Car park death probe

POLICE are probing the death of a three-year-old French boy killed by a British driver on the Costa del Sol.

Emergency services have confirmed that the victim was a member of the local Jewish community and that the incident is currently being treated as acciden-

It comes after police said that the occupants of the vehicle were four British holidaymakers aged between 20 and 24.

They had stopped in the car park of the Casa Rusia shopping centre in San Pedro de Alcantara, Marbella, to pick up a baseball cap that had blown out of an open window as they drove through the adjacent El Embrujo housing es-

And as they moved to leave their car struck the child, who had just been let out of a parked vehicle by his grandmother.

Paramedics were unable to do anything to save him after arriving at the scene.

The driver of the car was breathalysed but had not been drinking alcohol, while a local magistrate will decide whether criminal charges should be pressed following an investiga-

The incident has been misreported in the UK national press, with several media outlets stating that the victim was a girl.

But, speaking exclusively with the Euro Weekly News, an official from the 061 emergency service confirmed that the child was a



THE Priors' story is infamous among expatriates in Spain.

Ten years ago, the couple's dream property - which they designed themselves - was bulldozed by Spanish authorities on the orders of a judge.

Helen and Len Prior - now both in their mid-70s - were the first Britons to see their home demolished, in 2008.

"I can honestly say that they (the Andalucia government) have wrecked our lives. They have taken everything we worked for away from us, 45 years of working hard and now we have nothing," Len told The Daily Telegraph in 2012.

Their beautiful,€350,000 Vera (Almeria) Villa - named 'Tranquilidad' - was torn down because complex and multi-layered planning laws were not followed. The couple, who had been granted a licence by the local council in 2002, had no idea there were any legal issues when they bought the plot of land.

They had hoped to see out their retirement in the 'idyllic' property, but instead spent their remaining savings fighting their case in the Spanish courts.

fully moved in - the couple have faced an exhausting legal battle.

A symbolic victory in the Spanish courts amounted to little, but the European Union eventually became involved.

In 2009, an EU report into planning abuses in Spain was highly critical of the country.

After the economic crisis had hit, countless Brits' saw a similar fate befall their properties, following the boom in buildings in the late 90's and early 2000s. Over 300,000 homes in Andalucia alone were reportedly ruled il-

The EU's damning findings were music to not just the Priors' ears - but also expatriates and those of campaigning groups.

Then, in 2015, the Spanish senate approved a law barring authorities from demolishing 'illegal' houses if the owners bought in good faith.

And a breakthrough came in October, when the regional high court ruled that Vera Council had to give the couple €220,334 in compensation and €9,194 in 'moral damages.

If the mayor doesn't pay by the end of Februrary, courts can seize council assets and charge up to €40,000 in interest.

The couple were hoping for more, since legal costs may soak up most of the money, but according to The Times, they are now keen to move on with their

Now living in a bungalow, the Priors spent years in a garage on the plot of land where their home was demolished. They were only given a few hours to gather their things before the property was

They intend to use their compensation to buy a new property, but are yet to receive the money.

SPAIN'S fiestas are famous the world over. But the action really heats up in the early months of the vear, with carnival season sweeping in while most tourists are away.

During late January and early February, processions, costumes, songs, dancing and drink fill the streets as Spaniards party into the morning.

There are countless public celebrations across the country, though all the regional variations - particularly on theme and costume - are impossible

The festivals take place across various dates but

all in the run up to lent which some believe is the origin of carnival season: the excess before restraint.

The party season tends to take place in Christian countries and has Catholic origins. While Spanish carnivals may not have the swagger of Brazil or charm of Venice, they certainly have charm.

The public celebrations stretch across all the social divides - disregarding age, politics and class.

Social satire, mockery and plain ridiculousness tend to account for the majority of costumes.

■ SOUTHERN SOFTIES? NOT QUITE

THE most intensely celebrated events arguably take place in southern Spain. Cadiz, Andalucia, Tenerife and the Canary Islands are particular favourites with partygoers.

■ THE BIGGEST AND BEST?

FROM Las Palmas, Gran Canaria, the Santa Cruz carnival is broadcast on national television. Spain's largest event attracts around a million people every February. Frivolities reportedly date back to the 16th century and there is apparently even a drag queen gala. In 1987, 250,000 people attended a concert by Cuban singer Celia Cruz - setting a Guinness World

SARKY CADIZ

IN Cadiz, cutting costumes take a sarcastic dig at current affairs. Likewise, satirical songs highlight society's problems. But even amid the criticism, there is a playful atmosphere and party feel.

CARNIVAL QUEEN

IN Tenerife, a carnival queen is crowned - as is the case elsewhere - amid much glamour. Spectacular costumes and vibrant parades attract revellers from around the world.

COLD SNAP: Spain shivers in the freezing conditions as police and soldiers battle to free thousands of cars.

SPAIN was gripped by freezing weather as snowstorms swept the country

The icv blast sparked chaos after more than 3,000 vehicles were stranded on the AP-6 motorway between Galicia and Madrid as they returned from the weekend's Epiphany celebrations.

Many motorists were trapped for more than 18 hours leading authorities to call in the army, deploying 240 soldiers from the military emergency unit to help Guardia Civil and police officers battle snow drifts and reach

Some drivers took to social media to complain about the slow response by emergency

Sara Ramos told Spanish TV: "I'm with my family, there are two children: one two years old. the other six years old. The adults haven't eaten since midday yesterday. The children ate the small amount of food we brought with us, but since then they haven't eaten anything.

But while opposition politicians called for Public Works Minister Íñigo de la Serna to ap-

pear in parliament and explain how the debacle came about, the Spanish government is probing Iberpristas, the operator of the toll road.

Mr de la Serna said that although the government owns the motorway, Iberpistas has "management responsibility," and is contractually obliged to have the means to deal with emergencies.

The icy weather was caused by a large and cold low-pressure system that formed before hanging over the Iberian Peninsula.





Drought concern must be addressed

SPAIN was ravaged by a freezing cold snap days after unseasonal wild fires broke out in several parts of the country. These are signs of the times, as climate change continues to hurtle the planet towards an uncertain future. And while snow has blanketed large swathes of the Iberian Peninsula in recent days, it is unlikely to be enough to lessen the effects of Spain's worst drought in decades, as national water reserves sit at just over 40 per cent of capacity.

A recent report by the national Higher Centre for Scientific Investigations showed that rising temperatures have 'increased the severity of droughts despite it raining more now than in previous dry periods.' Water for irrigation accounts for around 80 per cent of consumption, and demand has increased by 20 per cent over the last 30 years, during which construction has rocketed by 75 per cent and the Spanish population shot up by 20 per cent. But the Spanish government seems to have its fingers in its ears when it comes to water.

