Rental thieves arrested

A GANG dealing in the shipment of top of the range cars has been arrested.

Following collaboration between the National Police and the Guardia Civil, the six men - originally based in various locations throughout the Alicante Province - were detained.

The men, made up of Spanish, Italians and Moroccans, are believed to have stolen around 40 rental cars estimated to be worth around €1m after hiring them and not returning them on their due dates. Fifteen of the vehicles have already been recovered.

They began their series of crimes in Orihuela, Santa Pola and Almoradi before moving to the provinces of Almeria and Malaga in the south of the country.

Brakes put on traffickers

NATIONAL POLICE officers have dismantled a network involved in alleged sexual exploitation based in Santa Pola. During the latest intervention by the police, they were able to release one of the gang's victims.

The group arrested were all from Hungary and were running an alleged dedicated human trafficking network for the purposes of sexual exploitation. Two of the four people detained have been accused of raping one of the women that they ended up forcing to go into prostitution in the municipality. She is a 29-year-old woman, also from Hungary, and was forced into her trade following a series of threats to her and her family back home and a constant supply of cocaine.

Police arson attacks

Victims not covered by insurance

Forty members of the Local Police in Orihuela gathered to support three of their colleagues whose private cars were found burned out the week before. This followed an announcement by the council that their civil liability insurance will not cover the damages incurred.

The police officers had parked their cars close to the town hall premises located on the Orihuela Costa in Playa

Flamenca during their night shift, only to find them destroyed by a fire that is suspected to have been started deliberately.

Investigations are being carried out by the Guardia Civil to try to catch the alleged arsonist who they believe is someone who was earlier arrested by Local Police and decided to retaliate against them.

Unions representing the three police officers affected - UGT, CSI-F and SPPLB - have sent a registered letter to the mayor of Orihuela, Emilio Bascuñana, pointing out that the attack on these vehicles could've been avoided if there were better facilities for their members to keep their cars safe. They were, however, parked in spaces authorised for the Local Police to use,

and this is the area of dispute.

The council's public liability insurance will not compensate the officers as the cars were parked on the public highway; although the officers claim that they were in designated spaces reserved for them and town hall officials.

Mariola Rocamora, Orihuela's councillor responsible for citizen security, said that the ruling is a business decision taken by the insurance company and cannot comment on the matter.

Dancing on the street

Costa Blanca looking for more German tourists

TOURIST boards representing the Costa Blanca in general and Alicante in particular have held a seminar in Frankfurt to promote the areas as tourist destinations.

They were joined by eight representatives from APHA (Alicante Hotels Association) who were there on behalf of some of the most prestigious hotels in Alicante.

Tourism councillor Eva Montesinos said that the main objective is to show potential German tourists what the city has to offer and to give that market a boost.

Presentations were made during the series of meetings in which emphasis was given to Alicante's fame as a gastronomic centre and offered tastings of many local products... especially the rice. Head Chef at the famous Brunch de Alicante Restaurant Carlos Tomás gave a cooking demonstration and the event concluded with a big raffle which offered prizes of staying at the participating hotels in the Alicante Province.

In 2016, German passengers accounted for 877,137 of the arrivals at Alicante-Elche Airport which was

Spain honours dead

THOUSANDS of people flocked to the graves of deceased relatives to pay respect as Spain marked the Dia de Todos los Santos (All Saints' Day).

As is custom, many Spaniards took the national holiday as an opportunity to return home and decorate the graves of dead family members with elaborate floral displays.

Town councils across the country also made sure local graveyards were cleaned and ready for yesterday's public holiday. As happens every year, the graveyards were crowded with visitors, the surrounding roads were packed with traffic and stalls selling flowers lined the streets.

Many also indulged in the traditional food eaten on this day, including chestnuts and sweet treats such as huesos de santo (tubes of pastry filled with marzipan) and buñuelos de viento (doughnuts sprinkled with cinnamon and sugar).

After visiting the graveyard, more religious families attended a mass service dedicated to the deceased which is supposed to shorten their time spent in purgatory.

Cruise record

PRESIDENT of the Port Authority of Cartagena, Antonio Sevilla, has announced that the forecast for the number of cruise passengers for 2017 has been exceeded. A total of 230,000 people - up by 2,000 - are expected from 150 cruise ship arrivals; the 200,000 barrier has already been broken.

Pigs in the middle

EXPORTS of live animals from the Murcia Region during the first six months of this year amounted to €107.3m, of which €2.39m corresponded to the pig market and an increase of 11.16 per cent. The most popular destinations for the products are concentrated in Germany and Italy.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...35

Wild mushroom season is officially upon us and is the highlight of the year for fungi fans, reports Kat Ashton.

No 'shroom for error!

BOTH Spaniards and tourists alike flock to the countryside in the autumn months to forage for their favourite fungi, which can reach record sizes thanks to the moist woodland conditions.

The mushroom business is estimated to be worth millions of euros each year, and a whole range of varieties grow across the Iberian Peninsula. Experts believe that the climate creates the ideal environment for mushrooms to grow, with hot summers followed by autumn downpours.

The season tends to fall in October or November but can be earlier or later, depending on the weather. Due to the increase in popularity, many companies now organise mushroom hunts to help tourists seek out the best areas where they are found, often followed by a tasting.

As edible and toxic mushrooms tend to grow side by side, it is always advisable to go foraging for mushrooms with such an expert. There are around 50 species of poisonous fungi in Europe, and six of these can be lethal.

Mushrooms or setas are a staple Spanish cuisine and are often served on their own as the popular tapas dish *champinones al ajillo* (garlic mushrooms), as well as being used to make stews, soups and croquettes.

Top five wild Spanish mushrooms

1. Amanita caesarea: Commonly known as Caesar's mushroom, this prized fungi is easily the most expensive on the market and foragers can charge as much as €120 a kilo. It is prized in the culinary world for its bright orange colour and soft texture. Renowned Spanish chef Ferran Adria was known to use it to make fluorescent mousses.

2. Niscalo (*Lactarius deliciosus*): Commonly found in Mediterranean pine forests, this flavourful mushroom can also reach a high price in markets but is worth the price. It's known as the 'saffron milk cap' in English as it oozes a reddish-orange liquid when

bruised or cut.

3. Boletus del Pino (*Boletus pinophilus*): This popular mushroom is known for its sweet taste and can be recognised by its white or creamy brown cap and thick stem.

4. Rebozuelo (*Cantharellus cibarius*): This yellow, trumpet shaped 'shroom can be found in woods where pine, chestnut or oak trees grow. It can be eaten raw, but also goes great in stews or with meat dishes.

5. Seta de Cardo (*Pleurotus eryngii*): Considered one of the tastiest mushrooms out there and highly prized in the mushroom community. Studies have suggested that this species may also have therapeutic properties and could help to reduce cholesterol.

Twenty years for the ‘Alicante strangler’

A MAN has been sentenced to a jail term of 20 years after being found guilty of strangling his great aunt.

The courts rejected the man's defence that he'd killed her because she had asked him to do so because of her ongoing illnesses and that she'd died without being able to defend herself.

A jury decided that the accused man Felix Redondo Suarez was guilty of the crimes of murder with treachery, as well as the theft of several items of jewellery and television belonging to the 88-year-old victim.

The events took place back in October last year when it's alleged that the accused man strangled the woman without warning with a wire attached to a lamp. She was sitting in her rocking chair waiting for her great-nephew to bring her breakfast when she was

killed. The man then placed a rubbish bag over the corpse and dragged her to one of the bedrooms in the house where he left it on the floor.

Five days later, he turned up at the police station of his own free will to confess to the murder and took the officers to the house where they were greeted with the dead woman at the crime scene.

However, during the trial the accused said that he'd killed his aunt because she

was suffering so much with poor health and that she had to rely on him to do everything for her. The jury dismissed such claims.

The defence council Luis Santamaria announced that he would be appealing the ruling to the High Court (TSJ) believing the sentence should have been reduced to 15 years because the accused had always collaborated with the police from day one and had always admitted his guilt.

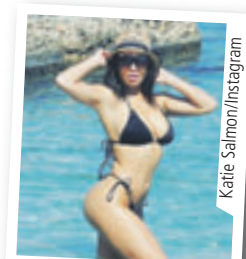

University car park fire prevented

QUICK work by firefighters prevented a more serious blaze while attending an incident in Alicante.

Emergency services were called by a security guard after smoke was spotted by a number of students coming from under the bonnet of a car in the University of Alicante car park.

When the fire brigade from nearby San Vincent del Raspeig arrived, they discovered an old rag in the engine blocking the car's alternator. Firefighters issued a warning after the incident that such scenarios are becoming quite common and very high risk to life and property.

They recommend that all drivers should regularly check inside their engines to check that nothing flammable - like a cloth - has been left inside that may lead to obstructing some of the working parts. "If the car had actually caught alight, it would have easily spread to the cars parked alongside in a full parking area."

OUR VIEW

Direct control in place

WHILST it could be very tempting not to return to the Catalan problem, it is the most important piece of recent news to hit Spain.

With article 155 actually in place and most of the Catalan cabinet dismissed, the Public Prosecutor has said that he wishes to charge a number of the politicians with rebellion, sedition and misuse of public funds, which would certainly see them imprisoned if found guilty.

During an interview, Foreign Minister Alfonso Dastis confirmed that a new election for the Catalan Parliament which will be held on December 21 would be managed by a special electoral committee and that assuming former president Carles Puigdemont was eligible (not in jail) then he would be free to stand.

In the meantime, after leaving a recorded message of defiance, Mr Puigdemont reportedly fled to Brussels with members of his former cabinet as they may be offered political asylum by the Belgian Secretary of State for Immigration and Asylum.

Slowly but inexorably, the Madrid government is taking over the running of Cataluña and at the moment only the Catalan Speaker's Committee which is 'standing in' for the dismissed government is immune from prosecution until the December elections.

One unexpected result of article 155 is that Spaniards all over the country have clamoured to buy lottery tickets ending in that number.

Sacked Catalan leader flees country

EX-CATALAN leader Carles Puigdemont has fled to Belgium after Spanish prosecutors called for him to face charges of rebellion, punishable by up to 30 years in prison.

Following a vote by the Spanish Senate backing the decision to impose direct rule on Madrid, Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy sacked the leader of the Catalan Parliament and dismissed the rest of his cabinet. Rajoy called for regional elections to be held in Cataluña on December 21.

The decision was made following weeks of turmoil after 90 per cent of Catalans allegedly voted in favour of independence during the controversial referendum on October 1.

Puigdemont had refused to appear before the Spanish gov-

ernment to explain his actions and decided against calling regional elections himself, instead choosing to make a declaration of independence from Spain.

