Drugs high on a roof



FIELD OF DRUGS: Two arrested.

NATIONAL POLICE officers have arrested two Dutch nationals - aged 35 and 46 - in connection with alleged drug trafficking in Lorca.

Investigations focused on houses in country areas that had been rented to non-Spanish EU citizens, based on previous intelligence that suspected the owners were growing marihuana indoors.

A subsequent collaboration between National and Local Police in Lorca then visited the suspected locations and found two plantations of the drug.

They found a very sophisticated system of irrigation and environmental controls.

The arrested men had even set up a cultivation area on the roof of one of the warehouses in an attempt to hide the plants from any internal search.

In total, 4,300 marihuana plants were seized.



No Brexit disruption

Spanish minister interviewed by BBC

SPAIN'S foreign minister, Alfonso Dastis, has said British expats will be allowed to continue living in Spain even if Britain doesn't strike a Brexit deal with the European Union.

The senior government minister speaking on BBC One's Andrew Marr Show, said, "I do hope that there will be a deal.

"If there is no deal we will make sure that the lives of ordinary people who are in Spain, the UK people, is not disrupted.

"As you know, the relationship between the UK and Spain is a very close one in terms of economic relations and also social exchanges.

"Over 17 million Brits come to Spain every year and many of them live here or retire here and we want to keep it that way as much as possible."

Spain is host to the largest number of British citizens living in the EU (308,805) and just over a third are aged 65 and over, according to the Office for National Statistics.

Prime Minister Theresa May is continuing to negotiate withdrawal issues with the EU, including a financial

Halloween has crept into the Spanish psyche in recent years, and is now the spooky event of the year

reeping it real

LIKE other religious holidays including Christmas and Easter, Halloween has become more commercialised in Spain over the years and has moved away from its religious origins.

While 20 years ago trick-or-treaters were a rare occurrence, stores these days are packed with themed sweets and creepy costumes from September onwards.

Another reason Halloween has become more popular is that the next day, typically known as All Saints' Day, is a national holiday. Children and adults now take advantage of partying the night away in spooky costumes without worrying about going to work or school the next morning.

Many Spanish cities still hold their own unique celebrations around this time, however, which keep the holiday separate from the profit-oriented notion of Halloween made popular by the US.

One of the best places to visit at this time of the year is Cadiz. Although not actually linked to Halloween, on October 31 they celebrate the 'Fiesta de Tosantos'. Locals create over-the-top market stall displays depicting all the latest political and social scandals and hold concerts and street performances across the city.

A more sinister event is celebrated in the small Catalan village of Sant Feliu Sasserra. During the two-day 'Witch Festival,' residents pay tribute to the 23 women accused of witchcraft during the Spanish Inquisition and sentenced to death.

nuts, sweet wine and traditional Catalan 'panellet' cakes. In Castile and León, people commemorate the holiday by baking traditional pastries called 'Huesos de Santo' which they bring to the graves of loved ones.

Feelin' spooky

These days, Halloween is now closely associated with the Mexican holiday 'Dia de los Muertos' (Day of the Dead) on November 1. While Spain has traditionally celebrated 'Dia de los Santos' (All Saints' Day) on this day, the increased popularity of the Mexican festival means that people are beginning to combine traditions from the two.

It is becoming more common to see people perform traditional 'Day of the Dead' rituals such as decorating graves with sugar skulls and gifts.



Hampered by the campers

MOTOR HOMES have once again descended on the Playa de los Locos beach in Torrevieja, which has become an unofficial camping site for more than 30 vehicles.

In 2016, the city council tried to persuade tourists not to use the area to park their caravans as it doesn't provide the necessarv services and they are taking up a significant amount of space. They also promised to put up signs demonstrating where it is forbidden for these campers to park, but these have yet to materialise.

According to national traffic regulations, owners of caravans can park where they choose so long as they don't block the area around the vehicle with tables. chairs or other obstructions.

Allegedly, most are parked

within the boundaries allowed by the regulation, but some are believed to be spilling over into prohibited public spaces.

As there are no specific parking areas for caravans in Torrevieja except private campsites, parking by the Punta del Salaret cliff has become popular due to its strategic location by the Playa de los Locos beach.

The recent good weather is also believed to have encouraged the increase in numbers. which now amount to more than 30 carayans

However, although the tourists are very mindful of the environment, the spot has become crowded with visitors who often stay for weeks.

Local media sources claim the majority of these visitors are international, often Dutch, German, British or Swedish retirees who are exploring Spain.

Government urged to take their toll

MAJOR construction companies across the country are urging the Spanish government to place tolls on all motorways, including those that are currently free. Their argument is that this will raise funds for the maintenance and construction of new public roads.

The proposals are for 10c per kilometre and would affect 320 kilometres of state owned motorways in the Murcia region. This would mean €5 to drive from Murcia to Cartagena, €7 to Lorca and €8 to Alicante. The cost to Madrid would be €40. In the case of the route between Murcia and Cartagena. there is no alternative except using stretches of the old N-301.

The proposal would also affect stretches from Cieza to Cartagena (A-30), Santomera to Puerto Lumbreras (A-7), the Blanca to Yecla crossing (A-33), Puerto Lumbreras to the border with Granada (A-91) and Cartagena to San Pedro del Pinatar (AP-7).

Results of the poll in Italy

COINCIDENCE or not, referendums have been held in two formerly secessionist parts of Italy calling for greater autonomy from the Italian state.

Lombardy with Milan as its main city and Veneto with Venice as its most famous icon both saw votes exceeding 90 per cent calling for a larger percentage of tax payments to remain in the regions rather than see it be sent to Rome.

The turnouts were in excess of 60 per cent in each case and although the results are not binding on central government they are an example of how a legally undertaken referendum can alert government to the wishes of the people.

Interestingly, the two Italian regions are both in the north of the country and like Spain, there is some divide between the wishes, aspirations and expectations of those living in the north and the south.

Whilst it is possible that there will be similar votes in other parts of the European Union, it must be remembered that as recently as 1993, Czechoslovakia split amicably to form two independent republics which both went on to become members of the EU.

The Spanish situation is much more volatile but it is to be hoped that the breakdown in communications with Cataluña will be resolved using sense rather than violence from either side



A cleaner and quieter future

ORIHUELA Council is in the process of acquiring a number of new silent street cleaning machines.

These new pieces of equipment will not only reduce the amount of noise when they're used but also save on the costs of petrol that the old machines needed. The department responsible for road cleaning in Orihuela has received many complaints from local people about the noise these 'street blowers' make and have responded to them in this way.

The new blowers will be fully electric and thus save the expense of petrol, and the €21.000 cost will be recovered in the space of 18 months due to those fuel costs. Each contain a battery that has a life of about five years and doesn't need any maintenance

Those operating the new blowers will notice a major difference in the handling of them as they weigh about five kilos less than the old ones.

Port to lose number of cruise ships that visit

THE port of Alicante has suffered a major blow to its future as a cruise ship venue after a major company has taken the city off its itineraries for 2018.

Cruise company Pullmantur Cruises SL - based in Madrid and beginning its operations in the late 1990s - was the first of its kind to pick Alicante as a stopping point during some of its Mediterranean cruises.

