### Ports in a storm

#### A wanted drug dealer who went into hiding for 10 years has appeared in a Spanish court after he was tracked down by North Yorkshire Police.

Michael John Walsh, 75, was in October 2005 convicted of growing and supplying cannabis in the Scarborough area.

He was jailed for five years and nine months at Hull Crown Court in April 2006.

In December 2007, Walsh, from Leeds, was released from prison on licence.

He was recalled to prison shortly afterwards for breaching the terms of his release.

But instead of handing himself in, Walsh went on the run

### Caught at last

### Fugitive held after 10 year chase

North Yorkshire Police conducted extensive enquiries spanning a number of years to track Walsh down.

The force's Intelligence Bureau along with Spanish Guardia Civil officers eventually located him in Malaga and applied for a European Arrest Warrant, so he could be held anywhere in Eu-

They worked closely with Interpol and Spanish and UK authorities to bring him to justice.

Walsh was due in court in Madrid at the end of last week. but when contacted by the Euro Weekly News North Yorkshire Police were unable to provide details of the outcome.

The court was set to decide whether to remand him in custody before extraditing him to the UK to serve the remainder of his sentence.

North Yorkshire Police Intelligence Management Officer Paul Somerville said: "As this case

shows some criminals think that because they can't see us, we can't see them

"But in this day and age, very few offenders are genuinely untraceable - everyone leaves footprints.

"Sometimes gathering information about people who abscond, especially overseas, can take time, patience and commit-

"But by working closely with British and Spanish authorities. we've been able to arrest a convicted drug dealer who's gone to great lengths to evade justice."

### Lucia case goes on

MALAGA Prosecutor's Office has requested an extension of the investigation into the case of Lucia Vivar, the three-year-old girl who was found dead on the train tracks near

Three-year-old Lucia went missing from her family close to the town's train station on July 26, before her body was found more than 4km away the following day.

A police report ruled her death was accidental and she had been hit by a train, but her parents have been sceptical of the circumstances of their daughter's death and have demanded a further enquiry, to which the judge agreed.

And now the public prosecutor has called for an extension of the investigation, due to the fact that proceedings are still being carried out.

According to Spanish media, the Public Ministry has stated "it is not possible to conclude with the legal deadlines (six months)" due to the outstanding "pending proceedings."

If an extension is granted, the investigation would have a further year to continue with its enquiries.

### SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...43

As more and more people crack open the cava worldwide, the Spanish sparkling wine continues to take the country by storm, writes Harrison Jones.

### hat a corker!

CATALONIA'S take on Champagne is a sparkling white (or rosé) wine that everyone knows by name. The increasingly popular Cava - a word which means cave or cellar in Catalan - used to be aged in caves.

Over 200 years - and some industrial-scale reforms later - the tipple is still going strong, particularly at this time of year.

Indeed, Spaniards reportedly drink six times as much Cava during December as they do at any other time of the year.

Often seen as the cheap cousin to its French rival, under European law, the drink can no longer be referred to as the 'Spanish Champagne,' because the French Champagne region has Protected Geographical Status.

The name Cava itself was in fact only adopted in 1970, when Catalan winemakers tried to distinguish it

But the only differences between the two wines are the regions in which they are grown and the grapes

used. Meanwhile, Prosecco - another similar drink, from Italy - appears to be increasingly visible in Spanish shops.

Cava, though, is enjoying something of a resurgence at the higher end of the market, with some paying hundreds of euros for a single bottle.

### Wine with a sparkle

THERE are numerous types of Cava, which tend to be sorted by sweetness and ageing

Those distinguished by age are labelled as Joven (nine to 15 months), Reserva (15 to 30 months) and the most expensive Gran Reserva (at least 30

But whilst quality appears to be increasing, there is no let up in quantity. with Spain producing roughly 250 million bottles of the stuff every single year. Around 90 per cent of it is Joven.

Great Britain was the third largest importer in 2014, narrowly trailing Belgium and Germany, who buy some 30.5 million bottles of the standard product. In total, 130 countries import the wine: even Sierra Leone take a lowly 60 bot-

Back in Spain, the drink is important in many traditional celebrations, including baptisms, marriages and dinners.

Yet for all the hype, Cava is not without its problems. In the aftermath of the Catalan referendum, there have been more calls for a boycott of Cava, in an attempt to hurt the political movement for independence.

Of course, there seems to be little ap-

petite to part company with the drink just yet - so don't be surprised to see Cataluña's version of Champagne becoming the posh sparkling wine of choice in years to come.





### Catalan crisis rumbles on

KING FELIPE VI used his Christmas speech to call for peace in Cataluña. The Spanish monarch tried to calm the situation by warning against violence, saying the country already knew that "would generate nothing but discord, uncertainty and discouragement."

But since last Thursday's vote which saw separatist groups retain their majority - there has been remarkably little movement.

The festive period has seen very limited activism on the streets. And the Spanish authorities have pulled police reinforcements back from Cataluña, where they have been stationed since the illegal referendum, almost three months ago.

