THE discovery of a predatory fish in a Marbella park has sparked panic.

A Manilva expatriate is furious at the lack of aid he has received after flooding to his property cost him €60,000.

Peter Fake, 62, lives in a bungalow in the picturesque Hacienda Guadalupe urbanisation, but his Spanish dream home is being ruined by water damage which rots his furniture and has caused a wall to collapse.

Previous inhabitants did not report any issues but the property was vacant for nine months before the tyre store owner purchased it in 2010.

And during that period a neighbour built a wall which has resulted in torrents of

water streaming into his bungalow.

Peter told the *Euro Weekly News*: "It gushes in through the bedroom, the whole house floods unless I shut the door. It can get about 20 centimetres high and the furniture ends up floating, it's terrible!"

As the seventh owner of the property built in 1984, Peter insists there was no previous water damage.

He secured a Mayoral Decree to correct the problem

but when he started work, his neighbour filed a police complaint which resulted in a judge ruling against Peter and forcing him to stop.

"The courts are deliberately condemning my property."

Peter has tried everything to solve the issue but is sick of being passed from pillar-to-post with law firms taking his money and officials neglecting to aid him whilst his costs increase.

He also lives in constant dread of rain.

He claims that all that needs to be done is for sufficient drainage to be put in place, diverting the water away from his home, but nobody will answer his plight.

Spain in crisis

Catalan secession plans go on

CONFUSION reigns as Spain and Cataluña continue to sing from different sheets.

Defiant Catalan leader Carles Puigdemont has repeated his determination to declare independence after officials claimed that 90 per cent of the 2.26 million voters in last Sunday's referendum voted to leave Spain.

It comes in the wake of a polling day marred by police violence which left almost 900 members of the public and more than 30 officers hurt.

In a TV interview with the BBC on Tuesday, Puigdemont said he'd "act at the end of this week or the beginning of next."

But the Spanish government and Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy remain adamant that the poll was illegal and refuse to recognise the result or discuss the issue with Cataluña.

Tensions remain high and

thousands of Guardia Civil and National Police remain deployed in the region, as it yesterday emerged that Spain has sent military forces to "provide logistical support."

King Felipe of Spain gave a televised speech on Tuesday in which he said the Catalan regional government has tried to break "the unity of Spain" but

did not mention the violence or protests which have continued all week, including a general strike on Monday.

And as the controversy drags on the European Union has remained notable for its silence despite Puigdemont's appeals for Brussels to intervene.

Rajoy may yet invoke article 155 which would enforce direct rule from Madrid on Cataluña, but Puigdemont said this would be "an error which changes everything."

No fitting send-off for airline

TENS of thousands of holidaymakers continue to be repatriated following the collapse of British airline Monarch.

An estimated 32,503 travellers - out of more than 110,000 across Europe - were left stranded in Spain, as the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) takes on the 'mammoth operation' of returning them to the UK.

British consular staff have been dispatched to Spanish airports.

CAA chief executive Andrew Haines said they "got off to a good start" having already got more than 12,000 passengers home.

Monarch declared itself bust after it was unable to renew its Air Travel Organiser's Licence, forcing the carrier to axe more than 410,000 bookings.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...31

Rivers are the backbone of Spain but many are in danger of drying out, due to climate change and poor water transportation policies.



UNDER THREAT: The Tajo.

THERE are over 1,800 rivers in Spain. Most are fairly short and only carry water during certain times of the year. Dry riverbeds are a common sight, and the Spanish government has been using pipelines in recent years to divert water from the north to drier regions further south.

Five of the main rivers in Spain flow out into the Atlantic Ocean, and several, including the Tajo and the Duero, pass through Portugal before they reach the coast.

Others, including the Ebro, have their estuaries in the Mediterranean Sea.

Many rivers irrigate fertile land enabling crops including rice, olives, grapes and corn to grow. They are also used to power hydroelectric plants and in some cases transport.

Rollin' down the rivers...

Dry as a bone

THE River Tagus or Tajo, also known as the Tejo in Portugal, is the longest on the Iberian Peninsula and runs for more than 1,000 kilometres.

It rises in the Sistema Iberico mountains near Madrid and passes through Toledo before crossing the Portuguese border and flowing out to the sea at Lisbon.

Few towns are built along this river in Spain, with Toledo being the largest, as much of it passes through steep, rocky valleys which are unsuitable for building developments.

The headwaters of the Tagus are in serious danger of drying up due to a combination of climate change and pipelines which transport water to drier regions including Almeria and Murcia.

Delta blues

THE Ebro discharges the second-largest volume of water after the Duero and is also the longest river to run solely through Spain.

The Ebro Delta, near Tarragona, contains one of Europe's largest wetlands which is under threat due to water extraction to grow vegetables, fruit and, most significantly, rice.

Dams upriver have also prevented silt reaching the delta, which is now in danger of being completely covered by water with a potentially disastrous impact on Spain's food production.

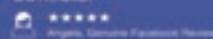

A great view

A MALAGA CITY viewpoint has opened to the public seven years after it was completed.

Visitors to the Old Town can now ascend the 11th century Alcazaba fort to a platform allowing commanding views over the city Roman theatre below.

It comes after the council invested €55,000 to finish a job started in 2010 by installing lights and other elements to improve security.

The viewpoint is open from 10am-5pm from October to April and 10am-8pm from May to September.

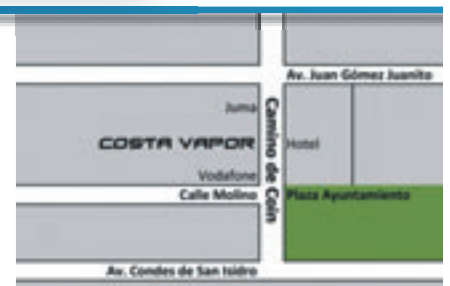

Four jailed after Russian mafia investigation

FOUR members of the Russian mafia who were seized in Marbella have been sent to prison after appearing in court on Friday.

As previously reported in *Euro Weekly News*, the men were wanted for their involvement in a €30 million

money laundering plot which involved two rival gangs.

The arrests were made during several dramatic raids which saw officers descend on a luxury mansion in the Bahia de Marbella urbanisation and the Marbella Football Club.

Eleven of the alleged conspirators were detained during the raids and po-

lice also confiscated a large amount of cash and over 20 high-end vehicles. According to the Andalucía High Court of Justice, the four detainees were all foreign nationals - three were Russian and one was Estonian.

Alexander Grinberg, the owner of Marbella FC was among those sent to jail.

The other seven have since been released on bail, but have been banned from leaving the country and are obliged to appear before the court on a weekly basis.

The men were investigated for money laundering, falsifying documents and were allegedly involved in drug and human trafficking.

Theatre of dreams

Local star invests €1m in project

ANTONIO BANDERAS has announced that he has chosen the Alameda Theatre in Malaga City as the site of his ambitious project.

The building will undergo a complete renovation and host two theatres, commercial and dining spaces and even a hotel as the Hollywood star fulfils a life-long dream.

The project is estimated to take at least a year to complete, and will cost around €1 million.

The actor made the decision to use the Alameda following the Astoria cinema fiasco earlier this year. Banderas chose to abandon work on the council-owned building he had initially chosen for the project following the “insulting treatment” he received while it was still in development.

Banderas announced the news on his social media accounts last Thursday, where he thanked the current owners of the theatre, the Sanchez Ramade family, for their “collaborative spirit and good-

will” and also revealed that he wouldn’t receive any profit from the enterprise.

While an official contract has yet to be signed, local media reports that the agreement is practically set in stone. The film star will also get help from several Madrid theatre entrepreneurs who will help with funding the project.

As well as being an investor, Banderas plans to throw himself into his new role

by acting as the official face of the company and helping to organise events and raise funds from other parts of the country.

The Malaga native has always kept close ties with his hometown and has “been dreaming for too long” about endowing the city with a state-of-the-art cultural space which will benefit the community and attract visitors.

Catalan solution is needed now

Extradite him now!

A COURT in Malaga has demanded that former councilman Carlos Fernandez is extradited back to Spain.

As previously reported in the *Euro Weekly News*, Fernandez went on the run in 2006 to avoid corruption charges but was finally tracked down last month in Argentina following an 11-year manhunt.

Fernandez fled the country after being implicated in the ongoing Malaya corruption scandal that has seen almost 50 people sent to jail, including Julian Muñoz, the ex-mayor of Marbella, and his girlfriend, singer Isabel Pantoja.

Fernandez is reported to have received over

€150,000 in bribes between October 2004 and February 2005.

Council official Felix Romero stressed how important it is for Fernandez to testify as the public funds that were embezzled during the Malaya scandal have yet to be returned.

Following his arrest in Argentina, the prosecutor's office claimed that the crimes Fernandez is charged with had not expired and asked the court to "file the timely request for extradition."

The ex-councilman faces from two to six years imprisonment if convicted of the offences and a ban from employment in public services lasting from seven to 12 years.

Desperate appeal

Mother and son cancer victims need help

A CROWDFUNDING page has been set up to help a family from Malaga, after both mother and son were diagnosed with cancer this year.

Friends hope to raise enough cash so that single mum Amanda Edwards can take her two children, Abs, aged eight, and Jose, aged 12, on holiday to Disneyland in Paris to make special memories.

Amanda was shocked when her son, Abs, which is short for Abraham, was diagnosed with two types of leukaemia earlier this year and then was dealt the devastating blow that she had breast cancer just months later.

They have been going through chemotherapy together.

The translator for expats has been unable to work due to her treatment, so the family have lost their only source of income.

Her dad died last August after moving to Spain to be closer to the family. Adding to this hardship, Amanda's sister-in-

Natalie Hancock from Sandhurst, Berkshire and Amanda's best friend of 40 years, wanted to help the family through these difficult times.

Writing on her JustGiving page, Natalie said: 'Amanda has to fund so much of her's and her little boy's treatment. As she is ill she is unable to work, so we need as much help as we can to assist with their treatment and making their lives as comfortable as possible.'

She continued: 'As well as fundraising for their treatments

and everyday living Amanda wants to donate to the Hospital Materno-Infantil in Malaga to the oncology ward which is the maternity and children's hospital in Malaga.'

She added: 'Amanda's aim in life is to take little Abs to Disneyland Paris where he can enjoy his life as much as he can in the time he has. Please help me help my best friend who has breast cancer and her little boy with leukaemia, have a better way of life and get their trip of a lifetime.'

River rescue drama

EXCLUSIVE**“They left him for dead”****Expatriate mum thanks son's saviour***By Matt Ford*

AN expatriate mother has reached out to a woman who she is convinced saved her son's life.

