Stab battle

A MAN is to appear in a Vera court after seven people were injured in a petrol station brawl.

Police said in a statement that the accused is a 29-year-old man from Mojacar with the initials RVT.

He is accused of stabbing a 38-year-old woman in the thigh during a fight involving at least eight people from two families

The scuffle broke out at a petrol station on the N340 road in Los Gallardos, with six others hurt in addition to the stab victim, who was taken to hospital in Huercal-Overa.

The suspect has a long criminal record and was most recently arrested in November for damaging 10 cars in one night in different streets in Vicar and La Mojonera.

Plant pot disguise

TWO burglars were surprised by police inside a Huercal de Almeria home they had broken into. Guardia Civil and Local Police worked together to apprehend the two local men, aged 26 and 30.

They were caught thanks to a neighbour who spotted a hooded man sneaking into the property shortly after midnight on Friday. Two police patrols were dispatched to the scene and found the window smashed.

At that moment one burglar peeked out the window and saw the officers. He began running along the rooftop connecting neighbouring apartment buildings. A neighbour gave police access to the communal rooftop and they were able to surprise the thief at the other

Other officers then spotted a second burglar hiding behind a large plant pot on the communal terrace. He was quickly arrested.

Never-ending story

A NEW trial of disgraced former Zurgena mayor Candido Trabalon and his four fellow accused will take place in December. As previously reported in the Euro Weekly News, the five had recently appealed against their convictions by Almeria's criminal court.

Trabalon was sentenced to six years in prison and disqualified from public office for 18 years. He and former councillor Manuel Tijeras were found guilty of helping develop and sell dozens of homes on land they knew it was illegal to build on.

Their appeal centred on whether they were guilty of bribery as well as corruption and that will be among the main questions tackled in 11 months time.

SPAIN'S fiestas are famous the world over. But the action really heats up in the early months of the vear, with carnival season sweeping in while most tourists are away.

During late January and early February, processions, costumes, songs, dancing and drink fill the streets as Spaniards party into the morning.

There are countless public celebrations across the country, though all the regional variations - particularly on theme and costume - are impossible

The festivals take place across various dates but

all in the run up to lent which some believe is the origin of carnival season: the excess before restraint.

The party season tends to take place in Christian countries and has Catholic origins. While Spanish carnivals may not have the swagger of Brazil or charm of Venice, they certainly have charm.

The public celebrations stretch across all the social divides - disregarding age, politics and class.

Social satire, mockery and plain ridiculousness tend to account for the majority of costumes.

■ SOUTHERN SOFTIES? NOT QUITE

THE most intensely celebrated events arguably take place in southern Spain. Cadiz, Andalucia, Tenerife and the Canary Islands are particular favourites with partygoers.

■ THE BIGGEST AND BEST?

FROM Las Palmas, Gran Canaria, the Santa Cruz carnival is broadcast on national television. Spain's largest event attracts around a million people every February. Frivolities reportedly date back to the 16th century and there is apparently even a drag queen gala. In 1987, 250,000 people attended a concert by Cuban singer Celia Cruz - setting a Guinness World

SARKY CADIZ

IN Cadiz, cutting costumes take a sarcastic dig at current affairs. Likewise, satirical songs highlight society's problems. But even amid the criticism, there is a playful atmosphere and party feel.

CARNIVAL QUEEN

IN Tenerife, a carnival queen is crowned - as is the case elsewhere - amid much glamour. Spectacular costumes and vibrant parades attract revellers from around the world.

Snow joke!







COLD SNAP: Spain shivers in the freezing conditions as police and soldiers battle to free thousands of cars.

SPAIN was gripped by freezing weather as snowstorms swept the country.

The icy blast sparked chaos after more than 3,000 vehicles were stranded on the AP-6 motorway between Galicia and Madrid as they returned from the weekend's Epiphany celebrations.

Many motorists were trapped for more than 18 hours leading authorities to call in the army, deploying 240 soldiers from the military emergency unit to help Guardia Civil and police officers battle snow drifts and reach them.

Some drivers took to social media to complain about the slow response by emergency

Sara Ramos told Spanish TV: "I'm with my family, there are two children: one two years old. the other six years old. The adults haven't eaten since midday yesterday. The children ate the small amount of food we brought with us, but since then they haven't eaten anything.'

But while opposition politicians called for Public Works Minister Íñigo de la Serna to appear in parliament and explain how the debacle came about, the Spanish government is probing Iberpristas, the operator of the toll road.

Mr de la Serna said that although the government owns the motorway, Iberpistas has "management responsibility," and is contractually obliged to have the means to deal with emergencies.

The icy weather was caused by a large and cold low-pressure system that formed before hanging over the Iberian Penin-

Drought concern must be addressed

SPAIN was ravaged by a freezing cold snap days after unseasonal wild fires broke out in several parts of the country. These are signs of the times, as climate change continues to hurtle the planet towards an uncertain future. And while snow has blanketed large swathes of the Iberian Peninsula in recent days, it is unlikely to be enough to lessen the effects of Spain's worst drought in decades, as national water reserves sit at just over 40 per cent of capacity.

A recent report by the national Higher Centre for Scientific Investigations showed that rising temperatures have 'increased the severity of droughts despite it raining more now than in previous dry periods.' Water for irrigation accounts for around 80 per cent of consumption, and demand has increased by 20 per cent over the last 30 years, during which construction has rocketed by 75 per cent and the Spanish population shot up by 20 per cent. But the Spanish government seems to have its fingers in its ears when it comes to water.

There are no water saving campaigns to be seen anywhere in the national or local media, the use of inefficient irrigation methods remains widespread, while desalinisation plants produce nowhere near the amount of clean water promised or remain unfinished following years of legal wrangling. Some towns even continue to dump raw human sewage into rivers or the sea as they have no means to process it. And with experts agreeing that 75 per cent of the country is susceptible to becoming a desert, Spain needs to wake up to its water woe before it is too late

Anchor action underway

A MAJOR clean-up operation of the Cabo de Gata's coastal waters is underway. Workers are draining the sea of chains, anchors, and abandoned boats that are endangering native posidonia fields.

At least 30 heavy pieces of metal have already been removed from the Agua Amarga beach in Nijar. The environmental department of Almeria's provincial council has pledged to remove all illegal anchors and chains from the waters of the protected Natural Park.

Posidonia is a range of sea grasses endemic to the Mediterranean. The underwater meadows play an essential role in marine ecosystems but are routinely damaged by boats tossing down heavy anchors and chains

By law anchoring for more than 24 hours requires express permission from the

coastal authorities. But the law is regularly flouted by fishing boats and difficult to en-

Once the Cabo de Gata waters have been cleared of damaging anchors and chains, work will begin on developing a network of ecological buoys. These will not affect the posidonia meadows and will be positioned to show fishermen the most environmentally sound areas to anchor in.