There were fears about further arrests of politicians, but that has so far failed to materialise.

The progress of coalition talks - which could vet take weeks - remains unknown, with the identity of the next Catalan president still in some doubt. But observers widely see the Spanish government's decision to call a snap election as a spectacular mistake. with pro-independence parties taking an unexpected majority.

However, pro-independence parties failed to win a majority of the votes - gaining 47 per cent of

support - despite winning most seats. They saw their majority reduced to two, taking 70 of 135

Turnout was a record high - of over 80 per cent - as Catalans flooded to the polls following a divisive and bitter campaign.

Though the pro-Spanish unity Ciudadanos party won most seats (37), three independence parties working together would have a majority. That means deposed President Carles Puigdemont or Ciudadanos leader Ines Arrimadas could lead the region's next government, at least in theory. But separatist and unity parties are split on policy, meaning coalition talks may prove tricky. Pro-independence Puigdemont -

whose centrist party came second with 34 seats - appears the more likely to take power.

Any separatist coalition would probably include his former vicepresident's leftist party, with 32 seats, and the support of four anticapitalist politicians, who back declaring independence regardless of Madrid's response.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy's ruling PP party lost eight seats to finish a dismal last, on three.

Rajoy dissolved the regional parliament in an attempt to weaken calls for independence. Separatists had declared independence following an illegal referendum, which saw them win 90 per cent

### Ten years of anguish

It is a decade since Amy Fitzpatrick vanished, but family hope goes on

EVERY year since daughter Amy went missing in Calahonda on New Year's Eve 2008, mother Audrey has made the lonely journey from Ireland to the Costa del Sol as a mark of respect.

Euro Weekly News has covered this sad story since Amy disappeared after babysitting for a family friend and regularly speaks to Audrey, especially at this time of year.

And she has revealed that although she had booked her flight to Malaga so that she could once again try to jog memories and publicly remind everyone that the 15-year-old mysteriously vanished on the short walk home, she has decided that she can't do it again this year.

"I've done everything I can over the past 10 years to try to find out what happened on that night" Audrey told EWN on the phone from Ire-

"We have made appeals, produced posters, spoken to people locally, prayed and have had support from the press, but all to no avail. At the moment, I'm simply too tired to make it over this year although my thoughts are constantly with my daughter," she continued.

Then in contemplative mood, she added "My last happy memory of that terrible night was sitting in a bar and hearing performer Stevie Nelson sing Sweet Home Calahonda. All I can hope now is that the Irish media and papers like Euro Weekly News will keep covering the story and that eventually the truth will come to light.'

The last decade has not been a good one for Audrey as she has also had to overcome her own serious health problems and saw her partner Dave Mahon jailed for the manslaughter of son Dean.







### Bigger, better hospital opens

RONDA'S new hospital will open its doors to the first outpatients on

Expected to attend to the medical needs of 85,000 inhabitants of nearby towns and villages in Malaga and Cadiz provinces, the Serrania de Ronda hospital will be gradually taking over from the old facility over a period of 12 weeks.

First to be up and running will be outpatients' departments for general surgery, dermatology, anaesthesia, gynaecology, obstetrics and paediatrics, which the Junta de Andalucia regional government reported had cost €48.5 million to set up.

The old and new hospitals will both be running over the three months it will take to move all departments over to guarantee service to patients, Junta representatives explained.

The new hospital, which covers a surface area of more than 37,000m2, is expected to deal with more than 41,000 emergencies, 113,000 outpatient appointments, 32,000 hospital stays and 3,500 operations per year.

# Cruelty boss is to face new charges

THE head of an animal welfare centre convicted of cruelty by killing hundreds of healthy cats and dogs, is to face new criminal charges.

Carmen Marin is accused of fraud and misusing public funds.

Tens of thousands of euros from the city of Torremolinos were designed to subsidise the costs of looking after the animals.

Instead they were used for stays in luxury hotels, two of them in Boston, USA, and St Petersburg, Russia, it is claimed.

Money was diverted from the Animal Park's accounts to pay for driving lessons, gym membership and the installation of a private security system at her home.

Between 2008 and 2011 Marin spent more than €11,000 in restaurants.

Nearly € 105,000 was allegedly spent not on the animal centre but on redecorating the business premises owned by a

member of her family.

A Citroen car worth nearly €15,000 was bought by Marin for a family member using public funds.

The claims are contained in papers submitted to a judge by the city's legal chiefs.

The judge is also to investigate whether family members may have committed crimes including fraud and money laundering

Marin was convicted in December of

involvement in the death of thousands of animals, so-called 'extermination sessions,' designed to free up more space and therefore attract more council funding.

The court heard she had also taken part in the deliberate misrepresentation of documents in relation to the numbers of animals incinerated.

Marin was sentenced to four years in jail but is free pending an appeal.


