Gypsy plot

Gang leader and ex-officer jailed

A retired Guardia Civil officer was jailed for nine years for helping provide a Palma gypsy gang with a kilogram of heroin.

The 51-year-old was living off his pension in La Jonquera, Girona, when he became involved with the gangsters from Palma's notorious Son Banva slum, often dubbed the most dangerous neighbourhood in Spain.

The leader of the 'El Forrito' gang was sentenced to 10 and a half years for drug trafficking. Other gang members were called to testify as witnesses, but all claimed not to know the corrupt

Four fingerprints of the former officer were found on a package containing a kilogram of

heroin in Palma port six years ago.

Police believe he acted as a middleman hetween the leader of El Forrito and Barcelonabased traffickers and personally supplied the heroin. The gang leader then shipped the heroin to Palma on a ferry from the Catalan capital, stashed in the boot of a Renault Clio.

He was arrested the next day upon arrival at the port. But it took another two years for police to catch up with him. His fingerprints were checked when he was arrested in a domestic violence case and matched those found on the heroin package.

He tried to argue that he might have touched the package in the course of duty, while stationed in a border town near France. But forensic experts proved that he had already retired when the prints

Brazen burglar jailed

A BURGLAR has been arrested on suspicion of raiding 50 Spanish hotel rooms in the popular tourist hotspots of Ibiza, Mallorca and Barcelona.

The 24-year-old allegedly used a combination of fake home-made key cards and electronic locks to break into rooms to steal laptops, watches and mobile phones whilst holidaymakers were out.


He even escaped capture after being caught red-handed by hotel staff in Magaluf.

But officers later apprehended the suspect, and linked the items he allegedly stole with reported thefts in Palma, Magaluf and Barcelona.

He has been charged with 50 thefts, but the investigation is

HUNDREDS of people from all nationalities gathered on Palma beach to show their support for the island's beach hygiene.

With surfers in the water and yachts sounding their horns, the beach clean volunteers formed a chain from the Gesa building to the Portixol car park

The Dos Manos beach cleans form part of the work undertaken by Asociacion Ondine, but this event also attracted other conservation groups from around the island.

According to the Mallorca Blue Facebook site, the intended presence of television cameras led to the deployment of heavy equipment at 11pm on Saturday night to clean up the site before anyone arrived.

Despite this, volunteers picked up more than 800 kilograms of plastic, cigarette butts, ear bud sticks and straws on Sunday morning.

The greatest volume of pollutants found on Sunday were in the form of wet wipes. In October Emaya admitted it had to spend more than a quarter of a million euros a year on unblocking its sewage plants due to wet wipes and tampons being put down toilets.

"The problem needs a twopronged approach," Asociacion Ondine president, Brad Robertson explained.

"First, everyone needs to understand that our ecosystem will continue to be damaged every time anyone puts anything down the loo that hasn't first been eaten, or is normal loo paper! Secondly a huge amount of investment needs to be ear-marked to renovate the island's dated sewage system."

Spain honours dead

THOUSANDS of people flocked to the graves of deceased relatives to pay respect as Spain marked the Dia de Todos los Santos (All Saints' Day).

As is custom, many Spaniards took the national holiday as an opportunity to return home and decorate the graves of dead family members with elaborate floral displays.

Town councils also made sure local graveyards were cleaned and ready for yesterday's public holiday. As happens every year, the graveyards were crowded with visitors, the surrounding roads were packed with traffic and stalls selling flowers lined the streets.

Many also indulged in the traditional food eaten on this day, including chestnuts and sweet treats.

Whisky exile

TWO young Colombians who attacked guards at Palma's Christmas market with whisky bottles and knives were jailed for three years. They will then be banned from Spain for nine years. One guard took five months to recover and suffers from memory loss and sleep disturbance.

Beach heroes

LIFEGUARDS clocked up 36,960 safety actions in Palma alone between May and September. Five people died at the city's beaches, 32 were rescued from the water. Lifeguards treated seven heart attacks and treated 1,134 people for other health problems.

Supermarket **sweep**

A GANG of supermarket thieves are being pursued by the Guardia Civil after breaking into their seventh business this year, a Muller market in Inca. So far they have stolen €40,000 worth of groceries. They dig holes in rooftops and climb in using a rope.

No apologies

A SLUM drug lord known as 'El Pablo' laughed in court as prosecutors read out drug trafficking charges against 52 members of his Palma gang, amid extremely heavy security. Between them, the El Soledat-based clan are facing more than 200 years in prison for smuggling cocaine.

A BRITISH tourist was helped out of the sea after a gang of muggers threw him into the water. Two Brits were attacked during the 5am incident at Playa de Palma. Witnesses came to their rescue after the gang escaped. Police are hunting the assailants.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...35

Wild mushroom season is officially upon us and is the highlight of the year for fungi fans, reports Kat Ashton.

No 'shroom for error!

BOTH Spaniards and tourists alike flock to the countryside in the autumn months to forage for their favourite fungi, which can reach record sizes thanks to the moist woodland conditions

The mushroom business is estimated to be worth millions of euros each year, and a whole range of varieties grow across the Iberian Peninsula. Experts believe that the climate creates the ideal environment for mushrooms to grow, with hot summers followed by autumn downpours.

The season tends to fall in October or November but can be earlier or later, depending on the weather. Due to the increase in popularity, many companies now organise mushroom hunts to help tourists seek out the best areas where they are found, often followed by a tasting.

As edible and toxic mushrooms tend to grow side by side, it is always advisable to go foraging for mushrooms with such an expert. There are around 50 species of poisonous fungi in Europe, and six of these can be lethal.

Mushrooms or setas are a staple Spanish cuisine and are often served on their own as the popular tapas dish champinones al ajillo (garlic mushrooms), as well as being used to make stews, soups and croquettes.

Top five wild Spanish mushrooms

1. Amanita caesarea: Commonly known as Caesar's mushroom, this prized fungi is easily the most expensive on the market and foragers can charge as much as €120 a kilo. It is prized in the culinary world for its bright orange colour and soft texture. Renowned Spanish chef Ferran Adria was known to use it to make fluorescent mousses.

