Woman hurt in cliff fall

52-YEAR-OLD woman was seriously injured after plummeting four metres down a cliff in Alicante.

The incident happened in the popular cove of Cabo de Huertas for reasons that continue to be investigated.

Bathers raised the alarm and paramedics arrived on the scene to treat the victim.

According to information from the Emergency Information and Coordination Centre (CICU), she was treated at the scene before being taken to the Alicante General Hospital with severe head injuries.

It was later revealed that the injured woman had suffered from a brain injury and remains in intensive



Killer on trial

35yr demand for car thief

A man could be sentenced to 35 years in prison for killing two people when driving two separate stolen vehicles.

The prosecutors in this case have also asked for a fine of €1.620 against the Moroccanborn defendant who has been accused of killing a cyclist and a pedestrian over a period of four days.

The events leading to this case happened in Mazarron when the man - named as Abdelwahab O - hit a group of three cyclists, killing one of them and causing severe injuries to one of their companions. Only four days later, according to the prosecution, he hit a woman pedestrian who was walking along the road in the municipality of Totana who suffered such serious injuries that she died 30 minutes later.

The prosecution have explained to the court that the accused man had carried out these attacks on the two deceased people for no apparent reason as he had no connection with any of the victims.

In addition to the long custodial sentence and the fine, the prosecution are also seeking a compensation payout to the injured cyclist who was accompanying the first victim when they were struck and killed.

No escape for illegal holiday renters

FOLLOWING a dedicated campaign throughout the months of July and August in Murcia, a number of 29 companies have been identified as working in the black tourist economy.

With a combination of a series of visits to selected establishments through various internet portals dedicated to renting, a total of 548 separate properties were regularised during the first eight months of the year; somewhat short of the 750 target that had been set.

During July and August, the exercise discovered 170 properties of which 52 have now been legalised, and also discovered that a large number of the companies dedicated to renting out tourist accommodation aren't even the owners of the dwellings.

This has made the legalising process that much tougher as the real owners are sought out.

A result of the inspections has been to impose the removal of all publicity relating to the illegally rented accommodation as

it's breaking the law. It also means that if the owner cannot be traced, it will prove impossible for the property to be rented out and for others to make a profit from it.

During 2016, inspectors were able to legalise 1,213 properties throughout the Murcia region meaning that in just 20 months and including the results of the recent exercise, a total of 1,800 were being illegally

Homeless shelter faces axe

THE city council of Elche has begun a demolition programme of the abandoned Hort del Gat used as a shelter by a number of homeless people.

A total of €15.000 has been invested in the project in advance of a final decision as to the future of the building that has already seen a considerable amount of items removed.

Mattresses blankets. clothes, bags of food, and a large amount of accumulated rubbish was taken away in the first day of the clean-up and demolition of part of the building that was believed to be home to around a dozen homeless people and rough-sleepers.

Many of those using the building left of their own accord. Among the items removed were a number of syringes; a team also entered dressed in specialist clothing to remove asbestos from a roof.

The Hort del Gat is located in the centre of the famous Elche palm tree park and has suffered a number of damages caused by vandals over recent years when it was closed down, as well as a number

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...33

Spain is the second most mountainous European country after Switzerland, and is also home to one of its most active volcanoes.



Mountain high and totally breathtaking!

SPAIN was once described as "just one big mountain," and although a tongue in cheek comment by a 19th century English travel writer, the nation does possess an extensive and rugged landscape.

With five main mountain ranges - the Sistema Central, the Cordillera Cantabrica, the Pyrenees, the Cordillera Subbetica and the Sierra Morena - more than 20 per cent of the country's land is 1,000 metres or more above sea level. The individual daddy of them all, though not on the mainland, is Mount Teide, in Tenerife on the Canary Islands,

More than 3,700 metres high, Teide is the country's most visited natural attraction and the highest - and still active volcano in the world outside Hawaii when measured from peak to ocean floor.

Teide last erupted in 1909 but it is still rated as being unstable leading many to speculate an eruption is imminent.

A study eight years ago by Granada University found that Teide is likely to violently erupt and the International Association of Volcanology also labelled it a 'decade volcano,' one with a destructive history that is close to populated areas.

The highest mountain peak on mainland Spain is Mulhacen, at more than 3,400 metres, just over two hour's drive from Granada in the Sierra Nevada range.

Not only does the Sierra Nevada offer opportunities to do extreme sports, but it is also a popular ski resort.

Larrun, at nearly 1,000 metres, was used by the French troops when they sought shelter from Wellington's forces during the 19th century Peninsular War.

Many interesting sights can be found sky-high including St Mary's church on Mount Naranco and the Montserrat monastery in Cataluña, which is more than 1,000-years-old.





Serial bank robber facing five years

PROSECUTORS are seeking five years imprisonment for a man accused of a series of bank robberies over a number of years.

During a four-year period, seven banks located in Alicante and Murcia were robbed at the point of a gun and suffered losses amounting to more than €350,000. A man was arrested in May of this year in Hondón de los Frailes suspected of being the perpetrator and his court case has recently begun in Alicante.

He's a well-known fruit trader in the vicinity. Specifically, the prison sentence is being requested for the robbery committed at a bank branch in Monforte del Cid where €54,000 was stolen.

This original attack occurred back in June 2014 when the Banco de Santander was about to close. The accused then entered the premises with a gun that had been hidden in his right trouser leg which he then waved in front of the bank's employees before locking them in the manager's office accompanied by verbal threats as to their fate should they raise the alarm.

The robber gained access to the safe and placed the stolen money in a black plastic rubbish sack before fleeing the premises. The bank staff managed to escape shortly afterwards and were

able to raise the alarm.

In addition to charges of crimes of robbery with violence using firearms, the defendant also faces trial for the possession of guns for which he had no licence. During a search of the house of the accused man, Guardia Civil officers found two revolvers - one a Smith & Wesson and the other a Magnum - three boxes of ammunition, balaclavas and hoods and other items used to carry out the bank robberies.