On Monday, Puigdemont fled to Belgium with several members of his cabinet to allegedly seek political asylum. Theo Francken, Belgium's immigration minister, had previously suggested it was not "unrealistic" for Puigdemont to be granted protection.

Hours later, Spain's attorney general Jose Manuel Maza announced that he would ask the Spanish court to bring charges of rebellion, sedition and the misuse of public funds against Puigdemont and 13 other members of his administration.

Puigdemont later denied that he had fled to seek asylum, but claimed he would not return to

Spain until he was guaranteed a fair trial. He also declared he would accept the results of the snap regional elections called by Rajoy for December.

Belgium's Prime Minister Charles Michel revealed an asylum request was "absolutely not on the agenda" and claimed the ex-Catalan leader would be treated the same as any other European citizen.

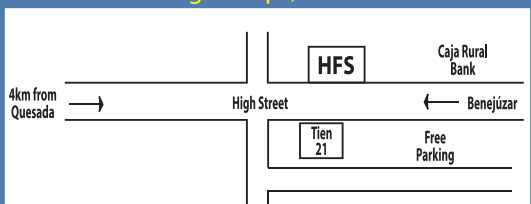

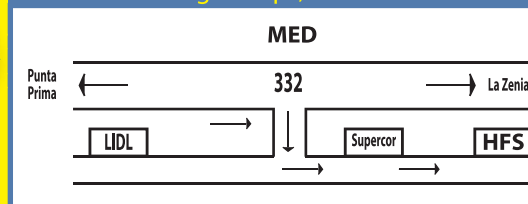

Requests for dog beach extension

A GROUP of dog owners will be asking the Santa Pola Council to expand the amount of space available on the dedicated dog walking beach.

Since it was opened to the public around 18 months ago, the Caleta dels Gossets in the municipality has seen more than 20,000 owners with their dogs. However, there has been a growing number of complaints about the growing lack of sand - not helped by the series of storms that hit the area during the year - which has resulted in a series of requests from about 100 dog walkers to extend the area to one of the adjacent coves. This will make the experience for both animals and humans much safer on a beach with more sand.

The amount of dogs, and their owners, that use the

beach which is fully monitored and subject to regular inspections of microchips has doubled in number during 2017, with numbers in September rising to 16,500 from 7,800.

Frequent visitors to this part of the coast are also demanding more safety mea-

sures in the cove where pet dogs are permitted to swim. They are unhappy about the speed of some of the traffic on the nearby road and fear that unless some restrictions are introduced, harm could soon come to more dogs following one being hit in the area this summer.

Dedication second to none

ANIMAL welfare is most certainly the top priority of Torrevieja councillor Carmen Morate since her and her Los Verdes party took control of the municipality following the 2015 local elections.

Somehow, she manages to combine her role as International Residents' councillor with her animal responsibilities and even finds time to volunteer at the Torrevieja Animal Shelter during whatever spare time she has, and has done for more than six years

Euro Weekly News recently caught up with Carmen in her office in the old Tourist Information Centre following a controversial report on the alleged failings in the organisation of and the conditions at the shelter were reported in the local Spanish and English-speaking press.

She was concerned that the report from the CSIF union, whose sole purpose is to represent the council employees and nothing to do with animal welfare, made a number of accusations that were simply 'exaggerated.'

"They say the people who volunteer

there have no formal qualifications or training in handling the animals in their care. This may be because there are no official qualifications available," said Carmen. "However, a number of dog training courses do exist for our volunteers and dog owners to attend from time to time."

The councillor also wanted to clarify the accusation that people not officially working for the municipality had access to personal information of those that were looking to adopt dogs from the shelter. "This is simply not true. People

wanting to adopt apply to do so via our website and the dedicated Facebook page and we collate the data. The only 'personal information' that the volunteers have is a telephone contact number and an address we give them to be able to visit them and carry out an initial assessment interview with potential adopters.

"How else would they be able to do this on our behalf without this information? Without their help in this way, it would be impossible for us to give a new home to the amount of animals we do."

Other accusations stating that there

was no access for people with reduced mobility were challenged by Carmen. "The suggestion was that it was impossible to get around the animal shelter if you were in a wheelchair. This would only affect access to the office which has two steps leading up to it and is so small inside that it wouldn't accommodate mobility equipment in the first place. In any case, anyone arriving at the office entrance can be seen by those on duty and are greeted and spoken with outside the premises."

Since Los Verdes came to power just over two years ago, they have adopted a 'zero putting down' policy of all animals that come into their control, and thus the need for more volunteers and larger premises is necessary. "We have €350,000 available to spend on the refurbishment of the animal shelter to show our commitment to animal welfare in the municipality, and we intend to complete the work next year," said Carmen.

Beach access to be improved

COASTAL authorities in conjunction with the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries, Food and Environment, are planning to shortly begin a programme of works to improve access points to a beach in Guardamar del Segura.

The popular Campico beach is around 2km south of Guardamar and is separated from a number of urbanisations by the busy dual carriageway of the N-332.

Those affected are La Laguna, Larrosa, Moncayo and Portico Mediterráneo.

Residents associations representing people living on the urbanisations have repeatedly demanded that their access is improved, despite a

footbridge crossing the N-332 that has been in place since 2010.

Their complaints are that they still have to navigate a further 600 metres to reach the beach itself which is made up of a path through the pine forest and sand dunes with rocks, that makes it difficult for beachgoers and particularly those with mobility issues.

The new works will include a construction of another footbridge connecting to the existing one that will cross the intervening dunes and lead directly to the beach and will take three months to complete.

The budget allocated amounts to €257,533.

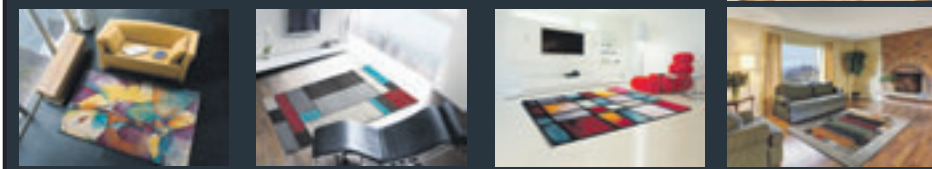

Non-resident tax in Spain: Income tax form

Every year before December 31st all non-residents in Spain must complete a non-resident income tax form

So who does this tax apply to?

This applies to anybody who is not legally a resident in Spain, but who has assets such as property in Spain, income from rental of property, income from bank deposits when applicable, royalties from intellectual property, etc...

What do I need to do?

You will need to fill out a 210 form with all of your personal details, bank account number, and the details of any assets you have in Spain. If there is one or more owner of your property, each owner must complete their own tax form.

You will require the following information:

- Address of your Spanish property, and your address in your country of residence.
- The date of purchase of the property.
- The valor catastral of your property.
- Name, date and place of birth and tax number of each owner of the property.
- Any other information regarding the above mentioned items of income.



What happens if I don't do a tax return?

When you sell your Spanish property, 3% of the sale value will be automatically withheld by the tax office. In most cases the 3% sales value will be more than the capital gains tax due, so you may be able claim back a

substantial amount. This process is slow and if you have not submitted your annual tax returns, the process will become much slower. What's more the tax office may subject you to fines for not presenting your annual tax returns or for late submission.

MAYOR of Cartagena, Ana Belén Castejón, has announced on behalf of the city council the approval of a detailed study into a 150-room hotel on the edge of the Mar Menor.

The planned hotel in Los Urrutias will have a capacity for 400 guests and will be aimed at increasing the number of tourists able to take advantage of what the Mar Menor can offer, both in nautical activities and the delights of the local gastronomy.

The idea is for the hotel to open in the spring of 2019.

This project has very much been 'the baby' of the mayor who appropriately has just returned to office after having her second child in the middle of September. She has been committed to making the idea a reality since the beginning of this year as part of a redevelopment programme to restore the southern coast of the Mar Menor.

The project has been promoted by the company Profusa and has made an agreement with the British group Neilson to build the hotel complex at

an estimated investment of €15m. The company already has extensive experience in the holiday sector focusing on nature and sports tourism throughout Europe with facilities in Sardinia, France, Croatia, Greece, Italy, Austria and Andorra.

Once approved, the works are planned to last for 12 months and the idea is to offer a location for people interested in making trips to the Mar Menor outside of the peak summer season, and not offer the increasing amount of all-inclusive deals.

Buried car shock for builders

BUILDERS carrying out excavating work were taken totally by surprise when a rather unusual item was found in a block of cement on the site planned for the new Playas de Orihuela School.

Embedded in the cement were the remains of a car that had been there for what appeared to be some length of time. The workers called the Local Police who in turn alerted the Guardia Civil who are now leading the investigation into this strange and shocking discovery.

Among the remains was a British number plate and all were taken to a Guardia Civil location by a tow truck where further forensic tests will be undertaken along with a check for any signs of human remains; a standard procedure in such cases. There are no indications as to how long the vehicle had been buried or as to how it came to be there in the first place.

Recycling champs get green award

THE city of Pilar de la Horadada has been given a special award to acknowledge the commitment of their citizens and businesses to recycling glass.

They have been awarded

the 'Iglu Verde' (Green Igloo) based on the shape of the popular bins used for a number of recycling schemes but especially where people are encouraged to dump glass prod-

ucts. The prize has been given to El Pilar for recycling 11 per cent more glass than last year.

Ecovidrio - the company running the recycling plan and responsible for the management of such waste in Spain - has managed to recycle 264 tons of glass during the summer in El Pilar, and the local mayor Ignacio Ramos together with Environment councillor Antonio Escudero have expressed their satisfaction at the figures. They have been at the forefront of encouraging their local citizens to participate in the recycling schemes and it has borne fruit.

The catering industry in the area has been a major contributor to the success of this initiative with more than 100 establishments collaborating and being responsible for more than 50 per cent of the glass collected. The summer months, when these businesses are at their

busiest, account for 30 per cent of the total recycled glass collected throughout the year.

During 2016, the citizens of Pilar de la Horadada recycled a total of 538,470 kilos of glass which averages out at 25.2 kilos per inhabi-

tant, distributed across 134 green igloos.

Across Spain, the plan has the participation of 80 coastal municipalities with more than 6,300 establishments which so far has managed to recycle almost 28,000 tons of glass.

A combination of man-made technology and the wonders of nature enable the waters around the Mar Menor to produce tons of salt for transporting all around the country and across the world.

Around 60 per cent is packaged into 25kg bags for the industrial food market, 25 per cent is put into one or two kilo bags for sale in supermarkets, while the rest is made up of the big bags of

Student noises

A 42-YEAR-OLD man was taken to hospital after an accident at work. He suffered from a head injury and dislocated a shoulder in the Cox food company.