He was attacked by a group of drunk, 'well to do visitors from Madrid who left him for dead' in a shocking incident in central Marbella.

"I just want to say from one mother to another how grateful I am, because without her quick actions they might not have been caught," said the relieved mum, who wishes to remain anonymous due to a court case launched in the wake of

the ordeal.

"I also want to say thanks again to the National Police for their fast response in helping my son."

As the 27-year-old headed towards a taxi rank following a night out with friends, he was attacked by two men and a woman.

They pushed him over and launched a series of kicks at his head.

The attackers then stole a bag containing his wallet and other personal effects before jumping into their car and speeding off, leaving their victim unconscious on the ground.

But an English woman sitting nearby in her car witnessed the brutal beating and immediately called the police, after first jotting down the licence plate number of the culprits' car.

Investigators were able to quickly locate the vehicle and arrest those inside, who still had the victim's bag with them.

He is now out of hospital after regaining consciousness and undergoing a series of brain scans.

The case has now been referred to a High Court Judge in Malaga after an initial hearing in Marbella.

Facebook fascism row erupts in Mijas Council

Councillor criticised

MEMBERS of Mijas Council have called for the removal of councilman Juan Manuel Muñoz for praising ex-Spanish dictator Francisco Franco on Facebook.

It comes after Muñoz, leader of the right-wing Popular Party (PP) in the town, shared posts that included symbols of the dictatorship while excusing Franco's behaviour during his leadership.

The posts were later removed after a number of people criticised their content.

Some posts seen before their removal included statements including, 'the Franco regime was not a dictatorship, but a regime of authority' and the 'prison population in 1975 was 8,440, and now it is more than 80,000.'

Members from the Spanish Socialist Workers' Party (PSOE) in Mijas have since called for the councilman to

be removed from office, stating that this was not the first time Muñoz has expressed such beliefs and that they are "unacceptable."

PSOE councillor Jose Antonio Gonzalez pointed out that this kind of attitude from

a Popular Party member is not surprising, given how, just a few days before, a journalist was insulted about his sexual

orientation by party representatives.

The PSOE has also demanded that the councillor apologise and remove any posts that show a lack of respect for those who suffered during the Franco regime.

Not the final frontier yet

THE long-running debate over the placing of the border between Marbella and Benahavis is creating a headache for new mayor Angeles Muñoz, barely a month after she returned to office.

This is not the first time the border between the two towns has been up for debate.

As previously reported in the *Euro Weekly News*, citizens complained when Marbella was granted the entirety of the Cerro Colorado archaeological park since the city's historical terrain only covered half of it.

The council rectified these mistakes last April but has now come under fire for a new amendment that grants a portion of San Pedro to Benahavis.

A citizens' group criticised the mayor for participating in and voting on the changes, even though they ignored traditional boundaries between the towns.

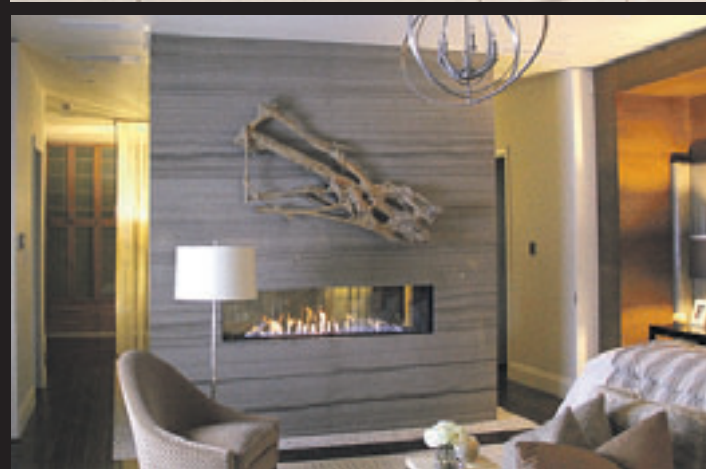

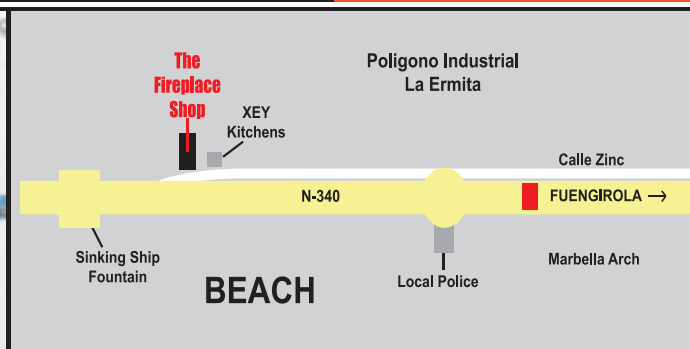

Arsonists arrested

Study reveals growing flood risk from climate change

Malaga in deep water

By Kat Ashton

MALAGA Province is growing increasingly vulnerable to flooding as a result of human interference and climate change.

According to a study by the MADECA Foundation, responsible for implementing action plans for Malaga Province, Malaga City is the area most at risk, followed by Marbella, Mijas, Velez, Fuengirola, Torremolinos, Estepona and Rincon de la Victoria.

The region has suffered an increase in flooding in recent years, which the MADECA Foundation's flood risk study puts down to mankind's influence on the local environment and climate change. The study focused on the areas of the province most affected by flooding in recent years.

One of the main causes of flooding in Malaga

Province, which impacts over one million people each year, is the impact of man-made developments on flood-relief land.

The director of MADECA, Jacobo Florido, explained that, "Mediterranean coastal

regions have undergone a lot of intensive development making them more vulnerable to flooding, which often leads to catastrophes, and Malaga is no exception."

The MADECA study has recommended that the areas whose natural draining capacities have been affected by such development are supported by an artificial drainage system.

Malaga Province is prone to flooding due to its natural landscape, which causes water to flow down to the coast from the mountains and also excessive deforestation that has impacted on the

natural landscape.

Climate change is believed to have a big impact on the increased frequency and intensity of flooding, which is estimated to cost the region even more in the future.

Reports from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) point to an increase in the frequency and intensity of floods.

They estimate that the contribution of climate change to the economic costs of natural disasters will increase in the future because of the greater intensity and frequency of flooding.

The project is the 11th in a series belonging to the 'Estepona, Garden of the Costa del Sol' initiative which aims to transform the image of the town's historic centre by renovating underused spaces. Among the public spots that have been revamped so far are the 'Garden of Andalusian poets' and the Antonio Ortega square.

Urbano stated the council will continue to work on recovering spaces in the old town to expand the initiative and stressed the centre has become one of the main tourist hotspots.

Workplace gives staff the blues

THE building which houses Malaga's Oceanography Institute in Fuengirola is in dire need of repair, staff say.

Damp walls, damaged windows and water leaks are just a few of the problems that plague the building - not to mention cockroach and rodent infestations which put the workers' health at risk.

According to staff, there are also many exposed wires throughout the building which run the risk of electrocution or starting a fire.

Workers complained to the General Labour Confederation (CGT) about the "grave and distressing situation" after "repeatedly" complaining to local authorities and failing to even receive a response.

A new headquarters in Malaga City's San Andres port is already in the works but it will take at least another year to complete. It will have three floors and all the necessary features demanded by the Oceanography Institute such as meeting rooms, laboratories, a library and a dining room.

Ramping up the A-7

Overdue roadworks finally begin on Exit 222

WORK has finally begun on a problematic motorway exit on the Costa del Sol.

Access to Arroyo de la Miel in Benalmadena will at last be improved after years of neighbourhood campaigns and political clashes.

The first stone was laid in July but the project was postponed until the end of the summer due to the tourist influx.

The problem lies at kilometre 222 where dangerous tailbacks, of up to a kilometre in length, form at peak times, clogging the inside lane and hard shoulder.

The project to add an additional exit lane is expected to take two years to complete.

Construction company Ferrovial has been contracted to undertake the works and a priority is being placed on traffic flow so that movement between Benalmadena and the

A-7 remain possible during construction.

Noise dampening road surfaces and 876 metres of acoustic screens will be put in place to ensure minimal disturbance for nearby residents in the wake of the job.

That's nuts!

HORNETS and heatwaves are to blame for shrinking this year's chestnut harvest in Malaga Province by 50 per cent.

A combination of high summer temperatures and a recent hornet infestation is said to have had a serious impact on the trees.

The Malaga Young Farmers Association (ASAJA) forecast that production levels will be down to two million kilos this year, compared to the average of four million that has been harvested in previous years.

The weather over the next two weeks will have a huge impact on numbers as bouts of rain could refresh the trees and ease the process.

In spite of efforts carried out by pest-control departments to combat the wasp infestation earlier this year, it continues to be a problem.

The hornets' larvae cause abnormal growths on chestnut trees which weaken them and leave them more vulnerable to other pests and diseases.

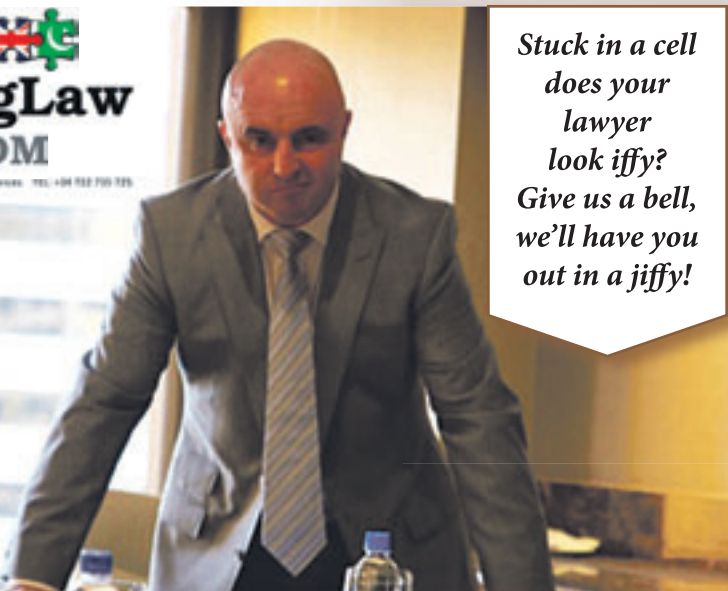
But the pillonga, which is the main variety of chestnut grown in Malaga's Genal Valley has not been affected by the insect plague and the harvest is expected to proceed as normal.

CHARLOTTE DEL RIO loves dogs with a passion.

That much is clear from the moment that you step beyond the imposing gates outside her finca near Alhaurin de la Torre.

The ex-riding instructor from Halifax in Yorkshire lives here with husband Dioni and children Nathan, 11, Sofia, 15,

and Sebastian, 22, and they dedicate their lives to helping abused galgos, or Spanish greyhounds. "The biggest satisfaction is when they go home, although

it's hard it's also the best feeling in the world," she smiles.

