Brave pooch saves owners

A fearless dog saved its owners lives after a fire broke out at their Costa Blanca home.

Tania, 22, who owns Lola, an eight-year-old German shepherd, told Spanish media: "Lola started scratching at the bedroom door. She woke me up and when I went to open the door, I saw that the room was full of black smoke.

"She saved us, for sure. If

Lola hadn't warned us, the fire would have been much worse." she said

Tania lives in a flat on Avenida Mediterraneo in Javea above the Masia de la Sal restaurant which her family runs - with her 27-year-old partner.

The fire reportedly started in the living room, where Lola sleeps, when the TV caught alight.

The couple called the emergency services immediately, who swiftly arrived and put out the flames

Although the walls of the flat were blackened by the smoke, the fire was relatively small and caused minimal damage, which Tania said was all thanks to Lola warning them about the blaze straight away.

"She scratches the door on other nights because she wants to come inside. I usually open it and let her come in. Thankfully she did the same thing that morning," she revealed.

Tania's family adopted Lola when she was a puppy and had been the only one left from the litter that hadn't found a home.

Son confesses to mother's death

A 37-YEAR-OLD man was arrested in Benidorm after confessing that he had killed his mother in Valladolid.

Earlier, a cleaner at Hotel Bali found a note in the hall that read, "Please don't help me, I want to die" which she showed to colleagues. Noticing the word Valladolid on the piece of paper, staff searched the hotel register and identified a male guest from Valladolid who arrived the previ-

A staff member went to his room on the 14th floor and was finally admitted after repeatedly knocking at the door.

After the guest confessed that he had suffocated his mother and now wanted to kill himself, she persuaded him to call the police.

Full details have not emerged but some hotel sources claimed that he intended to throw himself from the balcony, while others maintained that he had taken an overdose of barbiturates.

He appeared to be drunk or

drugged, witnesses agreed.

After confirming to the police that he had killed his mother, he was arrested and initially taken to the Psychiatric Unit at Villajoyosa hospital.

He was later remanded without bail after declaring before a Benidorm judge, who turned down his lawyer's request that he be held in a psychiatric centre. Although the accused's mother was found dead in their family home in Valladolid, there were no obvious signs of violence. A post mortem would shed light on the circumstance of her death and her son's involvement, police sources said.

Kirsty pathologists defend actions

SPANISH pathologists confirmed that they destroyed the clothes worn by Kirsty Maxwell at the time of her death.

As previously reported in the Euro Weekly News, Kirsty's family were appalled to learn that they had no chance of taking DNA samples that could shed light on the circumstances surrounding her death.

The 27-year-old Scots woman, who was in Benidorm for a hen weekend, plunged 10 storeys to her death from an apartment.

Her family are convinced that more details would have emerged with further analysis of her pink t-shirt and denim skirt.

According to Spanish media sources, a pathologist's report stated that DNA taken from Kirsty's hands and cervical area - 'amongst others' - has been retained.

'Personal objects found on her body' were originally collected and kept but once her clothes were analysed visually they were 'discarded and destroyed.' They provided 'no further elements of interest to the investigation' and the clothes were bloodstained 'with the consequent biological risk,' the report continued.

Kirsty's case has now reached the UK parliament where MP Hanna Burdell asked the government to intercede with the Spanish authorities to discover what hap-

FOLLOWING Benitachell's recent campaign urging foreign residents to register on the Padron, the Communications and Residents councillors stressed that this does not automatically bring voting rights in municipal elections. In order to vote, residents should register on the Electoral Roll before December 31, 2018, they said.

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE nº49

With cheap, good quality beer and wine available by the gallon, what more could the Spanish want from their alcoholic drinks? Just a little je ne sais quoi with those reds, it would seem.

PACKETS of crisps, pints of lager and glasses of wine: typical British pub orders are outstandingly predictable.

Yet in Spain, the liquid accompaniments to a bowl of olives or tapas often come with a twist.

While sangria and tinto de verano are not exactly earth-shattering variations on a glass of wine, they do at least add a little diversity.

For the uninitiated - though there are probably not many - sangria is a sweetened and fruity spin off of your standard glass of red wine.

There are a number of variations particularly regional ones - but traditionally, Spanish red wine is mixed with orange juice and a liquor before being served in a jug with plenty of citrus fruit and ice. Rioja is the red of

Other recipes include sugar, lemonade and other spirits.

There is also sangria blanca - a variation featuring a white wine base.

European law only allows a drink to be called 'sangria' if it is made in Spain or Portugal. However, it could be called 'British Sangria' - for example - if made in another country.

But strangely enough, sangria is thought by some to have originated in the Caribbean, before being introduced to America. This earlier version was known as Sangaree, according to Andrew Smith's book about American food and drink.

Smith reportedly suggests that the iced drink was reintroduced to America around the middle of the 20th century, through Hispanic Americans and Spanish restaurants.

Yet most attribute the roots of sangria to early Greek and Roman culture. People from the ancient civilisations added various flavours to their wine, which was the drink of choice.

Known as 'hippocras,' this seems the most likely ancestor of sangria -

and would explain its popularity across the Mediterranean and especially in Spain and Greece.

Tinted, not minted

Meanwhile, tinto de verano is another relatively cheap 'punch' with a resemblance to cold mulled wine.

Simpler than sangria - but similar -

it is one part red wine and one part lemonade (or similar), served on the rocks with a slice of lemon.

Literally meaning 'red wine of summer,' one theory links the drink's history to Cordoba, where a man called Federico Vargas allegedly created the mix in the early 1900s. He initially called it 'a Vargas' and served it in his lively bar called The Brilliant, according to one account.

Presumably the future success of the drink only added to his modesty.

The light fantastic



OUT OF THIS WORLD: Zodiacal light is said to be the largest feature in the solar system.

THIS is the stunning moment that Spain's highest mountain is bathed in a mysterious celestial light.

Captured by a photographer from the Canaries Astrophysics Institute, it shows Mount Teide, Tenerife, covered with snow and illuminated by a phenomenon known as zodiacal light.

Appearing above the peak as a roughly triangular glow, the light is most easily seen around an hour after sunset. and can be seen on the island for the next few weeks.

It is produced by sunlight reflecting off particles known as cosmic dust which lie in the so-called interplanetary

dust cloud, orbiting the sun around 600 million kilometres from Farth

The dust is most likely formed from fragments of asteroids broken off by erosion or collisions, and comets, which release dust and gas when they travel close to the

In the northern hemisphere the light is best seen in the western sky on clear, moonless nights in February, March and April, although it is easily rendered invisible by moonlight or electric light pollu-

And in September and October it can be seen by looking east an hour before dawn.

It appears when the ecliptic - the annual path which the sun appears to take in the sky throughout the year - lies at a steep angle to the horizon, hence the light's vertical appearance.

