Towering hotel confirmed

A giant €35 million hotel is to be built near La Fossa beach, Calpe, dominating the skyline as the area's

tallest building.

According to Spanish media reports, the twin-towered hotel will have over 600 rooms (including 14 suites), across 30 floors.

It is likely to exceed the height of the Suitopia hotel, but will reportedly match it at the very least.

AR Hotels & Resorts have announced the four-star project, which it says will provide 2,000 jobs for the local area, while building work continues for three years.

Once complete, it is expected to create 1,000 fulltime jobs.

The building will have 14 convention rooms as well as a garden and pool.

The company are hoping to pick up custom throughout the year, regardless of the season, through business conventions.

Calpe's local authority incentivise the building of four and five star hotels in

The award-winning chain manages five hotels and 17 tourist apartment complexes, according to Spanish me-

Calpe already has some 13 hotels - according to the popular website booking. com - which will compete with the new hotel. Its name is not yet known.

Plurilingual legislation dropped

THE regional government has abandoned plurilingual plans that would have favoured Valenciano in state

The legislation went through by decree a year ago with the backing of all parties in the regional parliament with the exception of the Partido Popular.

It was fiercely opposed by many parents and parents' associations in Alicante Province who had an ally in the provincial council, the Diputacion.

Its president, Cesar Sanchez, maintained that Education chief Vicent Marza's plans did not take into account Alicante Province's 'special characteristics' and lodged an appeal against the decree.

This was halted as a temporary measure by the Upper Court of Justice (TSJ) and schools were ordered to revert to the existing system.

The TSJ highlighted the decree's 'imbalance,' as children taught in Valenciano would have had more tuition in English while pupils taught principally in Spanish received

Sanchez welcomed Marza's decision to revoke the Plurilingual decree: "This is a victory for educational free-

The now-abandoned plans to favour Valenciano were an attack on the right of parents to choose how their children were taught, Sanchez maintained.

He would also continue to safeguard Alicante Province's 'sociological reality' against a monolingual regional government that was hostile to the Spanish language, Sanchez

'Connect' us up plea

TIRED of waiting for a fibre optic internet connection, residents in Villajoyosa's Old Town appealed to the regional Ombudsman. In response the Sindic de Greuges has rapped the town hall over the knuckles for not adopting 'effective measures' to install the faster system.

This was the second time the Ombudsman had raised the question in the past 12 months but on this occasion, he asked the town hall to let him know within a month how it intended to remedy the situation.

This was the second time the Ombudsman has contacted Villaiovosa Town Hall about 'making every effort' to ensure the Old Town had a fibre optic connection after receiving a complaint signed by 238 residents.

The town hall assured the Ombudsman in October that it was considering 'different possibilities' bearing in mind that installing fibre optic would first require careful study, and considering the Old Town's special Protection Plan.

AN ELDERLY woman resident at a nursing home in El Verger had to have her left leg urgently amputated because she had gangrene.

A YOUNG Alcoy woman, now 20, who killed her new-born baby will go to prison for 15 years. Having managed to conceal her pregnancy from her family, she gave birth alone in the bathroom of her home, stabbing the child with the same knife that she used to cut the umbilical cord.

Labour saving

THE Guardia Civil cleared up 35 burglaries in Alicante, Albacete, Murcia and Madrid after arresting two Spanish men aged 27 and 41 who were found robbing a San Vicente house. A search of their vehicle revealed stolen items later identified by their victims in all four regions.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE...44

January 6 sees the arrival of the best-loved Christmas tradition in Spain, as the Three Kings bring presents for children and huge parades take place, Joe Gerrard reports.

SANTA VS **THE KINGS**

DEBATE rages as to who is preferred in Spain, Santa Claus or the Three Kings. In a 2015 survey of Spanish children the kings came out on top, 67 per cent to Santa's 27 per cent.

ANDALUCIAN KINGS?

THE previous Pope, Benedict XVI, claimed in his book on the nativity the three kings were from the ancient kingdom of Tarsis (Tartessosa). Historians place this kingdom somewhere near Huelva. Cadiz and Sevilla, in modern day Andalucia.

PAGAN ORIGINS

THE origin of the celebration goes back further than Christianity. In pagan times celebrations were held on January 6 to welcome the longer days that followed the winter solstice on December 21.

CONTROVERSY

DURING parades Balthazar has traditionally been played by a white actor in 'blackface' make-up. Critics have branded this racist and Madrid's council employed a black actor for the first time last year in response.

We three kings

JANUARY in Britain sees families pack away their Christmas decorations and get back to business as usual.

In Spain however Christmas festivities continue until January 6, when the country celebrates the annual Three King's Day holiday, also known as Epiphany Dav.

The day (El Dia de los Reyes in Spanish) marks the moment in the nativity story when the three kings or wise men visited the baby Jesus to give gifts.

The three kings in the modern-day festival, Melchior, Caspar and Balthazar, are now said to give out presents to Spanish children, similar to Santa Claus in Britain and elsewhere.

Spanish children polish their shoes and leave them outside for the kings to put presents in on the night of January 5.

These presents only go to well behaved children however, and Balthazar is tasked with giving coal or wood to those children on the naughty list.

The night of January 5 also sees the annual parades (the Cabalgata de Reyes), beginning at dusk.

The three kings appear here too, standing on floats and trailers that go through Spanish towns and cities throwing sweets to excited children.

Some of these parades involve hundreds of actors and are broadcast live on Spanish TV.

On January 6 the Spanish traditionally enjoy a round bread cake called Roscon. The cakes are baked with a figurine of the baby Jesus and a dry flava bean.

The person who finds the figurine is crowned king or queen of that day's festivities. The one who finds the bean has to prepare next year's Roscons.

January 6 is marked by a bank holiday school until after the festival.

Shell shock!