Charlotte and family have created a true haven. At 112 Carlota Galgos there are no kennels, the dogs live in wooden chalets called 'bays' accompanied by soothing music and lights.

Used to catch Iberian hares on flatlands in areas including Sevilla and Extremadura, tens of thousands of galgos continue to be abandoned or killed via cruel methods such as 'playing the piano,' a barbaric form of hanging.

During their short working lives they are often kept in cramped conditions with no natural light and fed a diet of leftovers.

Charlotte spends hours uploading photos and comments

to social media every day as well as providing therapeutic care using state of the art equipment, since the shelter specialises in the worst cases of mental and physical trauma.

"I feel like I work 24 hours per day!" she laughs. "If we've got cases that are paralysed, for example, then we're up out of bed turning and massaging them."

They often drive hours to collect dogs from Sevilla or Extremadura, and have an astounding rate of success in terms of rehabilitation and rehoming.

"The typical cases we get are quite bad and they don't leave until they're ready.

"They are one of the most forgiving dogs, they're so gentle and exuberate love and I

think we should do the same, so I just make it really positive and it becomes a big family."

But the shelter is funded entirely by donations, and it isn't cheap.

"A pallet of 70 sacks of food can cost €1,600 and lasts around two-and-a-half months, and each bay will take a full bottle of detergent a day to clean.

"There's also antibiotics, bandages, vet bills, which can be anything from €2-4,000 per month."

Happily for Charlotte, the Mijas Hash Harriers have chosen to donate the proceeds of their annual Red Dress Run to the shelter.

"I can't believe they've chosen us!" beams Charlotte.

"When they first mentioned it to me it just seemed like a dream come true, it's not something that really happens very often!"

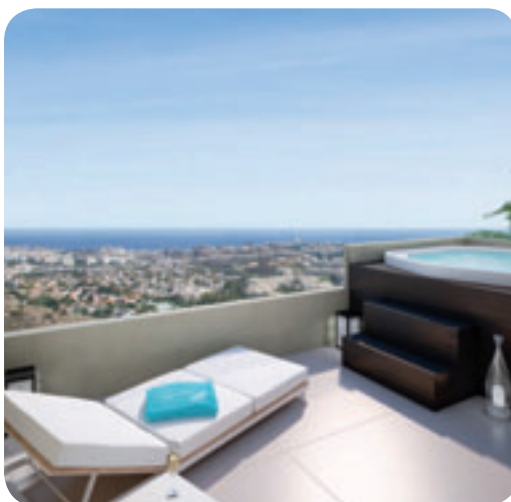

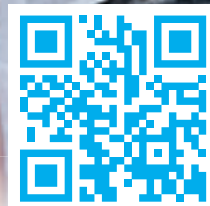

SPAIN'S deployment of the National Police and the Guardia Civil to try to stop the illegal independence referendum in Cataluña has already cost almost €32m - but the figure is set to rise.

Breaking bad

ONE of the largest dealers of weapons on the black market has been held by police in Navarra. The 24-year-old taught himself how to navigate the black market-dominated dark web and manufacture weapons.

Blown down

A HOTEL in Mallorca has set up a unique 'sanctuary' for inflatable pool toys that are left behind when holidaymakers return home and allows new guests to 'adopt' them during their stay.

Arms heist

A GANG has stolen 80 rifles from Madrid's biggest weapons arsenal. The thieves used a thermal lance to cut their way into the vault and also made off with an undisclosed amount of money.

Family feud

A MAN has died and four others were injured after a knife fight broke out between two families in Valencia. Police have arrested three suspects as investigations continue.

Little hero

A FIVE-YEAR-OLD boy saved his mother's life by contacting the police. The young boy dialled 091 when he found her lying face down in her bath.

Out of work

THE end of the summer season saw 27,858 Spaniards become unemployed, the largest number since the economic crash of 2008. There are now 3,410,182 unemployed people in Spain.

Squatters held over kidnap

NINE Polish and Romanian squatters have been held by police and a young woman freed after she was abducted and forced to prostitute herself in Valencia.

The sting was launched when the victim escaped from a disused industrial unit where she was being held captive.

She told investigators that a man had persuaded her to go there with him several days earlier.

But once they were inside, he beat and raped her before making her his prisoner.

He also allowed others to pay for sex with her in exchange for money which he kept.

A brief probe revealed that there were several others living illegally in the unit who were aware of the situation but did nothing, leading to the arrests of two women and seven men after police stormed the building.

Four have previous criminal records, while the victim's details have not been released.

Airline charged mum after going bankrupt

SINGLE parent Lynda Mynott booked Monarch flights to Spain in April next year at a price of €300 for herself and 13-year-old daughter, Gracie.

But the mum, from Wibsey in Bradford, was shocked to discover that the airline, which went into administration at 4am Monday (October 2), took money from her account later that day.

She had arranged the holiday in Spain so her that her daughter's father and his wife could fly in from Australia's Gold Coast to have some holiday time with young Gracie.

Speaking from the UK Lynda said, "I heard about Monarch last night so logged in to my on-line banking.

"The money was still there at 11.30pm so I went on this morning at 7am to cancel the payment but it had gone.

"I rang the bank and explained that they had processed the payment after midnight and she said it still didn't make any difference, I wouldn't be able to get a refund."

Lynda said, "I paid through PayPal so it comes out of my bank account. I don't have a credit card."

Disabled Lynda and daughter Gracie were due to stay with a family relative, Julie Jones Peel, and had booked flights from Manchester airport to Almeria on March 27, 2018 and returning on April 12.

"Gracie has only met her dad three times before so is really disappointed by this news."

Cousin Julie in Almeria added, "I think that's disgusting.

"She paid through PayPal, and all day she's been trying to get through to them but the lines are busy."

Murder suicide probe launched

POLICE in Barcelona are probing whether a man killed his wife and baby before committing suicide.

Officers found the woman, who had been shot in the head, in the building's reception, while her husband was found dead next to their 11-month-old child in the apartment upstairs. The bodies of the man and the baby also had gunshot wounds, and a firearm was found next to the man.

The events took place around 3pm Sunday in the Sant Marti district of Barcelona.

Officers are now investigating

whether the incident was caused by domestic violence.

According to a statement released by the Catalan police, initial evidence suggests that the husband killed the other two members of his family before shooting himself.

Animal thefts on rise

PET owners in Sevilla have received a police warning after a spate of dog thefts hit the province.

Distraught owners were called from a private telephone number and told that their animals would be hung unless a ransom was paid.

The majority of those taken were small breeds including chihuahuas and pugs.

Investigators called several of the numbers on the notices, with the owners confirming that they had received phone calls threatening their pets and demanding that they pay to get them back.

One said that his chihuahua was taken from the terrace of his home and that shortly afterwards a person called to "say that they had found his dog and that if he wanted to see it again it would cost him €250."

Detectives set a trap after arranging a rendezvous between the owner and thief, swooping to arrest a young man who carried the dog.

He claimed he was merely delivering the canine and was freed after giving a name to police who have now held a second suspect, but residents have been warned that more dog thieves may still be at large.

A grave mistake

FOUR workers at the Municipal Cemetery of El Salvador in the city Oviedo in Asturias, northern Spain, have been arrested by police for stealing from dead bodies.

They have been charged with theft and desecration of corpses.

It is alleged they stole jewellery, personal effects and gold teeth from corpses as the bodies were exhumed from niches and transferred to the general ossuary. It is believed their activities had been going on 'for years.'

Officers from the National Police believe they would have profited around €11,000 from the sale of gold teeth and other effects.

Underwear scare

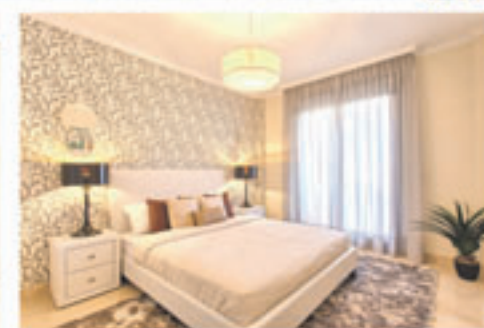

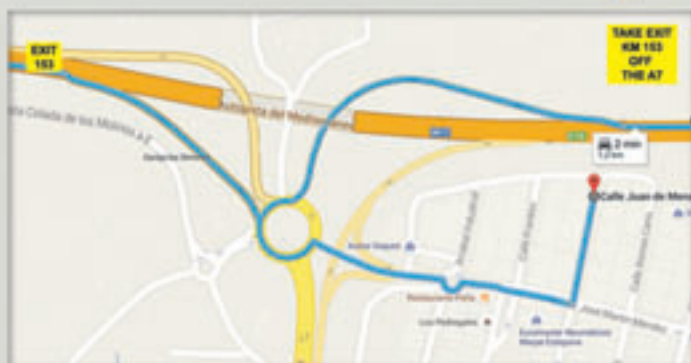

Most valuable companies

THE Inditex Group owns three of the top 10 most valuable Spanish companies which between them are valued at more than €29 billion.

Zara alone is worth €25 billion and accounts for 25 per cent of the value of the top 30 Spanish brands with its nearest rival being Movistar with a number of banks following, but none of them coming anywhere near the value of the Inditex collective.

Bank reviews job options

ALERT to the fact that the Spanish economy might not be able to sustain further job creation in certain sectors, the Bank of Spain has undertaken an in-depth study.

The results are that it seems that the creation of jobs in construction and hospitality may now slow down and that it is important that those who have a low level of education are not disadvantaged.

Although tourism has been a great fillip for the Spanish economy, a number of North African countries and Turkey are fighting back.

As the British Foreign Office revises danger warnings and resorts have been hit by lack of visitors, prices are dropping quite considerably in an attempt to woo package tourists back and in the meantime, Spanish hoteliers have raised their prices.

A lot of work in the hospitality sector is seasonal and has been a useful source of income for the younger unemployed, but the fear is that if prices remain higher then

there will be a drop off in visitors.

In the construction industry, whilst there is a reasonable amount of activity, it isn't anything like the pre-crash levels so experienced workers rather than apprentices are being taken on and with the amount of older property on the market and uncertainty over expatriate situations after Brexit, this could be a 'false spring.'

The Bank wants to see a diversification in job creation as well as better educated students able to undertake more sophisticated work.

Numbers of wealthy growing

THOSE with wealth in Spain are increasing as it is now estimated that there were 202,000 Spanish millionaires in 2016, an increase of 5 per cent. The recently published World Report of Wealth shows that Spain is 14th in the list of the number of millionaires and seventh in Europe, with Inditex founder Amancio Ortega being one of the wealthiest in the world.