In this case the glow is accompanied by Mount Teide being covered in snow, creating an unearthly scene.

Teide is an active volcano that last erupted in 1909, and at 3.718 metres is the highest point in Spain.

If measured from its true base on the ocean floor, it is 7,500 metres high, making it the highest volcano in the world outside the Hawaii archipelago.

Later she told police that she had just left a nightclub and began to run after realising that she was being followed.





Dead dolphin washed ashore

TWO local fishing boats, Borea Segunda and Fliper. contacted Denia's Marine **Environment and Fishing** Service after sighting a dead dolphin.

Following the trawler's information, coastguards located the young, 1.85-metre mammal off the Els Molins beach and took it back to Denia port.

Valencia University and the Generalitat's Environment department, who were advised of the find, collected the striped dolphin which was sent to Valencia where experts will try to discover what caused its death.

"Unfortunately dead cetaceans and turtles are washed up on our beaches or seen floating off the coast every year, particularly during the winter storms," a Marine Environ-

ment spokesman said.

"Year-round the Denia coast is one of the most-frequented by dolphins and other cetaceans, so it's inevitable that many are washed up on our beaches."

The spokesman also warned members of the public not to touch any dead

or unwell cetacean or turtle that they find on a local beach, as these can transmit disease

"They should ring the 112 number which will launch the procedures for these cases and send experts to collect the beached crea-

'Lamentable' conditions for **Podencos**

RESIDENTS on an Orba urbanisation are indignant about the plight of 11 Podenco hunting dogs.

They are shut away in a garage, chained up all day, and taken out only when their owners need them for hunting. There are also ferrets, used for rabbiting, which are confined in an underground hole covered with a grill.

"I have been making official complaints about their dreadful conditions since 2016," said Nathalie, who lives on the Orbeta urbanisa-

She recently contacted the Guardia Civil's nature protection unit, Seprona again after complaining to the town hall, which she claimed turns a blind eye to the problem.

Nathalie also maintained that whenever the Local Police received a complaint, they advised the owners, giving them time to clear the garage.

Other residents, many of them British, are equally upset about the dogs, Nathalie told the local Spanish press.

In 2016 Seprona officers inspected the premises where the dogs are kept, Nathalie said, although the owners tried to remove the animals. They succeeded with the ferrets, for which it is necessary to have a permit, she alleged.

Seprona reported that the dogs were kept in 'lamentable' health and hygiene conditions, noting that their chains were so short the dogs could not reach their food and water and eight were not microchipped or vaccinated.

"But they weren't fined and worse still, the dogs are still tied up," Nathalie said.

But the sobering reality is that the working classes in Spain are worse off than ever, as cash continues to be funnelled to the top 1 per cent.

Critics say that Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy is oblivious to the struggles of the man on the street, after he was recently quoted as saying that the political crisis in Cataluña is "the only shadow looming over the economy."

However a flourishing economy does not always make for a healthy society.

Last year ended with more than 611,000 new jobs having been created in Spain, but a new Oxfam report shows that wages have been more-or-less frozen since 2009, while a lack of investment in education has seen families pay almost 40 per cent more to send their children to school than a decade ago.

The rate of saving has dropped to its lowest ebb since 2008 as ordinary people battle to make ends meet, with retail sales affected and figures for the January sales failing to match forecasts.

It is a stark reminder that since the 2008 collapse of Lehman Brothers and subsequent recession, a disproportionate percentage of the resultant costs have been foisted onto millions of blameless,

And perhaps the most sobering aspect is that the trend shows no sign of slowing, with 7,000 new Spanish millionaires last year in a country where 10.2 million remain below the poverty line.

At some point, the balance will have to tip.

High court awaits Polop accused

MORE than 10 years after it was committed, the Polop murder case should soon reach the Alicante High Court.

In October 2017 Alejandro Ponsoda, who was mayor of Polop at the time, was shot by a hired hitman as he arrived at his home in Chirles. He died in hospital eight days later.

Since then the case has been through the hands of seven different investigating judges as it was shelved and reopened. A substitute judge, the latest person to inherit the case, has finally taken action and announced a preliminary hearing at Villajoyosa's Number Two on February

This will set in motion the formalities for sending the case to the High Court in Alicante City where the four men accused of planning Ponsoda's death and the three men supposedly involved in carrying it out will stand trial by jury.

The killing was allegedly planned at Club Mesalina, a Benidorm brothel, by Juan Cano, who succeeded Ponsoda as mayor, together with businessman Salvador Ros, the club's owner Pedro Hermosilla and the manager Ariel Gatto.

Two Czech nationals, Radim Rakowski and Robert Franck, together with Spaniard, Raul Montero Trevejo are accused of the shooting

Swelling the Padron swells funds

BENITACHELL Town Hall is urging residents to register on the municipal Padron

Councillor Myra van 't Hoff, who heads the Communications department and Residents' councillor Dirk Rheindorff recently launched the 'Benitachell grows with you' campaign.

They explained to residents not included on the Padron, the advantages that being on the Padron brings.

Registering automatically grants full citizens' rights that include discounts on municipal sports, educational and cultural services. There are also other benefits, van't Hoff and Rheindorff said, as registering on the Padron also entitles the town hall to more help, subsidies and supplements from the central government.

"The Padron's importance is fundamental, as the greater the number on the register, the greater the economic help that a town hall receives," the councillors said. "We are talking about health centres, upkeep of beaches and parks, municipal installations, schools and public transport."

The campaign also reminds residents

of the importance of renewing their Padron entry.

"Residents think that once you register you are on the Padron for life, but it does not work that way and it's necessary to renew," van't Hoff and Rheindorff said.

Failing to do so is the principal reason for disappearing from the Padron as residents from EU countries or those from outside the EU with long-term residence permits should renew every five years. All other non-Spanish residents need to renew every two years.

Could Ismael still be alive?

FINESTRAT couple Sol and Angel want to know if their newborn son died or was a 'stolen baby.'

Sol, who already had two children, needed an emergency Caesarean and gave birth in what is now Alicante General Hospital on December 26, 1982.

Her baby, whom she and Angel named Ismael, died 10 days later. He weighed 1.4 kilos at birth and died due to heart failure, doctors told the couple.

Ismael was the second baby that Sol lost that year, the following premature birth of another son, again by Caesarean, who died soon afterwards.

In 2014 the couple began to suspect that Ismael could have been given in adoption after seeing a television programme about Alicante City's 'stolen babies.'

They were never shown Ismael's body but told that he had suffered and it would be best not to see him, Sol said. The hospital also insisted on arranging his burial in a common grave in Alicante City cemetery but although the

death was recorded in the Civil Register, there was no death certificate.

Sol and Angel lodged an official complaint that was passed on to Madrid in 2015 and the mother's DNA has been entered on a national database.