There are no water saving campaigns to be seen anywhere in the national or local media, the use of inefficient irrigation methods remains widespread, while desalinisation plants produce nowhere near the amount of clean water promised or remain unfinished following years of legal wrangling. Some towns even continue to dump raw human sewage into rivers or the sea as they have no means to process it. And with experts agreeing that 75 per cent of the country is susceptible to becoming a desert, Spain needs to wake up to its water woe before it is too late.

Blood money

A probe revealed that she had travelled from the smaller island of Curação - part of the Kingdom of the Netherlands - alongside a second assassin.

THE Costa del Sol continues to enjoy mild weather following the recent cold snap.

It comes after the area was blasted by arctic conditions as sub-zero temperatures brought snow, hail and thunderstorms, leading state weather office AEMET to issue yellow and orange alerts for dangerous weather.

Carvajal beach in Fuengirola was blanketed in white after being covered by hail,

which also fell thickly on the AP-7 toll road at Calahonda, creating lethal driving condi-

Emergency services attended more than 30 incidents as the chaos reached its peak, after vehicles were trapped on roads in a dozen municipalities, mostly in the Serrania de Ronda

A bus skidded into a guard rail in the village of El Burgo with six passengers rescued by police and firefighters, while a hiker who slipped and fractured a hip bone was hospitalised.

Mountain roads to the Sierra de las Nieves and El Torcal beauty spots were closed, as were two of Ronda's main access roads, with 90,000 litres of brine and 220 tonnes of salt needed to clear them.

There were no reports of serious injury due to the icy conditions.



Deportations finish as enquiry begins

Migrant abuse probe

ALL of the migrants being held in the Archidona prison have now been removed from the facility, according to the Spanish government, amid accusations that the authorities are removing potential witnesses to the death of Mohamed Bouderbal.

Video footage earlier this week showed activists protesting the removal of the Algerian group from the facility, where 572 people (according to a newly published government figure) were originally imprisoned in mid-November.

Some activists were restrained by police as coaches pulled away. Others cried.

The Spanish journalist Sergio Rodrigo claims that over 300 migrants have been expelled since Mr Bouderbal's mysterious

Police claim he committed suicide, while activists, inmates and family members accuse them of severely beating him shortly before he died.

The Algerian government have told the APS news agency that they are investigating the death.

The United Nations have previously condemned the Spanish authorities over their use of the prison, which is not scheduled to officially open until later this year.

The government has faced accusations of police brutality and illegal action, amid condemnation from rights groups. A riot broke out last month.

Mr Bouderbal's brother is reported to have seen his brother's remains - after a legal battle - but a plastic bag was allegedly covering the whole body except his face.

An Algerian television station accused the police of beating him to death, while inmates say he was kicked in the head and face. However, the preliminary results of an official Spanish enquiry suggested the police version of events was accurate.

Police say he was found hanged in his room. Video footage appears to show the 36year-old lying on the ground in the prison.

On Wednesday, some reports suggested there were still 67 migrants remaining in the

Meanwhile, three prisoners were reportedly put under surveillance after self-harming.

There have also been accusations that deliveries of warm clothes were recently denied to the inmates, despite snow falling on the prison.

The Ministry of the Interior, Juan Ignacio Zoido, said the prison would now be repaired ahead of its official opening, because some of the migrants had damaged the facili-

The migrants' current location is not known.

Horsing around

A DECISION to axe show jumping events in Mijas has sparked

It comes after the town hall scrapped the annual Costa del Sol Equestrian Tour, which takes place at the Costa del Sol's hippodrome in spring and autumn.

Mayor Juan Carlos Maldonado is rumoured to want horse racing to return to the site, while there are also whispers that propertv developers have registered interest in buying the land.

But the council signed a contract requiring that the venue be used for equestrian events with its owner more than 20 years ago, meaning the local authority could stand to lose millions if the decision to cancel proves to be unlawful.

FUENGIROLA Town Hall have again been accused of allowing drinking water to be used to noisily clean streets while residents are sleeping.

Despite warnings that a severe water shortage is likely to hit the region, clean drinking water is regularly being used to clean the city's pathways.

The town hall has been contacted for each of the previous two Euro Weekly News stories about the issue, both by phone and by email. They have never previously provided a response and had not commented at the time of writing.

Reporting more cleaning at 1.30am this morning, one resident told Euro Weekly News: "I can't believe it, just now they cleaned the streets again in Fuengirola, with thousands of litres of clean drinking water, despite the fuss in the councils of the town halls."

The company responsible for water distribution on the Costa Del Sol is reportedly seeking the agreement of local authorities to use treated water from sewage works to wash streets.

Acosol, a publicly owned company, wants to extend a deal in the Marbella area, to use recycled wastewater, to the rest of the region, according to

The resident, 69-year-old Ron Gombault, added: "This time the street parallel to the Paseo Maritimo, two nights ago the Paseo, all (at) about 1.30 in the morning."

spray hose pipes, which are particularly loud. There have been previous claims that cleaning occurred at 5.30am and 12.30am.

One street cleaner has previously confirmed to a Euro Weekly News journalist that the water being used to clean an area of pavement was drink-

There have long been concerns about the availability of water in the region, and local experts have warned that action must be taken to avoid a severe drought.





Last dance for gunman

Strip club shooter held in Norway

By Matt Ford

A MAN who opened fire with a submachine gun in a Costa del Sol strip club has been held in Norway.

The 30-year-old Dutch suspect was arrested in capital city Oslo after a European Arrest Warrant was issued in his name.

He was reportedly living under a false name using a forged Dutch passport, and had burned the tips of his fingers to further conceal his identity.

It comes in the wake of a violent incident at a Marbella nightspot last September which saw the fugitive beaten up by four men.

He managed to escape but returned an hour later wearing a hood before producing the gun and firing at his assailants, one of who returned fire with a pistol he had managed to sneak through security with the help of a

member of staff.

Five people were wounded during the shootout, with four hit by bullets.

Six people were held at the club after police swooped on the scene, but the Dutchman fled in a car and has been on the run ever

The vehicle - which had been rented under a false name - was found abandoned and completely burned out a day later.

Among those held at the time were a 30-year-old Frenchman from Marseille wanted by authorities in his home country for homicide and weapons trafficking.

During subsequent raids on three homes investigators seized guns, ammunition, six high-end cars, a series of false vehicle licence plates, €12,660 in cash, and 21 mobile phones.

Storm Eleanor claims two lives

Diego Verdejo Lopez, 67, and Loli Kintana Martinez, 65, had ventured onto a breakwater to look at the impressive fivemetre breakers sweeping in off the Bay of Biscay when they were swallowed by what onlookers described as "a huge wave."