Pullmantur, the owner of the ship 'MV Horizon' has decided to follow in the footsteps of Costa Cruises and will in future concentrate on developing Barcelona and the Balearic Islands. In fact, the ship 'Legends of the Mediterranean' has already disappeared from the Alicante programme, and the 'MV Horizon' will make its last visits on Saturdays October 28





For British expatriates, understanding domicile is an important element of estate planning. It is domicile, not residence, that determines your liability for UK inheritance tax. Determining domicile

Domicile is a complex and adhesive UK common law concept. The basic rule is that a person is domiciled in the country in which they have their permanent home - the country regarded as your 'homeland'. However, you can remain UKdomiciled even after living abroad for many years.

There are three types of domicile under English law: domicile of origin; domicile of dependence and domicile of choice.

If challenged by HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC), the onus is on you - or your family inheriting your assets - to prove you

Changing domicile

To acquire a domicile of choice you must be physically present and tax resident in your new country, intend to live there permanently, and not foresee a return to the UK. You need to sever as many ties as possible with

the UK, as HMRC will look for any indication that you see Britain as your homeland and may return one day. Even stating in your will that you wish to be buried in the UK could work against you. Electing for UK succession law to apply over local 'forced heirship' rules could also be a tipping point in combination with other ties to the UK.

Even if you adopt a domicile of choice outside the UK, it can take up to four years to shed a UK domicile for inheritance tax purposes. HMRC may treat you as UK-domiciled if you:

- were UK resident for 15* (previously 17) of the last 20 tax years (*due to change imminently and be backdated to April 2017)
- return to Britain for more than a year (if the UK is your domicile of origin and place of birth)
- move to a third country until you can demonstrate you have

established a new domicile of choice.

The effect of domicile on taxes

Anyone who is deemed UKdomiciled is liable to 40% inheritance. tax on their worldwide assets above the individual tax-free allowance of £325,000 - which is transferable to your spouse or civil partner. By 2020, the phasing in of a new 'family home allowance' will add an extra £175,000 allowance per person, meaning a total potential threshold per couple of £1

Non-UK domiciles are only liable to tax on assets situated in the UK.

Domicile is a complex area of law, particularly for inheritance tax purposes. If you are looking to claim change of domicile, or if there is a significant amount of UK inheritance tax at stake, you should take expert advice specific to your circumstances. Whether or not you have UK domicile status, there are tax planning arrangements available to reduce your liabilities to inheritance and other taxes. Fudge's rescue is the sixth

A SEVERELY malnourished pony stallion showing signs of physical abuse is now in the care of Easy Horse Care Rescue Centre in Roiales.

Rescued from the streets of Algorfa in conjunction with Almoradí police, the pony known as Fudge is the sixth rescued by the sanctuary in five months, confirming an alarming trend of ponies being abandoned in public places.

"When we started the centre nine years ago, we were rescuing animals that had been locked away and left to starve," said Easy Horse Care cofounder Sue Weeding. "Now, they're literally being dumped in the streets."

The influx of ponies is putting the centre under increasing financial pressure as it looks to provide the medical attention and care each abused equine

"They all come to us needing castration and with a whole host of health problems," said Sue. "We pride ourselves on caring for them properly. We don't just give them a bit of food to keep them

The latest rescue, which has gained international attention, was found in a skeletal state, with a massive infection in one eye and showing signs of what could well be deliberate physical abuse.

A visible scar on his neck suggests Fudge suffered a significant blow that left two of his vertebrae broken, causing him to walk with a wobbly gait. Fudge's rescue takes the total number of equines at the sanctuary to 108.



Posidonia, a type of sea grass that is often mistaken for algae, is used by experts to determine the quality of Mediterranean sea water.

were not cleared of the posidonia were able to regenerate quicker and the sea grass was also proven to have improved the general health of the water. The more touristic beaches which are regularly cleaned of the sea plant were also found to have experienced a higher degree of erosion and damage after storms.

The marine plant was also used in another CIMAR study to help prevent the coastal erosion caused by heavy rain in 2016. The research centre tested how well posidonia can absorb water to prevent leaks, and discovered that the areas protected by posidonia were less vulnerable to coastal erosion or damage caused by large downpours of water.



Changes proposed to noise and smoke levels

To get around these laws, businessmen are proposing the installation of special hoods in the kitchens that purifies smoke and fumes thorough a chemical process called Filtronic. Such a system won't need the construction of a chimney that takes smoke outside the building.

Waiting times to be reduced for patients

HOSPITAL authorities in Murcia (SMS) have put together a plan to reduce waiting times for specialists.

They will ask the heads of various departments to modify their work plan to ensure that patients will get their first appointment within a maximum of one week and to schedule a number of tests for the afternoons and evenings rather than just the mornings.

According to data supplied by the SMS, despite the waiting time for surgical interventions reducing by 11 days in the past vear the number of days waiting to see a specialist has increased to 64 days since September 2016. Those awaiting routine tests are waiting, on average, 27 days.



UK police have appealed for the help of expats to help find fraudster Mark George Aklom, who might be back in Spain again.

Acklom, 44, is the subject of a European Arrest Warrant and was named as part of Operation Captura, an appeal launched and run by the National Crime Agency and Crimestoppers.

He's wanted by Avon and Somerset Constabulary for defrauding a woman he was in a relationship with out of £850,000. Acklom allegedly make a number of false representations after starting a romantic relationship with a woman from Bath in January 2012.

The victim stated that Acklom first claimed to work in the banking world in Switzerland and was very wealthy. He then went on to claim he worked for an intelligence agency.

Acklom arranged for the victim to live in one of the properties he claimed to own in Bath. He stated he had cash flow problems that were hindering renovation work, and the victim gave him numerous loans totalling £850,000.

It later transpired that Acklom did not own the property. The victim never received any of her money back.

Aklom has also used the names Mark Conway, Mark Desmond, Marc Ros Rodriguez, Kid Con, Marc Ros and Marc Long. Detective Inspector Adam Bunting, who is leading the ef-

forts to find Acklom, said, "Mark Acklom is a convincing fraudster and we're working hard to locate him as soon as possible.

"We believe he'll be with his wife Maria Rodriguez and their two young daughters, who we know up until last year's appeal, were enrolled in El Limonar International School in the Murcia area of Spain.

"In the days following the appeal he removed his children from the school and together with his wife, he disappeared.

"We have significant concerns about the children's well-being given they were uprooted, with no notice, from their school, friends and family. It's highly likely Acklom will have placed his children in another feepaying school.

The children are aged six and eight. Since the Operation Captura appeal, a photograph was taken by a member of the public of Acklom in Geneva, Switzerland in May but he's not been sighted since.

Now police are issuing details of Acklom's wife for the first time, as they believe she may be assisting him but she isn't the subject of a European Arrest Warrant.

Maria Yolanda Ros Rodriguez, 47, is likely to be with Acklom and may be using the aliases Yolianda Ross, Maria Long, Mary Moss or another name entirely.

DI Bunting added, "Mark Acklom has links through property to Spain and there's been a positive sighting in Switzerland.

"We also have information linking him to Dublin and Italy, but he could be anywhere in Europe. It's possible he may have travelled outside the EU. He's described as 5ft 10ins, of medium build, with dark brown hair and green eyes.