2. Niscalo (Lactarius deliciosus): Commonly found in Mediterranean pine forests, this flavourful mushroom can also reach a high price in markets but is worth the price. It's known as the 'saffron milk cap' in English as it oozes a reddish-orange liquid when bruised or cut.

3. Boleto del Pino (Boletus pinophilus): This popular mushroom is known for its sweet taste and can be recognised by its white or creamy brown cap and thick stem.

- 4. Rebozuelo (Cantharellus cibarius): This yellow, trumpet shaped 'shroom can be found in woods where pine, chestnut or oak trees grow. It can be eaten raw, but also goes great in stews or with meat dishes.
- 5. Seta de Cardo (Pleorutus eryngii): Considered one of the tastiest mushrooms out there and highly prized in the mushroom community. Studies have suggested that this species may also have therapeutic properties and could help to reduce cholesterol.





TWO bar owners have been accused of treating two Indian employees as modern day slaves. The waitresses at the Palma bar claim they worked 17-hour days and were sexually humiliated.

year sentence for recruiting Islamic terrorists in Spain to travel to Syria to fight for Daesh and commit suicide attacks. The 40-year-old was resident in Ceuta but was transferred to Palma to serve his time.

Despite being subjected to a strict prison regime, Abdeselam managed to scrawl Islamist graffiti and draw a Daesh flag in the prison yard. He has just a few hours of yard time per day, always under surveillance.

On this occasion two other prisoners were in the yard. It is unclear whether they played any part in providing him with the contraband tools. The graffiti he wrote on the walls read 'There is no god but Allah,'

and 'Muhammad is the prophet of Allah.'

Abdeselam has spent four years in Palma prison, typically in strict isolation. He was arrested with seven other jihadists in Ceuta, who have been sent to different Spanish prisons.

Recently, he complained about the hygiene conditions in his prison cell.

Direct control in place

WHILST it could be very tempting not to return to the Catalan problem, it is the most important piece of recent

With article 155 actually in place and most of the Catalan cabinet dismissed, the Public Prosecutor has said that he wishes to charge a number of the politicians with rebellion, sedition and misuse of public funds, which would certainly see them imprisoned if found guilty.

During an interview, Foreign Minister Alfonso Dastis confirmed that a new election for the Catalan Parliament which will be held on December 21 would be managed by a special electoral committee and that assuming former president Carles Puigdemont was eligible (not in jail) then he would be free to stand.

In the meantime, after leaving a recorded message of defiance, Mr Puigdemont reportedly fled to Brussels with members of his former cabinet as they may be offered political asylum by the Belgian Secretary of State for Immigration and Asylum.

Slowly but inexorably, the Madrid government is taking over the running of Cataluña and at the moment only the Catalan Speaker's Committee which is 'standing in' for the dismissed government is immune from prosecution until the December elections.

One unexpected result of article 155 is that Spaniards all over the country have clamoured to buy lottery tickets ending in that number.

Leaving on a jetplane

AFTER almost four decades of whisking holidaymakers to Mallorca, Air Berlin has flown its last flight. Once Germany's second-largest airline, its maiden flight was from Berlin to Palma in April 1979.

After years of making unsustainable losses, the firm filed for bankruptcy in August. Dozens of office workers in Palma are waiting to hear about their future.

A domestic journey between Berlin and Munich on Friday was the last under the AB flight code.

British carrier easyJet is buying 24 Air Berlin planes and will also absorb some 1,000 jobs as part of a takeover. The sale is yet to be approved, however, by EU competition judges in Brussels

DRAGONERA'S marine reserve must be extended to protect endangered species, urged Balearic environmentalist group

The activists have requested that the Balearic executive apply pressure on Madrid to secure approval for their proposed expansion.

Rare bird species and fish stocks remain threatened after years of fishing and other human activity before the reserve was created in 2016.

But GOB scientists argue that, without expanding the protected area, the indigenous fauna stand little chance of making a much-needed recovery.

They want more areas to the north and west of the famous island to be granted protection. Any such plan needs the approval of the Spanish national government, which reserves control over coastal policies.

Unfortunately for the environmental group, the Balearic executive and Spanish government are already at loggerheads over Madrid's desire to drill for oil in Mallorca's waters.

Sacked Catalan leader flees country

EX-CATALAN leader Carles Puigdemont faces up to 45 years in prison if he fails to appear before the Spanish government.

Following a vote by the Spanish Senate backing the decision to impose direct rule on Cataluña, Prime Minister Mariano Rajov sacked the leader of the Catalan Parliament and dismissed the rest of his cabinet.

After declaring Cataluña's independence, Puigdemont fled to Belgium as Spanish prosecutors called for him to show his face in Madrid to face charges of rebellion and sedition, punishable by up to 30 years and 15 years in prison respectively.

He ignored orders to return to Spain and claimed he would not go back until he was guaranteed a fair trial. while his lawyer suggested that he could testify from Brussels.

Puigdemont chose to flee to Belgium with several members of his cabinet to seek political asylum. Theo Francken, Belgium's immigration minister, had previously suggested that it was not "unrealistic" for Puigdemont to be granted protection.

Puigdemont later denied that he had fled to seek asylum, but claimed he had left "for safety purposes." He also declared he would accept the results of the snap regional elections called by Rajov for December.

However, if he refuses to return to Spain, the court could issue an arrest warrant which would make it impossible for him to run for re-election.

Belgium's Prime Minister Charles Michel also revealed that an asylum request was "absolutely not on the agenda" and claimed the ex-Catalan leader would be treated the same as any other European citizen.

Tension goes on

FOLLOWING the fallout of the controversial Catalan independence referendum on October 1, Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy and his government voted to invoke article 155 to suspend Cataluña's powers and remove Carles Puigdemont and his cabinet from gov-

Rajoy then announced new regional elections will be held on December 21.

Puigdemont refused to call regional elections himself or appear in front of the Spanish parliament to explain his actions and instead declared Cataluña's independence from Spain.

Spain's attorney general then called for charges of rebellion and sedition to be brought against 14 cabinet members accused of coordinating the independence movement, who are due to appear in court on Thursday and Friday.

