A court has upheld the decision to hold a man in prison without bail after he confessed to killing his own mother.

As previously reported in the Euro Weekly News, the man was arrested in the Hotel Bali in Benidorm after professing that

killer confession

he had suffocated his mother in Valladolid.

A cleaner reportedly discovered a note in the hall that read, 'Please don't help me, I want to die.' Staff then tracked down the guest to his room and convinced him to open the door.

He confessed to his crime and claimed he wanted to kill himself, so a hotel worker persuaded him to call the police. Initial reports suggested the man appeared to be drunk or drugged, and had allegedly taken an overdose of barbiturates.

He was temporarily placed in the Psychiatric Unit at Villajoyosa hospital following his arrest, before being transferred to the penal institution in Alicante Province where he remains.

The 37-year-old, whom local media sources refer to as César FM, appeared by video link from prison in front of a court in Valladolid, where the judge upheld a previous decision made by a court in Alicante to reprimand the man without bail.

Woman survives 3-storey fall

A MAN of 34 was arrested after allegedly throwing his expartner from a third-floor window in Sagunto (Valencia).

Miraculously, the 36-yearold Brazilian's fall was broken by lean-to roofing and washing lines suspended across the apartment building's interior patio.

Neighbours, alerted by the noise of her fall, immediately contacted the Emergency Services and after her rescue the victim, who was semi-conscious, managed to name her aggressor.

He was able to flee before the first patrol cars reached the scene but was later located in a friend's house in Benifaraig.

The courts had issued a restraining order against him, which he broke to visit the apartment and where the violent episode was witnessed by the woman's four-year-old daughter.

The woman, who suffered head wounds, is now recovering in hospital, where doctors do not fear for her life.

Heart equipment saves two lives

THANKS to a semiautomatic defibrillator, two Local Police officers saved two people who recently suffered heart attacks in Muchamiel.

They first intervened after a person collapsed in the street and the officers, after carrying out CPR and applying the defibrillator, managed to keep him alive until an ambulance with medics arrived to transfer him to San Juan hospital.

On the second occasion, the Local Police were called to the resident's home where again they used the defibrillator to revive the patient before he was admitted to hospital.

In both cases, rapid use of the apparatus was instrumental in saving two people when their lives were in the balance.

Muchamiel's police were provided with the defibrillator some months back after receiving basic instruction in its use. As the Local Police are often the first to arrive on the scene during an accident or a health scare as in the two re-

cent cases, the region's Safety and Emergency Response Agency now recommends

that defibrillators should be included in standard equipment for all forces.

DENIA fire-Flipping hel fighters rescued a woman after her car over-

turned near the Pego-Oliva Natural Park.

The vehicle reportedly overturned after hitting a wall at a road junction trapping the woman - believed to be between 60 and 70 years old - inside the car.

The emergency services managed to free the woman in less than an hour. The driver apparently did not lose consciousness during the incident and only suffered minor

injuries.

She also requested to be transferred to the Pego Health Centre when she was free, instead of the nearest hospital.

THE countdown to one of the world's most colourful celebrations is almost

Ushering in the Year of the Dog symbolising luck - Chinese New Year 2018 starts tomorrow (Friday). Around a sixth of the world's population is gearing up for the event, including tens of thousands in Spain.

Following the lunar calendar and

taking place on a different day between January and February each year, festivities continue for around two

Normally starting by sweeping their homes, Chinese people also celebrate by decorating with red posters and lanterns, setting off fireworks, eating traditional food and attending dragon puppet parades, while children often receive 'luck money' in red envelopes or increasingly via a special app.

Each year is given a name from the Chinese zodiac, with each of the 12 sections represented by an animal.

Famous dogs include Dame Judi Dench, Sophia Loren, Alan Rickman, Steven Spielberg, both Prince William and Kate Middleton, Justin Bieber, and Madonna.

Something's goat to give



BILLY GOAT: A young single man from Bielsa dressed as a 'Tranga.'

THIS is a 'Tranga,' in other words one of the young single men from the village of Bielsa in the Pyrenees who dresses in the skin and horns of a male goat and scares the children during the annual carnival. The Bielsa Carnival is the town's most important festival of the year. It has been celebrated unchanged allegedly since the beginning of the village's origins, retaining the essence of the tradition and the characters involved.

In the past, the celebrations used to go on until Shrove Tuesday, but now have been confined to the last weekend before Lent. Neither the Spanish Civil War nor the ensuing dictatorship put a halt to the festivities.

The Trangas dress up as goats, wearing a skirt, sandals and bells hanging around their waist. Their faces are painted black with soot and oil and they carry a large stick, also called a 'Tranga' hence their name. The Trangas symbolise fertility, and are charged with 'picking up' the single women at the door of their houses during the carnival. The young women are called the 'Madamas,' they dress in regional costume which usually consists of silk dresses, white stockings and shoes and coloured ribbons. They adorn themselves with earrings and necklaces and are considered a symbol of purity

The carnival begins with the making of 'Cornelio Zorrilla' - a doll made from old clothes stuffed with straw - on Thursday night that is hung in the window of the town hall throughout the carnival. The party then ends on Sunday evening, when Cornelio Zorrilla is judged for his misdeeds, sentenced to death and burned at the stake.


Residents living nearby have complained that the noise is keeping them awake as the machinery comes into action at night, bringing water from the Font Major.

Stumble caused fatal accident

A 23-YEAR-OLD faces manslaughter charges after a girl of 19 died in a hit-and-run accident in Sueca (Valencia).

According to witnesses, the young woman, who lived in Cullera, had just left a disco in the Palmeretes area in the early hours of the morning when she stumbled and fell. She was then 'violently' run over by a white 4x4 that fled the scene and when medics arrived shortly after,

they could only confirm her death.

The following afternoon, the driver of the 4x4 and his two male passengers gave themselves up to the National Police in Torrent. Despite the intervening hours, the driver tested positive for drugs and was charged with manslaughter and failing to give assistance after an accident.

The passengers, aged 27 and 28, were also accused of failing to give assistance to the victim.



Help for gender-violence victims

BENIDORM'S Local Police is to have a two-member unit on call at all times to prevent and monitor gender violence.

The unit will work closely with the National Police, announced Public Safety councillor Lorenzo Martinez following approval from members of the Local Public Safety Committee.

"This unit demonstrates our commitment to the Integrated Gender-based Violence System that we signed up to," Martinez said.

The unit's members will be specially trained and will deal exclusively with gender violence, the councillor continued. "They will be on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week, whether or not it's their week for working or resting."

There will also be help for the children of victims and awareness talks in schools.

As well as the National Police, the unit will work closely with staff from the town hall's Equality department who are assigned to gender violence victims. Lorenzo said.

"This unit will bring improved communication and coordination, especially as regards restraining orders and court rulings," said Equality councillor Paquita Ripoll.

Merger tensions eased

THE Bankia-Banco Mare Nostrum merger has affected not only Costa Blanca clients whose BMN branches closed but also bank emplovees

Industrial action was threatened when talks on redundancy packages failed to make headway, but was called off after unions representing 92 per cent of the employees reached agreement with Bankia. The bank originally planned to lay off 2,510 workers - most of them from BMN - but this has now been reduced by 36 per cent to $1,\!602$ and redundancy conditions improved.