A giant leap for mankind

PLANET Earth's largest library of galaxy histories has been developed by Almeria's Calar Alto Observatory. After years of eye-straining research, astronomers have published data on the evolution of 300 different galaxies in renowned research journal Nature Astronomy.

By analysing heat, light and other physical characteristics of thousands of stars, they were able to piece together accurate pictures of the history of hundreds of galaxies over millions of years.

Researchers described the movement pattern of stars as providing a history book on the formation of galaxies. They hope their efforts will help science take a small step towards understanding the history of the universe.

Ling Zhu is one member of the international team of researchers who led the CALIFA proiect at Calar Alto. He is also a member of the Max Planck Institute which jointly manages the Observatory.

"CALIFA uses a newly developed spectroscopy technique which can observe galaxies in such a way that it shows the complete

movement of stars," he said. "This helps us put together a kinetic map of the galaxy."

With the movement history of more than 300 galaxies charted, the team believe they have created the world's biggest galaxy library.

Calar Alto, located in the Sierra de los Filabres, is one of Europe's most important observatories. It possesses the largest telescope on the continent.



New Year, same crisis

It can hold 157.7 hectometres of water but, as of Friday, contained just 8.8 hectometres.

To the west, the Beninar reservoir is just 8.2 per cent full, with a paltry 5.1 hectometres occupying a space designed for 63.

The figures come from the ministry of the environment which has described the situation in both reservoirs as critical.

The Junta de Andalucia has warned that it might have to declare an early state of drought in Almeria unless there is significant rainfall in the coming months. Problems with the Tajo-Segura and Negratin-Al-

Meanwhile, he noted, other horticultural products routinely see prices go up over Christmas.

Delay danger

FEARS are mounting that delays in the arrival of firefighters to Carboneras could lead to tragedy. The local branch of the PSOE party has requested an urgent council meeting to reduce waiting times - described as excessive - by spokesman Jose Luis Amerigo.

He said that recent fires in homes, public bins and at the port had seen fire crews take more than 40 minutes to arrive.

The PSOE has proposed a joint action plan to be signed by Carboneras, the Endesa fire brigade, and the Fire Consortium of the Levante - based in Turre - that would guarantee a faster service for residents and businesses

Endesa firefighters are currently unable to intervene in fires erupting in Carboneras due to red tape despite having a base nearby. Amerigo called for an agreement to end that anomaly.

Beauty and the beast

AN ugly piece of modern art that has been annoying local residents in a historic Almeria neighbourhood will be removed. The bust of a deformed face will be replaced with a bust of the famous Almeria painter Jesus de Perceval.

The council controversially installed the strange looking original in a small square between Calles Trajan and Antonio Ledesma. It immediately sparked outrage among the residents association, with one local leader saying it was so ugly it was unsuitable for children.

The bust soon became known locally as the pigs head and neighbours have been demanding a substitute for months.

So far there are no complaints over the replacement. Jesus de Perceval is a favourite son of the city who spearheaded the Indalo art renaissance in the post-war period. He died in 1985 having seen his work exhibited in Europe and South America's most prestigious galleries.

A FORMER Lord Mayor of Birmingham who later founded a successful Moiacar Estate Agent has died in a Nijar nursing home.

Sir Frank Price, who was 95, spent his childhood in working class Birmingham and left school at 14 to work at a tool makers.' before later leading Telford Development Corporation during the new town's construction in the 1960s and 1970s.

The ex-Labour politician and Chairman of Public Works was also a driving force behind the Midland Arts Centre, one of the first of its kind for young people in the UK, and forged ties with political leaders and royal family members around the

"I wasn't very clever or handsome," Sir Frank once said. "I don't know what it was all about, but people liked me because I wasn't a money-grabber."

He moved to Los Gallardos in Almeria during the 1980s, where he successfully started the Price Brown Partnership - which in 2016 celebrated its 30th birthday - with his wife.

Nurses' nerves shattered

A SURVEY of nurses in Almeria Province found that half felt burned out from working too much. Eight in 10 said they suffered stress and nine in 10 believe their work environment has gotten worse in recent years.

In concerning news for patients, seven in 10 said they believed that the service offered by hospitals has also deteriorated.

The study, 'Stress Perception in Nursing Professionals in Spain: 2012-2017' consulted nurses from across the nation. Almeria was one of the provinces which provided the most input.

The aim of the study was to evaluate the impact of austerity cuts on Spain's public health service in the past five years.

"In primary care there have been dramatic cuts of up to half of all staff," said Jose Gonzalez. president of the SATSE nurses union in Almeria.

"That has resulted in the remaining staff becoming extremely overworked and burned out."

Inventor's beach lockers

Marin has already secured a patent for his invention and says the potential applications are endless. It could also be used in parks, shopping centres, and airports.

The set of several dozen lockers come in a prefabricated box made from sustainable and recycled materials. The box can charge itself using renewable energy to ensure a constant supply.

It is easy to assemble and comes with security cameras, protection against vandalism and even a Wifi antenna for internet access. Payment



Thanks for all the fish

SCIENTISTS at the University of Almeria have found further evidence that fish is healthy.

They discovered that two distinct omega 3 fatty acids found in fish worked together to prevent certain diseases emerging in rats.

The same fatty acids extracted from microalgae and given separately to the rats did not confer the same benefits.

Researchers concluded that only when they are combined, which happens naturally in fish, do the omega 3s boost health.

Working together, the

fatty acids offer the largest benefits to children, pregnant women and the elder-

They promote proper development and prevent the deterioration of neurons in the brain. The two fatty acids concerned are EPA and DHA.

They are both considered essential fatty acids because the human body needs them to function properly and cannot produce adequate amounts it-

"The most important thing we found was that the real benefit is not in the individual action of each fatty acid," said Jose Luis Guil an Almeria University researcher. "Rather it is in their combination which occurs naturally in fish."

The discovery has important consequences for the lucrative omega 3 industry.

Fish have been over-exploited in the rush to produce millions of fish oil capsules for health and cosmetic reasons.

Microalgae was considered an alternative but the University of Almeria has shown that replacing fish isn't as simple as it might

Hunters become the hunted

ONLY two poisoned baits were found by inspectors in Almeria Province in 2017. The result is being hailed as a success by the Poison Research Brigade (BIVE) of the Andalucian environmental ministry.

In 2010 there were 23 confirmed cases of poisoned baits being used by hunters and farmers in Almeria. Since then BIVE has upped the number of surprise inspections and expanded its local team to 10 environment officers who conduct field trips across Almeria.