Visiting the coast from the inland town of Vitoria, they had been romantically involved for around a year after earlier losing their long-term partners.

According to eyewitness accounts, the pair were seen parking their car and walking onto the breakwater - which was not cordoned off and forms part of a wave energy converter - when a larger wave engulfed them and swept them into the raging

Three people who were on the beach at the time rushed to

Mr Lopez was already dead, having drowned before they reached him, but Ms Martinez managed to briefly grab a rope they threw towards her.

But the force of the water caused it to snap and she was killed after being repeatedly dashed against the brick struc-

One of the would-be rescuers

even dived into the water to try and help her and had to be rescued by firefighters after they arrived at the scene.

Mr Lopez' body had by this point already washed up on the beach, while that of his partner was eventually pulled from the


A fire brigade official later said: "When we saw that the woman was already dead we decided not to enter the water as the conditions were so diffi-

A distraught family member told Spanish media he could not believe how they "failed to see the danger."

The town council has in the wake of the incident announced that the breakwater will in future be closed whenever a dangerous weather warning is in place.

The deaths came as Storm Eleanor battered northern Spain, bringing rain, snow, high winds and dangerous sea swells after orange warnings for dangerous conditions were put in place by national weather office AEMET.



MORE than 200 African migrants have entered Spain after storming over a double fence between Morocco and Melilla.

In total, 209 people reportedly forced their way over the two sixmetre (20 feet) high double fences between Morocco and the Spanish

US couple avoid prison

Pair 'lived with body of dead son for a month'

AN American couple living in Spain have avoided being sent to prison after they lived with the body of their dead son in their home for more than a month.

Bruce and Schrell Darlene Hopkins, 41 and 40, reportedly refused to release the body of their youngest son Caleb to Spanish authorities several weeks after he died of an asthma attack in their rented apartment in Girona.

They were arrested after police discovered his body in January 2016 and were facing at least three years in prison, amid claims that they were guilty of homicide with serious imprudence.

However, a Girona court ruled that while it agreed that the child had needed hospital care that his parents did not provide, there were aggravated circumstances and fined the couple €990 for a crime of homicide for 'less serious imprudence' with aggravating kingship.

The Hopkins, along with their three children, reportedly moved to Girona seeking a safer and quieter life than they had in Ameri-

Police found the body when visiting the couple's flat and reportedly described the apartment as having 'a nauseated stench.'

According to reports, rather than call the authorities following his death, the family kept a vigil next to his body, which was wrapped in a sheet.

Caleb is believed to have suffered the fatal asthma attack between the end of November and the beginning of December 2015, though the specific date of his death has not been





sis. The man's loved ones were even informed of his death. His body was sent to a hospital mortuary in Oviedo and reportedly marked in preparation for a post-mortem examination before forensic scientists heard noises coming from his body bag.

FORMER King of Spain Juan Carlos made a rare public appearance with the current King and son, Felipe VI, at the annual Three Kings and Epiphany Day celebrations.

The former King, who turned 80 on Friday, has reportedly complained about feeling side-lined by the royal family in recent weeks, but appeared in full military uniform alongside his wife Sofia, son Felipe and Queen Letizia at Madrid's Royal Palace.

Catalan leader to remain in prison

FORMER Catalan deputy Prime Minister Oriol Junqueras will remain in pre-trial custody, after Spain's Supreme Court unanimously rejected his appeal.

Junqueras, the prominent separatist leader who has an outside chance of becoming president when the regional parliament is sworn in later this month, has been in prison since early November. He is accused of rebellion, sedition and misuse of public funds following his role in the declaration of Catalan independence, following an illegal referendum.

Despite some of his colleagues being released on bail, Junqueras was kept in Estremera prison, outside Madrid.

The court has now upheld the decision despite Junqueras' appeal, citing fears he would commit the same crimes for which he is being investigated. He was number two in the regional parliament before Spain dissolved the government.

His Esquerra Republicana (ERC) party came third in last month's elections and will be crucial to forming a new, pro-independence government.

Junqueras is now likely to be prevented from being sworn in at the opening session of the new Parliament on January 17.

That complicates the process of forming a government, since his party make up the second largest grouping of pro-independence representatives.

The largest party was Ines Arrimadas' Ciudadanos - a pro-unity group - with deposed president Carles Puidgemont's Junts per Cataluña (JPC) party coming second.

Junqueras' ERC were a few seats behind.

Both men were fired from their previous positions when the Spanish government dissolved the Catalan administration.

But Arrimidas also cautioned against any expectation that the situation could be resolved quickly, warning: "I understand people want to deal with 35 years of nationalism in five days, but unfortunately that's not going to happen."

She finished the interview by adding: "they are not going to achieve independence."



Junqueras has appeal case in court

A SPANISH court is considering an ap peal by former Catalan Vice President Oriol Junqueras against his detention during the recent political crisis.

If he is granted bail, Junqueras may run to become the new Catalan leader. However, he faces being potentially charged for rebellion, sedition and embezzlement which could see him incarcerated for decades. Junqueras has already had two court appeals dismissed.

His legal team hopes that the separatists' victory in the elections to the Catalan parliament will help his cause.

Services industry grows

IN the wake of easing tensions in Cataluña, the service industry in Spain ended 2017 in an upbeat way, reporting an increase in the rate of activity. After two months of declines in the rate of growth, HIS Markit's index of purchasing managers rose to 54.6 in December, up by 0.2 from November.

"Although the final quarter of 2017 saw a weaker expansion in activity than the other three quarters of the year, the economy continued to grow at a healthy pace," Andrew

"Overall, 2017 has been a positive year for the Spanish economy, leaving it well placed heading into 2018." The marked increase in activity at the end of 2017 extends the current sequence of expansion to 50 months.

The strengthening of economic conditions was deemed to be behind rises in both activity and new business. According to a survey of more

than 350 companies, new business, orders and job creation all grew in December.

There had been fears that Spain's economy would be hit hard by the political fallout over Cataluña's vote for independence last year, when thousands of companies moved their headquarters out of the region.

However, these concerns have not been borne out and another reason for Spain's upturn can be attributed to the economic strength of the euro-

IT sector in need of reboot

THE IT and telecommunications sectors are most in demand by companies, and yet are the professions that receive the least applications, according to a study by the employment site Infojobs.

The survey revealed that job vacancies increase by up to 20 per cent in January, as a result of many people seeking a change at the start of the year. Openings within computing and telecommunications are the most numerous, making up 16.4 per cent of all the job offers published in Infojobs.

Despite the fact these industries offer above-average salaries, there are far fewer applications per vacancy than other sectors. Companies are desperate to address this, particularly in relation to cybersecurity.