Red herring to avoid repaying debt

TWO Russians, aged 59 and 66, were arrested in Campello after the former reported an alleged robbery.

A year earlier, he reported that two hooded men broke into his luxury villa on the La Nuza urbanisation in Campello, taking jewellery and € 60,000 in cash.

Nevertheless, Guardia Civil officers were surprised to find that the housebreakers left behind two rifles, a revolver and ammunition.

After the 59-year-old explained that the money and the weapons belonged to a friend who was currently in Russia, the Guardia Civil impounded the weapons.

They also began an illicit possession of firearms investigation, as one of the rifles turned out to have been stolen in Callosa and none of

the other firearms were registered in Spain.

The Guardia Civil were waiting for the second man when he entered Spain almost a year later and, armed with a search warrant, inspected his home.

Here they found another revolver, a rifle that had been stolen in Czechoslovakia, a crossbow with a pulley, an airgun and several cartridges.

The search also revealed an IOU for €90,000 signed by the first man.

The supposed break-in was fictitious, investigators discovered, and the first batch of weapons were a red herring to deflect attention from the allegedly missing money which was in fact a debt that he had hoped to avoid repaying.

OUR VIEW

Don't look back in anger

IT has become clear that the majority of expatriates living in Europe are opposed to Brexit and would prefer to maintain the status

Looking back, it would appear that David Cameron could not have been more mistaken in his belief that the British electorate would vote to remain in the European Union and had he not been so gung ho, he could still be in power.

The concept of expatriate rights to vote has been something of a moveable feast with no obvious rhyme nor reason to the current 15-year limit which has also been 20 years and seven years at dif-

One of the election promises given by the conservatives prior to the 2015 general election was that expatriates who had been registered to vote or had been born in the UK would have the right to vote, granting the franchise back to those who had lost it.

That was three years ago and finally, the government is getting its act together in order to return the vote but arguably for Cameron and the country, it's too little, too late!

Having found the time to force through the referendum bill, it was ironic that the government couldn't actually grant the promised rights to the disenfranchised who were probably more interested in voting on their immediate future than voting in a second general election (which they missed anyway).

Had Mr Cameron actually given expatriates the right to vote in the Referendum it is possible that Brexit would be a broken dream for the likes of Nigel Farage, David Davis and Jacob Rees Mogg.



Slippery flyers detained

A CHINESE couple were detained at Manises (Valencia) airport as they tried to smuggle live elvers out of the country.

Guardia Civil customs officers, their suspicions aroused by their six suitcases as the couple checked in, asked to look inside. They were confronted by 36 bags containing hundreds of minute elvers that weighed a total of 1.17 kilos.

The couple, a woman of 58 and a man of 51 who were flying to Hanoi via Istanbul, lacked any type of documentation or authorisation relating to the elvers.

These had been packed in plastic bags filled with water and insulated with ice and isothermic wrappings, to ensure that they arrived in optimum condition.

The angulas (elvers), so young that they are practically transparent, are considered as great a delicacy in Vietnam as they are in Spain and would have fetched a high price on reaching Hanoi.

Useful future for architectural gem

Now municipal property, emergency work was carried out in 2008 on doors, windows and the roof to prevent further deterioration and the

porch was underpinned in 2013.

More work was needed in 2014 on the caretaker's lodge, chapel and the perimeter wall.

Plans centre on rehabilitating Villa Marco and its gardens for future use as an informal museum with facilities for cultural, official and business activi-

Structurally, the building and roof are sound but the interior needs a complete renovation, explained Campello's Culture councillor Pepe Varo.

Villa Marco is an Asset of Local Relevance, with gardens that are also listed and the complex has "enormous" cultural, social, tourist and economic potential Varo said

His department has now produced the Master Plan routinely required prior to applying for official subsidies and putting the project out to tender, but it was too early to say when work would start, the councillor continued.

Oltra trolled on Facebook

REGIONAL vice-president Monica Oltra has received death threats via Facebook.

These appear to have been prompted by Oltra's opposition to 'life means life' prison sentences, a move backed by the father of Diana Quer who disappeared in August 2016 and whose murdered body was finally discovered last month.

"Let's see if you still feel the same if they kill your mother or rape you, you illiterate anti-Valencian idiot," the troll

In another post he called her a 'daughter of a bitch' and wrote that she should be hanged 'for betraying Valencians.'

Oltra, who is also head of the regional government's Equality department, belongs to Compromis and the spokesman Fran Ferri stressed the party's unanimous support for the vice-president and called on the Public Prosecutor to start proceedings against the troll.

"This person whose name and surnames as well as a profile photo are on his Facebook page should not be allowed to act with impunity on the social media," Ferri said.

These were grave threats against Oltra and her family, the spokesman added and pointed out that Penal Code classed these

Cheeses recalled in meningitis case

RAW ewes' milk cheese, held responsible for a meningitis case in Madrid, was withdrawn from sale in Calpe.

The Gutizia, Txuria and Beltza varieties were initially recalled in the Basque region where they are produced by the Ohian Txiki Koop, as well as Madrid and Cataluña.

Spain's Consumers, Food Safety and Nutrition Agency (Aecosan) then added the Valencian Community, Andalucia, Castilla-La Mancha, Extremadura and Galicia.

The recall came after doctors found that a 39-year-old Madrid man diagnosed with meningitis had eaten cheese contaminated with the listeria monocytogenes bacteria.

He is now said to be making good progress and doctors explained that although listeriosis is relatively benign, in extreme cases this can lead to meningitis.

According to the regional Health department sources, inspectors impounded eight of the Basque cheeses which a Calpe hotelrestaurant had acquired from a Madrid dis-

Valencian consumers' association (AVACU) advised consumers who had bought Gutizia, Txuria or Beltza cheese produced by Ohian Txiki Koop not to eat it or, if they had done so, to go to their nearest health centre.



Water runs clear again

ALTEA Town Hall recently advised residents not to drink or cook with the tap water which was cloudy after heavy rain.

Restrictions were lifted after three days when analyses showed that the domestic supply was once again fit for consumption.

The ban was short-lived compared with December 2016 and last month when there were two lengthy episodes of turbid water. These followed periods of prolonged rain and gales that stirred up sediment at the bottom of the Guadalest reservoir, which was at its lowest-ever level.

Finestrat, La Nucia and Alfaz were affected but have since taken steps to prevent a recurrence. Although all local water is purified, none of these towns had filtering plants. Finestrat has alternative arrangements whilst La Nucia and Alfaz have plans in place.

Fortress church to get new roof

NUESTRA SEÑORA DE LA ASUNCION church is to close while it is completely

The old tiles will be carefully removed so that those in good condition can be reused, explained parish priest, Fr Juanjo Ortega.

Having detected some deterioration in the dome this, too, will be strengthened, he said.

The project is expected to take three months and three-quarters of the €160,000 cost will be donated by parishioners who in the past have paid for other repairs, including the sacristy.


The Orihuela-Alicante diocese will provide €20,000 and the Provincial Council, the Diputacion has allocated € 15.000.

