Brit stab suspect in denial

AN unnamed British man accused of stabbing a compatriot with a Stanley knife in Benalmadena may face three-and-a-half years in prison.

The alleged incident occurred in Plaza Solymar after an argument between the pair, with the injured party needing 11 stitches in his back.

But the accused disputes the prosecution's claims, arguing he had simply tried to break up a fight and he was not carrying a knife, with the wound caused by the victim falling on the floor.

He was caught by police while waiting for a taxi.

Police swoop on car thieves Grand theft auto!

Six people have been held on suspicion of stealing luxury cars worth €1 million on the Costa del Sol.

The arrests come after a Guardia Civil and National Police probe revealed that the gang used fake documentation to rent the vehicles from hire firms based near the airports of Malaga and Almeria.

Investigators swooped to seize properties with a value of €318,000 plus 15 cars, several of them dismantled and stowed in a lorry, six mobile phones, false identi-

cards.

A police statement said that the operation was headed by three men from Italy who would rent the motors before passing them to a fourth Italian who acted as an intermediary, finding specialists to fit false licence plates or take them apart.

They were then smuggled to Morocco and traded for parts or rebuilt before being offered for sale

All four Italians have been remanded in custody alongside a Spaniard and a Moroccan.

No Brexit disruption

Spanish minister interviewed by BBC

SPAIN'S foreign minister, Alfonso Dastis, has said British expats will be allowed to continue living in Spain even if Britain doesn't strike a Brexit deal with the European Union.

The senior government minister speaking on BBC One's Andrew Marr Show, said, "I do hope that there will be a deal.

"If there is no deal we will make sure that the lives of ordinary people who are in Spain, the UK people, is not disrupted.

"As you know, the relationship between the UK and Spain is a very close one in terms of economic relations and also social exchanges.

"Over 17 million Brits come to Spain every year and many of them live here or retire here and we want to keep it that way as much as possi-

Spain is host to the largest

number of British citizens living in the EU (308,805) and just over a third are aged 65 and over, according to the Office for National Statistics

Prime Minister Theresa May is continuing to negotiate withdrawal issues with the EU, including a financial settlement, expat's rights and Irish border issues.

Spains Foreign Minister also responded to questions on Catalan independence saying, "This is a matter to be decided by all of the Spanish people," before denying that the government's move to strip autonomy from the region represents a coup.

"If anyone has attempted a coup, it is the Catalan regional government," he added.

Meanwhile Donald Tusk. the president of the European Council, suggested that Britain could still choose to reverse Brexit. Tusk said that Britain's negotiations with the EU could finish with "no Brexit," if the UK government wanted.

"It is in fact up to London how this will end," he announced. "With a good deal, no deal or no Brexit."

Norwegian slashes **UK** flights

LOW-COST airline Norwegian is scrapping all its flights from Birmingham, Edinburgh and Manchester to Spain with effect from this weekend.

Norwegian operates routes to five destinations in Spain from the Midlands; Barcelona, Gran Canaria, Madrid, Malaga and Tenerife. The Manchester routes included popular winter destinations Alicante and Lanzarote. Apart from Tenerife, all flights departing from Edinburgh have also been scrapped.

A statement from the company on Tuesday said, "Following a review of our services, we will cease operating flights from Birmingham to Spain with the last services departing on Saturday, October 28," and then the following day they announced they would pull out of the northern hub.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...34

Halloween has crept into the Spanish psyche in recent years, and is now the spooky event of the year

reeping it real

LIKE other religious holidays including Christmas and Easter, Halloween has become more commercialised in Spain over the years and has moved away from its religious origins.

While 20 years ago trick-or-treaters were a rare occurrence, stores these days are packed with themed sweets and creepy costumes from September onwards.

Another reason Halloween has become more popular is that the next day, typically known as All Saints' Day, is a national holiday. Children and adults now take advantage of partying the night away in spooky costumes without worrying about going to work or school the next morning.

Many Spanish cities still hold their own unique celebrations around this time, however, which keep the holiday separate from the profit-oriented notion of Halloween made popular by the US.

One of the best places to visit at this time of the year is Cadiz. Although not actually linked to Halloween, on October 31 they celebrate the 'Fiesta de Tosantos'. Locals create over-the-top market stall displays depicting all the latest political and social scandals and hold concerts and street performances across the city.

A more sinister event is celebrated in the small Catalan village of Sant Feliu Sasserra. During the two-day 'Witch Festival,' residents pay tribute to the 23 women accused of witchcraft during the Spanish Inquisition and sentenced to death.

Becoming popular in stalls, selling chest-

nuts, sweet wine and traditional Catalan 'panellet' cakes. In Castile and León, people commemorate the holiday by baking traditional pastries called 'Huesos de Santo' which they bring to the graves of loved ones.

Feelin' spooky

These days, Halloween is now closely associated with the Mexican holiday 'Dia de los Muertos' (Day of the Dead) on November 1. While Spain has traditionally celebrated 'Dia de los Santos' (All Saints' Day) on this day, the increased popularity of the Mexican festival means that people are beginning to combine traditions from the two.

It is becoming more common to see people perform traditional 'Day of the Dead' rituals such as decorating graves with sugar skulls and gifts.







THAT OLD CHESTNUT: Journalist Richard Duebel

Out to conker

THE BBC sent a television crew to the Genal Valley to report on the chestnut harvest.

During the show, journalists Richard Duebel and Sylvia Smith investigate how the chestnuts are harvested by local farmers, how the plague of chestnut gall wasps has affected this year's crop and how they influence local cuisine.

Most of the filming has been centred on the villages of Jubrique and Genalguacil and local officials believe the show will help to put these locations on the map. It is hoped the programme will help to boost tourism in the area.

The Genal Valley has nearly 4,000 hectares of chestnut forests, which are considered of high importance to the region's economy as many local families make a living from selling their produce.

ENVIRONMENTAL experts claim the Guadalhorce River is 'a sewer' after hundreds of birds and fish were found

dead in its waters.

Several environmental organisations have asked the authorities to take action to put in new measures to improve the water quality.

Paco Rivera, a spokesman for the Spanish Ornithological Society, declared that the river is "currently a sewer."

The regional authorities have already sent several of the dead fish to be examined by biologists and have written the problem off as an "isolated incident.'

But environmental groups disagree, and Ecologists in Action have asked the council to provide more solutions to resolve the situation and stressed to local media sources that "much more could be done."

Several towns along the river's middle and lower course have no water treatment facilities with raw sewage dumped into the water despite its importance for wildlife and the presence of a nature reserve at its mouth.

Wee problem

The toxic discharge is allegedly having a harmful effect on local species, such as otters, which are steadily decreasing in numbers.

According to local media sources, 20 per cent of Malaga Province's sewage is disposed of without treatment, and more than 60 per cent of the wastewater plants in the region don't work properly.

It comes as provincial sub

delegate for the Spanish government, Miguel Briones, this week announced a €48 million package to improve water treatment in the Guadalhorce Valley, but failed to say when or where the cash would be spent.

But when quizzed, Malaga City Council officials claimed that they had received no message from Madrid and denied knowledge of the funds.

IT has been confirmed that the next Vuelta a España cycling race will depart from the Costa del Sol, and is scheduled to kick off at Malaga's Pompidou Centre on August 25 next year.

Park life

THE Andalucian regional authorities have confirmed that the Sierra de La Utrera national park will be declared a site of National Interest to protect the area from urban development, after protests by concerned residents.

THE Spanish police will auction off nearly 800 guns they have seized in raids, but interested buyers must already possess the required firearms licence to purchase any of the weapons.



A MANHUNT has been launched after a high speed car chase and police shootout in Torrox.

It comes after officers were forced to open fire to avoid being mowed down by two high-end BMWs.

The drama unfolded after a Local Police patrol tried to stop three vehicles that "were performing suspicious and evasive manoeuvres," an official said.

But the cars sped away, leading to a pursuit.

The first, a Volkswagen Golf, headed for the A-7 motorway and was intercepted at a toll booth in Marbella several hours later, with two Spanish men, from Ceuta and Algeciras respec-

tively, remanded in custody.

Meanwhile the other two cars, both BMW 7-series and each containing two people believed to be foreign, hurtled through the centre of Torrox Pueblo for almost three kilometres before taking a dead-end turn near the town's cemetery.

When the chasing officers realised, they parked at the end of the street, blocking most of it with their car and leaving just a two-metre gap.

And as they drew their weapons and shouted for the fugitives to step out of their vehicles, the officers instead saw both spin around and accelerate towards them, leading them to open fire, aiming at the wheels and engines.

But the ploy failed and the men were forced to dive to safety as the cars shot by, sparking a major search operation.

Initial reports suggest that the incident was related to drugs trafficking or robberies.

Lombardy with Milan as its main city and Veneto with Venice as its most famous icon both saw votes exceeding 90 per cent calling for a larger percentage of tax payments to remain in the regions rather than see it

The turnouts were in excess of 60 per cent in each case and although the results are not binding on central government they are an example of how a legally undertaken referendum can alert government to the wishes of the people.