INHABITANTS of Ibi, Alicante have staged their annual mock battle to mark the biblical Massacre of the Innocents by King Herod.

Known locally as Els Enfarinats - the floured ones revellers hurl smoke bombs. flour and eggs at each other in one of the world's greatest food fights.

Clad in military gear and wearing goggles to protect their eyes, some participants also brandish firecrackers as the flour and egg artillery whizzes by.

The fake coup d'état dates back around 200 years and sees Els Enfarinats take control of the village as they stage a revolution against the authorities.

A new mayor is elected and a series of ridiculous new laws are announced, with citizens who break them fined and the money later donated to charity.

Meanwhile, a second group called La Oposicio - the opposition - attempts to restore order before both sides storm the streets armed with 12,000 eggs, 8,000 kilos of flour and 6,000 firecrackers.

Taking place on Innocents' Day (December 28), there was a political edge to this year's event, as one plucky participant dressed as ex-Catalan leader Carles Puigdemont.

He was set on by a gang of battle-hardened soldiers wielding fire extinguishers filled with flour before being locked in an imitation prison cell.



On yer bike says mayor

Rail fail

SKATERS in Denia were left open-mouthed after arriving at the municipal skate park with their boards to find a large piece of protective railing from the local tram line dumped between the obstacles

ALCOY was present on the streets of Benalmadena, Marbello, Torremolinos, Almuñecar and Mojacar over Christmas.

It was featured on advertising panels proclaiming Alcoi Ciutat de Nadal (Alcoy, Christmas city) through the mediation of Javier Llopis.

Director of the Alcoy publication El nostre ciutad (Our city), Llopis contacted the company responsible for street publicity in the towns on his own initiative.

As a result of Llopis' involvement, the council has had to meet only the cost of printing the panels and nothing at all for digital advertising in the Andalucia municipalities.

"Our Christmas has gone farther afield and will be even better-known, thanks to Javier Llopis," said Tourism councillor Lorena Zamorano.

Something fishy going on

THE Guardia Civil impounded 235 kilos of fish and shellfish from municipal markets, supermarkets and fishmongers in Alicante Province.

The Nature Protection Service (Seprona) inspected 18 different outlets and detected 12 infringements, revealed the Guardia Civil's provincial headquarters in Alicante City.

The inspections were carried out owing to the increased demand for fish, and especially shellfish, over the Christmas holidays, Guardia Civil sources said.

The most common infractions were selling undersized fish and not indicating that a product contained sulphite, but there were also fines for selling shellfish without indicating that it had been frozen, omitting details of how it had been thawed.

Selling products without specifying their origin were also sanctioned.

In all, the Seprona officers impounded 150 kilos of different types of shellfish, which was handed over to the regional government's Health department.

Eighty-five kilos of smallfry too immature to be legally sold were sent to the department of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Snatched from traffickers


POLICE rescued 808 protected mammals, birds and reptiles from traffickers and poachers in Alicante Province last year.

Working in conjunction with the regional government's Environment department, the National Police intensified operations in Alicante Province in 2017, arresting 10 people as the result of 17 investigations that recovered 407 birds and reptiles as well as assorted mammals and even tropical snails. Not all were exotic in origin and many were protected native animals at risk of extinction.

They confiscated 546 illegal traps that included the classic type as well as cage traps for capturing live animals and birds. These finds then led them to trace the illegal sale of these banned devices, particularly those obtained via the social media.

Interpol now place environmental offences, motivated principally by the profits that can be made by criminal networks, as a crime category that has grown the most at international level, the National

All their operations were orientated towards protecting endangered species, preventing their sale and safeguarding Alicante Province's wildlife. This also covered preventing the introduction of invasive species which would have a negative impact on the area's ecological balance.

Forestry brings mutual benefits

LA NUCIA'S woodland clearing and fire prevention project began last month and will continue until June.

The initiative organised by La Nucia Town Hall, will be funded with an € 18,039 subsidy from the region's official employment office, SERVEF and the national government's Ministry of Employment under the EMCORP programme.

The funding will cover six months' wages for two workmen who were registered as unemployed and have been selected by SERVEF.

The EMCORP programme engages the unemployed while teaching them a trade to help them find work in future. In La Nucia's case, the two men will be trained in forestry, clearing wooded areas on municipally-owned land, especially in zones adjoining residential areas, to eliminate the risk of forest fire.

As fire is an ever-present hazard in the area. iobs are often available for workers with this type of experience, explained Citizens' Participation councillor Pepe Cano.

"Employment is one of the town hall's priorities and we are demonstrating this by taking advantage of all lines of help and subsidies from public bodies," Cano continued.

"This forestry EMCORP has enabled us to find work for two people for six months, but as well as learning a trade they will be working for the common good of La Nucia," he said.

T-shirt was a burning issue

A MAN accused of burning 2.2 hectares of woodland in the Font Roja national park faces a two-year prison term.

According to Fiscalia (the Public Prosecution department) he was walking with a friend along the Via Verde (Green Path) when he placed a t-shirt on a stone and set fire to it with a lighter.

He took no safety measures although this happened in July 2014 when the accused was aware there was a considerable fire risk owing to climate con-

ditions at that time of the year, Fiscalia said.

The flames soon spread to the surrounding woodland, burning 2.2 hectares of the national park and causing €2,009 of immediate damage, while extinguishing the fire required two firefighting aircraft and six fire engines.

These cost almost € 17,000 to deploy and the Generalitat, the Alicante Diputacion and Alcoy City Council are now claiming compensation via an Alicante criminal court.

The ultralight was not based at Muchamiel, aerodrome sources confirmed, and the pilot - thought to be British or American - was making a stopover there.