Quote of the Week

"I am convinced that the Spanish state and society will face the challenges and we will have another cycle of prosperity," said Luis de Guindos Minister of the Economy referring to the Catalan situation.

Quarterly hand out

THE Spanish Finance Ministry will hand out €7.87 billion to the autonomous communities with 25 per cent (€1.97 billion) allocated to Catalonia despite the heated disagreements over the independence referendum. Andalusia will receive €1.51 billion.

Double role

THE current CEO of Santander España Rami Aboukhair will now add the role of head of the recently taken over Banco Popular. He will also head the bank's steering committee until it is assimilated into the Santander group.

BLACK economy evades VAT.

EU loses out on VAT due

THE loss of VAT revenue in Spain due to fraud, tax evasion, bankruptcy or simple error in 2015 may be €1.12 billion or €2.5 billion depending on which figure you believe. The Spanish Tax Agency believes it to be the lower figure but the European Commission has published a study which suggests the higher figure.

Whichever is correct (and the EU uses a different formula to the Tax Agency), it is recognised by both organisations that the loss of

VAT in Spain has dropped for four successive years and only Sweden and Hungary are more successful in collecting VAT.

It is estimated that the total non-collection of VAT across the European Union in 2015 was €152 billion, representing almost 13 per cent of the total VAT due and whilst Greece is getting better at collecting the tax, Italy is the worst, losing €35 billion in the year, although the UK managed to 'miss out' on collecting €22.2 billion.

Spain is not so competitive

DESPITE positive words coming out of the European Union on competitiveness, a new report shows that many EU states are losing ground against other countries. The World Economic Forum which studies the results of 137 different countries has reported that the three most com-

petitive countries are Switzerland, Singapore and the United States of America.

One eye opener however is that Spain which has supposedly seen a financial rebirth has reverted to 34th place although it remains the leader of the PIGS (Portugal, Italy, Greece and Spain).

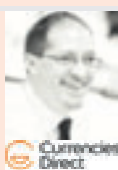

German election result leaves EUR unsteady

SEPTEMBER proved pretty positive for the GBP/EUR exchange rate, with the pound rallying from a low of €1.07 to hit a 10-week high of €1.14.

EUR/GBP, on the other hand, moved from £0.92 to £0.87, while EUR/USD dipped from a high of \$1.20 to \$1.17.

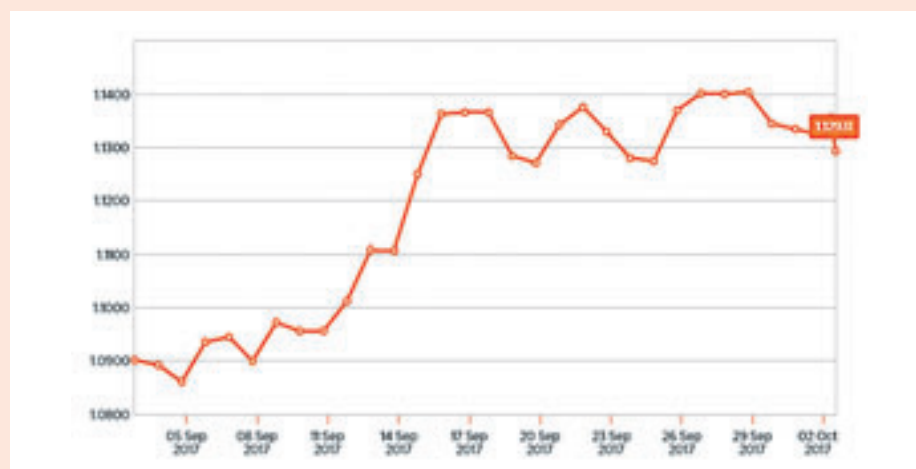
What's been happening?

There's been a lot going on recently to keep the currency markets occupied.

It's been a busy period for UK politics, with Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson causing a stir after reawakening the controversial claim that Brexit will free up £350 million per week to spend on the NHS.

Theresa May also delivered a speech on the UK's approach to Brexit, but markets were disappointed with the lack of clarity it provided.

Meanwhile, the US dollar was weakened by political concerns (with military tensions be-

tween the US and North Korea escalating) but later recovered thanks to an improving outlook for US interest rates.

The US Federal Reserve stated that it will start to trim the balance sheet from next month and also indicated that it might raise interest rates one more time during 2017.

The month was less upbeat for the euro, with the uncertainty sparked by the outcome of the German Federal Elections leading to a decline in demand for the single currency.

The election saw Angela Merkel retain her majority but lose her coalition partners the Social Democrat Party (SPD), meaning that there could be weeks of negotiations as she tries to form a coalition with minor parties.

What do you need to look out for?

There's quite a bit on the calendar with the potential to keep GBP, EUR and USD on their toes over the weeks ahead.

For starters, the euro will remain pressured to the downside until a working government is

formed in Germany. If this occurs more quickly than currently forecast, and if the government's prospects for growth and stability are favourable, EUR exchange rates could bounce back.

Of the economic reports due for release, inflation, PMI, growth and retail stats for the UK, Eurozone and US are likely to be the most influential.

Any figures which support the case in favour of tighter monetary policy will be supportive for their respective currencies.

Speeches from central bank officials are also worth attending to. If the Bank of England (BoE) hints that interest rates might just rise in November, we can expect the pound to gain.

Similarly, if the odds of the Federal Reserve increasing interest rates in November remain elevated, the US dollar may continue driving the euro lower.

NOW YOU CAN BUY BITCOINS IN CARREFOUR Also on a Visa card

WHEN China recently banned the sale of Bitcoin, the crypto-currency, there was an initial drop in its price which saw a quick recovery and it is now being sold through Carrefour.

The initial trial will be run in 50 stores around the country and special Bitcoin cards produced by Bitnovo will be available to purchase so that the Bitcoins can then be downloaded onto a digital wallet for use or investment.

This computer produced currency has been long associated with the underworld as it is not a physical currency backed by a government so can be transferred around the world via the internet.

It has proven to be a very volatile 'currency' with one Bitcoin now being worth just under €3,500 so the purchase of a €100 gift card will allow the owner to download 0.03 of a Bitcoin and then hope that it will retain its value or increase before it needs to be exchanged for goods or physical cash.

In addition, there are now a num-

ber of companies offering debit cards through the VISA system which allow payment for goods and also separate purchase of new Bitcoins.

For those who obtained Bitcoins (which are produced by a convoluted system of computer programmes which go 'mining' to create new coins), considerable fortunes have been made as the original value of a single Bitcoin was less than €1.

As this is a relatively uncontrolled currency, governments in particular

fear that it has become the exchange of choice for drug smugglers, organised crime and even terrorists as well as an ideal way for individuals to evade currency controls.

The latest of these computer based currencies the Whoppercoin is being launched by Burger King in Russia, but although in theory it will be possible to trade on the open market, one Whoppercoin is only worth 1.5 euro cents which will be given for every Rouble spent.

To purchase a single burger, customers will need to earn 1,700 of the special coins, but if this is successful then the concept may roll out across the whole of Europe with Spain a potential target.

Currently, restaurant chains in Spain such as Da Bruno, the Italian family group on the Costa del Sol already offers a loyalty card whereby regular customers can build up points to use against the cost of a meal, with €1 being credited for every €10 spent, so this may not become a huge success in Spain.

Three will become one

CURRENTLY Spanish banks use three different companies to arrange payments through the 50,000 cash machines in the country used by 75 million card holders.

If all goes to plan and shareholders in the three companies, Servired, 4B and Euro 6000 agree, the three companies will become one and their shares will be held mainly by participating banks.

Servired will actually merge its payment division to allow it to join the new, as yet unnamed company and in theory the entire merger will be completed before the end of the year so that all of the main Spanish banks will use the same service.

What has not been revealed is whether with the merger any bank charges for using other banks machines will be scrapped.

US TOY COMPANY SEES GROWTH POTENTIAL By investing in Spain

By investing in Spain

ALTHOUGH the Toys 'R' Us operation in the USA has sought protection against its creditors after dropping sales, it still sees Spain as a strong and potential market.

So confident is it in the prospective strength of the Iberian market that its new five-year plan calls for continued expansion as well as a redesign of the online business.

With 51 stores in Spain and a new one due to open prior to the Christmas and Three Kings rush, the company will also be taking on more than 1,000 part-time staff in order to be able to cope with the expected business.

According to new general director of the company Jean Charreteur, responsible for France and Iberia in an interview with the news agency Efe, whilst Spain is not the largest European market in turnover, it does generate profit and there appears to be a significant option for long-term growth.

Whilst the company has been seriously hit by the internet sales made through Amazon in the USA, the online giant has not made significant inroads within the Spanish market with El Corte Ingles being the major toy seller, followed closely by Toys 'R' Us.

For this reason, the company plans to expand its number of outlets in smaller towns but only if the potential stores are in the right locations and promise to generate significant footfall.

Having seen the success of internet sites worldwide, the group plans to make its site far easier to operate and

to introduce the option for customers to order online but then collect at a designated store or even have the manufacturer deliver directly.

Funds are apparently being made available to allow for this growth and there will be an emphasis in promoting the little known Babes 'R' Us business which like Mothercare in the UK and Spain offers a range of items ideal for newborns.

One other possibility being considered, once the new website is up and running efficiently, is the possible introduction of third party companies offering their product for sale with the group receiving a percentage of the sale in the same way as Amazon and other similar online stores.

Although there is a strong emphasis on new stores and an improved internet facility, money will also be spent on upgrading the existing stores as well as adding special events to ensure that customers visit on a regular basis and that each store is of the same high standard.

Best value store

THERE are some significant savings to be made by choosing one supermarket over another with the average basket being €900 per annum cheaper if you pick the right chain.

There seem to be two deciding factors over the pricing of goods, location and store with the Alcampo chain being the most economic on a national basis although the Dani group in Andalusia is considered as being cheaper.

The consumer organisation OCU has completed its annual survey of Spanish supermarkets and compared 164,276 prices in 1,137 establishments in 63 different locations to allow it to come up with its cheapest options.

Mallorcan supermarkets were the most expensive, but the majority of the different chains offer similar prices although fruit and vegetable prices have increased generally.

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

MANY UK expatriates living in Spain own properties in the UK and have pensions and investments in the UK. They rely on their UK assets to maintain their lifestyles (and those of their families) in Spain. An LPA must be made while you have full mental capacity. It is therefore important to make one while you are in good health.

Why should you get an LPA?

You can choose a person or people, who you trust, to act for you when you are no longer able.

If you lose your mental capacity and do not have an LPA, then your family (or the authorities) will have no choice but to make an application to the Court of Protection to appoint a 'deputy' to look after your affairs, which can be time consuming and costly.

