Multi million racket

FIVE people have been held for illegally selling luxury homes valued at €4 million in Marbella. Among those seized for corruption are a lawyer and two real estate agents who were working on the city's upmarket Golden Mile.

A police probe was launched after the owner of several properties in the Casablanca urbanisation complained that scam artists had tried to see his houses by pretending to be the real owners. Those involved allegedly contacted the victim and told him that they were property investors from Madrid.

They used the information the owner had listed on several genuine websites to advertise.

A 41-year-old British expatriate has been held in Mijas on suspicion of robbing a hotel while dressed as a character from sci-fi movie franchise Star Wars.

The culprit was wearing an Imperial Storm Trooper mask as he entered the Mijas Pueblo hotel carrying a gun before stealing €1,500 in cash from reception and fleeing the scene.

It comes after police released CCTV footage of the incident, which has been widely shared on social media.

In the video, the helmet-clad man can be seen casually walking through the hotel's reception before pointing a gun at the receptionist.

After putting the money into a small black bag, the thief initially leaves the scene but returns to destroy what appears to be the desk phone.

Hours earlier, there had been reports of an attempted robbery at a holiday home in the area by the same individual.

After probing videos and images of both events, Guardia Civil officers were able to arrest the unnamed Englishman and also found a loaded gun at his registered address.

The 41-year-old has reportedly been accused of two counts of alleged robbery, robbery with attempted violence and intimidation.

He has been imprisoned without bail pending trial

Policemen probed

TWO Guardia Civil officers have been held in Malaga City amid accusations of drug trafficking, after a total of 38 kilograms of hashish was found in one of their private vehicles alongside €3,500 in cash and a small amount of cocaine.

A YELLOW warning issued for severe weather on the Costa del Sol remains in place today (Thursday) after storms battered southern Spain.

It comes after the area was hit by more than 2,000 bolts of lightning in the space of three hours yesterday morning, leaving eight towns without electricity, including Marbella, Mijas, Fuengirola, Benalmadena, Torremolinos, Alhaurín de la Torre and Alhaurín el Grande, according to Spanish weather agency AEMET.

calls alerting emergency services to landslides, flooding and other incidents, while the train between Fuengirola and Tor-

remolinos was suspended. However, local dams were replenished to an extent following an extended period of drought.

Flood threat goes on

OVER 1,200,000 people in Malaga Province are estimated to live in areas at high risk of flooding.

A new study by the Madeca Foundation, responsible for managing and implementing strategic actions plans for Malaga Province, declared that 15 towns in Malaga Province are 'high-risk' flood zones.

Some of the most vulnerable towns include Estepona, Malaga capital, Marbella and Fuengirola. The research also revealed the frequency of flooding in the region has risen from once every seven years to once every four years.

The study also suggests that the economic costs of repairing damage caused by floods will rise in the near future due to their increased intensity and frequency.

Man fined for dog's death

A MAN in Fuengirola has been given a €540 fine after a dog was found hanged at his farm in Mijas. After a complaint made by a neighbour, Guardia Civil officers reportedly found the dog tied up by a short iron chain directly wrapped around its neck, which allegedly later killed the animal.

Masked raiders

INVESTIGATORS have held a man on suspicion of robbing a Chinese bazaar in Marbella. The 36-year-old Spaniard and an accomplice allegedly broke into an establishment wearing ski masks and brandishing knives demanding staff deposit cash into a rubbish bag. A second suspect has been identified and is the subject of a manhunt.

Harassment horror

A MALAGA man has been jailed for harassing his ex-girlfriend and advertising her contact details in local newspapers. He was accused of inflicting emotional and physical abuse and has been sentenced to two years in prison and a five-year restraining order preventing him from seeing or having any contact with the victim.

Mussel bound

THERE will be a new section within the port of Fuengirola following approval of the opening of a new area for the marketing of bivalve molluscs. BCM Ingeniero has the rights to sell various shellfish such as mussels and also keep crustaceans in the same area.

Water expense

THE city of Casabermeja has already spent more than €70,000 since last June giving water supplies to neighbours of the municipality. Currently, the rural areas of Casabermeja continue to be supplied by tanker trucks which insert 50,000 litres of water into local reservoirs every day.

Spain is the second most mountainous European country after Switzerland, and is also home to one of its most active volcanoes.

Mountain high and totally breathtaking!

SPAIN was once described as "just one big mountain," and although a tongue in cheek comment by a 19th century English travel writer, the nation does possess an extensive and rugged landscape.

With five main mountain ranges - the Sistema Central, the Cordillera Cantabrica, the Pyrenees, the Cordillera Subbetica and the Sierra Morena - more than 20 per cent of the country's land is 1,000 metres or more above sea level. The individual daddy of them all, though not on the mainland, is Mount Teide, in Tenerife on the Canary Islands.

More than 3,700 metres high, Teide is the country's most visited natural attraction and the highest - and still active - volcano in the world outside Hawaii when measured from peak to ocean floor.

Teide last erupted in 1909 but it is still rated as being unstable leading many to speculate an eruption is imminent.

A study eight years ago by Granada University found that Teide is likely to violently erupt and the International Association of Volcanology also labelled it a 'decade volcano,' one with a destructive history that is close to populated areas.

The highest mountain peak on mainland Spain is Mulhacén, at more than 3,400 metres, just over two hour's drive from Granada in the Sierra Nevada range.

Not only does the Sierra Nevada offer opportunities to do extreme sports, but it is also a popular ski resort.

Peak interest

ON the French/Spanish border in the north, the Pyrenees have more than 200 peaks over 3,000 metres high, and the largest surviving glacier can be found on Aneto, the region's tallest peak.

Larrun, at nearly 1,000 metres, was used by the French troops when they sought shelter from Wellington's forces during the 19th century Peninsular War.

Many interesting sights can be found sky-high including St Mary's church on Mount Naranco and the Montserrat monastery in Cataluña, which is more than 1,000-years-old.

€4m seized

POLICE have held 17 people alleged to be perpetrators of a Malaga tax evasion scheme and seized more than €3.8 million in assets.

The suspects, all Spanish nationals belonged to an organisation alleged to have profited from tax evasion through money laundering, fraud and falsifying documents.

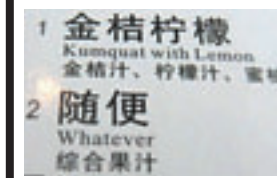

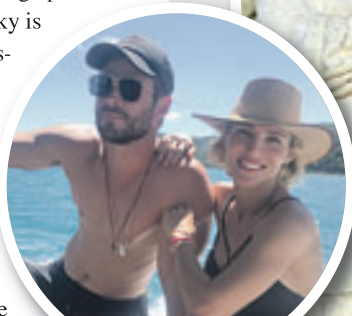


Abs-olutely fabulous!

Galician disaster

AFTER the terrible news of the wildfires devastating parts of California and killing at least 41, things have moved closer to home with four killed in Galician fires.

It appears that at least some of those fires were started by arsonists and that they have been made worse by strong winds hitting the coast of Spain due to the fall-out from Storm Ophelia.

Fire brigades in the region have found it incredibly difficult to cope with more than 100 separate active fires and this problem has been made worse by the fact that many brigades have laid off firefighters now that the dangerous summer period was thought to have passed.

Prime Minister Rajoy travelled to his home province as a show of support for those who had been affected by the fires and to grieve alongside the families of a 78-year-old man who died trying to protect his animals and a 70-year-old man who was fighting the fires near his home in Vigo.

Two bodies were also discovered in a burnt out car but at the time of writing the victims had not been identified.

Our hearts and best wishes must go out to all of those affected by these fires and those in the emergency services fighting them.

We hope however that if any of these fires have been started deliberately that those responsible realise the pain and suffering that they have caused.

POLICE have arrested 16 people in Fuengirola over the summer for selling counterfeit goods.

It comes after officers also seized over 3,600 illegal items during the operation, including more than 2,500 items of clothes, nearly 500 pairs of shoes and more than 650 leather goods products.

The police operation began when officers first noticed that several stalls in the local Sunday market in Fuengirola were selling counterfeit products.

Sixteen stands and six vehicles were searched during the investigation and police seized thousands of fake items

bearing the logos and prints of well-known luxury brands.

Over the summer, police in-

tervened in the sales of illegal goods or services over 23,000

times, over 10,000 of which

were for illegal street vending and nearly 200 were to stop illicit masseurs.

MYSTERY Marbella dog deaths were caused by an illegal herbicide, according to the city council's health department.

The announcement comes after the *Euro Weekly News* previously reported that authorities had closed a Marbella playground after a spate of dog deaths occurred in the area. Samples of the ground were taken in for tests following fears that it had been laced with a toxic substance.

Experts working for the health department have since been able to confirm that

the substance was in fact a herbicide used to kill insects on orange trees, which has been banned by the EU for two decades.

At least seven dogs and one cat suspected to have ingested the toxin have died. The mayor's office of Nueva Andalucia, where the poisonings took place, has confirmed that the herbicide is the likely cause of death.

Locals accused the city hall of using

the herbicide to treat weeds in the area, but a spokesperson for the council argued that they has not used the product for "a long time, since its use was first vetoed."

Officials, including the deputy mayor of Nueva Andalucia and the Local Police chief, held a meeting with citizens on Monday to clear up any rumours surrounding the poisonings and explain where they stand in the investigations.

Toddler's parents beg police

THE family of Lucia Vivar, the three-year-old girl who was found dead on the Pizarra railway tracks in July, has gathered over 6,000 signatures in the past week to urge the police to speed up their investigation.

Lucia's parents met with the authorities on Tuesday to ask them to bring an end to their questions. They have also called for a meeting in Pizarra and Alhaurin el Grande on Friday and Saturday to criticise the lack of progress in the case.