Neither the helicopter pilot nor its eight other occupants were hurt in the collision, although the seriously injured ultralight pilot was unconscious when medical staff went to his aid, the Generalitat's emergency services con-

He regained consciousness after paramedics carried out CPR before he was transferred by ambulance to Alicante General Hospital.

A SUDDEN surge in flu cases is saturating A & E departments at Alicante Province hospitals and health centres.

With primary care centres closing each afternoon over the Christmas holidays, appointments are being made for more than a week ahead and as only scaled-down staff are dealing with emergencies, pa-

tients are going to their nearest hospital.

Unlike other years when flu cases tend to spread from north Alicante to southern areas, the pattern has been reversed, according to Health department sources.

The director of Virgen de Los Lirios de Alcoy, Jose Manuel Molto, confirmed that the Alcov Public Health area was one of the most affected zones in the province.

There was 'high activity' in both primary care centres and A & E although most cases were elderly people with existing health problems.

"All patients who need it will be admitted to hospital. Beds are available in all the hospitals," Health department sources emphasised.

Faced with the sudden increase, both Observation and the Admissions Holding Unit are saturated at San Juan hospital, where A & E have received extra staff.

Sources at the hospital lamented that the public does not make correct use of the services that are available. Health centres are open in the morning and for emergencies in the evening, they said, and patients should only go to hospital as a last resort. "Half of the cases that we see should not be coming to A & E," they said.



during the Valencia region's Guerra de las Germanias (War of the Guilds) in the 16th century.

The cemetery is referred to in several books including those of the Alicante writer Gabriel Miro.

A new and more accessible cemetery was built in 1945 on the outskirts of the town the old burial ground was abandoned. It was restored in recent years by the town hall and included in those parts of the town with links to Miro who was fascinated by the cemetery.

Ministry funds for roof repairs

CALLOSA Town Hall will purchase a 796-square metre plot of land adjoining the town washhouse.


As reported in the Euro Weekly News in November, the 18th century structure's roof collapsed in the early hours of the morning although the troughs themselves were undamaged.

Later inspections

revealed that a wall supporting the roof was affected by damp, caused by torrential rain in January last year.

With this acquisition, the town hall hopes to protect the washhouse, which is catalogued as an Asset of Local Relevance, as well as the adjoining zone, explained Callosa's mayor Josep Saval.

The town hall has presented its rebuilding

plans to the provincial council, the Diputacion, for submission to the Ministry of Hacienda and Public Administrations which allocates funds for repairs to municipal infrastructure damaged by natural disasters.

Once the €75,000 purchase agreement is signed the town hall hopes to enlarge the area round the washhouse to include a recreation zone, Saval said.

Andrea's family are asking how her ex-partner could prey on her so easily. When she finally broke up with Llorens her mother contacted the 016 helpline for gender violence victims who put Andrea in touch with the 24-Hour Women's Centre in Castellon.

Although her case was catalogued by the Centre as 'high risk"' nobody alerted the courts. Andrea had no protection until December 13 when a judge issued the restraining order against Llorens.

On December 15 a Local Police officer was assigned to protect Andrea although the police maintained their own 'medium risk' evaluation and days later Llorens was able to abduct her at knifepoint.

She was the 56th woman to lose her life at an abusive partner's hands in Spain last year.



App to the rescue

ALICANTE University researchers have developed a smartphone app for use in emergencies when mobile communications are down.

The project's leader, Professor Jose Angel Berna, explained that even though there is no signal, once the app is activated the phone sends out a Wi-Fi signal which becomes a distress beacon that can be picked up over a distance of several kilome-

The signal contains the user's GPS coordinates together with a short text message describing the emergency that can be picked up by rescue crews using a

small receptor equipped with an antenna.

The system has already been successfully tested by the Guardia Civil's Special Mountain Rescue Groups and the Maritime Rescue Service.

"No existing system uses Wi-Fi to geolocate a smartphone," said Professor Berna. "Some devices allow you to detect signals from a smartphone which they pinpoint through triangulation but they cost around €80,000 and have to be used with a helicopter."

Once the receptor devices are in production, these could cost as little as €600, Berna added.

La Malladeta made easier

The town hall's Historic Heritage Department has ensured that the surface on the new section is in keeping with the existing path while making it accessible for baby-buggies and wheelchairs.

Vilamuseu and the department have have carried out a cleaning operation along the path with maintenance for the "museumised" excavations at the Sanctuary directed by the municipal archaeologist Diego Ruiz.

Each year the Historic Heritage department adds another 'museumised' phase to the Malladeta site but this year's programme is particularly relevant because these can now be enjoyed by all members of the public, including those with mobility problems.

Vilamuseu, the Casa Museo la Barbera dels Aragones, the Sant Josep tower and El Castell Cultura Park are also accessible to all, and even the wreck of the Bou Ferrer Roman galley can be visited at certain times, including those with mobility problems.

Solbes ceded the use and management of these aquifers, the Sacos wells, to the Regantes de Callosa, guaranteeing that the valuable water he had given the town would never have to depend exclusively on one body.

Instead, Solbes decided, it would always be necessary to reach consensus over an asset that has since been so important to the town's pros-

From lookout tower to music centre

Once completed the Ansaldo complex will showcase San Juan's position at the heart of the Huerta de Alicante with an

interpretive centre. It will also further traditional links to music, as the town is home to Sociedad Musical La Paz, which together with the Conservatorio Profesional teaches 600 pupils.

The first phase will involve clearing

the site of rubble before consolidating the buildings, replacing their rafters and repairing the roof.

Work is expected to take four months and most of the €239,000 cost will be met by the Diputacion.

Peak death

A SECOND climber in two weeks has died after suffering a fall on the Mulhacén peak of the Sierra Nevada in the province of Granada, Andalucia.

Stabbing horror

A WOMAN has been stabbed to death by her husband in front of their three children.

After killing his partner the alleged attacker attempted to kill himself.