Alicante cemetery has since turned down the couple's request to open the common grave to seek a DNA match, explaining that they would need a court order.

Undeterred, Angel called on any male born in December 1982 with doubts about his origins, to contact the Guardia Civil. "Until it's proved to the contrary, my son is still alive," he

Bridge project ahead of schedule

THE remaining two cables of the Fernando Reign suspension bridge in Alcoy have been replaced.

The bridge, which took two years to build and was inaugurated in 1987, has been closed since July 2016 after one of the bridge's cables was found to be damaged. Closer inspection by the Ministry of Public Works confirmed that all

38 stays were corroded and it would cost €7.2 million to replace them.

The bridge is the city's principal exit to Alicante City and the Ministry undertook from the outset to carry out the repairs as quickly as possible to relieve the 'complicated' traffic situation inside Alcoy.

The contract to carry out the highly-specialised work was awarded in May last year and although the Ministry had calculated that the bridge would take 13 months to repair, work has gone smoothly and is ahead of schedule.

If all goes according to plan the bridge could reopen sooner than expected, the Ministry confirmed.


It never rains but it snows

Temperatures plummeted some days ago in Alicante Province where inland snow fell as muchneeded rain on the coast.

Mountainous inland areas, where below-freezing temperatures and snow are always expected during the winter, were ready for the blizzards that temporarily closed some roads on high ground.

Despite AEMET recommendations to remain at home or to drive with chains, emergencies arose and rescues were

requested.

The Denia fire brigade and a snowplough had to assist a driver trapped on the CV-752 between Tarbena and Castell de Castells who was later towed to safety.

Not long after, the Emergency Services were needed again on the Agres-Alfafara road where 15 drivers found themselves snowed-in.

At the time of writing, no roads were closed although the General Directorate of Traffic (DGT) warned of problems at the Tudons and Confrides passes on Aitana as well as the Benifallim-Benilloba and Tarbena-Castell de Castells roads.

Spring clean

THE Villajoyosa Department of Historical Heritage has started to clean out an irrigation pool believed to date back to the 17th century

The pool, located next to the old railway bridge over the Amadorio River, is listed as one of the town's protected sites and collects water from the irrigation canal that used to supply the La Llobeta Mill.

Following the maintenance work, the council has revealed that it plans to carry out a comprehensive restoration project.

The project will involve an archaeological study that will examine the interior of the irrigation pool, to determine how the pool was built and which materials were used.

The Councillor for Historical Heritage, Maria Angeles Gualde, explained that "once this study has been carried out, it will be possible to eliminate any additional pollution and start the restoration work needed to preserve the site."

Gualde added that "this pool is a protected site and a relevant piece of the town's cultural landscape. For this reason, these maintenance tasks are essential to ensure its protection."

A reprieve for mail

Earlier, Spain's postal service Correos wrote informing them that as these urbanisations lack centralised groups of postboxes, residents would have to pick up their own mail from Calpe's post office after February 5.

Instead, the town hall stepped in and persuaded Correos to postpone their plans until September, Citizens' Attention councillor Hilda Backaert said.

In the meantime the council will install multi-occupancy post boxes on each urbanisation to ensure that all homes continue to receive their mail after September 3.

"Although this is the residents' responsibility, we thought it would be better if the town hall carried out the initiative. A huge number of mailboxes are needed and many residents are foreign and absent at certain times of the year," municipal sources revealed.

"We wanted to take the part of residents and to make life easier for them, bearing in mind installing their own post boxes would have been an impossible task," Hilde Backaert said

The cardboard horse, made around 1915, and the child's wooden wagon are typical of the toys produced at that time in Denia, explained the Toy Museum's director, Josep Antoni Gis-

The horse originally belonged to a well-off Javea family who owned a bakery and Bartolome Bas's father appears in a photo taken with the horse in the late 1920s.

Almost a century later, his son asked Denia expert Josepa Padin Devesa to restore the horse, which is similar to two others in the Toy

These would have been made by one of the

two Pego factories producing cardboard horses in the 20's and post-war years, despite appearing in the catalogues of Denia toy manufactur-

"The horse is a gem and has been expertly restored by Josepa Padin," said Gisbert who announced that it has been selected as Exhibit of

The wooden cart, also restored on behalf of the Bas Perello family, is 'absolutely emblematic' of Denia toy production and was probably made in the 1940s, Gisbert said.

Denia's Culture councillor Rafa Carrio thanked the Bas Perello family, which is closely linked to Denia, for the donation. "This is how countries and history are made," Carrio said.

Car park qualms calmed down

OPINIONS are divided in Altea over the town hall's proposal to eliminate the the Paseo Maritimo car park

The first phase of Altea's seafront regeneration has been completed but as the council embarks on the second, residents and business-owners are reluctant to see so many parking spaces disap-

Aware of growing opposition, the town hall recently called a meeting at the Casa de Cultura to give full details of the project.

"We tried to explain that this is a unique opportunity which, out of sheer responsibility, we cannot pass up if we truly want a 21st century Altea," Town Planning councillor Imma Orozco said

"It means going hand-in-hand with the Ministry of the Environment for the coastal regeneration project and remodelling the Paseo while saving on costs and disruption."

A BENISSA bar-owner defended allegedly troublesome customers after an upstairs neighbour threw water over them from her balcony.

"I did it to make them go away. They insulted me and I couldn't put up with it. In the end I called the police," Isabel Reyero told the regional Spanish press.

"My customers aren't riffraff," the bar owner later responded. "They are decent hardworking people, from the five-year-olds who have their birthday parties here to the elderly."

In more than 30 years he has never had problems with anyone except Reyero, who moved in with her family 22 years ago, he

The wife of Isidor Molla, now a Benissa councillor and a former mayor, she maintained that her family was tired of 'disagreeable and even violent situations' caused by several cus-

"We are suffering something very similar to harassment," she said.

That night she and her family returned from a trip and were tired. "More than a problem of noise, we felt intimidated," Reyero explained.

Relations with the bar, which opened in 1986, have never been good, she said, but although the town hall started proceedings on three occasions, nothing ever came of the complaints.

Following the latest incident, she had once again asked the town hall to step in, Revero said: "We can't take any more. We shall complain to the courts."

No ticket to ride

LINE 9 passengers have had to complete the Calpe-Denia leg of their journey by coach since summer 2016.

Already due for modernisation that autumn, this section closed early on safety grounds and a coach linking Calpe, Benissa, Teulada, Gata, La Jara and Denia was provided for passengers.

This outsourced service cost the regional rail operator FGV €900,000 between August 2016 and the end of 2017 and will cost another €672,457 between now and the end of 2018.

Despite the outlay the number of passengers using the Benidorm-Denia line has slumped now that more than half of the journey must be completed by road.