Councils to pay €15m for rubbish project

FORMAL authorisation has now been given for the refurbishment of the rubbish processing plant in Elche and work is due to begin in January.

Ten municipalities in the Alicante Province that are part of the waste consortium of Baix Vinalopó had already given their blessing in principle to the modernisation of the plant, but the decision taken recently was the formal green light for the project that will cost €15m. The local councils will need to start contributing from their budgets from 2019 when the project is expected to be completed after 12 months unless there are no unforeseen delays, and for many of them will mean an increase of around 50 per cent to

their current budget for waste management.

Currently, the Elche waste plant receives around 135,000 tons of rubbish per year, of which 80,000 tons of that comes from the municipality of Elche itself. Hence, they

will be responsible for the highest financial contribution to the reformation to the building located in the Sierra dels Cremats, Saladas part of the city.

As explained by the councillor for Cleaning and Maintenance, Héctor Díez, the improvements to the plant will mainly consist of improving the system for recovering waste throughout the province and sending less rubbish to the landfill sites. Another advantage that will recognise the many concerns over a number of years is that the impact of smells on the environment will be minimised, and not just during the heat of the summer months; all the waste management will be carried out in watertight compartments.

THE number of people unemployed in Alicante has fallen by more than 20,000 during the summer months and now stands at a rate of 16.22 per cent.

Across Spain, the unemployment rate has now dropped to 16.38 per cent from the high levels of 25 per cent at the start of the economic crisis in 2008.

Unemployment down... employment up

Between July and September, very positive figures were shown for the labour market in the Alicante Province with both lower unemployment and growing employment in virtually all the sectors. The total number of unemployed

now stands at 146,800 and 2 per cent lower than the previous second quarter of the year.

Data published by the Spanish National Institute of Statistics (NIE) showed the total number of people in work in Alicante was

758,200 at the end of September, with the growth being in no small way due to the increase in the numbers of those employed in the service sector. The only downside was those employed in agriculture which fell by almost 1,500.

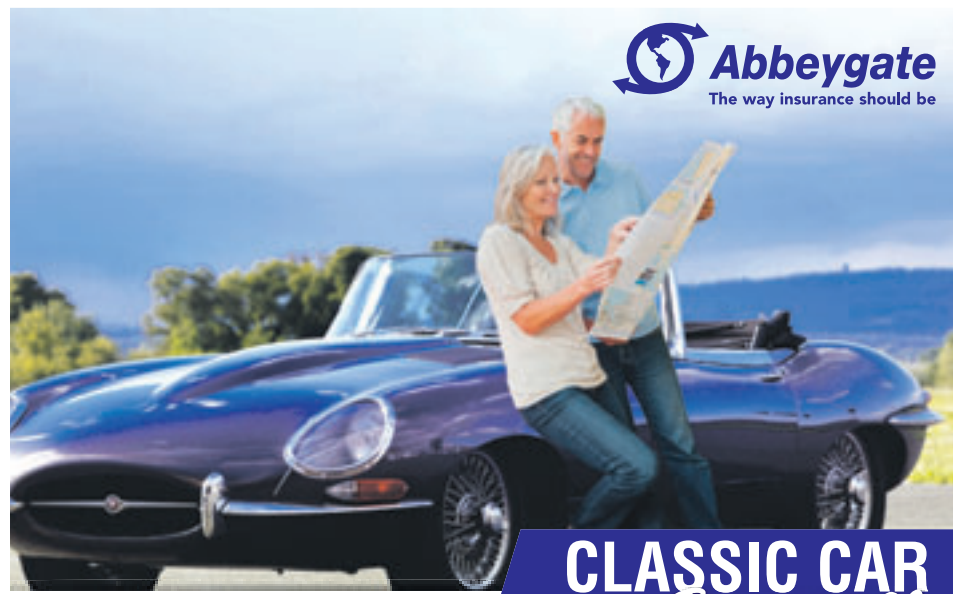

Booty boats to be auctioned

THREE boats that have been seized from drug traffickers over a number of years are about to be auctioned.

The three merchant ships - 'Green Cedar,' 'Mehtap' and 'Mungo' - were captured over a period between September 2014 and May 2015 and all contained hashish and cocaine within their cargo holds. Had they reached their intended destinations the value of the drugs onboard was estimated to be in the tens of millions of euros.

Since they were seized, the three ships have been moored in the Escombreras docks and they will now be auctioned to the highest bidder. The

closing date for the submission of bids is tomorrow (Friday).

'Mehap' will lead the auction and has already attracted opening bids of around €118,000. When it was intercepted off the coast of Cabo de Palos in May 2015 it had more than 1,350 kilos of hashish on board. Whoever buys the 'Mehap,' it has already been decreed that it must be scrapped.

The 'Green Cedar' was captured south of Cartagena in April 2015 with 15 tons of cannabis on board and finally, the 'Mungo' was discovered in the Sea of Alborán (between Andalucia and North Africa) in September 2014 containing 50 tons of cocaine.

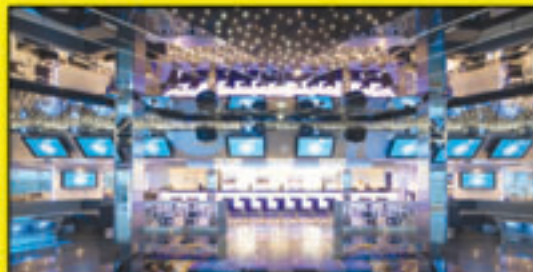

Clean car boost

THE recent plenary of the Orihuela Council has approved a subsidy of between 25 and 75 per cent for those that use electric cars to reduce emissions levels.

Building on

TORREVIEJA Council has given the go-ahead for the first licences for the building of 1,300 houses on La Coronelita. The reclassification of land allows such building after 16 years.

Fighting back

HOTELS throughout the Alicante Province have launched discounts of up to 35 per cent to protect bookings due to the resurgence of holidays to Tunisia and Turkey.

Advice for dealing with terrorist attacks

TORREVIEJA'S police and traffic department in collaboration with the local Guardia Civil has produced a detailed document that gives the population instructions on how to react in case of terrorist attack. The city's mayor, José Manuel Dolón, said: "These are clear and simple instructions that can save lives before members of the security forces arrive at the scene of any attack."

The instructions, complete with illustrations, have been distributed among the areas of high population and are an adaption of those that were circulated in Paris by the French government following terrorist incidents there in November last year. Mayor Dolón continued: "The purpose of these instructions is to keep our citizens informed and to make them aware that terrorism is a reality and that they must not allow it to change their way of life."

In the document, citizens are advised to get away from the danger zone as soon as possible, to help others escape from the scene if it's practical and safe to do so, to hide away and avoid being exposed in popular public areas, and to warn others from entering the area.

Other advice includes locking themselves behind doors if they're unable to escape from the scene and turn off lights and their mobile phones. If people close to the scene are approached by members of the security forces they should raise and open their hands. Finally, anyone that has been rescued by the police should call 112 or contact the Guardia Civil through the Alertcops APP and follow the instructions that will include being asked not to share any details about the security operation or to use social media to spread unverified information.

Old buildings to get new look

CARTAGENA City Council has signed an agreement that will see €800,000 allocated to the remodelling of old houses in the area.

More than 150 homes will qualify to be part of the scheme of subsidies agreed between the council and the Areas of Regeneration and Urban Rehabilitation (ARRU) programme of the regional development ministry.

Up until now, the programme of redevelopment was restricted to buildings in the old parts of town, but the council has now requested the scope of work be extended into the area around Calle Jorge Juan and includes the historic centre of The Ensanche.

It's predicted that 155 dwellings can be remodelled with an estimated total cost of €871,428.57.

Guardia barracks to get life saving devices

GUARDIA CIVIL has approved the installation of semi-automatic defibrillators in nine of their barracks headquarters in the Comunidad Valenciana.

In making the announcement, the government delegate in Valencia Juan Carlos Moragues said that the use of such devices increase chances of recovery by 70 per cent and one

of the machines had already been used and had saved the life of someone passing by the Guardia Civil HQ in Torrevieja.

He took the opportunity to thank the two officers who acted quickly on that occasion and who were present at this event.

Moragues also confirmed that "...in Spain alone, more than 30,000 people die due to

heart issues each year. The use of these defibrillators can only help to reduce that number."

The nine locations to benefit from the installations are Benimaclet, Patraix, Malvarrosa, Alicante, Castellón, Torrevieja, Paiporta, Calpe and Burriana, and is the second autonomous community behind Cataluña to develop this initiative.

Killer father arrested

ONE of the most wanted men in Germany has been arrested in the north of Spain.

A huge international police manhunt swung into action after the body of the man's two-year-old daughter was found dead in the family home in Hamburg, Germany.

It was feared the man had left the country and an international search order was issued.

Spain's National Police traced the man, a 33-year-old of Pakistani origin, and arrested him in Gipuzkoa (San Sebastián) in the Basque Country.

The man had sought refuge at the home of a friend.

He will now face extradition back to Germany.

Basque leaders held

TWO of the last remaining leaders of the Basque terrorist organisation ETA to be at large have been detained in Berlin.

It comes after a joint operation between the Spanish and German police.

The arrest of the Basque organisation members was granted by a European arrest warrant and, after locating them in the German capital, officers launched operation 'Exodus' to bring the convicts in.

Mikel Barrios Santamaria, aged 29, was wanted for being involved in a group that allegedly committed several attacks in his hometown of Pamplona in 2007. He fled to France in 2008 but was arrested a year later.

However, while waiting to stand trial he managed to escape again and lived in hiding in Berlin.

The other detainee, Iñigo Gulina Tirapu, was accused of committing acts of vandalism and violence between 2004 and 2007.

He was initially arrested but later released from prison after paying a

bail of €6,000. He then disappeared to Germany and failed to show up for his second trial in 2013.

The German police do not believe the men were involved in a cover-up operation, stressing that it was easy

for them to remain in hiding in Germany without many resources or a network of contacts.

Both the accused will remain locked up in Berlin before they are extradited to Spain to face trial.

Horse hobbling ban enforced

GUARDIA CIVIL officers are clamping down on the mistreatment of horses in Spain and horse hobbling in particular.

Horse hobbling is the practice of tethering one of more legs to allow a horse to graze and move short and slow distances, yet prevent the horse from running off too far. But frequently the tethers can tighten around the limb and cause injury.

Legislation outlawing the practice in Spain was introduced in 2015 with fines of up to €10,000 for first-time offenders. Repeat offenders face a life-time ban from keeping horses. The Guardia Civil's environmental branch, Seprona, is now appealing for the public to contact them by calling 062 if they see cases of horses being mistreated.

Mum complained to doctors FOUR times

A 38-YEAR-OLD woman from Malaga was sent away by her GP four times when she complained about “unbearable” pains in her back and stomach.

