Disgraced

Brits jailed over sickness scam

A British couple who made fake sickness claims against a Mallorca hotel have been jailed.

The landmark case saw Deborah Briton, 53, and her partner Paul Roberts, 43, convicted on multiple counts of fraud by Liverpool Crown

They are the first Brits to be jailed amid a growing holiday sickness scandal that saw Mallorca hotels forced to pay out €50 million last year.

The couple boasted online about their holidays on the island packed with 'sun, laughter and fun.' But they both wept as Judge David Aubrey sentenced Briton to nine months in prison, and Roberts to 15 months

He described their claim as a "complete and utter sham."

The pair tried to claim more than €20.000 for fake gastric illnesses after two stays at the Globales America hotel in 2015 and 2016.

Their action was brought against travel operator Thomas Cook, If successful some €30,000 in legal fees would also have to be paid. Travel operators typically recoup all losses directly from the

Roberts was inspired to make the claims following a 'conversation in the pub,' said his lawyer. He left convinced that they wouldn't be detected.

But their social media boasts about how 'fab' their holidays were directly contradicted later claims that their time in Mallorca was 'ruined.'

A Thomas Cook spokesman said: "The sentences handed down today demonstrate how serious the issue of fraudulent illness claims has become.'

Foreign secretary Boris Johnson has previously spoken on the scandal, saying "These claims make it more expensive for Brits to go abroad. They should not have to shoulder the inevitable rising costs of bogus accusations made by a small minor-

Black X protest

A LARGE black letter 'X' was painted on the door of four young Valencians who share a home together in

The ominous graffiti came after they hung a Valencian flag from the balcony with a pro-independence message.

They have since raised a complaint with the police, claiming that they and other neighbours felt intimidated.

The pro-Valencian independence message was put out amid the furore over Cataluña's separation

The young activists also distributed literature around the apartment

building promoting independence for Valencia which, like Cataluña, has a distinct culture from Castilian Spain.

After the huge 'X' was marked on the door, they put notices up in the lift and corridors to inform neighbours as to what happened. The next day they were all torn down.

When more were put up, someone took them down and set them alight in the corridor.

Though preferring to remain anonymous, the foursome have told local media that they denounced the vandals "for attacking people for ideological rea-

THOMAS COOK has announced it is setting up a new airline that will be based in Palma de Mallorca. Flights are planned to begin in early 2018, with at least three Airbus A320 planes.

Leaders' arrest sparks fury

THE pressure is on for Catalan leader Carles Puigdemont to confirm whether or not he declared independence following the region's referendum vote.

On Monday he wrote a letter to Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy calling for a meeting 'as soon as possible.' Rajoy had previously warned that Madrid would suspend Catalonia's autonomy if independence was declared.

The arrest of two senior pro-independence activists, who were sent to prison without bail, has also heightened tensions between Madrid and Cataluña. Thousands took to the streets in Barcelona. Cataluña's regional capital, on Tuesday to protest the ruling.

Jordi Cuixart and Jordi Sanchez were accused of stirring up major demonstrations in the run-up to the controversial independence referendum on October 1 which Madrid regards as illegal.

Wild fires tamed

WILD fires destroyed far less land than is normal this summer. Roughly 88 hectares were torched across the islands over the season, around half the 170 hectares destroyed last year.

Formentera was the worst hit of the islands this year, with almost 30 per cent of its countryside affected.

Balearic environment minister Vicenc Vidal chalked the good news down to sterling efforts from more than 350 firefighters. Awareness and quick thinking among local citizens was also "very important," he said.

Nevertheless, Vidal said it was shocking that more than half of all 2017's fires were caused by negligence and could easily have been prevented. More alarmingly, around a quarter were the result of arson.

"Now it is time to move from extinguishing to prevention," argued Vidal. He also expressed his sympathies with the victims of the wild fires in Galicia and Asturias.

Metro catches fire

A METRO train caught fire early on Tuesday morning, forcing the evacuation of 60 passengers. Panic ensued at the Son Costa-Son Fortesa metro station when the fire erupted on the ceiling of the train.

Two passengers suffered from smoke inhalation and were taken to hospital. Preliminary investigation indicates that an electrical fault was to blame.

The blaze began at around 7.45am, during the busy morning period. The station quickly filled up with smoke and much of the metro, and surrounding train lines stopped operating for several hours.



Drug lords own up

A GANG of 33 drug-dealing Dominicans pled guilty to reduce the total jail time of 358 years requested by prosecutors. They were caught with 2.5 kilos of pure cocaine and €70,000 cash during a police raid that also uncovered a pristine drugs processing lab and a money laundering network.

Flight stats

GERMANS dominated Palma airport's September statistics with 1.27 million passengers. Brits came a distant second with 835,700, though it was a healthy 6.6 per cent increase on last year. In total, 3.6 million people passed through security in September, a rise of 11 per cent on

Pretty penny

CRISIS in Cataluña could cost the Balearic Islands €154 million. A possible delay in Madrid's 2018 budget would see the region get a repeat of its much lower 2017 funding. Balearic treasurers have already begun planning how to spend the extra money.

Toxic air

OZONE pollution in the Balearic Islands is worse than anywhere else in Spain. Ozone levels are above legal limits more than 100 days a year in Palma and Alcudia. The pollutant causes breathing problems and kills 1,800 people per year prematurely in Spain.

Green space

NEW buildings are to be banned on the Calvia coast as the council promises to knock down unused buildings to create an extra 86 hectares of green space. Four large parks will be built in Magaluf, Illetes, Santa Ponsa and Son Ferrer.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...33

Spain is the second most mountainous European country after Switzerland, and is also home to one of its most active volcanoes.