The 112 emergency control centre in Castilla-La Mancha said the crime took place in Azuqueca de Henares (Guadalajara).

The three children, who were at home at the time of the murder of their mother, are being counselled by a specialist Red Cross team.

Boy loses ears in dog attack

A THREE-YEAR-OLD boy has lost both ears and suffered bites to his face and left thigh after being attacked by a dog in Madrid.

The child is in a 'serious but stable' condition in Madrid's La Paz hospital after suffering the attack by a bull terrier on a farm in the town of El Molar, north of the capital.

Catalan crisis 'cost €1 billion'

crisis has cost the country €1 billion already.

Luis de Guindos told Spanish radio that a slowdown in the region's growth - following the illegal independence referendum - has hit the country's economy.

"Cataluña used to have growth above that of Spain, it was one of the drivers of the Spanish economy," Mr de Guindos said.

He blamed the previous regional government for generating 'enormous uncertainty, concern and a loss of confidence.' Growth was reduced from 0.9 per cent to 0.4 per cent in the last quarter, he claimed.

Last month's election failed to provide a decisive result, with separatists retaining a slim majorof the result. Pro-unity party Ciudadanos, led by Ines Arrimadas, won the most seats.

According to reports, 3,100 companies have moved their headquarters out of the region as a result of the ongoing crisis.

The Spanish government dissolved the regional parliament and called snap elections after an unauthorised independence referendum prompted the government to declare independence.

Various politicians were arrested, and some including the former president Carles Puidgemont - fled. So far a government has not been formed.

Deposed Catalan leader Puigdemont, whose party came second in the elections, is still in selfimposed exile in Belgium.





Foundation problems?

Carlos Baos We can help you.



I BOUGHT a house four years ago from a developer in Javea; unfortunately, significant cracks have appeared in the house. It looks as if the problem is that the foundations are not properly dug bearing in mind the soil on which the house is built (clay). Who is liable? What can we do?

Dear Reader Thank you for your enquiry. As mentioned in previous articles for construction works, in respect of which planning permission was requested after May 2000 the Law of Construction Planning (LOE) applies.

We understand that missing or incorrect inclusion in the project of the property of the soil material, problems and other circumstances etc are within the responsibility of the senior architect (arquitecto superior) as he, as author of the project, should assess the quality and type of soil and make decisions concerning proper construction.

Therefore, the senior architect should have taken into account the circumstances of the plot, but not only that, he should also have been able to foresee whether these would affect the future of the building and if so, he should have taken the necessary steps to design a solution that would avoid what unfortunately appears to have occurred.

On numerous occasions, different courts have referred to this and the Supreme Court of Spain declared: "the prior examination of the soil, verifying it or at least checking its analysis and subsequent geological survey personally, is a fundamental obligation of the senior architect's obligations that in any case are demanded by the dignity and competence inherent to their profession."

The fact that the senior architect is responsible does not mean that you cannot claim against the other persons involved in the construction process as per the LOE, such as the technical architect, contractor, insurance company, etc. All possibilities should be studied.

We recommend the next step to be taken, is to call in an architect expert in building defects to ascertain whether the cracks are still moving as well as the reasons, causes, consequences and possible solutions of the problem. The expert report is key in the event of a future claim.

We understand that you must get expert legal advice on building defects, as a legal strategy must be set up, in order to determine against who you can and should claim. It is essential to notify the potential respondent of the damages as soon as possible, as there are some deadlines to claim that must be fulfilled.

As in previous articles, we recommend a visit to our office or to another lawyer expert in this field. It is sensible to involve the lawyer from the beginning.

Traffic deaths up again

Spain's roads has increased for the second year in a row after more than 14 years of reducing numbers

Up until December 19 a total of 1,169 people have died on the roads in 2017 a figure that already exceeds the total for 2016, when there were 1,161 deaths. According to provisional data from the Direccion General de Trafico (DGT) 2017 becomes the second consecutive year that has seen increases in the number of fatalities on the roads after 14 of deaths. 


Recognition for local businesswomen

EU funds to preserve Javea's history

THE council will ask for European funds to restore the air raid shelter in the port, which dates back to 1938 and stretches about 20 metres into the hillside. The council wants to restore it and turn it into a museum, creating an audio-visual to illustrate the terror of the Civil War.

Radars is structured through the creation of a neighbourhood network made up of 'radars': neighbours, businesses, associations, clubs and resident communities.

The radars will work to identify loneliness and social isolation of Javea's elderly residents, so that they can seek community resources.

Loneliness and social isolation are important health risks in the elderly, according to a study of WHO (World Health Organisation).

Reduced social contact, being alone, isolation and feelings of loneliness are associated with a reduced quality of life.

Councillor, Pepa Gisbert said, "we hope that people will act with humanity and solidarity and be sensitive to the issue," and expressed her greatest

thanks to the Valencian government for its support. In the last two years it has more than doubled Javea's social services budget.



Woman found after EWN appeal

A MISSING woman who had not been seen for a month was located 12 hours after a Euro Weekly News story asked for information about her whereabouts was published online.

Caroline 'Caz' Williams, 66, was last seen on November 22 when she collapsed in Moraira before being taken to Denia Hospital. Friends were growing concerned about her welfare, since she has a number of serious medical conditions.

Speaking before Caz was found, Garnett's wife John said: "Something serious has happened, but let's hope it's not extreme.

"Those people who know her are very concerned. We really have no knowledge of where she might have been."

Miss Knight added: "Caz has, unfortunately, been diagnosed with leukaemia in an advanced stage and will now need home care as they want to discharge her - so it's lucky that we are around at this time this year to offer some support.

"We are just so very grateful for your online announcement - it worked so quickly!

"Thank you so much for the vital help that your staff gave us. Definitely a Christmas gift that no-one was expecting."