This is the most ambitious restoration undertaking so far in Fr Ortega's plans for restoring the 16th century church-fortress to its former glory.

The basic project, which had to adhere to the Catalogue of Protected Assets and Spaces, was drawn up by Alicante University and submitted to Villajoyosa Town Hall for planning permission.

This was granted last month but making a start had to be delayed until the Generalitat's Culture department gave its approval, as the church has been declared an Asset of Cultural Interest.

Although the Nuestra Señora de la Asuncion will

Preparing for visitors

AN amphibian harvester is making the Pego-Oliva marsh hospitable for rare aquatic warblers which are threatened with extinction.

The Global Nature Foundation, part of the Life Paludicola project which has recovered wetlands in the Valencian Community, Castilla La Mancha and Castilla Leon, recently demonstrated how the newly-acquired harvester rapidly demolishes reeds. These can then be shredded and used for biofuel, said Global Nature's director Eduardo de Miguel.

The aquatic warbler is one of the rarest birds in mainland Europe with a world population of between 12,000 and 20,500 pairs and classed as vulnerable on the Red List of Endangered Species.

Nesting in the Baltic region, the birds migrate twice a year, crossing wetlands like the Pego-Oliva marsh on their way to and from Africa: "But they need open wetlands and fens," De Miguel emphasised.

Many have disappeared along the aquatic warblers' route, owing to building development, changes in land use and inadequately-maintained wetlands.

"The Pego-Oliva reeds will regrow rapidly now they have been cut down although in the past sheep and goats would have grazed there," De Miguel said. He has now found a local farmer who has agreed to bring his sheep to help keep down the regrowth and complement the harvester.

Infrastructure and resurfacing began last month but some of the car owners were unaware that the road was going to close to traffic some days later.

The road works will take six months and residents complained of lack of information when they met Councillor Eva Ronda at their monthly neighbourhood meeting.

Two garages had notices fixed to their entrances but there was no apparent warning for the third garage where, residents learnt later, the notice was ripped off soon after it was put

Ronda explained that removing the cars would have to be arranged with the town hall's Urban Development department, headed by Maria Josep Ripoll who admitted that she had not been informed about the trapped

She pointed out that the town hall had given due warning of the road works and announced the date at a residents' meeting.

There is currently a trench down the middle of the road, making it impossible to move the cars safely, Ripoll said. Nevertheless, residents would not have to wait the six months that work is due to take and would have their cars back in less than eight weeks.

Four arrested in sex trafficking sting

FOUR people who allegedly forced women to become prostitutes in a system of 'semi-slavery' have been arrested by the Guardia Civil. A fifth person is also under investigation.

The Melilla-based gang made the Moroccan women, some of whom were children, pay once they got pregnant to find Spanish men who could claim to be their baby's father.

The three men and one woman behind the trafficking network did this so their children would be Spanish nationals once born, according to police accusations.

Police seized three kilos of hashish, doses of cocaine prepared for consumption, cash, mobile phones, documents and passports in a raid on two floors of a building in the city.

The investigation began when the Guardia Civil discovered the existence of the network which they said recruited undocumented Moroccan women in the Spanish enclave in order to exploit

The women were struggling to make ends meet for themselves and their families and had little, if any, chance of finding work without documenta-

Once the gang met the women they were then

taken to a building where they were kept and forced into prostitution. The two floors of the building were also used to sell drugs and contraband tobacco and alcohol.

The women were made to practise sex work according to a non-stop schedule and were forced to take drugs to keep them going. They were also encouraged to sell them to their clients, according to reports.

Police allege the women had no freedom under what they said was a regime that resembled slavery. They were also charged for staying in the building and for its maintenance, leaving them with little money left over.

Some of the women who became pregnant were made to look for Spanish men who could be registered as their baby's father.

The child would then gain Spanish citizenship and the mother a residency card. The women were made to pay for this process.

The alleged leader of the gang, a 40-year-old Moroccan national, controlled the price and number of services the women were made to provide.

He has now been arrested along with the other suspects and proceedings have been sent to a court in Melilla

Health workers confirmed the baby was on the verge of hypothermia.

When the police contacted the father, they discovered the pair were separating and that another child could possibly be home alone.

There they found a young girl sleeping and with the house windows open.

The girl confirmed that she had been alone since she left school in the afternoon and that the only thing she had eaten was a sandwich.

Police took the little girl to her grandparents' house to take care of her.

The father told the police of his intention to denounce the mother of the two children for 'abandonment of mi-

SPAIN is set to launch its first spy satellite, and Elon Musk's SpaceX company has agreed to blast it into

Named Paz [Peace], the € 160 million unit will lift off from the Vandenberg Airbase in California, United States (US) aboard one of the flamboyant billionaire's Falcon 9 rockets.

Built by Airbus Defence and Space, a division of aeroplane manufacturer Airbus, the satellite is owned by Madrid firm Hisdesat, although the Ministry of Defence and a number of private individuals provided most of the funding.

The Spanish Armed Forces Intelligence Centre, CIFAS, will receive 30 of the 100 high-resolution images captured daily by Paz, with customers for the other 70 being sought.

A contract with the European Space Agency has already been signed, and the craft will also collaborate with the European Union's satellite centre.

Its main base will be the National Institute of Aerospace Technology in Torrejon de Ardoz, Madrid, with support from the Maspalomas station in Gran Canaria, while project leaders are exploring the possibility of a third headquarters in the North Pole.

In addition to its military tasks, the satellite will also be used for mapping, environmental monitoring, ur-




IMAGE: An artist's impression of how Paz will look in orbit.

Paz will be released at an altitude

of 514 kilometres above the earth's surface before it settles into orbit, and six months of testing will be carried out to ensure it is working correctly.

SpaceX made 18 successful launches last year, but in January a billion-dollar US satellite named Zuma was lost after being sent into space aboard a Falcon 9 from the Cape Canaveral complex in Florida.

An unnamed multimillionaire has reportedly agreed to cover the cost of the Spanish project should anything go wrong.

The news comes after South African-born entrepreneur Musk. earlier this week, used his Falcon Heavy rocket - which employs two Falcon 9's as boosters - to fire a convertible Tesla sports car into

Have you bought a property and made changes to it? Perhaps you have added an extension, built a swimming pool or simply modernised your home?

The 'licencia de obra menor' applies to minor works.

The 'licencia de obra mayor' refers to major works.

permit in place you can be fined. It will not be the builder, but you as the owner who will be made liable. Town halls have inspectors responsible for checking up on renovations and home improvements, and if they detect a building site without a licence they will take the necessary actions.

- Does the information on your deeds match the current state of your property?
- Have you applied for the required building permit?

- Have you notified the land registry of the work that has been carried out?
- Has the community of owners given you the required permission? (only if applicable)

What is a Spanish power of

It is the document by which one or more **principal** persons, whether individuals or legal entities (companies) authorise another person/s, representative (individuals or companies), before a Spanish public notary or someone with notarial faculties (like a consul) to act on their behalf.