Interestingly, the two Italian regions are both in the north of the country and like Spain, there is some divide between the wishes, aspirations and expectations of those living in the north and the south.

Whilst it is possible that there will be similar votes in other parts of the European Union, it must be remembered that as recently as 1993, Czechoslovakia split amicably to form two independent republics which both went on to become members of the EU.

The Spanish situation is much more volatile but it is to be hoped that the breakdown in communications with Cataluña will be resolved using sense rather than violence from either side

Parents' desperate plea

Members of the Find Agnese Klavina campaign have said, "Sometimes you really have to worry about the Spanish justice system.

"We have just been notified that the Audencia (High Court) of Malaga has granted permission for Craig Porter to travel to Liverpool for the birth of his fourth child in spite of our opposition and a likely chance that he could use this opportunity to run away from jus-

"We have just filed an appeal to this decision.

"How can someone who is currently being tried for making Agnese disappear, a crime that in our opinion is tantamount to murder be granted this kind of request?

"It beggars belief how the Spanish courts can allow this person to travel. He is bound to use this opportunity to escape from justice.

missing on Saturday, September 6, 2014 after leaving a popular Puerto Banus night club.

Capper and Porter admitted driving Agnese away from the nightclub but Capper claims he dropped her off near her apartment, while Porter was asleep on the back seat of the car.

Police are in possession of CCTV footage which depicts the men leaving the club with Agnese, and, later, three unidentified men dragging a large suitcase onto Capper's motor boat soon after she vanished.

The boat left Marbella and was seized some 300 kilometres away

in Cartagena, but no body has

Both men refused to testify during a hearing in Marbella in April 2015, but a court source confirmed, "The investigating judge has committed Westley Capper and Craig Porter to trial on a charge of aggravated unlawful detention and discharged another two suspects.

"Capper and Porter remain on bail but as part of their conditional release conditions, they have to sign on twice a month and are banned from leaving Spain.

The pair are also facing trial for killing a Bolivian mother in a hitand-run in San Pedro, Marbella.

In the early evening of May 9, Fatima Dorado Para, a 40-year-old Bolivian woman, was struck by a British-registered Bentley as she was crossing the road on a pedestrian crossing adjacent to the San Pedro Alcantara Boulevard.

The Bentley struck her, throwing her about 100 feet in the air, before speeding off without stopping.

Emergency services were called and Fatima was rushed to the Costa del Sol hospital but suffered heart failure and died.

Police found the damaged Bentlev about six kilometres away from the scene of accident, at Diana Park where the owner and his passenger were discovered drinking in an Indian restaurant.

Capper has been charged with negligent homicide, failure to stop and provide help to the victim, driving under the influence of alcohol, and possession of false documentation.



Record-breaking summer tourism

THE summer saw more than 25 million people visit Andalucia.

Despite the record-breaking figures, Malaga was the only province not to see an increase in the number of holidaymakers. It was however the destination for 38 per cent of tourists and matched last year's figures.

Although Andalucia saw a 7 per cent increase in international holidaymakers, the Junta Tourism Minister Francisco Fernandez pointed out that the region saw a drop in Spanish visitors.

"It is important to make more efforts in the national market. because they are a primordial client for the destination," he said, adding "we cannot ignore the national market, as it accounts for 60 per cent of travellers."

Fernandez also denied claims the increase in hotel prices was leading to less Spaniards visiting Andalucia, and suggested that the drop was more likely due to the more than 17,000 tourist rentals available in the region.



THE Andalucian High Court of Justice has announced that it sees no reason to justify installation of nearly 60 surveillance cameras in Puerto Banus.

The local police advised Marbella City Council while putting together the original proposal, which took into account local crime statistics, and suggested that a total of 57 cameras should be installed in the area.

The High Court's committee which supervises video surveillance has approved cameras for some areas, such as the Muelle de Ribera, the Antonio Banderas Square and the port. The green light has also been given to the La Cañada and Elviria shopping centres, where 11 and 13 cameras will be installed respectively.

The committee decided that the

number of crimes committed in these zones gave grounds for the requested surveillance cameras. Allegedly, the same reasoning did not apply to other locations suggested by the council.

The High Court claimed that it could not justify all the 100 proposed surveillance spots in Marbella simply on the grounds of the terrorist alert, which has been on level 4 since the Barcelona terror attacks, and the high

influx of tourists to the town.

However, the council could still protest the court's ruling and re-request that cameras be installed in the neighbourhoods that weren't ap-

The surveillance project has become a priority for the council, which has already allocated €1.5 million of the budget to spend on video cam-



At the farm, along with the 250 marihuana plants, officers also found 12 boxes containing a total of 40 kilos of marihuana buds, two fans, four dryers, an exhaust fan, filters. an air conditioning, a crossbow with arrows, two machetes, an axe, a weight and an electric diesel generator.

Brakes put on thieves

POLICE have detained two men accused of committing more than 20 burglaries in Malaga capital.

Allegedly, the two men, aged 39 and 24, were not working together but committed similar crimes within the same area of the city. One man is accused of robbing goods from inside nine different vehicles, while the other reportedly stole from 14 vehicles.

One of the men was held after police launched an investigation into the spate of vehicle thefts that occurred between May and August. The other man was allegedly caught in the act by the owner of one of the vehicles, who immediately alerted the police.

Officers retrieved several of the items taken from the victim, and charged the man with eight similar robberies reported in the neighbourhood.

Man set to swim from Gib to Morocco

A BRAZILIAN man is hoping to lend a helping hand in the fight to end world sanitation problems as he attempts to swim from Gibraltar to Moroc-

Aldo Jansel, a Brazilian national who lives in the US, will attempt to swim the Gibraltar channel after becoming engrossed in the topic of sanita-

The 30-year-old has previously competed in triathlons and admits that he has always enioved swimming.

He told the Euro Weekly News: "Swimming has always been a part of my life; I've swam since I was little and it helps me to organise my thoughts, much like meditations.

For more than a year, Aldo has been involved with sanitation related projects and gave a TEDx talk on the matter in Mexico earlier this year.

Since then he has travelled around Europe in an attempt to spread the word on sanitation.

"Most of us don't realise that when we flush our toilets that precious potable water now contaminated will end up in the ocean, where I swim," he said.

"Most coastal towns like Tarifa, have only primary sewer treatment which entails removing solids then adding a chlorinated mix and pumping

this effluent into the ocean through what's called marine outfalls.

"Thirty per cent of a home's water consumption goes to the toilet alone. Either we change our water consumption model or we cannot expect everyone in the world to have a water flushing toilet.

"My goal is for every single person to have a toilet which does not waste water, nor the

nutrients in humanure and a toilet that is sustainable and truly affordable. This goal can only be attained through a dry, compost toilet. "

On why he chose to swim the Gibraltar channel specifically, Aldo said: "Gibraltar is part of the Ocean's seven channels. similar to the seven summits.

"I've been trying to swim it for two years but the waiting list gets longer every year. I have been in contact with AC-NEG, the association which runs the swims since then.

"I just came out of a meeting with them and I'm waiting for a window of opportunity. I'm hoping to swim next week. I just found out I can't swim this weekend, but I'm high up on the waiting list, hopefully early

Aldo aspires to raise 5.000 dollars in order to build 100 emergency toilets, but he also aims to make people more aware of sanitation problems across the world.

"I hope to raise awareness about dry toilets, about the fact that there are close to three billion people worldwide without access to sanitation, get the conversation going about sewer dumping in our oceans and its impacts on marine life and

"Immediately though, I want to help the earthquake survivors in Oaxaca, Mexico by building dry toilets for them.

"Sport is a metaphor for life. When I'm swimming in the open ocean in the middle of tall waves and strong currents and I look at the Mountain of Yebel in Morocco, I wonder if I will get there.

"Similarly, when I look at the sanitation crisis around the world, I wonder if we will ever fix this problem.

"Yet, the only way to get to Morocco is to swim, one armstroke at a time, and the only way to solve our global sanitation challenge is to start with one toilet, at a time."



Speaking at the council offices in La Cala de Mijas, she explained that the concept of this new site in English and Spanish www.supportinspain.info is to point elderly expatriate residents in the Costa del Sol and Malaga towards a range of services that they may not be aware of.

tance no matter what the problem may be and because it is also produced in Spanish, those who can't speak the language can demonstrate to neighbours or the authorities the assistance they are seeking.

Thanks to the fact that this is part of a much wider project, connected with research into Muslim and Polish communities in Britain and the possible effect on them caused by Brexit, funds were made available which allowed for the site to be translated into Span-

Representatives of many charities and organisations involved in assisting older people attended the launch alongside Council representatives from Benalmadena, Manilva and Mi-

As a number of the target audience are not completely computer savvy, the site has been made as simple as possible with direct links whenever available to each organisation on the site.

Those directly working with the elderly will also be able to print out the contents of the site for people without computers and many will be distributing a useful flyer which explains the concept of the site.

This is without doubt a very useful and impressive option for those who don't know exactly how to proceed to obtain help and assistance and it is hoped that it will eventually be extended to other parts of the country.














