School shooting shocker

A MAN has been shot dead in broad daylight outside a school in Beniajan, Spanish media said.

According to reports, the victim stopped in his car near Los Granaous school, before a young man approached the vehicle, broke the glass and shot the man three times.

The 36-year-old victim was killed in the El Boial district at around 11.30am on Tuesday morning, reports say.

One witness reportedly said the alleged killer was wearing a hood and ran away after the shooting.

On Tuesday, Guardia Civil were taking samples and testimonies as they began their investigation.

They were also reportedly trying to ascertain the identity of the victim and whether he owned the car.

However, local reports have suggested that the victim is a Romanian father living in the area.

Pictures of the incident show emergency services at the scene, surrounding a silver estate car - which appears to be a Renault - in a narrow street.

Grainy footage shows forensic investigators entering the cordoned off area on Calle Principe Felipe and significant police activity by the motionless car, which has both doors

Italian job

Top mafia boss arrested in Spain

An Italian mafia chief on the run for 25 years has been arrested in Alicante, reports say.

Fausto Pellegrinetti is reportedly charged with money laundering and cocaine trafficking to the tune of 550 kilogrammes.

He had escaped Italian house arrest in October 1993, before police tracked him to a luxury penthouse in Alicante and arrested him on Sunday, at around 2pm.

Police suspect him of living under a false identity in the city for several years. They say he is also known as 'Franco' or 'En-

Believed to be an important figure in Rome's mafia - notably the 'La Magliana' ring - he had already been sentenced to 13 years in prison. He is also reportedly associated with

the Marsigliesi, Berenguer. Bellicini and Bergamelli clans.

A joint investigation by Spanish and Italian police into the ring led them to Pellegrinetti, who they believe has remained active in the criminal underworld for decades.

Speaking at a press conference on Sunday, police spokesperson Luigi Silipo told reporters: "Fausto Pellegrinetti is a person who represents 50/60 years of criminal history of Rome. He is the first Roman criminal that was declared wanted."

Fleet rocked by short stocks

TORREVIEJA'S fishing industry is on tenterhooks after a dismal start to January saw catches fall by nearly 40 per cent, according to reports in the Spanish media.

Just over 30,000 kilos of anchovies and sardines were reportedly caught and sold in the first half of this month, compared to 120,000

throughout January 2017.

A Patron of the Fishermen's Association, Pedro Carmona Perez, suggested sardine stocks seemed particularly scarce.

Other representatives from the organisation have also reported the virtual disappearance of sardines from the area, media reports say.

Con caught out

NATIONAL POLICE have reportedly arrested two people on suspicion of swindling a Kazakhstani person living in Alicante out of \in 20,000. They are both 49, and allegedly failed to provide services promised to the victim.

Council in chaos Mayor Dolon due in court

TORREVIEJA mayor Jose Manuel Dolon's future is in doubt, ahead of a court date

He is accused of 'administrative prevarication against individual rights,' according to reports in the Spanish me-

He could be disqualified from public office.

The complaint against him was lodged by Popular Party (PP) councillor, Agustina Esteve, last October.

That came after Ms Esteve had reportedly made a request from another local body for information, but was told the information could not be made available 'because it would paralyse the normal functioning of the Council.'

As an opposition councillor, he is entitled to a response, reports say.

Following the complaint, a judge reportedly requested a complete set of files on the case from the relevant authorities, before summoning the official to court.

Mr Dolon told a press conference that he only learned from the media about his court summons, and that, to date, he has not received any notification.

The mayor has reportedly

said he "wish(es) to know the content of that citation to request information on the relevant file," claiming that he is willing to answer, resolve or clarify the re-

mayor's office or from the government team, has any order been given to limit the right to information of the opposition but quite the oppo-

The PP of Torrevieja's secretary general, Joaquin Albaladejo, said: "Jose Manuel Dolon forced us to go to the justice to collect useful municipal information for all (residents) and we have reached the point where a judge criminally investigates the mayor."

Sueña Torrevieja spokesman, Pablo Samper, said that the presumption of innocence must be respected, but that it was very sad that Torrevieja is known by a former mayor of the PP who was imprisoned, another former popular mayor and current spokesman of the PP that is being investigated, and now, the current mayor who is also cited to testify.

Ciudadanos official Pilar Gomez Magan indicated that her party will wait for the Prosecutor's Office to request a writ for the opening of an oral trial to demand the resignation of the mayor for lack of transparency.

Mayor Dolon is expected to appear in the Court of Instruction No. 3 of Torrevieja on January 30, at 10am.

Drought at root of veg issue

VEGETABLE production in Alicante dropped by 25 per cent last year because of drought, Spanish media says.

Production reportedly fell by some 30,485 tonnes in 2017 compared to 2016. A report by the Association of Young Farmers of Alicante blames 'the ravages of the severe drought' for the fall.

"The situation will be much more serious in 2018," the group warn. Alicante produced around 335,000 tonnes of vegetables in total last year.

A lack of water has decreased the area's available farm-

However, the production of grapes dropped 20 per cent in 2017, as a result of heavy rain in September.

A summary in the report says: 'the balance of the 2017 agricultural year in the province of Alicante has been marked by the pressing drought, in which we are immersed for four years and that has worsened severely since May closed the Tajo-Segura transfer, according to Spanish

Another factor was the emergence of a bacterium named Xylella Fastidiosa - which reportedly hit vegetable production.

"The only positive note of 2017 is the economic value of the plantations, thanks to the fact that citrus fruits and vegetables reached reasonable prices in the field for the producer," he said.

According to the organisation's estimates, the economic value of agricultural production increased, from €684.5 million in 2016 to €711 million in 2017, despite the problems. "The great work done by the agricultural entrepreneur has caused that, despite having planted 1 per cent less, agricultural production has increased (+2.5 per cent)," the group commented.

Significant issues also hit fruit trees, with 1,449 hectares being lost, leaving 31,391 hectares remaining, according to the association. Cereals also lost 439 hectares, but there were significant increases in olive cultivation - 480 hectares - and vineyards - up 593 hectares.

Experts have been warning for some time to expect severe drought in the region and major consequences for food production.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE nº47

There are many lazy stereotypes about Spain, but the siesta - and laziness itself - seems particularly unfair in one of Europe's most hardworking countries. Could the traditional nap really be dying out, asks Harrison Jones.

Time out for siestas?

SUN, sangria and paella: the clichés of Spanish life are numerous and often live up to the hype. Yet one particularly prominent stereotype seems especially tired, since it now barely registers in modern Spain.

The famous siesta is a period in the late afternoon when the country shuts down for hours - at least in theory.

But the idea that Spaniards are lazy is not supported by their working hours, which are far higher on average than other European na-

And now, it seems their mid-afternoon break is being put to bed.

Traditionally, the business siesta would run between roughly 2pm and 5pm, with restaurants closing later. Spaniards would have a big, long lunch, often with alcohol, followed by a nap.

The original reason for the siesta was supposedly to avoid the mid-afternoon heat, particularly for manual labourers working in the sun, and to allow rest/travel time between morning and afternoon jobs.

But there are also suggestions that the practice has Roman origins, making it Italian - though it is far more widely associated with Spain.

In turn, the Spanish influenced other countries in colonial times to take up the practice.

Spaniards also stay up notoriously late and tend to sleep less than other nations, meaning an afternoon break helped maintain their latenight lifestyle.

But as modern, western culture and - crucially, air conditioning -ar-

rived, the humble siesta took a hit.

A 2017 poll found that 58 per cent of Spaniards do not take a daytime nap, with the share of those saying they sometimes indulge consistently dropping.

Office-based workers are highly unlikely to go home for lunch and sleep in a globalised, high-pressure country.

Meanwhile, calls to realign Spain with its geographical time zone could impact the practice. The fascist dictator Franco changed Spanish clocks to align with Germany, but there is increasing pressure to return - which would mean the sun goes down earlier and people could go to bed earlier, with less need for afternoon sleep.