"We're grateful for the ongoing support of the National Crime Agency and our law enforcement colleagues in Europe but we need the help of the media and the public in the UK and Europe to track him down."

Investigators identify almost 800 culprits

NEARLY 800 British tourists have been identified by the Spanish police for claiming compensation in fake food poisoning scams.

The claims were made while the tourists were on all-inclusive holidays in the Balearics.


A police probe was launched last summer after a surge in complaints which caused hotels

to lose more than €60 million.

Weak UK legislation on the issue reportedly made it possible for tourists to claim the full amount of compensation without proof. This meant that tourists were able to file the complaint against the hotel after they returned home, who refused to take the cases to court because of the high legal costs.

Officers have confirmed that nearly 800 tourists acted through more than 70 UKbased law firms. Allegedly, 'lawyers' would pick up clients in the hotels by telling them they could claim the cost of their holiday back by filing a food poisoning complaint.

Some complaints were made three years after the trip.

First reports from the authorities suggest that the car in which they were travelling did not stop at a police check point which is the reason for the officer opening fire but it appears that the driver and passengers dispute this and say that there was no order to stop.

The Spanish Embassy to Brazil and the local Rio consulate are involved in trying to establish exactly what happened and Brazilian authorities have confirmed that there will be an internal enquiry.

SPANISH police are warning of highly toxic bracelets being sold in markets across

Last week officers from the Guardia Civil's Seprona branch found five bracelets at a medieval market in Soria while a dozen were found in Zaragoza during the annual Fiesta del Pi-

lar celebrations.

The intense red and black bracelets are made with abrin seeds which can cause hallucinations, vomiting and even death.

The seeds are also known as

'Indian liquorice' or 'ladybird seed' and potentially lethal.

No antidote exists for abrin.

Just three micrograms of the toxin in the blood can lead to death.

The major symptoms of abrin poisoning depend on the route of exposure and the dose received, though many organs may be affected in

Swallowing any amount of abrin can lead to severe symptoms as it attacks cells in the kidney, liver, adrenal glands and central nervous system.


The

police warn the bracelets are even dangerous to touch as the toxin can be introduced into the body in small amounts through the skin.

Last July a score of brace-

lets, amulets and key rings were detected in a flea market in Llerena, Badajoz.

And in 2014 the Guardia Civil seized 184 pendants, 100 bracelets, 63 necklaces, 10 rosaries and 5,525 seeds for the manufacture of costume jewellery in Gran Canaria.



A JUDGE in Malaga has ruled that Craig Porter, 37, a chief suspect in the case of missing Agnese Klavina, can return to the UK for a month for the birth of his child in Liverpool.

Members of the Find Agnese Klavina campaign have said, "Sometimes you really have to worry about the Spanish justice system.

"We have just been notified that the Audencia (High Court) of Malaga has granted permission for Craig Porter to travel to Liverpool for the birth of his fourth child in spite of our opposition and a likely chance that he could use this opportunity to run away from justice.

"We have just filed an appeal to this decision.

"How can someone who is currently being tried for making Agnese disappear, a crime that in our opinion is tantamount to murder be granted this kind of request?

"It beggars belief how the Spanish courts can allow this person to travel. He is bound to use this opportunity to escape from justice.

"Shame on you Spain."

Porter and his pal Westley Capper, 39, were the last to see the 30year-old Latvian girl who went

Capper and Porter admitted driving Agnese away from the nightclub but Capper claims he dropped her off near her apartment, while Porter was asleep on the back seat of the car.

Police are in possession of CCTV footage which depicts the men leaving the club with Agnese, and, later, three unidentified men dragging a large suitcase onto Capper's motor boat soon after she vanished.

The boat left Marbella and was seized some 300 kilometres away

in Cartagena, but no body has been recovered.

Both men refused to testify during a hearing in Marbella in April 2015, but a court source confirmed, "The investigating judge has committed Westley Capper and Craig Porter to trial on a charge of aggravated unlawful de-

tention and discharged another two suspects.

"Capper and Porter remain on bail but as part of their conditional release conditions, they have to sign on twice a month and are banned from leaving Spain.

The pair are also facing trial for killing a Bolivian mother in a hitand-run in San Pedro, Marbella.

In the early evening of May 9, Fatima Dorado Para, a 40-year-old Bolivian woman, was struck by a British-registered Bentley as she was crossing the road on a pedestrian crossing adjacent to the San Pedro Alcantara Boulevard.

The Bentley struck her, throwing her about 100 feet in the air, before speeding off without stopping.

Emergency services were called and Fatima was rushed to the Costa del Sol hospital but suffered heart failure and died.

Police found the damaged Bentley about six kilometres away from the scene of accident, at Diana Park where the owner and his passenger were discovered drinking in an Indian restaurant.

Capper has been charged with negligent homicide, failure to stop and provide help to the victim, driving under the influence of alcohol, and possession of false documentation.

Now, the British government accepts that a Citizen's Advice Bureau report that highlighted three companies - EE, Three and Vodafone - who act in this manner should be considered.

These companies have stated that their charges are fair, but the other major supplier O2 has made it clear that it separates the charges so that customers are totally aware of costs and can see the reduction once the phone has been paid for.

It is also suggested that those over 65 are the least likely to change their contracts and are therefore at the greatest risk of paying too much.

Imports increase but exports up more

EVEN though Spanish exports have increased by 9 per cent in the past eight months, the trade deficit now stands at €16.4 bil-

This deficit increase is 49 per cent higher than the same period last year and imports have continued to rise to €198.7 billion.

To some extent this was to be expected as the recovery in the economy required an increase in purchase of raw materials which may be converted into consumer products for later export.

Large firms reduce waste

MANY WILL BEAT THE EU 2030 DEADLINE

A LARGE number of major companies are now committed to significantly reduce the amount of waste they generate and to conserve energy

As a recent report suggested that 64 per cent of Spanish consumers polled were looking for greater clarity in packaging description and the European Commission is introducing strict targets for reduction in waste, Spanish companies are enthusiastically looking at their procedures. Landfills are a major environmental problem within the EU and although household waste is often not properly sorted for recycling, these companies which include Procter and Gamble (P&G), Nestle and Pascual are taking major steps to reduce their negative affect upon the

One obvious area where those involved in the production of food and drink is to ensure that there is no spillage - which would result in rejection and end up as possible landfill - by improving their production lines and such investment also means in the long run that they will save money by producing more saleable products.

The Grupo Pascual has streamlined its Barcelona milk packaging factory so that it sends nothing to landfill and any waste liquid is recycled. It expects that all of its factories will significantly reduce waste by 2020 and will follow a 3R rule (reduce, reuse and recycle) to achieve this.

Already half of the 10 production units operated by Nestle in Spain are able to boast that they send nothing to landfill and they too are committed to make all of their factories environmentally friendly by 2020.

Unilever was able to declare its entire factory base around the world as free of waste in 2015 and discovered that it was able to make savings

of €200 million, so has now turned its attention to its global office network. More than 50 per cent of P&G factories are already producing zero waste and this group has also set 2020 as its target for all factories worldwide to join in the Spanish success which has already seen the elimination of all landfill.

As these major manufacturers lead the way in ensuring that their production produces as little waste as possible, so it is expected that other smaller businesses and consumers will start to play their part in making the world a less dangerous place.