Her husband revealed to local media sources that doctors had just advised her to go on a diet to lose weight, and she was sent home on four separate occasions without doing any tests.

During her previous visits to the emergency room, the

woman had been diagnosed with lower back pain, but on her fifth and final trip she discovered she was pregnant with twins and in labour.

The two girls were reportedly born in good health but their mother remains in intensive care due to complications she suffered during childbirth.

The woman had also discovered a lump on the lower part of her body, but the doctors initially diagnosed

this as an abscess when she was rushed to the emergency room for the final time. They performed several tests anyway and discovered that she was pregnant with twins and had gone into labour.

Her husband is now suing the hospital for medical malpractice, and claimed that if he had not taken his wife to the hospital on the final occasion, then his wife and daughters could have died.

The mother, who suffered a blood clot in her head while giving birth, had in-

formed doctors she had not had a period for four months but they had told her she wasn't capable of getting pregnant because of her weight.

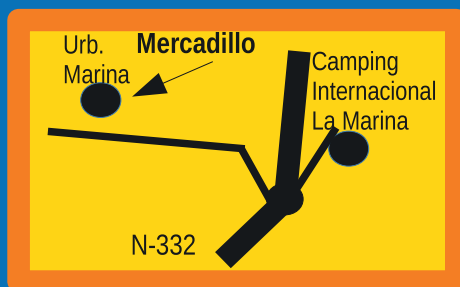
The husband said his wife had always dreamed of being a mother and criticised the doctors for depriving his pregnant wife of the treatment she needed which could have prevented the complications from arising during birth.

The Andalusian authorities also announced they would open an investigation into the matter.

A HOLIDAYMAKER from Liverpool who almost died after being bitten by sandflies on the Costa del Sol is on the road to recovery.

It comes in the wake of a two-year battle during which doctors were unable to diagnose what was causing 46-year-old Mark Russell's muscles to waste away, with kidney stones blamed at one point.

But the father-of-one had in fact contracted a blood disease normally confined to the tropics during a 2014 Malaga break with wife Yvette and their 16-year-old son.

In an interview with local media he said: "Everyday, I didn't know what was going on and neither did the consultants.

"I had to be so strong - sometimes I thought I was going to die. I was weeing into a pot as I couldn't get out of bed, I was that weak.

"It's the worst nightmare imaginable, I wouldn't wish this on my biggest enemy."

Having lost more than three stone in weight and being forced to spend months off work, he was cured after being transferred from Arrowe Park Hospital near his home on the Wirral,

Merseyside, to the Royal Liverpool University Hospital.

Once there, experts from Liverpool University's School of Tropical Medicine were able to identify the cause of the funeral care worker's illness as visceral leishmaniasis, a potentially life-threatening condition caused by a parasite.

Nick Beeching, a senior lecturer at the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine, said: "Mark developed a prolonged fever and became very anaemic.

"Eventually, he was diagnosed and we looked at it under the microscope and could see the parasites causing the fever.

"We started Mark on a toxic treatment. He tolerated that okay but, soon after, he had a relapse - so we gave him a longer course of treatment which was very successful.

"He now looks a different man, he's put the

weight back on and has regained his energy."

The affliction is mainly confined to the tropics but there are occasional cases in the Mediterranean, and if untreated can be lethal.

Mark added: "I was off work for six months and it took two years to get

me back to full fitness.

"I suffered a lot of muscle wastage and looked like someone with cancer.

"And the emotional side was very tough - I didn't know what was going to happen to me.

"It's been a long road to get that parasitic disease out of my system."

Fatal copter crash

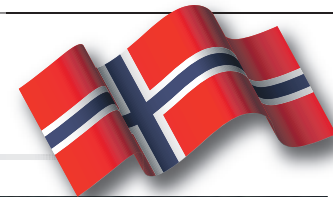

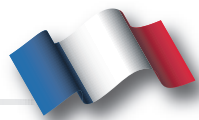

Power politics



KSENIA: Russia's Paris Hilton wants Putin's job.

■ A SOCIALITE and TV presenter caused a stir when she formally became a candidate in Russia's 2018 presidential election. Ksenia Sobchak, aged 35, has five million online followers and has been described as Russia's Paris Hilton. Many suspect she is a Kremlin stooge handpicked to inject vitality into the campaign.

Psychotic attack

■ A 'MADMAN' stabbed the deputy editor of a Russian radio station that is critical of the Kremlin, police say. They rejected claims that Boris Grits had a political motivation for the stabbing of Tatiana Felgenhauer. Instead, police say, he is mentally ill and was out of his mind at the time.

Fealty first

■ NATURALISED Russian citizens swore an oath to their new country. All new citizens are now required to pledge an oath of allegiance and swear to protect Russia's culture, traditions and identity. Last week 62 former nationals of old Soviet states became the first to make the pledge.

Pussy riot

■ CONTROVERSIAL activists Pussy Riot took their anti-Putin campaign to New York last week. They unfurled a giant banner on Trump Tower in support of a jailed Ukrainian film director. Oleg Sentsov is serving a 20-year term for 'masterminding terrorist attacks' in Crimea.

Smart system

■ ALL of Moscow's land and property registrar will be digitised and run by computers with a degree of artificial intelligence. If the project is successful, Russia's pension and health care systems will also be completely digitised in what the Kremlin describes as a 'number one priority.'

Killer gang

■ MEMBERS of a Moscow gang which murdered homeless people to 'cleanse the city' were jailed. The five-strong gang killed at least 14 people in deserted city areas. Knives, hammers and clubs were used in the savage attacks. They flashed Nazi symbols during the trial.

Warped wages

■ A POLICE officer threatened to kill activists who dared compare his wages to the Swedish police force. The incident, caught on tape, shows a protestor telling Russian officers that their Swedish counterparts earn €3,800 per month. In Russia the average salary is €530. He was called a 'Swedish homosexual' and threatened.

Repaying debts

THE Spanish government has received permission from the European Stability Mechanism (ESM) to make an early repayment of €2 billion to reduce its borrowings to save banks.

This does however still leave an outstanding debt of €31.7 billion from the €41.3 billion originally borrowed in 2012 to allow it to save a number of struggling banks. The entire debt is due for repayment by 2027 but the ESM is impressed with current early repayments.

Comparison site review

A BRITISH initiative which will review the clarity and honesty of hotel booking comparison sites could well benefit consumers and hotels in Spain.

The Competition and Markets Authority (CMA) is contacting all of the major websites operating in the UK such as Booking.com, Expedia and Trivago to try to establish a number of matters.

The enquiry will want to discover whether there are any hidden charges, how accurate the discount offers are and whether the sites are influenced to promote particular establishments due

to the commission they receive.

According to the CMA as many of 70 per cent of UK residents looking to make hotel bookings do compare options on the various websites and should there be any evidence that consumers are being misled then action will be taken.

Having contacted hotel groups and websites, the watchdog also wants to hear from the general public about their experiences with these sites.

One area of particular interest is

whether sites ignore criteria entered by those searching for hotels and respond with lists of those hotels where they receive the greatest commission.

Another area of interest is the accuracy surrounding the number of rooms still available in a particular hotel as there is some fear that the numbers may be manipulated in order to encourage immediate booking.

One early conclusion is that those searching websites for hotel availability should check with more than one site to ensure the best available deal.

Bad news Barcelona

THE president of the Spanish Confederation of Employers' Organizations (CEOE) believes that the 1,500 companies leaving Cataluña employ 30 per cent of the Province's workforce. He made it clear that this situation is potentially damaging not only for the Catalan people, but also for the economy of Spain as the return to growth and prosperity could be halted.

Egyptologists turn to crowdfunding

AN incredibly successful team of Spanish archaeologists who have unearthed numerous valuable Egyptian artefacts is so poor that it has had to turn to crowdfunding to raise €20,000.

Whilst the group has been excavating the tomb of Djehuty and others in Luxor, many of their rare and exquisite finds are the property of the Egyptian government and end up in local museums. These experts are not treasure hunters but are dedicated to their work howev-

er they need to be able to pay their local teams of labourers in order to launch next year's exploration session in January and February.

Needing to raise €20,000 the group came up with the idea of making an appeal on the Kickstarter platform and with more than a month before the appeal ends, they have already raised just short of €28,000 from 247 supporters who will receive small tokens such as books and videos in thanks.

LATEST unemployment figures show that the number without jobs in Spain has dropped to its lowest level since 2008. The National Statistics Institute third quarter figures show unemployment at 16.38 per cent, down from 17.22 per cent in the previous quarter.

La Caixa

LA CAIXA bank's CEO Gonzalo Gortazar said that whilst he feels that the Catalan situation would be resolved, there could be economic problems if matters drag on. Having moved its HQ from Barcelona, he confirmed that few withdrawals by disgruntled Catalans had occurred.

In the money

SPANISH billionaires saw their wealth increase by 10 per cent to a total of €105.81 billion in 2016 according to a report by Swiss bank UBS and consultancy PwC. The number of billionaires also increased by four to 25.

Sacked for working too hard

IN what is an unusual case, a store worker who was sacked for working too hard has taken former employer Lidl to court claiming unfair dismissal.

The supermarket branch in Barcelona for which he worked accused him of breaches of his employment contract as he turned up early and spent between an hour and an hour and a

half stocking shelves and generally tidying up. Apart from working too hard, he also didn't clock in whilst he was doing this work as he didn't expect to get paid and didn't know that he wasn't allowed to do this as it breached the company's rules which required payment for all work undertaken.

FOR the last few weeks central bank speculation and political developments have been the driving force behind currency movement.

Euro

EUR/GBP: Up from £0.87 to £0.90

EUR/USD: Up from \$1.16 to \$1.18

Although the euro has been pressured by political tensions in Cataluña and uncertainty about the path the European Central Bank (ECB) will take with fiscal policy, the common currency has still managed to strengthen against both the pound and US dollar over the last four weeks.

The euro was kept on its toes as the Catalanian populace voted overwhelmingly for independence, igniting fears for Spain's economic outlook. However, with Madrid refusing to sanction a split, EUR exchange rates recovered losses.

Hopes that the European Central Bank (ECB) would taper its quantitative easing scheme also bolstered the euro - right up until investors found

out that the central bank was scaling down its programme, but running it for longer. The move inspired some EUR losses as October drew to a close.

The repercussions from the ECB decision are likely to remain a cause of euro movement over the next few weeks. Any significant developments in Cataluña are also liable to spark EUR shifts.

Pound

GBP/EUR: Down from €1.14 to €1.12

GBP/USD: Down from \$1.34 to \$1.32

The pound was knocked around a fair bit during October. The British currency swiftly dropped from September's highs as Brexit negotiations ended in deadlock - potentially delaying discussions about the UK's future trading relationship with the EU. A string of less-than-impressive UK ecostats (including concerning services and retail sales stats) also kept the pound under pressure.