Yet, there are some who value the

tradition, particularly the elderly and those living in rural areas. Some towns, including Ador, Valencia, have enshrined the practice into

There are other small signs of a modern resurgence.

The health benefits of 'power napping' are widely hailed by health experts. A roughly 25-minute nap boosts memory, alertness, nighttime sleep, heart condition and mental/physical well-being generally.

And in cities, 'siesta hotels' are a rising trend.

The overall outlook for the siesta, though, is ominous. And while it might not be put to bed completely, it is certainly dropping off - just don't expect the stereotype to fade with it.

Lynx effect!

IT is the most endangered wild cat in the world. And this stunning image, captured last month, shows the Iberian lynx in all its predatory beauty.

It comes as wildlife lovers and nature photographers descended on the Sierra de Andúiar mountain range in Jaén Province, Andalucía, to catch a glimpse of the elusive feline.

Normally secretive during sunlight hours, sexually mature adults are active throughout the day in December and January as the females come into heat and males compete to breed

And the vast Sierra de Andújar - part of the larger Sierra Morena chain - is home to the largest and best-preserved population, with around 100 females each commanding a territory of 10-20 square kilometres.

Spanish authorities recently announced that wild numbers of the cat have risen to at least 547 from a historic low of 94 in 2002.

More than 400 inhabit Andalucía, with the remainder split between Castilla-La Mancha. Extremadura and Portugal.

Andalucían environment councillor. José Fiscal and director of the European Commission-funded lynx conservation programme LIFE Iberlince, Miguel Ángel Simón revealed

the encouraging figures during a Sevilla press conference.

But it is not all good news, after 58 lynx were found dead in 2017, a record.

According to reports, 31 of the animals were killed by traffic, leading to widespread criticism from environmental groups, although the main issue continues to be a lack of rabbits, its principal prey.

Native to the Iberian Peninsula but introduced around the world. Spanish rabbits have been devastated by the myxamatosis virus and, more recently. a haemorrhagic disease known as RHDVb.



Serial robber detained

A SERIAL robber has been arrested in Murcia, according to Spanish media.

An off-duty Guardia Civil officer reportedly forcibly arrested the robber in an El Esparragal-Murcia building which they were trying to

The 44-year-old Spaniard is suspected of some 16 robberies in houses and shops in Las Lumbreras, Santiago. Zaraiche, Cobatillas, El Esparragal and Llano de Brujas-Murcia.

Countless objects have since been recovered. Some have been identified by - and returned to - their original owners, linking the suspect to the robberies, reports say.

Officers requested a court order to enter and search the suspect's home in Las Lumbreras, Murcia. Numerous goods were subsequently

found and transferred to police to verify their origin.

Several documents reportedly detail second-hand sales of goods suggesting that the suspect had made a habit of selling stolen items of jewellery and tools in a secondhand Murcia shop.

The accused remains in custody.

The Guardia Civil has ap-

pealed for information about the recovered objects, many of which still remain in the head office of the Civil Guard of Santomera. They hope to identify and return them to their legitimate owners.

FOLLOWING numerous calls from his peers to step down, Roque Ortiz, the former Murcia city councillor for development has resigned.

Ortiz has been caught up in controversy since last Thursday when several of the comments he made during a meeting with parents and members of the neighbourhood, which was presided over by the mayor himself, were leaked to the press.


In the meeting, the councilman hanged his party, saying that "there are many people who are where they are thanks to the Popular Party" and commented that anyone who forgot that was "a pig."

The former councilman presented his letter of resignation addressed to the Mayor of Murcia, Jose Ballesta, on Tuesday.

In the letter, Ortiz says that "I leave the Murcia Council with a clear conscience, my head high and assured of having fulfilled my mission.

"I leave, recognising that I made a mistake, an unfortunate verbal error - as I have publicly acknowledged - that during the past few days has made me reflect on whether politics is worthwhile, when it shows its worst face."

Ortiz concluded his letter by stating that "I am not a professional politician, I cannot play this game. I have not sought to prove my value by comparing myself to others, by being who I am, not being better than others.



who live near her house.

According to the publication. she said on the first day after she felt able to go out onto the street following what happened, "his relatives began to shout 'bitch' at me. And to tell me that I took all the money from him and I put

him in jail." She told the paper that she had got a restraining order against him after filing "six complaints for hitting me, six for kidnapping and another for rape... Plus many other times that I have not reported."

She also alleges that he burned her documentation.

Joaquin, who is said to be of Romani ethnicity, has since been put in custody.

Irena reportedly sustained minor injuries to her legs in the incident two weeks ago, while Joffre Rolando - her boyfriend - has his leg in plaster.

"I was pregnant with Joffre. My ex came for me and, because of his beating, I lost the baby," she said in her home.

"He (Joaquin) spent 10 years

(in jail) for drug trafficking and two more years for hitting me," she told the paper.

"I always escaped from him," she added.

"He got me into heroin and smoked cocaine," Irena admitted to Spanish media sources, but added that "since I'm with Joffre, I'm fine and I do not want drugs in my life."

She says she intends to denounce Joaquin's relatives who, she says, have threatened her in the neighborhood.

Police are treating the incident as domestic violence and found the car shortly after the incident.

The vehicle was recovered in the La Fama neighbourhood the same area where the event took place.

Are we losing touch with nature?

NEWS that the Iberian lynx population is increasing is cause for good cheer. It is an example of what can be achieved if wildlife conservation efforts are properly coordinated.

Having increased from 94 individuals to almost 550 in the last 15 years, the world's rarest wild cat has made a genuine comeback. And in doing so it has avoided the fate of being the first cat species to go extinct since the sabre-toothed tiger 10,000 years ago.

But how did it come to this?

In just three decades - from the 1960s to the 1990s - the Iberian lynx lost around 80 per cent of its former range, which extended across much of Spain and into southern France. It is a sad indictment of the rapid extension of human development over the last 50 years, and one that is mirrored across the globe.

This surging rate of urbanisation now sees more than 50 per cent of the world's population living in towns and cities, and the majority no longer come into regular contact with nature. As Sir David Attenborough puts it: "So over half is to some degree out of touch with the natural world and don't even see an animal from one day to the next unless it's a rat or a pigeon.

"That means that people are getting out of touch with the realities of the natural world, of which we are in fact a part." So have humans now changed the face of the planet to such an extent that many of us are only aware of what we have created, rather than the natural processes that made it all possible?

And as alcoholism, gambling and other self-destructive practises continue to rise, we must surely examine whether we are, as a species, losing our place in the world.

Driver pays for bus blunder

€ 100,000 for family of girl killed after unplanned stop

THE family of a girl killed after a bus conductor allowed her to get off at an unmarked stop will be compensated with over €100,000, according to Spanish media.

The 16-year-old died more than three years ago, when she was hit by a tourist driver near Playa Honda, 30km east of Cartagena and close to La Manga.

The amount of ≤ 109.000 must be paid in compensation to the girl's parents by the region of Murcia's Autonomous Community.

The Chamber of Contentious Superior Court of Justice (TSJ) of Murcia ruled that financial responsibility lay with the regional administration for 'consenting' to the child getting off at an unmarked stop.

The area where she got off did not have a sign or pedestrian crossing.

The ruling also points out that the unofficial stop - located on a service road of the Cartagena-La Manga motorway - lacked the minimum required security measures.

There was no lighting and the road was known for heavy traffic in the summer months - the period when the girl was run over by a tourist travelling in the opposite direction.

While deciding on the value of the compensation, the Chamber reduced the figure by 10 per cent, because it said the child should have taken more care when crossing the road.

The figure includes the €3,000 claimed by the parents for the funeral expenses.

However, it did not include an additional €70,000 claimed for moral damages.

The TSJ said that the authority's own inspector described the place where the incident occurred as one of "extreme danger," according to translated reports.

The Autonomous Community reportedly proposed a €59,500 payment package, and to split the sum equally with the transport company involved in the incident.



Earthquake system boosted after tremors

SPAIN'S National Geographic Institute has reportedly reinforced the Murcia region's earthquake monitoring network

Two mobile seismographs which measure movement of the earth - have been added to the four machines already operating in the area, according to Spanish media.