Mountain high and totally breathtaking!

SPAIN was once described as "just one big mountain," and although a tongue in cheek comment by a 19th century English travel writer, the nation does possess an extensive and rugged landscape.

With five main mountain ranges - the Sistema Central, the Cordillera Cantabrica, the Pyrenees, the Cordillera Subbetica and the Sierra Morena - more than 20 per cent of the country's land is 1,000 metres or more above sea level. The individual daddy of them all, though not on the mainland, is Mount Teide, in Tenerife on the Canary Islands,

More than 3,700 metres high, Teide is the country's most visited natural attraction and the highest - and still active volcano in the world outside Hawaii when measured from peak to ocean floor.

Teide last erupted in 1909 but it is still rated as being unstable leading many to speculate an eruption is imminent.

A study eight years ago by Granada University found that Teide is likely to violently erupt and the International Association of Volcanology also labelled it a 'decade volcano,' one with a destructive history that is close to populated areas.

The highest mountain peak on mainland Spain is Mulhacen, at more than 3,400 metres, just over two hour's drive from Granada in the Sierra Nevada range.

Not only does the Sierra Nevada offer opportunities to do extreme sports, but it is also a popular ski resort.

Larrun, at nearly 1,000 metres, was used by the French troops when they sought shelter from Wellington's forces during the 19th century Peninsular War.

Many interesting sights can be found sky-high including St Mary's church on Mount Naranco and the Montserrat monastery in Cataluña, which is more than 1,000-years-old.



Galician disaster

AFTER the terrible news of the wildfires devastating parts of California and killing at least 41, things have moved closer to home with four killed in Galician fires.

It appears that at least some of those fires were started by arsonists and that they have been made worse by strong winds hitting the coast of Spain due to the fallout from Storm Ophelia.

Fire brigades in the region have found it incredibly difficult to cope with more than 100 separate active fires and this problem has been made worse by the fact that many brigades have laid off firefighters now that the dangerous summer period was thought to have passed.

Prime Minister Rajoy travelled to his home province as a show of support for those who had been affected by the fires and to grieve alongside the families of a 78-year-old man who died trying to protect his animals and a 70-year-old man who was fighting the fires near his home in Vigo.

Two bodies were also discovered in a burnt out car but at the time of writing the victims had not been identified.

Our hearts and best wishes must go out to all of those affected by these fires and those in the emergency services fighting them.

We hope however that if any of these fires have been started deliberately that those responsible realise the pain and suffering that they have caused.

"I don't know anything about it," he responded to questions about internet searches on his computer for weapons, making silencers, hired assassins, and personal searches on his wife and his lover.

val twice with a revolver.

"Someone set me up," he told the court, when confronted with fingerprint evidence and gunpowder residue found in his bag.

Identified as AMN, the defendant is accusing of murdering Angel Abad, aged 61. in Porto Cristo in June 2014.

Witnesses told the court that Abad had complained about his tyres being slashed months before his death. He had a brief romantic affair with the defendant's wife but they were separated at the time.

Trafficker not terrorist

Suspected spy claim accepted

JUDGES acquitted a man accused of being a terrorist. They believed his story that he was in fact trying to infiltrate Daesh to help the Spanish intelligence services

Mohamed Harrak had been described as a 'clear threat to Spanish security' in court. Prosecutors wanted him to face 10 years in prison for inciting terror attacks on Spain and communicating with Daesh members in Syria.

But Harrak always maintained his innocence. He claimed to be working on behalf of an intelligence agent codenamed Angel.

His task, he claimed, was to infiltrate Daesh and report valuable information back to his spymasters.

Emails sent to Spanish intelligence appeared to back up his story. Angel was never identified, but the court found sufficient evidence to

suggest Harrak, a 26-yearold Moroccan national, considered himself a spy for Spain, even if he was misguided.

He spoke of his desire to join the Spanish Foreign Legion. Judges also considered evidence that he volunteered to help trap drug

dealers in his Palma neighbourhood for the Guardia

But this couldn't justify the 15 grams of cocaine found in his possession when an anti-terror squad arrested him. Harrak was sentenced to three years in prison for drug possession.

The low-cost airline described the incident as a 'smell event.' The foul smell came courtesy of a hydraulic fluid leak.

It proved too much for passengers and crew to stomach all the way to Luton airport. The flight was diverted to Paris and the co-pilot given oxygen

by medics before being taken away in an ambu-

One child vomited due to the smell, making matters even worse for passengers.

"We can confirm the captain took the decision to divert to Paris due to some passengers and crew feeling unwell," said an easyJet spokesman. "He took the decision as a precaution only and the aircraft landed routinely."

Mysteries of space

A TEAM of scientists based in Mallorca have once again helped shock the world with a new discovery. The Balearic University crew are already credited with helped prove Einstein's theory of gravitational waves.

In doing so they were an integral part of a Nobel Physics prize-winning effort from more famous scientists across the pond in America, including Rip Thorne. Their discovery of four gravitational waves emitting from the collision of two black holes proved foundational to Thorne's research.

This time the Balearic group, led by Sasha Husa and Alicia Sintes, detected more gravitational waves coming from the spectacular collision of two neutron stars in a distant galaxy 130 million years ago.

Gravitational waves are invisible yet incredibly fast ripples in the fabric of space, much like in a pond when a stone is thrown in. They were first predicted by Einstein in 1916, but it took 100 years and a dedicated Palma-based team to confirm their existence.