The police have so far kept the details of the investigation from the public eye and no new information has transpired since they concluded that the youngster's death was likely an accident.

On the evening of her death, Lucia allegedly became separated from her family and walked 4km to the spot on the train tracks in Pizarra where her body was later found by a search party.

Battle of the riches!

Employee fraud claim goes on

BRITISH business tycoon John Caudwell has accused his ex-employee of claiming expenses while attending a WAG's birthday party in Malaga Province.

Mr Caudwell, the billionaire founder of Phones4u, is locked in a money battle with French financier Nathalie Dauriac, who allegedly scammed nearly €37,000 in expenses from his company.

Ms Dauriac, while on a £200,000-a-year salary, reportedly fiddled her expenses to pay to attend the birthday party of 'The Real Housewives of Cheshire' star Dawn Ward in Malaga and drinks with TV personality Lizzie Cundy.

Mr Caudwell's lawyers alleged that Ms Dauriac also claimed for spa trips to Spain, a €115 birthday cake and flights for her nanny and husband to Bordeaux, amounting to nearly €37,000 in total.

An investigation into Ms Dauriac's expenses was launched in 2014 by Mr Caudwell's company, Signia

Wealth Management.

Ms Dauriac allegedly blamed her staff for not attributing the details of her trips correctly and said that the 'ulterior motive' of the investigation was to force her out of the company, as she resigned several months later.

She claimed that she never received her €330,000 end-of-year

bonus and that she is owed up to €20 million in company shares.

A Signia representative revealed that Ms Dauriac would have been sacked if she had not resigned, and Mr Caudwell's lawyers argued that her shares are not worth anything as the company is not profitable, according to British media sources.

A bitter blow!

Cannabis found on lemon farm

A MAN has been held after National Police investigators found a plantation of marihuana hidden in a lemon orchard on a Cartama farm.

The plants were unearthed in the Manguarra neighbourhood of Cartama, with the culprits also stealing electricity via an illegal connection to the public power grid.

During the operation, the National Police seized 100 marihuana plants, 16 kilos of buds as well as 64 grams of cocaine, a shotgun, a revolver, and ammunition for both guns.

The investigation reportedly began after police received information about the distribution of cocaine and marihuana in the region.

After the investigation led officers to the farm, they were able to confirm the owner was distributing the substances, such as cocaine and marihuana, and also located the items they later seized.

The 36-year-old now faces charges for many alleged offences, including drug trafficking, electricity fraud and illicit possession of weapons.

Ex-councilman could be freed from prison

THE clock is ticking for the Spanish government who have less than a week to finalise the request to extradite ex-Marbella councilman Carlos Fernandez, before the Argentine authorities decide whether to release the fugitive from jail.

As previously reported in the *Euro Weekly News*, Fernandez initially fled the country in 2006 to avoid corruption charges for his involvement in the Marbella Malaya scandal but was tracked down last month in Argentina following an 11-year manhunt.

A court in Malaga has already filed a request to extradite Fernandez but it has yet to be approved by the Spanish Council of Ministers. Once the Argentine authorities receive the appropriate documents, they will have 30 days to choose whether to approve the extradition.

If the documents are not processed in time, the Argentine judge who is overseeing the case will decide on October 25 if Fernandez should continue to be locked up.

As well as his involvement in the Malaya scandal, which saw him allegedly receive over €150,000 in bribes, Fernandez is also wanted for granting building licences illegally. The ex-councilman faces up to six years imprisonment for his offences if he returns to Spain and a ban from employment in public services lasting from seven to 12 years.

Grapes of wrath!

Fake wine jobs leave sour taste

A MAN has been arrested for swindling people out of their money by posting adverts for a fake job in a French vineyard.

The fraud artist posted the job advertisement on the website milanuncios.com to scam unemployed labourers who are willing to travel thousands of miles for a salary.

The advert offered workers nearly €5,000 for nine weeks of labour, with lodging and food included. The 'employer' only asked for €85 to cover transport costs from Malaga to France, which the interested parties had to pay to close the contract.

The man also contacted the victims by telephone and through the messaging app WhatsApp, where he specified that they had to bring their own tools and asked them to send him their ID card and a signed form agreeing to the terms and conditions of employment.

Those who had applied for the position were told to meet at Malaga bus station to catch the 'pre-arranged' coach to France that they had paid for, only to find that there was no transport waiting for them as promised when they arrived.

The man told his victims to carry on waiting before disconnecting his phone number and ignoring their calls. That evening, more than 40 people reported the incident to the Malaga police.

Allegedly, the fraudster was able to trick almost 200 Andalucians out of their money with the fraudulent adverts, as well as victims from other parts of Spain including Madrid and Valencia.

Police have estimated that the man stole more than €16,000 from the people he scammed.

AROUND 50 people lose their driving licences in Malaga Province each month, according to the Regional Traffic Headquarters.

Speeding continues to be the most common offence on the

Need for speed

region's roads, but it is not the only traffic violation that causes drivers to lose their licences.

According to local media sources, traffic officials caught a motorist in a Maserati speeding at over 222 kmph on the motorway between Malaga and Fuengirola. The offence was detected by the department's helicopter, Pegasus, which is used to detect speed violations and other offences from the skies.

On this occasion the driver

was charged with a €600 fine and had six points deducted from his licence.

The Pegasus also caught drivers using their mobile phone without a hands free device, which amounts to a €200 fine and a three point deduction, and a driver who overtook several vehicles at one time by driving in the opposite lane and was consequently fined €400 and had four points deducted from his licence.

Petra on the mend

Dog dumped after being violated

A DOG found with three wall screws and an incandescent light bulb stuffed inside its genitals is showing signs of recovery.

The good news comes after the story of Petra, posted online by Malaga-based animal rights campaigner Paloma Luque, went viral on social media after being shared over 900 times and gaining over a thousand comments.

Petra was found lying inside a city centre animal shelter with suspicious bleeding after a stepladder was used to break into the

facility at night.

After being taken to the vets, they were left disgusted by what they found.

After many people donated to a PayPal account to help pay for Petra's treatment, Paloma continues to document her progress and says that she is making a slight recovery.

Writing on her Facebook page, she said: "She's got less pain and she's still resting. She is calm and less scared. We're still on medication and a lot of love. Very happy and hopeful."

Remains may lay on hotel grounds

THE Department of Culture has requested that the site where a new hotel is to be built is searched for archaeological remains before building work begins.

The hotel, which will be built next to the Jardines de El Retiro in Churriana, will stretch across four buildings on one level and house over 30 rooms.

The council has claimed that the site is limited in the General Plan for Urban Development as it has been

one of the areas which could contain archaeological remains of previous civilisations. Therefore, it asks for the developers' agreement to be archaeologically 'cautious' when they start work on the development.

Ancient Phoenician artefacts were recently discovered while builders were working on the new Malaga airport runway, which is located close to where the new hotel will be built.

A prisoner in her own home

A MAN accused of assaulting his own family could face up to a year in prison after his wife hid a note in her child's schoolbook begging for help.

A teacher at the child's school in Benalmadena found the hidden note which claimed that the woman and her children were victims of domestic abuse and alerted the police.

She went on to claim that she did not know who to turn to and feared the consequences of what might happen if her husband found out what she did.

The prosecution has demanded that the accused be sentenced to a year in prison and banned from approaching or communicating with his wife for three years.

He has continued to deny the charges against him throughout the investigation.

Flushed away

Water waste threatens supply

MALAGA Province allegedly loses a fifth of its water every day due to leaks, putting the increasingly scarce water supply in even more danger.

Allegedly, one in every five litres of water that is distributed throughout the region is lost before it even reaches the tap. This figure becomes even higher in more rural areas, where it is estimated that as much as 50 per cent of water is lost before it is used.

Water companies refer to this supply as unregistered water, but the waste is actually the result of the poor quality of pipes in the area, some of which haven't been repaired for more than 40 years.

Companies also lose water through fraud as there have been instances of people making illegal pipes to redirect the water supply or manipulating their water meters so they don't get charged as much.

The main reservoirs in the region are dangerously low in supply and on high alert, meaning the region only has enough water guaranteed to meet demand for the next one to two years.

Local media sources claim that of the nearly 115 billion litres of water that are distributed in the province annually, around 63 million of this is lost as 'unregistered water.' This is equivalent to the amount of water the Costa del Sol uses in 10 months.

All towns in the area are aware of the problem but are unlikely to make the changes to put an end to this much wastage because of how expensive it would be to repair the water systems.

However, the regional authorities are collaborating with Acosol, the public water

company, by putting together a plan which aims to reduce water loss and damages in the main pipelines over the next few years.

Among the projects in the works, €15 million will be invested to replace several sections of the main pipes in Mijas, Istan, Marbella and Estepona. Repairs will also be made in Malaga capital, where 20 per cent of the total water supply is estimated to be lost each year.

The Environment Department will decide what further measures need to be taken to tackle the drought at the end of the month.


Baby among injured

NEIGHBOURS alerted Emergency Services to the fact that smoke was being seen issuing from a property on Calle Jacinto Benavente in Marbella early last Saturday morning.

The fire brigade assisted by Local Police and medical services attended the scene and discovered the fire on the fourth floor of the property.

As the fire was being brought under control, officers evacuated all present in the building but four people were badly affected by smoke inhalation and were taken to the Costa del Sol hospital.


Those taken for treatment were an 11-month-old baby, a man of 36, a woman of 37 and a 70-year-old woman.

Desperate search for missing man

THE family of a man who disappeared last month have asked for the search to be reactivated.

Jose Romero Benitez of Benalmadena went missing on September 17 and has not been seen since.