THE British Consulate in Malaga has had a particularly busy time following the liquidation of Monarch Airlines according to Consul Charmaine Arbouin.

Addressing an audience in the council offices in La Cala de Mijas on the day of the launch of the website www.supportinspain.info she took time to update everyone on what she described as "the largest ever peacetime evac-

Many of the 110,000 passengers who were repatriated in planes chartered by the British government were flown out of Malaga Airport and she and her staff were constantly involved in offering assistance and

Her personal experience was that those who flew out of Malaga were pleased with the action taken and by the helpful attitude of the ground staff at what was an unusually busy time.

Three times the number who were returned actually never managed to leave the UK on their booked flights and will now have to hope that they can recover the money that they have already spent either through ATOL insurance or if they booked with credit cards from their card supplier.



A BRITISH luxury cruise ship with 4,000 passengers on board has rescued 10 African migrants off the coast of Spain near Almeria.

The crew of the the P&O Cruises flagship Britannia spotted an inflatable dinghy carrying the migrants at 1am in the morning and im-

mediately performed a Uturn and issued a man overboard announcement to the cruise passengers.

A Spanish coastguard helicopter was sent to pull the migrants out of the water and they were given shelter, food, drink and medical care on board Britannia until a coastguard ship arrived and they were handed over to Spanish authorities.

Once on dry land they were attended to by the Spanish Red Cross.

The MV Britannia, named by HM The Queen in March 2015, resumed its normal cruise itinerary.

Legal row resolved

Brit scams revealed

Investigators identify almost 800 culprits

have been identified by the Spanish police for claiming compensation in fake food poisoning

The claims were made while the tourists were on all-inclusive holidays in the Balearics.

Some complaints were made three years after the trip.

Budget boom

LOW-COST airline Jet2.com has added 550,000 extra summer 2018 seats from former Monarch bases after the collapse of the rival airline

SPANISH police are warning of highly toxic bracelets being sold in markets across Spain.

Last week officers from the Guardia Civil's Seprona branch found five bracelets at a medieval market in Soria while a dozen were found in Zaragoza during the annual Fiesta del Pi-

lar celebrations.

The intense red and black bracelets are made with abrin seeds which can cause hallucinations, vomiting and even death.

The seeds are also known as

'Indian liquorice' or 'ladybird seed' and potentially lethal.

No antidote exists for abrin.

Just three micrograms of the toxin in the blood can lead to death.

The major symptoms of abrin poisoning depend on

the route of exposure and the dose received, though many organs may be affected in

€65m lotto jackpot

A EUROMILLIONS ticket bought in southern Spain was the sole winner of the €65,407,072 jackpot in Tuesday's draw.

The lucky lottery ticket was bought in the city of El Puerto de Santa María in the province of Cadiz, Andalucia with the winning numbers of 9, 11, 13, 27 and 33. The stars were 7 and 10.

Bumper payouts of €148,690 for players who matched five numbers and one star also went to two punters in Sevilla and one in Teruel.

Only recently (October 6) a record €190 million jackpot for the twiceweekly draw went to another ticket bought in Spain.

UK health authorities are warning of an outbreak of Legionnaire's disease in Palmanova on the Spanish holiday island of Mallorca.

Most of the infected are recovering well but Spanish media reported the death of a 70-year-old British man who already had diabetes, chronic leukaemia and ischemic heart disease which complicated his recovery.

The regional government has confirmed positive legionella samples in a hotel in Palmanova where eight of those affected stayed and for the time being it remains closed.

Other establishments in the area have also started to disinfect their premises and have taken preventive measures.

Public health technicians on the island have also collected water samples from ornamental fountains, beach showers, restaurants with outdoor nebulizers, as well as in irrigation sprinklers, swimming pools and various areas of a water park and are waiting to hear the results of these tests to rule out the existence of more outbreaks.

Public Health England (PHE) has said that since mid-September, 17 British travellers have returned from the area with the infection.

Nick Phin, Deputy Director at PHE said, "At this time, the source is under investigation and the Spanish authorities are leading the response to this outbreak. We are active in responding to

any requests for information on UK cases from the Spanish authorities.

"We are advising people who have travelled or are planning to travel to Palmanova in Mallorca to be aware of the signs and symptoms of Legionnaire's disease, which are initially flulike. This is particularly important if you are in a group at increased risk of infection such as those with underlying medical conditions, smokers or people aged 50 or over.

"Once infection starts in the lungs, symptoms may become pneumonialike, such as a persistent cough. If you do experience symptoms, speak to your GP as soon as possible and inform them of your travel."

They advise that, "Once infection starts in your lungs, you may also experience symptoms of pneumonia, such as a persistent cough. This is usually dry at first, but as the infection develops, you may start coughing up phlegm or (in some rare cases) blood, whilst experiencing shortness of breath and chest pains."

PHE is advising people who have al-

ready travelled to Palmanova, Mallorca to be aware of the symptoms of Legionnaire's disease and if they develop these symptoms, they should alert their GP, telling them about their recent travel.

They also say that if you plan to travel to Palmanova, Mallorca and are at increased risk of contracting Legionnaire's disease (see above), you should look out for the symptoms of the infec-

Legionnaire's disease is an infection from the local environment and does not pass from person to person.

Damp patches and defects in new builds

IT'S clear these days Spain is slowly but surely easing itself out of the grips of the construction crisis.

However many new homes occupied for the first time earlier this year and last will still have to endure winter rains. The much needed rain that so many will be looking forward to will inevitably also reveal structural defects in some of these new buildings. the most common being damp patches. It may be inevitable but who is responsible? Unfortunately the ruling regulations are far from clear.

Firstly, an owner does not have to wait for the developer to act or sue a developer directly to get their damaged property repaired.

New buildings means new communities and all communities have responsibilities of adequate maintenance to ensure habitability. If a communal element of a building, for example a roof is leaking and causing damage to a private property then the community is responsible for the repair. Article. 10.1, a of the Law of Horizontal Property is quite clear on that.

If the community fails to respond appropriately, the owner can take the community to court and have the court

force them to make the repair. In turn the community can seek remuneration for damages from the developer.

However considering the high costs often involved, it may be wiser for both the community and the owner to wait for the developer's response before pushing ahead with a costly repair or court

Communities both new and old will carry insurance, but few community insurances if any will cover structural defects. The public liability aspect of the community insurance would probably cover damages caused by a structural defect, for example damp inside an apartment but not the cost of the structural repair itself.

New buildings also have guarantees from the developers but these are often misunderstood and chances missed. Building guarantees from the developers will include an insurance for up to 10 years. However this insurance only covers the major

aspects of the building; the foundations, beams, loadbearing walls and any other structural elements concerned with the strength and stability of the building.

Other defects, which unfortunately are the most common, are not covered by this insurance and therefore the community cannot make a claim for them.

This said, the community can still make a claim for defects such as damp patches etc directly against the developer or any of the other professionals and sub-contractors involved in the construction of the building as per Article 17 of the 1999 Spanish Law of Construc-

For the claim to be valid these defects depending on their nature must materialise within one to three years from the date the building was officially signed off and considered to be finished. Surprisingly after that, developers and subcontractors cannot be held responsible.

Property developers also have contractual responsibilities. If an owner has not received the build quality expected then they are free to make a claim for breach of

The legal period would be longer than that for a claim for structural defects but it would be necessary to prove the defect actually constituted a breach of contract.

If a problem arises with a new building and an agreement cannot be reached the community can pursue in court the following; either the developer, as the one having overall responsibility for the architects, builders, sub-contractors and other professionals involved in the construction or all or any of the professionals, builders and subcontractors etc individual-

These scenarios are often tricky so as usual, we the solicitors for Intercala Administration recommend our readers seek competent advice in all matters concerning the law.

UK police have said there have been two potential sightings of fraudster Mark George Aklom, who might be back in Spain again with his wife, Maria Rodriguez, and their two young daughters.

Police have said they have received 'potentially significant information' just two days after a new European hunt for fresh information but they have not revealed from where

Although detectives said he could be anywhere in Europe they believed there is a good chance he might be in Spain where the family used to live until a year ago.

Acklom, 44, is the subject of a European Arrest Warrant and was named as part of Operation Captura, an appeal launched and run by the National Crime Agency and Crimestoppers.

He's wanted by Avon and Somerset Constabulary for defrauding a woman he was in a relationship with out of £850,000. Acklom allegedly made a number of false representations after starting a romantic relationship with a woman from Bath in January 2012.

The victim stated that Acklom first claimed to work in the banking world in Switzerland and was very wealthy. He then went on to claim

he worked for an intelligence agency.

Acklom arranged for the victim to live in one of the properties he claimed to own in Bath. He stated he had cash flow problems that were hindering renovation work, and the victim gave him numerous totalling loans £850,000. It later transpired that Acklom did not own the property.

The victim never received any of her money back.