Stock markets still strong

MANY Stock Exchanges around the world have seen significant increases in share value except for Spain, although even there the Catalan problem has not seen huge drops.

The convincing re-election of Japanese leader Shinzo Abe saw the Nikkei index raise to its highest level in 21 years and Wall Street saw record levels last Friday. based on an expectation of tax cuts and the suggestion that Janet Yellen may be reappointed as head of the Federal Reserve.

European markets were fairly static and slightly worried about the Spanish situation and possible problems with other European separatists, but most analysts consider this to be unlikely and say the Catalan crisis will be contained within Spain.

THE CATALAN CRISIS AFFECTS THE ENTIRE COUNTRY

National economy suffers

WHILST a great deal has understandably been made about the political problems facing the Madrid government, managing the financial fall out of article 155 is another thing.

Already the Catalan economy is facing a potentially disastrous downturn with a number of major companies moving their head offices out of the province, but according to Prime Minister Rajoy, at least 1,300 small and medium size businesses have already moved with a further 3,000 considering the possibility.

Fear of potential public disruption with protests, especially in Barcelona appears to have frightened a number of potential foreign visitors off and bookings have already fallen by 30 per cent which will directly affect hotels with the possible knock on effect of lay-offs of staff.

This reduction in the number of visitors has seen a similar loss of income for many retail outlets as well as bars and restaurants in city centres, which to a great extent rely upon tourists spending, with even taxis

feeling the pinch.

Investment in the province is most certainly down, with companies considering whether investment or even the granting of loans to Catalan companies is a wise move at this pivotal time and indeed some operations have already indicated that they will put Spain as a whole on hold.

Car sales continue to appear to be buoyant at the moment, but that is because dealers have already placed orders with manufacturers, but the

harsh reality is that the number of advance orders being placed could have fallen by at least 20 per cent.

If Spain wants to hit its GDP forecasts and please the European Union, it needs a vibrant and economically strong Cataluña back in place, otherwise it will face a number of very unpleasant consequences.

Already the government is having to increase rates of interest paid when issuing bonds which means that it is costing considerably more to borrow money on the international market and with the European Central Bank looking likely to cut back on the amount it is spending on buying euro bonds, another interest hike could be on the cards.

Several years of economic growth meant that the international credit ratings companies such as Standard & Poor's and Moody's were considered likely to upgrade Spain's rating but this is now unlikely until what they consider a positive conclusion with Cataluña independence is

More jitters over Cataluña

THE Starwood Capital Finances Europe which has recently loaned €46 million for the building of a new hotel in Barcelona has expressed concern at the situation in Cataluña.

With a further €61 million advanced to two other developments in other parts of Spain, it has announced that it will divert investment to other parts of the EU until the current crisis is resolved.

It isn't just Spain which is being watched closely by the company which is also nervous over Brexit and the results of the German election but with €53 billion in funds being managed, the group intends to ensure that customer's funds are safeguarded as much as possi-

British banks split in two

AS British banks with assets in excess of £25 billion (€28 billion) split their businesses in two in order to protect retail customer's deposits. Santander takes a different

Large retail banks around the world accept customer deposits and manage commercial accounts. whilst at the same time speculating in the international market.

The British government has given high street banks until 2019 to split their operations so that each stands alone with their own staff and accounts in order to try to ensure that the debacle of 2008

With Brexit around the corner. there is the risk that some banks may consider taking the opportunity to relocate their speculative and high value customer business outside of the UK, although so far both Barclays and HSBC seem likely to keep the bulk of business within the UK.

Spanish bank Santander however is taking a different stance and has announced that its higher risk activities - thought to be worth £40 billion (€45 billion) - will be transferred to Banco Santander, the Spanish parent of the group.

Largest trade partner

A RECENT visit by King Felipe VI to Saudi Arabia underlined the importance of trade links which in 2016 were worth €5.5 billion to Spain.

Whilst his visit was primarily aimed at ensuring that the Kingdom purchased five Avante warships, trade talks have continued and the recently appointed Spanish Ambassador Alvaro Iranzo Gutierrez made it clear that his government was not only happy to be involved with ongoing trade but supported Saudi Vision 2030.

"We fully support the Vision 2030. Our companies are ready to contribute and help it develop in all areas, such as the development of renewable energies and state-of-the-art infrastructure. Spain hopes to contribute to unleash the potential of Saudi youth using professional training centres across the country," he told the Riyadh Daily newspaper.

There are currently 120 Spanish companies who have combined with Saudi partners to set up offices in Saudi Arabia and the rail link between Mecca and Medina, whilst having some problems has been hailed as a successful innovation managed by a consortium of Spanish companies.

Other large infrastructure projects related to water, electricity and renewable energies are also under way, while Spanish brands such as Zara with 34 stores and discount store Lefties are well represented in the Kingdom's shopping centres.

One potential new market for SEAT and other Spanish produced vehicles will be Saudi women, now that they are officially allowed to drive.

Vhat is the flu?

INFLUENZA, commonly known as the 'flu', is an extremely contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza A or B viruses. Flu appears most frequently in winter and early spring. The flu virus attacks the body by spreading through the upper and/or lower respiratory tract.

A severe case of flu can lead to lifethreatening illnesses such as pneumonia.

What's the difference between a cold and flu?

The common cold and flu are both contagious viral infections of the respiratory tract. Although the symptoms can be similar, flu is much worse. A cold may drag you down a bit, but the flu can make you shudder at the very thought of getting out of bed.

Congestion, sore throat, and sneezing

are common with colds. Both cold and flu bring coughing, headache, and chest discomfort. With the flu, though, you are likely to run a high fever for several days and have body aches, fatigue, and weakness. Symptoms of the flu also tend to come on abruptly. Usually, complications from colds are relatively minor, but a severe case of flu can lead to a lifethreatening illness such as pneumonia.

Remember: Antibiotics only treat bacterial infections.

Two antiviral medications are available to treat flu. But there are no medications that specifically defeat the common cold. Antibiotics may be helpful only if there is a secondary bacterial infection.

Wet weather tips

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

WEATHER conditions pose the biggest risk to road users, partly due to inexperience and lack of preparedness, and partly due to changing road dynamics and the driving environment.

Here are our top tips for dealing with rain.

1. Slow down

It's easy to be lulled into a false sense of security but speed and adverse weather is a deadly combination. When the road is wet, your vehicle's tyres cannot grip the road as much as in normal, dry conditions, so slow down.

Cornering and braking are all affected by water on the road, reducing grip and increasing stopping distances considerably; slowing down allows more time to adapt and deal with the situation. Ease off the accelerator a little and you will see the difference immediately.

2. Avoid violent movement/sharp braking

Sudden braking, acceleration or harsh movements of the steering wheel may result in loss of vehicle control. If the operations are carried out progressively, smoothly and slowly, it also gives other drivers more time to react. Remember that a smooth drive is a safer and more efficient ride under normal conditions and even more so when it rains.

3. Avoid driving on road markings

Road markings provide less grip than the road surface itself and can therefore increase braking distances. Riders on two wheels should be particularly aware of this problem.