Dublin vigil for Amy Fitzpatrick Decade since 15-year-old vanished in Spain

AMY FITZPATRICK went missing from southern Spain a decade ago.

She had been babysitting with her friend Ashley Rose in Riviera del Sol, near Mijas Costa on the Costa del Sol on New Year's Eve 2007. Amy left Ashley at 10pm for the 10minute walk home but didn't arrive.

But she never arrived home and has not been heard from or seen since that night.

Amy was officially declared missing on January 3, 2008

Searches did not find any trace of Amy, nor has she been seen again since that fateful night.

Ashley says that Amy had her mobile phone with her when she left, yet this was found at the apartment where she lived during police

To mark the 10th anniversary of her disappearance Amy's father Christopher and her family and

friends attended a vigil at Mansion House in Dublin at which the Lord Mayor was also present. A piper and the release of white doves also took

Amy - who was then aged just 15 - had moved to Spain with her mum Audrey following the break-up of her parents' marriage.

She lived with her mother and mother's partner Dave Mahon.

Mahon is serving a seven-year prison sentence after he stabbed Amy's brother Dean to death in Dublin in 2013. The trial jury dismissed Mahon's claims that Dean deliberately took his own life by running onto a knife Mahon was

Every year since daughter Amy went missing, mother Audrey has made the lonely journey from Ireland to southern Spain as a mark of respect. But not this year.

Weekly News that although she had booked her flight to Malaga so that she could once again try to jog memories and publicly remind everyone that the 15-year-old mysteriously vanished on the short walk

home, she decided that she couldn't do it again this year.

"We have made appeals, produced posters, spoken to people locally, prayed and have had support from the press but all to no avail. At the moment, I'm simply too tired to make it over this year although my thoughts are constantly with my daughter," she continued.

Amy's dad Christopher recently told the Sunday World newspaper, "I am still devastated over the loss of my two children. Amy and Dean. Things will never be the same again.

"I would like to ask people, who were there 10 years ago when Amy went missing and may have information they can now share, to con-

"People went back to the UK and different parts of the world afterwards, and they should come for-

"We just want to find Amy. We know where Dean is, but to bring Amy home would be great."



GBP set to end the year weaker, EUR/USD up 16 cents



THIS year was another dramatic year for the major currencies. Read our summary of the year's biggest news, and find out what you should be looking out for in the year ahead.

Latest currency news

Over the last 12 months the GBP/EUR exchange rate has fallen from €1.17 to €1.13, EUR/GBP has risen from £0.85 to £0.88 and EUR/USD has advanced from \$1.04 to \$1.20.

What's been happening?

Brexit continued to dog the pound in 2017. Slow progress in negotiations kept Sterling under pressure throughout the year, but it was political news that inspired the most significant GBP movements.

Prime Minister, Theresa May's decision to call a snap election back in April initially drove the pound to its best levels of the year, but an ill-judged campaign saw the Conservatives lose their majority and Sterling lose its strength.

The pound's been battling its way back over the last few months, despite concerns that the Bank of England (BoE) will leave interest rates on hold next

year after raising borrowing costs for the first time in over a decade in November.

However, while the British government finally concluded the first stage of Brexit negotiations, concerns that the second stage could prove just as protracted prevented the pound from seeing much ben-

In terms of euro movement, the early half of the year was dominated by fears of a rise of populism, with the common currency unsettled by speculation that elections in the Netherlands and France could result in victory for Eurosceptic parties.

These fears proved unfounded, and the euro

gained after Emmanuel Macron secured victory in France, However, a surprising result in September's German elections left the common currency on less stable ground during the last quarter of the year.

Although the Eurozone's economic recovery continues apace, stagnant Eurozone inflation, and the expectation that the European Central Bank (ECB) will choose to leave monetary policy accommodative for the foreseeable future have conspired to limit the euro's gains against the pound.

EUR/USD has surged by around 16 cents this year, however, despite the Federal Reserve increasing interest rates three times.

What do you need to look out for?

The currency market in 2017 has certainly been a volatile one and 2018 looks set to be equally event-

The outlook for pound exchange rates is highly dependent on the second phase of Brexit negotiations. Progress would be Sterling supportive, while delayed or fractious trade discussions could send GBP lower.

The BoE interest rate hike outlook will also be key to how GBP performs in the months ahead. Sterling will benefit if wage growth rises, inflation remains persistently high, and the odds of a rate hike in 2018 improve.

Meanwhile, the euro could be boosted if the political situation in Germany stabilises and Eurozone data continues outperforming forecasts.

However, as it would take a notable uptick in consumer price pressures to significantly alter the ECB's stance on monetary policy, EUR exchange rates may be restrained by inaction from the central

A vital bid has been received for Niki More flights to Spain

IT would seem that the New Year may bring some positive news for Austrian and German travellers to Spain as IAG hopes to purchase Niki Airline for €20 million.

Originally founded by former racing driver, Niki Lauda, the Austrian holiday airline suffered from its association with Air Berlin which was declared insolvent in August after main shareholder Etihad Airlines (of the United Arab Emirates) withdrew its

Whilst Air Berlin cancelled its flights at that time. Niki continued. with support, in the hope and expectation that it would be rescued by Lufthansa, but when the European Commission expressed its concern over the possible takeover by the German company of both Air Berlin and Niki, the 'plug was pulled' and Niki ceased trading.

With flights to seven Spanish destinations including Malaga and Palma de Mallorca, the Austrian airline was an important link for Austrian

and German holidaymakers and its closure alongside Air Berlin was not helpful to the Spanish tourist econo-

Niki Lauda had himself indicated that he would be interested in taking back the airline, but the liquidators appear to prefer the concept of IAG (owner of Aer Lingus, BA, Iberia and Vueling) injecting funds into the failed airline and relaunching as an

In addition to the initial purchase price of €20 million, IAG has indicated that it will keep on some 740 staff and will spend a further € 16.5 million on assimilating the airline into the group.