Aklom has also used the names Mark Conway, Mark Desmond, Marc Ros Rodriguez, Kid Con, Marc Ros and Marc Long

Detective Inspector Adam Bunting, who is leading the efforts to find Acklom, said, "Mark Acklom is a convincing fraudster and we're working hard to locate him as soon as possible.

"We believe he'll be with his wife Maria Rodriguez and their two young daughters, who we know up until last year's appeal, were enrolled in El Limonar International School in the Murcia area of Spain.

"In the days following the appeal he removed his children from the school and together with his wife, he disappeared.

"We have significant concerns about the children's well-being giv-

with no notice, from their school, friends and family. It's highly likely Acklom will have placed his children in another fee-paying school.

The children are aged six and eight.

Since the Operation Captura appeal, a photograph was taken by a member of the public of Acklom in Geneva.

Switzerland in May but he's not been sighted since.

Now police are issuing details of Acklom's wife for the first time, as they believe she may be assisting him but she isn't the subject of a European Arrest Warrant.

Maria Yolanda Ros Rodriguez, 47, is likely to be with Acklom and may be using the aliases Yolianda Ross, Maria Long, Mary Moss or another name entirely.

DI Bunting added, "Mark Acklom has links through property to Spain and there's been a positive sighting in Switzerland. We also have information linking him to Dublin and Italy, but he could be anywhere in Europe. It's possible he may have travelled outside the

"He's described as 5ft 10ins, of medium build, with dark brown hair and green eyes.

"We're grateful for the ongoing support of the National Crime Agency and our law enforcement colleagues in Europe but we need the help of the media and the public in the UK and Europe to track him

Police loyalty questioned

THE Spanish government is reportedly planning to rid Cataluña's police force of officers who support the independence movement.

It comes after Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy announced that he plans to invoke article 155 of the constitution which will allow the government to impose direct rule on the embattled region. The senate is scheduled to vote on whether to implement the decision tomorrow (Friday).

Among the proposals Rajoy has asked the Senate to approve, including the removal of Catalan President Carles Puigdemont and his cabinet from office immediately, is the possibility of replacing Catalan Mossos d'Esquadra officers with officers from the National Police force.

Deputy Prime Minister Soraya Saenz de Santamaria also claimed that one of the government's first acts when they take control of the region will be to see "the political control of the Mossos taken over by the interior ministry."

While speaking to a UK media outlet, the Spanish government spokesman Iñigo Mendez de Vigo revealed that the government plans to use the Mossos to "restore the law" if there are any acts of disobedience when article 155 is invoked.

According to Spanish media sources. many Catalan officers are reluctant to use the forceful techniques that that were used by riot police on October 1 during the referendum. Trade unions also revealed that several Mossos officers suddenly submitted sick notes to get out of working that day in order not to get involved in the clash.

The Police Chief of the Mossos d'Esquadra, Major Josep Lluis Trapero, is currently under investigation for failing to carry out orders from Spanish authorities to prevent the unauthorised referendum from

leadership structure for the Mossos as fears grow that many will pledge their allegiance to the Catalan authorities if Madrid imposes direct rule.







CROWDFUNDING for property whereby investors 'chip in' to purchase real estate has just taken a step forward with an American investment company offering in Spain. Prodigy Network in New York will accept Spanish customers who wish to commit \$10,000 (€8,500) or more into the purchase of commercial and residential property in Manhattan which will be rented out.

Giving away €42 a month

ALTHOUGH a large number of mobile phone owners in Spain tend to purchase their telephones outright, the opposite is almost the norm in the UK.

In many cases, arrangements are made whereby customers agree a higher contract price in order to pay for expensive phones over a period of 18 to 24 months.

This means that phone users are able to obtain the latest models with affordable monthly payments but in many cases, once the contracted period expires, some comBy John Smith

panies simply renew without deducting the extra charged for the phone.

Now, the British government accepts that a Citizen's Advice Bureau report that highlighted three companies - EE, Three and Vodafone - who act in this manner should be considered.

These companies have stated that their charges are fair, but the other major supplier O2 has made it clear that it separates the charges so that customers are totally aware of costs and can see the reduction once the phone has been paid for.

It is also suggested that those over 65 are the least likely to change their contracts and are therefore at the greatest risk of paying too much.

As many expatriates in Spain still keep their UK numbers, it would be worth their while to check that they are not on expired contracts which can cost up to £38 (€42) per month more than they should according to the research.

Catalan crisis could hurt property

Imports increase but exports up more

EVEN though Spanish exports have increased by 9 per cent in the past eight months, the trade deficit now stands at €16.4 billion

This deficit increase is 49 per cent higher than the same period last year and imports have continued to rise to €198.7 billion.

Large firms reduce waste

MANY WILL BEAT THE EU 2030 DEADLINE

A LARGE number of major companies are now committed to significantly reduce the amount of waste they generate and to conserve energy

As a recent report suggested that 64 per cent of Spanish consumers polled were looking for greater clarity in packaging description and the European Commission is introducing strict targets for reduction in waste, Spanish companies are enthusiastically looking at their procedures. Landfills are a major environmental problem within the EU and although household waste is often not properly sorted for recycling, these companies which include Procter and Gamble (P&G), Nestle and Pascual are taking major steps to reduce their negative affect upon the

One obvious area where those involved in the production of food and drink is to ensure that there is no spillage - which would result in rejection and end up as possible landfill - by improving their production lines and such investment also means in the long run that they will save money by producing more saleable products.

The Grupo Pascual has streamlined its Barcelona milk packaging factory so that it sends nothing to landfill and any waste liquid is recycled. It expects that all of its factories will significantly reduce waste by 2020 and will follow a 3R rule (reduce, reuse and recycle) to achieve this.

Already half of the 10 production units operated by Nestle in Spain are able to boast that they send nothing to landfill and they too are committed to make all of their factories environmentally friendly by 2020.

Unilever was able to declare its entire factory base around the world as free of waste in 2015 and discovered that it was able to make savings

of €200 million, so has now turned its attention to its global office network. More than 50 per cent of P&G factories are already producing zero waste and this group has also set 2020 as its target for all factories worldwide to join in the Spanish success which has already seen the elimination of all landfill.

As these major manufacturers lead the way in ensuring that their production produces as little waste as possible, so it is expected that other smaller businesses and consumers will start to play their part in making the world a less dangerous place.

Stock markets still strong

MANY Stock Exchanges around the world have seen significant increases in share value except for Spain, although even there the Catalan problem has not seen huge drops.

The convincing re-election of Japanese leader Shinzo Abe saw the Nikkei index raise to its highest level in 21 years and Wall Street saw record levels last Friday. based on an expectation of tax cuts and the suggestion that Janet Yellen may be reappointed as head of the Federal Reserve.

European markets were fairly static and slightly worried about the Spanish situation and possible problems with other European separatists, but most analysts consider this to be unlikely and say the Catalan crisis will be contained within Spain.

THE CATALAN CRISIS AFFECTS THE ENTIRE COUNTRY

National economy suffers

WHILST a great deal has understandably been made about the political problems facing the Madrid government, managing the financial fall out of article 155 is another thing.

Already the Catalan economy is facing a potentially disastrous downturn with a number of major companies moving their head offices out of the province, but according to Prime Minister Rajoy, at least 1,300 small and medium size businesses have already moved with a further 3,000 considering the possibility.

Fear of potential public disruption with protests, especially in Barcelona appears to have frightened a number of potential foreign visitors off and bookings have already fallen by 30 per cent which will directly affect hotels with the possible knock on effect of lay-offs of staff.

This reduction in the number of visitors has seen a similar loss of income for many retail outlets as well as bars and restaurants in city centres, which to a great extent rely upon tourists spending, with even taxis

feeling the pinch.

Investment in the province is most certainly down, with companies considering whether investment or even the granting of loans to Catalan companies is a wise move at this pivotal time and indeed some operations have already indicated that they will put Spain as a whole on hold.

Car sales continue to appear to be buoyant at the moment, but that is because dealers have already placed orders with manufacturers, but the

harsh reality is that the number of advance orders being placed could have fallen by at least 20 per cent.

If Spain wants to hit its GDP forecasts and please the European Union, it needs a vibrant and economically strong Cataluña back in place, otherwise it will face a number of very unpleasant consequences.

Already the government is having to increase rates of interest paid when issuing bonds which means that it is costing considerably more to borrow money on the international market and with the European Central Bank looking likely to cut back on the amount it is spending on buying euro bonds, another interest hike could be on the cards.

Several years of economic growth meant that the international credit ratings companies such as Standard & Poor's and Moody's were considered likely to upgrade Spain's rating but this is now unlikely until what they consider a positive conclusion with Cataluña independence is

More jitters over Cataluña

THE Starwood Capital Finances Europe which has recently loaned €46 million for the building of a new hotel in Barcelona has expressed concern at the situation in Cataluña.

With a further €61 million advanced to two other developments in other parts of Spain, it has announced that it will divert investment to other parts of the EU until the current crisis is resolved.