Cruel animal abuser escapes jail sentence

A MAN that admitted in court that he stabbed a dog has avoided being sent to prison as he has no previous record. Instead, he has been required to pay €9,000 compensation.

The case is connected with an incident that took place almost two years ago in November 2015, when the man attacked a dog, named Zarpas that was kept in the Murcia Canine Association; a place where dogs are trained to assist in rescue operations.

In addition to stabbing Zarpas, the man - a 51-yearold Spaniard - also admitted to abandoning another dog named Kazan, close to a main road. A local found the dog wandering the streets in Roldan.


National Police officers began taking an interest in the case in January 2016 when alleged disagreements

and arguments were reportedly taking place between the accused and his previous business partners, and he attacked and mistreated the dogs as a form of revenge.

The man was arrested for the crimes of animal abuse and one of robbery with force. In addition to his mistreatment of the dogs, it's alleged that he also damaged the premises of the association and stole items from the building.

The accused man was facing a custodial sentence of one year and seven months. but it's understood that because he admitted his guilt and his previous unblemished record - the sentence was re-

Zarpas, the stabbed dog, made a full recovery from his ordeal and was already a hero on four legs beforehand, having taken part in the search for people trapped under rubble following the Lorca earthquake in 2011.

Shook up... again

RESIDENTS of Murcia were sharply woken up on Saturday morning by the second earthquake to hit the city in the space of a week.

The latest tremor - measuring 2.7 degrees on the Richter scale - had its epicentre just outside the capital city itself at a depth of 12 kilometres and shook the area just before 9am.

The earthquake was strong enough to worry several locals to call the 112 emergency number, especially from the areas of Los Garres y Lages, El Palmar and Alcantarilla. The specific location of the epicentre was in the Murcian village of Corvera, south of La Alberca.

Two days earlier, a 1.9 strength quake was felt in the same area at 12.20am.

Galician disaster

AFTER the terrible news of the wildfires devastating parts of California and killing at least 41, things have moved closer to home with four killed in Galician fires

It appears that at least some of those fires were started by arsonists and that they have been made worse by strong winds hitting the coast of Spain due to the fallout from Storm Ophelia.

Fire brigades in the region have found it incredibly difficult to cope with more than 100 separate active fires and this problem has been made worse by the fact that many brigades have laid off firefighters now that the dangerous summer period was thought to have passed.

Prime Minister Rajoy travelled to his home province as a show of support for those who had been affected by the fires and to grieve alongside the families of a 78-year-old man who died trying to protect his animals and a 70-year-old man who was fighting the fires near his home in Vigo.

Two bodies were also discovered in a burnt out car but at the time of writing the victims had not been identified.

Our hearts and best wishes must go out to all of those affected by these fires and those in the emergency services fighting them.

We hope however that if any of these fires have been started deliberately that those responsible realise the pain and suffering that they have caused.

A NURSE from the Hospital Virgen de la Arrixaca in Murcia has ended up in the operating room herself after suffering injuries as a result of a robbery in the building.

The events happened at 4.30am one morning when a middle-aged man was spotted in the nurses control station on the third floor of the Arrixaca Hospital stealing two bags belonging to members of staff.

As the man tried to escape he became aware he'd been seen as one of the nurses began to chase him down the stairs. She eventually caught up with him and during a struggle she suffered a heavy fall and fractured a tibia and fibula and dislocating an ankle, all of which required surgery.

Nursing union representative, Juan Antonio Garrigós, has commented on the alleged lack of security at the hospital during the night shift, which makes members of staff more exposed to these and more serious incidents.

For this reason, he has requested an urgent meeting to address the issues as soon as possible.

Storm damage cleared before influx

TO prepare for the arrival of thousands of extra visitors during the two recent Spanish regional and national holidays, a total of 15 tons of sand were removed from the roads and pavements around Los Arenales

The higher than normal amount of sand in the area had been caused by the local storms that damaged the beaches and their surroundings, and needed extra working hours to clean up the aftermath.

Up to four municipal vehicles were needed

to prepare the streets for the arrival of locals and tourists for the two October holidays.

Heavy rain dumped 20 litres of water per square metre and caused major traffic delays in the municipality, caused not only by flood water but the build up of sand and small stones that had been washed in during the storm.

The force of the rain also broke or tore away a number of water pipes used for washing the feet of beachgoers, and one of the wooden access paths was also badly damaged.







Researchers state the need for storms

THE Mar Menor is facing an ecological disaster if there is a lack of heavy rain and winds during the course of this winter. Anything other than a sustained amount of these weather conditions would prove detrimental to its recovery.

These are warnings that have been made by a researcher from the Polytechnic University of Cartagena (UP-CT), Francisco Lopez Castejon, who said that levels of water and salt in the Mar Menor are at worrying levels and a change in atmospheric pressures and a number of heavy storms are key to the adequate renovation of the iconic lagoon.

During his presentation,

Government may put restrictions on water

UNLESS there is a significant amount of rainfall in the coming months leading up to the end of the calendar year, the government hasn't ruled out the possibility of bringing in water restrictions during 2018.

This is due to reservoirs being at their lowest levels since the turn of the century, and the worst since 1990.

A government spokesman acknowledged that the water supply could be guaranteed until the end of 2017 but that "wa-

ter use will probably have to be limited as from next year if the current drought conditions continue."

The statement was made in the Spanish Senate by the Minister for Agriculture, Food and Fisheries and Environment where he went on to assure people that the government is always looking ahead to be able to react to all possible scenarios that include the severe drought conditions in the Júcar, Segura and Duero reservoirs that sup-

ply much of the Costa Blanca and Costa Calida.

The lack of rainfall in the official hydrological year of 2016 / 17 ended on September 30 with a 15 per cent deficit. The new year that began on October 1 registered, in its first week, rainfall of 95 per cent lower than what would be expected at the time of year. According to the Spanish Meteorological Agency (AEMET), six litres per square metre is expected to fall compared to the one litre in reality.