THE oldest Anglican cemetery in Spain is the English Cemetery in Malaga which shares a plot of land with St George's Anglican Church and it was to there that British Ambassador to Spain Simon Manley made a special visit.



### Golden visa woos Arab and Chinese buyers

MALAGA is now the secondmost popular province in Spain for the world's wealthy.

The Costa del Sol is topped only by Catalan capital Barcelona in a ranking of the number of luxury properties sold since the Spanish government introduced their 'visa for the rich' in 2013.

Also known as the golden visa, the document permits individuals from non-EU countries to purchase properties with a value equal to or greater than €500,000.

In Malaga, 348 foreign millionaires have purchased housing since the new system was introduced, compared with 893 in Barcelona, 306 in Madrid, 151 in Alicante, 91 in Girona and 77 in Valencia.

The most important market is currently China, from where 702 buyers have spent € 489 million, while 640 Russians have made investments worth € 502 million with these two countries contributing 64 per cent of sales.

Other nationalities appearing



on the list include Ukraine, Egypt, Venezuela, Saudi Arabia, the United States, Lebanon and

Ricardo Bocanegra, president of the Costa del Sol Foreigners' Association, has paid tribute to the golden visa system, calling it "an indisputable success."

However, Chinese buyers are not flocking to the costa, where the market is being driven by Arabic capital, particularly from "It is the Arabs, principally, who are making large investments in luxury mansions, especially nationals of Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates," says Bocanegra, adding the Russian and United States markets are also making waves in the so-called Golden Triangle formed by Marbella, Estepona and Benahavis.

"The big advantage of the golden visa is it allows them to reside in Europe whenever they want without having to be here for six months per year," he concluded.

A life on the sofa with swollen legs due to the removal of lymph nodes was a terrifying prospect. She soon discovered that exercise



could help push fluid past the blockages, helping her live a far more active life.

She took up cycling and was soon completing 25-mile rides a day, helping control her condition far better than doctors ever thought possible. In 2012 the cancer expanded and she had a lung removed. But even that didn't stop her doing a 700m climb over 18km during a holiday in Spain.

The Tour de Sands pays tribute to her awe-inspiring energy in fighting for a life where she was in control, not the disease. The Tour finishes on June 1 and on June 3 there will be a special party held at the Avanto Beach Club to celebrate Sandra's life and raise funds for charity.



er, and became a popular brand in the 1960s.

Over 40 employees will work at the new brewery, with the possibility of more jobs as production increases.

The new site has the capacity to produce 1.2 million litres a year, while any extra demand will continue to be made in the Murcia factory where the beer was brewed for the

last two decades. The company aims to eventually move all production back to Malaga, however, which will require further investment of around €15 mil-

Beer enthusiasts are able to visit the factory located on Avenue Velazquez which also boasts an onsite museum and a large room designed to host tastings, events and even concerts.




of the Leading Hotels of the World group, which restricts membership to the best luxury hotels and resorts on the planet.

The hotel has already hosted an array of conventions, conferences and weddings since its partial opening 10 months ago.







# Many workers claim low earnings

A SPANISH trade union has revealed that only 2 per cent of those who are self-employed declared earnings of more than €1,000 per month in 2016.

Of the 965,161 sole traders recorded as being autonimo (self-employed), after deducting expenses and social security costs 942,418 said their annual income was less than €12,000 per annum.

This finding was released by Gestha, the trade union representing officials at the Spanish Ministry of Finance and Tax Agency.

The union has inferred that these declarations of earning may not be wholly accurate and the government doesn't properly police the situation which could allow for false returns to be made.



# Bitcoin value is erratic

# Price almost halved in just one week

FORWARDS markets in Chicago started trading in Bitcoins the cryptocurrency in mid-December and saw tremendous rises with a single 'pretend' coin breaking the \$20,000 (€16,870) barrier.

In a matter of days, Bitcoins lost 40 per cent of its value as a whole slew of different securities organisations around the world warned investors about the volatility of the unsupported internet currency.

Some people have made huge profits, taking advantage of the rise and fall in the value of the currency but at the end of the day, any legitimate investor will still need to buy and sell their Bitcoins by trading in a legitimate currency.

Euros, dollars, pounds and all other major currencies around the world are issued by and underwritten by governments, so there is legitimacy to their banknotes and it is possible to use them to transact business in all manner of different situations.

A cryptocurrency (and Bitcoin is just the best known) is created by an individual or company and has no legitimacy other than the interest that others have in purchasing it. To some extent, investing in Bitcoins can be compared to the Tulip Mania of the 17th century or indeed a Ponsi (Pyramid) investment scheme where early investors who sold quickly made money and those at the end of the chain simply lost everything.

Arguably the main long term support for Bitcoins is the dark web where drug and arms dealers as well as terrorists can buy and sell whatever they need without being properly policed and this is no doubt what may keep the currency in existence.