Poison baits aren't only illegal but pose a severe threat to vulnerable wildlife populations and regularly kill or inflict serious harm on wandering domesticated animals.

The two cases in Almeria took place in Turrillas, where two turtles were poisoned, and in Berja, where several dogs were killed.

Anyone who finds a dead animal in strange circumstances is advised to contact the Guardia Civil's Seprona unit. Using poisoned baits is punishable by a fine of up to €300,000.

Killer wave strikes

By Matt Ford

A DEADLY wave has killed two people in Mutriku, Basque Country.

Diego Verdejo Lopez, 67, and Loli Kintana Martinez, 65, had ventured onto a breakwater to look at the impressive five-metre breakers sweeping in off the Bay of Biscay when they were swallowed by what onlookers described as "a huge wave."

Visiting the coast from the inland town of Vitoria, they had been romantically involved for around a year after earlier losing their longterm partners.

According to eyewitness accounts, the pair were seen parking their car and walking onto the breakwater - which was not cordoned off and forms part of a wave energy converter - when a larger wave engulfed them and swept them into the raging sea.

Three people who were on the beach at the time rushed to their

Mr Lopez was already dead, having drowned before they reached

brick structure.

One of the would-be rescuers even dived into the water to try and help her and had to be rescued by firefighters after they arrived at the


Mr Lopez' body had by this point already washed up on the beach, while that of his partner was eventually pulled from the sea.

A fire brigade official later said: "When we saw that the woman was already dead we decided not to enter the water as the conditions were so difficult."

A distraught family member told Spanish media he could not believe how they "failed to see the danger."

The town council has in the wake of the incident announced that the breakwater will in future be closed whenever a dangerous weather warning is in place.

The deaths came as Storm Eleanor battered northern Spain, bringing rain, snow, high winds and dangerous sea swells after orange warnings for dangerous conditions were put in place by national weather office AEMET.








MORE than 200 African migrants have entered Spain after storming over a double fence between Morocco and Melilla.

In total, 209 people reportedly forced their way over the two six-metre (20 feet) high double fences between Morocco and the Spanish enclave.

Several people were reportedly injured during the violent barrage, including four of the migrants and a Guardia Civil officer.

Footage captured by journalist Helena Maleno Garzon shows a large group of migrants running through the streets of the city.

US couple avoid prison

Pair 'lived with body of dead son for a month'

AN American couple living in Spain have avoided being sent to prison after they lived with the body of their dead son in their home for more than a

Bruce and Schrell Darlene Hopkins, 41 and 40, reportedly refused to release the body of their youngest son Caleb to

Spanish authorities several weeks after he died of an asthma attack in their rented apartment in Girona.

They were arrested after police discovered his body in January 2016 and were facing at least three years in prison, amid claims that they were guilty of homicide with serious imprudence.

However, a Girona court ruled that while it agreed that the child had needed hospital care that his parents did not provide, there were aggravated circumstances and fined the couple €990 for a crime of homicide for 'less serious imprudence' with aggravating kingship.

The Hopkins, along with their three children, reportedly moved to Girona seeking a safer and quieter life than they had in America.

Police found the body when visiting the couple's flat and reportedly described the apartment as having 'a nauseated stench.'

According to reports, rather than call the authorities following his death, the family kept a vigil next to his body, which was wrapped in a

Caleb is believed to have suffered the fatal asthma attack between the end of November and the beginning of December 2015, though the specific date of his death has not been confirmed.

The sentence is subject to an appeal within 10 days.

Firefighters have been working non-stop to clear icicles and dangerous accumulations of snow from eaves and roof tops in the area.

Catalan leader to remain in prison

FORMER Catalan deputy Prime Minister Oriol Junqueras will remain in pre-trial custody, after Spain's Supreme Court unanimously rejected his appeal.

Junqueras, the prominent separatist leader who has an outside chance of becoming president when the regional parliament is sworn in later this month, has been in prison since early November.

He is accused of rebellion, sedition and misuse of public funds following his role in the declaration of Catalan independence, following an illegal referendum.

Despite some of his colleagues being released on bail, Junqueras was kept in Estremera prison, outside Madrid.

The court has now upheld the decision despite Junqueras'

appeal, citing fears he would commit the same crimes for which he is being investigated.

He was number two in the regional parliament before Spain dissolved the government.

His Esquerra Republicana (ERC) party came third in last month's elections and will be crucial to forming a new, pro-independence government.

Junqueras is now likely to be prevented from being sworn in at the opening session of the new Parliament on January 17.

That complicates the process of forming a government, since his party make up the second largest grouping of pro-independence representatives.

The largest party was Ines Arrimadas' Ciudadanos - a prounity group - with deposed president Carles Puidgemont's Junts per Cataluña (JPC) party coming second.

Junqueras' ERC were a few seats behind.

Both men were fired from their previous positions when the Spanish government dissolved the Catalan administration

With Puigdemont still in Brussels - where he fled to following a warrant for his arrest -Junqueras could, theoretically, become president if Puigdemont does not return to Cataluña.

But Junqueras may now be unable to return, if he is still in prison.

ERC and JPC have still not agreed on forming a coalition, according to Reuters. The separatist block would have a slim majority if they work with four anticapitalist representatives.

'Certified dead'

Prisoner wakes up in body bag

By Matt Ford

A PROBE has been launched after a prisoner declared dead by a trio of doctors woke up inside a mortuary in northern Spain.

It comes after an inmate named as Gonzalo Montova Jimenez was found sitting unconscious in a chair at the Villabona prison, Asturias

Prison medics were unable to find a pulse leading two of them to pronounce him dead, before a third doctor sent by a court confirmed their diagnosis. The man's loved ones were even informed of his death. His

body was sent to a hospital mortuary in Oviedo and reportedly marked in preparation for a post-mortem examination before forensic scientists heard noises coming from his body bag. He was transferred to the Central University Hospital of Asturias where he remains in intensive care under watch by the Guardia Civil.

Hospital officials told Spanish media that they suspect the bizarre incident to be a case of catalepsy, a condition which causes a person's vital signs to slow down and their posture to become rigid.

Crowning glory

FORMER King of Spain Juan Carlos made a rare public appearance with the current King and son, Felipe VI, at the annual Three Kings and Epiphany Day celebrations.

The former King, who turned 80 on Friday, has reportedly complained about feeling side-lined by the royal family in recent weeks, but appeared in full military uniform alongside his wife Sofia. son Felipe and Queen Letizia at Madrid's Royal Palace.

King Felipe VI praised his father during a ceremony held at the palace, thanking him for his "many years of loyal service to Spain."