Spain experiences relatively regular tremors and it is hoped that with better monitoring the region will be able to deal with them more effectively.

graphs, which record ground movement during earthquakes, are also being implemented, translated reports say.

The new seismographs will reportedly be placed in Albudeite and Yereachar.

The National Geographic Institute has already installed 18 accelerographs, 10 in Lor-

A number of tremors have been felt in the region in recent weeks.

In 2011, an earthquake measuring 5.1 on the Richter Scale hit Lorca. Two years ago, 26 people were injured in a 6.3 earthquake which hit Andalu-

The director of the Seismic Network, Emilio Carreño, told Spanish media that experts

have not been surprised by recent tremors.

"The region is one of the most seismic and most dangerous (in) all of Spain, and citizens should be aware of that," he reportedly said.

"Fieldwork is being done and when we refine the research we will have an answer."

He added that there was no suggestion that the tremors could be a precursor to a larger quake, because "we cannot predict or know if after a series like the last one they will continue producing more."

He said that each year there are about 7,000 earthquakes in Spain and "it is very frequent" that a series of tremors occurs before tectonic movement "then disappears."



Baby returns to scene of miracle survival

A PREMATURE baby given less than a 1 per cent chance of survival has visited the hospital where she was born eight months ago, to the delight of staff.

Araceli Gil is thought to be the smallest baby to ever be born at Alicante General Hospital. According to reports, she was born 17 weeks early and weighed just 490 grams.

Eva Garcia, one of the staff who helped Araceli, told Spanish media: "The survival of newborns both in ages less than 24 weeks and with weights less than 500 grams is not usual."

She noted that some extreme cases of survival at 22 weeks have been documented, but said "Most of them have been left with serious consequences."

Araceli, who was born after just 23 weeks, now weighs 4.5 kilos and is healthy.

All the staff at the hospital's Neonatology service were delighted to see the girl, who posed for pictures when she came in for a health review.

Her mother and father - also called Araceli, and Marcos, according to reports - are delighted by their daughter's

"In the first days, the family and acquaintances gave their condolences," Marcos recalls.

His partner adds: "They told me that I had gone into labour and that the girl could not be born there because they were not prepared. They took me to an ambulance to move me to the General

Hospital of Alicante, although they told me that it was most likely that I would lose the girl on the way."

Over a period of months of intense care "it was a triumph every hour that passed and my daughter was still alive,"

Nurse Eva Garcia and a colleague, Pedro Munoz, said: "These babies are so small they are manipulated by two and three people for a nappy change or to suck the secretions because they are stressed a lot."

Pain awareness in premature babies "is enormous and has repercussions at the brain level," Garcia explains. As such great care was taken over noise and light, "since until the 40th week the stimuli that the child receives are essential for her brain development."

She continued: "(This) insurance contributed to the improvement of immunity as well as maturation and development of the different organs, fundamentally

Former mayor back in court

Pedro Hernandez Mateo was in court last week, with the current mayor trying to disqualify him from public office for a further four years, according to reports.



Criminals are not welcome

ELCHE and Orihuela have the lowest crime rates for municipalities of over 60,000 in the Alicante region, according to Spanish media

The Ministry of the Interior's annual report suggests there was a rate of just 21 crimes per 1,000 inhabitants in the two areas. The city of Orihuela has a population of around 80,000, while the town of Elche is home to roughly 227,000 peo-

In Alicante, with a reported population of over 330,000 people, the crime rate is 27.25

crimes per 1,000 inhabitants. The figure in Torrevieja - which has a reported population of 84 000 - is double that of Elche and Orihuela, at 42.36.

Experts say that the Elche and Orihuela figures are surprising, since both municipalities have a large population area, with many districts and country areas.

This can often lead to more frequent crimes, notably robberies, due to the difficulties police face in covering many of the outlying areas.

But authorities have report-

edly suggested that the coordination of Local Police, National Police, Civil Guard and Autonomous Police has helped reduce criminal activity.

Police sources say that coastal towns normally have higher crime rates because many of the properties lie empty for much of the year.

That provides temptation for criminals who know they will have less chance of being

Scorching records

MURCIA has broken its record temperature for January, Spanish media has said.

On Monday, temperatures in the region hit 26 degrees centigrade - the hottest in January for 33 years according to the meteorological site Eltiempo.es.

The previous record, from January 2014, was reportedly 25.8 degrees.

Luis Bañón, a meteorologist and regional spokesman for the Spanish weather service AEMET, told Spanish media that the unseasonable warmth was "caused by the anticyclonic situation, the winds of Poniente and a strong anticyclone that has been stationed on the coast of Portugal."

Temperatures are expected to remain high for the next couple of days, with no rain forecast until Sunday or Monday, at the time of going to print.

Tonnes of recycling has been left abandoned in a recycling plant in Benidorm destroyed by a fire in 2011, according to the Environmental Council.

Patients run out of patience

MORE than a dozen patients were angered after reportedly being kept waiting for an absent doctor at the San Andres Health Centre.

A consultant from the Traumatology Centre, in Murcia, was apparently not at work for several hours because of a mix up with shifts earlier this week.

That meant there was no on duty doctor in the department, according to Spanish media.

More than 12 patients waited for around three hours for someone to cover the missing

One patient told Spanish media they had waited seven months for the appointment, only to be initially told to go home and arrange another one. The Murcian Health Service has reportedly apologised for the incident, admitting: "it is a situation that should not occur."

Fly-tipping clean up

URGENT action is going to be taken to halt fly-tipping and clean up waste dumps on the Orihuela Costa, according to the local councillor for the Environment. Miguel Angel Fernandez claims he is going to act immediately to remove the unattractive and unhygienic sites.

The clean up operation will reportedly last three to four days, across three locations. The first is a landfill on a PAU 26 plot visible from the AP-7 motorway. The second is on an adjacent plot and the third is a landfill located in a municipal urban plot, ac-

"This landfill has generated a significant degradation of the environment which adds to the public health risks of local residents who are directly exposed to the physical and chemical effects of the dump, with the increase of rodents and the proliferation of mosquitoes that breed in this type of environment," the councilor said, according to local media reports.

He added that the cost of the work will be around €6,000.

FMG victims indentified in Elche

THE University Hospital of Vinalopo de Elche says it has detected six cases of female genital mutilation (FGM) since April 2017, according to Spanish media reports. The women, reportedly from Mali and Senegal and between 30 and 38, had all suffered the practice before they were 15.

Three girls in the area have also been identified as at risk, reports say. The practice of FGM is widespread in other cultures, and particularly in Africa. It is also common in Asia and the Middle East.

Over 200 million women and girls are estimated to have undergone FGM - a cultural practice intended to repress female sexuality.

One dead in border stampede

A MAN has died in a stampede at the Moroccan and Spanish land border, according to media reports.

Several others were injured in the stampede at the Barrio Chino border post near the Spanish enclave of Melilla. At least three of those were injured on the Spanish side of the border.

The man, 39, died of cardiac arrest, according to Moroccan government sources.



Teens held on murder charge

The well-known pair who until a decade ago ran a popular home decorating business - had been

stabbed and beaten to death in their ground floor flat during what police believe was an attempted robbery.

A probe launched in the wake of the find lead to the arrest of the two children, both of who are from Otxarkoaga and have prior criminal records for robbery and

They were identified after detectives interviewed neighbours who had seen them 'hanging around' the property, police revealed in a state-

One of the boys was arrested in the nearby town of Balmaseda before the second turned himself in at a Bilbao petrol station after realising he was being followed.

Residents say that Otxarkoaga has suffered a 'wave of robberies' by 'the usual suspects' in the past year.

Trump rage goes on

THOUSANDS of Spanish protesters took to the streets to mark the anniversary of last year's Women's March. Worldwide. countless people demonstrated in over 30 countries - and 300 US cities - a year after an event which saw millions show their opposition to President Donald Trump on the day after he was sworn in.

Much of the march's focus was on women's rights, while Trump was the subject of ridicule.