The acquisition which still has to be approved by the EU will bring with it 15 aircraft and a number of important landing rights in Austria, Germany, Spain and Switzerland.

Approval has already been given for easyJet to take over Air Berlin's base at Tegel Airport in Berlin and it will operate internal German flights, but also regular flights from the German capital to Palma de Mallorca, having taken over a number of routes from the bankrupt airline.

Although fairly vocal in its criticism of the support given by the German government to Lufthansa in its bid to obtain ownership of Air Berlin. Irish based airline, Ryanair has currently missed out on the opportunity to add to its fleet.

Future car production looking positive

THE Spanish automobile industry is forecast to produce three million vehicles in 2018 according to Spain's Association of Car Manufacturers (ANFAC).

This would bring production back to the same level as 10 years ago when the world financial crisis struck

In 2017 production was broadly the same as 2016 with an estimated 2.8 million vehicles being produced, but the future forecast is positive because of the need to increase the number of alternative energy vehicles for the internal

With the value of the automobile industry representing nearly 10 per cent of Spain's GDP, any significant movement in production and sales will be good for the economy.

FOLLOWING a suspension in trading in its shares, Irish company EQTEC has returned to the UK AIM market following a € 16 million take-over of a Spanish company. This was a somewhat complicated arrangement as the deal was technically a reverse take-over of a fellow subsidiary of its Spanish par-

The all share arrangement saw it gain ownership of Eqtec Iberia which specialises in the design, construction, operation and maintenance of power plants.

EQTEC which produces energy from waste products believes that

the Spanish company's EGT gasification technology will help the Irish company to extend its involvement with energy projects in the UK.

Coinciding with the acquisition, EQTEC issued a further 246.5 million shares at a heavily discounted price to raise £1.6 million (€1.8 million) of working capital and installed a new board of directors.

The new Irish company with access to both the British and European market believes that it is now ideally placed to become a leading player in the creation of electricity by converting waste into synthetic

Disney to expand its coverage through pay TV

THE Disney Company has its eyes firmly fixed on expansion of its services within Spain and has entered into two deals with major telecoms suppliers.

On December 22, it launched Movistar Disney, as part of the Movistar+ pay TV offer which is a 24-hour a day service broadcasting a whole range of different Disney-owned properties.

In addition to cartoons and children's programmes, it will also be supplying the latest and classic movies from both Walt Disney Studio and Pixar which includes the Pirates of the Caribbean franchise and a whole selection of animated films such as Toy Story.

Existing subscribers to Movistar+ will receive this new channel at no addition-

To add to its coverage in Spain, the company which had an estimated worldwide turnover of \$55 billion (€46 billion) has also signed a new deal with Vodafone's Videoclub which supplies video-ondemand through set-top boxes and Vodafone TV Online.

Some of the Disney channels are already available to view with Vodafone TV Online contracts, but the video-on-demand option is a new pay service which not only gives access to the studio's movie selections (including some Star Wars products) but also allows subscribers to see pay-TV channels, Disney Channel, Disney XD and Disney Junior seven days before other sup-



seat and can just about steer the thing. It's surprising how few of us can manage to even switch on the wipers, as it were.



When the boss finally appears Dr S explains the room is totally unsuitable for a disabled person and, on top

of that, the room is really shabby. The boss, who was nice and polite, agreed and said, 'I suggest you find somewhere else to stay!'

So there we were - Christmas Eve and there's no room at the inn! Sound like a familiar story? There was nothing else to do but go last-minute shopping for food, pressies and now a hotel room.

As luck would have it, the extraordinarily expensive, beautiful hotel just down the road we had originally discounted due to the horrendous price, had had a cancellation. So our budget trip turned into an expensive but luxurious outing and a good time was had by all.

One thing I did find strange was that on Christmas Eve the only food choice at this fabulous hotel was either a £75 per head fivecourse dinner or nothing! No room service literally nothing - which I thought was a bit out of order. LEGALLY SPEAKING

Time to check your lights again

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



ESSENTIAL: Working lights.

ALTHOUGH we are getting closer to the time when the evenings start to get lighter, the lights on our vehicles have possibly been in use more than ever, and so it's a good time to check that all of the lights on our vehicles are fully working.

Until quite recently, all vehicles had to carry a spare set of bulbs, this is no longer the case. The Spanish government recognised that changing a bulb is no longer a simple task, and in many cases can only be done by qualified mechanics, and so carrying a spare set was pointless, if the ability to change the bulbs had been removed.

However, it is still important to check all of the lights on a regular basis, even those not used too often, such as fog lights.

It is better to have an assistant to help you do this so that one of you can be in the car operating the switches, the other on the outside monitoring

Remember, check every light, headlights (including full beam), indicators and hazard lights (front and back), rear lights and brake lights, reversing and fog lights, and the lights that illuminate the number plate at the rear.

If your vehicle is a modern one you might also have Daytime Running Lights installed. Although these lights are often more reliable than traditional lights, on account of them being LEDs, they should also be checked on a regular

If you don't have anybody to help you can still carry out the checks by using reflective surfaces such as shop windows or other parked vehicles. Make sure you do this in an isolated location though as you don't want to confuse other mo-

If any of the lights have failed make sure you get them replaced immediately as it is an offence to drive with defective lights.

Can their plan work?

common-law couple and gives you many husband and wife benefits, such as lower inheritance tax. You need a good lawyer to see you through this.

Greens and animal rightists are vociferous against hunting, yet they contribute little in terms of actual payment towards habitat preservation. The more habitat lost to agriculture and housing development the less wildlife there will be. Only when game becomes a contributor

to economics is its existence guaranteed. In Africa, indeed in most countries nowadays where there are wildlife reservations, most game reserves receive more funding from highly controlled 'unpopular' hunting, often as controlled culling, than from other visitors and tourists' fees.