The other appeal is that those who understand the internet can produce their own Bitcoins (known as mining) by harnessing large numbers of computers to solve complicated puzzles and apart from the cost

of electricity, using existing computers (sometimes hacking into innocent parties' machines) they can create new coins for next to

The success of this cryptocurrency has encouraged other organisations to produce their own, although investors might be better served to go to a casino and bet everything on red or black as at least then they would either make their profit or go bust.

# ECJ rules in favour of appeal against EU

THE European Court of Justice (ECJ) has overturned a decision made by the European Commission to instruct Spain to recover aid granted to television operators.

Following a complaint from Luxembourg-based satellite operator SES Astra, the Commission decided that the Spanish government had acted improperly in granting subsidies to broadcasters to assist in the transition from analogue to digital transmission.

The actual policy of digitalisation has been encouraged by the Commission as early as 2002 and in its ruling the ECJ indicated that the actions taken by Spain were reasonable and that there was no justification in demanding that those who had received financial support should have to refund it.

# IT'S A FACT: OLDER IPHONES ARE BEING SLOWED DOWN

# Apple says it helps users

IF you think that your aging iPhone is less efficient, then you might be correct as Apple has admitted that it is slowing down some models.

For some time now, there have been suggestions that the company was surreptitiously making some of the earlier versions slow down in order to encourage customers to purchase new models.

Now after one user compared the speed of his iPhone 6 against his brother's, an in-depth review of iPhones led to a US technology website Geekbench confirming its view that some phones were markedly slower than others.

In response, Apple issued a statement confirming the fact that it was deliberately slowing down some phones, not as a marketing tool but to try to make owners' phones have a longer life as the lithium battery in the phone starts

"Our goal is to deliver the best experience for customers, which includes overall performance and

prolonging the life of their devices. Lithium-ion batteries become less capable of supplying peak current demands when in cold conditions, have a low battery charge or as they age over time, which can result in the device unexpectedly shutting down to protect its electronic components.

"Last year we released a feature for iPhone 6, iPhone 6s and iPhone SE to smooth out the instantaneous

peaks only when needed to prevent the device from unexpectedly shutting down during these conditions. We've now extended that feature to iPhone 7 with iOS 11.2, and plan to add support for other products in the future," said a spokesman.

Social media comment has been significant in as much as whilst many accept that there was probably no nefarious intent behind Apple's silence, at best, the normally open company has shot itself in the foot by not advising customers in advance of its intention.

It is also argued that if the problem is resolved by a new replacement battery which would cost about €90, the company should not have adapted the design of the iPhone in order to make the exchange of battery so difficult with minute screws and the potential to wipe the phone if a mistake is

The data showed that Spain was by far the highest exporter of oranges last year, exporting 1.6 million tonnes, totalling 57 per cent of the total EU Member States' exports.

Greece was the second highest exporting EU state, exporting 462,000 tonnes.

A subsidiary of the Mondragón Corporation, Batz has received €25 million in order to allow it to increase design staff and to develop new and innovative technologies with the aim of manufacturing lighter and more aerodynamically efficient vehicles on both land and in the air to cut CO2 emissions.

Talgo is to receive €30 million to develop new prototypes for the electric trains to be used by commuters on short and medium-length journeys, as well as enhancing high speed performance with the expectation of increasing exports.

Thirty-five million euros has been made available to Incarlopsa famous for its ham and cured meats to increase staffing by up to 1,000 and upgrade its production facilities.

The largest loan being made by the EIB is €45 billion to Laboratorios Farmacéuticos Rovi to finance its research and development programme focusing on technologies for the administration and extended release of medication, including pre-clinical development and clinical trials that could help develop future treatments to fight cancer and nervous system diseases.

# Medieval bible sold to museum

PRODUCED in the 14th century, one of just a handful of known examples of a Hebrew Tanakh produced in Castile has been sold for a sum thought to be close to €5 million.

Originally to be auctioned by Sotheby's with an estimated price of \$3.5 million to \$5 million it was eventually sold to the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York for an undisclosed

The Tanakh is known as the Jewish Bible and contains the writings in the Old Testament which was eventually adopted by Christianity.

This particular illustrated bible - which is in exquisite condition - is the earliest known complete illuminated Hebrew Bible from Spain ever to be auctioned and was one of six recorded as existing in private

# Feliz Navidad to all our Spanish clients

I LOVE Spain at this time of year, temperate climate, everyone friendly and how great to actually have a nice phrase to use. So much better than that dreadful word all too often used over the past year, Brexit!

As a debt collector, I have always tried to avoid anything political when speaking with clients and debtors alike, but whether in Spain, the UK or other countries it has been impossible to avoid the word Brexit and the worry and insecurity it has conjured up in the minds of most I talk to. Well, hopefully I can put it in to a little more perspective today.

Will Brexit affect the ability to collect debts in the UK, if incurred in Spain or other EU countries. The simple answer is no it will not.

Before the whole Brexit saga started, on EU debt we had always been able to use EU legislation, now enshrined in UK law. On a debt incurred in one EU country debtor assets are at risk in any other EU country in which they principally reside

The above statement really means that any debtor can be sued on a personal ba-

sis in the UK, for example, with their assets at risk on a debt incurred in Spain.