Many suggested 'time's up' for the US President, while others referenced the sexual harassment scandal, #MeToo movement and the need for more women in public roles.

In Madrid and Barcelona, thousands marched through the streets. One social media user wrote: "Everybody is welcome... but today is about women of the

There were similar demonstrations in numerous European capitals, including London, Berlin and Paris. Last year, demonstrations were reported on every

Figures are difficult to clarify, but it is thought significantly more than 120,000 people came onto the streets in the USA.

Trump tweeted, seemingly ironically: 'a perfect day for all Women to March. Get out there now to celebrate the historic milestones and unprecedented economic success and wealth creation that has taken place over the last 12 months. Lowest female unemployment in 18 years!'

Government has officially 'shut down' in the USA, for the fist time in five years, after the two main parties - Democrats and Republicans - failed to agree funding deals for agencies. It is hoped that an agreement will be reached shortly.

In London, there were speeches from various women's rights advocates, including the great-granddaughter of Emmeline Pankhurst, a suffragette leader widely credited with helping women win the



Expats and Brexit

Formal study might inform government policy

INTERVIEW

by John Smith

DUE to all of the uncertainty surrounding Brexit, the UK government funded Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) has initiated 25 independent projects to study the entire situation.

Just one of those is aimed at expatriates in Europe to record their views and feelings in the lead up to the eventual divorce from the European Union.

Entitled 'Brexit Brits Abroad,' it is undertaking research in France and Spain and Professor Karen O'Reilly, an ethnologist with many years of experience in examining the British in Spain is the lead interviewer for the Spanish study.

She first spent 15 months as a PHD student in 1993 and 94 living in Fuengirola with her husband

and two children then aged nine and 11 before returning to the UK where the results of her studies were eventually published as a scholastic book in 2000, which has been in print ever since.

After becoming a full Professor of Sociology at Loughborough University, she recently retired and was appointed to her current role by Goldsmiths University of London, although as Professor Emeritus at Loughborough she also teaches research methods to students on a part time basis.

Speaking to Euro Weekly News, Karen explained that she was impressed by the speed at which the ESRC reacted to the Referendum vote and rather than spend months on discussing minute details, the Council has worked very quickly to get all of the research up and

She has made a number of visits to the Costa del Sol engaging with

and trying to gauge their reaction to the result of the vote and their hopes, fears and opinions for the

There has been a very positive response from expatriates ready to share their thoughts with Karen and her perception is that the bulk of those she has spoken to have been opposed to the results of the vote, although there is a significant minority in favour.

The findings appear on https://brexitbritsabroad.com/ and are updated on a regular basis, but when Karen was undertaking her work last year, her overall impression was that Brits in Spain were most worried about the fact that there was so little information available and that many believed that the British government simply didn't care about them.

They recognised that the British Consuls and the Ambassador in

Spain were regularly trying to calm people's fears but believed that they were only promulgating government policy which really wasn't much help.

Now back in Spain again, she feels that people are much more comfortable and whilst recognising that there isn't any formal agreements between Britain and the EU, those she has interviewed seem more confident that the situation will be resolved without them being simply forgotten

The project is still being funded until December of this year and with the possible interim period after March 2019, it may even continue with the information gathered hopefully helping the British government to understand better the views of expatriates in France and Spain.





Fashion forges ahead

SPANISH BRAND ECLIPSES TRADITIONAL LEADER

CLOTHING retailer Zara has outstripped telecommunications giant Movistar to become the best-performing Spanish brand.

The bombshell comes after global consultancy Interbrand published its

It is the first time that Movistar has failed to top the national ranking in a decade, after the company lost 12 per cent of its brand value as it plummeted to € 19.65 billion.

And the clothing manufacturer, owned by tycoon Amancio Ortega, is now estimated to be worth €15.45 billion, up 45 per cent from 2015.

Bosco Torres, technical director of the report, claims that the drop can be attributed to 'financial analysts' forecasts, which project a flatter growth, with revenues set to grow by just 1 per cent due to increased prices driving a potential loss of customers, plus competition from the new wave of platforms including HBO and Netflix."

Banking group Santander - valued at €5.6 billion - was placed third, having grown by 20 per cent in the last two years, thanks to a stable business model with predictable results, since it is working in mature economies including the UK and Germany and in growth regions in Cen-

Basque country-based bank BBVA and clothing brand Bershka, also owned by Ortega, make up the top five.

Supermarket chain Mercadona, in eighth place, is the second-fastest growing brand after Zara, after its value increased by 31 per cent in the last two years, while fashion chain Mango is the biggest loser, with its value having plunged by 39 per cent.

New entries in the top 20 include beer brewer Estrella Galicia and private medical firm Sanitas, while British-owned telecommunications com-

pany Jazztel, and banking group Banco Popular drop out, the latter in the wake of its takeover by Santander.

Spain's two biggest football clubs, Real Madrid and FC Barcelona, appear in positions 17 and 20, with respective values of €530 million and €470 million

By sectors, banking is the most-represented with eight entries on the list, whereas fashion is the most valuable despite only appearing five times, with the worth of Zara, Bershka, Massimo Dutti, Mango and Designal estimated at \leq 18.8 billion, 35 per cent of the overall to-

Debt grows but leaders count on 2018 boost

PUBLIC debt in Spain has broken all records.

After rising by more than €9 million in November, the total of €1.14 billion is the highest ever registered, according to the Bank of

The figure is equivalent to more than 98.8 per cent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP), well above the country's European Union target of 98.1 per cent by the close

But the Spanish government said it expects the figure to fall to 96.8 per cent this year.

The increase is being blamed on higher indebtedness registered by the State, which increased by €11.1 million to an unparalleled €987.2 million.

Spain's public debt before the global financial crisis hit in 2007 was €384 million, or 35 per cent of GDP.

UK losing out in space race

INFRASTRUCTURE for the Galileo satellite system will be moved from the UK to Spain over Brexit fears.

It comes after a committee of representatives from European Union member states voted in favour of the move from London to Madrid.

The back-up security centre for Galileo - an advanced version of GPS - is not yet fully operational in London, but was expected to employ 30 people.

It was originally awarded to London in 2010, and controls access to the system with 24hour monitoring when the main security headquarters near Paris is offline.

It is the latest Brexit blow to the UK's space industry, and follows a November announcement by aerospace companies and the Royal Aeronautical Society, in which they claimed they were being overlooked for contracts.

DEFENCE BUDGET SET TO GROW **Bottom line of fire**

SPAIN'S annual military spending has risen to €835 million.

The figure represents an 8.2 per cent increase on the €771.1 million splashed out in 2016, after the Ministry of Defence took part in 17 missions during 2017.

According to official figures, the most expensive operation was conducted in Lebanon, after 618 Spanish soldiers were deployed on a peace-keeping mission, at a cost of €138 million.

The forces joined a campaign, started 12 years ago, by the United Nations (UN) in the wake of a violent confrontation between Israel and militants from the Shia Islamist political party.

This was followed by a € 123.1 million operation in Iraq as 541 troops, including 71 from the Army Engineer Corps, joined the international coalition fighting Muslim fundamentalist group Daesh in the war-torn country.

And €84.3 million was spent on the European Union (EU) Operation Sophia, combatting human trafficking and illegal migration in the Mediterranean Sea, an ongoing campaign based mostly in Libyan waters.

Spain currently deploys 2,469 soldiers on five continents, and national Defence Minister, María Dolores de Cospedal, is due to appear in the Congress of Deputies, the lower house of Spain's legislative branch, to request an increase in spending for 2018.

In particular, the official wants to send an additional 152 troops to Mali, with Spanish General Enrique Millán set to assume command of the EU mission based there.

GOVERNMENT DEFENDS COST OF EXTRA POLICE

€87m Cataluña spend

THE Catalan independence crisis cost the Spanish state €87 million in police spending.

Interior Minister Juan Ignacio Zoido was forced to defend the eye-popping figure, after thousands of Guardia Civil and National Police officers were deployed to the troubled region last autumn.