According to his family, the 69-year-old left home without any money or a credit card and did not have his driver's licence either, though it is be-

lieved that he did have some form of identification.

The family reportedly requested the search be suspended on September 23, six days after his initial disappearance, but have since asked for the case to be reopened.

Jose is described as 1.8 metres tall, weighing 92 kilos with grey hair and glasses.

The family have called a rally on Sunday in the square outside the mosque in Arroyo de la Miel, with the following number provided to report any information that can be given as to Jose's whereabouts: 696 522 307.

MARBELLA City Council will fork out €350,000 making improvements to the local coastline.

The council has given the green light to a project which is set to restore the 25,000 square meters of clay footpath along the promenade and improve local infrastructure.

Gold coast

Councillor Javier Garcia stressed that restoring the 15km coastal stretch is a priority for the local government, and stated that the plans focus on repairing the clay footpath as it is particularly 'sensitive' to wear and tear.

Garcia clarified that the work will take place specifically between the neighbourhoods of El Ancon and La Pesquera and will take around 40 days to complete.

In addition, the council will install three kilometres of portable pipelines, three kilometres of special irrigation pipes to im-

prove green spaces and 5,800 metres of cable for new lighting features.

The councillor revealed that the city hall will continue to work on improving other sections of the coast in the future, with work also scheduled for the stretch between Ventura del Mar and Guadaiza.

Garcia also claimed that a maintenance and conservation plan will be put in place in order to improve all lighting, gardens, signs and street furniture along the seafront.

Leading the objection, Casares Council has appealed

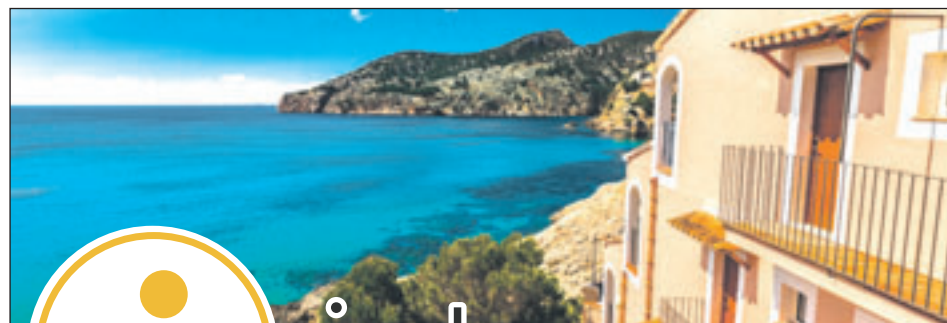
to the Junta de Andalucia to support its opposition especially as two ministries appear to be at odds with one declaring it an area of cultural and heritage interest and the other approving the mining.

With the final result a draw, the minister and her family were content with the outcome although they would have preferred to have seen the Madrid team emerge victorious.

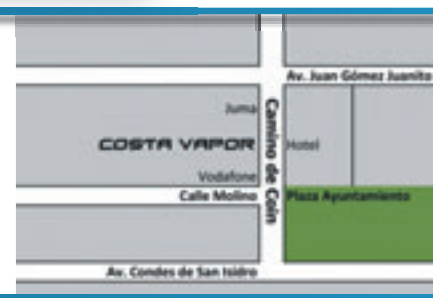

Buying property in Catalonia?

THE Catalonian separatists' independence adventure has ended up in economic failure: no longer a Catalan bank has its HQ in the region, following

Banc Sabadell and Caixa's hasty departure to pastures new -Valencia.

And they're not alone: fearing massive loss of clients and being left out of

the protective umbrella of the EU, hundreds of companies are following suit in what could be, potentially, an unprecedented financial debacle for any European country or region.

But rather than macroeconomics, what interests me is the - possibly - hundreds of foreign investors with private contracts exchanged for property in Cataluña that have been caught in the middle of this nightmare.

What are their options? Should they proceed, or wait?

Can they rescind and recover their down payment, or must they complete or lose their deposits?

We can confirm, almost without margin for error, that no contract signed for any property in the Catalonian region would include a 'political unrest' get out clause. You can

the legal doctrine allowing contractual undertakings to become inapplicable because of a fundamental and extraordinary change of circumstances not envisaged by the parties.

It is essentially an 'escape clause' that makes an exception to the general rule of pacta sunt servanda ('promises must be kept') and favor contractus ('conservation of contracts').

For instance, the hotel chain Accor persuaded the Supreme Court that the 2008 crisis impacted tourism so dramatically that a 29 per cent reduction in the rent for a hotel was acceptable. Simi-

larly, a couple who had specifically intended to finance the final payment on an off-plan property and were left 'high and dry' by banks following the onset of the worldwide financial crisis, were granted remedy.

Still, the Spanish Supreme Court remains cautious when applying the clause and recommends a case by case analysis of each contractual scenario.

As for the buyers of Catalonian-based property, we suggest a wait-

and-see approach as the next days, if not weeks, will hopefully relax the political turmoil and allow for safe decision-making.

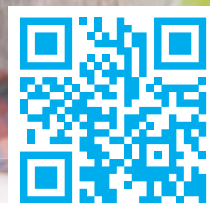

NEWS IN BRIEF

Storm forces flight back

AN easyJet flight from Spain was forced to make an emergency landing in the UK on Monday due to excess dust in the air caused by storm Ophelia and the wildfires raging in Spain and Portugal.

Sick scheme

A BRITISH couple have been jailed after submitting a fake food poisoning claim trying to claim £20,000 for fake gastric illnesses while on holiday in Mallorca.

Local heroes

A THIEF attempting to rob a shop at gunpoint was restrained by several have-a-go heroes in Spain who wrestled with the man for several minutes to release the weapon from his grip.

Car crisis

BRITISH owners and drivers of Mercedes-Benz cars in Spain have been alerted to a massive recall notice, as the cars may have a potential short-circuit electrical fault which could deploy the airbags by mistake.

Traffic trauma

OVER 1.3 million people have been injured in traffic accidents in Spain in the past decade, according to a study by Direct Line insurance and the Spanish road safety foundation (FESVIAL).

Party over

IBIZA council leaders threaten to close bars and nightclubs in popular resort San Antonio as part of plans to clamp down on noisy and drunken holiday revellers.

Home safe

A TWO-YEAR-OLD girl who vanished while walking her dog with her father in Gil Garcia (Avila) forest on Monday night was safely returned to her family after a major search.

Flag flaunter

A REAL ESTATE developer placed what is believed to be the largest ever Spanish flag, valued at around €15,000 and measuring 731 square metres, on the side of a building in Valdebebas, Madrid.

Leaders' arrest sparks fury

THOUSANDS took to the streets in Barcelona, Catalonia's regional capital, on Tuesday to protest the arrest of two senior pro-independence activists who were sent to prison without bail.

Jordi Cuixart and Jordi Sanchez were accused of stirring up major demonstrations in the run-up to the controversial independence referendum on October 1 which Madrid re-

gards as illegal.

The two are presidents of pro-independence groups and are being investigated over a protest in which a crowd blocked Civil Guard officers inside a building in Barcelona. The ruling has heightened tensions between Madrid and Cataluña again with protests breaking out in Barcelona as news of their imprisonment spread.

On Monday the Catalan President Carles Puigdemont failed to confirm whether he had declared independence or not but instead wrote a letter to Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy calling for a meeting "as soon as possible."

Rajoy had warned that Madrid will suspend Cataluña's autonomy if independence was declared.

Wildfires acts of 'incendiary terrorism'

AT least 40 people have died in the wildfires that have swept northern Spain and Portugal after more than 500 fires were declared over the weekend.

Rain from passing Hurricane Ophelia helped firefighters to tame the blazes, which the Spanish government called acts of 'incendiary terrorism.' On Tuesday authorities announced that the biggest fires had been brought under control.

In Spain, Alberto Nuñez Feijoo, the leader of Galicia, claimed that many of the fires had started as acts of arson.

"The only thing we desire is that these criminals pay for what they have done," he told a news conference.

However, it has emerged that two weeks ago, Galicia dismissed 436 forest rangers who had been hired on temporary contracts over the summer months.

When asked to justify the decision, Mr. Feijoo said that the risk of fire along the Atlantic coast had "lowered significantly."

The fire in Carballada de Avia (Ourense) led to more than 500, mainly elderly, people being evacuated from their homes.

Mayor Luis Milla said it was "like the end of the world" and claimed that "70 per cent of the city had burned down." Milla also reported that there were many people who did not want to leave their homes, saying they preferred to burn with their houses because they had nothing left.

In the city of Vigo 400 people were evacuated from their homes including students from the university campus.

The city's mayor has pointed out that, given the large number of outbreaks, and the distance between them, "Everything indicates that this was not accidental."

Slave bosses held amid abuse claims

THREE Portuguese men have been arrested in La Rioja accused of keeping compatriots in a state of 'semi-slavery.'

All three were Spanish residents and ran a business which persuaded vulnerable Portuguese men, some of whom were alcoholics, to work as countryside labourers, promising to pay them €50 per day, but in fact they received as little as €15 for a 10-hour day as they were charged for food, overcrowded accommodation, transport, cigarettes and alcohol.

Once in Spain, the men were not allowed to contact relatives in Portugal and were threatened if they attempted to complain or tried to

return home.

Police officers had kept a close watch on one of the three men, who had been involved in similar activities in the area previously, and discovered that the man and his accomplices were 'renting out' 40 men to different farmers in the area.

A 21-YEAR-OLD woman has been arrested in Girona for her alleged involvement with Islamic terrorists. The suspect is believed

Fake cash culprits caught out

TWO men have been arrested in Ibiza accused of distributing fake €50 notes and selling drugs.

Officers of the National Police across Spain were aware that a large number of fake €50 notes were being put into circulation, especially in Barcelona and Madrid.