"Nature has been very generous to us by placing this special event at a remarkably close distance to Earth," said Alicia Sintes.

She and her team are now in Madrid to report on their findings.

Tourist tax divied up

Controversial allocation leaves greens furious

By Matthew Elliott

ALMOST half of this year's tourist tax bounty will be used to fix heritage sites and roads. At least €20 million of the €49 million collected so far will help spruce up various estates, historic sites and major public

The rest will be divided between water infrastructure, with €8 million, unspecified 'innovation,' which commands another €8 million, and rural projects. Dozens of smaller initiatives will also benefit

from the tax windfall.

By the end of the year some €64 million will have been collected from tourists paying up to €2 per night for the privilege of staying in Mallorca. Other projects tipped for investment include restoring the Es Trenc natural park and the Temple Towers in Palma.

The decision is ultimately made by members of the Sustainable Tourism Commission.

Green groups GOB and Terrferida have already stated their opposition to the planned allocation. Each argue that the tax should be used exclusively for environmental and sustainability purposes.

Investment in water and electric irrigation has been cut by half compared to last year, in favour of heritage sites.

Across the islands the state is also investing heavily in acquiring large public estates from landowners. These will be converted into natural retreats or tourist attractions in their own right. The stand out example is the Es Canons farm in Arta, which will be purchased for €4.8 million.

Poverty strikes

Even workers struggle to make ends meet

ONE in five Balearic residents are in poverty according to a shocking new analysis. The State of Poverty Report from a group of local NGOs also revealed that roughly 50,000 people, around 5 per cent of the population, survive on less than ≤ 342 a month, or just ≤ 11 a day.

An estimated 19.1 per cent of the population, some 211,000 people, struggle to make ends meet on a daily basis. Although worse than European standards, the figure still represents an improvement on 2015, when 7

per cent more people struggled.

From a wider perspective more than half of the Balearic population find themselves struggling by the end of the month. Women are also far more likely to experience poverty than men.

Just over 40,000 people are believed to suffer serious deprivation, with food and shelter considered luxuries. Among the most worrying findings was that 21,000 pensioners are in 'severe poverty' and another 97,000 hovering dangerously on the poverty line.

Releasing the report, the collective of NGOs, stressed that the Balearic Islands actually enjoyed the greatest GDP growth among Spanish regions last year. "It is clear that simple GDP and poverty rates do not go hand in hand," the writers concluded.

Low levels of 'labour intensity' are part of the problem. Some 58,000 employed workers don't get enough shifts to cover basic needs. The report identified the new phenomenon of the 'poor worker,' who finds themselves in poverty despite having a job.

Chainsaw attackers jailed

TWO men who threatened another with a chainsaw were jailed for two years. The thugs put a chainsaw to their victim's neck and forced him to call his mother and girlfriend, who immediately wired € 5,244, everything they had, to a bank account.

A third suspect was involved but was let off with a suspended one year sentence and fine due to his drug addiction. The other two have been sent to a mainland prison after being found guilty of assault and extortion.

The incident took place in Manacor. The victim had just arrived on Mallorca and was spending the night at one of the assailant's homes, whom he was vaguely acquainted with.

He was violently assaulted during the attack. The men used knives and lighters to torture him before bringing out the chainsaw. It took him weeks to recover from his injuries.

Luxury comes first

Families pushed out as villas dominate

REAL ESTATE on Mallorca is favouring villas, fincas and townhouses, at the expense of large apartment blocks suitable for housing multiple families.

With wealthy foreigners and Spaniards pumping money into the island's lucrative property market, developers see little incentive in building flats or other affordable housing.

In 10 of Mallorca's busiest towns there is not one single development project for multi-family residences.

The key problem is the scarcity

of available land. With prime acreage commanding a high price on the island, building one multimillion villa for sale to a wealthy buyer makes more sense than trying to sell two dozen apartments and complying with tougher building regulations.

From January to September, permission was granted to build 1,178 new homes. Single-family homes, such as villas, fincas and townhouses, accounted for 696.

The rest were in apartment buildings and come nowhere close to

meeting demand for housing among local families and first time buyers.

Prices are rising quickly too, which is good for many, but adds to the frustration felt by local working families. At an average of €2,108 per square metre, across Spain it is €1,530. Prices have shot up by 3.3 per cent in the past year, compared to the Spanish average of 1.6 per cent.

Palma is now the fifth most expensive city in Spain with an average per square metre price of €2.307.

Fury over donkey death

A DONKEY died after becoming trapped in a fence after it was broken by a hiker. An Escorca farmer has demanded justice from the council and urged more protection for farms against roaming tourists and hikers.

The popularity of the Tramuntana mountains for walkers and other explorers has frustrated traditional farmers, who struggle to protect their land from invasion.

Escorca mayor Antoni Solivellas responded to the donkey's death by instructing forest agents to keep their eyes open. But he realises it is an extremely difficult challenge.

"The problem is not surveillance, but it would be impossible have to personnel needed to cover such a huge area," he said. "It is a problem of education and basic respect for other people's property, something that appears to be missing lately."

Other farmers have raised the alarm over damage to fences, fruit trees, and mushrooms. People leaving gates open, then sheep, goats and other cattle escaping, is a major concern.

The mayor has pledged to maintain the openness of the area and right of passage enjoyed by hikers. But new signposts are expected to make it clear that they have responsibilities too.





The German government injected €150 million into the company by way of a loan in order to allow it to continue to operate for a short period of time whilst the liquidators negotiated possible sales of assets with interested parties.