Content of power. We can authorise by means of a power someone to perform as many actions as we wish and depending on the content, the powers are usually divided between:

Special or General POA: the first if contains all or the general possible faculties, or special if we want to limit it to some concrete action. It is important if we give a general power to make sure that the representative is a person who we trust 100 per cent because they will be able to act on your behalf in a very wide area. On the other hand, if it is a special power, we must be careful to not to limit it too much because it might not be good enough if some of the needed actions are not foreseen.

There are also the powers for courts, preventive, relative to the

Formalities. The principal must identify himself and give his personal information: address, marital status, etc.

At the time of identification, if the principal is an individual, they must show to the notary the ID, passport or identity card.

In the case of companies, the company must be identified by means of tax or registration number (in Spain CIF) and the person acting on its behalf must prove their position and that they are empowered to act on behalf of the company.

The representative. It is very important to identify the representative correctly, although it is not necessary for him/her to go to the notary to sign at the time of granting power.

If the POA will be used for a transaction with tax conse-

quences, like a purchase, inheritance, etc in Spain, all the parties must need a Spanish Tax number or if they are foreigners an NIE

With whom? If the power is signed in Spain, it should be undertaken before a Spanish notary public and not before a lawyer, solicitor or similar, as happens in some countries like United Kingdom.

How to cancel it? The power could be revoked before any notary and the representative must be notified.

It is important to note that in principle the powers of attorney in Spain, unless otherwise stated. do not have a specific validity period, so if you do not say anything they will be valid until your

Some precautions

Conflict of interests clause. If, for example, you want to give power to a person who will later be party on the same transaction, you must include a clause stating


sent him even if he incurs a possible conflict of interest. Example: if you want to donate a property to your child, and give him power to take care of every-

Substitution clause. It is worth considering within the terms of the POA the possibility that the representative could appoint another representative if for example they are sick and cannot sign on your behalf, etc.

In general there are very different ways to prepare and draft a power of attorney, the important thing is to ensure that in your case it is done conveniently and according to your circumstances. If you want help with this or any other legal matter, contact us and we will help you.

A PAINTING depicting the Apostle Santiago has been covered in a church in Membrilla for reportedly being 'too sexy and erotic.'


The portrait was donated to the church by renowned Membrillan artist Antonio Ximenez Muñoz, and portrays the Apostle in a kneelength tunic.

Economy to soar in 2018

THE European Union (EU) has handed Spain a financial boost.

In a new report, the bloc has raised the country's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth forecast for 2018 from 2.5 to 2.6 per cent.

The move suggests that the EU does not feel that the Catalan independence crisis has adversely affected the Spanish econo-

Spain's output is currently growing at a much faster pace than the EU average, but is likely to fall to 2.1 per cent by 2019.

Store wars check out

SPANISH supermarket chain Mercadona has strengthened its position as national market leader.

The company last year accounted for 24.1 per cent of supermarket sales in Spain - a year-on-year rise of 1.2 per cent - according to an annual report by consumer consultancy Kantar Worldpan-

Nine out of 10 Spanish families bought at least one product from a Mercadona store during 2017, and the Valencian firm was responsible for 20 per cent of all fresh product

French rival Carrefour placed second in the national ranking with an 8.7 per cent market share, 0.2 per cent up on 2016 after it launched a series of takeover bids for hypermarkets formerly belonging to Basque chain Eroski.

Madrid-based brand Dia completed the top three as it scooped 8.2 per cent of the market, falling 0.3 per cent, while the Eroski Group also lost 0.3 per cent to finish the year with a 5.6 per cent

German chain Lidl continues its steady growth in Spain, with sales increasing by 0.2 per cent to take a 4.3 per cent portion of the market.

"Mercadona is revamping its stores and has become fashionable again," said Kantar Worldpanel's retail director, Florencio Garcia, adding that the company is also leading the pack in online sales.

Spanish households spent an average of €4,190 on groceries during 2017, with Catalans (€4,599) splashing out the most and Valencians (€3,932) the

€656m offload to spark buyout

THE battle for Spanish toll operator Abertis goes on. It comes after the company agreed to sell its majority stake in satellite company Hispasat to national grid operator Red Electrica for around €656 million

And the move could speed up the battle between Hochtief - the German offshoot of Spanish constructor ACS - and Italian motorway operator Atlantia, with both companies having launched bids to buy Abertis. Spain's stock market regulator rubber-stamped Atlantis' bid in October but has not yet endorsed Hochtief's offer.



SPANISH car maker Seat has joined forces with French telecommunications behemoth Orange.

The partnership will see the companies work together to turn the private car into the occupants' 'second digital home.'

In addition to the so-called connected car, the agreement will lay the groundwork for creating new entertainment options to improve driver and passenger experience, including bringing the digital home or office experience to car users.

The firms will also launch a loyalty scheme offering benefits to those who buy into new 'connectivity and mobility options' as they are released.

Speaking in the wake of contracts being signed, Seat's head of business development, Arantxa Alonso said that "we feel privileged to have strategic arrangements with partners such as Orange that give a major boost to our development of car connectivity.

"This partnership opens up a large collaborative space for both companies that are pursuing a common goal - promote the use of the connected car and make the car user's experience easier and more efficient."

Luis Santos, Orange Spain's director of innovation and new digital services, added: "This strategic agreement with Seat is a great step for Orange in its strategy of connected objects and Big Data and opens the door to innovations and new developments surrounding cars of the future, which will contribute to helping us achieve our goal of connecting our customers with what truly matters most to them."

Initial projects will reportedly focus on developing new audio, visual and educational apps focused on ensuring maximum safety while optimising functionality.

The loyalty scheme will involve a cross-company series of offers

based on frequency of use, with purchase discounts, rewards and gifts all set to feature in an attempt to ensure customers do not defect to other brands

The car manufacturer will also take advantage of Orange's Big Data technology to glean insights into user preferences and develop products that most closely match their needs.

It comes after Seat recently confirmed agreements with other multinationals, including Amazon - with plans to integrate the smart voice Alexa assistant in the company's cars - and Google for its Waze pavigation system.

Google to help fend off e-shop expansion

INTERNET giant Google is fighting back against online retailers.

The firm's general director in Spain and Portugal, Fuencisla Clemares, said that the company aims to be a key ally of high street shops in the battle against Amazon and other virtual rivals.

"We are working closely with companies including El Corte Ingles, Carrefour and Mediamarkt to understand how we can help them be more successful retailers using our technological strength," she said.

Speaking at the New Economy forum in the Spanish capital Madrid, Ms Clemares added that online commerce is growing fast in Spain, and that traditional brands must find ways of competing which capitalise on their assets, particularly the in-store experience.

Her comments come days after El Corte Ingles president, Dimas Gimeno, told Spanish media that his company "is seeking partnerships to resist Amazon."

DEAL SEES COUNTRIES INCREASE TIES Investment Sheikh-down

SPAIN is cementing its business ties with Saudi Arabia.

The level of investment between the two nations is set to skyrocket after officials met during the second session of the Saudi-Spanish Joint Committee in the Arabic country. Co-chaired by Spanish Secretary of State for Trade, Marisa Poncela Garcia, and Saudi Minister of Commerce and Investment, Majid Al-Qasabi, a wide range of topics were reportedly discussed during the talks.