Eagle-eyed officers were intrigued when they saw two men, who they recognised as members of a local gang, hand a bundle of notes to a third man in Ibiza town who then went into a guitar shop and purchased an expensive acoustic guitar.

After the man left with the guitar, officers entered the shop and checked the notes which they discovered were counterfeit.

The discovery of these notes tied in with a number of complaints received from local shop keepers and businesses, so the National Police visited three properties associated with the gang.

During these raids, they arrested two men and found 2,000 of the fake €50 notes, much of which was stashed in the recently purchased guitar, and €24,000 in genuine currency, along with heroin and cocaine.

Second jet tragedy

FOR the second time in a week, a Spanish pilot has died following a crash.

According to the Spanish Ministry of Defence, the accident happened as the F-18 fighter plane was taking off from the Torrejon de Ardoz airbase in the outskirts of Madrid on Tuesday morning.

It is understood the aircraft suffered a loss of engine power on take off and hardly left the ground. The pilot, 26-year-old Lieutenant Fernando Perez Serrano, was unable to eject from the aircraft.

The disaster comes after a Eurofighter crashed while preparing to land at Los Llanos air base in Albacete last Tuesday, killing the pilot instantly.

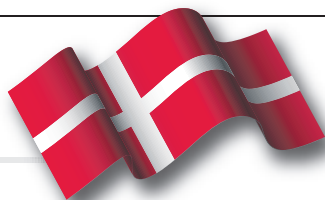

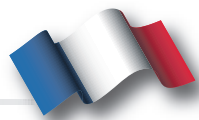

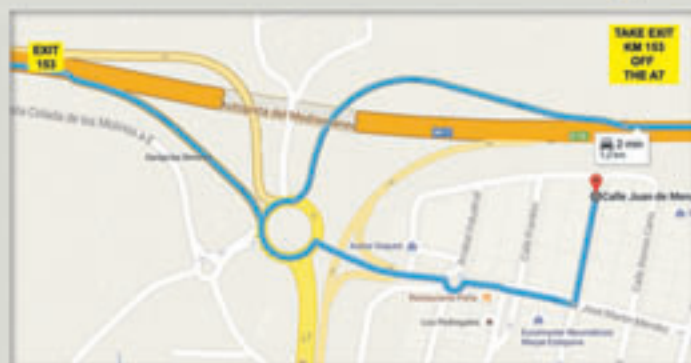

Ryanair to fight Germany

By John Smith

THERE is to be a public spat between Ryanair and the German government over the proposed €210 million sale of parts of Air Berlin to Lufthansa.

Air Berlin was the second largest airline in Germany which had a major base in Mallorca and was one of the busiest airlines transporting passengers from different parts of Germany to Palma.

It had been haemorrhaging money for several years and in the end, main shareholder Etihad, the Abu Dhabi-based airline, indicated that it

would no longer support Air Berlin and its subsidiaries and the company went into liquidation.

The German government injected €150 million into the company by way of a loan in order to allow it to continue to operate for a short period of time whilst the liquidators negotiated possible sales of assets with interested parties.

It has now been revealed that an agreement has been reached whereby it would purchase the Austrian

leisure travel airline Niki (founded by former racing driver Niki Lauda), the LGW German regional airline and 20 aircraft.

Ryanair is furious and has referred to the agreement as a "stitch-up" orchestrated by the German government in order to strengthen flag carrier Lufthansa and therefore intends to refer the matter to the EU competition authority.

A spokesperson for the German government has however made it clear that it expects the European Commission to approve the deal.

Bouncing pound

THE pound has recovered slightly against the euro following a drop when Chief EU Brexit negotiator Michel Barnier said that no agreement over the 'divorce bill' had been reached.

Without this, it seems highly unlikely that the 27 remaining EU states will agree to any immediate discussion of unfettered access to the EU trade market even though Britain has offered to continue to make contributions during a requested two-year transition period.

Quote of the Week

The situation in Cataluña is worrying because it creates a lot of uncertainty, both for the Catalan economy and for the Spanish economy," according to Maurice Obstfeld, chief economist of the International Monetary Fund.

Sale approved

THE European Commission (EC) today authorised the acquisition of the Spanish highway concessionaire Abertis by Italy's Atlantia, after concluding that its merger would not prevent 'effective competition' in the market.

Budget deficit

AS it has not been able to obtain full approval for its 2018 budget in parliament the Spanish government will have to increase its deficit target. Whilst it had hoped to hit a 2.2 per cent deficit, this is now to be uprated.

ECB support

THE European Central Bank (ECB) is currently injecting €60 billion into the bond market monthly but this will come to an end at the end of the year. It is forecast that it will halve the amount spent in 2018.

Spain and Belarus meet

IN a spirit of expansion of contact the first meeting of the Belarusian-Spanish joint intergovernmental commission on economic and industrial cooperation will be held in Minsk.

The parties will discuss the current state and prospects for cooperation in trade and investment and it is expected that the two countries will sign a

document of understanding following the meeting.

This initiative has been organised following the visit of Belarus' Minister of Foreign Affairs Vladimir Makei to Spain in June 2017 when the two governments signed a memorandum of economic and industrial cooperation which allowed for the establishment of a joint commission.

Telefonica invests millions

MOVISTAR PLUS LOOKS TO WIN TV AUDIENCE

WHEN it was first launched, Telefonica's Movistar Plus looked as if it would be very similar to more mature pay TV operations like Netflix and Amazon but it has been something of a revelation.

Rather than just offer a selection of blockbuster movies and American series, the company has invested large amounts of money in order to produce Spanish orientated transmissions which use national stars and directors acting out well-written stories set in Spain.

In the same way that Scandinavian detective programmes have found an international audience, it looks as if Spain will not be the only country in Europe watching some of these new productions.

BBC4 is running *I Know Who You Are*, produced by Telecinco but the new big budget Movistar Plus productions promise to really get audiences excited and earn money for their producers.

The Spanish have come to pay TV quite late and initially without a huge amount of enthusiasm but recently an episode of its first big series *Velvet Collection* attracted the broadcaster's largest audience ever and it even saw more viewers than *Game of Thrones*.

So confident is the company in its Spanish series that it is currently promoting *Velvet Collection* alongside *The Plague*, *Giants* and *La Zona* at Mipcom in Cannes, the world's largest market place for the promotion and sale of TV series.

All of these big budget series have high production values with some of the most successful Spanish directors bringing original scripts to TV screens with attractive locations ranging from the Rastro Market in Madrid, to the Pyrenees and 16th century Sevilla.

As Telefonica is such a wealthy company, it can afford to take the

risk of producing such impressive properties in order to not only consolidate the position of its subsidiary within the Spanish pay TV market, but also to try to generate income from sales across the world.

One advantage it has is that although the programmes will have to be dubbed for English speaking and European markets, there are some 52 million Spanish speakers in the United States and close to 500 million in Latin and South America, many of whom will enjoy these blockbusters from Spain.

FINANCIAL LIFELINE OR ECONOMIC COLONIALISM

China invests in Silk Road

FOR many years, China remained insular except for excursions into Africa but in 2013 it committed €127 billion a year to its 'one belt, one road' initiative.

With 60 nations involved, it is investing in a number of countries who were part of the ancient Silk Road trail which is supplying much needed investment, although also causing some worries as to whether this is invasion by stealth.

A recent forum held in Thessaloniki, Greece highlighted the importance of Chinese investment in that country and indeed in many of the European Union states although the American government fears that this is a form of financial colonialism.

Spain believes that the growth of trade with China is beneficial to both countries especially as the quality of Chinese goods is increasingly high, whilst there is a market for Spanish produce and know-how in China.

The latest trade figures for 2106

show that Spain earned in excess of €5 billion exporting to China and now that there is a direct rail link between Madrid and Yiwu City in Zhejiang Province, trade can only become easier and busier.

There is an added benefit for Spain as it sits opposite Morocco which is a gateway to the North African market as well as an ideal conduit for Chinese products to be sent to Latin

America and vice versa.

Chinese businessmen have been investing in real estate in the country as well as expanding tourist activities with plans for specially built Chinese orientated hotels and holiday centres plus in a smaller way, every town of any size has at least one Chinese Emporium.

The Spanish government has been trying to make it easier for Chinese business people to invest in the country and also for corporations to bring senior staff and their families to Spain by making applications easier.

Spain has relied to a great extent on investment from Britain with a huge influx of tourists and at one time, the settlement of relatively well-off retirees. With the strengthening of the euro and uncertainty for a post Brexit future, it has to look further afield for investment and partnership.

If the past is anything to go by then Spanish trade links with China can only continue to grow.

New book review

Inflation on the rise

Thanks to the recovering economy, prices of white goods and electrical items have not dropped as much as they did in 2016.



MALLORCAN BUYERS BOYCOT CATALAN GOODS

No cava for Christmas

ALTHOUGH there are close historical links between Cataluña and the Balearics, there appears to be a backlash against Catalan products in Mallorca.

According to the Federation of Small and Medium-sized Companies of Mallorca (PIMEM), there seems to be a significant number of companies deciding to effectively boycott certain products and the most obvious target is producers of cava.

Traditionally, a bottle of cava is included in Christmas hampers but as two of the major producers Codorniu and Freixenet are Catalan-based it appears that they will feel the pinch as their sparkling wine is dropped from the hampers.

A number of Catalan-based companies have already moved their head offices to different provinces but with cava having a Denominacion de Origen contained within Cataluña, a move is unlikely to help.

Amazingly it appears that even brands such as Cola Cao who have their

head office in Valencia are suffering as their production centre is in Barcelona and this decision to cut back on the purchase of goods from the province could have far reaching effects, if this antipathy spreads across Spain.