It isn't just Spain which is being watched closely by the company which is also nervous over Brexit and the results of the German election but with €53 billion in funds being managed, the group intends to ensure that customer's funds are safeguarded as much as possi-

AS British banks with assets in excess of £25 billion (€28 billion) split their businesses in two in order to protect retail customer's deposits. Santander takes a different

The British government has given high street banks until 2019 to split their operations so that each stands alone with their own staff and accounts in order to try to ensure that the debacle of 2008

With Brexit around the corner. there is the risk that some banks may consider taking the opportunity to relocate their speculative and high value customer business outside of the UK, although so far both Barclays and HSBC seem likely to keep the bulk of business within the UK.

Spanish bank Santander however is taking a different stance and has announced that its higher risk activities - thought to be worth £40 billion (€45 billion) - will be transferred to Banco Santander, the Spanish parent of the group.

Largest trade partner

A RECENT visit by King Felipe VI to Saudi Arabia underlined the importance of trade links which in 2016 were worth €5.5 billion to Spain.

Whilst his visit was primarily aimed at ensuring that the Kingdom purchased five Avante warships, trade talks have continued and the recently appointed Spanish Ambassador Alvaro Iranzo Gutierrez made it clear that his government was not only happy to be involved with ongoing trade but supported Saudi Vision 2030.

"We fully support the Vision 2030. Our companies are ready to contribute and help it develop in all areas, such as the development of renewable energies and state-of-the-art infrastructure. Spain hopes to contribute to unleash the potential of Saudi youth using professional training centres across the country," he told the Riyadh Daily newspaper.

There are currently 120 Spanish companies who have combined with Saudi partners to set up offices in Saudi Arabia and the rail link between Mecca and Medina, whilst having some problems has been hailed as a successful innovation managed by a consortium of Spanish companies.

Other large infrastructure projects related to water, electricity and renewable energies are also under way, while Spanish brands such as Zara with 34 stores and discount store Lefties are well represented in the Kingdom's shopping centres.

One potential new market for SEAT and other Spanish produced vehicles will be Saudi women, now that they are officially allowed to drive.

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Wet weather tips

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

WEATHER conditions pose the biggest risk to road users, partly due to inexperience and lack of preparedness, and partly due to changing road dynamics and the driving environment.

Here are our top tips for dealing with rain.

1. Slow down

It's easy to be lulled into a false sense of security but speed and adverse weather is a deadly combination. When the road is wet, your vehicle's tyres cannot grip the road as much as in normal, dry conditions, so slow down.

Cornering and braking are all affected by water on the road, reducing grip and increasing stopping distances considerably; slowing down allows more time to adapt and deal with the situation. Ease off the accelerator a little and you will see the difference immediately.

2. Avoid violent movement/sharp braking

Sudden braking, acceleration or harsh movements of the steering wheel may result in loss of vehicle control. If the operations are carried out progressively, smoothly and slowly, it also gives other drivers more time to react. Remember that a smooth drive is a safer and more efficient ride under normal conditions and even more so when it rains.

3. Avoid driving on road markings

Road markings provide less grip than the road surface itself and can therefore increase braking distances. Riders on two wheels should be particularly aware of this problem.

During rain or reduced visibility, make sure that you have your lights on. Daytime Running Lights may not suffice, especially in reduced visibility where headlights must be used. The timely use of indicators and brake lights is cru-

cial to give other road users advanced warnings of your intentions. Keeping your vehicle under control and following all the advice for a smooth ride will also allow for an improvement in your visibility to other road users.

5. Avoid aquaplaning risks

Keep a sharp lookout for puddles, which may reduce the grip of your tyres, potentially creating a liquid barrier between the tyre and road surface, commonly referred to as aquaplaning. However, don't carry out any sudden movements to avoid puddles. Simply slow down, hold the steering wheel firmly and try to keep your vehicle on a straight and level course. Whilst maintaining an adequate distance from the vehicle in front, it is often beneficial to follow vehicles through such areas as the displacement of water becomes easier.

With these five basic tips your journey through the rain should be much safer. But remember, it's not only about how you drive your vehicle, but about the vehicle itself.

Proper maintenance is crucial. Check tyres and their pressure, lights, windows, brakes and other features regularly to reduce the risk. If in doubt, your local garage can check the vehicle.

How much CGT do I pay?

IF I sell my house in Spain valued at €225,000, how is the CGT paid, or can I roll this into another property?

M.C. (email)

THAT depends on whether you are a tax resident in Spain, selling your principal residence, or you are a non-resident.

If you are a non-resident. you will pay Spanish Capital Gains Tax (CGT) at 21 per cent of your profit. If you bought for €125,000 and sell for €225,000, you have a profit of €100,000 and a tax of €21,000. A **David Searl** You and the Law in Spain

non-resident has no rollover

You may be free of CGT if you meet three conditions. You are selling your principal residence, where you have lived for three years. You have paid your income tax in Spain for

three years. You are over 65 years of age. If you are vounger than 65, you can also escape CGT if you purchase a new principal residence using the total value of your sale.

The resident pays CGT on a sliding scale. Tax is 19 per cent up to a profit of €6,000, 21 per cent from there to €50,000, and 23 per cent above that.



ANDLORDS enjoy the greatest return on their leased properties in Lerida, Algeciras, and Tarrasa. In those municipalities they reap an average of between 7 and 8 per cent return on an annual basis.

Across Spain the average return is in the range of 4 to 6 per cent according to analysis from the Spanish department of Urban Data Analytics. The international firm used big data analysis to investigate property trends in Spanish municipalities with populations exceeding 100,000.

Multiple factors are considered. For instance, although Algeciras offers one of the best returns in Spain, the market there for landlords is still fairly risky. It takes an average of more than two months to find tenants,

during which time thousands in rent is being lost.

By contrast, in Madrid and Barcelona, returns are lower in percentage terms but prices are far higher anyway and it takes less than two weeks on average to find a suitable tenant.

Then there are places like Marbella and Alcobendas where returns are slightly lower than average because, although rents are high, so is the initial investment required to purchase a property.

Overall the report found that the best places for landlords, in terms of overall profitability, were Las Palmas in Gran Canaria, Hospitalet, Tarrasa, and Reus.

The last three are all close to Barcelona.

'Holy Grail' apartment

A THREE-bedroom apartment with a lift is the Holy Grail for Spanish renters. A report from the Mitula Group found that the modest request is the most common search term on rental websites.

Though in vogue on magazine covers and interior design programmes, attics, duplexes, chalets and other more innovative properties don't cut it when it comes to the average tenant.

The Spanish Housing Prices Report for the third quarter of 2017 found that a two, three or four-bed apartment with a common lift accounted for six out of every 10 searches nationwide.

In larger cities that figure rises sharply, In Zaragoza the two to four-bed apartment accounts for more than 90 per cent of searches. Three-bed is the magic number, however, representing more than half of all searches.

Lifts are valued so highly by Spanish tenants that the rent of a property plummets by 21 per cent if it doesn't have a common lift

ates, while on the hunt for property abroad, specifically hunt for a place in an urbanisation.

These often bring many advantages - such as an enriched sense of community, lack of DIY upkeep and shared amenities such as a swimming pool or sports facilities. However, community comes at a cost and it can often cause a financial headache if the property sellers are upfront about all the charges beforehand.

One thing worth taking into consideration is if the urbanisation allows short-term or holiday rentals. Tourists are often much noisier than permanent residents and a daily turnover of guests could be quite disruptive during the summer months. They are also likely to be less respective of common areas and shared facilities as they are only staying there for a few days, which could get aggravating.

It is wise to check out how well communicated the urbanisation is to the other parts of the coast. Even if

you have a car, road travel can be time consuming and expensive as coastal roads can get congested easily and it can be difficult to park in the summer months. Finding somewhere which has good bus connections and

supermarkets within walking difference could make all the difference.

Another problem which can cause tension in these gated communities is making sure that everyone pays the upkeep costs. If many homeowners dodge paying these charges, the extra costs have to be covered by everyone else which can get expensive. If a development has many properties on the market, this also is a sign that you could end up paying more in these fees than you first thought.

You should find out whether the community tends to carry out any major renovation work before you buy as this could also hike up the costs in the near future. Check whether you are liable for paying for these improvements and also find out if the previous owners owe any service charges, as the owners of the urbanisation might transfer those costs to you if they are not paid before they leave.

Finally, before you buy any property abroad always make sure you hire a good, English-speaking lawyer to check out all the contracts and investigate any loopholes before you sign anything. This way you should be able to sleep sound at night knowing all the costs you have to pay upfront.

Real estate's

digital makeover

PAIN'S real estate industry is set to get a digital makeover thanks to Neinor Homes. The developer, created by an American investment fund, has launched Neinor Next.

The project will offer support to an emerging sector within the property business, known as 'proptech.'

At present the proptech field is occupied by start-up companies with bright ideas on revolutionising the sector from a digital perspective, but without the initial capital needed to make their ideas a reality.

Neinor Next is set to change that. At a convention held last

week in Barcelona, Neinor positioned itself as the link between the real estate and technology sectors.

These start-ups use blockchain technology, which dramatically improves market analysis, and artificial intelligence, to offer buyers and sellers the best chance at making a profit.