Brain food

IT has often been said oily fish is good for us.

But scientists at the University of Pennsylvania have found eating fish just once a week can have a dramatic effect on IQ and sleep quality of children.

In a study of more than 500 children aged nine to 11 in China, the study showed children who ate oily fish weekly scored an average of 4.8 IQ points higher than children who rarely ate the food. Children who 'sometimes' did still scored 3.3 points higher than those who 'never' did.

Professor Adrian Raine, the study's lead author, explained fish was also shown to have a positive impact on

sleep and behaviour, saying, "lack of sleep is associated with antisocial behaviour and poor cognition is associated with antisocial behaviour. We have found that omega-3 supplements reduce antisocial behaviour, so it's not too surprising that fish is behind this."

He added, "doing that could be a lot easier than nudging children about going to bed," concluding, "'if the fish improves sleep, great. If it also improves cognitive performance - like we've seen here - even better. It's a double hit."

Scientists encourage parents to introduce children to eating oily fish from around 10 months old.



Flamenco and the real thing

MANY visitors to Spain wander into restaurants which offer Flamenco shows without often understanding the tradition or history behind this very special and not necessarily typical Spanish obsession.

This is very much an art form of southern Spain which is attributed to the arrival of the Romany gypsy population which made its way to Spain from India in the 15th century and there is no doubt that many of the most famous Flamenco performers came and continue to come from the gypsy world.

It has to be remembered however that Spain in the middle ages in particular had a huge cross culture with Jewish settlers and Moors who also added their traditions to the Flamenco style which was not really recognised until the 18th century.

Originally it was dance only, an expression of the feeling of the performers and their compatriots but it expanded to include voices and instruments with hand claps and shouts of encouragement from the audience.

Nowadays, the Flamenco style is more popular than ever, not just in Spain but on an international basis and it is said that there are more Flamenco academies in Japan than in Spain whilst in America there are even heavy metal bands who incorporate Flamenco into their musical style.

These Peña which are most numerous in Almeria and along the Costa del Sol into Cadiz Province as well as Sevilla serve simple food and drink, but are not drinking clubs rather, temples to the Canto Jondo (deep song) style which can be very moving yet to some ears is rather cacophonous. This singing is accompanied by guitar and cajon (the wooden box drum on which the drummer sits).

Dance is another intricate part of Flamenco with both men and women performing to a very high standard. On occasion you can witness duels between the musicians and the dancers to see who can be the fastest and yet most accurate performer.

So as you enjoy Flamenco in a specialist restaurant, remember that there is a whole world of culture where every movement of a dancer has a meaning and that the very fact of being of gypsy extraction saw many disappear during the Civil War.

WHILE Lambrusco is not among Italy's best wines it is one of the leaders in export sales and can be found in wine shops and supermarkets throughout Spain.

Lambrusco is the name of an Italian red grape and the wine from Emilia Romagna and Lombardy has a history

dating to Etruscan's times. Most Lambrusco is made from more than one variety and often blended to a maximum 15 per cent with other grapes, including Ancellotta, Marzemino, Malbo Gentile

and Cabernet Sauvignon. Mostly frizzante (slightly sparkling), Lambrusco can be secco (dry), amabile (semi-sweet) and dolce (sweet).

It is typically made using the Charmat process with a second fermentation conducted in a pressurised tank. While the grape is not particularly sweet, most commercial Lambrusco is sweetened with the addition of grape must.

Lambrusco denominations are:



LAMBRUSCO: An alternative to Spanish wine.

Grasparossa di Castelvetro: From the smallest producing region, typically dry, full bodied, tannic with a deep purplishred colour.

Mantovano: The only Lambrusco from Lombardy, either dry or semi-dry.

> Reggiano: The most exported and made from up to four types of Lambrusco grapes: Maestri, Marani, Montericco, and Salamino with up to 15 per cent Ancellotta.

> Salamino di Santa Croce: Consists of at least 90 per cent of

Salamino grapes; frizzante, light in colour and body and semi-sweet or dry.

Di Sorbara: Regarded as the highest quality; fragrant, with high acidity and berry flavours with deep ruby colour.

Generally inexpensive with little complexity and easy to drink, unfortunately the quality of exported Lambrusco rarely equals that found in its native region.





HOUSE prices shot up by 2 per cent in the final quarter of 2017. The average cost per square metre now stands at $\in 1,228$.

The easy way to grow your own fresh and tasty potatoes even in a small space

GRAEME TYRRELL

IF you have even had the privilege of eating home grown potatoes from an organic garden you will probably always be disappointed with commercially grown potatoes.

The difference in taste is dramatic as the additional micronutrients give a flavour and vigour to the potatoes that is hard to find from most potatoes in the market place.

The problem with growing your own potatoes though is the hard work to harvest them from the soil and the damage that can occur when digging with ordinary home garden tools

There is an easy way however to make the growing and harvesting much more enjoyable and productive without the hard work. Some potatoes can even be grown in containers on your balcony or terrace with good results from following a few simple steps.

If you have a vegetable garden this procedure has been well proven to work in northern Europe with less weeding and the ability to selectively harvest the best potatoes and let the rest continue to grow and mature.

The procedure is quite simple and just requires straw and a nutrient rich compost with plenty of manure included to provide ample nitrogen and other essential growth elements.



SEED POTATOES: Ready to plant.

In the garden you need to have a way of containing the potato bed. You can dig a trench in the soil, just get some hay bales to act as a wall to surround the area you want to grow the potatoes in or use blocks, bricks or wood planks to make raised bed on the soil surface to the size you want.