PIRATE taxis have retaken Palma airport, claims the association of independent taxi drivers. Association president Biel Moragues said that the unregulated taxis have returned en masse since September, after being forced out by police over summer.

Balearic transport minister Jaume Mateu has conceded that the pirate problem has returned after tougher attitudes saw 80 per cent of them vanish in May.

Scuffles broke out between taxi drivers and their unlicensed competitors during an airport protest on May 25.

Authorities admit that the airport is a 'weak point' in the battle against pirate

> taxis. Minister Mateu has pledged to hold a meeting with police and drivers to eradicate the problem during 2018.

But Moragues is sceptical, arguing that collaboration between drivers and Local Police has left a lot to be desired. He wants more on the spot inspections and warned that tensions will be especially high at Easter, unless the problem is resolved.

With record tourist numbers taxi drivers had nevertheless had

a good summer, he said. Most of the drivers he represents earned enough to last them over the low season without much hardship.

Record busting budget

A BUDGET of more than €5 billion has been approved for the Balearic Islands next year. The regional executive will now put the budget before parliament, expected to pass the bill without delay.

It represents a €340 million increase on 2017's budget, equating to a 7.3 per cent rise, the highest annual jump in Balearic history. Since the Socialist PSOE and Mes per Mallorca coalition took office in 2016, the budget has already gone up by €768 million.

Regional accountants are predicting that the Balearic economy will grow by a healthy 3.5 per cent next year, above the Spanish aver-

Balearic begin paying off its debt, estimated at more than €8 billion.

Healthcare is the single biggest projected expenditure with more than €1.5 billion put aside. Almost €1 billion will go to education, while transport, housing, social services and environmental projects make up the bulk of the rest.

Road revamp gets serious

ALMOST €10 million will be spent on renovating Palma's pavements and streets. City infrastructure councillor Rodrigo Romero said the investment will be spread over the next two

The €9.8 million represents a substantial increase on Palma's typical spending on road repairs. The extra €2 million per year will be used to asphalt the Playa de Plama promenade and other key streets.

Car parks, pavements, and drainage systems will also be markedly improved with the funding, said Romero. The extra money will provide contractors with more 'agility' to work around unexpected problems, he claimed.

The number of vehicles registered 32,106,520 in Spain at present according to traffic sources.

Despite the budget increase, Romero admits that it is likely not enough to meet all the city's road infrastructure needs. A decade ago city administrators calculated that €5 million per year was needed. Since then expenses have grown.

The city is now working on creating a digital map of all of Palma's streets. Those in need of urgent maintenance will be highlighted and a long-term plan drawn up to modernise the





Island's melting pot

NEW statistics published by Palma Council provide an insight into the city's demographic make-up. Argentinians are now Palma's single largest expatriate group.

There are 11,652 Argentines registered with the town hall. Germans are second with 8,040 nationals on the city books. Colombians, Ecuadoreans, Bulgarians, Romanians and Moroccans make up the bulk of the rest of Palma's foreign residents.

The findings show that roughly a quarter of Palma's 434,516 registered citizens are foreign nationals. In Cala Major the figure is almost half, at 45.5 per cent, with residents from more than two dozen countries.

In total there are 182 nationalities in the city. Demographics are constantly shifting with more Africans and South Americans now leaving than arriving, while the numbers of Italians and Romanians rise quickly.

Horse hurray

Bylaw says neigh to heatwave pain

HORSES carting tourists around Palma won't have to suffer through heatwaves. A new bylaw set to be applied in the city will govern the

working hours and conditions of 'galeras,' horse-drawn carriages.

Experts have been consulted to suggest at what point it is too hot for the horses to work safely. They will advise on when the horses should be

returned to the stables, and how many hours per week they should work.

The move comes amid a growing swell of opposition to the very existence of the carriages. Complaints from the public and animal rights

groups have more than doubled in the past year.

Snap inspections are also now being carried out on the request of animal rights groups. More than 5,000 signatures have now been gathered by AnimaNaturalis for their #StopGaleras petition to replace horse-drawn carriages with electric coaches.

The town hall has rejected demands to ban the carriages outright. But it has pledged not to issue any new licences so that the practice

can be phased out gradually. Councillors are onboard with the plan to replace carriages with electric vehicles.

AnimaNaturalis have accepted that all 28 city carriages cannot be replaced by electric coaches overnight. But leader Guillem Amengual pointed out that the idea was first floated three years ago and that countless horses had been exploited and injured while new laws were being developed.



Horse hobbling ban enforced

GUARDIA CIVIL officers are clamping down on the mistreatment of horses in Spain and horse hob-

Horse hobbling is the practice of tethering one of more legs to allow

a horse to graze and move short and slow distances, yet prevent the horse from running off too far. But frequently the tethers can tighten around the limb and cause injury.

Legislation outlawing the practice

in Spain was introduced in 2015 with fines of up to €10,000 for first-time offenders. Repeat offenders face a life-time ban from keeping horses. The Guardia Civil's environmental branch, Seprona, is

now appealing for the public to contact them by calling 062 if they see cases of horses being mistreated.

They say, "To mistreat the animals is a bad and cowardly act. The old traditions must be stopped."

Holiday horror

Insect bite sparks two-year battle for life of British dad



'I ALMOST DIED': Mark and wife Yvette.

A HOLIDAYMAKER from Liverpool who almost died after being bitten by sandflies on the Costa del Sol is on the road to recovery.

It comes in the wake of a two-year battle during which doctors were unable to diagnose what was causing 46-year-old Mark Russell's muscles to waste away, with kidney stones blamed at one

But the father-of-one had in fact contracted a blood disease normally confined to the tropics during a 2014 Malaga break with wife Yvette and their 16-year-old son.

In an interview with local media he said: "Everyday, I didn't know what was going on and neither did the consultants.

"I had to be so strong - sometimes I thought I was going to die. I was weeing into a pot as I couldn't get out of bed, I was that weak.

"It's the worst nightmare imaginable, I wouldn't wish this on my biggest enemy."