In essence this is a legal principle for any debt incurred in any country and sued cross-border. It just means that the process is simpler when it is defined under the EU rules embedded in all EU countries. If the UK exits the EU these rules are still now embedded in UK legislation and there will be no good reason to change them.

Even if there was a move to look again at all debt related EU legislation embedded in UK law there still remains legal conventions between most world countries, allowing for reciprocal legal actions and enforcement. The UK in particular has had legal conventions with many other countries going back to the 1920's.

From a debt collection perspective there has been a lot of rumour about a more difficult legal scenario outside of Spain.

Whilst there may be a little more paper work the previous legal conventions between most countries remain. It may increase costs a little but I am confident that the EU legislation currently in use will remain so.

Brexit has, unfortunately, done much to reduce confidence in cross-border dealings in all sorts of ways but LPL's principles have not changed one bit. If money is owed and the debtor resides outside of Spain let's get on with the business of collection. Brexit has been an unwelcome side issue and will unfortunately remain so for some time.

At the moment there is absolutely no change in any procedures, so if there are debt problems in your community there is no need, for any reason, to delay action.

In general I really think it should be 'business as usual!'



NINETY PER CENT of people leave their phone chargers plugged in day and night. The other 10 per cent are either obsessive compulsives (guilty as charged m'lud) or planet-savers.

Depending on whose statistics you believe, a permanently-plugged phone charger consumes less than €5 of electricity a year. No, that's not a misprint. Tell that to the coffee-bar owner who refused to let me charge my phone for a couple of hours there while I did other business, 'unless you pay for the electricity.' Will one cent do nicely?

LBA is now an acknowledged modern syndrome: Low Battery Anxiety. Typically that's when it's barely lunchtime and you're down to 20 per cent and panicked. Manufacturer LG says nine out of 10 people suffer from LBA, while the rest of us just get on with our lives.

In our 'always-on' society, a dead battery is today's best excuse, or genuine reason, for missing calls, not responding to messages or turning up late for appointments ('I had to wait for my phone to charge.')

An American survey revealed that in a low-power scenario and having to choose between hitting

the gym and charging their smartphone fully, a third of those asked opted for the charging.

We have become so seriously charger-dependent. Most people charge their phones twice a day now, where my wife's old Nokia happily used to chug along for a week or more.

HAPPY NEW YEAR

It's also surprising just how uninformed we are when it comes to the way we treat our batteries.

Gone, for instance, are the days when you should religiously charge a new phone for 24 hours before use, and then regularly run it down before recharging.

That worked with prehistoric nickel-cadmium batteries, but today's lithium-ion packs don't like being fully recharged and discharged; experts say it's better to keep trickle-charging them more often, at between 40 and 80 per cent of capacity, and never leave them near-empty for long.

It's also a myth that keeping your phone on charge all night will degrade the battery. Modern technology turns off the phone's appetite, just like ours, when it's

When you think about it, it is of course iniquitous as fewer and fewer phones now have replaceable batteries, that when the battery is finished so is the phone. Or could that be a plot by those now selling all those portable power banks by

But underlying it all, here's how you know you're an LBA sufferer: if you're asked to list your favourite position in bed, and you answer "Near the wall so I can use my phone while it's charging."

# Staying safe this Xmas - part 2

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



### I STAY SAFE: Look after yourself and your belongings.

ADULTS should avoid carrying large amounts of cash and make sure you are not followed when you have collected cash from an ATM or a bank. If you become suspicious, contact the police immediately.

Do not accept help from strangers who supposedly want to help, they sometimes take advantage of your guard being lowered in order to grab money and valuables.

Avoid street-gamers playing such tricks as the 'shell game' or 'find the lady' type scams, not only will you not win, your distraction leaves you vulnerable to theft.

When you visit friends and neighbours, always lock your home securely, leave nothing of value in view, don't fully lower your window blinds and don't announce your intentions to vacate the premises on social media.

Similar advice also applies to the car of course, never leave valuables such as gifts on show. If you return to your vehicle with goods, be careful you are not seen if you then leave your car to continue to shop.

The police would also like to remind party organisers and revellers that any activity, party or public celebration must have administrative approval and comply with safety standards, such as having fire extinguishers, security and emergency exits indicated. If any incident occurs: keep calm and try to stay away from that area, alerting the organiser or 091.

Finally, if you see anything or anybody acting suspiciously, please notify the authorities immediately. Although you might not consider it an emergency, the 112 call centre is staffed by people who speak a variety of languages and nobody will be offended if an alert turns out to be false, as that is by far a better outcome than ignoring something which later results in a tragic incident.

Stay safe this holiday period, look after yourself and your belongings, keep them out of sight at all times, keep bags and wallets secure and never unattended, and be vigilant, that way we can all hope for a safe and peaceful Christmas and New Year period.