Add the straw and compost

in layers or mixed together to fill the trench, raised bed or container about 15cm deep. Place seed potatoes at about 30cm apart in all directions in the garden for the largest potatoes, but they can be 20cm apart in containers for smaller but a more plentiful harvest.

Next, cover the seed potatoes with layers of straw and compost another 15cm deep. The straw/compost mixture will settle and the growing potatoes will need to be covered, so more mixture will need to be added.

It is important to keep covering the emerging potato plants around the base of the plant to ensure that the expanding potatoes growing from the roots are not ex-

posed to the light as they will turn green and will not be suitable for eating.

This method requires regular watering but as the mixture holds the water so well it requires less watering than soil based culture. Weeds are much less of a problem and are much easier to remove from the mixture.

Harvest is easy as you can just lift the straw to check the progress of the potatoes and remove the potatoes that you consider ready and leave the rest to keep growing until needed. Just make sure you press back the mixture to exclude the light from the roots and remaining potatoes.

It's a great way to enjoy delicious potatoes without the hard work.

- Get him used to being away from you sometimes in another room, or indoor kennel ('crate'), and ban him from the nursery.
- Take a refresher course at a training school, and think about practice walks with the pram - it can be trickier than it sounds!



- Check with your vet about canine hygiene and worming.

When your baby is born your dog may be left for hours while you are in hospital, or upset by the excitement if you are at home. Arrange for someone he knows to look after/walk him. It is an old wive's tale (letting your dog drink breast milk or play with dirty nappies) this will not help your dog

and baby to become friends, but sending home a blanket that the baby has slept on may help your dog to get used

When you come home let someone

else hold your baby while you greet your dog: introduce them later when he is calm. Do not try to keep your dog and baby completely apart, you won't be able to keep it up!

Teach them both to interact calmly and gently, no licking by the dog or grabbing by the child.

Never ever leave dogs alone with babies or young children; shut your dog out of the room or pop the baby in a secure play-pen. This applies every time you use the bathroom, answer the door/phone or get a meal. It is not a matter of 'trust.'

Toddlers can accidentally injure or alarm dogs (eg by falling on them) and startled dogs may react impulsively, lashing out or biting.

The most tolerant dog needs peace and quiet sometimes; allow him a place (eg his bed) he can escape to without being followed. Allow the child to go there at other times to prevent it becoming an exclusive area which he feels entitled to defend.

When your baby starts to crawl and walk teach your dog to step back out of her way in doorways and on stairs.







The German giant has revealed plans for 30 new electric models to be released by 2025, including a green-friendly remake of its legendary microbus.

Named the Buzz, the electric hippie wagon is slated for release in 2022 and appeared for a test run in the fitting location of Venice Beach, California.

Other electric concept cars unveiled include a hatchback and crossover SUV, which should both be in production by 2020. Most of the buzz will be about the Buzz, which is suitably colourful in a two-tone yellow and has spin around front seats that can face backwards.

Back in the realm of reality, Volkswagen is enjoying rave reviews for its new T-Roc SUV. It has now debuted in the UK and

across Europe, with the 114hp 1.0 litre TSI model with frontwheel drive and a manual gearbox expected to be the top seller.

Though with a slightly less

powerful engine than other SUVs in a packed market, the T-Roc is advertised as perfect for nipping around town and is 225kg lighter than previous models. It is similar to Audi's O2 and smaller than Volkswagen's own Tiguan.

It is mechanically basic but practical and modern, with no elaborate 4Motion all-wheel drifotainment system, two-climate control system, and optional

comes with a three-year, 60,000 mile warranty. There are no electric or hybrid options, aiming at the petrol market. UK prices begin at around £20,000 (€22,500).

Built in Britain

BREXIT and diesel concerns have seen British drivers lose their appetite for British-built cars. Domestic demand for cars built in the UK crashed by almost 30 per cent at the tail end of 2017.

Exports rose but couldn't make up for the drop in domestic sales. Now 85 per cent of all cars built in Britain are sold abroad. Overall in 2017 domestic demand dropped by 9 per cent, leading to an overall decline of 2 per cent.

The Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders (SMMT), cites Brexit uncertainty and diesel tax confusion as reasons for the demand drop.

Chief executive Mike Hawes said the figures show the importance of negotiations with the EU over Britain's future car trade with the bloc.

Subaru Outback SE Premium

THERE are plenty of four-wheel-drive models to tackle tough terrain and there are many SUV models which are great on the tarmac but less so off-road.

There are also many people who would like a combination of the two, and the Mitsubishi Outback is an outstanding example of a vehicle able to take on this dual role. It is a formidable off-roader which is also at home on city streets, an ideal blend for those who meld urban and rural lifestyles.

The Outback is quite refined to drive, very well equipped, looks stylish and classy and prices start at €37,197 (£32,995). There is a sporty 2.5 litre petrol model for those seeking sharper performance but for most, the well-proven 148 hp 2.0 litre diesel will be the choice, and this was the version I tested.

In SE Premium Lineartronic trim, with CVT auto transmission and all wheel drive, it costs €39,452 (£34,995) and is exceptionally well equipped. Standard kit includes alloy wheels, roof rails, auto LED lights and wipers, powered tailgate,

leather upholstery, powered and heated front seats, slide/tilt sunroof, privacy glass, seven-inch touchscreen infotainment system, Bluetooth, sat-nav, connectivity, adaptive cruise control, dual-zone climate control, reversing camera, hill start and hill descent assist, keyless entry and push-button start.

It also has plenty of safety features including multi-airbags, blind-spot warning, lane-change assist and rear cross-traffic assist. Top speed is 191 kph (119 mph) and the 0-100 kph time of 9.9 seconds is nippy for a vehicle of this size and weight. It is quite frugal too - fuel economy is 16.4 kpl (46.3 mpg).






The Spaniard tweeted: "I am sorry to announce I won't be coming to Brisbane this