No new tax office planned

ANYONE living in Torrevieja that was hoping to be able to resolve any of their tax problems locally will be disappointed with the latest decision taken by central government.

Spokesman for the political party Compromis based in the Senate in Madrid, Carles Mulet, raised a formal question in the House to ask why locals need to go to Orihuela City for their nearest tax office - the only

one in the region - when a virtually vacant Social Security office has been operating in Torrevieja since being built in 2011.

Highlighting the fact that Torrevieja has had more than 100,000 people officially registered - a figure that is now closer to 86,000 - and that there have been long-held plans to locate a branch of the Agencia Tributaria (AEAT), Mulet asked as to what the government

are planning to do.

The official reply was that the government has a commitment, through the Tax Agency, to bring in new technologies and has such reduced the numbers of people needing to visit their network of offices to resolve their problems. They further stated that anybody finding it difficult to get to Orihuela should log on to the official website in an attempt to solve issues at www.agenciatributaria.gob.es.



Home tech lesson for patients and carers

ALICANTE'S San Juan Hospital has hosted a training meeting for patients and their families that rely on using mechanical ventilators at home.

Numbers of patients suffering from severe respiratory diseases or neuromuscular disorders that don't require hospital stays and instead are treated at home are increasing.

This latest initiative, thanks to the collaboration of a number of health associations and the University Hospital itself, was the latest in a series of activities acknowledging that 2017 has been declared the year of respiratory challenges.

Around 25 people, patients and their carers who use the home ventilators. attended the meeting where specialists explained how the current technology al-

lows such treatment to take place in the patient's home and thus contributes to reducing hospital admissions and out-patient consulta-

However, the possibility of using such equipment in the home requires a certain amount of basic training for both patients and those looking after them so they

can cope with any problems that arise and thus guarantee the patient's quality of life.

Throughout Spain, around 23,000 people are treated using home ventilators either as non-invasive - with a simple mask covering the nose and mouth or invasive via a tracheoto-



Passenger numbers still flying high



GROWING: Tourists from the UK continue to dominate airport figures

FIGURES released by airport operators AENA showed that passenger numbers are once again at record levels for Alicante-Elche Airport.

For the month of September, airport registered 1,437,449 passengers representing an increase of 10.9 per cent when compared to the same month last year.

Taking 2017 as a whole, the total number of passengers until September 30 has broken through the 10 million barrier on 10,885,825 and 12.9 per cent up on 12 months ago. Those almost 11 million people travelled on 74,853 flights and an increase of 11.3 per cent year-on-year.

Looking at the nationalities of the airport passengers, those from the UK led the way with 650,384 passengers followed by Spain (115,310); Germany

(94,752); Holland (94,064); Norway (70,333); and Belgium (62.190).

In terms of operations, Alicante-Elche Airport dealt with 9,391 flights in September, an increase of 7.5 per cent over the same month in 2016, of which 3.827 were to and from the UK, Spain (1,227), Holland (567), Germany (557), Norway (429), Belgium (394) and Sweden (324).

Port moves into the top four in Spain

A SIGNIFICANT increase in the amount of ships arriving in the port of Cartagena has taken it above Bilbao in terms of the movement of goods.

An average of five ships a day are arriving in Cartagena and according to official data supplied, the port has already reached 22.8 million tons; 600.000 tons more than Bilbao recorded in August, the last month for which figures are available. If that trend continues, Cartagena is on course to break its own record of 31.9 million tons that was achieved during 2016.

Now it has overtaken Bilbao, Cartagena finds itself fourth in Spain and is only headed by the large ports of Barcelona, Valencia and Algeciras.

Compared to last year, the increase in the number of goods has reached 10.37 per cent, with the growth extending into all different kinds of products. Liquid goods increased 11.38 per cent, reaching a record 18 million tons; solid goods increased by 5.75 per cent to reach 3.6 million tons. The remainder accounted for an increase of almost 16.54 per cent at over 1.1 million tons.

An explanation for this growth is due to the fact that company taxes have been reduced by an average of 14 per cent in recent years and has made Cartagena more competitive.

House sales increase for fourth consecutive month



ON THE RISE: Murcia's rate of house sales is more than national average.

FIGURES recently released by the National Statistics Institute (INE) have shown the sale of houses increased by 17.2 per cent in August compared to the same time last year; the last month for which data is available for the Murcia region.

The figures also show an improvement of 11.3 per cent over July.

In Spain as a whole, purchase and sale of housing rose in August by 16 per cent which represented 41,282 operations and the fourth month in succession that such an increase had been recorded. During the first eight months of 2017, house sales increased by 14

Of the transactions regis-

tered in Murcia, 914 corresponded to existing homes while the sale of new builds accounted for 239.







Ryanair to fight Germany

THERE is to be a public spat between Ryanair and the German government over the proposed €210 million sale of parts of Air Berlin to

Air Berlin was the second largest airline in Germany which had a major base in Mallorca and was one of the busiest airlines transporting passengers from different parts of Germany to Palma.

It had been haemorrhaging money for several years and in the end. main shareholder Etihad, the Abu Dhabi-based airline, indicated that it By John Smith

would no longer support Air Berlin and its subsidiaries and the company went into liquidation.

The German government injected €150 million into the company by way of a loan in order to allow it to continue to operate for a short period of time whilst the liquidators negotiated possible sales of assets with interested parties.

It has now been revealed that an agreement has been reached whereby it would purchase the Austrian

leisure travel airline Niki (founded by former racing driver Niki Lauda), the LGW German regional airline and 20 aircraft.

Ryanair is furious and has referred to the agreement as a "stitch-up" orchestrated by the German government in order to strengthen flag carrier Lufthansa and therefore intends to refer the matter to the EU competition authority.

A spokesperson for the German government has however made it clear that it expects the European Commission to approve the deal.