Neither is the arrangement profitable, according to the SF railway employees' union, because only passengers leaving or joining the Trenet in Calpe or Denia are paying for tickets.

Those who take the bus in Benissa, Teulada Gata or La Jara rarely pay for the journey

because although there should be four ticket collectors, two are off sick and one has to double up as a train driver.

"Even those who want to pay, can't as there is no-one to pay and no vending machines," a SF spokesman said.

A disappointing debut

The *empadronamiento* (also called *padrón*) is a city hall registration to inform the municipal register where you currently reside. It is a census record, which allows the city to generate a list of local inhabitants.

Whether you are here in Spain legally or not, Pellicer & Heredia recommends that you register with your local *padrón*, as it provides innumerable benefits if you intend to live in Spain for any extended period of time.

Registration means that you're an official resident of your community. Also, the *empadronamiento* is the way to verify or accredit your stay or residence in Spain – a

necessity for a variety of administrative procedures. Such as (depending on regions):

- Applying for an NIE
- Getting a health insurance card
- Buying a vehicle
- Getting married

It is important to note that the *certificado de empadronamiento* is only considered valid if it doesn't exceed three months from the day of issue. Once registered, a copy with a recent date can be requested at your nearest town hall. You may or may not need to pay a small fee, this varies on the place of residence.

To find out how to get on the *padrón* and what documents are required, always check with your local town hall.

A city or town receives money from the government to provide services to those who live within its jurisdiction, based on the number of inhabitants. It's therefore in everyone's best interest to have an accurate count of who is living in the community, to provide optimum service levels.

How to cancel a contract to purchase a property and what to consider

I signed a reservation contract for a property (villa) in Javea, Al-

icante Province. The property is not as we expected and we want to terminate the contract, cancel

it, and recover the deposit paid. Could you please confirm how that works?

Response:

Thank you for your inquiry.

Unfortunately we cannot advise you legally, without reviewing the contract and without knowing what the actual problem that has arisen is, although in a general way, we can make the following comments.

First of all, if what you call reservation contract, is a contract where you and the sellers reached an agreement on the price and object of the contract ie the property to be sold, it is possible that there is a sale agreement in place, so, depending on how the contract is written, it may or may not be possible to terminate the contract for you.

It is essential when buying or selling a property, that the contracts are worded clearly to

ensure it is understood by both parties how to terminate or resolve the contract.

In the second place, it will be necessary to discover whether the reason you want to terminate the contract could be considered as acceptable due to a breach by the selling party or a legal issue sufficient to allow you to terminate the contract.

To advise you, we must know if there has been any breach of contract by the seller, in respect of any of the conditions of the sale, for example in terms of the cadastral, registry, planning situation of the property, etc.

It is essential when buying or selling a property in Spain, to state on the contract the conditions of the purchase, for example: that the property must be identified as being approved by the land registry, with an occupation licence, etc.

This will depend on what the parties agree.

Resolution or termination of a

Agreement between the parties: If you and the seller agree on the termination of the contract and its consequences, you must sign a resolution agreement.

If there is no agreement between the parties, in most cases a judicial resolution to the contract will be necessary, which means the parties will need to go to the courts to declare the termination of the contract, due to a breach by one party, by mistake in the object, or any other reason.

Sometimes clients consult us saying the contract stated that if a certain condition was not met, it could be terminated unilaterally but even if this is the case, the contract must still be resolved through a Spanish Public notary,

and sometimes through a court.

Otherwise, if we resolved or terminated the contract directly in a unilateral way, we could and the client finds themself with serious legal consequences, because legally we could continue to be linked to the contract if not terminated correctly.

It is therefore essential to draft the contract stating the essential conditions of the purchase and sale and also, if there is any problem, to ensure we resolve or terminate the contract in the correct manner, in order to avoid unpleasant legal liabilities.



A MOTORIST has been held in northern Spain after watching a 32-inch flat screen television while driving on amphetamines.


He was spotted in Santacara, Navarra, by a Local Police patrol car which was attending to an overturned lorry on the NA-5330 road.

Architects outline concerns

THIS week, a group of concerned architects from Javea met with members from the local branch of the Partido Popular (PP) to reportedly express some of their concerns related to town planning.

They claim they have projects held up by the town hall, which leads to complicated conversations with clients when they ask why there are delays.







A plague of locusts

■ HORDES of locusts could cause a 'global scandal' during the World Cup in Russia, an agriculture official has said. Pyotr Chekmarev, head of the agriculture ministry's crop department, warned the insects could attack green pitches. There are reportedly thousands of locusts currently living around Volgograd, the tournament's host city.

Snow plane delays

Opposition leader arrested

■ ALEXEI NAVALNY was arrested along with 15 others following a rally which called for a boycott of the country's March presidential election. The prominent opposition leader was tackled by police while walking up the Tverskaya road in Moscow, according to reports. Police fought off supporters who attempted to pull him free and also raided his headquarters to reportedly stop a broadcast.

Gas pipeline approved

■ A GAS pipeline worth billions of dollars and set to run into Europe has been approved by German authorities. Russian energy giant Gazprom's 1,200 kilometre long Nord Stream 2 project has been criticised by the United States and Poland who said it undermined Europe's energy security.



Bank raid too cheap

BANCO POPULAR - bought by rival Santander for €1 as part of a rescue package - could have been worth more than €1 bil-

A confidential report by consultancy firm Deloitte, now released into the public domain, valued the failed bank's equity at € 1.3 billion in a 'best case'

Popular was the first bank to be wound down under new European directives blocking taxpayer bailouts, but the sale was contested by investors who lost an estimated €850 million.

Opel jobs fear eases

unveiled a cost-cutting plan designed to keep production of the Opel Corsa in Spain.

The owner of Peugeot and Citröen bought Opel from US firm General Motors in 2016, but recently threatened to move production of the Corsa compact away from its Zaragoza plant due to spiralling overheads.

Chief executive officer Carlos Tavares said that the site is too expensive compared with the company's other Spanish factories in Madrid and ViBy Matt Ford

It comes after he earlier criticised spending at Opel's Vauxhall plant in Ellesmere Port, Cheshire, which he claims is twice as costly as its French counterparts.

But the company has now presented a five-year plan to workers' unions which it hopes will save jobs at the factory, which currently employs 5,300 people and last year ran at 80 per cent of capacity.

PSA said in a statement that it is "convinced that the employees will unof the site through the performance plan, which will pave the way for new investments and projects."

No specific details regarding the deal - which will need to be approved via a poll of workers - were given, but Spanish media report that it includes a freeze on salaries in 2018 to be followed by wage rises at half the rate of inflation, plus a 5 per cent reduction in overtime pay.

Union sources said that they have agreed to the package in principle following 12 hours of talks.