Having lost more than three stone in weight and being forced to spend months off work, he was cured after being transferred from Arrowe Park Hospital near his home on the Wirral, Merseyside, to the Royal Liverpool University

Once there, experts from Liverpool Universi-

ty's School of Tropical Medicine were able to identify the cause of the funeral care worker's illness as visceral leishmaniasis, a potentially lifethreatening condition caused by a parasite.

Nick Beeching, a senior lecturer at the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine, said: "Mark developed a prolonged fever and became very

"Eventually, he was diagnosed and we looked at it under the microscope and could see the parasites causing the fever.

"We started Mark on a toxic treatment. He tolerated that okay but, soon after, he had a relapse so we gave him a longer course of treatment which was very successful.

"He now looks a different man, he's put the weight back on and has regained his energy."

The affliction is mainly confined to the tropics but there are occasional cases in the Mediterranean, and if untreated can be lethal.

Mark added: "I was off work for six months and it took two years to get me back to full fit-

"I suffered a lot of muscle wastage and looked like someone with cancer.

"And the emotional side was very tough - I didn't know what was going to happen to me.

"It's been a long road to get that parasitic disease out of my system."

This news means that there will be more help and assistance for those affected with Butterfly Skin in Spain and there is the possibility that new treatments and even a cure may be found in time.

An official ceremony at the La Paz Children's Hospital in Madrid formally announced this news in the presence of health specialists, Princess Elena of Spain, Nieves Montero an architect from Marbella who is President of the Spanish Association of EB Debra-Butterfly Children Charity alongside sufferers and their families.

Princess Elena in her role as project Director of the Mapfre Foundation has been collaborating with the charity via the 'Donate a Euro' campaign involving more than 4,600 employees of Mapfre to help raise muchneeded funds.

It is believed that the establishment of these reference centres will not only help to highlight the needs of the children but will also lead in the long term to an extension of knowledge in how to treat the condition and bring some relief to those who suffer from its awful effects.

According to the CMA as many of 70 per cent of UK residents looking to make hotel bookings do compare options on the various websites and should there be any evidence that consumers are being misled then action will be taken.

Having contacted hotel groups and websites, the watchdog also wants to hear from the general public about their experiences with these sites.

One area of particular interest is

whether sites ignore criteria entered by those searching for hotels and respond with lists of those hotels where they receive the greatest com-

Another area of interest is the accuracy surrounding the number of rooms still available in a particular hotel as there is some fear that the numbers may be manipulated in order to encourage immediate booking.

One early conclusion is that those searching websites for hotel availability should check with more than one site to ensure the best available deal.

ECB decision and Catalan concerns drive euro




FOR the last few weeks central bank speculation and political developments have been the driving force behind currency movement.

EUR/GBP: Up from £0.87 to £0.90 EUR/USD: Up from \$1.16 to \$1.18

Although the euro has been pressured by political tensions in Cataluña and uncertainty about the path the European Central Bank (ECB) will take with fiscal policy, the common currency has still managed to strengthen against both the pound and US dollar over the last four weeks.

The euro was kept on its toes as the Catalonian populace voted overwhelmingly for independence, igniting fears for Spain's economic outlook. However, with Madrid refusing to sanction a split, EUR exchange rates recovered losses.

Hopes that the European Central Bank (ECB) would taper its quantitative easing scheme also bolstered the euro - right up until investors found

out that the central bank was scaling down its programme, but running it for longer. The move inspired some EUR losses as October drew to a

The repercussions from the ECB decision are likely to remain a cause of euro movement over the next few weeks. Any significant developments in Cataluña are also liable to spark EUR

GRP/EUR: Down from €1.14 to €1.12 **GBP/USD:** Down from \$1.34 to \$1.32

The pound was knocked around a fair bit during October. The British currency swiftly dropped from September's highs as Brexit negotiations ended in deadlock - potentially delaying discussions about the UK's future trading relationship with the EU. A string of less-than-impressive UK ecostats (including concerning services and retail sales stats) also kept the pound under pressure.

However, towards the end of October the UK's third quarter growth data was published. The data showed quarterly growth of 0.4 per cent, slightly better than the expected rate of 0.3 per cent. As the result was viewed as upping the odds of the Bank of England (BoE) increasing interest rates at its November policy meeting, GBP exchange rates were able to recover some of their recent losses.

The BoE rate decision is liable to be the biggest cause of pound volatility in the month ahead. A rate hike would lift GBP, while the decision to leave policy unchanged would weaken Sterling.

USD/GBP: Up from £0.74 to £0.76 USD/EUR: Fluctuating between €0.84 and €0.85

While expectations for a December rate hike from the Federal Reserve have been lending the US dollar support, USD gains have been limited by the debate over who President Donald Trump will appoint as Chairman of the Federal Reserve. A Chairman who is likely to increase the pace or size of interest rate adjustments would boost the US dollar, while a dovish President could send USD sliding

The December Federal Reserve decision is edging ever closer but as long as upcoming US releases keep the odds of a December rate hike high, USD will remain sturdy.

MORE GOVERNMENT MONEY TO BE COMMITTED Spain wants electric cars

THE Spanish government is to spend a further €50 million to support the widespread introduction of electric charging points and to encourage drivers to purchase electric cars.

This decision has been made despite the fact that a previous effort to assist purchasers of environmentally friendly vehicles was spoiled by the Volkswagen diesel emission scandal.

Of the money now due to be made available, €30 million will be put towards the introduction of more electric charging points which are almost nonexistent in many parts of Spain as well as supporting additional research and development

The balance of €20 million is expected to be paid to motorists in the form of 'cash backs' or discounts from manufacturers' price when purchasing a new electric car or one that uses a propulsion system that is not oil based.

This new initiative which is expected to be in addition to €50 million previously agreed by government for expenditure in the second half of 2017 has been championed by the Ministry of

Energy, Tourism and Digital Agenda and is expected to be managed by the Institute for Energy Diversification and Saving (IDAE).

This whole enterprise is quite different to previous funding plans as it will be managed by IDEA rather than Tragsa - which is associated with the Ministry of Agriculture - and whereas the previous campaign looked to persuade car owners to swop their old vehicles for more fuel and environmentally friendly oil driven cars, this

campaign will only apply to vehicles which use alternative energy.