# Can Community fine debtors?

Can a Community of Property Owners legally add a surcharge to your fees due if the payment is late?

R P (Costa del Sol)

No, they can't. Not legally, anyway. By law, the Community can only charge the established fees of the participation shares, or cuotas, Nevertheless, a number of Communities have voted to charge penalties on late payers. If no one objects, this can work. Experienced property administrators,



however, recommend that the reverse method be applied. That is, those who pay on time receive a discount for prompt payment. The late payers have to pay the full amount.

This system requires a vote at the AGM to raise the fees, so that the late payers will face higher charges while the prompt payers apply their discounts and pay the same fee as they paid before the change. This system has the twin advantages of creating a positive feeling as well as being completely legal.

evening's viewing, but voting figures were vastly down on previous years.



### **High triglycerides**

#### This week a reader has asked the doctor about his blood test results:

DEAR Doctor.

For some years I've been under treatment for high blood pressure and recently I've been having trouble keeping it under control.

My GP sent me for blood tests and the results said my triglycerides were very high, twice as much as they should be, but he didn't explain what that means, just said that could be what's sending my blood pressure up and told me to go on a diet and get some exercise.

Could you please explain what they are, what they do and why I need to lower them? I'd also appreciate some detailed advice on 'diet and exercise.'

The doctor replied

- High blood pressure is a chronic complaint which usually shows no symptoms to begin with but can cause problems in various internal organs such as the heart and kidnevs over time.

Treatment consists of an adequate, balanced, low in salt diet, regular moderate exercise (a 50-minute walk five days per week or 50-60 minutes swimming three or four days per week) and medication.

This is often enough to keep blood pressure under control but sometimes it can remain a problem. If this is the case, you should see a specialist in Internal Medicine to rule out certain causes which may need more specific treatment.

In your case, your triglycerides are high which has nothing to do with your high blood pressure levels but can usually be controlled with a low-fat diet and by avoiding alcohol. High triglyceride levels are dangerous as they are a cardiovascular risk and can increase the chance of suffering a heart attack.

Diet is the most important thing to change. Follow a diet low in fat and sugar. rich in vegetables, fruit and fish. Red meat should be avoided and swapped for white meat. Food should be boiled or grilled. You should avoid drinking too much alcohol and fizzy drinks.

# An apple (or three) a day

HAPPY NEW YEAR

EXPERTS have claimed three apples or two tomatoes a day could reverse lung damage caused by smoking.

The scientists from Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health said the fruits could also slow down the natural ageing of lungs.

The group made the discovery that fresh versions of the fruit - as opposed to canned varieties - saw the decline in lung function in smokers of 10 years slow. They believe this news could prevent smokers developing Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disorder, an incurable condition. The potentially fatal condition thought to affect

### Hope for heart disease

EXPERTS have found one or two portions of some of our favourite foods each day may lower the risk of heart disease.

Scientists from St Michael's Hospital in Toronto, Canada, said meat and dairy - previously thought to be bad for our hearts- could in fact lower risks by 5 per cent.

Dr John Sievenpiper said there could be benefits to having more animal-based proteins innour diet rather than plant-based ones.

He explained the statistic, "may not sound like much, but as people in North America eat very little plant protein, there is a real opportunity here to make some small changes to our diets and realise the health benefits." He added, "we are seeing a major interest in plant-based diets from Mediterranean to vegetarian diets in the supermarket, and this comprehensive analysis provides us with more confidence that these diets are heart healthy.

"When he arrived back in London with short hair I was interviewed and the headline was 'The barber who made Paul a

The Godello grape is versatile and somewhat neutral, greatly reflecting in its aromas and flavours the methods and techniques of the winemaker. Producers in Bierzo favour ageing Godello in oak barrels, making richer, fuller wines; those from Valdeorras tend to be aged in steel tanks, giving them a fresher, livelier quality.

> Overall Godello wines are clean and fresh with deep rich mineral and fruit flavours that are ripe and savoury. Ageing well, some last up to a decade, gaining complexity and depth with time.

> Seafood is an obvious choice of food to match with Godello, especially heartier choices including

lobster, scallops, crab, and halibut, though salads and lighter chicken dishes also pair

Known producers in the area are Santa Maria, Vina Godeval, Soto del Vicario, Castro de Lobarzan and Pazos del Rev.

As always with white wines, drink lightly chilled but not icy cold.







# Time to plant bulbs for spring flowers

ABUNDANT bright colourful flowers are a hallmark of the Mediterranean garden.

New Year is the perfect time to prepare for a wonderful flower display in spring with minimal preparation and years of regrowth with minimal additional input to obtain heavenly scents and delightful flower displays.

Bulbs, tubers and corms can be planted now in containers, pots and the garden while still dormant to quickly sprout and grow in time for spring as they are so easy to grow and so versatile.

In containers they can be displayed in entrances, on window sills, balconies, patios and terraces to provide attractive blooms and allow the perfumed scents to add a natural fresh ambiance and uplifting appeal to any zone around the home where there is sufficient light and fresh air.