Many clouds do have silver linings however and there are other Spanish regions which produce sparkling wines which are very similar in style and taste to cava, with perhaps the most popular being Rueda Espumoso from Castilla y Leon whilst Italian Prosecco is becoming much more popular in Spain, especially with expatriates.

It seems likely therefore that those

companies importing various foodstuffs and drinks into Mallorca may have to consider obtaining other sources of supply of similar items but without the Catalanian association.

In some cases this could be easier said than done, especially in the agricultural sector where a number of long standing agreements exist in such areas as supply of almonds and other nuts from producers based in Tarragon and Reus.

Trade bodies representing exporters from Cataluña are anxious to play down the problems and want to be able to continue to supply goods to the Balearics and mainland Spain, but in the short term appear to accept that there will be some resistance to purchase of their products.

Businesses on Mallorca also have to consider whether dock workers and even hauliers would be likely to boycott products being imported from Barcelona and therefore look for other sources of supply with ferries coming from Denia and Valencia.

There is gold in Spain's hills

THE Canadian based Orvana Minerals Corp has announced that it expects considerable growth in gold production at its El Valle and Carles mines in northern Spain for the last quarter of 2017.

With gold currently trading at €1,105 per troy ounce, it forecasts production of 15,201 ounces worth €16.75 million, an increase of 11 per cent over the third quarter figures.

These Spanish mines also produce copper and silver but it is gold which is the major generator of profit and production will increase thanks to an expected upturn in the quantity and quality of ore being extracted.

Annual production of gold from these two mines is estimated as being in excess of 60,000 ounces

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

MANY UK expatriates living in Spain own properties in the UK and have pensions and investments in the UK. They rely on their UK assets to maintain their lifestyles (and those of their families) in Spain. If they can no longer manage their affairs in the UK due to a loss of mental capacity, it can cause many difficulties.

neys to act for you when you are no longer able to act for yourself.

such as a solicitor or a family member or friend.

There are two types of LPA: ‘Health and Welfare’ or ‘Property and Financial Affairs’

An LPA must be made while you have full mental capacity. It is therefore important to make one while you are in good health.

Why should you get an LPA?

You can choose a person or people, who you trust, to act for you when you are no longer able.

If you lose your mental capacity and do not have an LPA, then your family (or the authorities) will have no choice but to make an application to the Court of Protection to appoint a ‘deputy’ to look after your affairs, which can be time consuming and costly.

Will my LPA be recognised in Spain?

Unfortunately there is no international type of LPA which is guaranteed to work in both the UK and Spain.

The advice we give to our clients at Stone King, is that if you have assets in both Spain and the UK, your only safe option is to appoint attorneys in both jurisdictions.

"It has the potential to be the most powerful GT car in the world."

The inaugural Electric GT Championship in 2018, will see racers compete on circuits around Europe. Rounds will consist of a 20-minute practice session, a 60-minute qualifying heat, a day race (60km) and a dusk race (60km).

ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

BMW 5 Series M Sport



BMW's 5 Series executive saloon has been around for more than 40 years and the latest seventh generation models are still dominant in the business sector, offering style, status and dynamic driving.

Current 5 Series models are a little larger and - thanks to extensive use of aluminium - a little lighter than predecessors, and more refined too. Prices start at €39,965 (£35,835) for models that are well-equipped but most buyers are keen to move up the range to versions like my recent test model, the M Sport.

In 2.0 litre 187 hp diesel form, this version costs €43,531 (£39,025) and deliv-

ers a 0-60 kph of just 7.5 seconds and top speed of 235 kph (146 mph). But the stand-out figures are the fuel economy of 25.6 kpl (72.4 mpg) and low emissions of 114 g/km.

The 5 Series M Sport comes with all the standard kit you would expect, including power windows, alloy wheels, air-conditioning and connectivity features but various option packages are available that can soon boost the price - my test model had almost €10,000 (£9,000) worth of extras! These included technology and comfort upgrades, electric sunroof, larger wheels and even soft-close doors.

The cabin, with its wrap-around dashboard, is beauti-

fully designed and immaculately finished, with premium materials throughout and excellent noise suppression. It is very spacious, with rear seat occupants getting almost as much leg-room as in its larger 7 Series stablemate. Boot space, at 530 litres, is much the same as that of main rivals in the saloon sector.

Ride quality is excellent, even with the slightly firmer M Sport suspension, and the standard eight-speed gear-

box is impressively seamless. The smooth effortless driving dynamics make the car a joy to be in.

The exterior of the 5 Series M Sport is elegant and its sporty body quite subtle.

While the overall visual impact is perhaps a little more conservative than comparable models from Mercedes, Lexus and Audi, it still exudes plenty of kerb-appeal - with a distinct hint of potency.

Model tested is UK-specification and equipment levels and prices may vary in other markets.

Colour confusion

Over three quarters of drivers in wrong-coloured cars

A NEW study has revealed that 87 per cent of car owners in Spain are driving the wrong coloured car for their personality.

According to the research conducted by Nissan, approximately a third of the overall survey should have opted for more striking shades, such as orange, instead of traditional grey and black, based on their personality type.

The data, based on 5,000 responses across France, Germany, Spain, Italy and the UK, also found that high-energy colours should top the table.

Of the 1,000 motorists questioned in Spain, 63 per cent of drivers claimed that

colour had impacted their vehicle choice, with the same percentage claiming they had chosen their favourite colour.

Karen Haller, an acclaimed colour psychologist, said: "Social

factors come into play with colour choice. For example, in times of economic uncertainty, it's common for people to play it safe and pick a car with a neutral palette; such as black, white or grey.

High energy colours signify energetic, fun and optimistic traits.

"So I'm not surprised that two-thirds of motorists are driving more conservative shades.

"Cars with high energy colours signify energetic, fun and optimistic traits within someone's personality. White is associated with simplicity, perfection and being in control, while blue is a calm colour loved by people who value integrity."

In Spain however, 62 per cent of those questioned drive more traditional coloured cars, such as white, black, grey and silver, 24 per cent of respondents currently drive a grey vehicle and 17 per cent a black car.

In comparison, only 56 per cent of UK motorists questioned drive more traditional coloured cars, with 18 per cent driving black cars and just 10 per cent grey.

Haller continued: "Often colour choices are based around aspirations, and black is often seen as aspirational, associated with high-end technologies and innovative brands. "It may be that far from playing it safe, they are choosing what they perceive as the finer things in life."

Citroën launch new SUV

CITROËN have revealed they are launching a new SUV vehicle.

Following the unveiling of the C5 Aircross at the Shanghai Motor Show in April, the car giants have now announced the new C3 Aircross.

Inspired by the C-Aircross concept revealed

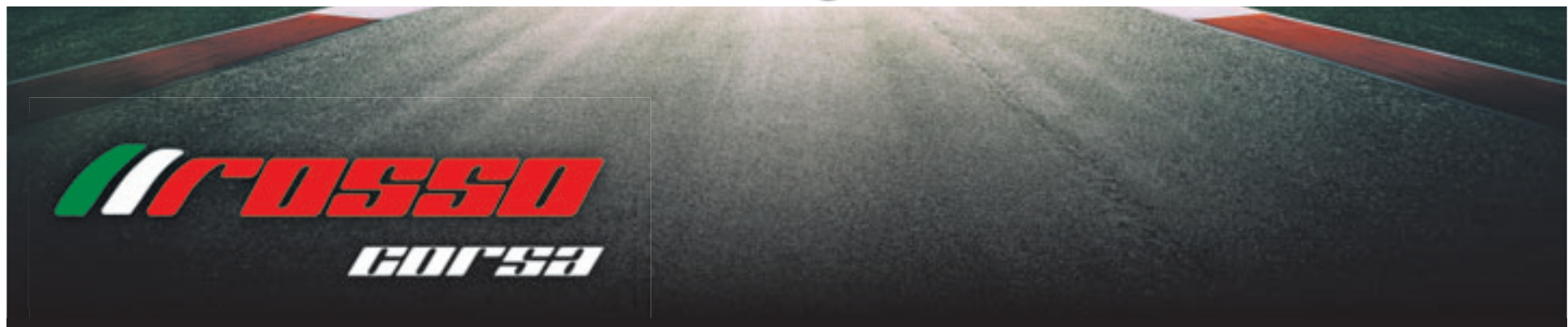

Porsche on-demand

German giant reinvents the wheel

ON-DEMAND Porsches are now available in an American pilot project. In exchange for a monthly charge, the German giant will deliver a Porsche model of the customer's choosing to their home, or any other location.

The pilot is being rolled out in the southern American city of Atlanta. Drivers can choose between two different membership plans. For \$2,000 (€1,700) a month they have access to eight Porsche models, including the Cayenne and 718 Boxster.

For \$3,000 (€2,500) a month almost the entire Porsche collection is at their disposal, with on-demand access to 22 models, including the top of the range Carrera S, Panamera 4S, and classic 911.

Ordering a Porsche is as simple as ordering a pizza. Customers

will have their Porsche app on their smart phone. They can pick a model, delivery spot and time frame.

A businessman looking to make a splash at a meeting might order a flashy sports model. But if he's taking a road trip with the family might prefer a roomier Cayenne.

"Our Strategy 2025 vision is to be the most aspirational brand in a new era of mobility and con-

sumer expectations," said CEO of Porsche Cars North America Klaus Zellner. "With Porsche Passport, we now offer our customers a simple and flexible driving solution at their fingertips."

Mileage is unlimited, and full insurance included in the monthly fee. Extensive driving and credit checks are carried out on clients.

Porsche Passport is similar to Jaguar's concept of selling steering wheels instead of cars. Drivers would be able to order Jags to the doorstep, then use their personalised wheel with all their preferences, routes, and driving history to enjoy a smoother ride.