It has now been revealed that an agreement has been reached whereby it would purchase the Austrian

leisure travel airline Niki (founded by former racing driver Niki Lauda), the LGW German regional airline and 20 aircraft.

Ryanair is furious and has referred to the agreement as a "stitch-up" orchestrated by the German government in order to strengthen flag carrier Lufthansa and therefore intends to refer the matter to the EU competition authority.

A spokesperson for the German government has however made it clear that it expects the European Commission to approve the deal.

Bouncing pound

Telefonica invests millions

MOVISTAR PLUS LOOKS TO WIN TV AUDIENCE

WHEN it was first launched, Telefonica's Movistar Plus looked as if would be very similar to more mature pay TV operations like Netflix and Amazon but it has been something of a revelation.

Rather than just offer a selection of blockbuster movies and American series, the company has invested large amounts of money in order to produce Spanish orientated transmissions which use national stars and directors acting out well-written stories set in Spain.

In the same way that Scandinavian detective programmes have found an international audience, it looks as if Spain will not be the only country in Europe watching some of these new productions.

BBC4 is running I Know Who You Are, produced by Telecinco but the new big budget Movistar Plus productions promise to really get audiences excited and earn money for their producers.

The Spanish have come to pay TV quite late and initially without a huge amount of enthusiasm but recently an episode of its first big series Velvet Collection attracted the broadcaster's largest audience ever and it even saw more viewers than Game of Thrones.

So confident is the company in its Spanish series that it is currently promoting Velvet Collection alongside The Plague, Giants and La Zona at Mipcom in Cannes, the world's largest market place for the promotion and sale of TV series.

All of these big budget series have high production values with some of the most successful Spanish directors bringing original scripts to TV screens with attractive locations ranging from the Rastro Market in Madrid, to the Pyrenees and 16th century Sevilla.

As Telefonica is such a wealthy company, it can afford to take the

risk of producing such impressive properties in order to not only consolidate the position of its subsidiary within the Spanish pay TV market, but also to try to generate income from sales across the world

One advantage it has is that although the programmes will have to be dubbed for English speaking and European markets, there are some 52 million Spanish speakers in the United States and close to 500 million in Latin and South America, many of whom will enjoy these blockbusters from Spain.

FINANCIAL LIFELINE OR ECONOMIC COLONIALISM China invests in Silk Road

FOR many years, China remained insular except for excursions into Africa but in 2013 it committed €127 billion a year to its 'one belt, one road' initiative.

With 60 nations involved, it is investing in a number of countries who were part of the ancient Silk Road trail which is supplying much needed investment, although also causing some worries as to whether this is invasion by stealth.

A recent forum held in Thessaloniki, Greece highlighted the importance of Chinese investment in that country and indeed in many of the European Union states although the American government fears that this is a form of financial colonialism.

Spain believes that the growth of trade with China is beneficial to both countries especially as the quality of Chinese goods is increasingly high, whilst there is a market for Spanish produce and know-how in China.

The latest trade figures for 2106

show that Spain earned in excess of €5 billion exporting to China and now that there is a direct rail link between Madrid and Yiwu City in Zhejiang Province, trade can only become easier and busier.

There is an added benefit for Spain as it sits opposite Morocco which is a gateway to the North African market as well as an ideal conduit for Chinese products to be sent to Latin

America and vice versa.

Chinese businessmen have been investing in real estate in the country as well as expanding tourist activities with plans for specially built Chinese orientated hotels and holiday centres plus in a smaller way, every town of any size has at least one Chinese Emporium.

The Spanish government has been trying to make it easier for Chinese business people to invest in the country and also for corporations to bring senior staff and their families to Spain by making applications easier.

Spain has relied to a great extent on investment from Britain with a huge influx of tourists and at one time, the settlement of relatively well-off retirees. With the strengthening of the euro and uncertainty for a post Brexit future, it has to look further afield for investment and partnership.

If the past is anything to go by then Spanish trade links with China can only continue to grow.

Inflation on the rise

SEPTEMBER inflation figures show that General Consumer Price Index (CPI) has increased by 1.8 per cent which is 0.2 per cent higher than the August result.

The bulk of the increases are due to higher costs of fruit and vegetables and a minor rise in non-alcoholic

MALLORCAN BUYERS BOYCOT CATALAN GOODS No cava for Christmas


ALTHOUGH there are close historical links between Cataluña and the Balearics, there appears to be a backlash against Catalan products in Mallor-

According to the Federation of Small and Medium-sized Companies of Mallorca (PIMEM), there seems to be a significant number of companies deciding to effectively boycott certain products and the most obvious target is producers of cava.

Traditionally, a bottle of cava is included in Christmas hampers but as two of the major producers Codorniu and Freixenet are Catalan-based it appears that they will feel the pinch as their sparkling wine is dropped from the

A number of Catalan-based companies have already moved their head offices to different provinces but with cava having a Denominacion de Origen contained within Cataluña, a move is unlikely to help.

Amazingly it appears that even brands such as Cola Cao who have their

EWN online Join the conversation on our Facebook page head office in Valencia are suffering as their production centre is in Barcelona and this decision to cut back on the purchase of goods from the province could have far reaching effects, if this antipathy spreads across Spain.

Many clouds do have silver linings however and there are other Spanish regions which produce sparkling wines which are very similar in style and taste to cava, with perhaps the most popular being Rueda Espumoso from Castilla y Leon whilst Italian Prosecco is becoming much more popular in Spain, especially with expatriates.