Gone are the days of guesswork and economic reports. Complex computer programs will evaluate every possible feature of a property's vulnerability, or strength, in the marketplace and

make recommendations beyond the scope of human intelligence.

Other features, such as virtual reality, will also offer future buyers the chance to know even more about a potential property without even setting foot in it.

Owner dilemma:

Rent or sell?

PROPERTY players in Spain who own an unoccupied building have a fairly tough choice today between selling it or renting it out. Both options have some excellent prosthanks to the wider health of Spanish real estate.

The price of second-hand housing rose last month by 4.8 per cent. Compared to September of last year it is the largest year-on-year increase since May 2007, just before the bubble burst.

On the other hand, in September the prices of rents clocked a 9.7 per cent year-on-year increase. It also marked two

years of consecutive monthly increases in rent, according to Fotocasa.

That leaves owners with a tough choice: take advantage of high prices to make a sale, or earn money from the rental game and look to sell further down the line.

House prices and rental prices are expected to continue rising stably until at least 2020. Going into the new decade both are expected to plateau, allowing the rest of the market to catch up.

The trend at the moment is to rent. But the personal situation of owners is perhaps the decisive factors, since the market favours both options.


MADRID is continuing its rise as a key European property investment hub, according to leading luxury real estate agency Lucas Fox, which has seen its sales in the Spanish capital increase by 30 per cent and its total sales value rise by 170 per cent in the year to the end of June 2017.

Housing plans hot up

MARBELLA Council has agreed to invest €17 million in new homes.



6 things to remember now you've moved to Spain

AFTER making the move across the Mediterranean, there are many people who may feel lost and unaware of what to do next. Now that the move is done, the boxes might not yet be unpacked but here is our list of things to do to make sure the move continues to go as smoothly as possible.



Paperwork needs sorted out.

1. Sort your residency

One of the biggest issues in Spain once you have bought your property and decided to make the move is the paperwork.

Those who live in Spain need a Foreigners' Identity Number (NIE) and a residencia.

If you are intending to work in the country you will also need a SeguridadSocial (SS) but that can only be obtained once you have your NIE or residencia.

3. Correct driving licence

There are a lot of rules about having a European driving licence once becoming a resident in Spain. After gaining residency, you have two years to change your driving licence over to a Spanish licence when living in Spain and when driving a foreign-registered vehicle, you will need to have it reregistered in Spain within a month.

4. Health Care

Once you are registered on the padron, you are then eligible to apply for a SIP card, or the Spanish health card, if you are entitled to state health care. If not, you will have to ensure that you have private health insurance or buy into a state health insurance





Laws are different in Spain to the UK.

5.Make a will

When moving to live in Spain, it is important to make a Spanish will if you want to ensure that your wishes are fulfilled when you die, as Spanish succession laws are different from those in Britain and Ireland.

With regular income you may get an account with reduced charges.

6. Banking

When setting up a new bank account in Spain, make sure it represents the specific residency status. When setting up a bank account as a resident and if you also have regular income going into the account then you may be eligible for an account with reduced charges.

House prices slashed

The Andalucian offer is based around the province of Almeria, with more than 1,200 properties, followed by Malaga with 340 and Granada with 220.

No **Brexistential** crisis

BREXIT will not affect British real estate investment in Marbella, according to Senior Financial and Economic Officer at the British Embassy in Madrid, Paul



2. Organise your







That's inkredible

PRINTERS come in two main flavours: laser and inkiet.

Lasers are the workhorses of the printing world: generally monochrome, more expensive to buy than inkjets but cheaper to run if you're a serial printer.

Inkjets are cheap as chips until you start buying the replacement ink cartridges. And they print ever so pretty in colour, at a price.

That's a pain you can ease slightly by buying generic cartridges online or from your local shop, and despite the manufacturers' quality warnings, I've never vet encountered one which printed any worse than the branded one, or which 'ru-

(And don't even think of refilling your cartridges by hand, as some of us used to do. Accompanied by frequent embarrassment when visitors would remark on the profusion of used syringes lying around the home...)

Now is the printer of our discontent

TERENCE KENNEDY shares his love-hate relationship with the most treacherous of computer devices, the printer.

EVER wondered why your printer won't let you produce a black and white document because it's 'out of magenta ink'?

Is it a good idea to let your printer know you're in a hurry, because it can smell the fear?

And if we had a 3D printer, could we then print out our own 3D print-

You'd think after more than three decades. Messrs Hewlett-Packard. Epson, Canon, Brother and co. could finally get it right - but 'printer rage' is now so common that an idle search on Google produces more than three mil-

Paper jams, empty cartridges, upright A4 printed in landscape, worthy but misguided attempts to save the forests by printing double-sided: these are all facets of our troubled interactions with technology.

The irony is that not too long ago, pundits like me were confidently predicting the paperless society, yet today in the developed world we each consume an astonishing 200 kilos of paper a year. And in 15 years the planet's paper consumption has actually grown 77 per cent.

As for the printers themselves, at the current rate they'll soon be given away free with the cornflakes.

That's because they use the Gillette business model, so-called from the days when that company sold the razor for next to nothing, but made its fortune on the blades we then had to buy for it (one of the reasons I stopped shaving; call it a matter of principle but more probably sheer laziness).

I recall staying up all night years ago trying to persuade my clunky bubblejet to print a British pound symbol. Or wrestling with it for hours





THE small, green western Canary Islands of La Gomera, El Hierro and La Palma are quiet at the moment. You can hear a collective sigh of relief that the late summer visitors have all gone.

There's time to relax, play dominoes and cards and enjoy the all-important tertulia, or social chat. Stories of the noisy, demanding, rubbish-tossing summer tourists from the other islands, and comparisons with the quieter visitors from northern countries, including the UK, who'll arrive soon abound. This annual conversation is traditional, after our short dose of mass tourism.

Small island Canarians prefer nature-loving Northern European visitors because the local, summer visitors' mass tourism attitudes and habits impact negatively, while the winter visitors' don't

Locals from the bigger islands of Tenerife, Lanzarote, Fuerteventura and Gran Canaria wouldn't agree that Northern Europeans are lower impact, because their northern tourists are different and often of the dreaded shag

Are we jumping into unknown dangers, feet first?



IT'S amazing how many things we do without considering the consequences.

Just last week it was brought to my attention that the iPhone actually informs us (although not in these actual words) that if you put the 'phone to your head you'll fry your brains, if you put it in your pocket you'll nuke your nuts and so on.

I bought my kids those phones that are cooking them alive and yet never thought to take a moment to do my due diligence and find out what it was all about beforehand.

We've become like gullible children believing the 'powers that be' are looking after our well-being and that everything available is safe to use without further investigation.

About five years ago I first saw the fish tank spas. The idea comes across as quirky but natural; you sit with both feet dangling in an adapted fish tank and Garra rufa fish (a mini toothless carp) swarm around your feet and ankles feasting on your dead flesh. Not something I could bear to do myself but certainly nothing I thought to worry about if I, or the

children, did give this a try.

However the subject came up in conversation recently and I was taken aback to find out that many States in the USA have actually banned 'doctor fish' (as they've come to be known) as they can potentially transmit and spread infectious diseases.

Following up with a bit of reading online it would indeed seem this is a real concern, particularly as many of the fish spas can't afford to maintain the degree of hygiene required or don't think they need to.

I have often watched people 'enjoying' the fish spa experience but I must say I don't recall witnessing a water change between each customer; the recommended practice for hygiene.

I don't think I've seen the fish being replaced or treated between each use either. Using the same fish with different clients apparently greatly increases your chance of catching something nasty from the last person.

General recommendations include waiting at least 24 hours after waxing or shaving legs before having a fish pedicure as any open wound is subject to water bacteria as well as fish transmitted infections.

We also need to watch out for the more economical Chin Chin being passed off for Garra rufa. This similar species grows teeth after just a few months, meaning that blood can be drawn and the risks to our health even greater, putting the HIV infection and Hepatitis C on the list of concerns.

It is also understood that in order for the fish to be ready to snack away on our feet they need to be very hungry, which is obviously cruel to the fish.

I for one have to admit I feel a bit overwhelmed at all the unknowns that confront us with such disparity; hopefully like with these fish, I won't necessarily always jump in feet first!

MORE than 50 per cent of Millennials (aged 23-40) have admitted to eating cereal as a snack at home, compared with just 32 per cent of Baby Boomers (aged 53-71), according to Mintel research.

agree that it makes a great snack.

Sciatica and how to deal with it

What are the symptoms or signs of it?

The main symptoms that produce pain usually originate in the lower back. This can affect the legs and produce muscle contractures and the inability to move.

When should I talk to my physician?

Whenever you begin to feel symptoms that may suggest something's wrong in the previously mentioned areas you should consult a health care professional. First, talk to your family doctor but if that's not enough you will need to consult a specialist.

What causes it?

It's usually caused by problems in the intervertebral discs which bring about herniated discs, inflammation of the tendons and muscles and dislocation of the back bones, typically via arthritis and mainly in the elderly.