Minimum wage boost

SPAIN'S lowest earners will receive a welcome 4 per cent salary rise in 2018, in a new pledge made by the Spanish government.

In addition, if specific economic growth and employment targets are met, the figure could increase to as much as €850 a month by 2020.

In an agreement reached with trade unions and company executives, Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy will implement the increase which will see the country's lowest earners receive €28.4 more a month this year.

"This is a boost to rebuild the salaries of people who lost most in the economic crisis," says Unai Sordo, leader of the Worker's Commissions, Spain's largest union. The unions will consider the measure a triumph for their work, having long demanded wages to mirror Spain's speedy recovery from the 2013 recession.

Jobless down

UNEMPLOYMENT in Spain shrank by 7.8 per cent last year as the numbers continue to recede from the record highs of 2013. The Labour Ministry said 3.4 million people were registered as out of work in 2017, representing 290,000 fewer than in 2016.

Ortega stays

BUSINESS tycoon Amancio Ortega will retain control of his Pontegadea empire until 2029, when he will be 93 years old. The parent company of Zara and other fashion brands holds the most valuable block of shares in Spain.

Diesel injection

THE price of diesel has seen a second consecutive rise, to climb to €1.146 per litre. This is a level that has not been seen since July 2015. In turn, the average price of petrol has also increased this week by 0.56 per cent to reach \in 1.242.

Investment in roads

Costs are lowest for three decades

SPENDING on Spain's road network under all of its administrations is down to 0.4 per cent of GDP, a level not seen since 1986. On top of this a new cut of €600 million in the funding of the Ministry of Development was announced last April.

The majority of that reduction in investment is due to be sustained by the road network, for several reasons. The railways are likely to be protected in order to keep the European funds that are attached. Indeed trains are wrapped up in political commitments that the government will be reluctant to break. It is also seen to be faster and generally easier to cut funding from roads. "It draws attention to the way the authorities try to protect the railways from the cuts," explains Matilde Mas, an Ivie Professor of Economic Analysis.

As a result, spending on roads will regress to the levels of the mid-90's, when €4,500 million a year was allocated for road maintenance. Compared to 2008, at the end of 2015 investment in this area by the Central Administration fell by 85 per cent in construction, and 59 per

Of course once a road network is built, far less funds are required to maintain them, which the OECD has fixed at 2 per cent of the cost of the infrastructure. However, according to a study by the Spanish Road Association, the state of conservation of the State Highway Network on the autonomous regions is 'deficient.' The survey showed that as many as 325,000 road signs need replacing, and 50,000 km of road markings require repainting.

However, conserving roads has no political glamour and does not require set piece speeches and photo-friendly presentations for politicians. Governments therefore prefer to cut investment here than more publical-

ly sensitive areas like health and pensions.

Jacob Diaz, General Director of the Spanish Association of Cerretera, warns, "When roads are not conserved, damage does not increase linearly but exponentially, until there comes a time when you do not have to maintain but rebuild." Although there is no study linking the maintenance for roads and accidents, it is clear that repairs are essential to ensure public safety.

Property firm to float shares

REAL ESTATE firm Metrovacesa has announced plans to sell off 25-40 per cent of the company via the stock market.

Scheduled to take place in February, the move is likely to set a new record as the largest listing by a European residential property developer.

The current record holder is Neinor Homes, which last year listed with a market capitalisation of €1.3bn, but Metrovaseca has a net asset value of

It comes as the residential property sector in Spain continues to recover, with house prices rising steadily over the last two years.

Metrovaseca was responsible for the biggest property deal in British history when it acquired a tower in London's Canary Wharf for €1.6bn in 2007.

Rental prices rise again

RENTAL property prices in Spain continue to rise, with last year seeing an increase of 18.4 per cent. According to a survey produced by property portal Idealista.com, the average price now stands at nearly €900 a month for an average house of 90 square metres.

Barcelona and Caceres are the only cities in Spain where prices have reduced in 2017, although Barcelona unsurprisingly remains the most expensive place to rent in.

The provincial capitals of Santa Cruz de Tenerife and Las Palmas de Gran Canaria have seen the highest price rises, increasing by 22.7 per cent and 22.5 per cent respec-

The biggest rise has happened in the Canary Islands, where owners asked for 27.8 per cent more for leasing their properties than in 2016.

ONLINE GIANT WILL LAUNCH LABOUR PROGRAMME

Amazon to 'Flex' its muscles

DELIVERY giant Amazon is leading the way in showing that digital business models can revolutionise labour regula-

Moreover, it plans to launch its 'Flex' programme in Spain. This is a scheme where the company hires drivers in countries to deliver its packages. It is already up and running in the US, where people can earn \$18 to \$25 an hour and all they require is a car and a smartphone.

The 'flex' moniker is justified as drivers tell Amazon where they want to work and how many hours they want to do. During the shift, packages are picked up at the nearest Amazon location and delivered to people in the local

Rafael Chelala, a professor at Duesto Business School, comments, "The new model of Amazon is channelled into this so-called collaborative economy, which replaces the traditional model of assets with digital platforms."

There is even talk of a 'platformisation' of labour relations and Amazon is just one example of a growing trend in

which online commerce and collaborative economy platforms converge.

As the Uber court case has shown, questions arise in such systems as to whether each professional is simply self-employed, or a self-employed worker. This is clearly important when it comes to accountability and worker's

As a result there are calls for the establishment of comprehensive reforms to labour regulations to make them fit for this new digital world. In Spain there is only one legal precept that regulates teleworking and there is no reference to flexible days.

> However, some companies have taken progressive steps and Axa has become the first company in Spain to include the rights of its workers not to respond to mobile phones outside of working hours.

Even the environment in normal working offices is evolving. "Before, it was going to the offices and a schedule was imposed because the means to work were there.

This has changed with increasing flexibility, and face to face meetings are only required when absolutely necessary," explains Chelala. Digital platforms and the 'gig' economy has become a popular route for students to earn money in hours that they can choose.

There may be a risk of exploitation and socioeconomic effects for the foreseeable future, but it is a brave new

SPANISH BRANDS HOPING TO BOUNCE BACK

Bargain boom begins

SPAIN'S traditional sales campaign, the day after many Spanish children receive their presents from the Three Kings on January 6, has lost ground in the face of year-round discounts and a huge increase in online shopping. Nowhere is this growing trend more visible than during Black Friday, when nearly a third of all Christmas shopping gets done, according to a study by Deloitte.

All the main fashion brands, including Mango, H&M, Cortefiel, and Women's Secret, large department stores such as El Corte Ingles, and the online retail giant Amazon are already offering early sales with discounts of up to 70 per cent in

This change of emphasis towards yearround sales is having a negative impact on small and medium firms in the textile industry, as reduced prices eat into their profit margins. The Spanish Commerce Confederation (CEC) has again insisted on the need to establish a well-defined sales period.

