank has not officially cancelled it in the Property Registry.

The Notary or your lawyer can check on this. You might need to contact Halifax Lloyds Bank to find out. Try calling 902 024 365.

THE Picos de Europa are defined by soaring mountains, diverse wildlife and miles of forest making them the ideal location for thrill seekers looking for an adventure off the beaten track.

Thinking of tourist attractions in Spain often conjures up images of beaches layered with sun cream lathered bathers or towns with a contrasting mix of Moorish and Christian architecture.

Very few think of the mountain peaks in the north west with walking trails and scenery to challenge hiking holiday locations like the Black Forest or the Alps.

The name was given by the early colonialists on their way home from America, as this was the first landmark they could identify. This is not surprising as the mountains are so huge they stretch through parts of Asturias, Cantabria and Castile and Leon.

The animals which roam throughout the area, most of which is protected national park



land, is one of the biggest draws of the Picos. In the most remote parts there are significant populations of wild wolves and brown bears which are known for avoiding humans and being quite timid.

Buzzards, eagles and vultures can be spotted as well if you keep your eye to the

As physically challenging as it may be to hike around the Picos de Europa it is a rewarding experience which will provide breathtaking views of Lakes of Covadonga and vast expanses of forest relatively untouched by waves or tourists.

If hiking up great hills doesn't sound enjoyable the Fuente De cable car will take you up 800 metres to a great peak from which you can hike down. There is also a great network of natural caves beneath the mountains believed to be the deepest in the world which are still being explored.

What are the symptoms of a wasp sting?

When you are stung by a wasp on your skin, the area infected will become inflamed and red with a noticeable centre where the sting occurred. In general the reaction is contained to where you are stung, however some people can have reactions all over their body.

Can they be dangerous?

Wasp stings tend to hurt, but are not often dangerous. In some cases, especially with people who are allergic to them, the reaction can be much more severe and can cause death.

How can you tell if you are having an allergic reaction to a sting?

Normally when a person is stung by a wasp the

reaction is contained to the area they were stung. However if a person feels generally unwell, begins to sweat, has other skin lesions appear on their body, swollen lips or face, difficulties breathing or loss of consciousness and chest pains, among other things, then it is certainly an allergic reaction.

What should I do if I get stung?

Normally if it only causes a reaction on the skin you don't need to see a doctor. However if the area stung becomes infected or you notice an allergic reaction then immediately go to accident and emergencies where you will be prescribed with treatments which can include anti-inflammatories, corticoids or maybe even antibiotics.

All about the beets

BEETROOT has long been known for its 'superfood' properties, and has also gained popularity in the baking community who use the purple root to reduce sugar quantities in sweet treats and add an instagram-worthy pink hue to food.

Now there's another great reason to add more beetroot to your diet - it can help your muscles to recover after a workout.

Dr Emma Derbyshire, a public health nutritionist who wrote a paper based on these findings for Complete Nutrition, claims athletes who eat a portion of beetroot within 90 minutes of doing exercise experience less muscle soreness and are able to achieve higher performance results.

Beetroots are full of nitrates which release oxygen into the bloodstream and boost circu-

lation to the places that need it. This helps to aid muscle recovery, especially after high intensity interval training (HIIT), and can even lower blood pressure.

The increase in oxygen levels also brings along other health benefits, such as improving concentration, increasing stamina and helping to prevent illnesses caused by high blood pressure such as heart attacks and strokes.

They are jam packed with other essential nutrients as well, including iron, potassium, B vitamins, magnesium and manganese - which is good for the bones, kidneys and liver. Drinking beetroot juice is also an effective way to help the body detox, as it is a natural blood cleaner.

Eating this wonder vegetable on a regular basis becomes even more important as we

age, as research shows that our capacity to produce nitric oxide, which the body generates from nitrate-rich foods, decreases as we get older. Eating a diet full of beetroot can

Sven Dirkschneider, is playing the drums on this tour. When previously asked in interviews if he would be willing





Pleasure without measure?

A TOAST TO GOOD FOOD. **GOOD WINE** AND GOOD **FRIENDS**

WITH GARRY

HAVE always been a great lover of 'free pouring' - the absence of using fixed measures of alcohol.

Even though it was technically against the law, it was well practised in my restaurants in the UK. It must have been the Spanish influence even all those years ago. But even with this method it was possible to pour exactly the same measure into each glass. Apart from alcohol, pubs and restaurants started to use legally (or voluntarily) measure marks on the wine

But most bars and restaurants here free pour without such guidelines, which leads to differences that are quite noticeable.