Will my LPA be recognised in Spain?

Unfortunately there is no international type of LPA which is guaranteed to work in both the UK and Spain.

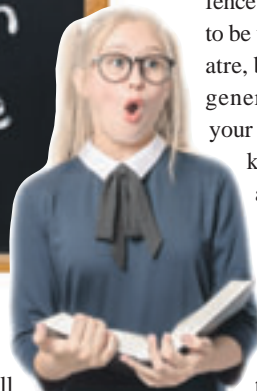
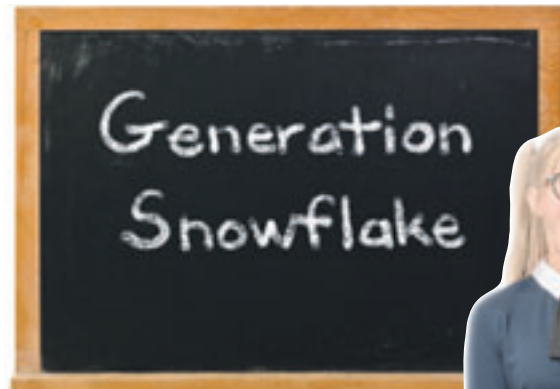

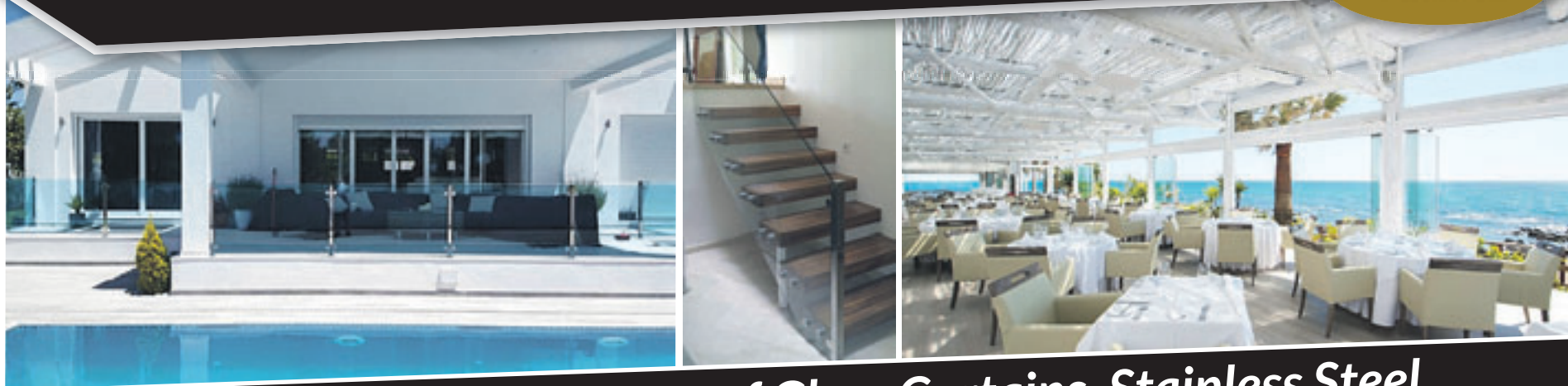

LEGALLY SPEAKING

New mobile phone

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torre Vieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



STAY SAFE: A small distraction can mean the difference between life and death.

AN instant of distraction can make the difference between life and death. This is why the International Automobile Federation (FIA) and Dieter Liebrech Koch, with the collaboration of RACC and RACE and other European automobile clubs, are launching the #ParkYourPhone initiative. The ambassador for this campaign is singer Pharrell Williams.

European Transport Commissioner Violeta Bulc said that "with smartphones integrated into our lives, it seems increasingly difficult to take our eyes off the screen. In fact, driving distracted is causing an increasing number of victims on the road."

The message is unmistakable: the best way to prevent an accident is, first and foremost, to have our eyes on the road and not any other element that can prevent us from driving with attention. Jean Todt, president of the FIA, said that "road safety is one of my top priorities. Drivers, cyclists and pedestrians need to un-

derstand the dangers of using smartphones in traffic. To combat the 3,500 lives lost daily in traffic accidents, I call on all road users to 'park' their phones when they are in traffic."

RACC Recommendations

The RACC emphasises that talking on the phone multiplies by four the probability of an accident and drivers who write a message are 23 times more likely to crash. In a study carried out by the Catalan motor club last year, 26 per cent of drivers admitted to using their mobile 'always or often' on their journeys, a percentage that increases to 47 per cent in the case of pedestrians.

To reduce the accidents related to mobile use, the RACC recommends: Promote the use of applications that block the mobile while driving; require certification (eg an ISO standard) to be able to standardise mobility-related apps and identify them as safe and compatible with driving.

Is the UK licence invalid?

Q. With respect, you are giving the wrong advice regarding UK driving licences. First, there is no such thing as an EU driving licence. Second, a UK driver's licence cannot 'be used in Spain until it expires' - far from it in fact. A UK driver's

licence must have the holder's current address on it by law for it to be valid. As a foreign address cannot be given, the holder is committing an infraction and there is a penalty.

A. What you say is perfectly correct. But there is more.

A Directive of the European Union establishes that a driving permit from any European Union member can be used in another EU country until it expires, even if the dri-

ver takes up residence in that country.

This Directive, which has been transposed into Spanish law as well, takes

precedence over the UK regulation which says the permit is valid for driving even though the holder can be fined for an outdated address.

When I referred to an 'EU driving licence' I meant a licence from any EU country.

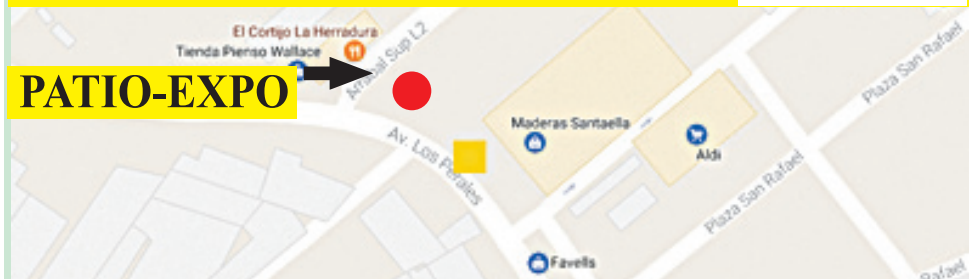

One actor but 16 characters in the most unusual film for the Marbella International Film Festival

AWARD-WINNING director and writer Stephen Cookson will be at the Marbella International Film Festival with Timothy Spall as they present the unique Stanley, Man of Variety.

"I always knew that I was destined for a career in the arts having been a member of the National Youth Theatre alongside the latest James Bond, Daniel Craig and appeared as an extra in a number of blockbuster movies including Mission Impossible and The Russia House," Stephen told *Euro Weekly News*.

He decided however that his future was more likely to be in writing and directing and was involved in a number of short films with members of the Monty Python crew as well as music videos which brought his name to the attention of a number of producers.

Funds were made available for his first feature, a comedy, Stone Man which he wrote and directed and this was followed by another comedy Mumbo Jumbo again as writer and director which introduced him to a number of popular British character actors such as Brian Blessed.

and they spent several years trying to find an ideal vehicle for a new film project starring Timothy.

An idea about a prisoner who escapes into the world of football was given to him by a friend Falcon Fields and Stephen spoke to Timothy about the concept, but as the actor doesn't even like football, that was a non-starter.

For two years Stephen played with the concept and kept trying to enthrall Timothy about playing an entire cast of characters single handedly (perhaps a little akin to Kind Hearts and Coronets where Alec Guinness played eight different parts) but whilst the actor liked the concept, he didn't think that he was up to the challenge.

Eventually after a great deal of discussion about their joint love of classic comedy characters, Timothy was won over and agreed to play 16 different characters in Stanley, Man of Vari-

ety, an unusual yet compelling story.

Stanley finds himself in prison for a crime he believes that he didn't commit. After many years in solitary confinement he begins to talk to his comedy heroes from the past as each one tries to help him remember what he has done.

The narrative follows Stanley through his journey of hallucinations as he faces up to his unusual upbringing and his parents' bizarre religious beliefs and he becomes desperate to learn the truth about what happened to his daughter and what happened to the ordinary life he had always dreamed of.

Apart from playing his own parents and Stanley, Timothy Spall appears in character as a number of well-remembered comedians and actors including Max Wall, Noel Coward, Tony Hancock, George Formby, Max Miller and Alastair Sim.

The schedule for this film was particularly

tiring for actor and director alike with Timothy filming one character each morning after being made up before reverting to Stanley in the afternoon.

Acting 16 different characters, all of which had to be filmed separately and then edited in to the final 85-minute film was a challenge but off camera, an actor read the lines of the characters that Timothy was playing in order to allow him to be able to focus his sightline and also react to a third party.

The film has received a huge amount of praise at different festivals in China, Chile, France, Ireland and the UK that it has been entered into and has won several awards already.

Actor Timothy Spall and Director Stephen Cookson are attending the Marbella International Film Festival next Saturday when their film will be shown at 5pm and the pair will also be involved in a Question and Answer session.

Stephen has never visited Marbella before and commented "I am really looking forward to sharing this incredible film with visitors to the Festival and to enjoy being in what I understand is a great city."

Timothy who has been bitten by the sailing bug sailed to Marbella, planning the journey to allow him to arrive in time for the screening of the film.

Saturday night is a strong night at the Festival with My Best, the story of Calum Best's journey to understand his father, the iconic footballer George Best, a man that Calum never really knew, being presented at 7.30pm.

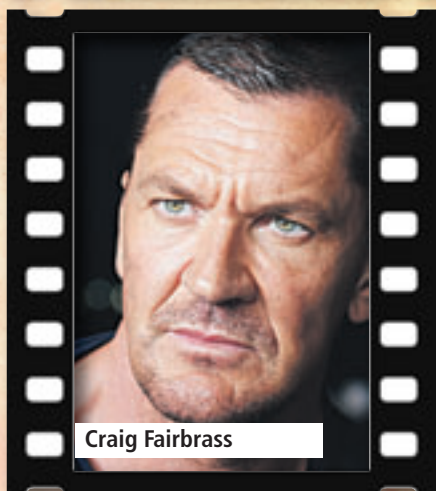

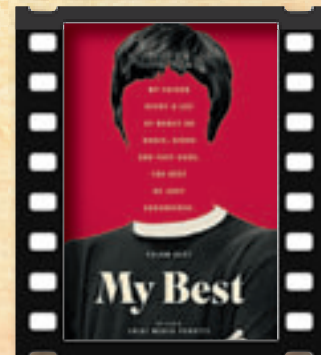

In recent years, there's been an explosion of life-saving treatment advances against breast cancer, which include, surgery, chemotherapy and radiation therapy.