It seems likely therefore that those

companies importing various foodstuffs and drinks into Mallorca may have to consider obtaining other sources of supply of similar items but without the Catalonian association

In some cases this could be easier said than done, especially in the agricultural sector where a number of long standing agreements exist in such areas as supply of almonds and other nuts from producers based in Tarragon and

Trade bodies representing exporters from Cataluña are anxious to play down the problems and want to be able to continue to supply goods to the Balearics and mainland Spain, but in the short term appear to accept that there will be some resistance to purchase of their products.

Businesses on Mallorca also have to consider whether dock workers and even hauliers would be likely to boycott products being imported from Barcelona and therefore look for other sources of supply with ferries coming from Denia and Valencia.

There is gold in Spain's hills

Minerals Corp has announced that it expects considerable growth in gold production at its El Valle and Carles mines in northern Spain for the last quarter of 2017.

With gold currently trading at €1,105 per troy ounce, it forecasts production of 15,201 ounces worth € 16.75 million, an increase of 11 per cent over the third quarter figures.

These Spanish mines also produce copper and silver but it is gold which is the major generator of profit and production will increase thanks to an expected upturn in the quantity and quality of ore being extracted.

Annual production of gold from these two mines is estimated as being in excess of 60,000

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Guidance on speeding

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

ACCORDING to Article 51 of the Reglamento General de Circulacion: "The maximum fixed speeds for conventional roads which do not pass through urban areas may only be exceeded by up to 20kph by saloon cars and motorcycles whilst overtaking other vehicles travelling at lesser speeds."

This clause first came about to allow cars to pass a slower moving vehicle in the shortest time possible, allowing an increase in speed in order to execute the move quickly.

The word 'execute' being a potential reminder though that overtaking is one of the most dangerous manoeuvres we can carry out. In the event of a head-on collision, our speed is added to that of the oncoming vehicle, and so a crash where two vehicles are travelling at 90 kilometres per hour is the equivalent of crashing at 180 kilometres per hour, when the two speeds are combined.

But the rule does exist and does allow drivers to go over the speed limit, but only in certain circumstances. In order to simplify the explanation, let us break it down to see when this clause can actually apply.

Firstly, we can see that it can only ever apply to cars and motorcycles, so we know the sort of vehicle the allowance applies to.

Secondly, we need to look at the types of roads the clause can apply to. We can see that it is not permitted on motorways. We can also see that it does not apply on dual carriageways. So, we can exclude faster moving roads

Next, we see that the clause does not apply in towns, or cities for that matter, so we can exclude those routes too.



OVERTAKING: The rules explained.

Now, all that we are left with is so-called conventional roads, single carriageway, with no central reservation and outside of towns. But, then we have to take away those for which a speed limit already applies, because, that speed limit overrules this clause too.

In other words, you are NOT permitted to exceed the speed limit for any reason, including overtaking

On a conventional road, the maximum permitted speed on a road where no other signs indicate a restriction, and there is a hard shoulder of more than 1.5 metres, is 100 kilometres per hour. On other conventional roads, the maximum permitted speed is 90 kilometres per hour.

This is what we might refer to as the National Speed Limit in UK terms. Incidentally, these roads do sometimes have an R-301 sign.

Finally, we must add sections of roads where overtaking is either prohibited or unadvisable, then that too is an overruling element.

So, the only road where this clause can apply is a conventional road, where no overruling speed limit applies and where overtaking is allowed.

bungalows, Telefonica always asks for permission to run cables along the front of the bungalows but these people do not. I have also e-mailed the Internet company office and asked if they are insured in case of an accident while they work on our roof but have received no reply. What can I do?


When he veers away from the script and adlibs he has other cast members cowering, hoping they are not going to be targeted.





Whatever you do, don't accept your web browser's kind offer to Save a password when you input it into a site. All it takes is for your computer to be stolen and there goes your life. Not to mention your electric toothbrush tracker.

PASSWORD is no longer the world's most popular password, but it's close. This year's winner is 123456. Followed by 12345678 and perhaps most curiously at number 11.

Passwords really are a pain, and the bane of our technological age, as we stagger under growing torrents of the things. Even my new electric toothbrush has a password so that I can track my brushing performance, when what I actually need is a life.

And we really are so hopeless at choosing good passwords. Even the simplest computer these days can crack a six-letter password in seconds, putting your whole identity at risk if you've decided to go with hola or cheers because you can't be buttocked to come up with something better.

If there's anything we're even worse at than thinking-up passwords, it's remembering them. Grave New World

SOMETIMES it feels as if I went to sleep in one world and then woke up in another bizarrely different copy. I have roots in the UK and Spain and both countries seem to be going through incredible changes with no-one able to actually take control or influence

Here in Spain we are back to deep divisions with a minority of the people in Cataluña apparently desperate to commit what appears like financial suicide by declaring independence despite the fact that they would be thrown out of the European Union and could well be invaded by Spanish troops. With the National government unlikely to enter into meaningful negotiations, there are only two possible outcomes, either Cataluña backs down or it will be controlled from Madrid which is likely to infuriate even the local anti-independence groups.

Meanwhile Theresa May is not having a good time with regards to Brexit and so little progress has been made that she had to travel to Brussels for an intimate dinner with Jean-Claude Juncker with both accompanied by their chief negotiators David Davis and Michel Barnier. The results of the meeting however were somewhat predictable as it was agreed that negotiations need to speed up but following their dinner which was undertaken in a 'constructive and friendly atmosphere,' there were no new agreements reached.