As the world moves to develop vehicles driven by electric power and in some cases liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) the current option of hybrid vehicles continues to be a major leader in environmentally friendly motoring and will remain so until such time as electric car batteries can hold much greater charges and can be topped up quickly.

It will be very difficult to persuade drivers to give up their gas guzzlers in exchange for a vehicle which has a range of less than 300 kilometres and could take hours to recharge.

SEAT will be cooperating with the entire Volkswagen Group in order to try to find a workable solution and a small Spanish manufacturer Velantur has been trying to launch its four seater electric luxury sports car which it hopes will have a range of 400 kilometres.

Tesla continues to increase the charges of their batteries but unless it is quick, cheap and easy to recharge an electric vehicle, then the entire concept could turn into a disaster.

Royal Mint takes a pounding

WITH companies around Britain furious about the short time allowed for the changeover between the old and new pound coins, many are still accepting them as legal tender.

Councils who have not changed their parking machines to take the new pound are under fire from drivers and associations as they are fining anyone parking without a valid ticket. even though many have disposed of their old round pounds.

Gibraltar has taken the step of demonetising British round pounds but is continuing to allow Gibraltar round pounds to be considered legal tender on the Rock as the company they use to mint their pound coins has simply not been able to obtain blanks from the Royal Mint.

MONARCH SHAREHOLDERS ADMIT MORAL DUTY

May pay charter costs

lines have confirmed that they have a moral duty to help repay £60 million (€68 million) spent by the tax payer.

Greybull Capital have written to the UK Transport Committee confirming that it would be prepared to assist in paying some of the repatriation costs involved in bringing more than 100,000 people back to the UK if it makes a profit when the liquidation is finalised.

The British government chartered aircraft at short notice to bring back stranded Monarch passengers in what is believed to be the largest ever peacetime repatriation and picked up all of the costs.

The private investment company was responding to an observation made by Chris Grayling, the Minister for Transport with regards to the morality of the situation should Greybull - which is Monarch's main secured creditor - actually make a profit from the closure of the airline.

In the event that the court confirms that the rights can be sold to the highest bidder, certain of the rights to the more valuable slots could raise a significant amount of money, the bulk of which would be due to Greybull Capi-

If there was to be a 'bidding frenzy' then in theory, the main investor could has confirmed that in such a scenario it would channel such profits back to the UK government as part repayment for the money spent on chartering the air-

In its letter to the Transport Committee, Greybull maintained that whilst sorry for the closure it had been doing all that it could since 2014 when it obtained the majority of shares in the airline - to try to stave off bankruptcy but was unsuccessful.

Apart from the inconvenience and in many cases financial loss suffered by passengers who may never receive their payments back, more than 2,000 Monarch staff have lost their jobs.

The other possible assets of the former airline will be their aircraft, although many have been leased rather than paid for outright and it may well be that the administrators will be unable to raise any funds from them and in fact depending on lease contracts, there may be a significant liability.

More steel production in the USA

THE steel manufacturer Acerinox has invested \$150 million (€129 million) to launch a new production line in its North American Stainless (NAS) plant in Kentucky.

The introduction of this new plant will increase capacity of the American subsidiary of the Spanish manufacturer by 10 per cent and allow it to increase the range of different stainless steel products that it can offer, including a range that is produced with a glossy finish.

Currently producing half of all US stainless steel, it believes that the days of cheap Chinese imports are gone and that the market can only increase for the high quality locally rolled steel that it manufactures.

The main markets for the company's products are situated within a nine-hour drive from the factory which employs more than 1,000 local

This year's cybercrime estimate is €2.5 trillion worldwide, but very little of it is from online shopping.

Trusted payment methods like credit/debit cards or Pay-Pal take the sleepless nights out of buying online. And if you're worried about an online retailer's reputation, so are they in these days of buyer review overload.

The better retailers are on rating sites like Trustpilot. When an order of mine disappeared into a Hong Kong void recently, my critique on that site quickly got my cash

Just be careful not to overdo it. It really is time to stop shopping online when the computer asks if you need another shopping cart.

TERENCE KENNEDY offers up the online shopper's prayer: 'Dear Lord, please don't let my wife be home when all my online orders arrive.'

Shop till your computer drops

AN older friend who doesn't 'do' the internet just gave a local travel agent nearly €400 for air tickets I found online for €89. Frankly I was amazed travel agents still exist.

Yes, doing stuff online can be risky, especially when a Nigerian prince offers you untold riches. But squadrillions of online transactions occur every day with barely a hitch, and by 2025 the majority of the world's retail trade will apparently happen online. So there.

Why then, like our overcharged dinosaur friend, wouldn't you do it? London department store Harrods used to advertise you could buy anything from an elephant to a safety-pin; these days with watertight security Amazon, China's Alibaba and eBay sell more in a second than Harrods could in a year.

Including elephants.

Hunt for an offbeat item in your local shops and you could be at it for days. Find it online in just seconds, have it delivered to your door the next day. Or perhaps in an hour if Amazon's current drone delivery tests work out.

The main objections are fraud and identity theft. Yes they do happen, but the percentage is minuscule, and if you use a plastic card your bank covers most of your risk anyhow if things go pear-shaped.

The bad news for online-shopping virgins is that they soon won't have any choice: from tax declarations to newsagents' top-shelf magazines, everything's moving online for better or worse.

Worse, certainly, for traditional

bricks-and-mortar retailers, whose plight has even added a new word to the Oxford dictionary, 'showrooming': the practice of examining and fondling a product in a physical shop before going home to order it more cheaply online.

It was an album by Sting which is said to have launched online shopping back in 1994, say the (online!) histories. By next year online shopping will be nearly 9 per cent of all retail sales (but 18 per cent for the world's most enthusiastic eshoppers, the Brits). Seven out of every 10 internet users in Spain shop online, spending around €1,100 each a year.

The bad news for our reluctant buddy is that it's unstoppable and that, inevitably, even he is going to have to bite the bullet (also available online). Within his lifetime only those enterprises which cannot easily sell through what he calls the 'Interweb' will be left standing, like convenience stores, bars, bistros and brothels. And perhaps elephant traders.