Spanish Ambassador to Saudi Arabia, Alvaro Iranzo, told local media: "The joint committee held the second session in [Saudi capital] Riyadh and the two sides discussed bilateral cooperation and issues and common interests, in accordance with the joint cooperation agreement that was signed by the two countries in Madrid on February 22, 2007."

He added that meetings are to be held in Madrid and Riyadh on an alternating basis, with the first having taken place in the Spanish capital in 2014.

Mr Iranzo described the talks as "very successful" and revealed that the



BUSINESS: The Saudi and Spanish delegations sign new agreements. committee discussed bilateral trade relations, the promotion of trade and economic relations, plus mutually-beneficial investment opportunities in commerce, investment, economy, energy, industry, mining, science, technology, water, agriculture, finance, housing and tourism.

"Many aspects of bilateral relations were discussed with both sides keen to further enhance economic and technical cooperation in line with Vision 2030," the envoy said.

Building new collaborations in the private sector was also a hot topic, with exchange visits between delegates set to help identify import, export and investment opportunities, share expertise in the small and medium-sized business sectors, and enrich the experience of entrepreneurs.

"Companies from the kingdom doing business in Spain, and Spanish companies working in Saudi Arabia, will be encouraged to help further enhance bilateral cooperation," Mr Iranzo confirmed.

Saudi firms SABIC and Alfanar have already made significant investments in Spain, building large factories, and the official revealed that trade between the countries "stands at €5.5 billion ... and we have scope to further increase the volume

"Saudi Arabia is passing through an exciting time with Vision 2030, and Spain is willing to be a partner in development for a positive change and for national transformation."

Question marks over €3.6bn deal

BRITISH private equity firm CVC Capital Partners is ramping up attempts to buy a stake in Spanish utilities firm Gas Natural.

The investment group aims to purchase a 20 per cent share from energy company Repsol, and is reportedly negotiating a deal to secure external financing to cover around a third of the cost, with the overall package set to be worth € 3.6 billion.

But the price has come into question after € 3 billion was wiped off the company's stock market value, after the Spanish government announced a series of potential cuts to electricity and gas company subsidies.

Football deal sparks fury

SPANISH multimedia company Mediapro has signed a €3.15 billion deal to broadcast Italian foot-

The announcement comes after bosses from Italy's Serie A pulled out of talks with Sky Italia after the latter refused to pay the sum, set by the league's adviser Infront Sports & Media.

Former Italian prime minister and AC Milan owner Silvio Berlusconi's Mediaset were also in the running

But the deal - which covers the next three seasons and must be ratified by the Italian antitrust authority - has sparked outrage, with Sky suggesting it could take legal action.

Under Italian regulations, Serie A rights cannot be held by a single company, but Mediapro has snapped up all packages available to independent intermediaries due to a lack of alternative bids, although they only cover the Italian domestic

The sale of international rights will be handled by New York-based sports firm IMG, with the three-year deal reportedly worth €371 million per season.

Spain holiday sales slip as Turkey gains ground

HOLIDAY giant Thomas Cook says that Turkey and Tunisia are hot destinations for UK holidaymakers in 2018, with Spain viewed as expensive.

Chief executive Peter Fankhauser revealed that the brand is shifting capacity east this summer, with Turkey the standout market so far.

"From all that we see so far, customers' appetite for a summer holiday abroad shows no sign of slowing down. We've taken early action to meet strong demand for destinations in the eastern

"This has enabled us to shift capacity out of the Spanish islands where we have seen a continuation of the margin pressures we experienced last summer, particularly for the UK market."

Around 30 per cent of the company's holiday

sales are traditionally to Spanish destinations, but last year the figure approached 40 per cent.

Mr Fankhauser added: "The very strong demand for Spain is returning to slightly more normal levels. Spain is getting more expensive compared to the good value-for-money proposition we are seeing in the eastern Mediterranean."

Greece is also selling strongly, and the travel agent is about to relaunch in Tunisia, after a threeyear absence in the wake of the deadly Sousse beach attack during which 30 British holidaymak-

The group's revenue rose by 7 per cent to just under €2 billion in the fourth quarter of 2017, as it benefited from the collapse of airlines Monarch and Air Berlin.

Amid this onslaught of music for the millions, it's perhaps surprising that good old-fashioned vinyl LPs are on the up, with 40 million sold last year.

Who would have thought that the snap, crackle and pop of needles on plastic would break through the niche nostalgia barrier, normally reserved for anorak steam enthusiasts, philatelists and people who thought life was better when we all lived in cardboard boxes and walked 30 miles to school. Barefoot.

What certainly isn't coming back is the late and largely unlamented cassette, a triumph of convenience over quality. Even if the amazing ability to compile your own mixtape back in the 70's and 80's meant cassetting there was half the fun.

DIGITAL assistants are well on their way to being the fastest-growing techno-toy of the era, with nearly 60 million due to be sold in 2018

Using one like Amazon's market-leading Echo can be a truly spooky experience. Simply say 'Alexa, play...' plus the genre, artiste or actual track of your choice and away it goes in high quality, either on its own or through your home stereo if you've hooked it up by cable or Bluetooth.

Sadly, trying out the sniggeringly popular command, 'Alexa, play baby-making music' shows that Amazon's engineers really need to get out more.

I can't speak for anyone else, but the cheesiness of its 'elevator muzak' choice had my partner and I in gales of laughter. 'Baby-making' romantic that certainly ain't.



Spain ramps up fight against domestic violence

Taking on gender violence

While love has been in the air to mark Valentine's in recent days, gender violence continues to be a major concern across the country. David Noon looks at what measures Spain has already put in place and asks what more can be done?

ALENTINE'S DAY is a time to celebrate, to unashamedly kiss in the streets without fear of being judged and to shower your other half in heart-shaped gifts.

And while the presence of lovebirds frolicking gaily through the streets may turn the stomachs of singletons. it can be an especially traumatic time for the women, and men, who are trapped in an abusive relationship.

For while a lot has been done - and

domestic violence, it is still an ugly stain on the nation and the world as a

In 2017 alone, some 47 women had died at the hands of their partners in Spain.

Thousands more domestic violence cases are reported each year, and more worryingly still is the number that go

There were 28,281 officially registered female victims of gender-related violence in Spain in 2016, a 2.4 per cent rise from the previous year, according to the country's National Statistics Institute (INE).

The rate of abuse is highest in people aged 25-29, with three out of every 1,000 requiring some form of official protection.

In terms of teens, there were 569 victims of domestic violence recorded in 2016, a slight decrease

compared to the previous year.

At the other end of the scale, complaints by women aged 75 and older increased by nearly 15 per cent, while offences against those aged between 40 and 44 increased by 8.5 per cent.

Across all age ranges 24 per cent of domestic abuse cases relate to married couples.

And there were few signs of change at the start of 2017.

The year had in fact started off with some of the worst figures for genderrelated murders in Spain, with 16 women killed by partners or ex-partners as early as March 2.

The backlash from these shocking figures saw seven women from the Asociación Vel-la Luz, a Galiciabased organisation working with domestic violence survivors, go on a 25day hunger strike in Madrid's Puerta



Horror story that started a movement

abusive husband for four decades. Ana Orantes bravely went on television to retell her traumatic ordeal.