Basically paraphrasing Jerry Maguire, Brussels simply said "Show me the money" and there is unlikely to be a trade deal before an agreement is reached about the amount that Britain has to pay in the 'divorce' settlement. It does rather look as if we are heading towards a 'Grave New World.'

WHILE the sight of a matador toying with a bull is the iconic image of Spain's obsession with the animal, there are several other controversial festivities which focus on the horned beast.

The most famous is Pamplona, which sees thousands of locals and tourists take to the streets of the city.

The catch: bulls are set free behind the willing runners before being slaughtered in the bullring that very same

This year's event saw almost as many protestors as runners as those for and against the festival clashed.

One of the most controversial bull 'traditions,' is the Toro Embolado... also known as 'the Burning of the Bulls.

Although rarer these days, the Toro Embolado sees a bull's horns set alight while it runs around attempting to extinguish the flames.

The custom hit international headlines in July this year after a video showed a bull 'commit suicide' by driving itself into a wooden post after its horns had been set alight during a show in Valencia.

And it doesn't stop there. Of the countless other tradi-

ing to ban, the encierros which take place in rural communities - are near the top of the list.

Setting a bull free in an open field, dozens of men mount horses or run after the bull on foot, armed with rocks and spears.

The aim is to drive a spear through the bull bringing it to an abrupt stop. In reality the

Each year, approximately 250,000 bulls are killed in **bullfights** around the world.

> bull often limps on for much longer than intended, enduring multiple blows before it finally gives in.

> With bullfighting on the ropes, campaigners will hope that these traditions - and many more like them - are also given the boot.

Cock and bull story

SAY what you will about bullfighting. But to go into a ring against a 1,000 kg bull armed with no more than a sword and a cloak takes a lot of courage.

This year alone, two matadors have lost their lives in the ring and several more have been injured. The latest to lose his life was legendary matador Iván Fandiño who was gored after trip-

ping on his cape.



Others are more fortunate and live to tell the tale, but suffer life changing injuries.

One of the most famous incidents took place in Madrid earlier this year

where onlookers were left wincing after matador Juan Miguel took a horn to the nether region as he was tossed into the air.

His colleague Frenchman Andy Younes then suffered a catastrophic injury of his own after being thrown into the air before landing on his head as he attempted to tame the bull.

Of Spain's most famous matadors to return to the ring Juan Jose Padilla must top the list. Losing an eye to a bull in 2011, Padilla came back to fight again. However, last year, almost five years since the horrific goring, Padilla was again struck in the face and gored in the same eye socket.

Whether or not Padilla dons the traje de luces again remains to be seen. But no one would blame him if he calls it a day.

To ban or not to ban has lon Trick or

It is not just the matadors doing the fighting, as those for and against Spain's most controversial tradition engage in verbal sparring outside of the ring. David Noon takes a look at the history of bullfighting and weighs up whether or not Spain should consign the corrida to history.

T was once considered as ingrained in Spanish culture as tapas or flamenco, but a decade of decline suggests that the corrida's days are numbered.

As the gates are locked on many iconic bullrings across the country, it begs the question of whether or not Spain's controversial tradition can limp on for much longer.

In 2017, where animal rights and political correctness sit on lofty pedestals, the decadence of bullfighting jolts somewhat out of kilter.

And many would argue - and do so, en masse - that bullfighting is fit only for the history books.

Where previously thousands upon thousands of Spaniards took to the plazas de toros in celebration, in their place equal numbers take to the streets to protest in anger.

Each year, fewer and fewer Spaniards openly support the pastime.

A poll carried out earlier this year by the World Animal Protection organisation found that as few as 19 per cent of adults in Spain support bullfighting while 58 per cent are totally opposed to it.

In September 2016, record numbers of protestors lined the streets of Madrid in the largest-ever demonstration against the corrida.

And this year, large, boisterous protests again in Madrid and during Pamplona's bull run have further proven that momentum is swinging in favour of those against bullfighting.

The beginning of the end (if that is where we are headed) took place in Barcelona in 2011, in front of a packed house of nearly 20,000 people at El Monu-

Top matadors Jose Tomas, Juan Mora, and Serafin Morin lead the corrida, as Cataluña brought the curtain down on bullfighting in the region ahead of a ban coming into force in 2012.

It was an important moment in Spanish history felt far beyond the borders of the ever-headline grabbing

Municipalities across the country have followed in Cataluña's footsteps, with a trickle-down effect leading to bans far and wide.

Nowadays there are dozens of municipal bans on bullfighting across the country. And no doubt more will follow.

It is a reality that was unimaginable in Spain until the last decade.

Even in the bullfighting heartland of Andalucia,

the number of fights has fallen by more than 50 per cent in the past 10 years.

The latest municipality to clamp down on the pastime was the Balearic Islands who voted in a new law that bans the tradition of bulls being slaughtered in

Fights can still take place as part of the new law, but bulls cannot be killed (how exactly that will play out remains to be seen).

But the 'sport' still boasts a number of high-profile aficionados who rally to keep the tradition alive.

While the number of bullfights is falling in Spain,

banned in Catalonia and the Canary Islands but is still legal in most other parts ' of Spain, as well as in Portugal, parts of southern France and some South

American countries.

Throughout the years artists, authors, politicans and singers have all voiced their admiration of the tradition.