"Early sales by many commercial brands have forced small and medium

EWN online Join the conversation on our Facebook page stores to do the same, as a way to get rid of their excess stock," said the CEC in a statement. The surplus is the result of a slow autumn-winter sales season."

Despite the general tendency to get ahead of the pack on sales season, Inditex - the parent company of Zara and other major fashion brands, continues to wait until after January 6 before slashing its prices. Meanwhile, El Corte Ingles has taken a balanced approach: some items are already 40 per c ent off their regular

price, but the bulk of the offers will come after the January 6 Three Kings.

At the other end of the spectrum, fashion brands are already offering large discounts for online and physical shopping. "Consumers take advantage of these offers to do their Christmas shopping, and businesses are offering more promotional prices in order to adapt and defend their sales," explains Emilio Gonzalez, who teaches economics at the Madrid-based business school Icade.

Despite the endless discounts, businesses remain hopeful that the Christmas and official sales season will yield positive numbers, even if profit margins suffer. "This is our key campaign, it is still out great sales bastion," says an El Corte Ingles spokesperson.

The textile business association Acotex said it is expecting to see sales growth of between 5 and 10 per cent but described it as a bad thing. "There are going to be very good sales with a lot of products available, which is bad because it's going to eat into companies' profit margins," said Acotex president Eduardo Zamacola.

Brent oil price at high level

OIL has been one of the great boons to the Spanish economy in recent years and during the past year led to a saving of €2.3 billion via crude imports.

The steep drop in oil prices between 2014 and 2016 left more disposable income in the pockets of households and com-

As a result, the rise in the oil price in the second half of 2017 is a slight concern for the economic outlook. The Brent oil price, a notable benchmark in Europe, has begun 2018 at its highest level since early 2015, exceeding 65 dollars. This represents a rise of 50 per cent in the last six months.

The reasons for this spike are varied but involve policies restricting the supply in oil producing countries, as well as geopolitical conflicts.

Any attempt at a merry quip, particularly at shop assistants, is met by an icy glare of suspicion while they apparently try and work out whether





Soap yawns, festive laughs and cracking drama

stars should clearly change their agent.

MURDERS, thefts, assault, drug overdoses, lying, fraud and much more are all served up in the most popular soap operas nowadays.

Coronation Street, EastEnders and Emmerdale are very dangerous places to live at present. I realise the script writers are competing for ratings but come on guys, get real. These repeated hospital scenes being shown, really are beginning to grate with the British public. I also think the writers are missing a trick, let's have some groundbreaking rating busters.

How about a plague of locusts, or Noah's Ark anchored in Albert Square? Being a policeman on any of these soaps virtually guarantees employment.

A yearly compulsory watch over Christmas for us is Nativity!; a children's film on BBC about a primary school teacher Mr Madden (Martin Freeman) tasked with putting on the school Nativity with the headmistress's loony nephew, a classroom assistant called Mr Poppy wonderfully played by Marc Wooton. It's a hilarious and touching comedy come musical that plays with the heart strings, and watch out for cameos from Ricky Tomlinson and Alan Carr.

Pointless, the BBC's nightly quiz show

presented by Alexandra Armstrong but overseen and directed by the irrepressible Richard Osman seems to be still going strong after what feels like a million shows. The two presenters' professionalism keeps the programme fresh, unlike many that went before. I particularly like the celebrity editions, usually shown over the holidays, in which the

Storage Hunters on Dave TV is a rip off from the American series of the same name. It features a motley crew of punters bidding for the contents of storage containers presumably left by their owners. The original American version is slick,


smart and full of brilliant one liners from

the punters. The English version is dim, dull and full of false people buying

Against my better judgement but in the line of duty I watched Doctors Behind Closed Doors on My 5 and found myself enjoying it to the degree of taking in a few more episodes which were running continuously. There's something quite bizarre about being in a doctor's treatment room 'spying' on seemingly unsuspecting patients. It's really interesting to see what the diagnosis is and what treatment is prescribed, but also very scary at times. Different doctors featured with different patients and my conclusion was what a great job they do.

McMafia is both stunning and confusing but highly watchable. Maybe my brain's incapable of absorbing this fast moving plot. It's an everyday tale of a Russian oligarch (!) and his family, conflicting with the shadowy criminal past activities of the ageing father. Violence and huge finance abound as Alex Goodman (James Norton), son of the tortured father tries to unravel the exact cause of his father's grief. The quality of the filming is stunning and it's a class watch.







LEGALLY SPEAKING

Are dash cams legal in Spain?

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



DASH CAMS: Legal and even useful in Spain.

A FREQUENTLY reoccurring question searched for is 'are dash cams legal in Spain?'

Although there are data protection issues, when referring to traffic law the simple answer is yes. One point that must be considered is that under data protection legislation you can run into problems if you share the footage on social media showing faces or number plates without permission, for example.

That said, not only are dash cams legal in Spain, they can also be extremely useful, especially in providing evidence in the event of an incident, or worse, and can be used by the authorities to help prosecute offenders, such as was the case when a lorry driver embarked on an extremely dangerous overtaking move, the footage was used to track down and prosecute the driver.

What we must take notice of is that the installation of the dash cam must not interfere with our primary field of vision. The optimum position will depend on the style of camera and vehicle, but if the camera can be hidden behind the rear view mirror, then it will not impede your view of the road ahead, and will not create an additional distraction.

Like all devices, such as GPS and mobile phones, they must also be secured and you must not touch them whilst you are driving.

In terms of them being useful, dash cams have been in use in many countries for many years, serving not only as a means of providing evidence in the event of an incident, but also protecting vehicle owners against false

Russia is one of the countries where dash cams have been in use for many years and in America, a move to make them mandatory gained support in recent years, on account of the value they provide.

Are they exempt from fees?

I have been led to believe that, if your house is immediately facing the main road, then you are exempt from Community fees. Our housing estate is not fully enclosed. Can you explain?

D S (Costa Blanca)

Not true. If you are a member of a Community of Property Owners. you must pay the fees, whether you are an apartment, a terraced house or a free-standing villa on its own plot. Only properties which are on a street in a town or a farm in the country and which do not belong to a



Community are free of Community fees. Instead, they pay taxes to the town hall to maintain the street and the services. Confusion may arise because some housing

developments where city streets or roads are used wind up paying both municipal taxes and Community fees to maintain streets and lighting. These complex legal situations, which grew from rapid property development, are gradually being sorted out along the Spanish coastal areas.


The real draw, though, is the sea view particularly at sunset - and the ice cream vendors who serve all manner of flavours. from the exotic to the traditional.