Bouncing pound

THE pound has recovered slightly against the euro following a drop when Chief EU Brexit negotiator Michel Barnier said that no agreement over the 'divorce bill' had been reached.

Without this, it seems highly unlikely that the 27 remaining EU states will agree to any immediate discussion of unfettered access to the EU trade market even though Britain has offered to continue to make contributions during a requested two-year transition period.

Telefonica invests millions

MOVISTAR PLUS LOOKS TO WIN TV AUDIENCE

WHEN it was first launched, Telefonica's Movistar Plus looked as if would be very similar to more mature pay TV operations like Netflix and Amazon but it has been something of a revelation.

Rather than just offer a selection of blockbuster movies and American series, the company has invested large amounts of money in order to produce Spanish orientated transmissions which use national stars and directors acting out well-written stories set in Spain.

In the same way that Scandinavian detective programmes have found an international audience, it looks as if Spain will not be the only country in Europe watching some of these new productions.

BBC4 is running I Know Who You Are, produced by Telecinco but the new big budget Movistar Plus productions promise to really get audiences excited and earn money for their producers.

The Spanish have come to pay TV quite late and initially without a huge amount of enthusiasm but recently an episode of its first big series Velvet Collection attracted the broadcaster's largest audience ever and it even saw more viewers than Game of Thrones.

So confident is the company in its Spanish series that it is currently promoting Velvet Collection alongside The Plague, Giants and La Zona at Mipcom in Cannes, the world's largest market place for the promotion and sale of TV series.

All of these big budget series have high production values with some of the most successful Spanish directors bringing original scripts to TV screens with attractive locations ranging from the Rastro Market in Madrid, to the Pyrenees and 16th century Sevilla.

As Telefonica is such a wealthy company, it can afford to take the

risk of producing such impressive properties in order to not only consolidate the position of its subsidiary within the Spanish pay TV market, but also to try to generate income from sales across the world

One advantage it has is that although the programmes will have to be dubbed for English speaking and European markets, there are some 52 million Spanish speakers in the United States and close to 500 million in Latin and South America, many of whom will enjoy these blockbusters from Spain.

FINANCIAL LIFELINE OR ECONOMIC COLONIALISM China invests in Silk Road

FOR many years, China remained insular except for excursions into Africa but in 2013 it committed €127 billion a year to its 'one belt, one road' initiative.

With 60 nations involved, it is investing in a number of countries who were part of the ancient Silk Road trail which is supplying much needed investment, although also causing some worries as to whether this is invasion by stealth.

A recent forum held in Thessaloniki, Greece highlighted the importance of Chinese investment in that country and indeed in many of the European Union states although the American government fears that this is a form of financial colonialism.

Spain believes that the growth of trade with China is beneficial to both countries especially as the quality of Chinese goods is increasingly high, whilst there is a market for Spanish produce and know-how in China.

The latest trade figures for 2106

show that Spain earned in excess of €5 billion exporting to China and now that there is a direct rail link between Madrid and Yiwu City in Zhejiang Province, trade can only become easier and busier.

There is an added benefit for Spain as it sits opposite Morocco which is a gateway to the North African market as well as an ideal conduit for Chinese products to be sent to Latin

America and vice versa.

Chinese businessmen have been investing in real estate in the country as well as expanding tourist activities with plans for specially built Chinese orientated hotels and holiday centres plus in a smaller way, every town of any size has at least one Chinese Emporium.

The Spanish government has been trying to make it easier for Chinese business people to invest in the country and also for corporations to bring senior staff and their families to Spain by making applications easier.

Spain has relied to a great extent on investment from Britain with a huge influx of tourists and at one time, the settlement of relatively well-off retirees. With the strengthening of the euro and uncertainty for a post Brexit future, it has to look further afield for investment and partnership.

If the past is anything to go by then Spanish trade links with China can only continue to grow.

Inflation on the rise

SEPTEMBER inflation figures show that General Consumer Price Index (CPI) has increased by 1.8 per cent which is 0.2 per cent higher than the August result.

The bulk of the increases are due to higher costs of fruit and vegetables and a minor rise in non-alcoholic

Thanks to the recovering economy, prices of white goods and electrical items have not dropped as much as they did in 2016.

MALLORCAN BUYERS BOYCOT CATALAN GOODS No cava for Christmas

ALTHOUGH there are close historical links between Cataluña and the Balearics, there appears to be a backlash against Catalan products in Mallor-

According to the Federation of Small and Medium-sized Companies of Mallorca (PIMEM), there seems to be a significant number of companies deciding to effectively boycott certain products and the most obvious target is producers of cava.

Traditionally, a bottle of cava is included in Christmas hampers but as two of the major producers Codorniu and Freixenet are Catalan-based it appears that they will feel the pinch as their sparkling wine is dropped from the

A number of Catalan-based companies have already moved their head offices to different provinces but with cava having a Denominacion de Origen contained within Cataluña, a move is unlikely to help.

Amazingly it appears that even brands such as Cola Cao who have their

EWN online Join the conversation on our Facebook page head office in Valencia are suffering as their production centre is in Barcelona and this decision to cut back on the purchase of goods from the province could have far reaching effects, if this antipathy spreads across Spain.

Many clouds do have silver linings however and there are other Spanish regions which produce sparkling wines which are very similar in style and taste to cava, with perhaps the most popular being Rueda Espumoso from Castilla y Leon whilst Italian Prosecco is becoming much more popular in Spain, especially with expatriates.

It seems likely therefore that those

companies importing various foodstuffs and drinks into Mallorca may have to consider obtaining other sources of supply of similar items but without the Catalonian association

In some cases this could be easier said than done, especially in the agricultural sector where a number of long standing agreements exist in such areas as supply of almonds and other nuts from producers based in Tarragon and

Trade bodies representing exporters from Cataluña are anxious to play down the problems and want to be able to continue to supply goods to the Balearics and mainland Spain, but in the short term appear to accept that there will be some resistance to purchase of their products.