Pablo Picasso, Orson Welles, Goya, Dalí, Hemingway and the the poet Garcia Lorca to name just six were all vociferous in their admiration of bullfight-

American author Gabriel Garcia Marquez and Spain's top folk singer Joaquin Sabine have both spoken out against 'antitaurinos,' blasting their protests

Holding no punches, Sabine recently claimed that 'art of the antitaurino problem' was that those against bullfighting simply 'can't accept the profound truth that, without death, there can be no life.' And while there are many more who would support Sabine in her argument, the scales appear to be tipping in favour of those opposed to her views.

People have been

The opinions of poets and artists of the past bare little significance when challenged by PACMA's YouTube channel which boasts countless images of animal cruelty.

How far the scales tip and for how much longer the fight goes on remains to be seen. But for as long as there are matadors in Spain, bullfighting will be a topic of much debate, protest and bloodshed.

Fighting to keep



the custom alive

WHILE thousands take to the streets to put an end to Spain's most hotly talked about tradition, there are others looking for an alternative way of keeping the custom alive.

For the last two years <mark>Santilli</mark>ana del Mar in Cantabria has enjoyed <mark>a</mark> successful bull run without bull nor human injury.

Replacing the bulls with men dressed in bull suits, the organisers claim that the event 'keeps tradition alive while ensuring the safety of animals and peo-

More spectacularly, and still with a serious element of danger, one trend gaining <mark>steam in Spain is the</mark> flight of the bull jumpers.

Armed with nothing more than their reflexes, the Recortadores are put into a ring with a bull and then aim to jump over the oncoming beasts in the <mark>style of a high jumpe</mark>r arching his back over the

However, unlike pole jumpers, bull jumpers risk their lives by mistiming the leaps of faith.

And while the tradition dates back more than 500 years, supporters argue that the nail biting spectacle could replace traditional bull fights and maintain Spain's love affair with bulls for years to come.


Seeds and nuts are high in fat which mean they take longer to digest. Keep them to a minimum though; otherwise they might leave you feeling slow and sluggish.

THIS week we've asked the doctor about hip pain, a common problem for many especially as the colder months descend.

What are the most common causes of hip pain?

There are many things which can cause hip pain. The most common is osteoarthritis of the hip, when the components of the joints like bones and tendons degenerate over time. Other common causes are infections or injuries.

Many elderly people seem to suffer from hip pain. Is it something which we will all suffer in the end, in other words, is there no way to avoid it?

Over time deterioration of the hips is inevitable and osteoarthritis is bound to appear. This appearance can, however, be delayed or the severity reduced with certain rehabilitation exercises and by avoiding being overweight and following a balanced diet.

Pain-killers, anti-inflammatory medication and muscle relaxers can be used to help keep the pain under control. Physiotherapy is also vital to help control the symp-

Will surgery be necessary in the end?

Walking works wonders this Saturday



Luxe landlord opportunities

By Matthew Elliott

BECOMING a landlord is far more profitable in today's Spain than placing money in a bank account. The average annual profitability on buy-to-let properties is now a very healthy 5.7 per

The sizeable return is up considerably on just a few years ago. In 2013 it was 4.8 per cent. Since then the rental market has flourished thanks to young professional and students.

Returns vary fairly dramatically by region. In Cataluña it is 6.6 per cent, making it the most profitable region to lease property in the country.

Yet the Catalan capital Barcelona offers a cautionary tale for landlords. Rent prices have soared so quickly that they have now plateaued. In 2017 landlords can expect an annual return of 5 per cent less than the Catalan regional average.

Those looking to invest in buy-to-let property should strike while the iron is

hot, before rents hit a natural peak

Meanwhile, buyers interested in owning luxury property might be among the few investors excited by the possibility of Catalan independence.

Luxury real estate agent Uxban has warned of 'buyer flight' from Barcelona, should independence become a reality.

In 2016 more than 80 per cent of the €1 million plus homes sold were purchased by foreigners. Many chose Barcelona property to get a Spanish Golden Visa and a foothold in the European Union. Both perks which could disappear in the event of separation.

Uxban expect any such crisis to result in a mass flogging of luxury real estate in the city at heavily discounted prices. "This collapse in the price of luxury property would be far more pronounced than that experienced in London after the Brexit vote", said the

Prices in London's richest areas, such as Chelsea, have plummeted by more than 10 per cent since June 2016.

Summer sales hit budding heights bringing optimism

SALES soared in Spain over the summer, with records showing the best three months for sales since 2011, in May, June and August.

In August, sales crossed the 40,000 threshold again, seen as an indicator of the market's ro-

Another good sign is that the increase in new home sales surpasses that of second-hand homes. Used homes are still in the ascendancy when it comes to total volume, but new home sales are increasing faster.

New home sales shot up by 21.3 per cent in August, the impressive pace of increase is only set to continue until Spain's thirst for new homes is quenched.



Per capita, the Valencian community, which includes most of the Costa Blanca, clocked the highest number of sales in August. It averaged 163 sales per 100,000 residents,

compared to 152 in the Balearic Islands, and 125 in Andalucia. which registed the highest volume with 8,225 sales in just one month.

Nationwide, there is near

unanimity in the property sector that total sales will surpass the half million mark in 2017. Next year's projections are even more optimistic, at around 650,000 sales.

Future dream home reality

HUNDREDS of property experts discussed the future of the Spanish market at the Fotocasa Real Estate Conference

Fotocasa, one of Spain's biggest property portals, gathered academic, sales and business experts to detail the trends expected over the next few

Among the consensus conclusions was the prediction that home prices in large cities will continue to increase until at least 2021.

Keynote speaker Gonzalo Bernardos, an economics professor at Madrid University, said unemployment will soon drop to around 10 per cent, ushering in an era of greater consumer confidence and purchasing power.