During rain or reduced visibility, make sure that you have your lights on. Daytime Running Lights may not suffice, especially in reduced visibility where headlights must be used. The timely use of indicators and brake lights is cru-

cial to give other road users advanced warnings of your intentions. Keeping your vehicle under control and following all the advice for a smooth ride will also allow for an improvement in your visibility to other road users.

5. Avoid aquaplaning risks

Keep a sharp lookout for puddles, which may reduce the grip of your tyres, potentially creating a liquid barrier between the tyre and road surface, commonly referred to as aquaplaning. However, don't carry out any sudden movements to avoid puddles. Simply slow down, hold the steering wheel firmly and try to keep your vehicle on a straight and level course. Whilst maintaining an adequate distance from the vehicle in front, it is often beneficial to follow vehicles through such areas as the displacement of water becomes easier.

With these five basic tips your journey through the rain should be much safer. But remember, it's not only about how you drive your vehicle, but about the vehicle itself.

Proper maintenance is crucial. Check tyres and their pressure, lights, windows, brakes and other features regularly to reduce the risk. If in doubt, your local garage can check the vehicle.

How much CGT do I pay?

IF I sell my house in Spain valued at €225,000, how is the CGT paid, or can I roll this into another property?

M.C. (email)

THAT depends on whether you are a tax resident in Spain, selling your principal residence, or

you are a non-resident. If you are a non-resident, you will pay Spanish Capital Gains Tax (CGT) at 21

per cent of your profit. If you bought for €125,000 and sell for €225,000, you have a profit of €100,000 and a tax of €21,000. A **David Searl** You and the Law in Spain

non-resident has no rollover

You may be free of CGT if you meet three conditions. You are selling your principal residence, where you have lived for three years. You have paid your income tax in Spain for

three years. You are over 65 years of age. If you are vounger than 65, you can also escape CGT if you purchase a new principal residence using the total value of your sale.

The resident pays CGT on a sliding scale. Tax is 19 per cent up to a profit of €6,000, 21 per cent from there to €50,000, and 23 per cent above that.

That's inkredible

PRINTERS come in two main flavours: laser and inkiet.

Lasers are the workhorses of the printing world: generally monochrome, more expensive to buy than inkjets but cheaper to run if you're a serial printer.

Inkjets are cheap as chips until you start buying the replacement ink cartridges. And they print ever so pretty in colour, at a price.

That's a pain you can ease slightly by buying generic cartridges online or from your local shop, and despite the manufacturers' quality warnings, I've never vet encountered one which printed any worse than the branded one, or which 'ruined' a printer.

(And don't even think of refilling your cartridges by hand, as some of us used to do. Accompanied by frequent embarrassment when visitors would remark on the profusion of used syringes lying around the home...)

Now is the printer of our discontent

TERENCE KENNEDY shares his love-hate relationship with the most treacherous of computer devices, the printer.

EVER wondered why your printer won't let you produce a black and white document because it's 'out of magenta ink'?

Is it a good idea to let your printer know you're in a hurry, because it can smell the fear?

And if we had a 3D printer, could we then print out our own 3D print-

You'd think after more than three decades, Messrs Hewlett-Packard. Epson, Canon, Brother and co. could finally get it right - but 'printer rage' is now so common that an idle search on Google produces more than three mil-

Paper jams, empty cartridges, upright A4 printed in landscape, worthy but misguided attempts to save the forests by printing double-sided: these are all facets of our troubled interactions with technology.

The irony is that not too long ago, pundits like me were confidently predicting the paperless society, yet today in the developed world we each consume an astonishing 200 kilos of paper a year. And in 15 years the planet's paper consumption has actually grown 77 per cent.

As for the printers themselves, at the current rate they'll soon be given away free with the cornflakes.

That's because they use the Gillette business model, so-called from the days when that company sold the razor for next to nothing, but made its fortune on the blades we then had to buy for it (one of the reasons I stopped shaving; call it a matter of principle but more probably sheer laziness).

I recall staying up all night years ago trying to persuade my clunky bubblejet to print a British pound symbol. Or wrestling with it for hours

to produce an envelope despite my exasperated partner's entreaties to 'Just write the **** thing by hand!'

Now printers 'simply work', or they should, at a (hidden) price.

Despite printers being cheap and cheerful these days, ink in branded cartridges has become one of the most expensive liquids in the world: €1,500 a litre by my quick calcula-

You'd think as a result that we'd be more selective about what, and how much we print. Yet I had an older colleague who insisted on printing all his e-mails.

Until he saw reason, he was using an entire ream of paper (that's 500 sheets to the stationery-challenged among us) every few days.

So next time you're wondering whether to print, you could do worse than abide by the automatic signature I've had at the end of all my e-mails for years:

'Please consider the environment before printing this e-mail. No trees were harmed in sending this message, but quite a few electrons were slightly inconvenienced.'

Seeing is believing in gorgeous Guadalest


Benidorm to the Algar Waterfalls. This week, we travelled just a few minutes further to the delightful village of El Castell de Guadalest, usually known simply as Guadalest.

This picturesque village was a strategic military stronghold and has a long history dating back to the period of Moorish occupation in Spain.

The village grew around the castle's fortress with the population originally living within the castle walls. It retains its small population of just hundreds of people living there, but it attracts over a million visitors each year and is reportedly one of the most visited municipalities in Spain with the Castell de Guadalest, perched upon its rock and the turquoise waters of the reservoir amongst the most visited and photographed.

Whilst clearly targeting tourists with its array of souvenir shops and cafés, its whitewashed ancient streets are still a delight to meander through as you head towards the castle gates.

Guadalest is now also known for its eclectic mix of museums including the micro-miniatures museum where you can see some of the best micro art-

of Liberty inside the eye of a needle.

There is the Belen and Dolls House museum and the Casa Orduña Municipal Museum which was built after the great earthquake of 1644. Perhaps something a little more unusual is the salt and pepper museum which has more than 20,000 original pieces from all over the world. It is reported the museum in Guadalest is only the second such museum with the other salt and pepper museum being in Tennessee in the USA.

For those with a more morbid fascination for torture, head to the Medieval Historical Museum, home to more than 70 pieces of torture instruments and capital punishment.

For those wanting to get round them all, visitors will be pleased to know that most are open all day in the summer and do not close for siesta.

If you are wanting to explore the area a little further, take in its natural, breathtaking beauty and go for hikes and bicycle rides, there are a number of small guest houses in the heart of the village and just outside, and of course bustling Benidorm is just a half hour's drive away. www.guadalest.es

Getting the answer right

JUAN JOSE IBARRETXE was the Basque region's president from 2004 until 2009. During his term as lehendakari he decided to declare independence, hoping to put an end to ETA's separatist terrorism.

His independence proposal was approved by the Basque government but later defeated by the PSOE and PP in the national parliament in Madrid. Undeterred, Ibarretxe planned a referendum on "the right to decide" which was challenged by Jose Luis Rodriguez's government. The Constitutional Tribunal declared it illegal and Ibarretxe accepted the sentence. End of story.

Pushing the limit

A NEW study has found that white men who do excessive amounts of exercise each week are almost twice as likely to suffer from heart disease as those who work out moderately.

A study by the University of Illinois in Chicago analysed the exercise habits of over 3,000 people over 25 years and discovered that

white men who exercised for more than seven hours per week were more likely to suffer from serious cardiac problems.