Last week I had occasion to be in three different establishments of varying standard. One was a place I pop into quite often. A family run eatery of few tables and fewer

customers, but a warm welcome and a decent glass of Rosé, well chilled but the measure is half as much again as I would pour. They must be getting four glasses out of the bottle at the most: and at €3.95 a glass they are selling the bottle of wine for €15. Makes sense even if it looks generous.

The second place was a restaurant that is very busy and whose prices are quite high. A glass of red wine from Ribera del Duero (the price I do not know as I was being invited - but I imagine around the €5 mark) came in a modern glass with a wider base and a curved side, the sort of glass used by most upmarket establish-



Too little.

I tell my staff to fill the glass to just above the curve, which gives five good glasses from the bottle. But on this occasion the measure was below the curve which would give the house six glasses to the bottle. Making a bottle of house wine worth around €30 a bottle. which I am sure we would all say is too much.

However I did ask them to fill it to above the curve which they did without question.

The third place was a very modern tapas/raciones/and restaurant operation in Marbella. Very professionally run. We had a bottle of wine which was their house



Perfect.

wine at €21 from Castillo de Mancha, which wasn't particularly good. The red wine by the glass was pleasant enough and at €3.50 a glass was good value. The measures poured were also correct.

Now dear reader, you may have got down to the bottom of this article and ask if there is a point to it? Well, my point is that whatever price you charge, or quantity you give, the chances are it is normally more expensive to drink wine by the glass than the bottle.

This last place was charging less for drinking by the glass than the bottle. White by the glass at €3 means €15 a bottle, red at €3.50 means €17 for the bottle. With the former being €21 a bottle and the latter €25 it's obvious which makes more sense to the

Weeds are flowers too once you get to know them

I DON'T know about our readers, but I am sure there are many of you that have beautiful gardens and perhaps grow your own vegetables. Have you ever been surprised when in the countryside to see flourishing trees and bushes

that receive no water from artificial sources, neither pruning nor maintenance, yet are healthy and happy?

Switch to my terraces and after two years, despite the odd watering ('don't water them too much' said the gardener) and talking to them they have now reached the end of their lives and will be consigned to the garden rub-



However, a thought crossed my mind; if I leave them where they are I could be the only one out of my neighbours that will have a dried cactus display.

Autumn gardening -Mediterranean style

GRAEME TYRRELL

UNLIKE northern European regions, autumn is a busy time to clean up the garden and start planting the winter and spring annuals, flowering perennials, herbs and vegeta-

It is the best time to set out new garden designs to allow new trees and shrubs to get established with the winter rains and cooler weather benefiting them to grow stronger before the onset of the next hot, dry summer season. Pruning back spent flowers and scraggly growth can also be done now.

Flowering annuals and perennials to plant now include sweet alyssum, calendula, Canterbury bells, English daisy, African daisy, Iceland poppy, larkspur, lobelia, pansy, annual phlox, ranunculus, stock, sweet pea, sweet william, viola, primroses. cyclamen, and bulbs such as daffodils and jonquils. Having flowers always brightens up the home garden, balcony or terrace and take up only a small area whether in pots, planter boxes or the garden.

Vegetables to plant now include beet, bok chov, broccoli, brussels sprouts, carrot, cabbage, cauliflower, celery. endive, garlic, kale, kohlrabi, leek, head and leaf lettuce, onion, pea, radish, spinach, snow peas, Swiss chard and turnip. There is nothing like your own fresh vegetables if you have the time and space.

Most herbs are planted at this time but lavender. marjoram, oregano, sage, rosemary, tarragon, thyme, parsley, basil, chives, mints, dill, coriander, are all favourites that have a variety of different forms to add

even greater interest to the garden and the kitchen meals. Herbs can be grown near or even in the kitchen where there is sufficient light so that they can be easy to gather when needed.

The most successful time to plant most trees and shrubs is just after the first good rains have moistened the soil. Add compost in proportion to the needs of the plants' requirements to do their best. Integrate the compost into the natural soil through cultivation.

It is well worth the effort to prepare the soil to allow the plants to have a good start in their new location and the compost will give better water retention to help the soil continue to provide nutrients and moisture more evenly for many years. Mulching the plants is not essential until before the hot weather returns in spring. I prefer to leave the soil free of mulch over winter in case of water logging and introduction of fungal problems to the soil over the cooler wet months.