Catalan jobs go downhill

THE Spanish government has claimed that six out of every 10 jobs lost in the country since September were in Cataluña.

Social Security Secretary Tomas Burgos said that during the same period more people found work in Madrid than Barcelona for the first time in five years, although he emphasised that the two cities are "the main locomotives" of employment in Spain.

"This is a clear sign of the effect that the political situation in Cataluña is having on the economy," he added.

Spain's burning desire

COAL POWER BILL SLAPPED DOWN

THE Spanish government has been snubbed by its own energy regulator.

It comes in the wake of a recent announcement that the state intends to support policies encouraging utility firms to continue the use of highlypolluting coal-fired power plants.

But the Comision Nacional de Mercados y la Competencia (CNMC) has now said that the country could lose a "significant part of the existing coal capacity" without threatening energy security.

The government last November issued a Royal Decree allowing it to prevent a company from closing down a coal power plant should the move be deemed a risk for the national energy supply, incompatible with energy planning, or detrimental for 'any other economic reason.'

This was widely seen as a response to Basque Country-based utility Iberdrola's announcement that it intends to axe its remaining two coal fa-

Environmental groups panned the decree, claiming that it contravenes both Spanish and European Union (EU) law, and the CNMC has agreed, releasing a statement that said: "The Spanish electricity system will not have problems of security of supply in the medium nor the long term.

"(Even) in the worst scenario with demand peaking at 46,000 MW and low generation, a significant part of the existing coal capacity could be

The report also said that the decree could break European rules and prevent fair competition.

Spain produces around 30 per cent more energy than it needs, whereas the industry standard safety margin is 10-15 per cent.

The country has a long history of mining and burning coal, and political support for the industry within the conservative govern-

Endesa - the country's largest electric company - recently revealed that it intends to sink €400 million into three of its existing coal plants to ensure they remain operational beyond 2030 despite new EU air pollution laws taking effect in 2021.

The CNMC's decision is not legally binding, but the main opposition political parties have also rallied against the decree. Electrical firms not in favour have threatened legal action if the government pushes it through, and EU lawmakers from the Climate Action and Energy Commission have launched a probe.

Police slam government cop out over pay promise

THOUSANDS of police officers took to the streets to protest over their wages.

The rally, which took place in Andalucian capital Sevilla, saw off-duty Guardia Civil National Police officers from cities including Madrid, Barcelona, Alicante, and Murcia demand that Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy keeps his promise to invest €1.5 billion into increasing salaries over a three-year period.

But according to an official "Interior Minister Zoido and the tax agency" have "still not reached an agreement" over how much money should be spent.

"Or maybe they don't want to," he added, before claiming that the government is now "only offering €600 million.

"It is an insult and shows a lack of respect."

Rich getting richer, report says The haves and have nots

THE Spanish economy is on the up, growing by an average of 3.3 per cent from 2015 to 2017.

But a new report by Oxfam Intermon - a Spanish offshoot of international poverty-relief charity Oxfam, shows that financial inequality is greater than ever.

Entitled '99: An economy for the 99 per cent,' the study demonstrates how economic growth since the financial crisis of 2007-2008, has benefited the rich, with 1 per cent of the population now owning a quarter of the country's

According to the data, Spain is ranked third among European Union nations where inequality has grown since the crippling economic downturn in the wake of the global banking catastrophe.

The richest three people in Spain own a combined fortune equivalent to the wealth of the poorest 30 per cent of the population, around 14.2 million.

While executive pay soars, with 7,000 new millionaires created in Spain during 2017, 10.2 million people remain below the poverty

An average of 16,347 people re-

quired the services of care centres for the homeless in 2016, with the figure having increased by 20.5 per cent since 2014.

Wages have virtually stagnated since 2009, increasing by around 0.6 per cent nationally, while inflation remains above 1 per cent.

Investment in education has fallen by 30 per cent over the same period, with families forced to spend 37.2 per cent more to cover the costs for their children.

Youth unemployment fell from a record 55 per cent in 2013 to 37 per cent at the start of 2018, but the average annual salary for under-25s in Spain is now 33 per cent lower than in 2008.

And the number of part-time contracts issued to young workers has grown at a rate three times faster than for other age brackets.

Seven out of every 10 people who receive the lowest wages are women, with only 34.5 per cent of the highest earners in Spain fe-

A survey revealed that 68 per cent of the population believe that no matter how hard they work, it will be 'difficult or impossible' for them to save more money.

Rail revamp announced

STATE-OWNED train company Renfe has announced plans to convert six more disused trains into high speed AVE units.

The news follows an earlier commitment to transform 13 'hotel trains' at a cost of €107 million, with the total now to exceed €151 million.

Once the conversion by Spanish manufacturer Talgo is complete, the trains will be able to travel at 330 kilometres per hour and transport 405 passengers

This is the first phase of a scheme to spend €1.5 billion on revitalising the firm's fleet over the coming years, with the purchase of new trains and carriages to follow the current round of refurbishments.

The bank lost money during the fourth quarter of 2017 for the first time in three years, and blamed one-off 'restructuring costs' after it purchased rival Banco Mare Nostrum

The purchase came as the company tried to boost profits after a fast recovery from its €22.4 billion rescue in 2012. and agreed to buy BMN in June, creating Spain's fourth-

At the time Bankia said that it expected restructuring to set it back around €300 million. with most of the cash spent on closing branches and paying off redundant staff.

But it has now revealed that the final total was €312 million, with the bank making a €235 million loss in the last three months of 2017.

Ticket probe launched

THE Spanish government is probing how tickets for two upcoming U2 concerts sold out 'almost instantly.

It comes after the Irish rockers announced a second September date in Madrid when those for the first gig ran out within minutes of going on sale.

And Minister of Culture Inigo Mendez de Vigo has ordered detectives to investigate after smelling a rat.

"It is not normal that a few minutes after tickets go on sale over the internet, there are none left," he told Spanish media.

He added that fans are being forced to pay over the odds with tickets being resold online "at a much higher price."

The band play the 16,000-seat WiZink Centre on September 20 and 21, and entrances are already being sold on Spanish classified websites for up to €500 after originally being

Come your own personal digital apocalypse (pressing the delete button when you shouldn't, losing your phone, data corruption), and it's goodbye life.

Friends also lost their entire collection because their pictures were in some free photo album software with a lifespan barely longer than a

geriatric fruit-fly's, a program which is now long-gone to the great Recy-

So always save your photos in an industry-standard format which might just last as long as we do. The JPEG (or JPG) format is now ubiquitous, and serious photographers opt increasingly for the high-quality but huge RAW format.

(And here's a tip if you have old photos in an obsolete format: download the all-purpose free image reader IrfanView which might help).

Like anything else digital, photos should be subject to 'the rule of threes': the original copy, a backup copy on a different device, and a third copy off-site.