Juan Carlos abdicated in favour of his son in 2014 and was given the title of 'King Emertius' after nearly 40 years on the throne.

The former king is credited with leading Spain to democracy after Franco's dictatorship but reportedly abdicated after a series of scandals damaged his public image.

Football fans clash

AT least 24 people have been arrested after fighting broke out between two sets of radical fans in Sevilla.

The small groups of fans, also known as 'ultras,' of La Liga teams Real Betis and Sevilla clashed ahead of their teams' match at the Ramon Sanchez Pizjuan stadium this evening.

According to reports, the fight, which occurred close to the Barqueta de Sevilla bridge, was allegedly organised between the two groups on WhatsApp beforehand. One person was left needing hospital treatment in the aftermath of the fight.

During the arrests, police reportedly seized a number of various objects including sticks, knives and axes.

All of those arrested are males between 20 and 30years-old.

In last month's regional election - called following an

illegal referendum and a declaration of independence - Arrimadas' party won 37 seats. That put them ahead of former president Carles Puidgemont's party on 34 and his former number two - jailed won 32 seats.

However, pro-independence parties working together would have a majority in the parliament.

Arrimidas said: "I wish the number of seats we obtained was more in line with the number of votes that were cast in our favour... But we're going to handle this in the best possible way. We know what we're doing."

But Arrimidas also cautioned against any expectation that the situation could be resolved quickly, warning: "I understand people want to deal with 35 years of nationalism in five days, but unfortunately that's not going to happen."

She finished the interview by adding: "they are not going to achieve independence."

Junqueras has appeal case in court

A SPANISH court is considering an ap peal by former Catalan Vice President Oriol Junqueras against his detention during the recent political crisis.

If he is granted bail, Junqueras may run to become the new Catalan leader. However, he faces being potentially charged for rebellion, sedition and embezzlement which could see him incarcerated for decades. Junqueras has already had two court appeals dismissed.

His legal team hopes that the separatists' victory in the elections to the Catalan parliament will help his cause.

Services industry grows

IN the wake of easing tensions in Cataluña, the service industry in Spain ended 2017 in an upbeat way, reporting an increase in the rate of activity. After two months of declines in the rate of growth, HIS Markit's index of purchasing managers rose to 54.6 in December, up by 0.2 from November.

"Overall, 2017 has been a positive year for the Spanish economy, leaving it well placed heading into 2018." The marked increase in activity at the end of 2017 extends the current sequence of expansion to 50 months.

The strengthening of economic conditions was deemed to be behind rises in both activity and new business. According to a survey of more

than 350 companies, new business, orders and job creation all grew in December.

There had been fears that Spain's economy would be hit hard by the political fallout over Cataluña's vote for independence last year, when thousands of companies moved their headquarters out of the region.

However, these concerns have not been borne out and another reason for Spain's upturn can be attributed to the economic strength of the euro-

IT sector in need of reboot

THE IT and telecommunications sectors are most in demand by companies, and yet are the professions that receive the least applications, according to a study by the employment site Infojobs.

The survey revealed that job vacancies increase by up to 20 per cent in January, as a result of many people seeking a change at the start of the year. Openings within computing and telecommunications are the most numerous, making up 16.4 per cent of all the job offers published in Infojobs.

Despite the fact these industries offer above-average salaries, there are far fewer applications per vacancy than other sectors. Companies are desperate to address this, particularly in relation to cybersecurity.

Minimum wage boost

SPAIN'S lowest earners will receive a welcome 4 per cent salary rise in 2018, in a new pledge made by the Spanish government.

In addition, if specific economic growth and employment targets are met, the figure could increase to as much as €850 a month by 2020.

In an agreement reached with trade unions and company executives, Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy will implement the increase which will see the country's lowest earners receive €28.4 more a month this year.

"This is a boost to rebuild the salaries of people who lost most in the economic crisis," says Unai Sordo, leader of the Worker's Commissions, Spain's largest union. The unions will consider the measure a triumph for their work, having long demanded wages to mirror Spain's speedy recovery from the 2013 recession.

Jobless down

UNEMPLOYMENT in Spain shrank by 7.8 per cent last year as the numbers continue to recede from the record highs of 2013. The Labour Ministry said 3.4 million people were registered as out of work in 2017, representing 290,000 fewer than in 2016.

Ortega stays

BUSINESS tycoon Amancio Ortega will retain control of his Pontegadea empire until 2029, when he will be 93 years old. The parent company of Zara and other fashion brands holds the most valuable block of shares in Spain.

Diesel injection

THE price of diesel has seen a second consecutive rise, to climb to €1.146 per litre. This is a level that has not been seen since July 2015. In turn, the average price of petrol has also increased this week by 0.56 per cent to reach \in 1.242.



Investment in roads

Costs are lowest for three decades

SPENDING on Spain's road network under all of its administrations is down to 0.4 per cent of GDP, a level not seen since 1986. On top of this a new cut of €600 million in the funding of the Ministry of Development was announced last April.

The majority of that reduction in investment is due to be sustained by the road network, for several reasons. The railways are likely to be protected in order to keep the European funds that are attached. Indeed trains are wrapped up in political commitments that the government will be reluctant to break. It is also seen to be faster and generally easier to cut funding from roads. "It draws attention to the way the authorities try to protect the railways from the cuts," explains Matilde Mas, an Ivie Professor of Economic Analysis.

As a result, spending on roads will regress to the levels of the mid-90's, when €4,500 million a year was allocated for road maintenance. Compared to 2008, at the end of 2015 investment in this area by the Central Administration fell by 85 per cent in construction, and 59 per

Of course once a road network is built, far less funds are required to maintain them, which the OECD has fixed at 2 per cent of the cost of the infrastructure. However, according to a study by the Spanish Road Association, the state of conservation of the State Highway Network on the autonomous regions is 'deficient.' The survey showed that as many as 325,000 road signs need replacing, and 50,000 km of road markings require repainting.

However, conserving roads has no political glamour and does not require set piece speeches and photo-friendly presentations for politicians. Governments therefore prefer to cut investment here than more publical-

ly sensitive areas like health and pensions.

Jacob Diaz, General Director of the Spanish Association of Cerretera, warns, "When roads are not conserved, damage does not increase linearly but exponentially, until there comes a time when you do not have to maintain but rebuild." Although there is no study linking the maintenance for roads and accidents, it is clear that repairs are essential to ensure public safety.

Property firm to float shares

REAL ESTATE firm Metrovacesa has announced plans to sell off 25-40 per cent of the company via the stock market.

Scheduled to take place in February, the move is likely to set a new record as the largest listing by a European residential property developer.