Businesses on Mallorca also have to consider whether dock workers and even hauliers would be likely to boycott products being imported from Barcelona and therefore look for other sources of supply with ferries coming from Denia and Valencia.

There is gold in Spain's hills

Minerals Corp has announced that it expects considerable growth in gold production at its El Valle and Carles mines in northern Spain for the last quarter of 2017.

With gold currently trading at €1,105 per troy ounce, it forecasts production of 15,201 ounces worth € 16.75 million, an increase of 11 per cent over the third quarter figures.

These Spanish mines also produce copper and silver but it is gold which is the major generator of profit and production will increase thanks to an expected upturn in the quantity and quality of ore being extracted.

Annual production of gold from these two mines is estimated as being in excess of 60,000

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Guidance on speeding

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

ACCORDING to Article 51 of the Reglamento General de Circulacion: "The maximum fixed speeds for conventional roads which do not pass through urban areas may only be exceeded by up to 20kph by saloon cars and motorcycles whilst overtaking other vehicles travelling at lesser speeds."

This clause first came about to allow cars to pass a slower moving vehicle in the shortest time possible, allowing an increase in speed in order to execute the move quickly.

The word 'execute' being a potential reminder though that overtaking is one of the most dangerous manoeuvres we can carry out. In the event of a head-on collision, our speed is added to that of the oncoming vehicle, and so a crash where two vehicles are travelling at 90 kilometres per hour is the equivalent of crashing at 180 kilometres per hour, when the two speeds are combined.

But the rule does exist and does allow drivers to go over the speed limit, but only in certain circumstances. In order to simplify the explanation, let us break it down to see when this clause can actually apply.

Firstly, we can see that it can only ever apply to cars and motorcycles, so we know the sort of vehicle the allowance applies to.

Secondly, we need to look at the types of roads the clause can apply to. We can see that it is not permitted on motorways. We can also see that it does not apply on dual carriageways. So, we can exclude faster moving roads

Next, we see that the clause does not apply in towns, or cities for that matter, so we can exclude those routes too.



OVERTAKING: The rules explained.

Now, all that we are left with is so-called conventional roads, single carriageway, with no central reservation and outside of towns. But, then we have to take away those for which a speed limit already applies, because, that speed limit overrules this clause too.

In other words, you are NOT permitted to exceed the speed limit for any reason, including overtaking.

On a conventional road, the maximum permitted speed on a road where no other signs indicate a restriction, and there is a hard shoulder of more than 1.5 metres, is 100 kilometres per hour. On other conventional roads, the maximum permitted speed is 90 kilometres per hour.

This is what we might refer to as the National Speed Limit in UK terms. Incidentally, these roads do sometimes have an R-301 sign.

Finally, we must add sections of roads where overtaking is either prohibited or unadvisable, then that too is an overruling element.

So, the only road where this clause can apply is a conventional road, where no overruling speed limit applies and where overtaking is allowed.

bungalows, Telefonica always asks for permission to run cables along the front of the bungalows but these people do not. I have also e-mailed the Internet company office and asked if they are insured in case of an accident while they work on our roof but have received no reply. What can I do?

Grave New World

SOMETIMES it feels as if I went to sleep in one world and then woke up in another bizarrely different copy. I have roots in the UK and Spain and both countries seem to be going through incredible changes with no-one able to actually take control or influence

Here in Spain we are back to deep divisions with a minority of the people in Cataluña apparently desperate to commit what appears like financial suicide by declaring independence despite the fact that they would be thrown out of the European Union and could well be invaded by Spanish troops. With the National government unlikely to enter into meaningful negotiations, there are only two possible outcomes, either Cataluña backs down or it will be controlled from Madrid which is likely to infuriate even the local anti-independence groups.

Meanwhile Theresa May is not having a good time with regards to Brexit and so little progress has been made that she had to travel to Brussels for an intimate dinner with Jean-Claude Juncker with both accompanied by their chief negotiators David Davis and Michel Barnier. The results of the meeting however were somewhat predictable as it was agreed that negotiations need to speed up but following their dinner which was undertaken in a 'constructive and friendly atmosphere,' there were no new agreements reached.

Basically paraphrasing Jerry Maguire, Brussels simply said 'Show me the money" and there is unlikely to be a trade deal before an agreement is reached about the amount that Britain has to pay in the 'divorce' settlement. It does rather look as if we are heading towards a 'Grave New World.'

Keep calm and change your password

ONE of the world's most popular password managers (LastPass) was recently hacked - but then these days, who hasn't been?

By and large though, you would expect password managers to safeguard the precious keys to your life, and they do.

Many are free: look for LastPass, Dashlane, LogMe-Once or Symantec Norton Identity Safe.

Pay a few smackers and you can add more bells and whistles, like protection for multiple devices, automatic form filling and for all I know, the ability to brew a good cup of Earl Grev.

Whatever you do, don't accept your web browser's kind offer to Save a password when you input it into a site. All it takes is for your computer to be stolen and there goes your life. Not to mention your electric toothbrush tracker.

PASSWORD is no longer the world's most popular password, but it's close. This year's winner is 123456. Followed by 12345678 and perhaps most curiously at number 11.

Passwords really are a pain, and the bane of our technological age, as we stagger under growing torrents of the things. Even my new electric toothbrush has a password so that I can track my brushing performance, when what I actually need is a life.

And we really are so hopeless at choosing good passwords. Even the simplest computer these days can crack a six-letter password in seconds, putting your whole identity at risk if you've decided to go with hola or cheers because you can't be buttocked to come up with something better.

If there's anything we're even worse at than thinking-up passwords, it's remembering them. Sure, even Stephen Hawking probably couldn't remember the 80-something passwords I need to stay afloat online, for everything from managing my subscription to Barbed Wire Monthly right through to keeping Nigerian princes away from the €63 in my current account.