They were tasked with preventing an illegal independence referendum on October 1, and many remained in place until after the snap election, called by Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy, eventually withdrawing on December 30.

Clashes between police and pro-independence supporters, during the referendum saw hundreds injured, as the Spanish forces closed 113 polling stations and stopped a further 100 from opening.

Images of the violence - including footage of armed police

beating elderly people, women and peaceful protesters - were condemned across the globe.

But Mr Zoido, who was appearing before the Spanish Senate voluntarily, strongly defended the offensive, which he said took place against "the absolute passivity and minimal collaboration" of the Mossos d'Esquadra

"The operation was legitimate, professional, and proportional," he said. "I regret as much as anyone that people were hurt, but those responsible generated a climate of disobedience with their reckless and illegal behaviour."

He went on to justify the cost of the exercise, with the money used for accommodation, food, travel and day-to-day living.

"It is a high price that all Spaniards have to pay due to the irresponsibility and stubbornness of the pro-independence government," he said.

The official also pointed out that damages to police stations and vehicles cost € 135,000.

An average of 4,500 officers were based in Cataluña throughout the crisis, with 6,000 in place on the day of the referendum.

Opposition groups criticised Mr Zoido, with Xavier Castel-

lana, of the pro-independence Esquerra Republicana party, accusing the government of "applying the political will of Franco to maintain the unity of Spain."

Others quizzed the minister over the use of rubber bullets and pepper spray.

Following the referendum, the regional government declared independence, prompting the Spanish government to dissolve Catalan parliament and call snap elections.

A number of pro-independence politicians were subsequently arrested, and some - including ousted leader Carles Puidgemont - had warrants issued for their arrest. Puigdemont has since fled to Belgium.

December's snap election failed to provide a decisive result, with separatists retaining a slim majority, but not taking over 50 per cent of the vote.

Chinese seek to sell hotels

A CHINESE conglomerate is seeking to sell its stake in a Spanish hotel chain.

HNA Group, which has investments across the globe and ranked number 179 on the Fortune Global 500 list, is reportedly trying to offload its majority stake in the NH Hotel Group.

The move comes days after NH - headquartered in Madrid - turned down a takeover bid from Mallorca-based rival Barceló Group.

HNA revealed it has hired banking firms JP Morgan and Benedetto, Gartland and Company to find a buyer for its 29.5 per cent stake in NH, valued at around €632 million.

Spain's hotel industry is booming, as the country last year became the second-most visited country in the world after France, having outstripped the United States.



CATALUÑA still lacks a government but now has a Parliament plus a Speaker and Mesa to regulate its day-to-day running.

Unsurprisingly the Speaker, Roger Torrent, and the majority of the Mesa are pro-independence. Ciudanos was the most-voted party last December but is outnumbered in parliament by ex-president Carles Puigdemont's JxC, ERC and CUP.

Despite missing votes from Puigdemont who is self-exiled in Brussels with members of his former government, the secessionists pulled it off thanks to the Cataluña en Comun-Podemos tandem. Like the girl in the song, they never say yes and never say no to independence and this time did just that by casting blank ballots.

Torrent, an MP for ERC, declared that despite his pro-independence convictions he respected the crosssections in Catalan society and would do his best to defuse conflict.

Meanwhile pro-independence MPs are clamouring to vote on allowing Puigdemont to be installed as regional president via videolink.

Torrent and the Mesa have the nice job of deciding whether this can be done, which should not be too difficult as the Parliament's regulatory committee have already pronounced it unfeasible.

Far from defusing conflict Torrent will be plunged into it, with a lot of it coming from his own side.

Payback time for kickbacks

CARLES PUIGDEMONT'S old party PDeCat was once Artur Mas's old party and before that it was Jordi Pujol's.

The last two politicians were on the make with kickbacks, commissions and padded invoices that were nice little earners for them and for party funds. Unfortunately for Puigdemont & Co the courts have ordered PDeCat to pay back € 6.6

million 'earned' through govern ment contracts.

As though this hole in their finances weren't enough, the stench of corruption could sour relations with ERC, the other pro-secession party which proudly claims never to have dipped into the cashbox in its 87 years of existence.

Nevertheless, such admirable probity did not extend to using public money to fund the October 1 referendum, which is one reason why ERC leader Oriol Junqueras is currently remanded.

Junqueras describes himself a regular churchgoer and presumably is at home with the Jesuitical maxim that the end justifies the means.

Time to swim

IF there were a general election tomorrow, Ciudadanos would win it.

More than half the people who voted for Mariano Rajoy and the Partido Popular would not do so again, they told a Metroscopia poll.

Rajoy failed to get an overall majority in December 2015 or June 2016 because PP voters alone have

This body controls and regulates Spain's judges and both parties want to continue choosing 12 of the CGPJ's members.


Meanwhile the European Council reminded Spain that its Constitution requires the Lower House to name four CGPJ members, the Senate another four and the judges the rest.

BEYONCÉ is said to have dozens and to change them every week. I have four and haven't changed them for years.

We're talking e-mail addresses, which some people change the way others change their socks. Or should. Not mentioning any names.

It's a surprising half-century since e-mail first emerged, and now we send 50 billion a day, many aimed at augmenting the male anatomy or congratulating you on winning a lottery you didn't enter.

E-mail has decimated the world's traditional postal services, and has reached even the middle of the middle of nowhere. Experts say it's under threat from social media and texts, yet today the world has nearly five billion e-mail addresses, at 2.1 per online user.

But if you're over 50 and typical, you've got just one. Which is a really, really bad idea.

Far from simplifying your life, having just one actually complicates it. Let me give you a for in-

Wham spam thank you ma'am

If the internet really is 90 per cent porn and spam, Terence Kennedy reveals one way of staying sane online.



Buy just about anything these days, from a left-handed screwdriver, to a pack of Meccano-set furniture, and the vendor wants your e-mail address. Officially, for his sales records. Unofficially, so he can swamp you the way Amazon pioneered: 'If you liked this item, you may like these other seven hundred...

Buying online is even worse. Even e-mail providers want an email address to be able to give you an e-mail address.

What it all means is the tedious daily click and zap, deleting the average eight spam messages sent a day for every person on the plan-

So here's this week's priceless tip. Sign-up for at least one extra, free e-mail address. Dish it out happily to everyone who asks, and keep your 'real' address for just friends, family and work.

The biggest advantage is not actually having to download all the junk mail which hits this backup account. That's because you're not going to access it with your normal e-mail 'client' (programs like Microsoft's Outlook or Mail, Thunderbird, Apple Mail etc).

Instead, go to its website. Under your name will be a list, still without downloading anything. You can simply go tick, tick, tick against all the junk in the list, skipping any you might actually want to read, and then hit the delete button just once.

Voila - they are consigned to email oblivion. Nothing is downloaded, including viruses. There is no futile, irritating beeping coming from your smartphone. No waiting for spam to creep in at its petty pace, before you can get to that vitally important family or work

Mailing it

FREE e-mail accounts certainly cost less than the proverbial 'dime-a-dozen', letting you use the service in return for showing you some advertising or harvesting your personal data.

Most providers will indeed let you have more than one address, so in principle if you want multiple Gmail or Yahoo mailboxes, yes you can. Or how about the freebie addresses from your Internet Service Provider, which most of us don't actually use because we already had an established and portable one?

For an account with an address entirely different to your 'real' one, there are plenty of other providers who dish them out like sweets: Yandex, Zoho, Proton Mail com

Sadly, there is some bad news (for me at least) and that is that the best address has already been claimed: hotmale@hotmail.com.

THERE are so many daft 'fake' stories doing the rounds now. But surely all are topped by the one about the man who created a fake restaurant in his garden. purely to hoax TripAdvisor.


'The Shed' in Dulwich. England, became an internet hit, ranked number one on TripAdvisor, even though nobody had ever eaten there!

Eventually it became so popular that Oobah Butler had to let people in, serving them ready meals from Iceland. Apparently he got the idea from a previous job of

writing fake reviews on TripAdvisor at £10 a post, praising restaurants in which he had never eaten, to boost businesses up the rankings.