Both ideas represent a sea change in the concept of car ownership.

'Alcolyser' anniversary

THE Breathalyser test marked its 50th anniversary this month.

In October 1967 the first alcohol test was performed on a confused driver in Shropshire, England.

Just a day previously Britain's first drink driving act had taken effect.

It made driving with more than 80mb per 100ml of alcohol in the bloodstream illegal.

The new device was dubbed the 'Alcolyser.' It contained a tube filled with crystals.

If they changed colour the driver was hauled down to the station for further testing.

Government ministers faced fierce criticism from drivers. Some considered it an attack on the working class, who were only just beginning to enjoy car ownership.

PASSWORD is no longer the world’s most popular password, but it’s close. This year’s winner is 123456. Followed by 12345678 and perhaps most curiously at number 11, login.

TECH FOR THE TIMID

WHILE the sight of a matador toying with a bull is the iconic image of Spain's obsession with the animal, there are several other controversial festivities which focus on the horned beast.

The most famous is Pamplona, which sees thousands of locals and tourists take to the streets of the city.

The catch: bulls are set free behind the willing runners before being slaughtered in the bullring that very same evening.

This year's event saw almost as many protestors as runners as those for and against the festival clashed.

One of the most controversial bull 'traditions,' is the Toro Embolado... also known as 'the Burning of the Bulls.'

Although rarer these days, the Toro Embolado sees a bull's horns set alight while it runs around attempting to extinguish the flames.

The custom hit international headlines in July this year after a video showed a bull 'commit suicide' by driving itself into a wooden post after its horns had been set alight during a show in Valencia.

And it doesn't stop there. Of the countless other tradi-

tions which protesters are trying to ban, the encierros - which take place in rural communities - are near the top of the list.

Setting a bull free in an open field, dozens of men mount horses or run after the bull on foot, armed with rocks and spears.

The aim is to drive a spear through the bull bringing it to an abrupt stop. In reality the

bull often limps on for much longer than intended, enduring multiple blows before it finally gives in.

With bullfighting on the ropes, campaigners will hope that these traditions - and many more like them - are also given the boot.

Cock and bull story

SAY what you will about bullfighting. But to go into a ring against a 1,000 kg bull armed with no more than a sword and a cloak takes a lot of courage.

This year alone, two matadors have lost their lives in the ring and several more have been injured. The latest to lose his life was legendary matador Iván Fandiño who was gored after tripping on his cape.

Others are more fortunate and live to tell the tale, but suffer life changing injuries.

One of the most famous incidents took place in Madrid earlier this year

where onlookers were left wincing after matador Juan Miguel took a horn to the nether region as he was tossed into the air.

His colleague Frenchman Andy Younes then suffered a catastrophic injury of his own after being thrown into the air before landing on his head as he attempted to tame the bull.

Of Spain's most famous matadors to return to the ring Juan Jose Padilla must top the list. Losing an eye to a bull in 2011, Padilla came back to fight again. However, last year, almost five years since the horrific goring, Padilla was again struck in the face and gored in the same eye socket.

Whether or not Padilla dons the traje de luces again remains to be seen. But no one would blame him if he calls it a day.

To ban or not to ban has long been a matter of debate. Trick or

It is not just the matadors doing the fighting, as those for and against Spain's most controversial tradition engage in verbal sparring outside of the ring. David Noon takes a look at the history of bullfighting and weighs up whether or not Spain should consign the corrida to history.

IT was once considered as ingrained in Spanish culture as tapas or flamenco, but a decade of decline suggests that the corrida's days are numbered.

As the gates are locked on many iconic bullrings across the country, it begs the question of whether or not Spain's controversial tradition can limp on for much longer.

In 2017, where animal rights and political correctness sit on lofty pedestals, the decadence of bullfighting jolts somewhat out of kilter.

And many would argue - and do so, en masse - that bullfighting is fit only for the history books.

Where previously thousands upon thousands of Spaniards took to the plazas de toros in celebration, in their place equal numbers take to the streets to protest in anger.

Each year, fewer and fewer Spaniards openly support the pastime.

A poll carried out earlier this year by the World Animal Protection organisation found that as few as 19 per cent of adults in Spain support bullfighting while 58 per cent are totally opposed to it.

In September 2016, record numbers of protestors lined the streets of Madrid in the largest-ever demonstration against the corrida.

And this year, large, boisterous protests again in Madrid and during Pamplona's bull run have further proven that momentum is swinging in favour of those against bullfighting.

The beginning of the end (if that is where we are headed) took place in Barcelona in 2011, in front of a packed house of nearly 20,000 people at El Monumental.

Top matadors Jose Tomas, Juan Mora, and Serafin Morin lead the corrida, as Cataluña brought the curtain down on bullfighting in the region ahead of a ban coming into force in 2012.

It was an important moment in Spanish history felt far beyond the borders of the ever-headline grabbing Cataluña.

Municipalities across the country have followed in Cataluña's footsteps, with a trickle-down effect leading to bans far and wide.

Nowadays there are dozens of municipal bans on bullfighting across the country. And no doubt more will follow.

It is a reality that was unimaginable in Spain until the last decade.

Even in the bullfighting heartland of Andalucia,

the number of fights has fallen by more than 50 per cent in the past 10 years.

The latest municipality to clamp down on the pastime was the Balearic Islands who voted in a new law that bans the tradition of bulls being slaughtered in the ring.

Fights can still take place as part of the new law, but bulls cannot be killed (how exactly that will play out remains to be seen).

But the 'sport' still boasts a number of high-profile aficionados who rally to keep the tradition alive.

While the number of bullfights is falling in Spain,

WHILE thousands take to the streets to put an end to Spain's most hotly talked about tradition, there are others looking for an alternative way of keeping the custom alive.

For the last two years Santilliana del Mar in Cantabria has enjoyed a successful bull run without bull nor human injury.

Replacing the bulls with men dressed in bull suits, the organisers claim that the event 'keeps tradition alive while ensuring the safety of animals and people.'

More spectacularly, and still with a serious element of danger, one trend gaining steam in Spain is the flight of the bull jumpers.

Armed with nothing more than their reflexes, the Recortadores are put into a ring with a bull and then aim to jump over the oncoming beasts in the style of a high jumper arching his back over the pole.

However, unlike pole jumpers, bull jumpers risk their lives by mistiming the leaps of faith.

And while the tradition dates back more than 500 years, supporters argue that the nail biting spectacle could replace traditional bull fights and maintain Spain's love affair with bulls for years to come.

People have been speaking out against bullfighting for almost 500 years: in 1567, Pope Pius V called for an end to the 'cruel and un-Christian' sport.



some 2,000 events are still held every year in front of packed out stadia.

Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy is perhaps the most powerful supporter of bullfighting.

In 2012, the leader of the country risked a backlash when he overturned a broadcasting ban to bring live coverage of the corrida back to public TV for the first time in six years.

Throughout the years artists, authors, politicians and singers have all voiced their admira-

tion of the tradition.

Pablo Picasso, Orson Welles, Goya, Dalí, Hemingway and the poet Garcia Lorca to name just six were all vociferous in their admiration of bullfighting.

American author Gabriel Garcia Marquez and Spain's top folk singer Joaquin Sabina have both spoken out against 'antitaurinos,' blasting their protests as 'ignorant.'

Holding no punches, Sabina recently claimed that 'art of the antitaurino problem' was that those against bullfighting simply 'can't accept the profound truth

that, without death, there can be no life.' And while there are many more who would support Sabina in her argument, the scales appear to be tipping in favour of those opposed to her views.

The opinions of poets and artists of the past bare little significance when challenged by PACMA's YouTube channel which boasts countless images of animal cruelty.

How far the scales tip and for how much longer the fight goes on remains to be seen. But for as long as there are matadors in Spain, bullfighting will be a topic of much debate, protest and bloodshed.

Theresa May and the tarnished Tories need to get their act together fast!

Prioriat is famous for its

Important lessons learnt in training

AFTER the terrible scenes of fire at Grenfell Estate in London, a routine exercise assumed greater importance as the Gibraltar Fire and Rescue Service conducted a fire training exercise.

The exercise consisted of firefighters conducting a full scale rescue simulation from one of the upper floors within a government owned block of flats using artificial non-toxic smoke and fire hoses.

As this was being held in a building managed by the Housing Department, their officers and those from the Housing Works Agency attended together with observers from the Royal Gibraltar Police.

The exercise was considered to be a success and all parties were in a position to review procedures and policies with regards to fire safety in buildings.

THE Gibraltar Defence Police is to be restructured following a Ministry of Defence review. Whilst the changes may take up to a year to implement, no losses amongst the 72-strong force are expected.

Bids wanted

THE rapidly deteriorating old Queen's Cinema and Hotel site close to Trafalgar Cemetery needs to be redeveloped and the government is currently inviting expressions of interest. Any plan which shows mixed use of possibly another hotel and apartments with commercial properties with car parking will be welcomed.

Zombie alert

A FEW days before Halloween will see the start of the Zombie Apocalypse in Gibraltar. This popular event which gets underway at 6.30pm will see the usual band of walking dead hunting their prey around the Rock.

Indian link

THERE is to be a memorandum of understanding signed by the Securities and Exchange Board of India and the Gibraltar Finance Services Commission in order to promote mutual co-operation and understanding between the two organisations.

Power plant

THE minister with responsibility for Energy, Prof John Cortes made a formal visit to the site of the new power station and Liquid Natural Gas (LNG) plant. Work is proceeding to plan and additional material including LNG tanks are expected in the coming months.