As for his happy travel agent? Most likely she will have followed the clever advice I once saw pasted up in a travel agent's window: 'Please go away!'

WHY does everything have to be so difficult? I mean things start off simple then everything goes downhill. I receive a UK pension which, thanks to Brexit, dropped by 20 per cent-ish just after the announcement. So gawd knows what will happen when the UK actually does leave the EU.

Anyway, somebody told me that, as I'd had my own business here in Spain and had paid into their system, I may be entitled to a small pension here too. Now, as you all know, nothing here is going to go the way you hope. You can't just call an office, give your social security number, and hope that someone says 'Oh yeah, we will sort that for you.'

I had to make an appointment at my local social security office and take a load of completed and duplicated forms. You all know the form filling procedures here so I won't bore you. That done I turn up for my appointment and a very helpful young man tells me yes I am entitled to a Spanish pension. He explained that all they have to do

is write to the UK pension office to confirm a couple of things and 'Roberto es tu tio' (Bob's your uncle!). I'm told it will take a couple of weeks or so.

Well, a couple of weeks came and went and we were well into the 'or so' territory as I originally went in June and it's now November. On Tuesday I went back to the Spanish social security office to see what was going on. I hadn't made an appointment so I had to wait for an hour and a half for them to tell me that they hadn't heard back from the UK pension office.

Next I phone the UK office and after pressing 1 for this, 2 for that, 4 for something else, 5 for losing the will to live, I finally get through and tell them Spain is waiting for a couple of bits of information. They tell me they haven't been sent yet because they are very busy! 'Oh, I'm pleased to hear that. I'd hate for you to be sitting around twiddling your thumbs.

But, do you not appreciate that some people depend on their pensions to live and waiting six months for two forms to be sent back is not acceptable.' I'm told they will mark it urgent and get them sent as soon as possible. Let's see.

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Checking your details at the roadside

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



AS they go about their duties patrolling the roads of Spain, the Guardia Civil traffic police have a whole range of tools in their arsenal to both help those in need, and of course deal with those drivers who break the law.

One piece of kit carried by all of the officers, often stored in the panniers of their motorbikes, or inside the patrol cars, is their Personal Digital Assistant, or PDA. The device is linked via Bluetooth to a thermal printer, and so able to issue fines on the spot, and pools its data with the central office of the DGT traffic department.

The PDA can be used to check driver and vehicle details, such as if you are actually qualified to drive, if you've been banned, if you own the vehicle you are driving, and details about that vehicle and its insurance.

The whole process of checking the informa-

tion is almost instantaneous, but it can take a lot longer if the information provided by the driver is either inaccurate, or unknown.

One particular problem facing foreign drivers is when they are not registered as residents in Spain, or have not transferred their licence to a Spanish one.

For those who have, you are likely to be sent on your way a lot quicker than those with no registered details, as a single check of a driver's NIE number links all of the relevant driver and vehicle details together, and so the officers can almost instantly find the information they are looking to confirm.

However, when the information is not linked, such as for drivers who haven't swapped to a Spanish licence, then the process takes a lot longer to complete, and your journey is likely to be increasingly delayed as a result.

Do I need a Spanish driving licence?

After recent confusion over the legality of driving in Spain on a UK licence, the Directorate General of Traffic has now clarified the full letter of the law concerning this complex matter.

I am a British resident in Spain. Do I need a Spanish driving licence by law?

If you are the holder of a Group 1 licence (AM, A1, A2, A, B and BE) with a period of validity greater than 15 years - and this includes permanent licences - or a Group 2 licence (BTP, C1, C1E, C, CE D1, D1E, D, DE) with a period of validity greater than five years, then you must exchange the licence for a Spanish equivalent once you have been resident in Spain for two years.

If you are the holder of a

standard UK 10-year photo licence you do NOT need to exchange the licence for a Spanish equivalent until it expires, although you CAN do so voluntarily at any time.

However, if you are resident in Spain and your driving licence expires then you MUST renew it for a Spanish licence.

In a recent Legally Speaking Column article in EWN Issue 1683 some information given by David Searl on this topic led to social media users publishing contradictory views, some of those additionally incorrect.

Confusion over a long period according to the Directorate of Traffic has arisen due to various translations into English as to the law as outlined in Spanish.

The EWN - as a responsible newspaper - in publishing the above report, believes this to be an accurate translation and interpretation in English of what the law states in Spanish.

THE small, green western Canary Islands of La Gomera, El Hierro and La Palma are quiet at the moment. You can hear a collective sigh of relief that the late summer visitors have all gone.

There's time to relax, play dominoes and cards and enjoy the all-important tertulia, or social chat. Stories of the noisy, demanding, rubbish-tossing summer tourists from the other islands, and comparisons with the quieter visitors from northern countries, including the UK. who'll arrive soon abound. This annual conversation is traditional. after our short dose of mass tourism. Small island Canarians prefer nature-loving Northern European visitors because the local. summer visitors' mass tourism attitudes and habits impact negatively, while the winter visitors' don't.

Locals from the bigger islands of Tenerife, Lanzarote, Fuerteventura and Gran Canaria wouldn't agree that Northern Europeans are lower impact, because their northern tourists are different and

often of the dreaded shag and vomit sector. Puce-coloured drunks in 'Good Boys Go to Heaven, Bad Boys Go to Tenerife' t-shirts, bottle in hand, screaming obscenities as local families hurry past, spring to mind. This untruth leads to frustration at all levels, but more importantly, CACA tourism's responsible for accelerating the deterioration of local environments, both natural and cultural, nearly everywhere it exists. The tourism boom on the Spanish mainland and islands over the last few years has bolstered bank accounts, but exacerbated already glaring infrastructure-overload problems, which need addressing now. If the vast Atlantic's suffering, imagine the state of the Med.

A summer of scandals, political ostriching, infighting and lying about the effects of pumping uncontrolled toxic residues into the sea around the Canaries, together with an invasion of strange, residue-feasting microalga which closed beaches at a sensitive time, raise important questions, not only about our disregard for the planet, but also about the ethos of tourism and how we can change it for the better.

Flu

WHAT are the symptoms of flu?