However, towards the end of October the UK's third quarter growth data was published. The data showed quarterly growth of 0.4 per

cent, slightly better than the expected rate of 0.3 per cent. As the result was viewed as upping the odds of the Bank of England (BoE) increasing interest rates at its November policy meeting, GBP exchange rates were able to recover some of their recent losses.

The BoE rate decision is liable to be the biggest cause of pound volatility in the month ahead. A rate hike would lift GBP, while the decision to leave policy unchanged would weaken Sterling.

US Dollar

USD/GBP: Up from £0.74 to £0.76

USD/EUR: Fluctuating between €0.84 and €0.85

While expectations for a December rate hike from the Federal Reserve have been lending the US dollar support, USD gains have been limited by the debate over who President Donald Trump will appoint as Chairman of the Federal Reserve. A Chairman who is likely to increase the pace or size of interest rate adjustments would boost the US dollar, while a dovish President could send USD sliding.

The December Federal Reserve decision is edging ever closer but as long as upcoming US releases keep the odds of a December rate hike high, USD will remain sturdy.

MORE GOVERNMENT MONEY TO BE COMMITTED Spain wants electric cars

THE Spanish government is to spend a further €50 million to support the widespread introduction of electric charging points and to encourage drivers to purchase electric cars.

This decision has been made despite the fact that a previous effort to assist purchasers of environmentally friendly vehicles was spoiled by the Volkswagen diesel emission scandal.

Of the money now due to be made available, €30 million will be put towards the introduction of more electric charging points which are almost non-existent in many parts of Spain as well as supporting additional research and development.

The balance of €20 million is expected to be paid to motorists in the form of 'cash backs' or discounts from manufacturers' price when purchasing a new electric car or one that uses a propulsion system that is not oil based.

This new initiative which is expected to be in addition to €50 million previously agreed by government for expenditure in the second half of 2017 has been championed by the Ministry of

Energy, Tourism and Digital Agenda and is expected to be managed by the Institute for Energy Diversification and Saving (IDAE).

This whole enterprise is quite different to previous funding plans as it will be managed by IDEA rather than Tragsa - which is associated with the Ministry of Agriculture - and whereas the previous campaign looked to persuade car owners to swap their old vehicles for more fuel and environmentally friendly oil driven cars, this

campaign will only apply to vehicles which use alternative energy.

As the world moves to develop vehicles driven by electric power and in some cases liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) the current option of hybrid vehicles continues to be a major leader in environmentally friendly motoring and will remain so until such time as electric car batteries can hold much greater charges and can be topped up quickly.

It will be very difficult to persuade drivers to give up their gas guzzlers in exchange for a vehicle which has a range of less than 300 kilometres and could take hours to recharge.

SEAT will be cooperating with the entire Volkswagen Group in order to try to find a workable solution and a small Spanish manufacturer Velantur has been trying to launch its four seater electric luxury sports car which it hopes will have a range of 400 kilometres.

Tesla continues to increase the charges of their batteries but unless it is quick, cheap and easy to recharge an electric vehicle, then the entire concept could turn into a disaster.

Royal Mint takes a pounding

WITH companies around Britain furious about the short time allowed for the changeover between the old and new pound coins, many are still accepting them as legal tender.

Councils who have not changed their parking machines to take the new pound are under fire from drivers and associations as they are fining anyone parking without a valid ticket, even though many have disposed of their old round pounds.

Gibraltar has taken the step of demonetising British round pounds but is continuing to allow Gibraltar round pounds to be considered legal tender on the Rock as the company they use to mint their pound coins has simply not been able to obtain blanks from the Royal Mint.

MONARCH SHAREHOLDERS ADMIT MORAL DUTY May pay charter costs

THE main investors in Monarch Airlines have confirmed that they have a moral duty to help repay £60 million (€68 million) spent by the tax payer.

Greybull Capital have written to the UK Transport Committee confirming that it would be prepared to assist in paying some of the repatriation costs involved in bringing more than 100,000 people back to the UK if it makes a profit when the liquidation is finalised.

The British government chartered aircraft at short notice to bring back stranded Monarch passengers in what is believed to be the largest ever peacetime repatriation and picked up all of the costs.

The private investment company was responding to an observation made by Chris Grayling, the Minister for Transport with regards to the morality of the situation should Greybull - which is Monarch's main secured creditor - actually make a profit from the closure of the airline.

Much depends on whether the liq-

uidators (KPMG) will be able to sell on the lucrative international take-off and landing rights 'owned' by Monarch and this is now being decided in court.

In the event that the court confirms that the rights can be sold to the highest bidder, certain of the rights to the more valuable slots could raise a significant amount of money, the bulk of which would be due to Greybull Capital.

If there was to be a 'bidding frenzy' then in theory, the main investor could

make a profit from the closure and it has confirmed that in such a scenario it would channel such profits back to the UK government as part repayment for the money spent on chartering the aircraft.

In its letter to the Transport Committee, Greybull maintained that whilst sorry for the closure it had been doing all that it could since 2014 - when it obtained the majority of shares in the airline - to try to stave off bankruptcy but was unsuccessful.

Apart from the inconvenience and in many cases financial loss suffered by passengers who may never receive their payments back, more than 2,000 Monarch staff have lost their jobs.

The other possible assets of the former airline will be their aircraft, although many have been leased rather than paid for outright and it may well be that the administrators will be unable to raise any funds from them and in fact depending on lease contracts, there may be a significant liability.

More steel production in the USA

THE steel manufacturer Acernox has invested \$150 million (€129 million) to launch a new production line in its North American Stainless (NAS) plant in Kentucky.

The introduction of this new plant will increase capacity of the American subsidiary of the Spanish manufacturer by 10 per cent and allow it to increase the range of different stainless steel products that it can offer, including a range that is produced with a glossy finish.

Currently producing half of all US stainless steel, it believes that the days of cheap Chinese imports are gone and that the market can only increase for the high quality locally rolled steel that it manufactures.

The main markets for the company's products are situated within a nine-hour drive from the factory which employs more than 1,000 local staff.



Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

MANY UK expatriates living in Spain own properties in the UK and have pensions and investments in the UK. They rely on their UK assets to maintain their lifestyles (and those of their families) in Spain. Will my LPA be recognised in Spain?

Unfortunately there is no international type of LPA which is guaranteed to work in both the UK and Spain.

Staying safe

ONLINE fraud makes good headlines, but they don't always match reality as any *Daily Mail* reader knows.

This year's cybercrime estimate is €2.5 trillion worldwide, but very little of it is from online shopping.

Trusted payment methods like credit/debit cards or PayPal take the sleepless nights out of buying online. And if you're worried about an online retailer's reputation, so are they in these days of buyer review overload.

The better retailers are on rating sites like Trustpilot. When an order of mine disappeared into a Hong Kong void recently, my critique on that site quickly got my cash back.

Just be careful not to overdo it. It really is time to stop shopping online when the computer asks if you need another shopping cart.

TERENCE KENNEDY offers up the online shopper's prayer: 'Dear Lord, please don't let my wife be home when all my online orders arrive.'

Shop till your computer drops

AN older friend who doesn't 'do' the internet just gave a local travel agent nearly €400 for air tickets I found online for €89. Frankly I was amazed travel agents still exist.

Yes, doing stuff online can be risky, especially when a Nigerian prince offers you untold riches. But squadrillions of online transactions occur every day with barely a hitch, and by 2025 the majority of the world's retail trade will apparently happen online. So there.

Why then, like our overcharged dinosaur friend, wouldn't you do it? London department store Harrods used to advertise you could buy anything from an elephant to a safety-pin; these days with waretight security Amazon, China's

Alibaba and eBay sell more in a second than Harrods could in a year. Including elephants.

Hunt for an offbeat item in your local shops and you could be at it for days. Find it online in just seconds, have it delivered to your door the next day. Or perhaps in an hour if Amazon's current drone delivery tests work out.

The main objections are fraud and identity theft. Yes they do happen, but the percentage is minuscule, and if you use a plastic card your bank covers most of your risk anyhow if things go pear-shaped.

The bad news for online-shopping virgins is that they soon won't have any choice: from tax declarations to newsagents' top-shelf magazines, everything's

moving online for better or worse.

Worse, certainly, for traditional bricks-and-mortar retailers, whose plight has even added a new word to the Oxford dictionary, 'showrooming': the practice of examining and fondling a product in a physical shop before going home to order it more cheaply online.

It was an album by Sting which is said to have launched online shopping back in 1994, say the (online!) histories. By next year online shopping will be nearly 9 per cent of all retail sales (but 18 per cent for the world's most enthusiastic e-shoppers, the Brits). Seven out of every 10 internet

users in Spain shop online, spending around €1,100 each a year.

The bad news for our reluctant buddy is that it's unstoppable and that, inevitably, even he is going to have to bite the bullet (also available online). Within his lifetime only those enterprises which cannot easily sell through what he calls the 'Interweb' will be left standing, like convenience stores, bars, bistros and brothels. And perhaps elephant traders.

As for his happy travel agent? Most likely she will have followed the clever advice I once saw pasted up in a travel agent's window: 'Please go away!'

WHY does everything have to be so difficult? I mean things start off simple then everything goes downhill. I receive a UK pension which, thanks to Brexit, dropped by 20 per cent-ish just after the announcement. So gawd knows what will happen when the UK actually does leave the EU.

Anyway, somebody told me that, as I'd had my own business here in Spain and had paid into their system, I may be entitled to a small pension here too. Now, as you all know, nothing here is going to go the way you hope. You can't just call an office, give your social security number, and hope that someone says 'Oh yeah, we will sort that for you.'

I had to make an appointment at my local social security office and take a load of completed and duplicated forms. You all know the form filling procedures here so I won't bore you. That done I turn up for my appointment and a very helpful young man tells me yes I am entitled to a Spanish pension. He explained that all they have to do

is write to the UK pension office to confirm a couple of things and 'Roberto es tu tio' (Bob's your uncle!). I'm told it will take a couple of weeks or so.

Well, a couple of weeks came and went and we were well into the 'or so' territory as I originally went in June and it's now November. On Tuesday I went back to the Spanish social security office to see what was going on. I hadn't made an appointment so I had to wait for an hour and a half for them to tell me that they hadn't heard back from the UK pension office.

Next I phone the UK office and after pressing 1 for this, 2 for that, 4 for something else, 5 for losing the will to live, I finally get through and tell them Spain is waiting for a couple of bits of information. They tell me they haven't been sent yet because they are very busy! 'Oh, I'm pleased to hear that. I'd hate for you to be sitting around twiddling your thumbs.'