The current record holder is Neinor Homes, which last year listed with a market capitalisation of €1.3bn, but Metrovaseca has a net asset value of

It comes as the residential property sector in Spain continues to recover, with house prices rising steadily over the last two years.

Metrovaseca was responsible for the biggest property deal in British history when it acquired a tower in London's Canary Wharf for €1.6bn in 2007.

Rental prices rise again

RENTAL property prices in Spain continue to rise, with last year seeing an increase of 18.4 per cent. According to a survey produced by property portal Idealista.com, the average price now stands at nearly €900 a month for an average house of 90 square metres.

Barcelona and Caceres are the only cities in Spain where prices have reduced in 2017, although Barcelona unsurprisingly remains the most expensive place to rent in.

The provincial capitals of Santa Cruz de Tenerife and Las Palmas de Gran Canaria have seen the highest price rises, increasing by 22.7 per cent and 22.5 per cent respec-

The biggest rise has happened in the Canary Islands, where owners asked for 27.8 per cent more for leasing their properties than in 2016.

ONLINE GIANT WILL LAUNCH LABOUR PROGRAMME

Amazon to 'Flex' its muscles

DELIVERY giant Amazon is leading the way in showing that digital business models can revolutionise labour regula-

Moreover, it plans to launch its 'Flex' programme in Spain. This is a scheme where the company hires drivers in countries to deliver its packages. It is already up and running in the US, where people can earn \$18 to \$25 an hour and all they require is a car and a smartphone.

The 'flex' moniker is justified as drivers tell Amazon where they want to work and how many hours they want to do. During the shift, packages are picked up at the nearest Amazon location and delivered to people in the local

Rafael Chelala, a professor at Duesto Business School, comments, "The new model of Amazon is channelled into this so-called collaborative economy, which replaces the traditional model of assets with digital platforms."

There is even talk of a 'platformisation' of labour relations and Amazon is just one example of a growing trend in

which online commerce and collaborative economy platforms converge.

As the Uber court case has shown, questions arise in such systems as to whether each professional is simply self-employed, or a self-employed worker. This is clearly important when it comes to accountability and worker's

As a result there are calls for the establishment of comprehensive reforms to labour regulations to make them fit for this new digital world. In Spain there is only one legal precept that regulates teleworking and there is no reference to flexible days.

> However, some companies have taken progressive steps and Axa has become the first company in Spain to include the rights of its workers not to respond to mobile phones outside of working hours.

Even the environment in normal working offices is evolving. "Before, it was going to the offices and a schedule was imposed because the means to work were there.

This has changed with increasing flexibility, and face to face meetings are only required when absolutely necessary," explains Chelala. Digital platforms and the 'gig' economy has become a popular route for students to earn money in hours that they can choose.

There may be a risk of exploitation and socioeconomic effects for the foreseeable future, but it is a brave new

SPANISH BRANDS HOPING TO BOUNCE BACK

Bargain boom begins

SPAIN'S traditional sales campaign, the day after many Spanish children receive their presents from the Three Kings on January 6, has lost ground in the face of year-round discounts and a huge increase in online shopping. Nowhere is this growing trend more visible than during Black Friday, when nearly a third of all Christmas shopping gets done, according to a study by Deloitte.

All the main fashion brands, including Mango, H&M, Cortefiel, and Women's Secret, large department stores such as El Corte Ingles, and the online retail giant Amazon are already offering early sales with discounts of up to 70 per cent in

This change of emphasis towards yearround sales is having a negative impact on small and medium firms in the textile industry, as reduced prices eat into their profit margins. The Spanish Commerce Confederation (CEC) has again insisted on the need to establish a well-defined sales period.

"Early sales by many commercial brands have forced small and medium

EWN online Join the conversation on our Facebook page stores to do the same, as a way to get rid of their excess stock," said the CEC in a statement. The surplus is the result of a slow autumn-winter sales season."

Despite the general tendency to get ahead of the pack on sales season, Inditex - the parent company of Zara and other major fashion brands, continues to wait until after January 6 before slashing its prices. Meanwhile, El Corte Ingles has taken a balanced approach: some items are already 40 per c ent off their regular

price, but the bulk of the offers will come after the January 6 Three Kings.

At the other end of the spectrum, fashion brands are already offering large discounts for online and physical shopping. "Consumers take advantage of these offers to do their Christmas shopping, and businesses are offering more promotional prices in order to adapt and defend their sales," explains Emilio Gonzalez, who teaches economics at the Madrid-based business school Icade.

Despite the endless discounts, businesses remain hopeful that the Christmas and official sales season will yield positive numbers, even if profit margins suffer. "This is our key campaign, it is still out great sales bastion," says an El Corte Ingles spokesperson.

The textile business association Acotex said it is expecting to see sales growth of between 5 and 10 per cent but described it as a bad thing. "There are going to be very good sales with a lot of products available, which is bad because it's going to eat into companies' profit margins," said Acotex president Eduardo Zamacola.

Brent oil price at high level

OIL has been one of the great boons to the Spanish economy in recent years and during the past year led to a saving of €2.3 billion via crude imports.

The steep drop in oil prices between 2014 and 2016 left more disposable income in the pockets of households and com-

As a result, the rise in the oil price in the second half of 2017 is a slight concern for the economic outlook. The Brent oil price, a notable benchmark in Europe, has begun 2018 at its highest level since early 2015, exceeding 65 dollars. This represents a rise of 50 per cent in the last six months.

The reasons for this spike are varied but involve policies restricting the supply in oil producing countries, as well as geopolitical conflicts.

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad



MANY UK expatriates living in Spain own properties in the UK and have pensions and investments in the UK. They rely on their UK assets to maintain their lifestyles (and those of their families) in Spain. neys to act for you when you are no longer able to act for yourself.

Your attorney can be a professional,





At the moment, little is set in stone and it is quite possible that nothing will change with UK citizens resident in Spain or visitors with EH1C cards being eligible for free medical treatment as they are now. Those who have been in Spain for some time may be looking back to the UK and the National Health Service (NHS) with rose tinted glasses as it surely isn't what it used to be.

In the past week, the Minister of Health Jeremy Hunt publicly apologised for having to cancel all non-urgent operations until the end of January and admitted that waiting times in A&E continued to get longer.

The following day, Prime Minister May effectively contradicted him, suggesting that things weren't so bad as the government had increased funding in the NHS.

In an almost unheard of turnaround however, the next day she had to backtrack and apologised herself for the thousands of operations that had been cancelled as new figures were released showing that 16,900 people had been stuck in ambulances for more than the proscribed 15 minutes before admission to A&E.