Joined by her youngest daughter Raquel, Ana retold horrific tales of how her recently divorced husband had submitted her to continuous beatings, forced her to drink, to have sex against her will and constantly insulted her over a 40-year period.

Her aim was to raise awareness of a situation that many women suffered in Spain behind closed doors but did not dare to mention in public.

Some 13 days after the interview, Jose Parejo beat his ex-wife until she was unconscious, tied her to a chair and then burned her alive in front of 14-year-old Raquel.

Parejo died in prison after being handed a 17-year jail term.

But more poignantly, hundreds of people lined the streets of Granada to pay their respects to Ana on the day of her funeral.

Spain stood united in agreement that something had to be done to stop gender violence.

And yet, some 20 years after Ana's death, women are still dving at the hands of their husbands and Ana's daughter Raquel is demanding more

In an open letter broadcast on Cadena SER in December, Raquel lamented that 'almost nothing' has been done to prevent cases such as her mother's from happening again.

"I would love to tell you everything has changed, that there is political will and that all the people who work to eradicate violence against women have managed to move forward, but that is not the case, the victims are still the same and continue to kill with impunity. Unfortunately, we are still second class citizens," she said.





They were joined by millions more women - and men - on International Women's Day who marched in the Capital as well as cities across the country demanding an end to gender violence

And the Spanish government took note.

In fact, Spain should be applauded for recent measures it has introduced (regardless of whether or not you believe they should have come into force before now).

Set out in July and brought into force at the turn of the year, some 200 new measures have been put in place in relation to domestic abuse and gender violence (see Latest reforms).

These range from providing greater education about gender violence at schools, to enforcing greater sanctions to those prosecuted and offering better protection for those who report violent partners.

It was hailed as an 'unprecedented event' by Javier

Latest reforms

AS part of a wider reform of Spain's gender violence and domestic abuse laws, the government has introduced 200 reforms to legislation. Among the reforms are the following:

- The status of victim will be extended to women who have not yet filed a criminal complaint, to allow them to access safeguards and assistance
- Mechanisms for identifying victims of genderbased violence will be established in hospital emergency rooms and primary care
- Children orphaned by gender-based violence will have priority access to state benefits including educational support. Their guardians (excluding the abuser) will receive tax benefits and priority access to housing
- Tougher sanctions for gender-based crimes committed on the internet
- School curriculums to include lessons to tackle sexism and raise awareness of the feminist move-

ing figure in the ruling Popular Party and while some activists argue that it doesn't go far enough, it is most definitely an encouraging step in the

The long road to this point was started in 1997 when 60-year-old Ana Orantes was beaten, thrown over a balcony and then burned to death by her ex-husband after repeatedly complaining to authorities about his violent behaviour (see Horror story that started a movement).

Ana was the 59th woman to die at the hands of her partner that year and her death was the final straw for many.

It led to seven years of protests, parliamentary debates and finally le-

At the end of it, in 2004, the government introduced a law designed to reduce the number of domestic violence cases

A network of courts was set up to specialise in the matter and funds were ploughed into programmes aimed at supporting surviving victims

It came after 71 domestic murders were recorded in 2003, leading to reinvigorated protests for change.

Yet, while the reforms were initially seen as a sign of progress it didn't take long for cracks to begin to appear with activists readily pointing out where the law fell short.

Before the latest reforms many campaigners demanded legislation that properly tackles the issue once and for all.

> 'We need legislation that really addresses femicide, that really gives it the importance it needs," said Isabel Muntane, director of the Master's Programme on Gender and Communication at the Autonomous

University of Barcelona.

"Women are being murdered for being women, and it seems that society is immune to these murders. We always say that if it were football players being murdered, there would be a social revolution."

In fact, in the 14 years since the dedicated courts were created, official statistics record some 796 women have died as the result of domestic

However, according to the activistrun site Feminicio.net, which compiles an unofficial count of femicide murders not exclusive to romantic partnerships, the number of women killed since 2004 as a result of gender violence is closer to 1.500.

"The official femicide count doesn't include the murders of minors, sex workers, murders done by family members, trans-phobic murders," said Muntane. "If we're not aware of the reality of all femicides, we're not aware of the magnitude of the problem."

Following the economic crisis in 2008, the government also slashed funding to many previous-supported programmes set up to tackle gender

In total, government funds allocated to dealing with gender violence have been cut by some 29 per cent over the last decade.

Although you could be forgiven for looking at the latest measures with a pinch of cynicism, the introduction of new reforms should hopefully start moving that figure in the other direction once

One thing is for sure: a lot more still needs to be done to stamp this unnecessary evil out once and for all.

Shocking study

AN EU-wide study carried out in 2014 found that gender violence and domestic abuse is an issue that transcends borders. In fact, the statistics in the study show that there is need for greater reforms and tougher laws across the continent in order to tackle the problem head on.

Here are some of the key findings from the study:

- One in 10 women have experienced some form of sexual violence since the age of 15, while one in 20 has been raped
- One in five women have experienced some form of stalking since the age of 15, with 5 per cent having experienced it in the 12 months preceding the survey
- However, three out of four stalking cases reported in the survey never come to the attention of the
 - One in 10 women have been stalked by a previ-

- Of women in the survey who indicate they have been raped by their current partner, about one third (31 per cent) say they have experienced six or more incidents of rape by their partner
- Just over one in 10 women experienced some form of sexual violence by an adult before they were

 Most violence is carried out by a current former \mathbf{or} partner, with 22 per cent of women in relationships reporting partner abuse

Our snowflake-generation is so pampered by decades of child-centred parenting/education, is it surprising they're putting off real life?


But you can't hold back time, careers, finding lifepartners, babies. They'll regret it waking up at 40 totally alone in the world.



Drugged up

AROUND a quarter of young people between the age of 13 and 18 are thought to experience anxiety on a regular basis, according to a recent report, with approximately 5 per cent of all children in Europe estimated to suffer from AD-HD.

The situation has prompted the Duchess of Cambridge to launch a website that aims to help improve mental well-being of children in primary school and the support they receive if they suffer from any difficulties. The website claims that 'one in 10 children experience a mental health difficulty by age 11.'

However, Matt Hudson, a leading behavioural change expert and founder of Motivational Change and the Hudson Mind Theory, is warning parents of the dangers of confusing common emotions such as sadness, fear and grief which are commonly experienced by children with some symptoms

of actual medical conditions.

He revealed: "We are constantly hearing that mental illness among children is on the rise; more anxious, stressed and depressed than ever before. Confused and insecure children are likely to be diagnosed as depressed or traumatised. Energetic or disruptive youngsters are said to be suffering from attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). Children who give their teachers a hard time or argue with adults might even find themselves labelled victims of 'oppositional defiant disorder."

Hudson advises parents to seek other tools to help their children cope with their feelings, as "The authorities now have the power to issue drugs like Ritalin for ADHD, which is as powerful as cocaine, directly to children - and the parents have no say in the decision.

"The prescription is based on a chemical imbalance theory, a theory that has never been

proven to this day."