SPAIN'S president Mariano Rajoy had the nerve to urge Ines Arrimadas to try to form a government in Cataluña.

As Ciudadanos was the most-voted constitutionalist party, this was her obligation, he maintained, although Arrimadas knows she cannot compete with the combined seats of the pro-independence parties.

Yet after the December 2015 general election when the Partido Popular lost its overall majority in the national parliament, Rajov immediately refused to try to form a government despite heading the most-voted party.

Raiov wants to see a constitutionalist party in Cataluña but he also hopes to undermine Arrimadas now that Cs is inching its way up the national polls, overtaking Podemos and nudging the PSOE.

Meanwhile, the Cs leader will wait to see who turns up for a pro-independence investiture attempt.

regional president Carles Puigdemont and the four members of his former government self-exiled in Brus-

They are sure to be remanded if they appear, but the separatist parties will be eight MPs short with no room to manoeuvre if they don't. And that's when Arrimadas will start manoeuvring.

Promises to keep

MARIANO RAJOY has committed Spain to increasing its NATO contribution by 80 per cent over the next seven vears.

He could have taken the trouble to inform the public first but, wanting to avoid answering awkward questions, Rajoy buried the announcement while Spain was captive in the clutches of Christmas.

He admitted he promised to step up the country's contribution during the 2014 summit meeting in Wales but so did everybody else. And like everybody else, it was assumed - or at home, certainly - that Spain was not going to cough up when the time came.

So who does Rajoy want to curry favour with? Trump, who frequently trumpets about those who shirk their NATO dues?

The pledge definitely won't go down well at home, where millions are still out of work and where spending has been cut on more important things than international defence.

Lingering aftertaste

THE last of the cruise ships chartered to house police and Guardia Civil officers drafted in to prevent the October 1 referendum have left Barcelona.

The Ministry of the Interior sent between 5,000-6,000 officers to the region and the outside world's view of Catalan independence is based on footage of Spain's forces of law and order using an inordinate amount of muscle to prevent Catalans from voting in an unauthorised ballot.

Neither did the images go down well in the rest of Spain, although censure from the constitutionalist parties who recognised that the Catalan government was acting illegally, was muted.

But what should have been kid-glove treatment was ironfisted and later that day in Cataluña, media coverage pushed people into voting who would otherwise have stayed at home.

Rental trap

I HAVE rented apartments and houses for some years in Spain and while many private owners are honest, some are not. The problem is that the owner, by law, holds the deposit. For example in my previous rental, they held €400. And when it came to handing the deposit back - after first deducting water and electric bills for two months - that they would keep the other €348 for cleaning expenses.

When I complained to the owners, who were both out of work, they refused to reply to my emails. After some advice from the Citizen's Advice Bureau in Malaga, it gave me the information I needed. Owners should leave the deposit with the AVRA (the Agencia de Vivienda y Rehabilitación Andalucia). If they have not done so, it is probably because they do not want to pay taxes on the rental in-

I sent a letter to the owners saying I would contact the AVRA and then the local tax offices to see if they had paid taxes on their rental income if I did not get my money back. Paying me was cheaper than paying the taxes, so my money was returned.

Surely the law should be changed so the money automatically goes to the AVRA to help stop any such problems?

The disappointment at investing in a 'miracle' cream which comes in microscopic proportions can be high. But the good news is we may be using far too much of our favourite products, according to one beautician, and can get away with using less.


Dr Natasha Cook, an Australian dermatologist, has told one publication one of the most expensive products - facial serum - can be used in tiny proportions because it is so concentrated.

She explained, "for serum, all you need is a pea-sized amount over the entire face," adding, "these products are, in theory, concentrated with a high percentage of active ingredients. This means you shouldn't need too much."

Sticking to the same theme she says moisturiser should be used in an "almond-sized amount," adding, "two pumps if it is a pump applicator or an almond-sized amount over the entire face."

Foundation, which can be expensive if used several times throughout the day, can also be used in pea-sized quantities. Dr Cook explained, "if you've got a larger face, you may need slightly more," adding, "I recommend applying it to the back of your hand, before getting a 'kakubi' make up brush and evenly buffing it all over your face."

Lastly, for improving dark circles and puffiness use a "sunflower seed equivalent," of eye cream as, "these creams tend to be rich so you only need a small amount "

Beware the dreaded lurgy

ARE you ever surprised by how your friends often notice you are under the weather before you've even mentioned it?

Well according to scientists from the United States, Sweden and Germany, humans are able to tell if a person is displaying signs of illness even in the very early stages.

The group found people were able to distinguish a healthy person from an unhealthy one just by looking at very subtle differences in the faces.

These included pale skin and lips and drooping eyes.

Twenty-two volunteers took part in a trial led by scientists from Stockholm University and New York University (NYU), half of whom were given a placebo and half of whom were given a drug which temporarily mimics illness.

Sixty other participants were then shown photos of the group and asked to point out who looked ill and who looked well.

Of the 16 photos they were shown, the 60 observers were able to correctly identify whether a person was ill or not in 13 cases.

Three main signs of illness were identified, including looking pale.

The study's authors explained, "redness signals a

healthy and attractive appearance in both humans and animals and that appearing tired is strongly related to appearing healthy."

The researchers also said drooping eyelids on ill people were a sign of tiredness from fighting off infection.

Finally, the scientists noted the most obvious clue was pale lips on those who were ill, explaining it is a good place to look if you are trying to work out if someone is ill or not.

Painkillers 'could reduce fertility'

MANY women experience various pains during pregnancy and may turn to painkillers for help.


But this could damage your unborn child's fertility, according to scientists.

The study, carried out at the University of Edinburgh, found taking paracetamol or ibuprofen during pregnancy reduced the number of eggs in a female foetus by up to 40 per cent. And while

the research was carried out on rats, scientists say the same could be true for humans.

The news could affect the fertility of unborn males too as scientists found the number of sperm cells in foetuses reduced by up to 20 per cent.

The group was less concerned by this, however, as men can produce sperm all their lives but women only have a limited egg supply.



Spring cleaning

Your garden in January

APOLOGIES that my column disappeared for a couple of months but software problems, delays in obtaining a compatible hard disk and becoming acquainted with significant changes in user friendliness caused my first major problem since Google appeared in 1998.

This was the same time when gardening problems multiplied with a drying climate, the use of an increasing number and variety of plants from outside Spain, wide variations in the sources and qualities of composts and the occurrence of unwanted plant pests, from the ever increasing number attacking fruit trees to feral cats.

Most expat January gardening needs are common along the Mediterranean coast from north to south, but what is feasible from day to day are influenced by the tremendous gales, continued droughts on the Costa Blanca and widespread rain in Andalucia.