By contrast, I had to attend an emergency clinic in Marbella the other evening with a burst vein in my nose and although it was a bit third worldy, I was checked in immediately by a charming receptionist and seen within 20 minutes of arrival.

I wonder if that would have happened this winter in the UK where even GP appointments normally run late.



stars should clearly change their agent.



the punters. The English version is dim, dull and full of false people buying

It's an everyday tale of a Russian oligarch (!) and his family, conflicting with the shadowy criminal past activities of the ageing father. Violence and huge finance abound as Alex Goodman (James Norton), son of the tortured father tries to unravel the exact cause of his father's grief. The quality of the filming is stunning and it's a class watch.

WITH the sunny days almost guaranteed, a popular day out for Costa del Sol readers at this time of year is the gorgeous town of Ronda.

A beautiful drive from the coast that takes roughly an hour, Ronda is easily one of the most popular locations in Malaga for seaside daytrippers.

The town itself is the very definition of picturesque. But there is one major attraction that stands heads and tails above all the rest. Ronda is surrounded by an incredibly deep gorge that has a monumental bridge crossing it, one of the finest architectural feats you'll see in southern

Standing on the large sandstone hill that holds Ronda. visitors can peer down over 100 metres through the El Tajo gorge and take in some magnificent sights of the surrounding countryside. The high altitude also makes Ronda the perfect location to get some refuge from the sweltering Spanish heat in the height of summer.

Hiking and walking around the old town and surrounding areas are fantastic options for those with energy. But be warned. It is incredibly hilly and the shortest walk can quickly become exhausting. As a remedy there is an abundance of terrific local cafes and restaurants with delicious Malaga fare and at decent, non-touristy prices.

Shopping is also an excellent experience. Ronda has been spared much of the tacky souvenir shops that sell useless trinkets and instead has a thriving scene of local businesses offering handmade craftworks, clothing, oils and food.

To get to Ronda from Marbella take the A-397 all the way and directly inland. It's a windy, hilly road that requires caution but is a wonderful ride once you've got the hang of it. An alternative route from Malaga takes the A-357 deep inland and then the A-367 down to Ronda. It takes slightly longer at almost an hour and a half but is handy if coming from the eastern Costa del Sol.

Rental trap

I HAVE rented apartments and houses for some years in Spain and while many private owners are honest, some are not. The problem is that the owner, by law, holds the deposit. For example in my previous rental, they held €400. And when it came to handing the deposit back - after first deducting water and electric bills for two months - that they would keep the other €348 for cleaning expenses.

When I complained to the owners, who were both out of work, they refused to reply to my emails. After some advice from the Citizen's Advice Bureau in Malaga, it gave me the information I needed. Owners should leave the deposit with the AVRA (the Agencia de Vivienda y Rehabilitación Andalucia). If they have not done so, it is probably because they do not want to pay taxes on the rental income.

I sent a letter to the owners saying I would contact the AVRA and then the local tax offices to see if they had paid taxes on their rental income if I did not get my money back. Paying me was cheaper than paying the taxes, so my money was returned.

Surely the law should be changed so the money automatically goes to the AVRA to help stop any such problems?

Alicante's underrated tourist base

TORREVIEJA is not the destination at the top of many travellers' lists in Spain.

However, the city makes for an ideal base from which to see a number of quaint, charming villages and popular beach spots.

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Are dash cams legal in Spain?

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

A FREQUENTLY reoccurring question searched for is 'are dash cams legal in Spain?'

Although there are data protection issues, when referring to traffic law the simple answer is yes. One point that must be considered is that under data protection legislation you can run into problems if you share the footage on social media showing faces or number plates without permission, for example.

That said, not only are dash cams legal in Spain, they can also be extremely useful, especially in providing evidence in the event of an incident, or worse, and can be used by the authorities to help prosecute offenders, such as was the case when a lorry driver embarked on an extremely dangerous overtaking move, the footage was used to track down and prosecute the driver.

What we must take notice of is that the installation of the dash cam must not interfere with our primary field of vision. The optimum position will depend on the style of camera and vehicle, but if the camera can be hidden behind the rear view mirror, then it will not impede your view of the road ahead, and will not create an additional distraction.

Like all devices, such as GPS and mobile phones, they must also be secured and you must not touch them whilst you are driving.

In terms of them being useful, dash cams have been in use in many countries for many years, serving not only as a means of providing evidence in the event of an incident, but also protecting vehicle owners against false

Russia is one of the countries where dash cams have been in use for many years and in America, a move to make them mandatory gained support in recent years, on account of the value they provide.

I have been led to believe that, if your house is immediately facing the main Thave been led to believe that, it you are exempt from Community fees. Our housing estate is not fully enclosed. Can you explain?

Not true. If you are a member of a Community of Property Owners. you must pay the fees, whether you are an apartment, a terraced house or a free-standing villa on its own plot. Only properties which are on a street in a town or a farm in the country and which do not belong to a



Community are free of Community fees. Instead, they pay taxes to the town hall to maintain the street and the services. Confusion may arise because some housing

developments where city streets or roads are used wind up paying both municipal taxes and Community fees to maintain streets and lighting. These complex legal situations, which grew from rapid property development, are gradually being sorted out along the Spanish coastal areas.

Every little helps

HAVE you ever splashed out on an expensive new face cream only to find the whole tube is gone in a couple of weeks?

The disappointment at investing in a 'miracle' cream which comes in microscopic proportions can be high. But the good news is we may be using far too much of our favourite products, according to one beautician, and can get away with using less.

Dr Natasha Cook, an Australian dermatologist. has told one publication one of the most expensive products - facial serum can be used in tiny proportions because it is so concentrated.

She explained, "for serum, all you need is a pea-sized amount over the entire face," adding, "these

products are, in theory, concentrated with a high percentage of active ingredients. This means you shouldn't need too much."

Sticking to the same theme she says moisturiser should be used in an "almond-sized amount," adding, "two pumps if it is a pump applicator or an almond-sized amount over the entire face."

Foundation, which can be expensive if used several times throughout the day, can also be used in peasized quantities. Dr Cook explained, "if you've got a larger face, you may need slightly more," adding, "I recommend applying it to the back of your hand, before getting a 'kakubi' make up brush and evenly buffing it all over your

Lastly, for improving dark circles and puffiness use a "sunflower seed equivalent," of eye cream as, "these creams tend to be rich so you only need a small amount."

Painkillers 'could reduce fertility'

MANY women experience various pains during pregnancy and may turn to painkillers for help.

But this could damage your unborn child's fertility, according to scientists.