Then he said he had a revelation: "Within the current climate of misinformation and society's willingness to believe absolute bullshit. maybe a fake restaurant is possible? It became my mission. With the help of fake reviews, mystique and nonsense, I was going to do it: turn my own shed into London's top-rated restaurant on TripAdvisor."

He produced a website, a concept to attract attention (dishes named after moods), got a photographer to 'immortalise' the 'food' (closeups of shaving foam, bleach tablets and, at one point, his own foot) and friends to



write reviews like: "The earthy taste and freshness of the food was something

Now, TripAdvisor's a useful tool but you have to read between the lines and use your own 'idiot filters.'

If there are only five star reviews, be suspicious; similarly, if only bad ones. You come across silly comments as well as the 'Emperor's New Clothes' attitude to 'be-

ing there'. This was a harmless prank, but the guy was correct about our era of fake news. (Incidentally, any chance he could cook up a Brexit deal that'll stand scrutiny for more than a few

PS, I'll certainly be recommending this unbiased article! Five stars! Plus a warning: this column may not be written by a real person.

Finally, still need a bit of last-minute encouragement to embrace 'Dry January'? Well, there's always dry cider, dry white wine and dry martinis. Always glad to help!

Letter from The Canaries

Oil, earthquakes and record tourism usher in 2018

ISLAND news from the Canaries this parched January morning, where with insufficient rain to turn the islands into mini-Hawaiis this winter, or even fill reservoirs, we console ourselves with good news for the local economy. In this Best Winter Tourist Season ever, we're so happy we can hardly count!

In Lanzarote, however, there's alarm at Morocco's oil prospecting plans for coastline just 80 miles from the island's beautiful beaches. ENI, the multi-national outfit also commissioned by Trumpton, (sorry... the US), to prospect in Alaska's arctic waters, will soon threaten island beaches and ecosystems, despite criminal proceedings in Italy about oil spills in Niger valley.

More Africa-Canaries in Fuerteventura, where a man and two women have been arrested attempting to board a flight and three children taken into police care. The Syrian man, Kuwaiti woman, and a Swedish woman thought to have organised false documents for onward travel to Europe, are accused of holding fake passports and illegal immigration.

Eastern provincial capital Gran Canaria's news is of the million extra tourists arriving in 2017. The tourist boom is: "...due to our repu-

tation as a safe destination for tourists," said tourism head Pablo Barbero. Inter-island ferries and flights have also increased: the residents' discount encourages Canarians to go exploring.

Western provincial capital Tenerife also reports record tourist numbers, with Alison Alexander, arriving from Edinburgh with her family for Christmas, 2017's 11 millionth arrival. Energy producer Disa has announced the purchase of a 21-MW wind project, with

Siemens Gamesa Renewable Energy SA contracted to build the Bermejo and Vera de Abote wind farms in Arico, Tenerife.

Across the water in La Gomera, in admirable 'forget tourism, what about goats?' mode, New Year attention's on the primary sector, with the Cabildo (island council) organising information sessions for island stock keepers about: "... grants available to help commercialise their stock keeping."

Due west, on the former edge of the known world, lies tiny El Hierro, where councillor Miriam del Pino Moreno's New Year announcement about solar street lamps, which will provide free charging facilities for four devices, complete with instructions in Braille, reflects the Herreño tendency for innovation.

On La Palma, there's no New Year trace of sensationalist press panic. After increased seismic activity in late 2017, the National Geographic Institute monitored the site around the Cumbre Vieja volcano, which blew in 1949 and 1971, causing Brit tabloid hysteria. These are volcanic islands and seismic activity's a constant. Nevertheless, the story of how part of La Palma will fall into the sea, causing a 'megatsunami' to sweep across the Atlantic and obliterate the east coast of Trumpton, provokes screaming tabloid headlines.

"There's no evidence of this happening... It is theoretically possible, but smaller more localised collapses are more likely... generating local tsunamis just a few metres high," says Professor Iain Stewart of Plymouth University.

LEGALLY SPEAKING

How to avoid road rage

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



I KEEP CALM: It is not worth getting angry while driving.

FOR this week's driving tips, Guardia Civil offers spoke to the head of driving standards at the UK's Institute of Advanced Motorists Peter Rodger, who talked about how to avoid becoming a road rage victim, and what to do if it does escalate.

The first point is that with any conflict between two parties, both are likely to have played a part. So try to take yourself away from the problem - let the other driver go on ahead. You might feel wronged, but letting the other party go will make no difference to the rest of your day.

If someone is being confrontational or aggressive, don't make eye contact and don't react visibly.

If the conflict is more serious, call the police, especially if you feel there is a threat or possibility of violence against you.

If the other party approaches you in your car, can you drive away safely? If you can, consider doing so. But don't accelerate dangerously, or drive off if you think the other driver is going to chase you.

If you or better, your passengers, can film any behaviour on your mobile phone it will help in terms of evidence, including the registration number of the other vehicle involved. Don't open your door, don't open your windows fully and don't start or get provoked into an argument.

If you were at fault, admit it and apologise. It may be enough to diffuse the situation quickly. And do not do anything that can be interpreted as retaliation.

Hopefully by now the matter is over and you are driving away. If you feel upset or emotional pull over and get some fresh air or walk around if you need to before resuming your

Peter said: "Road rage does not affect everyone every day. If you're finding it is happening very often, you might want to think about how you engage with other road users."

Can they sell UK home?

WE want to sell our main home in the UK. We have owned it for 24 years and have lived in it for 95 per cent of the time. However, for the past year it has been rented out to tenants. In the UK, if a person sells their 'main residence,' they do not pay Capital Gains tax (CGT). Even if we are non-resident in the UK, we can still pay almost no capital gains tax if we comply with certain conditions. There is a system called 'Private Residence Relief' that reduces the CGT down to very little. We want to sell our UK home, but we do not know what the tax position is if we are Spanish (Canarian) resident.

PH (Canary Islands)

I doubt that you are a tax resident of the Canary Islands. Do you pay Spanish income tax? Have you filed Form 720 declaring your assets held outside Spain? Per-



haps you are simply away from your UK home for a

time. The Private Residence Relief provisions that I consulted mention three years of absence without penalty, for example. Get professional help in the

MADDOCKS: In his own

65 years as a cartoonist and painter

AS he heads towards his 90th birthday, cartoonist and Costa del Sol resident, Peter Maddocks took the time to reminisce with Euro Weekly

We are delighted that Peter supplies a weekly cartoon on an exclusive basis to the paper, as he has retired from commercial illustration and only paints for fun and the excitement of creating a new artistic work.

Having joined the Merchant Navy at the age of 15 in 1943, he not only braved the dangers of war, but says that he actually had a great time travelling the world and discovering new experiences and adventures.

This was quite a change for a young man from Birmingham, who had first started drawing at the age of six, before winning a scholarship at the age of 11 to attend the Moselev School of Art.

With a wicked glint in his eye and a smile on his face, Peter said "My tutor was Norman Pett, who drew the risqué Jane cartoon strip for the Daily Mirror, which saw the heroine out of her clothes as often as she was in them. There I was drawing daffodils whilst he was drawing naked women in the classroom!

After swapping the sea for a land based job, Peter set up his own advertising agency and started designing cinema posters, as well as writing Kit Carson stories

When he was very young, his teacher told him that whilst his art was good, his lettering needed improvement. Having studied fonts, he was determined to be involved in lettering the cowboy stories as

Whilst he had a love of painting, when he was invited to draw a sample cartoon for the Daily Sketch, his was delighted to be accepted as one of their main contributors and as this was in 1953, he is now celebrating 65 years as a car-

"I preferred to paint, but with cartoons I could take a thought, transfer it to paper quickly with a pithy comment and get paid almost immediately" he said, explaining why he had never become a commercial artist.

He quickly became much sought after by all of the major newspapers of the time including the Mail, Telegraph, Express, Mirror, as well as Mayfair and Private Eye. He eventually became Cartoon Editor for Express Newspapers and regularly produced a satirical look at events in 10 Downing Street.