But, do you not appreciate that some people depend on their pensions to live and waiting six months for two forms to be sent back is not acceptable.' I'm told they will mark it urgent and get them sent as soon as possible. Let's see.

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Checking your details at the roadside

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

AS they go about their duties patrolling the roads of Spain, the Guardia Civil traffic police have a whole range of tools in their arsenal to both help those in need, and of course deal with those drivers who break the law.

One piece of kit carried by all of the officers, often stored in the panniers of their motorbikes, or inside the patrol cars, is their Personal Digital Assistant, or PDA. The device is linked via Bluetooth to a thermal printer, and so able to issue fines on the spot, and pools its data with the central office of the DGT traffic department.

The PDA can be used to check driver and vehicle details, such as if you are actually qualified to drive, if you've been banned, if you own the vehicle you are driving, and details about that vehicle and its insurance.

The whole process of checking the informa-

tion is almost instantaneous, but it can take a lot longer if the information provided by the driver is either inaccurate, or unknown.

One particular problem facing foreign drivers is when they are not registered as residents in Spain, or have not transferred their licence to a Spanish one.

For those who have, you are likely to be sent on your way a lot quicker than those with no registered details, as a single check of a driver's NIE number links all of the relevant driver and vehicle details together, and so the officers can almost instantly find the information they are looking to confirm.

However, when the information is not linked, such as for drivers who haven't swapped to a Spanish licence, then the process takes a lot longer to complete, and your journey is likely to be increasingly delayed as a result.

Do I need a Spanish driving licence?

After recent confusion over the legality of driving in Spain on a UK licence, the Directorate General of Traffic has now clarified the full letter of the law concerning this complex matter.

Q. I am a British resident in Spain. Do I need a Spanish driving licence by law?

A. If you are the holder of a Group 1 licence (AM, A1, A2, A, B and BE) with a period of validity greater than 15 years - and this includes permanent licences - or a Group 2 licence (BTP, C1, C1E, C, CE D1, D1E, D, DE) with a period of validity greater than five years, then you must exchange the licence for a Spanish equivalent once you have been resident in Spain for two years.

If you are the holder of a

standard UK 10-year photo licence you do NOT need to exchange the licence for a Spanish equivalent until it expires, although you CAN do so voluntarily at any time.

However, if you are resident in Spain and your driving licence expires then you MUST renew it for a Spanish licence.

In a recent Legally Speaking Column article in *EWN Issue 1683* some information given by David Searl on this topic led to social media

users publishing contradictory views, some of those additionally incorrect.

Confusion over a long period according to the Directorate of Traffic has arisen due to various translations into English as to the law as outlined in Spanish.

The *EWN* - as a responsible newspaper - in publishing the above report, believes this to be an accurate translation and interpretation in English of what the law states in Spanish.

THERESA MAY ‘begged for help’ and seemed ‘tired’ and ‘politically weak’ at the recent EU summit according to leaks reportedly by the EU side to further weaken the PM.

Regardless of the truth of these leaks, it’s clear the UK needs to rapidly progress the negotiations before relationships deteriorate any further. Both sides are jockeying for position. The EU wants as much money as possible to offset the effect of the UK’s departure. The UK wants to minimise the amount it pays AND have a trade deal with the EU.

Unquestionably, the EU under both Merkel and Juncker has proved inflexible and unaccommodating. Merkel gave carte blanche to migration into the EU when the so-called Dublin Regulation was suspended, turning a steady flow of migration into a flood. “enough is enough!” Cracks are appearing - even the Danish finance minister recently stated that the EU’s wrangling over Brexit is “a game” and flexibility is required.

Thankfully, the EU is now showing a hint of flexibility, the ‘sequencing’ of talks having proved a major barrier to progress. All UK political parties should also be getting behind the government as it clearly has a very difficult job ahead. Labour in particular (yes, I’m looking at you, Mr ‘Groundhog Day’ Corbyn!) needs to stop all the political point-scoring.

Finally, talk of the billions of pounds ‘owed’ the EU is enough to drive us all crazy. Which reminds me of an old joke. Doctor: “Nurse, how is that little boy doing, the one who accidentally swallowed those old £1 coins?” Nurse: “No change yet.”

TV Couch Critic

Strictly camera angles plus unripe avocados

STRICTLY COME DANCING (BBC1, Saturday & Sunday) continues to delight with glitz and sparkle even though I wasn't sure that without Sir Bruce and Seven-loving Len it would remain as a weekend favourite.

But it most certainly is. Twitter-using fans of the show will have seen a flood of comments about the camera angles over recent weeks and I agree.

Clearly someone has a new box of tricks and wants to throw them all at the dancers, with cameras spinning around the dance floor, way too many overhead shots and on one occasion a lens so close to the dancing couple there was a real danger of a collision.

All that glitter and hair product to clean up, and that's just from a slight

brush against Bruno!

Maybe Len needs to return and sort it all out, as only he can?

A show that on paper shouldn't work, but on the screen really does, is *James and Jupp* (BBC2 Wales, Sunday).

Maybe a touch of Miss Marple is needed to find this given the channel, but if you want a blast of stunning countryside and two-blokes-in-a-car-humour, seek it out.

The format is simple: comedians Elis James and Miles Jupp take a car trip around

Wales, and while it isn't Top Gear or the sort of comedy normally familiar from these two, the banter is genuine and the trip on the A470 connecting south and north Wales is spectacular.

Meanwhile I am getting increasingly worried by some content panellists on *Loose Women* (ITV, weekdays) are being given to work with.

As daytime telly, viewers expect mixed topics to be discussed from hard hitting to trivial.

But a recent item asked if viewers suffered 'avocado anxiety,' a term used following re-

search that revealed a fear among one in three millennials when their avocados aren't ripe.

This may be about the right level for lovely Stacey Solomon and lets face it Linda Robson will read anything from autocue, but the likes of Janet Street-Porter and Ruth Langford as serious commentators surely deserve something better.

The latest written-by and starring Jack Whitehall offering *Bounty Hunters* (SKY1, Wednesday) pairs Jack with Rosie Perez, while Robert Lindsay and

Charity Wakefield are thrown in for good measure.

As Jack has written this one I am unsure why he has cast himself as a middle class fool; maybe just to reinforce his one-trick pony CV?

His character, Barnaby - why give him such a name Jack? - is trying to save the failing family antiques business and gets involved with looted treasures from the East.

It is unclear how this will play out, but Rosie is gorgeous and Jack looks good with spectacles and trimmed beard, so I'm sticking with it.

Finally, *The Crown* (Netflix) starts a second season on December 8. With the story known inside out, based on season one there will be little if anything new.

Even so the date is already in my viewing diary.

CARLES PUIGDEMONT, who dissembled for nearly a month, declared Catalan independence in a farcical vote in a half-empty parliament chamber.

Seventy pro-independence MPs were considered sufficient for UDI although changes to the region's electoral laws or the Statute of Autonomy require approval from 90.

Article 155 of the Spanish constitution has suspended Cataluña's autonomous status and on paper the separatists are set to lose the regional elections announced for December 21s

Vice-president Soraya Saenz de Santamaria, Mariano Rajoy's right-hand woman and not the best-loved member of his government, will oversee the day-to-day running of the region.

Anything can happen between now and the elections. And anti-system CUP plus Asamblea Nacional Catalana (ANC) and Omnium - obsessively separatist associations whose leaders are remanded for sedi-

tion - will want to ensure that it does.

Good PR

THE secessionists are great communicators, foreign correspondents covering the Catalan drama said.

They praised their ease in reaching Raul Romeva, the Generalitat Catalan's Foreign Affairs chief and even the regional president Carles Puigdemont.

Getting a Madrid government spokesman to make a live public statement was virtually impossible, they lamented, and they are used to getting nothing specific or a sermon about the Catholic Monarchs at Moncloa press conferences.

Little wonder the sympathies of the international media lie with poor little Cataluña, trampled under the hoofs of the raging Spanish bull and tossed on its cruel horns.

No matter that Carles Puigdemont, Oriol Junqueras and Anna Gabriel have done more to undermine democracy in their own region than anyone since Franco. That's good PR for you.

Conversation piece

ANTONIO TAJANI, president of the European Parliament, said that it is not Europe's job to mediate over a Spanish region.

Mariano Rajoy should have tried

that years ago but instead he and his government made a pig's ear of the Catalan issue. It started as a problem in 2010 when the Constitutional Tribunal overturned Cataluña's amended Statute at the Partido Popular's behest. Independence gathered momentum after 2012 and in 2017 ended in crisis and the Constitution's Article 155.

Unfortunately for Spain and Cataluña, Mariano Rajoy's brand of dialogue might be a monologue but Puigdemont's version was permission for independence.

Raking up the past

PABLO CASADO remarked that Carles Puigdemont could end up like Lluís Companys, the Catalan president executed by Franco's government in 1940 after the Gestapo returned him from occupied France.

Casado is the Partido Popular's Communications vice-secretary and as usual with politicians whose mouths run away with them, he immediately insisted that he hadn't meant that at all.

But Casado's original statement reeked of Spanish nationalism whose epicentre is based in Madrid. Despite the secessionists' provocation and disregard for law and democracy, this attitude is partly responsible for the escalation of the Catalan crisis and Mariano Rajoy's inability to do anything other than get out the rulebook and read it to the Catalans.

Autumn skin tips

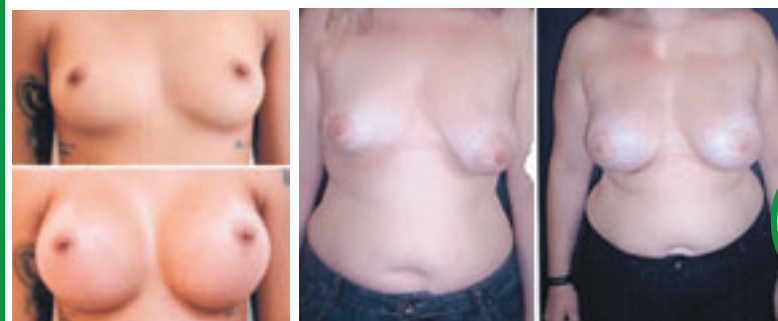

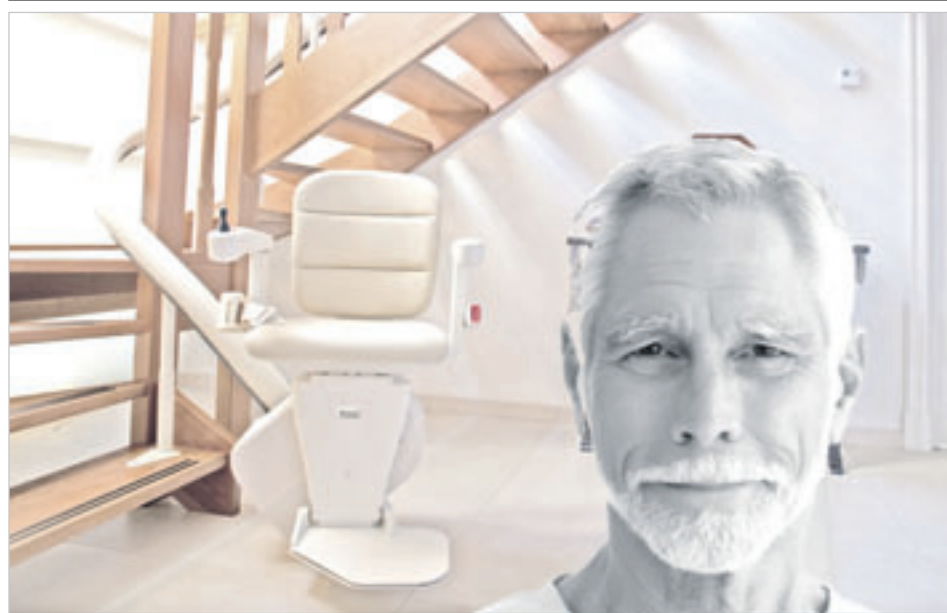
can be left on the skin for 15 minutes before being rinsed off with warm water.