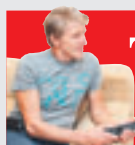

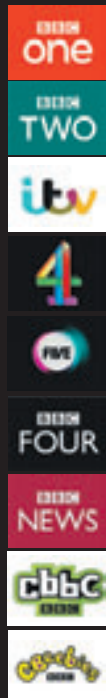

OCTOBER 1, the day of the illegal Cataluña referendum, was abbreviated by the Spanish media to 1-0.

This looked like a football score with a victory for the home team.

That is how Carles Puigdemont and his separatist supporters still see it, although Soraya Saenz de Santamaria, the Spanish vice-president insisted that the match never happened.

"There was no referendum," pronounced the woman routinely called on to do Mariano Rajoy's dirty work.

On the contrary there was a referendum albeit with only a 42 per cent turnout. Ninety per cent of the people who voted, those happy to participate in a ballot with no legal guarantees, voted for independence.

The regional president Carles Puigdemont interprets this as a mandate to declare independence within days, even though the 'yes' vote represents only 27 per cent of Cataluña's population.

So not only has he split Spain apart but he is going to divide Cataluña as well.

The pyromaniac

THE Spanish government failed to understand that not all of the Catalans who wanted a referendum, wanted secession.

Thousands of police and Guardia Civil officers were seconded to the region to stop them from voting and the more Rajoy used words like 'sedition,' the more he fuelled the referendum fire. Not for nothing was he compared to a pyromaniac by a Catalan Euro-MP on October 1.

That fire will take a long time to extinguish. Spain and the world saw footage of black-clad National Police and Guardia Civil officers, armoured literally up to the eyeballs manhan-

dling grannies, jostling pensioners and laying into youths.

"We did what we had to," Rajoy said, although rubber bullets and bloodstained voters are not the best way of upholding the law.

The days have gone when Mariano Rajoy could lie back and think of Spain in tricky situations.

The government's inability to parley and their inflexibility conveyed obduracy and fear, not strength and now no-one is happy. Not the Catalans and certainly not both governments who must pick up the pieces. How they will put them together is anyone's guess.

THE only joke last week was a cruise ship, docked in Barcelona harbour. One of three, it was chartered as floating lodgings for the 5,000 National Police and Guardia Civil personnel brought in to keep the peace before, during and after the referendum.

An oversized picture of Tweety Pie, accompanied by Daffy Duck and Wil E Coyote decorated its side which was tactfully covered after going viral.

Be prepared

JP MORGAN advised investors that Spanish bonds are no longer a sure bet, thanks to Cataluña. Instead they should choose Germany, which is logical, or Portugal owing to Spain's 'constitutional crisis.'

The latter option was nothing short of humiliating as along with Italy, Greece and Spain, Portugal was one of the PIGS in the doo-doo during the economic crisis.

Mariano Rajoy who repeatedly pats himself on the back for dragging Spain out of the economic crisis criticised his predecessor Jose Luis Rodriguez for failing to see it coming.

And now Rajoy, who didn't see the Catalan car crash coming or take seriously its effects on the economy, has created more problems with his habitual passive-aggressive response.

Venomous creatures in Spain

TOP 5

SPAIN is home to a host of varying wildlife but not all of it is cute and cuddly. This week we look at the country's top five venomous creatures.

1. Fire Salamander

One of Europe's most common species of salamander, it can discharge a poison through its skin which is potentially very dangerous to humans. Affecting all vertebrates (species with a spine) the toxin it secretes can cause muscle convulsions and hypertension as well as hyperventilation.

The salamanders are usually black with yellow markings though some can be almost all black or yellow or bits of red. Mainly dwelling in forests and hilly areas, their diet generally consists of insects, spiders, earthworms and slugs.

Adults can grow up to 25 centimetres long.

2. Processionary Pine Caterpillars

Infamous among Spanish residents for causing fatal injuries to dogs, they also pose a threat to hu-

mans, especially children and the elderly.

Their hairs are poisonous and cause great swelling and irritation.

The eggs are laid by moths in pine trees which soon become silk, cocoon-like nests. The caterpillars eat the pine needles and eventually move on to a new tree, following each other in a line which is where they get their name from.

More commonly sighted in early spring as the weather heats up, the best way to deal with their nests is to burn them as any contact with their hairs can be highly hazardous.

3. Mediterranean Tiger Centipede

The largest centipede in Europe, it can grow up to 150 millimetres in length. It has varying markings but usually they are yellow with

black stripes which is where the 'tiger' name comes from.

They are nocturnal and can deal an extremely painful bite, which can be very dangerous if the individual is allergic to the venom. Those bitten are advised to seek medical attention.

An opportunistic carnivore, the multi-legged insect will attack and consume virtually any animal that is not larger than itself including a variety of insects, small lizards and mice.

4. False Black Widow Spider

The false widow is a medium-sized spider with a round, brown body and cream coloured markings.

Its legs are a blend of red and orange colour. Females range in size from 9.5 to 14 millimetres

while males are 7 to 11mm. The spider's body and legs will have a glossy appearance. The species closely resembles the black widow spider, apart from its colouring.

5. Asp Viper

Achieving worldwide renown thanks to Shakespeare, this member of the cobra family is capable of injecting a venom that can stop the heart.

Those bitten are advised by medical experts to seek medical aid immediately and attacks can be anticipated by head jerking and hissing. They can grow up to 80 centimetres in length and are mainly thought to dwell close to the Pyrenees. Males are grey in colour with black stripes.

Females can be grey or brown and also have the stripes but they are less prominent.

Their heads are triangular and they have slightly upturned noses.

They feed mainly on rodents, lizards and birds, laying in wait and surprising their prey.

Steps to a healthier life

THERE are a lot of myths around the benefits of taking 10,000 steps a day. However, getting daily exercise is actually just as important for our health as eating well and drinking eight glasses of water.

Ten thousand steps may seem like an impossible target to reach, but with the help of a pedometer you will soon see how quickly the numbers add up.

The amount of steps you walk a day can also vary greatly on where you live, and how much you need to use a car or public transport in your day to day life. Adults in the US, for example, only walk an average of 5,000 steps while the figure is nearly double that in Australia.

Boosting how much you walk a day by just a small amount could have a significant impact on your health, however, and can reduce the likelihood of developing illnesses such as diabetes and cancer.

One study found women who increase their step count to 10,000 steps a day reduced their blood pressure after just 24 weeks. Another discovered that it helped to improve glucose levels. It also decreases hypertension in the body, which reduces the risk of heart attacks and strokes.

Increasing your step count could also have more short-term benefits. Walking regularly increases balance and endurance and also helps to reduce fatigue - which could result in getting a better night's sleep. It has also been proven to enhance the mood and battle the effects of depression as regular exercise helps to reduce stress and can act as a form of meditation.

Walking more could even make you smarter as it increases the blood flow to the brain.

If your average amount of steps is just 5,000 a day, getting an extra 30-minute walk in will take you to about 8,000 steps. However the more steps you can do, the better.

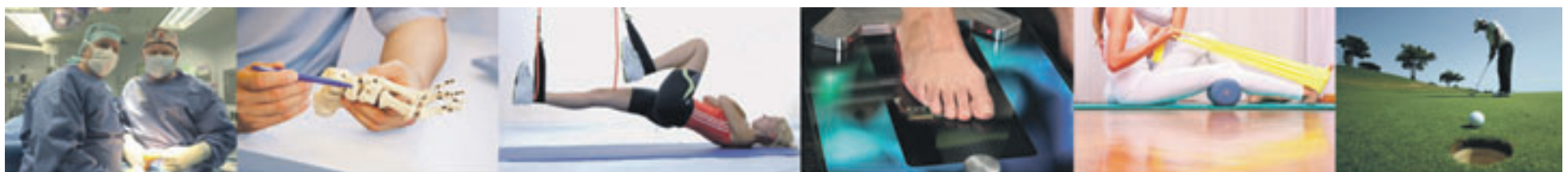

Poor posture

POOR posture results from certain muscles tightening up or shortening while others lengthen and become weak, which often occurs as a result of one's daily activities. There are different factors which can impact on posture, and these include occupational activities and biomechanical factors such as force and repetition. Workers who have higher job stress are more likely to develop neck and shoulder symptoms.

What long and short-term effects can an incorrect posture have?

Correct sitting and walking posture is essential in keeping our spine and other joints healthy. In fact, adopting an incorrect posture can cause problems in both the short and long-term. It can start with backaches and muscle spasms but over time can develop into much more severe disorders such as hernias and slipped discs.

What posture is recommended for office workers who sit for prolonged periods of time? Office workers or people who are sitting for long periods of time must maintain a posture in which the back is as straight as possible, if possible, with a proper chair

that helps support this. It is also recommended to move your legs regularly and to stand up often to stretch both the back and legs.

Are there any exercises that can be done to improve posture?

The first thing is to maintain proper posture so it is less likely complications will occur. Any exercises to strengthen the back muscles will also help to prevent injuries.

Can poor posture be associated with older people taking falls?

Older people lose muscle mass and tone so this often causes them to have a bad sitting posture, causing back problems. In advanced and severe cases this can cause the elderly to have frequent falls.

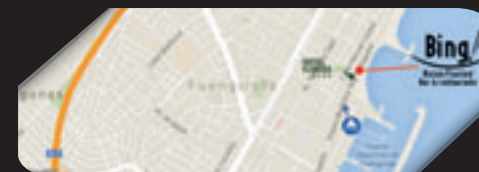

IN this new weekly series Lorenzo Barbareschi will provide thoughts on various wines, not just from Spain, and not only those enjoyed, but a few better kept perhaps for cooking or Sangria. But as a starter, first he peeps back in time.

History that spans over 3,000 years

SPAIN'S wine heritage dates back to the Phoenicians who planted the first vineyards in 1100 BC when founding the trading post of Cadiz in Andalucia at least 3,000 years ago.

The Romans also traded throughout the empire wines produced along the Mediterranean and cooler Atlantic coasts.

In 711 AD the Islamic Moors arrival put an end to wine production and commerce for nearly 800 years, but once freed in 1492 AD from Islamic rule wine production re-flourished, with exports to colonies in South America as well as to Henry VIII's court.

In the 20th century the Spanish Civil War and Second World War badly affected exports, but the wine industry then regained momentum, though with the exception of Rioja and Sherry, Spanish wines did not gain global popularity till the later 1900s.

Spain is now the world's third biggest wine producer, topped only by France and Italy.