1. There is a problem in a muscle, joint, bone, ligament, organ. . . some form of tissue in the body.

chanics better I suggest watching one (or 10!) of his video lectures (I have several on my blog!).

Now the important part for chronic pain sufferers is this:

Once a pain 'pathway' or route is created in the brain it becomes easier to use.

Think of a neural pathway that would lead to a pain experience as a dirt road. If you get a lot of traffic along

that pathway, eventually the pathway is going to have to get bigger to accommodate it.

So the pathway is widened.

Then it gets paved

Then the pathway becomes a motorway . . .

The more that pathway is used the faster and easier the pain experience happens.

What does this mean for me and my pain?

It means that patients with chronic pain do, genuinely, feel more pain from less stimulation. And this means certain treatments aren't applicable. Patients with chronic pain are more sensitive.

It means a proper, physical assessment is hugely important - when you have chronic pain these pain signals get confused and cover a wider area - so you get more pain, more easily, over a wider area.

It means we need to help teach your body to stop protecting something that doesn't need protecting anymore (that's what pain is - a protection signal!).

JUST when you thought avocados couldn't increase in popularity - they've become one of the biggest global food trends in the past few years - a Spanish company has now launched a 'low-fat' version of the creamy green fruit.

Isla Bonita, the fruit and vegetable innovators who are behind this product, claim that

the new 'light' avocado contains 30 per cent less fat than normal avocados. Allegedly, they also ripen faster and turn brown slower than the normal type. It's also supposed to taste juicier.

While avocados are incredi-

bly good for you - the fruit is packed with dietary fibre, magnesium, vitamin E and potassium - they are also high in fat.

This prompted Isla Bonita to create this new type of avocado, which is also bound to be

popular among the impatient types who hate having to wait for their creamy fruits to ripen.

However, when consumed in moderation, normal avocados are still incredibly good for you as the fat they contain is actually 'good' fats that help lower cholesterol and improve heart health. They also contain more potassium than bananas and are high in antioxidants.

Dieticians recommend that you consume half an avocado at most per day because the fat content is so high. This would make the new 'low-fat' avocado a game changer as unpeeled avocados usually turn brown by the next day so it often seems like a waste if you only eat half.

Avocados can be substituted into meals in a variety of ways to make them healthier. They make a tasty alternative to mayonnaise in sandwiches or in salads.

You can even swap butter for avocados when baking. This immediately substitutes all the bad saturated fat with good monounsaturated fat. Just take care that you adjust some of the other ingredients so the bake comes out moist enough.

Hip pain

THIS week we've asked the doctor about hip pain, a common problem for many especially as the colder months descend.

What are the most common causes of hip pain?

There are many things which can cause hip pain. The most common is osteoarthritis of the hip, when the components of the joints like bones and tendons degenerate over time. Other common causes are infections or injuries.

Many elderly people seem to suffer from hip pain. Is it something which we will all suffer in the end, in other words, is there no way to avoid it?

Over time deterioration of the hips is inevitable and osteoarthritis is bound to appear. This appearance can, however, be delayed or the severity reduced with certain rehabilitation exercises and by avoiding being overweight and following a balanced diet.

How can hip pain be cured, is there any medication?

Pain-killers, anti-inflammatory medication and muscle relaxers can be used to help keep the pain under control. Physiotherapy is also vital to help control the symptoms.

Are there any specific exercises to help prevent or improve the pain?

There are different exercise routines which can help to control the pain and stop it from progressing. Yoga and pilates exercises and certain exercises in the swimming pool, especially low impact ones, can help a lot.

Will surgery be necessary in the end?

Sometimes and with the pass of time the damage produced is so severe and causes so many symptoms, especially pain and mobility limitations, that surgical intervention is required. This often consists of implanting a prosthesis.

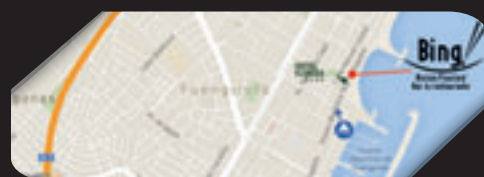

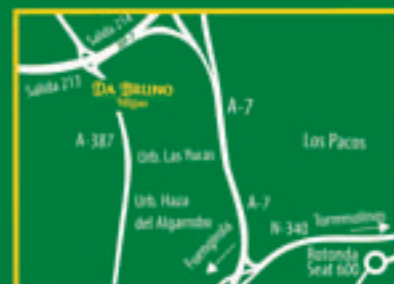

CONSIDERED one of the best wines for seafood, Albariño can also be an excellent aperitif.

High quality and light bodied, most of the Spanish Albariño wines are labelled from Rias Baixas in the cooler and wetter area of Galicia that has sandy granite soils ideal for this grape.

In Galician, the name comes from albar, albo, meaning 'white, whitish.'

However, Albariño is also grown in Portugal and has additionally started to spread to the West Coast of USA, South America and New Zealand, with the grapes similar in taste to Pinot Gris, Chenin Blanc, and dry Riesling.

Believed to have been brought to Iberia from France by Cluny monks in the 12th century, Albariño is light with alcohol levels of 11.5-12.5 per cent.

Adding cheer for seafood lovers

With a strong aromatic intensity it is loved for its high acidity, refreshing citrus flavours (lemons, limes, pear, grapefruit,

honeysuckle, nectarine, apricot and mango), dry taste, and slight saltiness.

To maintain its acidity and fruity aromas it is best consumed one to two years after the vintage, although Albariño wines are known to age for five to seven years.

As well as complementing seafood, its acidity and slight bitterness works well alongside white meats and with citrus and/or aromatic herb dishes, and it is also fun to experiment Albariño with Vietnamese and Thai cuisine.

Moderately priced labels (€3 - 7) are produced by Xovial; Bardesano; Freixas; Pazo das Estrelas by Lagar de Cervera and Vagalume by Luzada Xil.

Strawberries on a tree, seems unlikely but...

ONE of the fascinating things about gardening is the variety of plants that are available from various regions around the world. Here in the Mediterranean there are a number of lesser-known plants that make great ornaments, produce sweet-smelling flowers and provide fruit. One of my favourites is the Strawberry tree (*Arbutus unedo*).

You can see the tree growing wild in its native habitats in oak forests in zones below 800 metres in Spain. It has also become domesticated and can be seen in gardens as a feature tree due to its cinnamon coloured bark and deep green foliage being most attractive and highlighted in autumn with bunches of scented white waxy vase shaped flowers in clusters and dangling fruits that ripen individually from green to yellow and finally red when mature over a long period of time.

The fruit resembles a strawberry hanging from the tree but the similarities end there. It does not taste at all like a strawberry. It requires an acquired taste to appreciate and is not a fruit that you usually would eat many of. It is a delight to sample a few on occasions as an alternative to the more com-

mon fruits available, if only to try something different.

If you have a tree or can source the fruit it makes wonderful jams with a unique tinge to the taste. It needs the fruit to be fresh to

use as the fruit deteriorates quickly once off the tree. Only the soft red fruit is fully ripe and the fruit ripens gradually at different times on the tree making it difficult to collect significant numbers at one time.

This makes it tempting to pick some nearly ripe to make up volume for making jams but it does reduce the quality of the jam. Some people prefer to collect the fruit regularly from the ground as they fall once fully ripe. Overripe fruit can be intoxicating as they ferment.

This is why it is very difficult to find the preserves and nearly impossible to buy the fresh fruit in good condition. If you are able to grow the tree you will have a rare flavour to add to the larder. The fruit can be made into a compote, syrup, puree, glaze, jams, jellies, ice cream flavouring and converted into wine and spirits.

It is commercially used to make liqueur and wine in Sardinia and Portugal. The tree, the Madroño tree in Spanish, is featured on the coat of arms for Madrid being hugged by a bear so it is also bearly loved in Spain.

It is an interesting addition to the garden and can grow in a large container. It does not like to be transplanted or moved so it should be located permanently in a partly shaded zone. It is a pioneering and understorey tree that only grows to around five to 10 metres over many decades. It is drought tolerant to survive Mediterranean summers but needs watering to get established.

IF your garden isn't exactly a vast roaming plain, abundant with space for you to explore all your gardening fantasies, there are several things you can do to maximise space in a smaller plot.

Thinking outside the box is actually the best way to make the most of your garden's boundaries and can help to create an oasis in the smallest of spaces.

An easy way to trick the eye into thinking your garden is bigger than it is, is to plant all your shrubs and flowers in

close proximity. This will blur the colours and dimensions to a stunning effect, giving your garden a more natural vibe.

Aim to have your tallest plants at the back or around the edges of your garden and then work down to your smallest shrubs.

A potted herb garden is a great feature of smaller gardens as not only will it look

pretty and smell great, it is also a great way to maximise space. Nothing quite beats us-

ing your own herbs when you're cooking and they're also beneficial to the natural


ecosystem.

Creating plant structures out of bamboo or other trellises can also help to maximise surface area and create a secret garden vibe. Covering these structures with exotic surface plants, such as trumpet vine, will really help to add a wow factor.

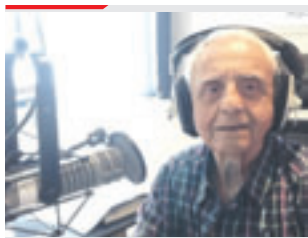

I THOUGHT that this week I would write about my weekly show on Talk Radio Europe from 10-11am.

My team consist of Nazli, our vet from the Pointer Clinic Estepona, and Celia Haddon, an expert on small animals especially cats. Celia was the pet agony aunt for the UK *Telegraph*. This week Rona Brown sat in for Celia who is taking a climbing holiday.

Rona Brown is known for her work on movies *Fish Tank* (2009), *Creation* (2009) and *Gorillas in the Mist* (1988).