How to cope with post-workout soreness

IT'S normal to feel a bit sore after an intense workout, but what should you do when the pain is worse than usual and is interfering with your

The scientific term for post-workout aches and pains is DOMS - 'delaved-onset muscle soreness.' It usually peaks around two to three days following exercise as your body starts to go to town on repairing any muscle fibres that may have been torn during the workout.

Occasionally, you may experience

'extreme soreness,' which is more likely to happen after you've done an intense activity that your muscles aren't accustomed to.

Just because you're more sore, it doesn't always mean you're getting better workout results and can cause you more damage in the long term so don't make a habit of exercising regularly on a high level of

However, there are several simple things you can do to ease the pain.

First of all, make sure you stay hy-

drated as research has shown a correlation between dehydration and DOMS. Water helps to purge waste products and toxins that are associated with muscle soreness.

Also make sure you eat lots of protein which is vital for rebuilding muscle tissue.

You could also try switching between heat and cold therapy as ice helps to reduce the swelling that is sometimes the result of extreme soreness while heat can minimise pain and tension.

Cracking down on sugar

cTHE Spanish health ministry has announced it plans to reduce sugar, salt and fat levels in 3,500 products by 2020.

In order to achieve this, the ministry has partnered with more than 500 food and beverage companies and catering companies will now have to improve the quality of the meals offered in schools, by reducing the amount of processed and fried products as well as offering more fruit, vegetables and fish.

Vending machines will also have to be filled by at least a third with more 'balanced foods' and the maximum amount of sugar added to hot drinks machines will be cut down by 15 per cent.

The news comes after the Lithuanian government made a similar announcement of its decision to partner with food manufacturers to reduce the amount of salt and sugar in food instead of bringing in a sugar tax.

Dolors Montserrat, the Spanish health minister claimed the move is "a pioneering plan to improve the composition of food, promote the health of Spaniards and prevent chronic diseases."

However, there's one way to make sure you avoid a deficiency and stay healthy - eat

According to research published in the American Heart

Go bananas

Association's journal, eating more bananas could reduce your risk of having a stroke by up to 20 per cent.

The potassium content in bananas has also been shown to benefit your bones

It prevents the body excreting calcium in the urine which can prevent kidney stones.

This also means you're left with more calcium to keep your bones strong and healthy.





Stretch it out

THERE'S a lot of research that praises the benefits of Pilates, from reducing the risk of certain illnesses to strengthening muscles and improving flexibility.

It's also a gentler workout than most but it can be just as effective, meaning you get all the benefits of exercise without any of the soreness afterwards.

According to a study by the Journal of Orthopaedic & Sports Physical Therapy, Pilates can help ease back ache as those with chronic lower back pain who attended classes for a month experienced more relief than those who went to see a physician or other specialist.

This is believed to be because Pilates strengthens the core, which then alleviates stress on the lowerback region.

A stronger core also will help to improve your posture and overall sports performance as all the body's muscles are connected through the core, so this will make your movements sharper and help you run faster.

It's also easier on your joints than other workouts as the slow, controlled movements cause minimal impact.

One of the major benefits of practising Pilates is the wonders it does to your flexibility, which can improve your body's range of motion and, therefore, your exercise performance.

A study that followed young Brazilian women, without any prior experience, as they attended 20 Pilates sessions showed they became 19.1 per cent more flexible by the end of the research.

WHILE spring is on the horizon, the flu is still making the rounds but is it too late to get a shot if you're worried about being knocked out cold?

In fact, it's never too late for anyone to get the vaccine as while the virus is normally passed on during colder times of the year when there is low humidity; flu season usually stretches into early spring and

has been known to stick around in May.

However, you should avoid the vaccine if you have a life-threatening allergy to the injection or its ingredients (such as egg or gelatin). You should also not get the vaccine if you who have Guillain-Barre syndrome (an immune system disorder).

Children and babies aged six months and older should get vaccinated but often need two doses to be adequately

Flu vaccines are only effective about 40 to 60 per cent of the time so you can still get the flu despite being vaccinated but the injection could help make the symptoms milder.



CARIÑENA: Old school wine.

CARIÑENA is a Spanish Denominación de Origen (DO) created in 1932 for wines produced on the Campo de Cariñena plateau near the centre of Aragón, the acknowledged source of the Carignan grape or Mazuelo. This is also grown in Italy and new world regions.

The vineyards lie between 400-800m above sea level with temperature extremes over 12 months as well as daytime and night which contribute to the characteristic intensity of Cariñena wines.

The local population had been producing mead since 300 BC; during the Middle Ages wine-making prospered under the protection of monasteries and by the 16th century vineyards covered 50 per cent of the territory of Zaragoza Province.

Since 1995 Cariñena exports have quadrupled thanks to changes aimed at attracting more overseas buyers through fruitier, lighter and well balanced wines while the traditional robust, high alcohol content wines are retained

mainly for local consumption.

The most planted variety is Garnacha tinta (55 per cent) for reds and rosés, followed by Viura (20 per cent), Mazuelo and Tempranillo (15 per cent), while Moscatel Romano is used for the production of sweet Moscatels and a rare red grape called Vidadillo.

Tempranillo is blended with Garnacha to make the Crianza, Reserva and Gran Reserva.

The whites are made with Viura and the rosés use Garnacha along with other white and red varieties and are macerated for colour.

Both the fresh young whites, which represent 20 per cent of total production, and rosés, are best consumed within the year of produc-


Reds have the characteristic style of Garnacha wines produced in hot climates and, in the case of oak-aged Crianzas, have the taste and strength provided by 5 per cent of Cariñena grapes which pair well with red meats and game. Happy tasting.

THE village of Almuñecar on the Costa Tropical is often bypassed in favour of its popular coastal neighbour Nerja, but this picturesque fishing hotspot should by no means be overlooked if you happen to be in the area.

While the stunning beaches are a major draw, there is much more on offer in this little-known town to explore.

Many people aren't aware that the English writer Laurie Lee was well acquainted with Almuñecar: in fact he was

staying in the town when the Spanish Civil War broke out in 1936 and it was even the subject of the final chapter of As I walked Out One Midsummer's Morning.

As a result, a statue paying homage to the writer was unveiled in 1988, which sits at the end of a row of beach bars on the Paseo del Altillo and is worth a visit.

The old town is a quaint jumble of whitewashed houses and winding lanes, which are lavishly decorated with may be a steep climb to get to the top, but the views over the bay are definitely worth

The impressive San Miguel Castle dates from the town's Moorish period and is more than 600 years old. It was used as a cemetery for over 130 years before restorative work on the castle began in 1986 and it is now home to an informative archaeological museum packed with historical artefacts.

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Checkpoint advice

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

THE security services (Guardia Civil, police, etc) carry out regular checkpoints on the roads.

Sometimes these are part of routine operations such as combatting drink driving, or vehicle inspections. Sometimes these checks are part of an increase in security. Sometimes, although rarely, they are directly related to a specific threat.

Although it may seem daunting to approach and be stopped at one of these checkpoints, it is important to remember that they are being conducted for your safety. These checkpoints do catch criminals, those risking road safety, terrorists and others, but the vast majority of people are allowed to go about their business normally.