An estimated 400 plus grape varieties are planted throughout Spain although 80 per cent

of production is derived from just 20 types, the most popular reds being Tempranillo, Garnacha, Monastrell, and Carinena, while Albarino, Palomino, Airen, Macabeo, Verdejo, Pedro and Ximenez are the favoured whites.

Meanwhile for cava production Parellada, Xarel-lo and Macabeo lead the way!

Fan Palms - fast growing palms for your Mediterranean garden or terrace

THE Mediterranean look for a garden is not complete without a palm tree.

They are symbols of the promise of warm, balmy nights and bright, sunny days. They take up very little ground space as they grow straight up and are ideal to make pool areas and gardens look more inviting.

Fan palms are very fast growing but require little maintenance as they hold on to spent leaves; so provide few problems in the pool or garden from constant small falling debris. They may need specialised care once they become very tall to prune the spent leaves, but it is usually only an annual or biannual event in a domestic garden.

There are two commonly grown types of fan palm. The Mexican Fan Palm, *Washingtonia robusta*, and the Californian Fan Palm, *Washingtonia filifera*, that have slightly different characteristics that are worth

knowing about.

The Mexican fan palm is faster and taller growing (30m), with leaves of about one metre that are densely grouped and sway more, when fully grown, in strong winds. The California

fan palm is slower growing (20m), with larger leaves of about 1.5 metres that are sparsely grouped, and more stable in high winds. Despite concerns for the palm's height when mature, these palms

rarely fall over even in very high winds due to its structure that gives it much greater strength than other trees.

Both palms are drought-tolerant but the Californian one is more so. It will tolerate even desert conditions so no watering is necessary once established, but it is less tolerant of humid conditions.

The Mexican one will survive better in places with higher rainfall or around the edges of natural ponds where there is a lot of ground water and it tolerates humidity better.

Fertilising is not generally recommended unless your soil is very low in nutrients or if you wish to make the palm grow very fast as they require only a minimum of nutrients to grow well. To establish you can use soluble fertilisers applied

when watering to ensure they are well established during their first summer.

They can both be grown in strong containers on your terrace or balcony using an ordinary potting mixture but they will need some watering over summer, as the soil can dry out quickly in a container. They should not be watered over winter, unless they receive no rainfall and the soil mix becomes too dry.

The invasive palm beetle that has devastated the unprotected Canary Island palms does not seem to bother the *Washingtonia* so much. It may be worth checking with your local agricultural office on the current procedures for protecting palms in your region if you wish to grow some palms in your garden.

Rocking a rockery

A FANTASTIC feature in all gardens, but especially those in dry climates, rockeries are easy to build and are great opportunities to get the creative juices flowing.

You can choose from a huge array of rock and plants to include, depending on your taste and what would work well in the garden.

It is a good idea to start building a rockery when the weather is a bit cooler as it is heavy work and causes unnecessary strain under the hot sun.

A sunny, well-drained patch of the garden is the best place to start building and if you have a slope of a mount this is even

better as it will give your garden an 'au-natural' appearance.

The best types of rocks to use tend to be volcanic rock, sandstone and granite. While some people prefer natural shaped rocks, cut blocks can also create interesting dimensions in the garden.

Always make sure you handle the rocks carefully and enlist the help of friends or a wheelbarrow if the rocks are particularly heavy.

Plants that grow well in rockeries are those that are happy in dry conditions, such as cacti, bulbs, succulents and flowering plants. Mosses and lichens that grow on rocks also provide an extra layer of colour and dimension.

FOR a colourful garden all year round, gardeners are turning to 'foliage plants' which keep things looking fresh and vibrant.

One of the most eye-catching varieties out there is the canna plant, which adds a touch of tropical flair to any garden

Enliven your dull garden

and comes in a variety of colours. They have large banana-like leaves that are sometimes striped and many produce eye-catching bursts of flowers.

Angel wings, or caladi-

ums, have a very unique look with grand, spade-shaped leaves that can be bought in eye-catching combinations of green, pink, red and white. They are actually tropical

plants, so flourish in warmer climates.

The leaves of Persian Shield, or *Strobilanthes*, have green and purple leaves that almost seem to glow in shady spaces.

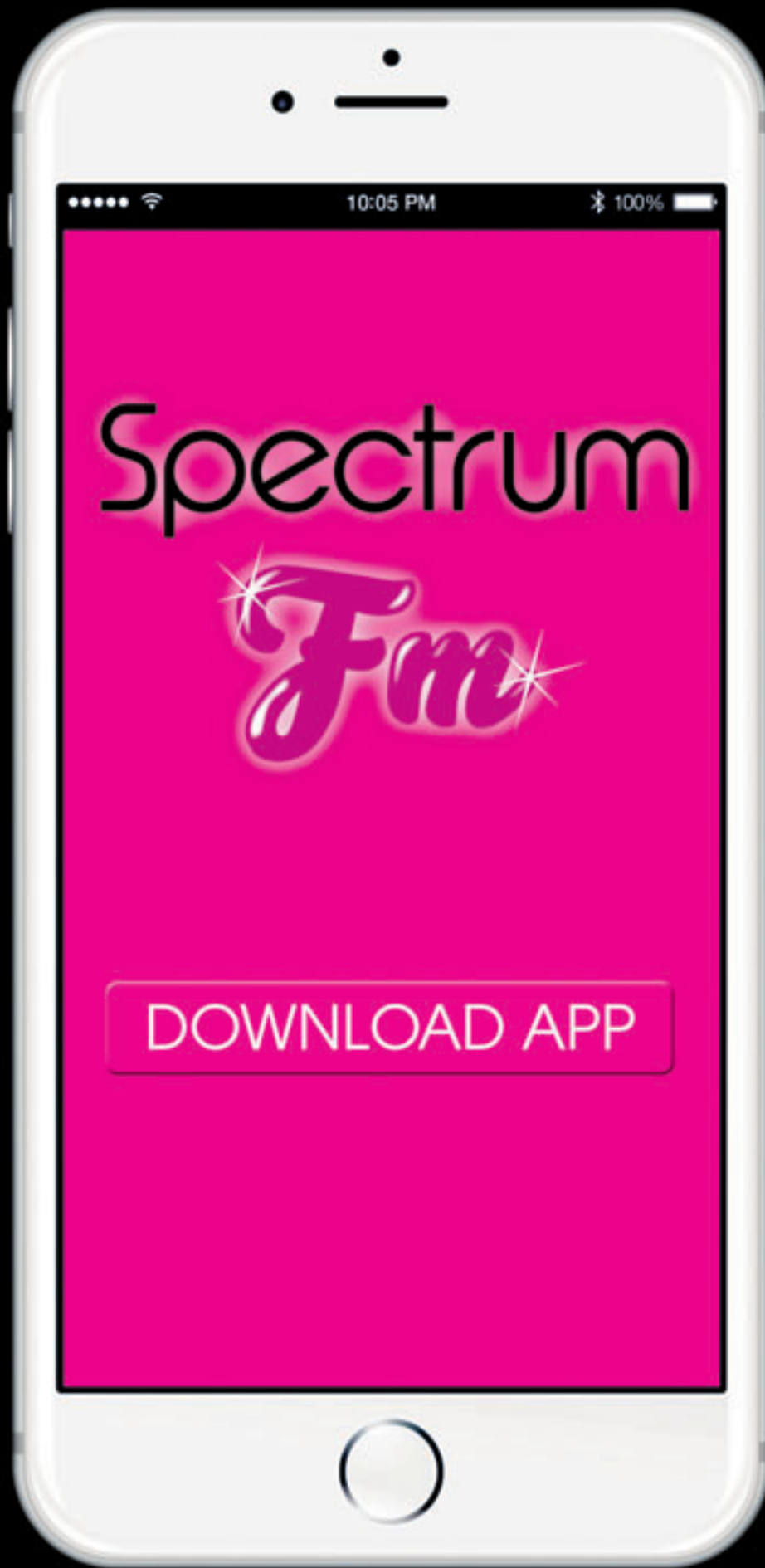

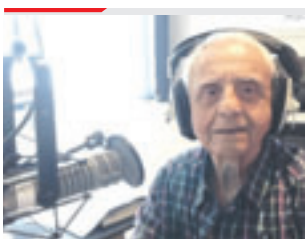

THE FEMALE:

Bitches are more affectionate and easier to control than the male dog. They are roughly 30 per cent smaller and, whatever their breed, tend to be gentler with children.

The bitch will come into season about every six months and this will last for around three weeks. The female is receptive to mating and extremely attractive to dogs that will instinctively try to mate with her.

A good clear sign that a bitch is coming into 'season' is that she will produce a discharge; initially a blood stain, that will be deposited wherever she sits or lays. She will spend a great

deal of time licking her vagina.

Be assured that your home will attract the local male dogs that will camp outside your home for about three weeks. Expect howling throughout the night to attract her attention.

The female will attempt to escape at the first possible opportunity so it is wise to keep all doors closed and secure, especially when greeting your guests. I have known bitches that have chewed their way through doors during the night to get to the male dogs.

Do not underestimate the great heights that male dogs can climb and jump to reach a bitch on heat. During this period it is well-known that the male dog can be extremely aggressive and may well attack you if you try to send him away.

If you are not going to breed from your bitch it is best to consider having her neutered a few months before her first season. Veterinary Colleges have endless scientific proof that the female will live longer and the likelihood of mammary tumours is negligible. She will certainly not put on weight.

THE MALE:

Male dogs, whatever their breed,

tend to be more dominant than the female. The adult male has an instinctive urge to escape and wander free from home for periods ranging from an hour to several days or weeks.

Often a clear sign of a dominant male, although house-trained, will show when he starts to lift his leg in the house and urinate on walls and furniture. He does this to scent-mark his territory and to affirm his domi-

nant status. This type of dog should be castrated.

Owners of dominant dogs should spend time reinforcing their own dominance and insisting on absolute obedience. This can be achieved through a training club where you can learn how to control the dominant male when he meets another dominant male dog.

Dogs that are confined and not al-

lowed to roam can develop sexual frustration and will mount the human leg and even mount children who crawl on the floor. This is intolerable and very dangerous to a child.

The best way to deal with this is to discuss the problem in an honest way with the vet who might consider either using a female hormone to try to counteract the condition or to castrate the dog.

I personally recommend castration for all dogs that are not to be used for breeding purposes. A castrated dog is happy and free from worry and frustration.

He will be more pleasant to have around, less likely to fight other males and more submissive to the wishes of the human pack leader. By having a dog castrated in no way alters any other instincts. He will guard, hunt, work, and retrieve.

The best time to castrate a male dog is around five to six months before he starts to lift his leg. Your vet will advise when your dog is suitable for this minor operation. Within 24 hours your dog will have fully recovered from the operation.