Keeping your photos on an everbigger SD card in your camera is as unwise as keeping all your wealth in

a big box under the bed (as I recall a former Sultan of Oman did with his country's assets, until mice discovered a fondness for shredding ban-

After every photo-session copy your pics to a computer, and ideally also to an external storage medium you keep somewhere else, like an external hard drive or flash stick.

Cloud storage sites are growing in popularity, with many offering free initial storage as an incentive, but be prepared for some purse pain if you're really prolific.

Most modern phones will actually back up your photos automatically 'to the cloud.' So at least you will still have your digital memories if your phone undergoes an unauthorised change of ownership.

Oh and by the way, did anyone ever tell you that St Mark's Square might occasionally be a little more beautiful when photographed without your undoubtedly-stunning mug

Photo-finish

THIS year an estimated 1.2 trillion photos will be saved to digital storage media. Increasingly, they will be shunted into 'the cloud.'

Plenty of well-known cloud services are vying for our custom, such as Apple iCloud, Google Photos, Amazon's Prime Photos and Dropbox. One good reason for using them is that they all share an important feature: automatic backups.

INSIDE NO 9 (BBC2, Tuesdays, 10pm) is in its fourth series and arguably the best yet. Written by Reece Shearsmith and Steve Pemberton of League Of Gentlemen fame, it's a dark comedy anthology coming in self-contained 30-minute episodes.

I didn't take to the League Of Gentlemen so it was with much apprehension I gave No 9 a chance, I'm so glad I did. Stand out episodes so far were Bernie Clifton's Dressing Room (episode two) about a lost show business friendship between two estranged comedy partners reunited for one last show. Bittersweet throughout. I have to admit the finale brought a tear to

To Have and To Hold (episode four) was the darkest of the lot. The basic story of an unhappy middle-aged couple with a brittle relationship was funny in itself, but the story had hidden depths to explore which came to its dark conclusion at the end. I leave the details out so that those who haven't enjoyed this brilliant series can catch up. For those who enjoy this type of drama, you won't regret it.

Piers Morgan's interview with Donald Trump (ITV, Sunday, 11pm) was hardly what you would call insightful. Morgan's soft-soaping of the president made for quite bland viewing. Nuggets such as Trump admitting he wasn't a

feminist and his continuing scepticism over climate change was hardly headline news, and the pally interview style (Piers may as well have sat on Trump's knee) had me bored fairly quickly. I did stay to the end though.

Even though the interview was heavily advertised by ITV, it drew nearly a million less viewers than the BBC news at the same time. Even the previously publicised possibility of Trump apologising for re-tweeting far right

group Britain First stopped short of an actual apology. His claims that he didn't realise what Britain First stood for did speak volumes however about his Twitter vetting procedure. Piers Morgan's abrasive and often aggressive style on Good Morning Britain (ITV, mornings) would have at least been entertaining.

Hidden gem of the week was Rhod Gilbert: Stand Up To Shyness (BBC2, Tuesday, 10pm) which was an exploration of social anxiety of

which, surprisingly, Rhod has had since childhood. He described his own trials and anxieties and spoke to fellow comedian Greg Davies, a number of scientists and took part in activities meant to help his condition.

The finale was his mentoring of three fellow sufferers from South Wales in a challenge to perform stand up in front of a live audience. That they succeeded in putting two fingers up to shyness was a fitting climax and induced in me one of those 'feel good' moments.

A short plea for the BBC to bring back Miriam Margolyes', Miriam's Big American Adventure, (BBC1, Wednesdays, 10pm). Her final episode into Middle America to seek out alternative views to her own delivered in bucket

From believers in creationism, the local altright group, to a visit to 'the most racist town in America', she encountered her opposites. The Ku Klux Klan refused to meet her but the pastor, who wouldn't meet face-to-face and instead relayed questions to her via a headset because she was Jewish, was stomach churning. The first female black sheriff in Texas was a positive end to the series. More please!

FUGITIVE MP's from the Catalan parliament, who fled to Brussels with Carles Puigdemont after he declared independence, fell on their swords and renounced their seats.

In keeping with the way that Spain's elections are organised, Esquerra Republicana (ERC) and two Junts per Catalunya (JxC) seats will be occupied by the next names down on the closed voting lists.

This exercise in self-sacrifice gives pro-independence parties JxC, ERC and CUP the overall majority they need to install Puigdemont as presi-

Trouble is, the Catalan Speaker called off the first investiture debate because Madrid and the Constitutional Tribunal stepped in to prevent Puigdemont from indulging in the political equivalent of internet dating and accepting the job via videolink from Belgium.

"He refused to propose an al-

ternative candidate", Roger Torrent said. Carles Puigdemont was the legitimate candidate with an overall majority.

"The president of the Generalitat will be chosen by the MPs in this Chamber, not a Tribunal or a minister 600-kilometres away," Roger Torrent said.

Meanwhile, according to the national daily El Mundo, Puigdemont's text messages the same day to Toni Comin - a former ERC counsellor now in Brussels - proclaimed that the independence process was finished.

He had been "sacrificed by our own," he said, and insinuated that someone else would have to take his place.

The former president's Twitter account meanwhile spewed out the same old fighting slogans, but that's the usual routine for Puigdemont who all along the way has so often failed to say what he means or mean what he

IÑIGO MENDEZ DE VIGO, minister of Education, Culture and Sport is also spokesman for the central government in Madrid.

Recently he apologised to the people 'who felt ill-treated' during the police charges of October 1 as Catalans were prevented from voting in the unauthorised independence referen-

THE doomed 2006 Catalan Statute of Autonomy that was emasculated by the Constitutional Tribunal in 2010 recognised the region as a country.

This led to garment-rending amongst Spanish nationalists as well as the Partido Popular and the latter appealed successfully against the 'pais' label and several other clauses in the Estatut that didn't tickle the party's fancv. but touched on a nerve instead.

All of which begs the question, if the Basque region can be called the Pais Vasco without making the PP froth at the mouth, what's the problem with Cataluña?

A surprising answer when you bear in mind that on average a woman in Spain earns 85.1 per cent less than a male doing the same job, it would have been interesting to hear his views.

How to drive safely in winter

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Overtaking and speed limits

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



DANGEROUS: Overtaking is risky.

ACCORDING to Article 51 of the Reglamento General de Circulacion: 'The maximum fixed speeds for conventional roads, which do not pass through urban areas, may only be exceeded by up to 20kph by saloon cars and motorcycles whilst overtaking other vehicles travelling at lesser speeds.'

This clause first came about to allow cars to pass a slower moving vehicle in the shortest time possible, allowing an increase in speed in order to execute the move quickly. But overtaking is one of the most dangerous manoeuvres we can carry out.