During that time, he helped

to found the British Cartoonists' Association and travelled back to the UK in 2016 to help celebrate its Golden Anniver-

With two of his three sons (there is also a daughter) he decided to set up an animation studio and attracted interest from the BBC for three cartoon series. The Family-Ness, which centred on the life of the Loch Ness Monsters, Jimbo and the Jet Set and Penny Crayon featuring the voice of Su Pollard.

He also worked with legendary animators Halas and Batchelor and spent a number of years working for them in Berlin, but admits that this wasn't the best time of his life.

Eventually, after writing a number of self-help books on

how to become a cartoonist (plus Condomania, 101 uses for a condom) Peter decided that it was time to come to Spain to follow his love of painting. Now, nearly 18 years later, he is happily ensconced in a property between Alhaurin El Grande and Coin.

"Having also produced children's books and short stories. I no longer produce any commercial work, other than my weekly cartoon for Euro Weekly News, which I started supplying five years ago.

"My passion is painting and with 200 pictures (that I call my family) around the house, all in a range of styles, I am definitely trying to perfect my own, although I may have left it a little late," laughed the 89-

Peter is a pleasure to chat with and confided that he stopped riding his motor scooter just two years ago. He is still driving his car on a daily basis, although he had been a little surprised with the ice that had formed on his vehicle the other day.

Although he has been living by himself in Spain for all of these years, he admits that he struggles with the Spanish lan-

But he has developed a perfect arrangement with local shopkeepers saying "If I can't make myself understood, I whip out my drawing pad and produce a picture of what I want to buy. It seems to work pretty well and the people in the shops seem happy to keep the sketches.'

Many people living by themselves could be lonely, but not Peter Maddocks as he simply loves to paint. As long as he manages to be creative at least once a day, then he considers himself a happy man.


He has the gift of being able to follow the news, think up a few funny lines, produce an accompanying image and then invariably change the words to make the cartoon even funnier.



No more sneezing

IF you suffer from a runny nose and itchy eyes just by looking at a plant you may be relieved to hear a hay fever vaccination is in the works.

The jab, which could be available in three years, has been shown to reduce medication use for hay fever symptoms by 25 per cent. Scientists say three rounds of injections a year could leave sufferers symptom-free.

Dr Rudolf Valenta, the study's lead scientist, explained, "My expectation is that the vaccine will lead to an almost complete relief of symptoms two or three years after injections."

He added, "People will be able to defend themselves from grass pollen using their own immune system, without having to take expensive anti-inflammatory

drugs which may weaken their immune system and make them tired during the day," concluding, "they may still have hay fever but they will feel no different to someone who is hay fever-free."

The study's lead author at the Medical University of Vienna's Ear, Nose and Throat Department, Verena Niederberger-Leppin, explained the effects would differ from person to person, saying, "The more severely the allergy sufferer is affected by grass pollen, the greater the beneficial effect following vaccina-

The news has been welcomed by other health organisations, with head of clinical services at Allergy UK, Amena Warner, explaining, "Traditional immunotherapy has been used for many

years, although it comes with a high level of risk, such as anaphylaxis. That is because it uses natural allergen extracts such as grass or tree pollens."

She added, "So this is an exciting de-

velopment if subsequent trials show success because recombinant technology, such as this, uses synthetic allergens and therefore potentially reduces the risk of severe side effects."

MICRO PAIN: Microwave

How safe are

FOR years there has been conflicting advice about the use of microwaves with some scientists telling us the machines could be damaging to health.

But now researchers have found microwaves may not just be harmful for us but also for the

Researchers from the University of Manchester found the number of microwaves in Europe could be as toxic for the environment as seven million cars due to the amount of CO2 they release into the atmosphere. The study also found the British were the worst offenders with the UK responsible for almost half of all microwave ready-meal use over all Europe.

The study's lead author, Dr Aleiandro Gallego-Schmid, from the School of Chemical Engineering and Analytical Science, explained, "consumers now tend to buy new appliances before the existing ones reach the end of

their useful life as electronic goods have become fashionable and 'status' items." He added, "as a result, discarded electrical equipment, such as microwaves. is one of the fastest growing waste streams worldwide."

The scientist concluded, "given that microwaves account for the largest percentage of sales of all type of ovens in the EU, it is increasingly important to start addressing their impact on resource use and end-of-life waste."

The rise in ready-meal use is being blamed for the phenomenon with many families now turning to cheap and easy preprepared meals for dinner.

Britons now spend € 3.4 billion (£3 billion) on ready meals a year, some which have been found to contain as much sugar as a can of coke, cheaper cuts of meat and additives made from

Chef Gordon Ramsay once described them as "food hell."

SPECIALISTS recommend a varied and not very strict diet with a steady weight loss to achieve your objectives.

Diets that are low in calories and restrict certain food groups are the least effective because the body reacts by reducing its energy use. What's more, although at first you may lose weight, in the longterm it gets more difficult, claim nutrition specialists from Hospitals Quirónsalud Murcia, Valencia and Torrevieia.

After Christmas a lot of patients decide to embark on miracle diets, taking weight reducing products, or doing intensive gym routines to burn off excess fat.

Carolina Perez, nutritionist at Hospital Quirónsalud Torrevieja and Hospital Quirónsalud Murcia, explains: "the main risk of miracle diets is related to the speed at which the individual loses weight. The drastic reduction in the calories they consume creates nutritional imbalances.

"The apparent success at the start of the diet is not just due to a loss of fats, but also to a loss of muscle, one of the most metabolically active body tissues we have. which explains the bad results of the diet in the long run."

Nutritionist Rocio Praxedes from the Obesity Unit at Hospital Quirónsalud Valencia advises people to try a moderately lowcalorie diet for more effective results: "that way people prevent their metabolism adapting which can later hinder a continuous weight loss; and more obviously because if a patient is hungry they are more likely to quit their diet."

Medical Advice

For a diet to be effective special-

Diets that are low in calories are the least effective for weight loss

ists recommend following these

- · Choose a complete and varied diet that covers 100 per cent of your nutritional requirements, and all basic food groups.
- Don't be too strict and adapt the diet to your own tastes, to avoid giving it up.
- Maintain a steady weight loss; losing more than one kilo a week is counterproductive. The optimum weight loss is 500gr-700gr/week.
- Be realistic. Plan progressive changes to your diet and achievable objectives.
- Don't skip any meals. Normally diets consist of five meals a day which must be carried out to maintain blood sugar levels and not be too hungry before the next
- Respect everyone's beliefs and cultures

When to choose surgery

When talking about a BMI (body mass index) of over 35, patients should first follow a diet supervised by a specialised nutritionist. If this does not reach the desired results, obesity surgery or bariatric surgery is an option. It should always be a doctor who decides what treatment is necessary and safe for each patient.

The advances in minimally invasive operations have revolutionised modern surgery in the last decade, including bariatric surgery. "The comprehensive treatment offered to overweight,

obese, or diabetic patients guarantees the best results. What's more the risks of the operation are very low, especially compared to the possible illnesses the patients are exposed to if they continue suffering from the disease," assures Doctor Pedro Bretcha, coordinator of the Obesity, General Surgery and Digestive System units at Hospital Quirónsalud Tor-

The benefits of the intervention are many, "80 per cent of diabetic patients overcome the illness, and the condition of the other 20 per cent is made substantially better and includes a weight loss of over 70 per cent of excess fat, even reaching an optimum weight if patients accompany the treatment with a healthy lifestyle. This leads to an increase in life expectancy of obese patients of up to 10 years, and a better quality of life," points out Doctor Carlos Sala, coordinator of the Obesity unit and specialist in metabolic surgery at Hospital Quirónsalud Valencia.

In spite of its advantages, only 5 per cent of overweight Spaniards undergo surgery due to a lack of information or not having access to the treatment.

Is gluten-free really guilt free?

WHILE some people avoid gluten because of a medical condition, other people cut it out of their diet because they feel less bloated and more energised without it.