The flu is an infection in the respiratory system caused by a virus that can bring about several symptoms that do not necessarily appear at the same time.

In general a person suffering from the flu will have a cough, fever, pains in their muscles and extremities, feel run down, tiredness, loss of appetite and lack of energy. These symptoms can last several days.

A person usually recovers gradually over a few days, however for some it can take several weeks before they are fully recovered.

How can you treat it?

Usually the best course of treatment is to take medication to manage the symptoms along with rest and plenty of hydration. In more severe cases antiviral or antibiotic medication may be required to deal with the virus.

Should I seek medical

help?

It is recommended that you see your doctor for an initial evaluation so they can refer you to specialists or to take further tests if they are necessary.

When would it be advisable to get a flu jab?

The vaccination campaigns tend to start in autumn and it is recommended that you get the jab especially if you have a high risk of catching the flu. The elderly and those suffering from chronic illnesses are also advised to get vaccinated.

Are there people who are vulnerable to the virus?

People over the age of 65 are more likely to get the flu, and to suffer more seriously from it. Anyone with respiratory illnesses such as Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease or asthma, or other chronic illnesses such as diabetes and those suffering from cancer are the most vulnerable to the virus.

Ask the Optician:

What are the most common problems with eyesight?

THE most common vision problems are refractive errors, more commonly known as nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism and presbyopia. Most people have one or more of these conditions. In this column we wanted to explain what they mean and how can they be corrected.

■ What is myopia/short sight and how can it be corrected?

A person with myopia or short sight can see objects close to them clearly, but not far away. Myopia is caused by the shape of the eye; either the eyeball is slightly too long or the cornea is too steeply curved. Myopia is corrected by spectacles or contact lenses with lenses which are 'minus' or concave in shape.

■ What is hyperopia/hypermetropia/long sight and how can it be corrected?

A person with long sight can see objects far away from them clearly, but not those close by. This is caused by the shape of the eye - the eyeball is slightly too short. It is corrected by spectacles or contact lenses with lenses which are 'plus' or convex in shape.


■ What is astigmatism and how can it be

People with astigmatism have an unevenly curved cornea or an unevenly curved lens inside their eye, shaped more like a rugby ball than a football. It is corrected by spectacles with a cylinder shape built into the lenses at a certain angle. Contact lenses can also correct astigmatism mild astigmatism can be corrected by an ordinary gas-permeable lens. Those who prefer a soft lens or have higher amounts of astigmatism can use specially designed, 'toric' soft lenses.

■ What is presbyopia?

As a person ages, so do their eyes. The crystalline lenses become thicker and less flexible, resulting in a condition called presbyopia. People often begin to notice its effects during their 40's - as a result of these changes, objects closer to them become blurred and the point of closest focus gradually moves further away from the





He was bequeathed one of the UK's most powerful property firms, the aptly-named Grosvenor. Through it he controls extremely valuable properties in London's plush Mayfair and Belgravia neighbourhoods.

Now the firm has snapped up three prestigious properties in Madrid. The most recent was in the wealthy Chamberi area and is a large former commercial headquarters that Grosvenor plans to convert into 'exclusive' flats.

"We want to have a bigger presence

in Spain", said Fatima Saez del Cano, director of Grosvenor Europe in Spain, so "we have decided to invest in the residential sector to develop exclusive housing projects.

"We love the neighbourhood of Chamberi. We believe it is the one with the most future," she added. "They are not luxury homes, we are looking for exclusive and special hous-

Similar projects are expected to crop up across the Spanish capital in the near future. The Grosvenor group has at least €70 million worth of funds ready to invest in Spain.

Hugh Grosvenor, whose family fortune stretches back to 1677, personally owns the La Garganta estate in Ciudad Real, a sprawling 15,000 hectare site often used for hunting by British aris-

Luxury bubble bursts

A LUXURY housing crisis has added to Cataluña's political woes. A report from real estate company Barnes International argues that the wealthy region's luxury housing market experienced a bubble in the past two

But concerningly for owners of €1 million plus properties in Barcelona and other areas, that bubble has burst and it is now a buyers' market.

The report concludes that although 'the Catalan luxury real estate sector was performing at its best level since the economic crisis, prices have seen a strong downwards trend in recent months.'

Founding partner of Barnes Spain, Emmanuel Virgoulay, said "In the past two years Cataluña's luxury housing mar-

"There will always be investors interested in Cataluña,

so the market will not collapse in the way businesses can, such as Lehman Brothers in 2008," Virgoulay said.

He also noted that the rental sector is continuing to witness sharp price increases despite the political crisis.



ATTRACTING birds to your garden is easy if you have the right plants that will provide water, food, shelter and protection from predators.

Birds do best in gardens with multiple storeys of plants from ground covers, shrubs as under storeys to taller tree canopies as an upper storey.

Providing water in the dry months in safe places for birds to drink is the sure way to have birds attracted to your garden. A steady, reliable source of water is a primary need, even more than food, if other sources of water are not near-

If you provide water, birds will visit regularly, if you provide food plants, they will stay longer and if you provide safe shelter as well, native birds may start to nest in your garden. Migratory birds will only visit but are more likely to visit if you have a food source as well as water.

There are many plants that can provide food for the birds. As different bird species have different requirements of seed. nectar or insects, a variety of

different plants are needed to attract the bird species you wish to support in your garden.

The best way to provide food is to use a lot of native plants and have a wild zone for allowing naturally occurring non-invasive native plants -

even the plants considered weeds in the ornamental and vegetable garden - to go through their full life cycle. Many plants considered weeds are useful plants for birds to

feed on for the flowers nectar and seeds

Birds usually prefer to arrive onto the upper storey to survey a garden for food and dangers before entering and different species build their nests in the upper storey for safety from ground based predators.

Each bird species have different needs, however, so many smaller birds will look for nesting places in the under storey that have dense thickets that prevent larger predators to enter. So to attract a wide

range of birds having a wide range of plants that give good protection is important for di-

Plants that provide nectar include Sages (Salvia species), Grevillea species, Torch lilies (Kniphofia species), Lobelia species, Penstemon species, Verbena species, Sunflowers (Helianthus), Thyme (Thymus species), Lavender (Lavendula species), Honeysuckle (Lonicera species), Ice Plant (Sedum species), Firethorn (Pyracantha species) and Barberry (Berberis species).