In the event of a head-on collision, our speed is added to that of the oncoming vehicle, and so a crash where two vehicles are travelling at 90kilometres per hour is the equivalent of crashing at 180-kilometres per hour, when the two speeds are combined.

But the rule does exist and does allow drivers to go over the speed limit, but only in certain

Firstly, we see that it can only ever apply to cars and motorcycles.

Secondly, we need to look at the types of roads the clause can apply to. We can see that it

is not permitted on motorways. We can also see that it does not apply on dual carriageways. So we can exclude faster moving roads straight-

Next, we see that the clause does not apply in towns, or cities for that matter, so we can exclude those routes too.

Now all that we are left with is so-called conventional roads, single carriageway, with no central reservation and outside of towns. But, then we have to take away those for which a speed limit already applies, because that speed limit overrules this clause too.

In other words, if you see a sign (which is called the R-301) that limits the maximum speed of a road to 70-kilometres per hour, then the maximum is 70-kilometres per hour and this exceptional speeding clause does not apply. The same if the R-301 sign limits the speed to 50 or 40, or whatever the speed restriction, that sign overrules the clause. In other words, you are NOT permitted to exceed the speed limit for any reason, including overtaking.

The only road where this clause can apply is a conventional road, where no overruling speed limit applies and where overtaking is allowed.

Can they reimburse over-payers?

After the financial crash, our new community had problems paying for essential services. The property developer still owned many units and was not paying the fees for these unsold units. The small group of original owners decided to pay more than their assigned share in order to keep the services running. Now, all of the units are sold and occupied and most of the

earlier unpaid fees have been fully paid up.

We want to reimburse the original owners for the amounts they overpaid, which seems only fair. We voted at the AGM to pay the owners out of our healthy reserve fund. Only one owner voted against the idea. Now our administrator says it must be a unanimous vote. Is this correct?



AS we sit in the beautiful Spanish sunshine, whatever the time of year, sipping our pina colada or our cafe con leche and reading the latest liquidation scandal in the UK, are we immune to the effects of such a disastrous commercial collapse?

Unfortunately, we are not! Reading the latest news, there may be some readers today who are worried about their Carillion pensions in particular. Well, by law, in the UK, pension shortfalls are protected but, as we saw with the recent BHS debacle, it can take many months to sort out and in that time payments could be delayed, reduced or worse still stopped.

It brings us back to the ongoing problem of slow or reduced payments when our community management fee statements are sent out to expatriates, and those holiday homeowners residing in the UK in particular, whose income may be under threat from the travails of the UK economy, including the latest business collapses.

As we well know, reduced or delayed payments back to our

communities can have a long-term effect on the well running and beautification of our Spanish homes

On a wider note I keep asking myself: why does it keep happening? It seems always to point to the directors and how they run their companies, or perhaps how the rules and regulations governing corporate responsibility seem to be ignored, flouted or deliberately mismanaged.

In the case of Carillion, my own firm's (LPL) Corporate Collections Team saw, at least two years ago, signs that Carillion were heading into cash flow difficulties, brought about by contract arguments in the Middle East, impossibly low contract tenders for private and gov-

ernment projects in the UK and worse still, lax oversight by those in government when looking at the public contracts Carillion were already involved in.

Hundreds of our own clients instructing LPL to collect unpaid invoices from Carillion should have given many the first warning signs that they were in trouble. The Stock Market knew two years ago and was actually betting shares on Carillion's imminent failure and made a small fortune doing so.

My firm warned many that their slow payments (Payment Lagging) were a sure sign of difficulties ahead.

The debate lingers on as to how our laws can make directors more responsible for their actions, particularly how pension funds are managed. Whilst there will certainly be new legislation, this will not be on the Statute books for at least another three years.

It is a sad fact that in an economy that relies upon credit, good fiduciary responsibility and at least a measure of prompt payment, all we can do is continue to be vigilant in the way we all run our businesses and here in Spain, our own communities.

From our own point of view, if management fees are late, don't ignore the warning signs, act quickly before some else does.

food becomes contaminated with bacteria or other harmful substances such as salmonella, listeria or E coli. However, food can also be infected with the same viruses that cause stomach flu so then it can be pretty hard to tell the two apart.

Either way, the most important thing is to keep hydrated the next time you're struck by either illness as the vomiting and other symptoms can dehvdrate vou.

GRAPPA is one of Italy's most popular alcoholic drinks, with approximately 40 million bottles produced each year.

In 1989 the name Grappa became protected by the EU and can be used only if the drink is sourced and produced in Italy with alcohol content between 35-60 per cent.

Grappa is made by steam distillation of the skins, pulp, seeds, and stems (the pomace) left over from the wine-making process in order to extract remaining flavours before the waste is discarded.

It is then bottled at once to make Grappa Bianca, or aged in wooden casks to create the yellow or brown-hued riserva: Flavoured grappas are also produced with infusion of herbs.

If at least 85 per cent of the pomace comes from a single variety, grappa can be designated di vitigno or varietale, and the type of grape



Moraira author's fascinating journey

LUCINDA E CLARKE is no ordinary author.

The Moraira-based 69-year-old has gone from toilet cleaner to giant teddy bear sewer to professional writer - via spells in nine different countries and a stint as a dog breeder. She has interviewed Nelson Mandela, met royalty and 'been abandoned in the African bush with a nine-year-old ba-

But after a lifetime of adventure, the Dublinborn writer is settling down to focus on her awardwinning work

"For me writing is a kind of drug, I get twitchy when I don't write," she told Euro Weekly News.

Happily married to her second husband for 20 years, Clarke is now promoting her latest novel, 'Cut For Life' - the fourth in her Amie series.

The subject matter for the latest instalment, though, is dark.

"All my books carry a message - living as an expat in Africa and understanding different cultures, radical religious groups, human trafficking, and now Female Genital Mutilation

(FGM)," she said.

"When I researched FGM I was horrified and I wanted to raise awareness of the practice, which is growing not only in Europe, but in America as well. It's total abuse and subjugation of women."

Clarke had spells in the Cotswolds and Liverpool as a child but has since lived in Scotland, Kenya, Libya, Botswana, Swaziland, South Africa and now Spain.

Despite hopes to go into writing from an early age, her career route was unconventional.

She jokes: "as a precocious brat I devoured Enid Blyton and thought 'I could do this."

After a series of random jobs, she recalls: "I was dragged to the South African Broadcasting Corporation for an audition which I failed abysmally. I was then shunted to the drama department and I underwhelmed them there too, but it was suggested that I enter the playwright of the year award (she won). After that there was no stopping me!"

Along the way, she found interviewing antiapartheid hero Mandela frightening.