Offices are still replete with every IT administrator's nightmare, Post-it

But now there are password managers, with a few of the most popular

listed in the panel alongside. These promise to store all your passwords and apply them where needed, as long as you remember, inevitably, One Password To Rule Them All.

Of course you could also write down every password in a notebook as you collect them - and just hope your home isn't burgled by a computer-literate Beagle Boy.

Or you could use your own downhome solution like mine: a text file of usernames and passwords, which is then compressed ('zipped') with any of the many widely-available zip programs (WinZip or 7-Zip are just two) - which let you encrypt (lock) the file with a password each time you save it. Roman baths in Casares

IF you have a nose for history then a visit to the Baños de la Hedionda (Casares, Malaga) might be a good idea.

That is if you also have a nose that can ignore the smell of sulphur in the baths which date back to Roman times and are said to be where the devil breathed out after being expelled from heaven.

These sulphurous springs are difficult to reach but are still accessible to the public if somewhat tatty as they have been partly vandalised over the past few years.

History records that Roman legionaries on the side of Julius Caesar visited the area in 61AD prior to one of the major battles with the troops of Pom-

pey and those suffering from the skin complaint Scabies were said to have recovered after bathing in the waters.

Although it is not confirmed that Caesar himself was a visi-

tor, work was undertaken in the baths over the centuries by the Romans, Moors and Spanish, and the area next to the Rio Manilva has been declared an area of local cultural interest.

WHILE the sight of a matador toying with a bull is the iconic image of Spain's obsession with the animal, there are several other controversial festivities which focus on the horned beast.

The most famous is Pamplona, which sees thousands of locals and tourists take to the streets of the city.

The catch: bulls are set free behind the willing runners before being slaughtered in the bullring that very same

This year's event saw almost as many protestors as runners as those for and against the festival clashed.

One of the most controversial bull 'traditions,' is the Toro Embolado... also known as 'the Burning of the Bulls.

Although rarer these days, the Toro Embolado sees a bull's horns set alight while it runs around attempting to extinguish the flames.

The custom hit international headlines in July this year after a video showed a bull 'commit suicide' by driving itself into a wooden post after its horns had been

Setting a bull free in an open field, dozens of men mount horses or run after the bull on foot, armed with rocks and spears.

> With bullfighting on the ropes, campaigners will hope that these traditions - and many more like them - are also given the boot.

Cock and bull story

SAY what you will about bullfighting. But to go into a ring against a 1,000 kg bull armed with no more than a sword and a cloak takes a lot of courage.

This year alone, two matadors have lost their lives in the ring and several more have been injured. The latest to lose his life was legendary matador Iván Fandiño who was gored after trip-

ping on his cape.



Others are more fortunate and live to tell the tale, but suffer life changing injuries.

One of the most famous incidents took place in Madrid earlier this year

where onlookers were left wincing after matador Juan Miguel took a horn to the nether region as he was tossed into the air.

His colleague Frenchman Andy Younes then suffered a catastrophic injury of his own after being thrown into the air before landing on his head as he attempted to tame the bull.

Of Spain's most famous matadors to return to the ring Juan Jose Padilla must top the list. Losing an eye to a bull in 2011, Padilla came back to fight again. However, last year, almost five years since the horrific goring, Padilla was again struck in the face and gored in the same eye socket.

Whether or not Padilla dons the traje de luces again remains to be seen. But no one would blame him if he calls it a day.

To ban or not to ban has lon Trick or

It is not just the matadors doing the fighting, as those for and against Spain's most controversial tradition engage in verbal sparring outside of the ring. David Noon takes a look at the history of bullfighting and weighs up whether or not Spain should consign the corrida to history.

T was once considered as ingrained in Spanish culture as tapas or flamenco, but a decade of decline suggests that the corrida's days are numbered.

As the gates are locked on many iconic bullrings across the country, it begs the question of whether or not Spain's controversial tradition can limp on for much longer.

In 2017, where animal rights and political correctness sit on lofty pedestals, the decadence of bullfighting jolts somewhat out of kilter.

And many would argue - and do so, en masse - that bullfighting is fit only for the history books.

Where previously thousands upon thousands of Spaniards took to the plazas de toros in celebration, in their place equal numbers take to the streets to protest in anger.

Each year, fewer and fewer Spaniards openly support the pastime.

A poll carried out earlier this year by the World Animal Protection organisation found that as few as 19 per cent of adults in Spain support bullfighting while 58 per cent are totally opposed to it.

In September 2016, record numbers of protestors lined the streets of Madrid in the largest-ever demonstration against the corrida.

And this year, large, boisterous protests again in Madrid and during Pamplona's bull run have further proven that momentum is swinging in favour of those against bullfighting.

The beginning of the end (if that is where we are headed) took place in Barcelona in 2011, in front of a packed house of nearly 20,000 people at El Monu-

Top matadors Jose Tomas, Juan Mora, and Serafin Morin lead the corrida, as Cataluña brought the curtain down on bullfighting in the region ahead of a ban coming into force in 2012.

It was an important moment in Spanish history felt far beyond the borders of the ever-headline grabbing

Municipalities across the country have followed in Cataluña's footsteps, with a trickle-down effect leading to bans far and wide.

Nowadays there are dozens of municipal bans on bullfighting across the country. And no doubt more will follow.

It is a reality that was unimaginable in Spain until the last decade.

Even in the bullfighting heartland of Andalucia,

the number of fights has fallen by more than 50 per cent in the past 10 years.

The latest municipality to clamp down on the pastime was the Balearic Islands who voted in a new law that bans the tradition of bulls being slaughtered in

Fights can still take place as part of the new law, but bulls cannot be killed (how exactly that will play out remains to be seen).

But the 'sport' still boasts a number of high-profile aficionados who rally to keep the tradition alive.

While the number of bullfights is falling in Spain,

banned in Catalonia and the Canary Islands but is still legal in most other parts ' of Spain, as well as in Portugal, parts of southern France and some South

American countries.