The study, carried out at the University of Edinburgh, found taking paracetamol or ibuprofen during pregnancy reduced the number of eggs in a female foetus by up to 40 per cent. And while the research was carried out on rats, scientists say the same could be true for hu-

The news could affect the fertility of unborn males too as scientists found the number of sperm cells in foetuses reduced by up to 20 per cent.

The group was less concerned by this, however, as men can produce sperm all their lives but women only have a limited egg supply.

Flamenco in Almeria - learn the true story

MANY visitors to Spain are lured into restaurants which offer Flamenco shows without often understanding the tradition or history behind this very special and not necessarily typical Spanish obsession.

This is very much an art form of Southern Spain which is attributed to the arrival of the Romany gypsy population which made its way to Spain from India in the 15th century and there is no doubt that many of the most famous Flamenco performers came and continue to come from the gypsy world.

It has to be remembered however that Spain in the Middle Ages in particular had a huge cross culture with Jewish settlers and Moors who also added their traditions to the Flamenco style which was not really recognised until the 18th century.

Originally it was dance only, an expression of the

feeling of the performers and their compatriots but it expanded to include voices and instruments with hand claps and shouts of encouragement from the audience.

Nowadays, the Flamenco style is more popular than ever, not just in Spain but on an international basis and it is said that there are more Flamenco academies in Japan than in Spain whilst in America there are even heavy metal bands who incorporate Flamenco into their musical style.

Almeria has a thriving Flamenco culture with at least 18 clubs (known as Peñas) affiliated to the Federation of Flamenco clubs of Almeria (Federacion de Peñas Flamencas de Almeria) and whilst the audience in these small but thriving clubs is predominantly Spanish, most welcome expatriate visitors who want to know more about the music and dance.

Although they serve simple food and drink, these are not drinking clubs but temples to the Canto Jondo (deep song) style which can be very moving yet to some ears is rather cacophonous. This singing is accompanied by guitar and cajon (the wooden box drum on which the drummer sits).

Dance is another intricate part of Flamenco with both men and women performing to a very high standard. On occasion you can witness duels between the musicians and the dancers to see who can be the fastest and vet most accurate performer.

If making your way to a Peña is a bit daunting, then prior to any Feria, local Peñas will host a Concurso de Cante which is a competition for local artists with the winners being invited to participate with more established artists (often full time professionals and recording artists) in the Festival.

Third in world rating



AIRÉN, an old Iberian white grape, represents about 30 per cent of all Spanish varieties and is the world's third most grown.

Unknown to many and predominantly grown in the south, central and western regions of Spain, its production is now declining and being replaced with red varieties including Tempranillo.

The grapes - late to bud and ripen and very resistant to drought and diseases - are perfectly adapted to the harsh arid climate of La Mancha with its calcareous soils and vinevards 700m above sea level.

Airén is also known under the many synonyms, including Aidén, Blancon, Forcallada, Forcallat blanca, Forcayat, Laeren del Rey, Layren, Manchega, Mantuo Laeren and Valdepenera blanca.



AIRÉN: In decline but well worth a try.

A relatively neutral taste and flavour and high acidity has made Airén the production choice for alcohol used as the base for Brandy, thus limiting its use to develop blended or varietal wines.

Additionally due to processes used including fermentation in terracotta vats, Airén wines do not always receive favourable publicity.

In general, Airén wines are characterised by a pallid colour with yellow iridescences and an alcoholic content of about 12 - 14 per cent making it quite pleas-

ant and easy to drink, with mature fruit scents including banana, pineapple or grapefruit.

To get the best out of it, pair Airén wine with grilled sardines with green pepper, garlic prawns or something spicy.

Better label Airén wines including Castillo del Moro; Sendas del Rey by Felix Solis and Don Octavio by Bodegas Villarrobledo are priced $\leq 4 - \leq 6$, though some can be found for just over €1.

Bumper 2018 projected

The future's bright

FORECASTS for Spain's 2018 property market are now in place. Barring an expected crisis, higher prices, more sales, more construction and higher rewards on investments are all on the cards.

The sale of new homes is expected to continue growing, after increasing for the first time since 2006 last year.

Servihabitat expects that total sales of new and second-hand homes will reach 560,000, up from 472,000 in 2017, but still shy of the high water mark of 775,000 in

New homes will account for almost 120,000 of those sales, more

than a quarter, as construction booms across the country.

Permits to construct new properties are expected to swell by 18 per cent to almost 140,000 this year. Developers are expected to be the dominant figures of the 2018 marketplace as buyers renew their faith in newly built properties.

The number of mortgages taken out is projected to increase from the 320,000 in 2017 and interest rates expected to stay low after falling below 3 per cent in October.

Investors who snapped up properties to let out long term, or to tourists, can expect a profitable year. The Bank of Spain is projecting long term returns of more than 10 per cent. After rising 4.5 per cent in 2017, prices are expected to increase by a minimum of 4.7 per cent this

More optimistic figures project a rise of between 6 and 8 per cent. Moody's is confident of an 8.6 per cent rise over the next three years.

Wage worry

RISING property prices are good news for investors but problematic for Spaniards on average wages trying to get on the property ladder.

New research found that a Spanish resident earning an average wage would need to devote 13.7 years of their salary to buy an average-priced house, which costs € 141,200.



New house smell

NEW home prices rose by 5 per cent in 2017, the highest annual increase since 2007.

The timely jump comes as Spain prepares to build tens of thousands of new homes this year after a decade of construction decline. During that period almost all buyers opted for secondhand homes.

But a study from the Appraisal Society of 400 municipalities suggests that might soon change. Prices of new homes rose by 1.7 per cent in the first half of 2017, and 3.3 per cent in the second.

The average price now stands at €2,227 per square metre.

New homes in Barcelona now cost €3,865 per square metre, compared to €4,500 in 2007. Prices are similar in Madrid and the luxury seaside destination of San Sebastian.

They are lowest in Ciu-

dad Real where a new home fetches just €1,160 per square metre.

Cataluña is well ahead as the most expensive region in Spain for new housing. But it is also the only region where the real estate confidence index fell, plummeting by two points at the tail

end of 2017. The political crisis is the obvious cause, with buyer confidence in every other Spanish region remaining high.

Your garden in January

By Dick Handscombe

APOLOGIES that my column disappeared for a couple of months but software problems, delays in obtaining a compatible hard disk and becoming acquainted with significant changes in user friendliness caused my first major problem since Google appeared in 1998.

This was the same time when gardening problems multiplied with a drying climate, the use of an increasing number and variety of plants from outside Spain, wide variations in the sources and qualities of composts and the occurrence of unwanted plant pests, from the ever increasing number attacking fruit trees to feral cats.

Most expat January gardening needs are common along the Mediterranean coast from north to south, but what is feasible from

day to day are influenced by the tremendous gales, continued droughts on the Costa Blanca and widespread rain in Andalucia.