Seed plants include Sunflower (Helianthus species), Coneflower (Echinacea species), Aster species, Zinnea species, Cumin (Cuminum species), Calendula species and many others

Attracting birds can just be a matter of widening the range of plants that you normally grow which may provide even more interest to your garden as many bird food plants are very attractive.

Hedges and thickets of plants will provide safe nesting places for smaller birds and tall trees can have nesting boxes installed to make trees a ready made nesting place. Applying natural mulches around your garden will help birds find materials to build the

There is a wide variety of birds that live in the Mediterranean zone and if you make your garden more attractive for them, you can enjoy their presence in your garden.

Good neighbours

WHILE many people arrange their garden on what they think looks best, it is actually more beneficial to put plants that actually help each other out beside one another.

In the gardening community, this is known as 'companion planting' and it can have a big impact on the health and vitality of your garden.

Companion planting is all about achieving a good balance, and it can even help reduce the amount of pest or disease control spray you need to

By introducing more plants that repel unwanted bugs, or attract larger insects to eat the pests, this can help protect your garden without overloading it with chemicals.

It is even possible to create plant 'communities.' Certain species enhance each other's growth rate by distributing extra nutrients into the soil or by offering protection from the sun

If you have limited space in your garden, adding plants that grow at

different rates can also help you to maximise potential.

One of the most popular 'companion planting' combinations is rose and garlic, as garlic is believed to repel aphids and other pests.

Nasturtium and cabbage also work well together as nasturtiums attracts caterpillars so they won't ravage the cabbage leaves.

CHOCOLATE made for human consumption can cause death in dogs. Dogs are sensitive to a class of chemicals called methylxanthines. Caffeine and theobtomine are members of that family. Dogs simply cannot metabolise and excrete methylxanthines as efficiently as humans. The half-life of those compounds in the human body is in the order of two to three hours, in a dog it is more like 18 hours.

In a dog the compounds are taken up by the liver and transmitted via the bile into the intestine. They are then converted back into the original methylxanthines for another circuit through the animal. This repeats itself a number of

times and instead of getting rid of the substances a dog keeps repoisoning it-

There are many formulations of chocolate with varying amounts of caffeine and theobromine. The lethal dose of sweet milk chocolate for a dog is 2oz per kilogram of bodyweight. For a five

kilogram dog this would be about 280 grams. A lethal dose of milk chocolate for a 25 kilogram, would be about 1.4 kilograms

Dark chocolate is at least 10 times as lethal. A 25 kilograms dog could die from the methylxanthines in five hyperactivity, restlessness, hypersensitivity to touch (a dog will jump when touched), very rapid heartbeat and rapid breathing rate. A loss of control of leg muscles, muscle tremor seizures, general weakness, coma and finally death follow.

Symptoms include vomiting,



Permanent moorings may be lost

A DECISION by the Balearic Ports Authority means that 667 moorings in Mallorca have to be renewed by the end of the year or holders run the risk of losing them.

The reason for this is that the Authority wants to identify the number of permanent moorings that are actually required before deciding whether to increase the number of moorings allowed island-wide and if they are not needed then that may make mooring waiting lists

shorter.

Whilst this applies to the majority of permanent title holders in Mallorca, owners in Puerto Soller are most affected as all 335 owners have to confirm their intention to remain or risk having to take their chance of a mooring on a visitors or temporary basis.

This means that even those with several years left on the leases will still have to apply to renew or will automatically lose their existing rights.

Spanish Cup attracts Mallorcan sailors

SIX crews from the Club Nautic s'Arenal will be competing in the 2017 Spanish Cup for class 420 boats from today (Thursday) until Sunday.

Hopes and fears for UK's niche motors

TOYOTA pulled out all the stops to woo motoring enthusiasts at the Tokyo Motor Show, one of the wackiest spectacles in the

The Japanese firm used its home country to launch its sleek new concept car, the FT-1, and its futuristic new taxi.

The aptly named 'Japan Taxi' is slated for release ahead of the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. It is a hybrid fuelled by an electric motor and liquified petroleum gas which has been developed for at least four years by the firm's top engineers.

Extremely accessible with a low door and huge windows, it is

wheelchair friendly and resembles a futuristic London Black Cab. It will be expected to dramatically cut pollution in the mega-city.

It pales in comparison to the Toyota Century, the third generation of the limousine originally invented for the Imperial Family. The latest version has

a V8 hybrid drivetrain, is 5.3 metres long, costs more than €100,000, and is relatively hard to find, with just 600 to be built a

It wouldn't be a Japanese motor show without at least some element of robotics. Toyota didn't

Formerly known as 'Yui,' The Agent was described by Toyota as "more than a machine, a partner." The Agent is an in-car com-

puter system guided by artificial intelligence which can analyse facial expressions and voice tones to better 'understand' the driver. It will even study Facebook and Twitter feeds to build a picture of its driver's personality.

The Agent will understand when drivers are tired, perhaps even before they do via body language analysis, and make suggestions accordingly. It will also help with directions, music, calls and other standard tools



"I got barged into the goalpost, sustaining a broken and dislocation of a finger, in a local derby against Notts County at Meadow Lane," said Higham.

"Trainer Tommy Graham got a boxing glove - God

knows where from - and got permission from the referee for me to wear it, to protect my finger," said Higham.

"I remember the pain was excruciating. To this day, I can't straighten my little finger," said Higham.

Higham, who delivered a knock-out blow with a boxing glove in Forest's top of the bill match against County 60 years ago, said: "I scored the third goal - I have the picture - with the boxing glove over my left hand!"

Conte or Mourinho to sparkle on **Bonfire** night

JOSE MOURINHO and Antonio Conte are set to light up Bonfire night on November 5 - as Chelsea host Manchester United - in the Premier League at Stamford Bridge.

Mourinho, in charge at Chelsea during 2004-07 and 2013-15, departed in September 2007, following reports of a rift with owner Roman Abramovich.