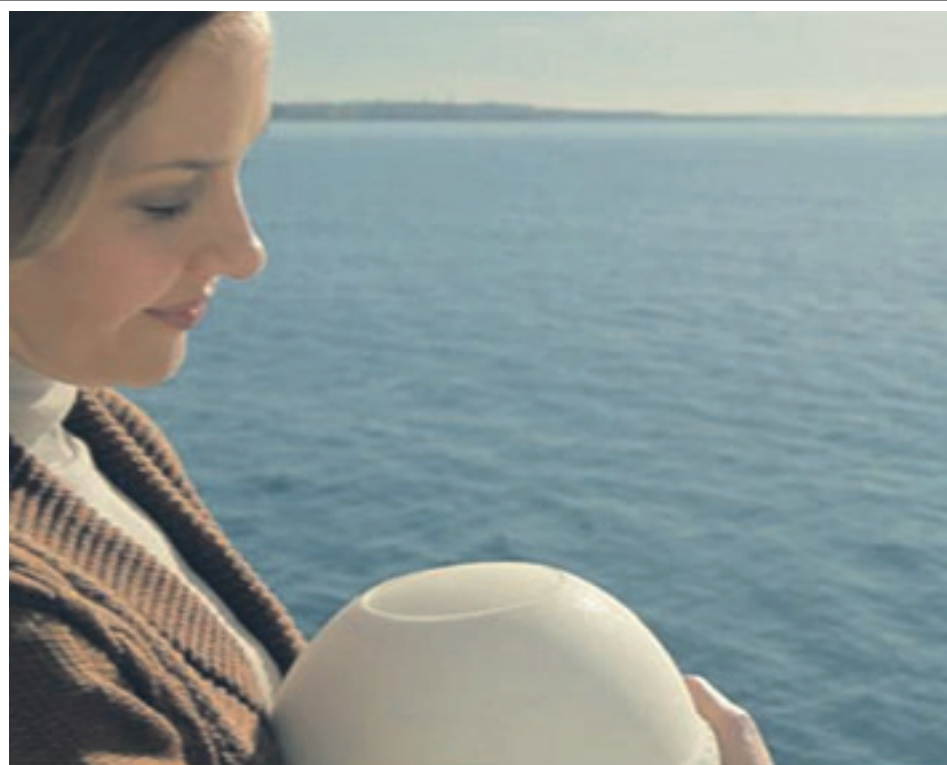

Ask the Optician:

What are the most common problems with eyesight?

Lisa James, Store Director, Specsavers Opticas Guardamar

THE most common vision problems are refractive errors, more commonly known as nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism and presbyopia. Most people have one or more of these conditions. In this column we wanted to explain what they mean and how can they be corrected.

■ **What is myopia/short sight and how can it be corrected?**

A person with myopia or short sight can see objects close to them clearly, but not far away. Myopia is caused by the shape of the eye; either the eyeball is slightly too long or the cornea is too steeply curved. Myopia is corrected by spectacles or contact lenses with lenses which are 'minus' or concave in shape.

■ **What is hyperopia/hypermotropia/long sight and how can it be corrected?**

A person with long sight can see objects far away from them clearly, but not those close by. This is caused by the shape of the eye - the eyeball is slightly too short. It is corrected by spectacles or contact lenses with lenses which are 'plus' or convex in shape.

■ **What is astigmatism and how can it be corrected?**

You should seek professional advice if you are concerned about your eye health and have regular eye tests. People with astigmatism have an unevenly curved cornea or an unevenly curved lens inside their eye, shaped more like a rugby ball than a football. It is corrected by spectacles with a cylinder shape built into the lenses at a certain angle. Contact lenses can also correct astigmatism - mild astigmatism can be corrected by an ordinary gas-permeable lens. Those who prefer a soft lens or have higher amounts of astigmatism can use specially designed, 'toric' soft lenses.

■ **What is presbyopia?**

As a person ages, so do their eyes. The crystalline lenses become thicker and less flexible, resulting in a condition called presbyopia. People often begin to notice its effects during their 40's - as a result of these changes, objects closer to them become blurred and the point of closest focus gradually moves further away from the eyes.

This natural alternative comes without a lot of the salt and sugar of its rivals and can be spiced up by frying with garlic, onions, chilli or spices.

Another satisfying pasta dish can also be made healthier. Spaghetti Carbonara is both creamy and hearty and can be made with fewer calories if the traditional Italian recipe is used instead of adding cream. Simply re-

move some of the fat from lardon or pancetta before frying it with thinly-sliced garlic. Take the frying pan off the heat and add cooked pasta to the mix. Place an egg beaten with a little pecorino or parmesan cheese into the pan and stir continuously, allowing the residual heat to cook the dish.

Most of your favourite recipes can be made healthier by replacing pork or beef for leaner game meats, including venison, or using lower calorie skinless turkey instead of chicken. For a carbohydrate fix, why not substitute sweet potato wedges for chips or even substitute vegetable-based crisps and pastas for the normal variety?

WHAT are the symptoms of flu?

The flu is an infection in the respiratory system caused by a virus that can bring about several symptoms that do not necessarily appear at the same time.

In general a person suffering from the flu will have a cough, fever, pains in their muscles and extremities, feel run down, tiredness, loss of appetite and lack of energy. These symptoms can last several days.

A person usually recovers gradually over a few days, however for some it can take several weeks before they are fully recovered.

How can you treat it?

Usually the best course of treatment is to take medication to manage the symptoms along with rest and plenty of hydration. In more severe cases antiviral or antibiotic medication may be required to deal with the virus.

Should I seek medical

help?

It is recommended that you see your doctor for an initial evaluation so they can refer you to specialists or to take further tests if they are necessary.

When would it be advisable to get a flu jab?

The vaccination campaigns tend to start in autumn and it is recommended that you get the jab especially if you have a high risk of catching the flu. The elderly and those suffering from chronic illnesses are also advised to get vaccinated.

Are there people who are vulnerable to the virus?

People over the age of 65 are more likely to get the flu, and to suffer more seriously from it. Anyone with respiratory illnesses such as Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease or asthma, or other chronic illnesses such as diabetes and those suffering from cancer are the most vulnerable to the virus.

cialising in the world of percussion. Most of the orchestra are students in the music conservatories of Torre Vieja, Orihuela and Almoradí.



Starting gun for sport investments

SPORTING facilities in Alhama de Murcia and La Unión are due to be repaired following an announcement of a major investment.

The council has approved a grant of €100,000 to Alhama de Murcia towards a programme of works to repair the athletics track which is expected to cost €510,422 in total.

Work will concentrate on fixing the parts of the facilities that are in desperate need of repair, such as the running track where there is hardly any top layer of the red synthetic paint left on it. It's the only outdoor track within the municipality and its current condition makes it difficult for people to train and race in total safety.

On the other hand, La Unión will receive a €40,000 subsidy to help toward the refurbishment and repair of a court in their sports centre.

The Alhama de Murcia project must be completed before December 31 this year; the work in La Unión has a termination date of December 31, 2018.

There will be a wide choice of good quality hand made goods, from pottery to leather bags, toys and lamps, crazy hats and jewellery in silver, ce-



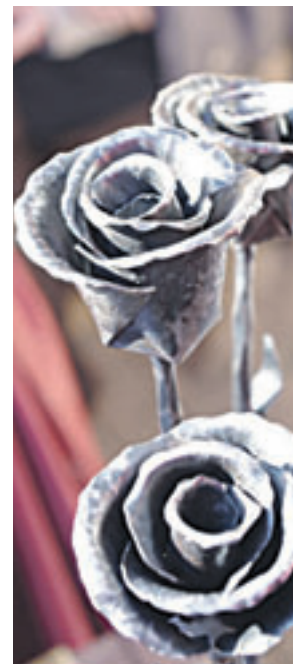

Luxury bubble bursts

A LUXURY housing crisis has added to Cataluña's political woes. A report from real estate company Barnes International argues that the wealthy region's luxury housing market experienced a bubble in the past two years. But concerning for owners of €1 million plus properties in Barcelona and other areas, that bubble has burst and it is now a buyers' market.

The report concludes that although 'the Catalan luxury real estate sector was performing at its best level since the economic crisis, prices have seen a strong downwards trend in recent months.' Founding partner of

Barnes Spain, Emmanuel Virgoulay, said "In the past two years Cataluña's luxury housing market was experiencing a bubble, the steady rise in prices led many sellers to ask for prices

similar to those in the elite neighbourhoods of Paris." He said that in the short-term future only buyers with liquidity will be able to dictate prices.

The news isn't all bad. If Cataluña can recover from the current political turmoil then there is no reason why the luxury market won't soon rebound.

"There will always be investors interested in Cataluña, so the market will not collapse in the way businesses can, such as Lehman Brothers in 2008," Virgoulay said. He also noted that the rental sector is continuing to witness sharp price increases despite the political crisis.

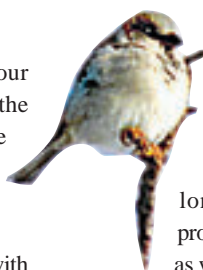

ATTRACTING birds to your garden is easy if you have the right plants that will provide water, food, shelter and protection from predators.

Birds do best in gardens with multiple storeys of plants from ground covers, shrubs as under storeys to taller tree canopies as an upper storey.