"I pushed past Reuters, CNN, BBC, etc waving my microphone jauntily in their faces. However, the great man was in a foul mood. He was incredi-


When the local constabulary of WPCs goes head to head with the pirates, and Frederic finds his loyalties torn, it's anyone's guess who will come out on top.

bly tall, which I wasn't expecting, and since he was fuming, and I'm not an important person, he did not turn on the charm, in fact he frightened me to death. He was kind enough to answer all my questions, but I remember thinking that I would never like to get on the wrong side of him."

She has warmer words for Prince Charles - and an anonymous African woman.

"He was not what I expected. The British media had given me the impression he was a bit of a wuss. When we chatted he was charming, confident, friendly and easy to talk to. He had an aura of power, like Mandela.

"But perhaps the interview that I remember (most) was in a mud hut with a middle-aged black lady, who was dying of AIDS. What she had accomplished in her life, with little cash, few resources and immense courage showed me the true depth of the human spirit."

Meanwhile, online sales represent only 4.5 per cent of Spain's total, compared to 18 per cent in the UK and 15 per cent in Germany.

Many are therefore targeting an opportunity for growth in ecommerce. In addition, student housing and old people's homes are beginning to attract more investors.

Village life for sale

MUCH of rural Spain is up for sale, with around 15,000 entire villages on the market.

For example, Olmeda de la Cuesta is a tiny community in La Alcarria, an isolated region of rolling farmland between Madrid, Guadalajara and Cuenca. With just 35 residents on the electoral roll and barely 10 over winter, it is facing oblivion.

As a result, in a bid to attract newcomers the local council is selling off land at hugely discounted prices.

It has also begun to auction off plots with some success. Last year the mayor Jose Luis Regacho auctioned off 14 plots of land at €5 per square metre.

This summer, six or seven areas have been identified for sale and buyers are being attracted from abroad.

Some are looking to make a home in the community, including a British sculptor and an Iranian who works as a chef.

Countless villages throughout Spain are facing a similar existential struggle.

"There are places where four or five villages are bought by a family, who then bring their friends and create a little community of their own.

"According to our data, this year half of buyers will be Spanish, and the other half from abroad."

Of the 3,500 abandoned villages in Spain, around 1,500 are up for sale and they have previously proved popular with American, German and French buyers.

At the upper end of the scale are villages priced at €15 million, with renovated houses and located near woodland and rivers.

IF you use garlic in your cooking or for anything else, with just a little preparation you can grow your own and have the freshest garlic possible, even if you have only a spare metre of

The climate in Spain is ideal for growing garlic. It can be

Gourmet garlic to garnish your Mediterranean goodies

grown in containers with a good soil mix and it takes up very little space. One good bulb can give you around 20 cloves that can be planted just eight centimetres apart in all directions.

A broad, shallow container is ideal as the roots do not need to go too deep if they are cared for correctly. A metre square container can give 100 new bulbs which could be enough for a year's supply in many kitchens.

A great way to have fresh garlic leaves, used in the way chive leaves are used in salads and soups, is to separate the smaller cloves from the bulbs being prepared to grow large bulbs.

Plant the biggest cloves in a larger container and the smaller

taste while waiting for the bulbs to mature in the other container. It is best not to harvest the leaves of the larger growing bulbs as it may affect their size.

If you have a space in your garden you can start your garlic

the soil just moist, and if your soil tends to be waterlogged at any time, plant them in raised beds. They do best with plenty of sun and only very partial

To obtain bulbs for planting, it is a good idea to source them from organic shops or good market stalls so they are chemical free and fresh. Garlic stored for long periods does not grow as strongly as fresh cloves so it

is best to look around for the freshest looking ones.

Once you get the bulbs home and your containers or plot prepared, break open the bulbs carefully, so that the plate at the base is intact on each clove, as otherwise they may not grow. Cloves with broken plates can be put to use in the kitchen.

The bigger the clove planted, the bigger the new bulb that will develop, but it depends on whether there is the right balance of nutrients and sun as to whether they will have the same size cloves in the new bulb when they mature.

They are ready to harvest when the leaves start to naturally die down, usually from summer to autumn. Maturity depends on the timing of planting, which can be from autumn to early spring in the Mediterranean climate. Planting in autumn and spring can give an extended harvest season.



Ready for take-off?

DUTCH company Pal V said it will reveal a flying car at the Geneva International Motor Show next month.

Named 'The Liberty', the model resembles a motorbike sidecar topped with helicopter blades.

Pal V have dubbed the vehicle 'the world's first flying car'.

Now in the final stages of its development, the manufacturers say they will certify the vehicle for road and air use shortly, with the final safety certification due straight after the Geneva show.

The company say the internal combustion engine will deliver 100 horsepower. Top speeds will be around 100mph on land and 112mph in the air.

Fuel economy is remarkably reasonable - according to the company's forecasts at least - given that the car is also an airplane. Pal V claim it will do 31 miles per gallon while driving with a 284-mile range.

Consumption rockets to 6.9 gallons per hour in the air, with a total range of 310 miles, however. And that assumes only one person is in-

Suzuki Vitara S Allgrip

THE latest Suzuki Vitara is a world away from the Jeep-style Vitara off-roader popular in the 1990's, it is now a chic SUV crossover with classy styling and car-like driving dynamics.

Well-equipped and with a sporty driving feel, the Vitara competes in a tough sector against the

likes of the Renault Captur, Peugeot 2008 and others, yet has its own plus-points to take on the

Priced from € 18,225 (£15,999), the Vitara is available with a petrol or diesel engine, manual or auto transmission, and with the option of 4WD on

the top-spec versions. Entry models get alloy wheels, Bluetooth, air conditioning and cruise control but you need to move up-

range to get touch-screen satnav and smartphone connectivity.

My test model was a top-spec S version with four-mode Allgrip 4WD and powered by a 138 hp 1.4 litre Boosterjet turbo-petrol engine and automatic transmission. Priced at €28,022 (£24,599), this version has a wealth of extra features including rear-view camera, black alloy wheels, roof rails, rear privacy glass, chrome detailing, adaptive cruise control, and suede seats.

presses with its sprightly driving dynamics. It has a responsive agile chassis, precise steering, nimble handling and a firm, yet still comfortable ride. The 0 - 100 kph time is 10.2 seconds, top speed 200 kph (124 mph). Fuel economy is good at 18.1 kpl (51.3 mpg).

Inside, the dashboard is rather dull-looking though it is logically arranged, and there are some personalisation options than can add some con-

trasting colour if you wish to brighten it.

A tall road stance means Vitara cabin accommodation provides good head and legroom in the rear, and seating is very comfortable. A deep tailgate gives good access to the 375litre boot, which has a flat floor, and the capacity can be more than doubled by folding the rear

It's hard to fault the Vitara, especially in S-specification, and it deserves to be on the shortlist of anyone looking to buy in the crowded SUV sector.