A number of bulbs are native to the Mediterranean region, including daffodils, but have been distributed and developed into various different cultivar around the world so that their origins have been obscured.

Many fit into the Mediterranean garden perfectly as they emerge in winter when the soil is normally moist and die back over summer after flaunting their springtime flowers to wait for the next winter rains before starting the cycle again. This can mean that garden bulbs will often not need any watering year round unless the spring weather is verv drv.

Containers with bulbs may need supplemental watering as containers can dry



The bulbs highlight the container plant in spring but as the bulbs die back the container plant becomes the new focus and the dried leaves from the builds are removed. In this way I don't have to put the containers away during the bulbs dormancy.

green over summer.

A good selection of bulbs, tubers and corms to select for planting at this time include: daffodils, jonquils, grape hyacinth, tulips, Madonna lilies, gladiolus, iris, freesia, cyclamen, crocus, anemone, scilla and

My personal favourite is freesias. I have grown them in a pot with a weeping fig for over 15 years and they come up every year, look


lovely while filling the terrace with their delightful scent and then disappear in summer as if never there. I just add a little compost every other year (biannual-

There are also many iris of various colours scattered around the garden and in the orchard giving annual displays while daffodils our children planted when only young still come up at the

base of a hackberry tree in the vegetable garden.

If you have good soil in the garden you can just dig a hole about three times deeper than the size of the bulb, pop them in and cover them over with the soil. Add compost to the soil surface rather than in the hole and you can have years of flower displays with little more work than some weed-











But instead of navel-gazing they should look at the footage of the police and Guardia Civil charges on October 1.

That would explain a lot.

#### Sitting pretty

MARTA ROVIRA said on the morning after the Catalan elections, "We won the elections and Rajov lost."

Rovira's 'we' was generic because her party, Esquerra Republicana de Cataluña (ERC) was overtaken, against all expectations, by self-exiled Carles Puigdemont's Junts per Catalunya.

But between them ERC and Puigdemont's party have 66 pro-independence seats - 70 if they allow the anti-system CUP party to hitch its wagon to their star.

Predictably, CUP is already being tiresome and bartering support in exchange for a republic - now, and not tomorrow.

But the separatists might even manage to dispense with CUP and could still be sitting pretty in their Parliament seats as Barcelona mayor Ada Colau's party Cataluña en Comun (CEC) would possibly abstain rather than vote against them.

They have until February to start haggling but meanwhile more big-name firms will probably leave the region, the economy will stagnate still further and hospital waiting lists will get longer. In other words, the same pattern that has accompanied 'El Proces' so far.

#### Double standards

CARLES PUIGDEMONT, regional president until the Constitution's Article 155 temporarily suspended Cataluña's autonomous status, fled to Brussels while others who joined him in the unilateral declaration of independence were remanded in prison.

Never mind, he said from his self-imposed exile, if the separatists win the December 21 election, we'll get them out of the slammer. Is this the same Puigdemont who accused the national government of using politics to influence the legal system?

A judge remanded the UDI faction for rebellion and sedition and only a judge can release them. But Puigdemont & Co have applied double standards throughout 'El Proces' so it's no surprise that they should be doing it now.

### Tarifa: Paradise found in the south

GHOST town in winter and a surfing paradise in summer, nowhere in Spain is the seasonal swing more emphatic than in Tarifa. Boasting some of the best beaches, not in Spain or Europe, but in the world, the seaside town comes alive in spring, making it a hugely popular day out for Costa del Sol families at this time of

A trip to Tarfia takes you out of Malaga Province and into Cadiz and Spain's southern Atlantic coastline. But it is surprisingly close to the Costa del Sol, just 45 minutes along the A-7 from Marbella, or 90 minutes from Malaga. Those times depend on the traffic but, with it being a straight road almost all the way, Tarifa is easily the wildest destination right on the

Beaches, surfing and other adventure sports are the main reasons people come to Tarifa. A wander around the historic old town is an enjoyable treat by itself, with plenty of Moroccan inspired restaurants to choose from. Of course many also come to take the short ferry trip from Tarifa port to Tangier. North Africa is so close you can see it on a clear day.

The easiest to reach and most popular beach is Los Lances which is almost 8km long and very rarely crowded. A walk along the beach and back would easily be a day's work itself.

Beyond Los Lances is Valdevaqueros which is even longer and, being on the Atlantic, much windier. Both are kitesurfing havens where world championships are often held.

If the beaches are a little too vast for your taste, or the weather doesn't permit sun-

bathing, Tarifa has plenty of cultural options up its sleeve. There is the Guzman Castle which is more than 1,000 years old and considered one of the best preserved medieval castles in Spain. Likewise the gothic San Mateo church is a terrific place to explore, as are the

Roman ruins of Bolonia, a small fishing village just a few kilometres away.