How do I treat it?

The first things needed are rest, dry heat, painkillers, anti-inflammatories and muscle relaxants. Physiotherapy exercises are also helpful in lessening the pain derived from this illness. In very advanced cases when pain cannot be managed, surgical intervention may be reauired.

OPTIONAL INTRO: The term sciatica describes a set of symptoms that are characterised by leg pain (and possibly tingling, numbness or weakness) starting at the bottom of the back and going through the buttocks and the greater sciatic nerve down the back of each leg. Sciatica is a symptom of another underlying health problem. It is not a disease in itself.

Pushing the limit

A NEW study has found that white men who do excessive amounts of exercise each week are almost twice as likely to suffer from heart disease as those who work out moderately.

A study by the University of Illinois in Chicago analysed the exercise habits of over 3,000 people over 25 years and discovered that

white men who exercised for more than seven hours per week were more likely to suffer from serious cardiac problems.

However, the researchers didn't find that the outcome applied to men from other ethnicities.

The study discovered that white men who exercised excessively were more likely to build up plaque in their arter-

ies which can lead to severe heart problems such as heart disease. This suggested that too much exercise could put excessive stress on the arter-

The results surprised the researchers, who expected those who did the most exercise to be less likely to develop these illnesses. Deepika Laddu, the co-author of the study, revealed that more research needed to be done to investigate why this was the case and why there was such a difference in the results from white participants and those of other ethnicities.

However, Laddu stressed that the study did not suggest that people should stop exercising altogether, but that they should limit workouts to the recommended 150 min-

While any form of exercise is considered crucial to keeping your heart healthy, there are some workouts that could be more beneficial than others. Swimming, weight training and cycling have all been shown to help prevent illnesses such as heart disease and boost overall health.



Chemical bothers

PARABENS have been widely used in cosmetic products since the 1950s to prevent bacteria growth, but have been getting some bad press recently over fears that they cause certain dis-

Allegedly, around 85 per cent of cosmetic products on the market contain parabens, ranging from shampoos and lotions to lipsticks and fragrances.

However, parabens allegedly disrupt the body's natural oestrogen levels, which have been linked to reproductive issues and breast cancer. They are also believed to cause skin irritations such as dermatitis and rosacea. and can even make you more vulnerable to allergies.

As a result, scientists in many countries have started recommending putting a limit on paraben levels in cosmetics. The EU now limits beauty companies to a maximum of 8g of parabens per kilo of cosmetic

In 2011, the Danish government also decided to put a ban

on companies putting parabens in products intended for children under the age of three due

to fears that they are at a higher risk from the side-effects.

Nowadays, there is an increas-

ing number of products on the market labelled 'paraben-free,' but should you really swear off all products without the tag? Both the World Health Organisation and the US Food and Drug Administration have stated that the chemicals are not harmful at low levels. Typically, the amount of parabens used in cosmetic products is quite small.

To be on the safe side, look out for oil-based organic items as water-based products often require more preservatives to make them last longer. Products in dark containers with a pump also generally contain fewer chemicals as they don't go off as quickly.

If you are going to cut parabens from one item in your beauty cabinet, make it a body lotion or moisturiser which is used to coat large areas of skin as this can increase vulnerability to the side-effects of chemi-

Every year the organisers receive numerous entries from established song writers, as well as newcomers to the art of song writing and encourage anyone who feels that their compositions should be heard to submit an entry.

One of the important things about the GISF is that reputations count for nothing, since the panel of judges who select the songs that will feature at the Finals Gala on June 2, do so 'blind.' In other words, they select songs without prior knowledge of the identity or country of origin of the song-

These details are only revealed to them once the points are added up and the finalist songs are known. This 'level playing field' approach means that newcomers to song writing have exactly the same chance of making the final as their established counterparts, as long as their songs are deemed to be of the required standard by the panel.

Judging at the Finals Gala will, once more, be in the hands of an international panel of experts



Sweeten up your garden with sugar cane

BRIGHT sunny spots in the Mediterranean garden are often a challenge to find plants hardy enough to tolerate the intense heat and sun and yet be strong enough to resist the cold winter months with shorter day length.

An interesting alternative to the more common species for these zones that requires minimal maintenance and provides a wonderful food source is sugar cane, (Saccharum offici-

Sugar cane has been grown commercially in Spain for hundreds of years, especially along the Mediterranean coast, but production declined when it was found to be more economical to grow in the New World after Christopher Columbus took plants there to grow on the tropical islands off Central America.

For the home gardener it is a great alternative to bamboo as it is less invasive and gives the option of extracting the wonderful sugar cane juice.

The sugar cane plant grows and looks similar to bamboo as it is of the grass family of plants,

Poaceae. With stalks of cane growing up to four metres high and with a width of five centimetres, it has wonderful flowering tassels at the top of the canes that are often called arrows,

due to the flowers form appearing as an arrow

The tassels wave in the wind giving a gentle relaxing rhythm reminiscent of the waves in the sea. The leaves are long, a very distinct shade of

green and rustle in the wind. The canes can be used like bamboo for making supports in the garden, or other structures.

The juice from the mature canes is used to make crystallised sugar, molasses and syrups.

Sugar is controversial for its health benefits as the refined sugar made from the juice has chemicals including added sulphur, which makes it acidic in nature, but the natural juice is deliciously sweet and alkaline has many positive health benefits. It is recognised in Ayervedic and other traditional medicines as therapeutic.

Extracting the juice requires a strong press to remove cleanly but alternatives are to boil down the inner core of the canes to make a syrup, or use a powerful blender or juicer.

In India it is a common refreshment with lime juice and ginger, added from street venders all over the country using what looks like a washing machine wringer to crush and extract

The plants are easy to grow from the stalks, by planting a piece from a strong healthy plant about 30 - 40 centimetres long with three or four joints which the plant will grow from. Growing from seed can give very variable results as the sugar cane can cross with other Poaceae species and may not be true to the parent plant. It takes two to three years for the emerging canes to be mature enough to produce the juice that can be extracted and be tall and thick enough to harvest as canes.

They are best grown in a position in full sun all year but protected from the cold if only growing a few as an ornament feature.







Tulip mania

WHILE tulips are most associated with Holland, they actually originate from Southern Europe and Central Asia, so make the perfect addition to brighten up a Spanish gar-

Tulips are a member of the lily family and there are around 100 variations of the tulin bulb to choose from. meaning you can have a lot of fun experimenting with colours and displays.

While tulip bulbs seem quite delicate on first appearance, they are actually fairly hard and easy to grow. When choosing your bulbs, look for ones that are firm when you squeeze them, with an intact outer skin. They also need to be a reasonable size to be able to flower in their first

The best time to plant tulip bulbs is in October or November, as they tend to flourish in cooler weather. However, if you live in an area where the temperature doesn't tend to drop too low, keep the bulbs in the fridge for a few weeks before planting, usually four is enough.

You can either plant tulips in individual holes or one big hole, but make sure vou leave around 15cm between each bulb and plant them twice as deep as the bulb is high.

Tulips thrive in sunny spots, and won't flower well unless they receive enough natural light. Also make sure they're planted in soil with good drainage, but you can also plant them in pots or raised beds to better control their water supply.

MANY times in a week I am informed that a dog only understands German, French, Spanish, or English.

I find that many owners and some trainers have a misguided perception of what a dog really is and entertain false expectations of their pet. Most think their pet is a small hairy person based on the assumption that a dog's level of understanding is equal to their

It is vital to keep in mind that dogs do not have the capacity to intercept human language, behaviour or emotions.

Understanding dogs

How intelligent is a dog?

Dogs are capable of linking two ideas together, but cannot link actions, which are separated to another time. If for example a dog makes a mess during your absence there is no point in telling the dog off or getting annoyed; the dog's brain cannot link the action. Many will say 'He knows he has done wrong', he does not, the brain is not formulated this way.

A dog's brain is much smaller than man's, in particular the cerebrum - the portion of the brain associated with intellectual function, emotion and personality. Dogs cannot understand our human language. It is far more important to use sound patterns, intonation and facial and body language as a form of communication.

A dog wants to please and all learning should be based on a positive reinforcement of reward. Owners should keep in mind that a large part of a dog's brain is occupied with sensory activity, particularly the interpretation of scent.



CHASING INSTINCT: Can be managed.

Instinct is something either there or not there.

Dog's natural instinct plays a vital role and often it is difficult to understand why so few dog owners can differentiate between instinct and intelligence. Instinct is an urge from within which makes a dog act in certain ways and has no connection with intelligence.

Dog's first instinct is to survive, when a pup is born he squirms about until he finds a teat and then sucks it. No intelligence or learning by any association plays a part in the process.

The maternal instinct tells the female to clean up the foetal membrane and stir the puppy into action by licking it. The female is not taught, as she has not seen another female do this. Most instincts provide pleasure to the dog, and because it associates the action with pleasure, the instinct grows stronger with usage.