Fortunately mild temperatures so far have allowed continuing good harvests of a diverse mix of tasty salad leaves and flowers. Chemical free salads with up to 20 ingredients continue from my raised beds and line of builders buckets surrounding the boule court.

One very useful job for a dry day is to clean up roses and prepare them for the 2018 flowering season. First prune to an appropriate shape leaving two strong budding points on each pruned stem. Spray with a strong garlic spray and plant two garlic seed segments under each plant before placing a deep manure mulch, preferably horse, under each

Climbing plants now need pruning to manageable heights and prevent them from becoming straggly when spring growth commences.

To achieve a healthy garden environment for humans, pets and beneficial insects and ensure that all possible vegetables and fruit can be eaten safely, only spray when essential and try to restrict your spraying to ecological sprays such as garlic and neem as insecticides and propolis for a general fungicide.

Inexpensive spring bulbs are now appearing so it is a good time to plant some extra ones. But do water and improve the soil first. It is also not too late to sow sweet peas for early spring displays.

When we had our large henegada allotment we always had a 20-metre row that supplied bunches of flowers and seeds to passing village ladies for whom sweet peas were a novelty.

If you have an area of bare vegetable growing soil top it up with a layer of animal and vegetative compost to renew and improve the fertility and moisture retaining properties.

THE luxury division in the SUV market has been heating up with Bentley, Jaguar, Range Rover and Audi vying for supremacy. But more affordable options are now on the market with the release of Renault's latest five-seater Koleos and the new look seven-seater Sorento from Kia.

The Koleos is by no means cheap, with a starting price of £27.500 (€30.900). Renault offers drivers a lot of bang for their buck with ample space compensating for less seats than the average SUV. The boot can be expanded to 1,690 litres.

For those keen on their gadgets, Renault offers an upgrade on the Koleos, the Initiale Paris line, which begins at £36,700 (€41,200).

For the extra 10 grand drivers get heated Nappa leather seats, an infotainment system with Apple CarPlay, TomTom satellite navigation, LED headlights, a panoramic sunroof which opens and a 13speaker Bose stereo. There's a spare wheel, automatic parking sensors and even cup holders which can be heated and chilled.

The Initiale Paris comes powered by a 2.0 litre dCi 175 turbodiesel engine with an all-wheel drive and automatic gearbox. Deliveries start in spring.

Kia's popular Sorento has been given a sporty GT-Line Series for 2018. This large SUV boasts all-black leather seats, LED headlamps, twin exhausts and an eight-speed automatic gearbox, with a six-speed manual alternative available.

There is a 2.2 litre CRDi turbodiesel engine. Apple CarPlay and Android Auto are available on all models and the SUV retains Kia's trademark ice cube fog lights. Prices range from £28,995 (€32,600) to £41,995 (€47,200) for the GT-Line S



Nissan X-Trail Tekna

NISSAN'S large SUV the X-Trail has been a big-selling model for some years and received a significant make-over in 2017, getting more curvy styling, upgraded interior and a punchy new diesel engine.

One of the roomiest and most practical in its sector. X-Trail is available with petrol and diesel engines, and the option of fourwheel drive and seven seats, with prices starting at €26,305 (£23,385).

The new engine is a 175 hp 2.0 litre diesel and it offers crisp acceleration - the 0-100 kph time is 9.4 seconds and top speed 204 kph (127 mph). Fuel economy is pretty good at 17.2 kpl (48.7 mpg).

In flagship Tekna spec and in 4WD form, this version costs € 37,976 (£33,760) and comes laden with kit including auto headlamps and wipers, privacy glass, climate control, lane departure warning, touchscreen system with DAB radio, sat-nav, connectivity features, surround-view cam-

The previous X-Trail looked rather boxy, but the latest version has a more classy and curvy appearance, with wider front grille, revised bumpers and a refreshed and more upmarket interior which allows it to better compete with recent rivals such as Skoda Kodiaq, Kia Sorento and Renault Koleos.

The X-Trail, now longer, wider and taller, offers class-leading interior space, with a 550 litre boot, expandable to a whopping 1.982 with flat-fold rear seats. Tiered seating still leaves good head and legroom and wider doors permit good access.

Its capacious cabin and overall versatility - with 18 different load/ passenger configurations - give it a distinct edge in a very competitive sector.

On the road, X-Trail is very car-like with light steering and a slick six-speed manual gearbox. While perhaps not quite as engaging as some rivals when it comes to allround handling, it still delivers composed cornering and comfortable ride quality and feels agile in city traffic.

Model tested was UK-specification and equipment levels and prices may vary in other markets.

German efficiency

WHILE British production took a hit with lower domestic demand in 2017, German manufacturers are reaping a bumper harvest.

Volkswagen revealed that it has shaken off the emissions scandal, producing a record-busting six million vehicles last year alone. They were built in 50 factories world-

Last year brought Volkswagen's total production since the first post-war civilian Beetle debuted in 1946 to 150 million vehicles. The figures don't include production from other brands under the VK umbrella, including Audi, Seat and Skoda.

Meanwhile in Munich, BMW celebrated the production of its 100,000th electric car in 2017 by lighting up its 100-metre-tall headquarters. Electric cars now account for 7 per cent of all BMW sales in Western Europe and the United States.

Ex-Malaga star, Barca prodigy Sandro set for Spain return?

EVERTON striker Las Palmas born Sandro Ramirez could be set to depart Goodison Park, just seven months after arriving from Malaga last summer in a £5.2m move

Toffees boss Sam Allardyce continues to trawl the January transfer window to bring in more firepower after signing striker Cenk Tosun, 26, from Besiktas for

"Securing the player is most important as the club's biggest area of concern is the number of goals we're capable of getting," said Big Sam.

Sandro, 22, whose future is unclear on Merseyside, eyed Champions League football this season, citing sacked manager Ronald Koeman as one of the reasons he joined Everton.

On Sandro, Allardyce, who replaced Koeman in November, said: "There's never a guarantee when a top player comes from abroad that he will settle in his first

"And certainly not settle when the team isn't doing very well. Every new player



that came from abroad would find it difficult to perform to his best level when the team struggles.

Everton were in dire straights under Koeman - sacked after the 5-2 home defeat against Arsenal in October - that left them in the Premier League relegation


Sandro has been linked with a loan move to Valencia in the January window, with a view to a permanent move.

Sandro started his career at Barcelona where he was a member of the youth academy, aged 14, and went on to make 17 first team appearances in La Liga, during 2014-16.

Released by Barca, Sandro joined Malaga on a three year deal in July 2016. A year later he moved to Everton on a four year deal after triggering a £5.2m release

With just 15 appearances in all competitions Sandro has netted a sole goal, having featured in Europa League football, the Premier League and the EFL Cup.