This week The Boris Bulletin

from Barrie Nathan about his cat Boris who is a she!

“Our morning schedule is as follows. Boris waits for me to a ablute in my bathroom, she then comes in and jumps onto her cushion which lives on the corner of the bath (I prefer bathing to showering), she then waits patiently for me to get in the bath, which may be as long as a 30 minute delay. Only when I get into the bath does she raise herself from her cushion, leans into the tub and starts drinking the hot water. She knows the water level is substantially higher after my entry! After about two minutes she gets off the bath and goes back to bed.”

Nazli mentioned that there are reports of dog poisoning and to be extra careful in dog parks and recommends a muzzle. I know most of you will say ‘my dog does not like a muzzle’, believe me they get used to a muzzle and it will protect your dog from putting his nose into trouble. Give the muzzle a try not once but a few times and of course rewards when taking off.



MUZZLE: Dogs will become accustomed.

Nazli says: “My vet has asked me to bring a urine sample of my dog, how do I do this?” You will need a clean container. For the female dog you can use a ladle, so that you do not have to crouch down when she squats, and pour the urine into the container, (do wash the ladle thoroughly afterwards). The male dog will sniff an

area, position himself and lift up his leg to urinate. Place the container in the flow of the urine, fill the container and then wash your hands. If you have problems then why not go to a professional for help at Pointer Clinic dog school.

Mic Martin, the famous trainer from Dog Borstal at the BBC joined us for the second half of the show. I

would mention that those attending Dog Borstal, if they get it wrong they can expect a punishment as Mic says “It’s the owners fault, not the dog.”

They can get ‘press-ups’ or running round the field, etc.

Mic worked in the Police Special Services as an instructor and certainly knows all about dogs from scent and rescue work. Mic spoke about the relationship one must have with the dog which is of prime importance. Like me he dislikes harnesses and flexi leads and explained a few simple rules “Stop the dog licking you” as germs can be passed.

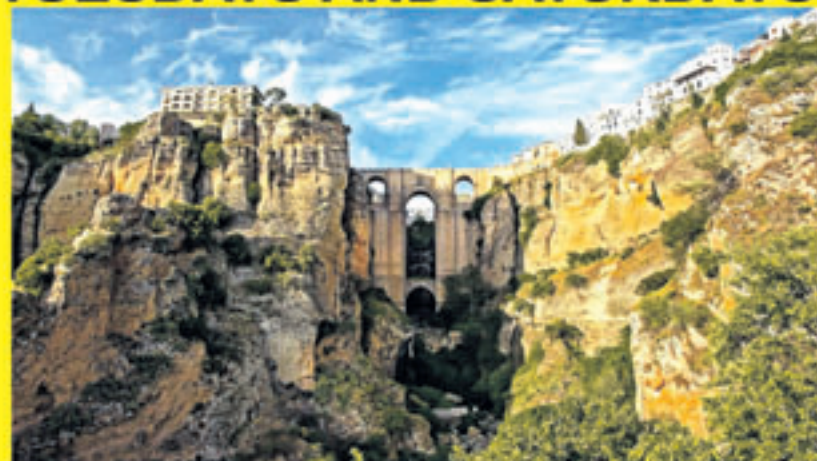

SPAIN'S Jon Rahm makes his first professional appearance on Spanish soil - when the World No 5 plays in the third edition of the Andalucia Valderrama Masters, hosted by the Sergio García Foundation, during October 19-22.

"I'm a competitor and I believe a lot in myself. The more I enjoy myself - the better I play," said Rahm.

A plethora of top golfers will line-up in the Andalucia Valderrama Masters, including Rahm's fellow Spaniards Sergio Garcia and Rafa Cabrera Bello.

Tommy Fleetwood, Justin Rose and Ross Fisher are the leading English trio, with Northern Ireland's Rory McIlroy among players ranked in the top 10 on the European Tour.

Rahm will return to the European continent in the wake of victory in his last regular European Tour appearance - a six-shot win - at the Dubai Duty Free Irish Open in July.

"I prepare well for a tournament. If I don't believe in myself who else

will?" said Rahm.

In 2012 Rahm won the Campeonato de España Junior Y Boys, Campeonato Absoluto País Vasco, followed by the 2014 ASU Thunderbird Invitational, Campeonato de España Absoluto, Eisenhower Trophy (individual title).

After the 2016 US Open, Rahm turned professional and in August 2017, Rahm reached a career-high ranking of No 5 in the world after a maiden professional victory on the US PGA Tour at the end of January.

Ahead of the Andalucia Valderrama Masters, Rahm, aged two when Valderrama staged the 1997 Ryder Cup, said: "I really look forward to playing in front of the Spanish fans."

Rahm, who went to European Tour venues as a teenager in a bid to get players' autographs, said: "My first round at Valderrama was five years ago.

"I played the Sotogrande Cup - with the Spanish national team. My

Rahm added: "Valderrama is one of the best layouts I have played - visually attractive and wonderfully maintained.

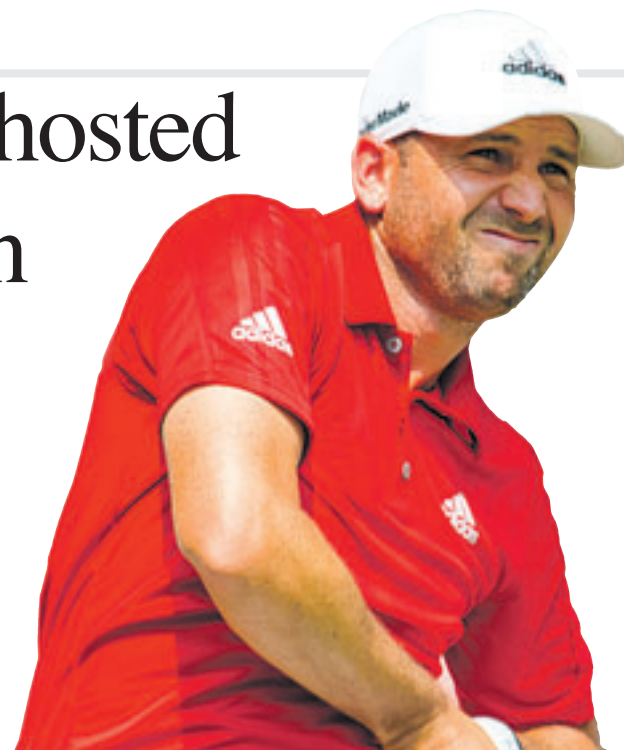
"I am extremely fortunate that my dreams are coming true. In October, I will be proud to play my first professional event in Spain.

O'Brien eyes £4.3m prize money at Ascot QIPCO British Champions Day in record

ASCOT hosts the QIPCO British Champions Day - the richest race day in the British calendar on Saturday October 21 - with Irish trainer Aidan O'Brien eyeing £4.3 million prize money.

The world's top sprinters, over six furlongs, long distance horses, over two miles, and the fillies and mares, over 1m 4f, will be racing.

Champion trainer O'Brien is looking for one more winner in the QIPCO British Champions 2017 Series to achieve a record haul.

Flat racing's showcase event sees the world's leading trainers, horses and top jockeys at Ascot in the finale of the 2017 European Flat racing season.

The QIPCO British Champions Series features the QIPCO British Championship (Group 2) with a prize fund of £350,000; The QIPCO Sprint Stakes (G1) with a prize fund of £600,000; and The British Champions fillies and mares (G1) with a prize

Richard Hannon trained Barney Roy, winner of the St James's Palace Stakes, is entered in the QIPCO British Champions Day.

"I'm not sure which race he goes for. He's very effective over a mile - a mile and a quarter isn't a problem either," said Hannon.

Richard Fahey trained Ribchester is also eyeing the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes on QIPCO British Champions Day, the richest Group 1 mile race run in Europe.

Churchill is just one horse who could oppose Ribchester - among a record pre-race entry of 48 horses for the £1.1 million race.

Classic winners Churchill and Winter could face opposition in UAE 2000 Guineas and Derby winner Thunder Snow, who won the Group 1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly.

"Thunder Snow has been a star horse for me this year. I would like to run him at Ascot on QIPCO British Champions Day," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor.

"We will look at both the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes and the QIPCO Champion Stakes," added bin Suroor.

The Queen Elizabeth II Stakes (G1) has a prize fund of £1.1 million; The QIPCO Champion Stakes (G1) has a prize fund of £1.3 million and the Balmoral Handicap has a prize fund of £250,000.

Capri, who won the William Hill St Leger at Doncaster in September, gave O'Brien his 10th winner in this year's Series. And O'Brien will be raiding Ascot this year - eyeing a repeat of bagging £5,648,937 in the 2016 Series.

O'Brien, who has won £5,153,693 in the 2017 Series, has a plethora of entries, including 2015 Gold Cup winner Order of St George.

Caravaggio, who won the Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot in June, is entered in the QIPCO British Champi-

ons Sprint Stakes.

O'Brien has duplicate entries in the QIPCO British Champions Fillies & Mares Stakes, including Winter, Rhododendron, Seventh Heaven and Hydrangea, prior to the final stage declarations.

In the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes O'Brien's pre-race entries includes duo Churchill and Winter, who have won four Classics between them, along with Alice Springs and Roly Poly.

Ballydoyle based O'Brien could run Churchill in the QIPCO Champion Stakes, be-

ing a pre-race entry, alongside Highland Reel and Winter.

The QIPCO Champion Stakes, Europe's richest mile-and-a-quarter contest, sees the entry of Enable, ranked third best in the world in the wake of winning the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes ahead of Ulysses, Idaho and Highland Reel, all of who are entered.

"It's a great day - a meeting we've had success at in the past. We hope to be supporting the whole day with runners," said Gosden.