Instinct can be strengthened, weakened or diverted, it cannot be put there and it cannot be taken away. It might lie dormant, but once developed it can never be weakened.

A dog with an obsession for chasing balls or chewing socks can be controlled by training and by providing other outlets for his energy. The same if a young dog is corrected the first time he chases a car he may give up the idea, but if he is allowed to chase cars the hunting instinct becomes stronger, and in no time it will be very difficult, even impossible to cure the

Instinct also covers survival, hunting, guarding, and the pack.

AN Italian woman was granted sick pay for taking time off to care for her sick dog.

The woman, an academic from Rome's La Sapienza University, won the landmark court case where she argued that taking time off to care for sick pets should be legally allowed.

The woman claimed that she should be compensated for the two days she took off to care for her 12-year-old English setter. who had recently undergone surgery.

The dog-lover had some help from one of the biggest animal rights groups in Europe, the Italian Anti-Vivisection League (LAV), whose president Gianluca Felicetti declared that the court win was "a significant step forward that recognised that animals that are not kept for financial gain or their working ability are effectively members of the family".

The woman's lawyers argued that her employers should have allowed her leave on the grounds that it was an absence

related to 'serious or family personal reasons'.

Their reasoning was supported by an exception in Italian law that punishes people who abandon an animal 'grave suffering'

fining them up to €10,000.

The court case was a landmark victory for animal lovers, as this marked the first time an Italian court allowed someone to receive sick pay while caring for a sick pet.





Brexit's luxury gamble

Hopes and fears for UK's niche motors

by Matthew Elliott

A HARD Brexit could threaten Britain's continued leadership in the motoring world's luxury market. The UK is currently a global trailblazer in the specialist and high-performance car production business.

But that could all change according to a study from the Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders (SMMT). If leaving the EU means tighter import restrictions and costs, the study suggests that British superiority might be over.

"We need certainty on Britain's future trading relationships, including customs plans, market access, regulations governing the design, production and approval of vehicles", said SMMT boss Mike Hawes.

Goodbye gearbox

BETTER efficiency and more choice have seen automatics now account for more than a third of all new car sales. The clutch is still dominant but future trends clearly favour the automatic.

A report from Glass's, a car guide specialist, found that the automatic's share of the UK market has leapt from 15 per cent in 1997 to 35 per cent in 2017.

The firm also found that premiums have increased on automatics across the board. They are now 4 per cent more expensive on average than their manual equivalent.

This is because their retained value is also improving. After two years of use, manuals typically are valued at less than half their purchase cost. Automatics, however, retain 55 per cent of their value.

Ford Fiesta Titanium

SINCE it was launched in the 1970s, the Ford Fiesta has notched up total sales of more than four million.

The obvious conclusion is that so many buyers just cannot be wrong. Ford puts the long-term success down to style, value and driving dynamics, though there is probably more to it than that.

There are class rivals which are cheaper. and in the view of some, may look better and perhaps drive better, but they all have individual shortcomings. The reason the Fiesta remains king is that it pulls all those strands together to make it the best car overall. It's the perfect all-rounder and that's key to why it has such a devoted following.

Fiesta prices start at €14,325 (£12,715) for a version which has alloy wheels, airconditioning and Bluetooth, but not too much more. Mid-range Zetec models add more kit and my upper range Titanium test model added even more, which took the price of a five-door diesel to €20.871 (£18.525).

This model has a refined 1.5 litre 118 hp diesel unit with six-speed manual gearbox, and nippy performance of 0-100 kph in nine seconds and top speed of 195 kph (121 mph). However, it still returns an impressive 31 kpl (88.3 mpg) - so frugal that at times I felt the fuel guage may have jammed!

The Fiesta is fun to drive, nimble and composed in the corners with a very com-

Steering is accurate and gives good feedback and while the gearshift isn't quite as slick as it might be, the gears are well-spaced.

The latest Fiesta - longer and wider than its predecessor - benefits from a mild visual makeover which sharpens its exterior looks, but the main difference is a re-designed cabin which looks more impressive, with greater use of soft-touch materials. The driving position is excellent, with good visibility and plenty of seat and steering wheel adjustment.

Fiesta scores highly for practicality. There is more leg-room for rear sear occupants, and boot space is 303 litres, expandable to 984 litres. The tailgate is larger than on the previous model though there is a deep load-lip. However, a variableheight boot floor is an option.

Standard kit on the Titanium version includes alloy wheels, heated windscreen, rear privacy glass, keyless entry and push-button start, cruise control, tyre pressure monitoring, auto lights and wipers, sat-nav with touch screen, DAB radio, Apple CarPlay and Android Auto - plus illuminated cup holders!

Johnston divided his 2017 season between the European Tour and the US PGA Tour and has struggled with a shoulder injury lately, making his return to action at the Italian Open.

Johnston said "It is such a tough course but players still love playing it. It is not all about birdies like most other courses and you really have to think your way around. It has such an incredible history and I think it is great that the European Tour is back there."

SPAIN'S two-times F1 world champion Fernando Alonso is looking ahead to 2018 - with the Gods mapping out his future: better times are coming

"I believe things happen because they have to happen," said Alonso, who is competing in the F1 2017 Grand Prix in Mexico on Sunday October 29.

Alonso's last F1 win was the 2013 Spanish Grand Prix at the Circuit de Cataluña, Barcelona. It was Alonso's 32nd Grand Prix victory.

Looking ahead to 2018, Alonso whose odds to win in Malaysia on October 1 were an astonishing 400-1 - said: "Next year there are minimum changes of regulations."

Renault will be supplying Alonso's current team McLaren's engines in 2018, and he said: "I think the rate of development this year has been very high - because of new regulations - and there will be extra development over the winter.'

Alonso, who has approaching 100 podiums, finishing first on 32 occasions, sees his fall from the top of F1 as fate: "All the things that happen in a race, in a championship, or in your life - are for a reason," he said.

"Better times are coming - I prefer to think that way," said Alonso, who tipped Lewis Hamilton for the 2017

"I want to be competitive - back in victory for the F1 world championship."

F1 title, ahead of Sebastian Vettel.

Alonso, who has competed against both Hamilton and Vettel for world titles, revealed he punched a fist into a wall in frustration after the 2017 Singapore GP.

Alonso, who went out of the race at the first corner, said: "It was frustration. That podium could have been one of the biggest things of my career - and we missed it.'

Alonso, who ended Michael Schumacher's reign at the top, moved to McLaren, had spells with Renault and Ferrari, and clocked up 17 victories, with three championship runner-

Oviedo born Alonso, aged 36, secured his first F1 race drive with Minardi, prior to joining Renault as a test driver in 2002, becoming a race

In 2005, aged 22, Alonso made history by becoming the youngest ever pole-sitter in Malaysia, and the youngest winner, with maiden victo-

In 2007 Alonso moved to McLaren, alongside Hamilton, returning to Renault in 2008 - gaining victories at the inaugural F1 night race in Singapore - followed by a race win in Japan.

In 2010 Alonso took just one podium, in Singapore. A move to Ferrari followed, to partner Felipe Massa, a season that saw Alonso gain five wins - finishing behind new world champion Sebastian Vettel.

Alonso's second season with Ferrari saw victory at Silverstone - followed by nine podiums - finishing fourth overall.

In 2012 Alonso won the Malaysian GP, and victory in front of a home crowd in Valencia saw Alonso head the drivers' standings, only to be thwarted by Vettel, who won a third F1 title.

Alonso achieved wins in China and Spain in 2013 - along with seven podium standings - but Vettel was



crowned F1 Champion, yet again.

In 2014, despite Alonso's two podium finishes, the team failed to win for the first time since 1993. leading to Alonso returning to McLaren.

In a woeful 2015 campaign Alonso scored points - in just two races ending the season with a paltry 11 points.

Alonso, who was lucky when he avoided serious injury following a crash at Melbourne's Albert Park in 2016, said: "I want to be competitive next year, back on the podiums. I want to be back in victory - fighting for the world championship. I remain

Despite no F1 wins during the 2017 season - and no podium placings, Alonso is undeterred: "I think positive - always.

"What has happened this year is because destiny wanted that - it is taking care of our luck for better op-

ENGLAND face Australia in Melbourne in the opening match of the 2017 Rugby League World Cup on Friday - with preparations of tailormade mattress toppers and personalised pillows.

"Quality sleep on a familiar surface is proven to enhance recovery rates naturally," said Rugby Football League Head of Human Performance, Richard Hun-

It is deemed the preparations will offer players a cooler, pressure-relieving and more breathable sleeping surface - while in competition.

Gale, aged 29, who underwent an operation in September to have his appendix removed, said: "A lot of planning goes into the squad's performance."

Gale, who was set to miss the 2017 Rugby League World Cup having been rushed into hospital for emergency keyhole surgery, said: "The doctor said my season was over - and I wouldn't be going to Australia."

And half-back Gale quipped: "In Rugby League

we tend not to listen to doctors. I'm feeling fit and healthy again."

On England's preparations, Gale added: "It's good to know that we're leaving no stone left unturned when it comes to doing our best at the World Cup.'