Providing water in the dry months in safe places for birds to drink is the sure way to have birds attracted to your garden. A steady, reliable source of water is a primary need, even more than food, if other sources of water are not nearby.

If you provide water, birds will visit regularly, if you provide food plants, they will stay



longer and if you provide safe shelter as well, native birds may start to nest in your garden. Migratory birds will only visit but are more likely to visit if you have a food source as well as water.

There are many plants that can provide food for the birds. As different bird species have different requirements of seed, nectar or insects, a variety of different plants are needed to attract the bird species you wish to support in your garden.

The best way to provide food is to use a lot of native plants

Bird lovers paradise, a garden for the birds

and have a wild zone for allowing naturally occurring non-invasive native plants - even the plants considered weeds in the ornamental and vegetable garden - to go through their full life cycle. Many plants considered weeds are useful plants for birds to feed on for the flowers nectar and seeds.

Birds usually prefer to arrive onto the upper storey to survey a garden for food and dangers before entering and different species build their nests in the upper storey for safety from ground based predators.

Each bird species have dif-

ferent needs, however, so many smaller birds will look for nesting places in the under storey that have dense thickets that prevent larger predators to enter.

So to attract a wide range of birds having a wide range of plants that give good protection is important for diversity.

Plants that provide nectar include Sages (Salvia species), Grevillea species, Torch lilies (Kniphofia species), Sunflowers (Helianthus), Thyme (Thymus species), Lavender (Lavandula species), Honey-suckle (Lonicera species) and Barberry (Berberis species).

Attracting birds can just be a matter of widening the range of plants you grow which may provide even more interest to your garden as many bird food plants are very attractive.

Hedges and thickets of plants will provide safe nesting places for smaller birds and tall trees can have nesting boxes installed to make trees a ready made nesting place.

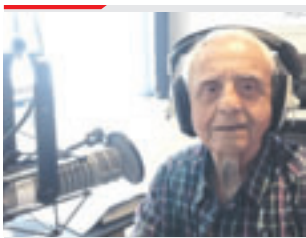

Chocolate a danger to dogs



CHOCOLATE: Toxic to dogs.

CHOCOLATE made for human consumption can cause death in dogs. Dogs are sensitive to a class of chemicals called methylxanthines. Caffeine and theobromine are members of that family. Dogs simply cannot metabolise and excrete methylxanthines as efficiently as humans. The half-life of those compounds in the human body is in the order of two to three hours, in a dog it is more like 18 hours.

In a dog the compounds are taken up by the liver and transmitted via the bile into the intestine. They are then converted back into the original methylxanthines for another circuit through the animal. This repeats itself a number of

times and instead of getting rid of the substances a dog keeps re-poisoning itself.

There are many formulations of chocolate with varying amounts of caffeine and theobromine. The lethal dose of sweet milk chocolate for a dog is 2oz per kilogram of bodyweight. For a five

kilogram dog this would be about 280 grams. A lethal dose of milk chocolate for a 25 kilogram, would be about 1.4 kilograms.

Dark chocolate is at least 10 times as lethal. A 25 kilograms dog could die from the methylxanthines in five ounces.

Symptoms include vomiting, hyperactivity, restlessness, hypersensitivity to touch (a dog will jump when touched), very rapid heartbeat and rapid breathing rate. A loss of control of leg muscles, muscle tremor seizures, general weakness, coma and finally death follow.

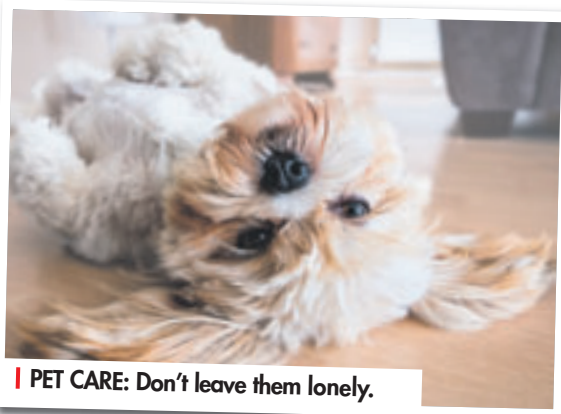

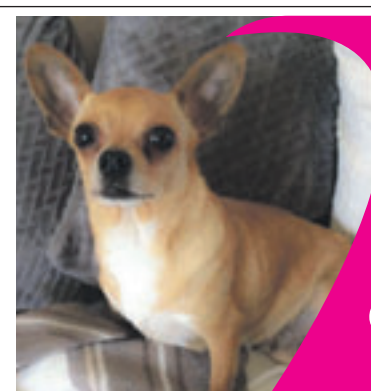

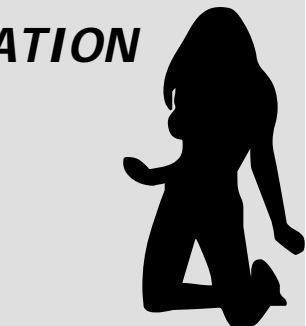

THE 150 millionth Volkswagen rolled off the production line into the arms of a happy customer last week. The car is a plug-in hybrid Golf GTE. Built in Wolfsburg it was dispatched to Norway, one of the world's top green car destinations.

Volkswagen is planning to have built one million electric cars within the next decade. CEO Matthias Muller launched a scathing attack on American tech company Tesla, which is pioneering new electric and autonomous vehicles.

"There are companies which sell 80,000 cars a year," he said, "then there are companies like Volkswagen, selling 11 million a year," Muller mused as he announced VW's determination to dominate the electric market.

Knockout blow 60 years before Rio's sucker punch

RIO FERDINAND'S decision to step into the boxing ring brought back memories of retired footballer octogenarian Peter Higham - who recalls scoring a goal - while wearing a boxing glove!

Ex-Nottingham Forest striker Higham, 86, found himself on the canvas in a derby clash against arch rivals Notts County in 1956, when he clattered a post, sustaining injuries.

"I got barged into the goalpost, sustaining a broken and dislocation of a finger, in a local derby against Notts County at Meadow Lane," said Higham.

"Trainer Tommy Graham got a boxing glove - God

knows where from - and got permission from the referee for me to wear it, to protect my finger," said Higham.

"I remember the pain was excruciating. To this day, I can't straighten my little finger," said Higham.

Ex-Manchester United and England defender Ferdinand is bidding to become a professional at Cruiserweight after signing up to a lucrative deal with a bookmaker.

That led to criticism from boxers, including Tony Bellew, set for a December

rematch with heavyweight David Haye, hitting out at Ferdinand: "He's making a mockery. It's not a game - it's a serious sport - and can be very dangerous.

Ferdinand, awaiting a licence from the British Boxing Board of Control, said: "Boxing can't be a gimmick. If I take it lightly, I will get hurt."

Ferdinand, 38, plans one fight, having initially spoken about ambitions of challenging for a belt: "I want to see if I can get a licence - become a professional - and have one fight," said Ferdinand.

Higham, who delivered a knock-out blow with a boxing glove in Forest's top of the bill match against County 60 years ago, said: "I scored the third goal - I have the picture - with the boxing glove over my left hand!"

JOSE MOURINHO and Antonio Conte are set to light up Bonfire night on November 5 - as Chelsea host Manchester United - in the Premier League at Stamford Bridge.

Mourinho, in charge at Chelsea during 2004-07 and 2013-15, departed in September 2007, following reports of a rift with owner Roman Abramovich.

After leaving Real Madrid in 2013 Mourinho returned to Chelsea, winning the Premier

League, only to be axed in December 2015, after a poor run of results.

Mourinho, appointed manager at Manchester United in May 2016, fired a rocket at his players after the shock defeat against newly-promoted Huddersfield Town in October.

Premier League leaders Manchester City manager Pep Guardiola believes the Blues will not repeat Arsenal's 'Invincibles' tag - The Gunners were unbeaten in 38 Premier League games - in the 2003-04 season.

City host Arsenal at The Etihad, in another Bonfire night spectacular, and Guardiola said: "We are going to lose games. Any team can beat us."

BARCELONA-born goalkeeper David Raya is set to return to FA Cup action as Blackburn Rovers host Barnet at Ewood Park on November 4.

"I've been here since I was 16 and it feels like home," said Raya, who signed a new extended contract at Lancashire League One club Rovers this year.

Raya, who has featured in five FA Cup ties since arriving in England as a teenager, joined Rovers Academy from Barcelona outfit UE Cornellà in 2012.

"It feels great," said Raya, 22, who signed professional forms in 2014, and has worked his way up to claim the number one jersey.

"It's a chance to carry on at this great club," said Raya, under former Celtic manager Tony Mowbray.

After four months' loan at Southport in 2014, where Raya made 15 appearances in the Conference Premier, he returned, making his Rovers first team debut against Leeds United in 2015.

"Leeds was where I made my full debut and it couldn't have gone any better, we won 3-0," said Raya, whose previous three year deal was set to end in 2018.

Former Rovers Academy starlet Raya, who has agreed a one-year extension to his contract until 2019, said: "I've been here for five years.

"It's given me a chance to grow up further as a footballer - and as a person - and I'm really pleased."

It has been a hard grind for Raya, who was a cameo player in the first team in the 2015-16 season, having only

been called upon after injury to first choice Jason Steele, at the tab end of last season.

"I hadn't played as much as I would have liked, but football is like that. When I got my chance, I just needed to take it," said Raya.

Rovers first team coach Mowbray, formerly in charge at Ipswich, Hibern-

ian, West Brom, Celtic, Middlesbrough and Coventry, who was appointed in February, has given Raya his big chance this season.

"David Raya finished the 2016-17 season extremely strongly. He's a very talented young guy - needed an opportunity - and we gave him one," said Mowbray.

"I waited for my chance to show the new manager what I can do," said Raya, called upon after Steele sustained an injury, after 82 consecutive league games.

"It was tough, but you get through it. Then, when you get your chance, you have to take it," said Raya.

Raya remained unfazed during that spell, saying: "You have to keep yourself motivated - keep working hard - and do your best."

Three years ago Raya was shipped out on loan to Southport and was a key figure in The Sandgrounders FA Cup run - progressing to the third round - before being knocked out by Derby County.

Rovers enter the first round of the FA Cup this weekend against Barnet, with a fixture in the EFL Trophy Northern Group C on November 7, prior to returning to a League One action against Walsall on November 11.

Blackburn, relegated from the Championship last season, are leading candidates to return to England's second tier at the first attempt, a task in the hands of Raya.

"I'm still young, I've got a lot of years ahead of me. Hopefully I can repay all the support I've had from the club," said Raya.

"I looked forward to this season after the summer holidays with my family, who I had not seen a lot of," said Raya.

Ex-UE Cornellà youth Raya said: "Blackburn gave me the chance to start my career. I want to stay for as long as possible. I'm very happy here."