Spurs host Everton in the Premier League on Saturday, with Newcastle hosting Swansea and Chelsea hosting Leicester. Sunday January 14: Bournemouth v Arsenal; Liverpool v Manchester City. January 15: Manchester United v Stoke.

Signs of hope for Malaga?

IT is safe to say that things haven't quite gone to plan for Malaga CF so far this season.

After Monday's 1-0 loss to Espanyol, Los Boquerones sit in a perilous position.

Following defeat to fellow relegation rivals Alaves in their final match of 2017, coupled with Monday's loss, the Malaguistas sit second from bottom on 11 points; five points and four goals

Post Christmas cheer


AT Christmas last season, Malaga were sitting pretty.

On December 18, 2016, Malaga were in 11th position on 19 points, having only lost just five of their first 16 matches in the La Liga sea-

Fast forward to this season and there is a stark contrast. Sat deep in relegation trouble, it is difficult to see a way out for them, but Los Boquerones have a knack for picking up points after Christmas.

Last year, 56 per cent of the team's total 45 points came after the Christmas break as they went on a five match unbeaten run in April and May, where they picked up 13 points from a pos-

In fact, in three of the last four previous seasons. Malaga have picked up more points after

Christmas than before the annual break.

In the 2015/16 season they picked up 28 points (58.3 per cent), while in the 2013/14 season they managed 25 points (55.5 per cent).

Their after Christmas form is undoubtedly a feat they will have to continue if they are to avoid the drop at the climax of the season.



RELEGATION BATTLE: Can Malaga beat the drop?

Results against teams around them

DESPITE somewhat unfavourable results against their relegation rivals this season, Malaga's form against those in and around them reads positively for the rest of the season.

Malaga have lost just once in seven matches in their previous four seasons against Deportivo La Coruña, winning four, including this season's dramatic 3-2 win at La Rosaleda in No-

They also similarly had a good run of results against both Las Palmas (W2 D1 2L) and Levante (W2 D2 L1) across the last four seasons.

While results against the other teams vary, it is safe to say they will need to get the wins against the teams around them to have any chance of survival.

TRANSFER WINDOW The January transfer window

will be key to Malaga's season and if they are to have any chance of survival then they seriously need to strengthen a number of key positions.

Los Boquerones have leaked goals in La Liga so far this season, 31 to be precise, while only managing two clean sheets and desperately need new recruits to stop leaking goals.

Former Arsenal defender Ignasi Miquel and midfielder Manuel Iturra have already signed on in the hope of shoring up the defence, but they may not be enough.

Similarly, they have the joint second worst scoring stats in La Liga, with just 13 goals all sea-

Midfielders Chory Castro and Diego Rolan lead the way with three apiece, while Borja Baston, a loan signing from Swansea in the summer, has managed just two goals in all competitions

But with Alberto Bueno signing on loan from FC Porto for the remainder of the season, and rumours of former striker Sandro returning after struggling to make an impact in the Premier League with Everton, Malaga are already taking a step in the right direction.

Malaga will be looking to get their season back on track tomorrow (Friday), when they travel to Getafe.

Rock 'n' Roll for Jose

MANCHESTER UNITED'S Premier League's fixture against struggling Stoke City at Old Trafford will be just another 'rock 'n' roll' day for Red's gaffer Jose Mourinho.

"The king of the rock and roll said I was underperforming," said Mourinho.

Ex-Real Madrid boss Mourinho, who enters the final 12 months of his existing annual £12m deal this summer, has pointed the finger at Oasis star Noel Gallagher, fan of arch rivals Manchester City.

Gallagher aired his views after City's 2-1 win against United in December: "It's payback time. Respect to the United fans who clapped Pep Guardiola.

"They know they've seen something special. The hypocrisy of the man (Mourinho) is staggering," said Gallagher, referring to Mourinho's post-match comments, which took issue with the nature of City's win.

United, who host Stoke on Monday, have invoked op-

tions to extend the contracts of Juan Mata, Ander Herrera, Ashley Young and Daley Blind until the end of next season.



United executive vice-chairman Ed Woodward and Mourinho's advisers are set for talks over extending his stay: "My commitment is total and I want to stay," said Mourinho.

'Rocket Ronnie' still potting balls, not plants

RONNIE O'SULLIVAN who won a record seventh Masters title in 2017 when defeating Joe Perry 10-7 in the final at London's Alexandra Palace, says: "It's just a job.

"I still like playing, but for me it's just a job," said O'Sullivan, in his 26th year on the green baize, who plays Marco Fu on January 16.

O'Sullivan, who has earned his nickname as 'The Rocket' with 31 ranking tournament wins, won the UK Snooker Championship in December, potting another £450,000 first prize.

"It's not always about the money," said Sullivan, edging towards a milestone £10m career winnings, following his bow on the green baize in 1992. World Champion in 2001, 2004, 2008, 2012 and 2013, Sullivan pocketed the £200,000

first prize, when successfully defending his 2016 Masters title, superseding Stephen Hendry's six Masters wins.

"It is great to get some records. To win seven, someone up there is looking after me," said O'Sullivan, who once told me he'd rather be potting plants, than balls.

ANDY MURRAY'S hopes that 2018 would be a better year than his injury plagued 2017 is in tatters with the former world number one's hip injury woes continuing.

"I want to be fit and healthy. It isn't about winning every match or winning more slams," said Murray, who missed almost five months with hip issues in 2017.

Murray, who underwent an intensive programme of rehabilitation in preparation for 2018, withdrew from the Brisbane International and the Australian Open this month, due to his long-term hip injury.

"I had every intention of making a strong start to the year," rued Murray, who rose to world number one in 2016, now ranked 16th.

Murray, who spent off-season in Miami, returning to the UK in December, could be suffering a torn labrum. A hip labral tear involves the ring of cartilage -

The Australian Open starts in Melbourne on January 15 and Murray said: "I won't be playing in Melbourne. I am not yet ready to compete."

If Murray is suffering a torn labrum surgery would be fraught with uncertainty. A hip labral tear may predispose osteoarthritis in the future.

Three-time Grand Slam champion Murray who has not played a competitive match since Wimbledon - considering surgery, said: "I just want to enjoy playing again."

Joining Murray in withdrawing is Japan's Kei Nishikori, suffering a wrist injury; and Serena Williams, who gave birth in September, said: "I'm not where I personally want to be."

Injury doubts surround Spain's Rafael Nadal, having withdrawn from the Brisbane International, leading to fitness concerns ahead of the Australian Open, due to a knee issue.

Doubts hang over Wimbledon champion, Spain's Gabrine Muguruza, who has severe cramp issues, and Britain's number one Johanna Konta, suffering a hip injury.