As a result, the range of gluten-free foods on offer has grown enormously over the past few years. From pastas and breads to ready meals, many supermarkets now have whole aisles dedicated entirely to the sale of gluten-free

And while it may not be necessary to cut gluten out of your diet unless you are suffering from certain diseases like coeliac disease, many people argue there is no harm in switching normal foods for gluten-free alternatives.

But scientists have revealed these alternatives can contain much higher levels of fat and calories than their gluten-full counterparts, and even cost up to 160 per cent more.


A study at the University of Hertfordshire looked at 1,700 gluten-free foods and found that with the exception of crackers, all examples contained more sugar, salt and fat than normal foods as well as having a

lower fibre and protein content.

Dr Rosalind Fallaize, a Research Fellow in nutrition and dietetics at the university, explained, "we found that gluten free foods were significantly more expensive than regular items, which is very concerning given the movement towards stopping gluten free prescriptions for people with Coeliac disease."

She concluded, "It's also clear from our research that gluten free foods don't offer any nutritional advantages over regular foods so are not a healthier alternative for people who do not require a gluten free diet."

CODORNIU is the world's oldest and second-largest producer of bottle-fermented sparkling wine - cava - made by the méthode traditionelle (same as Champagne).

Founded in Cataluña in 1551 by Jaume Codorniu, just over 100 years later Codorniu heiress Anna married Miguel Raventós merging two families with a long wine tradition.

Cava was first made in 1872 by José Raventós who established a new industry with Codorniu cellars established at Sant Sadurní d'Anoia between 1895 and 1915.

They were designed by renowned Catalán architect Josep Puig i Cadalfach.

Tragically in 1930 the Phylloxera plague infested the vineyards, but the family fought back with innovative viticultural techniques and ensured survival, with Codorniu producing more than 100,000 bottles of cava annually by the end of the 20th century.

Nowadays, Codorniu with modern instal-

lations and the latest equipment continues to control the production process of its cavas from vineyard planting to finished

Wines produced with different blends of Chardonnay, Macabeo, Xarel.lo, Parellada, Pinot Noir and reserve wines are: Anna de Codorniu Brut, Codorniu 1551 Brut Natural, Codorniu Mediterranea Brut Natural, Cuyée Raventós Brut Natural, Codorniu Rosé Brut, Cuvée Reina Maria Cristina Brut, Delapierre 'D' Brut, Delapierre Glacé Prestige Brut, Gran Codorniu Brut, Jaume de Codorniu Brut and Non Plus Ultra Reserva Vintage Brut.



Sevilla: A friendly city that has it all

SEVILLA just about has it all. Yet the city manages to retain a likeable modesty: it's grand but not flashy, modern but full of history, diverse but traditional.

Spain's fourth largest city - which is also the capital of Andalucia - is home to three UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

That is probably part of the reason why it has been named 'Best City to Travel in 2018' by the Lonely Planet.

Originally a Roman settlement, it has historical charm by the bucket load.

Later influenced by Moors, Castillians and Muslims, the points of interest in the city are hugely diverse.

The Cathedral, Torre Giralda, Plaza de Espana and historical centre are good places to start for antique architecture buffs and pretty-city strollers.

Torre Giralda, the bell tower, is particularly quaint and pleasing on the eye, much like the Royal Tobacco Factory.

Christopher Columbus is also buried in the city.

Fountains, cobbled streets, greenery and white buildings make up most of the river city's scenery and - alongside aristocratic

mansions - provide some insight into why the place was one of the Moorish empire's showpiece settlements.

On a more modern note, the Metropol Parasol (Las Setas) is the world's largest wooden structure. The slightly bizarre monument arguably looks most impressive at night from the walking platform.

Around that time, flamenco dancing, and Spanish restaurant culture make for vibrant but relaxed and friendly districts.

There is more than a hint of party atmosphere, though, so it is not difficult to imagine the festivities when Sevilla won their third consecutive Europa League in 2016.

Indeed, the city's festivals and crowded bars are considered some of the country's best.

For tourists, the Alcazar of Sevilla is an obvious highlight. Drawing on the city's medieval Islamic heritage, the stunning building, gardens and furnishing are an intriguing blend of Christian and Moorish architecture. It is not one to miss.

The city can be sweltering in summer but is on the warm side of perfect for most of the year, so many are glad of the shade from imposing buildings.

Balmy evenings make the tapas scene even more attractive. Local favourites include various seafood dishes, grilled and stewed meats, lamb kidneys in sherry sauce and spinach with chickpeas. A 'Serranito', meanwhile, is Sevilla's answer to fast food: a warm sandwich with grilled meat, traditional ham, green pepper, toma-

Fuelled by the tasty lunchtime treat, sightseers can tick off the main attractions in a few days, especially with a bike in one of the many cycle-friendly routes.

Government to monitor rental sites

THE Spanish government has announced plans to monitor accommodation

sites much more closely.

The move comes in the wake of the Cataluña terrorist attack last August.

The Interior Ministry has revealed new measures in the fight against jihadist cells, as part of the Antiterrorism Pact.

Records will be kept of people's bookings on hotel and short-term rental sites across Spain such as Airbnb and Booking.com.

The same action will be taking on vehicle rental companies and websites. given that the Catalonian terrorist attack involved three hired vans to kill 16 and injure 152.

The Interior Ministry also plans to tighten loopholes relating to immigration, where extremists and expensive court cases are involved.

"The measures will be put in action throughout the next year and most of them are already prepared or in the final stages of completion," said Interior Minister Juan Ignacio Zoido.

Airbnb bought background check start-up Trooly Inc last June in an attempt to protect users and restore its reputation.





Time to start planting seeds for spring

GRAEME TYRRELL

IF you like to grow your own plants to save cost, add interest from the huge range of plants available from seed, or just want to grow your plants in the way you like, now is the time to start planting.

Seeds are relatively cheap for many garden varieties in comparison to buying seedlings. A packet can provide seed for a series of plantings, to allow a continuous harvest of vegetables or a sequence of flowers over spring and summer.

I use special trays to grow a batch of seedlings, and when they are ready to plant out into the garden, I plant another batch from the same packet. It works well with vegetables like lettuce or flowers, including petunia, that have a long growing season, which permits planting through all of spring and summer.

There is a huge range of different plants that can be grown from seed, that cannot usually be found as seedlings or small plants in the nurseries. This



makes it much more interesting to garden with many unusual and exotic plants. This year I am growing a variety of passion fruit, sent over from Australia, that is not generally available here in Spain.

Growing your own can also be a great way to coordinate with other gardeners and neighbours, to have something to exchange if you grow more than you need. Probably half my garden is planted with varieties obtained in this way.

This also allows you to enjoy watching the seeds emerge with your care and flourish into a full grown plant, whether it is a vegetable to eat, a flower to

decorate, or a tree to stand as a long term memory of your work to grow it.

A visiting friend showed me pictures of a table she had made from an oak tree planted by her grandparents, that had been struck by lightning and fallen.

If you are concerned about the way plants are grown, and want to be sure that the soil is of good quality and without chemicals, to gain the maximum benefit from what you eat, as well as caring for the environment you live in, it also makes seedlings a good option to ensure you have the very best.

Any small container can be used to grow seeds, as long as it holds the soil and has drainage holes to allow excess water to escape. You can recycle yoghurt containers, egg cartons, shallow cardboard boxes and many other items that may normally just be disposed of.

The soil mix needs to be finer than general potting mix, but you can use a coarse sieve to remove the larger pieces of a general mix to obtain a finer

material, or do the same with your compost if you have some.

As a rule of thumb, seeds are planted about double the depth of the size of the seed. Fine seed is best just placed on the

surface, with a little more soil mix sprinkled on top.

Keep the soil moist, but not wet, and you will soon have new plants emerging to enhance your garden and share with friends.

SERGIO GARCIA has started 2018 where he left off last year as he won the Singapore Open by five shots.


The Spaniard carded a threeunder par 68 in the final-round to finish the tournament at 14under, 270.