However, the researchers didn't find that the outcome applied to men from other ethnicities.

According to Public Health England, heart disease claims more men's lives in the UK

than any other illness.

The study discovered that white men who exercised excessively were more likely to build up plaque in their arter-

ies which can lead to severe heart problems such as heart disease. This suggested that too much exercise could put excessive stress on the arter-

The results surprised the researchers, who expected those who did the most exercise to be less likely to develop these illnesses. Deepika Laddu, the co-author of the study, revealed that more research needed to be done to investigate why this was the case and why there was such a difference in the results from white participants and those of other ethnici-

However, Laddu stressed that the study did not suggest that people should stop exercising altogether, but that they should limit workouts to the recommended 150 min-

While any form of exercise is considered crucial to keeping your heart healthy, there are some workouts that could be more beneficial than others. Swimming, weight training and cycling have all been shown to help prevent illnesses such as heart disease and boost overall health.



Sciatica and how to deal with it

What are the symptoms or signs of it?

The main symptoms that produce pain usually originate in the lower back. This can affect the legs and produce muscle contractures and the inability to move.

When should I talk to my physician?

Whenever you begin to feel symptoms that may suggest something's wrong in the previously mentioned areas vou should consult a health care professional. First, talk to your family doctor but if that's not enough you will need to consult a specialist.

What causes it?

It's usually caused by problems in the intervertebral discs which bring about herniated discs, inflammation of the tendons and muscles and dislocation of the back bones, typically via arthritis and mainly in the elderly.

How do I treat it?

The first things needed are rest, dry heat, painkillers, anti-inflammatories and muscle relaxants. Physiotherapy exercises are also helpful in lessening the pain derived from this illness. In very advanced cases when pain cannot be managed, surgical intervention may be re-

OPTIONAL INTRO: The term sciatica describes a set of symptoms that are characterised by leg pain (and possibly tingling, numbness or weakness) starting at the bottom of the back and going through the buttocks and the greater sciatic nerve down the back of each leg. Sciatica is a symptom of another underlying health problem. It is not a disease in itself.

Chemical bothers

PARABENS have been widely used in cosmetic products since the 1950s to prevent bacteria growth, but have been getting some bad press recently over fears that they cause certain dis-

Allegedly, around 85 per cent of cosmetic products on the market contain parabens, ranging from shampoos and lotions to lipsticks and fragrances.

However, parabens allegedly disrupt the body's natural oestrogen levels, which have been linked to reproductive issues and breast cancer. They are also believed to cause skin irritations such as dermatitis and rosacea, and can even make you more vulnerable to allergies.

As a result, scientists in many countries have started recommending putting a limit on paraben levels in cosmetics. The EU now limits beauty companies to a maximum of 8g of parabens per kilo of cosmetic

In 2011, the Danish government also decided to put a ban

on companies putting parabens in products intended for children under the age of three due

to fears that they are at a higher risk from the side-effects.

Nowadays, there is an increas-

ing number of products on the market labelled 'paraben-free,' but should you really swear off all products without the tag? Both the World Health Organisation and the US Food and Drug Administration have stated that the chemicals are not harmful at low levels. Typically, the amount of parabens used in cosmetic products is quite small.

To be on the safe side, look out for oil-based organic items as water-based products often require more preservatives to make them last longer. Products in dark containers with a pump also generally contain fewer chemicals as they don't go off as quickly.

If you are going to cut parabens from one item in your beauty cabinet, make it a body lotion or moisturiser which is used to coat large areas of skin as this can increase vulnerability to the side-effects of chemi-



Tooth troubles

EVEN though your smile may be one of the first things people notice about you, a lot of people still tend to avoid paying a trip to the dentist whenever possible.

Good oral and dental hygiene is important to maintaining good, overall health as it can help prevent tooth decay and gum disease which can lead to more serious problems such as heart disease and diabetes.

Keeping a regular routine of flossing, brushing and using mouthwash also helps you to keep all your teeth as you get older.

According to Mintel research, one in five Brits only visits the dentist when they are having problems with their teeth. However, it would seem more men than women are tooth-shy as 21 per cent of men admit to avoiding check-ups unless they have a problem compared with only 16 per cent of

Although nearly two thirds of the UK claim that dental problems impact their general health, three in 10 confessed that it's been more than six months since they have visited the dentist.

Ten per cent of British people even disclosed that they have tried treating their problems using DIY methods at home.

Teeth cleaning habits have also changed over the past couple of years, as 15 per cent

less people use mouthwash now than in 2014 but 4 per cent more use an electric toothbrush.

Nearly a quarter of Brits also only brush their teeth once a day while a conscious 11 per cent brush their teeth more than the recommended twice daily.

However, a pearly white smile is still important for many Brits, as half of Londoners see white teeth as a sign of good dental health and over 40 per cent of people have

tried a regular whitening toothpaste.

Even though dentists continue to emphasise how important it is, it seems flossing hasn't increased in popularity. According to a study by Waterpik, only around 16 per cent of those surveyed admitted to flossing every day, with a further 20 per cent revealing they only flossed when necessary.

Flossing is vital to maintaining good dental health as it reaches the spaces between your teeth that your toothbrush can't.

An apple a day...

AUTUMN has officially arrived, so now is the perfect excuse to catch up on your daily apple intake.

Whether its cider, apple bobbing or picking, no other fruit is as strongly associated with this time of year and eating the recommended one a day can work wonders for your health (but perhaps avoid the toffee apples on Halloween!).

You get roughly 15 per cent of your recommended daily dose of vitamin C from just one apple, and the high fibre content of the peel can help with your digestion. Apples are also a source of vitamin A, which is a powerful antioxidant which helps to fight off infection and reduce inflam-

A RECENT study by Zensa Skincare found that the most painful beauty treatment out there is bikini waxing.

After surveying more than 1,000 men and women, researchers found that waxing topped the list, getting a ranking of nearly 3.9 out of 5.

Eating habits change course

traditional Sunday lunch and it is becoming increasingly common for Brits to buy lunch out rather than eat something home-made.

into people's desires to eat well and encouraging them to buy lunch out.



Free mammograms are available until October 31 via pre-booked appointments.

Breast cancer is the most common form of cancer in the female population in Spain, making up 29 per cent of all cancers. It is estimated that one out of every eight women will suffer breast cancer.

The highest incidence is in women over 50, although the incidence in women under 40 has risen by 10 per cent in the last few years.

The reason for this increase may be due to lifestyle changes, a tendency to have less children, the increased age women have their first pregnancy and a history of the disease in direct family members.

Early diagnosis of the disease, through a mammogram, lowers mortality risk by between 15 and 20 per



Moving on up!

House prices in Spain increase by 16 per cent

THE price of houses in Spain has increased 16 per cent since the end of 2014, according to a report by the Bank of Spain.

This is a significant improvement following the 37 per cent drop the market experienced after the 2007 financial crisis.

Investment in Spanish property has also grown about 1.5 per cent each year between 2014 and 2017, which has been put down to higher employment rates and rising disposable incomes.

According to the same report, there has also been a gradual increase in sales of Spanish property during this time period, with deals by international investors up a whopping 17 per cent. This also means the number of homes still left on the market is starting to go down.