Animal lovers can take up horse riding on the beach for the afternoon, or even whale watching as part of special guided tours from May to September.

DOGS want to be trained and there is so much proof that trained dogs are invariably happier than an untrained dog.

All trained dogs have happy owners. Great satisfaction can be derived from training a dog. It is not time consuming and most training can be done whilst exercising the dog. If you do not have the time to exercise your dog then you should not keep a dog.

Training classes undoubtedly contribute to better training of dogs. One great advantage of classes is that they accustom the puppy or young dog to meeting other dogs and the owners get an opportunity to meet people with a common interest and often the same or similar problems.

Many people are regarded as experts when they have trained a dog of one breed to a very high standard. Faced with a difficult dog they would not know where to start. Training methods vary just as much as dogs and their owners do. There are however, many accepted exercises that form a useful basis for most dogs and most owners.

Owners must not regard dogs as almost human; this is an insult to our canine friend. In this day and age we still do not know how dogs do some of these things, such as detecting mines and drugs. Intelligence is not an important factor in a dog's make up.

Dogs and indeed all animals

Animals do not reason at all. they simply react to what is happening and do not think what has happened or is about to happen. It is believed that they do sometimes work out a problem for themselves.

For training purposes we try to create associations we want and avoid those we do not want, by what is known as correction and reward. Correction does not mean beating the dog or jerking him on a choke chain it means any act, which forces the dog to obey, like pushing him into the sit posi-

Many dog owners will never know or have any idea of the pleasure they are losing in not having a dog that is trained to be a faithful companion and

A dog will accept a human as a substitute for a canine leader and this willingness to accept a human makes him easier to train than most other animals.







### Next generation Leaf **British built**

PRODUCTION of the new Nissan Leaf for the European market has begun in the firm's huge Sunderland plant in the UK.

The first customers are expected to receive their new wheels in February. Deliveries will be made right across Europe with thousands of vehicles rolling off the production line in the coming months.

Nissan describes its new Leaf as "the next generation of the world's best-selling electric car.'

It has an expanded range of 378km on a single charge. There is an 'e-Pedal' which allows drivers to start, stop, accelerate and decelerate simply by applying different levels of pressure to the accelerator.

The ProPILOT advanced driving assistance program keeps the Leaf in the centre of the lane and can automatically control the distance between the car and the vehicle in front to ensure safety.

ProPILOT Park is an automatic parking

technology that uses four high resolution cameras and 12 ultrasonic sensors to park the car accurately at the push of a button.

Nissan Europe vice president for manufacturing, Kevin Fitzpatrick said: "Nissan led the way in introducing electric vehicles to Europe in 2011, and every year since then it's been clear that more and more customers share our vision for the future of driving.

Having shifted more than 85,000 units across the continent the Nissan Leaf has been a huge success. The next generation is one of the most eagerly awaited releases of 2018 in the green car market and couldn't come at a better time for the brand as diesel's reputation continues to

### Under the hammer Hitler's Benz to go up for sale

A CLASSIC Mercedes Benz once owned by Nazi Dictator Adolf Hitler is set to go up for auction in early 2018.

The car, a 1939 Mercedes-Benz 770k Gross Open Tourer was first seen in public delivering Hitler to the Old Reich Chancellery in October 1939 and was used by the dictator during his Nazi parades.


The car was made to Hitler's specific orders and was first designed as a guest car for Hitler's garage when heads of states visited Germany.

Due to the car's original nature, the specially built 770k had special security measures added, including bullet-resistant glass in the windscreen and an armour plated motor.

According to the auctioneers, Worldwide Auctioneers, the Benz was initially sold in a package

with other classic cars, with the purchase being the single most valuable private transaction in the classic-car world.

The Benz will go on sale on January 17, with 10 per cent of the sale gong towards education about the holocaust.

# A round up of sports

### **Football**

Benfica, Celtic, Chelsea, Copenhagen, Feyenoord, Juventus, Real Madrid, Red Star Belgrade and Spartak Moscow won their respective League titles... Arsenal (FAC), Celtic (SC), Manchester United (EL/FLC), Real Madrid (CL) and England's U17, U19 and U20 teams, all triumphed in major Cup finals... Barcelona's Lionel Messi (37 goals) captured Europe's Golden Boot... Cristiano Ronaldo won the Ballon D'or for a fifth time and became the first player to score in every Champions League Group game... Chelsea's N'Golo Kante was PFA Footballer of the Year: Celtic's Scott Sinclair won Scotland's award... Manchester City set a new PL record for successive wins from the start of a season and ended Manchester United's 40-match unbeaten home record... Forest Green Rovers entered the League for the first time... and just before Christmas, Bristol City knocked holders Manchester United out of the League Cup.

Six Premiership managers lost their iobs in the first half of the 2017-18 season: Slaven Bilic (West Ham), Paul Clement (Swansea), Frank de Boer (Crystal Palace), Ronald Koeman (Everton), Tony Pulis (WBA) and Craig Shakespeare (Leicester).