Throughout the years artists, authors, politicans and singers have all voiced their admiration of the tradition.

Pablo Picasso, Orson Welles, Goya, Dalí, Hemingway and the the poet Garcia Lorca to name just six were all vociferous in their admiration of bullfight-

American author Gabriel Garcia Marquez and Spain's top folk singer Joaquin Sabine have both spoken out against 'antitaurinos,' blasting their protests

Holding no punches, Sabine recently claimed that 'art of the antitaurino problem' was that those against bullfighting simply 'can't accept the profound truth that, without death, there can be no life.' And while there are many more who would support Sabine in her argument, the scales appear to be tipping in favour of those opposed to her views.

The opinions of poets and artists of the past bare little significance when challenged by PACMA's YouTube channel which boasts countless images of animal cruelty.

How far the scales tip and for how much longer the fight goes on remains to be seen. But for as long as there are matadors in Spain, bullfighting will be a topic of much debate, protest and bloodshed.

Fighting to keep



the custom alive

WHILE thousands take to the streets to put an end to Spain's most hotly talked about tradition, there are others looking for an alternative way of keeping the custom alive.

For the last two years Santilliana del Mar in Cantabria has enjoyed <mark>a</mark> successful bull run without bull nor human injury.

Replacing the bulls with men dressed in bull suits, the organisers claim that the event 'keeps tradition alive while ensuring the safety of animals and peo-

More spectacularly, and still with a serious element of danger, one trend gaining <mark>steam in Spain is the</mark> flight of the bull jumpers.

Armed with nothing more than their reflexes, the Recortadores are put into a ring with a bull and then aim to jump over the oncoming beasts in the <mark>style of a high jumper</mark> arching his back over the

However, unlike pole jumpers, bull jumpers risk their lives by mistiming the leaps of faith.

And while the tradition dates back more than 500 years, supporters argue that the nail biting spectacle could replace traditional bull fights and maintain Spain's love affair with bulls for years to come.

This safe treatment uses threads which are broken down under the skin over time and do not need to be removed.

Results are immediate and usually without side

effects, although small bruises may appear for several days which should disappear on their own.

Tensioning threads are inserted in the dermis one by one, with the aid of a guide needle, in one direction and then in the opposite direction, creating a kind of mesh that holds and stretches the skin. This stimulates production of collagen and elastin.

Pain-killers, anti-inflammatory medication and muscle relaxers can be used to help keep the pain under control. Physiotherapy is also vital to help control the symp-


Are there any specific exercises to help prevent or improve the pain?

At present, the sports centre has two tennis courts that cannot be used following issues during their recovering and the skatepark was closed due to the amount of damage caused by the vandals.





Strawberries on a tree, seems unlikely but...

ONE of the fascinating things about gardening is the variety of plants that are available from various regions around the world. Here in the Mediterranean there are a number of lesser-known plants that make great ornaments, produce sweet-smelling flowers and provide fruit. One of my favourites is the Strawberry tree (Arbutus unedo).

You can see the tree growing wild in its native habitats in oak forests in zones below 800 metres in Spain. It has also become domesticated and can be seen in gardens as a feature tree due to its cinnamon coloured bark and deep green foliage being most attractive and highlighted in autumn with bunches of scented white waxy vase shaped flowers in clusters and dangling fruits that ripen individually from green to yellow and finally red when mature over a long period

The fruit resembles a strawberry hanging from the tree but the similarities end there. It does not taste at all like a strawberry. It requires an acquired taste to appreciate and is not a fruit that you usually would eat many of. It is a delight to sample a few on occasions as an alternative to the more com-

mon fruits available, if only to try some-

If you have a tree or can source the fruit it makes wonderful jams with a unique tinge to the taste. It needs the fruit to be fresh to use as the fruit deteriorates quickly once off the tree. Only the soft red fruit is fully ripe and the fruit ripens gradually at different times on the tree making it difficult to collect significant numbers at one time.

This makes it tempting to pick some nearly ripe to make up volume for making jams but it does reduce the quality of the jam. Some people prefer to collect the fruit regularly from the ground as they fall once fully ripe. Overripe fruit can be intoxicating as they ferment.

This is why it is very difficult to find the preserves and nearly impossible to buy the fresh fruit in good condition. If you are able to grow the tree you will have a rare flavour to add to the larder. The fruit can be made into a compote, syrup, puree, glaze, jams, jellies, ice cream flavouring and converted into wine and spirits.

It is commercially used to make liqueur and wine in Sardinia and Portugual. The tree, the Madroño tree in Spanish, is featured on the coat of arms for Madrid being hugged by a bear so it is also bearly loved

It is an interesting addition to the garden and can grow in a large container. It does not like to be transplanted or moved so it should be located permanently in a partly shaded zone. It is a pioneering and under storey tree that only grows to around five to 10 metres over many decades. It is drought tolerant to survive Mediterranean summers but needs watering to get established.

"Our morning schedule is as follows. Boris waits for me to a ablute in my bathroom, she then comes in and jumps onto her cushion which lives on the corner of the bath (I prefer bathing to showering), she then waits patiently for me to get in the bath, which may be as long as a 30 minute delay. Only when I get into the bath does she raise herself from her cushion, leans into the tub and starts drinking the hot water. She knows the water level is substantially higher after my entry! Protecting pooches

IT might have taken the government 30 years, but European laws ensuring the protection of animals will finally be put into practice in Spain next year.

As from February 2018, it will be illegal to modify animals for aesthetic purposes, such as getting rid of the tail or claws, unless a vet decides it is necessary for medical purposes or believes that it would be beneficial for the animal. It will also become illegal to give them away as rewards or prizes.

These laws protecting animals were actually passed by the EU nearly 30 years ago but

are only just coming into practice in Spain now. They also emphasise that animals should only be given or sold to children under the age of 16 with their parents' permission, to help decrease the number of

animals that become cast out on the street.