This will weaken the rental market and spark sales, he said, while confidently stating that there is no looming risk of another property bubble.

Head of Studies at Fotocasa, Beatriz Toribio, agreed that the market was stable. She said stricter financing deals both lenders and consumers.

In recent years the Spanish have changed their opinion about renting, with younger generations in particular more open to the market, yet they still dream of buying a home.

Much of the conference was dedicated to sales advice for real estate agents. They were encouraged to view a client relationship as a life-long partnership, rather than simply slamming the door after a sale.



Strawberries on a tree, seems unlikely but...

ONE of the fascinating things about gardening is the variety of plants that are available from various regions around the world. Here in the Mediter-

ranean there are a number of lesser-known plants that make great ornaments, produce sweet-smelling flowers and provide fruit. One of my favourites is the Strawberry tree (Arbutus unedo).

You can see the tree growing wild in its native habitats in oak forests in zones below 800 metres in Spain. It has also become domesticated and can be seen in gardens as a feature tree due to its cinnamon coloured bark and deep green foliage being most attractive and highlighted in autumn with bunches of scented white waxy vase shaped flowers in clusters and dangling fruits that ripen individually from green to yellow and finally red when mature over a long period of time.

The fruit resembles a strawberry hanging from the tree but the similarities end there. It does not taste at all like a strawberry. It requires an acquired taste to appreciate and is not a fruit that you usually would eat many of. It is a delight to sample a few on occasions as an alternative to the more common fruits available, if only to try something different.

If you have a tree or can source the fruit it makes wonderful jams with a unique tinge to the taste. It needs the fruit to be fresh to use as the fruit dete-

riorates quickly once off the tree. Only the soft red fruit is fully ripe and the fruit ripens gradually at different times on the tree making it difficult to collect significant numbers at

This makes it tempting to pick some nearly ripe to make up volume for making jams but it does reduce the quality of the jam. Some people prefer to collect the fruit regularly from the ground as they fall once fully ripe. Overripe fruit can be intoxicating as they ferment.

This is why it is very difficult to find the preserves and nearly impossible to buy the fresh fruit in good condition. If you are able to grow the tree you will have a rare flavour to add to the larder. The fruit can be made into a compote, syrup, puree, glaze, jams, jellies, ice cream flavouring and converted into wine and spirits.

It is commercially used to make liqueur and wine in Sardinia and Portugual. The tree, the Madroño tree in Spanish, is featured on the coat of arms for

Madrid being hugged by a bear so it is also bearly loved in

It is an interesting addition to the garden and can grow in a large container. It does not like to be transplanted or moved so it should be located permanently in a partly shaded zone. It is a pioneering and under storey tree that only grows to around five to 10 metres over many decades. It is drought tolerant to survive Mediterranean summers but needs watering to get established.







In the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes O'Brien's pre-race entries includes duo Churchill and Winter, who have won four Classics between them, along with Alice Springs and Roly

Ballydoyle based O'Brien could run Churchill in the QIP-CO Champion Stakes, being a pre-race entry, alongside Highland Reel and Winter.

The QIPCO Champion Stakes, Europe's richest mileand-a-quarter contest, sees the entry of Enable, ranked third best in the world in the wake of winning the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes ahead of Ulysses, Idaho and Highland Reel, all of who are entered.

"It's a great day - a meeting we've had success at in the past. We hope to be supporting the whole day with runners," said

Richard Hannon trained Barnev Roy, winner of the St James's Palace Stakes, is entered in the QIPCO British Champions Day.

"I'm not sure which race he goes for. He's very effective over a mile - a mile and a quarter isn't a problem either," said

Richard Fahey trained Ribchester is also eyeing the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes on QIPCO British Champions Day, the richest Group 1 mile race run in

Churchill is just one horse who could oppose Ribchester among a record pre-race entry of 48 horses for the £1.1 million

Classic winners Churchill and Winter could face opposition in UAE 2000 Guineas and Derby winner Thunder Snow. who won the Group 1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly.

"Thunder Snow has been a star horse for me this year. I would like to run him at Ascot on OIPCO British Champions Day," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor.

"We will look at both the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes and the QIPCO Champion Stakes," added bin Suroor.

SPAIN'S Jon Rahm makes his first professional appearance on Spanish soil when the World No 5 plays in the third edition of the Andalucia Valderrama Masters, hosted by the Sergio García Foundation, during October 19-22.

"I'm a competitor and I believe a lot in myself. The more I enjoy myself - the better I play," said Rahm.

A plethora of top golfers will line-up in the Andalucia Valderrama Masters, including Rahm's fellow Spaniards Sergio Garcia and Rafa Cabrera Bello.

Tommy Fleetwood, Justin Rose and Ross Fisher are the leading English trio, with Northern Ireland's Rory McIlroy among players ranked in the top 10 on the European Tour.

Rahm will return to the European continent in the wake of victory in his last regular European Tour appearance - a six-shot win - at the Dubai Duty Free Irish Open in July.

"I prepare well for a tournament. If I don't believe in myself who else will?" said Rahm.

In 2012 Rahm won the Campeonato de España Junior Y Boys, Campeonato Absoluto País Vasco, followed by the 2014 ASU Thunderbird Invitational, Campeonato de España Absoluto, Eisenhower Trophy (individual title).

After the 2016 US Open, Rahm turned professional and in August 2017, Rahm reached a career-high ranking of No 5 in the world after a maiden professional victory on the US PGA Tour at the end of January.