Fortunately mild temperatures so far have allowed continuing good harvests of a diverse mix of tasty salad leaves and flowers. Chemical free salads with up to 20 ingredients continue from my raised beds and line of builders buckets surrounding the boule court.

One very useful job for a dry day is to clean up roses and prepare them for the

2018 flowering season. First prune to an appropriate shape leaving two strong budding points on each pruned stem. Spray with a strong garlic spray and plant two garlic seed segments under each plant before placing a deep manure mulch, preferably horse, under each plants.

Climbing plants now need pruning to manageable heights and prevent them from becoming straggly when spring growth commences.

To achieve a healthy garden environment for humans, pets and beneficial insects and ensure that all possible vegetables and fruit can be eaten safely, only spray when essential and try to restrict your spraying to ecological sprays such as garlic and neem as insecticides and propolis for a general fungicide.

When we had our large henegada allotment we always had a 20-metre row that supplied bunches of flowers and seeds to passing village ladies for whom sweet peas were a novelty.

If you have an area of bare vegetable growing soil top it up with a layer of animal and vegetative compost to renew and improve the fertility and moisture retaining properties.

Inexpensive spring bulbs tra ones. But do water and improve the soil first. It is sweet peas for early spring displays.

Next you could try picking up a large rubbish bag and seeing how quickly you can fill it with unwanted goods. The website suggests anything collected in the bag can be given to charity.

Next, if you are struggling to part with clothes you may not have worn for years, a technique adopted by Oprah Winfrey could help. The website says 'hang all your clothes with the hangers in the reverse direction. After you wear an item, return it to the closet with the hanger facing the correct direction. IF you give your dog a command even a simple one like 'sit' - then the reward of good dog is given as the dog's bottom hits the ground. Just a verbal praise given in a light happy voice can be enough for most dogs.

Sometimes people will use food or a motivator for this reward system. I believe if you have used treats for a couple of months, a dog will now be content with the bright happy voice which should be sufficient for such a simple command.

As your commands become more difficult for the dog to

achieve you can always up the reward, especially if you are doing scent work. A motivator that the dog really loves can now be used such as that special ball or toy.

Most professional working dogs are rewarded in this manner as soon as they have found something. This reward for work well

Whatever you use, you only have a split second to give it on completion of an exercise. Personally I like to use my voice and a quick touch under the chin as my

rewards. I always have my voice with me, so it is always on hand, where a different type of reward may not be with me at that crucial

Think about the dolphin which performs in a show. He is being taught to jump out of the water. If he jumps about two metres, he gets a small whistle to call him back, and when he returns to the edge of the pool he is in, he gets a small

As his training increases, and he iumps about six metres or more out of the pool, he gets a huge instant whistle while he's at the top of the jump, which brings him swiftly back to the pool edge where he gets a bucket of fish as his reward.

The timing of any reward is important. (If your timing is out, you may be rewarding for the wrong action.) Watch the height he jumps from there on. The reward is always there for him immediately and will he give his best every







'Rocket Ronnie' still potting balls, not plants

RONNIE O'SULLIVAN who won a record seventh Masters title in 2017 when defeating Joe Perry 10-7 in the final at London's Alexandra Palace, says: "It's just a job.

"I still like playing, but for me it's just a job," said O'Sullivan, in his 26th year on the green baize, who plays Marco Fu on January 16.

O'Sullivan, who has earned his nickname as 'The Rocket' with 31 ranking tournament wins, won the UK Snooker Championship in December, potting another £450,000 first prize.

"It's not always about the money," said Sullivan, edging towards a milestone £10m career winnings, following his bow on the green baize in 1992. World Champion in 2001, 2004, 2008, 2012 and 2013, Sullivan pocketed the £200,000

first prize, when successfully defending his 2016 Masters title, superseding Stephen Hendry's six Masters wins.

"It is great to get some records. To win seven, someone up there is looking after me," said O'Sullivan, who once told me he'd rather be potting plants, than balls.

ANDY MURRAY'S hopes that 2018 would be a better year than his injury plagued 2017 is in tatters with the former world number one's hip injury woes continuing.

"I want to be fit and healthy. It isn't about winning every match or winning more slams," said Murray, who missed almost five months with hip issues in 2017.

Murray, who underwent an intensive programme of rehabilitation in preparation for 2018, withdrew from the Brisbane International and the Australian Open this month, due to his long-term hip injury.

"I had every intention of making a strong start to the year," rued Murray, who rose to world number one in 2016, now ranked 16th.

Murray, who spent off-season in Miami, returning to the UK in December, could be suffering a torn labrum. A hip labral tear involves the ring of cartilage - labrum.

The Australian Open starts in Melbourne on January 15 and Murray said: "Sadly I won't be playing in Melbourne. I am not yet ready to compete."

If Murray is suffering a torn labrum surgery would be fraught with uncertainty. A hip labral tear may predispose osteoarthritis in the future.

Three-time Grand Slam champion Murray who has not played a competitive match since Wimbledon - considering surgery, said: "I just want to enjoy playing again."

Toffees boss Sam Allardyce continues to trawl the January transfer window to bring in more firepower after signing striker Cenk Tosun, 26, from Besiktas for £27m.

"Securing the player is most important as the club's biggest area of concern is the number of goals we're capable of getting," said Big Sam.

Sandro, 22, whose future is unclear on Merseyside, eyed Champions League football this season, citing sacked manager Ronald Koeman as one of the reasons he joined Everton.

On Sandro, Allardyce, who replaced Koeman in November, said: "There's never a guarantee when a top player comes from abroad that he will settle in his first year.

"And certainly not settle when the team isn't doing very well. Every new player that came from abroad would find it difficult to

perform to his best level when the team struggles."

Everton were in dire straights under Koeman - sacked after the 5-2 home defeat against Arsenal in October - that left them in the Premier League relegation zone.

Sandro has been linked with a loan move to Valencia in the January window, with a view to a permanent move.

Sandro started his career at Barcelona where he was a member of the vouth academy, aged 14, and went on to make 17 first team appearances in La Liga, during 2014-

Released by Barca, Sandro joined Malaga on a three year deal in July 2016. A year later he moved to Everton on a four year deal after triggering a £5.2m release clause.

With just 15 appearances in all competitions Sandro has netted a sole goal, having featured in Europa League football, the Premier League and the EFL Cup.

Spurs host Everton in the Premier League on Saturday, with Newcastle hosting Swansea and Chelsea hosting Leicester. Sunday January 14: Bournemouth v Arsenal; Liverpool v Manchester City. January 15: Manchester United v Stoke.