The laws will also regulate how animals are allowed to be bred, and the conditions in which they should be kept. It also clarifies who is allowed to kill a pet animal and under which circumstances, namely that a person is only allowed to kill a suffering animal if it is impossible to seek the assistance

Spanish media sources report that some of the regional communities will have to check the new rules against their own regulations as there could be conflicts with local law that permit certain animal practices.

Porsche on-demand

ON-DEMAND Porsches are now available in an American pilot project. In exchange for a monthly charge, the German giant will deliver a Porsche model of the customer's choosing to their home, or any other location.

The pilot is being rolled out in the southern American city of Atlanta. Drivers can choose between two different membership plans. For \$2,000 (\in 1,700) a month they have access to eight Porsche models, including the Cayenne and 718 Boxster.

For \$3,000 (€2,500) a month almost the entire Porsche collection is at their disposal, with on-demand access to 22 models, including the top of the range Carrera S,

classic 911.

LAND ROVER has released the first specs of its new 2018 Range Rover. The highlight news is that the firm are offering a plug-in electric version of its iconic model.

The P400e PHEV Range Rover is expected to cost up to € 150,000 with all mods and cons. For that hefty sum, greenminded drivers get a 2.0 litre four-cylinder petrol engine with an 85 kW electric motor stashed in the automatic gear-

Running purely on the electric motor, the Range Rover can travel for 31 miles and reach a top speed of 85mph.

For those who care more about power than ticking the environmentalist box, Land Rover offers 5.0 litre supercharged V8 petrol engine with 518hp. It can reach 60mph from a deadstart in 5.1 seconds and weighs 2,497kg. Diesel options are also available.

All models include 4G wifi hotspots and come with 17 charging points. Land Rover has aptly described the 2018 release as a "digital butler fit for the 21st century."

The stereo boasts a whopping 1,700 watts and there are 29 separate speakers.

Front seats adjust in 24 different directions. They have 25 massage settings, massage intensity can be managed by

phone, and the armchairs are also heated. Sun visors can be moved simply by waving your hands at them.

With all the mod cons, the only decision facing buyers next year is whether to pick the ecoversion or the petrol guzzler.



Flat racing's showcase event sees the world's leading trainers, horses and top jockeys at Ascot in the finale of the 2017 European Flat racing season.

The QIPCO British Champions Series features the QIP-CO British Championship (Group 2) with a prize fund



of £350,000; The QIPCO Sprint Stakes (G1) with a prize fund of £600,000; and The British Champions fillies and mares (G1) with a prize

The Queen Elizabeth II Stakes (G1) has a prize fund of £1.1 million; The QIPCO Champion Stakes (G1) has a

prize fund of £1.3 million and the Balmoral Handicap has a prize fund of £250,000

> September, gave O'Brien his 10th winner in this year's Series. And O'Brien will be raiding Ascot this year - eyeing a repeat of bagging £5,648,937 in the 2016 Series.

> O'Brien, who has won £5,153,693 in the 2017 Series, has a plethora of entries, including 2015 Gold Cup winner Order of St George.

> Caravaggio, who won the Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot in June, is entered in the QIPCO British Champions

O'Brien has duplicate entries in the QIPCO British Champions Fillies & Mares Stakes, including Winter, Rhododendron, Seventh Heaven and Hydrangea, prior to the final stage declarations

In the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes O'Brien's pre-race entries includes duo Churchill and Winter, who have won four Classics between them, along with Alice Springs and Roly

Ballydoyle based O'Brien could run Churchill in the QIP-CO Champion Stakes, being a pre-race entry, alongside Highland Reel and Winter.

The QIPCO Champion Stakes, Europe's richest mileand-a-quarter contest, sees the entry of Enable, ranked third best in the world in the wake of winning the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes ahead of Ulysses, Idaho and Highland Reel, all of who are entered.

"It's a great day - a meeting we've had success at in the past. We hope to be supporting the whole day with runners," said

Richard Hannon trained Barnev Roy, winner of the St James's Palace Stakes, is entered in the QIPCO British Champions Day.

"I'm not sure which race he goes for. He's very effective over a mile - a mile and a quarter isn't a problem either," said

Richard Fahey trained Ribchester is also eyeing the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes on QIPCO British Champions Day, the richest Group 1 mile race run in

Churchill is just one horse who could oppose Ribchester among a record pre-race entry of 48 horses for the £1.1 million

Classic winners Churchill and Winter could face opposition in UAE 2000 Guineas and Derby winner Thunder Snow, who won the Group 1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly.

"Thunder Snow has been a star horse for me this year. I would like to run him at Ascot on OIPCO British Champions Day," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor.

"We will look at both the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes and the QIPCO Champion Stakes," added bin Suroor.

SPAIN'S Jon Rahm makes his first professional appearance on Spanish soil when the World No 5 plays in the third edition of the Andalucia Valderrama Masters, hosted by the Sergio García Foundation, during October 19-22.

"I'm a competitor and I believe a lot in myself. The more I enjoy myself - the better I play," said Rahm.

A plethora of top golfers will line-up in the Andalucia Valderrama Masters, including Rahm's fellow Spaniards Sergio Garcia and Rafa Cabrera Bello.

Tommy Fleetwood, Justin Rose and Ross Fisher are the leading English trio, with Northern Ireland's Rory McIlroy among players ranked in the top 10 on the European Tour.

Rahm will return to the European continent in the wake of victory in his last regular European Tour appearance - a six-shot win - at the Dubai Duty Free Irish Open in July.

"I prepare well for a tournament. If I don't believe in myself who else will?" said Rahm.

In 2012 Rahm won the Campeonato de España Junior Y Boys, Campeonato Absoluto País Vasco, followed by the 2014 ASU Thunderbird Invitational, Campeonato de España Absoluto, Eisenhower Trophy (individual title).

After the 2016 US Open, Rahm turned professional and in August 2017, Rahm reached a career-high ranking of No 5 in the world after a maiden professional victory on the US PGA Tour at the end of January.