The Bank of Spain also revealed that there is a

clear upward trend in mortgage stability. Given that the International Monetary Fund estimated that Spain's GDP growth will surpass 2.5 per cent by the end of 2017, making it the fastest growing economy in Europe, it would seem the country's recent financial stability is increasing investor confidence.

BBVA, Spain's second biggest bank, estimated that half a million properties would be sold in 2017, and figures at the six-month mark suggested that target would easily be met.

There are still several regions in Spain that stand-out in the recent property boom; however, including the Costa del Sol, Mallorca and the Costa Blanca. In fact, there has been a 43 per cent increase in real estate agencies in Malaga Province since 2013 as a result of the surge in demand.



Nearly 30,000 property sales were recorded in the region from June 2016 to June 2017, marking an increase of almost 10 per cent from the previous 12-month period, according to data from the Registrar's Association.

The good news does not stop there as the country's prime property hotspots are expected to continue to increase in value this year, according to a report by global real estate consultants Knight Frank.

Mark Harvey, head of European Sales at Knight Frank revealed that enquiries for Spanish homes are up 150 per cent year-on-year. He credited the strengthening euro as one of the reasons why international investors were keen to invest their money in the Spain market.

The study also revealed which nationalities

monopolised the key property hotspots. Madrid's main investors were from Venezuela, Mexico and Switzerland while Barcelona was popular among those from France, Turkey and the US.

In Marbella, the main foreign investors tended to be from Germany, Morocco, Russia and Scandinavia while in Mallorca the market belonged to the Brits, the Belgian and the

The predicted increase in prices also looks promising to those looking to make an investment on a Spanish home, as a property in an 'in-demand' location is likely to bring high returns.

Reaping the rewards

LANDLORDS enjoy the greatest return on their leased properties in Lerida, Algeciras, and Tarrasa. In those municipalities they reap an average of between 7 and 8 per cent return on an annual basis.

Across Spain the average return is in the range of 4 to 6 per cent according to analysis from the Spanish department of Urban Data Analytics. The international firm used big data analysis to investigate property trends in Spanish municipalities with populations

exceeding 100,000

Multiple factors are considered. For instance, although Algeciras offers one of the best returns in Spain, the market there for landlords is still fairly risky. It takes an average of more than two months to find tenants, during which time thousands in rent is being

By contrast, in Madrid and Barcelona, returns are lower in percentage terms but prices are far higher anyway and it takes less than two weeks on average to find a suitable tenant.

Then there are places like Marbella and Alcobendas where returns are slightly lower than average because, although rents are high, so is the initial investment required to purchase a property.

Overall the report found that the best places for landlords, in terms of overall profitability, were Las Palmas in Gran Canaria, Hospitalet, Tarrasa, and

The last three are all close to Barcelona.

Building soars in Spain

THE resurgence of Spain's real estate sector is most pronounced on the sunny Costa Blanca. Alicante Province is set to close 2017 with the largest investment in real estate projects seen in the past nine years.

Much of the new homes and developments being built are in the capital city itself, which is fast emerging as one of Spain's most exciting urban areas.

In the first nine months of the year a total of 720 homes have been built in the city. The vast majority are holiday and second homes for Spanish nationals from other regions of the country.

But naturally the surrounding Costas are proving more popular. In Orihuela alone 787 new homes have been built since January. The total investment is €48 million, compared to €45 million for the slightly more expensive homes in Alicante City.

Across the entire province a total of 5,350 homes are expected to be built this year, up from 4,800 in 2016. That reflects a 2017 investment of €400 million in new brick



Contrast that with 2012, when only 1,329 homes were built, the lowest ever recorded in the

province. There is still a long way to go, however, to reach the heights of the early 2000s, when more than 40,000 homes were being built per

The situation in Alicante is being reflected across Spain. Between January and July this year, 33,085

homes were built, an increase of 39 per cent on last year. In 2007 Spain reached a peak of 641,419 homes built in a year.

Take control of your currency transfers

As an expat, you've no doubt had to deal with currency transfers in the past - but you might not have had access to the most suitable services. Getting more for your money when moving it abroad (or sending it home) is simple with the right support and the best tools.

Sweeten up your garden with sugar cane

GRAEME TYRRELL

BRIGHT sunny spots in the Mediterranean garden are often a challenge to find plants hardy enough to tolerate the intense heat and sun and yet be strong enough to resist the cold winter months with shorter day length.

An interesting alternative to the more common species for these zones that requires minimal maintenance and provides a wonderful food source is sugar cane. (Saccharum officinarum).

Sugar cane has been grown commercially in Spain for hundreds of years, especially along the Mediterranean coast, but production declined when it was found to be more economical to grow in the New World after Christopher Columbus took plants there to grow on the tropical islands off Central America.

For the home gardener it is a great alternative to bamboo as it is less invasive and gives the option of extracting the wonderful sugar cane juice.

The sugar cane plant grows and looks similar to bamboo as it is of the grass family of plants,

Poaceae. With stalks of cane growing up to four metres high and with a width of five centimetres, it has wonderful flowering tassels at the top of the canes that are often called arrows, due to the flowers form appearing as an arrow

The tassels wave in the wind giving a gentle relaxing rhythm reminiscent of the waves in the sea. The leaves are long, a very distinct shade of green and rustle in the wind. The canes can be used like bamboo for making supports in the garden, or other structures.

The juice from the mature canes is used to make crystallised sugar, molasses and syrups. Sugar is con-

troversial for its health benefits as the refined sugar made from the juice has chemicals including added sulphur, which makes it acidic in nature, but the natural juice is deliciously sweet and alkaline has many positive health benefits. It is recognised in Ayervedic and other traditional medicines as therapeutic.

Extracting the juice requires a strong press to remove cleanly but alternatives are to boil down the inner core of the canes to make a syrup, or use a powerful blender or juicer.

In India it is a common refreshment with lime juice and ginger, added from street venders all over the country using what looks like a washing machine wringer to crush and extract the juice.

The plants are easy to grow from the stalks, by planting a piece from a strong healthy plant about 30 - 40 centimetres long with three or four joints which the plant will grow

from. Growing from seed can give very variable results as the sugar cane can cross with other Poaceae species and may not be true to the parent plant. It takes two to three years for the emerging canes to be mature enough to produce the juice that can be extracted and be tall and thick enough to harvest as canes.

They are best grown in a position in full sun all year but protected from the cold if only growing a few as an ornament feature.

MANY times in a week I am informed that a dog only understands German, French, Spanish, or English.

I find that many owners and some trainers have a misguided perception of what a dog really is and entertain false expectations of their pet. Most think their pet is a small hairy person based on the assumption that a dog's level of understanding is equal to their

It is vital to keep in mind that dogs do not have the capacity to intercept human language, behaviour or emotions.

Understanding dogs

How intelligent is a dog?

Dogs are capable of linking two ideas together, but cannot link actions, which are separated to another time. If for example a dog makes a mess during your absence there is no point in telling the dog off or getting annoyed; the dog's brain cannot link the action. Many will say 'He knows he has done wrong', he does not, the brain is not formulated this way.

A dog's brain is much smaller than man's, in particular the cerebrum - the portion of the brain associated with intellectual function, emotion and personality. Dogs cannot understand our human language. It is far more important to use sound patterns, intonation and facial and body language as a form of communication.