Plants that have flowered over summer but are now finishing their flowering should be clipped back where necessary and tidied

up. It is not a good time for severe pruning as large cuts can allow entry of diseases in large wounds on trees and shrubs while the weather is still warm and humid. It is better to just use clippers and leave the saw in the shed except for dead limbs and fallen trees.

Autumn is a busy time in the garden while the days are still long and warm. The works will pay off with the

establishment of a wonderful garden over winter and allow the blossoming in spring and the garden will have gained hardiness for the next summer's heat and dryness. Enjoy.

used to travel safely as soon as possible when they are young. I would not encourage holding puppies on the lap, this way you are training the puppy that this is the place to travel. As a dog gets bigger he is put in the back of the car and will

not like the idea which results in barking and jumping. This then results in owners shouting and turning around, thus being inattentive to their driving.

Many owners think that it is a good idea to let dogs have their

heads hanging out of the window of the car whilst travelling. This is dangerous for the dog and can cause many health problems to the eyes and to the nose. Never let your dog hang his head out of the window. Many a dog has jumped out of a travelling car through the window, resulting in death.

In many parts of Europe, it is an offence to allow dogs to be loose or unsecured in cars and can be very costly in fines.

A dog should never be left in a car during hot weather for longer than a few minutes. Owners should park in shaded areas, keeping in mind that the sun moves. Even if the windows are left open the temperature can reach 35 degrees in a few minutes. Dogs can suffer from heatstroke within 10 minutes or

From a training point of view, it is a good idea to make dogs sit before allowing them into the car. When opening a car door dogs should be trained to stay, so that there is no chance of them jumping out onto a road and causing an accident or indeed killing themselves.





A HARD Brexit could see BMW renege on a pledge to build its new electric Mini in the UK. Harald Kruger, chairman of the German giant, warned that if there was no Brexit deal then production of the hotly-anticipated new car could easily be shifted to the Netherlands

Over summer BMW said plans to mass produce the electric Mini at its Oxford factory would go ahead despite the Brexit complication. But as a 'hard Brexit,' whereby Britain would revert to default World Trade Organisation (WTO) import/export tar-

iffs, looks increasingly likely, BMW has backtracked.

"BMW can't invest in a future if you don't have any free trade agreements,"he told *The Times*.

At present it is tariff-free between the UK and EU countries. A reversion to WTO standards would estab-

BMW isn't the only company worried about a lack of progress in negotiations. At the outset, the British government was warned by motoring leaders that the industry needed to know where it stood quickly.

HYBRIDS may actually pump out higher emissions into the atmosphere than diesel engines. New analysis from The Miles Consultancy (TMC) found that plug-in hybrid electric vehicles gave out CO2 emissions of 168g/km, compared to 159g/km for diesels.

The report also questioned the efficiency of hybrids. It found that many drivers, es-

found that many drivers, especially in the transport industry, relied far more on petrol or diesel, preferring fuel to charging up the battery.

TMC concluded that companies are actually increasing their fuel bills, despite labouring under the impression that hybrids were greener and more efficient.

Hybrids were only cost-effective when the battery was charged daily, the report said. Standard hybrids were found to be much better than plug-in varieties.



Volvo lineup revealed

Strong Spanish team plans to make history

SPAIN'S crew for the Volvo Ocean Race has been announced. The epic round the world sail departs from Alicante port for the fourth time in its history next month.

Sponsored by Mapfre, the Spanish team is skippered by Xabi Fernandez. The Olympic Gold medallist has four Volvo Ocean Races to his name and is one of the most decorated sailors in Spanish history.

He replaces the evergreen Iker Martinez who took the Mapfre crew to fourth place in the 2014-15 race. Starring alongside Fernandez is Blair Tuke, another Olympic medalist and America's Cup winner from New Zealand. Tuke is hoping to become the first man to win the

'Triple Crown' of the sailing world, with Olympic, Americas and Volvo victories.

In charge of navigation will be veteran sailor Joan Vila who, at 55, is returning from a 15-year hiatus from the sport.

Other crew members include Tamara Echegoven, Louis Sinclair, Rob Greenhalgh, and Sophie Ciszek.

Expectations are high for Mapfre after the team set a new world record in the qualifying stages. But the real grind begins on October 22 when they set sail for Lisbon before racing down the west African coast and then onto Australia.

They will spend around nine months at sea before finishing in Holland next June. Team manager Pedro Campos has said that solidarity and spirit will be crucial to their success