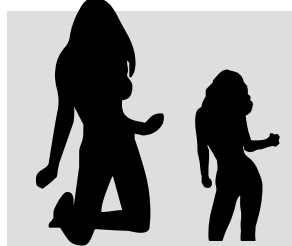

Trippy crossings

AN Icelandic company has created a unique 3D zebra crossing. Vegamalun wants to bring the innovative idea to the streets of Europe, after it successfully debuted in China and India.

The ‘3D’ crossing actually employs a clever optical illusion by painting the white strips in 3D paint. It isn’t actually a hologram but works in a similar way, giving approaching drivers the impression that the crossing is three-dimensional.

That alone is psychedelic enough to get drivers to slow down and pay attention. If the trial works well in Iceland, a country not known for its wild driving, then tech firms across Europe are bound to take notice.

Porsche power redefined

by Matthew Elliott

CONSIDERED one of the most powerful sports cars on the planet, the Porsche Sport Turismo is becoming a plug-in hybrid. The German manufacturer’s new Panamera Turbo SE Hybrid Sport Turismo combines an electric motor with a monstrous four-litre V8 engine.

It will generate 680bhp, do 0-100kph in just 3.4 seconds, and hit a top speed of 310km/h with ease. The Hybrid Panamera also boasts incredible fuel efficiency of 3.0l/100km and a power consumption of 17.6kWh/100km.

Using only the electric motor it has a range of 49km at a top-speed of 140km/h. The battery can be fully charged in under three hours.

The engineering marvels extend to the design. There is a full-

ly-digitised

Porsche Advanced Cockpit, which allows adaptive cruise-control and rear-axle steering.

The rear-spoiler can change between three settings, going into the aerodynamic performance

position automatically at speeds over 170km/h. Turbulence at high speed is minimised by automatic streamlining.

Inside there is 425 litres of

storage space and much more comfort than might be expected from such a high-performance car. There are three rear seats, two of which are electrically adjustable. When the seats are folded down total storage space ex-

pands to 1,295 litres.

The Panamera Turbo SE Hybrid Sport Turismo is now available for orders. The full package with power steering and dynamic chassis control starts at €188,592 in Germany.

ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

WHILE the VW Golf and Vauxhall Astra dominate the family hatchback class, there are other worthy contenders who are often overlooked, perhaps most notably the Hyundai i30.

The i30 is well-built, well-equipped, pleasing to drive and comes with a five-year unlimited mileage warranty, so the overall package ticks most of the boxes for would-be buyers in this hard-fought sector. Prices start at €19,334 (£16,995) but you need to move up a notch or two to get extras including parking sensors, sat-nav and connectivity features.

My test model was the top-spec Premium SE 1.4-litre petrol version which has all those features plus 17-inch alloys, powered driver's seat, part-leather upholstery, climate-control, cruise-control, auto lights and wipers, sunroof, rear-camera, touchscreen and a lot of safety kit including lane departure and rear cross-traffic warnings. You also get puddle-lights and chrome detailing. Overall, it's a great spec but does hike up the price to €27,576 (£24,240).

The 138bhp engine is smooth and responsive and delivers a sprightly 0-100 km/h in 8.9 seconds, has a top speed of 209 km/h (130 mph) and fuel economy of 18.5L/100km (52.3 mpg).

On the road, the i30 performs well. A six-speed manual gearbox is standard and is slick and efficient, and while the steering could provide more feedback, there is still plenty of

grip and the ride is very comfortable, especially on longer trips.

Cabin accommodation is good, with head and legroom for all but the tallest rear occupants. The boot, at 350 litres, is larger than those of the Golf and Astra, and with rear seats folded - a neat one-touch action - you are getting a whopping 1,301 litres. The dashboard has a logical layout with dials and controls in-vision and within easy reach.

The i30 has been specially designed for the European market and its smart new look is more noticeable than the rather staid appearance

of some of its main rivals. It should be on the short-list of anyone in the market for a new family hatchback. It impresses as a safe and dependable car and anyone who checks one out will be surprised at how good it looks close-up, and also how much kit it offers. Plus, as a bonus, its five-year warranty beats all its main rivals.

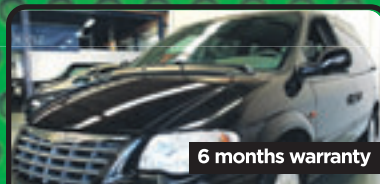

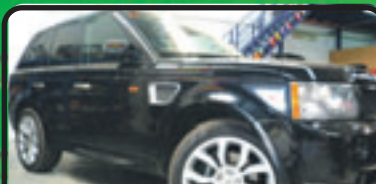

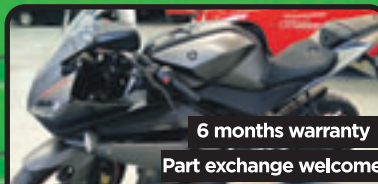

Lean, green, Dyson machine

VACUUM company Dyson is set to invade the motoring market with an audacious multi-billion investment in a new electric car to hit the streets in 2020.

Sir James Dyson, the man who transformed British carpets with his vacuum cleaner 30 years ago, has harboured a grudge against the motoring world for decades.

In the 1990s car firms refused to use his specially-devised emission-reducing exhaust pipes. The 70-year-old entrepreneur has a green streak in his blood and has been planning to build his very own eco-friendly car ever since.

He believes Dyson's battery expertise, drawn from its advanced collection of hoovers, heaters and hand dryers. "There's no point in doing one like everybody else's," he said when pressed on the design.

Lorry cartel smashed

A VOLKSWAGEN-owned lorry firm was fined almost €1 billion for price fixing. Scania is on the verge of bankruptcy after being slapped with the €880 penalty by the European Commission.

Judges found that Scania and five subsidiaries of Daimler, Iveco, Volvo, Renault and MAN, conspired for almost 20 years to fix lorry prices.

They also worked together to avoid paying for expensive emissions-reducing technology. The five other companies admitted fault and settled with the commission. But Scania protested its innocence and was punished by judges.

Fines totalling €3.8 billion have been imposed on the cartel.

England chief's heart to Hart with stopper Joe

ENGLAND'S 2018 World Cup qualifying Group F campaign continues on October 5 with a Wembley fixture against Slovenia ahead of a trip to Lithuania on October 8 - with manager Gareth Southgate backing Joe Hart.

"We owed Joe Hart for getting a point against Slovenia in October 2016 - he was fantastic," said Southgate.

England top the six-team Group F table, with 20 points from eight games going into the game against Slovenia, having been held to a goalless draw when the teams last met.

Hart, on loan at West Ham from Manchester City, said of his club future: "I was in Italy all last season. I love being at West Ham and I'm

Hart has been criticised for his errors in recent seasons -

for both club and country - but Southgate has stood by him.

"When Joe is calm and composed he's at his best - it's something we've discussed," said Southgate, who

replaced sacked Sam Allardyce as national manager.

Manchester City midfielder Fabian Delph has been named in England's 26-man squad for the World Cup qualifiers against Slovenia and Lithuania.

Delph has not made an international appearance since the 2-0 defeat against Spain in November 2015: "We think he's a really good player who has been unfortunate with injury," said Southgate.

England were less than impressive - despite chalking up victory on September 1 - against Malta, in what was a very late landslide 4-0 win, with boos coming from sections of the crowd. Malta are rated 190th in the world by FIFA.

Against Slovakia England ground out a 2-1 win, having trailed 1-0. England will qualify for next summer's World Cup in Russia if they beat Slovenia; or if they draw and Slovakia, their closest challengers in Group F, fail to win.

Southgate visited Russia for a World Cup 'research trip' in June, with England making the trip to view training bases.

Germany, Belgium, Sweden and Brazil had arranged earlier trips in a bid to book the best venues.

While the FA see St Petersburg and Moscow as preferred locations, other countries are looking at training facilities in Sochi and Rostov, citing a more predictable climate.

The FA will want to avoid Grozny, the capital of Chechnya, listed by FIFA as a potential team base camp, one of 23 bases on offer in and around Moscow.

The 2018 World Cup draw is scheduled to take place in the Kremlin on December 1, this year.

leaders Germany in Group C; in Group F Scotland host Slovakia on October 5; in Group D Wales travel to Georgia, the Republic of Ireland host Moldova, and Group G leaders Spain meet Albania on October 6.

Scotland boosted their 2018 World Cup qualifying hopes with victories against Lithuania and Malta in September and my pal, former Scotland chief Craig Brown, has backed national coach Gordon Strachan to take his Bravehearts to Russia.

With Scotland facing Slovakia and Slovenia in their final two qualifying games, Brown said: "The way Scotland are playing indicates

Rico Perez stadium Alicante host Spain v Albania 2018 World Cup qualifier

SPAIN return to the Rico Perez stadium in Alicante to host Albania on Friday October 6 in a 2018 World Cup qualifier ahead of travelling to Israel on Monday October 9.

Spain defeated Italy in their Group G qualifier in September with a 3-0 World Cup qualifying win in Madrid, a result which leaves four-time Champions Italy facing a play-off spot in November to go to Russia.

Spain followed up their 3-0 win against Italy with an emphatic 8-0 thrashing against Liechtenstein in September.

Italy, who face Macedonia and Albania in October, had to qualify via the play-offs to reach the 1998 World Cup in France.

Despite Italy's woes veteran goalkeeper Gianluigi Buffon said: "We believe - and hope - to go to the World Cup in Russia."

Spain's coach Julen Lopetegui, who succeeded Vicente Del Bosque as national chief 14 months ago, said Real Madrid midfielder Francisco 'Isco' Alarcon is better than ever.

"Isco is playing better than last year, but the trust we place in him is because he has shown he deserves it," said Lopetegui.

Lopetegui said, "Isco's growth as a player goes beyond his talent. He is a different type of player from Andres Iniesta - we can use them together."

A phone call from Angel Maria Villar, President of the Spanish Football Federation, led to Lopetegui being appointed coach of Spain's national team on July 21, 2016.

"When the federation called my objective became the Spanish national team," said Lopetegui.

Spain's goalkeeper David de Gea has backed Lopetegui in their quest to reach the 2018 World Cup: "I know Lopetegui from the Under-21 team," said de Gea.

Manchester United keeper de Gea, linked with a move to Real Madrid for the last two years, said: "He is a great coach and he prepares for matches very well."

Spain's form leaves no doubts that they are heading to the World Cup Russia in 2018 underlined by Isco's - nicknamed 'Magic' - performances.

Added to Isco's talent, coach Lopetegui points to Barca veteran Iniesta, 33: "He makes the difficult things look easy - he is an extraordinary player," said Lopetegui.