The key phrase to remember when you see one of these checkpoints is, 'Nothing to Hide, Nothing to Fear'. It is only those who have done wrong, or are considering it, who should in fact be concerned.

The first rule when approaching such a checkpoint is to stay calm. Respond and react to the instructions given to you by the officers conducting the check. They may usher your vehicle to a chosen place, they may ask you to exit the vehicle and they may wish to check the contents of your car, as well as your documentation. Simply let the officers get on with their duties and they will let you get on your way as soon as possible.

Secondly, and equally important, do not share this location information. Posting this information on social networks such as Facebook and Twitter for example can alert those who have done wrong about the presence of the checkpoint, allowing them to get away.

The point of these checkpoints is to catch bad people, so please don't share the information. You might think you are doing others a favour, but if a criminal is allowed to avoid being caught, they will be free to carry out even more of their chosen activities.

Finally, do not be overly alarmed. The presence of additional security teams on the streets is not a direct indication of an increase in the

NOT good. Sorry, but in fact there is no legal time limit for distribution of the official minutes of the AGM. The minutes must be signed by the President and Secretary within 10 days of the meeting, and this signa-



ture puts into effect any measures passed in the meeting. The law itself says only that the minutes shall be sent to the owners, who have 30 days after the notification to register any challenges against the results of the voting.

HAVING your own garden is a privilege. The convenience and cost saving of living in an apartment though often makes a garden that can provide fresh herbs, fruits, flowers and veggies just a

It is possible however through linking in with local community gardens to participate in the healthy and productive activities while enjoying the companionship available in neighbourhood gardens.

There are many community gardening projects available that provide garden plots for people without a garden. Local governments often set aside a place where you can reserve a space to grow your own plants and there are also organisations such as associations or foundations that have land available for people to share in gardening activities.

If you love gardening but do not have your own space there are plenty of opportunities available, even if you just want to do it for a while. Many projects are undertaken to plant trees and create gardens on a project basis for only a limited time. Mostly the projects are on a voluntary basis with the benefit going to the neighbourhood where the project is undertaken.

You can check at your local town

Community gardens for growing a garden when you don't have your own



hall or search through social media to find a community group that suits the type of gardening activity that you may be interested in. There are many that are looking for volunteers and others that provide you with your own space for your own garden.

Many community garden plots have waiting lists due to the demand for this

type of activity being so popular, but the more interest that is shown to have places available, the more that will be created.

The municipality of Inca in Mallorca recently raffled 24 urban garden plots at the local Serral de les Monges Park to bring the number of garden plots available for use to 36 places after peo-

ple had been waiting up to three years for a space.

Community gardens are a great way to meet new people with similar interests and to share gardening ideas and methods. It also gives a good reason to get out into the fresh air and undertake fruitful exercise with a project that can provide many benefits.

Many non-government organisations provide training to improve your gardening skills as well as projects to participate in to benefit the community such as tree planting and sustainable gardens to provide examples of what is possible with community support.

One of the most widely known group of organisations is Permaculture.

Permaculture is a worldwide movement that researches ways to provide sustainable methods of gardening and other lifestyle activities to bring harmony into our lives.

Their activities are well publicised and often have government and community support for the projects they undertake.

You can find a wide range of projects at https://permacultureglobal.org/projects or more locally in Spain at https://www.ecoherencia.es/areas/agroecologia-y-permacultura/.

It is a good idea to also ask locally as many such projects are not publicised outside of the local region.

More ways to make your garden eco-friendly

CREATING a green space that complements the environment requires a bit more thought than you would think. However, there are several simple techniques you can adopt that will make all the difference to your new garden.

A significant part of ecofriendly gardening is using untreated, non-GMO seeds and plants. Distributing organic. sustainable seeds throughout your garden is much easier now that many seed companies have taken the safe seed pledge, but ecologicallyfriendly plants can be harder to source.

The best way to source plants raised in organic gardens is to go to a plant fair at a garden centre where you will be able to talk to the grower about how the plants were

waste is to re-use supplies year after year, such as plant pots and tool, and use the oldfashioned wooden seed starting trays instead of the plastic

You can even re-use glass

or plastic bottles as cloches to protect small plants from frost.

Conserving water is an important part of eco-friendly gardening as tap water is often chlorinated, which can have a

negative impact on soil and plant life, and is viewed as a waste when used outside. This can be achieved by installing swales or rain barrels so you can direct rainwater to your



The right trainer is vitally important since this is early learning, get it wrong then you will have the wrong type of behaviours. Expect to start as soon as possible from eight weeks. Usually the area for puppy training is safe for unvaccinated dogs but of course ask the vet.

Your chosen vet is going to be your pet's best friend and anything odd in behaviour such as not eating. swelling, fatigue, and sudden aggression could well be a veterinary problem. Do not go to a pharmacy and do not ask people what they think, you must go to a known professional vet.

Looking for support

AFTER a recent surge in the number - and range - of animals passengers have tried to bring on a flight as a form of emotional support, airlines are cracking down on what passengers are allowed to bring on board.

Hedgehogs are one of the most recent animals to be included on a list of banned pets drawn up by US-based United Airlines, which also includes, ferrets, rodents, spiders, snakes, reptiles and 'non-household birds.'

The airline revealed that requests have risen by 75 per cent to 76,000 in a year, and recently had to turn down a request for an 'emotional support' peacock at New York's Newark Airport.

A spokeswoman for the airline said that the rules regarding which animals passengers can bring on board needed to be tightened because of a "significant increase in on-board incidents involving these animals."

Passengers will also now have to provide proof that their animal has been 'trained to behave properly in a public setting,' as well as giving 48-hours notice and a letter from a mental health professional validating the need to travel with their pet.

Opel/Vauxhall Insignia Sports Tourer

IN recent years the traditional estate car has been overshadowed by the rising popularity of SUV and MPV models, but Opel/Vauxhall's latest Insignia Sports Tourer is good enough to win back plenty of 'lost' customers.

Sports Tourer prices start from $\leq 21,560 \text{ (£19,135)}$ and the model appeals to both business and private buyers. Standard equipment is generous and even entry versions come with a smartphone-compatible touchscreen infotainment system, keyless entry, cruise control and autonomous emergency braking.

The Sports Tourer is large and practical but also offers refined driving dynamics with surprisingly nimble handling, and with its sleek sporty styling is a genuine head-turner.

The revised exterior styling features a wider front grille and swooping headlights which help give some distinctive visual cachet.

The cabin has a more upmarket appearance thanks to improved trim materials.

Front and rear occupants get plenty of head and legroom despite the sloping roofline and the load-space is enormous, with a massive 560 litres boot expandable to 1,605 litres with rear seats

On the road, the car immediately impresses with its smooth composed driving feel and crisp handling. It is a quiet refined cruiser yet docile in city traffic and has a real sporty character when you want


In a statement, ANFAC said: "Rental companies have started renewing their fleets before the beginning of the tourist season, which





Spaniard achieves historic result

SPANIARD Naitxo Gonzalez has finished third in the Nazare challenge as part of the Big Wave Tour (BWT).