A dog wants to please and all learning should be based on a positive reinforcement of reward. Owners should keep in mind that a large part of a dog's brain is occupied with sensory activity, particularly the interpretation of scent.



CHASING INSTINCT: Can be managed.

Instinct is something either there or not there.

Dog's natural instinct plays a vital role and often it is difficult to understand why so few dog owners can differentiate between instinct and intelligence. Instinct is an urge from within which makes a dog act in certain ways and has no connection with intelligence.

Dog's first instinct is to survive, when a pup is born he squirms about until he finds a teat and then sucks it. No intelligence or learning by any association plays a part in the process.

The maternal instinct tells the female to clean up the foetal membrane and stir the puppy into action by licking it. The female is not taught, as she has not seen another female do this. Most instincts provide pleasure to the dog, and because it associates the action with pleasure, the instinct grows stronger with usage.

Instinct can be strengthened, weakened or diverted, it cannot be put there and it cannot be taken away. It might lie dormant, but once developed it can never be weakened.

A dog with an obsession for chasing balls or chewing socks can be controlled by training and by providing other outlets for his energy. The same if a young dog is corrected the first time he chases a car he may give up the idea, but if he is allowed to chase cars the hunting instinct becomes stronger, and in no time it will be very difficult, even impossible to cure the

Instinct also covers survival, hunting, guarding, and the pack.

The woman's lawyers argued that her employers should have allowed her leave on the grounds that it was an absence related to 'serious or family personal reasons'.

Their reasoning was supported by an exception in Italian law that punishes people who abandon an animal 'grave suffering' by punishing them for a year or fining them up to €10,000.

The court case was a landmark victory for animal lovers. as this marked the first time an Italian court allowed someone to receive sick pay while caring for

ENGLAND face Australia in Melbourne in the opening match of the 2017 Rugby League World Cup on Friday with preparations of tailormade mattress toppers and personalised pillows.

"Quality sleep on a familiar surface is proven to enhance recovery rates naturally," said Rugby Football League Head of Human Performance. Richard Hunwicks

It is deemed the preparations will offer players a cooler,



The England squad have undertaken pressure point testing. prior to the 2017 Rugby League World Cup, to determine preferred levels of mattress firmness in a bid to improve recovery rates and induce quality rest.

"This approach, accompanied by regulating breathing before sleep, will add to the detailed processes we have in place during the World Cup," said Hunwicks.

England are amongst 14 teams playing 28 games over a five week period - during October 27 - December 2 - in a bid to become World Champions on the international Rugby League stage.

After England's fixture against Australia in Melbourne they have two Group games against Lebanon in Sydney and France in Perth. In addition to playing matches in Australia and New Zealand, there will be three pool matches played in Papua New Guinea.

"The challenge of training, games, travel and changing hotel beds on a weekly basis are all elements that can affect a player's rest and recovery," added Hunwicks.

And England and Castleford Tigers star Luke Gale said: "It can get pretty busy when on international duty with the training schedules, meetings, travel and games. A quality night's sleep is essential - to maintain our energy levels."

Gale, aged 29, who underwent an operation in September to have his appendix removed, said: "A lot of planning goes into the squad's perfor-

Gale, who was set to miss the 2017 Rugby League World Cup having been rushed into hospital for emergency keyhole surgery, said: "The doctor said my season was over - and I wouldn't be going to Aus-

And half-back Gale quipped: "In Rugby League we tend not to listen to doctors. I'm feeling fit and healthy again."

On England's preparations, Gale added: "It's good to know that we're leaving no stone left unturned when it comes to doing our best at the World Cup."

The 2017 Rugby League World Cup Final will be staged at Suncorp Stadium, Brisbane on Saturday December 2.

SPAIN'S two-times F1 world champion Fernando Alonso is looking ahead to 2018 - with the Gods mapping out his future: better times are coming.

"I believe things happen because they have to happen," said Alonso, who is competing in the F1 2017 Grand Prix in Mexico on Sunday October 29.

Alonso's last F1 win was the 2013 Spanish Grand Prix at the Circuit de Cataluña, Barcelona. It was Alonso's 32nd Grand Prix victory.

Looking ahead to 2018, Alonso whose odds to win in Malaysia on October 1 were an astonishing 400-1 - said: "Next year there are minimum changes of regulations."

Renault will be supplying Alonso's current team McLaren's engines in 2018, and he said: "I think the rate of development this year has been very high - because of new regulations - and there will be extra development over the winter."

Alonso, who has approaching 100 podiums, finishing first on 32 occasions. sees his fall from the top of F1 as fate: "All the things that happen - in a race, in a championship, or in your life - are for a reason," he said.

"Better times are coming - I prefer to think that way," said Alonso, who tipped Lewis Hamilton for the 2017 F1 title, ahead of Sebastian Vettel

Alonso, who has competed against both Hamilton and Vettel for world titles. revealed he punched a fist into a wall in frustration after the 2017 Singapore GP.

Alonso, who went out of the race at the first corner, said: "It was frustration.

"I want to be competitive - back in victory for the F1 world championship."

That podium could have been one of the biggest things of my career - and we

Alonso, who ended Michael Schumacher's reign at the top, moved to McLaren, had spells with Renault and Ferrari, and clocked up 17 victories, with three championship runner-up titles.

Oviedo born Alonso, aged 36, secured his first F1 race drive with Minardi, prior to joining Renault as a test driver in 2002, becoming a race driver in 2003.

In 2005, aged 22, Alonso made history by becoming the youngest ever polesitter in Malaysia, and the youngest winner, with maiden victory in Hungary.

In 2007 Alonso moved to McLaren, alongside Hamilton, returning to Renault in 2008 - gaining victories at the inaugural F1 night race in Singapore - fol-

In 2010 Alonso took just one podium, in Singapore. A move to Ferrari followed, to partner Felipe Massa, a season that saw Alonso gain five wins - finishing behind new world champion Sebastian Vettel

lowed by a race win in Japan.

Alonso's second season with Ferrari saw victory at Silverstone - followed by nine podiums - finishing fourth overall.

In 2012 Alonso won the Malaysian GP, and victory in front of a home crowd in Valencia saw Alonso head the drivers' standings, only to be thwarted by Vettel, who won a third F1 title.

Alonso achieved wins in China and Spain in 2013 - along with seven podium standings - but Vettel was crowned F1 Champion, yet again.

In 2014, despite Alonso's two podium finishes, the team failed to win for the first time since 1993, leading to Alonso returning to McLaren.

In a woeful 2015 campaign Alonso scored points - in just two races - ending the season with a paltry 11 points.

Alonso, who was lucky when he avoided serious injury following a crash at Melbourne's Albert Park in 2016. said: "I want to be competitive next year, back on the podiums. I want to be back in victory - fighting for the world championship. I remain optimistic."

Despite no F1 wins during the 2017 season - and no podium placings, Alonso is undeterred: "I think positive - always.

"What has happened this year is because destiny wanted that - it is taking care of our luck for better opportunities."

SERGIO GARCIA has won the Andalucia Valderrama Masters. The Spaniard, whose foundation hosted the event, carded a final round four-under-par 67 to beat Dutchman Joost Luiten by one shot.
